Black Creek Mountain Bike Trail to open Monday

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The Clay County Board of County Commissioners will celebrate the opening of the new Black Creek Mountain Bike Trail at Black Creek Park on Monday at 9 a.m.

The trail, located at 7890 U.S. Highway 17, was built entirely by Southern Off-Road

Bicycle Association in Jacksonville member volunteers whose mission is to create fun, rideable trails in Northeast Florida that are easily accessible, environmentally sensitive, and promote an active lifestyle. SORBA-Jax volunteers have put in nearly 100 hours of work to design, mark and establish the 2.5-mile loop trail, which was completed on June 30.

Volunteers used brush mowers and chain saws to cut the trail out initially and have done weekly routine maintenance with hand tools to keep the vegetation cut back and the path free of debris.

Liberty Ship named for Clay's resident, 18th Florida governor

the afternoon of July 25, 1944 at the St. Johns River Shipbuilding Company in Jacksonville

The clangor of metal on metal, neverending din of engines, shouts and hollers filled the air. This was not unusual to hear 24 hours a day because the plant was working around the clock to satisfy the military demand for ships.

What was unusual was the gradually gathering crowd of state and national powerful, formally dressed political and financial movers and shakers. They were there to celebrate the launching of the shipyard's 51st Liberty ship and christen the vessel in honor of Florida's 18th governor William Sherman Jennings.

Following his term in office, Jennings and his family divided their time between a home in Jacksonville and a working farm and vast timber interests near Middleburg in Clay County. By the day of the launch, Liberty ships were already a symbol of America's gargantuan wartime industrial output but they weren't pretty.

Dubbed "ugly ducklings" by President Roosevelt, the effort began with the construction of a fleet of maritime cargo carriers to supply allies al-

t was windy and bearing down hot on ready fighting. From Sept 1941 to Sept 1945, 2,745 Liberty ships were built. Parts for the W.S. Jennings were prefabricated in 250-ton sections then shipped to ports all over the country for assembly.

The sections were welded not riveted which allowed both rapid and cost-effective construction.

By 1944, the time required had been reduced from 70 days to nearer 50 due to the immense dedication of the American workforce. Heavily represented in the enthusiastic audience were members of the Duval and Clay County Women's Clubs who joined with Florida Federation of Women's Clubs to sell over two million dollars in war bonds and earn the honor of naming rights.

Gov. Jennings had more than ably served the state and with his wife, May Mann supported several of the women's legislative proposals. All this activity was no match for the frenzied yet choreographed action of the previous 52 days when the ship was being built.

The S.S. Jennings was laid down on June 9-441 feet long and 56 feet wide. She was powered by a three-cylinder steam engine and two oil burning boilers were installed allowing the ship to reach a top speed of 11 knots.

9,000 tons of cargo in five holds and that was just the beginning. Jeeps, planes and loaded train cars would be chained to her decks and, when complete, she carried a merchant marine crew of 44 with 12 to 25 naval guards to man the anti- aircraft guns mounted to her deck.

Day and night, crews in shifts continued the job amid raucous shouts and flying sparks until launch day.

Study: Preparing for another Irma too costly Orange Park can't afford to prepare for 100-year storm

ORANGE PARK - Preparing for the water of a 100-year event like 2017's Hurricane Irma is cost-prohibitive, according to a study commissioned by the city council.

The Orange Park Town Council commissioned Jacksonville-based engineering agency Jones-Edmunds to create a flow model to understand how the town could prevent the damage created by Irma. They learned it's not economically feasible.

"Planning for the 100- or five-year events would be cost prohibitive," Jones-Edmunds Vice President and Managing Director Brian Icerman said. "Planning for stormwater levels of that size is beyond the scope and scale of the town."

A 100-year event is based on probability, not a timeframe. A 100-year event means there's a 1% chance of a crippling storm like Irma every year.


Icerman said Orange Park should focus on conveyance for 10-year events and storage for 25-year events. In the realm of events and their associated year amount, the numbers represent how often an event might happen. Irma was classified as a 100year event.

Conveyance in stormwater management deals with a town's ability deal with flood waters. Storage in stormwater management is the use of manmade and natural features such as aquifers to store otherwise overwhelming amounts of stormwater.

