Middleburg is an unincorporated area and census-designated place (CDP) in Clay County. It began in the 1820s first as Clark's Ferry, named for the man who ran the local ferry. From 1833 to 1850, the area was known as Gary's Ferry. Then in 1853, it officially became Middleburg. When Clay County was created in 1858, Middleburg became the county seat until 1874.

One of the largest areas of Clay County, Middleburg includes both rural and small town areas and is fast growing as a center

of commerce and recreation. With access to Black Creek and Doctors Lake, the area boasts great fishing, boating and water sports activities. The beautiful Jennings State Forest offers plenty of outdoor activities including hiking, horseback riding, and canoeing.

Middleburg also is home to St. Vincent's Medical Center Clay County, a full-service hospital that recently added maternity and women's services, more ER rooms and 30 additional inpatient beds.

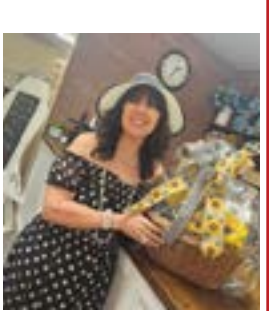

Middleburg Civic Association



Starting in 1937

On April 19, 1937 Mr. and Mrs. F.W. Budington deeded a parcel of land 150 feet by 200 feet on Palmetto Avenue to the Clay County Commissioners to be used as the ground upon which a Canning Center and Recreation Hall was to be erected for the citizens of Middleburg and for no other purpose. The property, as stipulated in the deed, was not to be used for any school purposes what-so-ever.

The building and original furniture was built by WPA workers and on Nov. 15, 1938, a committee held its first meeting to make rules and regulations for a "Community Home." Those attending this meeting were: Mr. and Mrs. A.W. Budd, Mr. and Mrs. Joe Masters, Mrs. Alice Masters, Mrs. Gussie Stewart, Mrs. Pearl Lee, Mrs. F.W. Budington, Mr. Joe Huntley and Mr. L.E. Ganann. Mr. Budd was selected Chairman and it was voted that anyone using the building would pay 50 cents, with an additional 25 cents as a guarantee that the building would be left clean and in good condition, this amount to be refunded when said conditions are complied with and accepted by the committee in charge. There was an additional charge of 50 cents if lights were used.

It was not until July 1941 that a temporary Executive Committee met for the purpose of forming a corporation and drawing up by-laws. The name was changed from The Community Home to The Middleburg Civic Association. The original sign, made by James McDonald, still hangs over the steps. The proposed Charter was approved, as presented, by Hon. A.D. McNeil, Circuit Judge of the Fourth Judicial Circuit of Florida on July 14, 1941 in Jacksonville. On July 15, 1941 said charter was

filed with Mr. L.T. Ivey, Clerk Circuit Court, Clay County. There were eight specific objects and purposes for which the corporation was organized. They were:

1. To promote the literary, scientific, social and philosophical improvement, advancement and benefit of its members.
2. To render aid to all worthy civic objects and purposes
3. To promote the general development of the Community of Middleburg, Clay County, Florida.
4. To cultivate public sentiment for the promotion of civic improvement and beautification of the community.
5. To develop the mutual welfare and benefit of its members.
6. To cooperate with and to assist in coordinating efforts of all similar organizations and individuals for the promotion of the civic benefit of the Community of Middleburg,
7. To own, maintain and operate a Community House in Middleburg with the full power to leave the building or equipment, to purchase equipment, furniture, fixtures and supplies and to promote meetings, dances, entertainments and other civil meetings and to charge admission.
8. To cooperate in all aspects with the Clay County Chamber of Commerce and the Board of Clay County Commissioners.

The opening date was set for September 10, 1941 and a concert was to be given.

