

## New recreational facility, pavilion coming to Moosehaven

ORANGE PARK – Residents at Moosehaven sat eagerly for the AAA groundbreaking ceremony last Tuesday, which commemorated the start of two promising developments for the senior living community.

"AAA" means "always active at" Moosehaven. Socializing and physical exercise are important for retired older adults' minds and bodies, and the community is committed to encouraging recreation of all kinds.

The existing sports and recreation center will be torn down to make room for a

modern, larger facility. Scherer Construction is leading the design and development of the two projects.

"In May or June, construction will begin. It'll move from paper to the ground," said Helen Taylor, a director of Moosehaven.

The new Moosehaven AAA building will have more space to play shuffleboard and go bowling. There will be a new bar, a workout gym, and an outdoor courtyard.

A new pavilion will be built along the scenic riverside. It will come furnished with ceiling fans to fight off muggy summer

## Orange Park Town Council Seat 4

### Candidate Maddie Hilt

ORANGE PARK – Madison “Maddie” Hilt is running against Kenneth Vogel for Seat 4 on the Orange Park Town Council.

“No matter who you are, I want to work with you to keep Orange Park strong and continue building our awesome sense of community,” Hilt said.

If elected, Hilt would be the first trans individual to hold public office in Florida. However, she doesn't want her identity to define her campaign.

“I don't want to have to talk about who I am; I want to talk about what I can do for my neighbors,” she said.

Hilt is an assistant pastor at Riverside Church at Park and King. She helps organize her church's outreach program, Clay Mission, which meets at the Orange Park Library and coordinates cleanups for parks and repairs for accessibility ramps.

She said her commitment to her congregation and community has led her to seek public office.

“I am really passionate about keeping the town safe for people to get around. We have some good roots of walkability here,” she said.

It's impossible not to notice the congestion along U.S. Highway 17. Hilt is open-minded about building a pedestrian bridge across U.S. 17 and Kingsley Avenue. She said she wanted to revisit the issue of red-light cameras.

“There are other ways to ensure intersection safety that is more rigorously

proven, especially since red-light cameras (have a disproportionate) impact on the lowest earners or those with fixed incomes,” she said.

Hilt cited possible federal funding for a rail study, which could open up Orange Park to an additional Amtrak station.

“Rails are what built this town. We would benefit from getting them back. We should give people other options in addition to cars,” she said.

Hilt said she was proud to call Orange Park home for many years. Her love for the community has only grown since moving into her grandparent's home after he passed away.

She said what makes Orange Park special is its small-town feel in an urban environment. Also, her neighbors. Many may have different opinions on orientation, but she said she is always treated respectfully. Hilt flies pride flags, and some of her neighbors fly Trump flags, but everyone gets along, she said.

Some of Hilt's goals include fostering greater transparency on the town council dais, organizing more events at Town Hall Park and being accessible to her constituents. She said she is excited to give back to the community that raised her.

“There's so much we can do so that town can live happier and healthier lives,” she said. Hilt responded to her decision to opt for Seat 4 instead of Seat 3. She said if anyone were going to run unopposed, she would prefer it to be Taylor who is already well-known in the community.

“Everything he was campaigning on I believe, too,” she said.

Her favorite restaurants in Orange Park are OP Fish House and Dairy Queen.

She currently serves on the Orange Park Economic and Community Development Committee.

### Candidate Kenneth Vogel

ORANGE PARK – Kenneth Vogel is running against Madison “Maddie” Hilt for Seat 4 on the Orange Park Town Council.

“You always expect someone else to step up. I decided to throw my hat in and go for it, myself” Vogel said.

Vogel is a local business owner of Essential Electric LLC. He has lived in Orange Park for 30 years. He says it's the best place to live, work, raise a family and call home.

“It's the best-kept secret,” he said about the town. “It's a close-knit community.”

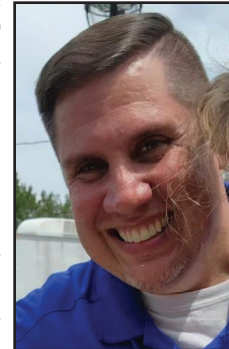
Vogel says what he brings to the table is a creative, outside-the-box perspective intent on bolstering the town's community.

“We are limited by our own thinking. This could be a destination town. Everything has to go through here,” he said referring to the many thousands of cars that pass up and down U.S. Highway 17 on any given day.

“Ultimately, the town should be a destination,” he said.

“You can't have a destination town without safety, and there has to be revenue. Revenue opens the door to many things, so we have to be enticing. I want to be the advocate for small businesses,” he said.

Being a small business owner is challenging, and Vogel says he wants to be

their advocate. He also wants to give a voice to the underserved communities of Orange Park.

“There's disparities throughout, such as in Grove Park. They need help. They need a voice. They need an advocate. My mother was a nurse at Grove Park Elementary, and I used to work as a counselor,” he said.

“How do we create the same equity for Orange Park and Grove Park elementary schools? What's the creative solution to create a paradigm shift?” he asked, in a rhetorical question.

Vogel says he would consider town-led ways to provide after-school programs in Orange Park. In addition to creating an outlet for students, it would also spare parents the typical daycare costs. One way would be encouraging family sports and revitalizing the public parks in the town to make them more accessible to the underprivileged, he said.

Vogel is interested in maximizing the utility of the town's existing recreational facilities. He's open to making the fields multipurpose for soccer and football, for example.

Vogel says he wants to promote walkability, integral to maintaining the small-town charm.

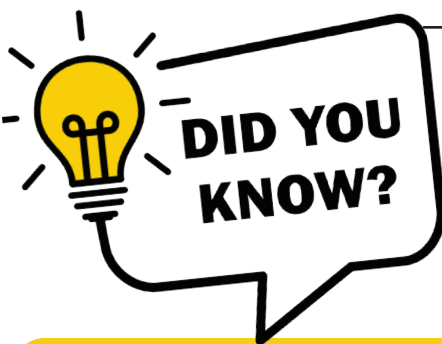
“We have to look to our future. Our kids are going to grow up. We want them to grow up and want to stay in the town. The goal is to create a community people love and don't want to leave,” he said.

“We got good folks. We got to keep them. We got to poach the good people from other cities. Bring them over!” he said.

His favorite restaurants in Orange Park are 4 Rivers and Aron's Pizza.

He currently serves as a board member for the Historical Society of Orange Park.

## Even if you doubt politicians, you can trust the election process

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Clay Today was guided on a tour through the Clay County Election Office. Supervisor of Elections Chris Chambless showed the tabulation boxes, the voting equipment secured in the warehouse and the rows and rows of glass windows running parallel from the city street to where the votes will be counted.

“You can’t get more transparent than that,” Chambless said.

There’s a slight tint and sometimes a glare, but if you put your face up to the window, you can peer in and watch the tabulation take place standing on Orange Avenue just outside. The rooms are also under 24-hour audio and video and surveillance.

Chambless has an open-window, open-door policy for anyone confused or skeptical about our election process.

During the tour, Chambless cleared up misconceptions and offered clarifications.

So, how are elections secure in Florida?

Florida has a statewide voter registration database preventing anyone from voting twice, either on accident or purpose. For example, to vote in Florida, you have to register first. You can register, update your registration and check the status of registration – all online. The address you declare will determine which precinct you can vote. In Florida elections, you also will need an ID with a photo and signature to vote.

The voter registration database is the safeguard that prevents those with multiple addresses from voting twice. No other can be cast once a vote is received from a registered voter. Also, it prevents double voting from those who may not have a primary address. Voting addresses are assigned for the homeless or those living in a camper or boathouse.

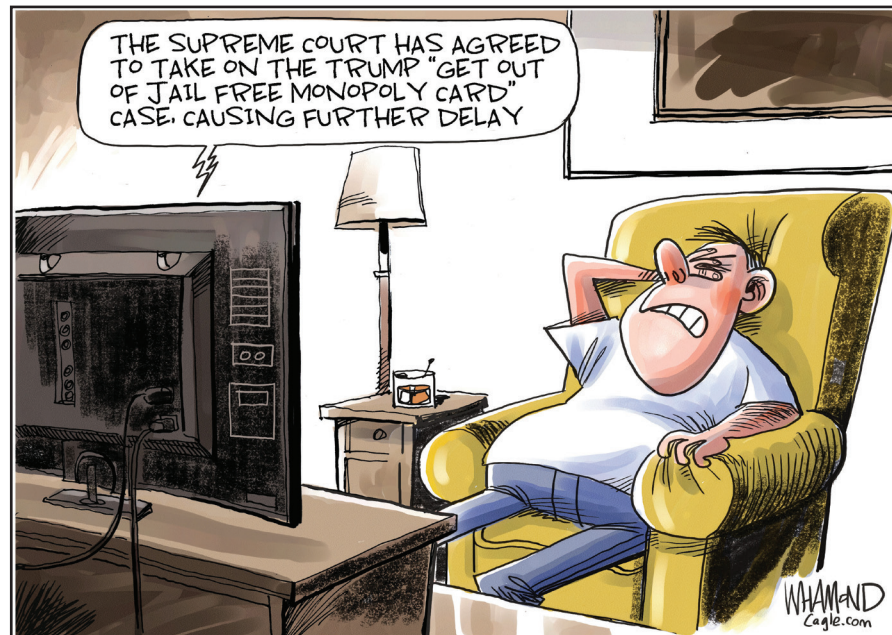
The voter registration database is connected to other statewide agencies. The election office receives death certificates for those registered to vote in Clay County. The vote is flagged if a death certificate comes before the postmark of the vote-by-mail ballot.

