GREEN COVE SPRINGS — Clay High's world and Olympic champion swimmer Caeleb Dressel often reminds his followers he is a Clay High Blue Devil first and foremost as he ascended from age group to state high school to Olympics champion to World championships.

"He loves telling people about his small-town roots from Clay High School, Green Cove Springs and Clay County," said mom Christina Dressel, who has been in the background with husband Michael at nearly all of her son's athletic accomplishments. "I think there are not too many of his championship meets that we have not found a way to be there for him."

They bought tickets for the Paris games, continuing to invest in their support for their son. They talked with Clay Today about the time and money it takes to be a parent of an international superstar. You can read that account in Sports on page 40.

Caeleb, who has won seven Olympic gold medals, will attempt to make the United States team for the third time in the 100-meter butterfly at 8 p.m. Former Clay High swimmer Sara Stotler will also try to make the women's team in the 200-meter Individual Medley, 200 butterfly and 100 butterfly.

Fire up grill for sweet, smoky smell of success

Tips for turning flame-broiled disasters into pitmaster perfection

CLAY COUNTY — There's more to cooking the perfect piece of meat over an open flame than soaking it with lighter fluid, throwing a match, and watching the smoke blanket the neighborhood in a greasy fog.

Most of us would like to believe we are the King of the Cookout, the Sultan of the Smoker, and the Potentate of the Pit. However, most of us lack the skill and patience to turn a slab of raw meat into a juicy, smoke-ringed masterpiece.

"First, it's a passion," said Blues Hog BBQ championship team member Josh Skipper. "It's supposed to be simple. It takes in all the senses — the smell, the taste, the sound, the sight and the touch."

Skipper lives on Fleming Island and was part of the 2022 team that won

the Whole Hog competition at Memphis in May, considered the World Championship. This year, Blues Hog finished fourth in Whole Hog and first in Seafood.

Like most grilling experts, there are differing opinions on achieving perfection. But most agree on a few basic facts: it takes patience, the proper cooking vessel and fuel, and quality meat and vegetables.

"I enjoy the atmosphere of being outside," said Middleburg's Jason Wheeler, who has a catering food truck, Wheeler's Barbecue. "Once you learn the art of true barbecue and what it takes to make really good barbecue, that's what really makes it fun because you put in the time and the effort. It's just slow smoke."

Wheeler said he prefers using pecan wood. Others like oak or hickory.


BCC approves funding for school resource officers

GREEN COVE SPRINGS- The Clay County School board will move forward with their decision to reutilize the Clay County Sheriff's Office within its school system.

The Clay County Board of County Commissioners voted unanimously to implement its Interlocal Agreement with the Clay County School Board at Tuesday's meeting.

The agreement will allow for a budget of approximately \$6.8 million dollars, for the 2024 to 2025 fiscal year, to be allocated to the sheriff's office to effectively transition and carry out their jobs within the school district.

The total budget will go towards various purposes including salaries, retirement, benefits, training and education, uniforms and operating expenses.

The approval comes following last year's vote by the school board to utilize the Clay County Sheriff's Office in lieu of the Clay County District Schools Police Department.

The usage of the resource officers on school campuses dates back to the passing of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act in 2018.

Following the Parkland school shooting, the act aimed to create a safer environment in Florida schools and made



many safety reforms, including requiring the presence of patrol officers on school campuses.

The new agreement and budget will officially take effect on July 1 and remain ef-

fective until June 30, 2027. According to the agreement, beginning on July 5, the school board is required to pay the county one-sixth of the agreed budget. For every month after, a payment of one-twelfth of the budget is required. The agreement also states that it can be renewed for additional one year terms

after its three year run, unless there is a notice of non-renewal by either side. "We are happy that the Interlocal Agreement with the Clay County School Board regarding funding for the school resource officers was approved tonight by the BoCC. Since the decision to return the SRO function was made last Fall, the Clay County Sheriff's Office and the Clay County School District have worked hand in hand to ensure a transparent and smooth transition," said Sheriff Michelle Cook. "The Clay County Sheriff's Office is committed to keeping our kids safe and that mission starts July 1. We are ready."

Still hot off the 904 Printing press one year later

ORANGE PARK — The 904 Printing store moved to Orange Park from Jacksonville one year ago. It was a good transition, owner Shawn Jamin said. It was the right business call to move back to the town where he grew up. "It's been a great community of people. There're so many awesome people here," he said. The business has five employees, or seven, depending on how you count. Sales Manager Shadow is a dog, and Human Resources Director Bubbas is a cat. "He closes all the sales," one employee

said, walking the sales manager on the leash. "He'll come down and sniff around to see if he wants to fire anybody," another employee said, referring to the human resources director. Jamin demonstrated the printing press. The aromatic, cozy smell of warm paper filled the room as the machine churned and sheets of warm paper rolled out. Nothing beats that "new paper smell," not even a new car. Sometimes, the 904 Printing crew churns out blank sheets just to feel the paper's warmth. Clients can send their digital designs for print in a variety of mediums.

In a process known as "UV curing," ultraviolet light generates a photochemical reaction in the ink, making the prints waterproof.

"We print anything. T-shirts, business cards, brochures, stickers, art prints..." Jasmin said. Well, what about newspapers? "No, no. That's the one thing we don't do." The waterproof material is printed using a process called "UV curing." Clay Today was handed yellow-tinted UV-blocking glasses to watch the spectacle. The ultraviolet light reacts with ink, causing it to harden. UV light is similar but much less than the radiation in a tanning bed. Yellow-tinted glasses protect the eyes, but there's no need for tanning oil. Charlie Eddins is a tenant in the 904 Printing building. His office is set up in one of the rooms. He is familiar with both the sales manager and the human resources director. Eddins' company, Renco Corporation, converts paper to digital. So, effectively, the opposite of Jasmin's business. The two have a great business and personal friendship. The store is located at 1106 Park Ave.

Getting children engaged in building safety

The future of building safety offers exciting career opportunities for the next generation. The International Code Council encourages educators to involve kids in discussions about the industry from an early age, fostering open-mindedness and offering them a new perspective on the world around them.

Inspiring young minds with interactive learning


Building safety awareness can start early if implemented in a fun, productive way that captures children’s interest. Parents and teachers can turn to interactive tools such as LEGO blocks and stickers to make the concept more approachable, accessible and engaging for young minds. During Building Safety Month, the Code Council creates materials specifically for this purpose, an annual campaign highlighting modern building codes and standards’ crucial role in ensuring public safety, including Junior Building Inspector stickers and hard hats. Linking these tools to other educational materials can help bridge the gap between the activity and understanding building safety. Incorporating stories relating to the children’s daily lives can simplify complex concepts, while props and visual aids, like themed toys, can heighten engagement and enrich the experience. The Code Council employs this approach through its mascot, CODiE the Cheetah. That’s why Pete Roque, director of code enforcement at 4LEAF, wrote the children’s book “Code Enforcement Officer Lucas Cleans Up Our Street” with his son. The book introduces young readers to code enforcement while providing insights into how blight and substandard structures are dealt with daily. Rachel Patterson, senior code enforcement officer for the City of Westminster, Colorado and secretary of the Code Council Colorado chapter, leverages Roque’s book as part of her curriculum, combining it with squishy building safety toys. “Using visuals, you can communicate with the kiddos in a way they can appreciate.” Patterson aims to tell more stories about building safety through her animated series, “Fiona the Fox,” which she developed with Roque. The series aims to inspire kids to understand and appreciate building safety and to consider what it means to be a good neighbor.

Building safety education resources

As children grow, the approach to building safety education should develop with them. The Code Council has developed

Five years ago, 2019

What changes in real estate industry mean to home buyers, sellers

Much discussion has been about the recent settlement involving the National Association of Realtors and its impact on consumers seeking to buy or sell a home. As we enter the summer “selling season,” buyers and sellers will notice two real estate practice changes:

1. Properties listed in a multiple listing service (MLS) will no longer include an offer of compensation to a buyer’s agent. It’s

important to note that commissions have been and will continue to be negotiable among buyers, sellers and brokers.

2. Buyers working with an agent must sign a written agreement before touring a home.

It’s important to note that written agreements will be required for in-person and live virtual home tours, but buyers do not need a written agreement if you are just speaking to an agent at an open house or asking them about their services.

The changes will go into effect on Aug.

30 years ago, 1994

- The Clay County School Board wrestled with whether to vote outright to raise the property millage rate by a quarter mill – allowable by state law at the time – or ask the Board of County Commissioners to place the measure on that fall’s ballot as a straw vote to gauge public support.
- Clay County Sheriff’s Office deputies retrieved the body of John Scholtz, 17, of Johnson, Fla., from Lake Geneva following a weekend incident. Police said the teen was on medication for a seizure disorder and may have had a seizure while swimming.
- The Clay County Drug Task Force arrested 57 people during an undercover sting operation. Drugs seized in the raid ranged from marijuana to LSD. The youngest person arrested was 19, while the oldest was 63.

40 years ago, 1984

- Florida Agriculture Commissioner Doyle Conner visited sites in the Keystone Heights area to determine what type of disease killed hundreds of live oak trees.
- Attorney Alan Winter was sworn in as an assistant state attorney for the Fourth Judicial Circuit in which he would serve Clay County.

•Rep. Frank Williams (D-Starke) helped secure \$175,000 in state funds that would be matched with county funds to build a new branch library to serve Middleburg.

