1. CAMP IN A TREEHOUSE

Camp Chowenwaw treehouses are located at the intersection of Black Creek and the St. Johns River, this 150-acre county-owned park was home to a regional Girl Scout camp for over 70 years.



2. THE FIRM

Test your speed and skills on the Rally Race Car Course at The FIRM in Keystone Heights. Action superstar Travis Pastrana brought his worldwide racing series, Nitro Rallycross to The FIRM in December 2021.

3. SPRING PARK

Take a dip in one of the country's oldest spring-fed swimming pool in Spring Park; it's been around since 1871 and known for its therapeutic healing and its constant temperature of 77 degrees.

5. INDOOR FUN




8. TOP OF THE TEE



Kairos Jax



In Clay County's Oakleaf neighborhood, Eagle Landing Golf Course features a 7,037 yard, par 72 course surrounded with Southern pine and palmetto trees. With six tees, ranging from juniors to championship, this course progresses in difficulty as the game reaches its way to the 18th green. Also designed by golf architect Clyde B. Johnston, Eagle Landing is said to offer a vintage feel with classically designed holes along the course. If you're interested in stepping up your game on the course, Eagle Landing golf professionals are available for private lessons for both adults and juniors.

For a bite to eat with great views of the course, stop in at The Landing Bar & Grill. This family-friendly spot offers breakfast, lunch and dinner daily with entrees ranging from wings, flatbreads, burgers, sandwiches along with a full bar.

FLEMING ISLAND GOLF CLUB

Designed by local architect Bobby Weed, the Fleming Island Golf Course comes in at 6,700 yards with a par of 71. Surrounded by water and carefully-place sand bunkers, the front nine challenges golfers to play their best game while the back nine features a quiet course among the trees


and wildlife.

Unique to Fleming Island Golf Club is the Top of the Tee – home to ten covered hitting bays equipped with Toptracer Technology. Each bay has its own seating area, paired with a nearby bar and televisions making this venue perfect for groups. Golfers can choose from different games including closest to the pin, longest drive competitions, points games and more. Top of the Tee is also available for practice sessions before moving over to the main course. The lighted driving range also allows for players to practice even after the sun goes down.

The club's Hibernia Pub overlooks the 10th tee and offers a full menu, including Irish cuisine and a full bar. Stop in for a bite to eat and stay for nighttime fun with live music featured throughout the week by local musicians.

MAGNOLIA POINT GOLF CLUB

In Green Cove Springs, golfers can test their skills at the Magnolia Point Golf Club among the pine and magnolia trees. Set within a 1,000 acre community, wildlife is frequently seen on the course making it a unique playing field for golfers. Designed by Mark McCumber and Mike Beebe in 1986, this 6,796 yard course features Bermuda grass and no parallel fairways.



Magnolia Point Golf Club is also home to The Golf Academy of North Florida, under the instruction of Dale Claussen, PGA. The academy has produced numerous collegiate players along with their thriving juniors program. With use of V1 Coaching Software, players can take advantage of video analysis during lessons and practice under covered and shaded hitting areas.

GRAY WOMEN

lay County is home to a rich history shaped by extraordinary women whose stories resonate across time. Women like Augusta Savage, Anna Kingsley, Margaret Fleming, and Cynthia Haymon have left lasting marks on the region through their art, resilience, leadership, and influence. This article dives into their stories, providing a fuller picture of their lives and the challenges they overcame to build their legacies.

AUGUSTA SAVAGE A Harlem Renaissance Artist From Green Cove Springs

Augusta Savage was born in 1892 in Green

Cove

when she molded clay she found in her backyard
into figures and animals. Encouraged by teachers
and the local community, Savage pursued her
passion and earned a scholarship to Cooper Union
in New York City. There, she excelled, completing
a four-year degree in three years.

Savage's career blossomed during the Harlem Renaissance, a cultural movement that celebrated African American art and identity. She became known for her sculptures, which captured the humanity and dignity of her subjects.

