

State: Death penalty off the table in 2012 murder

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – In her 16-year relationship with Jerry Ray Bullard Sr., Jacquilla Morgan Bullard, 35, tolerated more than her share of abuse and suffering.

They first met two years after he had been charged and arrested for attempted murder in Indiana where, police said, "he allegedly shot his cousin in the back after an argument over clothes on October 14, 1995." However, the charges were dropped "due to lack of cooperation by the victim of the shooting," court records show.

His Florida arrest record began in April 2001 when he was charged with grand theft and, while those charges were dropped, a month later, he was arrested for aggravated battery. He entered a plea agreement for misdemeanor battery, but two months later, he picked up where he left off in July 2001 with an arrest for battery during a burglary, charges that were also later dropped, according to court records.

In June 2001, he was charged with kidnapping the mother of one of his children from Indiana. Police said that on June 27, 2001, he held the woman at gunpoint and threatened to kill her if she fled while he drove them to Florida. The case was later dropped due to lack of victim cooperation. It is not clear whether Jacquilla was the woman held at gunpoint.

Arm teachers with knowledge, not guns

FLEMING ISLAND – Arming teachers to improve school safety should be a last resort, according to School Superintendent Addison Davis who hosted the first of seven Listen and Learn community meetings Monday night at Fleming Island High.

In an effort to reach out to local communities to address concerns about school safety and security, Davis will visit seven Clay County schools to give parents, students and faculty an opportunity to ask questions and understand what the school district's plan is moving forward in the wake of the Feb. 14 Parkland shooting that killed 17 people.

Despite many parents leaving the meeting wishing for more to be done, they left understanding the challenges the school district faces.

County removes Orange Park's only rescue unit

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Rescue 19 has literally left the building.

No later than an hour after the Clay County Board of Commissioners voted unanimously to remove Orange Park's only ambulance, county officials removed its rescue unit from Station 19 leaving six paramedic firefighters without a rescue vehicle. The measure was passed with little discussion from the county commissioners

This vote comes just weeks after the Orange Park Town Council voted 5-0 to authorize its staff to notify the BCC of the town's intent to seek its own Certificate of Need which would pave the way for the town to operate its own rescue unit. Because this is a first for the

Bryan Jennings Bridge caused county's first traffic jam

on June 16, 1917, Middleburg was covered up with local, state, and national movers and shakers. They were there to celebrate the dedication of the S. Bryan Jennings Bridge across the north prong of Black Creek.

Local farmers, loggers and moonshiners trying to make a living in the areas east and west of Middleburg were more than ready to celebrate. This bridge would change lives and vastly improve their ability to get their products north to lucrative markets. It was a game changer.

But needed as it was, the bridge would never have been built were it not for S. Bryan Jennings. He was the son of former Florida Governor William Sherman Jennings and grew up immersed in the kind of clout and connections at all levels of government and business to make things happen. Jennings was an attorney with an influential law firm in Jacksonville, a principal in the family's Artesian Farm Land Sales Company and a successful Clay County farmer, rancher and timber man.



On June 16, 1917, local movers and shakers gathered with national and state power brokers to celebrate the completion of The S. Bryan Jennings Bridge over the north prong of Black Creek. A good time was had by all.

His first hurtle was a hard one. Before the project could even begin he had to convince the county commission to petition the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for permission to construct a structure over a navigable waterway. Knowing they would remember the commissioners voted out of office for building a road from Governors Creek to the Duval County line in the 1890s, he presented a deal they couldn't refuse.

He committed to do all the legal work, oversee design and construction, solicit donations of money, labor and materials and requested only \$2,000 from the road budget. Other offers were hovering in the \$10,000 area for construction alone. They took the deal and volunteered offers to help. Locals donated and delivered materials to the site – heart cypress pilings, nails and tons of fill. They showed up to sink pilings and manipulate hoists to install the steel draw system. But before it was all over, some admitted that they jokingly talked about tying a bell on young Jennings so they could run and hide before he talked them out of or into something else.

When the big day arrived, cars lined up from the north as far as the eye could see for a grand parade into Middleburg. The traffic jam became a party of its own with back slapping, spirits sipping, glad handing and politicking.

Sadly, the traffic jams in Clay County are not nearly so much fun today.

Medical marijuana Planning board gives the 'green' a greenlight

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The Green Cove Springs Planning and Zoning Board unanimously approved new language to the city's zoning code that will allow Medical Marijuana Treatment Center Dispensing Facilities within city limits.

The topic came back up after the city's second consecutive moratorium on the issue was scheduled to come to a close on May 15. The current moratorium was issued as a six-month extension to the original one-year moratorium issued by the city after a 2016 statewide ballot measure passed with more than 70 percent in favor of state-regulated treatment centers in

At the Feb. 20 City Council meeting,



council members asked staff to draft language to allow dispensing facilities in the city, regulated the same way as pharmacies as required by the state. The facilities are tightly regulated by the state, and as explained by City Attorney Jim Arnold, regulations will continue to be added as the system works itself out.

"We hope the state does their job, obviously, if you're gonna have them in your

community," Arnold said. "There's gonna be a lot more regulations, I'm sure, as time goes by."

Arnold did note, though, that any sort of changes that regulations might see wouldn't really affect the item up for discussion at the meeting. He is always quick to point out that the city really only has two choices in the matter, either vote in language to allow treatment centers, or ban them outright. He also noted that even if the city didn't adopt the code proposed to the board, patients living within the city limits could still receive deliveries from facilities in Orange Park where their town council has already voted to allow them.

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Student volunteers hours of online homework help

ORANGE PARK – Ridgeview High School might have the most helpful Algebra I student in the state and he won a prize because of it.

By racking up the most karma points on Algebra Nation, a math website where students can complete homework and tutor others, freshman Matthew Rodriquez earned himself a free iPad. Each month, Algebra Nation tracks its users' karma points and whoever has the most at the end of the month wins an iPad. Karma points are earned by helping other users, which are also Florida students, with algebra problems.

