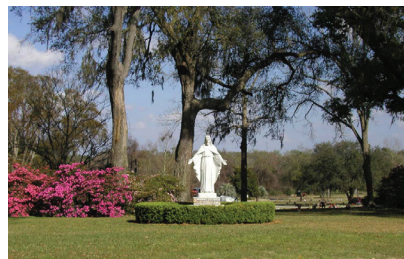

The fair strives to be the showcase for Clay County's agriculture, educational, civic and commercial interests. It provides an opportunity for residents to work and have fun together. Volunteers are the lifeblood of the Fair. Their dedicated support of sharing time and talents is vital to the Fair's success.

After gate admission, most exhibits and attractions are FREE. Two exhibit buildings are used for commercial, nonprofit and competitive exhibits.

Competitive Exhibits

Clay County residents are encouraged to enter the competitive exhibits to show off their talents and possibly win money and/or a ribbon. The Midway

Midway Rides are available from Deggeller Attractions. They have provided midway entertainment for the Fair since its inception. The midway features more than 40 rides to thrill both young and old alike. See pages XX to see many of the rides. Check out the daily deals on pages XX-XX for discount ride armbands.

Main Stage

Main Stage entertainment is located in the Cattleman's Arena. Special entertainment is featured almost daily during the Fair. Top national acts perform at the huge 28-acre facility. All entertainment is FREE, however you may purchase reserved seating in advance at claycountyfair.org.

T-Mobile Community Stage

T-Mobile Community Stage is located east of Founder's Exhibit Building No. 1. Entertainment and contests are held each day of the Fair. Local talent performs in a relaxed atmosphere. Tables and shades are provided so guests can enjoy the fair food and entertainment at the same time.

The E-Zone

The E-Zone is located north of the Cattleman's Arena and east of the Exhibit buildings. The E-Zone's focus is on Engaging, Educating and Entertaining elements in all of its activities. Daily entertainment, community stage acts, food court and contests are held in this area throughout the Fair. Tables, chairs, and water misters are provided to cool when it's hot so guests can enjoy all of the E-Zone offerings.



Early Florida Village

The Early Florida Village is a unique opportunity to step back and see Clay County life in the past. During the Fair, each exhibit is live with demonstrators dressed in the era to provide guests with a live experience of life in Early Florida. Food samples, shade trees, and sitting areas make the experience of living history a really enjoyable one. It's also home to our Little Red Barn, which features baby farm animals. The Early Florida Village is open each day of the fair until 7 p.m., with limited demonstrations on most days.



Livestock

Livestock is the foundation of the Fair. Livestock exhibits provide everyone the opportunity to experience our true agriculture roots. After all, this is an agricultural fair. Today, many guests haven't had the opportunity to experience our American way of life. Agriculture is our lifeline for our food supply. Come check out our beef, poultry, dairy, goat, horse, swine, rabbit and steer exhibit barns.

Vanilla Ice

His given name is Robert Matthew Van Winkle, but music fans know him as Vanilla Ice.

The American rapper, actor and television host released his debut album, "Hooked," which was remastered a year later and released as "To the Extreme," which became the fastest-selling hip hop album of all time with songs like "Ice Ice Baby" and "Play That Funky Music." "Ice Ice Baby" was the first hip hop single to top the Billboard charts, and it's been credited with introducing hip hop to a mainstream audience.

Ice, who describes his shows "It's a pretty crazy atmosphere," said his music was influenced by underground music, rather than mainstream music, including hip hop and funk artists such as Funkadelic, Rick James, Roger Troutman, Egyptian Lover and Parliament. Along with Beastie Boys, 3rd Bass and House of Pain, Ice was one of the earliest white rappers to attain commercial success. Ice was also busy with nine seasons on his DIY Network show "The Vanilla Ice Project," a reality show on home improvements and real estate flipping.

Tone Loc

Known for his raspy voice and his role as Emilio in "Ace Ventura: Pet Detective," Tone Loc also has hits like "Wild Thing" and "Funky Cold Medina," which earned him a Grammy nomination.

Tone Loc's debut album, *Löc-ed After Dark*, was released in January 1989. The video for the first single, "Wild Thing," became a staple on MTV in the U.S. The song rose to No. 2 on the Billboard Hot 100, and the Top 20 in Australia. The second single, "Funky Cold Medina," also became a hit. Reached the Top 5 in the U.S., peaking at No. 3; the Top 10 in Australia; and the Top 20 in the U.K.

