Turn it down

Local law enforcement will keep their ears open for loud music

CLAY COUNTY – Although Lynyrd Skynyrd tells their fans to “turn it up” at the beginning of its iconic “Sweet Home Alabama,” local law enforcement said such ear-shattering loyalty now could result in a \$114 ticket.

Florida’s new noise ordinance will force motorists to keep their windows up and

their volume control turned down. According to the law, which went into effect on July 1, audio that can be heard from 25 feet from a vehicle can result in a traffic ticket.

The statute states anyone is in violation who’s “listening to car radio, tape player, compact disc player, portable music or video player, cellular telephone, tablet

Floats, fireworks: Moosehaven, Keystone celebrate Fourth

CLAY COUNTY – Moosehaven and Keystone Heights will be filled with celebration, games, entertainment, food and, of course, fireworks for this year’s Independence Day celebrations.

This year’s theme for Keystone Heights’ Our Country Day will be “One Nation.” It starts on Saturday morning with 5K run at 8 a.m. Other activities include a volleyball tournament, arts, crafts and food vendors, poker run, raffles, baby crawl and watermelon-eating contests, and live music. The highlights of the day-long festival is the annual parade on Lawrence Boulevard at 11 a.m. and fireworks at Keystone Beach at

County to review Haller Airpark issue again

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Airplanes and people have to coexist, and the issue near Haller Airpark is no different.

Airports were a key topic of discussion at a county workshop Tuesday morning where commissioners also reviewed housing and land codes.

At the June 14 commission meeting, numerous Haller-based pilots were concerned about the rezoning of the 95.23-acre property last summer, setting up the arrival of a resort-style RV area feet from the airpark. They felt they hadn't been properly notified and not nearly enough safety requirements had been addressed.

One of those pilots, Pat Lee, spoke again Tuesday morning. Lee said when he was a commercial pilot, sometimes runways would be enveloped in storms or other hazards. He said Clay County is going through a hazardous time as well, with the arrival of the First Coast Expressway.

"We are relying on you to control this

growth," Lee told commissioners. "The growth has to be managed. It has to be focused. It has to not be at the whim of every developer that comes down and tries to influence you on your decisions on how our county grows."

The potential development of an RV resort with 550 RV spaces and other ameni-

ties was approved last August by the Planning Commission, though the homeowners and pilots disputed they were notified.

County Manager Howard Wanamaker read state Department of Transportation and Federal Aviation Administration criteria for airports, which impacts residences, noise, runways and wildlife.

Wanamaker called for a reform to the county's code that forged ahead on new ground. He recommended the county be allowed to use WGI, the firm tasked with editing the land development code.

Commissioner Betsy Condon said residents at a different airpark, Cecil Airport, told her they can see tail numbers because of how low planes fly.

"I think it's appropriate to look at that," she said. The safety of people on the ground and those flying in the air are both paramount, Commissioner Jim Renninger. Haller is a private airpark and Renninger reiterated the state does not adequately address private airparks. He said the area had several military retirees with a wealth of aviation knowledge.

"Don't forget about the community," he said. "We've got a lot of experience here."

BCC Chairman Wayne Bolla said it's always complex when personal property rights are in play.

"Somewhere in the middle we've got to find common ground," he said.

Orange Park sets deadline to fill open council seat

ORANGE PARK – Town council members are a step closer to filling Seat 1, vacated by Vice-Mayor Eddie Henley, who resigned on June 7.

Henley resigned about 45 minutes into that meeting, citing racist and intimidating emails. Mayor Randy Anderson kicked off Tuesday night's meeting by asking for courtesy from public commenters.

"The bottom line is we're all neighbors and let's keep it that way," Anderson said. "Treat others the way you would want to be treated."

Later in the meeting, council members addressed the vacancy. Anderson also postponed the election of a new Vice Mayor.

Council Member John Hauber said council members received emails about the vacancy.

He asked for some time to question the individuals before the board, with some public input.

"We can get public input and bring it back to the council and make a decision, and make sure we've given the public an opportunity to ask their questions ... ,"

Hauber said.

Council Member Susana Thompson

agreed and felt a special meeting should be held. Thompson issued another call for

candidates. She pushed for a meeting for residents to ask questions of candidates.

"People can come at will and speak to all the candidates and figure out for themselves who they would prefer," Thompson said.

Council Member Alan Watt said he's been through the appointment process before and it has the potential for disaster. He called for rigorous control of the process and to not allow for nominations from the floor.

"Again, we need to make sure this is done professionally and orderly," Watt said.

Anderson said the process should be open and a deadline should be created for consideration. He said it's important that potential candidates meet with residents. He pointed to July 19 meeting as a deadline, which council members approved unanimously.

"I really think we need to have a deadline. This needs to move forward. The last couple have really drug out," Anderson said.

The town of Orange Park will allow applications in the form of an email until July 8, and it will host a 6 p.m. meet and greet on July 13.

County reviews potential changes to event permits

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Events have returned in the county in full force over the past year and the county is looking to create a streamlined way to safely deal with requests and hold events.

County staff sought direction and input about a new event ordinance at Tuesday night's meeting.

Tourism Director Kimberly Morgan gave an overview of the proposed system. She defined general events, complex events that place a strain on county services and events that are exempted. The proposed fees are \$100 for general events and \$150 larger events.

The event ordinance relayed requirements to operate such as vendors, parking and waste management. The county will benefit from having a general awareness of the potential large number of events held, Morgan said.

"This ordinance doesn't ask anything above and beyond what a normal event

planner would be doing anyway," Morgan said.

Morgan said the county can revisit an event ordinance every few years by being flexible.

"We're on a learning curve right now with this. We've done a lot of work and a lot of homework on putting it together, but right now, we need some flexibility in those areas so we know what our market is really bringing to the table," Morgan said.

Clay County Sheriff Michelle Cook also suggested a nominal deposit for first-time event holders, meaning organizations with a solid working relationship with the county and CCSO could have their deposits waived. It's important because organizers can pack up and never be heard from again, Cook said.

She presented situations where a promoter can ignore CCSO fees to cover the event. One instance of paying deputies took five years to resolve, she said. The purpose of the new ordinance is driven by the difficulty to schedule staff ahead of time.

"This permitting process will give us a better idea of what is coming down the road," Cook said. "Sometimes, it's two days before and they say, 'We need police officers.' It's difficult to get people to work it."

County Attorney Courtney Grimm said some event organizers pay their bills in

the form of proceeds, which makes things difficult. Grimm asked to work on revising the ordinance and to have future meetings with CCSO before the first county meeting of July.

"Our hope is to bring it back to you at the first of July meeting so that we can get it rolling and have it in effect, so events occurring after Nov. 1, have to comply with it," Grimm said.

Spirit of 1776:

Never take our freedom of speech for granted

As we gather to celebrate Independence Day, it's a good time to reflect on how our most fundamental freedoms have served this nation well.

It's an even better time to think about what would happen if those liberties were taken away.

Sadly, the latter doesn't take much imagination in 2022. Your closest video screen will show you scenes of Russian troops pummeling Ukraine with the support of a majority of the Russian people.

