'Searching for Augusta Savage' documentary premieres on Saturday

Viewing will be at the WJCT Soundstage from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m.

JACKSONVILLE — If you haven't had the chance to see the "Searching for Augusta Savage" documentary on PBS, which explores the life and legacy of the visionary artist, educator and leader, you'll have the opportunity to see the Jacksonville premiere on Saturday, June 29, from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. at the WJCT Soundstage.

Augusta Savage (1892-1962) was a prolific, world-renowned sculptor. Born in Green Cove Springs, she eventually moved to New York City, where she contributed to the blossoming Harlem Renaissance movement. During her life, Savage captured international claims, and her art contextualized the Black American experience. She opened the first gallery in the U.S. dedicated to Black art.

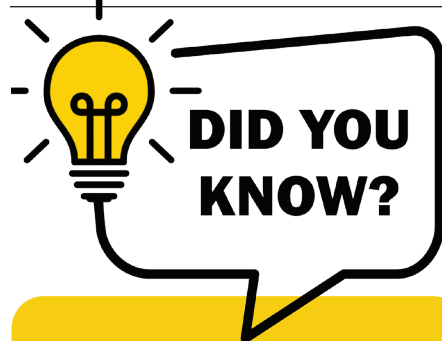

BCC approves grant application for state opioid funds

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — The Board of County Commissioners approved the submission of a grant application for state opioid funds with a 5-0 vote on Tuesday.

The \$165,000 grant by Lutheran Services Florida aims to partially fund the staffing for 24-hour response trucks within the Coordinated Opioid Response's (CORE) Community Paramedicine program.

The 24-hour response trucks are geared toward fast and efficient combative methods to respond to all overdoses in the county.

"We reach these patients early. We do have our finger on the pulse is a 911 system to respond to any overdoses," said Clay County Fire Rescue Bureau Chief of the Community Paramedicine Program, Jairo Herrera.

From there, Herrera said they are able to quickly transport patients, identify the problem, and enroll them in a medication-assisted therapy program.

The Board of County Commissioners is entering its second year participating

in the CORE program. The program aims to implement a network of addiction care in up to 12 counties in Florida, including Clay.

Herrera said the county's participation in the program is essential to making the community aware of the opioid crisis and preventing the fatalities that come with it.

"Our program does pass out Narcan. We do opioid education, we do make the community aware of what's going on," Herrera said. "And, so, I think those efforts drastically have helped with the opioid crisis."

Herrera added that the main goal is to give people the opportunity to get the help that they need, and the 24-hour response trucks are a step in the right direction.

"One thing the police officers say is, we can't arrest our way out of this. And, the other thing too is we can't Narcan ourselves out of this either," Herrera said. "But, we have to deal with the problem, and that is giving people the opportunity to receive Narcan, receive the training, reverse, (and) allow them to get into (a) recovery program."

MEET CANDIDATE-ELECT

Commissioner-elect Sgromolo ready to step up to the plate

FLEMING ISLAND — Since he was the only candidate for County Commissioner in District 1, John Sgromolo won a seat on the board.

He'll be sworn in following the general election on Nov. 5, and he'll be replacing Vice Chair Mike Cella, who was term-limited after serving since 2016.

"I am excited about being able to serve the community I grew up in. There's a lot of exciting things in Clay County with all the growth coming. There's

a lot of opportunity to make Clay County a great place to live, work and raise a family," Sgromolo said.

"I am very thankful for the community. I am excited to work with (the other commissioners) as colleagues, and with great teamwork, we can continue to make our community better," he said.

The Board of County Commissioners is Clay County's legislative body. The BCC votes on county-wide laws and annual budgets, which allocate funding for public safety, parks, infrastructure, and other capital improvements. Sgromolo will represent the entirety of Fleming Island.

Sgromolo will be joining commissioners Jim Renninger and Kristen Burke, who both won their re-elections unopposed, and commissioners Betsy Condon and Alexandra Compere, who will be up for re-election in 2026.

Sgromolo said the most pressing is-

sue is the growth coming to the community. Officials in Clay County government have stressed "getting ahead of growth," especially regarding infrastructure, and Sgromolo wholeheartedly agrees. Growth means more businesses and customers, but it can also mean more traffic and a greater strain on resources.

"You have to be smart and strategic with growth. You can't build developments without infrastructure. It is going to be important we evaluate each project individually. I don't think there is a one-size-fits-all approach to development. It is important to evaluate whether the development adds value to the community," Sgromolo said.

Sgromolo said he is open-minded regarding mixed-use developments, which interweave commercial and residential spaces, sometimes by constructing multi-story buildings with storefronts on the first floor and apartments as you ride the elevator. While dense, mixed-use developments would help slow down sprawl, they may also chip away at the county's receding rural character. Sgromolo said that any project depends on the development's merits.

As a commissioner, Sgromolo will continue his role as the St. Johns Country Day Director of Athletics — he'll have to mark his calendars every other week at 4 p.m. for the semimonthly BCC meetings. This past year was Sgromolo's first year as the

director of athletics. It was also the first baseball championship for St. Johns Country Day and the county's high school baseball championship.

Sgromolo has possessed a passion for athletics throughout his life. He played baseball as a student at Clay High. He graduated from Clay High in 2008 and was awarded a scholarship to continue playing baseball at Flagler College, where he earned a degree in business administration. After his senior year, he was drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers. He played two seasons in the minor leagues with the Dodgers rookie team in Arizona.

"I never took it for granted when I put on my Dodgers uniform," Sgromolo said.

"The place I felt most comfortable is the batter's box. The excitement of playing a game that you love that teaches you so much about life. Baseball is so much like life," he said.

Sgromolo lives on Fleming Island with his wife, Callie, and son, Charlie. He said he is ready to "step up to the plate" this November, although instead of a baseball, it will be at the dais in the board's meeting room on the fourth floor of the Administration Building.

"I am community-oriented and a team player. That's my goal as a county commissioner: to work as a team to improve Clay County," Sgromolo said.

Henderson Haven advocates for children, adults with disabilities

ORANGE PARK — In Clay County alone, more than 8,000 students have disabilities and need proper services. The small but mighty Henderson Haven is aiming to combat this daunting reality.

“They don’t have the life you and I take for granted. They don’t get to choose where they live, they don’t always get to choose who they hang out with, what they want to do with their lives. They’re told by everybody,” said Henderson Haven CEO Lee Henderson.

The organization highlights this need for independence by providing a safe space for children and adults with special needs, including after-school care, summer camps and educational opportunities.

Lee and co-founder/COO Sherri Henderson own and operate the nonprofit haven on Foxridge Center Drive as husband and wife.

Lee said that he and Sherri came up with the idea of the program after experiencing difficulties in providing their son, Trey, with proper care. Lee said that Trey, who was born with Down Syndrome, was placed in a segregated classroom for the

first time in his life when they moved to Florida with no real reason as to why.

“Because we already had a background in the field, we knew that that wasn’t going to fly with us. So, we kind of became the parents that the school system hates for a little while,” Lee said.

Sherri said that finding services for their son was nearly impossible. With higher living costs than expected, she said working was necessary. But leaving her son at after-school programs wasn’t financially viable.

“After-school programs are going to charge two to three times more for our son Trey because he had a diagnosis of Down Syndrome,” Sherri said.

Advocating for their son was the main goal, but when others started inquiring about their work and resources, the Hendersons decided to take their advocacy a little further.

Sherri began assisting families with their individualized education programs (IEP), and eventually, many parents began asking for direct care. In 2000, Sherri said she began helping a family whose adult daughter was abandoned by transportation in Northwest Jacksonville.

And, from there, it grew.

“We saw how hard it was for us. We knew it was harder for others,” Sherri said.

Working to help more people, Sherri said she was able to hire others for some assistance, and the two figured they could potentially make a business out of their unique services. Lee said they made a plan

and jumped in with both feet, officially incorporating in 2003.

Lee said that at first, Henderson Haven was mainly an in-home advocacy program. Staff would regularly meet families in their homes and provide care in five counties in

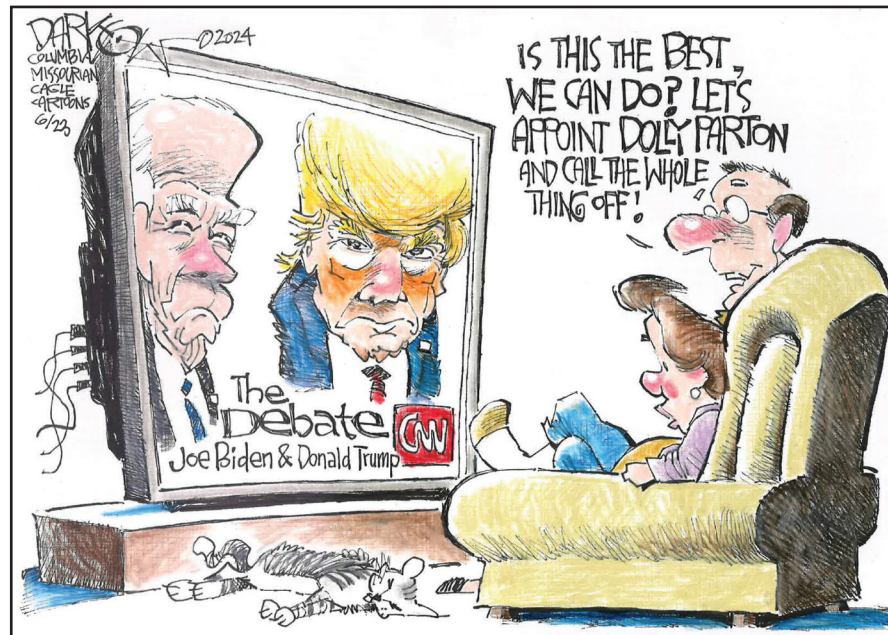

Gator Bowl exploring options for 2027 game during construction

Jacksonville's City Council voted Tuesday to partner with the Jacksonville Jaguars on renovation plans for EverBank Stadium.

It passed, as expected, so the stadium's tenants now know when to vacate.

The Jaguars plan to play in a reduced-capacity stadium in 2026, then play the 2027 season somewhere else, before returning to the newly renovated stadium for 2028.

The decision also impacts the annual Georgia-Florida game and the Gator Bowl game.

Officials with the Gator Bowl have already begun exploring other options.

Greg McGarity, the president of the Gator Bowl, said he needs 40,000 seats and a stadium capable of supporting a national broadcast on ESPN. He also noted that creative solutions are already being considered.

"For the 2027 game, we have already had preliminary discussions with UF and will also await the designation decision by the Jaguars as well," McGarity said.