"Algebra Nation doesn't just let students say, 'here's the answer,'" Rodriquez's Algebra I Honors teacher Amber Amato said. "If they do that, the post will get removed and the student will be told not to just give out answers but instead, help them work through the problem to get the answer."

According to Amato, Rodriquez helped other students in Florida on Algebra Nation 70 times, which earned him 8,900 karma points.

"It helps me prepare for class more and I'm helping other kids prepare as well," said Rodriquez, explaining why he strives to help so many. "It was never really about

the iPad for me."

The 2017-18 school year marks Amato's fifth year teaching Algebra I and no tool has been more helpful for teaching the subject than Algebra Nation.

"It's a really great thing for these kids to have and use," Amato said. "They are working on their math skills while helping others, all while being incentivized by a prize to do more and logging volunteer hours. It's so helpful."

The EOC, or End of Course, exams of Amato's students have been the highest they've ever been in the past five years and she gives a lot of the credit to Algebra Nation. Developed by the University of Florida and launched in 2013, Algebra Nation sought to help kids pass Algebra I, which

according to the Algebra Nation website, is a key gateway to higher-level math courses and high-growth careers.

Since its launch, the Florida passing rate of Algebra I has increased by 7 percent. Even if the use of the program wasn't recommended by the school, Amato believes that she would still be using it in her classroom, citing how resourceful and helpful it's been in filling in the gaps in between lessons. She said it's both for those students who are struggling and those who might not be.

"If you're struggling, there's expert professionals on the boards to help as well as the students like Matthew," Amato said. "If you're not struggling, there's still incentive to go help which, in turn, helps you."

Having won an iPad, Rodriquez no longer qualifies to win the prize again but that hasn't stopped him from finding a place back on the boards helping students. If he finishes his homework early, he'll hop on the Algebra Nation boards for a bit and do what he can to help those in need.

"It feels really good knowing that I was able to get the iPad just for helping kids out," Rodriquez said, smiling at the brandnew Apple device in his hands. "It really isn't about the iPad though. It's about just helping people out and knowing that maybe they passed a test or got a 100 on an assignment because I helped them."





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Do we really need amendment about teaching civics?

When someone complains the government did something they don't like, I sometimes engage in a fun little exercise known as "name your lawmaker."

Sure, everyone knows Donald Trump, and Stormy Daniels is on the way to becoming a household name.

However, the laws that most directly affect our lives are made closer to home. So, I'll ask someone to name the state representative or senator from their district. Or the county commissioner that represents

them. Or who is running for those offices in November from both major parties. Most of the time they can't.

I've had people look at me blankly when I mention outgoing House Speaker Richard Corcoran in a conversation. It's clear they don't know who he is, or that arguably he has been the most powerful person in the state for the last couple of years.

Usually, the conversation ends with "well, I don't really care about politics" and that's the problem.

In about seven months, these same folks are going to be asked to help choose Florida's next governor, a U.S. senator, and a whole bunch of other important positions that will determine the state's course for the next several years.

That's why it's interesting that the Constitutional Revision Commission is considering a proposal to place an amendment on the ballot in November to ensure public schools continue teaching how the government works. A final decision on that will be made in April.

Yes, sponsor Don Gaetz – a former senate president – noted, there already is a civics requirement in public schools. And his proposal admittedly is short on specifics, and schools already grapple with enough mandates from Tallahassee.

It's also true that adding another amendment for voters to consider shouldn't be taken lightly.

But as we have seen, the Legislature (I'm looking at you, Mr. Corcoran) can't resist messing with public education.

"The Legislature changes its mind," Gaetz told the Tampa Bay Times. "Especially education issues go in and out of fashion. ... The constitution enshrines what we don't change our minds about."

That's a strong point.

How much longer until someone in Tallahassee gets the bright idea that it's a lot

Tariffs on paper will hurt us and our readers

You have read about the new tariffs on imported aluminum and steel, and on products from China. Now it seems our own business — newspaper printing and publishing — will take

some casualties in a trade war over paper.

This month, the U.S. government piled huge tariffs onto the imports of newsprint from Canada, including those from our biggest supplier. As a

result, the price will jump from \$600 to \$800 for every ton, and we use about 17,000 tons every year.

That increase is more than 30 percent, and would add more than \$3 million to the Tampa Bay Times' annual newsprint bill.

You can multiply our example across the American newspaper industry, which is already facing strong headwinds. Historically, advertising provided the lion's share of newspaper revenue, but in just 10 years, the recession and other market forces have cut those ad revenues by more than half

Newspapers remain vital civic assets – nobody else will report on your community with the depth and breadth of a newspaper – but publishing them is not an easy business, and these tariffs will make it even harder. This is a kick in the teeth.

These tariffs will hurt our readers, because they create pressure to raise

our prices, and they will force publishers to re-examine every other expense. Maybe we will drop some puzzles and comics – no big deal, unless we cut one that is your favorite.

These tariffs will also hurt our employees, because payroll is the only expense that is bigger than newsprint. To help offset the extra expense of paper, publishers will eliminate jobs. Make no mistake: These tariffs will cause layoffs across American newspapers, including this one.

These tariffs started with a single American newsprint manufacturer who complained that Canadian companies were "dumping" their product in the U.S. at below-market prices. In the current political climate, that complaint found a friendly ear in Washington.

Other American manufacturers opposed these tariffs because they know they will damage newspapers and reduce the demand for newsprint. But now that the tariffs are taking effect, the American companies are hiking their own prices, so we have little room to shop around.

Just about every American newspaper and all our trade associations are joining the fight to challenge these tariffs, but even if we succeed, it will take months to reverse this terrible decision. Meanwhile, prices will go up. Jobs will be lost. Important stories will go uncovered.

