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Wanamaker in negotiations to be Clay's County Manager

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Clay County officials have started negotiations for its next county manager, former NAS-Jacksonville Commanding Officer and automotive executive Howard Wanamaker.

After interviews with four candidates, commissioners voted 3-2 for Wanamaker over former Flagler County Administrator Craig Coffey when the field was narrowed from four to two. Commissioners Gavin

Rollins, Gayward Hendry and Diane Hutchings voted for Wanamaker.

Commissioners Mike Cella and Wayne Bolla opted for Coffey, but both stated there was no

wrong choice. Stephanie Ko- Howard Wanamaker pelousos left the county manager position to become Gov. Ron DeSantis' director of legislative affairs in December. Fire Chief Lorin Mock has served as interim county manager. In addition to Wanamaker and Coffey,

commissioners interviewed former Hernando County Administrator Leonard Sossaman and Camden County, Ga. Administrator Steve Howard.

Commissioners cited Wanamaker's public and private experience as the right mix to handle Clay's day-to-day governmental operations, and residential and commercial growth. Hendry said Wanamaker's passion for the county was a boost.

Wanamaker spent the last three years of his 26-year military career as NAS Jacksonville's commanding officer. From 2011-13, he led NATO's Human Factors and Cognitive Science Section in the Technology and Human Factors Branch.

Wanamaker serves on boards for the

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Men dressed in Civil War uniforms stood in line at the food truck last Saturday, May 18, while a man dressed in Native American attire explored a half-size replica of The Hunley Confederate submarine. Elementary children studied the life work of country singer Slim Whitman, and everyone found something interesting, if not spooky, inside the Old Jail.

The Celebrate Clay County History Festival had something for everyone.

The Old Courthouse and Jail were open. Displays filled the oak tree, Spanish mossfilled the Clay County Historical Triangle. More important, residents spent hours pouring through artifacts and enjoying a sun-

Navy dropped anchor in Green Cove Springs in 1939

In 1939 the U.S. Navy came to Green Cove Springs and built Lee Field, an auxiliary air station, just southeast of the city limits.

The townsfolk had some experience and success with entertaining large groups of guests. In the late 1800s hordes of northern tourists and invalids flocked south escaping harsh winters, but they only stayed six months had lots of money to spend and were very well behaved.

The navy stayed year around, new sailors had considerably less money to spend and most of Lee Field's compliment were very young men. On base, their lives were run with strict military discipline. Off base, they were facing war and away from home for the first time, free of the restraints of parents and community. They were ready to kick up their heels and find out how far they could go.


Lee Field served as an auxiliary airfield for pilots training at Naval Air Station-Jacksonville. Landing strips were also built on Fleming Island, in St. Augustine and Switzerland.

For the sleepy town of Green Cove Springs struggling to break the painful grip of The Great Depression the military invasion was a mixed blessing. Almost immediately jobs were available for civilian men and women. Local suppliers of lumber, fresh foods and Coca-Cola gratefully struggled to meet demand and watched the bookkeeping numbers turn from red to black.

But no community can double its population overnight and remain the same. Before the base opened in March of 1941, a little over 1,500 residents claimed Green Cove Springs as home. The Navy presence hovered at more than 2,000 officers and men.

New businesses were attracted to town – some to serve the sailors and others to prey on their baser instincts. Car dealerships popped up like corn. A Green Cove Springs resident could shop for the best price with all the major auto manufacturers and never leave the city limits. With the arrival of older servicemen's families, appliance sales and service facilities blossomed.

But the shady trades also thrived because money was burning holes in the thin wallets they tucked in the waistbands of those buttoned bellbottoms. Local and imported ladies of the evening set up shop and despite the Navy's shockingly vivid filmstrips warning of the dangers of venereal disease, they prospered until local law stepped in.



The opening of Lee Field in 1939 more than doubled the population of Green Cove Springs and brought new business to the community like the fortune-telling establishment on U.S. Highway 17.

Fresh meat attracted hustlers of every sort. The local shine industry worked overtime to meet demands of this young group of marks. They were less discriminating than locals and didn't recognized good doit-yourself whiskey. A lot of rotgut made it on the market.

The people of Green Cove Springs took the good with the bad. They guarded their

daughters and kept tabs on their sons who were prone on weekend night to go looking for fistfights with sailors. They mainly wanted to keep the lid on and try to keep anyone from getting hurt. There was sure to be plenty of that from the war.

They also knew that their sons would soon be in some strange place, in a uniform, training to be warriors.

Save time, money by getting ready for hurricane season during tax-free holiday

CLAY COUNTY – With a system already brewing in the Atlantic Oceans and the official start of hurricane season approaching next week, residents can save money on supplies by taking advantage of the Florida Disaster Sales Tax Holiday.

Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis last week signed a bill that created a sales tax holiday from May 31 to June 6 for hurricane supplies.

Locally, residents now should be prepared to survive without electricity and other essentials for at least five days, said interim Clay County Emergency Management Director Glenn East.

"We now say up to five days instead of three," East said. "And now is the time to do it instead of waiting."



East said it's important to be prepared in advance since supplies will be limited – and more valuable – when a storm is approaching.

"Anything to help you maintain, anything you'd need if you were without power for five days," he said. "Solar battery chargers, generators, things to cover your windows and water are really necessary.