50 years ago, 1974

- Appointed by Gov. Reuben Askew on May 20, 1971, to fill a seat on the Board of County Commissioners left open by the death of her husband, Otto J. Murrhee Sr., Kathleen Murrhee said she would not run for re-election.
- The Clay County Zoning Commission granted a special use zoning classification to the Clay County School Board to enable the board to construct what would become Orange Park Junior High on Gano Avenue.
- Officers from the Orange Park Police Department investigated the death of Patricia Raye Boyles, 16, whose bruised and battered body was discovered on railroad tracks near I-295 and Wells Road.

Boats, revelers, hot temperature add up to busy Boater Skip Day

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – By any standard, the numbers for Boater Skip Day were remarkable.

According to the Clay County Sheriff's Office, at its peak at 2 p.m., an estimated 1,100 boats were near Mile Marker 24 on the St. Johns River at Bayard Point, which made the crowd at the annual event anywhere from 4,000 to 7,000 people.

That kind of event certainly required a massive response from law enforcement and fire rescue, including 62 members of CCSO, nine from Clay County Fire Rescue,

three from Clay County Emergency Management, two from the Green Cove Springs Police Department, 22 from Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation, two from the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, four from Jacksonville Fire Rescue Department, eight from the St. Johns Sheriff's Office, four from the Nassau County Sheriff's Office, two from the Putnam County Sheriff's Office, two from the Volusia County Sheriff's Office and one from St. Augustine Police Department.

There were a few issues. Fish and Wildlife issued 12 boating under the influence citations, SJSO and CCSO wrote five BUI

tickets, and the Florida Highway Patrol arrested six for DUI. CCSO also arrested five for disorderly intoxication, and one of those also was charged with resisting arrest. Two people were transported to a local hospital for minor trauma by CCFR and three others were treated and released for general sickness.

"I am happy to report there were no fatalities," said FWC's Major Scott Lee. "We appreciate the collaboration with local agencies devoted to keeping the boating public on the St. Johns River safe and providing safe waterways for everyone to enjoy."

Life is so precious and yet, can be changed at any moment. We have all been through trials and tribulations. Our family has never been through anything like this. We are not ones to ask for help, however, now is a time of desperate measures.

Chad Dew, owner/operator of Blue Sky Enclosures, a local business located in Fleming Island, was in a horrific accident at work causing him to fall three stories from a faulty pool enclosure. He has sustained life changing injuries including four skull fractures, orbital fractures that are affecting his eyes and vision, and severe lacerations. He has a trauma team at OPMC including neurosurgery, orthopedic, ENT, internists, pain management, and possibly ophthalmologist.

Chad has been the rock of our family.

In addition to this terrible event, Chad's wife Bridgett was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis last month. Due to her condition, Chad has been her caregiver and now the roles are being reversed. They share two beautiful little boys ages 3 and 8 who are their reasons for living. We are asking for any help to cover monthly obligations, medical bills for the trauma unit, and additional medical care Chad will need once he is released home. Chad will be out of work for a minimum of 5 months, likely longer as the work he does requires intense physical labor. As of now we know he will be requiring round the clock care as both of his arms and hands are not able to be used plus his skull fractures require him to be bedbound. William Raleigh Thompson, Jr.

Dr. William Raleigh Thompson, Jr. 90, died peacefully in his sleep on June 3, 2024, at home in Jacksonville. He lived a full and amazing life, bravely and honorably battling cancer and the effects of treatment for several years.

Raleigh was a loving and caring husband, father, grandfather, and friend. He was born and raised in Mandarin, Florida and graduated from Landon High School, and then Emory University.

After graduation from college, Raleigh joined the U.S. Navy and became a flight officer. Following his exemplary service in the Navy, he attended Emory University School of Medicine. Dr. Thompson and his family returned to the Jacksonville area in 1966 and settled in Orange Park. At that time, there were only four physicians practicing in the area and he worked with three of them. Dr. Thompson was a leader in the medical community, serving as Chief of the Medical Staff and President of the Clay County Medical Association. He was also instrumental in establishing the Family Practice program at the Regional Medical Center at NAS Jacksonville. Raleigh loved, and faithfully served, the rapidly growing

community of Orange Park in many ways, seen and unseen. His leadership in the expansion of both Grace Episcopal Church and St. John's Country Day School are just two examples of his devotion.

Dr. Thompson happily served as a mentor to many of the physicians who have practiced in Clay County throughout the years. After 59 years in Orange Park, he retired from medicine in October 2023. He always said the most rewarding part of his career was the relationships he enjoyed with his patients. Dr. Thompson considered his patients, and their families, dear friends, and he was honored to be a part of their lives.

Raleigh was a pilot, avid outdoorsman, Mason, and Shriner. One of his greatest joys was traveling with his wife, children, and grandchildren.

17. These practices will now be industry standards to the benefit of both the consumer and the agent. They will facilitate buyers meeting with agents, discussing services offered, expectations and costs and formalizing into a written agreement.

Home buyers and sellers will continue to have options regarding compensating brokers. Some may opt to pay a fixed fee, or a seller may offer a concession on the home price, which could be used by the buyer to pay their agent. Another alternative is that sellers' agents may offer some of their fees to buyers' agents so long as the offer doesn't appear on an MLS.

What won't change is that buyers and sellers alike will continue to rely on the expertise and savvy of their agents to guide them through what, for many, is the most important financial transaction in their lives. That's why 90% of homebuyers historically have opted to work with a real estate agent or broker.

Celebrating 50 years

Bhide & Hall Architects built, preserved Clay County's historic buildings

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — Bhide and Hall Architects was founded in Orange Park a half-century ago. The architectural firm has designed buildings worldwide, but some of its beloved projects are close to home.

Bhide and Hall's portfolio includes the Green Cove Springs City Hall, the Clay County Administration Building, and renovations to the 1890 Clay County Courthouse and the 1894 Clay County Jail.

E. Wendell Hall, the original co-founder, looked wistfully at the historic courthouse his firm was responsible for renovating decades ago. He pointed at a "star" on the side of the building where he ran a supporting horizontal cable line through.

"We did our best," Hall said. "The problem was, with all the period photographs we looked at, none showed the front door. It was always open with people standing (in front)," he said, pointing to the courthouse entrance.

"I selected those doors to go with the 1930s aesthetic. And nobody has ever said anything."

Hall — no relation to the long-serving

Sheriff J.P. Hall — is as percipient as he is witty. He's simultaneously genuine and sarcastic. In the shadow of such a historic building, he reflected on his own life.

He arrived in Orange Park to work at an architecture firm owned by Alan Frye, but the business went bankrupt soon after. His fellow cofounder, Vasant P. Bhide, was struck with the same misfortune. Bhide's architecture firm also coincidentally went belly up.

"We found ourselves wandering the streets together," Hall said metaphorically.

Their business was founded on Carnes Street on July 1, 1974. "And it should be put up on the National Register of Historic Places," Hall joked.

The first two projects were designing portables at Charles E. Bennett Elementary.

"We came together and made a firm together," he said.

In the Clay County Historic Triangle courtyard, Hall was joined by Brian Sawyer and David Shively, the new president and senior vice president of Bhide and Hall. Bhide retired in 2008. Hall retired in 2019.

"Now David and I are steering the crazy train," Sawyer said.

Vishi Garig, the Archives Supervisor of Clay County, unlocked the door and welcomed the architects in for a tour of the courthouse they renovated from 2003 to 2005. The building received a facelift and some quality-of-life improvements. Air conditioning was added behind unobtrusive decorative metal grates on the second floor.

Hall believes in designing human-scaled buildings. "Too many buildings forget they are designed for people," he said. Ergonomics and accessibility are tenets. The historic courthouse is two stories,

and Hall was determined that there should be an elevator to reach the second floor. There was an idea of making the elevator external, but he shook his head at the jutting, unsightly plan. The elevator was to be indoors, seamless and safe.

Hall noticed the two bathrooms in the building were stacked on each other, parallel from the first floor to the second. That was the space Hall carved out for the elevator.

The stairs, too, were treated with care. He said a woman who worked at an antique

Clay County marks its calendars for Juneteenth holiday

CLAY COUNTY—Residents in Clay County will continue the annual celebration of Juneteenth this year in big ways.

The day is meant to commemorate the ending of slavery in the United States. It wasn't until June 19, 1865, more than two years after the Emancipation Proclamation, that approximately 250,000 remaining slaves in Texas would get the message that slavery had been officially abolished.

This, in turn, marked the beginning of a country completely rid of servitude.

Juneteenth became an official U.S. federal holiday back in 2021 and has since fostered celebration and events across the country. And, here in Clay County, residents are keeping that joy alive.

There will be multiple local opportunities to celebrate and support the occasion this year, which falls on a Wednesday.

In Middleburg, St. Mark Missionary Baptist Church and the Hilltop/Clay Community Heritage will be hosting a "Juneteenth Holiday Celebration" on June 19.



The event will feature a "History of Juneteenth Program" at St. Mark Missionary Baptist Church from noon to 1 p.m. on 2703 Forman Circle. Following that, the community will be able to have fun in the sun at the Hunter-Douglas Park/Community Center until 4 p.m.

Located on 4227 Longmire Road, the outside event will feature food trucks, games, music, a poetry competition, a pound cake tasting and contest and a Q&A session with Maude Jackson, Dr. Bernard Fennell and other iconic Civil Rights Leaders.

"It is a way to bring the community back together," said Pastor Samuel S. Lee of Middleburg's St. Mark Missionary Baptist

Church.

Lee said the event will also feature appearances from the Clay County Sheriff's office, the fire department and Clay County commissioner Betsy Condon.