If you believe that newspapers do essential work, we would be grateful for your support. Please let your members of Congress and senators know that these reckless tariffs must be repealed – not just because they hurt newspapers, but because they will damage the customers and

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20 years ago, 1998

Embattled Clerk of Court John Keene wrote an official letter to Gov. Lawton Chiles announcing his resignation effective 5 p.m. on March 14, 1998. Days later, Chiles appointed Talmadge Bennett to serve as interim clerk until the November election.

Clay County Commissioners George Bush, Charles "Buddy" Griffin, Larry Lancaster, Pat McGovern and Dale Wilson were subpoenaed to testify before a Grand Jury in the ongoing investigation of alleged financial impropriety in the office of Clerk of Court John Keene.

Sheriff Scott Lancaster said Jimmie Ray Beagle, 40, of Jacksonville, verbally confessed to killing Don Hill, 63, and Gregory Wood, 37, both of Orange Park, days apart and at different deer hunting sites in November 1993. Beagle killed himself after a nine-hour standoff with officers while locked in a bathroom in the Middleburg CCSO substation.

30 years ago, 1988

Clay County Clerk of Court and Comptroller George Carlisle criticized Clay County management for overdrawn accounts and extra expenses and stopped the processing of county fair purchase orders a week before the start of the Second Annual Clay County Agricultural Fair.

St. Johns and Clay County commissioners vowed to work together to select a new route for the planned Outer Beltway that would connect I-95 in St. Johns to I-10 in Duval while passing through Clay.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested 31 men in a sting operation at the men's restroom in the Orange Park Mall. Men were charged with lewd and lascivious acts.


tedious and can go deep into the weeds. As the high school students learned on their trip to Tallahassee, not every lawmaker is willing to listen.

Silent no more: victim speaks to raise awareness

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - In 2006, a University of North Florida student held a young woman at gunpoint and raped her for hours, brutally violating both her body and her mind.

Following the traumatic event. the woman suffered immensely. Once an honors student, studying to become an orthopedic surgeon, she began to fail her classes. She went into a spiral and eventually refused to even return to campus.

She began to partake in high risk behaviors, isolating herself from those who loved her. It would be 8 years before the woman told a single soul, and even longer before she truly began to recover.

These days, Middleburg resident Patricia Koons is more outspoken about the trauma of the rape, and the problems it caused in her life. On March 26. Koons presented her story as part of a press conference at the Clay County Sheriff's Office, thanked those who helped herself and others in her time of need.

'Today, I want to personally thank the Clay County Sheriff's Office, the State Attorney and Quigley House for their efforts in bringing awareness to sexual assault,"

said Koons.

The press conference served as the CC-SO's observance of April as Sexual Assault Awareness month. Representatives from various organizations attended the event, including a large contingent of representatives from Quigley House, Clay County's sexual assault and domestic abuse center. As part of the conference, Sheriff Darryl Daniels presented a \$5,000 check to Ellen Siler, interim chief executive officer of Quigley House.

'[I want to thank] the Quigley House and all the folks on the protective custody teams, who do what they do to ensure that the victims of these heinous crimes are provided the services they need," said Daniels. State Attorney Melissa Nelson, who also attended, pointed out the importance of survivors telling their stories at events such as the press conference.

"A survivor actually gives voice to the issue." said Nelson.

Siler agreed, explaining that testimony from survivors, as well as coverage of the topic, could help a number of others who have yet to come forward and face the pain of abuse or reach out for help.

"The reality is, every time there is any kind of press on sexual assault, someone is going to call the hotline. For someone, this is going to help them trust going forward, especially when they hear from another survivor who's been through it," Siler said.

Koons concluded her story with a hopeful note, explaining how her life has turned around after assistance from Quigley

"I am a mere 6 months away from graduating with my associates in nursing. I'm also now engaged to my beautiful fiancé, we have our own home and we'll be getting married the week after I finish nursing school," said Koons. "We plan to start a family within a few years."

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School uses grant, other funds to beautify campus

MIDDLEBURG – After lots of saving and waiting, Wilkinson Junior High Principal Christina Cornwell has healthy plants outside her school.

For years, the garden beds that border the school's exterior walls ran into the sidewalks, causing massive erosion during heavy rain that would wash dirt across the sidewalks where students frequently walk between classes.

"When I first came here, the campus was already pretty old," Cornwell said. "A parent's first impression of our school is based on what they see the first time they come here."

Cornwell said she brought the problem up with district officials and saw immediate action in the form of concrete curbs bordering every planting area as well as adequate drainage to ensure the beds wouldn't overflow. Once that was done, her focus moved onto filling the beds now that they don't need to worry about washout.

"All of the plants and shrubbery had died," she said. "It's such a big campus that we can't spend time going around watering everything by hand."

As she continued planning for future foliage with school staff, the problem of watering kept coming up. She knew she would need some kind of irrigation, but the cost for a full irrigation system would eat up a large portion of the funds they had raised for the project.

"I've been working with the school for a while and we offer a giveback program with the school," said Rick Dendler, owner of the St. Augustine-based KONA Ice truck that serves southern Clay County and parts of Putnam County.

Dendler went to Cornwell and asked how they could help. Once the two began talking, Cornwell found out Dendler had previously worked in irrigation and the two struck up a deal. Dendler, through KONA Ice, would lay about 400 feet of irrigation supplies purchased by the school to service the new planting beds.

In addition to help from Dendler, the Wilkinson Science Club wrote a grant proposal to the St. Johns River Water Management District and were awarded \$2,000 through the SJRWMD Blue School Grant Type 2: Water-Conserving Garden Project. The grant will help pay for plants the

school has picked out to control erosion and offer drought resistance to the new beds, in addition to covering cost for the irrigation supplies. The school did fundraisers to make up any additional costs, but

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Easter's origin: Look to the heavens

Easter falls on April 1, and – hippity-hoppity – the Easter Bunny is working extra hard to get everything done on time. Word on the Bunny Trail is that he had to hire some seasonal help from the North Pole.

