

Guest shares fond memories at artist's 132nd Birthday Gala

FLEMING ISLAND - The Augusta Savage 132nd Birthday Gala included a special guest.

"I am humbled to share my little slice of history," said Dr. Cathy Powers, who shared her fond memory of meeting Augusta Savage last Saturday during the ceremony at Sacred Heart Catholic Church's Sullivan Hall.

Powers was 7 and living in New York at the time. It was summer, and she was the only girl attending her father's summer camp. During that summer, her parents had commissioned Savage to sculpt a bust featuring her.

She recounted how she curtsied for Savage when they met.

"I remember that very well," Powers said

She described Savage as being calm, pleasant, and serious but not severe.

"Her attention was profound. Her fingers were nimble. I remember her eyes. She would look back and forth at me and then at the block of clay. Her fingers were always moving. Her eyes were always focused."

Powers recounted how she had to sit still for Savage. The boys at the summer camp were working on their own arts and crafts projects off to the side, which was sometimes distracting. Anytime Powers glanced away, Savage reeled her back in.

"She was always confident and respectful. She had a job to do. We hardly spoke unless it was, 'Come back to me," Powers said.

She said the sculpting sessions took place over a couple of days or weeks. Her mother did her braids for her every day before the sessions. She said she could not see the finished product until the end.

"I was not allowed to look. When I first saw it, I was so impressed. She got the braids so right," Powers said.

Goble will concentrate on tee times and selling shaved ice from his family's Hawaii Fyve-Sno food trailer. One thing is certain: Goble won't slow down.


"I've got some opportunities that have been presented to me. We'll see where they go," he said. "I'm not sure what I'm going to


Every week, Clay Today will test or enlighten your knowledge on a variety of topics. This week, if you're driving, someone's always watching.

Remember when you believed your car was your only sanctuary? While you're still free to listen to whatever radio station you want, remember someone's probably watching. If you're on the roadways in Clay County, law enforcement has several tools to quickly locate people of interest by using one of 119 License Plate Readers and 21 closed-circuit television cameras. If law enforcement needs to locate a car, or if they need to identify a possible suspect, they can put the license plate number in the system and they will be notified when it passes one of the LPRs. The cameras help the Clay County Sheriff's Office monitor traffic. The **Orange Park Police Department** utilizes seven red-light cameras, while Green Cove Springs has five strategically placed on busy roadways. And don't forget, most businesses have outside surveillance cameras that can also pinpoint your location.

Councilmember-elect Taylor shares his vision

ORANGE PARK – There are two open seats on the town council following the resignations of Vice Mayor Susana Thompson and

Councilman Daniel Cobreiro.

Glenn Taylor was geared up for his campaign for Orange Park Town Council Seat 3. He had more than \$2,000 in professionally designed signs ready to be placed around town. He was ready to

meet his soon-to-be constituents and make his pitch for why he should be on the town council.

Now, he doesn't have to.

Taylor had two opponents. Both with-

drew their applications. Madison "Maddie" Hilt withdrew her application to run for Council Seat 4 instead. According to Taylor, Hilt gave him a call to congratulate him and inform him of her decision.

Taylor said that her decision was made because she believed she had a better shot against Kenneth Vogel.

Taylor reflected on his admittedly anticlimactic win. Now, he wonders what to do with the more than \$2,000 worth of signs he purchased with campaign funds.

"Yeah, no one ever got to see them. We never got to put them up. A friend has them in his barn. He said I could put a sticker to say 're-election' and put them up. That's three years from now," he said.

However, he is nonetheless thankful for the opportunity. Saved the trouble of a campaign, Taylor can focus on his vision for when he'll be seated at the dais in April.

A key tenet of his campaign was securing sufficient compensation for first responders. With the collective bargaining agreements signed earlier this month, Taylor says he wants to ensure wages remain competitive.

"Orange Park is so special because of our first responders who keep us safe," he said.

Taylor wants to manage the growth and development within the town by finding a balance between attracting businesses and keeping the community safe to raise a family.

"I am a big believer in the importance of local businesses. It is important to find that middle ground between businesses and residents, especially with the safety of children in mind. I'm sure the business doesn't want that (an unsafe community) either," he said, referencing Blake Avenue.

Taylor has been practicing law and accounting for nearly 30 years.

He graduated from the University of Florida School of Law in 1990, and he's been practicing real estate law since 1997, he said. He said he wants to use his career experience to work with the citizens and local legislatures to obtain more state funding for local projects such as waste management.

Most importantly, he said he wanted the voice of the citizens.

"I will listen to and be an advocate for the needs of the community," he said.

Taylor has two sons, Justin and Joshua, who are fraternal twins. He raised them as a single dad. With his children now in their junior years at the University of Florida, he is ready to take on the responsibility of being a town council member.

"I have wanted to do stuff like this sooner. Now seemed like the perfect time to give back to the community that has blessed me and my family for many years," he said.

His law office is at 462 Kingsley Ave., Suite 103, and he's a member of the Orange Park Rotary.

Fleming's Josh Skipper part of barbecue show with chef Michael Symon at Daytona

DAYTONA BEACH – Sweet smoke pierced through steady rain at the Daytona International Speedway, providing a tasty consolation to postponements of two days of racing.

Under large tents and a few yards away from 101,500 empty grandstand seats, four of the country's top pitmasters were competing to make the best taco, with the winner facing chef and Food Network celebrity Michael Symon. The man who has shows like "Symon's Dinners Cooking Out," "Throwdown with Michael Symon" and "BBQ USA," came to Daytona 500 weekend to film a pitch for a new cooking show. Cold and rain created another challenge but didn't stop grills from slowly turning raw meat into delicious treats.

"It was crazy out there with all the rain," said Josh Skipper, a member of Blue's Hog. "It was wet, cold and nasty. The camera crew was there on Saturday and Michael came down on Sunday. We still had a good time, and the food turned out great."

NASCAR's Xfinity race was scheduled for Feb. 17, and the 500 was supposed to take the green flag a day later. Both races were pushed back to Monday night. Skipper, who lives on Fleming Island, often cooks for Brandt Racing and its Xfinity Series driver Justin Allgaier. Skipper fed Brandt and worked with Blues Hog in the taco throwdown.

The featured dish for Brandt CEO Rick Brandt and co-sponsor Rev1 Energy of Tampa was a whole hog. Blues Hog won

the 2022 Memphis in May, considered the world championship, with their whole hog.

"We prepped the hog on Saturday and had it going all night," Skipper said. "They want me to do more NASCAR races. We'll see where it goes."

Blues Hog competed against Mike Johnson and Sugarfire Smokehouse, Brad Leighninger and Gettin' Basted and Joe Pearce and Slaps BBQ. Blues Hog owner Tim Scheer said the teams had little advance notice, but they all quickly accepted the invitation.

"It was a good opportunity to do a little small talk with the other teams and do some marketing and stuff like that," Scheer said.

Symon said he wanted to promote barbecues and travel to unique locations, Scheer said. "He wanted to see local barbecue and the different takes on it and shed a light on it. I think that's what he's trying to pitch (for the new show)."

There wasn't anything more unique than cooking at the grandest stock car race in the world.

Skipper said he may put the road course race at the Circuit of the Americas track in Austin, Texas, on his schedule. Austin is home to many of the iconic barbecue joints worldwide, including Franklin Barbecue, where hungry customers generally get in line hours before the doors open at 11 a.m.

"Austin, I'm not scared of that," Skipper said. "They (Brandt) want me at more races. I will go anywhere if it has to do with barbecue."