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UCF gets federal cash for PTSD treatment center

The University of Central Florida is set to receive another \$1 million federal grant to support its UCF RESTORES research center and treatment clinic aiding activeduty service members and military veterans with post-traumatic stress disorder.

Democratic U.S. Rep. Stephanie Murphy of Winter Park, whose district includes UCF, announced Monday that her office has helped secure the grant from the U.S. Army, following the \$1 million UCF RE-STORES received last year from the Army.

The center will use the new funding along with an additional \$1 million the center is expected to receive in the future to continue developing its own enhanced virtual reality software and improve overall quality of care, Murphy's office said in a news release.

"Those who put their lives on the line to protect our country expect their government to be as resilient in the search for new and innovative ways to help them in their recovery. UCF RESTORES has been a valuable tool in our efforts to treat central Florida veterans and first responders dealing with post-traumatic stress disorder and other forms of trauma," Murphy stated in the release.

UCF RESTORES was established in 2011 with a \$5.1 million grant from the U.S. Department of Defense and \$2.5 million from the Florida Legislature, and has received additional money through the U.S. Department of Defense, the Florida Legislature and philanthropic donations in subsequent years.

The center also assists first responders, survivors of sexual assault, and survivors of mass shootings, and has treated more than 750 people.

UCF RESTORES has attracted national attention for its program using a multi-disciplinary treatment approach, including a technique called exposure therapy, which uses virtual reality and UCF's expertise in simulation and modeling to immerse patients in the situations that gave rise to their PTSD.

"We would like to thank Congresswoman Murphy for her unwavering support and leadership, as well as recognize the strong support of our other champions within the Florida delegation," Deborah Beidel, director of UCF RESTORES, stated in the release. "This funding will allow us to develop new tools to further improve the treatment outcome for those suffering from PTSD. To provide the highest level of

Warrick Dunn also showed up for work, and he

did it without any fanfare Ramsey is the latest in a long line of self-absorbed. self-entitled professional athletes who believe they are

Don Coble more important than their teams or the game itself. And too often, we spend more time either

consoling or condemning their tantrums. In Ramsey's case, he wants to be traded because he doesn't feel "respected" by upper management. I guess he hasn't watched replays of this selfish tirade against head coach Doug Marrone two weeks ago when the coach didn't challenge a 3-yard reception by the Houston Texans. His rant on national television was the epitome of disrespect.

What's troubling is we continue to spend too much time on brats like Ramsey, Antonio Brown and Colin Kaepernick. They all suck the position energy out of the room.

And while we are dwelling on what's wrong with professional sports, we are distracted from others who are doing the right thing.

Like Dunn The former running back with Florida

State, Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Atlanta Falcons already has given away more than 168 homes – 145 in the Tampa and Atlanta areas - to single-parent families. He gave away \$800,000 to help needy families make down payments on new homes when he was a rookie with the Bucs in 1997. That evolved into a mission to give

away homes to honor his mother, Betty Smothers, who was ambushed and killed while escorting a woman to make a night deposit. Dunn was 18 when his mother, a police officer, was killed.

He used her life insurance to buy homes for his younger brothers and sisters.

Now he's working tirelessly to fulfill the dreams of others.

In 2007, Dunn's charitable foundation partnered with Habitat for Humanity to refurbish a home in Gainesville, Ga., for a single mother with four children.

One of those children. DeShawn Watson, now is the starting quarterback for the Texans.

"We were in government housing," Watson told The Associated Press. "I felt grown having my own room. Just having my own bed, not really being squished, not really worrving about someone sneaking up on me. It was a great moment, a special moment.'

Watson's mother, Deann Watson, put 200 hours of sweat equity into the build.

'We're helping people who are helping themselves," Dunn said. "It's crazy how much pride people have when it's something they work for and not something they're given."

Watson now volunteers time and donates money to Habitat for Humanity. He also gave his first game check in 2017

as a rookie - \$27,353 - to three women who worked at the stadium cafeteria who were deeply affected by Hurricane Harvey.

BCC approves \$358 million budget for next fiscal year

Millage rate will remain at 8.101

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - The county commission approved a new budget Tuesday night that won't reflect a rate change compared to last year.

