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Racketeering fraud case ends with 20-year sentence

JACKSONVILLE - A Jacksonville judge has sentenced a disgraced former certified public accountant to serve 20 years in a Florida prison in connection with stealing some \$16.6 million from former accounting clients.

Judge Mark Hulsey sentenced James Kevin Hargnett, 53, of Green Cove Springs

on Feb. 10 to serve five, 20-year sentences concurrently after his defense attorney had requested 10-14 year sentences. Defense attorney Allan F. Brooke II of Jacksonville stated he James Kevin Hargnett



made his sentencing request based on "the facts of the case and the cooperation of the defendant since September 2013," states the 101-page sentencing memorandum.

Hargnett pled guilty to three counts of grand theft valued \$100,000 or more, one count of schemes to defraud greater than \$50,000 and one count of racketeering on June 1, 2015. Police originally charged Hargnett with 254 counts of grand

theft – of which. 55 counts were for more than \$100,000 each, 144 counts were for \$20,000-\$99,999, 41 counts were for \$10,000-\$19,999 each and 15 counts were for \$5,000-\$9,999 each. During the investigation, police found that Hargnett "conducted more than 254 separate withdrawal transactions, on separate dates from more than a dozen accounts of indi-

Flagler's railroad killed Clay County's West Tocoi

West Tocoi, just south of today's Green Cove Springs and on the St. Johns River, became a thriving commercial port almost immediately following the end of the Civil War.

When Clay County was carved from Duval in 1859, homesteaders were already beginning to cluster on the west bank of the St. Johns River just south of Green Cove Springs

Steamboat schedules called the landing West Tocoi to distinguish it from Tocoi on the east side of the river. Early Indian inhabitants christened the site Tocoi which means "shallow crossing" and was part a network of tribal and game trails in use for generations before the Spanish arrived.

After the Civil War, steamboats again began to ply the river and life picked up in West Tocoi. Settlers were attracted by the vast inland naval store and timber resources, farming and grazing land with convenient access to widespread markets conveniently available at West Tocoi.

It was almost at once a busy commercial landing with frequent steamship stops to load rough sawn lumber, naval stores and seasonal crops. As newcomers settled inland, larger and larger numbers of cattle and hogs began to arrive at the dock for dispatch to markets. The dock was usually cluttered with animal skins – from bear and panther to alligator – headed for Jacksonville tanneries.

A few curious travelers, mostly naturalists and independently wealthy would-be adventurers, visited but stayed only briefly at the town's rough and primitive boarding houses.

Then, in the early 1800s, things in West Tocoi got even


better when the Jacksonville, Tampa and Key West Railroad began laying track and the first leg from Jacksonville to Palatka swerved close to the St. Johns River to include a stop in West Tocoi. Operation commenced in March of 1884, and by the beginning of the tourist season the next November, the town was perfectly situated.

Tourists anxious to avoid an arduous and sometimes dangerous ocean voyage to reach Florida were able to travel by train all the way to West Tocoi then board the new ferry and after a short trip across the river arrive at the town's sister city on the opposite shore.

There they boarded the St. Johns Railroad for a harrowing trip in open rail cars pulled along track by a fire belching engine. The advertising brochures made no mention of passengers being required to collect firewood to fire the engine along the way or the need to be on the alert for stray sparks that could turn you or your traveling companion into a flaming torch.

In 1892, Henry Flagler's railroad to St. Augustine east of the river was complete and the St. Johns Railroad closed in 1895. West Tocoi, like the rest of Clay County, began a gradual decline as fickle investors, settlers and tourists flocked further south in search of something new.

All that remains today are pilings in the river and deserted quarters built for turpentine workers in the 1930s and 40s and often mistaken for abandoned motels. For almost three decades following the Civil War, West Tocoi was a thriving rail, ship and land transportation hub for the farming and naval stores industries along both sides of the St. Johns River and inland Clay County.

Copeland of Jacksonville, explained that while Jitendra Patel owns the property, the motel is being ran like a franchise by Rick Patel, to whom Jitendra Patel is not related, though they have the same last name.

"Jitendra Patel is the owner and was the borrower of the loan. Rick Patel is leasing the property from Jitendra Patel by paying a significant monthly amount and running it as his own business, Copeland said.

"They are both my clients, but Rick Patel is responsible for operation costs, including maintenance, and is the party in possession of the property while Jitendra Patel is the owner. Jitendra Patel paid off the mortgage, which is what we had planned to do if we lost that hearing."

Copeland said the two men entered a contract in 2008 that requires Rick Patel to be responsible for operations costs and upkeep. Therefore, Rick Patel is responsible for the Rodeway's problems that resulted in the motel being declared a nuisance by the Orange Park Nuisance Abatement Board last year. Copeland said this is why Jitendra Patel hasn't spent the money to improve the Rodeway.

"He made a business decision," Copeland said. "It's up to Rick Patel to take care of it."

Copeland said Rick Patel expects to complete fire safety upgrades next month and the pressure to do so will remain as the Town of Orange Park continues to fight with the Rodeway Inn in court. The town's quest – via its Nusiance Abatement Board – has been trying to force the embattle motel to police itself better since February 2015. The motel has been the scene of at

least one murder in 2012 and at least two meth labs and other drug-related arrests.

"We were hopeful that, with the appointment of a receiver, that we'd be able to address the issues more quickly, but we'll march forward, said Sam Garrison, the town's attorney.

"The judge had indicated he would have an order in a couple days, but before it was even filed, the loan was paid off. So, the bank no longer has an interest in the property, making the foreclosure moot and the result is there's no reason for the receiver to be appointed."

Garrison said the next step is for the town to respond to Patel's countersuit by entering a denial and requesting a hearing with Judge Sharitt.

The bank had sued to foreclose against Jitendra Patel and JaxInns Inc. as the guarantor of the loan for the outstanding balance and claims of "waste, impairment and deterioration" that had taken place at the property.

The bank sought \$789.01 in interest, \$2,416.29 in late charges, \$8,300 in appraisal fees and interest, which accrues at the rate of \$396.90 per day. This totals \$2,657,131 on a mortgage that was originally taken out on Aug. 16, 2006 for \$4 million

The document indicates the bank fears its investment has been harmed by the condition of the motel and the controversy surrounding it.

The Nuisance Abatement Board held a series of monthly meetings last fall aimed at keeping the motel accountable. Rick Patel was required to pay for constant police and private security presence and after a few weeks, the board removed the off-duty police requirement, but the motel remains open with private security onsite.

But here's what Clinton did say when asked why she took \$675,000 from

Goldman Sachs for just three speeches.

"That's what they offered."

The poor lady just couldn't say no.

It didn't occur to her how that would sound to the average American, who earns less over five whole years than Clinton's \$225,000 for a one-hour speech.

Her tone-deafness persisted when she was asked to release the transcripts.

"Let everybody who's ever given a speech to any private group under any circumstances release them," she said. "We'll all release them at the same time....These rules need to apply to everybody.'

Now for an actuality check.

If the Wall Street bankers offered her \$225,000 per speech, it's because that seems to be the least she expects from any outfit that wants to hear her, and her agents aren't the only ones who know that. McClatchy newspapers reported last week that she was paid that much or more from each of four public universities, with UCLA topping out at \$300,000. The article estimated \$21.5 million for her speaking fees from the time she stepped down as secretary of state until she declared her candidacy last year.

As for "everybody else," everybody else isn't running for president. She is. Her friendship with Goldman Sachs and other Wall Street institutions is a legitimate concern for voters, and so are the contents of those speeches.

It would be surprising, though, to find in them any sensitive information, anything that the bankers couldn't get from hearing any other well-informed person, be she a politician, pundit or professor. One of the speeches reportedly was about nothing more out of the ordinary than her views on the status of women.

According to the New York Times, this describes another:

"Mrs. Clinton mainly offered what one attendee called 'a tour of the world,' covering her observations on China, Iran, Egypt and Russia. This person said Mrs. Clinton also discussed the dysfunction in Washing-

Florida Should Batten Down the Hatches to Protect Most Vulnerable

Floridians are accustomed to natural disasters. But the State of Florida is currently in the cone of another type of impending disaster: a man-made one that is sure to increase hunger for thousands of people in Florida.

In 2016, more than half a million people nationwide, including thousands in Florida, will begin to lose critical food assistance when the state imposes a limit on the length of time that certain Floridians are allowed to receive food stamps.

The highly effective food stamps program - now called Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program or SNAP - is one of the largest and most critical anti-hunger programs in the state of Florida. Last year, SNAP helped more than 2 million families in Florida keep food on their tables. However, under new time limits that take effect this year, able-bodied adults without a dependent will be limited to receiving SNAP for just three months out of every three years unless they are employed or enrolled in a job training program at least 80 hours a month.

Sadly, steady jobs, let alone job training programs, aren't available for all Floridians, especially in our state's rural counties. But the kicker with the new time limits is that single adults stand to lose SNAP regardless of job opportunities where they live, how hard they are looking for work, or whether job training is even available to them.

Federal law allows states to ask for a waiver of time limits for communities where the local economy has not yet recovered, and many parts of Florida would be eligible due to persistent rates of high unemployment. Unfortunately, the 2015 Florida Legislature passed a law that prohibits the Department of Children and Families from asking for this reasonable waiver without the Legislature's permission. And, guess what? The Legislature has not and is unlikely to ever grant DCF permission to waive this time limit for our most vulnerable relatives, friends and neighbors.

