MOBRO Marine transports jet back to Reynolds Park

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - Compared to other jobs, lifting the waterlogged Miami Air International jet from the banks of the St. Johns River wasn't especially challenging for MOBRO Marine, Inc.

But their other jobs didn't get as much attention.

The marine and construction company was entrusted with removing the Boeing 737-800 from the end of the runway at Naval Air Station-Jacksonville and delivering it to Reynolds Park, where the National Transportation Safety Board could conduct its investigation.

And the sight of a 125,000-pound jet floating up the St. Johns River on a barge created hundreds on onlookers and media, said company vice president and CFP Steve Cumella.

"We've picked up things much heavier than the plane," Cumella said. "It was unusual by its shape, not its weight. The plane was heavy, but in the grand scheme

Middleburg: Oldest village in Florida still has 'old-fashioned' essence

MIDDLEBURG - It's standard by now for St. Augustine to get all of the old-cityin-America buzz, but far fewer in Clay County know that one of the country's oldest cities is right in their backyard and it goes by the name it's had for more than 100 years - Middleburg.

First known as Clark's Ferry before being named Gary's Ferry sometime around the 1830s, to becoming Whitesville and finally landing on the name of Middleburg around the 1850s, Middleburg has long been a staple of industry and agriculture in Clay County's history and it was just as much the simpler way of life that the area holds onto today.

What I like about Middleburg is that it is so old fashioned," Cynthia Stone of Middleburg said. "That feeling, that tradition, that old fashioned lifestyle captured in Middleburg today is what it was like back [in the 19th and 20th Century], too."

Stone has a Doctorate in history and taught at Florida State University for nearly 20 years before becoming Middleburg's historian. She's the treasurer of the Middleburg Museum and the tour guide of historical tours through one of the oldest villages in America. According to Stone, Middleburg's history can be described in two ways: hysterical and important.

In terms of hysterics, Stone said Middleburg's history shows a pattern of quirkiness and a lifestyle that saw the law as merely a suggestion.

'Some of the craziest things in Florida history happened here," Stone said. "We have our very own Paul Revere midnight ride. We had moonshining. We had it all."

During the Civil War, a young boy was playing near a branch of Black Creek when he saw a troupe of Union soldiers approach-



ing. Knowing they hadn't entered Middleburg to be friends, the boy quickly ran back to the main street of the town where the main church was located. Known today as Middleburg United Methodist Church, this church is the oldest church in the county and the second oldest protestant church in Florida.

The boy told town officials who then told him to ring the church bells. This informed the town to prepare for a skirmish and alarmed the Confederate soldiers in town of the looming threat of incoming Union soldiers.

"That day had shades of Paul Revere," Stone said. "The Calvary saved the day from Middleburg's perspective and chased the Yankees out.'

Stone said the Union burned down the hotel in town and a few other businesses. Fortunately, they didn't lay a torch to the church which is why it still stands today. In fact, this church, which has since seen an expansion to accommodate modern times and modern crowds, still holds a traditional service on Sunday mornings in the original chapel of the church.

'We sing out of hymnals," Stone, who is a member of the church, said. "We sing the old songs. There's a piano and an organ. There aren't any TVs. It's a very oldfashioned service."

According to Stone, much of the original church sanctuary standing today is original, including the structure, the pews and even the floor.

Built in 1847, in just 28 years, the church will celebrate its 200th birthday. This church is located on Main Street. While Main Street might simply be the name of the street today, its significance can't be understated in Middleburg history.

Vishi Garig, the Clay County Archivist, who works as a service of the Clay County Clerk of Court, said before it was Main Street, it was the main road used for Fort Heileman, a fort used during the Second

Seminole War era of Florida, which occurred from 1835 to 1852.

This fort, which never saw a battle occur at its site, held supplies for American soldiers fighting Seminole Native Americans during the war and also transported supplies to other areas. Those supplies were transported both on water, by way of Black Creek, and by land, by way of the road known as Main Street today. It was during the Second Seminole War that this street was its busiest, thanks to the constant bustling of people staying at the inn on the street, people attending church, or soldiers traveling to and from Fort Heile-

Sometime after the war, it was officially named Main Street where it continued to serve as the focal point of Middleburg. Today, it's the road most often traveled on by those heading to service at the Middleburg Methodist Church.



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As Shands Bridge readies for its third makeover, it still connects county its past

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — On the St. Johns County side of the Shands Bridge, anglers throw bait and cast lines. It's a place of peace on a sweltering afternoon, except for the rush of cars entering the bridge.

The cars are duly ignored. There's not much talking or much to talk about. Nathaniel Nelson, of Fleming Island, sits on a bucket catching mullet. He comes a couple of times a month for about four or five hours.

"Lots of people spend their time out here," Nelson said. "They come from all over, Georgia, Ocala, Lake City. Everywhere."

The drive on this 1.2-mile bridge — a foot to the left you're in the other lane, a foot to the right and you're in the drink — is nearing its end. The Florida Department of Transportation featured a four-lane rebuild with an estimated cost \$763 million, as third segment of the First Coast Expressway.

In mid-March, when a semi jack-knifed and held traffic back for hours, Nelson stayed near the bridge for most of the day.

"I'm hoping they don't mess up the fishing, but I know they need a better bridge to get the barges through there," Nelson said.



"It's scary. In the 20 years I've been here, maybe two or three cars went off the side of the road. I looked up there [after the March crash] and thought, 'Well, I might as well keep fishing.'"

Another fisherman, named Leonard, likes the quiet. Leonard, who makes the 90-minute drive from Ocala, said he catches about 30 mullet a day in his three hours at the bridge. The limit is 50.