And hopefully, the weather will be more accommodating.

Short-term hardship options

This is when your mortgage company allows you to make a reduced payment or pause your payment for a specified period for as long as 12 months.

When this period ends, you will make up your payments in one of several ways. The fastest way is through "reinstatement," which means getting current on your mortgage by paying the owed amount in one lump sum. Alternatively, you can set up a "repayment plan," whereby you pay a little more each month on top of your mortgage.

Here's a vote of confidence for certainty of our elections

It shouldn't matter what side of the aisle you're from. We can all laugh at a Facebook post featuring a mail truck among headstones, with the caption reading: "I saw a mail truck in the cemetery today... I guess they have started delivering ballots!'

Sometimes, a joke is just funny. Laugh and move on. I think we too often forget to remind ourselves of that. Life is too hard to look under rocks for excuses to be offended.

Don Coble many of us don't find claims of elec-

tion improprieties to be amusing. It's become a crutch for losing candidates who believe they didn't win because the election process was rigged.

Al Gore had us looking for hanging chads in 2000; Hillary Clinton said Donald Trump stole the election from her: Stacey Abrams said Georgia participated in voter suppression in the governor's race in both of her losses to Brian Kemp.

Then there's Donald Trump. The jury's still out - literally - on how he tried to affect the last election with his unfounded accusations of ballot-stuffing. Without proof, why did we listen?

It's time we move away from political party gibberish and the blatant biases of network news. The empty, misleading rhetoric is an attack on the most basic sanctity of a democratic society - free and fair elections.

Neither Gore, Clinton, Abrams nor Trump have yet to present verified evidence to support their claims. Instead, they created political turmoil to further divide the country to appease their disappointments.

Equally important is creating the perception of a fair and open election. That's where there may be some gray area

Florida has the best voter protections in the country. Vote-by-mail ballots are mailed only to voters who request one. And when it's returned, the signature on the ballot is compared to the signature on the voter registration card.

Ballots are printed, one at a time, as needed, including at polling stations in November.

In California, Colorado, Hawaii, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Vermont, Washington and the District of Columbia, every registered voter gets a "universal voteby-mail" ballot whether or not they request one. Have you ever moved or received someone else's mail by mistake? Just asking.

I have no verifiable evidence to prove people illegally filled out mishandled ballots. Until there is, it's just a perception. not reality.

According to the U.S. Agency for International Development, a country cannot function without a legitimate and democratically elected government that is responsive and accountable to its citizens. Elections provide an important opportunity to advance democratization and encourage political liberalization.


• The formally known Black Creek District of the Boy Scouts of America raised \$20,000 to sustain its programs in Clay County.

If homeownership is no longer affordable for you, there are strategies to help you avoid the costly impacts of foreclosure. One of those is "selling with equity." With this option, you can use the proceeds from selling your home to pay off any remaining mortgage debt. If the home's value is greater than the amount vou owe, vou keep the excess funds. Alternatively, you can voluntarily transfer your property title to the mortgage company in exchange for a cancellation of your debt and a graceful exit from your home. This maneuver is known as a "deed-in-lieu of foreclosure."

Finally, if you've exhausted all other options, a "short sale" may be your best choice. This refers to selling your home for a lower amount than you owe. It also forfeits your negotiating power on the property's sales price. With a short sale, you will not see proceeds from the sale, and you must wait a certain period, which may be anywhere from 2-4 4 years, before qualifying for a new mortgage.

Elections also serve to encourage political debate and public dialogue.

Most of us trust our local election officials and Supervisors of Elections. The Tyson Group asked 1,000 likely voters if they have faith in local elections. More than 76% said yes.

Moreover, 88% of voters in Florida said they support multiple election options. like mail-in ballots, early voting and going to the polls on election day. And in Florida, 87% said they support early in-person voting, while 76% said they approve of mailin ballots.

"Florida voters trust in their local election officials and support early voting and vote-by-mail among many options to en-

sure voter access," said Daniel Griffith, senior director of policy for the Secure Democracy USA foundation.

"Despite growing polarization across America on some issues, when it comes to elections, Florida voters across the spectrum voice strong support for policies and processes that improve access and strengthen trust."

The best way to support the fair and accessible process is to participate. The Presidential Preference Primary will be on March 19, with early voting from March 8 to March 16. The last day to request a mail-in ballot is March 7.

The Municipal Super Tuesday Election will be on April 9, followed by the Primary Election on Aug. 20. The General Election will be on Nov. 5.




mechanic scouring the junkyards for parts, making do



Sowing the seeds to rezone the Agricola Property

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The highly anticipated, highly ambitious Agricola Property is one step closer to breaking ground after smoothing some concerns during a workshop last Tuesday.

The property has to be rezoned before there can be any development. At the workshop, Agricola made its pitch for why it should be rezoned from "agriculture" to "planned community."

"Our guiding principle is to create a complete community – parks, homes, healthcare, places to work, retail, agriculture, schools, churches," said Brian Wright, a consultant for Agricola.

"We want to be good stewards of the land and environment... that's the reason we're doing this in the first place," he said.

Agricola aims to be not merely a neighborhood, but an "agri-hood." The community has a unique commitment to fostering environmental sustainability and a rural character.

That commitment has some weight behind it, too, since Agricola's development agreement ensures the community must follow through on its promises.

"The PUD (planned unit development) and binding agreements prevent a 'bait and switch," Wright said.

Agricola's comprehensive plan was reviewed by several state agencies – St. Johns River Water Management District, Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, Florida Department of Transportation, Florida Commerce and more.

SJRWMD and FDOT expressed no concerns.

FWC had no objections either but offered some feedback.

The Agricola team said they would follow the guidelines the FWC suggested, such as providing bear-resistant garbage containers. Additionally, wildlife corridors would remain interconnected to maintain habitat connectivity. After all, it's better for wildlife to pass through natural corridors than through someone's property.

Following the question-and-answer section, the PC was reassured that Agricola would incorporate constructive feedback.

"I love your development," said Commissioner Kristen Burke. "I love all the attention to detail. One

"I love all the attention to detail. One negative that comes to mind is I wish this development came years before the others I see right now – because I would have lived in it, actually," she said.

If its rezoning application was approved, Agricola would begin development in the northeast corner of its property, the closest along U.S. Highway 17. Agricola is eager to show a successful proof of concept that interested residents and businesses can buy into. The 30-year development is planned to accommodate about 4,000 residential units, and Agricola estimates it will provide over \$236 million in ad valorem revenue for Clay County.



State of Clay: Elected officials said preparation for future growth starts now

ORANGE PARK – County Mayors and the County Commission Chairman shared a common theme Wednesday at the annual Clay Chamber State of the County luncheon: the time to prepare for the future is right now.


BCC Chairman Jim Renninger joined Mayors Connie Butler of Green Cove Springs, Randy Anderson of Orange Park, Adrian Andrews of Penney Farms and Nina Rodenroth of Keystone Heights to share their municipality's vision to prepare for unprecedented growth already on planning boards. They shared their visions with a room filled with elected, business and community leaders at the Thrasher-Horne Center. Officials said as many as 10,800 new homes are planned for five different developments, and with that comes the immediate need to repair and build infrastructure to meet the demands.

"My fellow Commissioners and I passed the budget surpassing \$731 million for this fiscal year, a huge amount of money," Renninger said. "A majority of those dollars are earmarked for increasing infrastructure, public safety and services to our community."

Renninger said in the next 15 years, 4,000 homes are planned for the Governors Park community; another 4,300 are expected at Saratoga Springs; the Rookery will have 2,000 homes and as many as 500 are slated at Sunrise Road and Fox Run Road developments in Keystone Heights.