Florida is one of only a few states that refuse to waive time limits for vulnerable people in depressed economic areas that would qualify, so food insecurity hurts these residents disproportionately. While over half a million people are at risk of losing benefits nation-wide due to time limits, according to the state up to 300,000 of those recipients live in Florida. Even in places where jobs do exist, many of these people, among the poorest in the state, face significant barriers to employment such as homelessness, limited education and transportation, or language barriers. Thousands are veterans, many of whom already face significant barriers to keeping food on the table for themselves and their families. And this is the way Florida salutes their service?

When people lose SNAP, local economies will also feel the pain. If only 100,000 people in Florida lose SNAP (a conservative estimate), that means our economy misses out on more than \$19 million dollars a month. In just one year, that's over \$228 million dollars no longer being spent in Florida's cities and towns. And that doesn't even include the \$7.476.691 it costs to operate ABAWD time limits in Florida. Importantly, there have been approximately 20,549 persons in Duval County alone who have been identified as an ABAWD.

ton, how to repair America's standing in the world after the government shutdown and also talked a bit about the Affordable Care Act, which had had a difficult rollout."

One likely reason Clinton doesn't want to release the transcripts is because they would reveal that she wasn't paid for what she would say but for who she is – a potential president whose favor Goldman Sachs would value most highly.

Another factor, regrettably, is an instinct for secrecy that keeps getting her in trouble. The stonewalling over her Whitewater transactions – which proved eventually to be insignificant –

led directly to an out-of-control special prosecutor and the stunning spectacle of her husband's impeachment over a sexual affair

The closed-door gestation of the Clinton Administration's health care package bred suspicions and lack of trust that contributed directly to its defeat.

That said, it's time for context.

Clinton isn't the only candidate with a Wall Street problem.

Jeb Bush went from the governor's office to the Lehman Brothers payroll at \$1.3 million a year just after his State Board of Administration began entrusting the Wall Street firm with – eventually – some \$1.5 billion in Florida pension and municipal trust funds. Lehman's collapse in 2008 left him without that job and Florida taxpayers with huge losses.

Ted Cruz's wife works at Goldman Sachs. That firm and Citibank sourced low-interest loans of nearly \$1 million to Cruz during his successful Senate campaign.

More context: Clinton is hardly the only golden-tongued ex-officeholder. Former President George W. Bush reportedly commands between \$100,000 and \$150,000 for each of his speeches. From 2001 to 2013 Bill Clinton earned more than \$100 million, according to CNN, which added that Condoleeza Rice, Colin Powell, Dick Cheney, and Jimmy Carter, among others, have had speaking fees in the five-to six-figure range. (Carter's exemplary ex-presidency moots that issue.)

Large as those sums seem, they're small compared to such excesses as the average \$5.15 million salary of a professional basketball player or the \$254,000 that Alex Rodriguez averaged for each base hit in a single season.

Everyone knows that life isn't fair. Most people understand that teachers, firefighters, soldiers, police officers and so many others will always be woefully underpaid, particularly when compared to speechmaking politicians, rock stars and hotshot athletes.

But most people also expect those they elect to show some sensitivity to life's unfairness. The sense of entitlement that Clinton projects through her tone-deaf explanations is quite the opposite of that.

Moosehaven property will not be re-zoned

ORANGE PARK – After a motion died on the dais for lack of a second, the effort to re-zone Moosehaven from residential to Planned Unit Development died along with it during a planning and zoning board meeting last week.

Three of the five board members attended and a motion to approve Moosehaven's petition to become a PUD was not seconded by another board member. A chamber-full of residents attended, expressing opposition during the public comment portion of the meeting. Not one resident who spoke said they supported the re-zoning effort.

They all expressed similar concerns as Orange Park resident Ben Dinkins did – he pointed out that Moosehaven is a nonprofit, so the town doesn't benefit from taxes as it does from businesses. He said the town doesn't have the resources to manage a PUD and that there would be too much potential for future problems, regardless of Moosehaven's current intentions.

"This just gives the developer what they want and it isn't good for the town," Dinkins said

John Capes, Moosehaven executive director, told Clay Today prior to the planning ans zoning board meeting that he simply wanted to make sure the zoning was the best match for everything the community does, including its annual Fourth of July Festival, which is open to the public. Moosehaven is residential at its core, but management also operates food service, religious worship and other offerings on the Moosehaven retirement center property. Capes had said Moosehaven wasn't planning any expansion, but wanted to ensure zoning wouldn't be an issue in the future.

The organization has always had proper permits for any projects outside of what is permitted by residential zoning laws, such as Independence Day fireworks and the PUD would have given Capes greater leeway.

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After-school reading program improves skills, confidence

ORANGE PARK — Holding up a worksheet for three children to see, Tatiana Lopez pointed to the word "rib" and asked the girls to sound out the first letter, then the second and finally, the 'b' sound.

"What's the word?" said Lopez, a sophomore at Orange Park High.

In unison with two other first graders, Sóle Young repeated 'rib' before moving down the list of words. Young and 46 other students at Montclair Elementary in Orange Park participate in the Y Reads Program, an after-school enrichment class that gives kindergarteners through third graders extra lessons in reading, fluency and broadening vocabulary. Typically, students in the bottom quartile for reading are eligible and recruited to enter the program.

"At my stations, I'm learning about reading and sometimes at my other tables when we switch, sometimes you can go and read a book," said Young, 7.

In its second year, the Y Reads Program located solely at Montclair, is funded by a grant from the Florida Department of Education and uses the SIPPS curriculum. The Systematic Instruction in Phonological Awareness, Phonics, and Sight Words was developed for new and struggling readers. Using SIPPS, students decode words

and gain reading fluency and comprehension. Younger students learn letters and basic words, while older students learn to merge syllables.

"We have three levels," said Clarissa Evans, the Y Reads Program coordinator. "We go through and we do individual letter sounds and as they progress through the level, they have to put those sounds together to make words.

"We do blending, we do segmenting. When they get further along, they have to sound out the words. The further they go, we expect them to have those skills in their head and we just have them read the word. They should be able to look at it and put all those sounds together."

The program will run through June 30 and is split into Monday-Wednesday and Tuesday-Thursday sessions with half the students participating two days each week for an hour and a half each day. Students rotate between two of five stations, depending on their age and reading level.

"We have them sounding the words out but in our highest level, the challenge level, they start reading by syllable," Evans said. "We're just laying the foundation at this point but even when you're reading by syllable, if you can't figure out the smaller words that make up the bigger words, then they're going to struggle. We have to make sure you can take the small word and sound that out, so when you get to the syllable you separate the smaller words and put it together and come up with the big word "

Jayla Prout, 6, joined last year as a kindergartener and needed extra help with reading. Prout's mother, Lindsey Gibson, said the program helped her not only learn to read but to develop a love for reading.

"She has come a long way," Gibson said.
"Before, she wasn't interested. I would read to her and try to get her to read back to me but this program has helped her become more interested in reading. We'll be at home and I don't have to tell her that she needs to read. In her classroom, her teacher has noticed an improvement. I've noticed an improvement. It opened up her vocabulary. She does spelling tests every Friday and she's gotten just about every one correct."

Volunteer Kathy Stawara worked with students on finding the main idea within a sentence, sounding out words, and memorizing sight words. Stawara, who started in September, likes that her groups are small because it helps them grasp the lesson more quickly.

"When you see their little lightbulbs go on and their fluency improves, it is so rewarding," she said.

Improved literacy often equates to improved confidence in the children.

"When a kindergartener runs out and tells her mom that she can read, that's the epitome of what the Y Reads program is about," Evans said. "We're giving them the skills. We're working on their confidence and maybe if she hadn't had the program, she might still be struggling."

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Grant enriches four Clay County schools

CLAY HILL – Blake Buterbaugh repeatedly placed his crochet hook through the circle of yarn to create a long chain. The fourth grader signed up for the crochet class as part of a club based, extended day program at Clay Hill Elementary.

"It's very fun and I like learning skills with my hands and it could help me learn other things like weaving and sewing," said Buterbaugh, who is 9. "It's a good thing to know how to sew or crochet because, say, I'm on vacation and I forgot to pack a hat, I can crochet one real quick."

Buterbaugh is one of approximately 100 other kids at the school impacted by a 21st Century Community Learning Center Grant. Students in the program eat healthy snacks, receive homework help, and participate in science, technology, engineering and math, or STEM-based clubs and arts classes. Students receive the additional enrichment programs at no cost to the schools, district or families.

"It's a federally-funded program that is allocated to the states and it's a competitive grant within the state," said Kathleen Schofield, supervisor of STEM and instructional support services for the Clay County School District. "We are a first time recipient, which we are so thrilled to be, and the target population is schools that have free or reduced lunch rates of 60 percent or higher."

Students at Montclair Elementary, Ridgeview Elementary, Clay Hill, Keystone Heights have the option of signing up for coding, robotics, sewing and crochet,

choral singing, Spanish and cooking. Two of the sites have 75 kids in the program, while the other two include 100 students. Some students were offered American Sign Language for a semester. Students can get moving with Zumba, karate and dance. The extended day is club-based and allows students to rotate through two or three activities after homework or tutoring is completed. Because the program runs four days each week, students' schedules are the same every other day. For example, students may switch from "sewing to science to Spanish, to project based learning and that's their first day," said Karen Olley, STEM and Instructional Support Services Specialist. "All of the clubs in some way are correlated and up to standards so in a fun, really cool way we're continuing their learning," Schofield said.