The goal of the new expressway is to connect I-10 in Duval County to I-95 in St. Johns via Clay County in a hook-like shape. Construction on the new bridge, just south of the current structure, is expected in 2023.

The old bridge will remain in place for drivers to use until the new one is completed, according to FDOT Spokeswoman Sara Pleasants. She said a possibility was a removal of the middle section of the bridge to create two fishing piers at either side. Aside from safety, one of the benefits of the

new bridge was extra 20 feet clearance for hoats

"One of the benefits of the new bridge is increased vertical clearance to 65 feet from the current clearance of 45 feet, which will be an improvement for marine commerce [particularly for ships accessing the Barge Port of Palatka]," Pleasants wrote in a statement. "Additionally, the

new bridge will have two travel lanes in each direction [double its current capacity] as well as emergency shoulders, which the existing bridge lacks."

The bridge was named after Alvin G. Shands, not to be confused with his brother, the namesake of UF Health Shands Hospital, state senator and county commissioner, William Shands.

Bridging Clay and St. John wasn't an easy task. To pay for the project that cost nearly \$500,000, Alvin Shands sold stock in the wooden bridge and collected between 35-50 cents as a toll. It opened in April of 1928, with a drawbridge two miles long and 20 feet wide.

A stock receipt from 1927 showed one share in the bridge was worth \$100, about

Participants in worksite wellness programs have 25-30 percent lower medical or absenteeism expenditures that non-participants.



Workplace wellness programs are one way to improve employee health and wellness and save money. A company's most important asset is its people. Savvy employers know that happy, healthy employees demonstrate increased productivity and morale and have lower health care costs.

Worksite wellness programs strive to promote a healthy lifestyle for employees, maintain or improve health and wellbeing, and prevent or delay the onset of chronic disease. This is accomplished through raising awareness about the importance of pursuing healthy behaviors and providing programs that encourage these behaviors or slow the progression of chronic disease. These programs include nutrition education, healthy cooking, stress management, blood pressure management, physical activity, tobacco cessation, financial education and more.

VA may delay Ken Brock's mission, but not his resolve to finish his walk

en Brock was 1,778 miles off his intended course from Florida to Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, on Mother's Day.

But he's determined to complete his walk, even if it means missing his self-imposed deadline of July 3.

The U.S. Army veteran was unexpectedly diverted from South Dakota by the Veteran's Administration from his

Without warning, and without exception, the VA ordered Brock back to Florida last week for an evaluation for benefits. Although he explained he already had walked 1,778 miles from Amvets Post 86 in Keystone Heights and was in Wanblee, S.D. since Feb. 1 to support WWP, the veteran's group didn't waver.

Get home or go without benefits. So much for helping veterans.

Despite being overwhelmed and underfunded, the VA does a lot of good work. I know. My father spent the last two years of his life at the Emory L. Bennett Veterans Nursing Home at Daytona Beach. He was a retired U.S. Air Force navigator who suffered a debilitating



stroke, and his care at Daytona Beach was exceptional.

Brock's problems probably weren't with the caregivers. It more likely started with the pencil-pushers who seem to be more interested in balance lines, red tape and quarterly reports than common sense. There's no other explanation why the VA would take such a drastic step to crush the momentum of a positive gesture that's meant so much to our veterans.

The VA responded last week to our questions, only to say they can't talk about their patients. Well, Brock did talk, and he wanted answers during his evaluation last Thursday.

"I'm going ask why, all of a sudden, they singled me out," Brock said ahead of his VA appointments. "Maybe he knows; maybe he doesn't. Someone has the answers."

The fear is the VA misconstrued Brock's plan to walk 2,650 miles as a sign that he no longer suffers from PTSD. In reality, the walk is a form of therapy, Brock said.

"They don't know I still suffer with nightmares," Brock said.

Brock was forced to drive back to Keystone Heights last week. He had doctor appointments last Monday and Tuesday

in Sarasota, followed by his evaluation on Thursday. After that, he drove back to South Dakota to continue his journey.

With only 928 miles to go.

"I'll be honest with you, with everything that's happened, it crossed my mind to quit," Brock said. "But I'm going back. I'm going to finish. It's a personal goal I have to complete.

With everything else that's going on in my life, I needed a way to get away from everything. The world was closing in on me. I needed to get away from it all. The walk for Wounded Warrior Project got me out by myself, away from everybody. It was for two reasons – giving back [to WWP] and for therapy. That's why I won't let them [VA] stop me.

Brock will resume his walk on May 21.

Brock got help from his brother, Terry Brock, to get back on schedule. Terry drove back with his brother to Wanblee, and he will follow for two weeks with Ken's cart and service dog Pam in the car so the 53-year-old can make up lost time.

He knows getting there by July 3 will be difficult, if not impossible, since the final 225 miles will be through the Rocky Moun-

"I won't have to push that heavy cart or worry about Pam for two weeks." Brock said. "I will be able to make up a lot of time. I may be able to make up for the lost week [for the VA]. Getting to Idaho by July 3 is probably out of the question. I'd have to average about 30 miles a day, and that's going to be really impossible in the Rock-

But Ken Brock won't be stopped - either by the challenges of the Rocky Mountains or the bureaucratic nonsense of the

Hilliard's Deputy City Clerk Erin West was chosen from a field of 289 applicants. West, 34, worked in Hilliard since 2012 and has held her current position since 2016.

council members approved hiring her 5-0. In a

brief 15-minute interview session, council members met and guizzed West on her experience, expected workload, knowledge of the area and her commute. City staff previously interviewed West and recommended the hire. A charter amendment passed in April that switched the city clerk evaluation from the council members to the purview of the city manager.