One of her most celebrated works, Gamin, a captivating bust inspired by her nephew, earned her a Julius Rosenwald Fellowship in 1929. This achievement allowed her to study in Paris, where her talent was quickly recognized and her work showcased at the Grand Palais. In 1931, Savage secured another Rosenwald Fellowship, enabling her to extend her stay in Paris. During this time, she also received a Carnegie Foundation grant, which allowed her to travel extensively across France, Belgium, and Germany, gaining inspiration and exposure to European art movements.

Upon returning to New York in 1932, Savage made an indelible impact on the Harlem art scene. She founded the Savage Studio of Arts and Crafts, where she mentored a generation of artists who would go on to shape the Harlem Renaissance and beyond. Her most famous work, The Harp, was commissioned for the 1939 New York World's Fair. The piece symbolized hope and resilience but was tragically destroyed after the fair due to a lack

of funds for preservation.

Despite facing systemic racism and financial challenges that hindered the preservation of much of her work, Savage's contributions to art and education remain monumental. Today, her work lives on through pieces like The Diving Boy at Jacksonville's Cummer Museum, and her story continues to inspire as a testament to the transformative power of art in challenging times.

ANNA KINGSLEY

A Freed Slave and Plantation Overseer

Anna Kingsley's life is a powerful narrative of resilience and complexity. Born Anta Madjiguène Ndiaye in present-day Senegal around 1793, Anna was captured and sold into slavery as a child. At age

13, she was purchased by Zephaniah Kingsley, a slave trader and plantation owner, who made her his wife. They had four children together.

When she turned 18, Zephaniah freed her and gave her responsibilities for maintaining his East Florida

plantations. As a free woman, Anna became a skilled and influential overseer of Zephaniah's land. In the 1820s, she managed Laurel Grove, a plantation in the Clay County area, where she oversaw the cultivation of crops. Her expertise in agriculture contributed significantly to the plantation's success.

Anna's life, however, is not without controversy. As a formerly enslaved person who later owned slaves, her story reflects the complexities of agency within a system of oppression. Yet, her ability to navigate this brutal system to secure freedom and prosperity for herself and her children is a remarkable achievement.

When the American Civil War began, Anna and her children aligned themselves with the Union

cause. In 1862, after Union forces took control of Jacksonville, Anna, along with other free Black residents, was evacuated for safety. The following year, she returned to the area to remain near her children. Anna passed away in 1870 at the age of 77. She was buried in Jacksonville, though the exact location of her grave is unknown.

MARGARET FLEMING

An Integral Developer of Fleming Island

Margaret Seton Fleming's life is a story of endurance and vision. Married to Lewis Fleming, she settled in Hibernia Plantation during the mid-19th century, a period marked by political and economic turbulence. After Lewis's death during the Civil War, Margaret took on the daunting task of managing the plantation on her own.

Recognizing the potential of the burgeoning tourism industry, Margaret converted Hibernia into a resort, welcoming visitors from across the country. Under her leadership, the plantation became a place of relaxation and rejuvenation, known for its hospitality and scenic beauty.

Margaret's contributions extended outside of tourism. She was instrumental in founding Saint Margaret's Episcopal Church, named in honor of Saint Margaret of Scotland. Sadly, she died just before the building was completed and the first service held was Margaret's funeral service.

Developments within the community continued after her death – her bold dreams were a catalyst in the origins of Fleming Island.

CYNTHIA HAYMON

A Gifted Singer From Penney Farms

Cynthia Haymon, a gifted soprano born in Penney Farms, brought international acclaim to Clay County through her exceptional talent and dedication to the music. She began her journey locally, developing a passion for singing that led her to study at Northwestern University.

Haymon's rise to prominence came with her portrayal of Bess in Porgy and Bess, a role that showcased her voice and captivating stage presence, ultimately earning a Grammy nomination.

