## Improvements at Tax Collector's Office saving money for residents

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The first thing you notice in Diane Hutchings' office is her desk, bookcase and conference table. All are regal in both size and influence, each masterfully crafted from wood to command a higher sense of attention.

But they were done on the cheap.

The one thing Hutchings hates most is spending money – especially other people's money.

The conference table was found in a closet at the Tax Collector's Office. Instead of buying a new one, she had it refinished. The desk and bookcase were purchased on

Craig's List for pennies on the dollar.

"We're always working on ways to save time and money," Hutchings said. "That way, we can be more efficient, especially as our county grows."

Hutchings was elected in 2020 and immediately moved to automate the office. Clerks got second computer screens, so they didn't have to constantly close one program to move to another. The office added a no-fee service to accept checks online and a tag renewal kiosk at the Publix Super Market at the Village Shopping Center in Orange Park.

# Commissioner Kiristen Burke answers angry voicemail about Sandridge Road

'I hope something becomes of this'

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The construction along Sandridge Road has been a continuous concern for Clay County residents ever since renovations began last year. Some of the concerns included possible delays, detours and the traffic dilemmas.

Thousands were inconvenienced when the road was closed for nearly two months last summer.

Progress has been slow and steady but consistent as the county works to expand two lanes into three, to add gutters and to pave bike lanes.

Commissioner Kristen Burke is no newcomer to angry calls, text or emails, but there was one voicemail she wanted to share with the other commissioners and families watching back home.

"I know we don't usually do this," Burke said during last Tuesday's Board of County Commissioners Meeting.

"I'd really like to address the citizens in our area. People are getting angry. Sandridge Road is not fun. We all know. We're all going through a lot in that area," Burke said.

From there, Burke pulled out a cellular device and placed it up to the microphone. Apparently, it was a voicemail left by a

constituent in her district who was critical of the state of Sandridge Road.

This is a transcription of the voicemail recording:

"Clay County deserves better than what you've allowed them, this company y'all contracted, to come over here to do the Sandridge Road. This road is a total joke. I'm sure you've had hundreds and hundreds of phone calls about the shape that it's in. You should be ashamed of yourself because you live in Clay County, and you should want better for all of us who live

here and pay taxes. I hope something becomes of this."

Burke appeared to have a serious expression as she held the phone over the microphone and then set it down on the desk when it was finished.

"I am ashamed," Burke said. "I am ashamed of people like you that talk about the hardworking people that are in our county right now working to make our lives better. It is not fun to have to go through what we're doing. And I live right there. I am a commissioner in that district," Burke said.

"It's going to be nice when it's done. Yes, I understand it's horrible right now. But that road was built on top of sand. My husband said that's why it's called 'Sandridge.'"

She said the drainage system was essentially constructed from scratch.

"It doesn't help at all for this anger to come out, threatening workers out there, threatening the flaggers. Come on. We're better than this."

Despite the criticism, Burke remains hopeful for the road's completion and the county's trajectory as it manages its growth.

"Let's work together and get through this. In a couple of years, we're going to look back and we're going to say, 'Yeah it was hard, but thank God we did it.'"

## Green Cove Springs City Council advance water projects

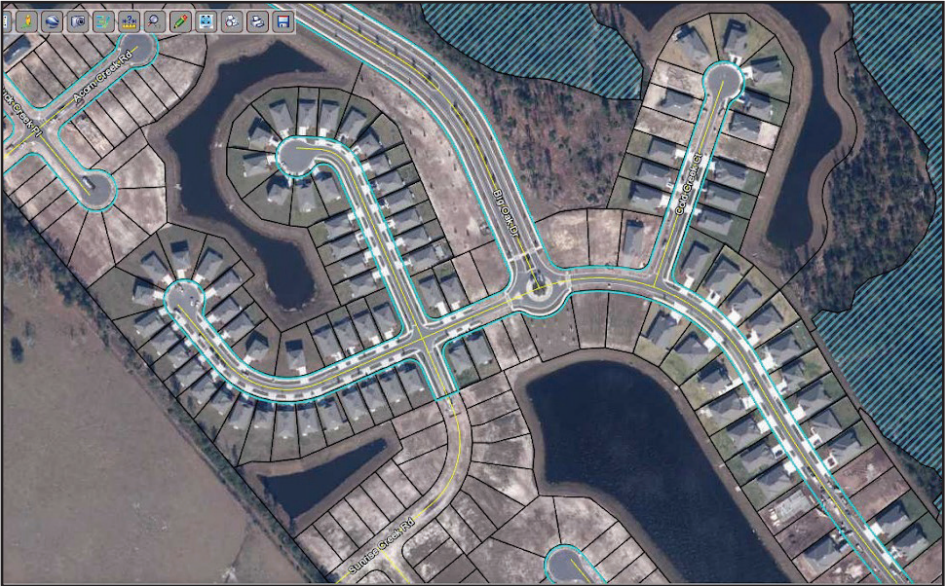
GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The City Council approved cleaning of 2,000 feet of stormwater pipe in the Cove subdivision and executing a loan agreement for the design and permitting of the Magnolia Point Reclaimed Water System and Reynolds Water Treatment Plant Improvements as part of the consent agenda of the March 12 Regular Session.

Cove subdivision stormwater pipe cleaning is part of the up to \$8.5 million in stormwater improvements the City Council approved on Dec. 19. The cost of the cleaning is \$29,952, after which Public Works staff can look at the current condition of the stormwater pipes and determine more permanent repairs to the subdivision's pipes. The cost of the design and permit-

ting of the Magnolia Point Reclaimed Water System and Reynolds Water Treatment Plant Improvements is part of one loan from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection Drinking Water State Revolving Fund of \$2.9 million.

Under the Public Hearings portion of the agenda, City Council approved the second and final reading of both authorizing Magnolia West Community Development District to use security facilities within their subdivision and to comply with newly enacted Section 166.041(4) of Florida Statutes, requiring a Business Impact Estimate to be prepared and filed on all non-exempt ordinances.

That means city staff must complete a business impact estimate before advertising an applicable ordinance to the City

Council. Both passed, 5-0, with Council Members Ed Gaw and Matt Johnson participating virtually.

The next meeting is on March 26.

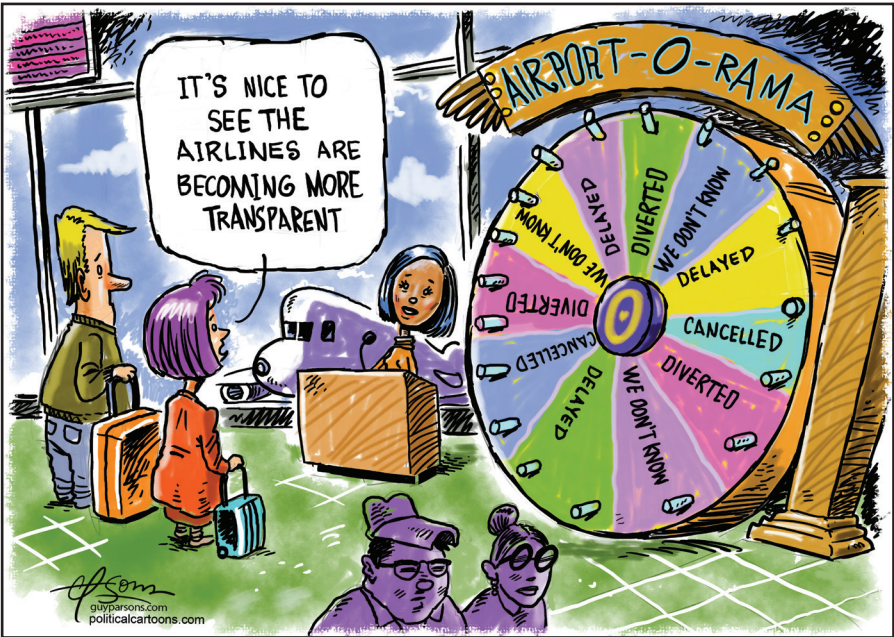

Here are some practical tips from the AAP that you can use to tackle issues with in your control:

- Learn about good nutrition. Visit MyPlate.gov for great ways to take a team approach to planning and making meals so kids can actively participate in their eating. The site considers cultural traditions, giving examples of healthy meals with familiar foods.
- Reach for water. Sugary drinks, such as 100% fruit juice, sodas, sports drinks and fruit drinks, account for 24% of added sugar intake in the U.S. diet in people one year and older. Consumption contributes significantly to an increased risk of cardiovascular disease, childhood obesity, type 2 diabetes and other health risks, according to USDA statistics. Ideally, aim for one sugary drink or fewer a week. Bonus: drinking water cleanses teeth and gums and prevents cavities now while setting the stage for lifelong dental health.
- Limit ultra-processed foods. Avoiding ultra-processed foods altogether may not be realistic, but try to limit their access and help children and adolescents learn the benefits of eating whole foods like fruits and vegetables. You can also talk with them about the health risks of too much “junk food,” which is generally loaded with sugar and salt, doesn’t increase feelings of fullness, and prompts overeating.
- Adopt a family media plan. Everyone benefits from sensible screen time limits

## Five years ago, 2019

- Town attorney Sam Garrison said Orange Park could not ban AirBnB and other short-term rental properties. He said the town can charge a business tax on those property owners, however.
- Sheriff Darryl Daniels pulled his proposal to keep Clay County Sheriff’s Office deputies in public schools from the Board of County Commissioners. Subsequently, the county and the school district moved forward to create the CCDS Police Department, which would serve public schools for five years.
- Responding to the recent closure of the Country Club of Orange Park’s golf course, tennis courts and other amenities, Clay County commissioners declined to purchase the club’s amenities and incorporate them into the county’s park system.

## 10 years ago, 2014

- The Green Cove Springs City Council approves mail-in ballots for amendments to the city charter, but not for elected officials.
- Orange Park businessman Eugene Nix defeated incumbent Marge Hutton, 458-332, in their election for Seat 2 on the town council.
- Orange Park Medical Center opened a new two-story, 7,000-square-foot atrium lobby, which included a new gift shop, large chapel, additional classrooms and a sandwich and coffee kiosk, as part of its 40th anniversary celebration.

## 20 years ago, 2004

light intersection.

The Green Cove Springs Police Department, which has five cameras, posted a video on its social media page showing a pickup truck running the light at U.S. Highway 17 and State Road 16. The driver claimed if he stopped, he would have been rear-ended. The video showed the light was already red when he approached the interception at 48 mph – 13 mph faster than the speed limit – with no trailing traffic.

Speeding and running red lights frequently go hand in hand.

GCSPD said every red-light camera violation is reviewed before it is submitted for a violation.

that make room for healthy activities. Engage kids in creating a plan for the whole family.

- Move more. Getting up and moving more can be challenging, but when you prioritize it, kids benefit. Organized sports aren't the only option. opening of Moccasin Slough Park, a 255-acre tract off U.S. Highway 17 on Fleming Island that includes two nature trails, a covered pavilion and picnic area. The site was transferred to Clay County after being purchased by the Trust for Public Land.

