Reunited

Refugee Celia E. Ochoa shares her story in memoir, 'Row Your Boat Cuban Refugee'

This is the first part in a four-part series telling the story of two women who were at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba during the 1994 Cuban Rafters Crisis. Celia E. Ochoa was a Cuban refugee. Tanya Lea was a naval officer. Each shared their perspective with Clay Today during the humanitarian crisis from both sides of the fence. The two women discovered compassion in a challenging time during both of their lives. Inspiringly, 30 years later, they reunited in Florida.

MIDDLEBURG – Celia E. Ochoa lives in Middleburg now, but it was nearly 30 years ago when she, her family and six other passengers were ankle-deep in the surf along Cuba's northern coast, boarding a boat her father had soldered together from scrap metal.

Their boat embarked from Santa Cruz del Norte, a Cuban fishing town, at 2 a.m.

On Aug. 22, 1994. More than 90 miles of pitch-black open ocean separated the family from the U.S. and their hoped-for freedom.

They were terrified, and rightfully so. While evading authorities in safe houses, Celia's father spent months building the boat. He mounted an engine, but it would be a stretch to say that his creation would

Record crowds, lively livestock, great food, fun rides make Fair a success

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – When they cut the ribbon to open this year's Clay County Agricultural Fair, Executive Director Tasha Hyder was already thinking ahead to 2025.

Everything had been planned for months and was in place to make this year's 11-day event "fair-tastic," so Hyder focused more on exceeding expectations next year.

"This was the best fair I've personally been in during my nine years here," she said. "Everything went very smooth. The setup was smooth. The 11 days were smooth. We had bad weather one day, Thursday, but it was early and moved out of the area quickly."

Last year's Fair attracted a record crowd of 157,000. More than 170,000 passed through the turnstiles this year, including single-day records for a Sunday, Monday and Wednesday. On April 13, the final Saturday, the Fair drew a single-day record 25,999 people, Hyder said.

Next year's Fair will be April 3-13. Hyder said some new ideas would include celebrity showmanship contests featuring elected officials who showed livestock inside the Cattlemen's Arena.

"That was a hoot," Hyder said. "It turned out to be a big deal, especially since so many 'celebrities' participated in it."

Another successful program was Our Fair Cares. With the help of Green Cove Springs Winn-Dixie Store Manager Mike Finnick and his employees and the Fair's

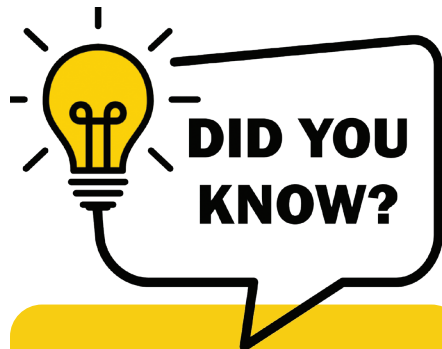

Every week, Clay Today will test your knowledge on various topics. This week, women's basketball.

The Iowa-Louisiana State women's game in the Elite Eight shattered records as the most-watched women's basketball game in United States history, with 12.3 million viewers. 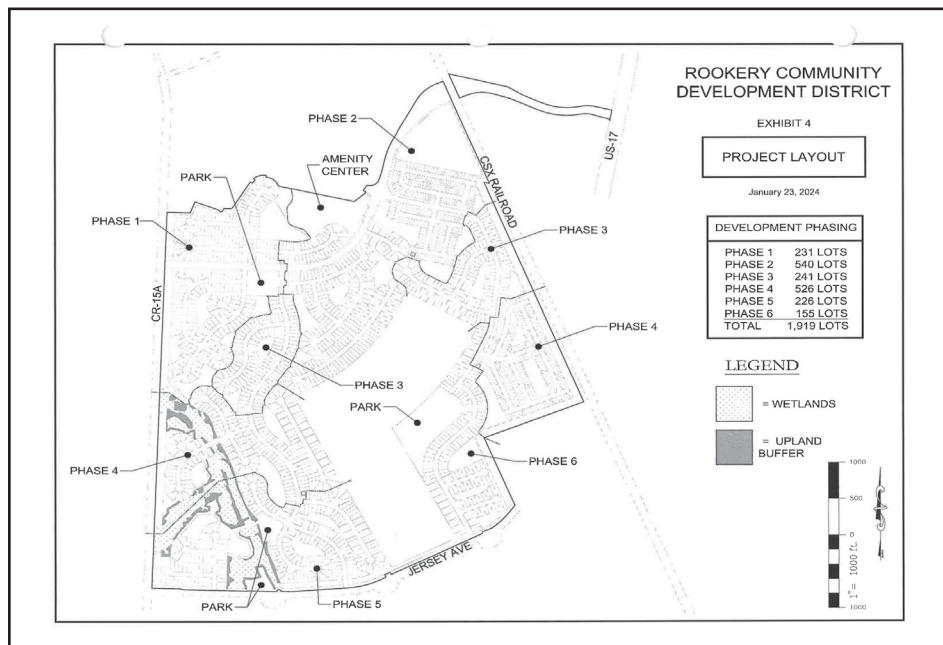
Rookery a step closer to setting up its CDD

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The Rookery passed the first hurdle of its plan to create a Community Development District when the City Council passed the first reading of its request to set up a taxing district to provide infrastructure services for a projected 1,919-home community.

The Rookery will be completed in six phases between the railroad tracks near U.S. Highway 17 – north of the First Coast Expressway, east of Green Cove Avenue and east of County Road 15A south of the city. It will include an amenity center and three parks.

"It complies with the statutory criteria, essentially, that it's true and correct and it's comprehensive, interrelated, which we would say ours is because it's more than that, a minimal separate government, which we are because we provide consent from the landowner and a better alternative than perhaps an HOA because we are a governmental entity," said Katie Buchanan, an attorney representing the developer D.R. Horton and the initial CDD Board of Directors. The infrastructure plan would call for the Rookery to be responsible for



roadways, water and wastewater structures, stormwater management, landscaping, recreation, building electric service, boulevard and local street lighting. To accomplish this, it would be allowed to tax its residents separately from the city.

The city would still own and maintain the roads, electric grid and boulevard lighting, while Clay County Utility Authority

would provide water and wastewater services. As such, both entities would be paid by the CDD. In other business, the council agreed to annex the abandoned Truemont Property at the corner of U.S. 17 and State Road 16 and to rezone it to Industrial.