Tax-free items include: less than \$10 reusable ice packs; less than \$20 - portable self-powered light source, flashlights, lanterns and candles; less than \$25 - gasor diesel fuel container, including LP gas and kerosene containers: less than \$30 batteries (excluding automobile and marine batteries), coolers, ice chests and non-electrical food storage; \$50 or less - tarps, visqueen barriers, plastic sheeting and drop clothes, flexible waterproof sheeting, ground anchors, tie-down kits, bungee cords, ratchet straps, radios, and two-way weather band; and, \$750 or less portable generators to provide light, communications and food storage.

Unflavored and uncarbonated bottled water, canned food, including meats, vegetables, fruit, peanut butter, and other non-

perishable items, first aid kits, prescription and non-prescription medications, baby food and formula always are exempt.

East also emphasized the need to register now for ALERT Clay County. The system can send an emergency alert to a home, business or cell phone or email address.

"We don't have the neighborhood warning systems like they do up north," East said. "There's nothing to wake you up in the middle of the night if a bad storm or a tornado is coming. Being informed is hugely valuable."

DeSantis also approved a sales tax holiday on school supplies like clothes, notebooks, shoes and backpacks from Aug. 2 to Aug. 6.



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Keystone Heights get grant to turn defunct railways into bike trails

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – City council members and staff secured a grant for the "Rails to Trails" initiative, another step toward promoting recreation in southern Clay County.

The \$46,000 matching grant is from the state Department of Environmental Protection. The county is adding about \$130,000 to the project for a total value of \$221,000, Keystone Heights City Manager Scott Kornegay said.

The funds are for construction of an asphalt parking lot and restroom facility. Trail signage and a drinking fountain will also be installed, according to city documents.

The Rails to Trails program transforms defunct railroad lines into bike trails nationwide. Rails to Trails Conservancy leaders aim one day to connect both coasts. In 2017, city officials broke ground on phase one, connecting Palatka to Lake Butler. Phase one cost about \$280,000.

The new grant is part of phase two. Phase one – which included bike racks, signage, benches and a bicycle repair station – was completed last year.

"Since [phase one], we've been going through a grant process with the state," Kornegay said. "We were informed about a few weeks ago that it had been approved."



Keystone Heights city officials stand where Phase 1 was started in 2017. The three-phases project now has money to start Phase 2 to turn old railway lines into bike trails and parks. Already being considered for the third phase are pickleball courts, which resembles a miniature tennis court.

Since phase two would use the county's bid procurement process, Kornegay said there wasn't a definite timeline of its completion. The new trailhead would give residents another recreational option to use the trail, he said.

"It's going to attract visitors, mainly," Kornegay said. "Rails to Trails is a nationwide project and this will connect our community to the rest of the system."

Kornegay said the additions for the third phase are uncertain.

"There's some different ideas being kicked around in terms of a playground and recreational equipment, that sort of thing," he said. "We've not made a firm decision in that regard."

Keystone's lakes have suffered a gradual drop in water level in the past decade, but a water-sharing partnership with often-flooded Black Creek has boosted morale.

Save Our Lakes, a Keystone-based water level advocacy group, turned out in force at council meetings supporting the St. Johns Water Management District's efforts.

Touting the rise in water levels and trail improvements, Mayor Karen Lake said Keystone was providing options to visitors and residents.

"As the lakes go up, what you will find is more people will come out to enjoy Keystone's fishing and boating," Lake said. "There's a wide range of activities."

Next up may be pickleball, the tennis-like sport popular with seniors.

"I can't believe how many times on the campaign trail I heard, 'I want pickleball,'" Lake said.



First step after high school graduation should be financial stability

CLAY COUNTY - I can feel the excitement in the air this month as graduating seniors celebrate their achievements and prepare to go off to college, join the military, or begin working. My children are still a few years away from graduation, but as a proud resident of Clay County, I'd like to share a few tips for the new graduates in our community.

First, make an effort to learn about finances. This investment of your time will pay you back many times over throughout adulthood. Learn early and reap the benefits throughout the rest of your life.

Second, invest in yourself by putting money in some type of savings every month, whether it's \$5 or \$50. As your salary increases or your financial situation improves, add more. Why save rather than spend that cash? In the worst-case scenario, you'll have a safety net to help you pay an unexpected bill. Best-case scenario, you'll have built a nest egg that might help you buy a car, put a down payment on your first home, or go on an awesome trip.

Third, make a budget. I recommend the 50/30/20 rule." It's simple: take your after-tax income (or monthly allowance) and spend 50 percent on basic needs; 30 percent on things you want, but are not essential (like dining out or a trip to the movies); and allocate 20 percent to debt repayment or a savings/investment account.

Fourth, begin building a strong credit score and history. While you do this, be diligent about managing debt and keeping it at a minimum. Only spend based on your budget and pay the balance off each month. Check your credit history yearly to make sure everything is correct.

Finally, protect your financial information! Don't share passwords to your debit and credit cards or online accounts. Consider getting online statements. Keep your Social Security card, passport, checkbook and insurance information in a safe place.

Service Department. And with active military working a couple miles away at Naval Air Station-Jacksonville, about one-in-six residents of the county have military backgrounds.

Veterans in Clay County generate a combined annual income of \$150 million.