Even through a seance, dead people can’t vote in elections.

## Senate adds ‘anti-grooming’ to online child exploitation bill

The House passed legislation enhancing penalties for child exploitation online. Still, the Senate is adding new language as it passes unanimously, meaning the House will have to reconsider this anew.

Republican Sen. Jonathan Martin substituted Republican Rep. Jessica Baker’s bill (HB 1545) for his identical product. Still, he offered an amendment targeting what the sponsor called “grooming language,” called “harmful communication to a minor” in the bill rather than the word “grooming” itself as it was in previous versions of the language.

This stipulates that an “adult who engages in a pattern of communication to a minor that includes explicit and detailed verbal descriptions or narrative accounts of sexual activity, sexual conduct, or sexual excitement and that is harmful to minors commits a felony of the third degree.”

The new language also says a “person’s ignorance of a minor’s age, a minor’s misrepresentation of his or her age, a bona fide belief of a minor’s age, or a minor’s consent may not be raised as a defense in a prosecution for a violation of this section,” removing the potential for victim blaming from the bill language.

Martin suggested wiggle room, such as when an 18-year-old communicates with a 17-year-old, as being something that would govern the interpretation of this language. Likewise, “sex education” that isn’t “harmful” likely wouldn’t qualify for the felony penalty.

The legislation is otherwise unchanged. It would increase the points that prosecutors and Judges use in the offense severity ranking chart formula to determine penalties for a variety of heinous crimes involving “possession, promotion, and production of child sexual abuse material.”

It seeks to remedy Florida’s relative leniency on online child exploitation as compared to other states and the federal government.

These include prohibiting a person from using a child in a sexual performance, prohibiting a person from promoting a sexual performance by a child, prohibiting a person from possessing child pornography with the intent to promote, and prohibiting a person from possessing or intentionally viewing child pornography.

“By increasing the offense severity ranking of specified child exploitation offenses, the bill may increase the minimum sentence to which a person convicted of such an offense may be sentenced and may increase a term of incarceration required to be imposed as part of that sentence,” a legislative bill analysis notes.

This could lead to more people going to prison for longer stretches for these offenses.

“The bill may have a positive indeterminate impact on jail and prison beds by increasing the OSRC ranking for specified child exploitation offenses, which may result in increased prison admissions or longer terms of incarceration for persons convicted of such offenses,” reads an analysis of the legislation.

Intake Stations (formally known as “drop off boxes”), which you will place your vote in. Votes are removed daily, and custody and control documents keep an accountable record.

What can we expect at the polls?

Voters will show up to their assigned precinct based on the address they provided and show proof of identification, such as a passport or driver’s license. Ballots are printed one at a time for each registered voter. Ballots are bubbled in and then inserted into the tabulation machine. The displayed number will tick up by one.

Chambless calls it the “tabulation odometer,” one more election safeguard.

During the logic and accuracy test last Friday, the elections office conducted the legally required testing to ensure the equipment was in working order and votes were correctly counted.

The voting equipment passed the tests with 100% success, and all equipment was reset, sealed and stored securely until the March 19 Presidential Preference Primary.

Can an election be “hacked?”

The election office uses an internal system that’s not connected to the internet. A fraudster would have to break into the office, disassemble the hardware, insert a trojan horse, reassemble the hardware and leave without getting caught or leaving any evidence behind.

But even that wouldn’t work, either. By “inseminating” artificial votes, the odometer would tick up for each artificial ballot. The fraudster could attempt to tamper with the odometer, and when the odometer count doesn’t match the number of ballots cast, it sends a red flag.

A spectator at the logic and accuracy test demonstration said he hesitates to trust elected officials and even the inten-

tions of some voters. But he was secured in the election process.

In one more layer of security, Chambless said the encryption codes for most bank accounts use a 128-bit algorithm to protect information. According to several security companies, 256-bit encryptions are considered “the strongest and most robust encryption standard” available.

The Clay County elections office uses a 1,024-bit algorithm, which means it would be easier to hack a bank than to steal an election.

The election’s office is eager to address any other concerns or questions. Don’t be fooled by misinformation. Do your research because a legitimate democracy is at stake.

## Early voting for Presidential Preference Primary is March 8-16

CLAY COUNTY – Republicans can participate in early voting for the Presidential Preference Primary March 8-16, from 9 a.m.-6 p.m.

Since President Joe Biden is running unopposed in Florida, there won’t be a primary for the Democrat Party. Since Florida has closed elections, which means voters can only vote in their party races during primaries, any of the county’s 83,084 registered Republicans can cast a ballot for any of seven candidates. While former president Donald J. Trump and Nikki R. Haley are the only active candidates, while Ryan L. Binkley, Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis, Asa Hutchinson, Vivek Ramaswamy and Chris Christie have suspended their campaigns. And, since they haven’t withdrawn, they remained on the ballot.

On Election Day, voters must vote at their assigned precinct. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Voters are encouraged to visit ClayElections.gov to verify their information, update their address, find their precinct, and check early voting wait times.

# Green Cove Springs breaks ground on Walnut Street improvements

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The city marked the start of construction on Thursday, Feb. 29, for Phase One of its Walnut Street Redesign project with a groundbreaking ceremony at the center of the street’s historic shops. Walnut Street Redesign is the first of many planned projects to emerge from the City’s long-range redevelopment plans and create a more pedestrian-friendly destination downtown for the City of Green Cove Springs. The total cost for Phase 1 Walnut Street Improvements is \$3,172,747, which

will be paid for by designated American Rescue Plan Act and tax revenue funds in the Fiscal Year 2023 and 2024 City Budget.

The work will span Walnut Street from Palmetto Avenue to Magnolia Avenue and take approximately six months to complete.

Improvements from Palmetto to Orange Avenue include two 10-foot-wide driving lanes, an eight-foot parallel parking lane along the north side of the street, a 15-foot-wide sidewalk from building to

curb on both sides of the street, improved landscaping, removable bollards on both ends of the street, and an outlined crosswalk.

Improvements from Orange to Magnolia Avenue along Walnut Street include a 15-foot sidewalk from the front of Clay

Theatre to the curb and replacing existing sidewalks and curbs on the corner of Walnut Street and Orange Avenue.

Using the existing brick, the brick roadway will be reconstructed to provide two 10-foot driving lanes along Walnut Street from Palmetto to Magnolia Avenue.

He was married to Toni Harrington on August 15th, 1970.

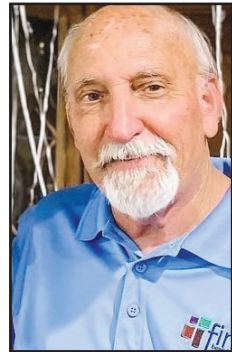
Curtis was a devoted husband of 53 years, a loving father of three children and seven grandchildren.

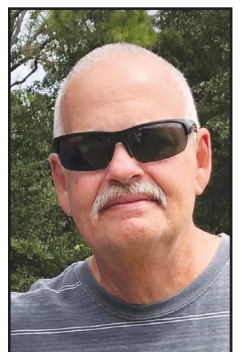

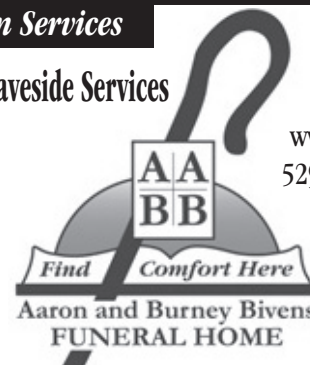

# Sheriff's Office working on transition to police county schools

FLEMING ISLAND – An unfortunate tragedy six years ago in Parkland sent shockwaves across the state of Florida and across the nation. Just one year after the mass shooting, the Clay County School Board voted to create and staff its police department.

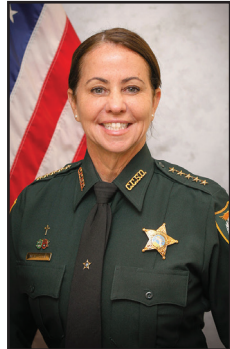
It would serve Clay County District Schools for five years.

A 4-1 vote during a school board meeting last November, with Board Member Mary Bolla dissenting, would begin the process that would effectively disband the Clay County District Schools Police Department and fold personnel and resources under the direction of the Clay County Sheriff's Office.

Thereby ending CCSO's five-year absence.

"The transition has been completed, and it won't be effective until July 1. So, we are currently processing the officers from the school board police who are interested in transitioning over," said Sheriff Michelle Cook.

The initial transition cost was projected at \$1.7 million, and it ended up being a bit less. The transition budget of \$1.3 million was approved by the school board and

agreed upon by the Board of County Commissioners on Feb. 27.

A "cosmetic" change is the first thing that comes to mind. The transitional budget will pay for new uniforms, jackets, shirts, deputy patches, new firearms and new training for existing CCSDS officers who will be under new management for the next school year.

The transition budget also includes background and psychological tests, which will largely be completed when students are away on Spring Break.

"We are working with the officers and school administrators to ensure continuity in their on-duty, on-campus duties as a law enforcement officer," said Cook.

Cook said her transition team has yet to meet with school board members to create a working template. Until both parties talk, she doesn't know how, or if, CCSO's duties will differentiate from CCSDPD's.

As Wagner can certainly attest, the burden of being the chief of police for 44 schools in the district is not a light one.

While there is no point in reinventing the wheel, Wagner says there are new state statutes that CCSO must be aware of since its hiatus five years ago.

CCSO said Chief Patrick Golemme will meet with Clay Today on March 20 to map out the changes and continuities as CCSO prepares for the school year.