The five-year grant, which has to be applied for yearly, gives kids at each school 12 extra weekly hours of enrichment programs.

"Three of the four schools that have the 21st Century are not Title 1 schools but they definitely have a need for some enrichment programs to help those kids, for whatever reason, will benefit from the extended day program," Schofield said.

Around 5:30 p.m., students get on the bus and get a ride home. Transportation is also funded by the grant, taking away some of the challenges of coordinating afterschool parent pick up.

"If the bus wasn't offered in communities like Clay Hill and Keystone Heights, there's no way the kids would be able to

stay," Olley said.

Victoria Carroll teaches fifth grade during the day and sewing in the extended day program. Through a separate grant, Carroll was able to purchase six sewing machines students use to make quilted placemats, lanyards, pillows and bookmarks. Some of the fabric and batting in her sewing classroom is donated. Students also bring in their own materials.

Carroll said she volunteered to teach the subject because it is important to know basic skills, such as how to re-attach a but-

"My mom and grandmother sewed and passed it on to me," Carroll said. "I don't have any daughters, but I wanted to pass on this skill to others. Next, they're going to make pajama bottoms by learning to use

a pattern."

Students in computer lab assistant Richard Leasure's classroom learned about robotics and coding, or writing instructions for the computer to follow, through the nonprofit Code.org. Leasure said having technology outlets is important for some kids because it requires an alternative way of thinking. 'Tech users are not creators." Leasure said. "I do coding and it's more creative. There are multiple ways to create code. There's no right or wrong, there are just different avenues to solve a problem. Coding requires a different way of thinking and coding offers those kids that might think differently – those whose brains are wired differently - the opportunity to come up with creative ways to solve problems."

Ponds will store treated wastewater, help environment

LAKE ASBURY – Officials have dedicated a new water system that will improve the environment by eliminating the need to pump seven-to-eight million gallons of treated wastewater to the St. Johns River.

With a cost of \$2.4 million, the Mid-Clay Reclaimed Water Land Application Recovery System sits on 31 acres just north of Sandridge Road in the Lake Asbury com-

"This has the potential for significant reduction in nitrogen and phosphorous getting into the river by storing it for irrigation, said Derek Busby, St. Johns River Water Management District project manager. "Normally, if people aren't irrigating, like in winter or in summer at times when it rains a lot, the water ends up in the river because of low demand. By using more reclaim water for irrigation, it diminishes the demand on drinking water, which is good for the aguifer."

On Feb. 10, the Clay County Utility Authority and the water management district dedicated nine new ponds they began constructing in January 2015. The new system was built for \$2.4 million, 46 percent of which was paid for by the water

management district. The ponds are near a housing development, but are fenced off to protect the public from contact with the nitrogen and phosphorous that are part of human waste and are still in the reclaimed water being stored in the ponds.

Celeste Laffy, CCUA public information officer said the system will not result in a price increase for customers.

"Because of the environmental benefits, we were able to collaborate with the water management district and, thereby, save our customers money," Laffy said. "The biggest thing we're trying to do is protect the environment.'

The system has a wet pond and horizontal well that will allow CCUA to withdraw effluent that was previously applied to land, partially retreat it and then distribute it through the reclaimed water system.

What does this mean to water customers? Previously during peak times, CCUA may not have enough reclaimed water to provide to its customers and may have to supplement that supply with potable drinking water.

The new system will store the surplus supply that is generated during low reclaimed water demand so it can be used later during high demand hours.

By disposing the effluent in the basins,

CCUA will no longer have to pump 7 to 8 million gallons of treated wastewater to the river.

Busby said the project couldn't be carried out anywhere. He said the sandy soil and topography here enabled the ponds to be built with horizontal wells that store water beneath the surface. When needed, water can be pumped to the surface through the piping system for distribution.

"The purple pipes are for treated wastewater coming from the wastewater treatment plant. There are valves inside the pipes that we use to rotate the wastewater between the ponds, so we rotate between zones instead of continually dumping the wastewater in the same place," said Ken Fraser, CCUA chief engineer.

Laffy said it takes four wastewater customers to meet the demand of one reclaimed water customer. Many older housing developments don't have reclaimed water pipes running through them and they would be expensive to install. Though not every customer can use reclaimed water, none of it will be wasted.

"This will eliminate 100 percent of our discharge to the river – there is always some amount of demand for reclaimed water and now, we will have the supply," Laffy said.



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Federal grants help upgrade neighborhoods

ORANGE PARK – For almost as long as she can remember, Sharon Ford has seen her property become flooded when the town's water and sewer system breaks down on Floyd Circle.

However, her life will improve with help from a \$700,000 federal Community Development Block Grant the town used to upgrade water and sewer lines near her

"We've had problems for years; I've lived here five years and have had water problems off and on. In the bathroom, the water isn't as clean as it should be. It seems like there's residue from inside the pipes that comes through the shower and you can see a ring in the toilet from it,"

The residue could be from asbestos cement pipes, which have Public Works Director Chuck Pavlos concerned. Replacing such lines throughout town, such as along Plainfield Avenue, was the top priority because the whole town would be forced to shut down its water system in the event those aged asbestos lines break. Pavlos said the town is working on other neighborhoods and the grant helped speed up

"We're doing water lines and a new water main and services to the houses will be all new," Pavlos said, concerning the Floyd Circle project. "We're also doing a new sewer system and some storm water improvements. We will rebuild the road and add some sidewalks and fire hydrants."

Floyd Circle is just east of Miller Street and runs north of Gano for a little more than a block before turning east for approximately half a block, then southward back to Gano. Pavlos explained that all three portions are being improved. Construction is expected to be finished sometime in March, having started last Septem-

performing.

"My church floods when the drainage along the railroad tracks gets plugged up and the water piles up on Floyd Circle. So, I expect this will alleviate the problem," he

Pavlos said he accepted his position in 2011 and began looking at water main problems, identifying neighborhoods in the greatest need. He said Floyd Circle was identified as needing work, in part because there was a need for fire hydrants.

"The road was in pretty bad shape, too. Orange Park is an older town with an older infrastructure – it's aging and we're doing what we can to replace it, Pavlos said.

"We updated the sewer plant, which cost over \$10 million, and they were wrapping that up when I got here. Since then, we've been working on a water and sewer master plan because we have a lot of asbestos cement piping that we're working on replacing with PVC pipes. So, we're targeting the most critical areas.'

For Floyd Circle, the town hired Jordan and Associates of Orange Park to write the Community Development Block Grant proposal on the town's behalf and administer the paperwork. The grant was awarded in 2014 and the group was paid from grant funds, instead of town tax dollars. The construction was awarded to Baker Klein. after five bids came back in June 2015, according to Assistant Town Manager Sarah Campbell.

Pavlos said the next street project Orange Park will undertake is Village Way, which is in the design stage and construction will begin sometime this year. Pavlos expects the road, drainage and lines project for the Village Greens subdivision to be a \$500,000-\$700,000 project. Campbell said it's included in the town's current bud-

Pavlos said this project would have been on hold until next year, but the town can get to it sooner because federal Community Development Block Grant funds enabled local funds to be saved on the Floyd Circle project. While the funds flow from Washington, D.C., each state funnels the grant funds to their municipalities through an application process that is administered by state governments.

The town received more federal CDBG dollars, which are allocated by the state, because the town contributed \$125,000 in local funds to that project. This is because the state uses a point system to prioritize competing projects and the town received 25 points for the local contribution. The more points awarded to a proposed project, the larger the possible grant amount.

The City of Green Cove Springs is preparing to compete for CDBG funds and Developmental Services Director Janis Fleet said the point system helps ensure a fair system devoid of the human prejudice that may take place if judgment were used to assign worth and prioritize project propos-

"It's a big program with lots of requirements and they don't have money for everything so the point system helps them evaluate projects and divide up the mon-

Green Cove Springs has created a committee that will evaluate possible projects and decide which ones take highest priority for submitting grant proposals. The city gets points for having this committee and it maximizes the point potential for having a committee by having 51 percent of those who constitute the committee being residents of low income. Any proposed project will also get more points if low-income residents would benefit from any proposed project, according to Fleet.

Mayor Van Royal said the Citizens' Advisory Committee is made up of low-income residents so that segment of the population's concerns are not overlooked.

"They give you 10 points for this and 15 points for that and different criteria have different point values. A lot of communities are looking for these grants and the state wants everyone to have a voice. So, the committee includes low-income people and that gives them a voice," Royals said.

The city will move ahead with prioritizing the neighborhoods in most need of street or pipe repairs and have the committee review them.

"Now that we have our committee, we'll prioritize our needs and come up with a list of five or so projects to give to the committee. They will review them, then we'll submit for a grant for one or two of those projects," Royal said.

He said Green Cove Springs has received CDBG funds in the past, but not lately, so the city wants to get back into the process.

Math students prep for regional competition

ORANGE PARK - Scott Ahlgren and Dominik Frietze approached the whiteboard, armed and ready to see who was faster at determining the arithmetic mean of the areas of non-congruent rectangles.