The county's Veterans Service Department worked with nearly 5,000 veterans a year ago. They helped identify benefits, gave advice on claims, provided counseling and information on additional resources, referred citizens to county and state agencies for financial help, visited hospitals and nursing homes to help veterans with paperwork, assisted in obtaining VA Home Loan certificates, offered help with eligibility paperwork and worked as advocates throughout the claims process.

In short, they helped a lot. But it's an unnerving challenge.

"Clay County's needs reflect the nationwide need for available resources and financial assistance for veterans experiencing homelessness or mental health issues," the county's Veterans Service Department said. "Clay County is no different than communities across the country seeing an increase in homeless and mental health issues.'

Only 50 percent of returning veterans who face mental health issues will get treatment, according to RAND Center for Military Health Policy Research. And 20 percent of the soldiers returning from Afghanistan, Iraq or Syria suffer

depression or post-traumatic stress disorder.

More troubling is the fact veterans are twice as likely to become homeless than non-military residents.

Mental health issues are a growing problem throughout our community, but especially for veterans. According to the VA, a veteran will commit suicide every 65 minutes.

We expected so much from out veterans when they stood a post to protect us. Now it's our turn to protect them.

The first step is breaking the barriers that keep veterans from getting help, like feeling embarrassed or weak, long lines at VA clinics and the stigma of having mental health issues.

The next step is to increase the funding and awareness for veteran's care. The best way to start that process is to stop using their needs as a political weapon. Nearly 70 percent of voters believe the government doesn't do enough for our veterans.

And third, we need to increase awareness to available programs. There's nothing more pointless than not being able to connect a veteran's need to a solution.



Sheriff Daniels offers apology for 'embarrassment' caused by 'personal incidents'

CLAY COUNTY – Sheriff Darryl Daniels offered an apology for a six-year affair with a subordinate a day after he returned home from Washington, D.C., to attend a ceremony honoring fallen deputy Ben Zirbel.

Daniels acknowledged "personal incidents" and vowed to refocus his attention to his work as Clay County's top lawman.

He issued the following statement on May 17: $% \left(\frac{1}{2} \right) = \left(\frac{1}{2} \right) \left(\frac{1}$

"I want to take the time to acknowledge a series of personal incidents. I have, in the past, made decisions in my personal life that I truly regret. I sincerely apologize for the embarrassment my past personal decisions have caused. My family has asked that I not discuss private matters in public, so I will not be commenting further on the personal aspects of this issue.

"As I have told the Clay County Sheriff's deputies and staff, I want you to know that every day of my career I have put on my uniform and done my level best to serve the people whom I am sworn to protect. It is an honor to serve with these members.

"To the citizens of Clay County, I reiterate my mission: to keep you safe and battle crime in your neighborhoods." Daniels called CCSO on May 6 and demanded Cierra Smith be detained for stalking him. Smith said she was 21 when she started a six-year affair in 2013 with Daniels, who is 27 years older, while he ran the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office Jail, during his campaign to be Clay County's sheriff and until recent months.

Smith's estranged husband reportedly alerted JSO of the affair.

Smith said Daniels gave her more than \$30,000 during their relationship.

The two were scheduled to meet on May 6 in Oakleaf. Smith followed Daniels into the parking lot of Oakleaf Village Elementary. Deputies quickly responded after Daniels called for help, saying he felt threatened by Smith.

Daniels said in his written statement: "I can draw no other conclusion other than Smith willfully and intentionally followed me in a manner that cause me great concern that if I stopped to engage Smith that I would be exposed to imminent danger."

Smith was detained but quickly released. The Florida Department of Law Enforcement is investigating Daniels.

Also, last Monday Daniels also resigned from the board at St. Johns Classical Academy.



New express lanes a quick, costly way to avoid rush hour traffic

Interstate-295 commuters to and from Clay County now have the choice of a two express lanes east of the Buckman Bridge to eschew the rush hour buildup – but at a cost

Knee-high orange delineators, from the Buckman Bridge to I-95, cordon off the Express Lanes, the Florida Department of Transportation's effort to increase travel speeds by about 13 miles per hour. The project cost \$89 million.

FDOT spokesman Hampton Ray said a significant portion of Clay County commutes outside the county.

A 2013 FDOT safety study showed the Buckman Bridge was traveled by more than 125,000 cars a day, a 15,500-car increase from 1998.

The Express Lanes would better connect drivers from Clay, Duval and St. Johns counties, Ray said. Express Lanes are also under construction from Butler Boulevard to State Road 9B.

"It's going to be great for people heading to downtown via I-95 or heading to the beach and the Ponte Vedra [Beach] area,' Ray said. "Currently the peak hour travel times between the Buckman Bridge and I-95 is 7 miles per hour, so we anticipate that to increase to 20 miles per hour."

Most criticism comes from commuters having to pay the tolls, which will be used to maintain the road. Ray said the Express Lanes eased the burden on the three other lanes on the beltway.

"[The Express Lanes] offer drivers a choice and adds capacity to the roadway," Ray said. "A lot of people are hung up on that they have to pay to use the lanes during peak hours. While that's true, you'll still see an impact on travel speeds on the roadway because of that additional capacity.

The tolls cost at least 50 cents, though the exact cost depends on congestion. The fine for not paying tolls is \$25. To use the Express Lanes, commuters must have a SunPass. Charges are in effect Monday through Friday from 6-10 a.m. and 3-7 p.m.