"He (Golemme) is extremely busy preparing for the transition. Could you imagine having the responsibility of all the schools

in one county to oversee law enforcement staffing?" Abigail Harris, the public information deputy, said.

“Employees park in the residential neighborhood. About 18-to-24 cars on Blake Avenue sometimes park on the grass, block driveways and mailboxes. Trying to drive down Blake Avenue is dangerous,” a resident said.

“I appreciate the mayor’s support. He has been diligent in helping with this situation,” she said.

The resident was pleased with how the situation has cleared up on Blake Avenue, but she foresees the employee cars returning without a formal, long-term solution. She petitioned the town council to pass a new ordinance prohibiting commercial parking in a residential neighborhood.

“When you (the mayor) quit going, they’ll keep coming back,” said another

resident. The mayor agreed.

“I’ll bring it to the council. We need to take action on this,” Anderson said.

Town attorney Jody Brooks recommended an amendment to an existing town ordinance depending on which direction the town wanted to take: no commercial parking, no commercial parking on week-

days from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. on weekdays, no parking on the left side of the street or no parking on the other side.

Brooks said that enforceability would also be an issue. “How will you know which cars are residential and which ones are commercial?” she said.

Council member Doug Benefield said

the fair solution would be to limit parking on both sides.

“If you put ‘No Parking’ signs on one side of the road and if I lived on the other side, I’d be annoyed,” Benefield said.

“I think you have to do them on both sides, Monday through Friday – except on holidays – 9 to 5,” he said.

“They work pretty long days. They come in pretty early. A 9 to 5 might not cut it,” said Councilmember Winnette Sandlin.

As an update to the town’s parking ordinance is discussed and updated, there will be a hearing process for residents to voice their concerns and suggestions.

The council typically meets at 7 p.m. on the first and third Tuesday of each month at Town Hall. However, because of the Presidential Preference Primary on March 19, the council’s next meeting will be Wednesday, March 20.

## Before Macintosh: The Apple Lisa

ORANGE PARK – Even if you're reading this on a Windows, it's impossible to deny the historical influence of Apple on personal computers.

Namely, it was the Macintosh that revolutionized and popularized personal computing. The market success of the Macintosh made itself the industry standard for many years after its release, but its success also overshadowed the achievements pioneered by its predecessor – the Apple Lisa.

David Greelish, a computer historian from Orange Park, reflected on the overlooked technical and influential achievements of the Lisa computer in a feature full-length documentary film.

"Before Macintosh: The Apple Lisa" is a documentary that explored the history, technology, people, stories and industry influence of the lesser-known personal computer.

The documentary begins with Greelish's story, when he worked in an Apple store in Gainesville about 35 years ago. While working at the dealership, he unfortunately could not afford a computer of his own, even with his employee dis-



count. Instead, he opted for the Lisa. The older, larger model was his first complete personal computer.

"The Lisa was not only my first 'fully setup' computer, where I could actually use it in a practical way, but it was more importantly my first 'Mac,'" Greelish said. "It then led to my becoming a computer tech while also leading to my fascination with computer history."

Greelish was captivated by the machine and its relative obscurity compared to the Macintosh.

The Lisa, allegedly named after the daughter of Steve Jobs, was an ambitious

# Hundreds 'blessed' by perfect weather, meaningful sermon

True Life Church hold inaugural church in the park

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Bright streaks of sunshine during a morning of worship that attracted parishioners and onlookers alike erased concerns about rain at the first True Life Church in the Park on Sunday, March 3.

Inviting musicians from last May's Riverfest at Spring Park to perform at the church's sanctuary on County Road 220 evolved into bringing church service to the park.

"A group of us from the church were there," Register said of the annual Memorial Day celebration. "We were sitting there watching some people sing in the gazebo. Somebody said one of the singers had talked to him and said something they were in their youth group at church. I thought that would be great.

"Then somebody said we could do church here. That's how it got started."

Register said the True Life congregation has about 375 people. While it's impossible to differentiate the morning walkers and parishioners, Register said there were more than 425 stopping to hear the ser-

vice. He said as many as 100 who weren't connected with the church participated.

Afterward, the church handed out 350 free lunches.

"I know a lot of (the lunches) went to a couple dozen people who didn't go to our church," Register said. "We sat and talked with some of them. We listened to their stories. A handful said they were homeless and they were just coming through. We gave them barbecue chicken, talked with them, and prayed with them about things."

Register said the church had lofty expectations about moving a service to the park, but they were "overwhelmed" by the number of people who joined part or all of the service.

"It far exceeded our expectations," he said. "The venue was a big part of that. The heartbeat of our church is to be an instrument to serve our community. We got to meet people and share fun like face-painting, free meals and kindness.

"Some people said they were considering coming to our church. We brought the church to them. We were so fortunate to be in a place, as a church, where we could do something like this to love our community. It was a great success."

project. It was one of the first computers to use a microprocessor effectively and to develop a convenient graphic user interface, including the ubiquitous mouse and keyboard. So why were thousands of Lisa Computers thrown in a dump in Logan, Utah in 1989 despite all these dazzling technological innovations?

Why did consumers choose the Macintosh (released in 1984) over the Lisa (released in 1983)?

What is the legacy of the Apple Lisa on personal computers today?

In his documentary, Greelish traveled across the country to seek the expert per-

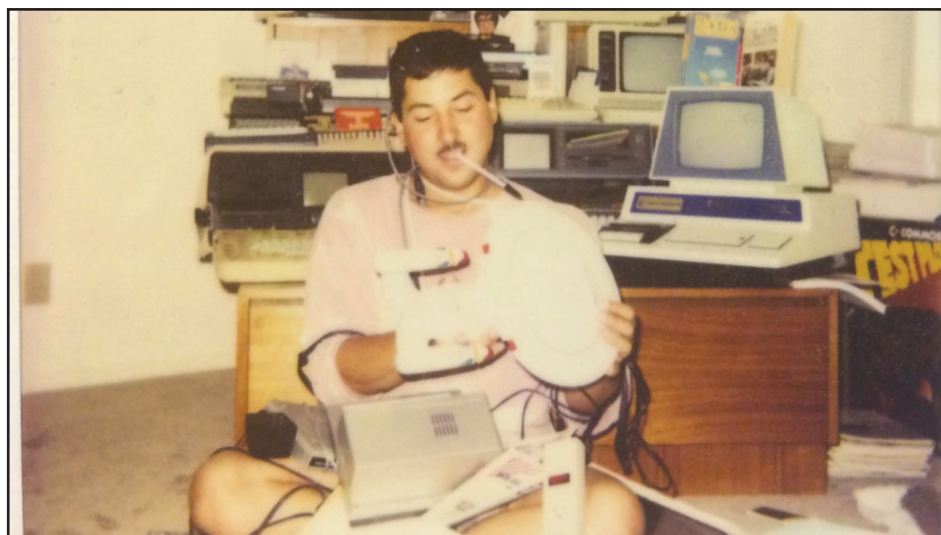
spectives of those who created the Lisa to answer these questions and more. He interviews engineers, historians and salesmen. He interviewed John Sculley, a former CEO of Apple.

Greelish's passion clearly spoke through his film.

"Passion is what keeps us alive! And passion was clearly present with a lot of the personal computing pioneers. They wanted to change the world," Greelish said.

# Organizers 'berry' happy with crowds, business at Strawberry Fest

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Sam Gilbert's attention was divided between approaching tractor-trailers and the hundreds of guests pouring into last Sunday's Strawberry Fest at the Clay County Fairgrounds.

One of the largest crowds in the festival's eight-year history kept his sellers at a frantic pace near the front entrance. Based on Saturday's sales, he desperately called for another semi to bring another load of fresh berries from Plant City. His fears were pacified when another truckload arrived around noon.

But the extra load still wasn't enough. The final pallet of the luscious achenes was gone by 3:15 p.m.

Font said Saturday's sales exceeded their expectations.

"Sam sold so many strawberries on Saturday," she said. "What we've done in the past was blown out of the water."

The number of visitors was also surprisingly high.

"We saw some big increase in numbers from last year," said June Font, a manager with festival promoter Buckler Promotions. "We're still going through all the numbers, but we had a great two days. Last year, we had 16,000 (people), and we certainly beat that this year."

The Clay County Sheriff's Office said as many as 4,000 cars drove on and off the property between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Saturday, March 2.

"They did a great job getting folks in and out," she said.



This year's attendance was as big as 18,000, making it one of the biggest in the eight-year history of the festival.

This year's strawberry crop was exceedingly plentiful and sweet, which created a demand that blew former sales "out of the water."

The forecast wasn't promising ahead of the annual event. Rain was expected all weekend, but nearly 18,000 were greeted by two sun-splashed days of games, carnival foods, a petting zoo and vendors that stretched from one side of the parking lot to the other.

"We were really blessed to have great weather," Font said. "This one was certainly up there compared to other festivals."

Buckler Promotions will be back at the fairgrounds on the final weekend of next January with its BBQ, Bacon and Brews Fest.

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The annual Vietnam War Veterans Day ceremony will be held Saturday, March 23, at 10 a.m., at the TAPS Monument, 915 Walnut St. in the Historic Triangle.

More than 300 are expected to attend the ceremony to commemorate the National Vietnam War Veterans Day. The ceremony is open to the public.

The ceremony is being held in partnership with Vietnam Veterans of America Col. William G. Byrns Chapter 1059 and the Clay County Board of Commissioners.