The Russian public has been told that their country is doing noble work ferreting out "Nazis" and that the West is engaged in its usual persecution of Russia and its people. Surveys say most Russians believe it.

In times of war, people always want to see their government as the good guys, but it's still a little hard to grasp how that many people can be so thoroughly misled.

That's the power of the Vladimir Putin playbook. The Russian president quickly and with little opposition eliminated the freedoms of speech and press.

First, Putin bandied around allegations of "fake news," undermining domestic news media that had far more latitude than their Soviet Union counterparts.

Then he coordinated a plan with the national legislature to pass a law imprisoning those who "lied" about the war, including even calling it a war. Russian media of integrity had to close up shop, and international journalists in Russia had to temper their reporting.

That left the internet as the one avenue for Russians to learn the truth about their country's misdeeds. Putin then banned social media outlets and sharply limited access to international news sites.

In short order, the Russian people were isolated, left to believe the lies of their government.

It took just weeks for Putin to wipe out freedoms of press, speech and dissent.

Could anything like that ever happen in the United States? As unlikely as it may seem, there are some areas of concern.

After all, over the past 60 years, certain presidents from both parties have been known to mislead the public about the purpose and progress of wars. And the use of "fake news" claims to evade responsibility began with politicians in this country, only to be adopted by totalitarian leaders around the globe.

Today there are active efforts to over-

Make sure to let your neighbors know the time you will be shooting your fireworks, and make sure the time is within what is permitted by your local ordinances. Do not start too late in the evening, as most firework shows end by 11 p.m.

Among the key safety measures, Phan-

tom Fireworks recommends the following:

- A sober adult should be in charge of the fireworks; children should never handle the products.
- Use common sense and be careful. Follow your local laws on fireworks use.
- Use fireworks on hard, flat surfaces; if you shoot on grass, lay down a plywood board as your hard, flat surface.
- Have water readily available for emergencies (hose is best; fire extinguisher or bucket of water will work).
- Keep plenty of distance between the launch site and spectators 150 feet for aerials and 35-50 feet for ground items; and shoot in a clear open area.
- Brace your aerials, tubes and fountains with bricks to avoid tip-over. Use safety gear (safety glasses and gloves) when lighting fireworks.
- Keep pets inside during fireworks use (the noise can frighten animals).
- Douse your fireworks thoroughly with water when you are done, and dispose of them in a covered metal container outdoors and away from any buildings.
- Clean up when the show is over,

which includes picking up any debris that may fall into your neighbors' property.

turn New York Times v. Sullivan, the 1964 Supreme Court decision that made investigative reporting viable in the United States. And there are many politicians, again of both parties, who want to control how private social media companies are run.

Do I believe that America could fall victim to something resembling the Putin playbook? No. But it's also no longer unthinkable.

It's not a coincidence that the first step would-be dictators take is to shut down the press. That eliminates questions and accountability, both of which are anathema to those who abuse power.

There are some today who choose not to be informed, saying the media are biased. Well, there are tens of thousands of media outlets in this country, including manipulative cable channels, partisan sites that masquerade as news providers and those sites that would entice us with clickbait. But there are also many core news organizations of integrity, including The New York Times, Wall Street Journal, PBS and the very newspaper, Clay Today, that you're reading right now. They're the ones we need to support with readership and subscriptions.

From the very beginning of this nation, Americans understood the importance of a free press aggressively reporting on people in power. In an era when newspa-

pers were fiercely partisan and unfair, that first generation of citizens still insisted on journalists being protected by the First Amendment.

That shouldn't surprise us. After all, the model was right there in 1776 in the document we celebrate this week.

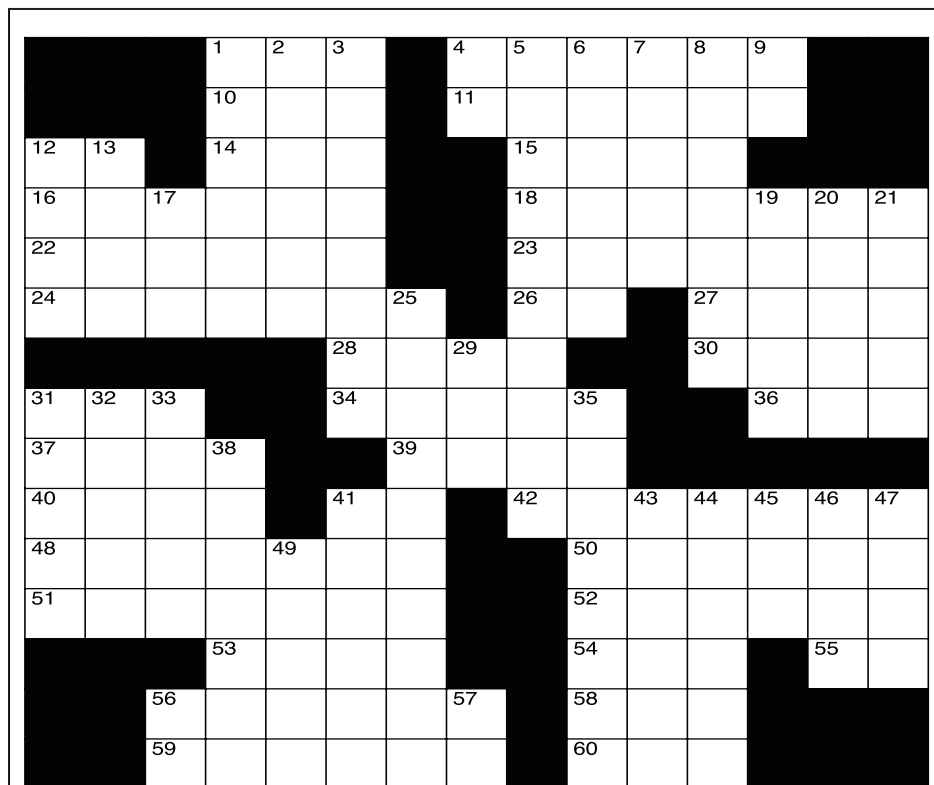
The Declaration of Independence called out King George III, reporting a list of injustices perpetrated by the mother country against its colonies. We had "unalienable rights," it said, and they were being violated. Americans were no longer going to put up with this "long train of abuses and usurpations."

That is the same spirit with which America's free press has exercised its duties since 1791. Abolitionist newspapers took on slavery, suffragist papers focused on injustices against women and news organizations spanning centuries have reported on scandals, corruption and racial injustice.

We live in a highly polarized time, when it's easy to dismiss the views of those with whom we disagree and deride those who publish the facts we don't want to acknowledge.

We have to take care, though, that our internal political wars don't turn us away from the core principles contained in the Declaration of Independence.

We remain a free people and need to be vigilant in protecting our rights and documenting the abuses of people in power, not just when the other guy's party is in office. That's the real spirit of '76.

"I like writing that fills your time and takes you to a weird place," he said. "We want to support all of that."