Only two-axle vehicles are permitted on the Express Lanes, and van-pools, buses and school buses are allowed with an exemption.

SunPasses are available at most major retailers or at SunPass.com.

YMCA, the Habitat for Humanity and the Clay County Chamber of Commerce. Since 2016, he's been the chief strategy officer and human resources director for Hanania Automotive.

He described his position at NAS JAX as comparable with the county manager job. Wanamaker said his management style was akin to a battle rhythm. Constant communication with multiple team members led to the most effective decision-making, he said.

"You have to think, 'What does this project affect down the road?' Wanamaker said. "You've got to manage smart."

Hendry asked Wanamaker why he wanted to leave the fixed parameters of the automotive industry for the rigors of local government.

"There's a lot of unknown factors, why would you do this?" Hendry asked.

"There's something about Clay County

that pulls me here," Wanamaker said. "I want to give back to the community."

Old county courthouse, jail still popular for historians, ghost hunters

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The town is known for many things, but chief among those things might be the Clay County Sheriff's Office and the Clay County Courthouse, with it being visible along the skyline before even entering the city.

That wasn't always the case, because before the 1970s, when tourists weren't bustling on the riverfront, they were likely at the old courthouse located on Walnut Street in the city.

Serving as the home of virtually anything and everything legal, including but not limited to marriages, divorces, taxes, appraisals, licenses and of course, trials, the old Clay County Courthouse has seen thousands and thousands enter through its doors since its inception back in 1889. While most of that happens in different buildings throughout Green Cove Springs today, the old courthouse still finds purpose in the 21st Century.

"Today, we use it for Teen Court and ghost hunters use it to see who still walks the halls."

Garig holds a unique job title in a county government system filled with dozens and dozens of employees. As the archivist, she works as a service of the Clay County Clerk of Court to maintain, update, preserve and learn about Clay County's history. As such, she's the go-to guru for all things related to this county's 150-plus year history.

While the courthouse isn't nearly as busy as it once was, Teen Court finds its courtrooms filled often. Teen Court is a service of the Clerk of Court that allows

juveniles who would otherwise be sent through the county's juvenile system to go through quite literally, a teen court system. The lawyers, the bailiff and even the jury are made up of teens headed by an actual attorney who serves as the judge. Together, juveniles who might otherwise find their record tainted by smaller crimes such as shoplifting are able to go through a trial held by their peers, giving a unique experience to everyone involved.

"These kids can make it out of teen court and see the crime that got them there removed from their criminal record," Garig said. "You can't get into Teen Court without being arrested or volunteering. We don't recommend that kids get arrested, but if someone wants to volunteer, we'd love to have them."

When Garig isn't helping Teen Court work efficiently or handing over the keys of the courthouse to ghost hunters - Garig said she's heard the footsteps of ghosts in the jail and the old courthouse - late at night. Her archives office is located in the 1894 Old County Jail office.

"They're used to me now," she said with a laugh. "I'm used to them, too."

Playing cards are positioned upstairs in the jail and checked periodically to see if they've been "moved."

Built in 1894, the Old County Jail once held dozens of criminals in any of its 16 cells. Featuring large drunk tank-like jail cells, standard jail cells and even solitary confinement cells with little to no exposure to light. The jail, which closed in 1972, now is best known for its paranormal visitors.

The site of paranormal investigation most weekends these days, small-scale ghost hunters to larger conglomerates, like the SyFy channel's "Ghost Hunters" television show, have spent nights within the jail to hear what past prisoners had to say. According to Garig, it's rare that a team of ghost hunters don't encounter ghosts in some way when they enter the jail. On her computer, she has dozens of electronic voice phenomenon and electromagnetic frequency recordings from these ghost hunter teams with many clearly showcasing past prisoners telling new visitors to get out.

Whether you're a ghost hunter or someone interested in the history of Clay County, the old courthouse or the Old County Jail, Garig said she encourages everyone to make a trip to the Clay County Archives within the jail at 21 Gratio Place in Green Cove Springs. There, Garig is happy to show you some history, including documents and pictures from more than 100 years ago, or take you through a tour of where Clay County's worst used to be held.





The military took aim at Clay County nearly 300 years ago

CLAY COUNTY – The Spanish builders of Fort San Francisco de Pupa had to have no idea that they would be the first in a long line of military installations in the county.

Writing in Florida Historical Quarterly in 1951, University of Florida anthropologist John Goggin believed the fort was first mentioned in the early 18th Century. The first structure was already degrading in 1737 and was, "... little more than a sentry house." Located about three miles south of Green Cove Springs, the fort was rebuilt in the 1740s.

The colonial period is rife with conflict between Spain and England. James Oglethorpe, the founder of Georgia, led forays in Clay County in 1740. English aggression toward the Spanish was part retaliation for not returning escaped slaves and previous attacks, and partly because the two colonial powers were used to fighting.

Oglethorpe took the fort with ease after two bombardments, though Goggin wrote that a cannon blast missed Oglethorpe by a matter of feet. He moved on to the Castillo San Marco, where he was less successful.

While Oglethorpe occupied the fort with

a reported 40-man garrison, he later abandoned the structure. Goggin mentions the Spanish may have occupied it again, but by the 1760s the fort was in ruins.

Years after the Spanish withdrew from Florida, American settlers in Clay County had a different problem. The second Seminole War mostly raged in Central Florida, but Garey's Ferry, near modern-day Middleburg, was an outpost in Florida's dangerous frontier.