"[West] could do the job that's required," City Manager Steve Kennedy said. West replaces Julie Clevinger, who retired last year. Kimberly Thomas has been the interim city clerk.

"It's kind of surreal," West said. "I was so shocked when [city Human Resources Director Mary Jane Lundy] called me with the offer."

West, who starts in early June, has an accounting background. She expects to finish a master's program from Liberty University by the end of the year. West also has a Certified Municipal Clerk certification.

The role of a city clerk involves overseeing city functions, such as organizing meeting agendas and clerical duties and is often the first city staff a resident may meet. The clerk must have a detailed knowledge of city codes and procedures.

"[The accounting aspect] kind of clicks with me liking to help people when they call with their issues or come to me wanting to do a resolution," West added.

Hilliard is in western Nassau County with a population of about 3,000 people. Green Cove Springs as 7,500. West said as a deputy city clerk she completed many tasks a head clerk would, related to meetings or payroll.

"I've done things in Hilliard to help with my experience and step into that role," West said.

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Clay Community Connect links businesses' surveillance cameras to sheriff's office

Live streaming throughout county to assist in 'real-time' crime solutions

MIDDLEBURG — Will Garcia doesn't mind if Big Brother watches. In fact, as long as it's the Clay County Sheriff's Office on the other end, the restaurant owner wants Big Brother to watch.

Garcia's two McDonald's franchises in Clay County were the first to join Clay Community Connect – known as C3 – to link his stores with 24-hour surveillance to the sheriff's office.

Now Sheriff Darryl Daniels wants "all" businesses to consider doing the same.

"This type of partnership, this type of technology being leveraged is a gamechanger," Daniels said while visiting Garcia's McDonald's at 2485 Blanding Blvd. "Everyone, including law enforcement, has some degree of responsibility in keeping our county safe. To establish partnerships like this, whether it be a real-time crime solution, surveillance cameras at a business — or the eyes, ears. This is an enhancement of see something, say something."

The sheriff's office recently installed a system that would allow businesses to share their live video feeds with deputies. Stores are responsible for installing and operating their own systems, but there is no cost by the sheriff's office to monitor the feeds, Lt. Jeff Johnson said. The sheriff's office then would monitor those video feeds to quickly identify and react to problems.

"This thing has paid for itself tenfold in the time it takes to make justice happen," Johnson said. "It's reduced the time in the courts with the video. You can't fight a video. We're freeing up court hours." The software at the sheriff's office cost less than the salary of a starting deputy, but nearly 80-percent of that was offset by grants, Johnson said.

For Daniels, it's money that will be well-spent.

"This is the 21st century. Everybody has a computer. Everybody has a laptop," Daniels said. "Everybody has a cell phone with access to the internet, and this is just another step in leveraging those technologies.

"If you could think, if we get the school district on board with this and tie into their camera system, hospitals, businesses, so on and so forth, that gives us the opportunity to have a deputy in place where a deputy is not in place because we have our eyes and ears in those places."

Garcia also tied is surveillance cameras to the sheriff's office at his restaurant at 561 Plantation Dr. in Middleburg.

"Being a business owner, the utmost importance is the safety of our customers is our responsibility," he said. "Being able to partner with the sheriff's office and all the great things they're doing, helps us as business owners to contribute to the community. Keeping my crew safe is of utmost importance. It's good to know they're keeping an eye on my restaurant and parking lots."

There are signs posted in the restaurant and decals on the doors assuring customers they are under 24-hour surveillance.

The Jacksonville and St. Johns County sheriff offices also are in the early stages of connecting with their businesses. Once their systems are at full speed, Daniels hopes the counties will link into each oth-

er, too

"For us, Jacksonville and St. Johns, this is a real-time crime solution," he said. "We're all kind of coming up together on this. The ultimate goal is for all the different counties to tie in, interface with one another, so we can see the things that happen in Jacksonville or St. Johns County that potentially could spill over into Clay

County."

Daniels said C3 simply is another tool to keep communities safe.

"We take a hard line on criminal misconduct. I know the others do as well. We're a little more outspoken, and for good reasons," Daniels said. "You're sitting on a gem in the state of Florida. You don't want anything to intrude on that."

\$1.400 today, with the Bank of Green Cove Springs acting as a trustee.

The timing wasn't great as the Great Depression soon engulfed the nation and Shands didn't recoup his money. The state bought the bridge in 1934 for about half the cost to build it. Tolls were then removed.

The draw span of the bridge was the source of several problems, either failing to close or falling into the river altogether. according to Clay County Archivist Specialist Vishi Garig. Prone to fires, a 150-foot section of the bridge burned in 1950. The fire was "presumed to have been started by a cigarette."

In "Parade of Memories" by Arch Fredric Blakey, the author detailed that there were about 1,700 drivers crossing the bridge daily in 1959. Use rose during and after World War II with Clay's strong military presence. It was time for a replacement.

"Drivers were made aware that 'one slight error in steering' was sufficient to 'send their cars hurtling through the wooden railings.' ... the State Road Department agreed with County residents that a new bridge was needed," Blakey wrote in 1976.

Several accidents and fires led officials to build a concrete structure. In the early 1960s, the current bridge was readied for commuters. It was 34 feet wide.

Hurricane Dora is mostly known for nearly derailing a 1964 Beatles concert in Jacksonville. But it also knocked out a 12-foot section of the bridge. Two high profile deaths over the edge prompted \$1.16 million in railing improvements in 2004. In 2016, it closed for two days after damage to the eastern portion from Hurricane Matthew

Alvin Shands he never saw the current bridge, Garig notes. Shands, 55, died in 1948. A Palatka Times-Herald obituary states he lived in Green Cove Springs.