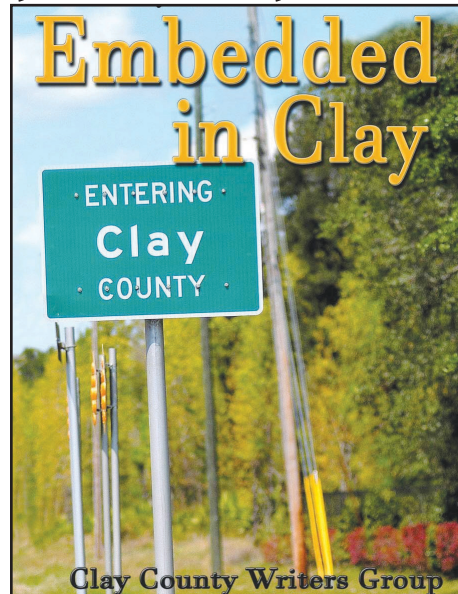

Clay Democrats condemn Supreme Court's ruling

(On June 24) the Supreme Court of the United States overturned Roe v. Wade, the nearly 50-year law that protected the constitutional rights of women who sought to terminate an unwanted pregnancy. The political ruling, based on personal religious views of Supreme Court Justices (which have no place in the laws of this country), throws the fate of these female victims into the hands of state legislators, overwhelming male – and in Republican states, women are now at risk of losing the right to abortion entirely. The Clay County Democratic Party strongly condemns this decision which will undoubtedly trigger further restrictions on a state level.

The ruling harshly affects Florida women; effective July 1, abortion laws will change, banning abortion after 15 weeks without allowing for tragic sexual



abuse situations including rape and incest. This law was considered unconstitutional when passed. Republican lawmakers have already threatened to impose further restrictions now that Roe v. Wade has been overturned.

"With this decision, women have lost control over their own reproductive health," said Jackie Cetnar, Clay County Democratic Executive Committee Chair. "Women have been made victims of men

again and again throughout history and have always sought and obtained abortions. Under Roe vs Wade, abortions have been safe, medical procedures for almost 50 years. Now not only are women victims of rape and incest but they are forced under the law to carry their unwanted babies for nine months and risking their own health in the process. Women desperately seeking abortions will now be at risk for unlicensed practitioners performing abortion in unsafe conditions, resulting in infections and even death, as their grandmothers were 50 years ago. This is an abomination; there are no words to describe my sorrow."

Women voters will have their say at the ballot box in November. Jackie Cetnar said that she urges women to seek out Democratic candidates who support a woman's right to choose and to vote out anyone who tries to restrict women's freedom to make decisions about their own bodies, lives and futures.

Concept of federalism affirmed in Roe v. Wade decision

The progressive left's outrage over the U.S. Supreme Court's ruling in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, in which they overturned Roe v. Wade, clearly demonstrates that they do not understand the concept of federalism. Their threats of violence also indicate that they fail to understand or appreciate that the United States of America, the greatest nation on earth, is a republic. We have a democratic form of government, but we are not a democracy.

The 1973 holding in Roe v. Wade was based on a majority of Justice's finding the right to an abortion in a penumbra of other Amendments. Their decision to find this right has been a puzzle for almost 50 years considering the 10th Amendment was right in front of them. Specifically, "[t]he powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to



the people." The Bill of Rights was enacted to restrain the power of the federal government; to keep the federal government from becoming a dictatorship.

Unfortunately, this is not the only example of the U.S. Supreme Court choosing to usurp the power of the States as can be seen in their 5-4 ruling in Louisiana v. Kennedy. A 1995 Louisiana statute called for the death penalty in an aggravated rape of a child under the age of 12. Kennedy's rape of his 8-year-old stepdaughter was described by an expert in pediatric forensic medicine as "...the most severe he had seen from a sexual assault in his four years of practice."

In this Louisiana case, the majority

ruled that the Louisiana statute was unconstitutional based on their belief in "the evolving standards of decency that mark the progress of a maturing society". However, as stated in the dissent written by Justice Alito, "[t]he party attacking the constitutionality of a state statute bears the "heavy burden" of establishing that the law is unconstitutional ...That burden has not been discharged here, and I would therefore affirm the decision of the Louisiana Supreme Court."

In other words, whether a state statute meets Constitutional standards relies on more than the personal feelings of any of our U.S. Supreme Court Justices. Some of the Justices may relish the idea of restriction-free abortion, just as some may disagree with the use of the death penalty, but their personal feelings are irrelevant. Just because something may be objectionable to any of the Justice's sensibilities does not mean it's unconstitutional. Last week's ruling in the Dobbs case was a reminder to our Supreme Court Justices to stay in their own lane! May God bless this magnificent Republic.

Keystone residents told how to deal with trauma by SafetyNet Alliance

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – Trauma Informed Community recently was held at Keystone Heights Elementary to educate residents about trauma. The four-hour training event covered topics such as adverse childhood experiences, the impacts of trauma and toxic stress and health. In addition, the event touched on resilience and the approach of being trauma-informed to deal with personal trauma and to help others with trauma.

“Any teacher or community leader would benefit from this,” said Carey Morford, member of Keystone SafetyNet Alliance.

The event had 60 people at the training session which was provided by Center for Child Counseling. Lunch was also provided.

The purpose of the event was to share the knowledge gathered by the Keystone SafetyNet.

“All of us at Keystone SafetyNet, as we have interacted with people who have experienced trauma, have had to learn some things. We wanted to share that with other leaders in the community,” Carey said.

It was conceived when several leaders of the Keystone SafetyNet Alliance wanted a way to train the community how to deal



with trauma.

“We are talking to people who have experienced trauma all the time,” Carey said.

She also said while researching for the event, she found Center for Child Counseling, which provided half-day training on trauma.

“I think it is going to do a pretty good job of helping people regardless of what their role is whether they are a teacher, a business leader, or a parent.”

Trauma Informed Community was made possible through the partnered efforts of local nonprofit organizations and Keystone Heights Elementary and Mission of the Dirt Road. They worked together to make the training session a reality and free for teachers and those interested in learning.

Answers Resource Facility provided lunch during the event and Community Partnership Schools made it possible for other schools to know about the event.

County working to smooth out crumbled pavement

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A push to improve large swaths of Clay County’s pavement is underway.

Bad pavement wear and tear resembles the skin of an alligator and is often referred to as “alligator cracking.” With most residents at work, pavement near the front of Fleming Island’s Harbor Island Drive subdivision displayed some of the cracking on an overcast Monday.

The Harbor Island Drive was a recent example used by county Deputy Director of Engineering Taylor Abernathy addressing commissioners.

The county oversees 795 miles of paved road, Abernathy said, that it has to constantly repair and maintain. About 714 of those miles are residential roads, with arterial and collector roads comprising the other 80 miles.

Abernathy added the focus is collecting data, upgrading and operating a network of suitable pavements. The county has a sensor-equipped van to document the distress of pavement, of which there are about 20 types of deterioration.

Harbor Island Drive is an example of what the county is trying to prevent.

“That’s what we call an alligator cracked street,” Abernathy said.

Poor and unsatisfactory roads are spread throughout the county, Abernathy said. The county’s Pavement Condition Index, a metric that shows the distress on the surface, is 71.5, a figure considered above average.