Fort Heileman, a supply depot that grew to two dozen buildings, was in operation from 1836-1841 on the north bank of Black Creek. It was named after Lt. Julius Heileman, who died at the Battle of Micanopy in 1836.

Soldiers were frequently ambushed and beset by sickness. The Clay County Archives casualty list from the war shows at least 19 men from Garey's Ferry killed. As the Indian chiefs consolidated their forces further south, Fort Heileman became less and less necessary, supplies were funneled to Fort Shannon in Palatka, and it was eventually abandoned.

But Clay would only have to wait about 20 years for the breakout of the Civil War, where Confederate forces tried to fend off a mounting Union presence.

The Union heavily outnumbered Con-

federate forces in the area and later assumed control of the St. Johns River. Prior to 1864, Union forces would occupy and reoccupy Jacksonville. The Middleburg Press' Tom Parham wrote in 1988 how Northeast Florida was a lawless region held barely intact by Confederate Capt. John J. Dickison.

As the Union fortified its position in Jacksonville and Fernandina they crept west into Middleburg in July of 1864. That fall, the 4th Massachusetts Cavalry established an outpost in modern-day Green Cove Springs called Magnolia, raided Middleburg and took rebel guns in Fleming Island. Union and Confederate forces skirmished in Middleburg, Lake Asbury and most notably Halsey's Plantation.

In October of 1864, the 4th Massachusetts Cavalry was ambushed about two miles north of Penney Farms. Reports suggest the Confederates only had a couple wounded while they took 23 Union prisoners and, "...killed 10 or 12," Dickison wrote. Some of the deceased Union troops were interred in Magnolia Springs Cemetery, where they remain today.

Another setback for the Union was the civilian chartered Maple Leaf steamboat, carrying about 400 tons of equipment and baggage. It was sunk by a mine on the St. Johns River in April of 1864. It was excavated from the murky St. Johns in the late-1980s and since then was designated a National Historic Landmark.

Fortunately, that would be the last

serious fighting in Clay County. The 20th Century saw the U.S. Army and Navy use the county for year-round training.

Bases radically transformed the county's population and importance with Camp Blanding, Naval Air Station Lee Field, Keystone Army Airfield, Naval Air Station Jacksonville and Naval Air Station Cecil Field.

The Camp Blanding Museum is in one of the camp's last remaining original structures, a guest house. Camp Blanding was originally slated to be a National Guard facility before the U.S. Army assumed command prior to World War II.

Aerial photos show the camp sprawled around Kingsley Lake, Camp Blanding museum curator Gregory Parsons pointed to a sliver of the fully-realized camp and said the camp was supposed to be significantly smaller with the National Guard. He said the military preferred the warm weather for the 60,000 men that could be on the base at a time. Throughout World War II, the base funneled through about 800,000 troops.

The National Guard's 30,000 acres was increased to about 70,000 after the Army expansion. The government also leased another 80,000 acres for training.

"It was considered the fourth-largest city in Florida during that World War II era." Parsons said.

A handbook for new soldiers referred to

the area having "... the most stylish assortment of alligators this side of the Congo." The camp newspapers mentioned charity boxing matches and vaudeville shows prior to Japan's attack on Pearl Harbor. Troops would stay for about three-and-a-halfmonths. The camp would also train infantry replacements after the war.

"The troops still had to fulfill occupation duty," Parsons said. "Blanding was one of the few sites to continue training replacements all the way to the end of 1945."

Clay County could about 1,200 German Prisoners of War and the camp held about 4,000 over time. Most were crews recovered from U-boats. The German sailors were given books, titled "Kleiner Fuhrer durch Amerika," from the Nazi regime on how American culture worked. Camp guards followed the Geneva Convention and prisoners could take classes on "American Civics."

In the early-1950s, the base, with its size reduced, was returned to the state and is operated as one of the National Guard's primary stations in Florida.

In Green Cove Springs, Naval Air Station Lee Field was a highly regarded pilot training school. Cadets flew F6F Hellcats, F4F Wildcats, F4U Corsairs, N25 Steermans and the NR-1 Ryan. The field was named after Ensign Benjamin Lee, a Jacksonville-born pilot who was killed in World War I.

Opened in 1940, the field consisted of 1,300 acres. Near the front of the Military Museum of Northeast Florida, formerly a repair shop, is an engine of a crashed Hellcat. The pilot was handicapped for training purposes and his altimeter was a few hundred feet off. He lived.

Joe Kennedy Jr. and Ed McMahon served at Lee Field. Falling out of use following the war, the property was annexed by the city of Green Cove Springs in 1980s.

Ray Scott, an eight-year veteran of the Marines who volunteers for the museum, was preparing the museum for Armed Forces Day last week.

"We get people all over the world here," Scott said.

To the south, Keystone Army Airfield had an important run as a reconnaissance school with the 432nd Reconnaissance Group, the 3d Tactical Reconnaissance Squadron and the 313th Fighter Squadron stationed at the field. All three were gone by 1944. The field was given to the city of Keystone Heights in 1947 and is now Keystone Heights Airpark.

In North Clay and Southwest Duval sat Cecil Field, a U.S. Navy air base. The base was decommissioned in 1999, and the city of Jacksonville discussed tearing down some of the older structures. The field saw fighters, carriers and bombers during World War II and a wide range of uses as an Auxiliary field for NAS-JAX.

