Transportation Update: The Truck Route opened up about 18 months ago, and the traffic has begun to settle into a normal pattern, US 301 traffic has increased from the drop experienced at the initial opening of 223. As it was planned, large trucks that were merely passing through with no intentions of stopping and causing much congestion have been greatly decreased in number and those that wanted to come to Starke are able to navigate more safely through town. We are still an "Orange Cone City" with the construction of the train overpass well underway on SR 100 adjacent to Downtown, but the completion of the bridge over Alligator Creek on US 301 is a very welcome site for locals. The community will be very thankful for this addition and glad they were patient once it is completed, especially when that occasional train decides to STOP on the tracks through downtown.

North Florida Regional Chamber of Commerce serves Bradford, Union and SW Clay Counties. One of our goals has been to increase the tax base, more public dollars by bringing outside dollars in. One way this is done is with the Bradford County Strawberry Festival which is in its 24th Year. The Chamber is the host of this event bringing over 15,000 visitors to our region during the weekend. The ripple effect an event of this magnitude has on small communities such as Starke, Lawtey, Lake Butler and Keystone can be measured weeks after the event, through retail sales, lodging and dining. The exposure of our region and businesses during the Strawberry Festival is felt long range in return patrons that are seeking the small town atmosphere away from the hustle of larger cities.

Chamber staff has worked tirelessly trying to find solutions to the infrastructure deficit in our region. Internet is no longer a luxury to business but it is as essential as water, and electricity, and not just the business community but the workers that are needed for those businesses require adequate internet for at home work and school. The Chamber has worked with many individuals and organizations making sure the business voice is heard and the problems that have occurred over the past years dealing with the lack of adequate internet are brought to the forefront. We are very happy to say that several solutions have come from those talks and meetings and in the very near future the business community should see relief and options to the internet situation.

The staff at NFRCC works in partnership with our

local workforce board, CareerSource North Central Florida. Hiring Events are held at the Chamber office for employers needing to fill multiple or specialty positions, allowing employers to do offsite interviews and meet with local talent

NFRCC staff is also the Administrator to the Bradford County Tourism Development Council handling many of the day to day operations for that organization, marketing, social media and website maintenance just to mention a few. Chamber staff assists the TDC with their local grant program for events that promote Bradford County and bring visitors to the county for extended stay. We work with outside organizations to bring in activities to our region of Florida that will promote Bradford County and put heads on beds and increase the tax base in our region. NFRCC is the Administrator for the Bradford County Development Authority, assisting them in much the same way with daily operations. The BCDA has an active website as well as a social media presence on facebook. Both TDC and BCDA have worked alongside the Chamber to improve the infrastructure of our area where businesses and residents experience the lack of internet service. This has become especially important over this past years with more folks working from home and doing more online activities. We have made improvements in this area for some but much still needs to be done in the outlying regions and we will continue to work on this particular issue. We are a small staff of two but we give one hundred percent to our jobs and our community.

Bradford County is a rural community located in Northeast Florida. Bradford was founded as New River County in 1858 but was renamed Bradford County in 1861. The county has a population of 27,000 people and covers 294 square miles. Bradford County is home to the City of Starke, City of Lawtey, City of Hampton and the Town of Brooker with Starke being the county seat.

Wildlife Management Areas

- Santa Fe Swamp Wildlife Management Area
Southeast 11th Avenue, Starke, FL 32091
(Approximately 1/2 Mile off State Road 100)

The Santa Fe Swamp Wildlife Management Area (WMA) consist of 7,272 acres and is open for fishing, wildlife viewing, horseback riding, hiking, and bicycling throughout the year. Children under the age of 16 are required to wear a helmet when horseback riding on public lands. Hunting of white-tailed deer, feral hog, turkey, gray squirrel, and eastern cottontail rabbit is allowed in this WMA during specified seasons with primitive weapons only (bow and arrow and muzzleloader).