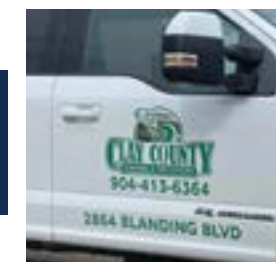

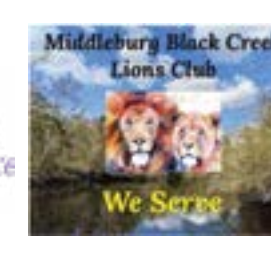

Hello from your Middleburg County Commissioner!

Hello Middleburg Friends,

It is an honor and privilege to serve as your County Commissioner. While 2023 and 2024 have brought changes to our area, I want to reassure you that I remain committed to conservation, fighting urban sprawl & smart growth. I know it may not seem that way but all of the commercial and larger residential developments, apartments & townhomes have had their zoning and land use since 2006. Interestingly, most businesses never come before the County Commission for a vote and we actually cannot choose which businesses locate on private property. Unfortunately, this is why we don't have a limit on number of carwashes, coffee shops, self-storage facilities, etc. I know that frustrates many but it is in support of private property entitlements which we all enjoy. We do have a Middleburg/Clay Hill Citizens Advisory Committee and if you are interested in serving on it, applications can be found on the county website. Fortunately, they haven't had to meet much as there have been very few zoning change requests in Middleburg in the past year but they provide advisement to the Planning Commission and the Board of County Commissioners.

We have been very busy with road resurfacing and paving

in Middleburg during my tenure as your commissioner. We have resurfaced more than 8 roads and improved 5 dirt roads with either pavement or millings. There is a rather large resurfacing and milling project planned for Middleburg for our 2024-2025 fiscal year if everything passes in the upcoming budget vote as we expect. Additionally, we have a number of drainage improvements, park and boat ramp improvements and a new fire station locating on Old Jennings Road by CCUA. We completed the first ever Strategic Plan for Clay County and it is available on the county website at www.claycountygov.com. Additionally, make sure you download the Clay Connected App through your app store on your phone for easy access to reporting public works issues, reporting animal control issues, reporting trash pickup issues or just to find out more information. MHS Cruce, Forkum highlights of Bronco athletics

MIDDLEBURG - Middleburg High junior wrestler Cheyenne Cruce has made it very clear that her journey to defend her state title at 190 from last year was with a philosophy of every match is a danger zone.

For volleyball coach Meredith Forkum, the treacherous path of following long-tenured coach Carrie Prewitt brought with not only a big target per game, but an anxiety of what would the new face in the director's chair add to such a prestigious program.

"I don't think at all about that I am the defending state champion and I should win all my matches," said Cruce, after defending that state title with a dramatic overtime win, 3-1, over a game Apopka High senior, Jada Jones. "I worked my butt off from the week after last year's title to make sure that I was the best me that I

could make myself to win a second one."

Cruce, 32-0 as she finished her junior season, rifled through her preliminary matches to the final with three pins to the final while Jones, 24-1 prior to the final and a third place finisher last year after being pinned by Cruce in quarterfinals, did that same only with all first period pins to set up a showdown of epic proportions.

Forkum, with a Top Gun set of fireballers on her front net, stormed the gates of volleyball to a dominating state championship that got the storied Prewitt era the final push to gold.

"I got the keys to a Porsche and just didn't have to crash it," said Forkum, prior to her rookie season at the helm. "The program need one final spark I guess to get that elusive title and we had players

like the Rahns; Connor and Camden, Brooke Forkum to lead the charge."

Cruce was the alpha athlete for a crew of girl wrestlers for coach Coll Robertson and Jamie Harrison that steadfastly battled the top teams in the state with fervor and enthusiasm; Memphis Mose, Sarah Walsh, Skylar Fisher; all state qualifiers as sophomores, with Fisher winning probably the most dramatic region title in girls wrestling in Clay County.

Cruce's second title highlighted a Bronco Nation; aka Horsepower, year of athletics highlights that included a second playoff berth for football under coach Ryan Wolfe, a fourth in track discus from Madison Underwood, a resurgence of boy wrestling under coach Coll Robertson, softball prowess again, a near baseball colossal upset and some basketball games that turned to heartbreakers.