"Löc-ed After Dark" reached No. 1 in the U.S. Since its release, it has been certified twice as a platinum release.

Tone Loc's second album, "Cool Hand LÖc" was released in November 1991. The album's first single was "All Through the Night," which found moderate success, reaching No. 80 on the Billboard Hot 100 and No. 16 on the Hot Rap Songs chart.

Tyler Farr

After co-writing hits for Cole Swindell and Joe Nichols, Tyler Farr released his first single, "Hot Mess" in 2012, and he hasn't slowed down since.

His third single, "Redneck Crazy," was a Top 10 hit in 2013, his "Whiskey in My Water" was a Top-3 single.

Farr considers himself to be a country-rock and a supporter of the U.S. military and the outdoors. He was recognized as a nominee for the "Breakthrough Artist of the Year" in 2014 by Country Radio Seminar, and he's the only solo man in the past decade to have his first two albums debut in the Top 5 on the Billboard 200 Chart.

After appearing with acts like Jason



Aldean, Florida Georgia Line, Luke Combs, Brantley Gilbert, and Lee Brice, Farr has become a headliner.

His silly antics and reputation as "a no-frills musician who pours his drinks as hard as he pours his heart into songs" have led to a riotous social media following.

Chapel Hart

Chances are, you're one of the more than 12 million who've viewed Chapel Hart's audition on "America's Got Talent" in 2022.

Danica and Devynn Hart, along with their cousin Treia Swindle, performed a vivacious

original called "You Can Have Him Jolene" that had the audience dancing in the aisles and prompted all four judges and host Terry Crews to give a "group" golden buzzer simultaneously.

They wrote the song because they loved Dolly Parton's music, but "we figured from 1973 to 2022, we cannot be fighting over the same man. You can just have him, Jolene," Danica said.

The performance earned acclaim from Parton, a spot on Darius Rucker's new album and an invitation to perform at the Grand Ol' Opry.

The group has since distanced themselves from country music and focused more on their music. Chapel Hart can still tug on your heartstrings with a tender yet powerful ballad, then have you pumping your fist in unison to the pulse of hard-hitting rock and roll.

Grace Tyler

It's hard to imagine a world where you can get a heady breath of fresh air before any of the dust settles – until you meet Grace Tyler.

The country singer-songwriter has never let the dust settle, just like she sings in her recent single "Dust," a refreshing voice with a novel perspective on falling in and out of love and moving on when staying put was never an option.

"I'm proud of where I come from, but I was raised up to go where the road runs on and on and on. I never let the dust settle, never made

for slowing down," Tyler sings. And it's more than just what she sings. It's who she is.

After landing in Nashville after high school, Tyler managed to balance the life of a college student with that of an aspiring singer-songwriter. So while she spent her days on campus, she spent her nights and weekends performing with residencies at Whiskey Row and The Twelve Thirty Club, and gigging around town at places like Whiskey Jam, the Listening Room Cafe, 3rd and Lindsley, Tin Roof, plus fairs and music festivals all over the south.

Diamond Rio

The formation that became known as the six-time Vocal Group of the Year, Diamond Rio, was formed in 1989 and consisted of Marty Roe (lead vocals), Jimmy Olander (guitar/banjo), Dana Williams (bass/vocals), Dan Truman (piano), Brian Prout (drums), and Gene Johnson (mandolin/vocals), and up until recently have had no member changes. After a remarkable 33-year journey, the band bid farewell to retiring members Brian Prout and Gene Johnson, and welcomed new bandmates Carson McKee (fiddle/harmony vocals) and

Micah Schweinsberg (drums).

Originating as The Tennessee River Boys in the 1980s, the band evolved into Diamond Rio in 1989. The following year, they signed with Arista Nashville, and in 1991, with the release of "Meet in The Middle," became the first country music group in history to reach No. 1 with a debut single.

The band has 20 Top 10 singles, 15 Top 5 singles and seven No. 1 hits, including, "How Your Love Makes Me Feel," "One More Day," "Beautiful Mess," "I Believe," "Meet in the Middle," "Imagine That" and "Love a Little Stronger."

Known for their charitable commitments, including long-time spokespersons for Big Brothers Big Sisters, the band has raised more than \$1 million for non-profits and received the Minnie Pearl Humanitarian Award.