- Raiford Wildlife Management Area
Northwest County Road 125, Lawtey, FL 32058

Raiford WMA consists of 9,141 acres and is located along the New River in northwest Bradford County. The New River flows through the center of the WMA, and Olustee Creek (which branches off of the New River) flows through the eastern portion of the WMA. Much of the area is closed or in private ownership but the remaining portion of the area is open for hunting during specified seasons. Wild turkey, white-tailed deer, gray squirrel, eastern cottontail rabbit, gopher tortoise, raccoon, and red-tailed hawk are some of the wildlife species that can be found in the area.

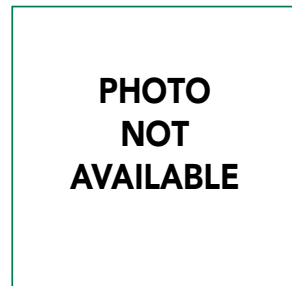

Bradford County Library

Every year, the North Florida Regional Chamber selects a collection of individuals and organizations to honor. Titles include Volunteer of the Year, Businessperson of the Year, and Citizen of the Year. This year, the chamber took a different approach to one of their categories and named the Bradford County Public Library the business of the year. I spoke with Library Director Robert Perone to learn more about the library and the reasoning behind the chamber's selection.

The Bradford County Library's motto is "Providing information and education for the people of Bradford County". In 2021, the Bradford County library did just that. From physical copies of books to Overdrive access for eBooks and audio books, the love of reading has never slowed down.

"We've noticed an increase in people returning to the library. It's not just regulars either. We've signed up an unprecedented number of people for library cards and renewals." Perone says, when I ask about numbers during and after Covid. "Returning in person to the library has been a sign of normalcy that so many people missed."

Despite the increase of in-person visits, Bradford County Library continues to offer remote resources.

"Some of the most popular programs in the past year have been at home or take-home opportunities," Perone comments. The library offers play-away machines that are already loaded with materials. When someone checks out a play-away, they can plug the device into a car stereo, a radio, or their own headphones.

Other programs the library offers are just as popular as citizens of Bradford County try to return to a sense of normalcy. There are children's story time events, a crafting group, and plenty of science and tech programs.

Bradford County Library always takes into consideration the wants and needs of their community. "I'm most proud of the work that my staff puts in." Perone comments.

"With everything going on, my staff never stopped providing for people. They went above and beyond to make sure someone could fill out paperwork they needed. We turned over rocks to find specific books that people wanted."

With programming being staff run, it means that the community hugely benefited from the work and dedication of the Librarians and staff.

"We reach out and bring in such a variety of material and programs, and all of that is because of the work my staff puts in. We did virtual programming like most of the other libraries, but it was our staff taking the time to listen and help our community. They took the time to show someone how to set up an email account. If a senior adult couldn't see their family, our staff would help them set up a zoom meeting and get to see them."

Despite the pandemic waning, many businesses of Starke are still facing hardships.

Lockdowns meant that less foot traffic was coming into businesses. Sales dropped, and with the whole business having to close for at least two weeks if someone tested positive, it was hard to stay open, let alone stay afloat.

With the help of 2021's Business person of the Year, however, it made things easier.

That's where Courtne Douglas comes in. When Douglas graduated from the University of Florida and joined Edward Jones in 2013. After joining the firm, Douglas opened the

first office in Starke. She works with a variety of clients and treats all of them to the kindness and respect that is now synonymous with the Courtne Douglas- Edward Jones experience.

Throughout the pandemic, Douglas helped keep businesses afloat. Whether it be through sharing pictures of her lunch that she got from a local restaurant or helping small business owners manage their finances in a professional capacity, Douglas brought in interest.

Pam Whitle, President and CEO of the North Florida Regional Chamber of Commerce, shared some insight into why they selected Douglas.

"She would always post about where she was going to lunch, or what businesses were open that she was going to stop by. She'd take a picture of her meal and it would look so delicious and post it on her social medias and tag the restaurant."