The county will spend \$174 million on road projects to keep pace. It will also build four new fire stations and remodel many of the 12 existing stations.

Renninger said other Northeast Florida Regional Council counties are working with Clay to create a regional plan. According to the U.S. Census, more than 300,000 people moved to Clay, Duval, Nassau, St. Johns, Baker, Putnam and Flagler counties last year. "The Regional Council helped



us to develop our first five-year strategic plan," he said. "They helped us develop such things as substance use disorder, transportation and resiliency."

All while maintaining a "small county" feel.

"I just want to say we are all about small towns and big passions," he said.

Andrews said Penney Farms is replacing its water pipes and electronically mapping out the town to be better prepared when the property around the 1.46-square-mile sleepy community is sold for development.

"We're trying to catch up with the technology that's out there to keep us abreast of what's going on in our town," he said. "Gold used to be the No. 1 investment. No longer. So we know we are surrounded by land that belongs to a corporation. When that group sells out, we're going to be able to handle the growth, those homes, and whatever business is coming our way."

Butler said Green Cove Springs is bracing for developments that will come when the First Coast Expressway is completed near the city's south side.

The city council has developed compre-

hensive plans to maintain its historic nature while welcoming new growth.

"As we know, our county is growing, and it's growing by leaps and bounds," she said. And in the process, we don't want to forget about the residents. You hear a lot about the growth, the growth, the growth. So, we're looking at ways to embrace the growth and have that balance."

Butler gleefully reminded everyone Green Cove Springs will celebrate its 150th birthday as a municipality this year. While the official event will be on Nov. 2, other events will be celebrated as lead-ups to the big party.

Orange Park's Anderson boasted that his town operates on a \$24 million budget and has no debt. He said the town is working to replace the last 45 septic tanks inside the city limits. Orange Park has also invested significantly in buying wetlands and improving drainage to address frequent flooding. Finally, Rodenroth reminded everyone of Keystone Heights' historic and recreational past. The city has rebuilt and opened the Keystone Beach Pavillion, and the water levels in the lakes will soon rise again when the Black Creek Restoration Project is completed by next year.

"After 15 years of the lakes in recession, we experienced a dramatic change in our physical landscape, property values, businesses and tourism appeal," she said. "The Black Creek project promises the return of our lakes' waters back to their pristine beauty and abounding shorelines.

"Fifty-seven percent of our residents were born in Keystone Heights. I value their input and vision as it will shed light on just how truly amazing the return of those precious lakes will be. Partnering with our Clay County tourism marketing team will be critical for our short-term future plans for success. Keystone Heights sixth-grader calmly wins county spelling bee

Jillian Huntley correctly spells 'cauterize' to advance to Northeast Florida Regionals

LAKE ASBURY – Just like she did with her 10 previous words, Jillian Huntley calmly asked three questions about her championship round word at Thursday night's Clay County District Spelling Bee.

Then she stepped up and, without hesitation, answered.

"Cauterize. C-A-U-T-E-R-I-Z-E. Cauter-ize."

Parents and school officials waited for two excruciating seconds for judge Amanda Strickland to say "correct" or ring a bell for a wrong answer.

"Correct."

The Keystone Heights sixth-grader flashed a calm, soft smile.

"I've always been a good speller," Jillian said after receiving her first-place trophy – and a trip to the 14-county Northeast Florida Regionals at LaVilla School of the Arts in Jacksonville on March 25. That winner will advance to the Scripps National Spelling Bee at National Harbor, Maryland, on May 28.

The Bee started with 39 contestants from the county's public and private schools. With words like "luciferin," "coc-

cidiosis," "avens," "Pleiades," "pronaos," "retinitis pigmentosa" and "Trinidadian," 34 contestants were eliminated in the first four rounds.

It took eight rounds to pare the field to three – Jillian, Aidan Watt of Lakeside Junior High and Peyton Holloway of St. Johns

Classical Academy-Fleming Island.

Jillian correctly spelled "ficus," Aidan spelled "cataclysmic" and Peyton spelled "Florentine" to move to the 10th round.

When Aidan misspelled "peradventure" and Peyton missed "extraneous," Jillian won with a word that meant "burn the skin or flesh with a heated instrument or caustic substance, typically to stop bleeding or prevent the wound from becoming infected."

Jillian said her favorite subject in school is math, but she spent "15 to 30 minutes a day, when I have time," studying the list of Spelling Bee words.

Some of the other words she correctly spelled were "unscathed," "dissemination," "rhythmically" and "campanology."

Jillian said she's competed in five Bees. She attended Melrose Elementary last year and won the Putnam County Bee. At Keystone, she can keep spelling for two more years since the limits are 16 years or not past eighth grade.

Before she left for Lake Asbury Junior High, Keystone Heights third graders made he a good luck poster that read: "We Bee Lieve in You." Her parents had the sign in the audience.

In addition to having a knack for remembering words from the hand guide and being a good speller, Jillian said she also relies on "sounding out words."

Principal Elizabeth Turbeville was euphoric about the win. She said she texted teachers and staff throughout the competition to keep them informed.

"I am beyond proud," Turbeville said. "I'm glowing with pride. This is the best part of my job. Being a principal isn't easy, but nights like this make it worth it."

Classmates heard about Jillian during Friday morning's announcements, and the school is expected to further celebrate the victory on Monday.

"She is a sweet, spirited girl," Turbeville said. "You really want to get behind someone like her."

Jillian brought the Spelling Bee trophy home to Keystone Heights for the third consecutive year. Junior/Senior High's Rena Reddish won in 2022 by correctly spelling "dicey." She followed that up by winning with "eradicates" last year.

However, Powers thought the eyes were a bit off. She took a pencil and tried etching to correct the eyes, which furthered her disappointment. She thought her father would be furious for damaging an expensive commission, but he wasn't.

"I thought he was going to be upset. Instead, he said, 'Well, now you've added your own piece to it." Powers said.

She said the sculpture of 7-year-old Powers was tucked away in a closet for 70 years. She was conflicted about what to do with the bust for many years. She said it didn't feel right to leave it on her mantle. She said it would be better for the whole world to see Savage's story so others could know it.

Powers ended up donating the bust to the New York Historical Society. You can still see the etchings in the eyes today.

Augusta Savage was born in Green Cove Springs on Feb. 29, 1892. She made animals from red clay from the Clay County Brick Works. Her father was a Methodist minister who abused her to discourage her creative interests, according to the Smithsonian American Art Museum.

"(He) almost whipped all the art out of me," Savage once said.

Her passion waned when Savage's family moved to West Palm Beach in 1915. Quality sculpting clay was hard to find (since leaving "Clay" County, after all). In 1919, a local potter gave Savage sculpting clay, which she used to model a group of figures that she entered at the West Palm Beach County Fair, according to the Smithsonian.

The figures received critical acclaim at the county fair, which encouraged Sav-

age to continue pursuing her passion. She moved to New York City in the 1920s and contributed to the Harlem Renaissance, a blooming rebirth of Black art and culture.

She earned a reputation as a portrait sculptor, completing busts of prominent Black figures such as W.E.B. Du Bois and Marcus Garvey.

Savage believed in the cultural significance of art and the importance of teaching. She established the Harlem Community Art Center in 1937 and became its first director. The center was closed in 1942 when federal funds were cut during World War II.

In the twilight of her career, she taught children art in local summer camps. She continued to create commissioned sculptures, such as the one she made for Powers.