“That’s the higher end of a fair condition,” Abernathy said. “That’s where we sit today. Some of that is because of a handful of new developments that have put pavement down.”

Abernathy said the county can bring a list of roads needing to be paved to commissioners. He said the county can simplify how the data is presented.

The cost and breadth of how many roads will be fixed from the newest pavement data has not been decided. The county’s pavement plan could hatch a few different budget scenarios. While commissioners can piecemeal a solution, there is a \$59.4 million price tag to fix all the failed roads.

These are decisions for the future, Abernathy said. Preserving pavement is a complex process and requires a lot of cost-benefit analysis.

“We’re trying to significantly lower the cost by keeping the good roads good, and by doing those repairs when the cost of repairs is cheap vs. getting them down into the reconstruction costs,” he said.

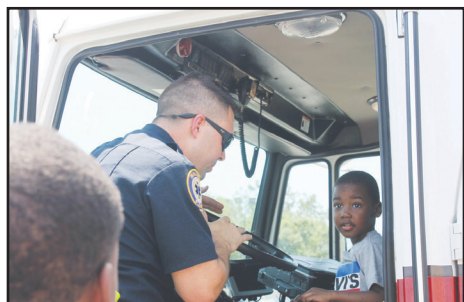
Clay County Master Gardener Plant sale set for Aug. 6

Surgical services head looks toward new hospital, operating room design

FLEMING ISLAND – In late 2018, Baptist Clay opened its surgery center, a precursor to its large hospital currently under construction.

A series of technicians, nurses and surgeons, and thousands of dollars in equipment, gave the empty rooms life. Mark Poon, the director of surgical services, is part of that process with Baptist's new hospital.

Poon said the goal is to provide services to the Clay residents, mentioning that people will avoid a trip over the bridge. He called the new hospital, and its two new operating rooms, an amazing opportunity.

"When it comes to an OR, it needs to meet the needs of myself, staff members and patients," Poon said. "What I have a lot of say on is how we build that OR, in terms of surgery to make sure it's right. At the end of the day, I'm not the one benefitting from that. It's the people that come here.

"At the end of the day, we need to make sure we have the best standards."

The surgery center used to be a field of dirt, Poon adds. The new hospital used to be a series of blueprints and now it's a large structure. Having a hand in designing the future is surreal, he said.

"That to me is very satisfying and there's no money that can pay for that. It's such an experience. Every single thing, the artwork, the trash cans, your part of building a hospital," Poon said. "That hospital is going to be here for years, decades."

perfect, but the patients' trust and cleanliness of the OR have to be placed first. Poon said a mentor told him people in surgery are usually asleep, which is why they should be given the utmost care.

"We are the patient's advocate," he added. "We'll go back to the OR if something's missing, if a patient hasn't had the right test."

Surgery is complicated from the pre-operation preparation, the actual operation, the recovery and dealing with the outcome at home. Surgeries have come a long way. Hysterectomies are now a one-day process handled with surgeon-

operated robotic instruments. Doctors now have the tools to peel a grape and suture it back up.

"It takes an hour, maybe an hour and 15 minutes," he said of hysterectomies.

Before a room is prepared, surfaces need to be wiped down, disposable items checked and tools like cameras ready to go. He refers to a cleaning cabinet that prevents its user from retrieving uncleaned equipment.

"At the end of the day, we need to make sure we have the best standards," he said.

What's happening in Tallahassee

Monthly Legislative update by Florida Rep. Sam Garrison

Each month, Rep. Sam Garrison, whose District 18 includes Clay County, will provide updates on proposed and passed bills that affect the county.

TALLAHASSEE – As your voice in Tallahassee, I believe the core function of government is to keep us safe. Crime is always a top-of-mind issue in the Capitol. How to prevent it, how to solve it, and how to hold

those who break the law accountable. This year's state budget contains funding for several projects that are a key part of public safety in Clay County. Here are three examples:

Prevention

This year's state budget includes \$250,000 for Clay County Youth Alternative to Secure Detention (HB 3723), also known as S.W.E.A.T. This program gives our Clay County judges an effective alter-



native to juvenile detention and saves taxpayer dollars through community service, mentoring and academic assistance.

Program services are provided to youth from ages 6 to 18 who are at risk of becoming involved in the criminal justice system.

Investigation

State funds for Project Cold Case (HB 3971) help that organization raise awareness of unsolved First Coast homicides and provide continuing services to families of victims.

The \$150,000 in this year's budget ensures these families know their loved ones are not forgotten and recognizes that the search for justice never ends.

Incarceration

Sheriff Cook makes a compelling case that the Clay County Jail is in desperate need of an upgrade. With Gov. Ron DeSantis' signature, Clay County has received \$1 million in this year's budget to expand the current facility in Green Cove Springs (HB 3973).

The county jail was built in 1972 and has not increased its capacity since 1999. The planned expansion will add an extra 100 inmate beds, prevent overcrowding, and most importantly, provide increased safety for the Sheriff's Office deputies who work there every day.

Lastly, in July, Floridians can celebrate our independence with two tax holidays. Beginning Friday, July 1st as part of Freedom Week, Clay citizens can purchase outdoor recreation items and tickets to entertainment, and cultural events tax-free. And don't forget the annual back-to-school tax holiday from Monday, July 25th to Sunday, Aug. 7th.

As always, thank you for the honor of representing Clay County in the Florida House.

computer, laptop computer, stereo, television, musical instrument or other mechanical or electronic sound-making device or instrument, which sound emanates from the motor vehicle" and it can be heard from 25 feet.

House Bill 1435 was signed into law on May 26. It also allows law enforcement to write citations if music is unnecessarily loud near special places adjoining schools, churches or hospitals.

The Orange Park and Green Cove Springs police departments, as well as the Clay County Sheriff's Office, said they will enforce the ordinance no differently than other traffic laws.

"Our officers will enforce this law necessary and as prescribed by statute to ensure and maintain the reasonable peace and quiet, and quality of life, that is expected here in the Town Orange Park," the department said.

The state legislature created a noise ordinance in 2007, but the Florida Supreme Court struck it down in 2012 because the language "plainly audible" was too vague. The new law now defines "plainly audible" as anything that can be heard 25 feet from the car.

The question is, how loud is too loud? According to the sheriff's office, "You will have to listen to your radio at a volume NOT plainly audible at a distance of 25 feet or more from your motor vehicle."

The law was passed after several dis-

putes and fights erupted over loud music, including the 2012 murder of 17-year-old Jordan Davis at a Jacksonville gas station. Michael Dunn was convicted of first-degree murder after he asked Jordan and three of his friends to turn down their loud rap music. When they refused, they got into an argument that resulted in Dunn firing into the car.

"Citizen complaints are what drives much of our education and enforcement when it comes to traffic," CCSO said. "This is a new law, and we are working hard to educate our community about what this law means to them. Like most traffic laws, the deputy on the street has the discretion on how to handle each interaction."

Officers in Green Cove Springs will issue warnings in the first month as they try to spread the word to turn the volume down.

