

Students impress judges with exceptional, innovative projects

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - Engineer and volunteer judge Ray Morin seemed enthralled with a project by Ridgeview High junior Angel Zheng.

So young to be so clever, Zheng was comfortable answering questions from a man who'd spent a career making difficult things seem easy, and it took a professional problem-solver to understand the complexities of Zheng's work.

Her project was called: "Waterproofing and Experimentation of Servo Motors: Obstructing Water Intrusion in the SG90 Servo Motor and Muizei 25KG Servo Motor in Submarine Robotics Needing to Achieve Angles of 90 (degrees), 180 (degrees) and 270 (degrees) While Utilizing Programming Language C and the Arduino Programming Integrated Development Environment Running on a Raspberry Pi."

Gone are the days of baking soda and vinegar volcanoes.

Last Tuesday, an array of ingenious projects was proudly presented at the Rotary Club Clay County Science Fair at the fairgrounds. Nearly 140 students presented 100 projects, turning the exhibition hall into a massive think tank.

Peaceful Price, a freshman at Ridgeview, created a mechanism that can turn fidgety finger movements into electric en-

"If you like fidgeting with a pipe here or any of these fidget mechanisms, there is an energy converter and rudder that would have that electric energy run to this battery where it can be stored and charged," she said.



Police, fire unions win pay increases in Orange Park

Hilt, Vogel to compete for Seat 4 on Municipal Super Tuesday

ORANGE PARK – After months of negotiations, the Town Council approved the collective bargaining agreements with employees in the Police and Fire unions.

"We have been working on this (since September) to make things right with our police. They do a great job. When you look at the local community our police officers (had been) underpaid. I want to thank them for everything they do. This is well deserved," said Mayor Randy Anderson.

He continued, "I want to give a thank you to our fire department. This is well deserved, and I support where we are going with this."

The Fraternal Order of Police (FOP) represents the Orange Park Police Department. The FOP was able to bring starting salaries for entry-level patrol officers in line with the new Clay County Sheriff's Office starting pay. The result was a 20.9% increase for the lowest-paid positions and a 10.9% increase for the highest. The average pay increase across all positions is 14.36%.

The signed agreement brought \$184,704 in additional wages and \$55,411





in benefits.

Additional changes include the work period now being 14 days instead of 21 days, Juneteenth will be a federal holiday and mandatory shifts during storms and emergencies will result in double wages, regardless of hours worked.

In return, the FOP agreed not to engage in any strike, picketing or activity interfering with police work. Any employee participating in or promoting a strike may be disciplined or discharged.

Det. Jeff Yaeger is the current president of FOP Lodge 144, representing the Orange Park Police Department. Yaeger said the bargaining contract negotiations were delayed due to the police department's transition from a former union to FOP.

"It wasn't that the town wasn't willing. It was because the police union was transitioning," Yaeger said.

Samantha Frehulfer, the presidentelect of FOP Lodge 144, said the town was

cooperative and respectful during bargaining.

"The communication went really well when we went to the table. They were understanding and willing to help us out," Frehulfer said.

The International Association of Fire-fighters represents the Orange Park Fire Department. The IAF negotiated standard pay increases to keep positions competitive in the local job marketplace. A base level increase of 6.5% will be applied to all positions. The signed agreement brought \$79,306 in additional wages and \$23,792 in benefits.

The IAF agreed to a similar "no strike" condition. Juneteenth became a federal holiday for firefighters and paramedics.

"I'd like to see the (impact) of the raises. I think we'll see hiring back where it needs to be," said Vice-Mayor Doug Benefield.

In other news, the council learned Glenn A. Taylor will run unopposed for Seat 3, while Madison "Maddie" Hilt will face Kenneth Vogel for Seat 4 during the Municipal Super Tuesday election on April 9. The qualifying period ended on Friday, Feb. 2.

The two spots on the Town Council came open in late December when members Susana Thompson and Daniel Cobreiro resigned.

City council advances plan for industrial park at SR 16 and US 17



Street walls, city seal also approved

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A proposed industrial park on the southeast corner of U.S. Highway 17 and State Road 16 cleared a significant hurdle Tuesday when the City

Council approved the first reading of an ordinance to amend its Future Land Use Map for a development that will be known as the Huntley Commerce Center or 17/16 Commerce Center

If formally approved, the park will sit on a 58.12-acre lot where a manufacturing plant once operated but closed in 2010.

Developers HLM Investments of Or-

ange Park originally approached the council in September to have the property rezoned from Mixed Use to Industrial. The council said it wanted more information and changes to the request before it could be considered.

The group returned after city staff approved the modifications after being satisfied with the frontage design, entrances,

lighting, buffering, mechanical equipment screening and signage compliance with Level of Service standards and Future Land Use elements.

The council voted 4-1, with Councilman Ed Gaw dissenting, to advance the request. The developer still must complete a traffic

'It's for the good of the city'

Resident hopes to sell land which would improve SR 100 and 21 intersection

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – During the past few months, the City Council has pondered how to address the cumbersome and usually congested intersection of State Roads 100 and 21.

An analysis presented by North Florida TPO during a city council meeting in January offered some recommendations to improve traffic flow through the intersection based on guidance from the Florida Department of Transportation.

North Florida TPO proposed a dedicated right-turn lane going northbound on SR 21, where the vacant China Chef restaurant currently sits, improving traffic flow and reducing crashes by 12%.

Currently, the right turn is at a stiff 46-degree angle, which causes vehicles to slow down into the turn. The analysis said that slow turning movement leads to a higher probability of rear-end crashes. Residents agreed with that sentiment as they shared their difficult experiences behind the wheel. The intersection was an area of particular concern for the former City Manager Lynn Rutkowski.