Advertising is one of the biggest ways to bring in foot traffic. Though most businesses have their own social media pages and their own marketing, because of the way these platforms are designed, it rarely has the widest reach possible. When someone like Douglas shares these businesses on their own social media, it opens a new range of customers who might not have found them otherwise.

Beyond marketing, Douglas boosted morale.

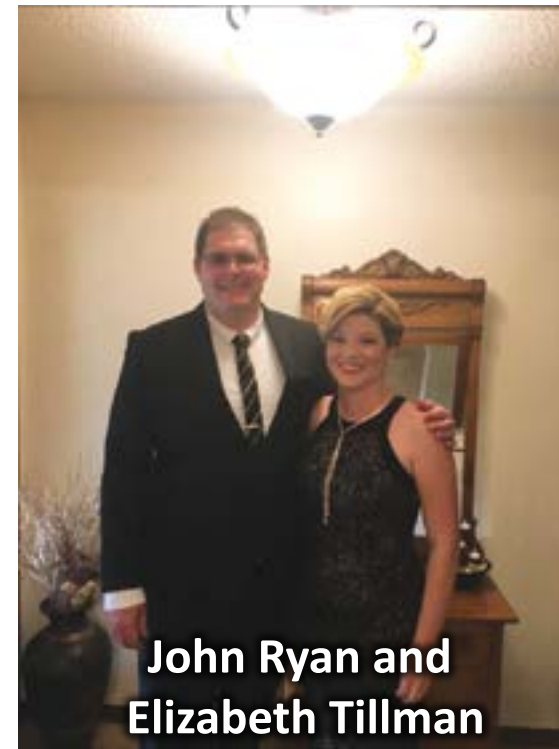

“But it’s a great privilege to help these businesses to succeed through advertising and getting their names out there.”

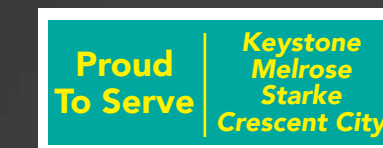
When talking about the community and why they wanted to give back, John Ryan had this to say.

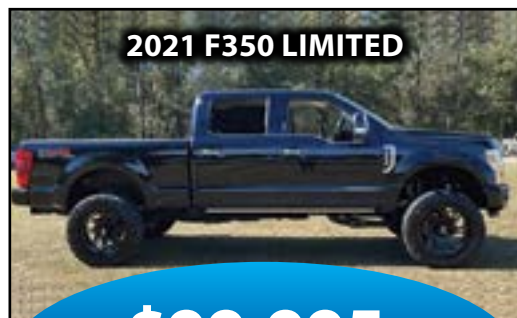

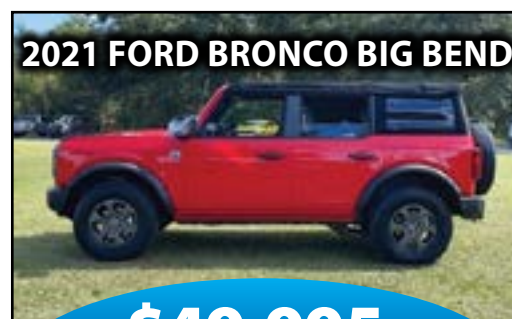

Timmy Hansen, Travis Pastrana and The FIRM come away from Nitro RX finale as big winners

World's best drivers compete in front of sellout crowd

STARKE – Former World Rallycross Champion Timmy Hansen closed out the inaugural Nitro Rallycross season with a victory at the Florida International Rally and Motorsports Park.

Series founder Travis Pastrana left the multi-purpose track at the Keystone Heights Airport with the first Nitro RX championship.

And with a sellout crowd on Sunday, Dec. 5, Northeast Florida made a lasting impression on the international organization.

“This far exceeded our expectations,” said Nitro RX general manager Chip Pankow. “Keystone Heights were super hosts.”

The three-day event was considered a risk by Pastrana because of its remote location, but his group put together enjoyable days of racing that included portions of pavement, soft sand turns and high-flying ramps. Race fans from across the country responded in an overwhelming manner and they were treated to a lot of thrills – and controversy – in the Supercar season finale.