"[Alvin Shands] was active in county and community affairs in Clay County. He served several terms as a member of the Clay Board of County Commissioners. He promoted the wooden bridge across the St. Johns River at Green Cove Springs, known as the "Shands Bridge." ... He was a director of the Atlantic National Bank of Palatka and was well and favorably known here."

Despite his skeptics – the beams in the river's mud were a concern - and numerous incidents on the bridge before the rebuild, Shands can take credit for connecting Clay and St. Johns counties.



Alstatt's amazing recovery includes returning to work at county jail

Cortney Alstatt returned to work last weekend, less than a month following a double-mastectomy to fight Stage 3 breast cancer. The Clay County Sheriff's Office deputy worked in the control room at the county jail. "I'm still real sore, but I'm feeling better," she said. "I couldn't have done this without the support of my husband, my children and, of course, everyone at the sheriff's office. It's all been amazing." Returning to work was another step in her recovery. Alstatt is scheduled to start six weeks of radiation treatments next week to make sure there are no lingering traces of the disease.





From World War I to Twitter: Wilhelmine Glenn has seen it all during last 100 years

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – A local member of the Greatest Generation celebrated a major achievement last Monday with Wilhelmine Glenn's 100th birthday.

The party at the city's senior center was not a quiet affair – a packed room sang, ate and laughed.

Glenn was born in Ironton, Ohio in 1919, the youngest of 13 children. The girls in her family were named after princesses

Seven months after Germany's surrender in the First World War, the headline of the May 13, 1919 New York Times read, "Two German Envoys Start For Berlin To Consult; Ebert Declares Americans Have Been Found Wanting; Wilson firm on Fiume; Italians Are Losing Hope."

A century later, she said it felt like any other day, though there were some jitters.

"It's scary. This morning I was kind of nervous," she said. "I don't feel any differ-

ent than I did yesterday."

Working as a beautician before she retired, Glenn moved to Keystone Heights to live with her son, Mike, about 20 years ago. The world has changed immeasurably in her century of life.

"There's not much comparison that I can think of from then and now," Wilhelmine Glenn said.

"The covered wagons are gone now," Mike Glenn joked.

Glenn said the occasion was special. He's had to drop his mother off early each morning due to Keystone Heights losing its bus routes.

"I think it's pretty interesting, I think everybody else is enjoying her birthday as much as she is. It's a landmark," he said.

Wilhelmine Glenn comes to the center every day, mostly painting, coloring, chair exercises or a new activity, the Zen Tangle, she learned from her friend Linda Dixon.

"The Zen Tangle is very relaxing. She loves it," Dixon said. "I want to be like her when I get that age. Oh boy, that's a mile-

Orange Park takes first step to regulate airBnB-like rentals

ORANGE PARK - The Park Town Council recently approved the first reading of an ordinance amending the town's code on short-term vacation rentals, or what's known as an AirBnB.

The council found itself at odds a couple months ago with the way AirBnB homes and other similar short-term rental vacation properties were allowed to operate seemingly unhinged within Orange Park

While some on the council expressed a desire to ban them inside the city limits, Town Attorney Sam Garrison said there were very few regulations for them.

"The main thing I wanted to let you know, because it was brought forth, is can we just ban these sorts of things?" Garrison said on March 5. "The answer is no, we can't. Love it or hate it, singlefamily properties are allowed in the state of Florida...to rent out all or a portion of the single-family home and while we certainly can regulate it in certain respects, we cannot ban it."

While not able to ban, Garrison presented the council with an ordinance to regulate short-term rentals.

According to Garrison, when writing the ordinance, he had to make sure that every regulation was to preserve the health, safety and economic development of residential neighborhoods while also protecting statutory rights of people who wish to rent out their homes.

"This is a matter of law," Garrison said. "This ordinance is concerned with safety and law and it comes from a place in legislature, not a desire to pick and choose.'

As such, the first reading, a short-term vacation rental certificate to be obtained from the town, along with a business tax receipt and a Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation license. It also includes regulations for swimming pools, which must comply with the Residential Swimming Pool Safety Act.

Beyond that, the ordinance dictates the number of guests based on the number of rooms, parking standards and garbage regulations. The full ordinance is available for viewing on the town's site.

"If this ordinance were to pass, you'd have the most stringent regulation on short-term rentals maybe on the entire first coast," Garrison said. "It's an aggressive ordinance.'

The first reading was passed by the council, 5-0. The next step is the second hearing, where if passed after that, the ordinance will become official.

Garrison advised the town to notify all short-term rental owners of the second reading so owners can ask questions and express concerns.

Creek District of Duval County became what it is today.

"I'm hoping people will find it fun and entertaining, not just learning about the history of Clay County, but history in general," said Vishi Garig, a specialist for the Clay County Archives.

The anchor for the festival is the yearlong curriculum taught to eighth grade students throughout the county, including winning its separation from Duval by the state legislatures in 1958.

Not only were students given addition Clay County history studies to supplement their history lessons, they were challenged to explore artifacts and documents to help decide which factors had a greater influence on the county's future, said Kelly Watt, Social Studies Curriculum Specialist for the Clay County School District.

"Starting last year, we came together with historians, teachers and archives specialists to design a local history curriculum," Watts said. "It's something that happens outside the history book of where they live, learn and play."

History lessons for eighth graders start with exploration to the New World and ends with reconstruction. But a lot has happened since, Watt said.