The city council meets at City Hall on the first and third Tuesday of each month at 7 p.m.

Precision Dermatology makes pitch for parking on Blake Avenue

ORANGE PARK – The town council appeared to strike a short-term compromise between Precision Dermatology and nearby residents during last Tuesday's meeting by continuing to permit streetside parking on Blake Avenue along commercial buildings but to prohibit doing so along residences.

Talks between Precision and Blake Avenue residents began earlier this year, although the controversy allegedly stretches back to 2018. Residents complained to the council that workers from the dermatology clinic were instructed to park on the street to make room in the parking lot for its patients.

The town council committed itself to unclogging Blake Avenue, resulting in a draft of the "Blake Avenue Amendment" during its meeting last month.

Patients and staff packed Town Hall last Tuesday to join in solidarity with Dr. Leonard Shvartzman and his clinic, making numerous pleas against passing the "Blake

Avenue Amendment."

"Dr. Shvartzman is the eminent dermatologist around. People my age need his presence," one Precision patient and Orange Park resident said.

"This man has saved my life at least once. Maybe twice. To force this man out of business would be a tragedy," another patient said.

The residents responded in favor of the ordinance.

"It would seem to me he has proven our point tonight. You can see the number of people in this meeting, patients and employees, that have gotten up to speak for him. There's just an inadequate amount of parking for his business. We don't want him to leave Orange Park. We want him to find somewhere that has adequate parking," one resident said.

The town council amended the ordinance before passing it unanimously. Since Blake Avenue is a mixed commercial and residential street, town council decided to continue to permit streetside parking along commercial properties, such as Precision

and Dreamette.

On the larger residential side of Blake, parking is prohibited (east of the commercial buildings to River Road) Monday through Friday from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. except on holidays. That specific residential portion of Blake Avenue would be marked off with street signs to let commuters know when and where parking is prohibited.

The fine is \$25.

The ordinance also includes a provision for commercial or heavy-use vehicles attempting to park on a public street or right-of-way, which would be enforced town-wide. The fine is \$100.

Shvartzman spoke with Clay Today following the decision.

"When we moved to that office, there was street parking. To change that seems somewhat unfair," he said.

Shvartzman said he has been working in Orange Park for 25 years treating more than 130,000 skin cancer cases. He wants to continue doing so.

"We are committed to working with the community. We value the local homeowners. We will obey the ordinance as written. I'm heartened by the response by patients and staff. We hope to be in Orange Park for a long time," he said.

Calling a need for peer support for 911 dispatchers, first responders

CLAY COUNTY – Out of the thousands of calls Mary Jensen answered throughout her 20-year career as a 911 dispatcher in South Florida, the memory of a singular gunshot still rings out with haunting clarity.

“An elderly gentleman had called one afternoon,” Jensen said. “He asked for the police to respond. When I tried to question what he needed, he just said to send somebody right away and hung up.”

Jensen called back and asked the woman who had picked him up to quickly locate him.

“As she walked into his bedroom, that’s when the gunshot went off. He had taken his own life,” Jensen said. “I can still hear that sound. I can still hear her scream.”

National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week, which is being celebrated through April 20, is not only the ideal time to recognize current and former 911 dispatchers like Jensen but also to ensure they have the proper tools to process the traumas they face every day.

Emergency dispatchers become part of traumatic events unfolding in real-time. That constant weight takes an emotional toll that can lead to damaging and sometimes life-threatening behaviors. Jensen said she’s seen the negative impacts of the job manifest differently among her friends.

“Some turn to alcohol, and some turn to suicide,” she said.

Statistically, first responders and dispatchers have higher rates of relationship issues, alcohol or drug abuse, and suicide attempts and completions. In fact, more than 1,250 first responders in the United States have tragically taken their own lives since 2018, according to Blue H.E.L.P. Eighty-one of those were in Florida. However, Jensen said that seeking help – especially from a peer – can make a significant positive difference in dispatchers’ mental health.

Jensen said she reached her breaking point on the day of that suicide, but that a colleague, who happened to be part of their organization’s critical incident stress management team, recognized she was upset and took her on a walk. That simple outreach from a peer proved remarkably effective in helping Jensen process the trauma and feel supported. No longer an emergency dispatcher, Jensen has come full circle as one of dozens of peer specialists on the other line when a first responder needs help. Jensen co-founded and serves as chief operations officer for Zero Life Center, one of several providers that administer a First Responder Peer Support program developed and managed by LSF Health Systems. The program employs specially trained peer specialists, who are current or former first responders or military members, to provide confidential and free support to first responders and their family members across 20 counties in Northeast and Northern Central Florida, including Clay County. This includes dispatchers, police officers,

firefighters, EMTs and corrections officers. By calling 211, a first responder can talk privately with someone who has been in their shoes.

Dr. Christine Cauffield, CEO of LSF Health Systems, said with the split-second decisions dispatchers make each day, it is only natural that they carry a lot of emotional weight on their shoulders.

“With this program, they have a free, confidential way to release some of that burden,” Cauffield said. “They are there for us ‘first,’ so our program is designed to be there for them ‘now.’”

Words don't do Augusta National Golf Club justice

Few places are hard for me to describe. Shoot, I've been known to talk about not being able to talk.

The Augusta National Golf Club is one of them.

I've been lucky, not make that privileged, to have been assigned to cover six Masters tournaments. For those who haven't been able to walk past the bamboo fencing off busy and cluttered Washington Road, it's like stepping off Blanding Boulevard at the Orange Park Mall at rush hour and into the most majestic canvas of solitude, color and opulence.

Television does a remarkable job showing viewers the splendor of the course, but it only goes so far. It's a two-dimensional representation that lacks the depth, true vibrant colors, the exhilaration of the patrons – don't ever call them the "crowd" or "gallery" – and the steepness of the hills, especially on the back nine.

When they talk about Amen Corner, it's really a hole. By the time you're at the No. 13 tee box, you're so far down in a hole you can only see the sky when you look toward the clubhouse. That's why you start your climb uphill for the final six holes.

My first Masters was in 1986. I walked down to 13, a sharp dogleg left, and stood on top of the hill facing the tee. The fairway turned to my right with the green surrounded by hundreds of blooming azaleas. No wonder the hole is called Azalea.

