

Guzman picked Green Cove Police Chief


Longtime GCSPD Commander replaces Derek Asdot

t's been 124 years since an 8-year-old Virginia O'Hanlon asked a question that would become an iconic part of Christmas: Is there a Santa

Claus?

Virginia O'Hanlon lived with her parents in New York in September 1897, when she wrote to the New York Sun asking whether her friends' opinions that there was no such person as Santa Claus were, indeed, correct.

Francis Pharcellus Church, an editorial writer with the newspaper, wrote what proved to be a masterpiece, passionately telling the girl, "Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus"

Here is that iconic holiday classic:

DEAR EDITOR:

I am 8 years old. Some of my little friends say there is no Santa Claus. Papa says,'If you see it in THE SUN it's so.' Please tell me the truth; is there a Santa Claus?




VIRGINIA O'HANLON 115 WEST NINETY-FIFTH STREET

VIRGINIA, your little friends are wrong. They have been affected by the skepticism of a skeptical age. They do not believe except they see. They think that nothing can be which is not comprehensible by their little minds. All minds, Virginia, whether they be men's or children's, are little. In this great universe of ours man is a mere insect, an ant, in his intellect, as compared with the boundless world about him, as measured by the intelligence capable of grasping the whole of truth and knowledge.

Yes, VIRGINIA, there is a Santa Claus. He exists as certainly as love and generosity and devotion exist, and you know that they abound and give to your life its highest beauty and joy. Alas! how dreary would be the world if there were no Santa Claus. It would be as dreary as if there were no VIRGINIAS. There would be no childlike faith then, no poetry, no romance to make




College transfer portals emphasize endorsements, not winning games

he Florida Gators got some good news Tuesday when quarterback Jack Miller announced he was

transferring from Ohio State to play for the Gators next year – just days after Florida starter Emory Jones announced he plans to transfer away from Gainesville.

College players jump from team to team with the same frequency of a dropped pass by the Jacksonville Jaguars. As a fan, it's impossible to embrace a college team when the roster changes every year. College rosters always are evolving, but complete overhauls every year is troubling.

For example, guard Charlie Moore now is playing for his fourth college basketball team. He started at California, moved to DePaul, then to Kansas and now he's playing for the Miami Hurricanes

Why? Because players have the freedom of movement – and the ability to cash in on the highest bidder.

new rule that started on July 1 allows student-athletes to profit from their identities and endorsement deals. Travis Hunter, a running back from Suwanee, Georgia, decided to play at the smaller Historical Black College and University school.

As a program, nobody believes Jackson State has the money to pay Hunter. But if a rich booster wants to throw cash at Hunter, there's nothing the school can do to stop it – even if they wanted to.

Moments after Hunter's surprising announcement, many believed Jackson State already set up a Name, Image and Likeness deal with supporters of the athletics department. Head coach Deon Sanders quickly debunked the ploy, but Hunter is free to get paid with endorsements and appearances.

Ole Miss Coach Lane Kiffin doesn't like pay-for-play, saying "the kids are going to go where they get paid the most."

"We're in free agency but there are no contracts," Kiffin told the Clarion-Ledger newspaper. "I really hope for these kids they're getting all the money they're being promised at these schools when they get there. Because there's a lot of money being promised so I hope for them they get it."

While athletes should be allowed to

to control and profit from their likeness, there are massive loopholes in the program. Coaches can use outside endorsements as an additional recruiting tool.

Heisman Trophy-winning Alabama quarterback Bryce Young already had deals worth "seven figures" before he made his first start for the Crimson Tide.

"Our OB has already approached ungodly numbers, and he hasn't even played yet," Alabama coach Nick Saban said. "It's almost seven figures.

Make no mistake: that was a recruiting pitch for other five-star athletes.

"That number blew me away," Kiffin said at the SEC preseason press confer-

Central Florida quarterback Dillon Gabriel left the Knights and accepted a "deal" at UCLA after considering offers from Oklahoma.