"We will for the first 30 days, I will probably have put out an administrative order to my troops, shortly saying for the first 30 days, we would do nothing but written warnings on this type of a call," said Cmdr. Shawn Hines. "I wouldn't anticipate that it's a situation where Green Cove Springs Police Department is going out looking to pull people over for music or anything like that. I think it would be common sense"

Hines also said he understands the need to put limits on loud music.

"You know, really out of control situations, sound or music that is loud is not just bothersome for law enforcement, but bothersome to the community. I think that's would be our guidance for our officers."

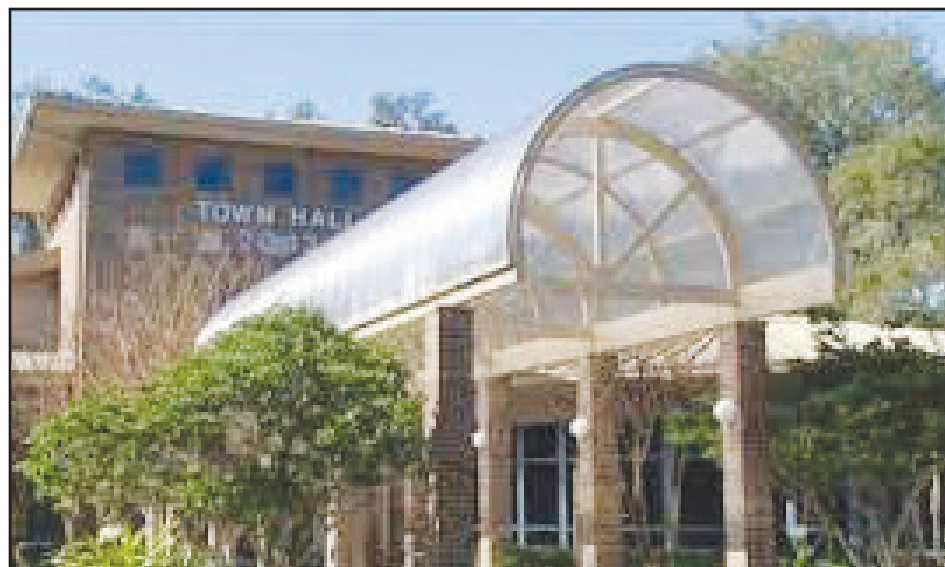

Radio waves

Amateur ham operators join national Field Day ahead of hurricane season

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The Clay County Amateur Radio Emergency Service and Orange Park Amateur Radio Club met with the county emergency management director last Sunday morning. Their conversation was both informative and relaxed.

All knew the next time might not be so tranquil.

The amateur radio groups spent the night at Camp Chowenwaw last weekend to participate in a nationwide field day ahead of the hurricane season. The groups wanted to test their equipment, renew connections with other operators and be on standby for a possible emergency.

“Field Day in a 24-hour cycle is very much like a military deployment,” said ARES volunteer Dave Steiner. “This helps us get into a battle rhythm so that when we do have a major event, we can take what

we have already tested and tried and put that into a schedule so that we get the most efficient operations during an emergency.”

Conditions were primitive during Field Day, especially in the middle of the camp’s swamp. But it didn’t stop the group from sitting behind their computer screens, radios and microphones. They simultaneously called out to other outposts and swatted mosquitos.

They know if they’re called into action, conditions will be worse.

“They are a critical component and a response,” Ward said. “Whenever we activate, we have amateur radio operators that are assigned at our emergency operations center, and at each of our shelters. That is just a redundant form of communications if for some reason we lost the ability for cell phones, landlines and or our radio system, they’re there.”

The Clay County team has played a vital



role in connecting emergency responders who’ve been cut off from civilization following a storm.

They were able to relay the needs of responders in the Florida Panhandle and South Georgia following Hurricane Michael in 2018. They also were called into action following devastating tornadoes last year in Western Kentucky. Without amateur radio volunteers, responders would have been even more isolated.

“The first hurricane or storm that we worked with John (Ward) was Hurricane Hermine. A few weeks later, it was Hurricane Matthew,” said Scott Roberts, the ARES assistant emergency coordinator. “And then we did Hurricane Irma.

“We hope that John never has to call us We hope it never happened. But in the event that something happens, we’re there. And we’re ready.”

According to the American Radio Relay League, Field Day is held on the final weekend of June – the beginning of hurricane season. It is ham radio’s open house when more than 40,000 hams throughout North America set up temporary transmitting stations in public places to demonstrate ham radio’s science, skill and service to communities and the nation. It combines public service, emergency pre-

paredness, community outreach, and technical skills all in a single event.

“We have a system where our radio operators operate from 6 in the morning until 10 at night, and then we go we go to minimize mode from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. where they can get some sleep and get some rest. However, we keep the radios on, and if something happens, like a storm rolls through or it changes directions, we can pick up the radio and reactivate and get them up.

“It is it’s one of those things we do to practice and prepare for when we are needed.”

The setup at Camp Chowenwaw included portable antennas and generators. They also were capable of using Morris code.

Ward said the ham radios are critical to responding to an emergency.

“They were a key component when we deployed our incident management team was deployed to Kentucky, Louisiana, where there was literally no communication,” Ward said. “They’re, obviously, going in when there’s no communication. They can provide that critical component of communications, whether it’s to our response teams or between Emergency Operations Centers to gather the critical resources that are needed for response.”

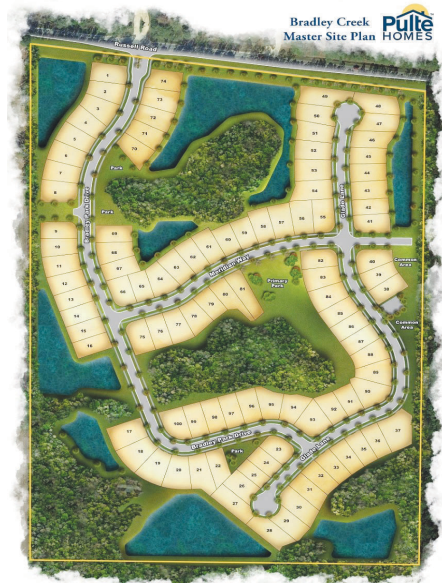

According to The Florida Scorecard:

- 9.5% of Clay County’s population are below poverty level; 13.9% of children live in poverty and the trend is increasing.
- 37% of the Clay County population is classified as Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed with the trend increasing.
- The Clay County School District has identified nearly 860 students without a fixed address.
- 52.6% of students are on free and reduced lunch.
- 44.1% of Clay households are “housing cost burdened” which is defined as paying more than 30 percent of their incomes



on housing; 21 percent of Clay households are “housing cost severely burdened” which is defined as paying more than 50 percent of their incomes on housing.

- The Clay County population is projected to increase to 300,000 from nearly 220,000 within 15 years.

For 10 years, Mercy Support Services has provided much needed supportive services to those in our community who are facing housing insecurity. Working collaboratively with churches, other non-profits and many other community agencies, Mercy helps Clay County families in crisis stabilize and move towards self-sufficiency. Last year, Mercy responded to more than 2,000 calls from individuals who reached out for help, touching more than 3,500 lives in Clay County.