As part of the 15-member math team at Orange Park Junior High, the two students are prepping to compete against 59 other teams in the Feb. 26 Math Counts regional competition at the University of North Flor-

"Solving problems in front of everyone can boost your confidence," said Frietze, 12, a seventh grader and first time competitor. "It's stressful to do it up there, but if you can do it now, you can do it in other settings. Even though I don't get everything, I like being able to learn new stuff for next

Since the fall, students have studied algebra, probability, statistics, geometry and trigonometry on their own and during practice sessions. Middle-school students will compete in team and individual events with a chance to advance to the state competition in Kissimmee, Fla. on Apr. 1. Nationwide, approximately 42,000 students representing 5,400 schools are expected to compete in 50 states and the District of Columbia.

To make practices similar to the style of the competition, Orange Park's math team sponsor, Julie Goslee, chooses questions from the mathcounts.org website and poses it to two competitors.

"We're utilizing a lot of what the Math Counts website has given us." Goslee said. "They have a problem solving program and we use that kind of like the countdown round at the competition. We're pitting two of the students against each other and they're trying to solve the problem first. Whoever gets it right stays at the board."

At the competition, students will be expected to solve problems in their head or on paper before hitting the buzzer to answer

"We've done a lot of past competitions, past state and regional and school competitions to get them familiar with the kinds of questions that are going to be out there,"

Eighth grader Harold Goslee, 14, attended last year's competition and said it combines two of his favorite things.

"I've always been a competitive person," Goslee said. "I have always loved math and that's been my favorite subject. I love being competitive with other people but also

are bright at math."

Eighth grader Caleb Pate, 14, said he especially loves the challenge of completing long math problems with lots of steps. Through the club and the competitions, Pate has learned how to deal with failure if a mistake occurs and to move on quickly after stumbling.

"For me, it's a mixture of confidence and apathy," Pate said. "I've learned to move on. Once I learned to do that, I've stopped worrying as much about things I did wrong."

About three miles away from Orange Park Junior High, the math club at Lakeside Junior High meets once each week before school, but students come prepared.

"I come to every single meeting every week," said eighth grader Hunter Bice, 14. "We practice all of the things that are the main problems at the Math Counts competition and we go over stuff like Pascal's Triangle, trigonometric ratios, Pythagorean triples and stuff like that. To get ready, you have to study at home and come as much as possible so you know you're good."

At the math club meeting held before school on Feb. 11. math sponsor Elba Howington passed out worksheets while faced

while working as a team with others who off in one long row. Working silently until the allotted time was up, Howington and the students went over the answers and addressed any questions. She encouraged students to ask each other questions before a clue was given.

> "If they're stuck on a problem, they can talk to each other and if they still don't get it, I guide them through and give clues," Howington said. "I try to help them as little as possible so they'll figure it out on their own."

> Howington's approach also has students mentally prepared and feeling confident heading into the competition later this

> "I think we're going to win and go to state. We're all pretty smart and our team is pretty stacked."

FLEMING ISLAND – Four students from two teams sat across from each other. placed their hands near red buzzers and listened as fellow student Magaleate Kostelnik guizzed them about which natural events do not cause tsunamis.


"Tide." said 18-vear-old Madalyn Tolen. pressing the buzzer and answering cor-

Kostelnik, 18, founder of Fleming Island High's National Ocean Science Bowl Club, then posed another question to students to help them study for an upcoming competition.

Seven members of the school's National Ocean Science Bowl Club are preparing for the 2016 National Ocean Sciences Bowl with the theme of "Our Changing Ocean: Science for Strong Coastal Communities," which will be held in Fort Pierce, Fla. Feb.

In its second year, club members study for the competition on their own time outside of class using the Nemo curriculum, a marine science literacy program developed by teachers, education specialists and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration scientists.

Senior student Hannah Henning, 18, wants to pursue marine biology in college next year. She said being in the club

solidified her interest in studying marine science.

"Even though we learn a lot about the ocean and dead zones and things like that, we still learn a lot about animals," Henning said. "[Kostelnik] gives us papers and we'll have to fill out parts of a fish or parts of a dolphin so we learn anatomy also."

Clad in a t-shirt bearing the slogan. "Staying true to the ocean blue," Kostelnik, a senior, moved to Fleming Island after attending Vero Beach High School in Indian River County where she competed in the National Ocean Sciences Bowl. Seeing the void at her new school, she set out to create a new club here.

"It's to bring awareness to communities about marine science in general," Kostelnik said. "Since we're in Florida, there should be marine science programs but there aren't. I think that's one of the goals and to develop knowledge about the ocean especially for those who want to go into the

The students learn far more than oceanography through the Nemo curriculum.

"It's biography and physics and chemistry, oceanography, ecology, meteorology," said club sponsor and science teacher Sarah Pederson. "Every science is tied into this club."

Because the theme of this year's competition is about coastal communities, the team is preparing for questions about water quality, estuarine ecosystems, seagrasses, oyster reefs, coastal planning and restoration.

"There's so much with flooding and rising sea levels and huge monster storms and erosion and the acidification that's destroying the coral reefs," Pederson said, who was Fleming Island's 2016 Teacher of the Year and a finalist in the countywide competition. "What can we do collectively as people to help save our oceans? How can we keep our coastal communities strong because a lot of people depend on them for their livelihood."

Junior Susie Mabry said she learned about emerging technologies and alternate energy sources through the club.

"So far we've learned a lot about the environmental implications of marine science and how we can work with the science and technology we have to combat things like ocean acidification and runoff," Mabry said. "So learning about that stuff is cool especially because right now we're developing those new technologies like algae biofuel. There's a lot mixed into the club that is useful to know."

With the knowledge learned through the club and studying for the competition, other students now look at the ocean in a different way.

"There's so many big issues that I didn't know about before." Tolen said. "It made me not paranoid, but more aware, that our world is really not in the best shape."



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This Week in History

5 Years Ago, 2011

A space heater in a rural Green Cove Springs home caught fire, causing about \$100,000 in damage. No one was injured in the fire on Hogarth Road. A second fire caught the following day at 1718 Bent Pine Ct. after a lit fireplace was left unattended. The homeowner sustained minor injuries.

A December 2010 report by the accounting firm James Moore & Company revealed Orange Park Town Council spent around \$200,000 on a solid waste management project without holding a bidding process to obtain the lowest price. Town Manager Cindy Hall resolved to create a more accountable system for hiring contractors.

On Feb. 12, Abraham Lincoln's birthday, more than 75 people gathered at Magnolia Springs Cemetery to recognize the Civil War burial site as a memorial. Eleven Union soldiers are known to be buried there. The city of Green Cove Springs donated a stone obelisk, the federal Veteran's Administration replaced missing tombstones, and the United Methodist Church of Florida donated the grounds.

10 Years Ago, 2006

Transportation officials announced long-awaited \$5.2 million plan to extend County Road 209 from Blanding Boulevard to County Road 220, scheduled for completion in fiscal year 2006-07. The extension had originally been slated for completion five years later. Also moved up the agenda was the addition of two lanes onto the Doctors Lake Bridge.

Kenneth Antoine McDougal reportedly stole Timothy Smith's truck. Smith chased McDougal he crashed and was apprehended by police. Smith found Mc-Dougal had stashed stolen items in the truck, among them a class ring of Chris Martin, a U.S. Army soldier then on deployment in Iraq. JACS Cybercafe opened in Orange Park. The café on Wells Road offered coffee, pastries and Internet access and instruction. It is now closed, however.

Fourth Judicial Circuit Court Judge Lamar Winegeart sentenced James W. Ortagus to 20 years in prison for the shooting death of F. Ellis Fowler, 45, of Green Cove Springs. The shooting took place in the parking lot of a shopping center at the intersection of County Road 218 and Blanding Boulevard in Middle-

The Fleming Island Advisory Committee was presented plans to build a 1,250-home development called Pace Island where homes would be priced from \$85,000 to \$500,000. Attorney John Kopelousos presented the plans on behalf of landowners John and Gussie Pace.

Clay County School Board Chairman George Bush cautioned the costs surrounding adding two new holidays to the 1986-87 school year calendar – Martin Luther King Jr. Day and President's Day.

40 Years Ago, 1976

Plans moved forward to allow citizens to collect signatures for a ballot referendum that would let voters decide if they wanted to establish a recreation tax district to fund the county's parks and rec department and programs after a clarification from the Comptroller General of

Keystone Heights to see only municipal election this year

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS — Because Councilman Brian Wilson isn't seeking re-election, Seat 1 on city council will be open on April 12. Because it's the only contested race in the county, it will be the only election on what was to be the county's first Municipal Super Tuesday.

When conceived, the concept of having each of Clay County's municipalities elect their councils on the same day was designed to save money and create a more efficient voting system. However, that would only come to fruition had enough candidates qualified to hold competitive elections.

Hayley Roisin Gartee, a 22-year-old realtor, and Steve Brown, a 36-year-old phone company network technician, are seeking to succeed Wilson in Seat 1. Gartee spent a year with the Community Development Advisory Board and worked on Keystone Heights downtown beautification projects, as well as promoting business growth.

"I've always been interested in city government and being involved with the community," Gartee said. "There are a lot of younger people in town and I want to represent them on council and I want to bring fresh ideas to it as we move forward as a community."

Brown has not served in government, but grew up in town and believes council is heading in the right direction.