Unlike the Jaguars, who must make plans for 10-11 displaced home games, including preseason games, the Gator Bowl only needs to find a home for one day.

"It makes it easier since it's only for

one year," McGarity said.

The Gator Bowl annually hosts several events around Jacksonville that will remain in the city. If the game were to be moved out of town, only it would leave Jacksonville for the 2027 season.

Television drives the bowl games, and one aspect of the broadcast is the atmosphere in the stadium. Show a great game with a great atmosphere, and the game's image improves. That could be temporarily limited if the Gator Bowl moves into the 88,000-plus-seat Ben Hill Griffin Stadium in Gainesville.

"(Atmosphere is) very important but not essential, especially for the 2027 game," McGarity said. "For all other games, it's essential to provide opportunities for fans to have a fun day before and after the game."

The atmosphere would likely be much different in Gainesville since, depending on the teams selected, the Gator Bowl typically expects to sell around 50,000 seats.

Unlike the Jaguars, who could consider playing some of their 2027 games in Orlando, that city is not an option for the Gator Bowl because of scheduling conflicts with bowl games already played at Camping World Stadium around the same time each year.

The Gator Bowl has made the trip to Gainesville before. When the Gator Bowl stadium was being renovated to accommodate the NFL's expansion Jaguars in 1994, the Gator Bowl was moved to the Swamp. More than 62,000 watched Tennessee beat Virginia Tech, 45-23.

Unless a new and creative solution

within the Jacksonville area is found, the most likely landing spot for the Gator Bowl would indeed be the home of the Gators.

40 years ago, 1984

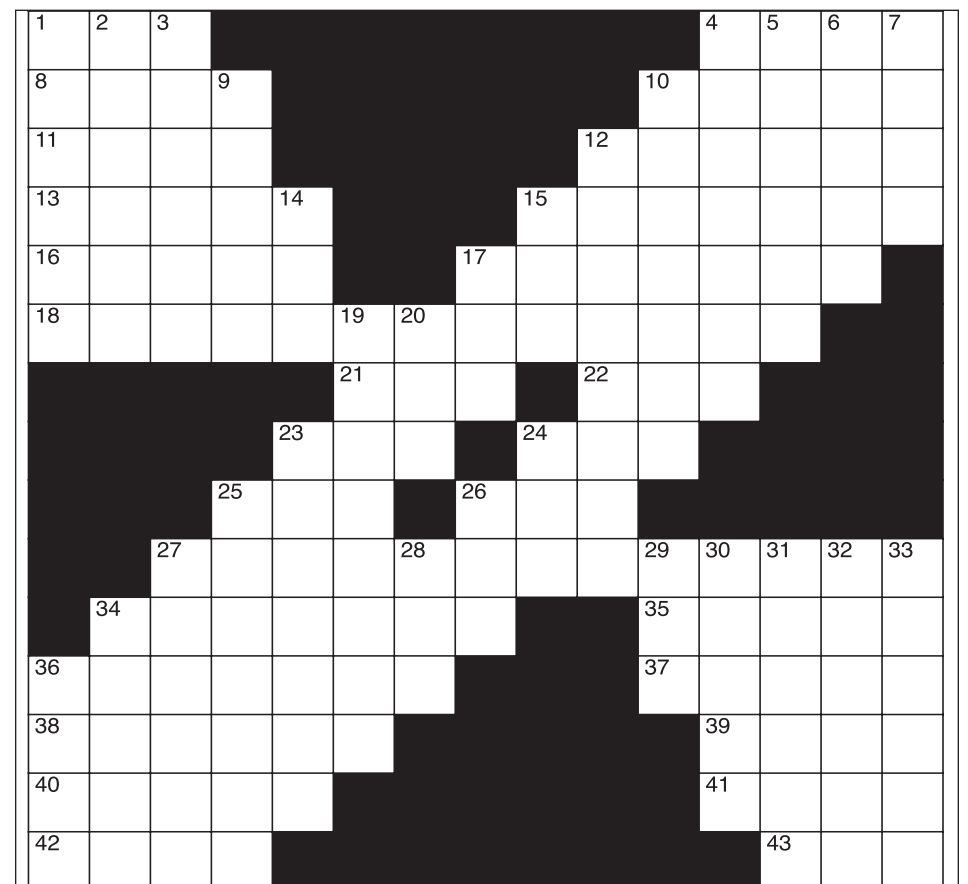

County makes renovations at Ronnie Van Zant Memorial Park

LAKE ASBURY — The “Ship of Theseus” is a famous historical thought experiment: if a wooden ship removed each of its wooden boards one by one and replaced each with an identical board (same size, same shape) in its place, would it still be the same ship?

Is an object the sum of its parts? Or is an object a symbol for what its parts represent?

Construction is ongoing at Ronnie Van Zant Memorial Park, which is fully replacing the wooden beams along the five fishing docks while maintaining the foundational pieces.

“All new framing, sub-framing, new decking and new handrails. The only remaining original things are the poles,” Tyler Giebeig said.

“We’re making it all new. The old was rotting out and getting washed away. We’re going to make it level around the pond and make it easier to walk around,” he said.

Ronnie Van Zant Memorial Park was built and named in honor of its namesake, the lead vocalist of Clay County’s Southern rock band sensation Lynyrd Skynyrd, who died along with other band members and crew in a 1977 plane crash. The band’s chartered Convair plane ran out of fuel near the end of the flight from Greenville,

South Carolina, on the way to a gig in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

The 90-acre memorial park was established in honor of one of the county’s most prominent artists.

Tyler owns Brothers Marine Construction with his brother Kyle Giebeig. Kyle “runs the crews,” and Tyler “pushes the paper.” The company was once involved with restoring the Governor’s Creek Boat Ramp.

The \$577,000 project at Ronnie Van Zant is the brothers’ biggest yet, Tyler said. The docks will be replaced with new boards, but the bulkhead, which will reinforce the circumference of the pond, is certainly a new feature. The bulkhead will prevent overflowing and erosion, making the trail surrounding the pond safer to walk around.

Tyler walked around the pond’s circumference on a warm, sunny morning, awakening the flock of ducks asleep on the shoreline. The startled fowl fluttered into the pond as he passed. A resident comes out most mornings to the pavilion that overlooks the pond. The flock of ducks gather around the resident’s feet, awaiting their breakfast of breadcrumbs. Tyler appeared glad. Not that he said he disdained the ducks outright, but it appeared he preferred them out of the way while the bulkhead was being constructed.

The company has been at work for three

weeks. The deadline is Sept. 30, and Tyler is confident he’ll make it with time to spare.

Gene Price is the building facilities manager. He oversees maintenance, public safety and various construction projects in Clay County. He’s excited about the new ecological improvements to the pond (which currently does not have an official name. It has been dubbed “Clay County Pond No. 067” by a street sign).

Price said the bulkhead will help stabilize the pond from some watershed issues. The bulkhead will act as a fortification, preventing water from overflowing and the shoreline from eroding.

Price said the park is a great spot for “citizens to go out and enjoy the outdoors.” The pond is one of the defining natural features of the park, especially the circular island — an emerald eye of shrubbery and

pine trees. The pond itself is managed by the Florida Wildlife Commission.

Ronnie Van Zant Memorial Park is a debatable tribute to the county’s most influential musician.

“Ship of Theseus” is a label used to describe Lynyrd Skynyrd in the modern day. Lynyrd Skynyrd has released nine original albums since reforming in 1987. More importantly, the current group has kept the music alive.

Still, for the park, residents (and ducks) should expect the same pond they’re used to. The bulkhead will alter the shoreline to preserve the pond. The five fishing docks will be returned refurbished on Sept. 30 at the latest.

“New lumber, new framing, new deck. But no more splinters for the kids out, either,” Tyler said.

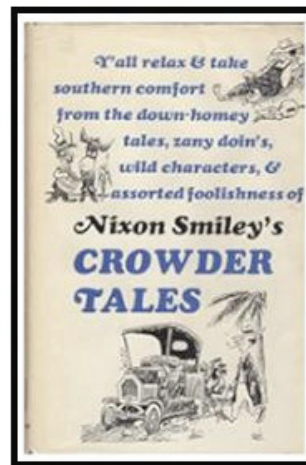
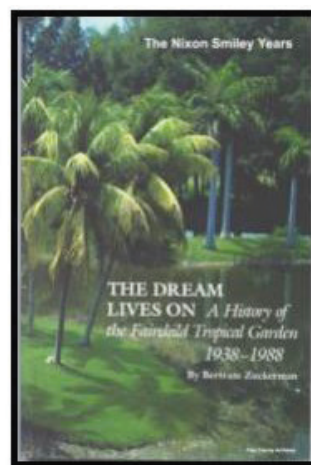
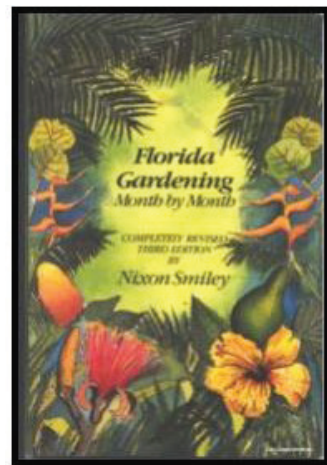

Nixon Smiley: A kid from a small town who went on to do big things

Like artist Augusta Savage and businessman Charles Merrill, Nixon Smiley was a kid from a small town who went on to do great things in life.

Nixon was a reporter, columnist, editor, and feature writer for the Miami Herald. He also published several books about his beloved Florida. His specialty was Florida horticulture, and many of his books focused on that topic.

Born in 1911, Nixon grew up in Orange Park, hearing the tales of the river and the northern tourists who once graced the town's homes and hotels. Having lived there until he was about seven years old, the Town of Orange Park left an indelible mark on Nixon, evidenced by the fact that he is buried there in Magnolia Cemetery next to his mother and maternal grandfather.

An excerpt from a 1969 Miami Herald column he wrote about growing up in Orange Park:

"My maternal grandparents came here in the 1880s to open a boarding house among the live oaks on the bluff overlooking the river. Among their winter guests was John Burroughs, the naturalist. Like President Grover Cleveland, more affluent guests stayed at the Hotel Marion built in 1881."

Burroughs was a famous naturalist who championed conservation and was

good friends with Teddy Roosevelt. Roosevelt went on to champion the creation of beautiful national parks. Burroughs was a regular winter visitor at the family's boardinghouse, and it was here that the young Nixon may have discovered his love of nature, particularly plants.

"After Orange Park's winter visitors forsook the St. Johns for warmer South Florida, business became intolerably dull here. My folks sold their boardinghouse in 1912 ..."