- Rick Beseler, a retired investigator for the Clay County office of the State Attorney's Office, announced he was running for Clay County Sheriff. He would win the election and then two subsequent reelections.

## 30 years ago, 1994

- Orange Park Town Council voted 3-2 to spend \$979,000 on its new town hall building. It awarded the bid to the Devcon Group Inc., which estimated it would take 270 days to complete construction.
- Clay County Sheriff Scott Lancaster warned residents to avoid a phony telephone solicitation campaign by people saying they were seeking donations on behalf of the CCSO, the Police Benevolent Association and the Fraternal Order of Police.

In 2011, Green Cove Springs issued 263 red-light camera tickets. Of those, 22 were dismissed, and 63 were found not guilty. In most cases, the winning defense was tickets were issued to car owners, not the actual drivers. However, none of the defendants argued the car didn't run the red light.

The other 166 drivers paid their fines that year.

Since adding cameras in fiscal year 2010-2011, Green Cove has collected almost \$4 million in fines, which doesn't count for the time for law enforcement to monitor the process. Perhaps the residents who oppose the cameras should argue taxes should be increased by that much to pay for additional police officers to patrol the streets instead of relying on cameras.

- Lean on support. Not all neighborhoods have safe places for children to play and walk to school or offer nutritious and affordable food nearby. Additionally, factors like racism, toxic stress, housing or food insecurity and safety risks can impact your child's health. Creating a safe home environment and leaning on the support of schools, health care systems and the wider community can create a healthier life for your child. One important resource is your pediatrician. Talk to them about ways to support your child's active, healthy lifestyle.

- "Remember that feeling loved, seen and appreciated is just as central to your child's health as nutrition and exercise. The brain and the body are one system – so when kids feel safe and secure, their bodies function well," said Dr. Muth.

## 40 years ago, 1984

- The Florida Striders received a proclamation from Orange Park Mayor George Kent and Dorothea Heinrich as the Doctors Lake Bike Path's name was officially changed to honor Heinrich's late husband, Edwin P. Heinrich.
- Voters turned down a \$25 million bond issue referendum that would have funded two new schools and funding for repairs at existing schools. Officials said 4,686 voters said yes, while 6,534 voters rejected the proposal.

## 50 years ago, 1974

- Members of the Clay County League of Civic Associations urged the Board of County Commissioners to appoint a steering committee to organize the county's first Clay County Planning Board.
- Dave Mattox of Green Cove Springs shot and killed a nutria, a South American rodent resembling the beaver, while out boating on the St. Johns River near the Shands bridge.

There are three red-light cameras in Orange Park.

Orange Park resident David Coughlin received a \$262 red-light camera citation in 2013 for running a red light at U.S. 17 Highway and Loring Avenue in Orange Park and \$262 for running a red light at SR 17 and Ferris Street in 2015. The case in Orange Park was eventually dismissed, but he was found guilty of the Green Cove Springs infraction.

Coughlin adamantly opposes the use of cameras, once telling the Orange Park Town Council, "We expect law enforcement officers to attest in court to the full hemisphere of events and audio as well as make proper identification of the motorist; however, we do not require this of our red light regime."

Here's a different approach that hasn't been discussed:

# School Police Chief Wagner to return to sheriff's office

CLAY COUNTY – After serving as the Clay County District Schools Chief of Police for nearly five years, Kenneth Wagner will return to the Clay County Sheriff's Office.

It would be easy to assume Wagner, the first and final CCDS Chief of Police, looks upon the beginning of the end of his police department with a twinge of melancholy. Instead, he is focused on recollection and pride.

"I am demoted," he said. "I am not upset."

Wagner said he's excited to return to CCSO.

"It is actually a great opportunity for me to return to where I originally started my career. We have a great sheriff. I will provide my knowledge regarding legal requirements to the sheriff's office as the transition moves forward in the right direction," he said.

He said he would be a deputy until he retired and earned his pension. Following retirement, he wants to be a bus driver. He foresees he will always have a passion for children and their safety.

Wagner reflected on "driving" the CCDS Police Department's formation. After being hired in 2019, Wagner said he had five months to purchase 45 cars and hire 48



law enforcement officers.

For context, every school in Florida was required to have a School Resource Office on a long-term basis following the 2018 shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High when 19-year-old Nikolas Cruz killed 17 students and three staff members.

In 2019, the school board voted 4-1 to stop paying CCSO for policing its schools. Sheriff Darryl Daniels told the Board of County Commission he needed to charge the school district \$4.5 million to hire, equip and pay for 36 deputies, six relief deputies, four sergeants, one investigator and one training investigator to protect 42

county schools in 2019. The Green Cove Springs and Orange Park police departments have officers in schools within town limits. The current budget for the CCDS Police Department is \$4.8 million for 45 schools. The school board decided to rehire the sheriff's office on April 27 this year. This decision came after School Environment Safety Incident Reporting data was erroneously sent to the Florida Department of Education.

Additionally, some board members and parents were concerned about a possible conflict of interest, as the CCDS Police Department reports directly to the superintendent. Some were worried the school district could have a vested interest in minimizing incident reports.

Board member Beth Clark the situation could be "dangerous" when the police chief reports to the school district. Because the district controls the officers on campus, it also controls the data and optics, Clark said. For School Board Member Erin Skipper, this was about delivering on a campaign promise she was elected to fulfill. During the school board meeting in November, she made the motion to begin negotiations with CCSO. Skipper said her decision on the dais was spurred by CCDS Police's underreporting, lack of transparency and chain of command issues.

"This was a move that was best for the schools and for keeping our students safe," she said. "We are in the business of education. Not law enforcement."

Wagner said the biggest challenge of CCDS Police was fighting misinformation and unsavory perceptions. CCDS police officers were unfairly compared to "mall cops."

Wagner admitted some SESIR data during the 2021-2022 school year was inadvertently incorrect.

"If there is an incident on campus, there is a separate SESIR and crime report. SESIR data is sent to the Florida Department of Education. Crime reports are sent to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement," Wagner explained.

Wagner acknowledges the misinputs for that school year but contends that CCDS Police has always submitted crime reports correctly. He denies that his department underreported incidents.

"It has been a great experience to serve. I will still be there in a supportive capacity," he said.

Sheriff Michelle Cook said members of the school police department have the opportunity to move into CCSO. Her agency will work with school administrators to keep most in their current schools to maintain continuity.

fun in the sun,” said Edwards.

Thanks to the help of the students and dozens of volunteers who have been coming out for months, Edwards hopes to receive a certificate of occupancy sometime next month.

“The families are anxious to be moving in here,” Edwards said.

“They’ll have an opportunity to thrive. They’ll have an affordable mortgage that will not exceed 30% of their income.”

The program is called “Alternative Spring Break.” It’s an opportunity for students to gain practical skills while also giving back to communities. More than 10,000 high school and college students participate in alternative spring breaks with Habitat for Humanity each year. Many participate through Habitat’s Collegiate Challenge program, a year-round alternative break program that offers students 18 and older the opportunity to spend one week working in partnership with a local Habitat and future homeowner families, according to its website.

“By adding the second screen, we sometimes reduced the amount of time they were on the phone by an hour, and we kept them from making repetitive keystrokes,” she said. “Before, it was just one monitor. They had to close the window, open a window, close a window, close a window. Now they just go.”

The main office at the County Administration Building offers a unique service for residents who have difficulty speaking English.

“We have a device called Pocketalk that we can use to set up a language and ask someone what they need, and it will ask them in their language,” Hutchings said. “When they respond, the answer is given back in English. It’s important for someone to feel comfortable. There’s no confusion. It saves time and eliminates mistakes.”

Hutchings likened the software to “Blockbuster Video” when she took over. The new software was expensive up front, but she said the time saved on the backside far offset the investment. She found that other Florida tax offices had saved “millions” over time with the new software, so she bought it.

“It was a no-brainer,” she said, “especially when you eliminate keystrokes and save hours of time.”

The Green Cove Springs office also uses a machine that opens, separates and catalogs checks for deposits. What used to take a half day now takes less than an hour.

After all, time is money.

The offices in Orange Park and Keystone Heights are in transition, too. Hutchings said the Park Central Plaza office will soon be relocated to the Challenge Enterprises Plaza at 500 Kingsley Ave.

“When ACE Hardware opened on Park Avenue, parking can be a little difficult at times,” Hutchings said. “There’s plenty of parking at Challenge, and it’s helping a great organization.”

Rent is also cheaper there.

The Keystone Heights office will soon move from Keystone Village Square on State Road 100 to the Clay County Health Department on Commercial Drive, where the rent is free since the county owns the building.

The Middleburg location has already been moved from Bear Run to the Grande Olde Plaza near the intersection of State Road 21 and County Road 218 to accommodate additional services and residents.

Last year, more than 100,000 residents visited one of the four offices for a transaction, including property taxes, driver’s,

hunting and fishing licenses, motor vehicle registrations, birth certificates and concealed weapon permits. The offices accepted appointments, but walk-ins generally are in and out in less than 30 minutes.

Most of her staff are allowed to wear blue jeans on Friday because they participate in a CARES committee. They voluntarily donate \$4 a month to a fund that’s used to pay for flowers when someone is sick or dies, or it’s used to pay for parties.

“We can’t use public money, so we build a little fund for things we need,” Hutchings said. “It creates an upbeat attitude. You’d

be surprised what a big deal it is to be able to wear blue jeans.”

Employees also select a nonprofit to highlight in the lobbies of their offices. Since June 2021, they’ve turned over more than \$31,000 to groups like the Quigley House, American Cancer Society’s Breast Cancer Research, Operation Barnabas, The Vineyard Transitional Center, Safe Animal Shelter, Wolfson’s Children’s Hospital and the Clay County Education Foundation.

“There’s a lot going on here,” Hutchings said.

All with a keen eye on the bottom line.

# Hammer and Hope at Green Cove Springs on March 20

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The Clay County Sheriff’s Department, Fire Rescue, and local community organizations will come together again with the spirit of hope on March 20 to deal with drug addiction in the area.

“I know that drugs and drug addicts many times just need a pathway out. So, using the sheriff platform, I have been able to pull community service providers from across the county together,” Sheriff Michelle Cook said.

The “Hammer” portion of the program is a promise to target the people who are peddling drugs in the county.

The “Hope” approach is designed to give addicts and their families a way out.

The next event will be at Vera Francis Park at 1503 Martin Luther King Blvd. from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. There will be more than 20 community service providers to support individuals struggling with drug addiction, along with their families and friends.

The program understands that addiction affects people from all walks of life, so it’s committed to offering a range of services to help those in need. It can offer resources from substance abuse counseling and mental health support to housing as-

sistance and job training. Take advantage of this amazing opportunity to start your journey toward recovery and a better life.

The program may not be able to solve all the problems in the world, but it can make a difference, one person at a time.