"I like the way things are going – council is doing a good job promoting family-oriented events and I want to ensure conservative voices remain on council, so I want to jump in and help out," Brown said.

Seat 2 Councilwoman Marion Kelly, 75, who is retired after a 33-year career with Clay Electric Cooperative, is running unopposed for her second term.

"I'm very interested in our city and I look forward to seeing it grow. I want to see the skateboard park and the splash park that we're working on be completed, as well as downtown beautification – those are our priorities and I want to see them through," Kelly said.

Orange Park

Recent controversy in Orange Park surrounding the qualification documents of a former candidate for Seat 4 leaves candidate Connie Thomas running unopposed. Mayor Gary Meeks is unopposed in his Seat 5 re-election bid, so there will be no election in Orange Park on April 12.

In May, Meeks will have been on council for six years and the 65-year-old security manager doesn't want to stop in the middle of several important projects the town has going on.

"I'm running for re-election because the town has several things in transition right now – rewriting regulations for land development and infrastructure projects. We also have a couple department head positions that are open – these are things we started in the last term, so I wanted to run for my final term to see them through," Meeks said.

Thomas is a 55-year-old self-employed licensed clinical social worker who has not served in government, but was a founding member of Citizens for a Greater Orange Park, a civic action group concerned about the community. She also campaigned for the Georgia General Assembly in 2008.

"I think Orange Park is a small town with urban problems and we have to do extra things to look out for our community," Thomas said. "We have a lot of outside entities affecting our town from the state planting trees on U.S. 17 to heavy transportation and crime that you may not think a small town should have to deal with. I'm running because these problems require crisis-management and big-picture-thinking"

After the election, on May 1, Council member Steve Howard will step down, forcing council to appoint someone on May 3. The new council will be seated on May 17. Howard – who is in his third term – notified council and the public of his resignation during a recent meeting in which he read a letter explaining his departure.

"I feel in my heart that now is the time for me to announce my decision to resign my seat," Howard wrote. "This will allow others the opportunity to serve the town of Orange Park in Seat 1."

Because the resignation was not immediate or announced before qualifying dates, Orange Park voters will not have any say in selecting Howard's successor. Howard wrote in his letter that important work remains to be completed before May 1.

"There is much important work that remains to be done and what I personally would like to see above anything else before I leave is code enforcement to clean up our town and keep on this path going forward along with the development of Kingsley Avenue east from U. S. 17 to River Road," Howard wrote.

Capes fails to qualify for town council

ORANGE PARK – With his petition to run for Town Council Seat 4 questioned, Council held a special meeting Feb. 11 to review John Capes' paperwork and determined he had not properly qualified to be a candidate. The result is Connie Thomas will run for Town Council unopposed and there will be no election in Orange Park on April 12.

Capes, the executive director of Moosehaven, had gathered signed petitions that were filed at the appropriate time. One hundred valid petitions are required and, according to Clay County Supervisor of Elections Chris Chambless, the Florida Election Code requires the forms to be signed and dated in ink by the same person.

Assistant Town Manager Sarah Campbell told council that Capes delivered 107 petitions on Feb. 4 and a Moosehaven employee brought in more on Feb. 5, the last day to file for the election. Campbell said that of the 121, 15 were rejected and 106 were deemed valid. She said that of the 106, 18 were not dated. Council determined that only 88 were, therefore, valid and Capes had not qualified.

"We're not here about a candidate – it's about the process," Mayor Gary Meeks said.


Questions surrounding the petitions were raised by former mayor and councilman Ron Raymond, who told Clay Today that Capes' running for council while seeking to have Moosehaven rezoned "didn't smell right" to him.

He said voter turnout for Orange Park municipal elections is usually around 30-50 voters, but Capes would have had a voting block at his fingertips in the retirement community he manages. Raymond said he went to town hall and requested copies of the petitions.

"I saw that virtually all of the signatures were from Moosehaven and that about 20 had been validated, but there was no date. According to the rules, that makes it invalid. I went to the supervisor of elections and showed him the petitions, which he said were invalid," said Raymond, who said he is also a 30-year member of the Loyal Order of Moose, which owns Moosehaven retirement community.

Chambless confirmed Raymond's allegation and said that he thought the

Natural gas to play role in economic development

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – After more than a year of negotiations and discussions, one of Florida's fastest-growing natural gas suppliers is ready to lay pipe here.

In late January, the Green Cove Springs City Council passed an ordinance, which is required by city charter, to grant a franchise to TECO Peoples Gas. The ordinance, in turn, requires TECO to pay the city six percent of its gross company revenues each month in return for doing business in the city.

"In order to provide service in our corporate limits and to points north and south, it is necessary for the City to grant a franchise to TECO that would allow them to traverse public streets and rights-of-way within our corporate limits," states the ordinance passed Jan. 26.

The city has underground utility easements that Mayor Van Royal said are 10 feet wide where gas lines can be installed.

"The change to the language in the franchise agreement gives TECO Natural Gas access to our easements and we made sure it isn't exclusive, so others can use it." Royal said.

Natural gas isn't a utility that has been available to Green Cove Springs before and the transmission lines will be brought to the region by SeaCoast Gas Transmission for TECO to extend into the city. SeaCoast will install nearly 10 miles of pipe to bring gas to the area, andTECO will install 13 miles of pipe to serve customers.

Once the city council approves the franchise, Green Cove Springs will have natural gas service for larger customers by the end of the year, according to Peoples Gas.

"This is a move to help spur economic development in Green Cove Springs," said Cheri Jacobs TECO media spokesperson, who is based at the company's Tampa headquarters.

"Some larger commercial customers will have service by the end of this year and smaller ones will have it next year. In the coming years, we hope to get lines to residential customers, as well."

She said TECO will install 13 miles of gas lines, but she wouldn't disclose the dollar amount the company will invest to expand here. Jacobs said having natural gas available could help everyone residents save money on utility bills if certain circumstances don't change.

"We're proud to be the company that brings natural gas to Green Cove Springs for the first time. It's a new market for us and getting it from the ground has become more efficient. That has made supply grow, which caused prices to drop, so natural gas is very inexpensive right now," Jacobs

As the city looks to market itself as a manufacturing destination to create jobs, making natural gas available will matter to those who look at available property.

"Green Cove Springs has the largest concentration of manufacturing land in the county," said Chris Eversole, the city's communications coordinator. "Some manufacturers use heat and that makes lowercost heat attractive to them."

Royal said other companies that need a lot of energy will be in his sights.

"We can now target power-intensive companies — anyone that heats material; any manufacturer that liquefies or manufactures. This won't matter as much to distributers, but it will to manufacturers, whether they're in the city limit or not because a lot of the gas lines will serve the surrounding area," Royal said.

One of those such companies is Vac-Con, which employs 300 Clay County residents. Bill Barnes, Vac-Con's continuous improvement manager, said the company is eager to use natural gas as a power source because saving money increases profitability and ensures the company's continued presence in Green Cove Springs.

"We have a very good cooperative partnership with Mayor Royal and County Manager Stephanie Kopelousos. They have bent over backwards to work with us throughout our expansion and incorporating natural gas merely integrates well with what we're already doing," he said.

Vac-Con is in the middle of a \$10 million expansion project of its facility, producing vacuum trucks to efficiently dig holes underground without actually digging from the topsoil.

From Green Cove Springs, trucks are sold around the country and can be powered by natural gas, if a customer orders them equipped that way.

"We have pushed to get natural gas here for the last two years," Barnes said. "We contacted TECO and elected officials and it took a good partnership between local business and local government to get it done."

Royal and other city leaders are also working on smaller projects going that won't generate a high number of jobs or high-paying ones, but will matter to many residents.

A Domino's Pizza is now in town and Eversole said there is ongoing work to attract Zaxby's. He also noted the presence of a community college with First Coast Technical College offering classes in town.

"All these things add up – from Domino's and McDonald's to antique shops and the business league – it's about synergy and creating a community that's on the upswing," he said.

Smaller commercial customers could have service in 2017. Residential customers would have service in coming years.

The pipeline will start at the Clay County Agricultural Fairgrounds, travel to the industrial area south of the city and extend along U.S. 17 to north of the city. An extension will run to the Reynolds Industrial Park.

Florida changing face of card gaming

ORANGE PARK – In December, Gov. Rick Scott signed a deal with the Seminole Tribe in South Florida that expands casinos in that part of the state. Meanwhile, state regulators have filed complaints against seven pari-mutuel poker rooms, such as bestbet in Orange Park.

In casinos, gamblers bet against the house and in pari-mutuels, they bet against each other. In January, the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, which also oversees Native American casinos, filed complaints alleging that seven pari-mutuels were holding games in which bets are made against the house, which are illegal in pari-mutuels.

In an email to Clay Today, bestbet President Jamie Shelton expressed confusion concerning the complaint because nothing had changed since the state approved the company's card games.

"We did receive an Administrative Complaint. We don't understand why the complaint was filed as the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering had previously reviewed the poker games at our facility before opening, approved our internal controls as to how the poker games are played and subsequently authorized the playing of the poker games in our facility, as well as 15 other facilities across the State. We will respond and defend our position through the appropriate legal process, Shelton wrote.