Life became difficult for Nixon Smiley and his family in Orange Park, as he later explained in his semi-autobiographical work Crowder Tales:

"I was about seven when my paternal grandparents of Crowder, Georgia adopted me. It was the fall of 1918. I had lost both my parents, my father in a logging train accident, and my mother in the influenza epidemic. My widowed maternal grandmother, with whom I was left, was unable to feed an ever-hungry boy, much less clothe and educate him. So, she wrote to my grandparents in Crowder. Would they take the boy?" And his grandparents did. They were James and Emma Smiley. James went by Pa, and Pa called Emma "Emmer." His grandmother, Lizzie Strickland, put him on a train by himself at seven years of age and asked the conductor to ensure he got off at the Crowder stop.

And so began a life of hard physical farm labor and poverty. Pa had owned a thoroughbred farm, and that's how Smiley's father, Conley, met Ruby Strickland, his mother. Conley would travel to Jacksonville to race, breed, and trade horses. Pa lost the farm to the bank in 1908, which led him and his family of seven boys to find work in the logging industry, resulting in

Conley meeting an early demise.

Nixon survived his childhood, which was filled with Pa's and his uncles' escapades. It was always "something or another." The saintly Emmer tolerated it all as deeply as well. Nixon later moved back home to Jacksonville, where he began his career at the Florida Times-Union. Excluding a brief stint during WWII, he wrote for the Miami Herald from 1940 until he retired in 1973. Nixon Smiley was an avid gardener, but he was more of a naturalist than just planting tomatoes and a few flowers. He volunteered at the Fairchild Tropical Botanic Garden and became Interim Director from 1953 to 1961. The directorship is a PHD level role, but Nixon, so well self-taught, executed his duties without a college degree. From 1958 through the 1960s, Smiley was a member of the board of directors of the International Palm Society.

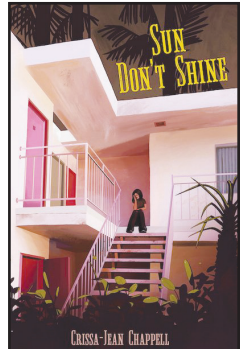
Nixon Smiley passed away in 1990. His wife, Evelyn, and son, Karl, survived him. He contributed in unmeasurable ways to conservation, beautification, and the study of Florida horticulture. The Nixon Smiley Research Papers (1940s-1972) are held at the Historical Museum of Southern Florida, and the 120-acre Nixon Smiley Pineland Preserve is located in Dade County. Nixon Smiley — a small-town kid who went on to do great things in life.

Northeast Florida. However, Lee said when the state stopped working with the children, in-home families panicked.

“They didn’t have anything to do with their kids after school anymore because they got kicked out of the regular after-school and daycare programs. So, we started the Free 2 Be Me program to give them an option,” Lee said.

The Free 2 Be Me program is a center-based children’s program encompassing private school and after-school care.

Open year-round, even during school breaks, Sherri said the center gets kids as young as four years old and will take them through their high school years up until 22 years old.

“We are here for these families that don’t have other options,” Sherri said.

Partnered with Broach Schools, the center provides students with an all-day private school option.

“We do spelling tests and things. We might find a different way to do it,” Lee said. “(For) some people, we started using Scrabble tiles to be able to spell.”

Additionally, Camp Possible is the center’s yearly summer program, providing engaging recreational summer activities.

Sherri said the center is not babysitting but rather an approach to engaging the students and working through their social life and communication skills, depending on what each person needs.

For Sherri and Lee, Henderson Haven also emphasizes each person’s self-confidence.

“They’re capable, so we have to keep giving them the input until we can figure out the output for some of them,” Sherri said. “And when we have that mentality, they seem to progress more.”

The Metamorphoses program aims to help people 22 years old and older and provides support to adults with developmental disabilities.

“No one is too old to stop learning. And, so we just keep working on that,” Sherri said. Lee said that Henderson Haven has given parents and children hope again, which keeps them going.

“They just can’t believe it when they

don’t get those phone calls and they can actually focus on work and not have to be sitting there stressing about what’s going to happen next because someone’s stepping up to help them out,” Lee said.

For Bridget Watkins, the center has brought her son Danny out of his shell. As a single parent, Watkins said it has just been them, and Danny’s shyness has caused him to be a little stand-offish with others.

“He was really able to belong, is the only way I can explain it. Danny really wants to be a part of the community, a part of the world,” Watkins said.

Diagnosed with Down Syndrome and mostly non-verbal, Watkins said that it’s hard for Danny to feel included.

“He went to elementary and junior high through the Clay County School system, and it was very hard on him because he wanted to be like the other kids. He wanted to be able to have peers and go hang out and do things that you do when you’re in school,” Watkins said.

Watkins added that after all he went through, Henderson Haven gave him that inclusion.

“He got picked on, and he was bullied. And it shut Danny down a lot,” Watkins said. “But then he goes to Henderson Haven, and he’s included.”

Corrine Johnson said that Henderson Haven had helped her son with potty training, behavior management, and his transition to the adult life program.

“All of those things are huge milestones in a world where you really feel helpless and you don’t have a lot of resources,” Johnson said.

Johnson said that getting services in Florida is astronomically hard, as the government doesn’t see it as an issue.

“It took me 11-and-a-half years to get my son on a Medicaid waiver list because we quote make too much money. It’s sad,” Johnson said. “I didn’t ask for my child to come out disabled.”

Johnson said that, because of this, having more facilities like Henderson Haven is much needed — not just for the support it provides for the child but also for the resources it provides for parents.

“When you have a special needs child, a lot of times you lose the support of everybody around you. And I say that with the

nicest of intentions because your family dissipates when you have a child that has difficult needs or behaviors,” Johnson said. “People don’t step in to help, they don’t give you a break and they don’t have the answers for you.”

The Hendersons said their son inspires them to give support, and it doesn’t stop there. Currently running its Doors to Independence Campaign, the center hopes to raise funds to expand and build The Trey Henderson Center for Community Inclusion. The three-year campaign aims to raise \$6 million. Henderson Haven has many plans for the nonprofit, from purchasing the building and remodeling it to officially classifying it as a hurricane shelter. Lee said that the lack of public hurricane shelters that accommodate people with developmental dis-

abilities is a problem. “You get some of the individuals that we work with, that they’re already have issues in trying to control some of their outbursts,” Lee said. “You get them in a storm situation, in a new place, and those behaviors just really manifest, and they’re asked to leave those shelters.”

This year, Henderson Haven’s 20th anniversary, the center aims to maximize its space and build more awareness in the community about its mission. Additionally, the center hopes to continue advocating for those who are disabled and teaching others how to do the same. “Families have resources, families have support, families have peace of mind,” Sherri said. “That would be the advocacy, what we hope to bring to Clay County and the surrounding communities.”

Audit reveals Orange Park to be in 'good financial condition'

ORANGE PARK — Purvis, Gray and Company presented an annual financial audit of the Town of Orange Park during the town council meeting last Tuesday.

"When we look at the financial results, we'll see the town is in good financial condition," said auditor Ron Whitesides.

The audit determined that the town's assets exceeded liabilities by \$69.5 million at the end of the 2023 financial year, a substantially positive net position. The town's favorable net position increased by \$650,000 since the end of the 2022 financial year. That was attributed to increased property taxes, sales taxes, charges for services, and other state-shared revenues. From 2022 to 2023:

- Property (ad valorem) tax revenue increased by \$386,000
- Red light camera revenue increased by \$178,000
- Investment earnings increased by \$205,000
- Ambulance revenue increased by \$60,000
- Moderate increases from other revenue streams.
- Major capital project expenditures during the year included improvements to Bradley and Clarke parks, the Magnolia



The Orange Park Town Council typically meets semimonthly on the first and third Tuesday. However, because of July 4, the next council meeting will be July 16 at 7 p.m.

Cemetery Culverts, Clover Avenue and other streets, septic-to-sewer conversions, and sewer system upgrades.

Notably, the town has no outstanding debt and hasn't since October 2015.

"Currently, (33%) of the general fund's annual revenues are from property taxes. The town implemented a utility service tax on electricity, which went into effect on April 1, 2015, and generated \$839,000 in

revenue in fiscal year 2023. Other current revenues are not expected to increase significantly, and many are beyond the town's control. Continued diversification of revenues where possible could help to alleviate pressure on property tax rates," the audit concluded.

John Villanueva, Director of Finance, was commended for his team's efforts in preparing the town for the annual audit. Despite his decade of experience, he manages to find a twinge of excitement for every annual "audit season."

"We spend about two months getting ready for the audit. I have a great finance team. A lot of hard work goes into it, but this is my tenth audit. So, I've gotten the hang of it now," Villanueva said.

In other news, the council voted 5-0 to adopt its five-year Capital Improvement Plan, funded through sales and gas taxes. According to the Expense Account Summary — which includes, among other line items of interest — \$750,000 provisioned for the Milwaukee Sidewalk project, \$15,000 for playground improvements at Gano Park, \$200,000 for a boardwalk at Bradley Park, and \$10,000 for improvements to the house and \$125,000 for improvements to the pond at Clarke House Park.

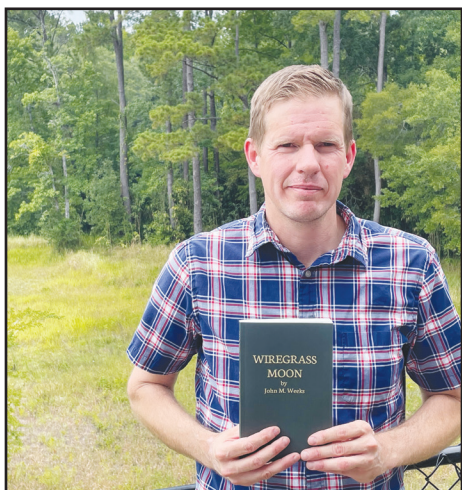


‘Wiregrass Moon’ by John M. Weeks

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS — For his first published poetry collection, John M. Weeks listened to Northeast Florida’s natural environments and transcribed their echoes and songs.

“Wiregrass Moon,” released on Amazon on June 7, begins with Weeks standing out at dusk on a cold winter evening, absorbing his surroundings. As the sun sets and darkness rolls over, he wistfully envisions “summer’s chartreuse.”

His poetry is both a catalog of Florida’s changing seasons — from winter to spring, summer, autumn, and back to winter again — and a contemplation of time, change, death, and renewal.