Allen Higgs

The songwriter and singer from Jacksonville with songs like "Fish Ain't Bitin'," "Distracted," "Kind of Night," "Sometimes," and "Dress Down" actually started as a drummer in church. He got his first guitar when he was 13 or 14, and he refined his act by singing along with George Strait and Alan Jackson on the car radio.

Higgs makes sure there is no doubt where his music genre lies. "County. Always country," he said.

Higgs was a regular at Prevatt's Sports Bar and Grill every Wednesday night, playing a lot of Justin Moore cover songs because his music was easy to play on the guitar.

Martina McBride

Over time, Martina McBride developed a pop-styled crossover sound, similar to Shania Twain and Faith Hill with a string of major hit singles on the Billboard country chart and occasionally on the Adult Contemporary chart. Five of the singles – No. 1 – "Wild Angels," "Blessed," "A Broken Wing," "Wrong Again" and "Safe in the Arms of Love" –

went to No. 1 on the country charts between 1995 and 2001, and one, "I Love You," peaked at No. 1 on the adult contemporary chart in 2003.

McBride has 14 studio albums, two greatest hits compilations, one "live" album, and two additional compilation albums. Eight of her studio albums and two of her compilations have an RIAA Gold certification, or higher. In

the U.S., she has sold more than 14 million albums. In addition, McBride has won the Country Music Association Award for Female Vocalist of the Year Award four times (tied with Reba McEntire for the third-most wins) and the Academy of Country Music's "Top Female Vocalist" award three times. She is also a 14-time Grammy Award nominee.

Jess Kellie Adams

For some, it can take a lifetime to heed the wise words of Dolly Parton: "Find out who you are and do it on purpose." For singer and songwriter Jess Kellie Adams, that awakening came early in her life and career, just in the nick of time.

"My whole life I've questioned who I am. It took seven years in Nashville for me to truly come into my own. My formula is different," she said. "My experiences are the foundation of who I am as a person and an artist."

With influences ranging from The Chicks, Loretta Lynn, Johnny Cash, Miranda Lambert, Martina McBride, Reba McEntire, Earl Thomas Conley and Merle Haggard, honest storytelling lies at the heart of everything Adams does.



Kaden Meeks

Also from Jacksonville, The Kaden Meeks Band is a gateway to an electrifying even. The band fuses the heartfelt sounds of classic country with the upbeat rhythms of classic and

modern hits. Their performances aren't just heard and felt, creating lasting memories and interactive experiences.

Some of their songs include "Jack and Coke," "Boys With Blue Collars," "Right Where She Left Me" and "Cadillac Trail."

For King and Country is a Christian pop duo originally from Australia, composed of brothers Joel and Luke Smallbone. The band has released four studio albums so far. Their music mostly revolves around love, hope, faith, and resilience in the face of adversity. They have earned several accolades over the years, including two Grammy awards.

Seeking to move forward as artists and human beings, For King and Country took a world on the verge, realized man's plight, and created a compelling song cycle to

"Doxology," which closes the project, offers blessings and a glimpse of what we find when we pay attention, embrace the flow, and each other.

The global hitmakers have collaborated with a diverse list of artists, including the legendary Dolly Parton, NEEDTOBREATHE, and Timbaland. Joel and Luke Smallbone are committed to numerous philanthropic efforts focused on human trafficking, children in need, and numerous programs supporting the arts.

The brothers have had the opportunity to create music with some of their musical heroes, like Dolly Parton, Timbaland, Echosmith, Lecrae, Tori Kelly and Kirk Franklin.

"The musical progression for us on this album is a question and a comment for all of us," Joel said. "Looking at the songs – 'Broken Halos,' 'Unity,' 'H.O.P.E,' 'Together' – the greater questions are where the urgency and hope lie. We need to recognize imperfections but not be drowned in shame when we do. Knowing if you ignore (flaws), you can become such ruthless judges of everyone else."

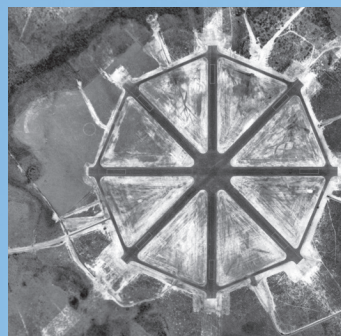

charted 10 singles to the Top 40 of the Billboard Hot 100, including six Top 10 singles and a No. 1, "Every Rose Has Its Thorn."

