Thousands at Spring Park to honor soldiers, welcome summer season

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - While some will be making a splash in the city pool, feasting on watermelon, perusing through a maze of 100 food and craft vendors or finding a comfortable place to watch fireworks, councilman Matt Johnson believes the most significant part of the day-long gathering is recognizing those who've served the nation's military.

For 35 years, the city's biggest singleday attraction starts with veterans and family members stepping to the microphone to describe their service and sacrifices. After all, Johnson said that's what Memorial Day is all about.

"I was really impressed the first time I went to RiverFest and saw the wreath laid at the soldier memorial," he said. "I've never seen in my life a ceremony where the microphone is handed to every single person who served, and they're given the ability to tell the public about their service. It can be as simple as, you know, you served 32 years in Florida Army National Guard or it could be you served in Vietnam or Korea, with the Army or the Navy.

"It's just really so special. I've never seen any place do this where they invite every single veteran to say a word about their service, so it's a way to celebrate."

Johnson is a retired U.S. Army colonel. He served with the 146th Expeditionary

Signal Battalion during Iraqi Freedom and the former commander of Camp Blanding.

For some, RiverFest is an opportunity to finally receive the accolades they earned more than 50 years ago.

"It's really neat because some of these people have bottled this up for years, especially Vietnam veterans that were never welcomed when they got home." Johnson said. "They are allowed to say a quick word

CLAY COUNTY - Clay County District Schools, led by Food and Nutrition Services Director Susie Glover, plans to connect children throughout the county with hundreds of free meals this summer. The program will fill the nutrition gap for eight weeks during the summer

"Obviously, hunger doesn't stop when the school year ends, so we try to reach out and provide as many meals to children as we can," Glover said.

Residents around Green Cove Springs, Lake Asbury address county's future

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - District 5 residents had the opportunity to pitch their ideas to county officials to help them create their 20-year Strategic Plan Monday night at the county's administration build-

The meeting focused on residents suggesting which factors they wanted to improve the quality of life in the county, with residents directing their responses toward Peyton Beattie, Community Resource Development Extension Agent at UF-IFAS Extension, and Troy Nagle, Assistant County

Suggestions filled five pieces of poster paper during the 90-minute meeting. Responses were taped to the wall, and residents voted for the items they deemed most and least necessary.

Among top choices included maintaining and balancing smart growth, infrastructure, conservation, preservation of trees, protecting wildlife, creating green spaces, parks, walking trails, and pocketed green spaces that connect to bike trails, affordable and mixed housing, attracting satellite campuses from universities to attract young people and developing safe nightlife.

Smart growth garnered the most votes, but the infrastructure was the secondmost-important option.

Misplanned or unplanned roads, traffic, the safety of crossing roads for children and pedestrians and narrow streets such as County Road 209-A/B were among the category's wide-ranging list of concerns.

Quality of life factors residents noted included properly timed stop lights, parking on neighborhood streets near Spring Park Elementary, the commute to Jacksonville for working residents, attracting businesses to increase job growth, limiting housing developments to cut down on traffic, improving mass public transit via buses, waterway, and railroads, attracting a younger and more diverse workforce and creating more bus stops close to housing.

Earlier in the meeting, residents were

encouraged to list what they liked.

Some of the best parts about Clay included the District Schools and the library system, the opportunity for outdoor recreation, the friendliness of people, the sense of community, the opportunity for business growth, the approachability of leadership, including Sheriff Michelle Cook and her

Meanwhile, some concerns included growth and overdevelopment.

District 5 Commissioner Kristen Burke said. "I felt like we had some really good perspectives. I think there was a lot of positive feedback and ideas from citizens regarding helping congestion and traffic. I felt like the people that were there had mixed feelings on development, but they (demonstrated) positive ideas on how to manage it and (looked) into smart growth and development with the number of people moving here."

Following the meeting, Nagle addressed some of the concerns.

He said the Jacksonville Transportation Authority's five-year mobility study for the county is in the process of being finalized, along with Clay County's Conservation Plan and the Bonded Transportation Program's roads project, which will create roadway enhancements for six existing roadways and one extension to the First Coast Ex-

Commissioners push back discussion for ER, medical building

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - The Board of County Commissioners reexamined a request to rezone three parcels totaling approximately 10 acres along County Road 220 and west of Claude Road for a standalone emergency room and medical office building.

The proposed rezoning from Agricultural Residential to Private Services would facilitate the development of properties designated for single-family dwellings.

The considered parcels totaling 9.56 acres contain approximately 1,041 feet of frontage along CR 220 and 478 feet on Claude Road. St. Johns Classical Academy is across the street on Claude Road.

However, after being pushed back for reconsideration at the March and April 25

item later. This time, the hearing is set for

After a motion made by Commissioner

meetings, the BCC decided to consider the Mike Cella, the reconsideration measure passed 4-0. The proposed hospital is in Cella's District 1.