Despite what the northern transplants might say, Florida does enjoy seasons. While Florida’s subtropical climate lends

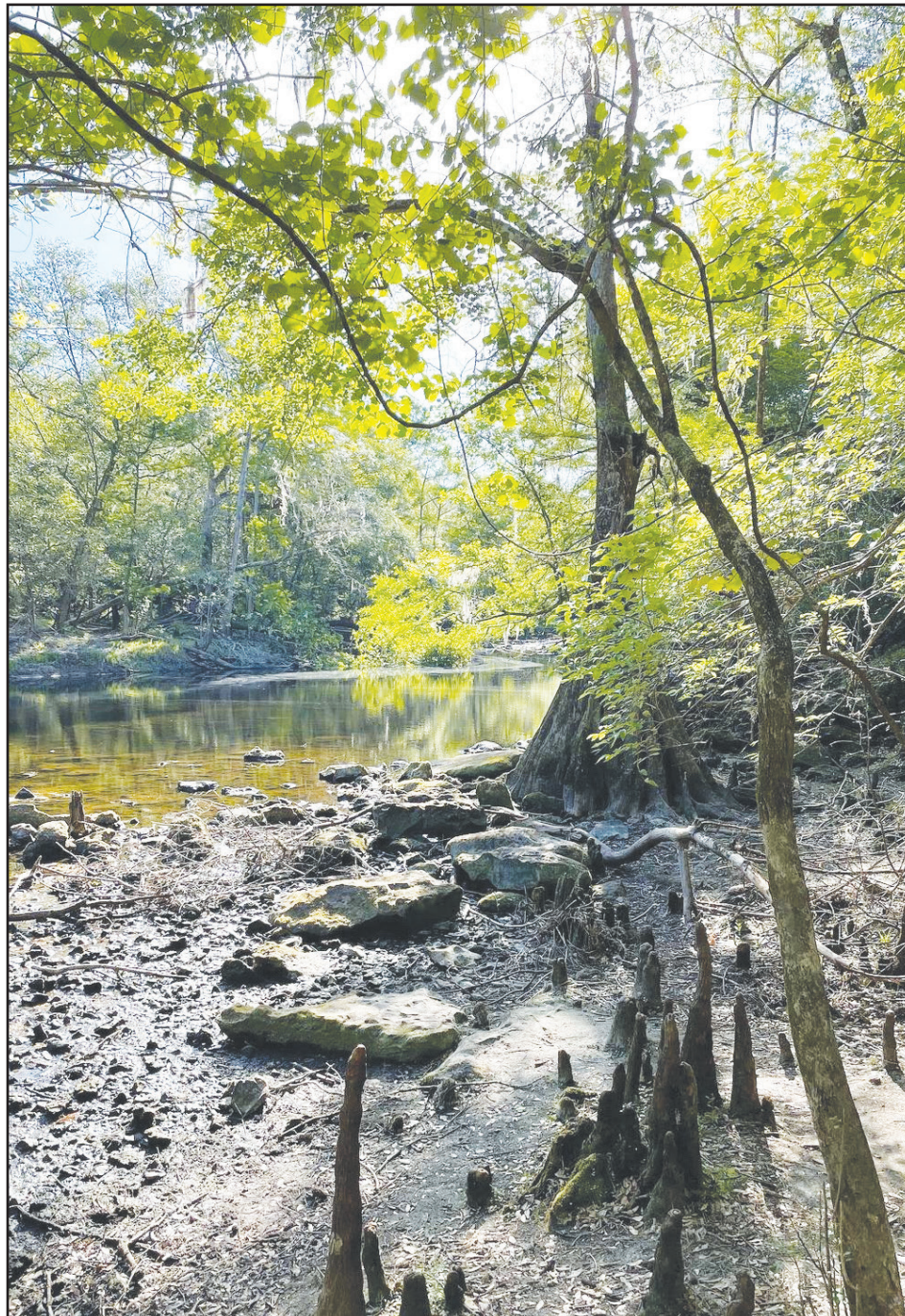
itself to a different ecology than snowbirds may be used to, it is nonetheless unique and beautiful.

Weeks said he’s been writing poetry for five years, although his journeys through Florida’s wildlife have been lifelong. “Little Ocean” and “Little Ocean, Part II” describe Lowry Lake (one of the first in the Etonia Chain of Lakes). “Controlled Burn” tells the barren, ashy landscape in Gold Head State Park, the aftermath of one of Florida’s fiery and unique spectacles. “Bees on Orange Blossoms,” a quintessentially Floridian scene, was encountered in Week’s backyard.

Themes of renewal and absolution are illustrated in “Santa Fe River,” which describes the real-life geology of the river plus Weeks’ reflections. Weeks describes how the river, colored dark by dissolved tannin, travels briefly underground through a sinkhole and reemerges filtered and clear on the other side.

“The Santa Fe River begins in Santa Fe Lake and runs off into this swamp. It starts not as much at all. Over time, it flows through pinewoods and hardwoods and continues west, where it undergoes that transition,” Weeks said.

“It is moving, and it does not flow back. It’s about change and new experiences in life. When thinking about such an ancient river, we humans have experienced such a

short amount of time,” he said.

Weeks describes animals he encountered along his temporal journey, such as Black Creek crayfish, blue-winged teal, alligators and a venomous coral snake.

Weeks is a teacher at Q. I. Roberts Jr.-Sr. High and a writer. His band, Leaning Trees, is an eclectic and catchy blend of rock and roll, blues, and folk. Weeks’ melodic voice smoothly spreads over mel-

ancholic and introspective lyrics. Nature is a common motif, much like “Wiregrass Moon.”

“I’ve found freedom in poetry. I spent my whole life in the environment out here. It was a lot of fun,” Weeks said, describing the calendar year-long project.

largely erased. While many of Savage's original sculptures have been lost to time, such as her 1939 New York World's Fair monument, "Lift Every Voice and Sing," her legacy lives on and continues to influence aspiring artists.

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS — The Kitchen of Clay County has spent the last 15 years working to fight food insecurity in Clay County. After serving Clay County residents almost 20,000 meals last year, The Kitchen wants to do more.

"Right now, The Kitchen of Clay County is reaching residents with kitchens happening every Saturday in Orange Park, Green Cove Springs and Middleburg," said Brian Knight, president of The Kitchen, "but if we are truly going to say we serve the residents of Clay County, then we need to reach as many residents as possible. And for that reason, we are working to open a fourth location in Keystone Heights."

The Keystone Heights location will be hosted by The Mission of the Dirt Road at 7790 State Road 100 and will begin in the fourth quarter of 2024. While that is the expected opening date, Knight said a few things are needed.

"To open a new kitchen and operate it for a year, we need to raise \$2,000," said Knight. "That money is used for plates, utensils and to-go containers. The other thing that a kitchen needs to run is volunteers. It's our hope that Keystone residents, and even folks outside Keystone, will consider spending a Saturday giving back to the community they love."

The new location will be a restaurant-style, sit-down location with volunteers serving the guests. All residents are welcome to come for a meal; no proof of need is required. The Kitchen will also provide to-go meals for residents to take with them or share with others in the com-

Health Department issues new warning for blue-green algae at Doctors Lake

For Clay Today

FLEMING ISLAND — The Florida Department of Health in Clay County issued a health alert for harmful blue-green algae toxins in Doctors Lake at Wyndegate Drive and Lawrence Road. The alert is in response to a water sample taken on June 17.

The public should exercise caution in and around these areas of Doctors Lake. DOH-Clay advises residents and visitors to take the following precautions:

- Do not drink, swim, wade, use personal watercrafts, or come into contact with waters where there is a visible bloom.

- Wash your skin and clothing with soap and water if you have any contact with algae, discolored water, or water that smells unpleasant.

- Keep pets and livestock away from the area to avoid any contact with water. Waters where algae blooms are present are not safe for animals. Pets and livestock should use an alternative water source when algae blooms are present.

- Do not cook or clean dishes with water contaminated by algae blooms. Boiling the water will not eliminate toxins.

- Eating fillets from healthy fish caught in freshwater lakes experiencing blooms is safe. Rinse fish fillets with tap or bottled water, throw out the guts and cook fish thoroughly.

- Do not eat shellfish in waters with algae blooms.

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection and partners collect algae samples from reported bloom locations. After samples are analyzed at their laboratory, the toxin results can be viewed on Protecting Florida Together or DEP's Algal Bloom Dashboard.

What is Blue-Green Algae?

Blue-green algae are a type of bacteria common in Florida's freshwater environments. A bloom occurs when the rapid growth of algae leads to an accumulation of individual cells that discolor water and



often produce floating mats that emit unpleasant odors. Blue-green algae blooms can also appear as scum, foam or paint on the surface of the water in various colors. To learn more about the appearance of algae blooms, visit Protecting Florida Together. Some environmental factors contributing to blue-green algae blooms are sunny days, warm water temperatures, still water conditions and excess nutrients. Blooms can appear year-round but are more frequent in summer and fall. Many types of blue-green algae can produce toxins. Blue-green algae may not always be visible as a bloom, but it can still be in the water.

Is Blue-Green Algae Harmful?

Blue-green algae can produce toxins, which can harm humans, pets and ecosystems, including fish and other aquatic animals. Sensitive individuals (e.g., children, the elderly and those who are immunocompromised) may still be at risk even at low concentrations and should avoid any exposure.

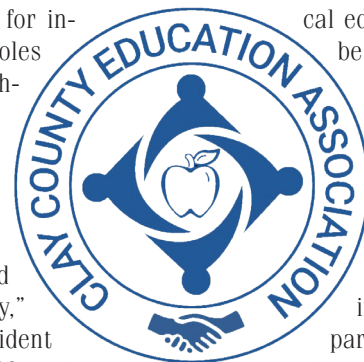

Lynyrd Skynyrd's 'Sweet Home Alabama' was released 50 years ago

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — More than a half-century ago, Lynyrd Skynyrd got together in a stuffy shack known as "Hell House" along Peters Creek where they were free to rock out from sunrise to sunset without anyone saying, "Hey, can you keep it down?"

"Sweet Home Alabama" was written and rehearsed here in Clay County and then recorded in Doraville, Georgia. It was released on June 24, 1974, and included in the band's second studio album, "Second Helping."

The song supposedly was made in response to Neil Young's 1970 song "Southern Man," which the band felt blamed the entire South for American slavery. In his 2012 biography, Young acknowledged the song and recanted his rhetoric on "Southern Man" for being accusatory and conde-



scending.

"Sweet Home Alabama" has sold more than four million units worldwide since its release date 50 years ago and is certified platinum. Alabama Gov. Bob Riley made "Sweet Home Alabama" a statewide slogan to promote tourism.