With City Manager Charlie Van Zant Jr. sworn in, the City Council voted 4-0 to allow the new city manager to begin negotiations to purchase the plot of land where the vacant China Chef restaurant currently sits.

The plot of land is owned by Rashaun Patel, who purchased the land for \$240,000. In a gesture of goodwill, Patel offered to sell the plot of land for the original price and no interest.

"It's no problem for me to sell to the city. I want to make the offer. I don't want interest (payments) from you. It's for the good of the city. I have no problem with how you handle it," Patel said.

Council members Stephen Hart and Tony Brown discussed the offer and how to use the land best when purchased.

"(The property) will probably be best as a turn land for the highway. It's a difficult turn, as testimony from the last meeting. Especially for trucks," said Hart.

"We've kicked the can around... we as a city should jump on the opportunity," said Brown.


"You guys are trying to do good things for the city, and I'm happy to help," Patel said.

A deal will likely be ironed out during the city council workshop on Feb. 28 at 8 a.m. The workshop will also discuss the Smart City Plan, the parks plan and vandalism in city parks.

At the workshop, Mayor Nina Rodenroth plans to share statistics on how much vandalism has financially burdened the city. She hopes to discuss possibly kickstarting a community-led task force to address the issue


You can bet there are many reasons to watch Super Bowl

Foreign-based online sportsbooks are trying to cash in on the widespread focus on Taylor Swift and her boyfriend, Kansas City tight end Travis Kelce. Bet-Online, based in Panama, is offering 89 Swift-Kelce proposition bets, like will former President Donald Trump mention Swift on Truth Social during the game, will she be shown eating a hot dog or will the couple kiss on camera? It's such a circus, one site is accepting wagers whether you see her bra straps or any

other undergarmets.

One of the challenges of creating prop bets is finding a storyline, Dave Mason, brand manager of BetOnline told NPR's Becky Sullivan. They hit a gold mine when Swift and Kelce recently became their own sideshow.

"Of course, this year, the crème de la crème fell into our laps," he said.

Sportsbooks in the United States are prohibited from legally participating in the "Taylor Swift Effect" because their props must be related to an official onfield statistic, activity or score.

Like what color of Gatorade will be dumped on the winning head coach, the length of Reba McEntire's "Star Spangled Banner," how many and which songs Usher will sing during his halftime show and will the pregame coinflip land on heads or tails?

Here are some curious facts about the game. Since the Chiefs are considered the home team, they got to choose which jersey they wanted to wear and picked red. Of the previous 57 Super Bowls, teams wearing white jerseys have won 37 times.

The Gatorade splash has become a very popular prop bet. According to Canada's FanDuel, the favorite color is red, while bet365 said it has more money bet on purple. In the past five years, blue has been the color of choice three times, including the last two years. Orange and purple each made a splash the other two years. I wonder how many gamblers have tried to become friends with the team trainers who mix the Gatorade for each team?

SJR State College to offer accelerated manufacturing prep courses

ORANGE PARK - St. Johns River State College wants its students to be job-ready with the Manufacturing Prep Accelerated Program in four months. The short-term training program connects participants with local firms and quickly increases their employability for manufacturing production and quality assurance positions.

The application deadline is Feb. 19, and classes start on the Orange Park and Palatka campuses on Feb. 26.

Students can earn their Certified Production Technician 4.0 designation with hands-on exercises and instructor training. Topics covered include Safety, Quality Practices and Measurement, Manufacturing Processes and Production and Maintenance Awareness.

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — Two rows of cages that were an emergency home to 94 dogs are now gone from the Clay County Fairgrounds. But as long as one dog still needs a home, Courtney Sumner of Animal Services will stay on watch.

Most of the dogs surrendered by a woman in Middleburg on Jan. 23 have been adopted, Animal Services Director Ernest Hagan said. With about 20 to go, the department wanted to make sure the community was still mindful of the project.

"These are the happiest dogs," Sumner said. "They're all in such good moods. Some are older. Some are young. We've got something for everyone."

All animals can be adopted for free, and each have been spayed or neutered, fitted with a microchip and had their vaccinations updated.

A litter of puppies that were six days old when Animal Services received them is now available, Hagan said.

"We have a very varied selection of animals to choose from," he said.

Including a dog named Olof.

"He's everybody's favorite," Hagan said. "He loves attention. He's really just a big, playful goof."

The adoption process starts at the Ani-

ORANGE PARK — A shopping cart was parked at the back door of the Orange Park Senior Center on Saturday, carrying two opened boxes of cereal, assorted clothes, a blanket, and water bottles. It wasn't much, but for one person eating lunch provided by The Kitchen of Clay County, it was likely the meager accounting of everything he owned.

That didn't matter once he entered the dining room. There were no questions,

no judgments and plenty of food from the group that has offered free meals for 15 years.

"I didn't know about this," he said while spooning hot soup with one hand and eating a sandwich with the other. "This means a lot to me."

The kitchen handed out meals in a drive-through at the First Baptist Church of Orange Park since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic. Not only was Saturday's undertaking the first at the senior center, but it was also the first time in

years residents were allowed to come inside, sit down and be served their meals.

"When COVID hit, we weren't allowed to serve the seniors," said Jennifer Knight. "It's so good to have a place where people can come in and sit down to eat. There's such a need here in Clay County. Last year, we served just short of 19,000 meals between our three kitchens."

