Middleburg is an unincorporated area and census-designated place (CDP) in Clay County. It began in the 1820s first as Clark's Ferry, named for the man who ran the local ferry. From 1833 to 1850, the area was known as Gary's Ferry. Then in 1853, it officially became Middleburg. When Clay County was created in 1858, Middleburg became the county seat until 1874.

One of the largest areas of Clay County, Middleburg includes both rural and small town areas and is fast growing as a center of commerce and recreation. With access to Black Creek and Doctors Lake, the area boasts great fishing, boating and water sports activities. The beautiful Jennings State Forest offers plenty of outdoor activities including hiking, horseback riding, and canoeing.


Middleburg also is home to St. Vincent's Medical Center Clay County, a full-service hospital that recently added maternity and women's services, more ER rooms and 30 additional inpatient beds.

Middleburg Civic Association



Starting in 1937

On April 19, 1937 Mr. and Mrs. F.W. Budington deeded a parcel of land 150 feet by 200 feet on Palmetto Avenue to the Clay County Commissioners to be used as the ground upon which a Canning Center and Recreation Hall was to be erected for the citizens of Middleburg and for no other purpose. The property, as stipulated in the deed, was not to be used for any school purposes what-so-ever.

The building and original furniture was built by WPA workers and on Nov. 15, 1938, a committee held its first meeting to make rules and regulations for a "Community Home." Those attending this meeting were: Mr. and Mrs. A.W. Budd, Mr. and Mrs. Joe Masters, Mrs. Alice Masters, Mrs. Gussie Stewart, Mrs. Pearl Lee, Mrs. F.W. Budington, Mr. Joe Huntley and Mr. L.E. Ganann. Mr. Budd was selected Chairman and it was voted that anyone using the building would pay 50 cents, with an additional 25 cents as a guarantee that the building would be left clean and in good condition, this amount to be refunded when said conditions are complied with and accepted by the committee in charge. There was an additional charge of 50 cents if lights were used.

It was not until July 1941 that a temporary Executive Committee met for the purpose of forming a corporation and drawing up by-laws. The name was changed from The Community Home to The Middleburg Civic Association. The original sign, made by James McDonald, still hangs over the steps. The proposed Charter was approved, as presented, by Hon. A.D. McNeil, Circuit Judge of the Fourth Judicial Circuit of Florida on July 14, 1941 in Jacksonville. On July 15, 1941 said charter was

filed with Mr. L.T. Ivey, Clerk Circuit Court, Clay County. There were eight specific objects and purposes for which the corporation was organized. They were:

- 1. To promote the literary, scientific, social and philosophical improvement, advancement and benefit of its members.
- 2. To render aid to all worthy civic objects and purposes
- 3. To promote the general development of the Community of Middleburg, Clay County, Florida.
- 4. To cultivate public sentiment for the promotion of civic improvement and beautification of the community.
- 5. To develop the mutual welfare and benefit of its members.
- 6. To cooperate with and to assist in coordinating efforts of all similar organizations and individuals for the promotion of the civic benefit of the Community of Middleburg,
- 7. To own, maintain and operate a Community House in Middleburg with the full power to leave the building or equipment, to purchase equipment, furniture, fixtures and supplies and to promote meetings, dances, entertainments and other civil meetings and to charge admission.
- 8. To cooperate in all aspects with the Clay County Chamber of Commerce and the Board of Clay County Commssioners.

The opening date was set for September 10, 1941 and a concert was to be given.








ant to get away from the hustle and bustle of everyday life? With all the stress and fear going on right now with the Covid 19, it's good to get away from it all and center yourself. To me horseback riding in the forest is like meditation in motion. Sometimes we get so caught up in the everyday problems and concerns that we forget the simple pleasures of life that take us back to basics. I enjoy seeing the new flowers bloom or watching the foliage change with the seasons. I sometimes feel like a pioneer trying to figure out what animal left the track I am looking at. I enjoy seeing all the wild animals that make their habitat in the forest.