In addition to learning about history, the event will also provide an opportunity for guests to get registered to vote and obtain a free health screening with Ascension St. Vincent. The event will also provide free vendor opportunities to showcase any church, organization, community resources or agency.

Lee said that he hopes attendees get a sense of peace from coming out to celebrate. There will also be a Juneteenth event on 3989 Eagle Landing Parkway on

June 19. It will be held from 3 to 8 p.m. and feature food, live bands, DJ entertainment, games and interactive folk telling.

Founder and host Johnnetta Bryant said this will be the event's third year and it won't be the last. "I've talked to so many people and sadly, this was something that was not taught about in school. And, again, this is as intricate and delicate to the United States citizens as the Fourth of July. So, I want this day to be given the same type of honor, the same type of respect, the same type of support," Bryant said.

Bryant said that the holiday has a special connection to Jacksonville in a big way.

"What we use as our Black national anthem, which is 'Lift Every Voice and Sing,' it just so happens to be written by someone out of Jacksonville, Florida," Bryant said.

Also, Bryant said that her son, Keedron Bryant, performed the viral song "I Just Wanna Live," detesting systemic racism and later being deemed the Associated Press song of the year, back in 2020.

"Those two songs were birthed out of this city, and I want Jacksonville to know that they should be aware, and they should support this day," Bryant said.

Uzuri Beauty will be having its grand re-opening on June 22 to commemorate the holiday. Owner Kai Hodge said the store closed last June but will be making its re-

store on Walnut Street was interested in the building’s renovation and was brought on to help with the wooden double staircase. “She did a beautiful job,” Hall said.

While the courthouse suffered “no interior deterioration,” the same could not be said about the historic jail, which was in “far worse shape.”

Clay County’s historic jail is the second oldest in Florida to St. Augustine.

“The building was beginning to come

apart. The second floor had already collapsed,” Hall said.

Hall said he had to sacrifice some historical accuracy for safety. He did not want to burden Clay County with exorbitant maintenance costs or safety liabilities. The goal of architectural preservation is to be lasting.

Hall said his most significant architectural influence is Antoni Gaudi, the Catalan architect inspired by nature and the pioneer of the “sui generis” style.

The Gaudi influence is seen in the Green Cove Springs City Hall, demonstrated by its curved staircase climbing to the

second floor and the backlit stained-glass dome. The city hall was built where the Qui-Si-Sana Hotel once stood, and the Qui-Si-Sana was what replaced the Clarendon Hotel after it burned in a fire.

When you step into the city hall, look up and over your shoulder, and you’ll see an iron lizard. That’s the Hall’s architectural signature.

“I like that building very much,” Hall said.

Today, the courthouse and jail stand proudly in the Clay County Historic Triangle. The monuments commemorate the past.

Hall and his cofounder Bhide have left a monumental legacy. While the building is one of the most treasured on the portfolio, Hall is most thankful for the relationships he made along the way. Projects have led him to Egypt, Monaco, Russia and Guantánamo Bay, Cuba.

Brick and mortar build buildings, while relationships and memories build people. Hall considers himself a humanist as much, if not more, than an architect. He says people are the most important part of any building. After all, what’s a building without the people who walk in through the door?

Parents encouraged to look into free VPK programs

CLAY COUNTY – “Free” is such a catchword that I must stop to check it out when I see it.

My name is Brenda Card, and I am the director of a childcare center in Orange Park. If you have a child(ren), grandchildren, or have family or friends who have children, then this “free” could be for them.

First, a childcare center must qualify to provide voluntary pre-kindergarten, the VPK program.

A childcare center with the certification to become a VPK provider, you as a child’s guardian, can enroll with a certification for 540 hours of free childcare in a school year program. At the center where I’m the director, we offer VPK from 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 am. We try to use the same calendar days of operation as the local elementary school uses for the VPK program. We have found that this schedule helps guardians with elementary school children.

The next question should be, “What would qualify my child to be enrolled in this program?” If your child is a Florida resident and will be four on or before Sept. 1, they qualify to start the program in August. Residence documentation and date of birth are required and can be uploaded online at familyservices.floridaearlylearning.com. Click on voluntary pre-kindergarten.

Some centers and your early learning coalition on the website will help you if you are having problems. Of course, education starts at home, and there is no substitute for it.

Still, the foundation to begin elementary school through the education they get from home and the VPK program can help your child become more confident with their abilities.

emergence amid Juneteenth.



According to the Grill Masters Club, oak and post oak are best for brisket, sausage, ribs, and chicken. Hickory is popular in the South and is best for pork and chicken. Maple has a sweeter undertone for bacon, ham, cheese, and vegetables, while pecan is similar to hickory and is best for pork, beef, and chicken. Alder works best with seafood, and Mesquite has a savory smoke flavor for chicken and larger cuts of pork and beef.

G's Slow Smoked BBQ owner Gary Park said one of the biggest mistakes made by amateur grillers is adding the meat too soon.

"You've got to wait until the charcoal burns down," he said. "When I started 20 or 30 years ago, I always ruined some hamburgers. I used charcoal, probably Kingsford or something, and lighter fluid, which is fine if you let it burn out. But I didn't let it burn out in time. I was ready to eat my hamburgers, and they smelled like lighter fluid, so they were ruined."

Todd Knowles, owner of Premier Gas and Grills in Green Cove Springs, said the type of fuel you use is critical.

"If you're serious about grilling, you should have three grills," he said. "Charcoal is from steaks and chicken. A pellet smoker is for ribs and brisket. A gas grill is for hot dogs, burgers and vegetables. Yes, I said vegetables. Grilling vegetables in a good pan with oil and seasonings is amazing."

"Each grill has a purpose. Pellet grills are great for smoking meats and are easy to use, while charcoal grills take a little more work but are always worth the wait once you take a bite. Propane can cook many things, but you must cook low and slow."

"Remember, with anything, preparation and time is what it takes to produce great-tasting food. We aren't microwaving. We're grilling."

World champions are determined by cooking whole hogs. But since most of us either can't or won't face that challenge, a brisket is considered one of the most difficult items to master, especially a whole brisket, since one end has two layers and the other is considerably thinner.

Again, the secret is low and slow. It could take 20 hours to trim, season, inject and cook a 16-pound brisket. And during that time, you must keep an eye on the fire to maintain a 225-275-degree temperature. It's best to start new charcoal and wood outside the grill and add the embers to the fire to avoid the bitter taste of creosotes until it burns off.

Also, it's important to cook brisket wrapped in butcher paper or foil on the

grill for the final two hours and let it "rest" for another hour before you cut into it. Your patience will be rewarded.

Park, who will open two BBQ restaurants in Starke and Green Cove Springs, said if you're in a hurry, go through the drive-thru line and the local burger joint. But if you want a real reward, light the grill, pull up a lawn chair and wait.

"For me personally, when it comes to barbecue, it's my passion," he said. "I love

barbecue. It's a game of patience. You want to ensure your fire's right because you want a good, clean smoke."

When you master that, you can tackle which sauce is best. There are Texas and Kansas City sauces, Alabama white sauce, North Carolina vinegar, and Lexington sauces. Georgia has a sauce, as do South Carolina, Florida, Memphis, and St. Louis. There are even mustard sauces and dry spice rubs.





The Melrose Center: A mosaic of art, music, community

MELROSE — A statue named “Aariel” spreads its arms as it stands in the sculpture garden beside a flamboyance (flock) of flamingoes. It is a welcoming monument that symbolizes the Melrose Center’s commitment to the community it cares for.

The Melrose Center – part art gallery, part restaurant cafe, part health clinic – is a nonprofit founded in 2010 by Bruce and Gwen Waite. The cafe is open five days a week from Tuesday to Saturday.

“Our model is to look and feel like a café and a restaurant. People come in to socially connect,” Bruce said. “It was in response to a need in the community. There wasn’t a place of this nature where people could come together. Over time, it’s proven to be a haven for many people.”

“We have many groups, such as singers and dancers, who perform. It’s fun. We love them. There’s a lot to do here,” Gwen said.

The first Friday of every month is a special occasion at the center. A health check-up fair kicks off in the morning, followed by an art walk later at night.

At the health checkup fair on Friday, June 7, the restaurant’s dining hall welcomed patrons for free screenings for diabetes and cholesterol, plus access to a pediatrician and a general physician. The screenings were free regardless of insurance status. Bruce said more than 20 received their COVID-19 booster shots.

“We have a lot of local artists who are also very involved in the health care stuff. They donate their time,” Gwen said.

The Melrose Art Walk is a community-wide event in which other businesses and art galleries participate. The same artists and patients from the health checkup fair can return later for a night of live music, a bite to eat, dancing beside the stage, and a stroll through the art gallery at the other building.

The Melrose Center is strategically located in the unincorporated town of Melrose, which is at the crossroads of four counties: Clay, Putnam, Bradford, and Alachua.

“And we’re right in the center of all four,” Bruce said. “We’re 200 yards from Clay, 200 from Bradford and 300 from Alachua. We serve all four counties.”

Bruce and Gwen are from Key West, bringing their motto: “one human family,” and an island-time appreciation for arts and culture.

The Waite family left Key West to pursue a contract to create the Butterfly Rainforest at the Florida Museum of Natural History in Gainesville. The contract was an interesting project that led the family to travel throughout Central and South America for “butterfly operations.”

“It was nifty to have 150,000 live butterflies flying around,” Bruce said.

The family fell in love with Melrose as they finished their contract. Their prior work in social services in Key West and Texas spurred an interest in the family to

set up their one-stop shop. They ended up fitting right in. Melrose consists of a large population of Key West “expatriates.”