Former pilot Buddy Harris said after Vietnam, bringing back POWs and servicemen missing in action wasn't as high of a priority for the military as it should have been. Harris worked in the Pentagon after his flying days were over and was a friend of Scott Speicher, who was one of the first casualties of the Persian Gulf War in 1991. Speicher's body was recovered in 2009 in Iraq.

"[Speicher] just had a way about him to make people feel comfortable and not threatened," Harris said. "He did his job and didn't shirk his duties. If you needed something, he'd be there in a heartbeat."

Organizers at Cecil Field are working to establish a POW-MIA Memorial. Cecil Field is one of the few installations that listed its MIAs and a museum is opening soon. The Chapel of the Hi-Speed Pass, where Speicher was married and had his memorial service, was recently refurbished.

"These families deserve this, and we plan on telling their stories," Harris said.

Clay's military might doesn't stop with bases, it's the veterans. There are more than 20,000 veterans in the county. Efforts over the last few years from Rep. Ted Yoho led to the announcement of a VA Clinic in Middleburg.

Voting for the name of the building includes Speicher, and Middleburg-born and "Father of the Marine Air Corp" Gen. Roy Geiger of WWI and WWII distinction. Geiger, 1885-1947, led Marines in the Pacific Theater and was on board the USS Missouri when Japan surrendered.

U.S. Air Force Col. Williams Byrns who flew numerous missions during Vietnam and Desert Storm, was captured and sent to the infamous "Hanoi Hilton." Byrns is the namesake of the local Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter. It's hard to attend a veteran's event without running into the chapter's president David Treffinger and Gary Newman, who was named to the state Veterans Hall of Fame last year. Both served in Vietnam and repeatedly advocate honoring veterans.

Orange Park resident William Phillips, 100, was drafted into the U.S. Navy during WWII. In the South Pacific, Phillips was 19 when he arrived in the Philippines as a supply and logistics officer.

Phillips said the secret to a long life was a strong family and a lack of cigarettes and alcohol. After living in Georgia and New York, Phillips and his wife, Elizabeth, arrived in Orange Park because they wanted someplace warm. They welcomed the new VA Clinic and said the area was excellent for veterans.

"We really liked the area," William Phillips said.

So did the military.

More than \$242,000 over budget, GCS council angrily approves new public works building

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Although it was \$242,546 over budget, contentious and annoyed city council reluctantly approved the final plans by an architect to design the city's new public works administration building.

Given a \$1.3 million budget, original plans submitted by Auld and White Constructors and Bhide and Hall Architects was for a \$1.8 million building. The architects immediately were told to make some "value-engineering" cuts to the plan. The latest plan is for \$1,345,000 – plus the cost adjustments made by the architects.

"As far as I'm concerned, it's been a shell game," councilman Van Royal said. "I'm very disappointed with the contractors. I'm very upset with the architects [Bhide and Hall]. I will not support any kind of work going forward. Every time they made a drawing, they got paid. I'm not going to do that anymore."

All five council members said delaying a final approval would likely lead to additional costs – and an even greater overage.

"We budget based on their estimate," Mitch Timberlake said.

The extra costs will be paid from 2020 tax revenues, assistant city manager Mike Null said.

The city wanted a building that would last as least 50 years, Timberlake said.

Included in the cost-saving cuts were: fewer windows, less restroom tile and the removal of a bike rack.

"We were expecting a 50-year building,"

council woman Pamela Lewis said. "We were expected a good place to work."

The meeting opened with council members Connie Butler, Van Royal and Steven Kelley all being sworn into new terms. After that, the council voted unanimously to appoint Kelley as the new mayor and Royal as the vice mayor.

In other business, the council approved the following:

- To borrow \$1.5 million from Synovus for improvements to three water distribution centers. The money will be paid back by the water utility system during the next 10 years.

- A certified map to the Clay County

Clerk of the Circuit Court showing a portion of Ruby Street that's been built, maintained and repaired continuously for the past four vears.

- The expenditure of \$115,151 for repairs to the Forbes Street gravity sewer system.

- An agreement with the Northeast Florida Area Agency on the Aging for customers eligible under the Home Energy Assistance for the Elderly Program.

- To purchase a used 2014 Chevrolet Tahoe K9 unit from the North Miami Beach Police Department for \$8,200, including repairs and upgrades.

Thomas elected Orange Park mayor a year after claiming gender discrimination

ORANGE PARK – Town council members elected Connie Thomas as Orange

Park's new mayor with a 4-1 vote.

Thomas was nominated for mayor by Council Member Alan Watt, though seconds later Council Member Ron Raymond nominated Watt for the position. Watt then was then confirmed as the vice-

mayor, 5-0.

Last year, Thomas accused council members of gender discrimination after Former Mayor Gary Meeks nominated Raymond to be vice-mayor, which Raymond and Meeks denied.

Tensions cooled. The town council then read a proclamation for Meeks. He was elected in 2010 and served three terms.

Meeks was an officer in the Orange Park Police Department from 1973-1989. Town staff, council members and residents showed their gratitude.

"Tonight marks the end of an era," said former Mayor Steve Howard. "Those of us who know you know how you make everyone else better."