It all ties in with Florida’s Coordinated Opioid Recovery program, which expanded to Clay in Fall 2022. The initiative allows addicts to receive medically assisted treatment, as patients are transported to a medical facility equipped to deal with addictions after a trip to the hospital so that they can begin a clinical pathway to sobriety.

Tommy Ferretti, the founder of the sober living program, Foundations of Freedom, said he loves being at events that allow him to be utilized and on the front lines of solving the issue.

Cook said that she hopes to continue the Hammer and Hope initiative to build a healthy and safe community – all by holding people accountable and providing assistance for the ones that want it.

“If you’re dealing drugs in Clay County, we’re going to find you, and we’re going to arrest you. But, if you’re an addict and you want help, there is a pathway out, And we will help you find that path,” she said.



More than 20 community groups will offer resources to addicts and their families to help them deal with opioid addictions.

There were 630 drug-related arrests in Clay County last year, Cook said. Also, the conviction rate for drug charges has increased by nearly 15% to 85%, she said.

In addition to the sheriff’s office, Fire Rescue’s Paramedicine Unit will dispense Narcan kits and establish training sessions on its use. Since Hammer and Hope’s inception, more than 5,500 Narcan kits and Fire Rescue has trained more than 800 residents on how to respond to an opioid overdose. To request a Narcan kit or enroll in a group training class, visit [claycounty.gov/community/community-paramedicine-program](http://claycounty.gov/community/community-paramedicine-program) or email [community.paramedicine@claycountygov.com](mailto:community.paramedicine@claycountygov.com).

The number of deadly overdoses and the number of calls for service have been

cut in half since the program launched.

Cook said Hammer and Hope is a “safe space” to start the process of sobriety. Clay Behavioral Health Center, Impact Clay, Clay Action Coalition, The Way Free Medical Clinic, Clay County Tax Collector’s Office, Kids First of Florida, The Quigley House, Department of Health Clay, Mercy Auto, Florida Department of Children and Families, Operation Barnabas, Wolfson Children’s Hospital, River Christian Church’s Celebrate Recovery Program, First Baptist Middleburg, Supervisor of Elections Office and Groups Recover Together also will participate.

Other Hammer and Hope community events have been at Clay Hill, Keystone Heights, and Orange Park.

# ‘Mount Russell’: neighbors react to backyard development on Russell Road

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Rafael Hinojosa stepped out to his backyard through a line of trees and faced an earthen mound that was higher in elevation than the rest of his property. His property on Silver Creek Hills backs up to the eastern edge of the upcoming development. The earthen mound is just about eye level with him. It appears to be a foundation for a row of single-family homes that will be built for an upcoming housing development called Russell Retreat, which is being constructed on Russell Road.

“Russell Retreat? More like Mount Russell if anything.”

Hinojosa bought his home in 2004. He’s enjoyed the sounds of nature and the setting sun through the trees. With a row of homes planned to be built on a raised earthen foundation, Hinojosa doubts he will be able to see the sunset again. A nearby neighbor named Angela Palmer voiced her concerns. Palmer and her family have lived in their home for over 20 years.

“I wouldn’t mind the houses. But the mounds of dirt have been building and building four to five feet off the ground. They put up a plastic barrier, but sediment has flooded over and into my property,” Palmer said. There is a shallow drainage ditch between the properties, but the residents doubt it will be a sufficient buffer.

“The easement is going to get flooded. Our yards are going to get flooded,” Palmer said.

“Am I happy with it? Not really,” said another resident. “Animals have been displaced. When their dump trucks unload, they rattle the windows.”

According to the Clay County Property Appraiser’s Office, the property is 19.27 acres and will soon have 51 single-family homes.

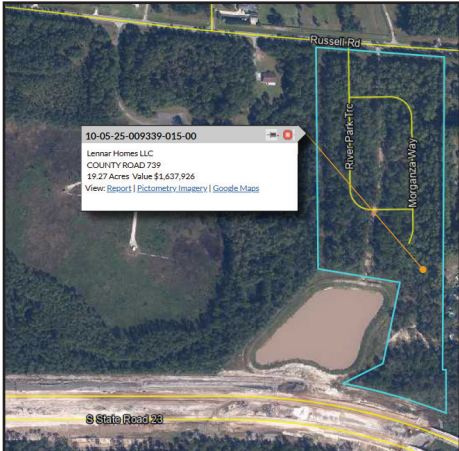
“In 2022, Sessions Development acquired, planned, entitled, and then sold this property to Lennar Homes. Residents of this community will enjoy close proximity to Fleming Island, the newly constructed First Coast Expressway, Clay County’s A-Rated school district, and quick access to various parks and recreation areas inside and outside the community,” according to Sessions Development. WAY Radio (550 AM), a Christian Teaching and Talk radio station, backs up to the western edge. A WAY Radio manager said he had no problems with the development next door, but he says the surrounding community might be in trouble.

“Russell Road is not ready for 5,000 new homes. On the one hand, I’m looking forward to the development, and our new neighbors and new ears for our radio station. But there are bad accidents on Russell Road. It’s not good.”

Usina Contracting declined to comment. Lennar could not be reached.

During last Tuesday’s Board of County Commissioners meeting, Hinojosa made one last petition before the dais.

“I am here again to continue the fight against the Lennar Corporation’s ‘Russell Retreat’ AKA ‘Russell Mountain.’ I’m here to put

a spotlight on the developer’s disregard to the way this will affect the adjacent community of Silver Creek Hills, the tranquility and peace we have enjoyed for twenty years,” Hinojosa said.

“The landscape has contorted and elevated five feet higher to accommodate a high-density development. (This) will create flooding issues and also add 150 cars to the already congested Russell Road corridor. (Also) a vertical wall of two-story houses, one after the other,” he said.

Commissioner Betsy Condon said the zoning was approved in 2005.

The plans for the development predate all of us on the Commission,” Condon said.

It appeared that the BCC’s hands were tied.

“I think you are right to work through engineering your concerns expressed at the last meeting and with your commissioner (Commissioner Kristen Burke), but otherwise, there is nothing the five of us (the BCC) can do to stop this. Staff can help you with drainage.”

Commissioner Kristen Burke met with Hinojosa after the meeting and appeared sympathetic. The next day, Hinojosa met with the assistant county manager to find a solution. He hopes to work out a compromise, an assurance for no more flooding onto his and his neighbor’s property.

“I am worried I am going to see a line of white picket fences at eye level,” Hinojosa said.

# Defining Keystone Height’s strategic plan now underway

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – Recreation is an integral part of the city’s culture. The sparkling lakes, sandy beaches and shady live oak trees beckoned the first residents to the area just about a century ago.

With the progress of the Black Creek Restoration Project moving along “swimmingly” and with the eager expectation that the water levels of the lakes will rise to high historic levels, city council has been working ahead to develop a “master plan” for Keystone Heights and for the 22 acres of parks within.

A proposal authored by Manzan Consulting for The Smart City Master Plan looked at ways to improve walkability through the city and the parks, implement technology when pertinent, and improve functionality and aesthetic character for recreational areas.

Some ideas included building a new government building, adding lights around the Moon Tree (an American Sycamore grown from a seed that traveled to the Moon on Apollo 14), growing native flowering plants in the butterfly garden, building a splash park at Keystone Beach and adding a kayak launch.

During the city council’s workshop on

Feb. 28, a consultant from Manzan said the proposal’s cost falls between \$2-8 million.

“We’re going to have to definitely find someone who can write grants because we don’t have the money that other parts of the government do,” said Councilman Tony Brown.

A resident argued the proposal was a waste of time and money.

“It’s easier to have the concept on paper so (the community) can work from that,” said the consultant. “It was a relatively low-cost project. It’s a normal part of the planning process.”

Another resident said whatever steps are taken, the historic charm of the city needs to be preserved. For example, the Keystone Heights Historic Pavilion was once part of the original resort.

During the city council’s workshop, Mayor Nina Rodenroth was finally able to address the repeated acts of vandalism that have maimed the pavilion and surrounding parks.

“We’ve had a ton of things happen in the bathrooms. They have been destroyed twice. I know paper towels are being pulled out and thrown everywhere so nobody can use them,” Rodenroth said.

Councilmember Stephen Hart suggested that the city should have a stricter stance, such as hiring private security. Brown agreed there is merit to having private security or an off-duty deputy patrol the parks.

“When I was mayor, we had one guy

# Board shares new policy for challenge books

CLAY COUNTY – A school board workshop on Feb. 27 presented the newest draft of the proposed policy to challenge books in Clay County District Schools.

The newest draft is the latest development in the Clay County “book ban” debate, an ongoing endeavor attempting to address the 778 titles that have been challenged and the 284 titles that have been removed from public school libraries according to the district reconsideration list.

As an overview, the process for submitting challenges and accessing material is similar to the policy’s previous draft except for some notable changes.

A point of contention during the open forum was the debate between “opt-in” and “opt-out.” The current 2023-2024 school year has taken the opt-in approach – parents must first sign a permission slip for their children to access the media center. The newest proposal uses a hybrid model based on different tiers of accessibility.

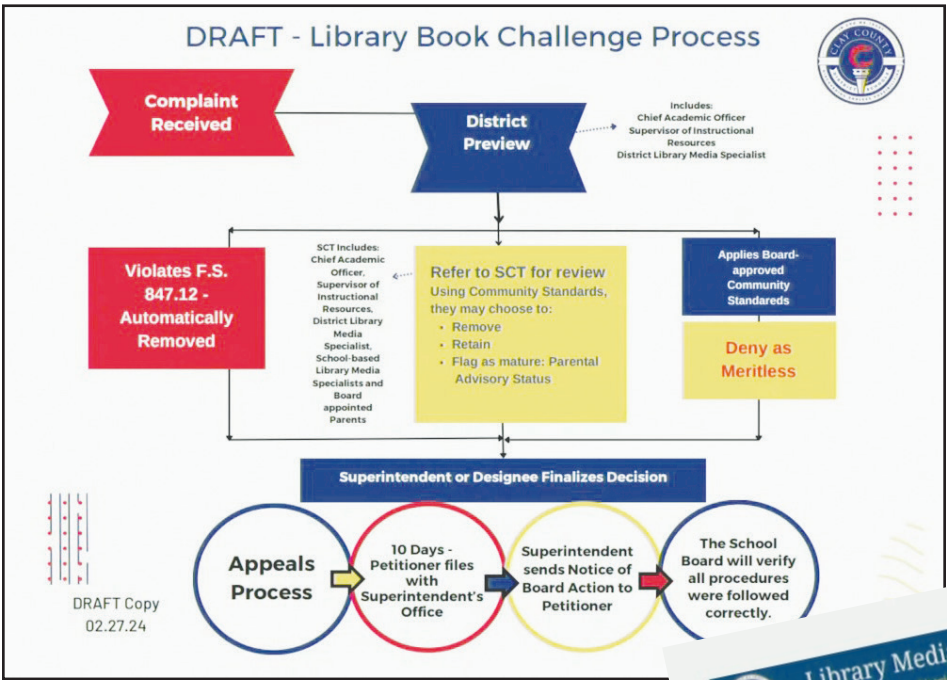
- Unlimited access
- General access: students can check out books but are not flagged as “mature.”
- Limited access: parents can limit books for their students that deal with certain themes or concepts
- No access

By default, without any parental signature, the newest proposal grants students general access. Parents can “opt-in” their children for unlimited access. Additionally, parents can set specific restrictive parameters on what their children can read – limited access. Parents also have the option to “opt-out” their children from the media center entirely – no access.