"No statutes related to pari-mutuel wagering have been changed since 2009. The statutes governing cardroom operations were the same when the Division of Pari Mutuel Wagering approved

girlfriends. Crawford and artist Sonya Cox led the two-hour class with a healthy dose of fun and their intent was clear from the start. Crawford joked that the class was not quite up to American painter and television host Bob Ross's level of step by step instruction, but Cox said "but it's the same thing. It's step by step, teaching people how to paint. I think we're filling a real void. It's something new for people to do instead of bowling or just drinking."

Argyle resident Lonni Stewart attended the class with seven of her friends. Her second experience with Painting with a Twist, Stewart said the instructors provide the perfect balance of humor and professionalism

"I like the way Brittani's led this class," Stewart said. "It's free-spirited and laid back. Everybody's not stressed and we have fun and we know how to take the jokes. It's the perfect thing to do if you want to have fun and not be a perfectionist. It's great to be able to take it easy and putting your own flair on it is the best part."

Stewart also said creating her own artwork helped her connect with the greater world of art.

"It's a way to get people to dabble in it who wouldn't otherwise participate," she said. "We have [the Museum of Contemporary Art] but this sort of teaches you the basics so you can connect on another level and appreciate artists' work in a different way."

Men and women of all ages and skill levels sat next to each other in long rows making Crawford's instructions easy to

see and hear. An example of the undersea mermaid with red hair and a green scales hung in the front of the room as Crawford explained the steps to make it come to life. Painters traced the mermaid's body using stencils and paper plates to shape the wine glass. Cox floated around the room helping tentative painters and adding a squirt of paint to the palettes.

Off-site Painting with a Twist sessions occur about once a week at different restaurants. Crawford and Cox rotate classes at Roadhouse Bar and Grill and Chili's in Orange Park, Taps Bar and Grill on Fleming Island among other venues. Usually, the

classes are offered drink specials, which helps the creative process flow much like the adult spirits. In case a painter partakes a little too much, SOS sessions are held at Painting with a Twist's County Road 220 studio each month.

"It makes it easier for people to design their own creations and let loose," Cox said, who currently works with fused glass creating jewelry and teaches classes in silk painting.

Crawford, a freelance artist who creates digital artwork for advertisements and app companies, said she likes teaching classes because art is therapeutic.

"It's a stressful process but at the end of it I think they feel accomplished," Crawford said. "Most people that come here have no idea what they're doing. They come in here with a can't-do attitude or I don't know what I'm doing, art has never been accessible to me, and most people leave pretty impressed with themselves."

That sentiment resonated with Orange Park resident Joanie Newton, who attended the class with her husband Greg.

"I'm OCD so I want it to be perfect and I know it's not, but it is fun," Joanie Newton said. "I've forgotten about work and the kids and bills and have been totally focused on this."

The Newton's ate dinner at Taps before and split a pitcher of beer during the class.

"I like it being at a venue so you can eat before you get here," Joanie Newton said.

The Newton's are exactly the type of customers Taps Bar and Grill manager Tyler Sylvester hopes to attract with the painting partnership. Sylvester said some people think Taps is a sports bar simply because they have televisions, but having customers come in and experience an art class exposes them to what the restaurant has to offer, craft beer and freshly prepared food.

"What I assume happens is that the girls will get off of work and the guys will get off from work and they'll come and have a couple drinks at the bar and then they'll make their way to the back room to paint their pictures," Sylvester said. "It brings a different sort of crowd. These people in the class might ride by and think Taps Bar and Grill, it's not my cup of tea, but we're doing Painting with a Twist. That would bring them in and get us exposed to them and them exposed to us. Everybody wins."

the new poker games – Three Card Poker, Two Card Poker, One Card Poker, Florida Hold'em and Pai Gow Poker."

Sen. Rob Bradley (R-Fleming Island) said what is going on with poker rooms fits into a context that revolves around the Seminoles.

"It's part of a larger discussion taking place in Tallahassee right now and it's too early to tell what's going to happen in this legislative session," he said.

Bradley said pari-mutuels typically argue that they are at a disadvantage because the Seminoles have a stranglehold on casino gaming in the state. Through a complicated mix of state and federal laws, Native American tribes offer games against the house and no poker room can do the same.

"The compact has to do with the Seminole Tribe's gaming in South Florida. Federal law holds that the Native American tribes can conduct whatever gaming is allowed elsewhere in the state and if they offer games not allowed elsewhere in the state, they are obligated to pay revenue sharing in exchange for exclusivity," Bradley said.

The tribe has seven casinos, all of them in South Florida, and blackjack is among the offerings. The compact Scott signed on Dec. 7 gives the tribe exclusivity for that game and adds craps and roulette, also with exclusivity. None of these games are played in pari-mutuel poker rooms, so it's unclear what connection there may be between the state's new deal with the tribe and rules overseeing the tables at bestbet. However, Shelton indicated the state's compact with the Seminoles puts bestbet in jeopardy.

"The compact already executed between the governor and the tribe takes away product from the pari Mutuels and by default gives them more exclusivity that they currently have under the existing compact, which by the way, has not expired," Shelton wrote in an email.

Via email, Clay Today asked Shelton, through his public relations representative, to elaborate and Clay Today didn't receive a response.

In a statement to Clay Today, Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation Secretary Ken Lawson indicated the office found violations, but he didn't offer any details.

"After reviewing operations and obtaining additional information at pari-mutuel facilities throughout the state, the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering discovered violations of Florida law resulting in administrative complaints. We will continue to administer the law and maintain our opposition to unauthorized activity conducted at any facility licensed by the state," Lawson wrote in an email.

Clay Today received the complaints the Division of Pari-Mutual Gaming filed against the seven poker rooms. They use the same language, making the same allegations which they indicate occurred on the same day — Dec. 7, 2015.

The complaint the office filed against bestbet alleges the poker room conducted a banking game, a game bet against the house, on Dec. 7, 2015 – the day the governor signed the compact with the Seminole Tribe.

The complaint doesn't specify what bestbet allegedly did, but alleges nine counts of "operating a banking game or a game not specifically authorized" on Dec. 7 at nine different tables. The complaint also alleges eight counts where it reads

that bestbet "allowed the person seated in seat eight at the corner of table 78 to work in Respondant's [bestbet's] cardroom" and that "On Dec. 7, 2015, the person seated in seat eight at the corner table 78 did not have a valid occupational license."

Bradley said that, in exchange for adding craps and roulette and having exclusivity over them and blackjack, the tribe will pay \$2 billion more each year in revenue sharing. He said he sat down with the governor, representatives from the tribe and Rep. Jose Diaz (R-Miami) to negotiate the financial terms of the compact.

"It will go from \$1 billion to \$3 billion," Bradley said. "It goes into the general fund and I'd like to see the additional money go toward education."

Bradley opposes gaming expansion, especially in Northeast Florida and in Central Florida because, he said, "we have a family-friendly atmosphere and I don't want to see that disturbed." He also said he likes the idea of increasing revenue without raising taxes.

The governor's compact must be ratified by the Legislature. It is currently being debated in the Florida Senate Regulated Industries Committee, which is chaired by Bradley.

Civics teacher completes Supreme Court training

TALLAHASSEE - Lake Asbury Junior High seventh grade civics teacher Sharon Moore recently spent five days training at the Florida Supreme Court. The only teacher representing Clay County, Moore was one of 25 teachers from 18 Florida school districts who participated in the high court's Justice Teaching Institute Feb.

An annual event, teachers acted as attorneys and justices in a simulated Supreme Court oral argument activity. After the mock oral argument, participants heard the actual case being argued in front of the Supreme Court of Florida. The case was State verses Christopher Markus which originated in Jacksonville.

"We spent a great deal of time analyzing cases from the 1st and 3rd District Courts of Appeal that were similar to the Markus case as well as U.S. Supreme Court cases.

We were split into teams of attorneys and justices for our mock arguments and one team went to the Leon County Courthouse and my team participated in the Supreme Court of Florida. I played the role of one of the Justices and we were provided with judicial robes to wear. Judge Kelly J. McKibben of the 18th Judicial Circuit and Judge John Phillips of the 15th Judicial Circuit were our mentors providing guidance with the oral arguments and the cases we were analyzing."

Teachers learned about the structure, function and jurisdiction of the state courts, the role of judges, judicial decisionmaking, case precedent and the appellate process among other topics.

Moore completed the application and submitted it before the Dec. 1 due date.

"I was so incredibly excited when I received the letter from Justice R. Fred Lewis that I had been selected." Moore said.

Through the program, teachers also learned to incorporate a variety of criti-



cal thinking and constitutional application strategies in the classroom.

"Everything we experienced had a direct relation to what is being taught in our civics classrooms," Moore said. "We covered the structure and function of the courts, explored the Florida Constitution

and followed an actual case from the trial courts, through the appellate court system and played the parts of the Supreme Court in hearing oral arguments from both the petitioner and the respondent. The rule of

since he was elected in April 2013. He's a 63-year-old local realtor and business owner who is in the middle of key projects that are important to the community.



next recourse would be to take the matter to the court system. Raymond said he didn't want to embarrass the town, so he spoke with Town Manager Jim Hanson. who met with Town Attorney Sam Garrison and last Thursday's council meeting was called.

Garrison told council that Florida's "home rule" laws gives the appropriate local ordinance precedent and that's the reason for the meeting. He advised council that the local ordinance pertaining to the matter was silent, so council should decide the matter according to the Florida Election Code, which he said was not in dispute. Garrison also said council's decision is subject to judicial review. Capes could appeal, but said after the meeting that he didn't intend to file an appeal.