Michaels has appeared in several films and TV shows, including as a judge on the talent show Nashville Star which led to his country-influenced rock album "Freedom of Sound" in 2005. He starred in the hit VH1 reality show Rock of Love with Bret Michaels and its sequels, which inspired his successful solo album "Rock My World." He was also the winning contestant on NBC's reality show "Celebrity Apprentice 3" and also featured in his own reality docuseries "Bret Michaels: Life As I Know It," which inspired his highest-charting album as a solo artist, "Custom Built," reaching No. 1 on Billboard's Hard Rock chart.

In 2006, Hit Parader ranked Michaels at No. 40 on its list of greatest heavy metal singers of all time.

Throughout the 1980s and early 1990s, Poison was one of the biggest glam metal bands in the world, recording their second album, the multi-platinum selling "Open Up and Say... Ahh!," and their third album, the multi-platinum selling "Flesh & Blood."

Michaels came close to dying when he crashed his Ferrari into a telephone pole. He incurred serious injuries, including broken ribs, a disfigured nose and lost teeth. In 1999, Poison reunited with original guitarist C.C. Deville and embarked on a successful greatest hits reunion tour.

In the next decade, Bret Michaels would split his time between Poison and a successful solo career.

Julia Gulia is a band out of Jacksonville Beach that's been playing for the past six years.

The four-part harmonies and upbeat songs of The Oak Ridge Boys have spawned dozens of Country hits and a Number One Pop smash, earned them Grammy, Dove, CMA and ACM awards and garnered a host of other industry and fan accolades.

Theirs is one of the music industry's most distinctive and recognizable sounds. Every time they step before an audience, the Oaks bring four decades of charted singles and 50 years of tradition to a stage show widely

acknowledged as among the most exciting. And each remains as enthusiastic about the process as they have ever been.

"When I go on stage, I get the same feeling I had the first time I sang with The Oak Ridge Boys," said lead singer Duane Allen.

"This is the only job I've ever wanted to have."

The Oaks represent a tradition that extends back to World War II. The original group, based in Knoxville, Tennessee, began performing Country and Gospel music in nearby Oak Ridge where the atomic bomb was being developed. They called themselves the Oak Ridge Quartet and began regular Grand Ole Opry appearances in the fall of '45. In the mid-fifties, they were featured in Time magazine as one of the top-drawing Gospel groups in the nation.