Stevens said the business idea came to mind following her and her family's frequent appeal to camping. She said they wanted to give other families that same experience.

"We just have a good time and wanted to get people to enjoy camping and take their kids camping and make memories," Stevens said.

Stevens and her husband initially wanted to purchase their own campground. However, Stevens said they decided to hit the road and go mobile instead, using others' property.

Stevens said she first pitched the idea on Facebook. After getting positive responses, she and her husband decided to follow through with the idea. What she thought was just going to be a little fun money on the side turned into something much bigger.

"It turned into 'Hey, can we have our birthday party in the tent?', 'Can we have a picnic in the tent?'. And, so, as people requested things, then I would buy them, or I would make them. And, so I worked full time for that first year and we just were growing the business and outgrowing our home," Stevens said.

Soon, what was once a small area in their home ended up being two storage buildings' worth of supplies.

"We've just kind of grown by meeting

the needs of what people want," Stevens said.

Stevens said the "glamorous" aspect of the camp setup was a way to ensure customers got the best experience possible. She said she didn't initially know that mobile glamping existed.

"I knew that glamping was a thing," Stevens said. "I didn't know that mobile glamping was a thing until I started the

business."

The cozy but large setup, which includes one to 12 glamping tents and full-on lounge rooms, makes for an intimate experience.

Stevens said customers regularly book for milestone birthdays, graduation parties, retirement parties, bachelorette parties and even bridal showers.

Additionally, Stevens said the business does yoga and sound bath setups.

Stevens said she crafts her own pillows, robes, and sleep masks with names and the theme of the event for personalization.

"For example, a mom wouldn't have to have anything. Like, she doesn't need to go outside of me to have something for those kids to leave that birthday party and remember that event," Stevens said. "Because we always want to make it an unforgettable adventure for you."

Stevens said the set-up process begins with the customer booking an adventure on their website. She then contacts the customer to get more information. Stevens said the process can vary depending on what the customer is looking for.

"If you're wanting to go to a campsite and go camping at like a state park or a local campground, I'd ask you like 'what are some of the things that you're wanting?', 'what kind of amenities are you looking for,'" Stevens said. "To make sure I fit you with the right campground and something that has availability."

From there, the customer booked the site, and Stevens said she set up everything they needed.

"You show up, you glamp, you leave. We come back in and take everything away, and you don't have to worry about anything," Stevens said.

The business provides the camping chairs, chuck box, and all the camping items needed during the adventure. Stevens added that the same goes for a backyard setup.

Stevens added that customers can

camp for one night up to a full week.

Stevens said the community's response to the business has been overwhelmingly positive.

"It's a lot of work what we do. And, when we leave a site set up, and the text messages that we get or if they come out while we're there and to see their faces light up and, they're like so grateful for what we've done it just really makes us feel so good inside," Stevens said.

SweetCaroline Spencer said she booked an adventure to celebrate her daughter's graduation, and the experience was lovely.

"It was simple, cute, and chic, and I loved it," Spencer said.

Spencer said before the experience she had never heard of glamping before.

"For me, glamping was staying in an RV or something like that. With all the amenities. Or, just staying in a hotel and pretending you were camping," Spencer said.

Tammy and Jay Weber also booked the experience for their daughter's graduation party and were impressed with how it came together.

"It was amazing. They really work hard at what they do and do their best to ensure everything is just perfect," Tammy Weber said.

Wendi Keeney said knowing that her daughter wanted to go camping for her 21st birthday, she was a little leery of letting her go on her own.

"She's never, ever camped on her own. So, I couldn't be there because I was working, and I was a little worried about her biting off more than she could chew," Keeney said.

Keeney said she googled 'glamping' and found Stevens and her husband. From there, she said she appreciated their hands-on approach.

And, with Stevens and her family not too far from her daughter on the same campground, Keeney said they were there to help.

"She went above and beyond to make that day special for my daughter," Keeney said.

Stevens said that she and her family hope to continue to share these special experiences with others in the future.

"We are determined to make sure that people have an unforgettable time. And, we go above and beyond to ensure you feel the value in your experience," Stevens said. "And you have an adventure you'll never forget."

- "AMI is a prevention program for boys, age 11 to 17, in Clay County because there was a need for those kids that are not on probation, they're not in legal trouble or anything, but they're headed toward trouble," said Executive Director Maria Prybylski. "We have these boys that come from Clay County Schools and team court,



wherever in the community thinks they need our services, education, and behavior modification.

"When you talk about behavior modification, we just try to chip away at all of the negative stuff that got them in trouble or is not making them successful in regular school or their home. We bring them in for treatment services, which are the mentoring and mental health services they might need. Let's face it, a lot of our young people have had a lot of trauma in their lives. So we tried to pinpoint how they could change and how to make them successful when they returned to regular school."

Prybylski said a study typically stayed in the AMI program for 12 to 15 months.

Boys wear black or camo pants and an AMI T-shirt to school. Prybylski allows camo pants "because we are in Clay County."

"I'm always looking for donations so I can go to the Goodwill or Salvation Army to find the pants that they need so they could be in uniform every single day," she said.

In return, students work with volunteer organizations or get on-the-job training to gain self-esteem before returning to school.

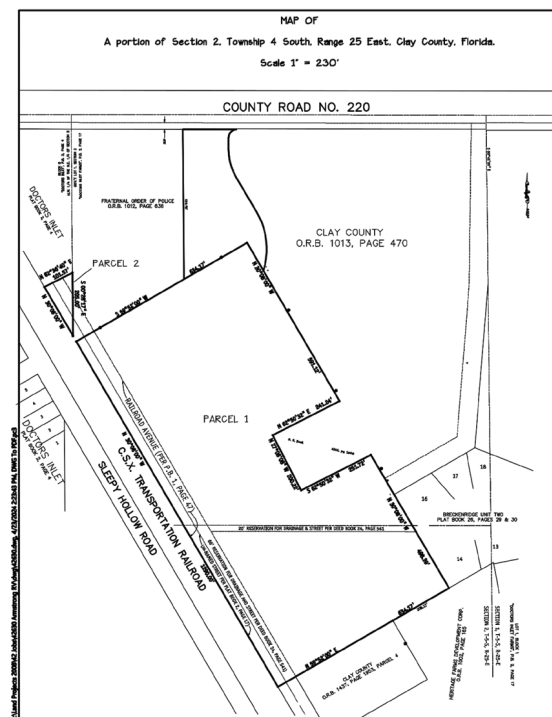

High class crime: 'Beverly Hills Cop: Axel F' continues Detroit cop's hijinks in Los Angeles



"Sunny" (Apple TV+ — July 10, Series Premiere)

Rashida Jones stars in this thriller series as Suzie, an American woman living in Kyoto, Japan, whose life is upended when her husband and son disappear in a mysterious plane crash. As "consolation" she's given Sunny (voiced by Joanna Sotomura), one of a new class of domestic robots made by her husband's electronics company. Though at first, Suzie resents Sunny's attempts to fill the void in her life, gradually they develop an unexpected friendship. Together they uncover the dark truth of what really happened to Suzie's family and become dangerously enmeshed in a world Suzie never knew existed.

One of film's most beloved and unorthodox police detectives is back on his beat, 30 years since audiences last saw him take down crime in Los Angeles' most famous ZIP code. Eddie Murphy ("You People," 2023) stars in the brand new action-comedy "Beverly Hills Cop: Axel F," premiering Wednesday, July 3, on Netflix.

Murphy reprises his role as Detective Axel Foley — who first made his iconic appearance in 1984's "Beverly Hills Cop," which was followed up by sequels in 1987 and 1994 — a Detroit police officer whose

work often takes him to sunny California and the glamorous, storied suburb of Beverly Hills to chase down drug lords, weapons kingpins and counterfeiting rings.

Joining Axel yet again is his trusty partner, Lt. Billy Rosewood, portrayed by Judge Reinhold ("Fast Times at Ridgemont High," 1982). Joseph Gordon-Levitt ("Mr. Corman") is Bobby Abbott, a detective with the Beverly Hills Police Department and ex-boyfriend of Axel's estranged daughter, Jane (Taylour Paige, "Zola," 2020).

So, what brings Axel back to the 90210 from his home in the Motor City this time, four decades since his first mayhem-filled assignment? Axel's daughter Jane, a criminal defense attorney, receives a threat to her life, prompting her father to team up with old and new partners and pin down the danger.

In an official trailer for the film, Axel, Billy and Bobby drive chaos all over Beverly Hills, from crash landing a helicopter on a golf course, to chasing down bad guys in a snow plow and steering a cargo truck through a palatial home's sitting room. The crime-fighting crew will get to the bottom of this case at any cost.

Reprising their roles from previous Beverly Hills Cop franchise films are Paul Reiser ("Mad About You") as Police Chief Jeffrey Friedman; John Ashton ("Gone Baby

Gone," 2007) as Sgt. John Taggart; and Bronson Pinchot ("Chilling Adventures of Sabrina") as former foe, Serge.

Joining the cast in this installment is Kevin Bacon ("Leave the World Behind," 2023) as Capt. Grant, who welcomes Axel back to the force — but can he be trusted? Axel has dealt with crooked cops before, so it wouldn't be the first time he found corruption went all the way to the top.

In a recent appearance on "The Daily Show," Bacon told Jordan Klepper, "I'm not afraid of being a bad guy in the movie," summing up his philosophy on being hated on screen by saying, "to me, it's just great parts and I just want to be them. And I'm exorcising some demons."

A newcomer to the Beverly Hills Cop franchise, Gordon-Levitt talked to Empire about his role in the upcoming film, saying, "this character is a bit straight-laced — I am an actual Beverly Hills cop, whereas Axel Foley is a cop from Detroit who finds himself in Beverly Hills — but he's not a simple straight man."

Anyone going toe-to-toe with Murphy is the straight man by default, but Gordon-Levitt shared that his character isn't just there to question Axel's hijinks. "I also get my licks in. I wouldn't be living up to this crazy opportunity if I wasn't going to have a few myself. We got to do some really fun stuff."

Hollingsworth went on to co-found Chain alongside B.J. Novak ("The Office") — an immersive dining experience reinventing chain restaurant favorites — and, alongside his current judging duties, plans to expand the Otium brand to other major cities.

Throughout his career, Hollingsworth has claimed many achievements, including the 2010 James Beard Foundation Rising Chef of the Year Award and placing sixth in the 2009 Bocuse d'Or. Hollingsworth also competed on and won Netflix's "The Final Table" in 2018, earning himself international fame.

