Welcome to Green Cove Springs

We're a thriving city located along the banks of the St. Johns River, where old Florida charm meets modern living.

Much of the City's downtown core is part of the National Register of Historic Places. Walk beside the original brick-paved street along Walnut Street where shops of all kinds reside in the same buildings that have made up the main shopping area in Green Cove Springs for over a hundred years.

Follow Walnut Street to the St. Johns River and walk through Spring Park, the City's crown jewel and main gathering space for events throughout the year. One of the main features of the park is the spring-fed pool that has been used as a private and public pool since the late 1800s. It underwent a complete renovation in 2016, converting the original location of City Hall to a two-story pool pavilion and office, rebuilding the pool structure, and adding a splash pad beside the spring. The pool is open to the public from May to October, while the splash pad is open year-round.

Spring Park and Walnut Street is also home for several events throughout the year, including Green Cove Springs RiverFest, Christmas on Walnut Street (held the first Saturday in December), and monthly events Food Truck Friday (second Friday evening from March to November) and Third Saturday Market in the Park (third Saturday morning from September to June).

We're also proud to be the birthplace of renowned sculptor Augusta Savage. The City has honored her legacy through the Augusta Savage Arts and Community Center, which includes an indoor gymnasium and outdoor fields, and most recently with the Augusta Savage Museum and Mentoring Center, which offers a public art museum space that features the work of Augusta Savage and other artists. Programs offered at the Augusta Savage Art and Community Center and Museum and Mentoring Center throughout the year are open to the public.

As a full-service municipality serving about 10,042 as of July 2022 residents and a city workforce of just

under 100 staff members, Green Cove Springs offers something for residents and visitors alike. You can find more details about our parks, events, and businesses throughout this directory as well as on our website greencovesprings.com.



Green Cove Springs celebrates 150 years since becoming an incorporated city in 2024! All throughout the year the City will hold special 150th celebrations during city-sponsored events such as Food Truck Friday and Third Saturday Market in the Park, which leads up to the City's 150th Celebration Festival on Saturday, Nov. 2, 2024, from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.

The festival will be held throughout the downtown core with events such as a car show, carnival-style games and rides, interactive displays telling the City's history, fireworks show, and more.

Beginning as a lumber town of White Sulfur Springs, the town was renamed Green Cove Springs in 1866 and became an incorporated City on November 2, 1874. From the late 1880s to the early 1900s, Green Cove Springs was known as the "Saratoga of the South" with several hotels built in the City ready to cater to the steady stream of high-class northern tourists by steamboat on the St. Johns River. During the turn of the 20th century Green Cove Springs became home to Gustafson's Farm and the first Federated Women's Club of Florida, incorporated in 1883. Green Cove Springs Village Improvement Association Federated Women's Club is the longest running club in Florida, celebrating 140 years as a club in 2023.

The military community became part of the City's identity with the construction of Camp Blanding, a National Guard training facility, and Benjamin Lee Field, a Navy flight training facility, in the 1930s. As a training facility, Benjamin Lee Field had four 5,00-foot runways designed to train pilots to land on aircraft carriers during World War II. Benjamin Lee Field was later renamed Naval Air Station Green Cove Springs and downgraded to a Naval Auxillary Station, holding the world's largest mothball fleet of over 600 retired ships until it was decommissioned in the 1960s. The City purchased the facility from the federal government then later sold it to the J. Louis Reynolds Corporation, now known as Reynolds Park.

In the past 15 years the City has seen new growth with revitalization of older commercial buildings, anticipation of the First Coast Expressway, and the reconstruction of the pool and new pool pavilion. City Council also began planning for the City's future in terms of safety and development with




"Tomorrow's Vision" in 2005. The goals in "Tomorrow's Vision" were broken down further in 2012 and updated in 2018 with "Vision 2025." The goals of the City's Vision were broken down further in 2021/22 with the "2045 Comprehensive Plan Update," which turned them into more actionable plans and projects. Since 2022 the City has taken the approved comprehensive plan update and completed several other plans, including the Downtown Master Plan, Downtown Parking Study, and Walnut Street Redesign. These plans help to set more specific guidelines for future development within city limits, which will give areas of the city a comprehensive look and feel.