The BCC approved the final millage rate of 8.101. It was approved with a unanimous vote, while the final budget of \$357,672,699 was approved 4-1, with commissioner Wayne Bolla dissenting because it reflects a deficit of nearly \$1 million.

"So it was about \$4 million (deficit) talked about at the last board meeting," County Manager Howard Wanamaker said. "(A) \$1.5 million in loss of revenue for the general fund. With that, we also had a \$2.5 million cut in reserves. But after all of that. we were able to cut it down to \$986,000."

Wanamaker was happy while cutting the deficit from \$4 million to \$986,000, there were no cuts to county services, like fire and police. The county cannot survive with the budget since it will deplete the reserves that covered shortages, Wanamaker said.

Bolla was thankful for the work Wanamaker and staff put in to decrease the deficit, but he couldn't approve a budget with a deficit in reserves.

'I've got to put a stake in the ground and say I'm going to have a hard time voting for a budget with a deficit of \$1 million." Bolla said.

The other commissioners voted to approve the budget but had concerns with future budgets and deficits. Commissioner Diane Hutchings said she wouldn't vote for a budget with a deficit next year. Instead, she'd like to see the county work together to create a fair and fiscally sound budget with untouched reserves.

The deficit won't wipe out the reserves. It simply will reduce the amount budgeted for the fund.

Part of that deficit can be attributed to what commissioner Gavin Rollins called the largest increase requested by the sheriff's office. That increase was originally pitched at more than \$10 million, but sheriff Daryl Daniels and Wanamaker negotiated a final increase of \$4,939,978.

"We could argue for days whether or not a creek or Dudley Branch is storage or conveyance, but for the sake of argument, let's call anything localized 10-year and the major ones 25 because the town doesn't really have any major storage system as in a reservoir," Icerman said.

'The way the town comp plan reads, the town is not obligated to protect beyond that. That doesn't mean you shouldn't choose to it just means that as far as what you have promised in the comp plan is to protect up to the 25-year event."

Icerman said as the town continues its work in improving stormwater management and maintenance, the town will soon hit a breakpoint in the cost-benefit curve. He

doesn't recommend the town proceed bevond a 25-year event.

"So, you've got this tool (the flow model) that allows you to do what-if scenarios." Icerman said.

"The next steps are to look at these improvements, prioritize them, find out what's the right combination of (cost and benefit) and eventually, you'll have to put everything together in a capital plan."

Icerman said the perks of the flow model is that with all future stormwater projects, the town can utilize the what-if scenarios to determine what could happen in different areas of town. The town is still waiting to receive FEMA money for hurricanes Matthew and Irma, and it's pursued grants to help pay the cost of stormwater.

High-speed chase leaves cars crashed, rush-hour traffic snarled

Jacksonville man charged with trying to out-run CCSO in Orange Park, Fleming Island

ORANGE PARK - A 20-year-old Jacksonville man led police on a high-speed chase through Orange Park and Fleming Island Monday, leaving a wake of at least four crashed cars and tying up rush-hour traffic on U.S. Highway 17.

Ayrmon Gerimiah Wilson faces a litany of charges, including aggravated assault with intent to commit a felony, possession of an unlicensed handgun, altering or removing the serial number from the handgun, possession of marijuana and Ayrmon Gerimiah drug paraphernalia,

failing to stop for a crash with injuries, leaving the scene of an accident involving property damage and attempting to flee from police officers with lights and sirens active.

According to the Clay County Sheriff's Office, Wilson was seen speeding southbound on Blanding Boulevard near College

Drive. Wilson made a u-turn and turned right onto Londonderry Drive and left onto Stone Haven Court. Deputy A.L. McCrea realized Stone Haven was a dead end, so he used his car to block the road. Wilson sped toward the patrol car, forcing McCrea to make evasive action to avoid a collision.

Wilson eventually turned south on U.S. 17 and he made another u-turn at the Doctors Lake Bridge, which led to three other vehicles being involved in a crash. He turned left onto Kingsley Avenue and hit another car. Wilson tried to escape by running by the Orange Park Town Hall and Orange Park Police Department. He was captured two blocks away.

Wilson remained in the Clay County Jail

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



Middleburg High's McRee earns pair of top honors State honors her with Excellence in History; district with most-improved teacher

MIDDLEBURG – A Middleburg High history teacher received a state award and was named the most-improved teacher in the Clay County School district.