It took less than 100 yards after the start for Pastrana to change the complexion of the race – and his own championship hopes. He started third behind Subaru teammate and pole winner Scott Speed with Timmy Hansen on the outside pole. Speed was on the inside going into the first right-handed turn when Pastrana went left through the dirt after being bumped by Kevin Hansen, and pushed Speed out of the inside groove toward the wall. Hansen quickly steered his car right to avoid the melee and took the lead.



“I couldn’t get on the brakes. I really messed him up,” Pastrana said. “I feel horrible.”

Pastrana quickly went to Speed’s car after the race to explain his side.

“We got smashed by Kevin [Hansen] coming in the first [turn], which I would have done the same. He hit me. Once you break loose on pavement ... I really feel bad for Scott coming in there. He mentored me. He was the fastest at the race this year. I hate to have something like that to go down.”

Pastrana didn’t want to accept the championship trophy until the race stewards made the results official. Speed didn’t wait for any rulings, though, telling Pastrana to “Take the trophy. It’s yours.”

Kevin Hansen wound up 1.187 seconds behind for the runner-up spot in the race, while Speed was third and Pastrana was fourth.

Pastrana and Speed each finished with 219 points toward the championship, but Pastrana won the tiebreaker with two wins this season. Speed had one victory.

“I know there will be some interesting things after this,” Pastrana said.

Timmy Hansen finished third in the championship with 2018 points.

“We were coming into this championship fight in third place,” Hansen said. “And we had to do was win – even better with a first, second place [with Kevin] and see how it all played out. It was the

perfect weekend here. My car has been absolutely on point. We came through one and two. It’s a fantastic way to end the season.”

Former NASCAR champion Chase Elliott made his first rallycross start, driving his way into the eight-car main event during one of the heat races. Despite finishing eighth and having no experience in off-road racing – particularly making 100-foot jumps on a two-story-tall ramp – he said he hopes to compete in future races.

“This is a different vibe. It’s fun for me,” Elliott said. “At the same time, I’ve enjoyed working with all of these guys. I would love to do more of this and get a little bit more up to speed on it. I feel like I came a long way in my couple days here, but I certainly have a long way to go.”

Two other classes also competed on the 1.6-mile raceway.

Another Swede, Mikafla Ahlin-Kottulinsk, won the side-by-side class by beating Kory Willis.

Former Indy Car and IMSA series driver Sage Karam won the Nitro RX Next division race, but Casper Jansson’s second-place finish easily propelled him to the support class’s championship.

Nitro RX safety officials cut off ticket sales Saturday afternoon after it determined the track had reached maximum capacity. Many portions of the track weren’t accessible because it borders thick woods on one side and the airport on the other. Nonetheless, sev-

eral thousand fans packed the parking lot, general admission and VIP areas with fans watching eight-deep in the standing-room-only areas.

“I tell you: I love The FIRM,” Pastrana said. “You guys have been awesome, everyone down here in Florida.”

