Ethics Commission fines VanZant's \$2,250 for improper financial disclosures

HEIGHTS – A Florida Ethics Commission investigation has ended in an order that former State Rep.e Charles Van Zant Sr. (R-19)

and his wife Katherine pay \$2,250 in fines for failure to disclose closely-held businesses, homes and bank accounts in financial forms for the last four years.

The Ethics Commission will hold a final action hearing Jan. 27, the culmination of a five-month investigation. According to Ethics Commission docu-

ments, Charles Van Zant, who served in the Florida House of Representatives

for eight years, failed to disclose bank accounts and businesses on disclosure forms since 2013, including an engineering firm.

The omissions accounted for a net worth discrepancy of between \$10,000 and \$50,000 as his net worth climbed each year, and although Van Zant amend-

Butcher, baker, candlestick maker Candlemaking project teaches students business and more

LAKE ASBURY – Laurie Corcoran's classroom at Lake Asbury Elementary resembles a bustling workshop.

Some students are painting glasses, some are pouring hot wax into containers, some are hammering crimps out of old candles, some are making wicks, others practice selling. Everyone has something to do.

In a roomy mobile unit, Corcoran oversees students making candles from donated glass and old candles. The class consists of 17 elementary students from three different classes, two students from Lake Asbury Jr. High, and two from Ridgeview High. They use the money to fund field trips to Seaworld, St. Augustine or host class parties. Corcoran said the project has a practical value to the

student that mundane assignments can't provide.

Candlemaking works for several different kinds of students because of the variety of work. There's physical tasks such as cutting wicks and pouring wax. Candlemaking allows students to be artistic when they decorate the glass and wrap the candles. Then there's the entrepreneurial side with people skills, that crop up when students sell the candles and manage money.

"The students work to their strengths whether it be wrapping, selling, something artistic, or pouring," Corcoran said, "It's so different than the traditional paper-pencil task and life skills are not something you cannot get in the classroom, so we're SEE CANDLE, 10

1890s killing freezes cured "Orange Fever" in Clay County

It was nearly Christmas in 1894 before Clay County residents experienced their first cold weather and it was a doozy. A hard freeze slipped in and ruined most of the fruit but the trees seemed fine and unseasonably warmer temperatures returned.

Most settlers breathed a sigh of relief, cleaned up the rotten fruit and even bragged a bit when new growth began to appear. Orange growing was the main occupation of many settlers and their primary sometimes only source of income.

The timber and turpentine industry and the hospitality industry were also thriving but tourists went home once the fierce northern winters ended and making a living from the woods was only for the very hardy.

Most of the settlers were new themselves and had no memory of the freeze 10 years before when temperatures reached 15 degrees and tropical fish, imported to impress in fancy hotels and the new-rich middle class, froze solid in their ornate shallow ponds.

Fewer still, only a handful of pioneers, remembered the 1835 freeze when thermometers dropped from 70 to 7 degrees in hours. One old-timer along Black Creek claimed he heard the mercury fall and went out on the porch to see what the thump was. There he listened to the creaking and cracking death of his orange trees.

On January 8, 1995, a chatty goings and doings column in The Florida Times-Union described groves as looking burned with black leaves and shriveled fruit still clinging and quoted W.E. Parmenter who predicted that severe pruning would be required but the trees appeared to have been saved.

Everyone breathed a sigh of relief and went about cautiously enjoying the benefits of the unusual cold spell. The Westcott family invited friends to ice skating parties in the frozen shallows on the banks of their St. Johns Riverfront home. Merchants and professionals, less immediately affected by the freeze than farmers, complained about the cost for plumbers to repair broken pipes.

Mrs. Eldridge, hostess for the New Year's party of the Orange Park Social Club, complained at the lack of oysters for her event – they had been frozen in their beds. Elite society of the times considered an opening course of oysters a requirement for a successful celebration. W.E. Parmenter was proud of his newly-finished hennery (chicken coop).

The cold weather generated a miniature crime wave in Orange Park with the appearance of sneak thieves and chicken snatchers. Mrs. Crocker had a load of wash stolen from her clothes line one night.



Farmers co-op building in Orange Park – built and maintained by area farmers – provided communal space for packing and shipping crops conveniently adjacent to the train station. A refrigeration system for strawberries built by Harry Horton was also available.

By February, most of the mess was cleaned up and folks were adjusting to the losses and then it happened again. Another hard freeze descended and this one sounded the death knell for the citrus industry in Clay County. Branches of trees that stretched 10 to 15 feet in the air were split to the ground destroying the original grafts at the base.

Successful farmers in Clay County were

more sophisticated than 10 years before. They employed scientific methods of agriculture, diversified crops and formed cooperatives to share costs of packing and shipping. But... oranges were still their main cash crop and recovery was slow.

Others who had put all their hopes and assets into the golden money trees were destitute and forced to simply leave and return home to the charity of family.

Daniels proposes inmate re-entry center

FLEMING ISLAND – Sheriff Darryl Daniels, who was elected last year and sworn in on Jan. 2, called for the formation of a center in Clay County to help prisoners transition into daily life when they are released from incarceration.

Daniels made the statements at a townhall forum on Sunday at the Town Hall Event Center on Fleming Island. He was among several elected officials at the event – including Diane Hutchings, vice chair of the Clay County Commission and Orange Park Councilwoman Connie Thomas.

"In my former employment (Duval County), the Jacksonville re-entry center

was one of the departments that reported to me, which many people don't know," Daniels told Clay Today. "One of the things I want to do is have a re-entry center, in some form or fashion, here in Clay County.

"One of the things in Duval is that the re-entry center caters to people who have served state time, coming out of state prison. That's good, but in Clay County, we don't have a bunch of people coming from the state prison system back to our county. What we do have are a lot of county-sentenced individuals who are in my care. And once they complete their sentences, they just get thrown back into the same environments they came from."

Nicole Porter, a civil rights activist who has received national attention for her

work, was the featured speaker at Sunday's event, which drew Clay County leaders from various sectors as well as simply concerned citizens.

"Rather than focusing on jail cells, practical solutions to these issues should include therapeutic interventions for atrisk youth and their families, with the support of faith leaders and law-enforcement officers," Porter said. "We need work programs. ... Deep racial disparities exist throughout the criminal-justice system, from the point of arrest to the point of incarceration to the point of post-incarceration, including voting and employment."

African Americans are incarcerated at

Jan. 20, 2017: A day that will live in infamy

When a family member or another loved one dies of natural causes, we understand that death is the price we pay for life. We must accept it and count on memories to console us.

But how do you grieve for your nation? How do you move beyond the death of everything you held sacred about the land of your birth? Whose uniform you wore proudly? Whose virtues you have tried to teach to your chil-

dren and to anyone else who would listen? When you know that the tragedy owes not to an act of God but to the malice of a man and so many of his supporters? How can you accept this? How can you rationalize it?

For me, Jan. 20 will be the saddest day ever. I don't think I'm alone in that regard.

Donald Trump is the most undeserving, unqualified and untrustworthy person ever to seek the presidency, let alone obtain it. He is a clear and present danger to our principles, our economy, our self-respect and our national security.