Jack Nicklaus hit his tee shot toward me, and the ball bounced 25 yards short, kicked left and rolled 40 yards downhill. He had an easy six iron to the green, where he two-putted for an easy birdie.

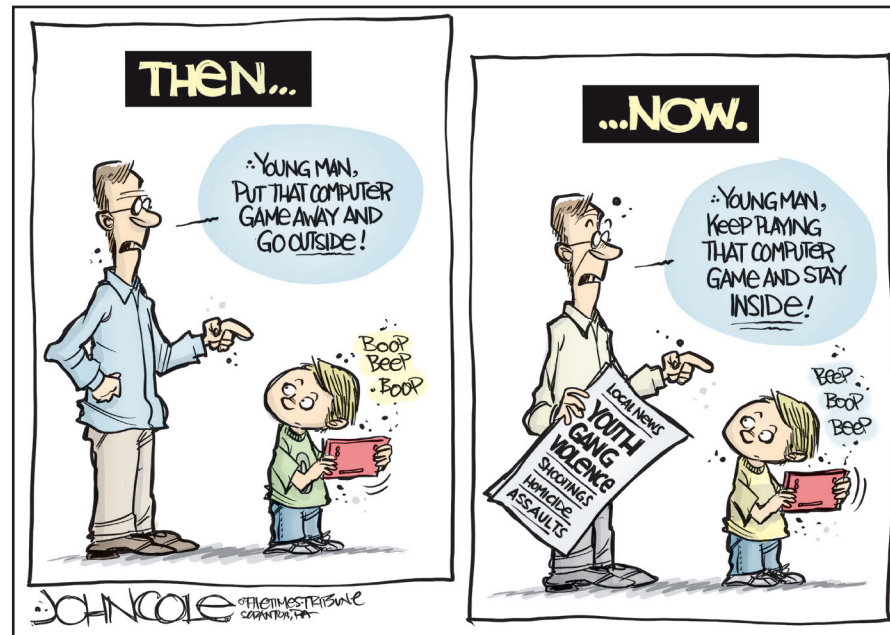
He talked about that tee shot during his post-round interview and mentioned aiming at a guy wearing a yellow shirt. I looked down at my yellow shirt and said loudly, "You're welcome!" We both laughed. Nicklaus went on to put on his sixth and final green jacket three days later.

I was in the clubhouse with Payne Stewart in 1989, watching the playoff between Scott Hoch and Nick Faldo. Stewart had a beer in his hand when Hoch started to putt. Stewart yelled, "Do it for America!" Hoch's two-footer never touched the cup. Faldo won the playoff on No. 11 with a 30-foot birdie putt. That's why he got the nickname "Scott Choke."

There's so much history at Augusta. The tournament used Army soldiers to post scores on the leaderboards until the 1950s, and other soldiers from nearby Camp Gordon (now Fort Gordon) were given free passes to the tournament. The soldiers latched onto a player who played

The nice surprise was at the J.P. Hall Livestock Barn. I spent hours looking at the animals and watching teens grooming their entries for shows. To them, it was more than a competition. It was personal. You truly understand why the word "Agricultural" is prominent in the name of the Fair and why it always will be.

In 11 days, I also got a better lay of the land and the routine. The hard work of the Fair Association paid off with five daily attendance records and an overall record.

But here are some secrets for future Fairs – and you should come back and explore everything the Fair offers.

Crowds and traffic start to build shortly after school hours. The difference between arriving at 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. can be as much as two to four miles of traffic.

Another hint I learned when I worked at Walt Disney World (great day, has it been that long?) 50 years ago is don't play the games when you arrive unless you want to lug a four-foot-tall Teddy bear all day. If you do win a stuffed animal early, consider taking it to your car. The extra walk is better than carrying it all day – unless you have one of those motorhome-sized strollers.

Occupational therapy empowers people to live productive lives

Dear Editor,

Some people say you are born into a profession, and I like to think that rings true for me. April is occupational therapy month. I am writing to raise awareness and educate readers on the value of occupational therapy. It is well known within the occupational therapy community that we must explain our profession to most people we meet. In honor of the month we celebrate our profession, I would like to take a step toward changing that.

"Occupations" can be defined as the tasks in everyday life that occupy your time. Occupational therapy empowers individuals of all ages to participate in their daily lives by using individualized strategies and environmental adaptations to increase independence after experiencing or living with injury, illness and disability. This may look like recommending adaptive equipment, working on cognitive strategies during meal preparation and grocery shopping, or practicing safety techniques while showering; the possibilities are truly endless.

However, the goals worked towards in occupational therapy must be functional and meaningful to the client. There is great value in being invested in the work that it

takes to reach a goal. The profession emphasizes stepping into the context of the client's life, providing our expertise and support, and then stepping out. The goal is for clients to live, participate, and get back to the tasks they need and want to do with as much independence as they would like. While people may doubt the impact of these everyday activities, there is evidence to support the value and benefit of occupational therapy services.

In 2016, Rogers et al. published a study finding that occupational therapy was the only spending category with a statistically significant relationship with lowering hospital readmission rates when additional spending was added to the category; this relationship was found when studying heart failure, pneumonia, and acute myocardial infarction (heart attack). The 2016 study supports the idea that investing in occupational therapy leads to better health outcomes over time by decreasing hospital readmissions. If you know an occupational therapy practitioner, remember to wish them a happy occupational therapy month this April. The profession will continue to defend the dignity of each client by viewing them through a lens that emphasizes strengths, adaptability and purpose.

