Welcome to the North Florida Region, we at NFRCC proudly serve and support the business community of Bradford, Union and SW Clay counties. We work with multiple agencies and organizations to make sure that our area businesses are represented and informed. We are currently working with the City of Starke and the Department of Transportation, as they work to complete the railroad overpass on SR 100 / Madison Street by the spring of 2023. The resurfacing of Call Street from US 301 to St. Clair Street started mid-January 2023 also on the list of projects is the removal of the pavers that were at two major intersections on Call Street and installing stamped concrete to simulate the pavers. The local businesses have been challenged during the six plus weeks that it has taken to complete this project and the Chamber has done our best to keep businesses informed about parking and driving details while encouraging customers to continuing coming downtown to shop and dine. Businesses located along this corridor keep reminding ourselves how great it will look when DOT has completed these projects

and there are no more orange cones and barricades dotting our downtown. The Chamber office is located beside one of the intersection projects being renovated so we have had a front row seat to this particular project.

We have been working with some of the key folks in Lake Butler looking to find that small hotel that is so needed for the community. This is a project that will be beneficial not just to the residents of Lake Butler but also utilized by the major employers that currently have nowhere in county for overnight visiting dignitaries. The addition of a Microtel would be beneficial for neighboring communities during major events like the Fair and Strawberry Festival keeping folks closer to the events. To date we have been unsuccessful in finding the perfect fit for Lake Butler / Union County on this project but we will continue to search and seek out the best business for the area.

The Keystone RV Resort has brought so many new things to our region, not just campers but residents who are now our neighbors. The additional spaces being opened with the expansion of yet another section of the



resort more will be coming to visit and live. The beautiful grounds and new community room are such an asset to our region adding a space that the area formally was lacking where larger groups may host meetings. The proximity to restaurant Orange Blossom and the Keystone Airport makes Keystone RV Resort truly a gem for our area.

These are just a few of the many projects that are currently in place or will be launched within the next few months. Starke/Bradford County is poised for growth and activity and the Chamber is very excited to be a small part in the great group that is working to make this happen. It is our plan that as our region grows that we grow wisely and keep the charm and appeal that brought so many to this region in the first place.

Wildlife Management Areas

 Santa Fe Swamp Wildlife Management Area Southeast 11th Avenue, Starke, FL 32091 (Approximately 1/2 Mile off State Road 100)

The Santa Fe Swamp Wildlife Management Area (WMA) consist of 7,272 acres and is open for fishing, wildlife viewing, horseback riding, hiking, and bicycling throughout the year. Children under the age of 16 are required to wear a helmet when horseback riding on public lands. Hunting of white-tailed deer, feral hog, turkey, gray squirrel, and eastern cottontail rabbit is allowed in this WMA during specified seasons with primitive weapons only (bow and arrow and muzzleloader).

Raiford Wildlife Management Area
 Northwest County Road 125, Lawtey, FL 32058

Raiford WMA consists of 9,141 acres and is located along the New River in northwest Bradford County. The New River flows through the center of the WMA, and Olustee Creek (which branches off of the New River) flows through the eastern portion of the WMA. Much of the area is closed or in private ownership but the remaining portion of the area is open for hunting during specified seasons. Wild turkey, white-tailed deer, gray squirrel, eastern cottontail rabbit, gopher tortoise, raccoon, and red-tailed hawk are some of the wildlife species that can be found in the area.



One of Florida's first state parks since 1935. The initial property was donated by Martin J. "Mike" Roess and developed by the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC). The CCC was launched in 1933 to combat unemployment during the Depression. In 1935, 25 craftsmen from Company 2444 were sent to the Gold Head site where they were joined by hundreds of CCC youth and established Camp SP-5. Together they planted trees, cleared areas for campsites, built roads and constructed many of the buildings.

The Bradford Sportsmen's Farm shooting range is located in Graham, FL and offers some of the best and most diverse shooting facilities available to the public in one site. These facilities include two fully automated, 14 station sporting clay courses with two machines at each station. We also have two fully automated 5-stands controlled by portable long-range controllers as well as a 25-yard pistol range, a 50-yard rifle and pistol range, a 300-yard rifle range, and an 850-yard rifle range. Our sporting clays courses are designed to accommodate all shooter skill levels with one course for novice to intermediate skilled shooters and another for tournament level shooters. New to our facility is our covered and air conditioned banquet facility.