The idea is to have the opt-in/opt-out form available on Synergy for the convenience of parents and media specialists.

The newest proposal appears to have moved away from decentralization, which was an idea shared in a workshop in January to answer challenges on a school-by-school basis. Decentralizing the book challenge and appeal process was criticized by media specialists PEN America and Bruce Friedman.

The newest proposal has taken a stab at framing what the district-wide community

standards could look like. A detailed rubric showing examples and non-examples will be presented in the near future. Books containing any of the following would be flagged as “mature.”

### Profanity

- Elementary - no crude profanity, racial, or religious slurs
- Junior High - limited profanity, racial, or religious slurs
- High - no pervasive use of racial slurs or crude or excessive profanity
- Horror: pervasive gruesome behavior or feelings of extreme fear, shock, disgust
- Violence: intense morbid behavior involving physical force intended to hurt, abuse, damage, torture, kill
- Glorification of weapons – such as a nonmilitary civilian parading a gun around the street
- Glorification of suicide, self-harm, or mental illness – such as a character bragging about cutting their wrist
- Glorification of drug use – such as a minor continuously using illegal drugs
- Gender theory, medical transition

Any other sexual content not defined by FS 847

The compromise to have a hybrid opt-in/opt-out policy was criticized by School Board Member Hanson, who has been the leader in drafting a new policy.

“To say that I am disappointed is an understatement,” Hanson said.

Hanson said the newest draft would not provide sufficient parental consent and not a sufficient acknowledgment of the 284 titles already removed from the district’s libraries, titles that were found to violate FS 847 by being pornographic.

During the school board meeting on March 7, School Board Attorney Jeremiah Blocker appeared to have cleared up that concern.

“Your policy does have informed consent and is consistent with Florida law, I want to assure you,” he said.

If approved, the policy would lift the

embargo on buying new books. Newly published titles, new releases in a series, and even new, updated ACT and SAT prep books could once again be purchased if they are consistent with the approved community standards. This would finally end the book purchasing freeze in the school district that has been in place for two years.

It appears the newest draft has struck a compromise between the two sides of the debate: opt-in versus opt-out. If approved, media specialists could finally stock new books on their shelves.

“As we move forward, can we please purchase books for our children? They would really appreciate it,” said one media specialist to the school board during the workshop.

One media specialist said she was heartbroken because she had been unable to purchase books for two years.

“I don’t think I am promoting literacy anymore. I feel like I am restricting it,” she said.

School Board Member Mary Bolla was sympathetic. She thanked the public for taking the initiative and bringing their concerns to the board as the proposed new policy is being authored.

“Never be sad. Never be upset about getting emotional about learning. That’s what we’re all here for, and it’s all about the children,” Bolla said.

“I just want to offer my apology because we should have had you here for a meeting a heck of a long time ago. And I think two years is too long,” Bolla said.

The policy would significantly affect

Bruce Friedman, the concerned parent who has submitted more challenges than any other resident. There were parts he commended and parts he did not.

“You are about to review and approve policy changes that include a rubric and a guideline, which is, I recall, what I asked for over a year and a half ago,” Friedman said during a school board meeting.

“The truth is out – the libraries are still filled with porn,” he said. “The (proposed) policy does not have a clear mechanism for cleaning up the mess, doesn’t have a timeline for it, and opens the gate for future purchases before the old mess is cleaned up.”

Hanson appeared to agree with Friedman.

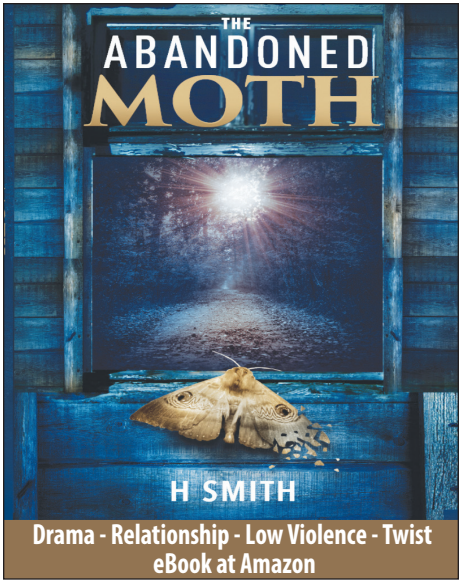
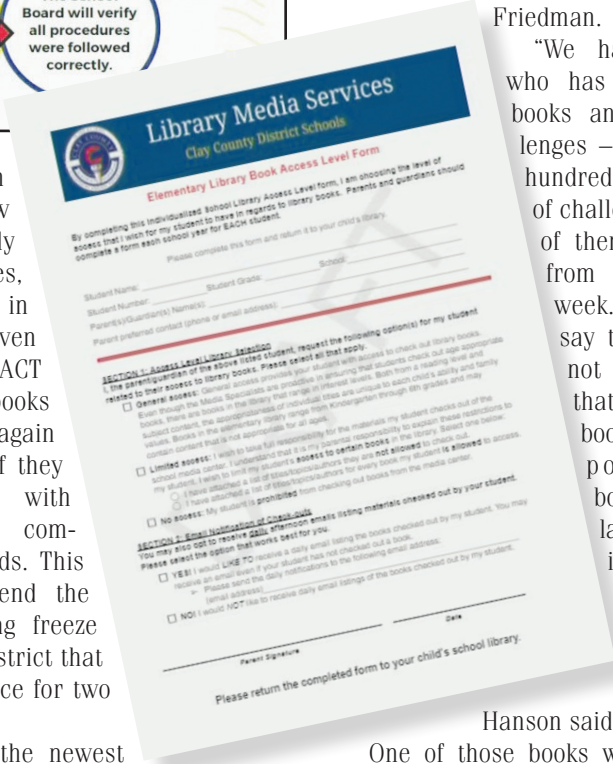
“We have a citizen who has been reading books and doing challenges – hundreds and hundreds and hundreds of challenges – and 32 of them were pulled from the shelf last week. So, are we to say that we should not tell parents that we had 32 books, obscene, pornographic books, pulled last week? But it’s OK for your kids to go in there? It doesn’t make sense to me,”

Hanson said.

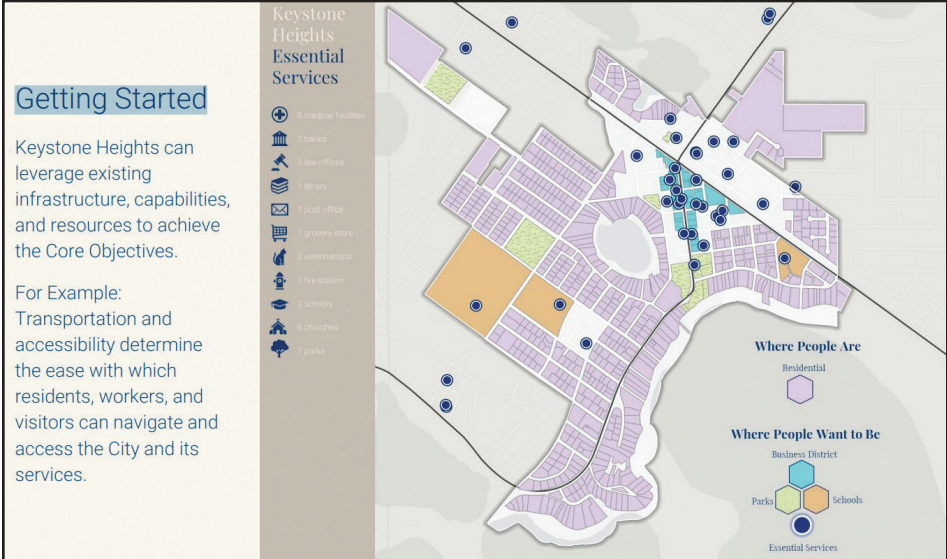
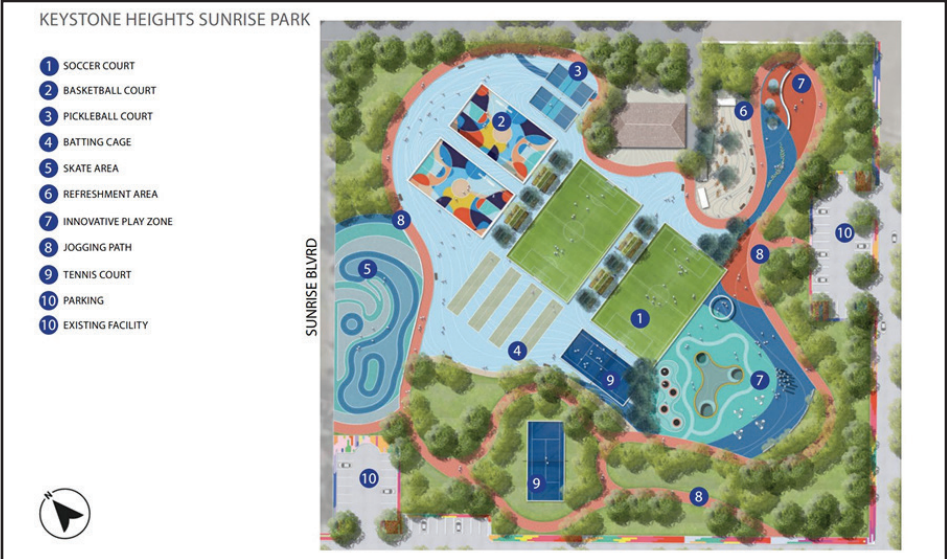
One of those books was “Imaginary Friend” by Stephen Chbosky.

“We don’t have clean libraries,” Hanson said. “We had a media specialist who had a student bring a book with pornography to her. They’re going to find it. If we don’t find it, they’re going to find it.”

The next school board meeting will be April 4 at 6 p.m. The final hearing, the final decision to approve the proposed policy, will be May 2 at 6 p.m.

actually shimmy up and knock off one of the cameras,” Brown said.

“If you come into this park and mess anything up, you’re going to be liable. Your parents are going to be liable if you’re underage. I think tough love is for the best,” said Vice Mayor Christine Thompson.

Rodenroth is still open to starting a Pavilion Park Task Force to lay out the data and present possible solutions to the public. One idea from the Clay County Sheriff’s Office was to encourage residents to record and report acts of vandalism. She said a volunteer community-led effort would save the city money from hiring additional private security.

“It’s got to be data-driven. Last year, we had 73 incidents in the city of Keystone Heights,” she said.