South Carolina women's basketball star Aliyah Boston was signed to represent Bojangles, and Penn State offensive tackle Caedan Wallace was hired as a spokesman for a car dealership and athletic clothing store during his freshman season.

Fresno State women's basketball twins Haley and Hanna Cavinder work for Boost Mobile; Kansas basketball star Mitch Lightfoot is a front man for 1-800-Got-Junk; LSU quarterback Myles Brennan pitches Smoothie King; and, Mission BBQ has the entire Notre Dame offensive line under contract.

Incoming Tennessee State basketball player Hercy Miller had a \$2 million endorsement from Web Apps America before he started his freshman season, while Miami quarterback D'Eriq King got \$20,000 to be the face of College Hunks Hauling Junk and Moving and Murphy Auto Group.

If a business skips a payment, the players are welcomed to re-enter the transfer portal to find a new deal. That makes college athletics more about bank balances from supporters than building a winning program.

him as Chief of Police."

As the Police Chief, Guzman said he will continue to build on programs he and Asdot established.

"My vision is to continue and improve on our community events, community relations," he said. "Also, getting accreditations in the future. We've been working on that. We've started the process to be accredited through CALEA [Commission of Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies]. That's one of the goals that's been set by the city manager. Many of them graduate with further clarity besides their further education. Lebrasseur



ACE fills in the educational gaps

ORANGE PARK — Adult and Community Education assists nearly 1,000 students a year and offers GED and numerous certification opportunities through the Clay County School District.

The ACE program is the sole provider for the GED program and GED prep classes in the county. The minimum age limit is 16 if the person is no longer enrolled in a traditional school and there no maximum age. The program also offers English as a second language courses and certificates for nursing, 911 dispatch or phlebotomy.

ACE Transitional Specialist Rachel Walker said ACE usually gets about 900 students a year over its three semesters, in-person and online. Classes run about \$30 and more information is available by calling (904) 336-4457. ACE's office is located at 2306 Kingsley Ave.

"I would say we have a pretty large impact. When people think about education, they forget there are people that didn't get to finish," Walker said. "We get them back

Veteran using book to empower himself, other PTSD vets

ORANGE PARK — A local Marine who served in the Vietnam War has written a book he hopes will help those suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder.

Edgar Maroon, who is from Orange Park, wrote "PTSD, Not All Wounds Are Visible: Veterans and Active-Duty Members of the U.S. Armed Forces," which was published in October. In the book, Maroon

details his struggles with PTSD and story of mitigating the condition that afflicts between 11-30% of veterans from combat situations according to the National Center for PTSD.

"Mostly, I wrote

this book for me," Maroon said. "I learned a lot I didn't know. It's something that I did to help out people who have these problems.'

He intended the book as a guide to understanding PTSD symptoms, causes, triggers and living with the disorder. He said there is hope through treatment, counseling and therapy. The book tackles everything from veterans' resources, filing taxes or service dogs.

Maroon's Cavalier King Charles Spaniel is a loval and helpful companion, he said, keen to follow him and take good care of him.

"When I get upset, she knows it before I know it," Maroon said. "She gives me the love that somebody in

that predicament needs."

Working through the pain and anguish with professionals was Maroon's way out. Part of the book tackles what not to say to a veteran, such as "Get over it." Maroon tells veterans they are not alone.

"You can't get over it. You have to work through it until you're good again. You can get better - and I have," Maroon said. "I had a bad attitude. I just wanted to be by myself. I had bad dreams about my time in a combat zone."

Through many rewrites, the first-time author's vision of a book was realized. Maroon's aim is putting his knowledge together to assist someone in need.

"It's not easy to write a book. I'm just a retired Marine who's been through all this stuff, writing now is for my mental health." Maroon added. "I did a lot of research and I read so much about PTSD and people with it and I knew exactly how they felt."





the back parking lot by daybreak, and children, most still in pajamas, were waking up to the reality of having gifts under the tree on Christmas morning.

"Even if one kid gets a Christmas gift who normally wouldn't, it's a success," said charity president J.P. Steinmezt.