Food is also provided in a drive-through at Black Creek Methodist Church in







Vulnerable family members can be registered at Clay Watch

Sheriff's Office creating databank to help find those prone to wandering

FLEMING ISLAND - Imagine the rush of terror and uncertainty when a family member who has autism, dementia, Alzheimer's disease or a traumatic brain injury is suddenly missing.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office is now collecting information on vulnerable residents so that they can be found quickly and brought back home safely.

Because every minute counts.

After a year of research, planning and training, Sheriff Michelle Cook said Monday the agency now offers the Clay Watch program to build a database of information on individuals prone to wandering.

The program allows family members to voluntarily provide information about loved ones to the sheriff's office, which will help the agency send immediate alerts to deputies. The time saved by providing a photo. description, background, and tendencies can lead to a quicker response and outcome.

"I'm going to give you a specific example. We have a person in Clay County who tends to wander away, and this person likes to climb trees," Cook said. "We also have a whole lot of new deputies on the street. So, if we have this person registered in the Clay Watch database, they (deputies) are sent to the area or the house because the person has gone missing again. They can

pull up the Clay Watch registry and look at the characteristics of the person who likes to wander and see that this person likes to climb trees.

"You know, some of these folks have challenges where they're drawn to water. Or they're drawn to retention ponds. So having information ahead of time can potentially save a life."

Family members can decide how much information they want to reveal. And while the information is secured, Cook said the more her agency knows, the quicker they narrow their search.

"When we find missing people wandering the street, and they are not sure who they are or where they live, we can check the Clay Watch registry to see if we can locate them," she said. "Again, if any individual would like to register a loved one but is unsure of how to do it or would like some additional information, you are more than welcome to stop by our workstation (at the Middleburg Substation), and we will be happy to have somebody walking through the registration process.'

"The program also includes how a person communicates and their aggression and anxiety triggers," said Lt. Mike Layne.

"One of the hardest things is checking somebody who cannot communicate with us," he said. "If we check in with somebody walking down the sidewalk and can't identify themselves, we wanted to be able to

search based on any of the descriptors we have, the neighborhood we were in, their physical description, what characteristics they were presenting to us.

We have a very robust search system built into this. We can take any of that, and it will provide a list of the folks and their photographs for anybody meeting that criteria. Then, we can simply the process. It's taken a lot of work for us to get there."

'God's Trombones'

Performance celebrates Black History Month through poetry, song

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — "God's Trombones" is a powerful collection of poetry and negro spirituals deriving from the oratory traditions of African Americans during slavery. The Mt. Pleasant Missionary Baptist Church performance was an inspiring, fitting start to the Black History Month events planned by Friends of Augusta Savage Arts and Community Center.

"God's Trombones" was written in 1927 by James Weldon Johnson, a Black poet and civil rights activist born in Jacksonville. Johnson also wrote the lyrics for "Lift Every Voice and Sing," which became known as the Black National Anthem, and was the leader of the NAACP from 1920 to 1930.

On Sunday, Feb. 4, Friends of Augusta Savage proudly presented a "God's Trombones" production directed by Dr. Barbara Bouie. It was the second annual "God's Trombones" performance and the sixth annual musical presented by Friends of Augusta Savage.

"The first 'God's Trombones' performance was last year by Mt. Pleasant Missionary Baptist church honoring Mrs. Ethel Lee Wright. I was there and thought it would be perfect to bring it back to the community," said Henrietta Francis, Board Chair of Augusta Savage Arts and Community Center.

"God's Trombones" was written in the context of African Americans in slavery, Dr. Bouie said. Singing negro spirituals was one vital way slaves were able to endure the hardships and injustices of slavery, and it is essential for the spirituals and stories to be heard today, she said.

"We can't let the Negro spirituals die. They're packed with meaning and messages which the masters didn't understand. As the slaves were forced to do what the masters said, they sang themselves through the misery and trials."

For those enduring under the yoke of slavery, the negro spiritual was sometimes all they had.

"God's Trombones' allows the modern generation to hear the spirituals of the slaves." Bouie said. "It is important for the






Children learned what foods affect their teeth and how to brush them before seeing a dentist – some for the first time.

FLEMING ISLAND – School Board Chairwoman Ashley Gilhousen cut the red ribbon to formally introduce the student art gallery wall, featuring student-crafted visual artworks throughout the year.

It was a ceremony that also symbolized the continued commitment of the school board to support fine arts programs throughout the county.

"Together, we're creating an environment where creativity, dedication, and excellence are celebrated. Thank you for being an integral part of your students' artistic journey," said Christopher Gugel, the Fine Arts Specialist for the school district.

Gugel has fostered music, art and theater programs as a fine arts specialist. He helped coordinate the curriculum and fostered a sense of community among fine arts teachers were a positive presence in the classroom and could reel in a \$1.2 million state-funded grant to support music education in elementary schools.

The district's fine arts teachers unanimously praised his efforts during the school board meeting on Feb. 1.

"In my nine years since coming from Leon County, this is the most support I have seen – financially and hands-on in the schools. I'm very appreciative," said Brett Pikuritz, the band director at Orange Park High.

"He's secured funding, which is difficult for music educators who are working 14-,

"In my 22 years in Clay County schools. I've seen support for the fine arts only grow. My first year in the county, I was very nearly cut (due to budget cuts), and unfortunately, that was not the last time," said a music teacher at Oakleaf Village Elementary.

"(In recent years), we have felt very secure, and I no longer have to hold my breath when allocations come out. We know we are supported. There is music in every school," she said.