"I understand that our two playoffs spots are good for the program, but I want to get that winning season for the school," said Wolfe, in his fourth season after three 5-5 seasons with the honor of the only Clay County school to achieve a region playoff spot. "I think we can push the program to the next level with an 8-2 7-3 record just to be able say we have a winning record."

Wolfe had quite the senior crew on the field with excitement quarterback Jaydan Jenkins, linebacker Austin "Cowboy" Cruce, DE Tucker Cody, DB Errick Fryer and super kicker Kaleb Robison.

"We have a lot of young players coming back this season that have game time experience," said Wolfe. "And, all of these kids have been with me for the past four years and that is a big advantage; they know the system and terminology."

Underwood, a sophomore, continued her prominence in her event, the discus with

her fourth place throw at state and will be force in the next two years.

In wrestling, Robertson is piece by piece building up the Bronco program with more and more athletes finding the wrestling room and competing at state levels; Tucker Cody, Wyatt Leduc, Gavin Fisher and Grady Woodard; as the core of a tough batch of grapplers.

In the spring, baseball and softball offered up their typical scrappy swashbuckling play with the Broncos almost, so almost, taking out Clay in the district semifinals in an excruciating extra inning baseball slugfest that ended with a 1-0 Clay win.

In softball, 2022 state champion coach Ashley Houston's quest for a second title got bumped by a Gainesville High team that featured a fireballing freshman pitcher, but the Lady Broncos kept fans glued to their seats with the bat power of trio KK Hagan, Kerra Clarida and Alyssa Prather and the flamethrowing of senior pitcher Morgan Beckham.

Flag football got a playoff berth and two athletes; Cheyenne Jenkins and Brooke Cooper chosen to a Jacksonville Jaguars Prep Top 25 players team.

And, on the hardwood, boys basketball coach Sean Sweeney opened his season on fire with a 12-2 start and some raised eyebrows watching the exciting play of Aiden Farber, Jarren Rosier and Jacob Lohse; all seniors, who may have set a high bar for upcoming Bronco teams with their final 18-8 record and a district tournament playoff win.

On the alum side, state champion softball pitcher Mallory Forrester went big at Santa Fe College and earned players of week and pitcher of year awards for Florida junior college.

That’s why we have started focusing more on the “Families of Middleburg” and collaborating with local family members to create family-specific notebooks to display in our collection. Below are photos of these family notebooks, examples of the old class photos we have from Middleburg Elementary School, and the Museum Resource Library we are creating. If you would like to get involved with this project, please let us know!



The Museum holds its monthly meetings on the third Thursday of the month at 6:30 p.m. at the Middleburg Civic Center, which is located at 2102 Palmetto Street, Middleburg, FL 32068. Each fiscal year we hold an Annual Spring Membership Meeting, and we have an Annual Fall Membership Meeting when we elect our Museum Officers to serve the following fiscal year. We thank the Middleburg Civic Association for allowing us to hold our meetings in their facility.

The Museum is open to visitors each Sunday afternoon from 2-4 p.m. (excluding holidays). We invite you to stop by some time to check out our collection. Our docents will be happy to answer any questions and provide you with a tour.

In addition to our meetings, we are also trying to make activities and museum tours more available to the public. Our “Friday Nights at the Museum” are held quarterly, and they give us additional opportunities to celebrate special occasions, provide tours of our collection, and enjoy refreshments with our museum members and friends. Our next Friday Night at the Museum will be Friday, August 16th and we hope members of the community will join us as we continue to celebrate the “Families of Middleburg.” We will be asking them to bring in their family photos and stories to share at this special get-together.

The building that houses our museum collection is owned by the Clay County Board of Commissioners and our nonprofit museum rents it from them. The structure was built in 1938 by the Works Progress Administration (WPA) as part of the New Deal which was an employment and infrastructure program created by President Franklin D. Roosevelt during the Great Depression. Since 1989, the building has been used by the Middleburg Museum. We are currently applying for a State Historic Marker to commemorate the historical significance of the Middleburg Museum, the Middleburg Civic Association, and the Middleburg Masonic Lodge #107 to the Middleburg community. The proposed name for the location of these three organizations is, “The Middleburg Palmetto Street Historic Triangle.”