"I have created nothing really beauti-

ful, really lasting, but if I can inspire one of these youngsters to develop the talent I know they possess, then my monument will be in their work," Savage famously said.

While many of Savage's greatest works have been lost or destroyed, her legacy has continued to inspire young artists at the Augusta Savage Museum & Mentoring Center.

Sponsored by the Friends of Augusta Savage Arts & Community Center, the fundraiser gala was a celebration of Savage's legacy and the achievements of the community center, from which the proceeds will help fund.

A painting made by Patrick Harris from Penney Farms, illustrating "The Harp," one of Savage's greatest sculptures that was commissioned for the 1939 New York World's Fair. Due to financial limitations, it was unable to be preserved and now no longer exists.

FLEMING ISLAND - Noel Reforma is a Boston Marathon finalist, but another cherished accomplishment is a little closer to home - he's run every road on Fleming Island.

"At this point, I've run almost all single runnable roads and trails in the area. I learned from this experiment that Fleming Island is a clean, safe, and runner-friendly place," he said in an Instagram post, illustrating his filled-in Strava Heatmap.

Fleming Island has a thriving running community.

Lisa Miller is an organizer of a running club that meets at Your Pie in Fleming Island every Thursday night at 6:30. It is an open invite for runners of all ages and all paces.

"Bring your dog. Bring your kids. Bring your kids in a stroller. Bring your dog in a stroller," Miller said.

Miller pairs up each new runner with a guide. The 3.5-mile loop begins at Your Pie on County Road 220, continues south along Town Center Boulevard, circles back north along U.S. Highway 17 and finishes back at the Your Pie restaurant.

Last Thursday, I laced up my running shoes and slipped on my Gate River Run hat to come out for the group run. I stretched, warmed up, and was paired up with Reforma. We hit it off instantly.

We talked about running, naturally. On Fleming Island, running under the shady pines along Eagle Harbor Parkway was a favorite route for both of us.

We found out we ran in the same Ameris Bank Jacksonville Marathon a few years back, although Reforma finished over an hour ahead of me. His 3:07 time qualified him for the Boston Marathon, which

It's a casual open invite. The runners are friendly and have many great tips for those trying to get back in shape - like me. Come out to Your Pie on Thursdays at 6:30 for exercise, community and a sweet treat.

'Turning Points in History' presented during History Fair

Students at Grace Episcopal, OPJH defend their theses

ORANGE PARK – The course of human history has taken twists and turns, sometimes abruptly so. This is why "Turning Points in History" was an exciting theme for the Historical Fair and an interesting lens for analysis and presentation.

Last Thursday, students from Orange Park Junior High and Grace Episcopal Day presented poster boards, websites and documentaries to defend their theses for the chance to represent Clay County at the State History Fair.

Some topics included the D-Day Normandy Invasion in WWII, Jonas Salk's polio vaccine, the Seneca Falls Convention, the Beatles Invasion, the Internet and more.

The presentations came after months of research, research and more research. Students were asked to provide 10 primary and secondary sources to support their theses. However, the work wasn't grueling. Instead, it allowed students to dive deeply into the topics they chose and were interested in.

Thai from OPJH shared a mixture of nervousness and excitement before their presentation, arguing Jonas Salk's polio vaccine was a turning point in history.


The group presented a website they created, which displayed a graph of the U.S. polio cases and death rates. The graph peaked in the early 1950s before it abruptly plummeted and leveled off entirely by the 1960s, dubbed a "miracle."

The group pointed to the rapid success of Jonas Salk's vaccine, developed in 1953, and the nationwide campaign that followed.

It was a monumental moment in medical history, they said.

Reilly McInnis from Grace Episcopal was eager to present a historical moment that was personally meaningful. His greatgrandfather fought in World War II, so he was drawn to the conflict, D-Day in particular, which he argued was a turning point in the war.

The largest amphibious landing in history incurred significant casualties, but by successfully landing over one hundred thousand soldiers at the five beachheads, the Allies could begin the liberation of France and the rest of Western Europe, he said.

Reilly McInnis won first place in the individual exhibit category for his project, "How did the Allied Powers' victory at D-Day change the outcome of World War II?" McInnis also received awards for the Art Hall and Creative Expressions categories.

Caitlin Garett from Grace Episcopal was runner-up and the Women's History Winner for her project, "How did the Match Girl Strike of 1888 lead to improved working conditions for women?" Sophia Pre, Amara Hassan and Tung Thai won first place in the group website category for their presentation, "The Beginning of Medical Advancements: Jonas Salk and the Polio Vaccine." The group also received the award for Best Use of Primary Sources.

Andreas Alvarez and Cameron Nixon were the runner-up group for their website presentation, "Revolutions in the Technology World: Invention of the Intel 4004."

Sophie Aranaga from OPJH won first place in the individual documentary category for her video presentation, "The British Invasion: How the Beatles Revolutionized America."

Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego: Faith and Deliverance

The story of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, found in the book of Daniel, is a story of unwavering faith, courage, and God's miraculous intervention in the face of adversity and danger. When King Nebuchadnezzar learned of their refusal to worship the golden image, he summoned them and gave them an ultimatum: bow down to the idol or face the punishment of being thrown into a blazing furnace. Unyielding in their faith, they responded with remarkable courage, saying, "If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to deliver us from it, and he will deliver us from Your Majesty's hand. But even if he does not, we want you to know, Your Majesty, that we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up" (Daniel 3:17-18).

The moment of truth arrived as Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were cast into the fiery furnace, which had been heated to an intensity so great that it killed those who threw them into the fire. To everyone's astonishment, a divine miracle occurred. A fourth figure, described as "a son of the gods," was seen in the furnace with them, and they emerged from the flames unharmed, not even smelling of smoke. This miraculous deliverance was a clear demonstration of God's power and protection. King Nebuchadnezzar, awed by what he witnessed, acknowledged the greatness of the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, and issued a decree that honored their God.

The story of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego teaches us the importance of standing firm in our faith, even in the face of seemingly insurmountable challenges. It serves as a reminder that God is ever-present, even in the midst of our trials, and that unwavering trust in Him can lead to miraculous intervention and deliverance. Their courageous example continues to inspire those who face adversity, reminding us that faith in God is a shield in the fiercest of fires and a beacon of hope in the darkest of times.

behind the curtain of fascism in the making, "The Regime" premieres Sunday, March 3, on HBO and Max.

Previously operating under the working title "The Palace," "The Regime" stars "Titanic" (1997) and "Mare of Easttown" actress Kate Winslet in the role of Chancellor. Although the term has often been associated with Germany, Winslet's chancellor is the sinister and darkly comedic leader of a fictional European country. As the HBO teaser trailer illustrates, the titular regime is determined to see "a new Europe without limits [and] without cruelty," but what that means for the regime is wildly different from what that means for its country's people.

According to HBO, the miniseries "tells the story of a year within the palace of a modern European authoritarian regime as it unravels," and who better to tell that story than the people behind some of the most successful business and political dramas of recent years: "Succession" and "The Crown."

Brought to life by directors Stephen Frears ("The Queen," 2006) and Jessica Hobbs ("The Crown"), series creator Tracy made sure to bring many talented satirists into the writers' room with him. Helping him realize his vision for a dark and satirical political dramedy are Gary Shteyngart ("Succession"), Juli Weiner ("Last Week Tonight With John Oliver"), Jen Spyra ("Our Cartoon President"), Sarah DeLappe ("Bodies Bodies Bodies," 2022) and Tracy's "The Menu" (2022) co-writer, Seth Reiss.