No one has put that better than J. M. "Mac" Stipanovich, a trusted adviser to two Florida Republican governors, expressed it in a Facebook post earlier this month.

"Ignorant, unprincipled and amoral," he wrote. That was in reply to a friend who had wearied of "my constant carping" against Trump and had challenged him to state his three "foremost objections" to Trump's presidency.

There's no need to try to summarize here the vast evidence of Trump's unprincipled amorality. Everyone is aware of it, although only some care. In a world bristling with economic rivalries and nucleararmed powers, Trump's ignorance is the greater danger than what he might steal.

"I am concerned," Stipanovich explained, "about what Donald Trump does not know, the fact that he does not know what he does not know and will not listen to those who do know."

Some Republicans, perhaps most, may relish what Trump will let the Congress do to the Affordable Care Act and to Medicare and Social Security despite his transparently worthless promises to protect them. Some will rejoice in the destruction of the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau and the Environmental Protection Agency, and in the neutering of the Securities and Exchange Commission.

But my hope is that there are still members of both parties who understand that character — defined as integrity, trustworthiness, fidelity to principle and fundamental decency — is what America has

The Green Cove Springs City Council recently renewed the contract of City Manag-

er Danielle Judd and awarded her a salary increase (which includes changes to pension contributions and car and phone allowances) from \$113,988 to \$124,727.

According to the Ballotpedia.org website, Judd now

makes more than the governors of the following 19 states.

Alabama, \$119,500 Arizona, \$95,000 Arkansas, \$86,890 Colorado, \$90,000 Idaho, \$119,000 Indiana, \$111,688 Kansas, \$99,636 Maine. \$70.000 Minnesota, \$119,850 Mississippi, \$122,160 Montana, \$108,167 Nebraska, \$105,000 New Hampshire, \$121,896 New Mexico, \$110,000 North Dakota, \$121.679 Oregon, \$98,600 South Carolina, \$106,078 South Dakota, \$104,002 Wyoming, \$105,000

Granted the comparison may be flawed because the governors' salaries might be augmented by perks not mentioned here. But even if Maine Gov. Paul LaPage was fed a lobster omelet for breakfast, lobster salad for lunch and two steamed lobsters for dinner every day for an entire year, it would not bridge the gap between his \$70,000 paycheck and Judd's. Not even close.

Let's take a look at Maine: More than half the size of Florida, 1.3 million people, 15,000 state employees, \$8.3 billion state budget. Governor is civilian chief of Army and Air National Guard. Governor earns \$70,000. His wife works as a waitress. Now Green Cove: 5,400 people, a pool and a pier. Not even its own fire department. Manager earns \$124,727.

Not only is there a vast difference in scale between the two jobs, but also in stress. The governor of Maine, like the governors of many other states, has to deal with a fractious state legislature. By comparison, the Green Cove Springs City Council is robotic and perpetually unanimous when there's a vote.

Please note that this argument is not personal. Danielle Judd, as far as I can see, is doing a pretty good job. And Paul LaPage may well be the worst governor in the nation. It's about the position and what it's worth. Every flawed decision is based on a study, and defenders of the city will argue that studies have shown that Judd's pay is on a par with that of other Florida city managers.

And that just points to a bigger problem. Clearly, the people of Florida have been suckered into overpaying their managers (and maybe a few other categories of public servant, too). I don't know how or when this happened, but one need only look at the above pay list to know *that it did happen*. By comparison, private sector salaries around here are damnably low. What gives?

Once Judd moves on, as she reportedly intends to do in a year or so, the city should hit the reset button. Advertise nationally for city manager to be paid, say, \$75,000 a year. And if someone named Paul LaPage applies, don't hire him. Please don't.

• A 3-hour Clay County School Board workshop ended with growth data pointing to the need to build a new high school and two other schools. If constructed, the new high school would be "either north and west of Doctors Lake, or in the Fleming Island area."

CJ Acres offers farm animals new hope

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – Rolling down State Road 21, the turn onto Jones Creek Road is easy to miss.

It's a dirt road surrounded by lots of woods. When it has just rained, a truck or four-wheel drive vehicle might be necessary. On this particular day, the road was dry and dusty, almost like beach sand, which also made getting stuck a risk.

About a mile down Jones Creek Road are some fenced-in, large open fields for horses and grazing cattle. A barn and other buildings sit at the end of a long grass driveway, and there are gated areas for various other animals.

This is CJ Acres Animal Rescue Farm. Upon pulling into the driveway, a friendly, 800-pound pig comes up to the edge of his pen to say hello. A couple of horses stroll over and stick their heads out over a fence, requesting to be petted.

"We have some mustangs, a stallion, there's a quarter horse over there, and there's a donkey," Lee Sackett, director of CJ Acres, said as he pointed around the property.

Sackett, who owns an advertising company called Carpe DM, has a home on the premises. The Ohio native began CJ Acres - a nonprofit that relies entirely on volunteers – 19 years ago in North Carolina, and

then moved it here in 2003.

"We moved animals with us," he said. "They had already been abandoned once, so we didn't think it would be a good idea to leave them in North Carolina. So we brought everybody down here. And the farm continued to grow, in terms of acreage, volunteers and the number of animals."

CJ Acres focuses on farm animals, not domesticated pets. In addition to those already mentioned, animals currently on the grounds include sheep, goats, turkeys and ducks. The rescue farm takes in and adopts out animals that have been abused, abandoned, neglected or been victims of a catastrophic disaster.

"The joke around here is that I wanted a dog when I was little, and my mom said, "Well, you can't have a dog, but when you have your own place, you can have as many animals as you want," Sackett said. "That was the one time I guess I listened to her.

"I rescued dogs and cats from college on. I had never had an opportunity to work with larger animals, and I found that there was really more of a need for that. There are lots of shelters for dogs and cats, but if the pig got loose or somebody didn't want their cow anymore, there were very limited opportunities for those animals."

CJ Acres, despite not rescuing dogs, has a dog in its logo. That's because the rescue farm is named after the first dog Sackett ever had - a Chinese Shar-Pei named CJ. Many of the animals CJ Acres takes in are from the southeastern United States, but

the farm rescues animals from throughout North America, including Canada.

Its mission is to "rescue, rehabilitate, re-introduce [adopt] and re-train" animals in need.

"We always seek for animals to be adopted, which allows us room for more animals to come in," Sackett said, as a nearby rooster began singing "cock a doodle-doo" periodically. "One of our criteria is, if we rescued it and rehabilitated it, you can't have it for lunch."

CJ Acres receives all of its funding from private donations and ticketed tour events. In March, it will be holding "St. Piggy's Day," and every year in June it has a "Wine with the Swine" event. The rescue farm also offers free public tours at various times each year.

CJ Acres usually has 15-20 volunteers on weekends as well as a regular pool – or "herd" – of about 20 volunteers throughout the week.