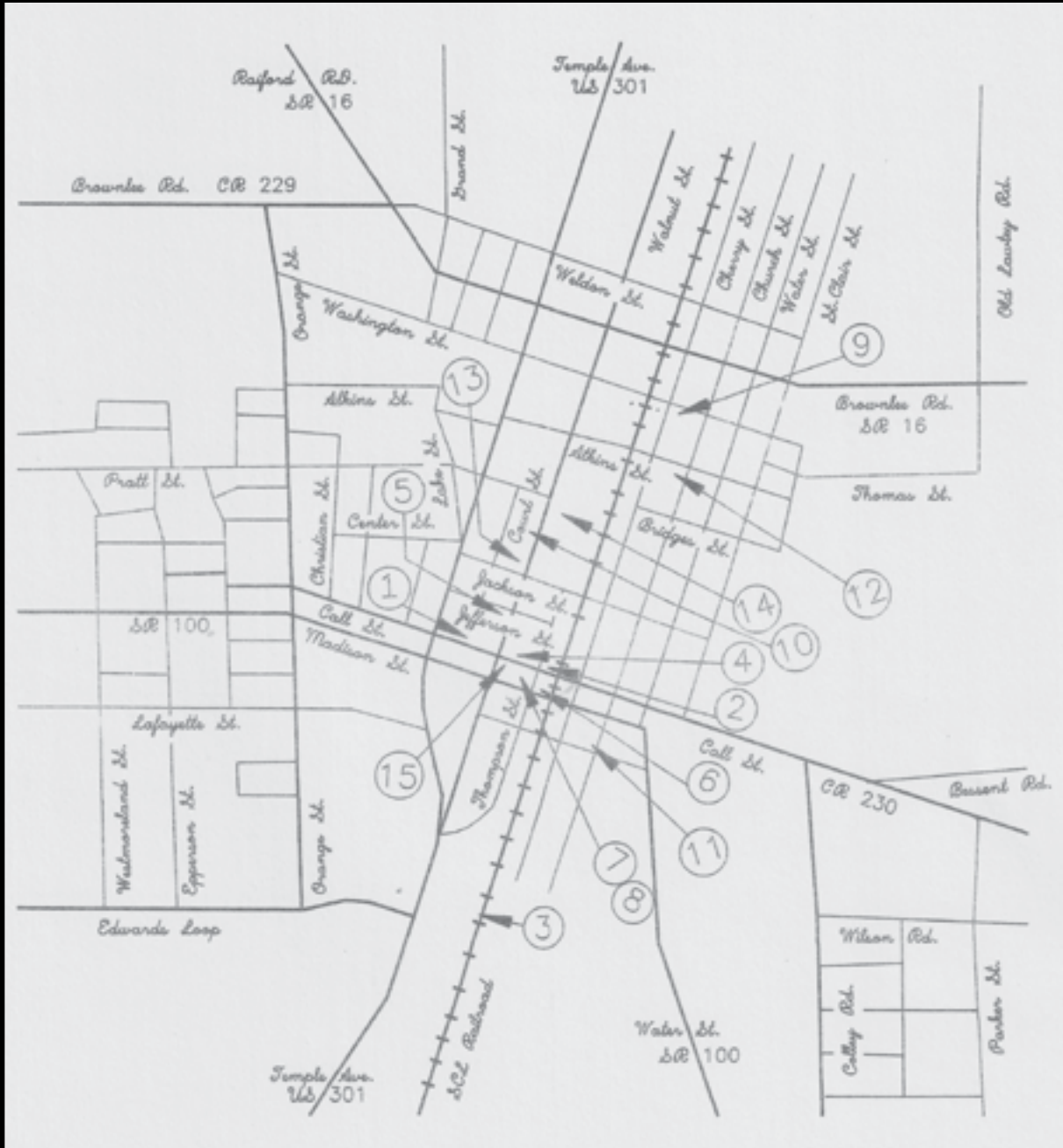

GUIDE TO HISTORIC STARKE

Eagle Scout Service Project of Douglas Wayne Snyder II
 Boy Scout Troop 70, Starke, Florida
 Project Sponsored by the Bradford County Historical Board of Trustees



1 The Old Bradford County Courthouse as built in 1902 and served Bradford County as the seat of government for 66 years. The Courthouse was renovated and is presently used as Santa Te Community College Andres Center. The site is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and is an excellent example of Southern Gothic Revival style.

2 The Rosenberg Building, located at 201-203 E. Call Street was built between 1895 and 1901. It has been used for many purposes, including lodging military for a short period. Bought by Charles Rosenberg in 1941, it has just finished renovation for use as a Fine Arts Center by the Santa Fe Andrews Center.

3 The Railroad has played a very large role in the history of Starke. Starke developed around the crossing of several early roads and the railroad, and it joined Starke to the rest of the country in the early years of growth.