Many technicalities have arisen during

the process, as the applicant's attorney was ill during the March meeting, and the principal was not present in April.

"We're going to try to rework some legislation and look into revising regulations that address this particular land use and separate some (of) those out that don't really belong, then run it by the planning commission and then get it back to you," Cella said.

The attorney said the process would take approximately 90 days to put together. He said the August date for reconsideration would be most effective. The attorney will also seek to readvertise the motion.

"There is a concern with the residents regarding (the project) because of traffic already next-door at St. Johns and on 220, and the fact that there is nothing else in the area except for residential," Commissioner Kristen Burke said.






Substance use, mental health disorders impact veterans

Millions of Americans celebrate Memorial Day, honoring the memory of those service members who have been lost. It is also vital to recognize the millions of veterans who made it home and struggle with substance use, mental health disorders, or suicidal ideation.

Substance disorders in veteran populations are linked to homelessness and suicide. In Florida are over 1.4 million veterans, the third largest veteran population in the na-

National on Drug Use and Health. 3.9 million

veterans have a substance use disorder or a mental illness. Roughly 12% of these individuals have had serious thoughts of suicide.

"Substance use disorders are complex and are influenced by many factors. Military life comes with its own risk factors and potential causes," said Michael Leach of Addicted.org.

There are common difficulties that veterans face when they leave service. That can include financial hardships, difficulty finding employment, or accessing benefits. There are significant challenges when transitioning back to civilian life.

Veterans are also at a higher risk of experiencing physical, mental, and emotional health concerns. Untreated trauma can quickly develop into addiction and mental health problems. That also directly impacts all areas of life.

Additionally, there are barriers to accessing some forms of treatment. That can include cost and insurance gaps. Many communities struggle with inadequate funding. Veterans also experience limited access to treatment in rural locations. Stigma regarding addiction and mental illness is also a factor.

Fortunately, there are options and ways that families can help; consider some of the following:

• The Florida Department of Veterans Affairs provides numerous resources to as-

DeSantis, Trump each have a path to win the state in 2024

Gov. Ron DeSantis announced his candidacy for the presidency Wednesday on Twitter with Elon Musk. This will lead the Governor into a head-on rivalry with former President Trump competing for primary votes and funding.

According to a new Florida law, DeSantis can run for President while remaining the Governor of Florida. As the third largest state by population, home to the top two leading potential Republican Primary contenders, and as a winner-take-all delegate state, Florida will play a vital role in the Republican Primary. DeSantis must win Florida to be taken seriously as a GOP Presidential Primary candidate. Does DeSantis' gubernatorial success indicate he can win the Florida Republican Presidential Primary?

Winning Florida will be no simple task. U.S. Sen. Marco Rubio embarrassingly lost to Trump during the 2016 Primary races in his state. Rubio lost by an astounding 18%, which equated to nearly half a million votes. Rubio only won Miami-Dade County, one out of Florida's 67 counties.

In 2016, Trump won 4,617,886 votes in Florida, or 48.6% of the votes. In 2020, Trump received 51.2%, or 5.668,731 votes. Trump continues to rise in popularity in many national polls due to his indictment.

Yet there is hope for DeSantis. In the 2022 Midterms, DeSantis won the gubernatorial race and received a whop-

ping 59.4% of the casted votes. This equates to 4,613,783 votes. DeSantis won seven counties that Trump lost. These seven equate to 37% of Florida's total voters and are home to Florida's quickest-growing regions.

Palm Beach County, home to Mar-a-Lago, Trump's primary residence, voted for Biden in 2020 and for DeSantis in 2022. During the 2020 election, Trump lost by 12.76% or 98,861 votes. In 2022, DeSantis won by three points or 15,842 votes.

The pattern is similar in Miami-Dade, Florida's largest county by population. Trump lost Miami-Dade County by 7.33% or by 85,031 votes. In 2022, DeSantis won Miami-Dade by 11.3% or 80,596 votes.

In Jacksonville, where DeSantis was born, spent his early years and served as a U.S. congressman, DeSantis won by 38,758 votes. In 2020, Trump lost Duval County by 18,794 votes.

Voter turnout in Florida was at 54% during the 2022 General Election. That far surpasses voter turnout in the 2016

and 2020 Presidential Primaries at 24% and 28%, respectively.

One strategy DeSantis can use to secure his base is relational organizing. This campaign strategy focuses on building personal relationships between the campaign team and voters.

There is a large overlap between social engineering and relational organizing as a campaign strategy. Individuals will feel more motivated to vote when they receive a personal text from a friend versus a spam text. The campaign team provides information such as state voting laws, polling locations and hours of operation. Diverse communities form around campaign staff, blending voters from all demographics of society. Each voter receives a score based on previous election participation. This score guides campaigns on focusing their time and resources on interacting with the local community.

The best campaign staffers are individuals who have preexisting relationships with the community and feel valued and empowered by the candidate. Interacting with campaign staffers gives many voters the empowering feeling that they are tapping into something larger than themselves and contributing to the future of America.