The organization relies solely on donations from the community to fund our unique programs and services. Together, we can lead them back to a place of self-reliance, confidence, and optimism for a much brighter future.



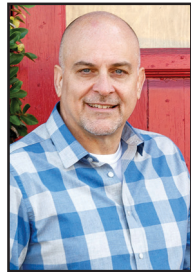

Don't let food poisoning ruin your holiday BBQ cookout

CLAY COUNTY – Whether you're hosting or attending a barbecue for the Fourth of July, avoid bringing foodborne illness to the party, said a University of Florida food safety expert.

"You might have a good system for keeping food safe when you're cooking at home. But when it comes to preparing and eating food outdoors, there are other risks," said Keith Schneider, a professor of food science and human nutrition at the UF Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences.

To prevent food poisoning at your next barbecue, Schneider answers some common food safety questions.

Is it OK to store raw meat in the same cooler as potato salad?

"The number one likely cause of foodborne illness at a barbecue is contact between raw meats and ready-to-eat foods, such as a potato salad," Schneider said. "That's why it's important to keep those things separate and prevent cross-contamination. Storing raw meat in a separate cooler is one way to do that."

Speaking of that potato salad, is mayonnaise what makes it go bad?

"Actually, bacteria don't grow very well in mayonnaise on its own. But when you



introduce other things to that mayo, such as potatoes, eggs or macaroni, you're adding water to the mix, making the mayo less acidic and creating a better environment for bacteria," Schneider said.

This is why it's important to keep foods made with mayo cold because the lower temperature prevents the growth of germs, he said.

I dropped a burger bun on the ground, but I picked it up right away. Five-second rule, right?

"There is no such thing as the five-second rule," Schneider said. "As soon as food comes in contact with germs, it's contaminated. At that point, it's best to use a new bun."

Is this chicken done?

"When it comes to poultry, you can't go by color. Instead, use a meat thermometer to confirm that the thickest part of the chicken has reached 165 degrees Fahrenheit. That's the temperature at which harmful germs are killed," Schneider said.

Are those communal charcoal grills at parks and beaches safe to use?

"Generally, yes. That's because those grills will get very hot. If you preheat them, that will kill any germs that were present," Schneider said. "Still, cleaning them is a good idea, not necessarily for safety, but who wants week-old charred cheese on

their freshly cooked burger?"

Do I need to use different tongs or spatulas for cooked and uncooked meat?

"This is another common mistake: using the same tongs or spatula for raw and cooked meat. This just contaminates cooked meat with germs that were on the uncooked meat," Schneider said. "However, washing those tools after they contact raw meat might not be practical when you're cooking outdoors. Instead, just bring two sets to your barbecue – one for raw meat, one for cooked."

Is hand sanitizer just as good as washing your hands?

"Using hand sanitizer or washing your hands with soap and water will reduce the risk of contaminating food," Schneider said. "If you don't have access to soap and water when you're cooking outdoors, hand sanitizer is a good choice."

How long can I leave the leftovers out?

"The general recommendation is to refrigerate leftovers within two hours. However, if it's a hot day and food is left out outside, that window shrinks to about an hour," Schneider said.

After the pandemic, Jehovah's Witnesses resume public ministry

dez, Florida spokesperson for Jehovah's Witnesses. "During the pandemic we continued to reach out to people through letters and phone calls, but because we love people, we are eager to be able to talk to people in-person and share the Bible's bright hope for the future."

While the organization is not yet back to knocking on doors, local congregations have also resumed free in-person Bible studies along with personal visits to those who have invited them back to their homes.

"While we understand that the pandemic is not over, we are entering into a phase of learning to live with COVID," said Robert Hendriks, U.S. spokesman for Jehovah's Witnesses. "We are sensitive to the



risks that still face our communities and our volunteers, which is why we will not resume door-to-door ministry at this time."

Mobile displays of Bible-based literature have been part of Jehovah's Witnesses' public ministry in the U.S. since 2011.

While "cart witnessing" began in large metropolitan areas around the world, the practice quickly spread to the tens of thousands of smaller communities, becoming a fixture in rail and bus stations, airports, harbors and main streets.

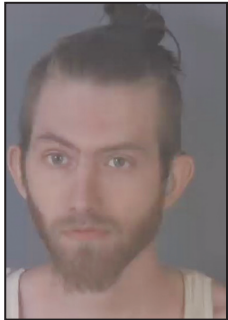

Drake's next court appearance is on Aug. 1. His bond was set at \$100,003.

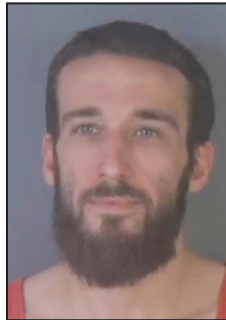
Man arrested for beating man with a stick in an argument over a woman

The victim was taken to Ascension St. Vincent's Clay.



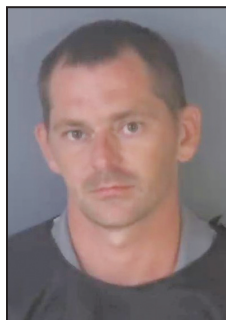

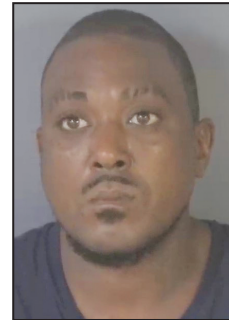
The original arrest warrant was issued Oct. 12, 2021. Minton was in jail at Jacksonville and was arrested by Clay County deputies on June 24.

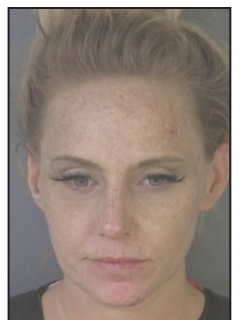

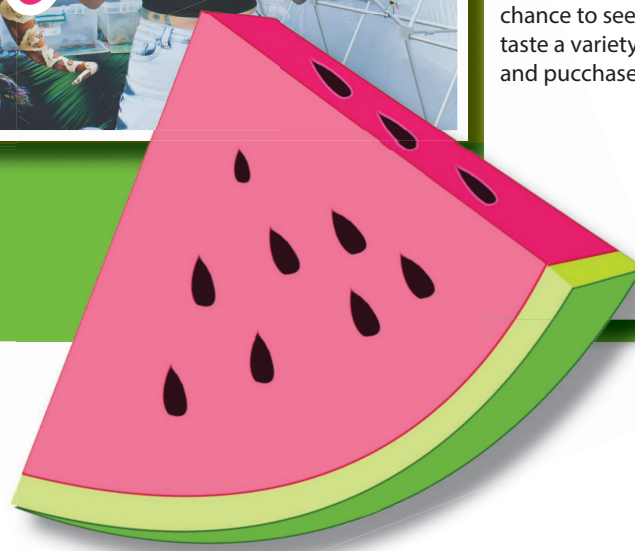

Hewett makes money on pro fishing tour

ORANGE PARK - The old fashion days of grabbing a fishing rod and reel, a bag of worms and getting dad to take him to a pond near the Peoria Road Cemetery for a day on the water in his canoe is now just a memory for one Orange Park High graduate, though now Cole Hewett's life may be about to change quickly.