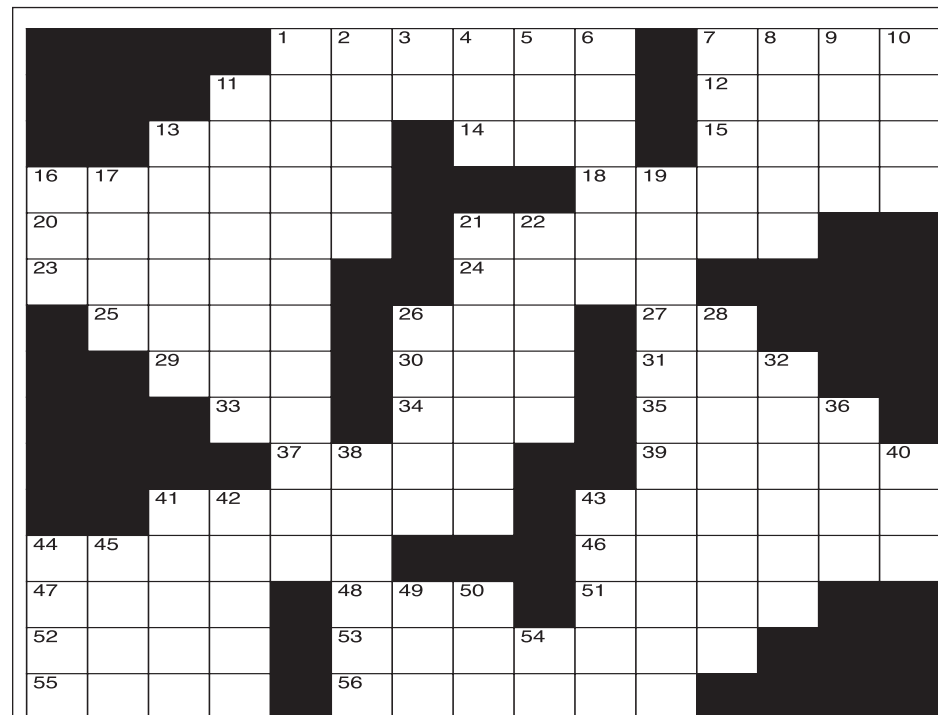

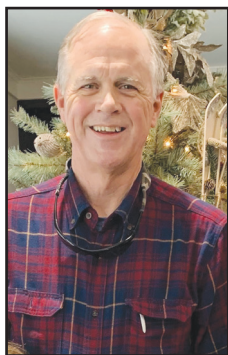

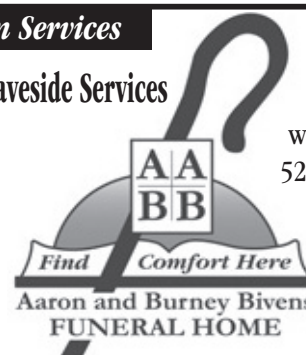

Mike Roess Gold Head Branch Park celebrates 85th birthday Sunday

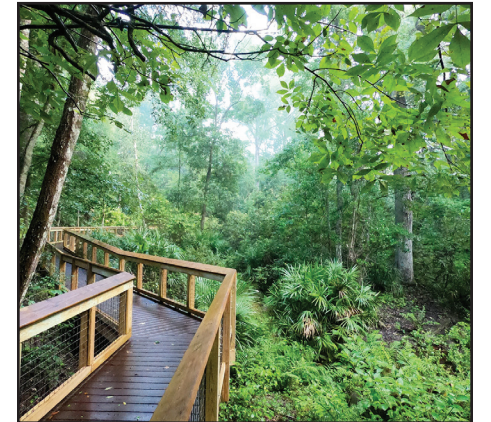
KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – Mike Roess Gold Head Branch State Park will have a cake-cutting ceremony on Sunday, April 21, at 1 p.m. at the Recreation Hall to commemorate its 85th birthday as a state park.

The event on State Road is free from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., with a park entry fee of \$5 per vehicle. The park will have an activity that will encourage visitors to explore several places throughout the park, including the trails, picnic area, a historic cabin and more.

In 1935, 25 craftsmen and skilled laborers from Company 2444 gathered at Gold Head Branch State Park. Over four years, they led hundreds of the younger Civilian Conservation Corps youth and taught them their trades.

Together, they established CCC Camp SP-5. Some stonemasons used limestone rocks to create so many of the distinctive features in the structures at the park. They built roads and planted trees. They diverted one of the Gold Head Branch branches to Little Lake Johnson.

Gold Head’s special features are a system of springs in a steep side ravine (Gold Head Branch) and sinkhole lakes in a karst landscape on the central Florida ridge. Scientists have found carbon-dated



pollen in the sediment of the lakes. They found that Sheeler Lake is one of the oldest sinkhole lakes in the park at an estimated 23,900 years. Another sinkhole lake, Kingsley Lake – located at Camp Blanding – is thought by some to be one million years old. The park was not untouched by man; there are the remains of a gristmill and dam, a historic church and a farmhouse dating back to the turn of the 20th Century.

The park was dedicated on April 15, 1939. At first, the park was simply known as “Gold Head Branch,” until 1966 when the Florida Board of Parks and Historic Monuments changed the name to honor the late Mike Roess, who died in 1952. It is considered one of the first state parks in Florida’s history.

be in seafaring shape. The boat and motor weren't tested. The Ochoa family wasn't even sure it would float.

Still, for the family, this was a shot in the dark they had to take.

In her memoir "Row Your Boat Cuban Refugee," Celia chronicles her life growing up and escaping Cuba in the grim aftermath of a family and national tragedy. Gen. Arnaldo Ochoa, a cousin to Celia's father, was executed by the communist government.

Fidel Castro awarded Ochoa Hero of the Revolution for his success in leading the Cuban contingency in the Angola Civil War. Five years later, Ochoa, the highest-ranking general in Cuba, was accused of corruption, drug trafficking, and treason.

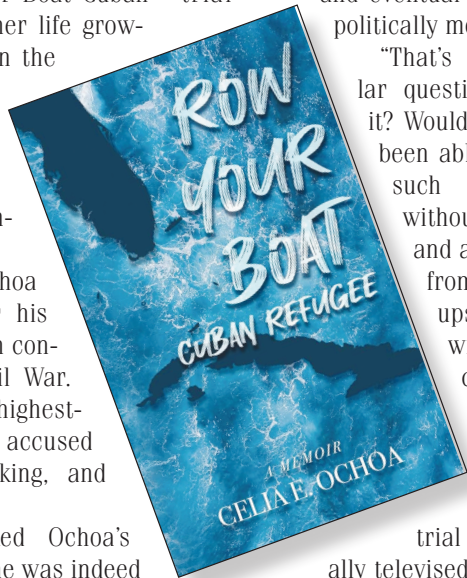
The accusations shocked Ochoa's family and the nation since he was indeed considered a hero to the Cuban people. He was beloved and applauded for epitomizing the revolution's ideals and the international socialist movement.

Clay Today was consulted by two professors for their expertise in the historical context.

"Arnaldo Ochoa was a decorated military leader and a rising star. The sentiment

was he may have gotten too big for his britches," Professor Michael Bustamante from the University of Miami said.