Students poured through documents, surveys and separated what played the greatest role in guiding the county's future — influence of the military, role of tourism and the benefits of how railroads and steamboats affected the use of land and waterways — like the rich farmlands of Penney Farms, orange grooves at Orange Park and the Black Creek.

"Through this, these kids see Clay County has its own rich history, and that helps them see their roots, where they live

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Jacob Hawkins honored with Outstanding Law Enforcement Officer award

Clay County deputy helped save the life of Customs agent after ambush

JACKSONVILLE – Clay County Sheriff's Office deputy Jacob Hawkins was recognized Wednesday a recipient of an Outstanding Law Enforcement Officer award Wednesday by the seven members of various Fourth Judicial Circuit agencies.

The idea originated after State Attorney Melissa Nelson last year met with Jacksonville Beach Police Department Detective Dan Watts. He introduced the concept and served on a committee with State

Attorney's Office members that received nominations from agencies and reviewed each to determine honorees.

"I cannot say enough about the good work performed by our Fourth Circuit law enforcement partners," said Nelson. "Our goal with these awards is to showcase exemplary individuals for their efforts and say 'thank you' for their service to our community."

On Sept. 26, 2017, Hawkins responded to a reported shooting in the parking lot of a supermarket on Oakleaf Plantation Boulevard. Upon arrival, he saw a victim who had been shot several times. The victim, Hawkins realized, was U.S. Customs Federal Agent Drew Stokes. Hawkins immediately used his trauma kit to provide first aid and treat the gunshot wounds, which were profusely bleeding. Aid required tourniquets and quick clot gauze in a severe upper torso wound.

Drew was walking out of an Oakleaf business as he was ambushed and shot five times.

Despite still having three bullets in him, Stokes survived, returned to work, and continues on the road to a full recovery thanks to Hawkins' lifesaving efforts.

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Federal judge orders Clay County to provide ballots printed in Spanish

Ruling demands Spanish-speaking employees and poll workers, website, 24-hour hotline

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Clay County must provide election materials, advertis-

ing, hotline, web site and ballots in Spanish, as well as hiring Spanish-speaking employees and poll workers, a federal judge ruled on May 10.

The ruling was delivered by U.S. District Judge Mark Walker, and it de-

manded that 32 of the state's 67 counties be in compliance before of next March's primary elections.

"Not complying with a federal order tends to put you in jail, and I'm not going there," said Supervisor of Elections Chris Chambless.

The case was in response to several La-

tino civic groups and residents of Puerto Rico who were displaced by Hurricane Maria in 2017. They challenged Section 203 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965 that said language support would be based on current U.S. Census figures. According to Chambless, there were about 2,000 people who claimed to primarily speak Spanish.

Marta Valentina Rivera Madera, one of the plaintiffs, successful argued a lesserknown Section 40 of the Voting Rights Act that states if a person went to school in a U.S. territory where English isn't the primary language, you have the right to have a ballot in your native language.

More than 4 million out of Florida's 20 million residents use Spanish as their primary language, according to the American Community Survey.

What this means to Clay County is additional work and costs, Chambless said.

Not only will Spanish ballots be required at each of 55 polling stations, each station must have instructions and staff workers who are fluent in Spanish. A year

ago, Clay County launched an exhaustive advertising campaign to hire Spanish-speaking poll workers, and only 12 replied.

The county also must have Spanish

The county also must have Spanishspeaking employees at the Supervisor of Elections Office, a separate web site in Spanish, as well as Spanish duplicates for all voter information currently printed in English. Chambless currently is calculating how much it will cost, but he knows where the money will come from — "we the people," he said. He eventually will have to send an amended budget to the Board of County Commissioners for extra money.

Affair, stalking, payoff accusations await Sheriff Daniels' return from memorial

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – As Clay County Sheriff Darryl Daniels participated in ceremonies Wednesday at the National Police Memorial Wall to honor fallen motorcycle patrolman Ben Zirbel in Washington, D.C., controversy continued to grow back home stemming from an affair, accusations of stalking and possible payoffs to his mistress that started while he was working at the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office Jail.

Daniels accused a JSO corrections officer Cierra Smith, who said they had a romantic relationship dating back more than five years, of stalking him on May 6 after she followed him into the Oakleaf Plantation. Smith initially was detained, but she was released after Daniels refused to press charges, according to a supplemental report provided by CCSO.

Soon after that, news of their affair

became public, followed by the release of secret audio recordings that suggest Daniels paid Smith to keep their relationship a secret. In the recorded call between Daniels, Smith and her ex-husband, Larry Smith, Daniels said: "There was an occasion where we did have sexual contact. Not like, probably not what you're thinking."

According to Smith's five-page sworn statement, she and Daniels were involved "outside of work on a weekly basis" since 2013. Smith said he got engaged in 2015 and she broke off their relationship. She moved to North Carolina while her husband served in the military, but she returned last year and was re-hired to work at the JSO jail. Smith said the two continued to talk regularly, especially after they learned local media outlets were investigating their affair.

JSO reportedly previously investigated the affair and cleared Daniels.

Smith said the two were supposed to

meet on May 6. After being followed, the sheriff parked at Oakleaf Village Elementary where Smith was stopped by another deputy, according to Daniels' sworn statement

Deputies found a loaded handgun in the glove compartment, but her attorney said she was allowed by have the weapon since she was a corrections officer.

Daniels' wife, Denise Daniels, used her cell phone to record Smith following them on May 6. She was heard saying "This crazy heifer right here has been stalking my husband for the longest." A copy of the recording was booked into evidence at the sheriff's office.

According to his statement at Oakleaf Elementary, Daniels said, "I can draw no other conclusion other than Smith willfully and intentionally followed me in a manner that cause me great concern that if I stopped to engage Smith that I would be exposed to imminent danger."