"It's wonderful to work with theater teachers in Clay County. He's been super supportive. He's been in our classrooms. It's been a wonderful experience. We've had an All County for theater for the first time, which was amazing. Our students can see that. And that is important to them," said a theater director of Ridgeview High.

seeing the teachers be advocates for their students' artistic journeys," he said.

The \$1.2 million grant will allow elementary school music teachers to strengthen and expand their programs. The grant will allow the purchasing of new

Brewer formed the band with bassist Mel Schacher and lead guitarist Mark Farner in Flint, Michigan, in 1969. They were more interested in their raw underground sound than commercial success. Farner eventually left the band. The current lineup still includes Brewer and Schacher, along with former 38 Special singer Max Carl, former Bob Seger keyboardist Tim Cashion and guitarist Mark Chatfield.

Brewer said the drive to be on stage hasn't waned

"This is 55 years of doing what you love," he said. "What else am I going to do? I'm extremely fortunate. How many people get to do what they love when they're 75?"

Grand Funk became immediate rock stars to a new audience when they drifted away from long, hard rock songs to shorter songs more acceptable for FM stations. They sold out Shea Stadium in Queens, New York, in 1971 in less than three days. Grand Funk also equaled The Beatles' attendance record at Shea, although selling every ticket took the Fab Four several weeks.

The band also appeared in front of 180,00 fans in 1969 during the three-day Atlanta Pop Festival at the Atlanta Motor Speedway (formerly known as the Atlanta International Raceway). Grand Funk recorded their 77-minute "Live Album" at the festival, and it peaked at No. 5 in the

United States and earned two Platinum Awards.

Brewer said the live shows, like Saturday's concert at Thrasher-Horne, are still what the band loves most because they get to see the energy and excitement in the audience

Bar, especially since all three won Best of Clay awards last year?

According to the National Restaurant Association, Mother's, Valentine's and Father's days are the busiest for eating at a restaurant, but restauranteware.com reported right behind the night before Thanksgiving, Super Bowl Sunday is the second-busiest day of the year to order takeout.

"Most of our business will be takeout orders," said V Pizza kitchen manager Paul Kelly. "We were very busy last year, although we only had one party here for the entire game. Others were eating here but weren't interested in the game. Most of our business were people picking up to-go orders for the game."

Kelly said one of the challenges will be having enough dough. He said his staff has made as many as six batches on a busy night, so he doesn't know what to expect. Also, all of the ingredients are either fresh or imported from Italy.

Nationwide, 12.5 million pizzas will be ordered on Sunday. The favorite toppings are mushroom, sausage and pepperoni.

And for those who want more than pizza, Kelly said the Fleming Island restaurant will also offer trays of 60 wings baked in their brick ovens.

But when it comes to wings, Dalton's started bracing for the rush of orders five days before kickoff. Owner Skylar Davis

said his Lake Asbury restaurant started accepting pre-orders for the Big Game last Tuesday. He expects to sell so many wings the kitchen staff had to re-arrange the walk-in cooler because he will need more than three-quarters of a ton on top of his weekly order

"I'll be on the verge of running out," he said. "I'll double in one day what we normally do in a week. About 60% of those will be to go."

The grill will also have boneless wings on the menu. And of the 23 sauces on the menu, Davis said his house-made Cajun Ranch and medium Buffalo are his best sellers.

Davis said there's a reason his restaurant's wings have been voted Best of Clay for five consecutive years.

"It's a secret recipe," he said. "There's a certain temperature we cook at and a certain type of oil. Most important is the people cooking them. There are only a few who can cook our wings. Those three things are our secret ingredients."

Most publications list wings as the most popular food for the Super Bowl. In fact, more than 1.42 billion wings – more than 100 million pounds, will be consumed, according to the National Chicken Council.

But no party is complete without chips and dip. La Catrina Tacos and Tequila Bar in Middleburg will make mountains of chips and buckets of sauces ahead of the game.

Manager Kenneth Morales said his restaurant will start with 100 gallons of fresh-made salsa, but they will make more as needed.


"You don't want salsa to sit too long," he said. "We keep ours fresh. We make it here with fresh jalapenos, cilantro and onions. It doesn't last long."

Morales said crispy homemade chips are the secret to a perfect chip and dip combination. According to Better Homes and Gardens, fans across the country will eat 8.2 million pounds of bagged tortilla chips. Moreover, Morales said he doesn't let the corn chips sit too long.

"We normally cook chips two times a day," he said. "It will be a lot more on Sunday. If you let them sit for too long, they get a funny taste, so we don't keep chips."

Her classmate, Zaria Jamison, studied the benefits and drawbacks of using solar power. She created a solar-powered oven and compared the differences between batteryand solar-powered lights.

"I basically had a discussion with my grandparents. Their house runs solely off

of solar panels," she said. "So, I collected data about that. My conclusion was that solar panels are more efficient in the long run and they're efficient because, eventually, they pay for themselves since you don't have to pay for the energy. But in the beginning, it's a really high cost in the beginning. So, it's a big commitment."

She also said battery-powered landscaping lights are brighter but more costly because the batteries have to be replaced every six months.

She also said the solar ovens worked but took twice as long as a conventional oven.

Judges met during a lunch break to tackle the challenging task of determining the winning projects. Winners will be announced on Thursday, Feb. 15.

One woman sat alone, slurping small bites of soup. A church member filled a bag with breakfast sandwiches and treats and left it beside her. She said it's been a while since anyone reached out to help.

"Until lately, I didn't need it," she said, "but things happen."

A series of unfortunate events forced her to live at an extended-stay hotel in another county. Not only did The Kitchen feed her, but they also gave her the attention and empathy she desperately missed.