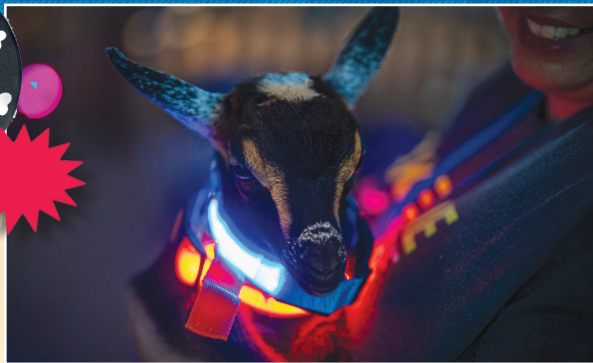

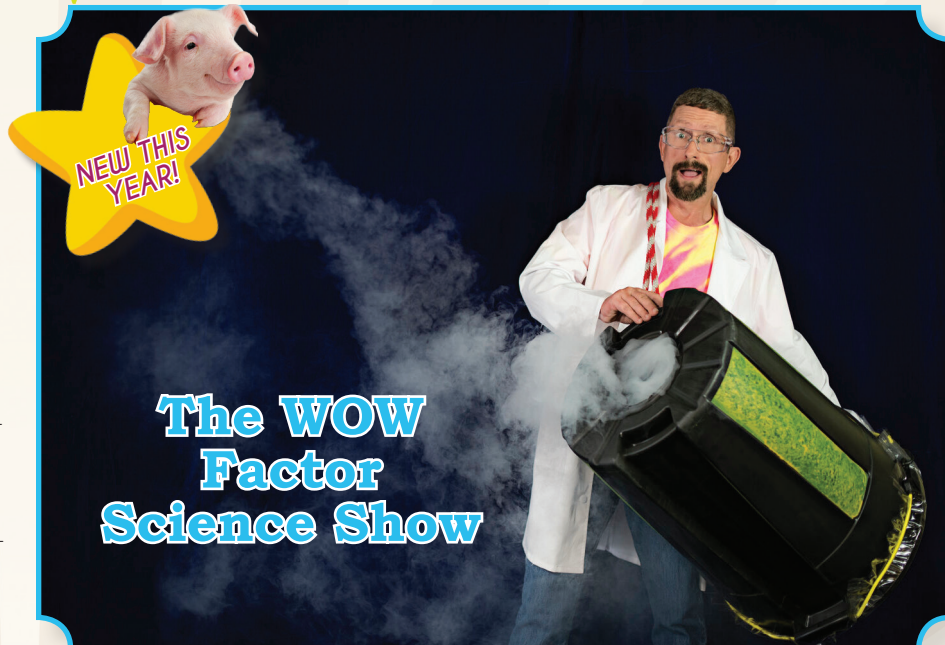

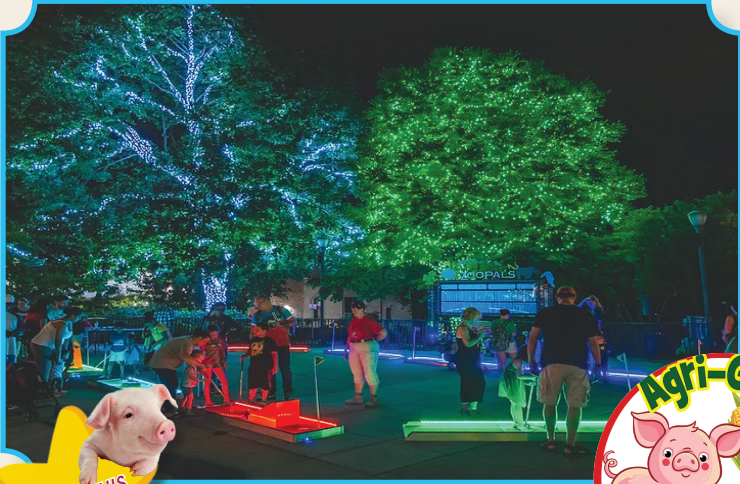

The self-proclaimed world's first and only mobile 3D scanning photo booth will be scanning, transcribing and translating patrons at the Clay County Agricultural Fair on April 4.

The process for creating your own "mini-me" is simple.

Step inside the Shrunk 3D booth and strike a pose. Wait for the cameras to take your photo, which will be a 360-degree panoramic shot. The images will be converted into you – a 3D model of you, that is. You can review the images and choose the figurine's size. It takes about four weeks for the Shrunk 3D to be delivered.

It'll be well worth the wait. What makes a better mantle piece, ornament or gift than you? A miniature, 3D model of you, that is.

"We chose 3D scanning and 3D printing because we could see where those two industries were really going. OK, how can we capture these moments and then create a tangible object with that? With our 3D printing space, we could do both in very high detail," Co-founder Micah Smith said.

"(Incorporating) a 3D scan of your body, it just adds another level to a memory you can capture – a tangible object you can have forever. It's the future of photography," Smith said.

Our Fair Cares collects needed supplies for community organizations

Our Fair Cares is on Thursday, April 9. "The purpose of this program is to shine a light on our commitment to our community and to show appreciation to those that have given so much to us," Clay County Agriculture Fair Executive Director Tasha Hyder said.

This year, the fair will engage with local nonprofits to help organize a food drive and to ensure donations are locally dispersed. The fair selected Clothes Closet and Food Pantry as its beneficiary for the canned goods this year. The Clothes Closet and Food Pantry provide patrons with canned meat and vegetables, fresh produce, rice, dry goods, peanut butter, pasta, and dairy products.

The Clothes Closet and Food Pantry exists to help people in Clay County who are in a crisis. The nonprofit believes assisting a family to meet basic needs and/or pay overdue rent or utilities can enable them to stand inde-

pendently. By allowing people to stay in their homes, we prevent them from having to live on the street. It also strives to assist homeless and transient people by meeting immediate needs with food, clothing, toiletries and blankets.

Each year, hundreds of families are given financial assistance in their time of crisis. The organization provides clothing, food, linens, kitchenware, furniture, baby items, toys, books and financial assistance through St. Catherine of Siena Catholic Church in Orange Park for overdue rent/utilities, medical needs or other special cases. It will provide referrals to other agencies if it can't meet a particular need.