4 Mitchell's Reccall Drug Store, located at 127 E. Call Street was built about 1897. The first floor has housed sev-

eral stores and the Starke post office until 1941. Offices were located on the second floor.

5 The Von Klein Home, now the Magnolia Hotel, is located at 137 N. Walnut Street. The home was built before 1884. The original owner was Dr. Lochr Von Klein, an early Mayor of Starke. The home was turned in to a hotel in the late 1920's by Arthur and Gertrude Williams.

10 The Charles Hardy home at 327 N. Walnut Street was originally build as the home of Edward P. Duncan, an officer of the Bradford County Bank, around 1900. The longest period of ownership was by the Eugene S. Matthews family, who purchased the home in 19227 and owned it until 1960.

11 The Archibald Johns Home on Nana Street was built before the year 1900. It was the home of the only Starke resident to become Governor of Florida, Charlie Johns.

6 Vaughn Johnson Cabinet Center is located at 140 S. Thompson Street and consists of three buildings built in the 1920-1930 period. The first building was used as a garage for the Ford Motor Company. The second building was built for a Coca-Cola distributor. The third building was added to the first building as part of the auto sale and service shop.

7 The building that. Now includes Starke Shoe Repair, City Barber Shop and This n'That was built in 1901-1912. This site was first owned by George Cole in 1859. Call Street is named after his friend, Florida's Lt. Governor Call. This building is a remnant of the earliest Starke business district.

8 The site at 108 E. Call Street was built in 1895. The most distinctive feature is the traditional storefront facade, which typifies early 20th century architecture.

9 The palatial Sidney J. Stemburg Home, built by a wealthy oil and coal family from Pennsylvania, has stood on the corner of North Cherry and Washington Streets since 1889.

12 The Color T. Peek Home was built in the early part of this century. Mr. Peek was one of the first teachers in the Starke Institute, the first school in Starke. Mr. Peek went on to become one of the Mayors of Starke. The home has been renovated by the current owner and was moved from Madison and Court Streets to the present location.

13 The Lex Green Home is located at 323 N. Walnut Street and is now owned by Edwin Jeffcoat. The home is an excellent example of Southern Classical Revival architecture prevalent in the second and third decades of this century. The home was originally occupied by the Green family. Mr. Lex Green represented the Starke and Bradford area in the U.S. Congress for more than 20 years.

14 The Judge Elzia Sanders Home at 344 N. Walnut Street was originally built by Lawrence Wall, who served in the Florida Legislature in the early years of this century. Later bought by Col. D. E. Knight, a Starke lawyer, it was extensively remodeled.

15 The Bradford County Bank, 100 E. Call Street opened on July 4, 1914. Now owned by C. R. Smith, Jr., the Bank has been restored to its Bold Classical Revival style, with a lofty interior making a strong architectural statement about the community's hopes and dreams in the early boom period of the construction. The Bank is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The City of Hampton, Florida, located about six miles south of Starke was incorporated in 1893 and has gone through phases of boom and busy throughout its history. Hampton was known as Crossroads primary because the Atlantic-to-Gulf railroad was built through the area in 1859 and the settlement grew up around it. Good farmland prompted further settlement and several small stores were established. A second railroad, the Georgia-Southern and Florida Rail Line, passed through town a little later and prompted a boom. Crossroads was renamed Hampton when the first post office was established in 1882. The town of Hampton, Florida was named after a 10-year-old boy, Hampton Terry, whose father owned a farm near the railroad tracks.

The town of Hampton, Florida was incorporated in 1893, but it also allowed its charter to lapse and had to be reincorporated in 1911 and 1925. The Big Freeze adversely affected Hampton's economy-as it did any town which relied on oranges and other agricultural crops and caused an end to the boom. Rapid use of timber in the area led to an exhaustion of the crop and a decline of the timber industry around Hampton. With the timber and oranges declining, farmers turned to cotton and strawberries. The town once had two cotton gins in operation. Hampton struggled to survive but as cars replaced trains as the main mode of travel, Hampton declined. Road 13 (now US 301) was re-routed and bypassed Hampton. The road had a curve called the Hampton

Curve, which was considered dangerous and the State Road Department re-routed Road 13 in the 1930's to straighten the curve.