In front of the camera, big-name stars Hugh Grant ("Love Actually," 2003), Andrea Riseborough ("To Leslie," 2022) and Martha Plimpton ("Generation") join Winslet. Additionally, Matthias Schoenaerts ("Red Sparrow," 2018) and Guillaume Gallienne ("Marie Antoinette," 2006) star in recurring roles alongside Patrick Fusco ("Quiz"), Vinodini Patel ("Wicked Little Letters," 2023), Alasdair Hankinson ("The Lost King," 2022), Donald Sage Mackay ("The Following Events Are Based on a Pack of Lies") and Louie Mynett ("The Man Who Fell to Earth").

While "The Regime" takes place in a fabricated Middle European nation, several locations in the series may look familiar to Austrian viewers, or those who have previously visited the country's capital city of Vienna. The city, which was used as the series' primary filming location, is filled with Baroque architecture and an old-world European vibe that provides "The Regime" with a perfect setting, complete with grandiose palaces and gardens. Chief among these edifices is Liechtenstein Garden Palace, which is reportedly the location of much of the series photography, per the German-language online newspaper, Kurier.

While travelers may be taken with the backdrop, movie buffs may recognize the sardonic, over-the-top dark humor from Tracy and Reiss's recent popular horror film, "The Menu." A deeply critical commentary of the absurdity and pomp of the modern luxury dining experience, if "The Menu" is any indication of Tracy and Reiss's writing style, "The Regime" is bound to be a scathing reflection of international politics.

Tune into the premiere of "The Regime" Sunday, March 3, on HBO and Max. New episodes air weekly until its anticipated April 7 finale.

It's go 'thyme': 'MasterChef Junior' returns with more Ramsays than ever

If you like your Ramsays sweet, not spicy, then this competition will tickle your taste buds. Season 9 of "MasterChef Junior" premieres Monday, March 4, on Fox.

On air since 2013, this series sees the softer, more encouraging side of chef extraordinaire Gordon Ramsay ("Hell's Kitchen") as he instructs, motivates and mentors young chefs (all between the ages of 8 and 13) to be better at their craft through increasingly difficult challenges. moviereview A 'Magnificent' remake that wasn't really needed

The 2016 remake of "The Magnificent Seven" is quite enjoyable. And quite unnecessary.

The original 1960 Western — inspired by Akira Kurosawa's Japanese classic "Seven Samurai" — still holds up beautifully, but after three sequels and a TV series that was a modest success for CBS over a couple of seasons, it's not hard to understand why a studio would return to one of its most famous properties. BBC America shows the most recent version Sunday, March 3.

The story basically stays the same: A town is besieged by a villain (portrayed in this case by Peter Sarsgaard, "Garden State," 2004) and his followers, and the citizens realize they'll have to hire defenders. Haley Bennett ("The Girl on the Train," 2016) plays the woman who spearheads the deal.

First up for the job is a bounty hunter played by Denzel Washington, reunited here with director Antoine Fuqua, who led him to

an Oscar in 2001's "Training Day" (and also worked with him on the "Equalizer" movies). Another collaborator from that film, Ethan Hawke, plays one of the other six — with the rest made up of the likes of Chris Pratt ("Guardians of the Galaxy," 2014) and Vincent D'Onofrio ("Godfather of Harlem"), each character possessing certain skills that are effective in battle.

And about that battle: You just know a big showdown is coming, and while it's violent enough, it stayed within the constraints of the picture's PG-13 rating. Those rules were even tighter for movies in 1960, and if director John Sturges could pull it off then, Fuqua certainly can here.

An updated "Magnificent Seven" is all well and good, but the original remains a wonderful example of filmmaking and storytelling that's just as rich today. One of the tests of remaking a classic is whether the update supports or diminishes the legacy of the original. This "Magnificent Seven" is perfectly serviceable, so it gets credit for not taking anything away from the allure of the title.

Also, Washington makes a solid successor to the first version's Yul Brynner ("The King and I," 1956) as the leader of the seven. Both iterations of the character hold back on using words when actions will do, so there's a nice lineage there. (A sad note: This was the final film of composer James Horner, who died in an airplane accident before the picture was released.)

Rachel McAdams went 'Live' for the first time

Q: I saw a reference made about Rachel McAdams' recent appearance on "Saturday Night Live" being her first time on the show. Is that true? -Jonathan Ford, via e-mail A: It is, which might seem surprising, unless one considers that McAdams seems to eschew the limelight quite a bit — somewhat unusual for a celebrity, admittedly. She had turned down an opportunity to reunite with several other "Mean Girls" (2004) alums in a



commercial recently, reasoning that it didn't quite feel like the right thing for her. (She later said that she hadn't known that so many other former co-stars of hers would be participating.) Though she did television at the start of her career, McAdams has kept her main focus on movie work, the second season of HBO's "True Detective" and several episodes of FX's "Dave" being notable extensions later on. That made her previously unannounced stint on "Saturday Night Live," which amounted to her introduction of musical guest Renee Rapp (who assumed McAdams' Regina George role from the original "Mean Girls" movie in the recent stage and film versions) and participation in a skit as a Rachel McAdams look-alike, even more of a surprise. **Q: It's good to see "Ride" getting another opportunity for an audience with its current run on The CW. Will there be a second season of the show? – Tara Williams, Buffalo, N.Y.**

A: Apparently not, which makes its CW pickup interesting since that network had to know it would be an automatically finite run — unless The CW should make its own move to revive it, but it's known that the intention there now is to keep production costs low, thus the many acquisitions of shows already produced elsewhere. CTV Drama ran the Nancy Travis-starring "Ride" in Canada, where the program originated, but there evidently aren't any plans beyond repeating the 10 existing episodes.

Q: I enjoyed seeing Vivica A. Fox in "The Wrong Life Coach" on LMN recently. I know she has made a lot of movies with "Wrong" in the title. When will the next one be coming? – Jean Murray, via e-mail

A: It's hard to predict when that will be, since the titles are usually announced only a few weeks before they premiere. However, you can bet that Fox will keep the "Wrong" franchise going, as an executive producer as well as a star. Those pictures traditionally get good ratings, also indicated by the marathons that LMN and sister network Lifetime often do by showing several of the titles on the same day.

No matter who else is in the cast of any given one, Fox is always a selling point of them — giving herself a role in each as a corporate boss, an athletic coach or whatever. No matter what career she's portraying, the character typically gets to put a coda on the story with some variation of the same line: "You messed with the wrong (check the given title)!" Viewers have come to expect that, and Fox enjoys doing it, as she has told us.

Georgia man back in Clay facing multitude of shoplifting charges at Home Depot, Target

NASSAU COUNTY - Following a twoyear investigation, a man suspected of participating in a three-state robbery spree, including stores in Clay County, was arrested on Feb. 22 after being returned

from custody in the Camden County, Georgia, Jail.

Brian Lee Wallace, 31, of Kingsland. Georgia, was charged with racketeering, eight counts of grand theft and a single count of petit theft after the Florida Department of Law Enforcement completed a two-vear

investigation that determined four people stole a total of \$86,083 of merchandise from 73 Home Depot and Target stores in Florida, Georgia and South Carolina.

David Alexander was a Clay County Sheriff's Office deputy until he joined FDLE in 2022. He investigated the robberies for CCSO before he left for the FDLE.

Deputies in Georgia met with Clay County Sheriff's Office deputies in Nassau County to return the prisoner to Clay County.

According to a 10-page affidavit for an arrest warrant, the two primary figures in the robberies were Robert Bryant and Kimberly Thompson of Brunswick, Georgia. Bryant was arrested and charged with possession of a controlled substance, providing a false name or ID to law enforcement, shoplifting, arson and obstructing law enforcement on Aug. 17, 2022.