I feel so fortunate to have Jennings forest right in my back yard. For those of you not aware of Jennings, you really should go take a hike out there. It's here in Middleburg and you can get to it by various locations. I go down Live Oak and enter at the front of the Forest. There is a small fee to pay but it is so worth it. One can also buy a yearly park pass, which gives you access to the Forest all year round. The forest is used for many things from hiking, camping, horseback riding, and hunting.

I ride the forest about 3 times a week and there is always something new to discover. One ride we saw a newborn deer. Other rides we have seen coyotes, owls, turtles, hawks, turkeys, snakes and all kinds of birds. There is actually a bird watching station close to the entrance off Live Oak Lane, which allows you to see the different species without being seen. I practice Martial Arts and we have a saying in Korean called Pyung Ahn, which means calm and peace. This is what I experience when I go into the forest. I forget the business and all the issues of daily life and take a few hours to enjoy nature's bounty. The birds singing their melodies, the squirrels scurrying all around, the turtles slowly moving through the forest, and the deer who jump and run away when we

Here is a description of the Forest from my riding buddy, Ms. Kathleen Rowan:

"When I first moved here Jennings was a novelty, an easy escape from daily stress. I started riding with a "seasoned rider" named Katie. She usually only rode in Jennings Forest. I used to ask to ride elsewhere. She was a very busy person and stated that Jennings was as beautiful to her as anywhere else. When I looked, all that I saw were pine trees, scrub,

sand, and scrub oaks. It was nice but not as beautiful as I remember other places.

Fast forward a few years and now I know what she meant. Jennings State Forest is as beautiful as other places. I now realize how wise Katie truly was. As each new season comes, the trails change. When fall comes the forest shows us things you could not see through the dense leaves. You can see further distances, into the streams, abandon nests, behind bushes and trees. In the fall you also see orange

mushrooms, pitcher plants, and yellow flowers blooming. As spring comes you see the wild azaleas blooming, honeysuckle, purple flowers, blackberry bushes blooming, and the density of leaves return. You also see different types of wildlife that appear and disappear like magic, zebra butterflies, moths, birds, deer, raccoon, tortoise, and of course bugs. When the storms blow through and the trees are down it makes us take a different route because our trail is blocked. The streams, which were running low are then moving and making sounds, which put our horses on high alert, as we pass by. Again, we notice something new that we did not see before while traversing our new trail. Going to Jennings State Forest is like watching your favorite old movie. It is relaxing and enjoyable, but with each new visit there is something



Softball state title fuels Bronco momentum

MIDDLEBURG - With the spring 2022 season being finalized with a thrilling state championship run by the girls softball team and coach Ashley Houston's amazing run to the first-ever team title for Middleburg High School, the fall to spring seasons of 2022 to 2023 provided a shift to the "W" column for Bronco nation "Horsepower".

Houston's run to the title gave a sort of 'Yes we can' to Bronco faithful and, with the football squad under new leadership with head coach Ryan Wolfe bringing his impressive history of coaching at a high level, the gridiron was the first test of the momentum theory.

Unfortunately, but somewhat telling, was that the Bronco football had four of the strongest teams on the docket to face in the first four games under Wolfe and the result was no wins. No wins and an 0-4 start was not what Horsepower wanted, but the pendulum swing reversed and Wolfe started to get the results that were anticpated on the broad shoulders of senior running back T.J. Lane and junior quarterback Jayden Jenkins behind a mountainous offensive line.

The Broncos football started to get into their rhythm behind an understanding that a playoff berth was still within reach based off the strength of schedule rankings that decide the fate of teams and a little luck for the Broncos.

That being said, also in the fall, legendary volleyball coach Carrie Prewitt was embarking on her final call as coach after nearly 30 years at the helm and her team

was enthusiastic to say the least to get the outgoing coach one final memory.

Prewitt, with handful of deep Final Four runs, district and region titles and players that extended their careers into fruitful college careers, used every tactic in her big Rolodex to get the Broncos that one final Final Four.