Our museum collection is filled with one-of-a-kind items such as the 1,000+ year-old Timucuan canoe pictured below.

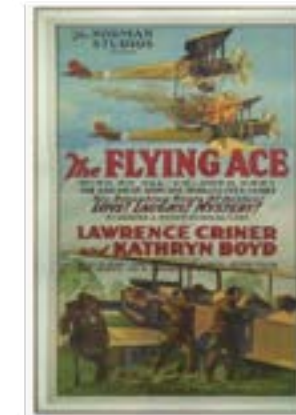


In June 2024, the Museum's longtime curator, Dr. Cynthia Stone, will be retiring. Through the years, she has been our most generous benefactor.

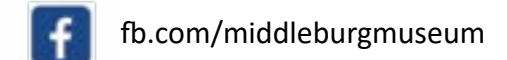

THE HOUSES OF HISTORIC MIDDLEBURG



LONG HOUSE
(Circa 1890) 3858 Main Street
This home was purchased by Edward Long for his parents in 1896. It was an example of the open side gambel frame vernacular style. This building features drop siding exterior wall fabric and an exterior field stone chimney stack.



UNITED METHODIST CHURCH
(Circa 1847) 3925 Main Street
This building is one of the oldest Methodist churches in continuous use in Florida. It is a frame vernacular Church built of Hand-wrought lumber and nails. Mr. George Branning later donated the bell which was forged in New York and shipped by steamboat. One early use of the bell was to toll the death of his son, Robert Branning, who died in 1861 at 20 years of age.



THE BARDIN HOME
(Circa 1888) 3881 Main Street
This is Middleburg's only example of Italian architecture. This style is more common in other areas of the country than in the South. There is a central cupola which is a small structure built on to the house. It is often used as a lookout and for air supply ventilation. Mr. Henry Bardin's house has two wide porches across the front of the hoe. It also has Victorian style gingerbread trim. The Bardins used to have square dances there many Saturday nights.



THE STEWART HOME
(Circa 1890-1911) 3895 Main Street
This is Middleburg's only example of center gable frame vernacular architecture. It is a white two-story home with a porch. It has a front facing gable wall dormer window. The home was built by George Chalker. As Mr. Chalker had a home on wharf Street, he rented this house to Mr. and Mrs. G.P. Stewart. The Stewarts moved from the Gin House Landing area where they had a turpentine mill.



THE GEORGE CHALKER HOME
(Circa Late 1800's) 2160 Wharf Street
This white two-story home sits on a large area of land. It is Colonial Revival architecture which features a flat roofed porch with a railing above which is supported by square columns. There is a dormer window on the roof on the front of the house. A vine-covered retaining wall fronts the home on Wharf Street. The Chalker family was related to many families in Middleburg. It is presently under-going renovation and restoration.



THE GEORGE HASKELL HOME
(Circa Late 1800's) 3894 Main Street
This frame vernacular home was built by Mr. Haskell as a replica of his home in Salem Mass. He was stationed with the Union troops during the Civil War in the area. He was attached to the Paymaster Corps. He later acquired 500 acres of land. The house is three stories and has been remodeled and kept in good condition. It is white with a decorative eagle on it.



THE BARTHLOW HOME
(Circa 1800's) 3884 Main Street
This is a frame vernacular home, which is a typical wood frame home of the period. It is a small home with a tin roof and green metal awnings over the porch. Homes during this period were built with fireplaces for heat as is this one. This home has a metal fence. Some of the other homes have wooden, brick, metal or stone fences in front of their homes. Some do not have fences. This home remains in the Barthlow family to this day.