Rodenroth said a restroom was destroyed at 3 p.m. on a Sunday. Vandal-

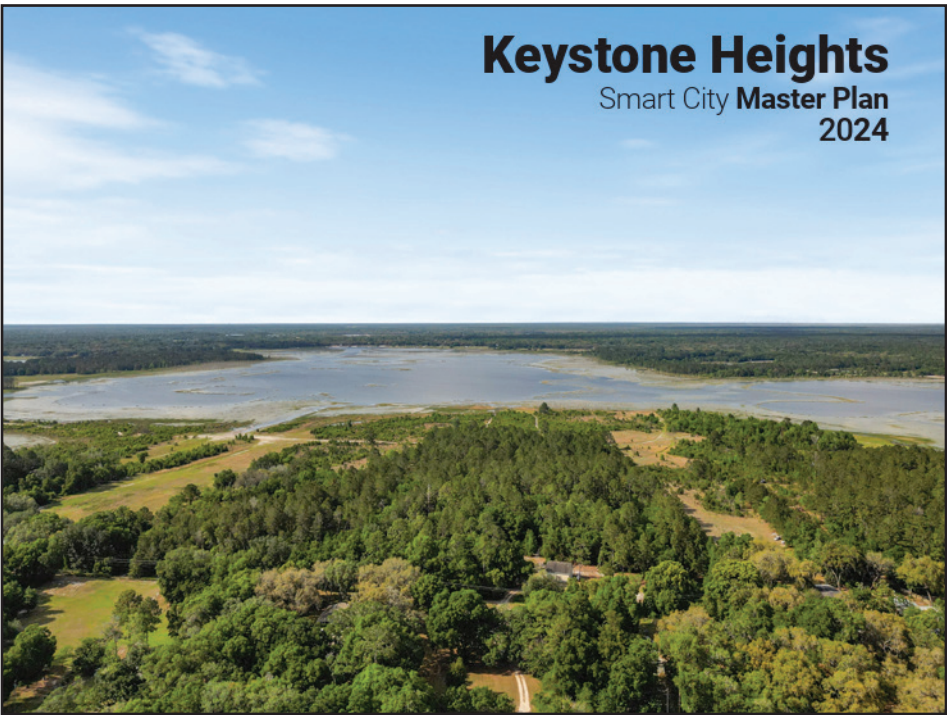
ism typically occurs during the day when school is out.

Fostering safe public recreational spaces will be a sizeable portion of the city’s strategic plan, if not the cornerstone. A finalized strategic plan is typically a prerequisite for grant funding and the first step to achieving short- and long-term municipal goals.

The city council must first chart the course before the city can be steered in a favorable direction.

A process which will not happen overnight. Councilmember Dan Lewandowski suggested nine months of writing and three months of review at the March 4 meeting. City Manager Charlie Van Zant Jr. said he would contact Dr. Joe Saviak, someone with experience authoring strategic plans.

The strategic plan will be a working document that will require months to iron out the details and much community input. Hopefully, it will come out shiny and smooth for the city’s centennial next year.

# The Precedent-setting Black River Phosphate Company

CLAY COUNTY – The Industrial Revolution led to many changes in agriculture. With machines now doing the bulk of the hard work, farmers produced crops on a grander scale. As fertile farmland became scarce after the Civil War, farmers needed a way to increase the yield per acre. Fertilizer was one of the ways to do that, and it resulted in a high demand for both fer-

tilizers and pesticides. One of those fertilizers was phosphate. The 1890s brought the discovery of large phosphate deposits in Florida and industrial-scale mining operations. Clay County had a phosphate source, which was under the dark, tannic waters of Black Creek. Accumulated eons ago, Florida’s phosphate deposits are believed to have originated in a few different ways. In a process called precipitation, some of the phosphate formed when conditions in the seawater caused dissolved phospho-

rus to solidify. As the solids settled to the bottom of the shallow coastal waters, they became part of the sedimentary layers that eventually formed the sediment that is mined today. Sea life excrement and remains also played a large part in creating the deposits. Bones, teeth, and other fossilized animal remains all contributed to the formation. Phosphate was also reported at other locations in Alachua and Duval counties. The largest deposits were discovered in Polk, Hillsborough, Manatee and DeSoto counties.

The phosphate at Black Creek was found to be part of the Hawthorne formation and more of a phosphate marl, which is pebbles mixed with lots of silica and clay. The quality of the phosphate was too low for export to Europe, so the mineral was distributed in America. Investors at that time were interested in ventures that extracted resources from Florida’s water and land. One such

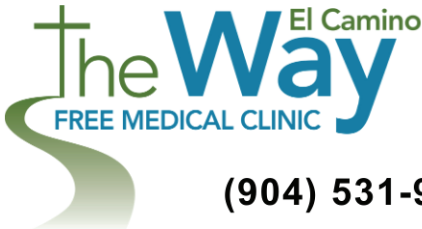

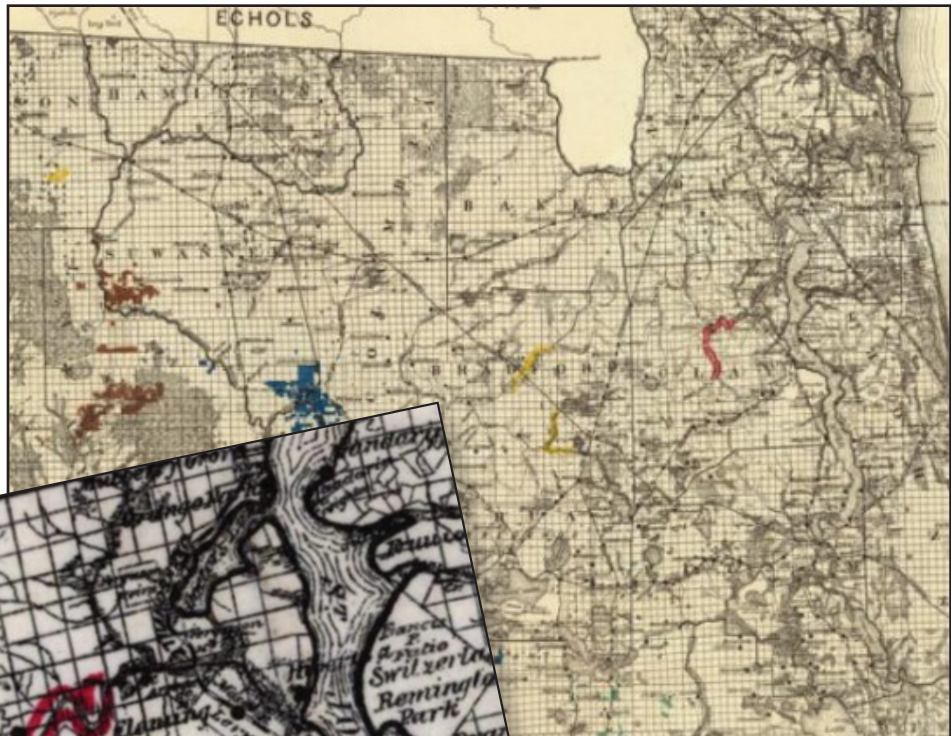

Dredging went on for 12 hours a day and was hazardous to workers. The inferno-like summer climate of Florida intensified the already tough working conditions. One can imagine the steam and boilers amping up the already stifling heat. Drowning, gators, and snakes were severe issues for workers, too, as were mosquito-borne diseases. Another hazard was continued exposure

Everything was going smoothly until the State of Florida sued Black River Phosphate (BRP). The 1893 Florida Supreme Court opinion set a nationwide precedent in the area of riparian owners' rights. (Riparian refers to any property relating to or situated on the banks of a river.) The precedent set in *State v. Black River Phosphate*, 13 So. 640 (Fla. 1893) is still being cited and followed. The Court's task was to determine the nature of the ownership of the state of Florida, which had to land under navigable waterways. BRP was taking phosphate from the bed of Black Creek, which was both tidal and navigable. BRP's claim to the land was based on The Riparian Act of 1856, which granted "title" to riparian owners, giving them the right to

# Black Creek Ravines Conservation Area a hidden gem

For Clay Today

MIDDLEBURG — Named for its unique geological features, Black Creek Ravines Conservation Area is a hidden gem in Clay County. The 964-acre property is one of the St. Johns River Water Management District’s most distinctive lands and offers an array of passive, resource-based recreation.

“The steep ravines and seepage slopes are about a mile long and average a 30-foot depth, from top of bank to bottom of trough, which is unusual to see in Florida,” said Tyler Mosteller, the District’s North Region land manager.

“While on the property, you’ll see a range of elevations, ecosystems, wildlife and, of course, the creek,” Mosteller said.

The conservation area borders 2.7 miles of riverfront on the south shore of Black Creek, which helps maintain the vital recharge function of the upland sandhill community, an imperiled natural habitat. District lands protect and preserve water resources while also safeguarding plant and wildlife habitat and providing spaces for public recreation and environmental education.

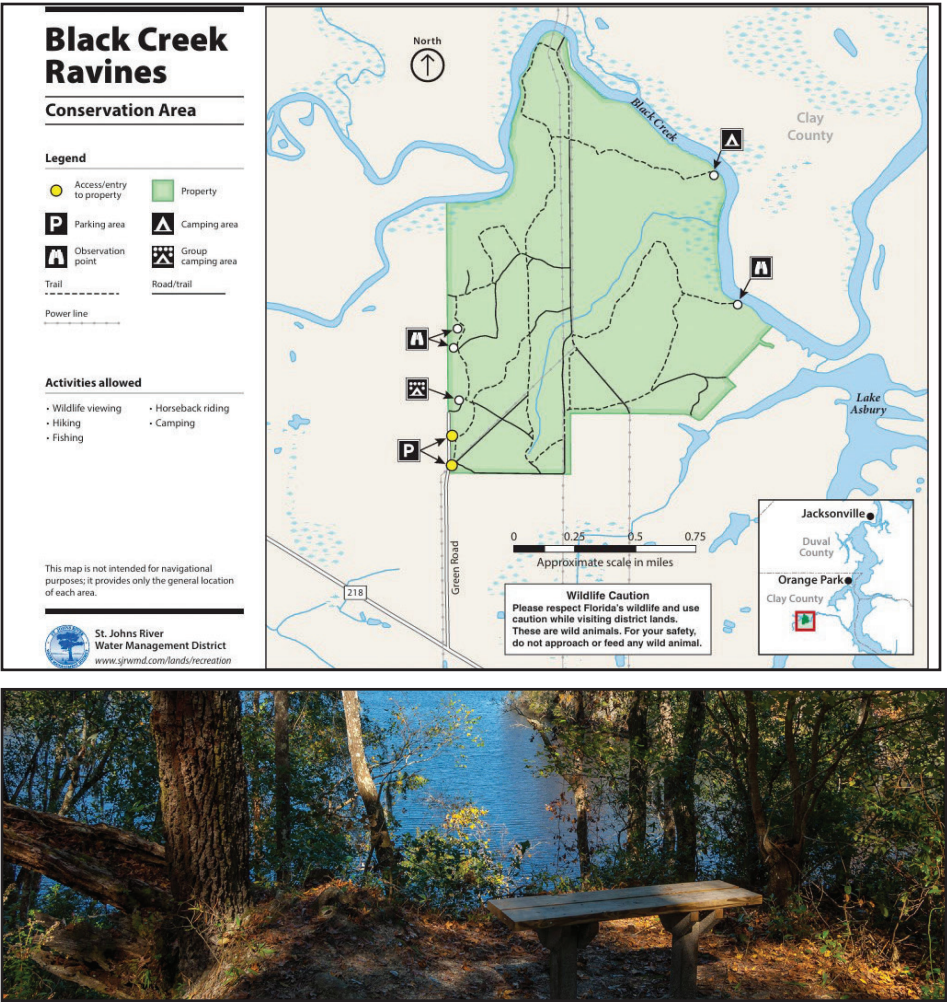
Over five miles of trails make Black Creek Ravines popular for hiking, trail run-

ning, nature viewing and horseback riding. With a half dozen natural communities, including sandhills, flatwoods, hammocks and floodplain swamps, visitors may see wading birds, woodpeckers, gopher tortoises, bald eagles, otters, deer or even alligators. Bartram’s ixia, a rare endemic state-endangered wildflower, seasonally blooms on the ravine’s edges. An overlook of Black Creek stands almost 30 feet above the water, providing a remarkable view.