In the final saga of the season, after a blistering five-game overtime win over a very tough Bartram Trail team that energized her girls; led by powerhitting of Connor Rahn and Brooke Forkum and led defensively by senior Summer Repogle eeked out a final district title for Prewitt as well as a regional playoff berth.

Back to football, Wolfe ended his season with a five win of six games finish that was halted in region playoffs with Middleburg earning the only region playoff berth from Clay County.

Along the way, Lane earned All State honors with a massive finish; nearly 2,000 yards rushing and 18 touchdowns, to put the Bronco football pin back on the mat.

Cross Country got a boost from a second Mussante as little brother to Emma, Kole, was one of top athletes on the harrier squad (best of 17:34) of with eventual wrestling medalist Logan Moore a top contender (best of 17:28). Mussante's sister, Emma, in her college races for Florida Southern College, continued her prowess with a record setting cross country and track season in the spring.

For the girls, Molly Burt "the Hurt" was top contender for the Lady Broncos with best of 21:20 that got her 25th place and near miss for a region championship berth.

In the winter, with wrestling on tap under now-proven coach Coll Robertson, the Broncos grapplers went on a tear with wins in tournaments throughout the state, though stuck in a region chock full of powerhouse programs like Fleming Island and Clay.

Robertson had four state qualifiers; Moore, Grady Woodard, Tucker Cody and Wyatt Leduc, all with 40-plus wins on the season with Moore earning a fifth place medal.

The big prize in wrestling though went to the girls wrestling team who had sophomore sensation Cheyenne Cruce go unbeaten and earn a state title with a thrilling finals match. Cruce and her teammates were steady top three team finishers in tournament competitions with the Bradshaw sisters; Grace Bradshaw, Skyla Fisher and Memphis Moses all making the state meet with Bradshaw, the lone senior, earning a bronze medal.

Middleburg boys basketball finished 10-14 under new coach Sean Sweeney with a roster full of underclassmen while the girls hoops finished 9-13 under coach Lindsey Burkhart.

In the second half of the school year, the boys weightlifting team got some state medals; Joshua Senear and Gabe Harp going 2-3 at 169 in Traditional scoring.

In track, Madison Underwood finished fifth in discus at state.

For softball, though, Houston's want of a repeat did not occur with a district semifinal loss to Columbia, though earning a region playoff berth off rankings. Middleburg eventually lost in eight innings in the region bracket to Fort Walton Beach.

Middleburg baseball finished 4-15 with a few highlights; one a grand slam homer by Bradley Gilbert, the other a near upset, 6-5, of region finalist Clay High in regular season play, then a just as thrilling 7-5 loss to Clay in the district tournament.

A Chronological History of Middleburg

1766 - William Bartram and son visited a trading post in the area now known Middleburg.





Bartram's Travels
is the short title
of the literary and
scientific classic
that describes his
journey through
southeastern North
America during the
Revolutionary War

First published in **1791**, it is an resource on the flora and fauna of the Southeast, especially Florida.

One of his most important finds was a plant called Bartrams Ixia, now critically endangered. A few small colonies of this plant were found at Camp Blanding, south of Middleburg.

1816 - George and Samuel Branning received Spanish Land Grant.

Branning operated two ferries and a toll bridge on the north prong of Black Creek. He also donated the lumber and labor to build Middleburg United Methodist Church in 1847.



1826 - Federal Road was built through area (then known as Garey's Ferry). Federal Road is now known as Main Street and is the oldest road still in use in Clay County today. Brigadier General Thomas Jesup ordered the road built from Micanopy, Florida, northward and to cross Black Creek where Branning's Ferry was operated.

1828 – United States Post Office at Whitesville was established. Samuel Garey, at Garey's Ferry, was the first postmaster. His ferry was located at the present day Main Street boat ramp. Whitesville (named after State Representative Joseph White) was another early name for the area that became Middleburg.