Ochoa was tied to Pablo Escobar and was accused of granting Escobar's operation permission to station and pass through Cuba while skimming money off the top. It is still debated whether the accusations, trial and eventual execution were politically motivated.



"That's the million-dollar question. Did he do it? Would he really have been able to coordinate such an operation without permission and acknowledgment from the higher-ups? There is a widespread perception that Ochoa was made to be the scapegoat. The trial was nationally televised and filmed in a weird, soap-opera-like way," he said.

"The Ochoa trial was this 'Stalinist' thing," Professor Lillian Guerra from the University of Florida said.

"It was chilling. It unmasked the true nature of the state for the millions of Cubans watching on live television," she said.

It is widely accepted that on the day of his execution, Ochoa requested not to be

blindfolded and to be able to give the command. Fidel Castro granted both requests. He faced the firing squad and gave the command on July 13, 1989.

Guerra said during the trial, protestors spray painted "8A" (Ocho-A for "Ochoa") across city streets nationwide as a statement of solidarity, an act which also would have been considered treason.

Whether it was a way to quash an upcoming political rival or not, the consequence was permanent. The Ochoa family was struck with grief. Ochoa's life, the family's pride, was stolen from them in such a disgraceful way. The family was forced to carry on.

In her memoir, Celia wrote, "Sharing a last name with Gen. Arnaldo Ochoa was basically the equivalent of being branded with a target on your back."

The Ochoa name, coupled with Celia's father being a fugitive facing 20 years in prison, was why the family rushed and risked their lives to escape the communist government in Cuba. The only feasible escape off the island was by sea.

There's this profound moment in Celia's memoir that occurs immediately after the family embarks from Santa Cruz del Norte. Worst-case scenarios pile up one after the other—seawater flooding the boat, the navigator dropping the compass into the sea, and realizing they had been navigating in the wrong direction for hours—all while the lights lining Cuba's coastline are still within eyesight.

Setback after setback, any other family

would have seen this as a sign to turn the boat back to shore.

In an inspiring display of determination or desperation, Celia's father took the helm, followed the North Star and pressed unflinchingly forward.

"There was no turning 'back moment' for my father. It was now or never," Celia said later in an interview with Clay Today.

It was a decision that would change their lives forever.

Celia, her family and the six other passengers were not alone on the Florida Straights. They were joined by 35,000 "Balseros," the Spanish word for "rafters," in what would be known as the "1994 Cuban Rafter Crisis."

In her memoir, Celia describes her odyssey on the sea as she saw it at age 6 – a flotilla of rafts and wreckage headed to Florida.

The total number of Cubans who perished at sea is a disputed figure. For 1994, Guerra estimated the number to be in the tens of thousands.

A U.S. Coast Guard ship eventually intercepted the 10 passengers on the Ochoa boat and picked up hundreds of other stragglers as the ship made its rounds.

The Ochoa family once thought they would never see Cuba again, but the Coast Guard transported them back to the island.

But not back to their homes.

Next week follows Celia's experience in the "legal no man's land" – The Detention Center at Guantanamo Bay.

Opioid epidemic creates additional challenges for child welfare system

Communities focus on National Child Abuse Prevention Month

CLAY COUNTY - We recognize National Child Abuse Prevention Month in April, yet we know that protecting children is always our responsibility.

A recent report developed by Casey Family Programs addresses the impact of substance use disorders on the child welfare system. While parental substance misuse has been a factor in children entering the system for many years, the opioid epidemic and increased number of overdose deaths have resulted in new challenges and an increase in the number of families impacted by issues of abuse and neglect. Substance use disorder is a disease that

can be treated and managed, and recovery is possible. However, the process must include multiple resources, partners, and collaborative relationships within a community.

In Clay County, our system of care for keeping children safe is based on the premise that helping to build strong, healthy families involves the whole community. This includes child welfare staff, law enforcement/first responders, mobile crisis and trauma support, local and state government, courts, hospitals and primary healthcare providers, behavioral healthcare providers, school staff, faith-based communities, social service and nonprofit agencies along with local businesses, advocates and concerned citizens.

The Casey Family report outlines practical strategies that may help systems provide the care needed to families. These include the early identification of families in need of substance use disorder treatment, equitable and timely access to assessment and treatment services, recovery support services, and family-centered treatment

services. By providing timely access to needed services, we can help develop parental resilience, offer concrete support in times of need, and encourage social connections, all of which are protective factors that strengthen families and may reduce the incidence of abuse and neglect.

As with any disease, education, prevention, and early intervention efforts are important, as well as having accessible treatment options available for individuals ready to begin treatment.

Different from other diseases is the stigma often associated with seeking help for a substance use disorder. As a community, we are working to remove barriers to care, reduce stigma and increase the number of resources available to support families. At the same time, they navigate the challenges associated with parental substance use. By sharing resources, supporting innovative local initiatives, including the Community Health Improvement Plan, getting involved, and staying engaged, we believe we can continue to make a difference and show that we can build a safer, healthier community, one life, one family at a time.

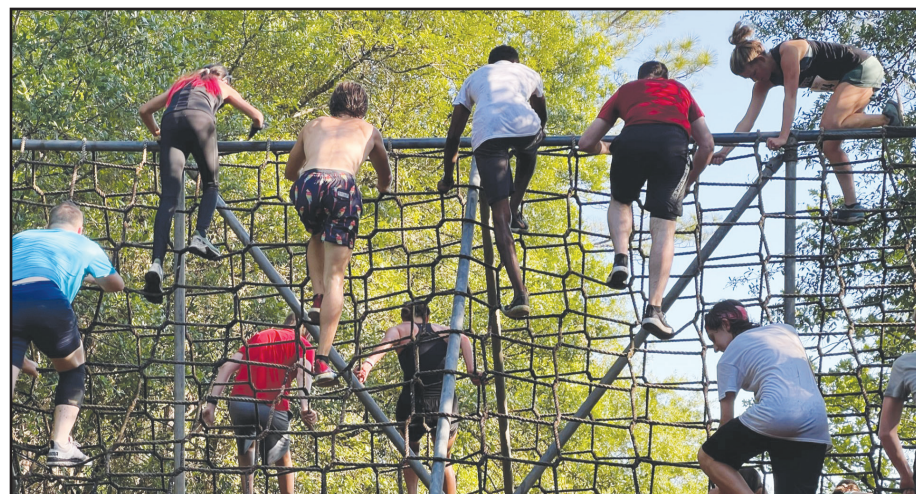
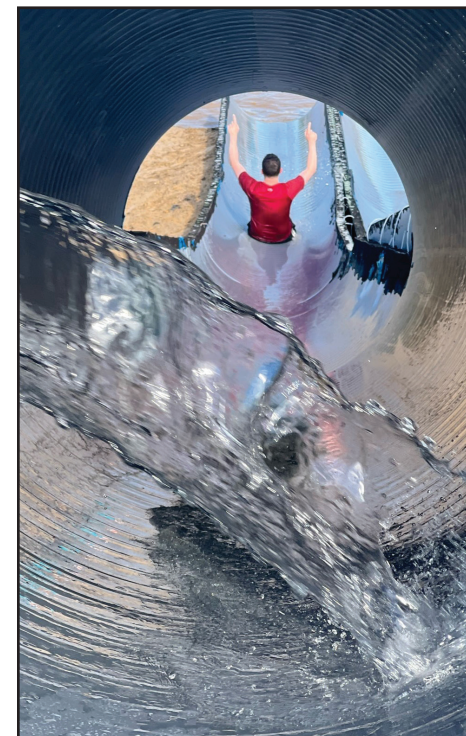