"It's very technical now and very much a business that the competitors can be cut-throat with," said Hewett, 24, and now a ranked professional bass fisherman in the Major League Fishing (MLF) ranks. "It's still all about getting the most and biggest fish out there, but the money helps."

Hewett, a mid-pack ranked bass fisherman national wide (89th overall), got his first tournament paycheck last week with a seventh place finish for \$17,000 at the MLF Pro Circuit Tournament event held in Richmond, Va, on the James River.

Hewett had one of his best four day tournament finishes with a surprising jump from 73rd place after day one to sixth place after day two to a top 10 cut after day three to make the final day's lineup got him his seventh place finish.

"It's been a progression ever since I started fishing with my dad at about 13 years old (at Whitey's Fish Camp in a Bassing for Babies Tournament)," said Hewett, who fished all the time locally while at Orange Park High, then expanded to the University of Central Florida fish team then entered the MFL Toyota Series for some pre-professional experience before embarking as a pro just recently. "My dad,

Cobbert's boys get fifth in tough nationals grind

KISSIMMEE - Fleming Island High wrestling coach P.J. Cobbert has had a pretty confident look about lately mainly because of the recent successes of his youthful wrestling entourage and a fifth place finish last weekend at the AAU Scholastic Duals national championship tournament; also called the Disney Duals, added to the re-

load of last year's strong state run.

"We had 11 guys go to state, 10 guys get medals with a team that had one senior," said Cobbert, who traveled to the ESPN Wide World of Sports complex and came home with a fifth place team finish in the national hub of high school wrestling after high schools season finish. "It's all part of the process."

Cobbert, noting that his young cadre of grapplers, including state runnerup Jayce Paridon, sophomore sensations Shane and Laird Duhaylungsod, Kaden Schaefer along with veterans like Joshua Sandoval and Jhoel Robinson will build from the Disney Duals experience to make the upcoming November high school season even more exciting. Added to the team were pickups Marcus McGee, Keon Barrientos and Isaiah Schevchook of Oakleaf High plus Palatka's Mikade Harvey (third in 1A at 132) to add to Cobbert's firepower.

"Our pool at Disney was brutal with our North Florida Wrestling Academy Black team paired up against most of the top 10 teams from around the country," said Cobbert. "It was brutal, but it was nice to see how the kids competed hard at every match even after the first one."

That first one, against eventual fourth place finisher Springboro (OH); a 33-30 loss, set the tone for the team's next two days.

"We were winning that match for the most part, but it was a tough start," said Cobbert. "My Fleming Island guys all won

their matches and we just had to get back into the game and realize that this was going to be a rugged weekend. They responded well."

After trudging through pool play, NFWA Black, who responded to that opening match loss with a string of wins; 78-6, 51-9 and 78-3 finished third with the Eagle Empire Purple (FL), with a ton of south Florida wrestlers, and Springboro at first and second to set up their gold championship round finish. Eagle Empire beat NFWA Black in their pool play match, 37-24, with

a slew of wins in the middle weights lineup.

"Each year, it seems the middle weight guys, from about 132 to 170, are the toughest guys on the mats," said Cobbert. "Our guys got a little beat up at the end with us just winning two of the final 10 matches."

Again, NFWA Black responded with a strong 36-30 win over Mill Creek High (GA) to get to their third place pool finish.

Against Mill Creek, ironically, at 106, Shane Duhaylungsod, opened with a loss by pin at 1:04 with twin brother Laird, up next, and winning by pin at 1:04.

"Shane had some really tough matches, but both of those boys are students of the game," said Cobbert. "They are having great careers at Fleming Island."

Shane finished at 7-6 with Laird at 11-2.

Paridon, second in Class 2A last year after finishing the season unbeaten up to the championship match, finished at 12-1 with a 3-2 loss to Indiana powerhouse Perry Meridian Blue's Toby Billerman, an

Indiana state runnerup last year, returned to Disney after his NFWA effort to compete in the All Stars matches a week later.

"He's a tough kid and was able to stay at his weight the whole week to be able to compete with the All Stars," said Cobbert.

At 132, Schaefer also went 12-1 with a loss to Eagle Empires' Danny Martinez (3A-SW Miami High), 12-5 before scorching the field with 12 wins off of seven pins with three under a minute; 27 seconds, 51 seconds and 43 seconds. Martinez also finished at 12-1 with a loss to Springboro's Dillon Campbell. Campbell, an Ohio state champion at 113, wrestled Harvey, a 16-1 win for Campbell, with Schaefer pinning in his Springboro match.

McGee, a state wrestler for the Knights, finished with a 10-2 slate with losses to Indiana Brownsburg's Brady Ison, 60-9 last year as a freshman in Indiana, and Eagle Empire's Aaron Lanster out of Miami.

One top pickup for Cobbert was Camden County High's Ryder Wilder who finished unbeaten at 170/182 at 13-0.

Joshua Sandoval, a Fleming Island High state placer, was 11-2 with losses to Eagle Empire's Cahmari Johnson, another Camden County High wrestler, and Constant Pressure's Brayden Bobo, out of Michigan, 67-10, fourth in Michigan at 171 last year. In the Community 2 rankings, NFWA Red finished fourth.

NFWA Red was led by Matthew Newman, 11-1 at 10, Mario Dibella, 10-2 at 113, Brody Boehm, 11-1 at 126, Austin Howard 8-4 at 160, John McNames 8-3 at 170, Walter Poe 8-3 at 195 and Kaiden Sanchez 7-5 at 285.

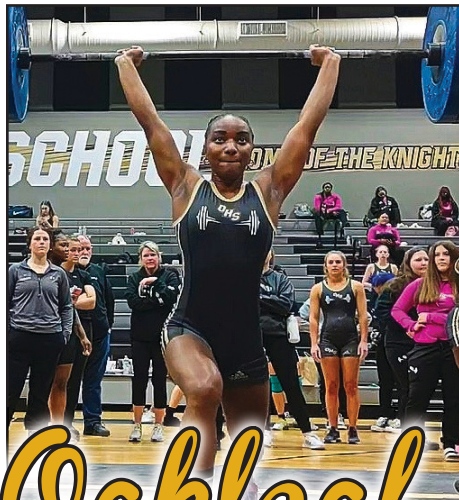

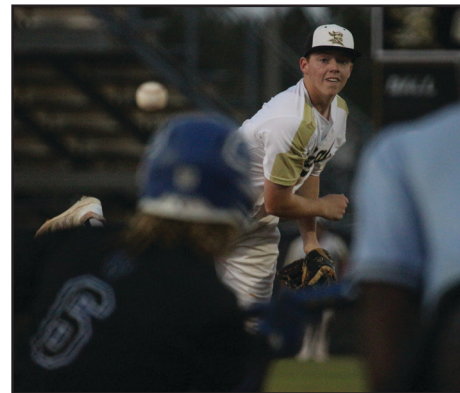
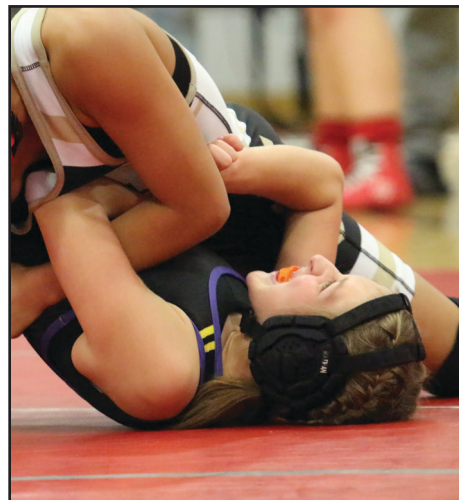

"It's about the bond; the people around you and how you feel about them, that made Florida State the final choice," said Kearney, a four star offensive tackle with nearly 50 NCAA Division I schools; west to Oregon, north to Michigan, east to Rutgers and south to FSU, bantering for his immense athletic ability. "If the people around you aren't right, you're not going to be right."