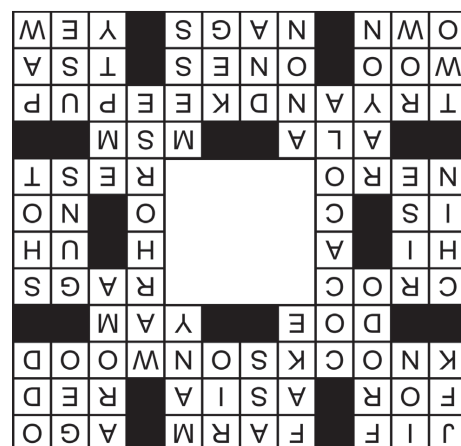

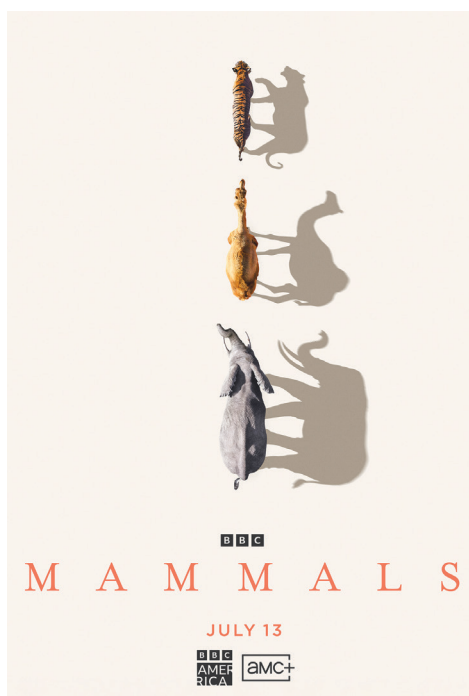

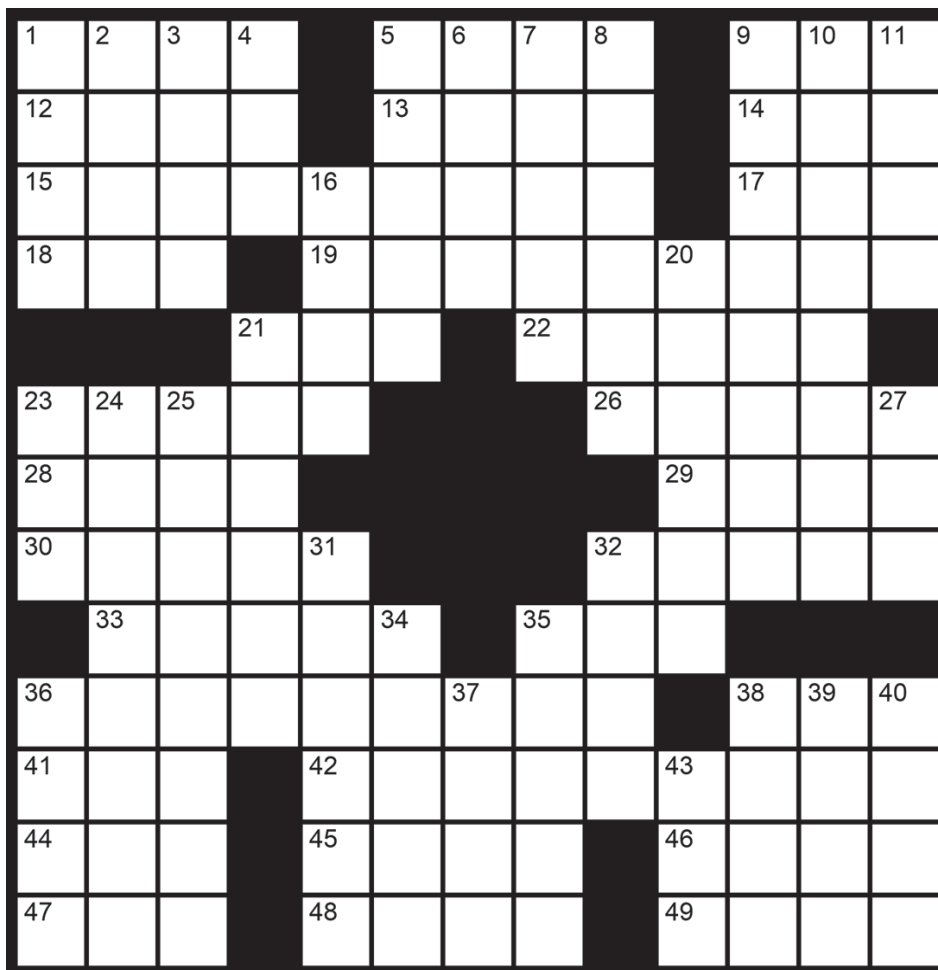

'Close Encounters of the Third Kind' still exist on TCM

Even if it didn't contain five of the most famous music notes in movie history, "Close Encounters of the Third Kind" would be one of the most memorable science-fiction movies yet made.

Turner Classic Movies presents the 1977 blockbuster on Saturday, July 6, as part of a "We Come in Peace" double feature of alien tales that concludes with 1951's "The Day the Earth Stood Still." Steven Spielberg's name was a huge selling point for "Close Encounters" after his monstrous success with "Jaws," and audiences were eager to see what the filmmaker would come up with next.

Director Spielberg imbued the story about alien-spaceship sightings on Earth, which he also wrote, with a humanity that has been a trademark of his career. He reunited with two of his "Jaws" collaborators — star Richard Dreyfuss and composer John Williams — to tell the story of several people whose lives are changed,

understandably, by unusual experiences eventually traced to the presence of extra-terrestrials in our orbit.

On one of her best screen roles, the late Melinda Dillon plays a mother distraught when her young son (Cary Guffey) vanishes in the wake of an at-home light show stunning enough to beat anything ever put forth on a stage. However, much of the plot centers on the utility-company worker portrayed by Dreyfuss.

After the truck that he's in shakes, rattles and almost rolls during a bizarre outage of all power sources in his area, he becomes obsessed with visions of an enormous mountain, making models of it ... even one out of mashed potatoes at the family dinner table. He starts to wonder whether he's going crazy, but a team of scientists (including one played by iconic French moviemaker Francois Truffaut) also is getting signals about possible UFOs.

Eventually, all relevant parties converge on Devil's Tower in Wyoming, the site that's indicated by the Dreyfuss character's visions. The resulting meeting is a display of sheer screen wonderment, and a big reason the movie has three versions: the original release, a 1980 "Special Edition" that Columbia Pictures wanted, and a 1998 "Director's Cut" that offers the film in the form that Spielberg ultimately wanted it in.

Was there more to 'CSI: Vegas' than the finale showed?

Q: I read somewhere that there originally was a cliffhanger ending to the last episode of "CSI: Vegas," but that it was deleted before the show aired. Is that true? - John Merritt, via e-mail

A: It is. It's interesting that CBS wouldn't have removed that dangling thread (concerning a vicious murderer) before sending the episode to critics for advance review, but it might have just been a matter of timing, with the final edit not yet ready when that copy for reviewers was made available. Otherwise, the story played out as intended as the series starring Paula Newsome and original "CSI: Crime Scene Investigation" regular Marg Helgenberger reached its end.

If that last "CSI: Vegas" season becomes available on home video, the cliffhanger might be included as an extra feature ... though there won't be a resolution to that plot, unless the show somehow returns in another form later. Never say "never" about that, since the fact that there was a "CSI: Vegas" at all (with original-show returnees William Petersen and Jorja Fox also involved initially) came as a surprise to some people initially. In fact, CBS executives already have hinted that "CSI" could be back in one form or another at some point.

Q: I know Kirsten Dunst has been getting praise for the movie "Civil War" lately. Can you remind me which character she played on "ER"? - Kelly Wade, Waterbury, Conn.

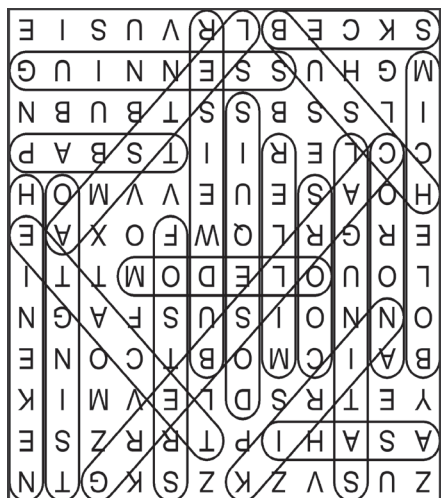
A: She played Charlie, a runaway who drew the concern of Dr. Doug Ross (George Clooney) when he thought she had been hurt on Halloween — but her "injury" turned out to be only a prank. Dunst had the part for a total of six episodes, during which the troubled Charlie's link to Ross had its ups and definite downs, leading to his treating her after she was brutally assaulted. The arc gave both Dunst and Clooney opportunities for heavy-duty dramatic acting on the NBC series during its third season, and Dunst already had proven herself capable of such a performing challenge at a young age, having worked earlier with Tom Cruise and Brad Pitt in the 1994 movie version of "Interview With the Vampire." It's accurate to say that she's been getting some of the best reviews she's had in a while for her work as a war photographer in "Civil War."

Q: Though Emmy Russell didn't win "American Idol," is it reasonable to expect that she'll continue to make television appearances, given how much attention she got? - Dee Phillips, via e-mail

A: We'd expect so, and it definitely didn't hurt that on the ABC contest's season finale in May, she became a viral sensation all over again by joining Wynonna Judd to perform "Coal Miner's Daughter" ... the song that was a trademark of country-music legend Loretta Lynn, who was Russell's grandmother, as anyone who recently watched "Idol" surely must know. Russell also didn't waste any time getting her career going post-"Idol," since soon after she was eliminated from the competition (having made it into the top five, though Abi Carter was the eventual winner of Season 22), she released her first single: "Redemption," which Russell co-wrote and based on her experience of what she has described as "a painful breakup."

Middleburg man arrested for 2023 deadly hit-and-run

ORANGE PARK – A man suspected of leaving the scene of a deadly accident was arrested nearly 18 months later after DNA results confirmed he was the driver who ran away from the scene after running a red light near the Orange Park Mall.

Sorie Anthony Christo Brown, 38, of Middleburg, was charged with vehicular homicide, leaving the scene of an accident without leaving information or rendering assistance and driving with a suspended license, resulting in a death after the Florida Highway Patrol arrived at a crash scene on Blanding Boulevard in front of the Orange Park Mall on Feb. 6, 2023, and found three cars crashed in the intersection.

The driver of an Acura said that when she had a green turn arrow to turn north onto Orange Park, a Dodge Durango ran through the intersection and collided with a Chevrolet SUV driven by Jerry Stepp, causing Stepp's SUV to overturn twice. Debris from that collision struck Nagwa Azer's Acura.