"Being here has been very, very rewarding," said Tracy Wallace, a retail manager who lives in Jacksonville and has been volunteering here for a little more than a year. "I've always had a passion for rescuing animals, and I wanted to make a difference in the community. It's something I've wanted to ever since I was young."

ORANGE PARK – When the idea for Clay County's first entrepreneurial pitch event first surfaced, there was a shared headache between its creators whether there would be enough pitchers and enough community support behind them.

Now, with the event just days away, they're anxious too many entrepreneurs might show.

The 'Pitch in the Park,' festival for innovators and budding business owners kicks off at Town Hall Jan. 21. Created by entrepreneurs, for entrepreneurs, the event marks the culmination of years of planning between Bob Hawkinson, co-owner of TLC Total Lawn Care, Brian Knight, head of the software company Pragmatic Works and Bill Garrison, president of the Clay County Development Corp.

"The most exciting part of the event, honestly, is the fact that it's happening," Garrison said. "The fact that we've brought a group of entrepreneurs and business owners together who want to tell the story of entrepreneurship in Clay County is just incredible."

Pitchers will have two minutes to present their idea to the audience and a panel of judges. Each of the inventors will fight for the \$1,250 first prize and exposure for their idea. However, each inventor, whether they win or lose, will have the ability to connect with potential business partners.

"The folks that are going to be pitching, even if they don't win, it's going to be an absolutely amazing education opportunity just to stand up there and describe your product in short concise terms," Hawkinson said.

Innovators have two minutes to pitch their idea.

The judges and audience then spend two minutes asking questions about the idea. The festival will host 18 of the 24 entrepreneurs who applied.

The audience holds 40 percent of the judging opportunities. Audience members get three chips they can use three times to vote for the ideas they like the most. Officials will use a ballot box voting system. The rest of the judging opportunities go to the judges themselves.

Food trucks and live music will populate the festival as well.

Pitch in the Park doubles as a pseudonetworking event to jumpstart the ideas of innovators even further.

"It's funny, we have one of the widest



St. Johns, Suwannee River boards approve North Florida water supply plan

PALATKA – The governing boards of the St. Johns River and Suwannee River water management districts on Jan. 17 jointly approved a 20-year plan to protect the sustainability of water supplies and identify potential future water supply sources. Approval of the North Florida Regional Water Supply Plan completes a four-year public process and the first-ever joint planning effort between the two agencies and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

"This has been a great partnership that has culminated in a realistic plan that will



help guide us in our work to ensure sustainable water supplies in the region," said Ann Shortelle, executive director of the St. Johns River Water Management District. "This plan is not the end – it's a beginning."

'This plan serves as powerful roadmap for providing our communities with water conservation savings of almost 50 percent of the projected water supply need for 2035," said Noah Valenstein, executive director for the Suwannee River Water Management District. "Backed by the strength of our regulatory programs, which ensure no harm to our natural resources, this plan gives us the tools we need to seek funding and plan projects to accommodate growth while ensuring the protection of our water supply.

The approved plan is a result of collaboration between a multitude of stakeholders from a variety of groups, organizations and entities from both water management districts that have an interest in the region's water supply, including agriculture, commercial/power generation, environmental advocates, industrial/mining, local governments and public water suppliers.

"Collaboration and engagement with community stakeholders on the water supply plan represents a key strategic priority for PCS Phosphate – White Springs," said Terry Baker, senior director, Environmental and Mine Development for PCS Phosphate - White Springs and SAC member. "We are thankful for the rigor and planning completed by both districts to ensure water resources are available and sustainable for all users in the area."

The plan constitutes an evaluation of how much water is needed in the year 2035 and whether the traditional sources of fresh groundwater can meet the future water demand while protecting the water resources and related natural systems, such as springs and wetlands. Where traditional water sources are not adequate, the plan identifies more than 200 million gallons per day (mgd) of water conservation, water resource development and water supply development project options to meet the 2035 projected increase in demand of 117 mgd.

Health officials urging residents to get a flu shot

TALLAHASSEE - With flu season in full swing and influenza activity increasing across the state. Florida health officials say it is critical that all Floridians get the flu vaccine to protect against infection and help prevent the spread of seasonal flu to others. It is never too late to get your flu shot. While most cases of flu are mild, there are exceptions.

"Our continuing mission is to protect, promote and improve the health of all people in Clay County. Promoting flu vaccination is one of the ways that we promote and protect the health of individuals in Clay County," said Heather Huffman, Administrator and Health Officer for the Clay County office of the Florida Department of Health.

Huffman encourages every Clay County resident to take advantage of the benefits of getting the flu vaccine.

Flu activity is on the rise in Florida, particularly in groups at high risk for severe illness such as children, pregnant women, people with underlying chronic conditions and people over the age of 65. Visits to emergency departments for influ-



enza are also increasing in these high-risk groups

The annual flu vaccine is safe and is the most effective way to protect yourself and your loved ones. The flu vaccine is recommended for everyone six months and older, including pregnant women. It takes about two weeks after vaccination for your body to develop protection against the flu. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends people get injectable flu shots. Nasal spray vaccine is not recommended for this flu season because of concerns about its effectiveness.

It is also essential to practice good hygiene by properly and frequently washing your hands to help prevent the spread of seasonal flu. Make it a habit to clean and

varieties I would have ever expected," Knight said. "From a new kind of fishing mechanism to tech ideas to people who are trying to raise money to bring back the Green Cove Springs Clay Theatre, so we've got a mixture of all kinds."

Judges are experts in their fields, ranging anywhere from patent attorney, to serial entrepreneur. to entrepreneurial community leaders, such as Kate Stewart, co-founder and executive director of the nonprofit Jacksonville Center for Entrepreneurship.

Innovators will also receive the opportunity for mentorships from successful entrepreneurs as prize rewards.

"You have got to be able to talk about your products succinctly and quickly forever," Hawkinson said. "You need to know vour product in its truest forms.

Innovators and entrepreneurs will never stop pitching their ideas if they're exposing themselves to the public eye enough.

"You never really stop pitching," Hawkinson said.

For example, Hawkinson won the Most Innovative Business award during New York's 2015 'Think Beyond Plastic' event for his idea on a biodegradable mulch bag. Think Beyond Plastic is a global business and innovation accelerator with a focus on lowering plastic pollution worldwide.

In 2016, the event received 145 applications from 35 countries.

If Pitch in the Park receives enough attention in its inaugural year, the group hopes to continue the festival to create an annual experience for Clay County.

'We we want this to be a yearly festival," Knight said. "The goal this year is to plant the seed in the community."



ed these forms in September 2016 after the first complaint was filed in August, the commission still found that "the public was deprived of access to information" it is entitled to in the original forms.

Documents show Charles Van Zant also failed to disclose his ownership of a condominium at 218 Kettering Ct. in Orange Park.

In the Ethics Commission ruling, Charles Van Zant stated he did not read the form's instructions every year, which led to his omissions

Katherine Van Zant, meanwhile, faces a \$500 fine for failure to list the Kettering Court residence in disclosure forms submitted when she tried to reclaim her husband's seat after he was term limited out last year. Rep. Bobby Payne(R-19) of Palatka defeated Katherine Van Zant's bid in August Republican primaries by a 10 percent margin.