Indeed, Easter does seem to be sneaking up on us early this year. Yet, there have been times when we had to wait until almost the end of April to celebrate Easter. Overall, it does seem a little "lop"-sided (get it?).

Some holidays, like Christmas, always fall on a certain calendar date. Others are mandated to occur on a certain day, such as Thanksgiving falling on the fourth Thursday in November, although the actual calendar date changes from year to year.

And I think we all know the date of the Fourth of July!

But Easter is a little different. It always falls on a Sunday, yes, but on which Sunday depends on some celestial mechanics and astronomy. Let's take a look.

In 325 CE, the Council of Nicaea established that Easter would fall on the first Sunday following the first Full Moon that occurs on or after the Vernal Equinox.

Sounds hare-raising (har!), doesn't it? Let's see if we can work through this formula to figure out why Easter falls when it does this year.

Earth's rotation axis is tilted about 23.5 degrees off the plane of its orbit. It is this tilt that causes the seasons, as the hemispheres alternately tilt toward

or away from the Sun throughout the course of a year. This affects not only the length of our days but also the intensity of sunlight that strikes the surface.

The Vernal Equinox marks the beginning of Spring in

the Northern Hemisphere. On this day, the Sun is directly over the equator, there are equal hours of day and night, and our hemisphere begins to tilt more and more toward the Sun in the three months that follow.

This year, the Vernal Equinox occurred on March 20. This is the first piece in our Easter-day puzzle.

The second piece: According to the 2018 Lunar Calendar, there will be a Full Moon on Saturday, March 31.

Putting these pieces together for 2018,

April 1 is the first Sunday after a Full Moon (March 31) that occurred after the Vernal Equinox (March 20).

The earliest Easter can occur is March 22, while the latest is April 25. The date of other holidays, most notably Palm Sunday and Good Friday, are dependent on which Sunday within this time frame that Easter falls.

Since Easter was on April 16 in 2017, the Easter Bunny lost two weeks to get ready for his rounds during the past year.

Me: People today still look for lucky Easter eggs. And the name "Ostara," that sounds familiar


E.B.: Eggsactly. It is the basis for the word "Easter."


Me: Fascinating. Mr. Bunny, I am going to type these notes up on my computer and secure them in a special document file.

county, the BCC also voted 5-0 to direct staff to create an application process for the town of Orange Park to go move ahead with plans to establish its own independent

"As of 8:15 last night, Orange Park did not have an ambulance at its disposal and already we've seen a drop in service," said Sarah Campbell, Orange Park town man-

Not long after the county had removed Rescue 19 from Orange Park did a car crash take place in town. The Orange Park crew, which now consists of two fire trucks, arrived at the scene in just four minutes. A Clay County ambulance did not arrive for 13 minutes. Campbell said if the ambulance the county removed from Station 19 had not been removed, an ambulance would have been at the scene of the crash in four minutes.

While both the county and the town of Orange Park are treading into new territory, the discussion surrounding this expedition has been going on for over a year. As part of a countywide agreement, the Town of Orange Park will provide its EMS services to other areas in the county if they are the first and closest unit available.

When this agreement was made over a decade ago, the county agreed to cut the town an annual check of \$1.2 million in tax reimbursements. The county disbanded the agreement after changing the county's tax

structure from a blanket, countywide fee to a tailored tax based on the actual cost of county services provided to each municipality, Clay Today reported last year.

From there, the county cut the town's millage rate in half in the 2008 fiscal year. At the time, county auditor Mike Price said the \$1.2 million tax reimbursements were no longer necessary and that there was no such inequity. "Since we [cut the millage rate and changed the tax structure], there's no need for us to kick you back \$1.2 million of ad valorem taxes anymore because we're actually providing you the services you're paying for," Price said.

The town of Orange Park disagrees with Price and believes there is an inequity, one of the main reasons for Orange Park applying for its own Certificate of Need to operate its own rescue services.

"So, while it is in our budget, it's unfair and there's an inequity because there are people who live outside the town who pay fewer taxes and they are getting the benefit of better service, whereas the town residents are paying more in taxes and ves, personnel that they are paying for are being called out more and more outside the town limits," Orange Park Town Manager Sarah Campbell said.

At a Feb. 20 Orange Park Town Council meeting, Mayor Scott Land said this move in service is not about revenue, a sentiment Campbell reflects today.

Meanwhile, Orange Park Town Council has called a special meeting for March 29 to address the BCC's Tuesday vote.

"The argument that this somehow saves us money doesn't add up because we are fully funded for the entire fiscal year," Campbell said. "The taxpayers have already paid their service. We can't give taxpavers a refund because this service isn't being offered and we aren't going to terminate six [Orange Park Fire Department] employees because they no longer have an ambulance."

The motion to remove Rescue 19 was temporary until Orange Park obtains a Certificate of Need from the county. According to Campbell, though, because this process has never been done, it could take a few months or it could take a few years. It's still up in the air, she said.

Clay County Fire Chief Lorin Mock was unhappy that despite years of maintaining what he believes to be the best possible service for the county as a whole, Orange Park is asking to operate their own rescue

"I have to say leading into this, this is not a very happy moment for me because I have really depended on the partnership and collaboration with both the town of Orange Park and its members," Mock said. "The only thing I can consider with this is that as the demand for services increase,

[Orange Park] town leadership feels the strain and feels like they must dedicate service to the town and not the county and that's disappointing to me."

Rollins joined in the discussion and asked Price is the current agreement is the most cost-effective solution for the county and town's EMS services to which Price said without question it is. Rollins also expressed his disappointment in the decision of Orange Park to remove its services from the county as he sees everyone fighting the same fight.

"I hate to see it because I know commissioner Hendry, you were marine, I'm army and we have navy and lots of different branches and it's always one team, one fight," Rollins said. "I hate to see this the way it has played out but let's take it one step at a time I suppose."