Relational organizing has been shown to increase voter engagement by over 12%. This percentage can fluctuate significantly during a race with a low turnout, such as a Presidential Primary.

Securing votes through relational organizing and grassroots is not cheap. According to POLITICO, DeSantis spent about \$100 million during his re-election campaign. This equates to approximately \$22 for every 4,613,783 votes cast in his favor.

Many campaign studies suggest that a voter can take seven to 10 indirect impressions to recognize a candidate's name. The impression can come from ads, hearing a name on TV, seeing their face on billboards or discussing candidates amongst friends.

The best way for voters to have a lasting impression is by meeting the candidate themselves or interacting with a campaign team member. These impressions typically happen over many months. In Florida, both Trump and DeSantis have likely reached this impression threshold. Nationwide, it will cost DeSantis more money per voter to strengthen his name recognition.

Florida has brought in more than 1.5 million new voters since 2016. This growth is fueled by blue-state transplants, many of which credit DeSantis for their newfound freedom. Many of these voters have reregistered as Republicans or were previously Republican in Democrat-controlled states.

If DeSantis expands his relational organizing and grassroots operations developed during his 2022 gubernatorial race, he can put up a fair fight against Trump. The Florida Presidential Primary will be held on Tuesday, March 19, 2024, alongside Arizona, Illinois and Ohio.

sist veterans and their families.

- The Florida Veteran Support Line, (844) 693-5838, is available 24/7 daily.
- Other helpful hotlines include the Veterans Crisis Line, (800) 273-8255, and the Lifeline for Vets, (888) 777-4443.
- SAMHSA provides a treatment locator highlighting substance use treatment and mental health resources for veterans.
- The Department of Veterans Affairs has a VA-Facility locator and resources for homeless veterans.

When overcoming financial barriers. families may want to consider combining VA benefits with other forms of health insurance, such as Medicare, Medicaid, or private health insurance, to reduce costs.

Family and friends can also make a huge difference by supporting their loved ones. Speak to them openly and honestly

about their substance use and express concern. Help them find treatment. Be patient and compassionate about what they are going through. Always remember these are treatable problems.

Drug and alcohol treatment facilities in Florida are also becoming increasingly better at treating veterans. Many programs provide services specifically for veterans, treat co-occurring disorders, and are gender specific, such as men-only or women-only.

Memorial Day is much more than a chance to kick off the summer months. It is a day to solemnly honor all the men and women who lost their lives serving in the U.S. military. We must also never forget or overlook the millions of veterans who made it home but are fighting a new battle.

'Deacon' goes from animal shelter to providing therapy, emotional support

ORANGE PARK – Despite being just 14 months old, an Australian Shepherd lived in five shelter homes. But everything changed when a resident took him up for adoption from SAFE Animal Shelter in Middleburg in 2015.

That was nearly eight years ago for the trick-learning, treat-loving "Deacon," who has risen to community stardom as a therapy dog and athlete on the American Kennel Club circuit.

Deacon now competes for championships in agility and rally competitions. Still, it may not have been possible without Keystone Heights' Lori Coleman, who worked for the Clay Humane Society as an Administrative Assistant for 27 years, who believed the dog could be a therapy dog.

"I rescued him from the shelter intending to become a therapy dog," she said.

Deacon, who comes from an intelligent breed of herding hounds, was a quick study under Coleman's direction. She is also responsible for observing and testing for the Alliance of Therapy Dogs.

"Two of the things to really look for are leash manners and having a little bit of self-control. Being able to be interested

but contained. So, that's what we look for in a therapy dog, and I could see those qualities in him, so I decided to go ahead and adopt him. We started training and working towards becoming a therapy dog," Coleman said.

Deacon has competed in agility and rally competitions, but the Australian Shepard had to hang up his hat for agility in April 2022 after his owner, Coleman, feared he would become injured. However, he still stars at rally, and he collected enough points at his latest competition in Perry, Georgia, to earn the Rally Championship crown, which is the highest title in American Kennel Club Rally Obedience.

After adopting him, Deacon became a fully-certified therapy dog by the Alliance in just six months.

"We just started logging visits because we wanted to keep track of how many places that (Deacon) visited," she said.

That is because the American Kennel Club has a titling program that tracks visits. If there are many visits, the dog can receive an award.


And that's exactly what happened for Deacon.

He earned his "Therapy Dog Supreme" title a month ago ago when recording his 600th visit at the Clay County Agricultural

Orange Park Hospital welcomes trauma survivors for celebration



ORANGE PARK – HCA Florida Orange Park Hospital held its annual tribute last week to trauma survivors. Patients, nurses, doctors, community leaders, family members and other care givers got to hear first-hand how the medical experts helped each survivor build their life back after unexpected events. Their stories are nothing short of a miracle.