"I accept that I'm no longer a candidate; I'm not going to fight with it," Capes said.

In a following meeting, the town's planning and zoning board met to decide Moosehaven's request to rezone the property for a mix of residential and commercial use. Only three of the five members attended and a motion to approve the rezoning failed for lack of a seconding of the motion.

Mentors share real-life expertise with budding engineers


ORANGE PARK – At first glance, Doug Barrows' classroom at Orange Park High could look like any other classroom, however, it is a place where ideas and possibilities are put to the test.

Nine of Barrows' students are members of this year's national Architecture, Construction and Engineering team and are reviewing plans for a conceptual bridge they propose building in Downtown Jacksonville to alleviate traffic and improve the city.

"We're about to make a decision as to how wide the bridge would be, how many lanes and how wide each lane will be," said Joseph DeMarco of Orange Park, a mechanical engineer who mentors the students.

DeMarco looked back and forth between a two-dimensional design for "Unity Bridge" on a nearby computer screen and a sketch on a whiteboard. As conceived, the bridge has 10 lanes of traffic, including two for public transit. What seems like mundane details will be important when the students present their design to judges for the national competition in May.

They're hoping for the same kind of success that last year's team had when it designed the conceptual Harmony Springs

Health Clinic they proposed building in Green Cove Springs. Last year's project reaped a \$5,000 prize for students after they competed against 45 other student projects from across the nation. Orange Park students came out on top along with student teams from Chicago, and Frederick, Md.

DeMarco and other mentors provide ACE students with real-life skills, every-

thing needed to design a real-world building project from the ground up. Students study everything from current traffic patterns to population demographics to costs of materials in creating their project.

"One of the main reasons I like it is because it narrowed down what I wanted to do after high school if you're thinking of an engineering-based field," said junior Michael Mancil, 16. "I would like to become

an architect and this helps me by learning software and gets me out there. The software I'm learning now, I'm getting certified in. It'll help me get a job when I'm older, and help get me into college."

Volunteer mentors from professional firms work with students for at least two hours each week for four months leading up to the competition. During the sessions, students work in teams to create practical solutions for real-world projects as an effective way for students to experience the reality of what architects, contractors and engineers do during a typical working day.

"Specifically, right now, we're trying to design a bridge to help alleviate traffic from downtown Jacksonville, particularly on game days," said Kenneth Windham, 18, a junior mentor. Windham is now mentoring other students after he helped design last year's award-winning health clinic.

The Unity Bridge would run from Interstate 95 and the south bank of the St. Johns River across the river to the Metropolitan Park and EverBank Field. The plan also includes additional routes of the city's Skyway monorail system.

"The bridge would connect the loop of the Skyway, which is underutilized in Jacksonville and make it a complete circle," Mancil said. "We'll be adding three skyway

Deadline for property tax exemptions

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Clay County residents have until March 1 to apply for property tax exemptions.

Homestead exemption applicants must have legal or equitable title to the property as of Jan. 1, provide two documents to establish proof of residency, such as a driver's license or identification card, voter registration card or utility bill, etc. and provide the Social Security numbers of all applicants. Mobile home owners should also bring the title or registration to the mobile home.

Applications may be filed at the main Property Appraiser's office in Green Cove Springs, at their Orange Park branch office at 1518 Park Ave. or at one of their remote locations, which are listed on their website.

Qualified applicants who fail to apply by March 1st may still file an application with the Property Appraiser's office on or before the 25th day following the mailing of the Notice of Proposed Property Taxes, which typically occurs in mid-August. However, applicants must provide sufficient evidence or documentation to demonstrate extenuating circumstances as to why the application was not filed in a timely manner.

City decides to move skate park project

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS — In the late 1990s, there were a lot of skateboarders in Keystone Heights, according to Mayor Tony Brown. He said his kids are older now, so he isn't sure if skateboarding is as popular now as it was then, but he said he still sees skateboarders in parking lots and around town.

The city has periodically looked at building a skateboard park for 16 years and the latest plan to build one in the nature park on Lawrence Boulevard has been scrapped in order to build the park in a better location – the original spot city leaders reviewed in 2000.

"Back then, the insurance costs were too high and council chose not to proceed," said Lynn Rutkowski, city clerk. "Then, they were looking at the nature park across the street from city hall, but have decided that wasn't the best location."

While planning to build the park near a gazebo where weddings take place, the city was awarded a \$50,000 state grant, which it now forfeits, but Brown said the city will re-apply.

"A couple years ago, we went for a \$50,000 grant and budgeted \$30,000 to build the skate park and we chose the nature park, but people have weddings over there, so we decided that wouldn't be the best location, Brown said.

"The grant specifically goes with that property, so we will get our ducks in a row

at the other location, which is at the corner of Nightingale Street and Sunrise Boulevard, then we'll re-apply."

Brown said the city already owns the property, which is home to a warehouse. Brown said the parcel already has a half basketball court and is large enough to expand into a full recreation park. He said, in the future, a splash park may be built on it but the city has no plans in place yet.

"Years ago, we couldn't build a skateboard park there because of the liability costs, but things have changed over the last 15 years and we can do it now," he said. "So, the skateboard park project is not dead – we just needed to make sure to build it at the right location."

stations. We'll be extending the lines down Bay Street from the station right across from the Acosta [Bridge] and we'll be adding one on the South Bank. We'll be adding one on the North Bank right near the stadium. The bridge would also alleviate traffic from I-95 and the Hart Bridge Expressway and Martin Luther King [Boulevard]."

Part of the academy of engineering and computer science, Orange Park High's ACE team selected the bridge project after reviewing other options. First, ideas came to fruition as sketches. The drawing evolved into a two-dimensional model using computer software. The Unity Bridge would alleviate traffic and create an iconic path for residents to exercise and enjoy views of the city. Each team will utilize visual boards to further explain and show the idea.

Their design acts as three bridges, one for cars with two lanes running each direction, two lanes for the proposed extended Skyway route, and a pedestrian bridge for bikers, joggers and walkers. To comply with the American with Disabilities Act and to make the bridge inclusive for everyone, the bridge design has a two percent grade.

"We were able to implement the two percent grade throughout," Windham said. "We designed it so that once it hits the main span of the bridge it goes up into a spiral and it evens it out so it stretches across the main span and ends in a spiral and keeps going to the end."

ACE students at OPHS exemplify what the Clay County School District academies strive to do. Part of the academy philosophy is to also provide students with knowhow on such things as presentations skills, collaborating in teams and workplace decorum. Students are also mentored on resume-writing and dressing for success. Since October, three groups within the team have been working on the project in preparation for the presentation.

"We are summarizing the purpose behind the design of our bridge and why we should build it downtown to boost the economy and alleviate traffic," said senior Christopher Osborne, 17. "Right now, we're all working together. We break it down to each portion, the pedestrian, the cars and the Skyway and what each one will give to the city."

Each ACE team has two or three mentors who meet with students for about two hours each week for 16 weeks. Every aspect, from the budget to the visual boards, is created by the students from scratch.

"We design for real people, for real projects and we make it a very realistic project with materials, budgets and technology," DeMarco said. "We look at the profile of who is going to be using the project. We have to figure out what our own limits are based on what the community can afford. Using all of these talents, we are trying to put together a realistic design here and we have professional mentors that are actually gaging whether this design makes sense. We're talking about realistic struc-

tural engineering issues here using concrete and steel."

DeMarco said to create a successful project requires a sense of empathy.

"Envision yourself as being the owner of that home or the person that's going to give you \$1 billion to build this bridge and think about it from both sides," DeMarco said. "Put yourself in those shoes and you'll get a lot of out of it."

The students are learning more than software design or presentation skills. The students mature into young professionals in a matter of months.

"It builds conversational skills, networking skills and, definitely, teamwork," Mancil said. "Without teamwork, this project gets nowhere."

Project Coordinator Destiny Childress, 17, is one of a few female team members and said she learned to speak up in a room full of men in addition to learning how to adapt and earn trust as a leader.

"Sometimes it can be overwhelming," Childress said. "Every guy in this room has a very loud opinion so you have to make sure your opinion is known."

Twenty-one students in the local ACE teams are simultaneously working on a separate bid utilizing three buildings called the Laura Street Trio including the Florida Life Building, the Bisbee Building and the old Florida National Bank.

"They get a real request for proposal just like any contractor would and they're submitting like they're a developer or engineering firm," said Brock Durig, a Navy engineer working as a mentor for the local ACE students. "Then it gets judged on cost and design. They have to come up with a plan for all three, but they only have to do a design for one of them."

The local ACE team are broken down into smaller teams of about seven students each.

Orange Park High student Catherine Bruns has been working with her team for a month to come up with a few good ideas. Her favorite idea includes turning a nearby park into a music venue.

"We're brainstorming right now," Bruns said. "There's a big park area right outside and we're thinking of maybe making that a little amphitheater performance area. They could have music lessons. There's also talk of condos or a bookstore, library combo."

Bruns' experience working with ACE has solidified her future plans to pursue a STEM-based field in college.

"It's real experience so we know what it's actually like," Bruns said. "I think I'll pursue something math or science related. I enjoy working in group settings like this and brainstorming and coming up with group projects."