“The bluff has a great vantage point; you can see over the creek about half a mile north,” Mosteller said.

For those looking for an opportunity to unplug from the hustle and bustle of modern life, the conservation area offers the authentic outdoor experience of primitive tent camping. There is a first-come, first-served campsite accessible by foot or boat near the creek bank and a group campsite (advance reservation required) closer to the ravines.

Show PBS some love this St. Patrick's Day when "Alice & Jack" makes its premiere on Masterpiece. Starring Irish actor and screenwriter Domhnall Gleeson ("Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows: Part 2," 2011) and English actress Andrea Riseborough ("To Leslie," 2022), the six-episode drama series premieres Sunday, March 17, on the network.

While "Alice & Jack" premieres to North American audiences midway through the month of March, it first premiered on England's Channel 4 this past Valentine's Day (Feb. 14) — a timely release due to the ongoing romantic theme of the series.

The six-episode series, which was created by "Mad About You" and "Mad Men" producer Victor Levin, spans 15 years and "explores the seminal question of whether the bonds between us are stronger than the forces that would tear us apart" (per PBS).

When Jack (Gleeson), a calm, reserved scientist, meets a young, tightly wound financier named Alice (Riseborough), the pair instantly hit it off despite their many differences in both lifestyle and personality. They spend just one night together before returning to their separate lives, but over the course of a decade and a half, Jack and Alice meet repeatedly — often by chance — and begin to question what it is about the other person that keeps them both coming back.

Described by Fremantle, the show's distribution company, as a "love story for the ages," "Alice & Jack" is arguably a more realistic representation of romance in the modern world than the traditional meet-cute romantic comedy. With so many possibilities to interfere with love, trust and friendship these days, the nature of our relationships have changed drastically, and TV fans need look no further than these star-crossed lovers for confirmation.

Following the series' September 2023 premiere at the Toronto International Film Festival, PBS Masterpiece executive Suzanne Simpson described "Alice & Jack" as "exceptionally beautiful and profound" and added that Masterpiece

is "proud to add" it to their lineup. And while it is easy to praise the show for its will-they-won't-they quality that has every hopeless romantic on the edge of their seat, critics, such as Marya E. Bea, now best known for her work in the Irish comedy "This Way Up" and the low-key sci-fi dramedy "Living With Yourself," is gaining popularity stateside for her quick wit and cheerful banter — a welcome addition to the uncertainty brought to the screen by Alice and Jack.

Along with this written teaser, the network also released the names of seven couples that will be highlighted throughout the new episodes, allowing viewers a quick taste of what's to come for each.

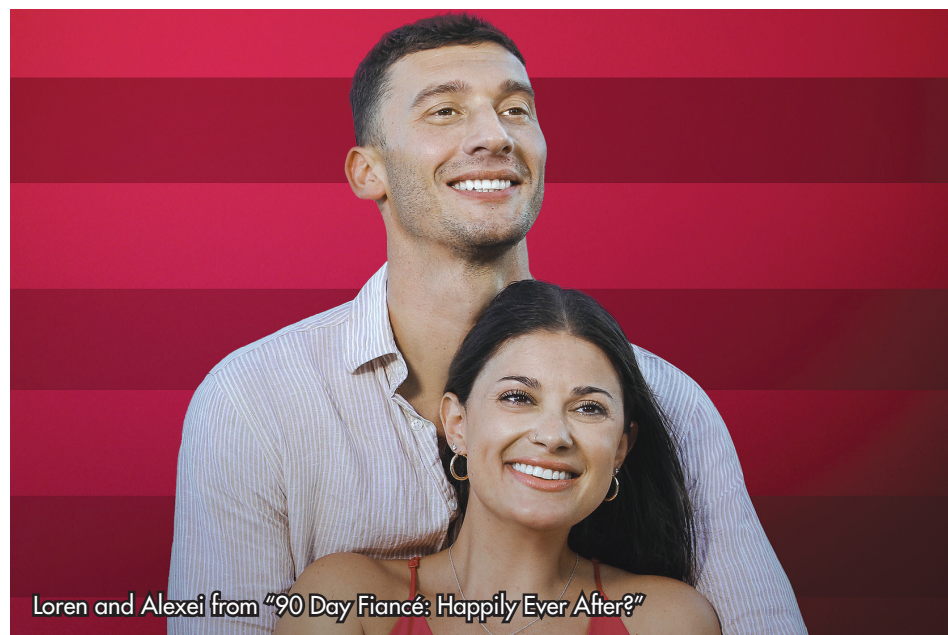
Emily Bieberly and Kobe Blaise, who

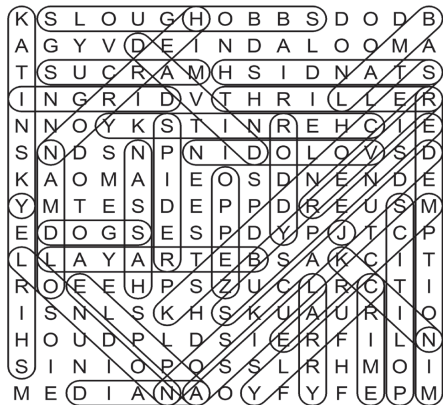

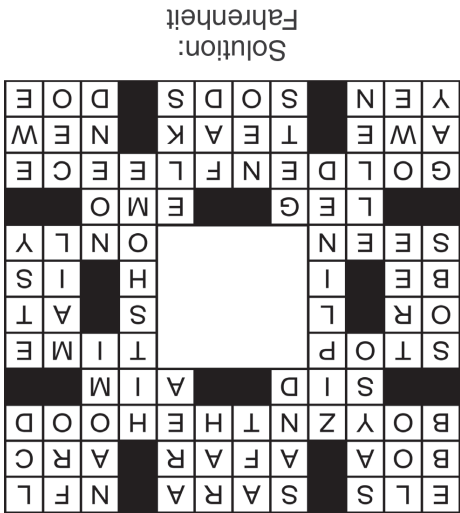

Melissa McCarthy is ‘The Boss’ as star and co-writer

Who’s “The Boss?” Well, in movie terms in 2016, the answer to that was fairly easy: Melissa McCarthy.

The “Mike & Molly” and “Gilmore Girls” alum’s film career has been an ev-er-fluctuating series of hits and misses ever since she struck the bullseye with her mar-velously bawdy, Oscar-nominated work in “Bridesmaids,” but it’s a thrill to see her still riding reasonably high ... especially, in some cases, with projects she generates for herself.

“The Boss” — which Freeform presents Thursday, March 21, and Friday, March 22 — was one of those, and as with “Tam-my” a couple of years earlier, she also was a co-writer of it with husband Ben Falcone, the film’s director. She plays a self-actualiza-tion guru who gets into legal trouble and goes to prison, then has to take a sizable dose of her own medicine and rebuild her life once she gets out.

She’s helped in several ways by her former assistant, played by a winning Kristen Bell,

who’s smart for knowing and grabbing a good supporting role when she sees one. There’s a lot of business about humanizing McCarthy’s Michelle Darnell, and that lets the actress put some spins on the image she has cemented through her television work.

The rest plays out a lot like Diane Keaton’s “Baby Boom,” with Bell giving McCarthy the incentive to get back into the business swing by marketing a certain product in a unique way. While the premise may be familiar, it’s the McCarthy twist that provides the difference, reaffirming the natural talent that elevated her from the supporting ranks to her current status in stardom. Remaining likable to an audience, even when your alter ego does some not-so-likable things, is a gift.

Seeing McCarthy placed up against other known performers is typically fun, too. Not only is the substantial time she shares in “The Boss” with Bell enjoyable, but she and Peter Dinklage (the multiple Primetime Emmy winner for “Game of Thrones”) make a great pair of friends turned foes, particularly in the picture’s home stretch.

“The Boss” certainly doesn’t reinvent the wheel of movie comedy, and it doesn’t really intend to. What it does do is to serve as a relatively solid vehicle for Melissa Mc-Carthy, less successful than some, but more than others — and knowing what works well for you always is a big part of being a good boss.

### Paul Giamatti: Not merely a 'Holdover' in TV

**Q: I know that Paul Giamatti has been getting awards and rave reviews for the movie "The Holdovers." Has he done any other television series besides "Billions"? – Karen Wade, via e-mail**

**A:** Though it was a limited series, HBO's "John Adams" is very significant in the actor's career, since the 2008 historical drama boosted his career substantially by earning him such awards as a Primetime Emmy, a Golden Globe and a Screen Actors Guild honor. By then, he had done guest shots on such shows as "NYPD Blue" and "Homicide: Life on the Street," and he had hosted a 2005 episode of "Saturday Night Live." He also had made cable movies including "Winchell" and "The Pentagon Papers."

Later, Giamatti appeared in multiple episodes of "Inside Amy Schumer" and "Lodge 49" (the latter of which he also was an executive producer of), and he reprised the role of John Adams in voice only in Ken Burns' 2022 documentary "Benjamin Franklin." He also was featured in the second season of "30 Coins," seen in America on Max.

**Q: I saw the Denzel Washington movie "Flight" on cable recently, and I recognized the actress who played the chief stewardess from a TV series, but I can't remember which one. Can you help? – Kara Johnson, Columbus, Ohio**

**A:** While Tamara Tunie may be remembered by daytime viewers as Jessica Griffin on the long-defunct "As the World Turns," she's arguably best-known as medical examiner Melinda Warner on "Law & Order: Special Victims Unit." She recently resurfaced in that role on another entry in the NBC franchise, "Law & Order: Organized Crime."