Augusta Savage Mentoring Center Classes

Where Dunbar High School's industrial arts building once stood is now another bustling center of learning in both art and academics. Augusta Savage Museum and Mentoring Center, located at 1105 Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard, was completed in May 2021 and a much-anticipated addition to the Augusta Savage Arts and Community Center Complex.

Since the original school industrial arts building was knocked down in 2015 the community rallied around constructing a new building on the site. What started simply as a computer lab and community library building morphed into an art and tutoring center, which became a reality with the availability of additional funding in 2020.

It is now the creative heart of Green Cove Springs with classes ranging from art, dance, and acting to reading and math tutoring. Inside is an art gallery/museum space, dedicated art studio and dance studio, classroom space, and computer center. The City is working with community partners to create a professional art gallery space for the history and work of Augusta Savage, which will accompany the historic marker dedicated to Augusta Savage in front of the building.

The mentoring center is run by the community for the community. Art and education after school classes are taught by volunteers approved by the City of Green Cove Springs. Classes currently in the center include art workshops, dance classes, reading and math tutoring, and individual counseling. There are also art-oriented pop-up classes that are offered throughout the year mostly as a single or two class workshops. Current class offerings are aimed at students in first grade through high school seniors.

City welcomes new classes all year round. Anyone interested in volunteering to teach a class or workshop can fill out the volunteer registration form on the Augusta Savage mentoring Center page of the city website for the City to consider adding the class.

All classes offered at the mentoring center are free to the public but filling out and returning sign up forms are required before participating in a class. SPRING PARK POOL SPLASH PARK

Green Cove Springs is home to one of the oldest spring-fed public pools in Florida. Water bubbles up from the spring at a constant 1,346 gallons per minute into the pool, then flows through the pool to the Spring run and into the St. Johns River.

Public pool access dates to as early as 1870, when Joseph W. Applegate and Jonathon S. Harris opened the Clarendon Hotel and built two pools for hotel guests that the spring ran into before flowing out and into the St. Johns River. The pool brought tourists from across the U.S. to Green Cove Springs for its advertised health benefits and as a cure for several diseases between 1870 and 1916, including President Arthur, President Cleveland and Thomas Edison.

Even as tourism and hotels in the area declined, the pool remained open for public use. Today, it's owned and maintained by the city of Green Cove Springs, and managed by Planet Swim, LLC, which includes staff, daily rates and pool passes, and any scheduled swim activities. The pool, located in Spring Park, has recently become an even popular spot since the City underwent a complete rebuild of the pool and spring, including building a splash pad by the spring and a new pool pavilion.

While the spring feeds into the pool all year round, the pool itself is open to the public from May to the end of October. During these summer months the pool is open Tuesday through Sunday from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Anyone can access the pool for a nominal daily fee that is set every summer, or purchase a pool pass for unlimited access to the pool throughout the summer. The splash pad by the spring is open 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. all year round and is free to the public.

You can enjoy the pool during the summer and splash pad all year round. These are just a few of the many amenities available in Spring Park, located in the heart of Green Cove Springs.

City Pier

Located at the end of Walnut Street in Spring Park, the City Pier is Green Cove Springs' entrance on the water. The pier is open to the public to dock boats for a small daily fee of between \$5 and \$10 and a reasonable overnight fee of \$20 for water and electricity to boats. Gazebo structures along the pier provide a popular spot for fishing and shrimping and added floating docks and dolphin buoys can hold larger river cruise ships. From the pier you can walk into Spring Park and to the shops and local restaurants of downtown Green Cove Springs.

Spring Park & Pool

Located just behind city hall at 200 Spring Street, Spring Park Is the hidden gem of Green Cove Springs. Inside this half-acre park is two playgrounds, including the City's first ADA accessible playground on Spring Street, South Dock Kayak Launch located at the end of Ferris Street, grand gazebo on the shore of the St. Johns River, newly renovated pedestrian bridge over Spring Run, paved trails connecting to the City Pier, and several picnic pavilions.

Spring Park pool is one of the oldest spring-fed public pools In Florida. Water from the spring flows directly into the pool before flowing out into the spring run connected to the pool and into the St. Johns River. The pool is recently renovated with a large, covered pavilion and splash pad area. Pool is open for the public to use from May to the end of October.