According to the accident report, the driver of the Durango ran away. Stepp, 22, of Middleburg, died three days later from his injuries.

FHP and Clay County Sheriff's Office deputies interviewed Brown several times, but he denied being the driver. FHP officers collected DNA evidence from the deployed airbags inside the Durango, eventually matching Brown. It took several months for the DNA to be processed, leading to the arrest delays.

CCSO arrested Brown later that night on an active Duval County warrant for driving under the influence. According to the affidavit for the arrest report, CCSO and FHP said Brown had "multiple" DUI convictions. As they arrested him, they noticed fresh burns on Brown's forearms caused by the airbags deploying.

The FHP obtained information from Brown's Durango's Event Data Recorder (black box), which revealed that he didn't stop at the intersection. In fact, the FHP said he pressed the accelerator to 95% "to run the red light."

Brown's bond was set at \$750,000. His next court appearance will be on July 22.

Wanted woman charged after being caught with cocaine, methamphetamine

ORANGE PARK – A woman was stopped on Wells Road for an outstanding narcotics warrant and Clay County Sheriff's Office deputies found more illegal drugs inside her car on June 20.

Krystal Lashea Doyle, 39, of Jacksonville, now faces additional charges of possession of cocaine and methamphetamine with intent to sell, manufacture or deliver, as well as possession of marijuana after K-9 Koda alerted deputies of the likely presence of narcotics inside her car during

the stop. According to the arrest report, the deputy was alerted Doyle's license was suspended. Before she was pulled over, the deputy was also told she had an outstanding warrant for distributing cocaine.

After she was detained, they found the drugs and a loaded handgun in the car.

Her bond was set at \$160,012. Her next court appearance will be on July 15.

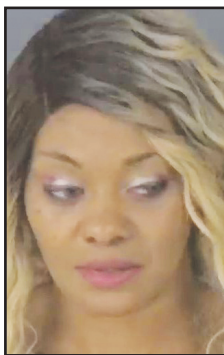

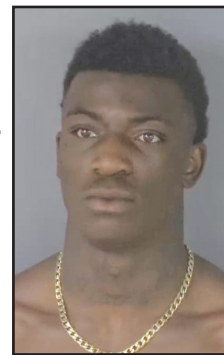
Woman returned to Clay County to face 2023 burglary charges

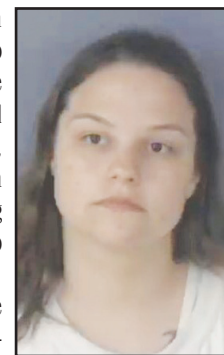

made a video recording of his bedroom before going to work, and when he returned, he realized his Xbox and accessories were missing. CCSO later recovered the Xbox, two controllers and an external game card at a nearby pawn shop.

CCSO said Smith and the man went to A1 Pick A Part on Joe Johns Road on Oct. 3, 2023, and asked a mechanic to remove the GPS unit.

When the mechanic realized it was a rental car, he stopped working. The next day, a Dodge truck was reported missing, and surveillance video showed Smith getting into the truck's passenger side.

Smith, whose bond is \$95,012, will return to court on July 29.

Former Orange Park resident pleads guilty of taking photos of him abusing a girl

JACKSONVILLE – U.S. Attorney Roger B. Handberg announced Henry Obdulio Cordon, 38, of Antioch, California, pleaded guilty to producing a photo of him sexually abusing a child. Cordon faces a minimum mandatory sentence of 15 years, up to 30 years, in federal prison and a potential lifetime term of supervised release. Cordon was arrested in California on May 16, 2019, and has been in custody since. His sentencing hearing is Oct. 23.

According to court documents, the investigation began in April 2019 when an internet service provider sent a series of CyberTipline reports to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. These reports related to the discovery of child sexual abuse photos within an email account that geolocated to California. Law enforcement officers traced the email account, which contained at least five photos depicting children being sexually abused to Cordon.

On May 9, 2019, the internet service provider submitted additional CyberTipline reports to NCMEC related to other accounts that were linked to and used by Cordon. One of the photos in the email account depicted a young child being sexually abused by an adult male.

Metadata associated with the photo indicated that it had been produced on July 11, 2011, using a Blackberry device. Ad-

ditional search warrants revealed that the email account was used at Cordon's apartment during April and May 2019.

On May 16, 2019, during the execution of a search warrant at Cordon's residence, Cordon admitted that he had searched the internet for "nude teen pictures." When asked if he ever had a Blackberry device, Cordon said he had one about nine years before when he lived in Orange Park. Investigators asked him about a particular photo depicting the sexual abuse of a young child that was recovered from his email account. Cordon eventually admitted knowing what they were discussing when asked who the child was and how he met her.

He knew the child in this photo and that she was "maybe" younger than four. Cordon claimed that his sexual abuse of this child only happened one time and that he remembered emailing this photo to himself to save. He also admitted taking the picture with his Blackberry.

Further investigation confirmed that Cordon had taken the photo and sent it to his email account.

The image was also recovered from the device he possessed in California on May 16, 2019. Law enforcement authorities in Florida confirmed the identity and age of the child, as well as the location in Florida where Cordon had taken the photo.

The case was investigated by the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force of Contra Costa County in California, the Contra Costa Sheriff's Office, the Contra Costa District Attorney's Office, the Clay County Sheriff's Office and Homeland Security Investigations. Assistant U.S. Attorney D. Rodney Brown is prosecuting it.

The case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative launched in 2006 by the Department of Justice to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse. Led by the United States Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to locate, apprehend, and prosecute individuals who sexually exploit children and to identify and rescue victims. 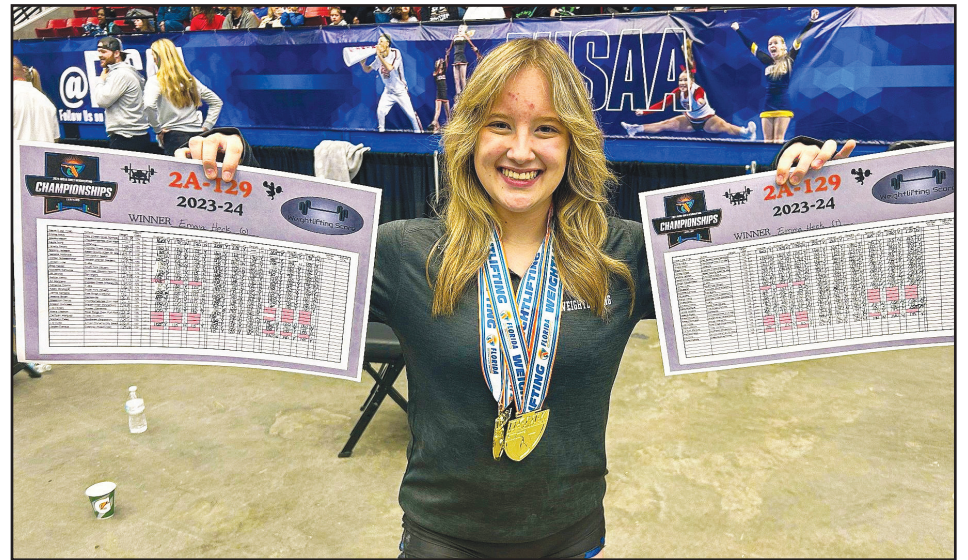

“Palatka had their usual explosive players; especially the quarterback and running back, both very fast and track stars,” said Kennard. “We won 21-14 in the half, and for not knowing what they were going to do; I had to write down adjustments on some paper on the sideline like old school, we did alright,” said Kennard. “We had to control their option and they got one bust; a pick-six interception for a touchdown.”

Kennard, though without returning quarterback Merrick Rapoza (at a baseball camp), got solid movement at the point of attack on both sides of the ball.

“Up front, our big guys did some really good things,” said Kennard. “Our goal for the spring game was to get lined up, get eyes on your keys and run to the ball. We do that, we do fine.”

Kennard used returner Eli Escoa at center, Josh Hetz at tackle and Blake Warren as his solid offensive line.

“We got some big boys,” said Kennard. “Both Swilleys; Darius and Dominic, and we had some play from Omar Goosby but he had a big blister on his foot. The guy to keep an eye on is Aaron Stacy. He and Omar are going to be destructive on the defensive line. They both got that ‘Dawg’ in them.”

For the summer, Kennard noted a trip to a team camp at Webber International and maybe a few 7 v 7s; Bolles here in June, Keystone Heights in July.

“Clay doesn’t set up and throw the ball as a matter of preference so 7 v 7 is not our game,” said Kennard. “Our thing is a strong run game.” With three quarterbacks battling for the top spot, Kennard wants to see more strength work over the summer and conditioning. “It’s very difficult to test that conditioning and strength training until you put the pads on,” said Kennard. “It’s all fun and games until you get punched in the mouth as Mike Tyson once said. We just prepare to be the one doing the punching.”

Kennard thinks the aura of Blue Devil football is to put the community back in the game. “Since I’ve been here, I love this community and we want to give something back,” said Kennard. “I preach that every day.”

his three Olympic journeys with his wife Meghan and child August along for the journey as well as his family; mom Christine, dad Michael and siblings Tyler, Kaitlyn and Sherridon, all in Indianapolis.

“Different experience, like in 2016, I went from a last-place finish, though not technically last because a guy got disqualified, in my first Trials, then making the team for the first time in 2016 as a relay then having my face on the building in 2020,” said Dressel. “This time, I still had goals and executed the best I could. I was feeling the love from the crowd all week.”

Dressel noted that, as a new dad, the experience had a new meaning for him.

“I haven’t really digested the experiences that I have had to put into my ‘dad’ speeches,” said Dressel, 27. “One way I will tell August is that if you make the Olympic team, you will always be an Olympian and no one can take that away from you. My son got to see me make the Olympic team this week, and, though, he won’t remember it, I got photos that I can show him. That thought and sharing all the ups and downs with me wife Meghan has been special. Meghan knows what goes into this. My whole family goes through every moment as well.”

At the Trials, Dressel finished third in the 100 free which gets him a relay spot in the 4 x 100 free relay, but does not allow him to defend his 2020 Tokyo title in the 100 free.

Dressel finished third in the 100 free final behind newcomers Chris Guliano of

Pennsylvania who won in 47.38 and Jack Alexy of California, runnerup in 47.47, with Dressel in third at 47.53. The 47.53 was Dressel’s fastest time in 2023 and 2024 after a two-year break from the sport. Dressel was the world record holder until 2024 when two swimmers; Pan Zhanle of China and David Popovici of Romania, swam splits faster than Dressel’s 46.96 set in 2019. Zhanle’s 46.80 is the official world record though his was from the leadoff of a relay while Popovici’s time of 46.88 came at the European Championships last week.