According to court documents. Katherine Van Zant said her husband filled out her disclosure documents for her.

The five-month investigation comes after complaints from Katherine's Republican opponent Leslie Dougher of Middleburg and Putnam County District 2 Commissioner Chip Laibl.

Laibl said the search started after Charles spurred a state investigation into Palatka and Putnam County finances, which he compared to Hampton's, a Bradford County town once labeled "the most corrupt city in America" over government fraud. Charles Van Zant was widely viewed as having a vendetta against the town of Hampton and its police chief.

'He said he saw smoke over Hampton and on his investigation found fire, and that the same thing would take place in Putnam County," Laibl said. "I decided to pretty much check Van Zant's house at that point - and I found fire.'

"I simply found seven properties that were not disclosed as well as four businesses that were not disclosed." said Dougher, a former chair of the Republican Party of Florida. "That's why the Ethics Commission is there, to make sure we hold our elected officials accountable to a high standard. They are representing us and we want to make sure they're held to a standard of disclosure and high ethics."

By Florida law, legislators must attend four hours of ethics training every year before the legislative session opens in March. The classes cover many topics relating to best ethical practices for constitutional officers, as well as how to fill out financial disclosure forms and the importance of them, according to Senator Rob Bradley (R-Fleming Island.)

"You can't say 'I didn't know how to do it," Bradley said, not referencing the Van Zant's ethics investigation. "It's a requirement of law."

This isn't the first time Charles has been investigated for fraud. In August, he paid \$8,716.28 in unpaid property taxes and interest levied by the Bradford County Property Appraiser after an investigation found the Van Zants had claimed a homestead exemption on a house in which they did not live.

The Van Zants listed the home at 127 SE 35th St. in Keystone Heights - the Bradford County side of the city – on their financial disclosure forms although the home remained vacant and falling into disrepair. The investigation found the Van Zants have been receiving a homestead exemption since 2008, the same year voters elected Van Zant to represent them in the House

In an August statement, Katherine vowed to appeal the property appraiser's decision at the county's Value Adjustment Board. The Van Zants dropped their appeal a month later, citing in a form they did not agree with the appraiser's decision, but no longer sought to appeal it.

a rate of approximately five times to that of whites nationwide, according to multiple studies.

"For me, personally, if we don't get behind (these issues), we're going to fall behind," said Ron Raymond, a white, retired business owner and manager. "We need to get rid of that box, that 'Check if you've been convicted of a crime' box. ... They already served their time.

"Part of the problem is white-haired guys like me don't hire people who have been in jail. In my factory, I had several folks who had been incarcerated. I had very good luck with some, not so much with others. But it didn't make any difference what their race was."

Florida's incarceration rates of blacks exceeds nationwide averages, according to Porter and several studies.

We have a problem with recidivism, and that's nationwide," Daniels said. "We need to introduce these inmates and former inmates to resources that aren't going to be the same paths they've already been down. They need to have options that aren't the same environments they came from, that led them to incarceration. ... You can't go back to the same environments and expect a different result."

One of the organizers of Sunday's event, which was to honor Rev. Martin Luther King Jr., was Rev. William H. Randall, pastor of St. Simon Missionary Baptist Church in Orange Park.

"Ex-felons who come out of prison. come out of jail, they may not have a place to live, they may not have job options," Randall said. "They need resources, so they don't fall back into old habits and reoffend. And that's a weight on taxpayers, when we're housing criminals who offend on a repeated basis.

"Some of these people come out of prison and they're immediately homeless.'

Orange Park Medical Center, Borszich quickly points out she wanted to help mothers who couldn't produce enough milk.

"It was just the right thing to do, I couldn't think of a better way to help somebody," Borszich said.

Andrew was born July 2016 and Borszich began producing more breast milk than she needed.

'My freezer was overflowing with breastmilk," Borszich said.

When Borszich reached out on social media, a friend recommended Orange Park Medical Center. She donated on Dec. 7, the first day the breastmilk donation center - and the first in the Jacksonville area – opened.

An Atlantic Beach resident, Borszich commutes 45 minutes to donate. Her first donation was 29 bags of breastmilk. She's donated 200 bags since December.

Nurse Donna Mason assists Borszich. Mason said the hospital receives a lot of calls from mother's worried about their milk supply. She said moms such as Borszich who have the extra breastmilk, have the ability and a huge opportunity to help babies in need.

"It's a fabulous gift. It's a very exciting and heady feeling to be the vessel that connects the moms to the milk bank," Mason said.

OMPC ships the milk to Coloradobased Mother's Milk Bank, a nonprofit program. Then it's pasteurized and distributed to the neediest babies in the country.

The screening involves a 10-minute phone call regarding the potential donor's general medical history. Then the milk bank pays for a blood screening.

So far, two mothers have donated but OMPC received 15 calls from mothers interested in the donation center after a radio story ran on a local news station.

OMPC currently doesn't use donor milk, but Suzanne Jones, director of Women and Children's Services, said OMPC is getting there.

"One of the goals for hospitals in the HCA South Atlantic division hospitals was to open a breast milk donation center," Jones said. "If you're already involved in the process of using milk, it's easier to get involved and use the donor milk in your own NICU."

Jones said she's hoping that OMPC can use locally-donated breastmilk by the end of year.

But to Borszich, her numerous donations represented one less thing families and their babies had to worry about.

"If I can just relieve the stress for these women, I feel like that's a job well done," Borszich said.

taking it on the road."

Corcoran's class set up booths at the Lake Asbury Elementary library, Asbury United Methodist Church, booth between the schools and the Hometown Holiday Festival at Clarke Park in December. Corcoran said the earnings from these booths was a little over \$500, well enough for the field trips.

"One of 10 kids, maybe two, would be able to pay the full amount," Corcoran said. "It's an expensive field trip."

While Corcoran said she's seen great support from the school concerning the project, she pays about \$500 for materials such as scents, glasses and bags. Corcoran expressed gratitude at the amount of glass and donated used candles she received.

A teacher for 30 years, this isn't the first time Corcoran has used a hands-on assignment to teach students about problem solving. Her previous classes have made clocks, birdhouses and Christmas ornaments out of recycled materials.

Allen Bauer, a 6th grader, and Jasien Cope, a 7th grader, liked how the repurposed candles helped the environment.

"It doesn't pollute the earth," Bauer said.

"It's teaching us how to recycle," Cope said.

"Learn how to use money in the real world, in the future if I'm a cashier I'll know how to give change back and all the teachers showed me how," said Aurora Danielle, an 11th grader.

Making the candles teaches students the importance of working in groups and relying on each other.

"If you don't do it [your job], it's still there, here if you don't do it the whole process is ruined."

"When people are purchasing the product, that's like the payoff," Corcoran said.



Municipal 'Super Tuesday' 2017 – more of an event, more of a deal

ORANGE PARK - Election season fatigue has begun to fade for Clay County voters as the months give way to municipal elections, which, since last year, have meant less hassle for the elections office and higher community buzz.