Hampton appeared to be dying, but when Camp Blanding's boom hit the area, the small town near Starke also benefited. Troops were carried to the camp on the train and their families rented rooms and homes in the town. When Blanding's boom ended, however, Hampton subsided back into the sleepy little hamlet it is today.

When the train signal starts clanging in the downtown area, traffic literally comes to a complete stop. And for most of the town, a passing train means being cut off from the Emergency Room. The Florida Department of Transportation decided to remedy the problem with an overpass on State Road 100 that will allow the wheels to keep rolling – for the train and local traffic. Currently, the City of Starke is divided by the CSX railroad that runs parallel to U.S. Highway 301. The FDOT said with 29 trains traveling through the city each day, emergency vehicles and other traffic experience frequent delays, and train traffic is expected to increase in the future. The overpass will ease congestion and improve emergency response times and allow traffic to flow more freely. The Starke Railroad Overpass will cost \$23.6 million and is projected to be completed in late 2022.

Sons Tom Smith and Jerry Smith joined in the racing scene as youth and as the story goes helped their father with auto repair and in a relentless search of collecting racing and collectable items, cars, oil cans, signs and you name its from long ago. They might be called the original American Pickers! Now, grandson to Harold, Shannon operates Smith Brothers Body Shop in Starke and the property also houses the 3,000 sq. ft. Museum packed full of over 10,000 incredibly cool and original racing items. The collection includes a 1938 Harley Davidson Knucklehead, several cars, thousands of items including the blood donor cards from Halifax Medical Center in Daytona Beach where Harold donated his blood type to Lee Petty (father to Richard Petty and grandfather to Kyle Petty) after a 1961 crash in Daytona. Tom Smith said, "dad carried that card until the day he died". 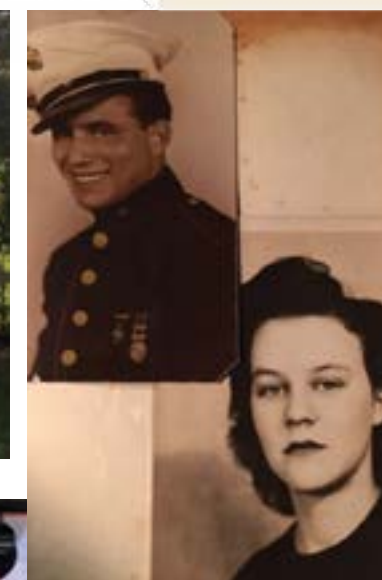

Camp Blanding Museum

As of the census of 1860, first head count made after the birth of Starke, showed 138 inhabitants of the tiny settlement, more than half of whom came here from Georgia and South Carolina.