The drive will also benefit Clay Education Foundation and Clay County Animal Services when fairgoers bring school supplies and pet food.

The Clay Education Foundation is a direct

support nonprofit organization designed to strengthen public education in Clay County. By matching community resources with the needs of schools, we ensure teachers and students have the tools to reach their full potential. Dedicated to providing funding for programs and initiatives that tax dollars cannot cover, the Clay Education Foundation solicits funding for these programs from grants and private donors to supplement district budgets. This funding allows for innovation in the classroom, recognition, and programs to drive student success.

Nearly 99% of animals at Clay County Animal Services are adopted – one of the highest live release rates in the state, according to a study at the University of Florida. The county-maintained office has 79 kennels. When it reaches capacity, it sometimes offers free adoptions of pets that have been spayed, neutered, chipped, and received their shots to reduce stress and overcrowding.

"If you bring anything within those three categories to the fair for our Fair Cares



Day on April 4, you get \$5 admission – and that's more than half off," Hyder said. You can bring items to the fairground. The Main Gate and the North Gate will be accepting donations."

Tonja Kallam is used to being in the middle of several projects, but during the 11-day run of the Clay County Agricultural Fair, she will be front and center as the Mayor of Ag-Town.

"My job is to have a lot of fun for 11 days, and hand out stickers and greet people at Ag-Town," Tonja said. "I've always been behind the scenes, and now I'm wearing the mayor's hat and sash. But it's a lot of fun. We'll have a lot of things going on."

Tonja will be joined by Rebecca Bailey, the Fair's AG Education Director of Education. The one thing not lost on either is the word "agriculture" in the name of the Clay County Agriculture Fair.

"I have dedicated my life to the agriculture industry," the owner of Russell's Feed and Farm Supply in Middleburg said. "Agriculture is how we make our living."

Tonja and her husband Bryan operate Kallam Realty Group. She became more involved with farm and agriculture projects when their children became involved with Future Farmers of America.

Executive Director Tasha Hyder said it is a small town in the barn where farming is fun. It is located inside the livestock barn. It features a feed and grocery store, school house, veterinarian office, potato patch and two Ag-Town Experience locations.

It's also home to the wildly popular Mullet Matchup on Sunday, April 7, at 5 p.m., a Husband-Calling contest on Friday, April 12, at 6 p.m., 36 Florida Ag Experience demonstrations and 32 Agracadabra animal shows.

"We have had a booth in the livestock barn during the fair for years. We also love supporting our youth and watching them with their projects," Bailey said. "I took on the Ag Education Director seat for the Clay County Agricultural Fair a year ago. Before then, I spent hours volunteering in the office but did not know all the details, dedication, and planning that went into making our fair a success. It's a lot of work, but I love it. There are a lot of things going on that nobody sees. Being part of the Fair Board is a lot of work, but I'm



very excited to do it."

Rebecca said Ag-Town promotes agriculture with youth organizations like the Future Farmers of America and 4-H.

"We support our youth project here," Rebecca said. "We set up our booth so all the

kids have the supplies they need. Our son has grown up out there. He can go into the goat pens and see how all these works."

For Rebecca, it's more than an exhibit. It's a way of life.

Poultry Pals, Unlimited Opportunities Goats

Livestock shows for those with physical, emotional challenges

Poultry Pals is a new unlimited opportunity event for adults with a permanent physical or intellectual disability who are interested in participating in a livestock show.

It will supplement the Unlimited Opportunities Goat Shows, a popular program that brings children 18 and younger together to learn to work together on agriculture projects and care for goats.

Participants in Poultry Pals are high school graduates or currently in a transition program at a post-high school. They will be paired with a 2024 4-H or FFA member who has experience showing animals at a competitive level and will be considered a Buddy.

The Buddy and the Adult Exhibitor will work together to walk a silkie chicken into the show ring for judging. The adult Exhibitor and their Buddy will work together so everyone is comfortable with the judging process.

Through this competition, Exhibitors will also learn chicken facts to answer questions posed by a judge.

"At the Clay County Fair, we truly believe that the fair is for everyone," said Livestock Chair Kelly Mosley. "We have a lot of different opportunities for individuals with special needs. We have our Unlimited Opportunities Goat Show, which is a goat show for youth with special needs. And then, Tyler Brock and

his mom founded the Poultry Pals Show this year, which is for adults with special needs.