David Krivit, a lifelong motorcycle rider, was hit by a car in a four-way intersection in town. With a sheriff's deputy nearby who really knew his job, "I was in the air in under three minutes," said Krivit. A testimony to the deputy and EMTs. "I landed at HCA Florida Orange Park Hospital because of their trauma center. It took three days to close me, 12 surgeries, countless screws, pins and rods, something called an external fixator and six weeks before I woke up."

After that, it was rehab and many months of treatments.

"Now, looking back on the group of roughly 100 men and women who touched me over all that time, it was an amazing group of people, an entire orchestra-sized ensemble, the best of the best, who got handed an incredible mess and dug in deep to turn it all around for me and my family. I'm forever grateful," Krivit said.



Many trauma survivors have extended stays in the hospital and then have to follow up with physical rehabilitation of various kinds once they get out. "As a trauma program, we are aware of the emotional wounds inflicted by both traumatic injury and some treatments. Increasing attention has been rightfully placed on post-traumatic stress disorder and the many ways we can get stuck after experiencing trauma," said Dr. Benetta Wholuba, Trauma Psychologist with the trauma program at Orange Park Hospital.

Others who attended the event were:

• John Taylor, who was admitted for injuries resulting from being struck by a truck. He had a long recovery which in-

volved multiple surgeries and extended rehabilitation. He is a veteran EMT with Clay County Fire Rescue.

- Gilberto Lopez, who was admitted for injuries resulting from being struck by a car while riding his motorcycle. His right leg injuries were so severe that he required an amputation. He now serves as a Peer Mentor for current trauma patients who have had or will have an amputation.
- Jose Rodriguez, who was admitted for injuries resulting from a motorcycle collision. He had a 47-day stay followed by 3 weeks in outpatient acute rehab. Tomorrow marks his one-year anniversary of his

accident.

• Dale Carter, who was admitted for injuries resulting from being struck by a car while walking in a crosswalk.

"HCA Florida Orange Park Hospital would like to express our heartfelt thanks to all the patients and families who came back and celebrated their health and wellness with the nurses, doctors, clinicians, EMTs, sheriff deputies, x-ray technicians, physical therapists and more," said Dr. Pam Melera, trauma surgeon. "It helps to close the circle and allow everyone to get some closure after the various impacts of traumatic events."



Party-goers, law enforcement brace for 'biggest day to be on the water'

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – If you're looking for one of the biggest parties in the county, all you have to do is pull up anchor and head south on the St. Johns River on Friday, June 2.

Boater Skip Day has become one of the most-organized days for adults to play hooky from their jobs and enjoy a day on the sandbar at Mile Marker 24 at Bayard Point, south of the Shands Bridge.

Last year's event attracted about 300 boats and more than 1,000 revelers. Most will anchor side-by-side or moor to each other to create a massive playground – all while boaters wade waist-deep in the water. The mix between alcohol, loud music, festive atmosphere and water will keep the marine divisions from the Green Cove Springs Police Department and Clay County Sheriff's Office busy.

Those agencies have been working with others since February to get ready for the event. The county's Division of Emergency Management has created a master plan with GCSPD, CCSO, sheriff's offices from Putnam and St. Johns counties and the Florida Fish and Wildlife Management to prepare for any challenge.

"There's a lot to getting ready for this,"

said CCSO Marine deputy Bill Maher. "We've been working on plans for months. We have to be ready for anything."

"We will be enforcing all of the maritime rules," said GCSPD Cmdr. Shawn Hines. "We will be out there protecting the general welfare of the public. We want people to have fun, but we want them to boat responsibly." Hines and Maher said medical issues are one of their biggest concerns.

"We've had people cut their feet on the oysters. Last year, we had a woman slice his leg on a prop," Hines said.

"Her leg looked like a shark attack," Maher said. "I applied a tourniquet. Luckily, we had a couple of doctors who were out there, too."

Boater Skip Day follows Safe Boating Week from May 20-26. The annual weeklong event encourages all boaters to brush up on boating safety skills and to prepare for the upcoming boating season.

This observance week is the annual kick-off of the Safe Boating Campaign. According to the North Florida Marine Association, this global awareness effort encourages boaters to make the most of their boating adventures by committing to safety, responsibility and education.

The group encourages boaters to follow simple rules to make sure everyone gets

back on shore safely, like:

- Take a boating safety course. Gain valuable knowledge and on-water experience in a boating safety course, with many options for novice to experienced boaters.
- Check your equipment. Schedule a free vessel safety check with local U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary or U.S. Power Squadrons to ensure all essential equipment is present, working, and in good condition
- Make a float plan. Always let someone on shore know the trip itinerary, including operator and passenger information, boat type and registration, and communication equipment.
- Wear a life jacket. Make sure everyone wears a life jacket – every time. A stowed life jacket is of no use in an emergency.
- Use an engine cut-off device it's the law. An engine cut-off device is a proven safety device to stop the boat's engine should the operator unexpectedly fall overboard
- Watch the weather. Always check the forecast before departing and frequently

during the excursion.