Also a stage actress (and theater producer, a job she first filled on the acclaimed "Spring Awakening"), the New York-centric Tunie has done guest roles on such other series as "Better Call Saul," "Blue Bloods," "Billions," "Elementary," "Survivor's Remorse," "Chicago Fire" (on which she also played the Melinda Warner character), "The Good Wife," "Days of Our Lives," "24," "Sex and the City," "New York Undercover" and "NYPD Blue."

**Q: Please settle a debate. Was there a remake of the Raymond Burr series "Ironside"? – Evan Myers, Stuart, Fla.**

**A:** There was, but it didn't last long. NBC – the network on which the original version also ran – showed how different it wanted the 2013 update to be while still holding to the initial premise, by casting Blair Underwood in Burr's earlier role as the police detective who used a wheelchair. The setting was changed from San Francisco to New York, and while Ironside still had other investigators working with him, they had different character names from the first show's. (One of the roles was played by Kelsey Grammer's daughter Spencer.)

When we said the revised series didn't last long, we meant it: It had only four airings before NBC pulled it, by which time the ratings were about half of what they had been for the premiere episode (which was directed by "thirtysomething" alum Peter Horton). Five additional episodes were filmed but not shown.

## Man arrested for trafficking LSD, possessing psychotropic mushrooms

ORANGE PARK – The Clay County Sheriff's Office uncovered LSD, psychotropic mushrooms and marijuana during a traffic stop for an expired license tag on March 11 on Wells Road.

According to the arrest report, Jeffrey Chambers II, 26, of Jacksonville, was charged with trafficking more than one gram of lysergic acid diethylamide, possessing more than 20 grams of marijuana and possessing a hallucinogen with intent to manufacture, deliver or sell after the deputy noticed the tag expired last December.

When the deputy approached the car, he smelled marijuana, which prompted a search. CCSO also uncovered a handgun and learned Chambers had two outstanding warrants out of Duval County for driving with a suspended license.

Chambers' bond was set at \$625,009.

## CCSO: Man caught in undercover methamphetamine trafficking sting

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A 45-year-old man was being held on a \$750,024 bond after the Clay County Sheriff's Office said it made at least four controlled purchases of methamphetamine in January and March.

Jason Patrick Hall, of Green Cove Springs, was charged with three counts of trafficking methamphetamine, one count of selling the drug and four counts of using his cellphone to facilitate a felony to set up deals with someone working with the sheriff's office.

According to three of four arrest reports, the purchases were on Jan. 9 and 12 and March 6.

Hall's next court appearance will be on April 8.

## Mother turns son in after two break-ins at GCS gas station

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The police department got some much-needed and greatly-appreciated help from an unexpected source on March 10 when a mother said she believed her 14-year-old son was likely responsible for a pair of break-ins at the BP gas station at 1383 N. Orange Ave.

Somebody smashed a side window on Feb. 13 and robbed the store of cigarettes and vapes. The theft also tried to pry the cash register open, the Green Cove Springs Police Department said.

The robber returned March 10 and repeated the crime. While on the scene, "officers were approached by a woman holding a backpack and claiming her son may be who we were looking for. The backpack was filled with stolen items from burglaries. Detectives interviewed the 14-year-old suspect, which led to a full confession and an arrest of the juvenile," GCSPD said.

The boy wasn't identified because of his age.

## Man shot during disturbance at Orange Park Mall

ORANGE PARK – The Clay County Sheriff's Office said it's investigating another disturbance near the AMC Movie Theatre parking lot at the Orange Park Mall after a man said he was shot during a disturbance involving a group of juveniles on March 9.

The agency said off-duty deputies were disbursing and trespassing a group of teens from the property when they moved to the parking. Deputies said they heard a series of gunshots, and a man approached them and said he had been shot in the arm.

He was taken to HCA Florida Orange Park Hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. "We have zero tolerance for violence in Clay County," said Sheriff Michelle Cook. "Those responsible for last night will be pursued and punished."

## Keystone Heights felon indicted after being caught with rifle

JACKSONVILLE – U.S. States Attorney Roger B. Handberg announced the return of an indictment charging Allen Tereal Grimes, 33, of Keystone Heights, with possession of ammunition by a convicted felon. If convicted, Grimes faces as many as 15 years in federal prison. The indictment also notifies Grimes the United States intends to forfeit ammunition alleged to be traceable to his offense. Grimes appeared in federal court on March 4 and was ordered detained.

According to the indictment, on Aug. 21, 2023, Grimes was stopped while riding a bicycle on County Road 214 because he had an outstanding warrant in Bradford County. Deputies uncovered 21 rounds of Winchester 9 mm ammunition when he was searched. At the time of the incident, Grimes had seven prior felony convictions, including battery on a law enforcement officer, resisting arrest with violence, fleeing and eluding a police officer, felony battery

and assault with intent to commit to a felony. As a previously convicted felon, Grimes is prohibited from possessing a firearm or ammunition under federal law.

An indictment is merely a formal charge that a defendant has committed one or more violations of federal criminal law, and every defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.

This case was investigated by the Clay County Sheriff's Office and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives – Jacksonville Office. Assistant U.S. Attorney Kevin C. Frein will prosecute it.

This case is part of Project Safe Neighborhoods, a program bringing together all levels of law enforcement and the communities they serve to reduce violent crime and gun violence and make our neighborhoods safer.

On May 26, 2021, the Department launched a violent crime reduction strategy strengthening PSN based on these core principles: fostering trust and legitimacy in our communities, supporting community-based organizations that help prevent violence from occurring in the first place, setting focused and strategic enforcement priorities and measuring the results.

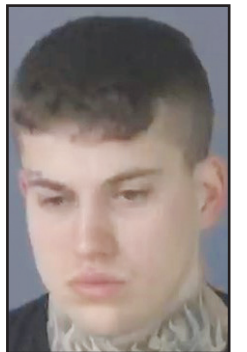
## 'Reckless' turn leads to fentanyl trafficking arrest

Velazquez was ordered held without bond.

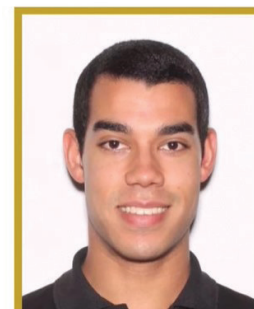

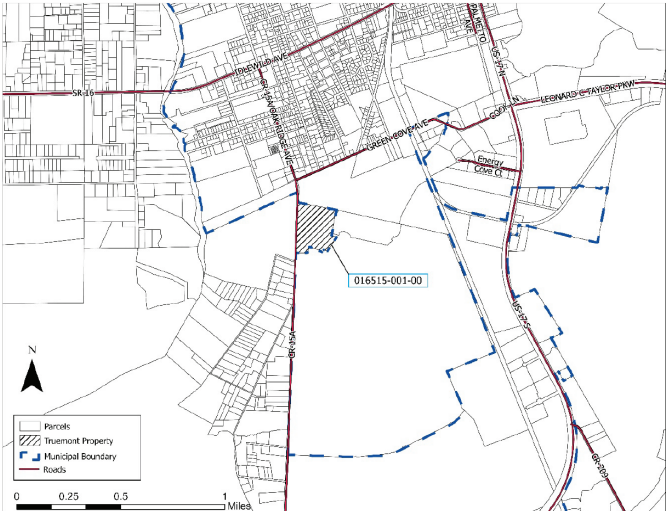

Oakleaf dominates at Clay County Track Championships

FLAGLER PALM COAST - At one of the fastest, deepest track meets in Florida on Saturday; the North Florid/South Florida Challenge at Flagler Palm Coast High School, the Fleming Island High girls and boys track teams put some muscle on display with record-setting performances in a handful of events.

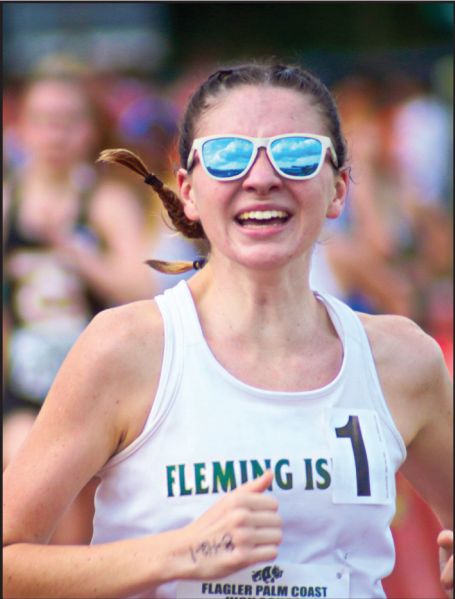
“We saw some great efforts in a lot of events and this could be our strongest team of athletes in a long time,” said Fleming Island track coach Chris Otero, who guides the sprinters while Dave Allen handles the middle distance and distance runners. “Our two milers; Brooke Reynolds and Allie Knotts both had personal bests by two seconds against one of the toughest fields before the state. Our boys sprinters took second behind a tough Jesuit team and will be tough to beat as the season rolls on.”

In the Flagler mile, Reynolds and Knotts, who have run nearly tethered to each other in previous races with the pair seemingly sharing track energy while they run, battled with a Bishop Kenny trio; Stephanie Grden, Emily Wheldon and Tessa Massa throughout the four quick laps with Knotts taking an early first lap lead. Grden and Massa were seeded numbers two and three before the race with five-minute, 16-second splits while Knott and Reynolds were in the 5:23 range.

As the race progressed, it was Ponte Vedra’s Daisy Ross, who was the top seed with a 5:08.71 split, who got into the fracas up front with Knotts while Reynolds bided her time in third and fourth place with the Kenny trio.

As the front pack positioned themselves for the final lap, Reynolds started to sneak closer for her fast kick tactics while Knott looked around a moment and kept her engine running hot with the leaders as Grden seemed poised to make a move off the final turn.

Grden, 14th in 2A last year with a 5:17, did make a strong move with 50 yards to go that broke the pack but Reynolds surged, attached to Knott and both finished side-by-side at 5:20.24 for Reynolds

and 5:20.49 for Knott for fourth and fifth behind the Kenny trio led by Grden who clocked in at 5:12.29. Ross, 16th in 3A last year in 5:21, was taken out of the front five with the pack strategy keeping her leashed in a box and finished sixth at 5:20.80. Neither Reynolds nor Knott were state finalists last year.

Reynolds’ performance, with her usual strong finish, came just two days after clocking a 5:22.95 just two days prior at the Clay County Championships to win the mile while also, just an hour later, clocking a 2:27.57 in the 800 meters for the win in that event.

At Flagler, Reynolds ran 2:25.52 for fifth in the 800 with Grden doubling jp with

the win in 2:22.46. “She’s a workhorse and has a high tolerance out there,” said Otero. “Her and Allie work together, keying off each other and that has made them both stronger. This (Flagler) just pulled them along.”