In a press release sent out the morning following the meeting, Campbell said the Orange Park Fire Department is in good spirits and intends on carrying out their mission of providing the best fire rescue response possible to town citizens given the circumstances. The town council will be discussing this issue further at a special meeting to be held Thursday, March 29 at

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



questions for Arnold regarding the regulations, which he was quick to answer with language from the state resolution which is basically a mirror image of the language proposed for city code.

There was not much discussion among the board on the topic, with member Marilyn Haddock speaking at the top of the agenda item on her support for the language on the grounds that a vast majority of voters wanted it and that it is identified as a medicine and, when used as a medicine, has helped people.

Speaking to the same sentiment, but with a more personal connection was board member Bob Lewis – no relation to city council member Pam Lewis – who also spoke at the Feb. 20 council meeting.

"Opiates, at least so far, are classified as being more dangerous than [medical marijuana]," Lewis said. "If it works for me, I can switch to this."

Lewis, who has been prescribed opiates for decades, explained that the state had just passed a bill that would only give patients a three-day supply of opiate prescriptions before having to go back to their doctor. For him, that won't work, and he wants to try medical marijuana as an alternative, something he thinks should be as accessible to him as his current prescriptions that can be had at Walgreens or CVS along Orange Avenue in Green Cove.

He also talked about the differences between the two prescription pain drugs, including the long-term effects of opiate use.

"[On opiates] you're taking more pills to counteract the effects of oxycodone, instead of taking two pills you're taking eight," Lewis said. "Medical marijuana seems to be an unobtrusive treatment."

Before a vote was taken, Lewis made one last comment on the issue. He said approval would allow local medical marijuana patients to shop in their city instead of spending their money at Orange Park dispensing facilities.

Following a motion from Haddock and a 5-0 vote, the code change will undergo its first public hearing at the April 17 meeting of the Green Cove Springs City Council, with the second reading on May 1, which, should it pass the first reading, would be the date of adoption for the new code.

The next regular City Council meeting is Tuesday, April 3.

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

"I'm back and forth on my feelings," said Crystal Wadley, a mother of a freshman at Fleming Island High. "I can see that the budget to do everything just isn't there but our kids still deserve safety."

Davis began the community meeting with an anecdote that left many shaken in the school cafeteria which had about 50 attendees. He explained that about a week and a half ago, he sat on a panel with other Northeast Florida superintendents, officers from multiple sheriff's departments, mental health agencies and students and their parents to discuss school safety. The 20 students in attendance were asked to raise their hands if they felt safe in school. According to Davis, not a single student raised their hand.

"As a superintendent, sitting in that seat in front of those at that forum, I was disheartened," Davis said. "I began to immediately reflect, and even though those students weren't from Clay County, it was still an indication that if they felt unsafe, then I know our students in Clay County feel the same way.

"As superintendent, I own that," Davis

Davis said student safety is priority No. 1 with the Clay County School District. According to Davis, safety occurs not only by installing security features such as fences around portables, single points of entry, around-the-clock surveillance and more, but also by taking an inclusive approach to ensure every school is a psychologically-safe place every day. He also urged parents to be more active in monitoring their children's behavior and actions.

"As parents, we own this and we should

be actively engaged every step of the way with our kids," Davis said. "I don't need you to be your kid's best friend. I need you to be the best parent."

Davis announced that Gov. Rick Scott approved \$400 million for safety and security although Clay County will only receive \$2.5 million of this, which according to Davis, simply isn't enough.

"While I appreciate this as a superintendent, this is underfunded," Davis said. "We do not have the funding to [do what we want to do]."

After Davis' 30-minute presentation, he fielded questions, which ranged from portable classroom safety to arming teachers to resource officers and more. Davis sees arming teachers as a last resort option, citing that he'd rather have men and women in green – a reference to the color of the Clay County Sheriff's Office uniforms – than teachers who already do so much.

"Our teachers and educators should be armed with additional money, armed with inspiration and they should be armed with the resources they need to educate every one of our children," a Davis comment that was met with resounding applause from the audience. "They should not be armed with a weapon."

In regards to supplying additional resource officers to schools, it's not something in the budget for the sheriff's office. Budget aside, Davis assured the audience the school district is working to install

fences around all 900 Clay County portables and work on ensuring school visitors have only one point of entry.

Some parents left that night feeling optimistic about what's to come while others felt that still, nothing had been done.

"That was crap," Leigh Ann Lunsford, a parent of a junior at Fleming Island High, said following Davis' presentation. "I heard a lot of 'we are going to do' but not a lot of 'we have done."

"How much longer until some real action takes place?" Lunsford asked.

Lunsford's son, Evan said this is his first year in a public high school after having been in virtual school for ninth and tenth grade. He said he feels extremely unsafe.

"My first year in a public high school and Parkland happens, and then Maryland, and it makes me wonder if I made the right choice," Evan Lunsford said.

Others left feeling more hopeful about Davis' plans.

"I don't think they have a choice this time," Crystal Wadley said, in reference to something being done about student safety. "It seems like they are trying to make work what they can but it's tough to tell. There's a lot of vague answers."

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Hospital gets to keep Level II Trauma Center

ORANGE PARK – New legislation passed in the 2018 Florida Legislature will allow Orange Park Medical Center to keep its trauma center.

Orange Park Medical Center began treating trauma patients in May of 2016 under a temporary permit as Level II trau-

House Bill 1165 amended sections of existing state law that relates to how the state approves trauma centers and trauma data. Under the previous law, the state capped the number of trauma centers in Florida at 44. That meant that, under the old rules, there was "a need for only one trauma center" in Trauma Service Area 5, Baker, Clay, Duval, Nassau and St. Johns counties, which was UF Health hospital on Eighth Street in Jacksonville.