- Know what's going on around you at all times. Nearly a quarter of all reported boating accidents are caused by operator inattention or improper lookout.
- Know where you're going and travel at safe speeds. Be familiar with the area and local boating speed zones, and always travel at a safe speed.
- Never boat under the influence. A BUI is involved in one-third of all recreational boating fatalities. Always designate a sober skipper.
- Keep in touch. Have more than one communication device that works when wet. VHF radios, emergency locator beacons, satellite phones, and cell phones can all be essential devices in an emergency.

"Last year, we made several BUI arrests," Hines said. "We'll be looking for that. It's probably the biggest day to be on the water in Clay County, the other being on the Fourth of July for the fireworks show."

Maher said everyone can enjoy the day if they follow a simple rule: have fun, be safe and be responsible.

BCC amends 7.5 acres from rural residential to commercial

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The Board of County Commissioners unanimously approved a measure to amend the 2040 Future Land Use Map to rezone a 7.5-acre parcel from Rural Residential to Commercial to facilitate the development of a future commercial/flex-space warehouse project in Green Cove Springs.

The parcel borders County Road 315, land designated industrial property to the east, and a CSX rail line to the east and south.

A companion application was also approved, 4-0, to rezone two parcels from an Agricultural Residential District to a Planned Commercial Development.

The BCC also unanimously approved a rezoning on the east side of U.S. Highway 17 for Take 5 Oil Change, a quick lube oil service station, to be built in Green Cove Springs.

The 0.64-acre parcel was rezoned from



Community Business to Specialty Business because the prior zoning did not allow this type of business.

Now, the property will have the same zoning as other parcels located directly across the street to the west.

The parcel is located at 1747 Verdad St. in an area that is undeveloped.

The district said sites are subject to close based on location.

Meal Service will be inside the cafeteria for on-site consumption. Anyone 18 or younger may receive breakfast and lunch at no charge and with no application process. "We have all our schools opening on June 5 except for one. Doctors Inlet will start on June 1. They will operate through July 31st. That location is a little bit different from our other schools," Glover said. "We are also collaborating with Clay County Libraries, so our Food Truck will be at our Middleburg and Orange Park Locations

for lunch only."

Meals won't be available on July 3-4 in observance of Independence Day.

Glover estimates approximately 1,500 free meals will be served based on current trends and dependent on on-site camps.

"We currently have 43% students on free lunch, 6% reduced lunch and 51% are full pay," she said.

Glover encourages parents to complete a free or reduced lunch application if eligible. Children attending a Community Eligibility Provision school will not need to fill out a Free and Reduced Application. Each CEP school will provide breakfast and lunch free of charge with no application process. To find out more, go to fns. myoneclay.net/meal-applications.

"We are also continuing to provide community resources and intentionally expand the Community Eligibility Provisions Program so we can provide as many students with free lunch as possible," she said.


In addition, Clay County School District has three UCF-certified Community Partnership Schools. The program provides tutoring, hygienic products, help with food hardships and access to medical care and a clothes closet for students.

"We do have a community partnership model with three of our schools — at Orange Park High, Keystone Heights Junior/ Senior High and Wilkinson Junior High. And what those community partners do is run food distributions as well. Those are typically volunteer-run," said Clay County

Schools Communication and Media Partners Supervisor Terri Dennis. "It is open to the first 80 families that come through."

Every third Thursday during the next eight months, families in Clay County can pick up fresh produce, meat, milk and other food items for free from 5-6:30 p.m. at selected Community Partnership Schools.

"We have our digital newsletter through Peachjar as well, so whenever a community partner is doing a food drive or distribution event that is free to the community, they will reach out to us, and we will share their flier through the newsletter," Dennis said. KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – After a five-year hiatus, the Keystone Heights Speech and Debate team inducted four members in the National Speech and Debate Association Honor Society – Mikayla Turner, Oliva McCoy, Seth Preseau, and Benjamin Man.

"This is our first year as a debate team. We have competed in a total of seven regular-season tournaments, a couple of State tournaments and then we are going to nationals at the end of the week. It's been keeping us very busy," said coach Shannon Southam.

KHHS' Turner and McCoy will compete at the national tournament with The National Catholic Forensic League in Louisville, Kentucky, on May 26-29. The competition is one of the most prestigious in the country

Events range from limited preparation events that require extensive knowledge of current events, impromptu speaking, Congressional Debate where students draft proposed laws and give position statements and Oral Interpretation of literature

"For drama interpretations, they had to pick a piece, memorize it, and perform it for 10 minutes. Then you have the public speaking aspect- impromptu, duo interpretation, declamation, auditory, and informative speaking," she said.

To prepare for competitive events, the team engaged in practice rounds. Students get seven minutes to select a topic, brainstorm ideas, outline and deliver a speech in front of their peers. Students also worked on presentation skills, tips and techniques.