More than 1,000 children got a stuffed animal and four large toys. All were broken down by ages and whether they were for a boy or a girl. And half of the children could pick a bicycle from a selection of more than 650.

"We gave away 500 bikes," Steinmezt said. "Every child that wanted a bike, got one. The ones who didn't get a bike didn't want one – whether it was because they already had a bike or they didn't have

By the time deputies arrived, Cooper had been shot, according to the arrest report.

According to the Clay County Sheriff's Office, Gregory Alford Sheffield, 32, of Middleburg, was upset with his uncle, Daniel Anthony Cooper, 56, of Middleburg, over Cooper getting power of attorney over Sheffield's grandmother.

Sheffield's bond was set at \$100,006, while Cooper's bond was set at \$75,003.

Old Jennings Road woman charged with 47 counts of animal abuse

ORANGE PARK – The woman found with 266 animals, plus another eight that were born after the seizure, living in squaller on her 1.29-acre lot on Old Jennings

Road now faces five counts of aggravated animal cruelty that led to deaths and 42 other animal cruelty charges.

Jennifer Michelle Wilkie, 51, was arrested on Dec. 17, less than two months after a Clay County Judge ordered all the animals – dogs,

pigs, rabbits, goats, chickens, birds and two turtles – to be moved to the custody of county officials, and that Wilkie was to pay for the costs of a day-long raid at her house and agree to never own another animal. The animals have since been nursed back to health and all have been adopted by residents throughout Northeast Florida.

Orange Park man caught secretly recording woman

ORANGE PARK – A 32-year-old man was arrested on Dec. 15 after a woman found a hidden camera in her cat's scratch-

ing post in her bedroom.

Lake Bryan Stewart, of Orange Park, was charged with video voyeurism. He was released from the Clay County Jail after posting a \$25,003 bond.

The victim made a controlled call to Stewart. With sheriff investigators listening, he said he did it because he liked the way she looked, CCSO said.

Man arrested following armed robbery at Orange Park Mall

ORANGE PARK – A Jacksonville man was arrested in Duval County and returned to the Clay County Jail on Dec. 13 to face charges of holding up a woman in the Orange Park Mall parking lot on May 11.

Henry Stephens III, 19, was charged with armed robbery while wearing a mask or hood after the Clay County Sheriff's Office were called to the mall after a woman's debit cards and cellphones were taken by three men near Sears in the middle of the afternoon

Deputies used Locate My iPhone App to find her phone on Collins Road in Jacksonville. Navy Federal Credit Union Fraud Protection then alerted deputies surveillance cameras captured images of two men who tried to use her debit card at an ATM at a convenience store. They were seen joining the third man in the same car reported used for the mall robbery.

The cellphone app was used to track down her second cellphone to Brittany Lakes Lane. From there, deputies were able to zero their search to a house on Carson Lake, where William Lamar Scott, 20, lived.

The debit card was used again at another convenience store. This time, surveillance showed Scott trying to get money from an ATM.

Scott was arrested on July 1 in Jacksonville and currently is in the Clay County Jail with a \$750,003 bond.

Stephens is being held without bond. His next court appearance is scheduled for Jan. 4. Police are still looking for a third suspect identified as Cory Foster.

Middleburg couple get probation, \$500 fine for Jan. 6 riot

JACKSONVILLE — The Middleburg couple who pled guilty to participating in the Jan. 6 riot at the U.S. Capitol was sentenced to probation and ordered to pay \$500 each. Prosecutors wanted three months of home confinement, another two years of probation and \$500 fines for Dana Winn and Rachel Pert. The judge gave two years of probation for Pert and 12 months for Pert.

Both told the court they wish they'd never gone to Washington, D.C., to join in the stop the vote rally following Joe Biden's presidential victory.

Daniels' trial set to start next month

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The trial for former Clay County Sheriff Darryl Daniels will start on Jan. 21, according to the judicial assistant for circuit judge R. Lee Smith. Daniels is facing charges of tampering with evidence and three counts of making false reports as part of his extramarital affair with a former co-worker in Jacksonville. The Florida Department of Law Enforcement accused Daniels of asking technicians at the sheriff's office to delete information from his cellphone after his affair became public.