Eleventh grade U.S. history teacher Julie McRee earned an Excellence in History award from the state and was recognized by the district after a 15-point increase in her students' passing rate on state exams.

Teachers work because they care for their students and want to ensure their futures are bright. But that doesn't mean an award or two doesn't make them feel just as great about their work.

"She believes that every student is capable of thinking at high levels," Clay County School District Social Studies Specialist Kelly Watt said. "Because of this, she is constantly reflecting on her impact in the classroom and revising her approach."

Watt said that over the past year, those reflections have led to a 15-point increase in her students' pass rate on state exams.

This shows just how important and the impact of Mcree's energy, reflection and innovative mindset.

McRee has taught for nine years at Middleburg. For her, this award means recognition for her passion in something she loves so dearly. "I feel very humbled, blessed and thankful for receiving this award and it is a great honor to not only represent Clay County but now the state of Florida," McRee said. "This award means that I'm being recognized for something I love and have a passion for: teaching students to love United States history.

School Board ponders dropping FSA testing for SAT, ACT

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The Clay County School Board and district staff have their

2020 legislative priorities lined up and it may include the removal of Florida State Assessment test for high schools.

Superintendent Addison Davis said during last Tuesday's agenda workshop meeting there's a bigger push to put end FSA testing in favor of a larger focus on nationwide tests like the SAT and ACT. He and the board said this is something they've wanted for years.

"I continue to put SAT and ACT on here because I think we need to eliminate highstakes assessments in high schools and punt it," Davis said. "If a kid is applying to Harvard...wherever...they don't really care if a student is level one, two, three, four or five on the FSA. They only want to know what your GPA is and what your SAT and ACT scores are."

Davis said he believes the school district should push the state to remove FSAs and instead, use the money that would have been spent on FSAs to cover the costs of an SAT test for every 10th grade student. The state would save tremendous amounts of money if they wiped assessments like the FSA, according to Davis.

The school board agreed with Davis.

"He's (Commissioner of Education) is ready to go," Davis said. "I think he and his team are, in a couple of years, ready to wave all of the assessments in high schools and use the SAT and ACT."

Two other priorities for the district are teacher salaries and teacher bonuses for those that teach dual enrollment classes.

Davis said the state is looking to increase starting teacher salaries but, to avoid any discrepancies with teachers already hired, he'd prefer to see a holistic raise across the board happen. Instead of just starting salaries being increased, all teacher salaries need to go up, Davis said.

As for teacher bonuses, right now, AP teachers receive a \$50 bonus for every one of their students that passes their AP

Pilot program to remove phosphorus from Doctors Lake

Legislature earmarks \$1.5 million for Fleming Island treatment plant

FLEMING ISLAND - A pond at the Fleming Island Regional Wastewater Treatment Facility will become a key component of removing phosphorus from Doctors Lake.

Local and state officials attended the groundbreaking for the Doctors Lake Phosphorus Removal Pilot Project last Tuesday morning.

The St. Johns River Water Management District received a \$1.5 million appropriation from the Legislature last year.

The pilot project handles treated waste before it enters the Doctors Lake water-

shed. The water is distributed onto a media bed, a sandy mulch-like material that clings to phosphorus and leaves no byproducts. The waste is filtered, it re-enters the effluent line and is chlorinated. Then it will be reused or enter the watershed.

Phosphorus is a nutrient algae feed from. Algae blooms on the St. Johns River are more prevalent recently. Blooms have numerous health effects and they block sunlight for underwater plants that fish populations eat.

There are about 10 algae blooms in Doctors Lake according to the state Department of Environmental Protection's algae dashboard.

"If you cut off or diminish the supply of phosphorus you begin to constrain how much algae you have," District Executive Director Ann Shortelle said. "One project is not going to get us where we need to be,

but with many projects working in concert we're going to begin to make good progress.

Clay County Utility Authority Executive Director Tom Morris said CCUA would

do its part to improve the water quality at Doctors Lake.

Success baked into everything at Wicked Batter Café

ORANGE PARK – Sister Barbara Tharp and Kelsie Willoughby run Wicked Batter Café, where a sweet smell of confectionary – and success – hits you at the door.