Meeks, who termed out, said he would miss the job. He praised the effort of the town's employees and voters for trusting him, he said. Anderson also thanked Meeks for his service in his council member comments.

"[Council members] have to make the decisions, but all the work that has to be done, [employees] do," Meeks said. "I do appreciate that."

Anderson assumed Meeks' Seat 5 facing no opponent in April. Anderson, a U.S. Navy veteran, was on the Planning and Zoning committee, so a seat on the dais wasn't a major change, he said.

"Once I sat down, I was like 'OK," he laughed at the end of the two-and-a-half hour meeting The 2017-2018 audit presented by Purvis, Gray and Company gave the town a healthy assessment. The town has no outstanding debt. Two items were discussed relating to defining trailers on properties and short-term vacation rentals.

In his council member comments, Raymond returned to the issue of Thomas and 2018 vice-mayor election. Raymond said he was disappointed Thomas didn't apologize for her accusation in the past year.

"I have not forgiven, and I will not forget," Raymond said. "Until you choose to apologize to me personally, we will continue to work together on this dais, each of us coming with our own ideas, but that was a very wrong thing for you to have done."

Thomas did not address Raymond's statement in her comment portion. After the meeting, Thomas called the mayor's role a privilege.

"I felt very honored," Thomas said. "For a place that you love, to have that form of leadership, it's wonderful."




Middleburg High football players "Bronco Up" by helping to box up library materials ahead of scheduled renovation.

vitation to stop at WWP's headquarters on the Southside of Jacksonville.

When he was greeted by two rooms of supporters, his commitment to bring awareness to the organization's programs to treat post-traumatic stress disorder suddenly was clear.

"I was shocked by it all," Brock said. "Actually, I wanted to walk back out. With my PTSD, I wanted to go back in my shell. But it was something I needed to do. It was something I had to do. And it was amazing."

Brock was greeted by WWP Chief Program Officer Jennifer Silva and spokesman Rob Louis. From there, he went to the main lobby where more than 25 fellow veterans and WWP employees were waiting to surprise him. A different group applauded him on another floor.

Everyone wanted pictures, especially with his service dog Pam.

"This is bigger than me," Brock said. "It makes me feel so awesome to be part of a group like this. I certainly picked the perfect [organization to support.] It humbles me to know there are so many people watching me, supporting me and cheering me on."

Brock was less than 1,000 miles from completing his five-month mission to walk 2,650 miles with Pam when he got a call from the V.A. He was told he had less than two weeks to complete a routine two-year evaluation to keep his benefits. The government organization wasn't willing to reschedule, so he was forced to drive home two weeks ago. He completed paperwork and answered question and was done in 15 minutes, he said.

By this Friday, May 24, he hoped to be walking again.

"I'm really charged up," he said. "This makes me feel like the Energizer bunny. I want to go, go, go. I can't say enough about Wounded Warrior Project."

And WWP can't get enough of him. Video boards throughout the headquarters often post updates on his progress.

Brock still has 928 miles remaining in his journey. He originally wanted to arrive by July 3 so he could participate in the town's parade of July 4.

"With all the delays, that's going to be impossible now," he said. "The important thing is to finish. Nothing was going to keep me from going back and getting to Coeur d'Alene."

Especially with so many supporters cheering him on at WWP.

Fleming Island finishes at 19-8 overall while Chiles (15-13) continues into the region with a semifinal game against district 2-8A runnerup Atlantic Coast High on Sat., May 18. Atlantic Coast beat Lincoln 3-1 in their region opener to advance. Wiregrass Ranch and Strawberry Crest, last year's region champion over Fleming Island, play in the opposite region semifinal.

Knights blanked by First Coast

JACKSONVILLE – Oakleaf High junior quarterback Walter "Tre" Simmons, III, played like the seasoned veteran he is, but his 127 yards passing were not enough to overcome mistakes at critical moments in Oakleaf's 20-0 loss at First Coast in the schools' spring game on Fri., May 18.

Simmons, a two-year starter who will be a junior in the fall, displayed accuracy and arm strength while completing 15 of 23 passes without an interception. His statistics were even more impressive considering he was frequently harassed by a speedy Buccaneers defense that sacked him four times and forced him to throw multiple passes off of his back foot or on the run.

On the game's first series, the Knights earned four first downs as they crisply moved to the First Coast 10 yard line. But Simmons could not control a shotgun snap that went high and to his left, and the ball fell to the turf. Simmons jumped on the ball and appeared to be in the process of securing it, but Buccaneers linebacker Jamal Gelsey dove in and ripped the ball out of his hands for a turnover.

"There were times when we came off our blocks a little early. But a majority of the calls tonight were run-pass options, meaning that we leave a linebacker unblocked and read him," Oakleaf coach Frank Garis explained. Oakleaf mounted another scoring threat to begin the second quarter. But a holding penalty negated an 18 yard run by Adrian Grey, and on fourth down, First Coast safety Criston Johnson blitzed and sacked Simmons to keep the Knights off the scoreboard.

Simmons opened the Knights' first possession of the third quarter with six straight passes, completing five of them, to get the Knights into the red zone. But the drive stalled when Simmons was forced to leave the pocket and take a two yard loss on a third down play. On fourth and six from the Buccaneers 15, Simmons' pass to the sideline was broken up.