Also highlighting the girl’s efforts for Fleming Island, sophomore triple jumper Mikayla Shavers, who was also in the open 100 meters dash, won her signature event against a familiar face with a 39’-3.25” leap over Miami Northwestern senior Shakynah Tresvant, who was runner-up at 39’-2” in a tense battle of the two stalwarts.

“She has been rehabbing back from a knee injury and we are slowly getting her back to state shape,” said Otero. “We ran her in the 100 and the relays and she did fine.”

Shavers’ jump was the top jump in Class 3A and put her on a track to return to the state championships where she lost by a half inch at 39’-6.5” with Tresvant third at 39’-5.25”. The state champion, Leon’s Alexandria Kennedy is graduated as are the fourth, fifth and sixth-place finishers from last year’s state final making Shavers and Tresvant and likely the top two battles in May.

In the 100, Shavers clocked 12.81 to finish 13th with teammate Kennedy Berkley 10th in 12.73.

For the boys, Otero’s sprint crew showed some prowess led by junior Kaylib Singleton who smoked the track for a 10.54 split in a field that had the top nine finishers under 10.96 seconds led by meet

record holder Durian Moss of Christopher Columbus High smashing his previous record of 10.6 with a red hot 10.37 seconds. Moss was fourth in 4A last year with a 10.64 time.

Singleton’s 10.54 split puts him in the top 100 times for Class 3A with Cibastian Broughton hitting 11.05 and Trace Burney hitting 11.15.

Broughton and Singleton teamed with Burney and Lennox Ivey to take second to Mandarin in the 4 x 100 by just a half second. Ivey was also fourth in the 400 in 51.25.

“Once we clean up our baton passes, we’ll go faster,” said Otero.

At the Clay County boys 100 and 200 races, Oakleaf got a first in the 100 from Devin Collins in 10.92 with Orange Park’s Daniel Richardson second in 11.07 while, in the 200, Oakleaf swept 1-2-3 with Josber Stimphil winning in 22.24, Collins second at 22.51 and Takoda Brown third at 22.76. Singleton got fourth for Fleming Island in 22.97.

Collins also won the long jump at the Clay County Championships with a 24’-.50” leap.

Stimphil won the 400 in 51.45 ahead of Fleming Island’s Alton Bacon and John Yulee; both under 52 seconds, with Broughton seventh in 54.24.

# Fleming Island ‘bass-man’ wins Phoenix Bass League

LEESBURG — Boater Ryan Crowley of Fleming Island caught a five-bass limit weighing 21 pounds, 8 ounces, Saturday to win the Phoenix Bass Fishing League (BFL) Presented by T-H Marine on the Harris Chain of Lakes. Hosted by Discover Lake County, the tournament was the third event of the season for the BFL Gator Division. Crowley earned \$4,541 for his victory.

In second place was Parker Stalvey, a second Clay County bass fisherman and former state high school champion from Clay High School, who bagged five bass for a 20-pound, 14-ounce total to earn \$2,270.

Crowley, who has three top-10 finishes with total winnings of \$7,186, came into the tournament with a two-part strategy: bed-fishing for spawning bass in a canal and fan-casting offshore around eelgrass and peppergrass. While pre-fishing, he located four quality bass on beds and was able to anchor his limit on tournament day with an early 8-pounder. Unfortunately, two of the other bedding bass he'd found were gone, and a 5-pounder he'd hoped to catch refused to bite.

Crowley, who works in construction, was able to catch a few small buck bass before overcast skies and dingy water made sight-fishing too challenging, which forced a move.

“From there I just went offshore and started chunking around a ChatterBait and a Speed Worm,” he said. “The water temperature was 72, so I thought maybe they'd hit a (Zara) Spook (topwater). So I threw that for a while but didn't get any blow-ups on it. I was able to catch one right at 5 (pounds) and one right at 4 on a ChatterBait.”

Specifically, Crowley fished a 1/2-ounce Z-Man ChatterBait Jack Hammer with a Gambler Burner Worm trailer on a 7-foot, 4-inch, medium-heavy moderate 13 Fishing Muse rod. He also worked a Burner Worm or Zoom UV Speed Worm through the grass on a 7-foot, 3-inch 13 Fishing Envy rod. Both of his offshore presentations were fished with 17-pound-test Vicious fluorocarbon. While sight-fishing, Crowley used the new Rapala Crush City Cleanup Craw in green pumpkin, and fished on a 7-foot, 6-inch, medium-heavy 13 Fishing Muse rod with 20-pound-test fluorocarbon.

“It was real thick where we were,” Crowley said about his best offshore area, which was about 8 feet deep. “I was just looking for more scattered, isolated stuff where, if I wanted to slow down and fish a worm, I could without getting hung up on every cast.”

Second place went to another Clay County bass fisherman, Parker Stalvey of Green Cove Springs, who was a Clay High state champion Bass

As a team, Oakleaf has 11 doubles, 39 RBIs and 15 stolen bases which means nervous coaches in the third base dugout.

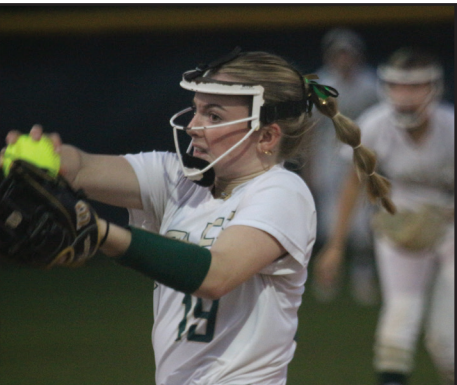

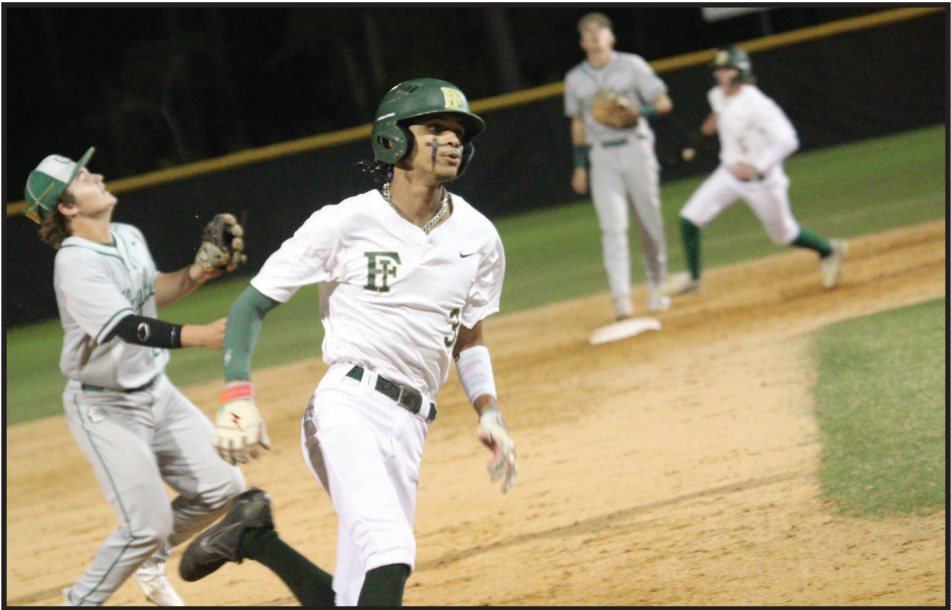

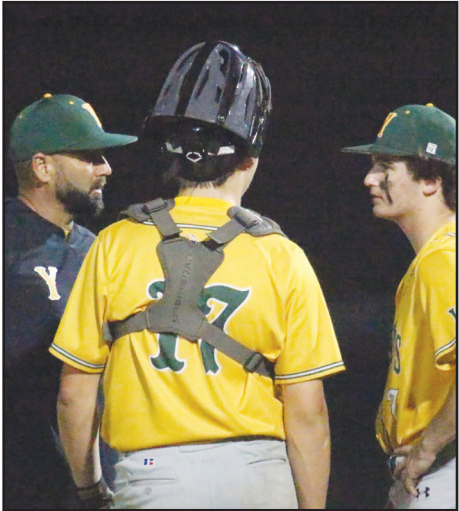

Stimphil, both clocked at 21.96, but also with a heavy tailwind (3.8; tailwinds exceeding 2.0 are considered assistance). Though Allen did not have mile ace Graham Myers on the track due to a family wedding event, seniors Roman Mollicone and John Keester IV were tasked to take on the distance juggernaut from cross country champions Belen Jesuit led by junior 1600 3A champion Joseph Socarras in 4:13.53 and and third and fourth in the 3200 finishers Marcelo Mantecon and Joshua Ruiz.

In the 800, Mollicone stayed locked in step with the front-running Socarras until the final 200 where Socarras hit the afterburners to open a gap with Mollicone trying to answer to finish second; 1:54.48 to 1:55.92. “The beasts were in that heat,” said Mollicone. “I know I have a strong finish and I may have to attack early next time.” In last year’s 3A 800 final, Mollicone surprised the state with a 1:56.28 fourth-place finish; Socarras was seventh. “Roman is going to get stronger after an ankle got tweaked earlier in the season,” said Otero. “He’s as dangerous a runner as any in the state.”

In the 1600, Keester was amongst five Jesuit runners up front into the third lap, but the pace accelerated and it was Fleming Island sophomore Andrew Boyer who surged to finish ahead of Keester with a 4:35.35. Socarras won in 4:20.68 with four teammates all under 4:30. In the 3200, Mantecon led three Jesuit runners at 9:14.94 with Fleming Island’s Jacob Campbell in sixth at 9:35.38. Over in the pole vault, despite the windy conditions and an occasional drizzle, Fleming Island senior Gideon Gilaspy had his best jump of the season that established a school record at 13’-3.5” with Gilasy finishing second the Bartram Trail’s

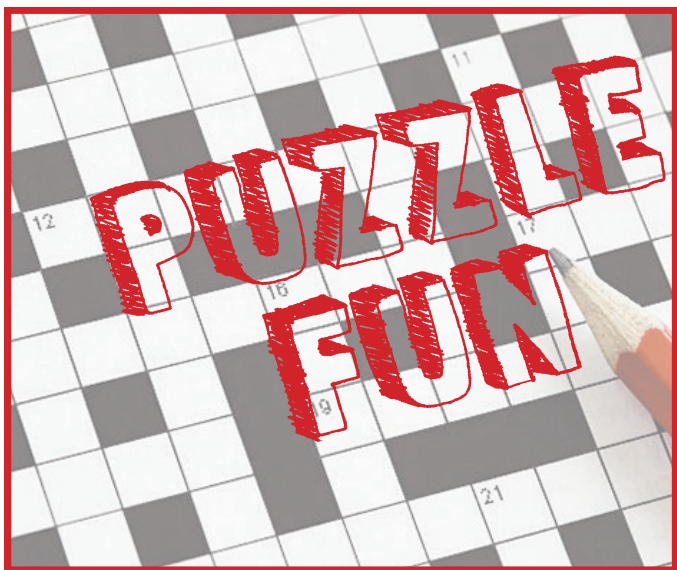
