# **OPCCOA** Board of Directors Meeting

There was a quorum of the Board of Directors, and the meeting was called to order by Tom Mackin at 6:00 p.m. Tom Mackin welcomed our new Community Association Manager, Kim Lang.

#### <u>Manager's Report</u>

The April Management Report included the ARC Project Tracker, Violation Log, April Gatehouse Summary, and the April Steering Committee Meeting Minutes.

#### Minutes

The minutes from the April 15, 2025, Board of Directors Meeting were approved by all. The minutes from the May 8, 2025, Special Meeting were also approved.

#### **Financials**

The April Financials provided by our Property Manager did not appear to be official and were tabled for future discussion.

#### **Committee Reports Architectural Review Committee (ARC)**

At the May 20, 2025, committee meeting 8 Initial Project Reviews were approved including 2 Roof Projects, 1 Driveway Paver Project, 1 Exterior Modification, 2 Paint Projects, 1 Fence Installation and 1 Tree Removal. 8 Final Project Inspections were also approved including 3 Tree Removal Projects, 1 Pain Project, 1 Driveway Paver Project, 1 Roof Installation and 2 Exterior Modifications.

#### Roads

Two of the three bids requested have been received to do road work throughout the neighborhood repairs and paving. One bid was in the amount of 1.25 million and the second was in the amount of 2 million. All the drains throughout the neighborhood need to be scoped prior to doing the road work. The cost for the scoping will be \$41,000 and there will be an additional charge if the drains need to be pumped out. The estimates for the scoping and pumping of the drains were approved.

#### Lakes

Jerry Deans reported that the amount

of algae in the lakes has increased due to higher temperatures. Lake Doctors has been requested to address this issue especially Lakes H4, H6 and G5.

#### Landscape

A dead Laural Oak at the roundabout started to rot apart and Spencer Tree Specialists cut and removed the tree and debris for a cost of \$1,000. aaoO Services canopied the 6 ligustrum tree at the roundabout signage area and removed the underlying overgrowth so that the lighting illuminates the ligustrums as intended. Shrubs will be planted to form a hedge at least 10 feet from the utility boxes located next to 2746 Country Club Blvd. so that they will be partially hidden from drivers' views. aaoO Services will trim the hedges at the roundabout signage so that the lighting will not be shadowed. The committee is working with Kintesh Patel to create a plan to improve lighting at the wing wall.

#### **Street Captains**

We have new Street Captains. Don Grace and Nancy Smith will serve 801-817 Cherry Grove Rd. and Dove Creek Circle. Mark and Stephanie Rankin will serve Golden Links Drive. There are 5 blocks that do not have a street captain.

#### **Gatehouse Report**

The April 2025 Gatehouse Summary was included in the Board meeting package.

Randy Rutan reported that the Florida Door Control invoice in the amount of \$1,770 for damage done to the gate on April 9, 2025, has been reimbursed by the resident who did the damage. There have been 2 additional incidents. On May 10, 2025, a delivery vehicle hit the visitor lane gate and on May 16, 2025, a driver for East Coast Sod hit the canopy and did significant damage. Both parties will be notified that they will reimburse us for the cost of repairs.

#### **Old Business Gatehouse Repairs** & Maintenance

Kintesh Patel has been working with IAS and clarification of the tasks required was provided in an email. IAS has started their work. Greg VanSuch has been working with Atlantic Homes to create a timeline for the other exterior and interior repairs.

#### **Update on Amended** & Restated Covenants

The Amended & Restated Covenants passed and the signed document has been filed with Clay County. It has been posted on our website.

#### Update on Gate Entry Policy

Randy Rutan shared a copy of the Gate Entry Instructions that The Hub is providing to pickleball participants. Once the pickleball is up and running the entry policies for The Grove and The Hub Pickleball will be added to the Gate Entry Policy.

#### **Discussion of New Signs Proposal from Brand 9 Estimate # 2676**

After some discussion the Board approved moving forward with replacing the playground sign and 2 mailbox parking signs. It was also decided that the creation of a new OPCC sign to place at the median at Thornwood Drive would be put on hold.