"My apartment was condemned, and they changed the locks so I couldn't get in," she said. "All of my belongings were in there. Everything I have now is what I had in my car. I love to get out, so it's been real difficult."

Between Social Security and her pension, she only has \$300 left after paying her hotel bill at the end of the month.

"My bills are \$350," she said. "I've maxed out all of my credit cards."

Her ex-husband is helping, she said. He makes her car, insurance and cellphone payments and may try to help with her rent.

And she's grateful for what she has.

"Now that I know about this, I will be back," she said. "This makes a difference."

CLAY COUNTY – Spring is coming, and I am starting to plan what flowers in my garden again this year.

Certainly, one of them will be Mexican sunflowers.

This plant has striking bright red and orange petals with yellow centers. It has nectar-rich flowers and is a magnet for butterflies and bees. Three good reasons to have this plant in your garden are: it can attract ladybugs and lacewings, which help control pests in the garden; it can take different types of soil; and it can tolerate both drought and heat.

This plant can grow up to 10 feet tall and will bloom from summer to first frost. When the flowers fade and dry out, birds eat the seeds. This plant is a champion for all three of the above pollinators.

STARKE – According to UF/IFAS, Clay County is home to more than 400 farms of varying sizes and types of operations: cow/calf and beef, beekeeping, timber, hay, hydroponics and aquaponics, vegetable, fruit and citrus operations.

The county has a proud rural culture.

However, rural living can be challenging. Sunlight, rainfall, weather, invasive species, pests, soil and erosion are all confounding variables that can make or break a harvest.

That's why Bradford and Clay Soil and Water Conservation Districts are partnering to host a multi-county event to help farmers across North Florida.

The inaugural Landowner Assistance Expo will showcase resources and assistance for landowners, such as best management practices, technical help and con-



servation. Some of the federal and state agencies in attendance will be the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation, the Florida Forest Service, UF/IFAS Extension, the North Florida Land Trust, Alachua Conservation Trust, and Clay and Gilchrist Soil and Water Conservation District.

These agencies will give presentations and be available to answer any specific questions about your property, farm or greenhouse and how to manage it best.

Amy Morie is the chairwoman of Bradford Soil and Water Conservation District. She invites all landowners in North Florida to come out and learn how to bring the best out of their properties.

"We'll be able to talk to landowners individually about how to manage their properties best and improve their land for conservation," said Morie.

"We'll be exhibiting an irrigation equipment demo. It's based on a new technology, a soil moisture sensor, that can be controlled with a phone," she said.

The event will be held in the Governor Charley E Johns Conference Center in Starke on Feb. 15 from 6 to 8 p.m.

On the hunt: Justin Hartley is the 'Tracker'



(2023) and has been advancing her singing career.

Now, it's Justin Hartley's turn. Formerly the commitment-phobic and trouble-prone Kevin Pearson in "This Is Us," he plays someone much more in command in "Tracker," a drama series that gets a post-Super Bowl premiere slot, Sunday, Feb. 11, on CBS and Paramount+. The series will stay on Sundays thereafter, with Hartley (also an executive producer of the show) playing Colter Shaw, a survivalist who crosses the country, using his specialized skills to help people — both police and private citizens — with searches and collects rewards for the missions when they're completed. His complicated family history has given him demons he tries to exorcise in the course of doing his work.

Also featuring Abby McEnany ("Work in Progress") and Robin Weigert ("Deadwood") as the managers of Colter's business affairs, "Tracker" is one of the first new series to debut after last year's strikes by writers and actors. The friendly Hartley admits he was "a little nervous" as those protests continued, but he marvels that "we were somehow able to save our premiere date and get back into production in enough time to let us keep going like it never happened ... which is pretty amazing. We'd worked so hard on this, there was some stress, but it's wonderful to report for work as nor-

mal — just a reminder of what a great business we have."

"Tracker" is based on the bestselling novel "The Never Game" (which was also the series' original title) by "The Bone Collector" author Jeffery Deaver, and that name adapts Shaw's credo that he uses to advise people he assists: "Never let panic take the wheel." Indeed, the first episode starts with him assisting a fearful hiker who has been seriously injured, then follows him as he seeks a missing youngster. In both cases, he stays calm as he informs his new companions of their odds for survival under their respective circumstances.

The opening story involving woodlands, rivers, high cliffs and the like suggests that much of "Tracker" will be set in visually rich locations, and Hartley reports that he's an outdoorsy sort anyway. He also appreciates that Colter, who typically would rather just do something than explain it, "can be so intense. He doesn't just let life happen to him, like Kevin did [on 'This Is Us']."

"With this guy, if there's some kind of a problem, he's the one who's going to figure it out. And selfishly for me as an actor, it's wonderful to take on a different role. I loved playing Kevin, but I'm having the time of my life. ['Tracker' is] cool, but it's also believable. I like that Colter is not a superhero. If he gets shot, he bleeds. He doesn't have an iron skin."



Jenny's odyssey: Lopez releases feature film alongside new album

Jennifer Lopez is back with her first studio album in a decade, and this time the artist has her sights set on the big screen: "This Is Me ... Now: A Love Story," premieres Friday, Feb. 16, on Prime Video.

From the Grammy-winning director Dave Meyers ("The Hitcher," 2007), the mind behind hundreds of music videos over the past 20 years — for artists such as Taylor Swift ("Midnights," 2022), Ariana Grande ("Éternal Sunshine," 2024), Harry Styles ("Harry's House," 2022), Kendrick Lamar ("To Pimp a Butterfly," 2015) and more — Amazon claims that this upcoming, feature-length, album-long adventure will be "nothing like you've ever seen from Jennifer Lopez.