Kingsley Lake

Kingsley Lake is an almost circular lake of about 2,000 acres in North Central Florida, about six miles east of Starke, Florida. According to some sources, it is the oldest and highest lake in Florida, located on the edge of the Trail Ridge formation. The lake is a very stable lake with a sandy bottom. Its deepest part is about 90 feet.

Biking

Just west of Starke you will find: Lake Sampson, Lake Rowell, and Lake Crosby. Fish these waters for bluegill, sunfish, crappie, and both sunshine and largemouth bass. Lake Sampson, in particular, is a fishermen's paradise. Lake Sampson and Rowell are connected by a canal, which is passable by small boat. Canoeing, swimming, picnicking, and hiking trails are also available. If you enjoy biking, you'll enjoy riding the Starke – Lake Butler Loop. This 61-mile bicycle route passes through Starke, as well as Hampton and Brooker, on its way around to Lake Butler.

Not all the loud blasts from the Camp Blanding area are military explosions. Some are part of the University of Florida's research on one of nature's most potent forces – lightning.

The university's International Center for Lightning Research and Testing was originally created after one of the state's worst droughts to find solutions for wildfires triggered by lightning strikes. But there was one problem: scientists had to wait for passing storms to do their work.

Martin Uman, chair of the College of Engineering's electrical and computer engineering department, told the university's Explore magazine his group had to create a way to accelerate Mother Nature's fury.

"It was a horror," Uman said. "We were all set to go. Everybody was there."

When storms blew through, strikes were unpredictable and lasted less than a second. Also, lightning is thunderous and 50,000 degrees.

Uman and the University of West Florida's professor of electrical engineering Doug Jordan set up a high-speed camera at Camp Blanding in Starke for optical measurements. But he only had 15 good images after 15 years of research.

Engineers at Florida launched skinny rockets 2,400 feet from batteries of steel tubes into a storm cloud to induce a lightning strike. According to the university, researchers recorded as many as 35 strikes one summer by firing rockets from a 35-foot wooden structure topped by a lightning rod on the base.

Not only will ongoing research help scientists better prepare for dangerous conditions, but it can also help avoid emergencies like small airports losing power and keeping people from being killed by strikes. Each year, about 150 people die by lightning and strikes create more than \$500 million in insurance claims, according to the university.

"When we understand the mechanism, we will try to design a better lightning protection system," said Vladimir Rakov, a UF electrical and computer engineering professor. Research at the Starke lab has resulted in more than 100 published papers on the different aspects of lightning, mainly how electric and magnetic fields are related to currents.

Lightning research has come a long way since Benjamin Franklin tied a key to a kite he flew in a storm. The Camp Blanding facility is considered one of the premier research centers in the world.

"Every year, we're able to do fancier and fancier stuff and learn more and more than we could before," Uman told Explore.

The City of Hampton, Florida, located about six miles south of Starke was incorporated in 1893 and has gone through phases of boom and busy throughout its history. Hampton was known as Crossroads primary because the Atlantic-to-Gulf railroad was built through the area in 1859 and the settlement grew up around it. Good farmland prompted further settlement and several small stores were established. A second railroad, the Georgia-Southern and Florida Rail Line, passed through town a little later and prompted a boom. Crossroads was renamed Hampton when the first post office was established in 1882. The town of Hampton, Florida was named after a 10-year-old boy, Hampton Terry, whose father owned a farm near the railroad tracks.

The town of Hampton, Florida was incorporated in 1893, but it also allowed its charter to lapse and had to be reincorporated in 1911 and 1925. The Big Freeze adversely affected Hampton's economy-as it did any town which relied on oranges and other agricultural crops and caused an end to the boom. Rapid use of timber in the area led to an exhaustion of the crop and a decline of the timber industry around Hampton. With the timber and oranges declining, farmers turned to cotton and strawberries. The town once had two cotton gins in operation.

Hampton struggled to survive but as cars replaced trains as the main mode of travel, Hampton declined. Road 13 (now US 301) was re-routed and bypassed Hampton. The road had a curve called the Hampton Curve, which was considered dangerous and the State Road Department re-routed Road 13 in the 1930's to straighten the curve.