Kearney, a massive 6'-4", 300 pound offensive lineman, brings a sense of work ethic and athletic power to his game with time after time on film, Kearney seen bludgeoning defensive counterparts 10-12 yards downfield with the Raiders run game on his tail.

For the work ethic part, Kearney gave another Orange Park High football standout, Kendy Charles, a lot of the credit.

"Kendy gave me knowledge," said Kearney. "When we had the quarantine (COVID), he was the one who kept me focused on doing the prep work to be ready when we got back on the field."

Charles, now a standout junior defensive end at Liberty University after an All State career as a Raider, remembered seeing Kearney entering the locker room as a freshman of immense size.

"I saw this very big guy come in the room and the first thing that popped into my head was the way he carried himself in," said Charles. "As a freshman, nobody knew who he was, but his size and his confidence when he walked in was what impressed me the most. We started a friendship right there."

Charles, on defense, and Kearney, his nemesis on offense, created a working relationship that made both players improve their skills to outdo the other.

"When you get to practice against a guy like that every day, you can only get better and improve," said Kearney. "He also kept me focused in the weightroom, the film room and on the field."

With the very possibility of a Liberty vs. FSU football contest somewhere in the next two or three years; maybe a post-season



bowl, Charles was confident that the intensity of the Raider practice sessions would present itself.

"Funny, but he knows I'm not going to go easy on him if I'm on the corner and he's coming off the edge," said Charles. "Whenever I came home, I talked to him about life and sometimes that comes up. He's going to be great in whatever he does."

For Kearney, that possible clash created a coy smile.

"I'm going to be ready for him if that happens," said Kearney.

As for the process, Kearney credits his mom, Veronica, with his transition through the web of recruitment, school and Raider football.

"Through all the years, my mom has been the one I could talk to," said Kearney. "Transportation rides, talks with me, she influenced me by helping me weave through all this to make a good decision. She's very smart."

In the Raider locker room, Kearney said his "brothers" in battle, the Raider teammates around him, get credit with giving him their take on things.

"My brothers here; JoJo (Restall RB), Brian (Green WR) and Nolan (Chambers WR) plus Braeden (Hawkins OL guard), we bonded here a lot and they helped in the decision," said Kearney. "We all put a lot of work in to put Orange Park back on top."

Don, has been a part of the experience from the very beginning.”

With his top 10 finish in Virginia, Hewett’s \$17,000 paycheck made his annual earning to nearly \$50,000 with an eye on one of those \$100,000 top prize checks in the future.

“One of the things that changed was that the TV cameras chose me to be the one they followed at the tournament,” said Hewett. “In the pro fishing world, that’s a big deal for the sponsors and the social media part of the business end of it.”

In his very first pro tournament, Hewett took second, earned \$6,000 and nearly won himself a brand new boat.

“The entry fees are sometimes up to \$5,000 so the \$6,000 just about covers that, but we missed the boat by a pound,” said Hewett. “The move to the pro circuit is

about making that commitment to possibly spending \$20-\$30,000 before making any money.”

For Don Hewett, a successful dirt car racing driver in the area, his son’s commitment to the craft of fishing is the key.

“Just like any sport or profession, it’s about how much time are you willing to put in to get better,” said Don Hewett. “Cole has been dedicated since his high school days to do this as a professional and he has been willing to put the time in to keep getting better.”

Hewett was miked up for the James River experience and was a little nervous because he was transporting about \$100,000 worth of camera equipment and crew on the James River.

“The camera guy told me that his equipment was worth that and that he wasn’t supposed to return home unless he had the camera,” said Don Hewett. “Those boats zip around pretty good on the water and

there is not a lot of room to move around, but having them be on Cole’s boat was a good first step into moving his professional career.”

Hewett noted that the filming was to be broadcast on the national TV; Outdoor channel and NBC Sports, in the upcoming weeks as part of the MLF pro circuit coverage.

“One of the aspects of the pro fish world is the social media following which is something I’m just now grasping and trying to find ways to expand by brand sort of speak,” said Hewett. “The fishing itself is exciting on the boat and in the competition, but spectators can’t sit in a stadium and watch like a football game so it’s up to us to generate the following. A lot of my prize money goes to learn and implement more of that social media following.”

Hewett quickly learned in his first money-making endeavor as a pro that split second decisions are the difference between

\$17,000 and \$100,000.

“It’s all about calculating a ton of information and making a decision to either move to a different spot or stick,” said Hewett. “I have four underwater monitors on my boat that I basically am video-screen fishing as I can see the fish, the obstacles, my bait on the line’s position and can monitor the tide pattern of the water to decide if the fish are going to be here or over there.”

Hewett noted that the underwater monitors is clearly just a professional investment.

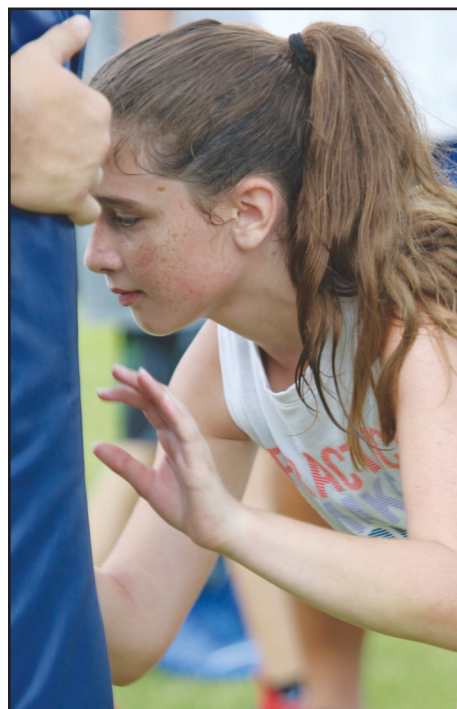
“I’m not going to get beat because I don’t have the technology to maximize by fishing,” said Hewett. “Sometimes, though, it’s frustrating because with all that technology, sometimes the fish just don’t bite. Then a guy follows you, in the same spot, same bait and bags a five pounder.”

Hewett’s next tournament is an MLF Pro Circuit event in Plattsburgh, NY, on Lake Champlain July 29-Aug. 1.