"We work on stage presence, how they walk into the room, how they talk, their movements, making sure they keep their hands presentable, but not as a nervous reaction. They are learning how to properly speak in front of an audience," Southam

Speech and Debate sharpens students' ability to think critically, organize their thoughts and communicate their viewpoint quickly and succinctly. Whether debating in the classroom, volunteering, speaking at a rally, or acting on stage, students use what they learn in speech and debate daily.

Students Turner and McCoy explained how debate helped them gain confidence, meet new people, and grow as public speakers.

"Basically, before Speech and Debate, I was a really reserved, quiet person in a classroom setting. With speech and debate, I've learned how to be confident and elaborate on what I am trying to say. Now I confidently give presentations and talk to my teachers about lecturers," Turner said.

McCoy agreed, noting that Speech and Debate made her more comfortable in public settings and open to people she wouldn't normally talk to. It also allows you to meet







After the big performance at the Georgia State Fairgrounds, Deacon's community service and athletic feats put him in an elite class, earning both the THDS and RACH titles.

To earn the THDS title, the Australian Shepard has been to plenty of places in the county and beyond to comfort humans in suffering or need a little extra boost of emotional support.

"Someone told me, 'I just really needed this today. This is exactly what I needed today," Coleman said.

On one occasion, Deacon was at the Clay County Courthouse providing support during a sentencing hearing.

"A victim requested a therapy dog during a sentencing hearing, so we were there with her throughout the proceedings, and she was able to pet him. (Deacon) went up with her while she was able to read her statement, and having him next to her made a huge impact for her and allowed her to complete her statement," she said.

But what was to happen next was even more of a testament to the healing powers of the dog.

"When she got back to her seat,

she completely let it go. Her walls were just down when she finished, and she just bawled. Deacon crawled across the seats over to her lap and just laid down, and she just ran her fingers through her hair," Coleman said.

The dog has visited several local nursing homes and made trips to the Jackson-ville International Airport. Now trips to the airport and nursing homes are becoming less frequent.

That's because of COVID-19 and the long commute from the pair's two-acre parcel and home in Keystone Heights to Duval County takes 75 minutes, which ended up becoming too challenging.

Deacon now sticks to a simpler plan.

His primary job is to visit the HCA Florida Orange Park Hospital, making his way around the facility by visiting patients in the Trauma ICU, PCU and Behavioral Health units on the second and third floors. He can also be found at the Life Care Center of Orange Park and Challenger Enterprises.

"It's an amazing opportunity to be able to do what we do. I am just very grateful and thankful to participate in what we do. I am just very grateful and thankful to participate. (Deacon and I) have grown a lot (during this process)," she said.

Collins and Marge talked after Marge saw a link to the Sherman Jazz Museum on the Ferguson website and made arrangements to get the albums to Texas.

We talked. He wanted to purchase them. I packed them and sent them. I don't even remember how much he gave me.

Last week, with my mother's strength improving each day, my friend Paula Ribbink and I took her on an epic 24-hour visit to Sherman to see my father's record collection.

"Bill had told me numerous times that I had a standing invite. He said he would pick me up at the airport anytime, take me to the museum and get me back to the airport. So we went, and it was amazing.

When we arrived in Sherman, my mother first noticed the file labels still affixed to the albums that adorned the walls of the three-story museum, a former Masonic Temple.

They had all of my father's records filed and organized so if anyone needed a particular song or artist, he could find it immediately.

For Collins, acknowledging my father's signature labels on the albums throughout the museum was a surreal way to know that his input was significant.

"We didn't know what the labels were and, in all honesty, never thought about removing them, and when Margie noticed them as soon as she walked in, it made them more significant," said Bill Collins. "Tom's spirit is genuinely here and a big part of the museum. He left his calling card with those labels."

Bill Collins said Marge's visit and her enthusiasm for seeing her husband's collection were special.

"I love it when people who donate stuff to us visit us and see their contribution in the displays," Collins said. "It's special to watch them see how their donation adds to the history of iazz here."

Gustafson indicted for distributing methamphetamine, cocaine

Gustafson, IV, 3, of Green Cove Springs, with two counts of possession with the intent to distribute a controlled substance involving methamphetamine and cocaine, and possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.

If convicted, Gustafson faces up

to 20 years in federal prison for each count of drug distribution and up to 15 years in federal prison for the firearm offense. The indictment also notifies Gustafson that the United States intends to forfeit a Smith and Wesson pistol and ammunition traceable to the firearm offense. The court ordered Gustafson detained pending trial. His trial is set for July.

According to the indictment, on Jan. 21, Gustafson was stopped by a Clay County Sheriff's Office deputy who recognized him for an outstanding warrant. Since there was a warrant, and because the deputy smelled marijuana, Gustafson's car was searched. Three handguns were recovered as well as a duffle bag strapped to the engine bay area containing the drugs. Gustafson had seven previous felony convictions, and therefore, is prohibited from possessing a firearm or ammunition under federal law.

An indictment is merely a formal charge that a defendant has committed one or more violations of federal criminal law, and every defendant is presumed innocent unless, and until, proven guilty.