It has been the only Vietnam War Veterans Day recognition event being held in Northeast Florida with Vietnam Veterans of America chapters from Duval, Nassau and St. Johns counties being represented.

The TAPS monument in Green Cove Springs has the names of 66 Clay County Veterans who were killed in action, 22 during Vietnam. The names of the KIA will be called, followed by a single bell ring.

The National Vietnam War Veterans Day, which is on March 29, honors the U.S. military members who served during the Vietnam War (1955-1975).

From Jan. 1, 1965, to March 28, 1973, 2.6 million military personnel served within the borders of South Vietnam. Another 50,000 served in Vietnam between 1960 and 1964.

During the Vietnam Era – Aug. 5, 1965 to May 7, 1975 – more than nine million served on active duty.

According to the National Archives, 58,220 U.S. military members died in Vietnam from 1959 to 1975. There are still 1,577 missing.

**Vietnam Veterans offering two \$1,500 scholarships to seniors**

CLAY COUNTY – The Vietnam Veterans Association Chapter 1059 will award two \$1,500 scholarships to graduating Clay County public, private, Camp Blanding Youth ChalleNGe and homeschool seniors.

The Col. William G. Byrns Chapter named the scholarships after former member Sid Newberg. It is open to relatives of current members of Chapter 1059. All applicants, except those from the chapter, must live in Clay County and plan to attend any post-high school accredited university, junior college or a vocational/technical school.

Applications must provide five requirements to be considered:

- A letter telling us about yourself, your life goals and your plans for the future. Include your name, address, phone number and email address.

- An official, original acceptance letter to an accredited four-year university, two-year college, or trade school on official letterhead.

- An essay, with a minimum of 500 words, based on an interview with a veteran, or active-duty member, from any branch of the U.S. military. The interview should include a veteran's experiences while serving either here or abroad or a significant mission in which he/she participated. An essay comprises the introduction, the main points (body) and the conclusion. The essay will be judged on originality, grammar and spelling.

- A letter of recommendation from a school faculty member who is a school counselor, principal or teacher.

- A list of your community service, awards and recognitions received during grades 9-12. Provide copies of documentation. The application will not be considered if any of the above attachments are missing. The deadline for the completed application is on or before April 30. The scholarship recipients will be announced at the Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 1059 meeting on June 1.

MIDDLEBURG – Two new Clay County Fire Rescue trucks – Fire Rescue 1 and Fire Engine/Ladder 1 – were blessed to serve the county. Fr. Andy Blaszowski of St. Luke Catholic Church offered a prayer on Friday, March 1, for the two new fire engines with fire chiefs, duty crews and children from Annunciation Catholic's seventh- and eighth-grade classes.

Fire Engine/Ladder 1 brings significant capacity to Clay County because it's a truck that can use its ladder to reach as high as 75 feet. It can act as a Ladder and an Engine, which means it has advanced life support equipment and personnel. Fire Engine/Ladder 1 can respond to incidents inside multi-story developments that already exist.

"This is a beautiful event to mark the achievement of obtaining these two new trucks," said Acting Fire Chief David Motes.

"We've been working with the Board



of County Commissioners throughout the past five years to put in place ways to meet the demand for service, which has been growing exponentially with the population," he explained, "and this important milestone shows we will be there for you when you need us."

Blaszowski said, "It's a great opportunity for us to come together, united in the name of God, to extend blessings upon the vehicles and those who will continue to keep us safe in the years to come."

This is the first event for CCFR, al-

though the fire stations obtaining a new truck will typically hold a "pushing in" ceremony. These trucks will be assigned to the new Station 1 on land the county recently purchased behind St. Luke Catholic Church on Old Jennings Road.

Until the station's completion, Rescue 1 will run out of Station 26 in Oakleaf, and Engine 1 will be based at Station 14 in Middleburg. However, these units will have the flexibility to go to different areas as needed so CCFR can ensure widespread coverage.

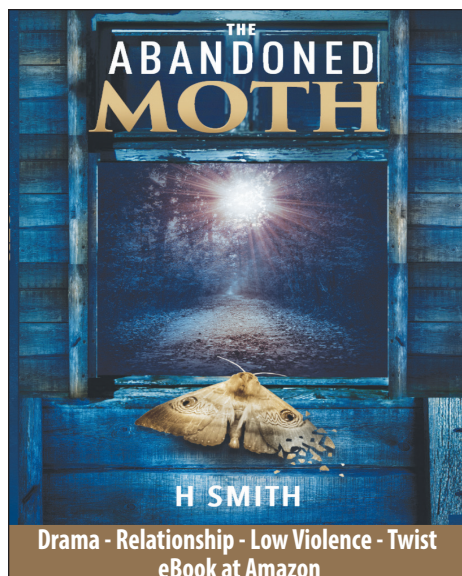

### Hammer and Hope coming to Francis Vera Park on March 20

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Building on the successes of the county's Hammer and Hope program, a fourth community services event will be at Vera Francis Park on March 20. The Clay County Sheriff's Office created the program's two-pronged approach in January, 2021. Now in its third year, Sheriff Michelle Cook said it's led to marketable results.

The "Hammer" portion targets drug dealers and abusers, while the "Hope component" offers treatment and counseling to people with an addiction and their families. There will be at least 20 service providers at the park from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. to help families affected by opioid abuse.

After launching the program, Cook said, "There is a cycle of drugs, crime and broken families that reach across our county. Here in Clay County, drug dealing will not be tolerated. If you are dealing drugs in Clay County, we're going to find you and arrest you. But we cannot arrest our way out of this problem."

There were 630 drug-related arrests in Clay County last year, Cook said. Also, the conviction rate for drug charges has increased by nearly 15% to 85%, she said.

In addition to the sheriff's office, Fire Rescue's Paramedicine Unit will dispense Narcan kits and establish training sessions on its use. Since Hammer and Hope's inception, more than 5,500 Narcan kits and Fire Rescue has trained more than 800 residents on how to respond to an opioid overdose. To request a Narcan kit or enroll in a group training class, visit [claycounty.gov/community/community-paramedicine-program](http://claycounty.gov/community/community-paramedicine-program) or email [community.paramedicine@claycountygov.com](mailto:community.paramedicine@claycountygov.com). The number of deadly overdoses and the number of calls for service have been cut in half since the program launched.

Cook said Hammer and Hope is a "safe space" to start the process of sobriety. Clay Behavioral Health Center, Impact Clay, Clay Action Coalition, The Way Free Medical Clinic, Clay County Tax Collector's Office, Kids First of Florida, The Quigley House, Department of Health Clay, Mercy Auto, Florida Department of Children and Families, Operation Barnabas, Wolfson Children's Hospital, River Christian Church's Celebrate Recovery Program, First Baptist Middleburg, Supervisor of Elections Office and Groups Recover Together also will participate. The park is at 1503 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd.

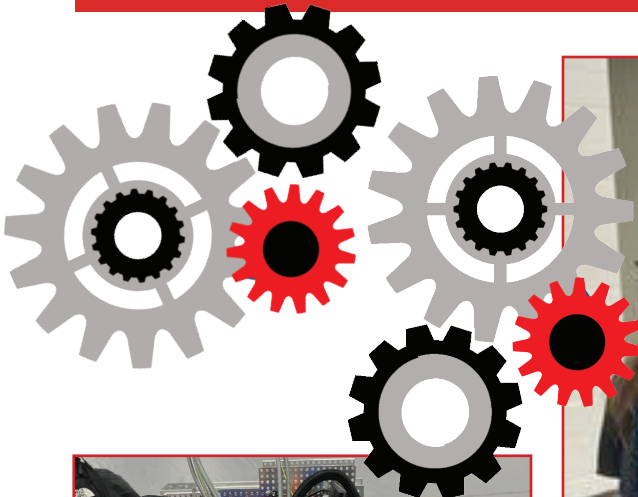

## Wilkinson Junior High finishes third at FIRST Tech Challenge

MIDDLEBURG – Even if the Robotics Team at Wilkinson Junior High was one of only two junior high teams at the 56-team FIRST Tech Challenge Florida Championships, the Talon Techs weren't intimidated.

Wilkinson's partner and sponsor were the Boy's and Girl's Clubs of Northeast Florida.

The team developed a program last August, and they quickly learned there was a lot more to a robotic competition

than building a clever gadget.

"It's a business at this level," said the school's robotic and technology teacher, Neil McKenzie. The competition started last September when teams were told their themes. Students had to find sponsors to pay for the project and decide how to make their robot complete projects within the theme.

"This year's theme was 'center stage,' so we started talking about different stage elements of an actual theater," McKenzie said. "We were dealing with backstage, backdrop rigging and those sort of things,

those named elements. We started to decide how we wanted to play the game and how we would score the points. And we had to try to solve the problem using a robot. The students completely designed our robot with help from mentors and technical advisors. They answered questions and taught them how to implement those dreams and processes."

The Talon Techs qualified for the state finals at the 42-team Northeast Florida competition. Other teams in the NE Florida Region came from Middleburg, Ridgeview, Fleming Island and Clay highs and Orange Park Junior High.

Wilkinson excelled in six qualifying rounds in Winter Haven to be a Top Four

finalist. They lost the chance to be in the finals to the eventual state champion from Punta Gorda.

FIRST, which is an acronym for For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology, is a youth-served nonprofit that advances STEM education. It prepares students for the future through a suite of life-changing youth robotics programs that build skills, confidence and resilience. The group also has a LEGO League for students in prekindergarten through eighth grade; Tech Challenge for students in seventh through 12th grades; and Robotic League for students in ninth through 12th grades.