It opened last December at 997 Blanding Blvd. after a lengthy construction process, with no loans or outside investors. Tharp said she had 24 years of experience

in restaurant business. Willoughby has about 12. Tharp's husband Timothy is a co-owner.

If it's a baked good, Wicked Batter probably makes it from scratch.

Tharp said she felt most restaurants defrost food and heat it up. Not many places make things from

scratch, she said, and bakeries are few and far between in the county. "I grew up up north," Tharp said. "(Bak-

eries) are everywhere."

One of Wicked Batter's main draws they stumbled onto by accident.

Keto is a popular diet gaining prominence: it's essentially high-fat, low carb and low sugar products. Tharp and Willoughby received a keto order and had extras. Demand then rose from word of mouth.

Tharp said keto products are hard to

find in the region.

"Six hours go north, south, east or west, you can't find another keto bakery," Tharp said. "You know with desserts, carbs and sugar are the two biggest components, so it's a big stressor for a lot of people. The cool thing is a lot of diabetic people can eat it."

Wicked Batter is entertaining the idea of shipping keto products nationally.

"I think people are going to start a riot if we don't," Willoughby said.

Tharp said Clay County residents shouldn't have to drive 45 minutes for a bakery in Jacksonville. The café's community outreach, from baking cakes for foster children's birthdays next month or sponsoring school sports teams, was a key element.

"We came here on purpose. We wanted Orange Park to have something unique, so you didn't have to drive to Riverside, San Marco or the St. Johns Town Center," Tharp said. "We get a lot of people who are like, 'I'm so excited, you're so close!' We really wanted to get back to the old school, community café, restaurant kind of feel."

A plan to expand Wicked Batter's reach is in order. Willoughby called Wicked Batter's format inexpensive and easy to replicate. Tharp added that franchising was an option from the beginning, but thanks to word of mouth and repeat customers, it's closer to reality.

"We had projections for how we'd do, but we really surprised ourselves," Tharp said.

"We have so many connections to history and I attempt to teach my students to recognize and learn from them."

McRee said she is honored to be named the most improved teacher in the district as well but she's not quick to take the credit for it. It was the students who passed the exam, and the cooperation between other teachers and administration at the school that helped her achieve this, she said.

McRee said principal Roger Dailey and Watt were especially helpful as they were always willing to help and give her muchneeded advice.

"I cannot tell you how much I admire, value and respect any professional educator who is so willing to make herself more vulnerable and endure so much stress in order to produce a more effective outcome for her students," Dailey said.

McRee said her faith in God and her Christian faith are what keep her going year after year, and what help her achieve awards like the Excellence in History award.

"My belief that teaching is a calling, this is what keeps me going," McRee said. "My Christian faith is extremely important to me...I rely on constant prayer, strength and patience. On days when it is stressful, I have to believe that God placed me in the position I am in, therefore, I want to serve Him well.

"So, I give God all the glory for any recognitions I receive and for my students' success."

McRee's husband and her children also deserve credit, McRee said, because they were patient and supportive with her when she needed it most.

For teachers hoping to follow in her footsteps, McRee said it's important they love their subject and that they teach that subject in a variety of ways.

"Students need to know that you care about them and want them to succeed," McRee said. "Have patience, especially on those stressful days."

Sugar and books aside, Owens said it's a great celebration for everyone involved.


"I think it's a really good idea," Owens said. "Showing the kids that we're here and we care is important and I'm happy to be here for that."

ORANGE PARK – St. Johns River State College will present "FASFA Frenzy," at its three locations this fall, beginning with the Orange Park campus on Oct. 10. The event will provide free assistance to families applying for college financial aid.

"The event will provide qualified students with assistance in completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), which is the first and most important step in applying for financial aid."


Students can base their financial information on the previous year's tax return. Potential students intending to enroll in college during the 2020-21 academic year are encouraged to complete the form as soon as possible, as some funds are awarded on an as-needed basis while others are awarded first-come, first-served.

FAFSA Frenzy nights are scheduled for the Orange Park campus on Oct. 10, 283 College Dr., from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.; St. Augustine campus on Oct. 17 from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. and the Palatka campus on Oct. 24 from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.