Between the wellness fair and the art walk, the Melrose Center employees have dinner together in the dining hall underneath, where the “Conch Republic Flag” of Key West is proudly displayed.

Bruce joked Melrose is the “Northernmost Point.”

The restaurant’s menu blends Cuban and Greek culinary traditions to reengineer popular meals to be healthier.

The walls are adorned with paintings and sketches. Crafts can be bought in the gift shop. One craftsman assembled a guitar made of stained glass that glows with a button press. Another crafted a lamp using found materials resembling a UFO.

All the added items create a mosaic of the Melrose Center’s close-knit community.

“Leave the politics outside. Enjoy the

music and the food. We focus on commonalities here. The things we still agree on,” Bruce said.

Catie Miller cherishes the Melrose Center, which she calls “our clubhouse.” Her partner, Kirsten Engstrom, sculpted “Aariel.”

“We were what you’d call ‘hippies’ or ‘counterculture.’ We’ve always been community-oriented and loving. We have recreated that community feeling here,” Miller said.

“Bruce and Gwen have offered a place for others to come. This is their service on this planet. They’re special, special people.”



Day serves as culinary specialist in Navy

MAYPORT – Petty Officer 1st Class Kyle Day, a native of Orange Park, serves aboard USS Cooperstown, a U.S. Navy warship. The skills and values needed to succeed in the Navy are similar to those in Jacksonville.

“I learned growing up to treat everyone equally and with respect,” said Day. “In the Navy, you never know what kind of day someone else is having. They could be having the worst day, but if you treat them with respect, you can make their day a little better.”

Day joined the Navy 12 years ago. Today, Day serves as a culinary specialist.

“I joined the Navy to have more structure in my life,” said Day. “I also wanted to travel.”

According to Navy officials, Cooperstown is a fast, optimally manned, mission-tailored surface combatant that operates in near-shore and open-ocean environments. Littoral combat ships integrate with joint, combined, manned, and unmanned teams to support forward presence, maritime security, sea control, and deterrence missions around the globe.

Littoral combat ships are hybrid surface combatants that lead manned-unmanned teams using unmanned aerial systems like the Fire Scout and Expeditionary

Ordnance Disposal forces unmanned underwater vehicles. They conduct forward and maritime security missions like the Secretary of Defense Oceania Maritime Security Initiative. Due to their shallow-depth hull, the ships also strengthen partnerships through port visits in small island nations like Tahiti and Fiji.

With 90% of global commerce traveling by sea and access to the internet relying on the security of undersea fiber optic cables, Navy officials continue to emphasize that the prosperity of the United States is directly linked to recruiting and retaining talented people from across America’s rich fabric. “We will earn and reinforce the

trust and confidence of the American people every day,” said Adm. Lisa Franchetti, Chief of Naval Operations. “Together, we will deliver the Navy the nation needs.”

Day has many opportunities to achieve accomplishments during military service.

“I am most proud of earning my first Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal for my work helping commission the Cooperstown,” said Day. “I am proud of that because I spent a long time in the Navy doing everything I thought I was supposed to be doing but didn’t earn recognition for it. The Spectrum of Fatherhood:
The meaning of an absent father

Happy Father’s Day is a greeting most take on the third Sunday of every June. Whether it’s said toward the man from whom you derived your name or another figure who has stepped into that man’s role, recognizing my fortune, I have been blessed with the former.

On the national day honoring fathers, I can purchase a card and pick up a pen to profess my love. Growing up, I took great pleasure in media. I digested TV shows in the mornings while I also digested my cereal, and the laugh track became white noise at night while my eyelids weighed heavy.

Many and most of the TV shows I absorbed illustrated dysfunctional families.

Albeit there were implications that both parents were still in the picture, the on-screen mother was the only parent pictured. Illustrating the Pendulum System, we see the father sliding across the scale. An absent father is often synonymous with the term “deadbeat.” The only interaction you have ever engaged in with your child is the money sent monthly regarding the shoes worn on their feet and the food in the pantry – if you are lucky. The societal view of absent fathers places “deadbeats” on the right of the scale. As a child, I always thought of myself as “normal.” Watching broken families on TV never made me recognize my privilege; instead, I just never applied it to my life. I never thought of it as anything to relate to or resonate with.

My father was always there. If he wasn’t, he sat in front of his computer, working at the bank’s cubicle space. He provided, he played, and in first grade, when Ms. Hannigan instructed her students to make a necklace out of macaroni commemorative to Father’s Day, he gave his daughter someone to think of. He has defined what a father is and depicted an adequate father figure.

My father grew up without one. He never felt as if he was missing one when he had his mother playing roles and four brothers who capped that void. He desired to grow up and be the man his father wasn’t. He exceeded this goal, having six children. During icebreakers, I always used this as my fun fact. Soon to come, I realized I only had three siblings. He is the opposite of a “deadbeat,” never defined as an “absentee.” Due to my sister’s grace, I’ve always been fortunate to live in a two-parent household. In 2019, my sister visited our home, and, for the most part, she came to stay permanently. I remember looking over at her journal and spotting my name and my dad’s written while she hurriedly closed the pages. Exerting her feelings on her own experience, my dad was always there, and she had to feel his absence all her life. The envy derives from that. Growing up, they only used their mother’s name on the parental contact forms, with the only contact from their dad being the formerly mentioned child support. He has defined and acted out what an absent father is. He is much higher on the spectrum.

A ‘House’ divided: Civil war breaks out in new season of ‘House of the Dragon’

The bloody battle for the Iron Throne continues in the long-awaited return of “House of the Dragon.” The “Game of Thrones” prequel series is back Sunday, June 16, on HBO and its Max streaming service, with the eight-episode second season continuing the story of House Targaryen and the ruthless usurpers who paved the way for the brutal power struggles of the original series.

This season further explores the division in Westeros following the death of King Viserys (Paddy Considine, “The Outsider”). The realm is now split in allegiance to either the Green or Black councils, forcing a civil war in service of the right-

ful heir. Queen Rhaenyra Targaryen, portrayed by Emma D’Arcy (“Misbehaviour,” 2020), the daughter of Viserys, expected to ascend to the throne after his death, but she and her council were thrown when another successor was named king.

The one in the seat of power, King Aegon II Targaryen (Tom Glynn-Carney, “Dunkirk,” 2017), leads the Green Council. Like so many of the battles waged in the extended A Song of Ice and Fire franchise from author George R. R. Martin, who serves as co-creator and executive producer for “House of the Dragon,” the line of succession is complicated by complex family trees. While Rhaenyra is the only living child from Viserys’ first marriage, Aegon is his first-born son with his second wife, Queen Alicent Hightower, portrayed by Olivia Cooke (“Ready Player One,” 2018).

HBO released two “dueling” trailers in March, teasing the new season — one Black and one Green — and revealing a peek into the motivations of each council. Everyone in the realm — and the fans at home — must choose which side of House Targaryen they stand behind while they prepare to wage war against each other.

“House of the Dragon” co-creator and showrunner Ryan J. Condal (“Colony”) spoke with Entertainment Weekly in March about the upcoming season, hinting that while the war begins because two half-siblings are jockeying for position on

the throne, the fight for power becomes more complicated than that.

Condal shared: “It’s a story of this family that’s been rent open by this dispute over who is meant to wear the crown after Viserys passes. Some people think it’s Rhaenyra, some people think it’s Aegon, and then there are other people within who think, ‘Why should it be one of the two of them? Maybe it should be someone else. Maybe it should be me!’”

About all of the pieces on the “House of the Dragon” chessboard, Condal added, “The fun of this Greek tragedy is seeing, when you introduce a power vacuum to a world like this, how all of these individuals react.”

In an official trailer for the upcoming season, Alicent warns Aegon that war must be fought “cautiously,” while the king, fueled by revenge, embraces the battles to come with more passion than tact. Rhaenyra, meanwhile, questions whether Prince Daemon Targaryen (Matt Smith, “Doctor Who”) accepts her rule as he prepares for war, hungry to lead on his own.

Experienced dragon rider Daemon amassed a number of dragons and eggs last season, making him a clear threat to the Green Council, but his loyalty to the Black Queen is also questionable — he may just live up to his name as the “Rogue Prince” with an army of fire breathers behind him.

Birtwhistle approves: Host of new 'Bakeover' show called a 'force of nature'

Get to know bakery expert, author and business mogul Nancy Birtwhistle ("Great British Bake Off") before the timer "dings" on an all-new episode of "The Big Bakeover," airing this Friday, June 21, on The CW.

Pulling from her humble beginnings, in which she learned how to cook and bake alongside her grandmother, Nancy was able to hone her craft in kitchens across the U.K., eventually earning herself a spot on Season 5 of "The Great British Bake Off," which she won with a flourish — and as the series' oldest winner to date, as of 2014 — despite only taking baking seriously after her retirement.

"Now," shares The CW, "Nancy is on a mission, traveling across America to save struggling bakeries. With the help of her master carpenter, Erik Curtis, she reimagines and revamps recipes, renovates storefronts and puts passionate pastry makers on a path to success," using her talents inside the kitchen and out to help blossoming businesses find their footing and evade "bakeruptcy."

"Through devouring books, taking tips

and inspiration from people she meets and lots and lots of trial and error, Birtwhistle has acquired an incredible breadth of baking knowledge," the network continues. "She loves the creativity of baking and the simple rewards of watching others enjoy something she's baked."