Mckenzie said next year's team is already thinking ahead.

"We're already making plans," he said. "The offseason is when a lot of things get done."

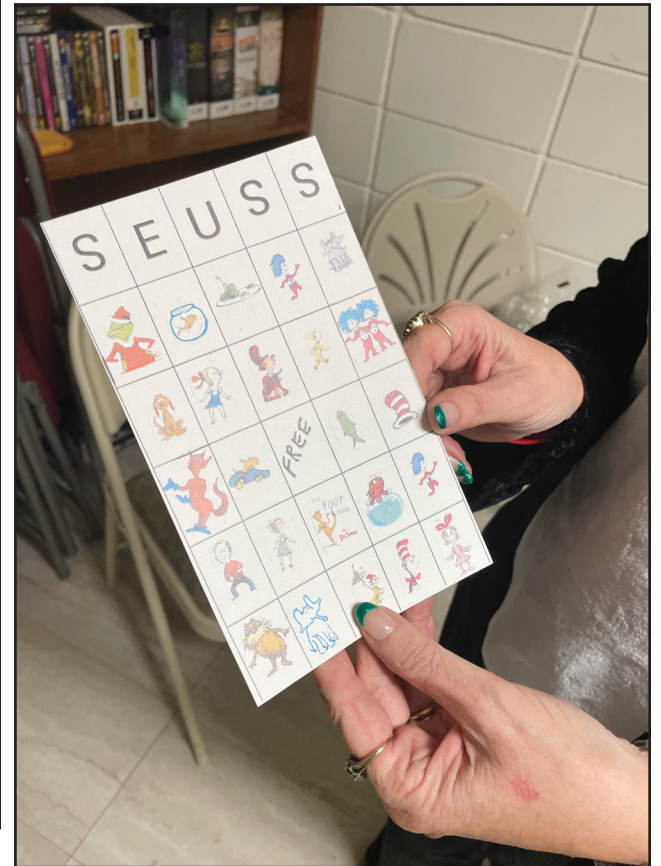

# Best and brightest: Hollywood royalty gathers for the 96th Oscars

Jimmy Kimmel returns to host the 96th annual Academy Awards



The calendar has been shaken up this entertainment-award season, but the movie industry’s top ceremony is remaining pretty much on time ... while starting an hour earlier than usual.

The 96th edition of The Oscars celebrates the best in the film as ABC televises the event Sunday, March 10, from Hollywood’s Dolby Theatre. The network’s late-night star, Jimmy Kimmel, will be back for his fourth turn as Oscar host. His wife, Molly McNearney, has her second consecutive year as an executive producer of the

event (a job she also performs, along with co-head writer, on her spouse’s “Jimmy Kimmel Live!” weeknight program).

Viewers can expect Kimmel to make reference to last year’s strikes that upended show business, with the work stoppages by writers and actors delaying – or, in some cases, cancelling – the production of movies and altering release schedules. Some of this year’s Academy Award-nominated films had less promotion than they might have received otherwise, since their stars couldn’t promote those pictures as part of the union agreement during the actors’ strike.

However, a big turnout by Hollywood can be expected now, with the Oscar red-carpet arrivals of many personalities again being the draws for worldwide interest and attention that they typically are. There’s also potential for the unexpected, as recent Oscar shows have confirmed, whether that amounts to surprise winners or unanticipated comments or actions by those who take the stage.

“Oppenheimer” leads the current group of nominated films with 13 bids, followed by “Poor Things” with 11, “Killers of the Flower Moon” with 10, “Barbie” with eight — and controversy over its lack of nominations for Margot Robbie as best actress and Greta Gerwig as best director — and “Maestro” with seven.

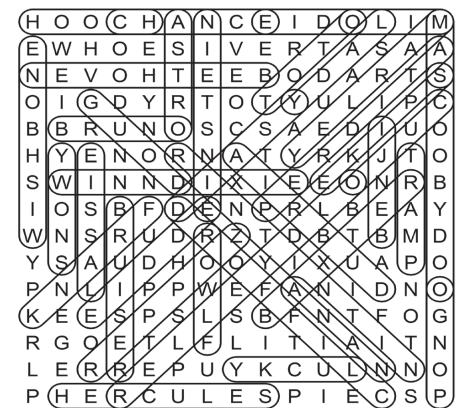

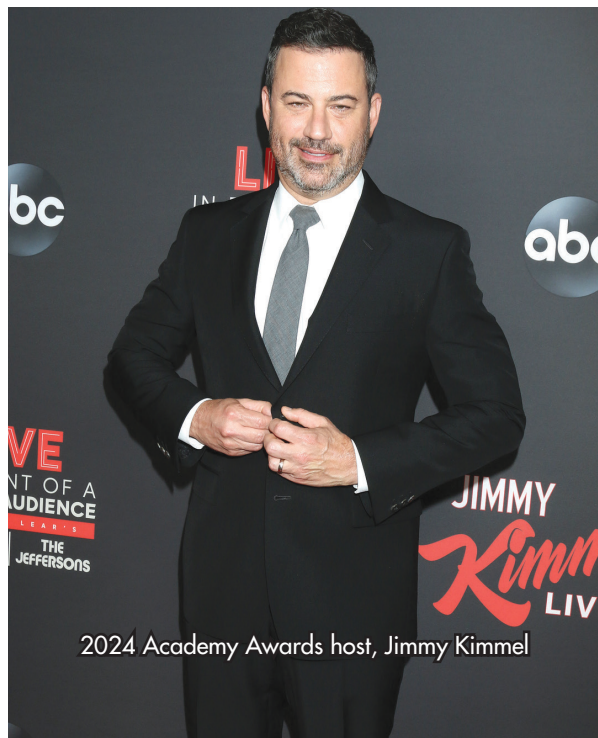

# Diane Keaton generates fun with 'Baby Boom'

Diane Keaton has been serviced well by the vast majority of her movies, and "Baby Boom" ranks high among the ones that have suited her best.

Within its main mission of being amusing, the 1987 film (which Turner Classic Movies shows Friday, March 15) addresses many themes that remain relevant more than three decades later ... relationship commitment, professional vs. personal life, the entrepreneurial spirit, and responsibility to oneself as well as others. And in this case, the main "other" is an adorable infant named Elizabeth.

Workaholic businesswoman J.C. Wiatt (Keaton) is shocked to become the immediate — as in, "handed off during an airport layover" — guardian of the child, whose

parents have died. Able to handle everything previously, including her at-arm's-distance live-in boyfriend (Harold Ramis), J.C. is certain she can balance her very active career with surrogate motherhood.

However, her boss (Sam Wanamaker) warns her, "You can't have it all." And much sooner than later, he's proven right, with J.C. caught up in moments such as having a restaurant hostess try to mind Elizabeth during a business meeting ... and eventually, J.C. is maneuvered out of the firm she served so totally and forced to reinvent herself.

She does that successfully, though it takes a while, by moving out of fast-paced New York to relaxed and scenic Vermont — where she gets inspiration from her newly inherited child to develop a baby-food brand that she labels Country Baby. Applying her savvy to marketing it eventually makes it a hit, catching the attention of her former employers, who want to broker a deal to buy it for a very tidy sum.

But will J.C. bite? What ultimately happens shows how well Keaton fares in developing the character's full arc, thanks also to then-married screenwriters Charles Shyer (the movie's director as well) and Nancy Meyers. This can be deemed the springboard for the female-empowerment comedies Meyers would write and direct later, including "Something's Gotta Give" (for which Keaton also was her muse), "The Holiday," "It's Complicated" and "the Intern."

### Taylor Kinney will stay on "Fire"

**Q: I've heard talk that there might be a spinoff series for the Severide character from "Chicago Fire." Is that true? – Ben Parsons, via e-mail**

**A:** There had been discussions about it, according to "Chicago Fire" executive producer Andrea Newman, but it was ultimately abandoned because Severide — and his portrayal, Taylor Kinney ("Trauma") — was deemed essential to the NBC parent show. That was confirmed when the actor was absent for an extended period last season, and given how that went, "Fire" wasn't eager to lose him again.

Had there been a spinoff, it would have put Severide back in the Office of Fire Investigation, probing arson cases — something he has shown his gift for a number of times, and something he has in common with his deceased father Benny (who was played by the late Treat Williams, of "Chesapeake Shores"). Undoubtedly, "Fire" will continue to go back to that aspect for Severide, as it did in explaining his absence and also in incorporating it into early chapters of the current "Fire" season.

**Q: I recently saw the Hallmark Channel movie "Summer in the City": and the lead actress looked very familiar. Where else would I have seen her? – Susan Case, Philadelphia, Pa.**

**A:** Julianna Guill has done quite a bit of television work over the past 15 years, but she might be known most widely for her recurring role as Nicolette Nevin's (Emily VanCamp, "Revenge") sister, Jessie, in the Fox medical drama "The Resident." She also co-starred as the title character's wife in "Joe Pickett" on Paramount+, and had multiple-episode runs in CBS's "Rush Hour," Bravo's "Girlfriend's Guide to Divorce," Netflix's "Bad Samaritans," MTV's "Underemployed," TBS's "Glory Daze" and The CW's "90210."