“We had six guys under 48 seconds in our 100 free final, that’s fast,” said Dressel. “I like to race and times will come with

execution; put me in a race and I’ll make it as close as I can, but I’m happy to see these young guys hitting those fast times. At this point, I don’t know if I’ll ever have the best time ever again. People say I may have been a part of the new faces being fast and, if true, that’s a good thing.”

Dressel, one of the more dominant swimmers since Michael Phelps, commented about his finishing third in the 100-free final as part of the changing of the guard.

“Seeing third place on the scoreboard, for me, was relatively new,” said Dressel, who noted that his ascension through the preliminaries to the 50 free semifinals and then the 50 free final, was all part of the process. “In the 100 free, could I have found an extra .06 of second?, I don’t know, but Jack and Chris deserve those spots on Team UA.”

Heading through the procession for the 50 free, his first defense run from the Tokyo Olympics, Dressel was second to Chris Guliano in the semifinal with a 21.61 split to Guliano’s 21.59, but, in the final Dressel went even faster with a 21.41 to beat Guliano’s 21.69 as runner-up.

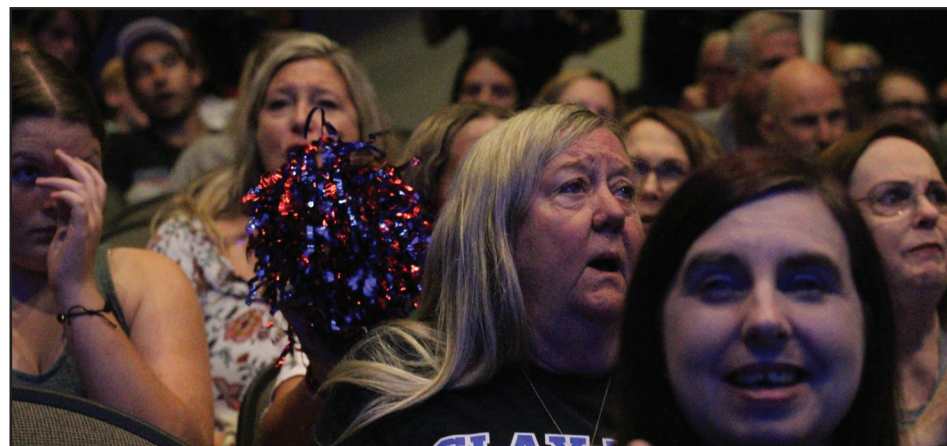
Just 34 minutes later, Dressel lined up in the 100 butterfly semifinal in a dramatic quick turnaround that would push Dressel’s international status one more level.

In the semifinal, Dressel stormed the final 20 meters with his well-known no-breathing sprint surge to outtouch a pre-race favorite, California’s Dare Rose, with a 50.79 winning time to Rose’s 51.11 with Heilman qualifying in seventh place in the heat with a 51.58.

In the final the next day, with Clay High fans watching at the Fleming Island Eleven22 Church Watch Party, Dressel looked the Dressel of old with his lightning start and the fastest first 50 of the night, then his usual mid-50 surge for the win in 50.19 seconds with Heilman second at 50.80 and Rose third at 50.84.

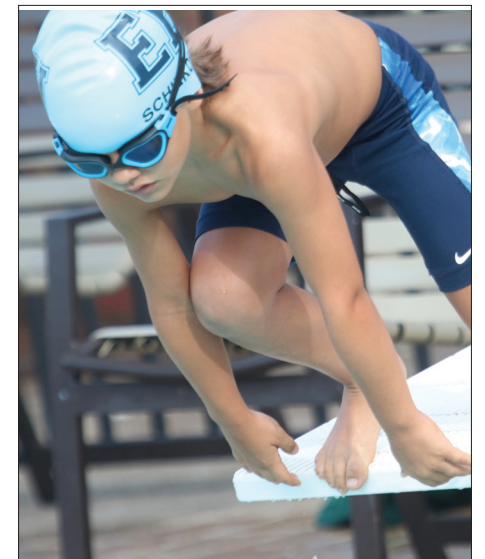

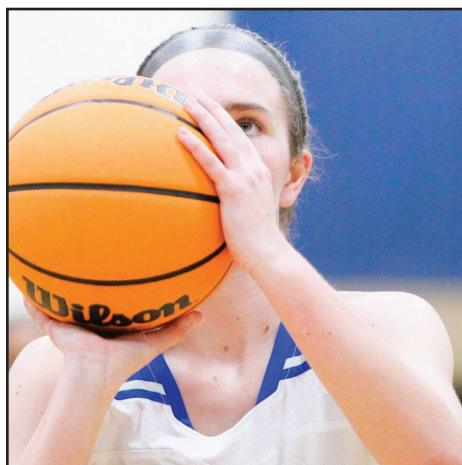

County tourism adds rugby to unique sports list

FLEMING ISLAND - With a handful of Clay County ex-football players on their roster, the Jacksonville Wolverine boys Under-19 rugby team showed off some of the fast-moving action of rugby with a two-game series at Thunderbolt Park in Fleming Island.

"We try to be creative and invite sports that are kind of non-traditional into the county to showcase the resources that we have here," said Clay County Director of Tourism Kimberly Morgan, who has orchestrated such events as professional motorized surfing in Keystone Heights, the USA Cycling national qualifying weekend (Criterium, Time Trial and Road Race) that incorporated such sites as Camp Blanding (Time Trial), Thrasher Horne Civic Center (Criterium) and Penney Farms (Road Race) in recent outings, plus a Florida Cyclocross championship race series in Ronnie Van Zandt Memorial Park in Lake Asbury. "Rugby was just sort of a no-brainer with the huge football presence in Clay County and this north Florida area and the Wolverines were looking for a permanent home field spot to play."

The two-game series played with the Wolverines, which is also an Under-16 team, hosting the Bermuda team visiting north Florida, was staged at Thunderbolt Park amidst lacrosse practice at one end and some Fleming Island Dreadnaughts youth football practice at the other end.

"Just on that one field in Fleming Island, three different sports were represented," said Morgan. "We have the facilities in Clay County, including the new regional park sports complex off Blanding Blvd that we just hosted a Florida Ultimate Frisbee tournament just a weekend ago. We also have a flag football tournament in the works."

The Wolverines, coached by Aaron Church, a former Navy soccer and rugby standout, then a four-year starter at Arkansas State, now an NCAA Div. I program, won both ends of the two-game series with Bermuda and won a Florida state title in 2019 in the early inception of the team in Jacksonville.

"Football in all three counties around here; Clay, Duval and St. Johns, all bring a tremendous amount of athletic talent from football and we are just trying to bring the rugby interest into north Florida schools," said Church. "A lot of the kids we get come to us after finishing their high school careers, coming to give it a try and realizing



that they should have done rugby for the last four years. It's that kind of sport."

In 2024, the Wolverines lost in the Florida Youth Rugby Union State Final 53-19 to Okapi Rugby of Weston, FL.

Locally, football players from Fleming Island; Jered Rhodes; Oakleaf, Prince Savea, and Middleburg high schools, have put their feet into the waters of rugby after finishing their high school football players.

"We take a lot of football players from around the north Florida area that maybe thought they were going to be NCAA Div. 1 scholarship guys, introduce them to rugby, and then watch them fall in love with the sport," said Wolverine Board member Aaron Taylor, who has been with the Wolverines since its inception in 2017. "Coach

Church has a lot of connections and there a lot more opportunities to four-year scholarships to rugby players that go unsigned then football and, once a kid plays, he doesn't go back to football."

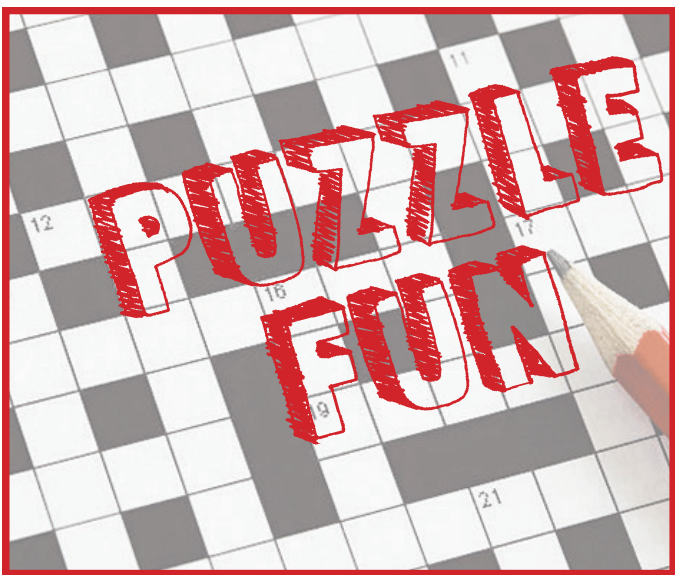
For Savea, a standout at Oakleaf High School, the transition to football has been a strategic life move that has quickly gotten a scholarship offer from Life University after just a short stint of playing rugby.

"I went to River City Prep for a season hoping to transfer out, didn't lose any eligibility and got introduced to rugby," said Savea. "I didn't know much about rugby, but it's very close to football and already have interest from schools like St. Thomas

University and Life after just four months. I'm the prop, the guy in the middle of the scrum. Honestly, rugby is so much more constant action."

For Rhodes, also a state weightlifting champion for Fleming Island High School, Church noted that his strength and very athletic talent made him an easy fit for rugby and that it has already paid off. Rhodes recently committed to play rugby at American International College, a Division I rugby program in Springfield, Massachusetts.

"Of all his scholarship offers from football, rugby just gave him his biggest scholarship opportunity," said Church, coach of the Wolverines for nine years. "Rugby scholarships are not as saturated as football. I get recruiters who ask for some interest in rugby and a great athlete. More money available and not necessarily under NCAA rules for roster size."

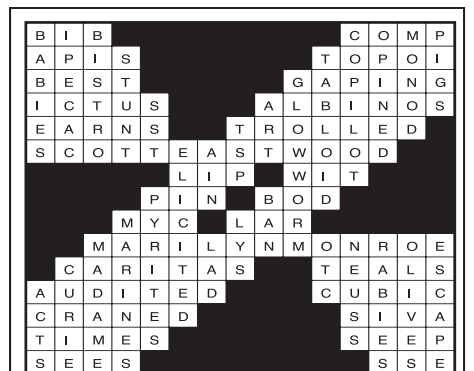