#### **New Business Proposal from The Grove**

We were presented with a proposal from The Grove that would address the issue of insufficient parking. The proposal was discussed at the May 8, 2025 Special Meeting of the Board. The Grove is in dire need of additional parking and has offered to move the mailboxes back to the pool parking lot at their expense if we will allow them to use the parking lot on the left side of the entrance to the clubhouse that was part of the pool acquisition. They have also offered to make monthly payments (an impact fee) to contribute to roadwork. The Board also discussed locating the mailboxes to a different area than behind the cabana. There were concerns about the maintenance and upkeep of the cabana. The Board approved relocating the mailboxes to a grassy area on the Cherry Grove Road side of the pool parking lot instead of locating them in front of the cabana. Since The Grove indicated that they would not support the increased cost of moving the mailboxes to the grassy area, a compromise position was suggested and approved. The Board suggested that the road impact fee would

# Loch Rane Board of Directors Meeting

#### **Memorial Day**

First, a big thank you to everyone who helped set out and pick up the flags along the boulevard. Despite being advertised in advance by Eblast and Facebook, there were fewer folks helping than we had hoped. The 600+ flags make an impressive display. Please help on the 4th of July and Veterans Day when we next set up the flags. Watch for information as the dates get closer.

#### **Minutes**

Minutes from the April meeting of the Board of Directors were unavoidably delayed. They are expected to be presented next month and posted on the web site after they are approved.

#### **Renovations at the gatehouse**

The project is progressing with installation of the new camera system. The next phases of the renovations will follow in order. You may have noticed the damage to the overhead of the gatehouse on the incoming side. It was recently struck by a truck too tall to clear the opening in the visitor lane. The damage will be paid by the company that owns the truck.

#### **Special Assessment**

The 2025 special assessment is now due. For those wishing to split it into two payments, the first half (\$500) is due no later than May 30th. 38% of the households have already paid the full amount (thank you). It is much simpler accounting and lets us plan projects with the funds we have in hand rather than hoping for the funds still expected.

#### Infrastructure for 2025

Repair of the road in Dunster Court is scheduled for mid-July. The old asphalt will be milled and removed July 7. The offending pipe will be removed and the road base rebuilt July 14 to 18th. Paving will be delayed until Thursday, July 24th to avoid fresh asphalt on the days the garbage trucks come through the neighborhood. Dates may be affected by weather. We will again have an objective inspector performing parttime spot checks on the road bed to insure proper materials and density. He will also monitor the paving for quality of the asphalt, temperature as it arrives and the paving process.

A letter will be prepared for the residents along Dunster with more details and delivered to each home.

#### **Pipe Relining**

Mr. Mcmahill has recently found a new method for relining old pipes. It does not require relining the entire pipe, just the joints where they tend to fail. He is exploring the cost which is potentially lower than our current vendors. He will also compare the reliability and warranty versus the relining systems we have been employing.

#### Pipe Failure

There was a recent area where the road on Torbay near the boulevard suddenly failed. There was an extensive void under the surface that eventually led to finding a leak in the large 54 inch diameter pipe that parallels the boulevard and carries storm water to the gabion ditch on the outbound side. The pipe was excavated and wrapped then patched with concrete. The pipe is officially part of the boulevard and so will be a shared expense between the two communities.

#### Retention Ponds

Bids are being sought from multiple companies to modify the ponds as approved by the St Johns Water Management District. One company has already declined the work and another did not care to bid on the job. There are still several companies considering making proposals.

The pond along Arran Court that had the modification to the outflow has silted in to the point the pipe now is right at the surface of the mud bottom. We knew it was just a temporary measure until the pond could be dredged. For this storm season, we ask that the residents along that part of the neighborhood help keep the pipe open and flowing by clearing out the area under the 90 degree elbow of the pipe. The pond will still drain if the end of the pipe is clogged but it will not drain down as low.

#### CAM Team Responsiveness

The phone call and email logs for the CAM Team for April were supplied and reviewed. We noted again calls from residents who were waiting for notices that their ARC requests had been approved but were still waiting after the letters should have arrived. It is being investigated as the letters are being generated electronically but apparently are not being routinely mailed. That function is to be handled by a third party (not the CAM Team). As an interim fix, ARC requests that received approval tonight will be contacted once the approvals are officially entered into the system without relying on hard copy letters.