The case was investigated by CCSO and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives. It will be prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Kevin C. Frein. The forfeiture will be handled by Assistant U.S. Attorney Mai Tran.

Man wanted in South Florida shot to death in Orange Park

ORANGE PARK — A man wanted for murder in South Florida was shot and killed on Friday, May 19, by two Jacksonville Sheriff's Office deputies who tracked him down to an Orange Park conveince store parking lot.

According to JSO, the Broward Sheriff's Office asked JSO a week earlier to help locate the suspect, 39-year-old Zonchez Delarfette Price. JSO searched a house and found two guns — one in a car and one inside the house. With that information, BSO obtained an arrest warrant.

JSO tracked the man to the parking lot in front of Eury's Market. They boxed him in with their cars and ordered him to surrender.

According to JSO, he yelled, "I'm not getting out. You're going to have to shoot me. You're going to have to kill me."

When he pointed a gun at the deputies, they shot him.

JSO Chief Alan Parker said, "They engaged him and eliminated the threat at that point."

JSO Sheriff T.K. Waters steadfastly stood behind his officers' actions.

"An officer is not required to let someone shoot at them before they use deadly force. That has never been OK, and it's not OK in this situation. So they (the two officers) did what they did. They followed the law and it ended up like it did."

Golden Eagles overwhelm Middleburg

MIDDLEBURG - Fleming Island High running bak Tyler Beverly's two long touchdown runs highlighted a smashing debut for new coach Chad Parker as visiting Fleming Island overwhelmed Middleburg 28-7 in a spring game shortened by lightning on May 22.


Taking over at running back after the graduation of Sam Singleton, who manned the role for the last three years, Beverly did a fine impression of the FSU commit, relieving any concerns Parker may have had about the role. The junior ran for 134 yards on just three carries.

"I did not know what we had in him (Beverly), but I think we know now that we are going to be all right there," said Parker. Beverly gained 37 yards on Fleming Island's second play from scrimmage. Two plays later, the junior bolted through a crease up the middle and outran the Middleburg safeties to the goal line from 42 yards out. He effectively put the game away midway through the second quarter. Facing a fourth and three from the Broncos 42 yard line, Beverly took a handoff from backup quarterback Carson Stewart, dashed through a hole over left guard and again split the safeties for a score that put the Golden Eagles ahead 21-0.

On offense, Parker is installing a zone run blocking scheme with lot of run/pass options and triple options, and the early results were encouraging. Cibastian Broughton, a sophomore with multiple collegiate offers, carried 13 times for 61 yards and threw a perfect slant pass that Daevean Boykin turned into a 55 yard touchdown when Middleburg safety Jaden Boyd went for an interception instead of tackling Boykin. Broughton finished with three completions on eight attempts for 100 yards, with no interceptions.

"I just wanted to see our guys come out and execute and do what they had done all spring, and I feel like they did that," said Parker.

Fleming Island looks set at wide receiver despite the loss of speedsters Darion Domineck and Brendan Cook from last Fall. Boykin and freshman Trace Burney,





who escaped the grasp of a Middleburg cornerback to turn a slant pass from Caleb Stewart into a 28 yard touchdown to make the score 28-0 in the third quarter, both look explosive.

"You can't give up big plays, and we got







big-played tonight," said Middleburg head coach Ryan Wolfe, who will enter his second year at Middleburg this Fall.

Middleburg moved the ball well at times, earning five more first downs (13-8) than Fleming Island. But mistakes prevented the Broncos from keeping it close. Aiden Worthy, who got Middleburg into scoring range with a 54 yard catch and run on their opening possession, dropped a third down pass that would have gained a first down inside the Golden Eagles 15 yard line. On the next play, Kaleb Robison was short on a 40 yard field goal attempt. Mason Zwilling threw two interceptions inside Fleming Island territory. Another drive was thwarted by a shotgun snap that squirted sideways and was recovered by Fleming Island tackle Joev Couch.

"I still feel like we have a really good football team," said Wolfe. "I just think our execution was not that great. We kept shooting ourselves in the foot."

Wolfe likes what do-everything weapon Jaydan Jenkins brings to the slot receiver position, so he is hoping that Zwilling, a junior, proves capable of handling the quarterbacking duties. On Monday, Jenkins led the Broncos in rushing with 54 yards on eight carries, caught one pass for four yards and completed both of his pass attempts for 54 yards. The Middleburg offense will revolve around him and running back Terrance Thomas, who gained 31 yards on eight attempts.

Middleburg avoided a shutout late in the third quarter when sophomore Lawson Padgett capped a 75 yard drive by sweeping right, maintaining his balance despite getting spun around by Golden Eagles linebacker Edward Randall and tip-toeing down the sideline for a nine yard score. Robison added the extra point.

Sophomore Kaylib Singleton, who Parker says may be a better football player than his brother, and freshman Sebastian Cruz had interceptions for Fleming Island, while Randall had two tackles for loss.