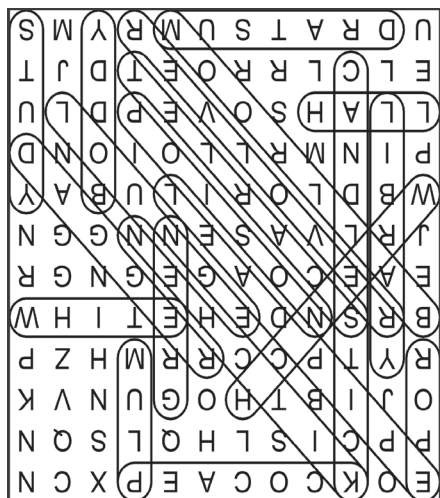
Shows on which Guill has done single guest shots have included "The Mindy Project," "Cougar Town," "Criminal Minds," "Psych," "Community" and "How I Met Your Mother." While the home screen has been her main domain, she also has made some notable movie appearances. She was in "Captain America: Civil War" (2016), "Christmas Eve" (2015), "Crazy, Stupid, Love" (2011), "Fired Up!" (2009) and a remake of "Friday the 13th" (2009).

**Q: On the "Sunday Morning" tribute to Charles Osgood, mention was made of Dave Garroway of "Today." Was Garroway that program's first host? – Michael Blank, via e-mail**

**A:** He was. After making a name for himself in radio, particularly in Chicago, Garroway made the jump to the then-young medium of television with NBC's musical-variety program "Garroway at Large" in 1949. His relaxed and relaxing style made him the network's choice — and even more specifically, the pick of NBC executive Sylvester "Pat" Weaver, the father of actress Sigourney Weaver — to front "Today" when it debuted in 1952.

Garroway also did several other shows during his "Today" run, including "The Dave Garroway Show" and "Wide Wide World" on TV and "Dial Dave Garroway" on radio. He left "Today" in 1961 to increase his time with his children after the death of his second wife, and he later picked up TV or radio jobs in cities including New York, Boston and Los Angeles. He passed away in the summer of 1982.

## Four more suspects in three-state shoplifting spree returned to Clay County

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Four additional people accused of orchestrating a string of shoplifting thefts at Home Depot and Target stores in three states were delivered from the Camden County, Georgia, Jail to Clay County to face charges in connection with the thefts.

Robert Thad Bryant, 40, and Kimberly Michelle Thompson, 46, both of Kingsland, Georgia, were identified as the ringleaders of an organized scheme to steal \$86,083.44 from 72 different stores in Florida, Georgia and South Carolina.

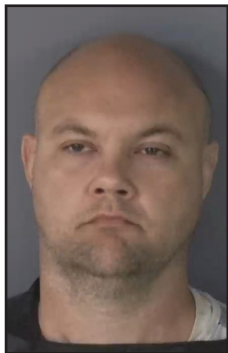
Bryant and Thompson were both charged with the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act after a two-year investigation by the Clay County Sheriff's Office and Florida Department of Law Enforcement.

According to FDLE, Bryant and Thompson fooled store employees at self-checkout lanes into believing they were paying for items before leaving the stores.

Stores identified by FDLE were the Home Depots on County Road 220 on Fleming Island, Wells Road in Orange Park and Branan Field Road in Middleburg.

In addition to the RICO charge, Bryant was charged with 49 grand theft counts and seven petit thefts.

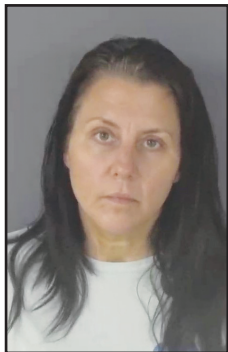
In the 35-page affidavit for an arrest report, FDLE investigator David Alexander, who originally investigated the thefts for CCSO, said six suspects were involved. Thompson was charged with violating the RICO Act because she had a "pattern of racketeering activity," and she conspired to solicit, coerce or intimidate others to commit the

crimes. Mary Lyn Corwin, 50, of Kingsland, was charged with four grand thefts, and Christopher Neal Coates, 41, of St. Marys, Georgia, was booked on five grand theft counts and two petit thefts on Feb. 27.

Brian Lee Wallace, 31, of Kingsland, was returned from the Camden County Jail to Clay County on Feb. 22 to face eight counts of grand theft and one for petit theft.

According to the affidavit, Bryant and Thompson recruited Corwin, Coats and Wallace to participate in the stealing sprees. Alexander said the group is accused of stealing from stores in Clay, Columbia, Duval, Volusia, Alachua, Flagler, St. Johns and Nassau counties in 2022 between April 18 and Dec. 13.

Thompson and Bryant were identified as suspects in a \$772.82 theft on May 31, 2022, from the Home Depot on Wells Road and a \$1,186 theft from the Home Depot on Fleming Island. On June 17, Thompson and Bryant are accused of returning to the Wells Road Store and taking \$906.39 worth of merchandise. The couple is also suspected of a \$1,740.42 theft on July 21, 2022, at the Home Depot on Branan Field Road in Middleburg, at the Wells Road store on July 24 for \$1,443.23 and the Home Depot on Fleming Island for 1,031.78 on July 25.

Thompson and Corwin are accused of a \$776.19 theft on Sept. 30, 2022, at the Fleming Island Home Depot and Thompson and Coates were suspected of taking a total of \$2,327.66 of merchandise on Dec. 12, 2022, in two incidents at the Fleming Island Home Depot.

The affidavit said the group often acted like they were paying at self-checkout lines without using legitimate forms of payment. Alexander wrote that the thieves sold the stolen items to prearranged buyers who provided a list of what they wanted or sold the merchandise on Facebook. A search of Facebook Messenger data revealed the items generally sold for less than half of their retail value.

Bryant told investigators he researched Home Depot policies and learned store employees aren't allowed to intervene once the merchandise passes through the doors.

Bryant's bond was set at \$535,164. Thompson's bond was \$250,003, while Corwin's is \$35,012 and Coates' is \$60,019.

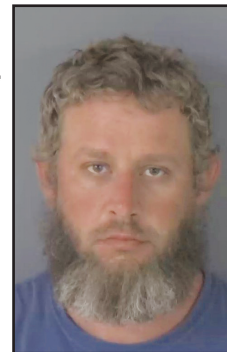

## Jailed man brought back to Clay County to face child porn charges

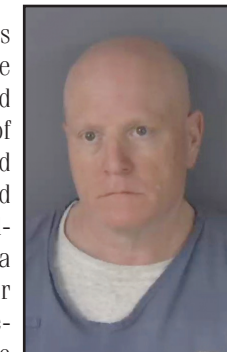

County with eight counts of having child porn on his phone and with three counts of felony aggravated battery and one count of having child porn on Dec. 15, 2022, in Duval County.

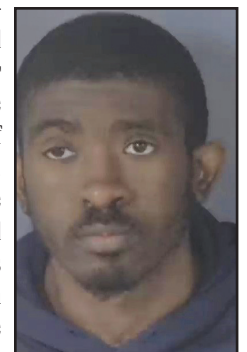
Clark will be in court on April 1 to face the Clay County charges. Until then, his bond is \$525,018.

## Orange Park man gets 5½ years for weapon, distributing cocaine, fentanyl

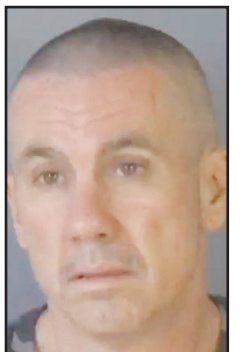
JACKSONVILLE – U.S. District Judge Marcia Morales Howard sentenced Lemuel Henry Crowder, 53, of Orange Park, to five years and six months in federal prison for possession with the intent to distribute

fentanyl and cocaine and possession of a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime. Crowder entered his guilty plea on Oct. 20.

According to court documents, on Feb. 26, 2023, deputies with the Clay County Sheriff's Office stopped a vehicle driven by Crowder for a traffic violation.

During the traffic stop, a law enforcement canine alerted deputies of the presence of narcotics in the vehicle. Deputies searched Crowder's vehicle and found more than 20 grams of fentanyl, more than 30 grams of cocaine and a loaded firearm.

CCSO and the Drug Enforcement Administration investigated the case. Assistant U.S. Attorney Aakash Singh prosecuted it.

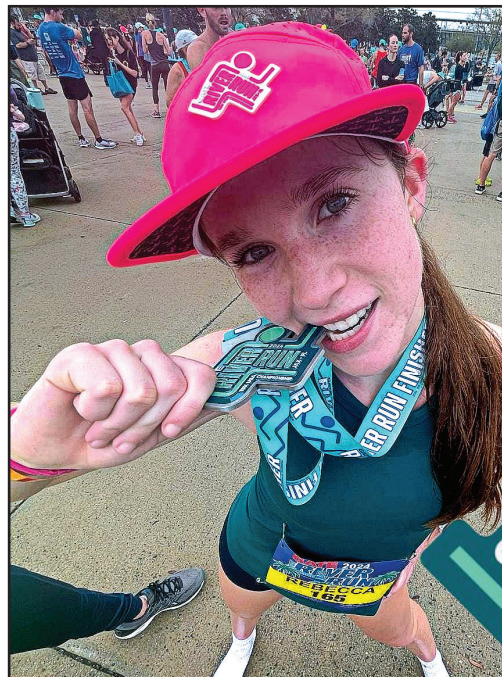

Reape lamented that his four guys just weren't enough to take on Fleming Island's depth.

"We wanted to take six or seven to compete, but only got four to go," said Reape. "You have to have numbers to finish in the top five."

FLEMING ISLAND - With a touchdown strike from quarterback Devyn Dudones to soccer ace Emily Poucher, the Fleming Island flag football team stayed unbeaten with a 13-6 win at Forest High in Ocala of Friday. The day before, the Eagles trounced Ridgeview 46-0 with 27-0 half-time lead highlighted by a 58 yard scoring run from London Jenkins. Fleming Island improves to 5-0 for the season while Ridgeview falls to 1-4.