With 13 new songs, including "not.going.anywhere.," "Dear Ben, Pt. II," "Hummingbird," "This Time Around," "Mad in Love" and many more, this upcoming cinematic odyssey is said to star Lopez, of course, alongside the likes of other singers, actors and celebrities, such as Affleck, Trevor Noah ("The Daily Show



with Trevor Noah"), Kim Petras ("Feed the Beast," 2023), Post Malone ("Austin," 2023), Keke Palmer ("Big Boss," 2023), Sofia Vergara ("Modern Family"), Neil deGrasse Tyson ("Cosmos"), Tony Bellissimo ("La La Land," 2016), Matthew Law ("Ahsoka") and more.

Tom Cruise tackles another 'Mission: Impossible' in 'Fallout'

Very simply, "Mission: Impossible - Fallout" was the movie of the summer of 2018. And it certainly was one of the movies of that

In promoting the spy adventure — which FX shows Sunday, Feb. 11 — Tom Cruise said he just wanted to give the audience its money's worth, and did he ever. For any and all complaints that there are about needless sequels, the sixth round of the "Mission" franchise is a series-best (at least to date), thanks to the know-how of Cruise and returning writer-director Christopher Mc-Quarrie.

The picture not only offers a jaw-dropping series of action sequences, it does a deep dive into the personhood of IMF agent Ethan Hunt, as those closest to him face threats of very bad things from an enemy. That alternately sways and doesn't sway Hunt from his mission to stop the theft of plutonium, to be used on very specifically chosen targets.



That's the nominal plot. As for the action? Hunt makes a HALO jump out of a plane. Hunt has a major brawl with a CIA man (Henry Cavill) in a restroom. Hunt goes racing through the streets of Paris at breakneck speed. And all of it is thrilling, especially since you can see that it's really Cruise doing it.

Also back for this mission - and neatly tying together virtually every other movie "Mission" that came before - are Ving Rhames, Simon Pegg, Rebecca Ferguson, Michelle Monaghan and Alec Baldwin, with great additions in a steely Angela Bassett as an espionage boss and a lethal Vanessa Kirby as an agile killer.

Back in 1996, some "Mission: Impossible" purists had concerns about the first feature-film variation being less about the spies' masks (which still figure in this time) and more about massive stunts that weren't parts of the television series all that often. It's somewhat ironic, then, that the stunts largely have become what drive the "Mission" movies ... to general audience pleasure.

A huge factor is that it clearly is Cruise doing that risky work, and the payoff for viewers is enormous. That he took a panicky James Corden skydiving on CBS' "Late Late Show" at the time of "Fallout" only confirmed how adventurous Cruise is, and even if producers and insurers sweat out every chance he takes with his safety, the results hit the mark exactly where the filmmakers want

Anthony Anderson is all about 'Family' now

Q: Since Anthony Anderson is hosting "We Are Family" now, does that mean "To Tell the Truth" is over? Carrie Lowe, via e-mail

A: At least for the time being, especially since "Mama Doris" has traveled along with him to the new Fox contest. His ABC revival of "To Tell the Truth" had a good six-year run, and it achieved Anderson's personal aim of making his mother a TV star, something she had hoped for, though she gave up that career ambition earlier to raise Anderson and his half-brother.



As it happens, Anderson wasn't supposed to be the "We Are Family" host initially. Jamie Foxx and his daughter Corinne were to preside over the show, but a medical condition that reportedly hospitalized Foxx evidently necessitated another host. Foxx does retain an executive-producer credit on the program, however

Q: It's been interesting to see the 60th-anniversary celebration of "General Hospital." As the only other two daytime dramas on broadcast network television, how long have "The Young and the Restless" and "The Bold and the Beautiful" been on the air? - Helen Richards, Raleigh, N.C.

A: "The Young and the Restless" began in 1973 on CBS, expanding from a half-hour to a full hour each weekday in 1980, and it will mark its 51st anniversary in late March. Its success eventually prompted executive producers William J. Bell and Lee Phillip Bell to launch "The Bold and the Beautiful" as a separate but related show in 1987, and it also has an anniversary coming up in late March ... its 37th.

Though "Days of Our Lives" now streams on Peacock instead of being broadcast by NBC, it's another still-running daytime serial that deserves mention for its longevity. That program began in 1965 (it marked its 58th anniversary last November), and in 1975, it also expanded from a half-hour to an hour. It will be continuing its Peacock run at least through September

Q: On the recent telecast of The Kennedy Center Honors, Rob Reiner said that Billy Crystal was cast as his friend on "All in the Family." How long was

Crystal on that show? - Paul Wright, via e-mail

A: Just for one episode, the 1976 story "New Year's Wedding." along with a couple of variety-show stints, It was enough to get Crystal noticed for the role of Jodie Dallas on the comedy "Soap," which began the following year and helped lead to the career that earned Crystal his Kennedy Center Honor, one of the most prestigious of all accolades in the entertainment

Q: Who is the actress who played Susan, George's fiancee who met her fate by licking stamps, on "Seinfeld"? - Doug Bachman, Oswego, N.Y.

A: That's Heidi Swedberg, who has appeared in many other series, but her "Seinfeld" part arguably is the one she's known best for — and certainly for the way she exited that show, by sealing wedding invitations the old-fashioned way. "Matlock," the original "Quantum Leap," "Northern Exposure," "Touched by an Angel," "ER," "Bones," "Murder, She Wrote" and "Star Trek: Deep Space Nine" are among other programs she had roles on, though she hasn't done much screen acting in recent years. Swedberg is also a musician who specializes in playing the ukulele.