Daniels hasn't been available for comment. All questions concerning the affair were directed to JSO.

of things, it really wasn't that out of the ordinary.'

What wasn't ordinary was seeing the plane hoisted onto a pier at Reynolds Park, about 100 yards from another high-profile MOBRO project – a 78,000-pound Space Shuttle external fuel tank.

Marine Patrols kept curious boaters at bay at the river. MOBRO then was forced to set up a roadblock for several days at the pier to keep spectators from getting too

"There were a lot of boats in the river trying to watch. They made a day of it," Cumella said. "We were worried there were too many boats trying to get a close look. When you have two cranes on barges, the last thing you need are the wakes from the boats. It was a difficult pick because of where it was. We had rocks under the boat

and a pier real close to the left-side of the plane. There wasn't a lot of room, and it was so shallow. It was a little tricky.

The plane was lifted by a sling under the center of the plane and two latches attached to the tops of each wing, Cumella said. After it was out of the river, a third barge wedged between both cranes and the jet was lowered on it. From there, the jet made the 18-mile trip to Green Cove Springs – all under the watchful eyes of the media and public.

The Boeing 737-800 was completing a scheduled military charter flight from Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, on May 3 when it skidded off the NAS-Jacksonville runway during a severe thunderstorm. All 136 passengers and a crew of seven walked away from the crash, although 21 required treatment for minor injuries at local hospitals.

Passengers at the front of the jet were soaked by the brackish water, but the plane came to rest in the shallow waters near the shoreline.

MOBRO Marine lifted the 62-ton jet onto a barge on May 7 and it made the four-hour journey to Reynolds Park a day later. Once the NTSB finishes its investigation, the jet will be scrapped, the airline

Since there wasn't a timeframe for the investigation, MOBRO decided not to park the jetliner at the pier and not on its 30acre yard.

"We've never had our work under so much continuous limelight," Cumella said. "We're a little-known secret down in Green Cove Springs. We've been family-owned since 1962. Our main business is renting equipment for dredging and construction for roads and bridges. We've picked a lot of boats out of the water, too. We've picked just about everything. The plane was unusual because it got so much attention. We just went about our work.'

MOBRO employs 110 people, Cumella said. Much of the company's recent focus has been in the Caribbean as countries try to build new piers and rebuild older ones that were damaged by hurricanes. In fact, one of the cranes used to lift the Miami Air jet from the St. Johns had returned from the Bahamas just a few hours earlier.

None of those other jobs, however, got as much attention.

"It wasn't the biggest or heaviest pick we've done," Cumella said. "But it certainly was one of the most-interesting."



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Four in jail following rash of car thefts, break-ins in Oakleaf area

CCSO: Guns, property easily taken from unlocked cars

OAKLEAF — A series of car break-ins during a six-month period not only involved at least 13 cars, it included the theft of two other cars and at least five handguns.

And most, if not all, of the thefts could have been prevented.

"The simplest thing could solve almost every car break-in: lock your doors," said

Clay County Sheriff Deputy Chris Padgett.

Most of the break-ins, including ones that occurred in the Cheswick Oaks Avenue, Spencer Plantation and Bottomridge and Foxridge drive areas from November to

April involved unlocked cars, Padgett said. Four men currently are in the Clay County Jail charged in connection with the burglaries, and new charges are being added as the investigation continues.

And most of the break-ins in the area weren't reported.

"Nine out of 10 [break-ins] are unlocked cars," Padgett said. "Rarely do we see a forced entry. They check the door handle and move on to the next vehicle," Padgett said. "And if 12 cars get broken into, we probably only hear from three or four [vic-

tims].

Thieves often are looking for spare change or small items that easily can be sold. That's why car owners don't make reports. But Padgett said it's important to report every break-in since it could lead to the evidence that could identify a suspect.

"Report it to us, regardless whether you lost something valuable or not," he said. "What's not valuable to you may be valuable to us. Maybe we get a thumbprint. That's very valuable to us. That one piece of evidence can lead us to solving dozens of cases."

A pair of teenagers were charged with

breaking into cars from Feb. 27 to April 9 in at least three Clay County neighborhoods. Kyle Garrett Prevatt, 19, and Justin Marshall Hill, 19, were charged in a connection with at five reported breakins. Not only were they caught in a stolen car,

deputies confiscated personal property, three handguns, money and clothes. Two of the guns were taken from separate cars in the Oakleaf area and another handgun was stolen near Henley Road in Middleburg.

Hill currently is being held on \$1,070,021 bond, while Prevatt's bond was set at \$830,021.

Another ring in- Justin Hill volved Jackie Rashad


Nash, 21, and Tyrell DeAndre Campbell, 18, CCSO said.

They ransacked cars in the Oakleaf in November, stealing a car and at least two handguns. Nash was being held on \$130,021 bond after arrested in Jacksonville and sent back to Clay County to face charges of 15 counts of burglary, including the theft of at least two handguns and a Toyota Rav4 from a garage near Hollybrook Lane.

Tyrell DeAndre Campbell, 18, was in jail with no bond. He was arrested on Jan. 14 and charged with 16 counts of breaking into cars, stealing a gun and the Toyota.

According to Padgett, thieves often find more than a couple dollars in change, a cell phone or headsets. He warned of victims leaving their garage door openers in

unlocked parked cars since the opener will provide an easy access to a home and personal information in the glovebox will reveal the address.

A favorite target for car thieves is gymnasiums, Padgett said. Women generally don't carry their purses into a workout, and men often leave their wallets behind. Those are easy targets for a break-in since the thief will have instant access to cash, credit cards, driver's license and social security cards – all which can be easily sold.