Hampton appeared to be dying, but when Camp Blanding's boom hit the area, the small town near Starke also benefited. Troops were carried to the camp on the train and their families rented rooms and homes in the town. When Blanding's boom ended, however, Hampton subsided back into the sleepy little hamlet it is today.



Ropoza and his sister, "Grannie" Pamela Synder, opened the restaurant 20 years ago and haven't slowed down since.

"It's always busy," Ropoza said.

Brother and sister work where needed, even if that means flipping eggs in the back or filling large glasses of sweet tea or coffee in the front.

The interior is filled with distinctive decorations, from a collection of dinner plates to antique signs, quilts and dolls.

The diner also offers a daily special, including all-you-can-eat fried chicken, real turkey, and dressing on Sundays. Getting in and out quickly won't be easy, especially after church. Everyone, however, said it was worth the wait.

Other specials include meatloaf on Mondays, chicken and dumplings on Tuesdays, all-you-can-eat spaghetti or fried fish on Wednesdays, beef tips and rice on Thursdays, prime rib and pork roast on Fridays and "Grannie's choice" on Saturdays.

Grannie's isn't your place if you're looking for a cookie-cutter national chain. If you want to have a great home-cooked meal and a pleasant chat with your server, pull up a chair and enjoy.

Starke Racing Museum.. a true Gem and Legacy of Harold Smith.


It began in Orion Illinois and the Quad Cities Speedway, which open in 1958 and was the first track to host a NASCAR Grand National Series Race. This was the original heart throb of Harold Smith. Smith owned a gas station in Orien and grew to love the race and became a big fan. His passion soon lead him to start regular trips to Daytona Beach for the annual race week festivities. Somewhere around 1970 he packed the family and made the move to Daytona. Only back then with no GPS and poorly done maps, they landed in Starke after 1089 miles and about 90 miles short of Daytona. They bought some land and opened up a body shop. Sons Tom Smith and Jerry Smith joined in the racing scene as youth and as the story goes helped their father with auto repair and in a relentless search of collecting racing and collectable items, cars, oil cans, signs and you name its from long ago. They might be called the original American Pickers! Now, grandson to Harold, Shannon operates Smith Brothers Body Shop in Starke and the property also houses the 3,000 sq. ft. Museum packed full of over 10,000 incredibly cool and original racing items. The collection includes a 1938 Harley Davidson Knucklehead, several cars, thousands of items including the blood donor cards from Halifax Medical Center in Daytona Beach where Harold donated his blood type to Lee Petty (father to Richard Petty and grandfather to Kyle Petty) after a 1961 crash in Daytona. Tom Smith said, "dad carried that card until the day he died". Tom and Jerry Smith opened the Museum so the world could see all the wonderful Auto memorabilia and Race History their family has amassed over seven decades. Visit us at 18536 US 301 in Starke.

GUIDE TO MISTORIC STARKE

Eagle Scout Service Project of Douglas Wayne Snyder II Boy Scout Troop 70, Starke, Florida Project Sponsored by the Bradford County Historical Board of Trustees



- 1 The Old Bradford County Courthouse as built in 1902 and served Bradford County as the seat of government for 66 years. The Courthouse was renovated and is presently used as Santa Te Community College Andres Center. The site is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and is an excellent example of Southern Gothic Revival style.
- 2 The Rosenberg Building, located at 201-203 E. Call Street was built between 1895 and 1901. It has been used for many purposes, including lodging military for a short period. Bought by Charles Rosenberg in 1941, it has just finished renovation for use as a Fine Arts Center by the Santa Fe Andrews Center.
- **3** The Railroad has played a very large role in the history of Starke. Starke developed around the crossing of several early roads and the railroad, and it joined Starke to the rest of the country in the early years of growth.
- **4** Mitchell's Reccall Drug Store, located at 127 E. Call Street was built about 1897. The first floor has housed sev-
- eral stores and the Starke post office until 1941. Offices were located on the second floor.
- **5** The Von Klein Home, now the Magnolia Hotel, is located at 137 N. Walnut Street. The home was built before 1884. The original owner was Dr. Lochr Von Klein, an early Mayor of Starke. The home was turned in to a hotel in the late 1920's by Arthur and Gertrude Williams.

is located at 140 S. Thompson
Street and consists of three
buildings built in the 1920-1930
period. The first building was used
as a garage for the Ford Motor
Company. The second building was
built for a Coca-Cola distributor.
The third building was added to
the first building as part of the auto
sale and service shop.