JACKSONVILLE – U.S. District Judge Brian J. Davis sentenced Alyssa Brooke Avery, 32, of Green Cove Springs, to six years in federal prison for possession with the intent to distribute methamphetamine, fentanyl, cocaine base, and cocaine. Avery entered a guilty plea on Oct.



10

According to court and arrest report documents, on Jan. 30, 2023, deputies with the Clay County Sheriff's Office observed Avery driving in a rental car in Lake Asbury. The deputy knew she had a suspended license, and when she left a gro-

cery store parking lot on Henley and Sandridge roads, he conducted a traffic stop.

K-9 Dante alerted deputies to the likely presence of illegal narcotics in the car. Deputies searched the vehicle and found more than 20 grams of fentanyl in 17 individual sealed baggies, 60 grams of pure

crystal methamphetamine, more than 13 grams of cocaine, Loratab, Alprazolam, paraphernalia and more than 16 grams

of cocaine base in a metal box that was wedged between the driver's seat and the center console.

Detectives learned Avery had been released from the Florida Department of Corrections the month earlier for trafficking methamphetamine.

According to the National and Florida Crime Information Center, Avery's license has been suspended 19 times since 2014.

The Drug Enforcement Administration and CCSO investigated the case. Assistant U.S. Attorney Aakash Singh prosecuted it.

Raiders click off six in a row

ORANGE PARK - After being down nine points at the half, the Orange Park Raider basketball team went on a third-quarter run of 21 points to close the gap on the visiting University Christian Fighting Christians, lighting a fire inside the Raider's players.

With a throw-in with 3.8 seconds to play, senior Johnnie Johnson put up a buzzer-beater lay-up off the glass to drain with 1.1 seconds to play. to hold the ball mid-court and let the clock burn off. Kurnitsky said of the tactic, "If he would have sat in a 2-3 zone all third quarter, it would have been 25-16 going into the fourth quarter."

As the five seconds approached, University Christian Head Coach Jody Bailey called a time-out to prevent a turnover. Back in action, Kurnitsky ran the same defense, this time forcing the Fighting Christians to exceed the five seconds resulting in the turnover. With a timeout plan, the Raiders set up Johnson under the net. With the play execution and drain, the Raiders were up 51-50 with 1.1 left. "Coach told me to come off the screen and lay it up," said a breathless Johnnie Johnson just after the buzzer. "I didn't even think. It was just score, just score. Let's win. It was like a dream." University Christian attempted one last gasp after another timeout, getting the ball to mid-court, only to have their player, untouched, lose his balance and fall, never getting off a shot.

"It's going to be exciting to play Fleming Island in the Raiderdome," said Kurnitsky. "They are well coached, a really good program, and a really good team. It should be a really fun night in the Raiderdome. It should be a fun night for Clay County Basketball. I'm glad it's in the Raiderdome and we don't have to travel."

Lincoln got two first-half goals against





Saturday. "Jacob Bucci is a state medalist (third last year 106) and we haven't had him in the lineup for about a month or so and this we his first big test back," said Clay coach Jim Reape, who got 192.5 team points to Somerset's 262.0 for the runnerup finish. "He didn't get to wrestle his finals match because of a medical forfeit to Somerset's Jake Austin (46-3), last year's state runner-up at 106 as a seventh grader."

Bucci, who dropped from being topranked in 2A to seventh before returning to the number one spot recently, returned with a fervor with three pins and a 17-0 tech fall before pulling from the meet. Austin is topranked at 113 in Class 1A for Somerset.

"I just finished with the knee and I was more interested in my endurance and stamina out there," said Bucci. "I got a little gassed and I was wrestling away from my

Also hindering the Clay chase was a medical forfeit at 126 by Rylan Herrera who was nursing a minor injury. Herrera had a much-anticipated semifinal match with Oakleaf's Sebastian Bonachea at 126 who came in with just one loss with Herrera at 33-8

Last year, Bonachea finished fifth at 126 after losing his second match to eventual champion Maximus Brady of Mariner.

"Sebastian is a steady, strong wrestler and one of the best out of Oakleaf," said coach Mark Detoro, who finished eighth with 107 points but also missed some key athletes in Keon Barrientos and Ghais Cooper

"They had some family issues, but both will be back in the lineup for districts," said Detoro

Districts are scheduled for Feb. 12-17. Bonachea lost in his final to Buchholz's Jedidiah Brown 1-0 in a hard-fought match.

Brown was ranked 8th in Class 3A at 27-5; Bonachea third at 132 in Class 2A.

For Detoro, Connor Barnes lost in the 106 final to Middleburg's Gavin Fisher 8-5. Fisher is now 51-2 and ranked sixth in Class 2A with Barnes 11th at 22-8.

For Reape, the forfeits are good for rehabbing for the postseason in a week.

"We have districts coming up soon and it's better to be safe and have them ready for that than risk more injury," said Reape. "Other than that, the team did fine against a pretty good field; 40 teams were here this weekend with 3A-Buchholz (third) bringing a strong team."

Clay had 120 Vonte Burke in the final against Florida's Jasper Croom in a match of ranked athletes; Burke ninth at 25-7, Croom third at 31-4 with Croom catching Burke in the final seconds of the match with a pin. Note: Croom lost to Somerset's Jake Austin in last year's Class 1A semifinal.

At 157, Clay's Landon Martin also lost by pin to Fernandina Beach's unbeaten (440) Enzo Gamba.