To avoid conflicts, the case will be prosecuted by the Fifth Judicial Circuit that comprises of Marion, Citrus, Lake, Hernando and Sumter County. It will be adjudicated by the Seventh Judicial Circuit which is comprised of St. Johns. Flagler, Volusia and Putnam counties.

The trial, however, will be held at the Clay County Courthouse.

Others attended programs at Hardage-Giddens Holly Hill Memorial Park in Middleburg, while hundreds more honored the memories of fallen service people at Orange Park's Jacksonville Memory Gardens.

The largest remembrance was at Jacksonville Memory Gardens, where 3,316 wreaths were distributed. That cemetery is the final resting place for more than 5,000 soldiers.

In addition to a pre-ceremony flyover, servicemen placed coins on markers of their military brothers. They left a penny if they weren't friends; a nickel if they completed boot camp together; a dime if they were in the same unit; and, a quarter if they were together when the other lost his life. More than 500 wreaths were placed at both Keystone Heights

and Middleburg. Retired Army Col. Matt Johnson, who is also St. Johns Classical Academy's Headmaster, told the story of his grandfather, Pete Delgado, a World War II veteran who died in a car accident not long after he returned. Delgado earned the Bronze Star and Purple Heart in Europe.

At Middleburg, Ret. Army Col. Matt Johnson, who also is the Headmaster at St. Johns Classical Academy, said he discovered his grandfather's, Pete Delgado, accomplishments later and started to piece together who his grandfather was and what he did. He created a memorial for Delgado at his mother's house.

"That's one way we can remember my grandfather's service," Johnson said.

Johnson said it's crucial to remember because it defines the nation.

"There's a story behind every service member," Johnson said. " ... Some of them are funny and some of them are sad."



Dental hygienist sets sights on mobile care for seniors

CLAY COUNTY - Armed with a trailer and a truck, a dental hygienist is hoping to help Clay County seniors with mobile dental care in the new year.

Heather Lynn-Crews runs Smiles to You and has lived in the county for more than 40 years. She has been a dental hygienist for about 20 years and the $\ensuremath{\text{COVID-19}}$ pandemic spurred the idea for a mobile operation.

Lynn-Crews said senior centers had a gap in care. Most people have their natural teeth later in life and live longer than before, she said.


There was a huge need at the senior centers," Lynn-Crews said. "It struck me that we need to bring a dental office to people."

Transportation is hard for facilities, staffing is down, and caregivers of the seniors have a hard time getting off work to take them to the dentist, Lynn-Crews said.

"COVID made it hard to go to a brickand-mortar facility. [Seniors] could still fear COVID, have to go to cancer treatments or have social anxiety," she said. "There is such a need for mobile dentistry. It's easier and it's cheaper."

Lynn-Crews acquired a trailer earlier in the year and will be assisted with administrative duties by her daughter, a health administration major. The goal is to start by January, though the amount of red tape is substantial, she said.

"It's going to be surreal for me [to

start], honestly. I'll be so happy to do what I've been longing to do for this past year," Lynn-Crews said. "It will happen. We'll do it the right way.'

Lynn-Crews has a large network of contacts for referrals, she added. Lynn-Crews said she has a collaborated agreement with Fleming Island-based Dr. John Verville.

In other states, dental hygienists can own their own practices, but Florida laws require them to be licensed under a dentist. For a mobile practice, there are a few targeted areas dental hygienists can treat on their own, which includes senior cen-

"I wish one day we could have more power in the state of Florida," Lynn-Crews

There is internet on the 26-foot trailer and it can also accommodate a dentist. Most of the forms can be done electronically. It has the capability for teledentistry, uses cloud-based software for fi les and can take patient photographs.

"I feel like everyone deserves affordable preventative dentistry," Lynn-Crews said. "The dental offi ce can come to you."