Birtwhistle — now a grandmother herself — is determined to pass down the knowledge that was once given to her, continuing a decadent chain of baked goods and pastries that spans from one generation to the next. From crumbly cookies to buttery books of croissant dough, each and every tip, trick and recipe pulled from Birtwhistle's bag of goodies is layered with patience, care, and, of course, lots and lots of butter.

"Full of energy and brimming with ideas, Birtwhistle is a force of nature," the network describes. "Whether it's growing her own fruit and vegetables to use in her recipes, rearing poultry (including the Christmas turkey), training her dog (who made it to Crufts) or getting a degree at age 40, [Birtwhistle] doesn't do things by halves" — and this latest endeavor is no

Beyond Barbie: Documentary celebrates release of Black Barbie, four decades later

Before 1979, Barbies only came in one color. Hear the stories of three women who brought diversity to BarbieLand, in Lagueria Davis' ("1 in 3," 2010) feature-length documentary "Black Barbie," premiering Wednesday, June 19, on Netflix, in celebration of Juneteenth.

Wearing a bright red jumpsuit and a fabulous "wrap-and-snap" disco skirt, with a look meant to emulate Diana Ross ("The Boss," 1979), the first official Black Barbie made its way to shelves in early 1980, with a box donning the slogan: "She's Black! She's beautiful! She's dynamite!" And she was.

Barbie is an astronaut, a doctor and a ballet dancer — but before the release of Black Barbie, she was always white. The only African American dolls made in Mattel's collection (all three introduced throughout the '60s) were void of the infamous moniker, instead made as friends to Barbie, like Francie (1967), Christie

(1968) and Julia (1969). That all changed when three Black women — Stacey McBride Irby, Beulah Mae Mitchell and Kitty Black Perkins — cleared a way forward for the introduction of the company's first Black Barbie, a doll who better represented Mattel's diverse (and growing) clientele.

Netflix describes: "Through insider interviews and charismatic retellings of what went down at Mattel in the days leading up to Black Barbie's debut, the documentary examines the importance of true representation — and how dolls aren't just dolls but childhood symbols that can be crucial to identity formation and imagination."

The film, produced by Shonda Rhimes and Betsy Beers (both of "Grey's Anatomy" and "Bridgerton") for Shondaland, provides the perspective of the three women responsible for the project — Irby, Mitchell and Perkins — examining

the importance of equal representation in all areas of life, from play to work, from childhood to adulthood, and "how these dolls have become crucial to the construction of identity and imagination" (per Shondaland).

Rhimes, who has previously worked with Mattel, through the Barbie Dream Gap Project — "a global mission dedicated to closing the gap by challenging gender stereotypes and helping undo the biases that hold girls back from

reaching their full potential" (per Mattel) — was quoted as saying: "You cannot be what you cannot see," and continues Irby, Mitchell and Perkins' mission even today, with the release of this film.

From executive producers Grace Lay ("The Deal," 2022) and Sumalee Montano ("The Lost Symbol") for LinLay Productions, Camilla Hall ("Subject," 2022) for Lady & Bird Films, "Black Barbie," premieres Wednesday, June 19, on Netflix.







If anything was a sure bet at the box office at the time, it was “Frozen II.”

The original, animated 2013 movie was that sort of serendipity any studio wishes for ... even Disney, which doesn't always have its expectations met. The company wanted to make sure its best foot was put forward on a “Frozen” sequel, which is why it took six years. Freeform shows “Frozen II” Saturday, June 22, right after — appropriately enough — the first “Frozen.”

The care shows in the storytelling, so the 2019 follow-up wasn't just a money grab ... though Disney very happily grabbed a lot of money from it. Voiced again by Idina Menzel, Elsa has returns to her kingdom (or make that queendom) after getting her power to freeze under control. She's still haunted by elements of her past, though, and she believes she might be able to change the fates of some of her ancestors. Thus, she and her sister Anna (again sporting Kristen Bell's voice) set off on that quest.



Of course, snowman Olaf also is along, with Josh Gad's vocals giving him the now-expected dose of attitude. In fact, the entire voice cast is well-chosen, with fellow Broadway veterans Jonathan Groff and Santino Fontana also back, and “This Is Us” alum Sterling K. Brown making a significant contribution in a new role. There's no “Let It Go” on the soundtrack this time, though that tune does get a reprise, but the included songs are appropriate and catchy enough.

A second act for a movie franchise always is dicey, since history bears out that so few sequels live up to (and, indeed, don't diminish) the original. It was particularly critical for Disney to ensure that didn't happen with “Frozen II,” and not only for the financial health of that project itself.

Its arrival in theaters roughly coincided with the launch of the streaming service Disney+, so it was incumbent on the company – which clearly wanted potential subscribers to see in every way that the Disney magic was intact. “Frozen II” was not a minor element of that, so in that sense, mission accomplished.

Such a massive legion of fans was waiting for “Frozen II,” its makers knew there was no option but to get it right. They did, and since then, the wait has been on for “Frozen III” ... and at this point, that “threequel” is expected to arrive in 2026. In the meantime, Freeform's double bill of the first two chapters should comfort quite a few people.

A 'Fire'-y exit for another longtime series regular

Q: I was surprised to hear that Eamonn Walker is leaving "Chicago Fire." Was he on the show from the beginning? – Roy Granger, Antioch, Calif.

A: He was. There have been many comings and goings on the Dick Wolf-produced NBC drama over the years, but Eamonn Walker originated and stayed with the role of Deputy District Chief Wallace Boden right from the beginning of the show in 2012. The network has said that he will have "a recurring capacity" on the show going forward, something that also has been shown by other former cast regulars as Jesse Spencer and Monica Raymund in their returns to the series (though those haven't been for long, admittedly).

Kara Killmer, Alberto Rosende and relative short-timer Rome Flynn also left "Chicago Fire" during the past television year. Walker's portrayal of Boden over 12 seasons has cast a particularly long shadow, and one that will continue to be seen in the plentiful repeats of the program that are available via such outlets as ION Television, USA Network and Peacock.

Q: I read somewhere that Barbra Streisand's song for the Peacock drama "The Tattooist of Auschwitz" was the first time she had recorded an original song for a television production. Is that true? – Jennifer Curtis, via e-mail

A: Yes, though she also contributed a song for a project in which she didn't appear with "Prisoner," from the 1978 Faye Dunaway movie "Eyes of Laura Mars." Streisand and the picture's producer, Jon Peters, were a high-profile Hollywood couple at the time.

Certainly, Streisand has sung on TV many other times, from her classic 1960s specials to the "Carpool Karaoke" segment she did on CBS's "The Late Late Show With James Corden." In those cases, though, she generally performed tunes that had been available via other media, from Broadway to recordings. Being the singular entertainment icon she is, Streisand's commitment to sing "Love Will Survive" for "The Tattooist of Auschwitz" — which she said she made on the basis of the context of the song within that story — was attention-grabbing.

Q: I heard that CBS is going to show Sylvester Stallone's Paramount+ series "Tulsa King." When does that start? – Greg Wayne, Tacoma, Wash.

A: The broadcast premiere of Season 1 is scheduled for July 14. CBS is hoping for results similar to those it has had by running much of "Yellowstone," which scored significant ratings there despite the fact that the episodes had been shown previously by Paramount Network. Giving "Tulsa King" an over-the-air berth also serves as a lengthy teaser for its second season, which is slated to debut on Paramount+ in the near future ... and possibly draw more subscribers to that streaming service, which clearly is one of the related hopes.

Q: I've enjoyed seeing Lady Gaga in the latest version of "A Star Is Born" on HBO again lately. What is her next movie, and when will it be out? – Kristie Forman, via e-mail

A: The singer-actress will put her spin on the role of Harley Quinn in "Joker: Folie a Deux," which is slated for release in October. Joaquin Phoenix will return as the Joker in the sequel, directed and co-written by the first "Joker" film's Todd Phillips. In the meantime, Lady Gaga's "Gaga Chromatica Ball" concert special is streaming on Max following its recent debut on HBO.

Man released from Bradford Jail arrested for stealing truck to get home

STARKE – Clay County Sheriff’s Office deputies said they caught a man breaking into work trucks at Chemours Company on June 6 and trying to get into the office building, and he had to be tackled when he tried to run away.

Drake William Newberg, 28, of Fleming Island, was charged with grand theft auto, resisting law enforcement with violence, leaving the scene of an accident with property damage and providing a false name or identification after he pushed a deputy and tried to flee in handcuffs.

He was quickly taken to the ground and placed in a squad car. He told deputies he had just been released from the Bradford County Jail and got lost trying to walk home to Fleming Island. Employees at Chemours told Newberg he needed to leave the property, but he continued to get inside the trucks. Another truck was found crashed about a quarter of a mile away from the company.

Newberg’s bond is \$52,257.

Mother arrested for drugs; daughter for child neglect; homeowner for operating drug house following raid

ORANGE PARK – A mother and daughter, along with the homeowner were arrested during a drug raid by the Clay County Sheriff’s Department’s Narcotics Unit and SWAT team on June 5.

The raid was set up after the sheriff’s office used a confidential informant to make a controlled drug buy from Kristian Elaine Barnhill, 50, of Orange Park.

After serving the warrant, deputies found methamphetamine, cocaine, marijuana, Xanax, drug paraphernalia and a bullet in Barnhill’s bedroom and an air vent. In addition to being charged with possession, Barnhill, 50, was charged with distributing and selling crack cocaine and trafficking methamphetamine.

Kristian Barnhill’s bond was set at \$535,002.

Brittany Elaine Barnhill, 28, was taken into custody after she admitted she’d left her 6-year-old daughter at home alone with the illegal drugs left in the open on

Kristian Barnhill’s bed on her dresser. Brittany Barnhill was charged with child neglect.