Keystone Heights felon pleads guilty to possessing ammunition

JACKSONVILLE – U.S. Attorney Roger B. Handberg announced Allen Tereal Grimes, 33, of Keystone Heights, pleaded guilty to possession of ammunition by a convicted felon. Grimes faces up to 15 years in federal prison and forfeiture of the ammunition, which is alleged to be traceable to his offense. A sentencing date has not yet been set. Grimes made his initial appearance in federal court on March 4, and was ordered detained.

According to court records, on Aug. 11, Grimes was in possession of Winchester 9 mm ammunition, among other ammunition. At the time of the incident, Grimes had seven prior felony convictions, including battery on a law enforcement officer, resisting arrest with violence, fleeing and eluding a police officer, felony battery, and assault with intent to commit to a felony. As a previously convicted felon, Grimes is prohibited from possessing ammunition under federal law.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives—Jacksonville Office investigated the case, which Assistant U.S. Attorney Kevin C. Frein is prosecuting.

This case is part of Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN), a program bringing together all levels of law enforcement and the communities they serve to reduce violent crime and gun violence and to make our neighborhoods safer for everyone. On May 26, 2021, the Department launched a violent crime reduction strategy strengthening PSN based on these core principles: fostering trust and legitimacy in our communities, supporting community-based organizations that help prevent violence from occurring in the first place, setting focused and strategic enforcement priorities and measuring the results.

Seatbelt stop turns into arrest for trafficking meth, fentanyl

MIDDLEBURG – A Jacksonville man was arrested for trafficking methamphetamine and fentanyl after he was stopped by a Clay County Sheriff's Office deputy on April 10 for not wearing a seatbelt while driving on Blanding Boulevard.

Richard Basil Brown, 50, was also charged with possession of drug paraphernalia. After the stop, K-9 Ory conducted a sniff search of the exterior of the car and alerted deputies of the likely odor of illegal narcotics. Deputies found methamphetamine, fentanyl, glass pipes, a scale and straws inside a bookbag on the passenger seat. His bond was set at \$155,005.

Jacksonville men busted for trafficking fentanyl, possessing cocaine

MIDDLEBURG – Men seen leaving a house suspected of selling drugs were stopped on April 10 and arrested for trafficking and possession of fentanyl.

Clay County Sheriff's Office K-9 Ory alerted deputies of the likely presence of illegal narcotics during an exterior sniff search of a car being driven by Nicholas Adam Lee, 40, of Jacksonville.

Deputies didn't find anything on Lee during an initial search, but they found a plastic baggie containing \$289.90 in cash and cocaine in the underwear of passenger Scott Alan Brooks, 51, of Jacksonville.

Lee was charged with trafficking fentanyl, possession of cocaine, Buprenorphine and drug paraphernalia, while Brooks was charged with trafficking cocaine and fentanyl. According to the arrest report, deputies then found fentanyl and crack cocaine in Lee's wallet. They also found glass bulbs with burnt residue that tested positive for fentanyl.

Brooks' bond was \$500,003, while Lee's was \$405,011.

Woman accused of pawning 32 guns taken from grandfather

ORANGE PARK – Bond was set at \$510,153 for a 26-year-old woman who was accused of stealing 32 guns from her grandfather and pawning them.

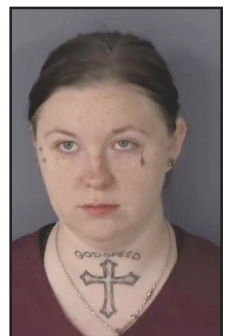

Middleburg man gets three years for having illegal sawed-off shotgun

JACKSONVILLE – Chief U.S. District Judge Timothy J. Corrigan sentenced Paul Steven Hulbert, 28, of Middleburg, to three years in federal prison for the unlawful possession of an unregistered National Firearms Act firearm, a sawed-off shotgun. Hulbert made his initial appearance in federal court on November 18, 2022, and was ordered detained. He entered a guilty plea on June 20, 2023.



According to Paul Steven Hulbert court documents and public records, in May 2021, a court in Clay County issued a "Temporary Injunction for Protection Against Domestic Violence with Minor Children" against Hulbert. The court extended the injunction until September 2022. The injunction expressly prohibited Hulbert from possessing firearms and directed him to surrender any firearms to the Clay County Sheriff's Office. In October 2021, Hulbert was con-

victed in Clay County of the misdemeanor crime of domestic battery. After the domestic battery conviction and issuance of the domestic violence injunction, both of which prohibited him from possessing firearms, Hulbert obtained seven firearms, including rifles, pistols and a shotgun.

On May 16, 2022, members of the CCSO went to Hulbert's home to serve an arrest warrant for violating the terms of the injunction.

Upon arriving at the home, the CCSO arrested him and searched the house. They located four rifles, a revolver, a pistol and a 12-gauge shotgun. A follow-up investigation by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) determined that the 12-gauge shotgun was illegally modified, as both barrels had been sawed off. ATF determined that the 12-gauge shotgun was not registered to Hulbert in the National Firearms Registration and Transfer Record.