During the event, current and potential students can participate in: FREE step-by-step instructions for completing and submitting the FAFSA, along with the Florida Financial Aid Application. Computers will be provided and Financial aid presentations.

To complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), students/ parents will need to bring the following: social security number; driver's license number; alien registration number (if not a U.S. citizen); most recent federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned. (Note: You may be able to transfer your federal tax return information into your FAFSA using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool); bank statements and records of investments (if applicable); and, records of untaxed income (if applicable).

Filling out the FAFSA doesn't obligate students to a particular career track or college.

Robert Dews led the volunteer effort to build the mountain bike trail. He chose Black Creek Park as the location for the new trail because it is close to a densely populated area and has parking and restrooms on site.

Dews said. "Black Creek Park is perfect for a mountain bike trail because of its raw natural beauty, dry sandy soils, and unique topography with elevation changes that might make you forget you are in Florida." Riders and pedestrians can also see some local history along the trail including the remnants of an old highway that ran between Jacksonville and Green Cove Springs.

'The trail is classified as easy, but it will definitely get your heart pumping. There are a few minor technical sections with log crossings and hills, but it is family friendly. Great for hiking, too."

Clay County Commissioner Wayne Bolla has supported the mountain bike trail project from the beginning.

"It is great to see this kind of citizenlead volunteer effort that fosters such strong community pride," he said.

Clay County has worked closely with SORBA- Jax through the entire process: attending bike trail planning meetings, drafting the lease agreement, and providing trail signage, maps and a kiosk to mark the trail head.

Chairman Mike Cella said, "Thanks to the efforts of SORBA-Jax volunteers, residents and visitors now have an exciting new outdoor adventure in Clay County".

The Black Creek Mountain Bike Trail is located at Black Creek Park, which runs adjacent to U.S. 17 on Fleming Island. The park offers eight miles of paved path, restrooms, and a covered picnic area, as well as ample parking for visitors. Space Florida, MHD-Rockland invests in Keystone Airport

Funds would add hangar facility, warehouse, office, taxiway, ramp space

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – MHD-Rockland is significantly investing in a pilot training and resource center at the Keystone Heights Airport.

MHD Rockland Services Senior Program Manager Todd Falconer said the company will receive up to \$24 million in backing from Space Florida. The funds would be used to build a hangar facility, warehouse, an office, a taxiway and ramp space.

The Canadian company operates a training school at the airport and currently leases two hangars and a warehouse.

"We met with Space Florida several times. There were a bunch of disclosures we had to provide to them," Falconer said. "But with our company, everything you can imagine is a very detailed process."

The facility is scheduled to open in two years and would feature 150,000 square feet of warehouse, hangar, training and office space.

The investment will include new services that will benefit pilot training for airplanes like the P3 Orion.

"We've been present in Florida since 2012 and are delighted with our decision to build and expand in the state," said MHD-Rockland CEO Bryan Dollimore. "... We're optimistic about growing our presence and contributions in Keystone Heights and throughout the state as we deliver our specialized training and services to customers and assert the status of Florida and the United States as leaders in the global aerospace industry."

Space Florida approved the funds at its July Board of Directors meeting, according to an MHD-Rockland press release. Falconer said good will from Keystone Heights Airport's accommodation meant investing at the airport was a positive step.

"We've always had a lot of support from

the airport itself. It's a primary reason for us deciding to stay there," Falconer said. "They've been fantastic business partners with their mentality and the way they work. They've been straightforward with us since Day One and we try to do the same."

Keystone Heights Airport officials praised the funds and MHD-Rockland's commitment.

"The (Keystone Heights Airport Authority) is pleased that Space Florida recognizes the incredible asset that MHD Rockland Services is to the Keystone Airport and surrounding communities," Airport Board Chairman David Kirkland said. "We look forward to working with them as they continue to develop their new facilities."

DeLeon sees franchisees as long-time partners that fit the culture of Grumpy's. He said Grumpy's would open in calculated and guided fashion, similar to the neighborhood diner feel of the Kingsley Avenue location.

Jacksonville RV show moves to Clay fairgrounds

Fall show scheduled for Oct. 10-13

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - The Jacksonville Fall RV Show at the Clay County Fairgrounds has a few firsts attached to it.