The skies opened up after Padgett's touchdown, and the game was called with 10:55 remaining due to lightning in the area.


And, come after them Deltona did with a set of singles and a misplayed line drive getting deep into left field for an in-the-



Fernald bedevils Clay in Regional Championship


GREEN COVE SPRINGS - Clay High's Aidan Hampton's inside-the-park home run was not enough to overcome the four-hit pitching of Lake City Columbiaâ \mathfrak{C}^{TM} s Josh Fernald as host Clay lost 7-1 in the Region 1-5A championship on May 16, 2023.

"You have got to tip your hat," said Clay head coach Josh Persinger. "That guy on the mound [Fernald] was frickin' good. He hit 93 on the radar gun several times, and he's got a good slider."

Fernald, who is committed to Central Florida, struck out 11 and walked only one while running his season record to 8-0. The senior right-hander showed no signs of tiring, fanning five of the final seven Clay batters. Mathew Dumas grabbed the early lead for Columbia right away, lining Clay starter Eli Roberts second pitch of the game into left center field for a single. Dumas then stole second base, advanced to third on a wild pitch and scored on a ground ball by Aiden Phillips one out later.

Two innings later, Dumas pulled a grounder just inside the first base bag for a double. The next batter, Hayden Gustavson, knocked a ground ball off of Roberts for an infield hit. Two batters later, Dumas and Gustavson executed a double steal, putting them on second and third with Fernald at the plate. Fernald, who bats clean-up for the Tigers, sliced a 2-0 fastball down the right field line for a two-run triple, giving Columbia a 3-0 lead. Persinger considered intentionally walking Fernald when the double steal left first base open.

"It crossed our mind, but the guy behind him (Camdon Frier, an FSU commit) has six bombs [home runs], so it is tough,"said

Persinger. "He hit a good pitch."

Roberts and Merrick Rapoza, who took the mound in the top of the fifth inning for Clay, faced the bare minimum nine batters in the fourth, fifth and sixth frames, giving the Blue Devils hitters a chance to mount a comeback. Their best chance came in the bottom of the fourth. Cole Cornell led off with Clay's first hit of the night, a line drive into center field. Two batters later, Parker Lowrence singled to right, putting two runners on with Clay's number four and five hitters coming up. But Fernald struck out Josh Rouw and induced Easton McMahan to ground out, stranding runners on second and third.

"I would put those two guys up in that situation a second time," said Persinger. "Rouw came through for us a couple of times when we were down, including against Middleburg earlier in the playoffs, and I felt like he was going to do it again."

Hampton pulled Clay to within 3-1 in the fifth inning with a deep fly down the right field line. Frier, the Columbia right fielder, sprinted toward the sinking liner to make the catch, but the ball went under his glove and rolled to the fence as his momentum carried him into foul territory. By the time Frier retrieved the ball and hit shortstop Brayden Thomas with a relay throw, Hampton had rounded third. Thomas throw to the plate was high as Hampton safely slid headfirst across the plate.

Clay brought the tying run to the plate in the sixth inning on another Lowrance single, but Fernald again escaped with no damage. Lowrance was the one Blue Devil who seemed to solve Fernald, singling twice in three at-bats.

"Parker does not pass the eye test, but he is short to the ball and is locked in," said Persinger. "He is a cat at third base, too."

An overflow crowd estimated at 1,000 spectators who had waited out an hour and fifteen minute rain delay before the game endured a tense pitcher's duel for sixth innings before the Tigers broke the game open in the seventh. Thomas, who is committed to Savannah State, notched the first Tigers hit off of Rapoza. One out later, des-

ignated hitter Branson Mann bunted down the third base line. Rapoza barehanded the ball on the wet infield grass but overthrew first base, allowing the runners to advance to second and third. Persinger ordered an intentional walk for Dumas, a move which appeared to pay off when Gustavson flew out to center field, leaving the bases loaded. But Phillips, a sophomore, hit a towering fly ball to left that carried five feet over the wall, sealing the Blue Devils' fate. Though not as dramatic as the walkoff grand slam that Fernald hit on May 12 to give the Tigers an 8-4 regional semifinal win over Tallahassee Lincoln, it was the second straight game in which a Columbia batter had hit a two-out grand slam in the seventh inning.

Fernald set down the Blue Devils in order in the seventh, touching off a raucous celebration at the mound by the Tigers and ending a 23-7 season for Clay.

Persinger spoke of his love for the 2023 team after the game, having spent four to five days per week with them since they had been in seventh grade.

"These guys exceeded my expectations," said Persinger. "If you look at them as individuals, they should not have gotten here. But they bought in and really understood the Clay way. There have been teams filled with more talented individuals who did not get this far."

Dumas played his lead-off role for the Tigers perfectly, going two for two with two walks, three runs scored and two stolen bases. Phillips finished with five RBIs.

Columbia, now 24-5, heads to Ft. Myers for a state semifinal game against American Heritage on May 22.