The homeowner, Julio Villanueva Sason III, 60, was also arrested after deputies uncovered crack cocaine and a glass pipe with cocaine residue in his bathroom. He was also charged with keeping a public nuisance structure for drug activity.

His bond was set at \$55,008.

Trespassing call leads to methamphetamine trafficking arrests

ORANGE PARK – Two men were arrested for trafficking methamphetamine after they were caught sitting behind a fitness club on Wells Road with a plastic bag of the drug.

Darrin Dewayne Touchton Jr., 37, of Jacksonville, and Antony Richard Staples, 40, of Orange Park, both were charged with trafficking methamphetamine after the Clay County Sheriff’s Office investigated two men trespassing behind a business. When the deputy arrived, he found both men sitting at a makeshift table with two bags on the table. Tests revealed one bag contained methamphetamine and the other mannitol.


Bonds for both men were set at \$150,003 each.

Boy, 16, charged with manslaughter after accidentally shooting friend



to the adult residents of the home where the incident occurred. How the suspect acquired the firearm is still under investigation.”



“Our decision to implement body-worn cameras underscores our unwavering commitment to fostering transparency, accountability, and safety within our communities while also increasing the safety of our deputies,” Cook said. “We recognize that this represents a significant investment of capital, and thus, we are taking a deliberate and systematic approach to ensure that we select the most effective so-

lution for our agency and our community. We are currently pursuing grants to offset some of the costs associated with a body-worn camera program.”
In January 2023, the Orange Park Police Department used money from the American Rescue Plan to offset the \$229,000 price tag for equipment and five years of video storage for its body-worn cameras.

DOMINATED

Clay County saw plenty of state champions this season

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Three first-time team champions, two three-time individual state champions, three repeat state champions; one undefeated state champion who did it twice and three guys who defied odds gave Clay County high school sports one of the more unique finishes in recent history, plus one champion that joined her boy's team peaking at the right moment.

Three first-time team champions; Middleburg High volleyball, Fleming Island boys golf and St. Johns Country Day School baseball all stormed the castles of their respective chases with dramatic fashion in all three playoff runs.

Middleburg rookie head coach Meredith Forkum, not necessarily new to the program as an ex-Bronco player herself and a former assistant coach under long-time coach Carrie Prewitt, added that little bit of something to get her power-laden Broncos squad, led by an all-state front led by senior Connor Rahn and junior daughter Brooke Forkum blasting from right and left side positions to wisk their way to a first-time state title. Rahn heads to the University of Tampa next fall with her little sister, though not so little at about 6'-2", Camden is destined to repeat the task.

Fleming Island had the luck of the Irish kind of with a disastrous region championship finish all but eliminating a spectacular, yet erratic regular season finish, but golf aficionados offering coach Bruce Cloud a breath of air with an at-large state championship bid.

The bid, for all that it was worth, seemed to be the fuel to fire up a squad that had the firepower to dominate any tournament when all cylinders were firing as lead hitter Tyler Mawhinney, just a sophomore, had two splendid rounds of championship golf including a hole-in-one for good luck on his first of two rounds, was ice throughout and crested with the first solo golf title for Fleming Island while leading his team to a first-ever golf team title for Clay County.



Middleburg High's volleyball team had the following on the entire school behind them on their trek to a Class 5A title led by senior Connor Rahn and first-year coach Meredith Forkum.

And, in baseball, in one of the more nerve-testing playoff runs in the history of not just Clay County, but maybe in the state, the near-death experiences of St. Johns Country Day School's baseball squad that turned to walk-off heroics of volcanic magnitude made the journey one of the more unique sports finishes of all time in Clay County.

Spartan coach Tom Lucas may have more gray hairs on his temple, but they would be well worth the chatter on his fishing boat with a few of his boys years from now.

On the individual state champion side of the conversation, Fleming Island swimmer Maryn McDade and Clay High weightlifter Emma Heck became a pair of three-time state champions in their crafts that defied all the probability of sports.

McDade was near-perfect in one of the most excruciatingly close events in not just swimming, but any sport except maybe the 100-meter dash in track. In the 50 free that happens in just about 22-23 seconds where one mistake is costly, McDade maintained her perfection of the event for a third consecutive year while

also adding the 100 free to her impressive resume. McDade heads to Florida State University next fall.

Heck, as dominant an athlete weightlifter as most programs could ask for, came in as a highly-touted freshman and has not failed to deliver the goods come state meet time. Heck is far and above one of the most dominant and consistent athletes to have honed her craft with one more season in front her just looking to be gravy on the cake.

In the double department, weightlifters Trey Jeffries of Keystone Heights and Kevin Reyes of Fleming Island returned to their platforms and repeated as state champions in their endeavors; Olympics and Traditional for Jeffries and Olympics for Reyes.

For wrestling, with a bucketload of state, meet qualifiers leaving from the county, it was Middleburg junior Cheyenne Cruce who returned with the lone gold after keeping her two years of perfection intact with another undefeated state title run although this one came with an

FHSAA decision good or bad?

FLEMING ISLAND – With many a high school athlete entering the fray of big-money aspirations when out of high school, the Florida High School Athletic Association's unanimous vote in June seems to have paved the way for Florida athletes to seemingly make big bucks from their images; Name, Image, Likeness (NIL), a trend that has put the NCAA sports conglomerate into a frenzy of who's making what where?

"I think that to think that a high school athlete; maybe a four-star guy, is aware enough of the pitfalls of being offered a big sum of money to use his image and how it will affect his final high school season and possibly his career is far fetched," said Oakleaf High football coach Chris Foy, who recently garnered near a dozen college football offers for his Knights football team while on a camp visit in Georgia. "The FHSA's signing, as I read it, is more for NIL education and not necessarily just a green light to make money as a high schooler."

Foy seems correct in his assessment according to a reading of the FHSAA By-law 9.9 Amateurism and Name, Image, and Likeness pages, with the first line reading simply, "The Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA) recognizes the importance of maintaining amateurism in high school athletics."

The second sentence warns that compliance with "this bylaw" does not ensure maintenance of eligibility to collegiate associations with NCAA, NAIA and NJCAA all

Dressel family wants Clay County to share Caeleb's return to the Olympics

As Caeleb Dressel's prowess has grown into worldwide status, parents Christina and Michael, have always found a way financially to fly and watch their son compete against the best in the world.

"Sometimes people don't know that we had three more swimmers that were also state champion caliber, NCAA caliber, and even Olympic Trials caliber along the way," said Christina of son Tyler, now 32, who made it to the finals of the 50 free in high school, daughters Kaitlin Dressel, 31, a state high school champion, an NCAA qualifier for Florida State University, and an Olympic Trials qualifier and Sherridon, 25, who was the last state champion, an NCAA qualifier also at the University of Florida, an Olympics Trials qualifier.

"We started our travels to watch them compete when Kaitlyn in sixth grade went to nationals, but Caeleb's trip to Dubai for the junior worlds was our first international meet," Christina said. "We missed that one because we didn't know we were allowed to go. I don't think we've missed one other than that in nearly 20 years. We find a way."

The Dressels mainly travel as a couple for the trips, but they have had one or two of their children along. The Olympic Games at Rio de Janeiro was the last time all five traveled to see Caeleb swim.

"That was a mess because you can't book anything until after the Olympic Trials, and then trying to get a hotel is almost impossible," Christina said. "The plane tickets can be refunded most times."

Caeleb Dressel's list of titles is impressive, dating back to 2011 with a 13-14 National age group record in the 50 free-style, a junior World championship medalist in Dubai, as well as state champion as a high schooler and a freshman 100 butterfly

champion as a Florida Gator.

Dressel, now 27, continued his dominance with a first sub-19 second 50 free as a Florida junior on his way to several SEC and NCAA titles and records through his senior season when he was selected NCAA Male Swimmer of Year.

"In hindsight, that is a lot of meets and a lot of traveling that we have been lucky enough to go to," the mother said. "This time, with Caeleb returning to the Olympics Trials in Indianapolis in mid-June, we wanted to share our experience with the Clay High and Clay County community. That has kept an eye on him all these years, just like Michael and me."

The Dressels are planning a Watch Party at The Church of Eleven22 on Fleming Island on June 22 from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m., inviting local fans to join the community to watch their famous graduate and champion attempt to return to world status and return to the Olympics.

"We want to surprise Caeleb by bringing his entire family; Michael and me, his siblings, his wife and his son, to Paris after the Olympic Trials July 26-Aug. 11," Christina said. "Michael and I have been able to get the both of us and the siblings when we can, but this one will be special and possibly his last. We want to see if the community can come along for the ride."

Dressel withdrew abruptly from the 2022 World Swimming Championships in Budapest, Hungary, after qualifying for the 100-meter butterfly semifinals, earning gold medals in the 4 x 100 free relay, and winning the 50 butterfly world title, citing non-physical reasons.

"He needed a break, simply so," Christina said. "He had been swimming at a high level for a long time. As his mother, I see his happiness in being back in the pool. He never really talked about it because, at the time, his life was very fragile."



The Dressel family has grown with the addition of wives, girlfriends and even a new grandson, August, born to Caeleb and wife Meghan last year.

After nearly eight months of self-awareness therapy, building a family with wife Meghan and new son, August, now in his corner, Caeleb has slowly rebuilt his body to near-world level status with a series of fast times in pro meets throughout the United States.