Jaden Bell was third at 285 with Aaron Stacey fifth at 215 and Will Kelley sixth at 190 after forfeiting his fifth-place match for injury.

For Middleburg coach Coll Robertson, who has traveled his team to far-away destinations in preparation for upcoming districts, the Clay Rotary lineup was as good as he has seen on his road trips.

"All of our good guys are doing as expected; Grady Woodard, Tucker Cody, Gavin Fisher, and we keep getting the younger guys to get better each week," said Robertson, who had three finalists; Fisher, Wyatt Leduc as 150 runnerup to Gavin Nolan of Clearwater Central Catholic and Cody, champion at 215. "We love the competition; went to St. Cloud, saw Somerset here and Key West."

One match that was slightly anticipated was a possible rematch of Cody (49-1) against Matanzas Jordan Mills (41-0) who was responsible for Cody's lone loss of the season.

"We wrestled against each other at 215 and he got me, but now he is back at 190," said Cody. "I learned a little about my mental preparation from that loss and I think it helped me to refocus my tactics."

Robertson concurred that Cody ranked second at 215 in 2A, has improved his practice methods because of the loss to Mills, ranked first at 190 in 2A.

"He learned that he had to work on getting to his opponent's legs and not relying on under hooks and throwing guys," said Robertson, who was missing Grady Woodard who is fourth-ranked at 120 in 2A, sees Cody, Fisher, Woodard and LeDuc as legitimate state medal contenders. "He's got sneaky good shots that have made him a more complete wrestler instead of just being a brute out there."

In fourth, Middleburg scored 132 points with Buchholz at 172 for third and Florida High fifth with 123.5.

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - Middleburg High undefeated defending state champion wrestler Cheyenne Cruce cruised to her second Clay Rotary title with two first-period pins against the solo opponent in her 190 weight class, while the rest of the Lady Broncos team, the defending Clay Rotary team champions, battled relentlessly to a third place finish against defending state champion Matanzas and a highly-touted Flagler Palm Coast team with the girls matches maybe overshadowing some of the boys matches according to Clay High wrestling coach Jim Reape.

"I think the girl's event had a little more firepower than the boy's events only because we have had the likes of Tampa Jesuit, Charlotte and Fleming Island here in past years," said Reape. "Most of the girl's matches were either decided quickly or were battles to the final whistle."

For Middleburg girls wrestling coach Jamie Harrison, the Lady Broncos are right on the bubble of being a legitimate state contender this season.

"I'd say wait until next year as most of our girls are freshmen and sophomores with Cheyenne a junior," said Harrison. "The team is getting tougher and tougher each match and when we show up with a five-loss team record, some teams may take us lightly, but that is a strong five-loss record. We don't shy away from competition." To start the final round of competition, two of the smallest athletes in the Clay High gym; Middleburg's 106 Skyla Fisher (11-5, 13th in 105), take on Clay's Vasheer Burke (26-5, 12th at 100) in what became a crowd favorite such that tournament officials had to halt the match to clear fans from crowding the outside of the mat.

Ironically, on the boy's championship match, Fisher's older brother, Gavin Fisher, was taking on Oakleaf's Connor Barnes for the same title.

Pals and Paws Dog Agility

Dogs flyin', tubin' and freezin'

JACKSONVILLE - A massive Doberman named Spyder, a tiny Boston terrier named Frankie and even a tiny Dachshund named Kepler all showed off their best athletic talents at the Pals and Paws Dog Agility Club's weekend contest held Friday and Saturday at the Cecil Equestrian Center on Normandy Boulevard.

"We have three or four events each year and this is one of them," said Lauren Hansen, Pals and Paws Agility Club out of north Florida. "We have dogs of all sizes, shapes and abilities doing courses of 20 or so obstacles for time, points and treats at the end."

Dogs start with 100 points and end up with deductions for infractions along the way; missing an obstacle, stopping on the course, going the wrong way as well as the time element.



On one end of the Gecil Equestrian Arena, an obstacle course was set up to test dogs and trainers through tunnels, teeters, hurdles and tubes while on the opposite end, the big dogs blasted for speed, height and turning ability in the arena dirt with the likes of Dalmation high-flyer Aspen soaring above the 20-inch hurdles with Edwin Moses-like ease. "It takes a trainer and dog sometimes about 3-5 years to become synchronized," said Pals official Rita Browning, who has been in dog agility since 2008. "It's just like a coach and a runner or swimmer. You put in the time and when it clicks, it clicks."

Browning noted that, Tulsa, is the 'mecca' of dog agility where the nationals have been held with a huge national event in Tampa as well. "You will see these dogs get just as excited to get on the course as any athlete," said Browning. "You also see the dog that looks like he has no interest, but when he gets the go, he sets off like he's on fire. They just click a switch and go."

Browning coined a phrase used by dog owners, Biddable, which is the word to describe the dog that has 'the look'.

"When the trainers look at dogs and say 'he's biddable', it means he has the look," said Browning. Biddable by definition is said "to be biddable" or do the bidding of the trainer with German Shepherds the top breed with Poodles, Border Collies, Doberman Pinschers and Labrador Retrievers in the top five "biddable" breeds.

"Then, you get a Boston Terrier like we have here, that's a national champion," said Browning. "A lot depends on the trainer and owner and that relationship."





Baudendistel, who finished fifth as a junior after rehabbing back from his injury then stormed to a senior year title. "I went through some bad spots in my life afterward, gained weight, made bad choices but now, I'm married got kids and, believe it or not, yoga with my wife is something I thought I would never do, but it's tough. Tough guy wrestler and my legs were shaking the first couple of times."