Clav County will hold its second countywide municipal 'Super Tuesday' election April 11, five months after a contentious election season and one year after Election Supervisor Chris Chambless campaigned

to align all municipal elections into one event.

All three municipalities have their current mayor's seat up for election. Meaning Green Cove Springs Mayor Pam Pamela Lewis, Keystone Heights Mayor Tony Brown and Orange Park Mayor Eugene Nix are up for re-election.

Also up for re-election are Green Cove Springs Vice-Mayor Mitch Timberlake and Orange Park Council member Steve Howard. All positions are three-year terms.

This election is the second year all municipal elections will fall on one 'Super Tuesday,' where voters in every municipality can vote in their district on the same days in what Chambless said makes for a smoother election system for both the elections office and municipalities from vears prior.

"Elections have become much more technical from 10 to 15 years ago - now they're very specific and require a great deal of a wide-ranging skillset and we're just better positioned to bring elections than the municipalities," Chambless said. "It's an additional duty or an aside for these municipalities. For us it's what we do, so we believe it takes a lot of pressure off these municipalities to conduct the number of these different processes"

The change loosens the burden on municipalities that previously had to allocate staff to the invisible yet time-consuming election season tasks of mailouts and provisional ballots, for example.

A more tangible effect of the changed system is it gives the municipal election season more teeth by making it more of an event for voters, thereby increasing turnout and community buy in.

"Rather than having multiple smaller elections than to have one larger election you could leverage that to garner more attention. Secondly was the idea that you would be able through consolidation to better administer the election process and that would reduce the overall cost,"

Chambless said.

The county saves money through ballot costs with the realignment as well as equipment fees, some of which were eliminated through election consolidation. However, it won't be until this year that Chambless can accurately identify exactly how much money is saved.

While qualifying for seats begins on Jan. 30, two candidates have already applied to fill the soon-to-be vacancies.

Ronald Raymond, a River Road Resident and former council member in 1989, has declared to run for Howard's seat, while Alan Watt, who lives on Birdwood Drive, will run to take incumbent mayor Eugene Nix's position on seat two.

Nix is running for re-election. Orange Park and Green Cove Springs council members select their mayors from current council members for a one year term, as opposed to other Clay municipalities who elect their mayor.

Orange Park's election this year is "hugely important because not only do we have council seats on the ballot, but three charter amendments," said Town Clerk Sarah Campbell. "So it's important for people to come out and vote for the candidates and the issues."

The three ballot measures will essentially align Orange Park's charter more

ORANGE PARK – There's something ancient brewing in Orange Park. John Harris' home off Milwaukee Avenue sits in a housing development studded with finely manicured lawns, birdbaths and a white

picket fence. At first, the structure blends into residential camouflage. Go out back, however, and the suburban façade drains away to sparkling machinery as Harris' \$60,000 mead brewery touches the pitched roof of his garage's ceiling.

Established in June 2016, Harris Meadery is the culmination of long talks with the town to convert his house's zoning to facilitate

Fresh Market back on track

FLEMING ISLAND – O'Connor Development Corp. has reached an agreement with The Fresh Market to begin interior build-out of its store on Fleming Island. The store is located on County Road 220 & East West Parkway at the Island Walk North Shopping Center in front of Kohl's.

Completion is scheduled for April with a store opening date of May 17, 2017.

After being announced in 2015, the Fleming Island store got delayed when private equity firm Apollo Global Management of New York City purchased The Fresh Market for \$1.36 billion.

Shortly after the purchase, Apollo began some belt tightening, which included closing 13 stores in four states, while other Fresh Markets under construction at the time of purchase, were paused.

Other tenants at the Island Walk North Shopping Center are open and have received warm welcomes from the community include Maple Street Biscuit, Arlette's Place, Williams Jewelry, Woof Gang Bakery, Exit Realty, Huntington Learning Center, Sola Salon, Jimmy John's and Pure Barre. The Loop, which is currently under construction, plans to open in March.

an operational brewery for mead, essentially the alcoholic intermediary between craft beer and wine made from fermented honey.

"It's the world's oldest fermentable beverage," Harris said. "It's over 8,000 years old – any culture that has contact with honey and beekeeping has naturally discovered mead all on their own."

He jokingly theorizes that civilization first discovered mead when they discovered drunk bears. Still, mead is an alcoholic beverage and the town's agreement with Harris came with a caveat – do not sell alcohol on site.

Despite the challenges, with bare bones equipment, Harris Meadery currently distributes its flagship meads to roughly 60 different vendors between Clay, Duval County and Georgia.

"We were more nervous about how we were going to be received in the marketplace, but now that most people really do seem to enjoy the mead and our sales are up, that's very fortunate for us," said Harris, who runs the business from home with his wife Melissa.

"We thought we would be in about 20 different vendors by this time, and we're closer to 50, coming up on 60...so we've been quite happy."

Happy enough, in fact, that Harris said he intends to review his revenue after his first year in business and within two years, if all goes well, move up to a larger facility. He said he will use the first year to pay off the \$60,000 investment they injected into buying their equipment and building the garage in the first place. However, he said he got off rather lucky considering a normal brewery can cost anywhere from \$750,000 to \$1.25 million to jumpstart.

He hopes to stay in Orange Park, "and I'm sure Orange Park would also like us to stay," he said.



Every batch starts with locally brewed honey. It takes 1,200 pounds of it to complete one batch. John Harris began the legwork of his Harris Meadery three years ago with the idea of being Orange Park's first mead maker.

He is currently looking into a freestanding warehouse located near the corner of U.S. Highway 17 and Milwaukee Avenue formerly owned by the current owner of Cheers bar on U.S. 17. Harris said if he is able to relocate to a larger facility, he hopes to open a tap room to give residents a chance to taste his mead first hand.

Some of the nervousness of his first months in business and the months prior is fading away as his business grows.

"It's one thing to be a decent brewer, it's another thing to get out into the marketplace itself and go to these events and press palms and make contacts and make friends, so that's been a lot of the learning curve for me," Harris said.

Just as his business is scalable, so are mead batches. And businesses have a beginning just like any good brew, he said.

"I started home brewing in college because I couldn't afford the high price of Milwaukee's best," he said.

Harris started brewing meads in early 2001, but admitted that every mead mak-

er's first few essentially turn into "rocket fuel."

Mead is really a cross over drink. It has characteristics from both craft beer and wine, and can be sweet, semi-dry or dry. Traditional mead is brewed with honey, water and yeast. Harris said the artistry comes in with what kind of yeast to use with what adjunct ingredients the brewer includes with the brew.

Harris specializes in meads with added spices, fruits or juices. His chief flavor is a key lime pie mead along with a cherry raspberry and black currant mead. He also makes limited small brews of seasonal fruits, but admits essentially when they're gone, they're gone. For instance, The Teaches, his peach mead, sold out almost instantaneously. It takes anywhere from 14 days to two and a half months to fully finish a brew.