The case was investigated by the Clay County Sheriff's Office and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives - Jacksonville Office. Assistant U.S. Attorney Kevin C. Frein prosecuted it.

This case is part of Project Safe Neighborhoods, a program bringing together all levels of law enforcement and the communities they serve to reduce violent crime and gun violence and make our neighborhoods safer.

On May 26, 2021, the Department launched a violent crime reduction strategy strengthening PSN based on these core principles: fostering trust and legitimacy in our communities, supporting community-based organizations that help prevent violence from occurring in the first place, setting focused and strategic enforcement priorities, and measuring the results.

Creative states: Tour America with homegrown artists in ‘The Express Way’

From sea to shining sea, Americans express their creativity, and the new, four-part documentary series “The Express Way With Dulé Hill,” premiering Tuesday, April 23, on PBS, looks at the ways self-expression and creativity are intertwined. Featuring artists from four different corners of the United States — in California, the Appalachian region, Texas and Chicago — “The Express Way” looks at the ways these individuals use art to make connections within and outside of their communities and how they use their artwork to challenge views and blaze a trail for others to follow in the future.

Best known by most for his portrayal of Gus in eight seasons in the detective sitcom “Psych,” which he also reprised for three spinoff films, Hill, a real TV veteran, has also had starring roles in “The West Wing,” “Ballers,” “Suits” and more recently, the ABC sitcom “The Wonder Years.”

Now, turning his attention to the artistic pursuits of others, PBS shared in a news release that Hill traveled across America “to connect with local visionaries, activists, changemakers and pioneers who are using their artistic passions to foster connection, deepen empathy and create meaningful change within their communities.”

“There are many people in this world who create space out of nothing. They are the ones turning on the light, setting the path and then guiding others along the journey,” Hill shared about the series in the release.

Shaheem Sanchez, known for his performance in the 2019 film “Sound of Metal,” is a deaf dancer based in Los Angeles. Hill meets with Sanchez in the first episode of “The Express Way,” connecting over a shared passion for dance before getting to know other artists across California.

Also featured in the California stop of “The Express Way” is a group of senior citizens who call themselves the Grant Street Follies, a committed activists and cabaret performers in San Francisco who use their art to combat anti-Asian hate and celebrate the city’s historic Chinatown. Finally, Hill meets trailblazing musicians in Los Angeles’s own Mariachi Arcoiris, the world’s first LGBTQ+ mariachi group.

Visiting the Appalachian region, Hill gets a thorough musical education. In Kentucky, he meets first with Doug Naselroad, the founder and director of Troublesome Creek Stringed Instrument Company. His program, The Culture of Recovery, teaches people to make stringed instruments as an assistive outlet while they recover from opioid addiction. In Johnson City, Tennessee, Grammy-nominated bluegrass musician Amythyst Kiah (“Black Myself”) teaches Hill

about the history of Black artists in traditional American music. The founder of “Latin-grass,” musician Joe Troop (“Red, White & Blues”), shares how he fused folk music with bluegrass instrumentation and continues to innovate with his latest collaboration with Venezuelan musician Larry Bellorin (“Caballo Viejo”).

Next, Hill makes his way down to Texas to meet artists who are leaders within their local communities. Hill meets Abuela M’api Rainflowa, founder of Houston Aztec Dance & Drum, who shows him the “Mexico” handshake, as well as the Aztec Sun Dance and a sweat lodge ceremony. At his next stop in Texas, David Lozano, executive director of Cara Mia Theatre, welcomes Hill to Dallas, sharing with him some of the theater’s productions that focus on the Latino experience. In Denton, John Bramblitt, a man who lost his vision taught himself to paint again using touch. Bramblitt creates vibrant paintings and murals, leads workshops and helps foster artistic abilities in other people with vision impairment.

In the final installment of “The Express Way,” Hill blows into the Windy City to meet artist activists. In Chicago’s South Side, Hill watches on as the Andre Theatre Collective casts its first play written by incarcerated playwrights. The production explores crime in the city and its impact on Black communities. Elsewhere in the city, Vershawn Sanders Ward’s Red Clay Dance uses African Diasporic dance to make a space for People of Color in her community to feel seen. Hill later meets musician Bassel Almadani, of Bassel & The Supernaturals (“Smoke”), who spreads awareness of the Syrian civil war and refugee crisis with his platform.

Clooney and Kidman see action in 'The Peacemaker'

When you're a television star trying to cross over to a movie career, the early choices you make can be extremely important.

George Clooney had done some films before "The Peacemaker" — which MGM+ Hits shows Saturday, April 27 — but "Return of the Killer Tomatoes!" wasn't the sort of thing he really could hang his big-screen hat on. On the other hand, the 1997 action-adventure teaming him with Nicole Kidman was a solid vehicle for him ... and it had added significance as the first release from the DreamWorks studio founded by Hollywood power players Steven Spielberg, Jeffrey Katzenberg and David Geffen.

The plot of "The Peacemaker" (which has become a cable staple) is very much in its genre's wheelhouse, with Clooney and Kidman as a military intelligence officer and a nuclear expert tracking a terrorist group that clearly has plans to generate mayhem using stolen warheads. With Russia as the backdrop for the villains' first attack, the film has



a superbly international feel, but the stars keep it grounded for U.S. audiences through the rapport they have together.

While Kidman's Dr. Julia Kelly takes a clinical approach to her work, Clooney's Lt. Col. Thomas Devoe keeps the human factor in his sights ... making for clashes between them, but also giving them good arcs to play as each gravitates toward the other's perspective.

Still, that isn't to infer that Clooney is a soft touch here. He shows terrific brawn in a number of tense sequences along the way, arguably the best being his brutal fight with an enemy in a truck carrying some of the warheads across a bridge. A hovering helicopter also is involved, and Clooney — and, presumably, his stuntman — certainly take and give their hits during those several minutes.

It undoubtedly helped that Clooney was quite familiar with the director of "The Peacemaker," Mimi Leder, who also guided him through numerous episodes of TV's "ER." She displays as much skill and confidence in the action scenes as any male filmmaker, or a female peer such as Kathryn Bigelow ("Point Break," "The Hurt Locker").

Ultimately, the setting of "The Peacemaker" shifts to New York for a showdown that's as notable for its negotiating between the heroes and a bomb-carrying opponent as for its staging and pyrotechnics. It all adds up to a highly satisfying exercise that did quite a bit to set Clooney on a course for the movie-world success (encompassing an Oscar win) that he's enjoyed for more than 25 years now.