"We just try to make sure that we do everything we can so everyone can come out and enjoy the Fair."

Tyler Brock is the FFA President at Lake Asbury Junior High. He said he started Poultry Pals to continue the impactful legacy of the Unlimited Opportunities Goat Show.

"After doing this amazing (goat) show at the County Fair, which is open to individuals who were in kindergarten through 12th grade,



when those students aged out and graduated, they didn't have that opportunity anymore," he said. "I came to realize there aren't a lot of opportunities for the adults with special needs. I figured I needed to create another opportunity."

Silkie chickens are flightless without spurs. They are soft and docile, and Brock said the inaugural participants quickly adapted to them. The Unlimited Opportunity Goat Show will be on April 7, while the Poultry Pals Show will at 5 p.m. be on April 11.

Fun Fish Show makes a splash



Goldfish have long gotten a bad rep, but these fish have something special underneath their scaly exterior. Maybe you can't walk them around the block or play fetch, but these animals have much to prove.

With lots of patience and determination, goldfish owners across Northeast Florida will unite to show the very best of their fishy friends.

Clay County's goldfish will compete for "grand champion" during the Fun Fish Show on April 8 from 3-4 p.m. at the JP Hall Show Barn Arena. The show will have two divisions; the Juniors for ages 3-12; seniors for 13-18 years old.

"A few of the livestock exhibitors started showing the goldfish that they won at the fair, and it became a tradition," said Blake Kendrick, Juinor Fish Show Superintendent.

There will be two parts to the show: general classes and showmanship. In the general categories, fish will be judged on coloring, frame, eyes, body, fins, size and overall marketability. Judges will be looking at the overall soundness of the fish.

"Judges are looking for fit goldfish. They don't want a goldfish that's too fat or a goldfish that's just bone. They don't like fins that are too small or fins that are too big. It's all about being proportion-



ate," Kendrick said.

During the fish showmanship competition, exhibitors will be judged based on how they show their goldfish. Exhibitors are to enter the ring and circle the judge slowly in a clockwise motion approximately three-to-four feet away.

Fish have to be presented in a clear, plastic container.

"It's competitive in a fun way. It goes back to its roots of being a fun thing for exhibitors to do after the fair," Kendrick said. "But there will also be prizes for the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion."

To enter, the fish shown must be of goldfish species. If officials cannot identify the fish's species, it won't be allowed in the show.

Entries will be in person only. Check-in will be outside of the arena. Please have your fish, container and show stick ready for inspection upon check-in.

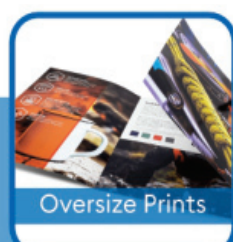

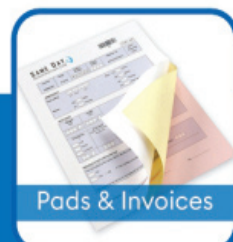

Deggeller Attractions was part of the first Clay County Agriculture Fair in 1987, and it's provided amusement rides and a carnival atmosphere since. There were just a handful of rides at the first Fair. This year, there will be more than 46, including the new Wave Swinger, where riders are suspended from the top of a rotating carousel.

"I was told on that first year, they drew out the plans on a napkin," Jamie Deggeller said of the layout. "The Fair has grown by leaps and bounds since. Clay is definitely top for us in Florida – and we do a lot of fairs in Florida." Armbands again allow riders to enjoy most rides without buying individual tickets. By using armbands, riders can avoid standing in line for tickets and avoid person-to-person contact.

Patrons can enjoy some of Deggeller's most popular attractions, like Hang 10, Searay, Spaceport, Hydra, Riptide, Starship, Vertigo, Typhoon, Zero Gravity and Musik Express.

There are plenty of family rides, like Crazy Chopper, Dragon Coaster, Magic Maze, Merry-Go-Round, New York Taxi, Tornado, Bananas, Circus Train, Haunted Mansion, Bumper Boats, Farm Tractors, Happy Swing, Teacups, Safari Bus, Quad Runner and Jump Around.