"As soon as our product is available... we're pretty much selling 100 percent of what we package, which is what I was hoping for [when we first opened.]" CLAYTODAYONLINE.COM

This may be due to a recent uptick in the popularity of mead. The American Mead Makers Association found an 85 percent growth in last year, while craft beer grew at a steady 13 percent.

"People are branching out. They're not afraid to try new things," Harris said. "People see it, it's getting out of that renaissance fair and more mainstream, we're seeing it as the next evolution in craft beverages, right now the big internationals are looking at cyber markets Angry Orchard, which is owned by [Samuel] Adams [Brewery], that's the market they're trying to tap into, cideries."

The fantasy television series Game of Thrones, Harris said with a laugh, often offers free marketing due to the sheer frequency that the characters drink mead.

Harris starts a pilot batch to try out new flavor combinations. He's currently working on a pineapple mead and has just finished a semi-dry blueberry mead special for the Georgia market.

Just like his pilot batches, Harris also had a pilot trial of professionally brewing his batches at Pinglehead Brewing Company, located in the Brewers Pizza restaurant and bar located on Blanding Boulevard.

"He and I did a collaboration together that enabled his product to be served under my license technically," said Steve Halford, co-owner of Pinglehead Brewing Company. "I've known John for a log time he's been a good friend and a good resource being that he has a wealth of home brewing knowledge and I've been able to rely on him for years."

"I've always kind of known for years that if he got the ball rolling that he would be successful in any aspect. We're glad to have him here, and he'll be on permanent tap here," Halford said.

As a another testament to mead's popularity, Green Cove Springs native Ed Stansel Jr. opened The Mazer last June at 1512 King St. in Jacksonville. A homebrewer for years, Stansel offers honey meads and ciders at the pub.



Town gets first tangible peek at Kingsley East upgrade

ORANGE PARK – Eight years of deliberation over the inevitable fate of the Kingsley East Roadway project is closer to reality.

Engineers and landscape architects tasked with designing the Town of Orange Park's most historical road – often referred to as the gateway to the St. Johns River – presented preliminary plans to the Town Council Tuesday. After briefly deliberating about minor errors and difficulties in the plans, the council allowed the plans to move forward from 60 to 90 percent completion.

Between the two intersection cross walks and midblock intersections between U.S. Highway 17 and Reed Street and Astor Street, and River Road, the architects have quite a bit planned.

The \$802,000 facelift includes sidewalks on both sides of the road, angled parking along the road, new curbs and gutters, storm water improvements and the installation of a curbed median. The preliminary plans include native and adapted plant species designed to provide color, historical value and low maintenance, while bricked crosswalks and proposed pedestrian level lights will give the road a sense of "arrival."

"When you're driving down there right now, it's very uninviting," said Brett Kuzoian, landscape architect with St. Augustinebased Castle Bay Design Studio. "It doesn't say hey, I've arrived I think that's what we wanted to give the street, a sense of arrival, when you turn down Kingsley you're in a different area it's a different experience this is something special. We wanted to open up Kingsley and kind of bring out the full potential it has. It's got a river view



– a historic feel."

Kuzoian hopes to remove clutter in the current Kingsley East Park. This includes roughly six arrow signs and moving the power lines underground to give a better view of the water.

``I think this will be a prescription for future projects, I think if it's done cor-

rectly...the Kingsley Avenue roadway project could be the prescription for how streetscapes are done in the future moving forward for the Town of Orange Park," Kuzoian said. "I think it's kind of a landmark project."

Designers hope to finish the preliminary designs and send the project out to bid be-

fore the end of February. Between now and then, the designers will include the design for the raised bulkhead sitting at the end of the three-block road. The bulkhead will lay level with the park, replacing the eight-foot drop, which has been notorious for catch-

care providers, diagnostic and imaging facilities, a surgery center and a public health component.

"St Vincent's Clay, which opened in 2013 and recently completed a \$35 million expansion and the future Brooks Rehabilitation Campus, have already created a mini medical city in this area, so it is only natural to continue with the medical provider growth in this area." Kiddy is a partner in Branan Field Village LLC, which bought up the property here. His company bought this land for \$1.8 million, based on published documents.

St. Vincent's Medical Center recently did a \$33-million expansion in this nook of Clay County. Amazon is also coming to this area.

"The First Coast Expressway is fueling the growth along this corridor, which will eventually connect I-10 to I-95 thru western Duval and Clay counties, cross the St Johns River and connect to I-95 through

"The first segment from I-10 to Blanding Boulevard will open early this year, and the next segment from Blanding to the river is funded and will commence construction in 2018."

The new development, when it is completed, will be named "Branan Field Village." It will include 600 apartments, four hotels, restaurants, retail stores and medical offices.

The time-frame is approximately two years.

St. Vincent's was a driving force behind the development. No one from St. Vincent's returned calls from Clay Today by a Wednesday publication deadline.

The development plan for Branan Field Village will require new roads and greenspaces.

St. Vincent's, according to reports, was looking for partners in its expansion. The hospital company wanted shopping, food options and hotels to surround its new venture in Clay County.

The First Coast Expressway – a longterm highway project – is a publicly funded toll road that will traverse Clay, Duval and St. Johns counties using SunPass to handle toll payments.

The greater Jacksonville area has been besieged by traffic problems in recent years. Also, according to several national articles, Jacksonville was the second-most moved-to city in 2015, so population in the region is growing.

"Amazon is under development with a million-dollar fulfillment facility," Kiddy said. "Residential building permits in Oakleaf and southwest Clay are on the rise with much more to come.

"All of these factors were reasons to invest. We saw no better opportunity in Florida where a property was so uniquely positioned where it would continue to grow in value because of the construction of the FCE and the future residential and commercial demand it will produce."

You may have lived through a terrible childhood. Perhaps you have genetic challenges that you battle. Your obstacles may be physical, mental or spiritual.

This is true: We all have obstacles of some kind that we must deal with in our lives. These challenges can fuel us to victory or cause our ultimate defeat. The way we respond to these obstacles will determine our success or failure.

closely with state standards by editing run off provision dates, authorizing the elections office to handle candidate qualifying and adoption of the Florida election code.

Keystone Heights Mayor Tony Brown, who has served roles in the city since the

early 90s, announced he would run for re-election after an intense outpour of public support after he previously said he would retire.

"His reasons for deciding to seek reelection was because of the outpour from the community," said City Clerk Lynn Rutkowski. "It's up to them to keep him in his spot...he decided he owed it to the people." Green Cove Springs officials hope, however, that there will be an election this year considering last year's three competing seats all ran unopposed. The lack of election meant charter amendments to clarify canvassing board language and loosen laws relating to how and when an elected official is declared winner by the elections supervisor went neglected.

Food pantry making dent for decades

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – At the beginning of each month, Lake Area Ministries on Northeast Commercial Circle, just across from the Post Office, is packed.

Standing room only.

Since 1989, Lake Area Ministries has become a staple of the Lake Region for low-income people in need of food. Early in the month is usually a busy time.

"We have received tremendous support from the community with private donations of money and food, church donations, business donations, and donations of food from Harvey's Supermarket in Melrose," co-director Chip Wester said. "We have a large number of people who give to us regularly."