In addition to her performance career, Haymon has devoted herself to education,

mentoring young artists, and sharing her expertise with future generations. Her work as a teacher underscores her commitment to fostering musical excellence in future generations.

The stories of Augusta Savage, Anna Kingsley, Margaret Fleming, and Cynthia Haymon offer a window into the resilience, creativity, and leadership of women who shaped Clay County's story. 



estled along Black Creek and the St. Johns River, Camp Chowenwaw is a captivating destination in Green Cove Springs that blends rich history, outdoor adventure, and a commitment to preserving the natural beauty of Clay County. Once a beloved retreat for the Girl Scouts, this 150-acre park is now open to the public, offering activities for all ages and interests. Whether you're seeking a weekend getaway, an educational day trip, or simply a peaceful place to reconnect with nature, Camp Chowenwaw has something for everyone.

HISTORY OF CAMP CHOWENWAW

Established in 1933 by the Girl Scouts of Duval County, Camp Chowenwaw served as a fantastic summer retreat for generations of young girls. Its name comes from the Creek word for "sister," reflecting the spirit of community and camaraderie that defined its early years. After 70 years of operation, Clay County purchased the property in 2006, with the assistance from Florida Communities Trust to conserve its natural communities, preserving its legacy, and providing outdoor recreation to the general public. Today, visitors can

explore its historical roots through exhibits and landmarks that tell the story of the camp's rich past.

THINGS TO DO AT CAMP CHOWENWAW

From tranquil hikes to immersive educational experiences, Camp Chowenwaw offers a variety of activities that cater to outdoor enthusiasts, history buffs, and families alike. If you're looking for a day of exploration or a weekend of adventure, the park provides countless opportunities to immerse yourself in nature, learn about local history, and create lasting memories.

OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES

Nature enthusiasts will find plenty to enjoy at Camp Chowenwaw. The park features a network of trails perfect for hiking, including the Tree House Boardwalk Trail leading to Treehouse Point and the Hickory Trail winding through over a mile of wooded paths and natural terrain. There's also the Jungle Trail, a boardwalk trail that goes to the fishing pier along Black Creek, which is a popular local fishing spot.

FAQS

What is the best time of year to visit?

Camp Chowenwaw is enjoyable year-round, but the cooler months from October through April are ideal for camping and outdoor activities.

Are there entry fees?

No, entry to the park is free. However, there are fees for accommodations and pool access.

How do I book a campsite?

Reservations can be made online or by contacting the park directly at (904) 529-8058. Fees vary based on the type of accommodation.

What are the park's hours?

The park is open daily from 8:00 a.m. to sunset. Overnight campers must check in between 1:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. and check out by 11:00 a.m.

Are there any rules I should know?

Yes, campers stays are limited to seven consecutive nights per month, and quiet hours are observed from 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Swimming is not allowed in Otter Springs, the onsite artisanal pond or Black Creek, and the pool fees apply to all day-use visitors.



The land is home to a diverse array of wildlife and plant species. Birdwatchers and nature photographers will appreciate the sightings of whitetail deer, wild turkeys, armadillo, and even the occasional manatee along Black Creek. The hiking trails offer prime opportunities to enjoy the park's lush landscapes and observe local fauna in their natural habitat.

If you want to get out on the water, PADL offers paddleboard rentals, allowing visitors to glide across the serene waters directly from the park.

A playground and a volleyball court add to the options for outdoor fun. In addition, from Memorial Day through Labor Day, the park's swimming pool is open. It's a perfect spot for cooling off during the summer months.

LEARN ABOUT HISTORY AND NATURE

The Chowenwaw Centuries Exhibit Museum is a highlight for history buffs, showcasing artifacts from the camp's Girl Scout era and the Indigenous Peoples of Clay County. Nearby, the Pawpaw Nature Center captivates visitors of all ages with interactive displays on local wildlife, from gopher tortoises to manatees.