According to the affidavit, while Bryant was in the Glynn County Jail, he phoned Thompson and instructed her to find new accomplices and continue to rob stores. Those conversations were recorded.

The affidavit states Wallace was one of three recruited to participate in the robberv spree.

Wallace was arrested in Kingsland on May 20 after being charged with child cruelty, aggravated assault, making terrorist threats, felony probation violation and family violence battery after Wallace beat and threatened his brother, according to the arrest report.

Alexander's affidavit said the group usually returned a small item and received a gift card since they didn't have a receipt. They then filled shopping carts with merchandise and acted like they were ringing them up at one of the self-checkout lanes. Alexander said they really rang up less than \$10 worth of goods and used the gift card for payment. Everything else was considered stolen.

Alexander wrote that the thieves sold the stolen items to prearranged buyers who provided a list of what they wanted

or sold the merchandise on Facebook. A search of Facebook Messenger data revealed the items generally sold for less than half of their retail value.

The primary source of financing was the Cash App. Stores in Clay, Columbia, Duval, Volusia, Alachua, Flagler, Nassau and St. Johns counties were targeted in Florida.

Bryant told investigators he researched Home Depot policies and learned store employees aren't allowed to intervene once the merchandise passes through the doors.

Wallace's bond was set at \$85,026.

Oakleaf woman charged after woman brutally attacked

OAKLEAF - A 38-year-old woman was arrested after another woman was savagely beaten at The Villages at Oakleaf apartment complex.

A Clay County Sheriff's Office deputy responded to a battery in progress on Feb.

22 shortly before 6 p.m. He found a pool of blood, a bloody handprint on carpeting and a woman with blood covering her face in the parking lot. The victim was taken to Baptist Oakleaf Emergency Room, but she was

transferred to UF Luendy Valerie Creese Health Jacksonville

because the ER center wasn't equipped to handle the level of trauma sustained by the victim.

Following an investigation, deputies arrested Luendy Valerie Creese, of Oakleaf, seven hours later and charged her with aggravated battery. According to the arrest report, her only injury was a swollen right hand.

The victim suffered swelling to her right hand, a cut on her forehead and scraps on her right forearm consistent with being rubbed against concrete. The victim wasn't physically able to complete a written statement.

Creese, whose bond was set at \$75,003. will be in court on March 25.



Wrestlers will need a bigger bus to state meet

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - Fleming Island High's wrestling team kept their foot on the gas pedal for the two-day Region 1-2A wrestling championships held Friday and Saturday at rival Clay High School and, with workmanlike precision, fended off an early front running spot by the hosts to win the ninth straight region title for Fleming Island coach P.J. Cobbert.

"Nine in a row; Class 3A and Class 2A," said Cobbert, after Fleming Island wrestled away the team title from Clay; 169.0 to 122.0, to take the region title; just a week after a similarly tight district title for Cobbert a week ago over Clay, as area wrestlers now must pack their collective busses to head to the FHSAA state championships in Orlando, Feb.29-March 1. "We just grind and keep wrestling our style no matter who is in front of us."

In an unprecedented boon for Clay County wrestling prowess in north Florida, Fleming Island's win highlighted a 1-2-3-4 finish for area programs with Clay second, Middleburg third and Oakleaf fourth; all above 100 team points and ahead of Panhandle powerhouses Tallahassee Lincoln and Gulf Breeze and Daytona Beach-area power New Smyrna Beach.

Also, locally, Ridgeview finished 16th and Orange Park finished 22nd.

Fleming Island's stalwart veterans, led by seniors Kaden Schaefer, unbeaten at 150 (41-0) and Christopher Chop at 175 (44-6) smashed through their rounds with Schaefer hoisting a 57-second pin, a 17-2 tech fall, a 9-1 major decision and a finals' 5-0 win over JJ Martinez of Ft Walton Beach (50-6) and Chop muscling his way to three first period pins to the final and a 5-0 win over a very agile footballer,






Girls off to state

Edward Craig of Beachside (30-3).

"I've wrestled just about everyone in my weight class and look forward to facing off in the state final with Tampa Jesuit's Draven McCall (23-2)," said Schaefer, who signed to wrestle at NCAA Div. I Bucknell University next fall. "I just stayed focused and wrestled one guy at a time."

Also on Schaefer's radar will be Brandon's unbeaten Thomas Gernhart (52-0). For Schaefer, both Gernhart and McCall are on the same side of the 150-pound bracket set for the state meet. Schaefer was third last year after losing to Lake Gibson champion Hayden Whidden in the 145 semifinal then beating Middleburg senior Logan Moore in the consolation semifinal to advance. Moore finished fifth.

"We wrestle the way we wrestle, who cares who is on the mat," said Cobbert. "That's just a singlet."

For Chop, a disappointing fifth last year with a second-round loss bouncing him into consolations, who has been mechanically tactical in his approach on the mat while seemingly easing through matches with confidence and power, had some difficulty nailing down the very fast and agile Craig from Beachside and resorted to simple grind wrestling to take the region title.

"Having the meet here made it very weird because it was in the Clay gym, but we just win wherever we go," said Chop, ranked third at 175 behind Elijah Penton of Winter Springs (44-5, defending state champion at 170 last year) and Ryan Beirne of Satellite (39-4, 1-2 at state last year) in one of the toughest weight divisions in all Classes of Florida with just one wrestler; Manatee's Mason Miller, with just one loss on the season (40-1, finished sixth with loss to Fleming Island's Ronan Bozeman). "We give a lot of thought to my style; just to keep grinding my guy to break him. Anyone in front of me, I'm going to beat."

In two of the best pseudo-upset matches of the day; at 285, with Fleming Island first-year wrestler Kevin Reyes facing off against Goliath-sized opponents in his semifinal and final; the top seed Ryder Luck of Lincoln, who beat Reyes in the regular season, and was top seed before the region championship, and Logan McAllister of Mosley, who was number four before Clay with Reyes fifth.

"Maybe that will change now," said Reyes, after the burly power wrestler and state Olympic Snatch weightlifting champion, outmaneuvered the two much-taller and weightier opponents for wins of 3-1 over Luck with a third-period takedown in a flurry as Luck came heavy at Reyes, and a 10-4 finals win over McAllister, who was five inches taller and much heavier than Reyes.

"Our strategy was to not let him get me on the ground," said Reyes. "I trusted my speed against his size and, in the end, I prevailed. I guess I won't surprise anyone at state now."

For Reyes, now 46-9, the prize was a number one ranking going into the state championship with Luck second and McAllister sixth. In the championship bracket, Reyes will only face one of the two in the final with both on the opposite side of the bracket to Reyes. Reyes does have the fourth and fifth-ranked wrestlers on his side of the bracket; Jaxon Newton of Charlotte and Carmine Morton of Tampa Gaither; both with 41 wins, Newton with nine losses, Morton with three. "Coach P.J. has taught me more and more each week about how to move around these big guys and I listen to him," said Reyes.

For Cobbert, Reyes' IQ is his strength.

"First-year wrestler and he buys in, simple as that," said Cobbert.

Also winning titles for Cobbert were Jordan Mukaddam at 120 who beat Middleburg's Grady Woodard 7-0 for his title and Laird Duhaylungsod at 138, 47-4, who beat Jonathan Bruner of New Smyrna Beach 5-2. Duhaylungsod advanced with three pins; two under a minute and his semi in the third.