1836 - Fort Heileman (Second Seminole War fort) was officially named by Capt. Charles S. Merchant. Due to the raids conducted by Native Americans, much of the population of the Black Creek District holed up at this fort for protection. Disease and food shortages marked the stay of many at the fort. The fort was located where the Main Street Boat ramp is today.




1841 - Fort Heileman abandoned as the fighting moved further south.

1843 - Garey's Ferry Post Office established; moved from Whitesville.

1851 - Middleburg Post Office established; moved from Garey's Ferry.

1858 - Clay County is created out of southern section of Duval County (legislation signed by the Florida Governor on December 31, 1858). More than 150 citizens signed the petition to become Clay County. Pioneering family names like Hatcher, Padgett, Prescott, Carter, Strickland, Dillaberry, Johns, Branning and more were involved in the effort.



1859 - Webster, an area south of Whitesville and also later known as Middleburg, is Clay County's first county seat (1/1/1859).

1864 - Civil War: The Battle of Halsey's Plantation occurs about five miles east of Middleburg on October 24th. Trouble started when Union troops raided Middleburg, set fire to warehouses and stole cattle. The battle occurred near the intersection of CR 218 and Henley Road.



1867 - Start of period of population growth due to turpentine and logging industries. Middleburg, on Black Creek, becomes the center of commerce, water transportation and government.



1871 – Reconstruction: The county seat moved to Green Cove Springs from Middleburg after a vote by the citizens. The railroad went through Green Cove Springs and a large tourism industry was developing there.

1890s to 1900s - Decline of the area occurred due to the above-mentioned decision to have the railroad bypass the area. There was less reliance on river and creek transportation. However, the timber and turpentine industries thrived. Cattle ranching and the dairy industry thrived, too.



1939 – 1946 Rapid growth took place again in the area due to construction of Camp Blanding. There was a massive influx of soldiers training at Camp Blanding in WWII. Military training continues in our area and the base (located on beautiful Kingsley Lake) continues to be a county jewel, attracting thousands of recreational visitors and military personnel year-round.



Post-WWII – Present Day: Initial development of area was focused on creating a suburb of Duval County (majority of working residents commuted). Now, expansion of State Road 21 (Blanding Blvd), development of the First Coast Expressway (\$1 Billion FDOT total project), and continued mixed-use development of Middleburg (commercial properties, hospitals, factories, schools, churches and large housing units) means Middleburg is in a prime position as a new hub for growth, revitalization and employment opportunities for citizens.

Efforts to preserve Middleburg's history and unique natural resources are ongoing thanks to the many local citizens, volunteers and local government personnel involved in maintenance of records, artifacts and photographs. Kudos to them all.

The Middleburg Museum at 3912 Section Street is open on Sundays from 2pm-4pm. The Clay County Archives (managed by Archives Specialist Vishi Garig) at 21 Gratio Place in Green Cove Springs is open Monday-Friday from 8am-5pm (check holiday schedule and/or call ahead). The Camp Blanding Museum at 5629 State Road 16 (between Middleburg and Starke) is open daily from noon-4pm. All these locations are worth a visit.

The Museum is working hard to make activities and tours more available to the public, including a new event called "Friday Nights at the Museum." Our last one was on the most recent Friday, May 12 when we celebrated Mother's Day. We enjoyed light refreshments and featured a

We have been addressing the structural issues at the Museum and met recently with Karen Walker, Director of Library Services for Clay County to discuss them. She, in turn, met with the Facilities people in Clay County to see what can be done before some of the problems become worse. Unfortunately, we learned that we are not in the budget for the repairs that must be made before the building continues to disintegrate. We were advised that another meeting will take place in the near future

wherein they will try to get Engineering on board. They will also be discussing ways they can incorporate the Museum into the planning stages of the new budget which begins on October 1. We are just hoping that some of the desperately needed repairs (i.e., the exterior walls which are decaying on the left side of the building) will take place before it is too late. Other issues that we have asked to be looked at are exterior and interior lighting,



leaking, and the instability of the upper front doors (which the Electrical Inspector noticed on a recent safety inspection of the Museum). There are several other items listed which were turned into Facilities on May 10. Some of these items are urgent. The Museum building is owned by the Clay County Board of Commissioners.