PICNICKING AND RELAXATION

Scattered throughout the park are picnic tables and grills, perfect for family gatherings or quiet lunches. Shared amenities, like covered patios, add to the charm, while the kitchens are reserved exclusively for campers to enhance their stay.

OVERNIGHT STAYS

For an unforgettable camping experience, consider some of Camp Chowenwaw's options for overnight stays:

- · Squirrel Run Cabins: These air-conditioned cabins sleep up to six people and are equipped with electric outlets for added comfort.
- · Ahwenassa Cabins: These cabins have a traditional log cabin look and also include beds and air-conditioning.
- Treehouse Cabins: Eight unique treehouses provide rustic accommodations with screened enclosures and bunk beds, perfect for adventurous families or small groups.
- · Primitive Tent Sites: Ideal for traditional campers, these sites offer a back-to-basics experience with shared amenities.

Round out your visit by exploring the nearby communities. In Green Cove Springs, stroll through scenic Spring Park, shop along Walnut Street, or grab a coffee at the charming Spring Park Coffee. 





Regulated hunting and fishing are allowed in designated areas, but visitors must obtain the appropriate licenses and permits. Hunting is only permitted during specific seasons, as outlined by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission

The State Forest Department encourages both hunters and other visitors to wear bright clothing and to keep dogs leashed. Hunters should stay away from marked hiking and horseback riding trails as much as possible.

- Plan your visit during the winter months for mild weather and optimal hiking conditions.

eorgia-Pacific's mill in Palatka has been a cornerstone of the community for 78 years, employing more than 1,000 workers. "In bathrooms, kitchens, and at backyard barbecues, you can find our household products helping to make everyday life a little easier," said Vin Webster, vice president of manufacturing at the Palatka facility.

The mill began operations on November 5, 1947, under the name Hudson Pulp and Paper Company. Initially, the Hudson mill had 279 employees but quickly became Florida's largest producer of facial and bathroom tissue. Over the years, it expanded its product offerings to include gummed paper tape and kraft paper for bags and sacks. In its early days, the mill was a significant community in Putnam County, featuring its power plant, fire department, police department, medical facilities, two cafeterias, and water supply. Today, it remains the largest private employer in the county, supporting more than 1,000 jobs directly and creating an additional 2,426 indirect jobs in the community.

The mill produces well-known consumer brands such as Brawny®, Sparkle®, and Angel Soft®,

as well as private-label paper towels and bath tissue. The mill also manufactures kraft paper used for recyclable mailers, grocery bags, butcher paper, and linerboard used in producing corrugated boxes.

Since its inception, daily production has skyrocketed by 800 percent. Georgia-Pacific acquired the mill in 1979 and has since modernized and expanded the facility, investing over \$1.2 billion since 2002.

With an annual economic impact exceeding \$1 billion, the mill plays a crucial role in the growth of Palatka and the surrounding region.

Beyond its economic contributions, the Palatka mill has also received recognition from the Environmental Protection Agency for its efforts in reducing energy and water consumption. In 2018, it earned the ENERGY STAR Challenge Achiever for Industry by cutting energy use by over 10 percent in three years. Additionally, in 2020, the mill

received the EPA's ENERGY STAR Top Project award for achieving a 40 percent reduction in water use within just 10 weeks, thanks to investments in upgraded equipment and monitoring systems.

The Palatka facility manages 16 wooded plots for sustainable forestry practice. When one area is harvested, saplings are replanted, allowing the land to be reused. After 15 years, these saplings mature into full trees, ensuring a continuous supply of resources without the need to encroach on new forested areas.

Georgia-Pacific, headquartered in Atlanta, is one of the leading manufacturers and marketers of bath tissue, paper towels, napkins, tableware, paper-based packaging, cellulose, specialty fibers, and building products.

The company operates over 150 facilities globally, directly employing around 30,000 people and creating more than 89,000 indirect jobs.