The new bill changes the number of trauma service areas from 19 to 18 and allowing up to five centers, including Level I, Level II, Level II/pediatric and stand-alone pediatric trauma center in each area.

Since May 2016, Orange Park Medical Center has treated nearly 3,000 patients, most of which previously had to travel to downtown Jacksonville for trauma-related injuries.

"Time is life," said Miren Schinco, trauma medical director at OPMC. "Having a trauma center close to you at all times is critical to survival when you're experiencing a severe injury."

The Bryan family experienced this first-hand when their daughter Caleigh's

arm was saved by the Orange Park Medical Center trauma team after an auto ac-

"When the phone rang at 12:30 in the morning and it was a police officer our worst nightmare came true," said Elaine Bryan, 17-year-old Caleigh's mother.

The Bryans, having recently moved to Florida, were unfamiliar with area hospitals. When asked by EMS which hospital to take their daughter to, they were unsure. "We told them, the closest, the best, what do you suggest, and they said Orange Park.'

Shinco said that having the proximity of this trauma center to the accident was vital to Caleigh's success. Having access to an operating room 24-hours a day, Caleigh was able to get into surgery quickly with the hand surgeon she needed.

A Level II trauma center provides 24hour immediate access to a dedicated operating room for trauma patients and specially-trained surgeons, specialists and staff to treat critically-injured patients like Caleigh.

"We're grateful that our elected officials recognize how critical trauma care is to our community," said Jeffrey Levine, trauma surgeon and former trauma medical director at OPMC. "Their support, in addition to that of the local fire and rescue teams, has helped make this a reality for our community."

The news comes just one week before the hospital launches a Stop the Bleed Program to educate residents how they can



help stop uncontrolled bleeding until emergency responders arrive. The program will be kick off March 30 at an event where

community leaders will receive training and will be followed by free monthly classes open to the community.



Orange Park High grad serves aboard 'floating airport'

NORFOLK, Va. – A Jacksonville native and 2012 Orange Park High graduate is serving in the U.S. Navy aboard the aircraft carrier USS George H.W. Bush.

Petty Officer 3rd Class Kiahna Young is an interior communications electrician aboard the carrier operating out of the Navy's largest base.

As an interior communications electrician, Young is responsible for the operation and organizational and intermediate maintenance on alarm, warning and indicator

"My favorite part of this command is the morale, welfare and recreation department," said Young.

Named in honor of former President George H.W. Bush, the carrier is longer than three football fields, measuring nearly 1.100 feet. The ship, a true floating city. weighs more than 100,000 tons and has a flight deck that is 252 feet wide. Two nuclear reactors can push the ship through the water at more than 35 mph.

Powerful catapults slingshot the aircraft off the bow of the ship. The planes land aboard the carrier by snagging a steel cable with an arresting hook that protrudes from the rear of the aircraft.

As a sailor with numerous responsibilities, Young learns about life at sea serving in the Navy and the importance of taking personal responsibility while leading others. She said she still uses lessons learned

in her hometown.

"I've learned to keep a positive attitude; it goes a long way while serving in the Navy," said Young.

Sailors' jobs are highly varied aboard the carrier. Approximately 3,200 men and women make up the ship's crew, which keeps all parts of the aircraft carrier running smoothly – this includes everything from washing dishes and preparing meals to handling weaponry and maintaining the nuclear reactors. Another 2,500 men and women form the air wing responsible for flying and maintaining more than 70 aircraft aboard the ship.

George H.W. Bush, like each of the Navy's aircraft carriers, is designed for a 50-year service life. When the air wing is embarked, the ship carries more than 70 attack jets, helicopters and other aircraft, all of which take off from and land aboard the carrier at sea.

All of this makes the George H.W. Bush a self-contained mobile airport and strike platform, and often the first response to a global crisis because of a carrier's ability to operate freely in international waters anywhere on the world's oceans.

"I am most proud of going to college and studying liberal arts," said Young.

As a member of one of the U.S. Navv's most relied upon assets, Young and other George H.W. Bush sailors know they are part of a legacy that will last beyond their lifetimes providing the Navy the nation's

"The Navy makes me more organized and I have a better work ethic," Young said.

walks. Known for his gentle caring ways and has, Danielson also provides transportation to medical appointments, and a listening ear for anyone with a need and a caring presence for those at end of





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

and Clemie Lee Roberson, 31, both of Jacksonville and charged them both with trafficking cocaine. Roberson faces additional charges of possession of not more than 20 g. cannabis, cocaine distribution and sale and delivery of marijuana.

The drug sting began when officers met with the confidential informant and

searched the informant's car and body to

make sure they had

no additional cash or drugs other than what police were going to supply in order to make the staged transaction.

The drug buy was set up after the informant told officers he had assurances from Roberson that Roberson could sell him \$2,500 worth of cocaine and, together, they made arrangements to meet in the parking lot, which was under surveillance.

According to the police report, Roberson pulled up in a 2009 Mercedes and Green was a passenger in the front. The informant got out of his vehicle and got into the Mercedes where he stayed approximately one minute, police stated in the report.

The informant went on to tell the narcotics officer he was working with that he

"saw cocaine in the mercedes[sic]," states the report. Officers who were nearby pulled up to the Roberson vehicle to ensure he did not flee the area. Minutes later, they brought in drug-sniffing dogs that alerted officers to the presence of narcotics in the vehicle, verifying what the informant saw.

Both Green and Roberson were booked into the Clay County Jail, where Green has since posted bond and been released. However, Roberson remained in jail at press time with bond set at \$480,013.

in with law enforcement, Jacquilla Bullard remained in a relationship with Jerry Bullard. However, court records show his life of crime continued to escalate with him in and out of courtrooms — in March 2002, throwing or shooting a deadly missile, possession of marijuana with intent to sell in May 2003, domestic battery in October 2003 for going to Jacquilla's job and physically attacking her in front of her co-workers. In September 2008, he was arrested for felony fleeing and child neglect.