The Oakleaf defense, which returns seven starters from last year, was stout. The Knights limited First Coast to 106 total yards in the first half and forced two turnovers. Junior defensive end Josh Murrell had two sacks. With the Buccaneers on the Knights' side of the field, rover Chrystian Sellers stepped in front of an underthrown pass, picked it off and returned the ball 12 yards to the Oakleaf 35. Linebacker Marcus Anthony intercepted a desperation heave by Edwards on the final play of the first half, returning the pick 32 yards before being knocked out of bounds.

Each team had exactly 225 total yards of offense.

One area of focus coming into the game was the quest to find a running back to replace three-year starter Keshawn King, a

"I am not looking for someone to seize the job," said Garis. "Davis brings a lot of power, but he is more elusive than you think. Grey has a really good feel for where the open space is, and finding holes."

The 2019 version of the Knights may have to throw in order to set up the run. If so, Simmons and an experienced receiving corps seem up for the challenge. Sophomore Terrance Anthony led all pass catchers with eight catches for 64 yards, while junior Sean Washington snared three balls for 28 yards.

McDaniels' overcomes injuries to sign track scholarship



sophomore season, but by districts, I had a break in my other foot. I tried to gut it out at meets, but I couldn't keep doing it; just too much pain."

McDaniels won the district title in the 400 in his junior year, but tore his right hamstring en route.

"That was unfortunate," said McDaniels

who won in 52.33 and finished second in the 200 in 23.47. "I was seeded first for 400, but tore my hamstring in practice. That stopped most of my summer training for my senior year."

McDaniels started back in his training in October of his senior season and felt like his speed was still intact, but his endurance needed to be refortified.

"In the 400s I was running; 52 lows, I was a little suspect on whether the muscle would last," said McDaniels. "My speed was still good at that time, but coach McEwen worked to get my stamina back to get me back to strength for the 400. I did a lot of flexibility and stretching drills to keep the muscle loose."

At this year's state meet, McDaniels got his 400 mark down to 50.92 and his 200 meters to 22.98. In the region 1-1A 200, McDaniels took fifth in 23.26 and fourth in the 400 in 51.57 with teammate Jett Isley third in the 400 in 51.52.

In the district 2-1A, McDaniels finished third in 22.80 to set the school record while finishing second behind Isley with a 51.75; Isley in 51.44.

"In the district and region races, I had to run from behind in both to get my spots, I took it as gut check," said McDaniels. "I wanted to at least be one of the better sprinters from the county at the state meet."

"She had to up me a bit, I guess," said Thompson. "It's all good."



Floyd top pick with Stanford track

MIDDLEBURG - Middleburg High School athletics ended the spring seasons with a flurry as 11 Bronco athletes signed scholarships to continue playing next fall with track sprinter Marcus Flovd signing one of the top track scholarships out of Clay County.

Floyd, a top 100 meter sprinter (eighth in 2017 at 11.07 seconds), long jumper and triple jump (second in 2017 at 45'-11.75") heads to NCAA track powerhouse Stanford University in California that boasts 13 national championship teams, 84 NCAA champions and 932 All-American athletes for indoor and outdoor track and cross country. Stanford also has 64 Olympic athletes on their storied walls with 19 Olympic medalists and nine Olympic gold medalists; including 2016 womens pole vault champion Katerina Stefanidi.

In 2019, Floyd finished with a 10.81 100 meter best to rank 21st in Class 3A but was a DNF (did not finish, hamstring injury) in the district 4-3A championships; finished second in the district long jump at 21'-1.5"; and fouled out of the district triple jump. As a junior in 2018, Floyd was region 1-3A triple jump champion and third in the 100 meters. Floyd was a DNF in the region 200 final. Injuries curtailed Floyd's state meet appearance.

Joining Floyd on the scholarship celebration was volleyball player Mallory Roney, who joins a legacy of Carrie Prewitt-coached athletes at Indian River State College including Erwin sisters Jenna and Maddie and freshman Jillian Bemis. Roney, a top multi-sport athlete for Middleburg, was also a top basketball player for the Broncos who made the district championship game and also earned a region playoff berth

From the wrestling team, Storm Mercado topped off a district and region title with a strong state meet effort to earn a spot on the NAIA Brewton Parker College wrestling team in Georgia. Brewton Parker had their best wrestling season with a 15th place finish of 49 teams at the NAIA Na-

tional Championships with two All-American wrestlers; a third placer and a sixth placer.

From baseball, Christian Powell and Clayton Simmons will join a slew of Clay County players at NAIA powerhouse Thomas University in Georgia. Thomas won their Sun Conference title in 2019, but lost in the opening round of the NAIA National Tournament. On the Thomas baseball roster are Jarrett Fowler and Tyler Keaton, both of Keystone Heights; Jacob Schmidt, of Oakleaf High, Holden Alexander, of Clay High and Maury Gonzales of Ridgeview plus players from Wakulla, Baker County, Santa Fe and Palatka.

From football, wideout Anthony Havens will play at Culver Stockton College in Canton, MI, where he joins former Fleming Island High running back Chauncey Garrison.

Also in football, Joseph Lied heads to Concordia University Wisconsin, a 7-3 team last year.

Also signing, Bronco cheerleader siblings Mallory and Madison Tomborg will head to Jacksonville University, hoop ace Layton Veon goes to Florida Gateway College in Lake City, and girls hoops ace Jamyah Harkins brings her fast feet to NAIA Warner University in Lake Wales.