Waste Not Want Not feeding families during the holidays on Monday

ORANGE PARK — An organization known for food rescues is trying its hand at food distribution next week due to time constraints during the holidays.

Waste Not Want Not saves discarded food that's unmarketable, but still wholesome, from grocery stores and restaurants. Food the organization saves would normally go to charities and food pantries, but most will close around the final week of the year.

On Dec. 27. Waste Not Want Not is holding a first-come, first-serve event food distribution from 10:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m. at Challenge Enterprise Plaza, 500 Kingslev Ave.

Sandra Staudt-Killea, Waste Not Want Not's executive director, said Thanksgiving and Christmas result in thousands of pounds in discarded holiday food. That leaves the organization with a lot of food but few places it can

A large distribution is unexplored territory for Waste Not Want Not, but they are up to the challenge, Staudt-Killea said.

"It's not what we usually do. There's so much food the stores are purging. Christmas falls on Saturday and we're getting [the food] on Sunday and Monday," she said. "Most pantries are closed for the whole week due to Christmas and New Year's."

Staudt-Killea said Waste Not Want Not can't handle walk up traffic at their primary location on Carnes St. The organization is taking calls at (904) 810-8012 where interested persons can say they plan to attend with how many people they need to feed.

"I think it's important to get the food to people who don't have it, and

it's important to put the food we rescue to good use so our mission can be fulfilled," Staudt-Killea said.

Waste Not Want Not will pick up food within a 15-mile radius and share it with 15 counties, as far as Alachua County. With food rescues, the organization can place a volunteer at a store or restaurant to retrieve the food.

The food rescued is sometimes oddly specific, which Staudt-Killea said is part of the fun. She mentioned recovering a broken-down truck full of onions that missed its appointment with a store recently.

She said volunteers will approach Monday's event the same as the truck, which was located in Baldwin.

"Our volunteers are passionate about our mission. That [onion recovery] was on a weekend," she added. "We do respond to those weird opportunities."

OAKLEAF - Under the direction of first year coach Rory Roderick, the Oakleaf High Knights wrestling team has been stealthily going about its ways with a win here and there in the early part of wrestling season as teams gear up for the district duals, then the individual tournament runs after the holiday.

"I have been a wrestler at Oakleaf when we were considered the team that everyone wanted to wrestle for a win," said Roderick. "This team may have a bit of chip on their shoulder with a lot of the veterans now ready to give the program a boost to being one of the better programs in north Florida."

Roderick, a former Knight standout himself, has already knocked out wins over a slew of teams at the 5-Way at Orange Park and also at their own Friday Knight Lights tournament (10 teams). The Knights roster dominated in both matches with a handful of undefeated grapplers. Oakleaf High will host the Hammer Invitational on Tues., Dec. 21 with a 15-team roster expected including Middleburg, Orange Park, Ridgeview and Fleming Island in a first close-up look at Fleming Island in Class 2A

"We entered an Oakleaf A and an Oakleaf B team in our meets and that is a very big advantage both in scoring team points and in readiness," said Roderick. "When the A team guys know the B team is working hard to go A, it makes the whole team competitive among themselves which is good for the program. No one has a clean shot to being the only guy in a weight class."

doesn't mean anything except for the talking heads, but when you are going to be ranked number one in 5A, this is how you are supposed to play. This is it; this is what it looks like."


Orange Park stayed in their team van, despite a blown tire along the way to Franklin County High, eighth ranked in Class 1A, for a Monday afternoon clash.

I am so appreciative to everyone who came out tonight to share this honor with me."

The ordeal seemed to only add fuel to the Raiders as they felt out the Crusaders for the first quarter, finding where they needed to adjust. The Crusaders, a team that lost most of their defeats by five points or less, were no pushover. The well-disciplined team liked the outside shots and were not stopped early as the speed of the dominant inside defense the Raiders brought to the court forced the Crusaders to stay outside and use three-pointers to edge the Raiders 16-14 at the end of the first quarter.

As Coach Kurnitsky is famous for, he