And despite Jerry Bullard's extensive public record of crime and violence, not every act of violence ended up in an arrest.

For example, in August 2010, the couple got into a verbal argument over social media messages. According to court documents, Jerry Bullard "threw her off the bed and punched her in the stomach." Two of Jacquilla's children heard the disturbance and told court officials they remember her yelling, "That hurts!" to which Jerry replied, "It's supposed to hurt!"

Fast forward to August 4, 2012, when the couple was living in a modest neighborhood in the Oakleaf community. This is where their relationship took a dark turn.

Jacquilla Bullard got into an argument with Jerry — who was 35 at the time — after she told him she did not want to have sex with him because he had previously given her a sexually transmitted disease. The argument turned into physical violence.

Court records show Jerry Bullard grabbed Jacquilla by the arm and neck, pulled her hair, pushed her down and began verbally abusing her — a fight that continued into the bedroom. Jacquilla was able to break away and go into the garage where she retrieved a gun and returned to the bedroom. Both testimony and court records show she crouched down across the bed from Jerry and shot him once.

Police reports said, he got up from the bed and asked, "What have you done to me, girl?" She fired a second shot, left the bedroom and went into a bathroom until "she did not hear any movement from the bedroom." according to court documents.

A day later, she was arrested and booked into the Clay County Jail where she has been held going on six years. However, Jacquilla Bullard's case is just weeks away from an April 12 hearing after she entered a new plea agreement.

Now, instead of facing a possible death sentence based on her original August 22, 2012 indictment for first-degree murder, and the state's notice of intent to seek the death penalty it filed on September 28, 2012, her case has changed course.

A six-page report documenting a review of the case by Assistant State Attorney Jonathan Sacks that also contains information from Jacquilla Bullard's defense attorney was released Monday by State Attorney Melissa Nelson. The report states that Bullard "seeks to plead guilty to manslaughter with a firearm, a first-degree felony, to be sentenced to 15 years in Florida

State Prison."

In reducing the charge and the penalty, court officials considered the years of abuse Jacquilla Bullard faced along with other factors.

"Together, all of these specific acts of violence contributed to an ongoing pattern of physical, psychological, and [redacted text] and would directly support a Battered Wife's Syndrome defense at trial," states Sacks' report. "Based on these aggravating factors, combined with Defendant's mitigation and potential affirmative defense, it is unlikely that the State of Florida would receive a unanimous, 12-0 jury recommendation for death.

"Accordingly, based on the mitigation and the totality of circumstances regarding the relationship between the Defendant and the Victim, a waiver of death penalty is warranted, regardless of whether this case proceeds to trial as currently charged."

According to Sacks' memo, Jerry Bullard's family originally supported use of the death penalty, however, the family is now agreeable to waiving the death penalty after numerous discussions about the case.

Spring means alligators are out & about

TALLAHASSEE – The American alligator is a conservation success story. Florida has a healthy and stable alligator population, which is estimated at 1.3 million alligators of every size.


They are an important part of Florida's wetlands, but should be regarded with caution and respect.

Alligators become more active and visible during spring when temperatures rise and their metabolism increases. Although serious injuries caused by alligators are rare in Florida, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission recommends taking precautions when having fun in and around the water. Alligators inhabit all 67 counties in Florida and can be found anywhere there is standing water. Reduce the chances of conflicts with alligators by swimming only in designated swimming areas during daylight hours. Also keep pets on a leash and away from the water.

Because alligators control their body temperature by basking in the sun, they may be easily observed. However, the FWC urges people to keep their distance if they see one. And never feed alligators because it is dangerous and illegal.

The FWC places the highest priority on public safety and administers a Statewide Nuisance Alligator Program to address complaints concerning specific alligators. People concerned about an alligator should call the FWC's toll-free Nuisance Alligator Hotline at 866-FWC-GATOR (392-4286). SNAP uses contracted nuisance alligator trappers throughout the state to remove alligators 4 feet in length or greater that are believed to pose a threat to people, pets or property. The FWC also works diligently to keep Floridians and visitors informed, including providing advice about Living with Alligators.

Is it really soil?

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - Is your lawn lazy in spots? Are your flowers floundering?

Oftentimes if the answer is yes, you may think some disease or pest is killing it but the fact is that most plant issues come back to

the ground they are planted in. With poor soil, roots do not grow, nutrients are not present or are unavailable, and water is held too long or runs out before plants can use it. These soil issues can even lead to pests and diseases attacking the weakened plants.

So, the question is, what is wrong with your soil?

Comes Back to Construction

Depending on where you live in the county, there are some natural differences in soil, but many soil issues around homes come from the standard construction

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practices used by your builder. When a subdivision is created, often the grade of the soil is changed with our limited topsoil being moved, buried or even sold at times. This is all done to get the slab foundations of the homes above the 100-year flood plain and poorly developed soils from the digging of retention ponds or from other areas are used.

This means the soil is changed forever, with a set of new characteristics that often lead to issues for the landscape.

Along with the changing of the soil, concrete is mixed on surfaces which can change the pH and leave debris and equipment traffic often compacts the soil, making it very difficult for plants to set their roots and thrive. Heavy equipment also can bring in weeds and invasive plants from other sites. Overall, the more disturbance there is to a site, the more problems will show up in the future.

Adapting Your Landscape

So, your soil is damaged. What do you do now?

The first step is to understand the way your landscape behaves and choose plants that could likely survive in harsher environments. Check for the way the sun moves through the day, where plants are doing poorly, dry and wet spots that are prone to flooding, and anything that may work for or against your landscape. This may take quite a while to determine since the site characteristics will change throughout the year but this step is well

You should also get a soil test performed based upon areas of differing characteristics in the landscape. The UF/ IFAS Clay County Extension Office offers free soil pH testing to citizens and the University of Florida offers affordable nutrient testing as well. Contact the extension office at (904)284-6355 for more

Once you know your site, begin to choose your plants that will work best. A great resource can be found at https:// fyn.ifas.ufl.edu/pdf/FYN_Plant_Selection_ Guide_2015.pdf, which is a guide of great Florida-Friendly plants for the landscape with information about their characteristics. A couple of items to remember is that Clay County is Zone 9a, so avoid any plants that do not survive in our zone.