Besides locking a car door, another deterrent is removing valuables. Thieves rarely like to smash a window since it draws attention. But if a camera, wallet, handgun or computer can be easily seen, the reward often outweighs the risk.

"Forced entry usually happens when there's a blatant, obvious thing of value," Padgett said. "Don't leave those in your car. And unless you're parking your car in the garage, don't leave your garage door opener in the car. Take it with you."

But most of all, lock the car, Padgett said. "We say 'check it, chirp it.' Make sure your car is locked," he said. "Hit that little button. It's the simplest way to prevent a break-in."

Man charged with shoplifting, fighting at different Walmarts

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Geiger's artwork brings life to Clay County's rich history

PENNEY FARMS — Without even knowing it, Clay County citizens have likely seen Elsbeth Geiger's art.

Right now, a stroll through the old courthouse, the Clay County courthouse, the Middleburg Museum and the North Florida Military Museum would include more than once instance of Geiger's Clay County-themed art. That's because for nearly 20 years, 91-year-old Geiger has been documenting Clay County's most well-known sights and best-kept secrets in the form of acrylic paintings. How she got started doing these paintings though is likely not what one might guess.

paint a background for something he was working on," Geiger said. "He was going to do the ferry boat and he asked if I would make the water and the trees, the dock and the old boathouse, and that's what I did."

Since that day, Geiger has found herself constantly involved with local Clay County historical efforts. She's volunteered her time at local museums, the old Clay County jailhouse, the Clay County Archives, the Clay County Agricultural Fair Early Florida Village and more. She's currently at work creating several presentations for the history of where she lives, Penney Farms, for

the Celebrate Clay County History Festival taking place this Saturday.

Her poster boards and framed pieces of history include snippets of newspapers mentioning J.C. Penney, the Wizard of Oz munchkin that called Penney Farms home and more. For her, documenting Clay County's history gives her meaning.

"I guess I could say it's given my life, especially these later years, purpose," Geiger said. "History lives on."

At the Clay County Courthouse located in Green Cove Springs, Geiger has multiple

pieces of her art on display just inside the main entrance including paintings of Keystone Inn, the Magnolia Hotel, the Rideout Ferry and other pieces of Clay County history. With many pictures of these historical landmarks no longer in existence, like the Magnolia Hotel, being in black and white, Geiger's paintings give new life in the form of a colorful lens to this piece of the county's history. That's why she does what she does.

"It's easy to look over Clay County's history or even Clay County," Geiger said. "You might not know it, but Clay County has such a rich history steeped in generations and generations. I'm just fascinated by it and it makes me happy to keep this history alive with my paintings."


Geiger has a degree in psychology and at one point in her life, taught second grade before working with her husband in his architectural hardware distribution company, so how she arrived to be known as a historical painter is still fascinating and exciting for her. According to Geiger, though, art is something her entire family is good at. Her daughter-in-law paints. Her son used to teach Fine Arts at the University of Virginia. Her grandson recently graduated from the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts and of course, Geiger herself has a talent for painting.

"There must be something in our genes," she said.

While Geiger doesn't paint much anymore due to how busy she is creating history presentations and poster boards for things like the Celebrate Clay County History Festival, she looks back fondly on her time painting Clay County's history.

Some of Geiger's favorite paintings can be seen at the Clay County Courthouse until May 24.



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
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Learn nature, agriculture, while getting EGG-cited about chickens

CLAY COUNTY — Raising a small, backyard chicken flock has gained interest in recent years as many small-farm owners, hobbyists and homeowners desire to produce their own high-quality food. Producing your own eggs from a small chicken flock can be extremely satisfying and a great way to teach your kids about agriculture, nature and instill a sense of responsibility. But

connecting with agriculture requires planning, research and dedication.

If you are just starting out or interested in starting a small flock, first find out if it is legal to raise chickens where you live. Many communities have regulations that restrict the location and quantity of poultry. In Clay County, the ability to house chickens on your property is dictated by your property zoning district. Certain zones, such as AG have no restrictions for raising poultry. Other zoning districts have a permitting process but do allow a small number of chickens. Other

zoning districts or within certain city limits, such as Orange Park or Keystone Heights, chickens may not be allowed at all. It is best to check with your local county zoning department to make sure you can raise chickens on your property. If you reside in an HOA, it is also advisable to check your HOA ordinances to see if chickens are allowed on your property.

If your goal is to produce eggs for you and your family, all you will need is a few hens in your flock. Hens should begin laying around six months of age and can continue

for several years. Peak egg production usually occurs within the first two years and will decrease production over the next couple of years. A layer hen should produce an egg every one-to-two days, but this can vary based on breed. The amount of daylight that is available is very important to egg production and the amount of eggs produced will vary based on the seasons. Hens will also go through a process called "molting". where the hens will lose their feather, in order to produce new fresh feathers. During this process, egg production becomes nonexistent, but have patience! This process is only temporary and usually lasts for oneto-three months.

Egg production is also affected by the health of the hens. Diet and nutrition have a direct effect on the amount and quality of the eggs. If your flock isn't provided a well-balanced diet, what little energy the hens have are diverted from egg production to maintaining their own health. Make sure the feed you are providing is proper for the age of your flock, is of good quality, and not moldy or stale. Also keep it free of rodents or other animals by storing it in a rodent-proof container. Vegetable or fruit scraps from the kitchen can be fed to chickens, but never used spoiled food, raw potato peels, avocado skins, raw beans, candy, raw eggs, or anything salty. Clean fresh water should be provided. A typical bird will need a half-pint a day depending on age and outside temperature.