Vera Francis Hall Park

Vera Francis Hall Park is located at 1400 Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard near the Augusta Savage Arts and Community Center. At the back of the park there is an amphitheater for entertainment, a fishing pier, and a canoe or kayak launch on Governors Creek that connects into the St. Johns River a few miles away. Vera Francis Hall Park also offers picnic pavilions and tables, a playground, basketball court, and a baseball/softball field.

Augusta Savage Friendship Park

Augusta Savage Friendship Park is located at the corner of Walburg Street and Pine Avenue. The park has a playground designed for younger children and families with playground equipment accessible for younger children. Park also offers a basketball court for older children and adults.






















Augusta Savage Social Services and Cultural Complex

The complex, built as Dunbar High School in 1942, is located on a fiveacre parcel of land at 1107 Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard. Augusta Savage sold the property for the first and only black high school before desegregation in Clay County.

The space now Includes the Thomas Hogans Memorial Gym, Jump Start VPK, Green Cove Springs Food Pantry, AMIkids, an outdoor playground, baseball field, soccer field, bike trail, and exercise trial.

The Augusta Savage Museum and Mentoring Center, completed In May 2021, is a new multipurpose building at the location of the former Dunbar High School Library that Includes a dance studio, multipurpose classrooms, a computer room, and a publicly accessible museum space which holds the work of Augusta Savage and additional artists. Both ongoing and pop-up classes are offered to elementary, middle, and high school students throughout the year by volunteer teachers. Thomas Hogans Memorial Gym

Located at 415 Lemon Street, the gym is part of the Augusta Savage Social Services Center. It is open to the public Monday through Sunday, from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. Current programs include basketball and pickleball.

Magnolia Park

Located at 3617 Harbor Road, across from the entrance to Magnolia Point, this small park includes a paved sidewalk path that circles around the lake and picnic areas dotted along the path.

Shands Pier Boat Ramp

Shands Boat Ramp is located just north of the Shands Bridge, off State Road 16 at Old Shands Bridge Boat Launch Road. The water at the boat ramp is very shallow and only the smallest of boats can use the boat ramp without encountering problems.

Bayard Conservation Area

The Bayard Conservation Area is operated by the St. Johns River Water Management District. With just over 10,000 acres, Bayard offers cycling, hiking, fishing, horseback riding, bank fishing, boating access, canoeing and wildlife viewing. Primitive camping is available. Governor's Creek Boat Ramp

This County-owned facility is located just outside the City's northern boundary along US 17 at Governor's Creek. It features a large covered picnic area, fishing pier and a two-lane public boat launching facility. Call 904-284-6378.

Knights Boat Ramp

This County-owned facility is located north of the City along U.S. 17 at Black Creek. For additional information, contact Clay County at 904-284-6378.

Carl Pugh Park

This County-owned facility is leased to the Green Cove Springs Baseball/ Softball Association (GCSBSA). It is located at 317 S. West St. (behind the Clay County Health Department). For additional information, contact Clay County at 284-6378.

Camp Chowenwaw Park

A 150–acre site that Clay County purchased in 2006 from the Girl Scouts of Gateway Council. The Girl Scouts operated the camp for more than 70 years before deciding to relocate. The parcel, which has 100 acres of wetlands and 50 acres of uplands, is located at the mouth of Black Creek. The trail systems through the uplands and the wetlands offer scenic tracts for the hiking enthusiast. Camping facilities include treehouse cabins.






VFW: Veterans helping Veterans



Across America, the initials VFW are a familiar sight and symbolize a commitment to the nation both at home and abroad.

In 1899 veterans of the Spanish-American War (1898) and the Philippine Insurrection (1899-1902) founded local organizations to secure rights and benefits for their service. Many arrived home wounded or sick. There was no medical care or veterans' pension for them, and they were left to care for themselves.

In their misery, some of these veterans came together and formed organizations that would eventually band together and become known as the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. After chapters were formed in Ohio, Colorado and Pennsylvania, the movement quickly gained momentum. Today, membership stands at nearly 1.7 million members of the VFW and its Auxiliary.