The organization describes itself as a "faith-based, non-denominational" non-profit that serves as a food pantry. Though based in Keystone Heights, it serves areas throughout Clay, Bradford, Putnam and Alachua counties.

"About 80 percent of the people we

serve are in Clay County," said Wester, who, along with co-director Paula Buckner, oversees day-to-day operations.

Lake Area Ministries serves nearly 450 families and has an annual budget of approximately \$100,000.

People who receive food from the nonprofit must meet certain income requirements and fill out paperwork on their first visit. For instance, a family of three that makes \$26,208 per year or less is eligible.

Any individuals or families who are part of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, Temporary Assistance to Needy Families, Supplemental Security Income or Medicaid are automatically eligible.

"Sometimes I'm asked, 'Aren't you worried about people committing fraud and getting food when they can afford to buy their own?" Wester said. "My response has always been that, yes, I'm sure some people try to take advantage, but if I'm going to err, I'd rather err on the side of helping people."

Among the regular items people can get at Lake Area Ministries are peanut butter,

pasta, canned vegetables, bread, limited meats, soup and laundry soap.

"Other items vary a lot," Wester said. We don't get to choose what we receive."

Lake Area Ministries – which has multiple rooms filled with shelves and pallets of food, as well as a room filled with large refrigerators of food – relies solely on volunteers, many of whom hail from 22 area churches.

Jan Hastings happened to be one of the volunteers here on this particular day. She was recording food donations and helping people check in at the front desk. Lake Area Ministries had just received a large shipment of matzo from Passover. "I enjoy helping out here," she said. "This is a wonderful organization and they do such a great job."

Other food assistance for Lake Area Ministries comes from the USDA as well as other nonprofits – including Waste Not Want Not in Orange Park, which provides bread and occasional desserts.

"As a country, we throw away a quarter of all the food we produce, and we try to rescue that food which is still good and give it to people and organizations who can use it," said Sandra Staudt-Killea, executive director of Waste Not Want Not. "One

in six Floridians suffers from food insecurity, meaning they don't always know where their next meal is coming from, so we're trying to make an impact in that regard."

Waste Not Want Not gets the bulk of its food from area businesses, where volunteers go to pick it up 363 days per year. They make 149 scheduled rescues per week and collect an average of 4,750 pounds of food per day.

Last year, the organization provided t

nearly 2 million pounds of food to 130,000plus charities in 10 counties. Every Saturday, volunteers from Lake Area Ministries drive up to the Waste Not Want Not headquarters on Carnes Street to load up their van.

"Waste Not Want Not has been extremely supportive," Wester said. "There are a lot of people in this region who donate and who lend their time. We have a lot of people who really care."

Time to transplant

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Do vou ever look out into your yard and realize that some trees or shrubs you really like but wish they were somewhere else? Whether it is with a plant that grew from seed, got bigger than you anticipated, or is just not doing well where you planted it originally, transplanting can be an option to save the plant and place it in a better spot if done properly.

One thing to always remember with transplanting is that it will stress the tree

and it is hard to keep a 100 percent success rate. Whenever you dig up a plant for transplanting, you are cutting off many of its feeder roots and the tree or shrub will most likely be at a higher risk of death than it would have been if left alone.

With that said, try to always subscribe to "Right Plant, Right Place" in deciding what plants will work best in the spaces around your home and garden so that you will not have to move it in the future.

It is also worth noting that some species of plants simply do not respond well to having their roots damaged and being moved and that some in your landscape may be too large to handle. An arborist who is certified by the International Society of Arboriculture can be a good resource if you are unsure of whether a plant can be moved or are looking to hire a service to complete the work for you.


If you do need to transplant the specimen, timing can be everything. The cooler months in fall through winter, are often the best time to transplant when growth slows or goes dormant. This is due to the tree not losing as much water through their leaves this time of the year and the plant will not dry up as quickly as it would in the heat of the summer. This timing does vary based on the plant so it can helpful to check with your local UF/IFAS Extension Office for advice

When transplanting, there are two main options, transplanting a root ball or using a plant with bare roots. Cutting a root ball, which is often known as ball and burlap, is often the best choice for many plants as it will retain roots and soils together, hopefully stopping the plant from drying out. With bare root, you would dig up the roots of the tree without regard of keeping soil together. This can make the plant lighter and easier to move but may not be as successful

With both options, root pruning is recommended for specimens, which is the process of cutting a circular area around the tree with a spade around six months before you plan to move the plant. This will cause the roots of the tree to stay in a small area, leading to more roots near the main plant during transplanting. This cut is usually the same area as the eventual root ball and will depend on the size of the tree being moved. The bigger the root ball, the better but exact specifications for diameter and depth are available from your local UF/IFAS Extension Office.

When you are ready to dig, you would dig out and around about twice the size of the area that is air pruned and dig downward at an angle towards the eventual root ball. You would clear out the soil around your future root ball until the ball is deep enough and then you can cut underneath to sever the rest of the roots. In our area, the soil is often sandy so it can be difficult to form a nice root ball that will hold. Many people will then wrap this soil ball with burlap to keep it from falling apart during transport.

When moving the tree, you should have a hole of the proper depth, dug around two times the size of the root ball of the tree being transplanted. Place the tree in the center of the hole and orient it the way you like best along with making sure it will grow straight vertically in the future. Also make sure the area where the tree or shrub had previously met the ground is even or slightly above the level of surrounding ground. It is also best to mix com-



posted manure or organic matter in with the soil you dug from the new hole and then you can fill around the tree when ready.

Digging and planting a bare root tree is very similar to one where you dig a soil ball except you do not attempt to save soil around the roots. You will still need a good amount of roots for the tree's survival however. When planting the bare root tree, leave a small mound of soil in the middle of the new hole and spread the bare roots around it. Make sure the crown of the tree or shrub, which is the point where the roots meet the trunk is at or slightly above ground level. If you bury the crown, the tree is likely to have issues going forward.

Following digging, transplants can also be transported to another property or location but this can be stressful for the plant. Make sure to tarp or cover the foliage if it is moved in a vehicle and try to not drop or damage the root ball. If a good root ball was maintained and wrapped in burlap, trees and shrubs can also be kept out of the ground for a period of time. This can actually help the success rate of transplanting as it gives the plant a chance to grow some new roots before it gets placed

in the new location.

Following planting, transplants need watering frequently, usually a couple of times per week, for the first few months of establishment. Allow the plant to get a lot of water but also to drv out some between applications. Larger transplants will require watering for a longer period of time. Mulching around the tree will also help hold moisture in the soil and can help with establishment.

Slow-release fertilizer can be applied to newly-planted trees as recommended on the label but soluble fertilizers should be avoided as they can burn the roots. Over time as the plant begins to grow new roots, it will require less and less work.







PONTE VEDRA – Tallahassee Leon came into Fleming Island on the historically spooky Friday the 13th and gave the Golden Eagles soccer team a little Freddie Krueger with the first loss of the season, a 3-1 match on a full moon night in Clay County.