We have been depending on several of our members to finance some of the projects in the past. Especially due our thanks is Dr. Cynthia Stone, Curator, who had generously been paying a considerable sum to store our valuables at a local climate controlled storage unit. She has most recently donated and paid for materials in order to get the storage shed (donated by Gayward Hendry), ready to house these materials.

The next time you visit the Museum, please spend some time in our new Music Section which features musical instruments, record players, album covers and lots of interesting musical memorabilia from the past. These are some of the items from our collection we've been able to bring back from storage to the Museum to display.

Elections were held at our Fall Meeting in October. It was decided on



THE HOUSES OF HISTORIC MIDDLEBURG



OLD MASONIC LODGE

(Circa Late 1800-1889) 3893 Main Street This building was moved to its present site from where the present Masonic Lodge is now. It is often called "the old lodge. It has an open side gable frame vernacular building built in the federal-period style. It has a one bay gable roof entrance porch on the east side. This yellow painted two-story building is balanced or symmetrical in appearance. It is beside the Clark-Chalker house.



THE FROSARD BUDINGTON HOME

(Circa 1910) 3916 Main Street

This is Historic Middleburg's only example of Queen Anne architecture. It is unusual in that it is a single story with a rounded corner on the veranda porch. The rounded columns are called ionic. The interesting shape of the left-hand gable window when facing the front of the house is called Palladian. In 1927, Mr. and Mrs. F. Budington gave a deed to the Middleburg United Methodist Church which later added the Budington Educational Building. This home is now owned by Mrs. Pat Mueller.



THE BUDINGTON HOME

(Circa Late 1800's) Originally at 3913 Main Street

This is a white two-story house with a wide L-shaped porch which extends out to an area which can be used now as a carport. The shutters on this home are functional. This frame vernacular home is thought to have been moved to its present sit by rolling it on logs from across the street where the F. Budington home is now. This home is simpler in ap-

pearance on the outside than the Frosard Budington house across the street. This house has been relocated to the Main Street Park.



DR. G.E. ADAMS & DR. STONE HOME

(Circa Early 1900's) 2145 Wharf Street This building is a small frame vernacular home. It has decora-

tive wooden trim on it. There is wooden "gingerbread" trim at the top of the porch columns. The porch with railing is on the left side of the house when facing the front. This building served as a Doctor's office and home in 1914. Later, the house became a private residence.



THE CLARK-CHALKER HOUSE

(Circa 1835) 3891 Main Street

This is the oldest building in Middleburg. It is a white two-story columned house with a white picket fence. This open side gable frame vernacular home was built for Capt. Matthew Clark and his staff. They were with the U.S. 2nd Dragoons stationed at Ft Heilman. During the Second Seminole Indian war, the house was headquarters for General Winfield Scott. Martha Ann Chalker later occupied the house for 82 years until her death in 1936.



THE HADDEN HOME

(Circa 1912) 3887 Main Street

This is a colonial revival home with a balanced front called a symmetrical façade. This is a two-story home with round columns. It has a tin roof like several of the historic homes in the historic district. An interesting aspect of this home is that the decoration above the front door was originally made from an old bed headboard. This is called a decorative entrance Pediment.



LONG HOUSE

(Circa 1890) 3858 Main Street This home was purchased by Edward Long for his parents in 1896. It was an example of the open side gamble frame vernacular style. This building features drop siding exterior wall fabric and an exterior field stone

chimney stack.



UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

(Circa 1847) 3925 Main Street

This building is one of the oldest Methodist churches in continuous use in Florida. It is a frame vernacular Church built of Hand-wrought lumber and nails. Mr. George Branning later donated the bell which was forged in New York and shipped by steamboat. One early use of the bell was to toll the death of his son, Robert Branning, who died in 1861 at 20 years of age.