OLD MASONIC LODGE
(Circa Late 1800-1889) 3893 Main Street
This building was moved to its present site from where the present Masonic Lodge is now. It is often called "the old lodge." It has an open side gable frame vernacular building built in the federal-period style. It has a one bay gable roof entrance porch on the east side. This yellow painted two-story building is balanced or symmetrical in appearance. It is beside the Clark-Chalker house.



THE FROSARD BUDINGTON HOME
(Circa 1910) 3916 Main Street
This is Historic Middleburg's only example of Queen Anne architecture. It is unusual in that it is a single story with a rounded corner on the veranda porch. The rounded columns are called ionic. The interesting shape of the left-hand gable window when facing the front of the house is called Palladian. In 1927, Mr. and Mrs. F. Budington gave a deed to the Middleburg United Methodist Church which later added the Budington Educational Building. This home is now owned by Mrs. Pat Mueller.



THE BUDINGTON HOME
(Circa Late 1800's)
Originally at 3913 Main Street
This is a white two-story house with a wide L-shaped porch which extends out to an area which can be used now as a carport. The shutters on this home are functional. This frame vernacular home is thought to have been moved to its present sit by rolling it on logs from across the street where the F. Budington home is now. This home is simpler in appearance on the outside than the Frosard Budington house across the street. This house has been relocated to the Main Street Park.



DR. G.E. ADAMS & DR. STONE HOME
(Circa Early 1900's) 2145 Wharf Street
This building is a small frame vernacular home. It has decorative wooden trim on it. There is wooden "gingerbread" trim at the top of the porch columns. The porch with railing is on the left side of the house when facing the front. This building served as a Doctor's office and home in 1914. Later, the house became a private residence.



THE CLARK-CHALKER HOUSE
(Circa 1835) 3891 Main Street
This is the oldest building in Middleburg. It is a white two-story columned house with a white picket fence. This open side gable frame vernacular home was built for Capt. Matthew Clark and his staff. They were with the U.S. 2nd Dragoons stationed at Ft Heilman. During the Second Seminole Indian war, the house was headquarters for General Winfield Scott. Martha Ann Chalker later occupied the house for 82 years until her death in 1936.



THE HADDEN HOME
(Circa 1912) 3887 Main Street
This is a colonial revival home with a balanced front called a symmetrical façade. This is a two-story home with round columns. It has a tin roof like several of the historic homes in the historic district. An interesting aspect of this home is that the decoration above the front door was originally made from an old bed head-board. This is called a decorative entrance Pediment.

Slow And Steady: A Smart Way To Invest

You've probably heard stories about fortunate investors who "get in the ground floor" of a new, hot company and quickly make a fortune. Again, if you're just beginning your career, you may not be able to put away much in this type of plan, but even a small amount is better than nothing. And as soon as you can possibly afford it, try to put in enough to earn your employer's matching contribution, if one is offered. These types of plans can offer some key benefits — and perhaps the biggest one is that investing is automatic, in that the money is moved directly from your paycheck

into the investments you've chosen within your 401(k) or other plan.

- Be prepared for downturns. The financial markets will always experience ups and downs. So, you need to be prepared for those times when your investment statements may show negative results. By understanding that these downturns are a normal part of the investment environment, you can avoid overreactions, such as selling quality investments with good fundamentals just because their price has temporarily dropped.

- Chart your progress regularly. A key element of a slow-and-steady investment approach is knowing how well it's working. But it's important to measure your progress in a way that makes sense for you. So, for example, instead of measuring your portfolio's performance against

that of an external stock market index, such as the S&P 500, you may want to assess where you are today versus one year ago, or whether the overall progress you're making is sufficient to help you meet the financial goals you've set for yourself well into the future. Another reason not to use a market index as a measuring tool is that the index only looks at a certain pool of investments, which, in the case of the S&P 500, is simply

the largest companies listed on U.S. stock exchanges. But long-term investors try to own a range of assets — U.S. and foreign stocks, bonds, government securities, certificates of deposit, and so on.

"Slow and steady" may not sound like an exciting approach to investing. But it's often the case that a little less excitement, and a lot more diligence, can prove to be quite effective.