The members were instrumental in establishing the Veterans Administration, developing the national cemetery system, fighting for compensation for Vietnam vets exposed to Agent Orange and for veterans diagnosed with Gulf War Syndrome. In 2008, they won a long-fought victory with the passing of a GI Bill for the 21st Century, giving expanded educational benefits to America's active duty service members, and members of the guard and reserves, fighting in Iraq and Afghanistan. They were the driving force behind the Veterans Access and Accountability Act of 2014, and continually fight for improved VA medical services for women veterans.

Besides helping fund the creation of the Vietnam, Korean War, World War II and Women in Military Service memorials, in 2005 the VFW became the first veterans' organization to contribute to building the new Disabled Veterans for Life Memorial, which opened in November 2010. And in 2015, the VFW became the first supporter of the National Desert Storm War Memorial which is planned for construction at our nation's capital.

The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States (VFW) is a nonprofit veterans service organization comprised of eligible veterans and military service members from the active, guard and reserve forces.

The mission of the VFW is to foster camaraderie among United States veterans of overseas conflicts, to serve our veterans, the military and our communities and to advocate on behalf of all veterans.

The VFW has many

programs and services that work to support veterans, service members and their families locally, as well as communities worldwide.

Flag Retirement Ceremonies are popular local events. About 1400 flags are retired each year at Post 1988. This is a respectful ceremony to appropriately dispose of tattered or faded American flags. An old, weathered, faded, ripped or torn flag should always be retired and replaced with a new flag. But a retired flag deserves to be treated with the respect and destroyed in a dignified way for it still represents our great nation and our citizens.

The Green Cove Springs Post 1988 will dispose of the United States of America Flag with dignity, with the proper procedures designated by the United States Government. So please give your old American Flag to Post 1988 for appropriate disposal. Post 1988 supports the high school athletic department, scouts and ROTC programs. The post also participates in the VFW national scholarship essay program that awards \$10,000.00 annually.

The members also support the Ft. McCoy Veterans Village near Salt Springs for ambulatory veterans and Paws for Patriots to provide service animals to veterans.

At Green Cove Springs Post 1988 it is all about "Veterans helping Veterans". The Green Cove Springs VFW welcomes anyone who has served on foreign soil to join them at 421 Orange Avenue.

Fraternal Order of Eagles



The F.O.E. traces its history back to 1898 when six theatre owners gathered in a Seattle shipyard to discuss a musician's strike. After a lengthy discussion they decided to "bury the hatchet" and form "The Order of Good Things." As time passed and membership increased, the Bald Eagle was chosen as the official emblem and the name was changed to "The Fraternal Order of Eagles."

Nationally, more than \$10 million a year is donated to local communities, fundraisers, charities and more. As part of its philosophy, the F.O.E. gives back 100 percent of monies raised in the form of grants. Fundraisers are conducted for eight major charities, Diabetes Research Center, Kidney Fund, Heart Fund, Diabetes Fund, Cancer Fund, Spinal Cord Injury Fund, Children's Fund, Alzheimer's & Neurological Fund, Parkinson's Fund, Muscular Dystrophy Fund, Memorial Foundation and the Golden Eagle Fund. The FOE also pledged \$25 million for the creation of a Diabetes Research Center on the University of Iowa's medical campus and in 2014 the facility opened its doors.

Historically, the FOE claims credit for establishing the Mother's Day holiday in the United States as well as the "impetus for Social Security. Distributed Ten Commandments monoliths across the United States and helped end age based job discrimination with their "Jobs After 40" program.

The clubs are known as "aeries". The Green Cove Springs Aerie is known as the little Aerie with "the Big Heart". Membership is just a little over a hundred members. This year we celebrated our 12th year of being an Aerie here and we have raised over \$160,000.00 for charity and still increasing our totals. In addition to national charities, many local charities are also supported including Charles E Bennett Elementary, Friends of the Library, Green Cove Food Pantry, Green Cove Springs Athletic Association, and Governors Creek Nursing Home to name a few.

The Eagles' Aerie is located at 424 Walnut Street in Green Cove Springs. We welcome visitors that might what to see what we are all about. We also invite anyone to participate in any of our activities; we play Meat Bingo, dice games, pool and bowling. Plus we have started having karaoke every Saturday. 