THE BARDIN HOME

(Circa 1888) 3881 Main Street

This is Middleburg's only example of Italian architecture. This style is more common in other areas of the country that in the South. There is a central cupola which is a small structure built on to the house. It is often used as a lookout and for air supple ventilation. Mr. Henry Bardin's house has two wide porches across the front of the hoe. It also has Victorian style gingerbread trim. The Bardins used to have square dances there many Saturday nights.



THE STEWART HOME

(Circa 1890-1911) 3895 Main Stree

This is Middleburg's only example of center gable frame vernacular architecture. It is a white two-story home with a porch. It has a front facing gable wall dormer window. The home was built by George Chalker. As Mr. Chalker had a home on wharf Street, he rented this house to Mr. and Mrs. G.P, Stewart. The Stewarts moved from the Gin House Landing area where they had a turpentine mill.



THE GEORGE CHALKER HOME

(Circa Late 1800's) 2160 Wharf Street

This white two-story home sits on a large area of land. It is Colonial Revival architecture which features a flat roofed porch with a railing above which is supported by square columns. There is a dormer window on the roof on the front of the house. A vine-covered retaining wall fronts the home on Wharf Street. The Chalker family was related to many families in Middleburg. It is presently under-going renovation and restoration.



THE GEORGE HASKELL HOME

(Circa Late 1800's) 3894 Main Street

This frame vernacular home was built by Mr. Haskell as a replica of his home in Salem Mass. He was stationed with the Union troops during the Civil War in the area. He was attached to the Paymaster Corps. He later acquired 500 acres of land. The house is three stories and has been remodeled and kept in good condition. It

is white with a decorative eagle on it.



THE BARTHLOW HOME

(Circa 1800's) 3884 Main Street

This is a frame vernacular home, which is a typical wood frame home of the period. It is a small home with a tin roof and green metal awnings over the porch. Homes during this period were built with fireplaces for heat as is this one. This home has a metal fence. Some of the other homes have wooden, brick, metal or stone fences in front of their homes. Some do not have fences. This home remains in the Barthlow family to this day.

There are lots of opportunities for YOU to shape Clay County in future years. The Board of County Commissioners is working on our first ever Strategic Plan. When I first ran just about 3 years ago, I heard a number of residents ask about a county plan. This year, as Chairman I got to choose a focus and I chose a Strategic Plan. Please give us your valuable input. You can do that by going to claycounty-gov.com \$ typing Strategic Plan in the search bar. This information will be culminated up into a plan the BCC will vote on at the end of this calendar year.

Another opportunity for your input is on Conservation. The BCC is putting together a list of potential conservation ideas; it isn't just land! We are working with the NE Florida Land Trust to craft language for a ballot initiative on the 2024 General Election Ballot. It will simply ask if you want to pay a little more every year on your property taxes restricted for conservation.

The BCC welcomes public input! However, did you know we can't just say no more storage units or car washes? As all property owners have rights, so do commercial owners. As long as a property owner is operating within current zoning and land use codes, we don't have any say on what is built. Complicating the matter is any property in the Branan Field master plan had their zoning changed back

in 2005. A lot of other Middleburg properties have zoning and land use dating back even further. No one could have anticipated this exponential growth Florida has & is experiencing post-Covid but we will do all we can to ease the pressure.

We have lots of other great projects wrapping up. We just finished Phase 1 of our Broadband Project with Phase 2 coming quickly behind it. We also anxiously await the opening of the Clay County Gun Range off CR 215 as it has been plagued by supply chain issues. It should open any day! Finally, our Clay Regional Sports Park will open phase 1 by the end of December. It is 250 acres of protected park land with 8 multipurpose sports fields, restrooms, a playground & walking trails. Immediately to the south, North Florida Land Trust has purchased over 800 acres where residents are welcome to hike & enjoy nature.