"He knows his body better than anyone on the planet, and his times for the past six to eight months have been a good sign that he is enjoying swimming again. He is just about ready to enter the world stage," Christina said, noting Caeleb has been on a media blackout prior to his preparations for the Trials. "No matter what he does at Trials and maybe the Olympics, as long as he is happy, I'm happy."

According to the U.S. Olympics Trials heat sheets, Dressel's name, though stationed at the top of numerous events, indicates an American record, a Long Course record, a U.S. Open record, a Junior World record, or a World record for the specific event, does not have Dressel at the top spot of potential swimmers in his record-setting events for the upcoming Trials.

"I don't ever look at heat sheets," Christina said. "He is in the best frame of mind I have ever seen him. I don't know how he practices, and I don't pay much attention to the results. But when I see him, I see him happy. He knows what he and his coaches are doing."

In the 100 free, Dressel is no longer the world record holder. China swimmer Zhanle Pan broke his record with a 46.80 split in February while Dressel still holds the American record of 46.96 seconds set in 2019.

In the heat sheet, Dressel is ranked 10th with a 48.30 split set in 2024 with six Americans in less than 48 seconds, led by California's Jack Alevy.

In the 50 free, the world record set in 2009 by Brazilian Cesar Cielo Filho is 20.91 seconds, with Dressel the American record at 21.04 (2019), the LC Nationals record at 21.29 (2022) and the U.S. Open record at 21.04 (2021).



For the Trials, Ryan Held of New York is the top qualifier at 21.50, with Dressel in fifth at 21.84 and Alexy second at 21.57. The top 10 in the 50 free listings are all quicker than 22 seconds, making the Trials race a race of microseconds.

In the 100 butterfly, Dressel owns four of the five records set in 2021 (49.45 world, 49.45 American, 49.76 LC Nationals, 49.76 U.S. Open). Dressel is close to the best in America, with Dare Rose of California at 50.46, Shaine Casas second at 50.80, and Dressel third at 50.84. All three butterfly specialists are the only three under 51 seconds.

"He's really not that stressed and says he's having fun," his mother said. "You

can't put into words what his family means to him, Meghan and August."

In an article on SwimSwam.com, one of the top international swimming coverage websites, Dressel is ranked as the 29th best swimmer in the world.

From SwimSwam: The big question on everyone's mind since the summer of 2022 will be answered this year. Will Caeleb Dressel make an impact again on the global stage? In time for Paris 2024? The seven-time Olympic gold medalist and world

champion several times over and has not returned to peak form since he pulled out of the 2022 World Championships. This past summer, Dressel placed as high as third at U.S. Nationals in the 50 fly and fifth in the 100 fly.

At the U.S. Open in December, Dressel won the 100 fly in 51.31, his fastest time since April of 2022 and one that currently sits fifth in the world rankings and No. 2 among Americans. Like all sprinters, his path to qualifying in the freestyle events

is very uncertain, but no doubt appears more difficult due to the emergence of Jack Alexy.

Dressel, who recently pulled out of the Knoxville Pro Swim Series meet due to the impending birth of his first child, certainly has a high chance of medaling at the Olympics but will first have to make the team.

The top 10 swimmers include France's Leon Marchand, a butterfly specialist more suited to win the Individual Medley events, 200 and 400. Marchand may see Dressel in relays.

Second is China's Qin Huyang, which is

mainly a breaststroker. The top American is distance ace Bobby Finke, a double gold Olympian in 2021 and a Florida Gator. Finke and Dressel also have women's champion Katie Ledecky in the Florida camp, while four-time Olympic backstroke gold and former world recorder holder Ryan Murphy is listed as No. 1 for the 100 and 200 backstroke.

Murphy and Dressel have been swim cohorts since they were about 8 in North Florida and in the Bolles Sharks Swim Club, Olympic and World Championship teams.

Hot, steamy Run for Pies 5K ‘brutal’

JACKSONVILLE - On a brutally hot and humid late afternoon in downtown Jacksonville, 45 elite runners and nearly 900 area runners took to the streets near Weldon Park to take on the Jacksonville Grand Prix’s season opener; the Run for the Pies 5K road race.

“It’s super hot out here and the course is a little deceptive in that it has a long downhill slope then a turnaround at the bottom and a long uphill climb I think for the three laps of the closed circuit course,” said Tim Cooper, a masters runner and former golf teacher in Clay County’s Magnolia Point Golf Course. “I’ve gotten back to running which was my passion in college (cross country) and had some good marathons with the Jacksonville Marathon getting me to the Boston Marathon.”

Cooper, 46, was amidst a slew of young tigers in the men’s elite race that was won by Stan Linton, 30, in a quick 15 minutes, 29 seconds just ahead of runner-up Joshua Estrada, 32, in 15:36 and Mandarin grad Sem Sultanov, 26, third in 15:41.

Cooper was in a tight front pack on the first of four laps but got dropped to finish 14th in 16:53.

Luke Klingenburg, 23, a Fleming Island High former swimmer and an area stand-out triathlete, finished ninth in 16:27.

In the women’s race, with former Clay High state track and cross country champion and former Fleming Island High cross country coach Karen Moritz in the field representing a handful of fast 40-plus runners, it was Brittany Eberson, 36, of Jacksonville, in 18:15 holding off two challengers; University of North Florida’s Hannah Martin, 22, and Jacksonville University’s Hayleigh Haid, 24, who finished stumbling over each other in second and third in 18:25 and 18:30.

Moritz, still showing prime time form,



finished a strong eighth in 19:28 with Stephanie Liles-Weyant, a Tallahassee 52-year-old Ironman Triathlon finisher, getting her first taste of downtown Jacksonville heat, finishing 13th in 20:10 in the 17-runner field.

“It was brutal,” said Liles-Weyant. “The so-called hills are draining because they keep going up though are not very steep. Fun though.”

In the open races, Creekside High’s Samuel Cassiani, 14, held off a sprint to a finish from 37-year-old Christopher Howard to win in 18:00 to Howard’s 18:01. Evan Weinroth, 16, was third in 18:04 in the tightly battled final uphill 150 meters of the race.

For the women, Claire Domingo, 47, won in 20:03 for 34th overall with 14-year-old Stella Krueger, a standout at Episcopal High School, second in 20:38 for 54th overall. Laci Watford, 19, a University Christian standout now at North Florida, was third in 20:47.

Bobby Wood, 58, of Orange Park, was an age group champion in the 55-60s with a 20:48 time.

Wimberly expecting ‘his’ team to push for better 2024

ORANGE PARK - Into his upcoming third year as head coach at Orange Park High football, Marcus Wimberly is expecting that the transition to him as a new coach and the new staff around the Raiders should be comfortable in 2024.

“These, so-called, my kids, have been around me for the last three years and understand the culture and expectations that we want,” said Wimberly, who came to Orange Park after a Tennessee state championship and a stellar collegiate career as part of a Miami Hurricanes national championship season and brief NFL stint with the Atlanta Falcons. “The culture is starting to seep in day in and day out with the kids and the parents. Everyone is buying in. We were close last year; lost two games by one point and should have made the playoffs.”

Finishing with four wins, six losses last year, with a 42-41 loss to Clay and a final game 28-27 loss in overtime to Fleming Island, plus a late season upset of playoff-bound Middleburg, 41-22, that almost got the Raiders into the playoffs, Wimberly had a team of erratic play and self-induced errors last year and saw a big difference in this year’s spring game against ED White, a tough 19-6 loss.

“We made mistakes which is expected,

but the effort was good,” said Wimberly, who has a returning starting quarterback, Gabe Taylor, leading the offense. “The mistakes are correctable though and we have a very young team. Gabe looked better and we are working on his footwork.”

Wimberly returns a bevy of firepower with his quarterback a junior, all his running backs returning; Joshua Johnson, Dylon Ruiz, and a handful of pass catchers; speedy Quinton “Q” Moore and Daniel Richardson with Damar Jackson a destructive runner and linebacker.

“The young guys know the plan now and we should be better at executing,” said Wimberly. “The seniors want to bring Orange Park football back where Orange Park football belongs.”

On the practice field, Wimberly brings in former Raider offensive line standout Tyler Dehart, also a top wrestler, to coach his line.

Wimberly’s 2024 slate gets much more difficult with a new district and with a pre-season opener with Mandarin (11-4, 4M state runner-up) with the likes of Oakleaf, Riverside (9-3, region semifinalist), Fleming Island and Bartram Trail (8-5, region finalist) on the regular season docket including a second half meeting with Middleburg. Fleming Island and Middleburg are now with the Raiders in the newly formed district 3-5A lineup along with Ponte Vedra (8-4, region 4S semifinalist) and Beach-

side (9-1 in Freelance in the second season with a season-ending 66-22 win over Providence). With Beachside the new kid on the block with just two seasons on their resume, the Barracudas were one of the most offensive productive teams in north Florida last year with six games of 40-plus points and a season-opening loss, 38-35, to Toco Creek. Beachside has a 2500 Yds 35TD quarterback returning and four of seven double-figure pass catchers. “They are going to be good for sure,” said Wimberly. “And, they will have a chip on their shoulder to prove they belong.”

For the summer, Wimberly already finished strong, second place, in an Orlando 7 v 7 tournament, and will keep adding

pieces to his puzzle.

“My main thing for the summer to compete at a high level is strength and conditioning,” said Wimberly. “We saw that in the ED White game with the younger kids on the field. That will be our main focus.”

Wimberly noted that the kids on the team were asking for more intensity over the summer.

“The attitude is a lot better this year,” said Wimberly. “They were acknowledging that they were not ready to go full speed yet. Their eyes were opened by ED White’s preparation.”