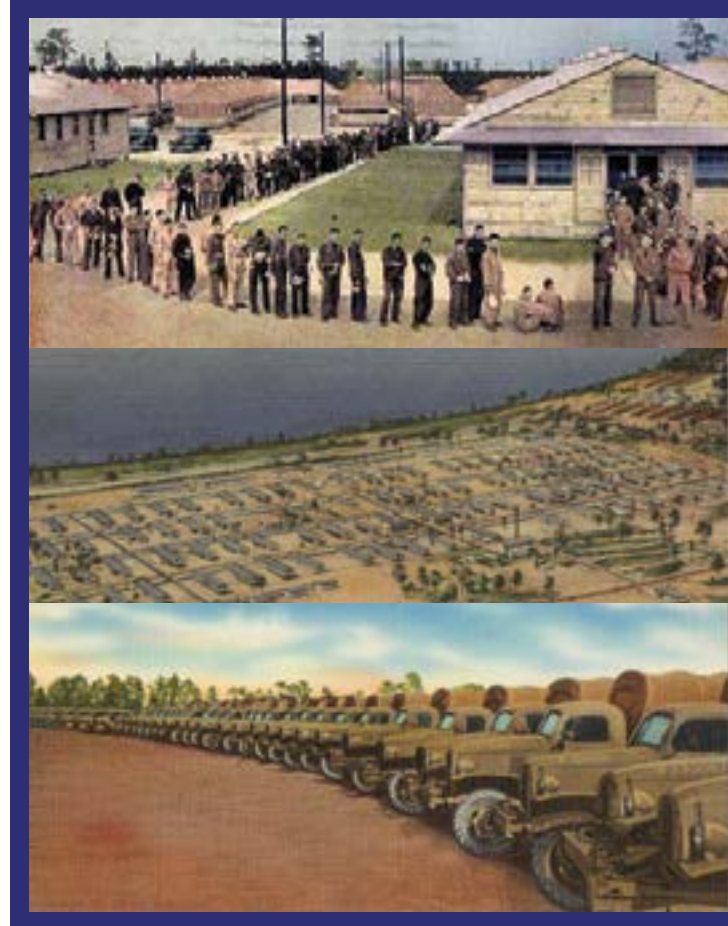
In 1940, Camp Blanding was leased to the United States Army as an active-duty training center. The post was originally used by New England and Southern troops preparing for deployment overseas. However, during the course of the war, Camp Blanding served as an infantry-replacement training center, an induction center, a German prisoner-of-war compound, and a holding center for 343 Japanese, German, and Italian immigrant residents of the United States. At the height of the war, the Army leased acreage from local landowners, raising the total to 170,000 acres. From 1940 to 1945, more than 800,000 soldiers received all or part of their training here.

Starke, while very small became a boom town with an abundance of people and cash, yet no hotels or rooms for rent, they quickly began to build and offer rooms for rent to the quickly expanding due to the military growth at Camp Blanding

Today, the history of Camp Blanding can be seen at the ever popular Museum, which was established in 1990 and currently features displays focused on Camp Blanding's History and involvement during WWII.

On display you will find uniforms, weapons, equipment items, vehicles, and aircrafts dating back to the 1940's. Our plans are to expand the museum to include displays for the Korean War, Vietnam War, Desert Shield/Desert Storm, and the Global War on Terror (Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom).

Inside the museum, you will also find a gift shop specialized in selling history books, pins, patches, badges, and other miscellaneous historical military items. The museum also has a Memorial Park dedicated to preserving large military artifacts of military history covering World War II, Vietnam, and Operation Desert Storm. You will also find numerous monuments to the men and units who trained and or were stationed at Camp Blanding over time.

Additional renovations have included a seamless wifi zone in the parks surrounding city hall as well as powered picnic tables to charge your laptops/smart devices so that you may work from our amazing park. The family can enjoy a dive into Lake Geneva from the recently added swim platform donated by L.R.D.C. as well as renting a paddle board to explore this breath-taking lake. Future renovations are to come in the early months of 2022. They will include restroom renovations and upgrades, replacing the stage overlooking the Lake Geneva, updating our covered picnic area and the addition of a restroom to the Historic Beach Pavilion.

The Keystone Heights Trailhead along the **Palatka-Lake Butler State Trail**, a nearly 47-mile, multi-use recreational trail from Palatka to Lake Butler, is closer to completion. The trail runs along the Norfolk-Southern Railroad spanning 4 northeast Florida counties. While this trail still has 24-miles in various stages of development, the 19-mile span that runs through Keystone Heights is paved and inviting you to explore. Riders/walkers are encouraged to park at the Keystone Heights trailhead where tools are provided for general maintenance for your bike. You can also grab a quick drink of water, fill your water bottle and rest for a moment under our shade trees. Don't forget to check out our story walk along the trail for a new family friendly story every quarter.

Keystone Heights, with its unique experiences and natural beauty matched with the friendly faces you'll see most everywhere you go, is a place you'll want to visit again and again.