6 Vaughn Johnson Cabinet Center

- 7 The building that. Now includes Starke Shoe Repair, City Barber Shop and This n'That was built in 1901-1912. This site was first owned by George Cole in 1859. Call Street is named after his friend, Florida's Lt. Governor Call. This building is a remnant of the earliest Starke business district.
- **8** The site at 108 E. Call Street was built in 1895. The most distinctive feature is the traditional storefront facade, which typifies early 20th century architecture.
- **9** The palatial Sidney J. Sternburg Home, built by a wealthy oil and coal family from Pennsylvania, has stood on the corner of North Cherry and Washington Streets since 1889.
- 10 The Charles Hardy home at 327 N. Walnut Street was originally build as the home of Edward P. Duncan, an officer of the Bradford County Bank, around 1900. The longest period of ownership was by the Eugene S. Matthews family, who purchased the home in 19227 and owned it until 1960.
- **11** The Archibald Johns Home on Nana Street was built before the year 1900. It was the home of the only Starke resident to become Governor of Florida, Charlie Johns.

- **12** The Color T. Peek Home was built in the early part of this century. Mr. Peek was one of the first teachers in the Starke Institute, the first school in Starke. Mr. Peek went on to become one of the Mayors of Starke. The home has been renovated by the current owner and was moved from Madison and Court Streets to the present location.
- 13 The Lex Green Home is located at 323 N. Walnut Street and is now owned by Edwin Jeffcoat. The home is an excellent example of Southern Classical Revival architecture prevalent in the second and third decades of this century. The home was originally occupied by the Green family. Mr. Lex Green represented the Starke and Bradford area in the U.S. Congress for more than 20 years.
- **14** The Judge Elzia Sanders Home at 344 N. Walnut Street was originally built by Lawrence Wall, who served in the Florida Legislature in the early years of this century. Later bought by Col. D. E. Knight, a Starke lawyer, it was extensively remodeled.
- **15** The Bradford County Bank, 100 E. Call Street opened on July 4, 1914. Now owned by C. R. Smith, Jr., the Bank has been restored to tits Bold Classical Revival style, with a lofty interior making a strong architectural statement about the community's hopes and dreams in the early boom period of the construction. The Bank is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.


He has served previously on many additional business and agricultural boards, including the American Turpentine Association National Board and has served as past President of the Union County Farm Bureau.

Transportation, budgets, work hours and

A study of Bradford County residents found nutrition, education, wellness and mental health were among the most critical concerns.

The Health and Wellness Hub, which is at the Rje Center at 1080 Pine St. Starke, is a collaboration of community services. The center will host workshops where residents can get information and be connected to available services.

Meridian will provide mental health services and Farm Share will help feed residents.

The University of Florida's Cooperative Extension Service Office doesn't just help farmers grow corn and raise cattle.

According to its website, the office in downtown Starke also has programs to provide information to motivate and empower families with the skills needed to adapt and sustain a healthy lifestyle and achieve financial services.

The extension office is a partnership between the U.S. Department of Agriculture and UF's Institute of Food and Agriculture Sciences. The office provides research-based educational programming.

The Extension Office launched its Health Equity program earlier this month to narrow the gap between families with needs and the ability to participate in available benefits.

The office also conducted classes to help residents identify invasive species. In a county where agriculture is king, keeping an eye on bugs that can destroy a field is paramount.

Of course, the primary function of the Extension Office is to provide information on Family and Consumer Sciences, Livestock Natural Resources, Agriculture, 4-H Youth Development and Horticulture.

One of the most popular programs includes master gardeners conducting workshops to show to grow more vibrant vegetable, flower and butterfly gardens.

Here's the scoop: anyone with a sweet tooth can easily find cold, creamy satisfaction in and around Starke. The trail of frozen delicacies starts on U.S. Highway 301 north of town near Lawtey, with a stop at Carl's Ice Cream.