It's the first major recreational vehicle show held at the fairgrounds. The show is hosted by the Florida RV Trade Association's Northeast Florida chapter from Oct. 10-13.

The fall show was held at the Morocco Shrine Auditorium near the University of North Florida last year, garnering a crowd of about 4,600 people, according to FRVTA President Ken Loyd.

The St. Johns County Fairgrounds in Elkton were subject to Hurricane Matthew and Hurricane Irma in 2016 and 2017. The

RV Mega Show at the Jacksonville Equestrian Center usually draws 10,000 people Lovd said.

"The main thing is to show people what new units are out there and what's available for the general public whether it's a small 2,500 pound unit, or a huge fifth wheel or motorhome." said Lovd, who is also the assistant general manager at Flamingo Lake RV Resort.

Loyd said FRVTA were drawn to the fairgrounds because it was an open area that hadn't hosted a major show. He estimated between 100-200 RVs would be on display.

"What I've noticed is that everything at the Clay County Fairgrounds has a great following," Loyd said. "There's a good base out there.

The RV show is the Clay County Fair Association's first non-fair event. The association is a nonprofit that organizes the Clay County Fair and owns land near the



fairgrounds; the county owns, maintains and rents the fairgrounds.

The association's general manager, Tasha Hyder, said most of the fairgrounds' events were from third parties. She said it was intriguing to add another community event to the county.

"(The association) usually focuses on the fair itself. so this is the only event we've co-sponsored so far," Hyder said. "I don't think there's been anything similar to it. It's exciting to bring a new event to the area.'

Loyd said there's a great amount of camaraderie, community and support.in the RV community. Lovd said at an RV campsite the more experienced RV owners give tips or help when they see somebody struggling with hookups.

"It just amazed me when my wife and I started doing it, how everyone always looked out for each other," Loyd said. "It's a real positive for the industry that more and more people are looking to get into it and it's starting with younger couples and families with small children."

The show runs from 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Oct. 10-12. and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Oct. 13. Adult admission is \$5 and children 12 and younger get in free. Seniors receive a \$2 discount Oct. 10, and military and first responders receive a \$2 discount on all days.

With the budget behind them now, the BCC hopes to see their finances return to form next year. Hutchings said a team effort needs to be made to make that happen.

"Now next year, the state has already forecasted that we're going to see a shortfall and that we're not going to see as much revenue as this year," Hutchings said. "For next year, we need to be thinking ahead.

There are not going to be any surprises. If you're looking at what you got this year, the goal should be to try to live with that next year because we're not going to have more money. We're going to have less.

"That would be my caution. I fully support this budget and I give you all kinds of accolades (Wanamaker) - what a way to get baptized by fire coming in - and I, too, am not happy about digging into the reserves and my goal next year is that I will not support it. Everyone needs to work together to balance our county budget and

the children were ready.

Jackson was waiting his turn for the bikes with his class.

"I think we're going to zoom very fast because I like going fast," the kindergartener said.

The school was selected by Tucker Powersports for a \$4,000 grant via the All Kids Bike Initiative. The initiative provides 22 Strider bikes and pedal conversion kits, 22 helmets and a five-year support plan for schools.

RideOut Elementary Principal Kim Marks said riding bikes at an early age was an excellent opportunity for children. She said the initial goal was to teach them balance and mobility. The All Kids Bike Initiative cites multiple studies showing the positive effects of riding a bike at a young age. Overweight adolescents who participate in bicycling three to four days a week are 85% more likely to have a normal weight as adults, a study from the Journal of Pediatric and Adolescent Medicine stated.

"It's going to build social and emotional health as well as their physical wellbeing," Marks said.

"Once you learn how to ride a bike, you never forget they say."

Marks said the school and future students benefited long term from the grant.

"We feel it's going to touch many children. These bikes are never going away," Marks said. "It'll be with our kindergarteners for the next few years."

Tucker Powersports staff members were on hand. Distribution center manager Jason Moak said the tiny bikes help bridge a gap for young bike-riders. The vendor, Strider, sold about 7 million small bikes, he said.

'We're excited to be part of the program," he said. "The balance really comes early.

Superintendent Addison Davis said he hoped the bikes would give children a fondness for riding and physical activity.