A healthy bird will be active, alert, and communicative. They should be moving around, pecking, talking or singing quietly. Unhealthy birds can potentially show the following signs: no longer active, will not move, limp, no longer talkative, diarrheic droppings, coughing or sneezing. Sanitation and coop ventilation are very important processes to maintain a healthy flock. After handling the chickens, eggs, or cleaning the coop, always wash your hands with soap and water to prevent bacterial infections.

While raising your own hens can be demanding, it can also be extremely rewarding. Chickens can be funny creatures and have the ability to put a smile on your face after a rough day. Besides providing fresh home-raised eggs, it can teach responsibility and can connect us with agriculture and nature.

Late homer gives 'Bigs' second title



Achors gets to Indiana Swim Hall of Fame

FLEMING ISLAND - Margarets Walk resident Greg Achors holds a strong connection to one of Clay County's most celebrated athletes mainly because they share the same passion for their sport.

"I live vicariously through Caeleb Dressel," said Achors, 55, an Indiana high school multiple state swim champion (Two individual golds; one relay in 1982 with team title; runnerups in 1981), an NCAA championship swimmer for the University of Tennessee (1983-84, sixth in 100 fly in SEC, seventh in 100 breast, 10th in NCAA in 400 medley relay, 10th in NCAA team finish 1983) and a near-miss Olympic hopeful that saw a broken wrist derail a possible shot at the big prize. "I started at 10 years old and swam everything like he has recently. Caeleb has taken swimming to his own level. He's fun to watch and is a good ambassador of the sport."

Achors was also a three time All-American in high school with top 10 times in the 100 butterfly, 100 breaststroke and 200 individual medley.

Note: Dressel is a multiple state swim champion who graduated Clay High School, has won a ton of NCAA championships for the University of Florida, set national and world records, won Olympic gold medals and world championship records.

For his swimming prowess at Kokomo High School in Indiana, Achors was inducted into the Indiana Swimming and Diving Hall of Fame as one of two swimmers in the Class of 2019 induction ceremony held April 14 in Indianapolis.

Achors, a retired U.S. Navy Commander and aviator and now a 20-plus year pilot for Federal Express, has spent the latter part those 20 years in Fleming Island with his wife Christi and two sons, Kyle and Konnor, Konnor Achors, now 27 and a Florida

Highway Patrol K-9 Unit officer, was a state meet hurdler, swimmer and basketball player at Fleming Island High School. Kyle, 29, is an orthopedic surgeon in the Tampa area. Wife Christi is a former high level tennis player who now works at the Eagle Harbor Tennis Complex.

"The older the boys got, the more they realized I was a pretty good athlete, "said Achors. "But, Konnor excelled and even ran for four years at the University of Indiana in the hurdles and played basketball. He was such a good athlete, they wanted him to do the decathlon. He still runs, but it's

mainly chasing bad guys."

Kyle was a cross country and track athlete at Fleming Island, but was intent on becoming a doctor post high school.

Achors, though, almost got his push into the family's sport of baseball with Major League Baseball players among his uncles and close relatives.

"I thought I was a better baseball player than a swimmer back then," said Achors. "I had a grandfather who pitched for the Cincinnati Reds, a cousin who played quarterback at Michigan and another cousin who was a Major League player."

Achors was recognized as a legit baseball prospect until a gym coach suggested to his parents that swimming might be his sport.

"He was a swim coach for another high school that saw me swim," said Achors. "He wound up calling my parents and told them I should try the local YMCA swim program. That's where it all started."

Fortunately, or unfortunately, the swim and baseball seasons conflicted forcing Achors to choose one.

"Not to brag, but when I was in high school, I didn't get beat in dual meets, sectionals and all but a couple of times, firsts in our Olympic conference stuff," said Achors. "I had quite a bit of success in swimming."

From 10 years old, Achors showed the prowess that would bring him state championship medals through high school and a lofty career at the University of Tennessee.

"I was highly recruited, but chose Tennessee who was just coming off an NCAA championship in 1978, a runnerup in 1979 and a third in 1980," said Achors, a 1982 graduate of Kokomo. "The Southeastern Conference back then was loaded."

Achors success created a track of optimism that an Olympic swim team berth was imminent, but a broken wrist in his second year at Tennessee set back that dream.

"My goal after two years at Tennessee was to get to the Olympic team," said Achors. "I was all set and had a chance before I broke the rest.

It threw my training way off and I wound up going to the U.S. Nationals and some of those high caliber meets, but the injury and recovery and trying to train through it made me think I had been swimming for a long time. I finished up school and then went into the Navy."

In the Navy, Achors flew P3s through Desert Storm and Kosovo and even tickled an idea of coming back to a Master's swim program.

"I knew that if I got into a Master's team, I would have to be all in and it would be all consuming," said Achors. "I had a swim friend at Auburn and some other guys and we played around trying to get a Master's national meet, but things always happened; I got sick, he hurt his shoulder. The master's idea didn't last long as I had already accomplished about as much as I wanted to."

Achors had a 19 year stint with golf clubs, stopped, but recently dragged his clubs back out.

"Same thing, I played a lot in those 19 years and then stopped, but when I picked it back up, I thought about I could be playing in the PGA, even got Eagle Harbor coach Pete Stuttz to help me out," said Achors. "But, I'm terrible."

Achors cited his Indiana high school team championship in 1982 as a highlight of his swim career

"We won that title with a limited roster; maybe six guys including a diver, " said Achors. "We had a good strong, small group of swimmers and we got big points in our relays. We had the fastest 200 medley relay in the nation our senior year; just 10ths off the national record."