"Sometimes you just don't get a break," said Fleming Island coach Frank Pontore, after the Leon game. "They couldn't score, they couldn't finish; this is the first night we couldn't finish all year long. We could see them again in the regions. That'd be nice. A little redemption and maybe we'll play a little better."

The loss comes on the heels of a weeklong gauntlet; Bolles, Ponte Vedra, Leon, that Fleming Island coach Frank Pontore hoped would season his boys for a soon-tobe-here rugged district 4-4A championship tournament.

On Wed., Jan. 11, Fleming Island High's boys soccer team with a second half barrage of shots on goal, thwarted a pesky Ponte Vedra High team to the tune of a 3-0 non-district win Wednesday (Jan. 11) at Ponte Vedra High School. Ponte Vedra (12-2-3) is the defending 3A champions.

"If you think, we had that lull in the first half against a state champion team and persevered to win, that's a good thing," said Pontore. "In my opinion, we have the toughest district and we just have to keep getting better."

On Fri., Dec. 13, the Golden Eagles scored first against Leon with Reid Davis coining up the blast at the 20 minute mark, but that was it for the Fleming Island scoring.

Leon is now the lead team in district 2-4A ahead of Columbia High (16-2-2), also a recent victim of the Fleming Island barrage-laden attack, and should be a likely region opponent for Pontore.

Tied 1-1 at the halftime break, Fleming Island had a shot for a second goal in the second half, but Murphy's penalty kick went directly to the Leon goalie with Leon scoring just 30 seconds later.

Fleming Island, now at 16-1-2 and the 2012 4A state champion with Cameron Mc-Curry's header in double overtime the final play, has Final Four appearances in 2014 (lost 4-1 in state final to Melbourne) and 2011 (lost in state semifinal to St. Thomas Aquinas). The Golden Eagles hiccuped the last year with Atlantic Coast knocking the Golden Eagles out of the region semifinals with a 3-2 penalty kick win in 2016 with Ocala Forest beating the Golden Eagles in 2015 and 2013, both in region semifinal rounds.

Against Ponte Vedra, the Golden Eagles appeared a step out of sorts in the first half with main strikers Reid Davis, Marcus Murphy and Mark Suhrer all making deep corner runs toward the Shark goal line, but neither being able to capitalize in front of the net.

"I think we got some opportunities in the first half but didn't finish them," said Pontore. "Everything looked like we are about a step off the pace of the game."

Top scorer Reid Davis, who made numerous early runs through the center of the Ponte Vedra defense, but had shots hitting the crossbar four times and shots narrowly missing the net three times, finally found the mark just after the second half water break at 20:00 on a breakaway against the now-gassed out Shark defense. After Davis' goal, the Golden Eagles went into a Shark frenzy and responded with more blitzkrieg-style attacks with Murphy,

"We just have to get in our groove and then things started falling our way," said Davis. "We trust the defense, we'll get the chances and we'll score."

Against Bolles, on a blustery, cold night in Jacksonville, Bolles scored first off a quick strike in the first two minutes with Zermeno not in goal, but Fleming Island woke up with Davis finding Murphy after a deflection to tie the game 1-1 just a minute later.

Six minutes later, defender Andrew Labelle fed Reid who found Murphy on another run through the center of the Bulldog defense to up the score 2-1 at 32 minutes.

Reid would score in the second half off a throw-in from Hastings to put the score at 4-1.

Oakleaf, on the other hand, has had about half as many games as Fleming Island with coach Carlos Celis hoping that the clips between games will be fruitful to the Knights district tournament hopes.

"Many of the kids play club ball and travel around the country a lot," said Celis. "I'm hoping that what we may lose in teamwork and morale will be replaced with excitement and fully rested bodies by district time. We will see."

Celis, who owns a much-coveted 3-0 win over Ponte Vedra High as does Fleming Island, saw that game as an early indication that the Knights were capable of explosive play if needed.

"That game was a big one for us, but it was in November and a lot of time has come for all the teams in the area," said Celis, who has just a 1-0 loss to Creekside and a 2-0 loss to Fleming Island in district play, plus a 2-2 tie with Nease. "We can use that one win as a motivator that we are capable and that might be enough to turn the trick against one of the district teams. We've been in all three of those games except for one or two plays."

Oakleaf, with a gap from December 12 through January 5 with go games, has its final two games are against winless Clay on Jan. 13 and 3A-Paxon (9-4) on Jan. 19.

MIDDLEBURG – As arguably one of the most prolific scorers in Clay County girls basketball; in the same ranks as Alicia Gladden at Orange Park (FSU), Mariah Masalin at Clay (Wofford) and even Keystone Heights school record holder Monique Cardenas (Florida), Middleburg High's Hannah Roney signed off on an athletic scholarship to continue her playing days at Belmont-Abbey College in North Carolina.

Belmont Abbey, an NCAA Division II school in the Conference Carolinas, finished with a 8-21 win/loss record last year, 7-15 in conference play.

"The greatest moment was a gamewinner I hit in a district playoff game against Columbia with no time left on the clock right here in the Middleburg gym," said Roney, who has been joined by younger sister Mallory the past two years. "She always has a smile, works harder than anyone and makes the players around her great," said Prewitt. "She came to me and we had her primarily as a defensive specialist but she evolved into one of our best attackers at the net."

According to Broncos' coach Michael Hayward; four years on the Bronco bench, two years as head coach, Roney is within a whisker of achieving a much-coveted 2,000 points scored in a varsity career. Roney, a shooting guard for the Broncos since her freshman year, punched up an area-leading 26 points per game in her junior year to push the needle closer to that 2,000 points.

"When she came here as a freshman after shooting the lights out at Lakeside," said Hayward. "She started, was a captain, averaged 15 points and scored near 370 points. I knew we had something special."

As a sophomore, Roney averaged 22.7 points per game; second in the First Coast area scoring leaders.

Hayward reminded fans at the signing of the buzzer beater three pointer that Roney hit against Columbia that gave the Broncos a district tournament win.

"We were down by two with five or so seconds to go," said Hayward. "She ran down the sideline of the court, got the ball and hit a corner three-point bank shot for the win. I picked her up and carried her all over the court after that."

Roney had games of 34 points twice, but hit an area high of 51 points in a match with Bradford.

In her junior year, Hayward said, Roney averaged 26.5 points per game, but, more importantly, he was able to start building a team around her. She also scored her 1,000th career point.

"Most players will be celebrated for 1,000 points in a career, but she was there in the middle of her junior year," said Hayward. "She would end that year at 1,850 points."

As Roney's senior year comes to a close, with five regular season games remaining with playoff games additional, Hayward had her at 1,910 as of the signing.

"If you are not here the next four or five games, you'll miss something special," said Hayward.

Of the three aforementioned players; Cardenas, a four-time all stater as a Lady Indian with three state titles and a runnerup finish in the 1990s, achieved a mark, without a three point shot, of 2,805 points that still stands as a girls (and boys) school record and one of the area's all time great records. Glidden became a defensive specialist at FSU and Masalin excelled at Wofford after scoring just under 1,500 points for Clay.