"Riding bikes is ageless," Davis said. "There's so many physical and mental benefits to riding a bike."

"(Franchisees) have to believe in what we're doing and that it works," DeLeon said. "It's a model that's been done many times over, as opposed to me trying to build a huge corporate structure to open these stores myself."

What makes Grumpy's an effective brand, he said, was fresh made-to-order food, the old school Americana ambiance and low prices in tune with working class and small communities. He said he wanted customers to be on a first-name basis with staff the way they would be with a barber or bartender.

"To me, it's about the price point. It has to be honest. I don't believe in pushing the envelope on our consumer," DeLeon said. "You're never going to see avocado toast for \$15 on our menu."

DeLeon said his marketing research showed people wanted a hearty homecooked meal before work or during lunch hour. The younger generations wanted a place to hang out and to take pictures of items like the s'mores waffles and cinnamon roll pancakes for social media.

Combining those groups didn't mean Grumpy's had to be high-end, he said.

"It's a blend," DeLeon said.

Exotic animals gone wild Pet store specializes in animals for zoos, collectors

MIDDLEBURG – Wild Things Exotic Animals has an assortment of tanks, tubs and cages.

The first room on the left is reserved for mammals like ferrets, degu and sugar gliders. Tarantulas and geckos are on different sides of the counter, where customers can buy mice and crickets for their animals. The two back rooms hold lizards, toads,


tortoises and a small caiman crocodile. You are usually in the same room as dozens of snakes.

The back room is a nursery and it holds the future breeders and "VIPs," said owner Matt Crews.

Matt Crews said he was fascinated with playing in the

woods and nature as a child growing up in rural Clay County. He didn't want the politics of working at a zoo, so he gathered the experience to breed animals and sell to zoos around the world.

He owns Wild Things with his wife Paula Crews. They produce their own animals, and at home have 200 crepuscular snakes,



The pair, with an extensive experience in reptiles and amphibians, said owning an exotic animal has moved beyond stereotypes. Matt Crews said it's not on the fringes anymore like tattoos.

About 4.7 million of U.S. households have a reptile as a pet according to the

American Pet Products Association's 2017-2018 National Pet Owners Survey. The same survey estimated there were 9.4 million reptiles as pets in the country.

"Once you get over that shock of, 'Oh my God, that's a tarantula. Oh my God, that's a snake,' you open your eyes to it and say, 'That's fascinating and interesting,'" Matt Crews said.

Paula Crews highlighted the educational side of the store. She lets a boy hold a tarantula and tells another about a bearded dragon that hurls itself at the glass.

"It's like the puppy of the reptile world," she said. "It just wants to play."

Matt Crews held out a feisty dwarf caiman crocodile and customers asked questions.

"Most of the species of caiman stay relatively small," Matt Crews said. "It's only going to reach about four and a half or five feet in length."

Two of the Crews' geckos produced an axanthic offspring, meaning it lacked a red pigment and came out silver. The Crews had to prove it's a genetic trait and not an anomaly.

"Those parents produced several (silver offspring) over the next two years. We raise them and breed those back together," Matt Crews said. "If those babies hatch axanthic as well, then we have proven that's not an anomaly."

Wild Things moved to its current location at 2500 Blanding Blvd. in 2010. The Crews have personally trained the staff and the store offers advice on Facebook. The Crews' animals have been featured on the Discovery Channel, Animal Planet and National Geographic for specials and stock footage.

"You can get a gecko anywhere, but we want the experience to be pleasant," Paula Crews said. "We want people to leave knowing what they've gotten themselves into."

Seven days a week staff cleans and feeds the hundreds of animals. Matt Crews said Wild Things went through 30,000 crickets a week.

"The biggest thing with this big of a selection of animals is the care involved for the animals. Every animal needs water, food, they need to be cleaned. It's a tremendous amount of work," Matt Crews said. "If you had a radio store, if you came in, you would just dust off the shelves and turn on the lights."



In the Lakeside gymnasium, the unbeaten Lady Gators (9-0) controlled the Oakleaf volleyball team with a decisive first game.

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

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







For the women, Becky Dougherty, 40, won that title in 21:04 with Annette Harris, 37, second in 28:09.