Emma Stone wasn't thrown by her Oscar tribute

Q: After the Oscars, much was made of the fact that Emma Stone and Jennifer Lawrence are close friends. Why, then, did Sally Field do the tribute to Emma Stone on the show instead? – Casey Grimes, via e-mail

A: In gathering past winners of the acting categories to present this year's awards, the producers tried to play up connections between performers who had worked together, and Field played Aunt May in the two "Amazing Spider-Man" movies that featured Stone as Gwen Stacy. Thus, she could speak to Stone's professional acumen on the set.

As photos taken after the presentation showed, Stone had plenty of time to commiserate with Lawrence as the evening went on, with Stone firmly grasping her second Oscar for best actress. She won that for "Poor Things," while her first one had been for 2016's "La La Land" — which also starred Ryan Gosling, whose Oscar-show rendering of the "Barbie" tune "I'm Just Ken" was pegged by Stone as the likely reason she "broke" her dress by singing and dancing energetically before she took the stage.

Q: Why did so many shows go into reruns so soon after their new seasons started? – Barry Kahn, Colorado Springs, Colo.

A: Actually, the great bulk of scripted broadcast-network series typically air repeats as spring nears, but it may have seemed more pronounced this time because of the late start the television season got. Last year's entertainment-industry strikes kept most shows from running new episodes until this past January, February or March, and with the impact on production, presenting some reruns gave the shows some leeway to catch up on their schedules for making stories for the remainder of the season.

By the same token, networks like to have their shows stay as fresh as possible until the traditional television season ends in May, so mixing in some repeats allows for the season's last new episode to be held until that general time frame. Because of the strike-related delay, series that normally would generate 22 episodes per season only have had an average of 10 or 12 this time, so that cutdown has largely dictated what the networks have needed to do.

Q: It's been fun to see Dan Aykroyd back on TV doing some promotion for the latest "Ghostbusters" movie. When was he on "Saturday Night Live"? – Hal Barker, via e-mail

A: He was one of the original Not Ready for Prime Time Players when the NBC staple premiered in 1975, and he stayed until 1979, when his opportunities in movies were heating up. Aykroyd earned a Primetime Emmy Award for his work as a "Saturday Night Live" writer, and the iconic characters he played on the show included Elwood Blues of the Blues Brothers, patriarch Beldar of the Coneheads, "Wild and Crazy Guy" Yortuk and cultural commentator Leonard Pimth-Garnell.

Aykroyd also was known for his "SNL" impersonations of famous people, and one of his most memorable was his take on pioneering celebrity chef Julia Child, who accidentally cut "herself" during a cooking demonstration and ... well, so as not to ruin anyone's appetite, we'll just let imagination do the rest of the work on that. Aykroyd has returned to "SNL" for guest appearances a number of times, though only once as an actual guest host of an episode (in 2003).

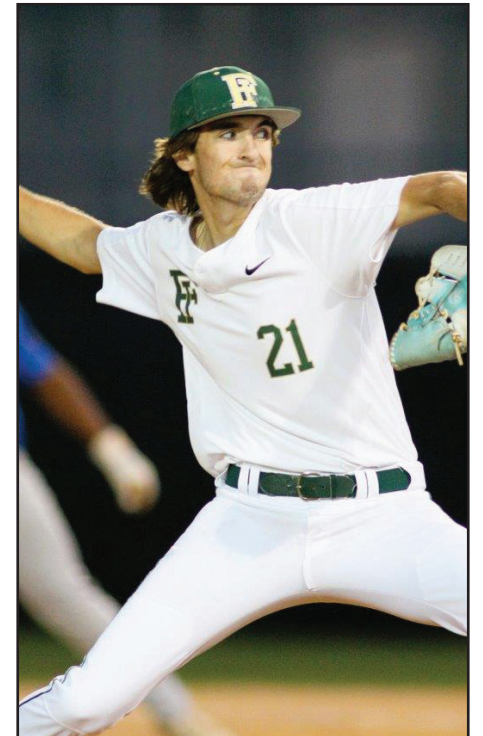

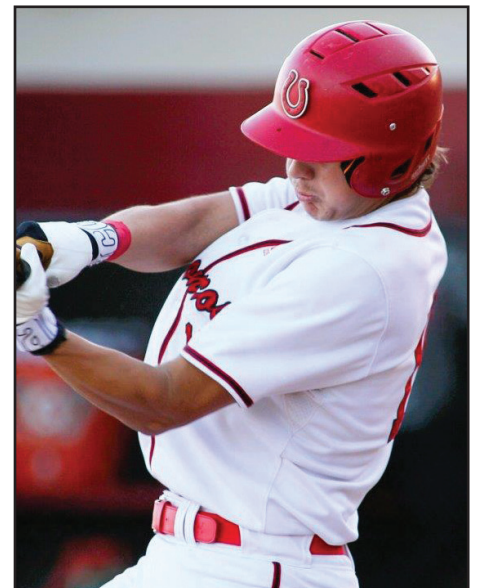

on her 99th career with the victory with a Mon., April 15 match at Fletcher to decide if 100 wins are in the books.

“Oakleaf had a good defense and their pitcher (Charlotte Maddox, 11 strikeouts) had a great game against our lineup,” said Houston. “Morgan threw well (pitcher Morgan Beckham, 10 strikeouts) out there, but overall I didn’t think we did very well; lack of adjustments out there. Palatka got their double in the final at-bats to score their lone run.

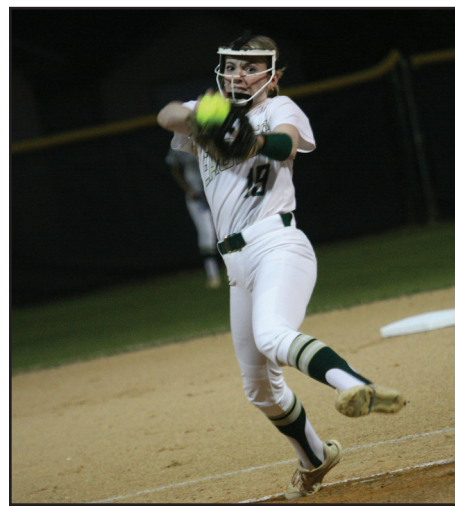