Forest, 2-2, scored first on a pass play to go up 6-0, but the Fleming Island offense moved efficiently behind Dudones and took a 7-6 lead in the second quarter with Jenkins scampering from three yards out to pay dirt and Jenkins hitting Poucher for the PAT point.

On their own five, linebacker Gabi Musa broke up a pass attempt by Forest with four seconds with Jenkins intercepted the next pass on the goal line to end the game. Musa finished with 15 tackles and two pass breakups while rushing for 35 yards and catching five passes.

Against Ridgeview, Dudones was sharp with 130 yards in the air with two scoring strikes with a 20 yard touchdown run. Jenkins accounted for 135 all purpose yards with two rush scores, one via air and one via interception from 24 yards out. Jenkins also toss one touchdown pass and had two extra points. 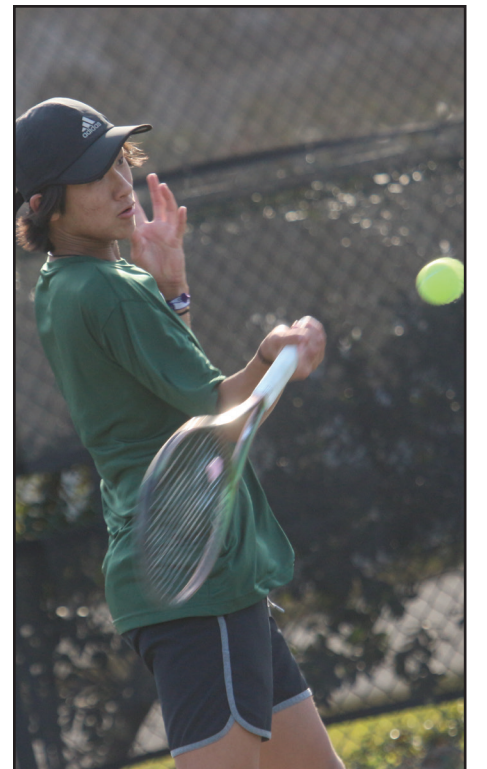
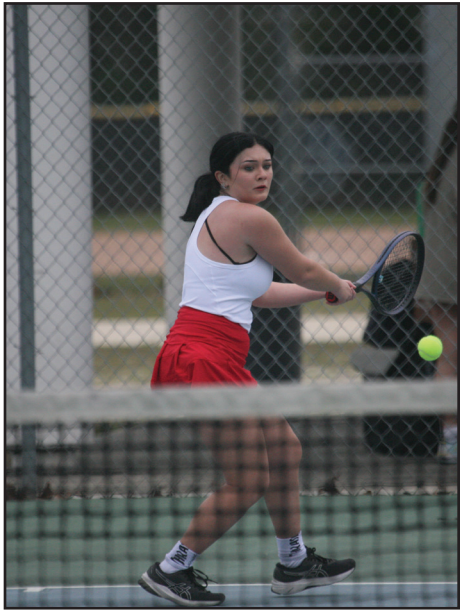

# Broncos, Knights, Spartans putting pins on the map

KISSIMMEE - Three of Clay County's freshest programs in recent wrestling history; Middleburg, Oakleaf and St. Johns Country Day School, earned some street cred for their programs with the trio earning a handful of medals with a slew of top eight finishers in the Class 2A wrestling championships for the Broncos and the Knights, and for Class 1A for the Spartans.

"We keep getting a little bit better each year and with more guys going to state and performing well and our girl's team having a two-time state champion, the interest level is increasing each season," said Middleburg coach Coll Robertson, who traveled with five wrestlers; Gavin Fisher, Nathan

Harvey, Grady Woodard, Wyatt Leduc and Tucker Cody and came home with a third place to Cody, fourths to Fisher and Leduc and a seventh to Woodard, plus the Cheyenne Cruce gold medal for the girls at 190. "If we keep getting one or two more people in the rooms, we keep growing. That's the plan."

For Oakleaf coach Mark Detoro, who also had five wrestlers, got a third-place finish from sophomore Sebastian Bonachea, but plenty of mat time for the rest of his young team; Connor Barnes at 106 (1-2), Micah Thomas at 132 (1-2), Keon Barrientos at 144 (1-2) and Jerimiah Baker at 165 (1-2). For the Spartans, in their first year with wrestling under former Clay coach Hunter Hill, two wrestlers; Kevin

Middleburg High senior 215 pounder Tucker Cody came in with just one loss; to unbeaten Jordan Mills of Matanzas at 190, lost his second match, but toughed out five matches to bring home a bronze medal finish.

"She was trying to stay away to just end the match at 1-0 and I kept pressing with my coaches yelling you gotta go," said Cruce. "The ref hit her for another stall and I got the tie point with just eight seconds to go."

In the first overtime, with Cruce seemingly energized by one more opportunity

to snare her second gold, the crafty Cruce got Jones' head down and intended on combining with a leg for a takedown when she found both Jones feet near each other and grabbed both for the double takedown and the overtime win.

"I was kind of shocked because once I got control of the second ankle, the ref called the match and it was kind of fast," said Cruce. "I thought, Oh my God, I did it. I was a little delayed in reacting because it was such a great match and I think she just made a mental error. She didn't sprawl when I went after her which kind of surprised me."

Cruce said her first thought was to find her mom in the stands, but she was already at the edge of the arena waiting for her.

"My support, her support is the best part of me wrestling," she said. "My broth-

er Austin congratulated me and my dad smiled, but mom was pretty emotional and it felt good."

For the rest of the area girl wrestlers, the weekend got quick exits from Cruce teammates Sarah Walsh (0-2 at 120), Memphis Moses (0-2 at 115) and Skylar Fisher (1-2 at 105).

"Sarah and Memphis were in fourth place at regions and both got the top seeds early," said Robertson. "Skylar got hurt in her second match and we think she injured a knee."

Oakleaf's Kailani Barrientos, the top seed before the state meet, lost in her semifinal by eventual runner up Emma Hoppe of Viera, battled back with a pin in the consolation semifinals then won a 7-1 decision over Miami Palmetto's Eysis Brinson to finish third at 135.

"He's a tough kid, but the Jesuit guy did some things that we had not seen on film and maybe caught us off guard," said Reape. "That being said, Jacob's return to this level after missing most of the first half of the season is a testament to his focus on the prize."

The third Class 2A finalist, Fleming Island's Kaden Schaefer at 150, was focused on his region title to match up with two-time defending state champion Draven McCall, 27-2, with Schaefer unbeaten to the final at 44-0.

Both Schaefer and McCall had dominant paths to the final with Schaefer teaching his first match, 18-1, then hitting two first-period pins. McCall, a two-time defending state champion and a fourth-place Fargo All-American, pinned his first two, then won a tough 4-3 match in his semifinal over Brandon's Thomas Gernhart who was unbeaten and twice a state medalist; fourth as a freshman.

Fleming Island put seven wrestlers on the floor at the state meet with Matthew Newman getting seventh at 113, Jordan Mukaddam finishing fourth at 120, Dylan Beck at 157 (0-2), Christopher Chop finishing fourth at 175 and Kevin Reyes at 285 (1-2).

JACKSONVILLE - With the top three men's finishers clocking last miles as fast as four minutes, 15 seconds, 4:13 and 4:11, for the men and 4:42, 4:51 and 4:55 for the women, the 2024 Gate River Run 15K American championship race got some welcomed dry weather and fast times as nearly 14,000 runners traversed the Jacksonville 9.3 mile race on Saturday.

Up front among the elite racers vying for prize money and an American title, Teshome Mekonen and USA Olympic steeple chaser and 2023 Gate River Run 15K champion Hillary Bor battled over the infamous Hart Bridge with Mekonen with a 4:11 final mile to win by just four seconds in 42:50 with Bor, despite a 4:11 final mile, unable to answer Mekonen's earlier push after both exited the Hart Bridge and hit a flat spot to the finish line. 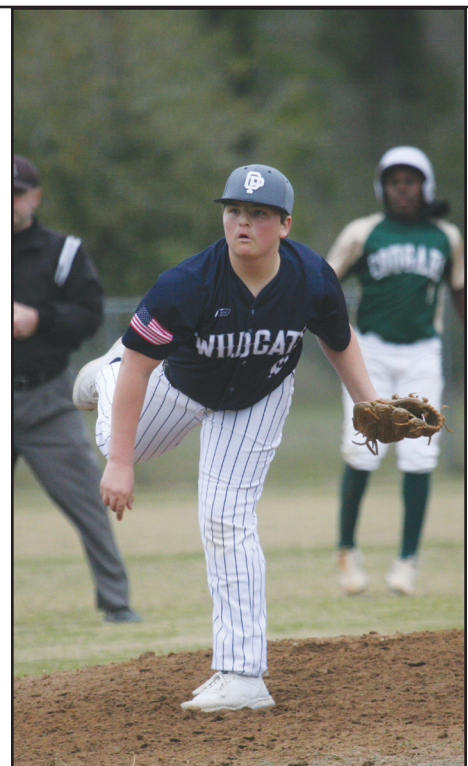
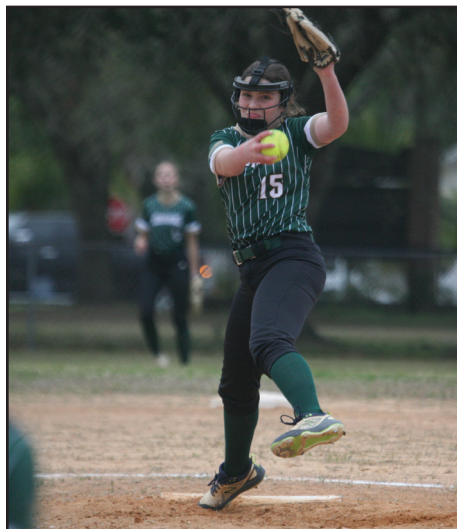

The infrastructure improvements are currently expected to include, but are not limited to, roadway improvements, stormwater management, potable water, reclaimed water and sewer utilities, underground electrical conduit, hardscape, landscape, irrigation fencing and signage improvements, amenity facilities and parks, and other infrastructure ("Improvements"), all as more specifically described in the Capital Improvement Plan, on file and available during normal business hours at the District Manager's Office. According to the Capital Improvement Plan, the estimated cost of the Improvements is \$91,895,349.