Mukaddam, 45-3, who showed a little power early in the season with a Knockout Christmas title blasted through his bracket with three pins before facing Woodard.

Fleming Island's region champions will be joined by Matthew Newman, third at 113 over Nathan Harvey of Middleburg, and Dylan Beck, third at 157 with a 6-2 win over Ft. Walton Beach's Matthew Sinclair. Beck workhorse his way to the state meet after losing his first match to Ridgeview's Preston Lewis winning five straight matches to earn his ticket.

Blue Devils get close, but still finish second

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - Clay High's 113-pound wrestler Jacob Bucci has taken the tough road to recovery from knee injuries and had been dropped to No. 7 in rankings, but nevertheless, stayed undeterred, as the state placer last year got a second ticket to the FHSAA state championships with a region title Saturday in his home gym at Clay High School.


"After I won my district title last week, I was out running and working because I know I lost a lot of time with my knee injury," said Bucci, a freshman third-place finisher at 106 last year. "It's not been easy, but I feel like I have something to prove."

Bucci, who was first man up in the Blue Devils' chase of perennial region champion; nine times, Fleming Island, set the tone for some scrappy wrestling despite the odds on Clay beating Fleming Island after a duals loss and a district final IBT loss last week.

With sophomore Landon Willard, with just 2-3 season record, having to face off with top-seed Middleburg's Gavin Fisher in his second match and getting pinned quickly, it was up to Bucci to reverse the momentum for the Blue Devils.

Bucci, whose arch rival county-wide, Fleming Island's Matthew Newman, was eliminated from the championship bracket by Gulf Breeze freshman Gavin Samons (46-8) with a 5-2 match, that left Bucci to answer in the final with a new face.

Samons beat two Clay County athletes; Ridgeview's Timothy Danz and Newman along the path to Bucci with Newman eventually beating Middleburg's Nathan Harvey for third.

"I've been training with Rylan Herrera and Drew Holmquist; bigger guys, to get ready," said Bucci. It's unfinished business."

After the region title, Bucci jetted to the top spot with Erick Vargas of Lakeland (7th at 113 last year), Malachi Ortiz of Tampa Jesuit (formerly Belleview) and Landon Quiroga of Merrit Island, the 106 runnerup last year, behind him. Newman, who lost to Quiroga in the 106 semis last year, is number nine with Middleburg's Nathan Harvey

At 126, Clay's Rylan Herrera, just 5-1, but one of the more explosive wrestlers on the Blue Devil roster, completed a two pin prelims and a 12-0 semifinal to face off with Oakleaf's sophomore sensation Sebastian Bonachea in a clash of high-flyers on the mat.

Herrera, the number two ranked 126 prior to Clay, dominated top seed Coby Shields, a seasoned ninth-ranked senior out of Gulf Breeze (50-6) with a 12-0 shutout in their semifinal with Shields unable to keep Herrera in his grasp for much of the match.

In a thrilling semifinal match at 157, Clay's Landon Martin looked to avenge a district duals loss to Oakleaf's Ghais Cooper and the two made the match very personal right down to the final points in the third overtime period.

"He wasn't going to quit and I sure wasn't, but I think when I scored on that first escape overtime, I broke him," said Martin, who simply stayed on top of Cooper the final 30 seconds seemingly unopposed for the region title. "We had that long break with the question about where his leg was on a possible reversal of two points, but the refs kept the score tied to force the overtime. I just had to refocus and regroup."

Martin will go to state following big brother Dominic Martin as the 11th seed in a weight division full of dangerous pits; top seed and defending 152 champion Gianni Maldonaldo of state champion Lake Gibson who has an incredible 61-5 record and second seed Kawayran Vazquez of Tampa Jesuit at 27-2.

In the state bracket at 157, Martin avoids Maldonaldo and even Terry Parker's Jeffrey Brown, who beat Martin for the region title 10-6, until a possible finals match, but does have Vazquez, just a freshman and even Fleming Island's Dylan Beck who stormed back to get a ticket to Orlando with five wins after losing his opener at regions.

Clay's final state ticket went to junior Aaron Stacey, just 5-1, who pinned another Gulf Breezer at the top of the bracket; senior London Taylor (40-16), only to have to

Lost as a state qualifier last year was Drew Holmquist at 132 who lost in the semifinals and then lost the consolation semis to end his season.

Vonte Burke, at 120, got to the semifinals before losing by pin to Middleburg's Grady Woodard then losing a tough 9-8 consolation semifinal to Ponte Vedra's Jaiden Zajni to end his season.

Will Kelly, at 190, lost his first match to Ridgeview's Rayhn Hutchinson, who finished 2-2, then battled back with two wins in consolation before a pin in the consolation semifinals.



Teenager from Texas unleashes bullish knockout

JACKSONVILLE - A 91.0 point ride; the top eight-second ride of a two-hour night of high-flying bull riding action Saturday night; the Unleash the Beast Professional Bullriders (PBR) in the Jacksonville Memorial Arena as the race to the 2024 World Championship, created the same spectator response as a 15th round knockout of a heavyweight boxing championship as worldwide rodeo riders and fans got to see the best in the world at last eight seconds on rock and roll machines of flesh weighing as much as a ton.

After an hour or so of preliminary qualifying between 37 rodeo cowboys from as far away as Spain and as close as Geneva, Florida, it was an 18-year-old Texan; John Crimber, who stole the show with the 91.0 point ride on the final ride of the night. Crimber's ride came after 39-year-old veteran Joao Ricardo Vieira, of Spain, clocked off a 90.0 ride to jet to a top-three slot. Vieira knocked out Crimber in January in the Tulsa PBR event.

"We don't go against the riders here, it's all against the bull," said Crimber, a homeschooler in Decatur, TX. "For me to be competing against a guy like him (Vieira) means a lot to me. And to get my first win means a lot."

Crimber jokingly said he was to return home to continue his high school after the Jacksonville event.

"I'll go back and take care of that," said Crimber. "I don't do any sports in high school, I'm just a bull rider cowboy."

Crimber's exciting finish moved him to No. 2 in the World Championship Rankings behind No. 1 Cassio Dias, a Rookie World Champion from Brazil. Diaz unloaded a 94.75 score last week to win the Michelob Ultra PBR Los Angeles event with Crimber second.

Ironically, Crimber's 91.0 scores in Jacksonville, on a bull called Doze You Down rated at just 78 percent buck off meaning the bull itself has been ridden to eight seconds numerous times, came after a scintillating ride a few slots back by a 39-year-old veteran who scored the first 90.0 of the night.

Joao Ricardo Vieira of Spain, who was among the most seasoned riders on the docket in Jacksonville and a recent winner in a tie at the Tulsa PBR event in January, knocked out a 90.0 point ride on his final ride to put the pressure on the rest of the field; with a dozen rides to follow him hoping to jump to the top of the field.

Crimber, a runnerup finisher in his recent PBR events, had to have at least an 86.5 score to get past leader Dalton Kasel who hit an 89.5 to jet to a 261.00 point lead. Vieira's 90.0 point ride, jetted him to second with 179.0 points which was vulnerable with Crimber still in the chutes with rides of 87.0 and 87.75 keeping him in the chase.

Kasel moved into the top spot with an 89.5 ride to put pressure on Crimber against his total of 261.0. Crimber's ride put is total at 265.75 for the win and a \$38,000 winners check plus a \$4000 bonus check. Crimber earned \$4,000 bonus money for the best ride of the night.

Kasel finished second with Vieira third with a distinct 179.00 points.

One guy who got a lot of "ride" time was Daylon Swearingen, of Georgia, who got to ride six bulls for the weekend due to Red Flags, or sub-par bull performances.