Wimberly plans a series of 7 v 7s with Bolles (June 12) and Bishop Snyder (June 27) visiting.

overtime challenge from a well-known also unbeaten wrestler. Cruce kept her chasers at bay with a unique attitude of not letting her own craft diminish for lack of preparation and being ready for all contingencies on the mat.

For Reyes, the chase for the repeat came after precariously battling with much larger front runner, but the savvy Reyes squashed his massive counterpart on his final lift knowing all he needed was to tie his 276-pound challenger to win with his 260-pound body weight.

For Jeffries, who has been the alpha dog for Indians coach Lantz Lowery for his two years as a lead lifter, the repeat was inevitable, the question was by how much and would Lowery get a fourth straight team title out of it.

Jeffries shook his bench press platform to repeat as a Traditional champion and added the Olympics title to his slate in 2024.

As for the newcomers to the gold medal crew, Oakleaf High weightlifter Elijah Shevchook may have been chasing the valor of his big brother who was a major player in numerous Oakleaf sports, but the middle man in the Shevchook hierarchy took his game to the next level with a state title on his first try. With the Shevchook family all stout, strong males, Elijah must worry about his little brother Noah in the next few years who got his own weightlifting medals as a freshman but has three more years to excel.

In track, Fleming Island had been in the mix all season as having a torrid bunch of 800-meter runners; maybe five that could go under the illustrious two-minute mark, but the Golden Eagles scorched the Earth at the University of North Florida with a 7:43 gold medal effort that saw four senior runners; Graham Myers, John Keester IV, Michael DeRousse and Roman Mollicone annihilate a field of challengers that did not see the sub-1:55 first two legs of Myers and Keester and a final scintillating leg of 1:51 for Mollicone.

Mollicone not only blasted his anchor leg with his final 200s of the 800s throughout the season having been blue-collar fascinating as he lowered the previous school record probably six times, but crushed the record one more time for gold in the individual 800 to put a second 800 gold medal in the Fleming Island trophy case (Cameron Davis, 2011).

In track, where one day makes or breaks a shot at a title, a guy and a gal that both primed for their day and both teetered at the top all season with little or no fanfare except maybe in the Clay Today sports pages, but Oakleaf triple jumper Takoda Brown and Fleming Island high jumper Gabrielle Flores both fulfilled the age-old championship credo of going big on the big stage with Brown winning the Class 4A



triple jump and Flores winning the Class 3A high jump.

Flores, though second in the region and first with four perfect jumps in the district, maintained that discipline with five perfect first jumps against two competitors who also had a perfect day going and eventually won by hitting her final perfect jump when it counted.

Brown, who was a distant fourth at regions by almost four inches, came back from a fouled first jump in his first jump at the Class 4A championships with his winning jump on his second try to hold off his chasers to win by nearly two inches.

listed in the sentence.

Georgia's NIL law, signed July 1, 2021, for college and signed October 4, 2023, for high school, also has its stipulations despite the opening sentence reading "As of October 4, 2023, Georgia allows high school athletes to earn money from their name, image, and likeness (NIL) deals through the Georgia High School Association (GHSA)."

Middleburg High football coach Ryan Wolfe is content to let the rule take effect and see the outcome.

"I like the positives of players being able to profit from their hard work," said Wolfe. "I worry about the negatives that have afflicted college sports, but I am not going to rush to judgment until I see how it affects high school sports. Most states already have this in place and it hasn't affected them too much."

Ironically, Georgia reports just 44 of 429,714 student-athletes have signed NIL deals since the October signing.

In 2022, NCAA statistics showed that 17 percent of all NCAA Division I athletes (190,000) had NIL deals with two sons of famous athletes; Bronny James, son of LeBron James of the NBA Los Angeles Lakers who has a \$4.9 million valuation of NIL deals with Nike, Google and PSD Underwear, and Shedeur Sanders, Colorado quarterback and son of NFL Hall of Famer Deion Sanders, who has a \$4.7 million valuation with Google, Beats by Dre, Mercedes-Benz and Oikos. One key stat for both James and Sanders was social media connect with James owning 13.4 million followers and Sanders having 2.4 million followers. One more interesting fact; Quinn Ewers, quarterback for Texas, with an NIL deal of \$1.9 million and 262,000 followers, and 16 other NCAA athletes, made more than NFL Super Bowl quarterback Brock Purdy of the San Francisco 49ers who earned just \$870,000.

When Georgia passed its NIL bylaw last October, former (Alabama) AHSAA execu-

tive director Steve Savarese said it was a "significant" ruling. Alabama is one of the biggest "sports" states not signing on to the NIL idea in high school.

"It will completely do away with the amateur rule," Savarese said, in an article for AL.com. "There is no way to govern or regulate it. We study history to predict what will happen in the future. What's happened with NIL in college? It's out of control. When high school athletes start making more than the principal and the superintendent, you've got a real problem."

Savarese may be prophetic in his statement after seeing the retirement of legendary Alabama football coach Nick Saban who stated at a Congressional hearing recently that "All the things that I believed in, for all these years, 50 years of coaching, no longer exist in college athletics," Saban said. "It was always about developing players, it was always about helping people be more successful in life."

Saban tells a story about his wife, Terry, who posited to him during a recruiting lunch "All they care about is how much you're gonna pay them, they don't care about how much you're gonna develop them, which is what we've always done, so why are we doing this?"

Foy also correctly coined the phrase "NIL Education" as does the FHSAA which states that "The FHSAA supports NIL education, which prepares student-athletes to make informed decisions."

Around the United States, 33 states had the provision in place as in a 2021 census with Florida, Texas, and Alabama; three of the biggest football powerhouse states in America, not on board at the time. Alabama is still not allowing high school NIL deals.

In section 9.9.1 General Principles, the FHSAA sternly proclaims that "A student-athlete may not participate in an athletic activity of the FHSAA unless he/she is an amateur. An amateur is one who engages in athletic competition solely for the physical, mental, social, and pleasure benefits derived from the activity."

Middleburg High former track coach April Martin concurs that the purity of

sports may be diminished.

"What happened to sports being fun?" Martin asked. "And for kids to learn to be a part of something in the ups and downs, learning to work together, support each other, play off each other and to learn a good work ethic. They're in high school, can't they just be kids?"

On the flip side, Orange Park High boys basketball coach Derek Kurnitsky commented that America is a capitalist economy and that an athlete and his family should be able to decide to go the route of an NIL and do it responsibly to protect his eligibility.

"There are pitfalls in everything we choose to do in life," said Kurnitsky. "I don't see a problem with it, but I think coaches have to be very aware of the situation on that particular team to avoid team disunity. If a kid is good enough and the team is good with it, then let it go."

Fleming Island High Athletic Director Travis Cunningham, charged with enforcing the rules in his program, looks for some internal work to keep the NIL deals in compliance.

"Still one more step to be approved, but it sure looks like it's here to stay," said Cunningham, who recently delivered his offensive lineman son Braden to Florida Atlantic University where the school already had FAU jerseys for sale with his name on it. "We're going to have to have due diligence and homework on it. If it's here, we have to handle it the right way."

In the by-law 9.9.2 which reads "Activities that may impact amateur status, the by law reads under (b) Receiving any award or prize of monetary value which has not been approved by the FHSAA" seems to put a bit of a cloak of above-board transparency.

St. Johns Country Day School baseball coach Tom Lucas, who just won the Class 2A championship, felt the slippery slope

of the rules makes for a tough decision for parents, athletes and school.

"I understand the FHSAA had to do it because of the lawsuits, but I am worried about the enforcement of the rules," said Lucas. "Florida is the only open enrollment state with NIL to my knowledge and my fear is this could become the Wild, Wild West."

On the final page of the by-law, the FHSAA succinctly gives a violation and escalating penalty sequence depending on the reversal of the violation including a first violation will get just a verbal warning and possible termination or modification of the NIL; a second violation will make the athlete ineligible to represent any member school for one year after the violation and, thirdly, ineligibility to play any more sports for duration of athletes' high school career.

One other aspect of the new law is the migration to greener pastures for elite athletes.

In an article in SI.com written by Noah Henderson on January 31, 2024, a five-star basketball recruit out of Texas, who had a commitment to the University of Texas, moved to Missouri for his senior season to sign a multi-year deal with sports card titan Panini.


For Orange Park High girls basketball coach Mike Nesmith, the attraction of getting money at a different school is a worry.

"It might be harder to keep kids in your program if you don't have connections to help get those players money," said Nesmith. "FHSAA doesn't want coaches recruiting, but that's exactly what will happen."

Henderson, a professor of sports management at the Loyola University of Chicago, postulated the final sentence as "Throughout 2024, it is likely we see more states embrace NIL at the high school level, without it, they will lose their best talent."

Clay High baseball graduate Max Williams, now a sophomore starting outfielder at Florida State University, hit his 16th team-leading homer and was on base with a single in front of a dramatic 12th inning three run homer by teammate James Tibbs III, the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) Player of the Year as the Seminoles won a 10-8 Super Regional Game two against the University of Connecticut to advance to the 2024 NCAA College Baseball World Series.

In game one against UCONN, FSU won 24-4 with Williams hitting a homer in that game. FSU (47-15) will be making their 24th appearance in the World Series, the first since 2019, with an opening game on Friday, June 14 in Omaha.


Max Williams went 3-for-7 with his 13th home run of the season and fourth of the postseason, most on the team. Williams has a 16-game on base streak.

In the playoff run, Williams hit home runs against Wake Forest, Stetson, Central Florida and Connecticut in both games and accounted for 13 runs batted in.