In addition, a new Eblast will be sent to all we can reach to remind folks how the ARC Requests are handled. The statute requires us to formally approve all ARC requests in an open meeting of the board of directors which occurs only once a month. Please plan accordingly. We have a procedure to address true emergencies but failing to get an ARC approved BEFROE you schedule work, remodels, roofs, driveways is not an excuse. Unapproved work may well incur fines or in extreme cases a legal notice to cease the work. No one wants to get to that endpoint.

#### Grove Update

The first restaurant is open for business. Non-members are permitted to eat there for now. Give it a try. There is a new chef who is reworking the menu based on the first few weeks of business. Once memberships hit a certain level, it will become a members-only private club. The Fitness Center is open and operational. Weddings have been held there already as well. There was a barbecue for both members and non-members on Memorial Day. Activity continues to pick up. Follow them at www.letsgrove.com.

The Hub Pickleball

The Hub had its grand opening May 23rd.

#### **Bylaws**

Loch Rane operates under its original bylaws drafted decades ago. The board reviewed the first four articles and made suggested corrections and changes to better reflect the current policies and operation of the association. Changes were discussed openly and residents provided their input as well. Article V is to be presented in June.

#### Welcome Packet Loch Rane

The welcome packet was out of date. It has been updated. As we get it completed with the final details, it will be given to every new resident as they move into the neighborhood. It can be a handy reference and we believe even those that have lived here for some time will find the information helpful. Once it is finalized, a digital copy can be emailed from the CAM Team to your email address. Once you see a note here that it is complete, you may request a copy.

#### **Lights at Mailboxes**

There are four areas with mailboxes that are in areas with very little light. Mr. Hudgins had researched the options and was able to find one with solar powered lighting that will cost only \$572 total for all 4 areas with volunteers to erect the posts and set up the lights. The board approved this expenditure.

#### Changing Meeting Days / Dates The board had looked at changing when we

The board had looked at changing when we meet to avoid the holidays that occur late in the month (Christas, Thanksgiving and Labor Day). It would also allow us to meet without financials that were nearly a month out of date. After reviewing available days of the week for the Community Building and the CAM Team representative, it was decided to keep our meetings on the 4th Tuesday of each month.

#### **Future Meetings**

We continue to meet on the 4th Tuesday of each month. Our next board meeting will be held June 24, 2025 at 6:30 PM in the Community Center.

#### **GATEHOUSE SUMMARY REPORT** FOR APRIL 2025

Total Guests admitted in April was 20,184 an increase of 1,065 from April, 2025. There were no incident reports. Committee members are working with the Gate staff to make improvements to the monthly summary report.

# **OLD BUSINESS:**

#### **Update on Repairs & Maintenance** at Gatehouse

• Atlantic Homes is preparing a bid for ceiling removal and repair. This work was not included in the original bid.

• IAS has begun work on the camera installation and conduit work.

• Once the ceiling tile is removed, Kintesh Patel will work with T&M Electric to address non-camera related electrical and wiring issues. We will need to get a price for providing power for the new rack that will be installed near the bathroom door and additional receptacles will need to be installed

#### **Malfunctioning Barcodes**

We are gathering data on residents with malfunctioning barcodes and how to get them to purchase a new one. It was suggested that a letter be prepared that can be sent by the management companies notifying the residents that they are

violating the gate entry policy. There was discussion of establishing a Board approved policy to fine a resident who fails to update the barcode and continues to cause problems in the barcode lane.

#### **Owners with High Visitor**

Entries-options to reduce? The committee approved allowing frequent visitors to Spencer Farm because they are boarding a horse there be allowed to purchase a barcode. The motion was made by Kathy Marko and seconded by Brian Rogers.

#### **Discussion of Barcode System**

It was noted that the current barcode system operates totally separately from the Gatekey System. It was suggested that other options be explored.

There was a gate incident on May 10, 2025 in which a flower delivery truck damaged visitor lane gate. Resident, Jerry Deans, was able to reinstall the gate but the LED lights were damaged. The delivery company will be billed for a LED strip replacement.

On May 16, 2025 an East Coast Sod truck damaged the overhead canopy. The company has offered to pay for the repairs. Atlantic Homes is the company that will be doing the internal and external repair

work to the gatehouse. They will provide an estimate for the repairs to the overhead canopy and add it to the work they have already provided an estimate for.