After developing your plan, the job begins to determine your management strategies for your site, which we will cover in the next few weeks based upon landscape beds, turf and vegetable gardens.

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

Dressel ends Gator career with three American records

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. - The Florida men's swimming & diving team closed out the 2017-18 season with a fifth place finish at NCAAs, garnering a total of 347 points over the four day meet.

Over the course of the week, Florida racked up five national titles (four individual, one relay) and 31 All-America honors. Caeleb Dressel, a Clay High graduate, earned his third CSCAA Swimmer of the Year award for his outstanding performance over the course the meet. This was the first time Dressel has not shared the honor with another swimmer.

"It's been a long journey since freshman year," said Dressel in a post meet interview on Swimswam.com. "At Florida, they have a Wall of Champions. I could probably cry about it, but me and my friends will be on it forever."

Dressel once again became the fastest man in history, this time in the 100 free. He is now the first human to ever break 40 seconds, posting a time of 39.90 in the championship final to earn his third individual title of the meet and the ninth individual title of his career.

"It felt really good to break it. I thought I was going to be a little bit more under the mark, but it hurt - it hurt so bad," said Dressel, who set the record in his 13th swim of the meet on


Indians get three region champs


For Fleming Island, the smooth shooting of junior guard Gianfranco Grafals was



Oakleaf High center Chantz Williams is destructive defensive force for Knights.





CREEKSIDE — With sophomore sprinter Alex Collier blasting the 100 meter field and not the 400 meter field, the Orange Park High track team speed squad is slowly making moves to be in position to challenge the fastest runners in the state in a few weeks.

"Right now, we know Alex (Collier) is solid in the 400 with back-to-back sub-50 second wins in the past couple of meets," said Orange Park sprint coach Kevin Elmore, who was corraling his sprint team for the upcoming 4 x 100 meter dash at Creekside's Friday Night Lights. "We are moving guys around to get a feel for who will be explosive at the end of the season."

Elmore's corral included senior Alex Meadows, who has inched closer to the 50 second mark and took a fighting second in the 400 to Fleming Island High's Felipe Fernandez, 50.56-51.57 with Raider teammate Sean Dixon seventh at 53.56.

In the 100, Collier bested the fast field with an 11.01 winning time to edge at Flagler Palm Coast's Tryquarius Jenkins who was runneruup at 11.25. Orange Park junior Keanan Restall ran 11.57 in the closely matched field for 12th.

"I wanted that 10 point something tonight, "said Collier. "It'll come. Running the 100 will make me faster in the 400 which a 46-47 is the goal."

Orange Park junior distance runner

John Bear, who got his seed time under 4:30 recently at Bishop Snyder, found himself in the mix of a fast elite field in the Creekside 1600 with Columbia's Yassin Raffay blitzing the field in the first 800 while Bear contended with Creekside's Matthe Ortiz and Columbia's Burch Greene to position the threesome for a chase to Raffay early lead.

On the third lap, near the 1000 meter mark, Raffay seemed to falter and allowed the chase pack to pass him on the curve in what seemed like a doomed early attempt to steal the race.

On the final lap, with Ortiz and Bear shoulder to shoulder and Greene lurking, the trio made a strong move to break from Raffay, but the Columbia senior was not going away after working the field.

"I worked too hard to not win," said Raffay, after he snuck in around the trio with a quick move in the first lane to win in 4:29.28 with Green second, Ortiz third and Bear fourth in 4:30:59.

Bear, who has a 1:59 split for the 800, finished fourth at the Creekside 800 in 2:02:34.





the final day. "Honestly, it is kind of a good feeling when you reach that level of hurt; you just have to embrace it. I was a little tired after the swim, but, hey, I'm human."

That time set a new American, NCAA, US Open and UF record, all of which he held from last year's NCAA meet (40.00).

With his nine individual titles and one relay title, the senior great closes out his Gator career with 10 national championships, the most of any Florida man in school history. He surpassed Ryan Lochte's seven titles with his 50 free championship earlier in the week and continued to build on that momentum.

The senior ended his week with seven All-America honors, bringing him to 28 over his four years at Florida. That is the most on the men's side in program history, surpassing Shaune Fraser (2006-10), who had 27 over his career.

Dressel concluded his collegiate career with four American records, three of which he set this meet: 50 free, 100 free and 100 fly.

"I haven't swum as many 50 frees as much this year as I have in my three previous years," said Dressel, after his record setting 50 free performances with three sub 18 second finishes including an astounding record of 17.63 seconds. "I really did not what to expect. I could have went anywhere from 18.5 to 18.11. I just want-

ed to step up and have fun with it."

No man in the history of Florida has ever won more than three titles (individual or relay) at one NCAA meet, Dressel has now won four over the course of this week: 50 free, 100 free, 100 fly, 200 free relay.

Dressel wasn't the only one making waves in tonight's final. Fellow classmates Jan Switkowski and Mark Szaranek each earned a top-3 finish during their final individual races of the meet. Switkowski

placed second in the 200 fly with a careerbest time of 1:39.55, good for the sixth fastest time in history.

The Gator men will say goodbye to 10 seniors, including the seven that competed this week at NCAAs. Six of the seniors (Dressel, Lawless, Manganiello, Enzo Martinez-Scarpe, Switkowski and Szaranek) combined for 24 of the 31 All-America honors throughout the week.

"They are my best friends and they are Florida – 347

my brothers," said Dressel. "All I can say is that I love them so much — what they have taught me as a man, as a student and as an athlete is unspeakable."