Swearingen, the 2022 World Champion, finished fourth with 173.25 points.



















Hagen, Clarida explosive blasts fueled week one softball



The Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the Shadowlawn Community Development District ("District") will hold public hearings on March 26, 2024 at 2:00 P.M., at Reinhold Corporation, 1845 Town Center Blvd., Suite 105, Fleming Island, Florida 32003, to consider the adoption of an assessment roll, the imposition of special assessments to secure proposed bonds on benefited lands within the District, a depiction of which lands is shown below, and to provide for the levy, collection and enforcement of the special assessments.

The District is located entirely within unincorporated Clay County, Florida. The lands to be improved are generally located south and west of County Road 218, north of State Road 16 and east of Thunder Road, and are geographically depicted below and in the *Capital Improvement Plan*, updated February 20, 2024 ("Capital Improvement Plan"). The public hearing is being conducted pursuant to Chapters 170, 190 and 197, *Florida Statutes*. A description of the property to be assessed and the amount to be assessed to each piece or parcel of property may be ascertained at the office of the District Manager c/o Wrathell, Hunt and Associates, LLC, 2300 Glades Road, Suite 410W, Boca Raton, Florida 33410 ("District Manager's Office").

The District is a unit of special-purpose local government responsible for providing infrastructure improvements for lands within the District. The infrastructure improvements are currently expected to include, but are not limited to, roadway improvements, stormwater management, potable water, reclaimed water and sewer utilities, underground electrical conduit, hardscape, landscape, irrigation fencing and signage improvements, amenity facilities and parks, and other infrastructure ("Improvements"), all as more specifically described in the Capital Improvement Plan, on file and available during normal business hours at the District Manager's Office. According to the Capital Improvement Plan, the estimated cost of the Improvements is \$91,895,349.

The District intends to impose assessments on benefited lands in the manner set forth in the District's *Amended and Restated Master Special Assessment Methodology Report*, dated February 20, 2024 ("Assessment Report"), which is on file and available during normal business hours at the District Manager's Office.

The purpose of any such assessment is to secure the bonds issued to fund the Improvements. As described in more detail in the Assessment Report, the District's assessments will be levied against respective benefitted lands within the District. The Assessment Report identifies maximum assessment amounts for each assessment area and land use category that is currently expected to be assessed. The lien for assessments is proposed to be allocated on an equal assessment per acre basis, and will be levied on an equivalent residential unit ("ERU") basis at the time that such property is platted or subject to a site plan or sold.

The annual principal assessment levied against each parcel will be based on repayment over thirty (30) years of the total debt allocated to each parcel. The District expects to assess and collect sufficient revenues to retire no more than \$126,030,000 in debt, exclusive of fees and costs of collection or enforcement, discounts for early payment and interest. The proposed annual schedule of assessments is as follows:

The assessments may be prepaid in whole at any time, or in some instances in part, or may be paid in not more than thirty (30) annual installments subsequent to the issuance of debt to finance the improvements. These annual assessments will be collected on the Clay County tax roll by the Tax Collector. Alternatively, the District may choose to directly collect and enforce these assessments. All affected property owners have the right to appear at the public hearings and the right to file written objections with the District within twenty (20) days of the publication of this notice.

Also, on March 26, 2024 at 2:00 P.M., at Reinhold Corporation, 1845 Town Center Blvd., Suite 105, Fleming Island, Florida 32003, the Board will hold a regular public meeting to consider any other business that may lawfully be considered by the District. The Board meeting and hearings are open to the public and will be conducted in accordance with the provisions of Florida law for special districts. The Board meeting and/or the public hearings may be continued in progress to a certain date and time announced at such meeting and/or hearings.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the Shadowlawn Community Development District (the "District") hereby determines to undertake, install, plan, establish, construct or reconstruct, enlarge or extend, equip, acquire, operate, and/or maintain the infrastructure improvements (the "Improvements") described in the District's *Capital Improvement Plan*, updated February 20, 2024, attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District to pay the cost of the Improvements by special assessments pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes (the "Assessments"); and

WHEREAS, the District is empowered by Chapter 190, the Uniform Community Development District Act, Chapter 170, Supplemental and Alternative Method of Making Local Municipal Improvements, and Chapter 197, the Uniform Method for the Levy, Collection and Enforcement of Non-Ad Valorem Assessments, Florida Statutes, to finance, fund, plan, establish, acquire, construct or reconstruct, enlarge or extend, equip, operate, and maintain the Improvements and to impose, levy and collect the Assessments; and

WHEREAS, the District hereby determines that benefits will accrue to the property improved, the amount of those benefits, and that special assessments will be made in proportion to the benefits received as set forth in the Amended and Restated Master Special Assessment Methodology Report, dated February 20, 2024, attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by reference and on file at 2300 Glades Road, Suite 410W, Boca Raton, Florida 33431 (the "District Records Office"); and

WHEREAS, the District hereby determines that the Assessments to be levied will not exceed the benefit to the property improved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE SHADOWLAWN COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

1. Assessments shall be levied to defray a portion of the cost of the Improvements.

2. The nature and general location of, and plans and specifications for, the Improvements are described in **Exhibit A**, which is on file at the District Records Office. **Exhibit B** is also on file and available for public inspection at the same location.

3. The total estimated cost of the Improvements is \$1,895,349 (the "Estimated Cost").

4. The Assessments will defray approximately \$126,030,000, which amounts include the Estimated Costs, plus financing-related costs, capitalized interest and a debt service reserve.

5. The manner in which the Assessments shall be apportioned and paid is set forth in **Exhibit B**, including provisions for supplemental assessment resolutions.

6. The Assessments shall be levied, within the District, on all lots and lands adjoining and contiguous or bounding and abutting upon the Improvements or specially benefitted thereby and further designated by the assessment plat hereinafter provided for.

7. There is on file, at the District Records Office, an assessment plat showing the area to be assessed, with certain plans and specifications describing the Improvements and the estimated cost of the Improvements, all of which shall be open to inspection by the public.

8. Commencing with the year in which the Assessments are levied and confirmed, the Assessments shall be paid in not more than (30) thirty annual installments. The Assessments may be payable at the same time and in the same manner as are ad-valorem taxes and collected pursuant to Chapter 197, Florida Statutes; provided, however, that in the event the uniform non ad-valorem assessment method of collecting the Assessments is not available to the District in any year, or if determined by the District to be in its best interest, the Assessments may be collected as is otherwise permitted by law.

9. The District Manager has caused to be made a preliminary assessment roll, in accordance with the method of assessment described in **Exhibit B** hereto, which shows the lots and lands assessed, the amount of benefit to and the assessment against each lot or parcel of land and the number of annual installments into which the assessment may be divided, which assessment roll is hereby adopted and approved as the District's preliminary assessment roll.

10. The Board shall adopt a subsequent resolution to fix a time and place at which the owners of property to be assessed or any other persons interested therein may appear before the Board and be heard as to the propriety and advisability of the assessments or the making of the Improvements, the cost thereof, the manner of payment therefore, or the amount thereof to be assessed against each property as improved.

11. The District Manager is hereby directed to cause this Resolution to be published twice (once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks) in a newspaper of general circulation within Clay County and to provide such other notice as may be required by law or desired in the best interests of the District.

12. Previously adopted assessment resolutions including Resolutions 2023-01, 2023-02, 2023-06, and 2023-07 regarding the imposition of special assessment, setting a public hearing thereon and levy of special assessment, are rescinded in their entirety

13. This Resolution shall become effective upon its passage.