The District intends to impose assessments on benefited lands in the manner set forth in the District's *Amended and Restated Master Special Assessment Methodology Report*, dated February 20, 2024 ("Assessment Report"), which is on file and available during normal business hours at the District Manager's Office.

The purpose of any such assessment is to secure the bonds issued to fund the Improvements. As described in more detail in the Assessment Report, the District's assessments will be levied against respective benefited lands within the District. The Assessment Report identifies maximum assessment amounts for each assessment area and land use category that is currently expected to be assessed. The lien for assessments is proposed to be allocated on an equal assessment per acre basis, and will be levied on an equivalent residential unit ("ERU") basis at the time that such property is platted or subject to a site plan or sold.

The annual principal assessment levied against each parcel will be based on repayment over thirty (30) years of the total debt allocated to each parcel. The District expects to assess and collect sufficient revenues to retire no more than \$126,030,000 in debt, exclusive of fees and costs of collection or enforcement, discounts for early payment and interest. The proposed annual schedule of assessments is as follows:

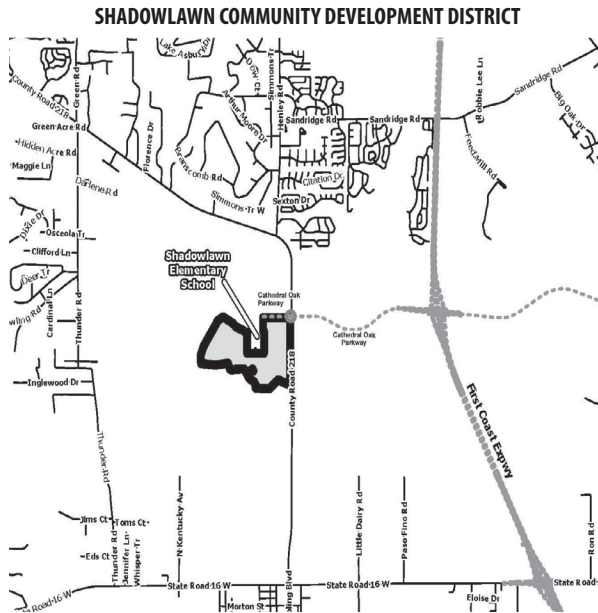
The assessments may be prepaid in whole at any time, or in some instances in part, or may be paid in not more than thirty (30) annual installments subsequent to the issuance of debt to finance the improvements. These annual assessments will be collected on the Clay County tax roll by the Tax Collector. Alternatively, the District may choose to directly collect and enforce these assessments. All affected property owners have the right to appear at the public hearings and the right to file written objections with the District within twenty (20) days of the publication of this notice.

Also, on **March 26, 2024 at 2:00 P.M.**, at **Reinhold Corporation, 1845 Town Center Blvd., Suite 105, Fleming Island, Florida 32003**, the Board will hold a regular public meeting to consider any other business that may lawfully be considered by the District. The Board meeting and hearings are open to the public and will be conducted in accordance with the provisions of Florida law for special districts. The Board meeting and/or the public hearings may be continued in progress to a certain date and time announced at such meeting and/or hearings.

If anyone chooses to appeal any decision of the Board with respect to any matter considered at the meeting or hearings, such person will need a record of the proceedings and should accordingly ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which includes the testimony and evidence upon which such appeal is to be based.

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the Shadowlawn Community Development District (the "District") hereby determines to undertake, install, plan, establish, construct or reconstruct, enlarge or extend, equip, acquire, operate, and/or maintain the infrastructure improvements (the "Improvements") described in the District's *Capital Improvement Plan*, updated February 20, 2024, attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated herein by reference; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interest of the District to pay the cost of the Improvements by special assessments pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes (the "Assessments"); and

**WHEREAS**, the District is empowered by Chapter 190, the Uniform Community Development District Act, Chapter 170, Supplemental and Alternative Method of Making Local Municipal Improvements, and Chapter 197, the Uniform Method for the Levy, Collection and Enforcement of Non-Ad Valorem Assessments, Florida Statutes, to finance, fund, plan, establish, acquire, construct or reconstruct, enlarge or extend, equip, operate, and maintain the Improvements and to impose, levy and collect the Assessments; and

**WHEREAS**, the District hereby determines that benefits will accrue to the property improved, the amount of those benefits, and that special assessments will be made in proportion to the benefits received as set forth in the *Amended and Restated Master Special Assessment Methodology Report*, dated February 20, 2024, attached hereto as **Exhibit B** and incorporated herein by reference and on file at 2300 Glades Road, Suite 410W, Boca Raton, Florida 33431 (the "District Records Office"); and

**WHEREAS**, the District hereby determines that the Assessments to be levied will not exceed the benefit to the property improved.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE SHADOWLAWN COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:**

- Assessments shall be levied to defray a portion of the cost of the Improvements.
- The nature and general location of, and plans and specifications for, the Improvements are described in **Exhibit A**, which is on file at the District Records Office. **Exhibit B** is also on file and available for public inspection at the same location.
- The total estimated cost of the Improvements is \$91,895,349 (the "Estimated Cost").
- The Assessments will defray approximately \$126,030,000, which amounts include the Estimated Costs, plus financing-related costs, capitalized interest and a debt service reserve.
- The manner in which the Assessments shall be apportioned and paid is set forth in **Exhibit B**, including provisions for supplemental assessment resolutions.
- The Assessments shall be levied, within the District, on all lots and lands adjoining and contiguous or bounding and abutting upon the Improvements or specially benefitted thereby and further designated by the assessment plat hereinafter provided for.
- There is on file, at the District Records Office, an assessment plat showing the area to be assessed, with certain plans and specifications describing the Improvements and the estimated cost of the Improvements, all of which shall be open to inspection by the public.
- Commencing with the year in which the Assessments are levied and confirmed, the Assessments shall be paid in not more than (30) thirty annual installments. The Assessments may be payable at the same time and in the same manner as are ad-valorem taxes and collected pursuant to Chapter 197, Florida Statutes; provided, however, that in the event the uniform non ad-valorem assessment method of collecting the Assessments is not available to the District in any year, or if determined by the District to be in its best interest, the Assessments may be collected as is otherwise permitted by law.
- The District Manager has caused to be made a preliminary assessment roll, in accordance with the method of assessment described in **Exhibit B** hereto, which shows the lots and lands assessed, the amount of benefit to and the assessment against each lot or parcel of land and the number of annual installments into which the assessment may be divided, which assessment roll is hereby adopted and approved as the District's preliminary assessment roll.
- The Board shall adopt a subsequent resolution to fix a time and place at which the owners of property to be assessed or any other persons interested therein may appear before the Board and be heard as to the propriety and advisability of the assessments or the making of the Improvements, the cost thereof, the manner of payment therefore, or the amount thereof to be assessed against each property as improved.

11. The District Manager is hereby directed to cause this Resolution to be published twice (once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks) in a newspaper of general circulation within Clay County and to provide such other notice as may be required by law or desired in the best interests of the District.

12. Previously adopted assessment resolutions including Resolutions 2023-01, 2023-02, 2023-06, and 2023-07 regarding the imposition of special assessment, setting a public hearing thereon and levy of special assessment, are rescinded in their entirety

13. This Resolution shall become effective upon its passage.

The FY 2021-2025 Consolidated Plan and the FY 2023-2024

Annual Action Plan have been revised to include this additional funding amount under the Public Infrastructure project, which includes street improvements and sidewalks. The Citizen Participation Plan has been revised to identify a change in the point of contact from the Planning and Zoning Director to Community and Social Services. These Plans will be available for 30-day public review and comment period and one public hearing will be held during the Board of County Commissioners meeting on Tuesday, March 26, 2024, as set forth below.

**FY 2021-2025 Consolidated Plan:** The Consolidated Plan identifies priority needs related to affordable housing, homelessness, public services, special needs populations, public facilities and infrastructure and economic development based on a local market analysis, needs assessments, and public input via the citizen participation process. The Consolidated Plan sets forth a strategic plan with goals and objectives for the use of funds received by the County through applicable HUD Community Planning and Development Programs through September 2026. The objectives of the strategic plan are as follows:

- Affordable Rental Housing – increase the supply of affordable rental housing
- Affordable Homeownership – Support affordable homeownership
- Homeless Assistance – assist persons who are homeless or at risk of homelessness
- Non-Homeless Special Needs- assist persons with special needs services or housing
- Non-Housing Community Development Needs

o Public facilities and infrastructure Improvements  
o Public Services – support services that will address identified needs  
o Special Needs Housing and Services  
o Code Enforcement – support municipal code enforcement activities  
o Demolition and Clearance – demolish unsafe and dilapidated structures