Deggeller is known for its spectacular assortment of amusement rides and keen

sense of quality and detail, with an emphasis on safety. It's an industry leader in customer service and is proud to be ranked in the Outdoor Amusement Business Association's Circle of Excellence. Safety at Deggeller Attractions is its top priority. Prior to opening, each piece of equipment is carefully inspected by a skilled midway manager and a ride superintendent using a certified inspection checklist specific to each attraction.

Based on other fairs this year, Deggeller expects big crowds at the Clay County Fairgrounds.

Hydra

The Hydra is one of the most popular rides on the midway. Upon boarding, riders are secured with over-the-shoulder restraints. As the claw begins to rotate, it starts to swing back and forth until it reaches its full height of 60 feet in the air! Combining a spinning and swinging motion, the Extreme provides riders with a completely unique riding experience.

Rider requirement: minimum 48 inches
Ride intensity: maximum

Super Shot

Riders are safely secured in the ride vehicle using a seat belt and over-the-shoulder restraint. As the vehicle slowly rises, riders enjoy

a breathtaking view of the midway. Once at the top, the vehicle pauses and plummets to the ground when the riders least expect it!

Rider requirement: minimum 48 inches
Ride intensity: maximum

Spaceport

One of the tallest rides at the fair! Take a spin around at speeds up to 60 mph as you spin in your seat.

The Americana Carousel is a classic, American-themed carousel sporting a patriotic red, white and blue color scheme. Each of the

Rider requirement: minimum 42 inches

Ride intensity: mild

The Scooter

The Scooter, otherwise known as the bumper car, is a timeless classic. Riders can

crash into one another without causing an accident or receiving a traffic violation!

Rider requirement: minimum 42 inches with an adult

Ride intensity: medium

Zipper

The ride vehicles travel around the perimeter of the boom at four revolutions per minute, not particularly fast, but the "flip" around the end of the oblong frame causes a sudden burst of speed and sends the compartments flipping end over end. The boom itself rotates at 7.5 rpm in the same direction as the pulley system.

This combined but offset rotation provides each vehicle with a unique and unpredictable experience.

Rider requirement: minimum 48 inches (no single riders)

Parking

Is FREE at the Fairgrounds. Please allow the Clay County Sheriff Deputies to direct you to park. Be sure to lock your vehicle, and take note of where you have parked. Admission prices are \$12.00 for adults (13-59), seniors \$8.00 (60+), \$7.00 for children (6-12), and children 5 and under are free. Gate admission will end 90 minutes prior to the listed closing times. No admission will be allowed after that time.

ATMs

ATMs are conveniently located throughout the Fairgrounds. (see Fairgrounds directory for locations)

Rentals

Are provided by Clay County Fair Association located behind the Main Gate while supplies last. We charge the following rates: \$50 per scooter daily, \$35 per scooter half day, \$10 per double stroller, \$5 per single stroller & \$15 per wagon. Isolating headphones.

Restrooms

Are located at the main gate, outside the Cattlemen's Arena, across from Exhibit Building 1 and next to Kiddy Land on the midway. Portable restrooms are also available throughout the Fairgrounds.

Cool Down Areas

For the convenience of our guests we have two cool down areas: Exhibit Bldg 2 and the tent near the Livestock Barns. Both areas include picnic tables for eating.

Diaper Changing

Facilities are available in all permanent restrooms.

Pets

We love pets, but the fair is not pet friendly. Pets are not permitted on the Fairgrounds except service animals in

compliance with the ADA. Emotional support not allowed.

Smoking

We are a smoke free fair, but have created two smoke zones for your convenience. The zones are located behind the main gate restrooms and near the north gate restrooms.

Phone Charging

Located in Cattlemen's & EZ Rest Area near the barn.

Protests

During the Fair, the Fair does not provide space for meet and greets, campaign rallies, fundraisers or other political events. Political signs and picketing are allowed only in designated areas.

We are alcohol free

While the Clay County Commission approved the sale of beer and wine at the Clay County Fairgrounds in 2018, the Clay County Agricultural Fair will still remain alcohol free.

"We have no desire to serve or allow the consumption of alcoholic beverages at the Clay County Fair," wrote Tasha Hyder, Executive Director of the Clay County Agricultural Fair, in a letter to the Clay County Board of County Commissioners.

"It is our position that we will remain an alcohol-free fair, regardless of the county's decision to allow alcohol on the fairgrounds or not.