Garden 'Refresh' to Greet Spring

Cooler temperatures make February the perfect time to get a major landscape project done. While many gardeners are forced to take winters off, Floridians have the great advantage of being able to get out there year-round. Whether you're looking for a big change or a small spruce-up, here are 10 ideas for winter projects that refresh your outdoors and greet spring in style.

Clear Out: It can be hard, but some-

times the biggest favor we can do our landscape is to let Overcrowded shrubs, ill-suited trees. thinning turf, and struggling plants are common events as selections fail to thrive or landscapes grow in over time. If vou've been on the fence about whether it's to be trees or turf, for example,

or that plant that's never looked good, then get off the fence and make a decision. By letting go of what's not working, your landscape will start to shape up instead of limping along.

Be Bold: Add color for an invigorating effect in the landscape. Bold colors that complement your décor can really liven up the landscape. A new shade can be introduced in many ways that creates eyecatching displays: consider adding color to a garden gate, a set of pots, a path of pavers, or an interesting piece of outdoor



furniture. Best of all, adding color with a painting project can be a quick weekend effort with big impact.

Tone Down: If bold isn't the right statement for your style and space, consider simplifying an area for a new look. Gardens in simple color palettes can really make a strong statement. You can work with only contrasting shades of green to create interesting compositions in the garden, or try flowers and accent foliage in all one color to create a look that's sophisticated and calming.

Go Natural: A more relaxed appearance is a growing trend in landscapes. Letting go of the fussy, clipped look — and the time spent pruning and mowing — can benefit your eyes, your back and your wallet. Combine ornamental grasses and perennial wildflowers with trees and shrubs that don't require major pruning such as hollies and viburnum. Keep it to a few species to start, selecting for year-round interest to create an informal look with style.

Add Eats: If you haven't yet gardened with edibles, make 2016 your year to bring fresh food a little closer to your doorstep. Annual vegetables look great in beds and

planters. Greens are great – kale, lettuce, mustard and Swiss chard can be harvested a few leaves at a time to keep the eyes and the table happy. Add to borders and planters along with herbs like chives and oregano, or create a living edible arrangement with edible flowers such as pansy and nasturtium

Sip in Style: If eggplant and broccoli aren't up your garden alley, then consider plants that help your garden flavor liquid refreshments. Teas to enjoy hold or cold can be brewed from lemon balm, lemon grass, mints of all flavors. Potted citrus can provide juice for the table in winter; plant old Florida favorite Roselle (Hibiscus sabdariffa) in spring to enjoy tart cranberry-like juice in late summer and fall. Native Yaupon Holly has caffeinated leaves that can be brewed for a zippy garden-fresh treat. Crafters can even try their own Muscadine grapes (https://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/ hs100) for wine or hops (https://edis.ifas. ufl.edu/ep488) for beer with a specialized sipping garden.

Move In: Indoor plants are the 'next frontier' of gardening. Gardening indoors can extend the growing season and provide

the perfect setting for gardeners when the weather's not cooperating. It can also help garden lovers with a yearning for year-round tropical color, like croton and philodendron. Plants can help clean your air indoors as well by transforming part of your abode into a green oasis, you can reap the benefits of year-round greenery indoors.

Read Up: Finding the right plants will be easier when you make informed decisions. Before buying plants, check out their needs for soil, sun, water and space and make sure your yard is a good match. Having a hard time choosing? Community resources such as your local library, Extension office and Master Gardeners can help you make selections that stand the

from more than a dozen accounts of individuals and entities for which he was supposed to be providing accounting services" and funneled the funds into a shell company called SA III Partners, a company he owned and created to facilitate the thefts.

Under the judge's ruling, Hargnett's sentence will be reduced by 796 days, which was the time he has been held in the Duval County Pre-Trial Detention Center. He will remain in the county jail until transfer to a state prison.

In the months leading to his sentencing hearing, Hargnett's attorneys worked to collect 49 letters from his friends, family, pastors and other community leaders asking for lenience in the sentencing process. One of the letters cites how Hargnett first disclosed his thefts to his employer – Demetree Brothers Inc. – on August 29, 2013, months before his December 6, 2013 arrest.

"He was remorseful and truthful, though he was not certain of the true magnitude of his wrongdoing," states the sentencing memo. "He pledged to work with his victims to determine the precise amount that he had stolen and to pay back as much as possible from the liquidation of his assets."

Court records show that Hargnett has paid back \$5.91 million in restitution as a result of selling off various assets he accumulated since 2006, the year the theft began. For example, one asset was an estate off County Road 209 in Clay County

that included two houses on 19 acres that sold for \$1.575 million. A second home in the Country Club of Orange Park, sold for \$385,000. A third house in Keystone Heights was sold off for \$338,968.

According to court records, Hargnett began paying back some of the stolen money before his arrest.

"Before December 6, 2013, he made restitution payments totaling approximately \$2,325,000 to the victims, and transferred ownership interests in business ventures in the approximate amount of \$225,000, states the sentencing memo.

"For the 100 days before he was arrested, Mr. Hargnett cooperated with the victims (directly or through counsel) to ascertain and mitigate the damage he had caused. He was candid and truthful with his employers over this extended period of time. He demonstrated sincere remorse."

In a three-page letter to the court, Hargnett asked for "undeserved leniency," while recounting a life of helping others and spending other people's money to make donations to various ministries, churches, private schools and nonprofit organizations.

"I cared for people and helped when asked," he writes. "But even these acts were self-serving and vain. As people or organizations looked to me for help, I felt needed, important, worthwhile. Inside, I knew it was a sham, but I couldn't stop."

Hargnett described his crimes much like an addiction saying he couldn't "break away from it," despite trying several times. His letter also explains the raw truth of how he betrayed people who treated him like family.

"I have hurt my victims more than I ever imagined, causing a dear old man, my friend who I cared for deeply, such pain and anguish in his last few years that I cannot forgive myself," states Hargnett's letter. "He trusted me as a member of his family, and I could barely look him in the eye the last time I saw him. I could not attend his funeral, nor even send a card with my sympathy and respect to his family lest it appear shallow and self-serving."


Hargnett also explains the betrayal and harm his theft caused his immediate family. His now ex-wife Kimberli remarried and moved from Florida with their 10-year-old daughter. "It's as if her daddy has dropped out of her life, abandoned her," Hargnett


writes.

However, Hargnett's letter is not all contrition. In an almost bragging manner, Hargnett explains that had he not re-traced his financial chicanery for the authorities, it would have taken years and multiple experts to unravel.

"I meticulously re-created records and identified all of the illegal transfers and the account sources," Hargnett writes. "It might have taken a forensic accountant or the State Attorney's Office years to piece all that together, but I had to try to begin to atone for what I had done."

Neither attorneys for the state or the defense agreed to comment for this story. Under Florida law, Hargnett must serve 85 percent of the 20-year sentence.





Rumor dispelled about school superintendent candidate

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A candidate for Superintendent of Clay County Schools said there is no truth to the rumor she is being supported by incumbent School Superintendent Charlie Van Zant Jr.

Rebekah Shively – who holds a doctorate in educational leadership – declared

her intentions to run for superintendent in January, making the superintendent's fourrace a person race this year. Running as No Party Affiliation, Shively will face Van Zant, Democratic candidate Marion Keith **Nichols**

and Republican Addison Davis. Shively is Teacher of the Year at Bannerman Learning Center where she teaches literacy, writing and journalism.

She said there is no truth to the allegation.

"Absolutely not – I haven't discussed my candidacy at school, for one thing, and

there is no filing fee. There is a qualifying fee that is \$5,000 for candidates with no party affiliation. I'm qualifying by petition and I'm in the process of gathering the 1,361 signatures now," Shively said.

Candidates can declare their intention to seek public office at any time prior to the official qualifying period, which runs from noon June 20 until noon June 24 this year.

"Other than being an employee of Clay County Schools, I'm not affiliated with Mr. Van Zant in any way – he has not communicated with me and he has not given me anything," Shively said.

Meanwhile, Clay County Superintendent of Elections Chris Chambless confirmed there is no filing fee at this point in the process and said he doesn't believe the rumor, either.

"There's nothing that precludes Charlie Van Zant from giving a contribution to his opponent, but in my mind, that's something that has never taken place. What this amounts to is just a rumor – qualifying will be in June and a portion of a filing fee could be paid then," Chambless said.

Meanwhile, Van Zant said the rumor was not true.

"That's the craziest thing I've ever heard," Van Zant said.

Hawley takes over Fleming Island lacrosse

JACKSONVILLE – Patrick Schreiber and Sam Barrington combined for eight goals as Fleming Island gave newly-named head coach John Hawley with a 20-0 smashing of host Flagler Palm Coast on opening night on Feb. 9.


Hawley is replacing Fleming Island's previous head coach, Jeff LaVangie, who went 33-14 in three years at as the Golden Eagles head coach before accepting an assistant coaching position at Shorter University in Rome, Ga., in the offseason.

Hawley, a retired U.S. Navy neurosurgeon, was a high school All-American lacrosse player and then a letterman at the U.S. Naval Academy. He has been an assistant coach at various times with the Golden Eagles, so is familiar with their personnel. Like LaVangie before him, Hawley has a son on the team. Junior Jack Hawley plays middie for the Golden Eagles, and is expected to take up much of the scoring and play-making slack left by the graduation of Hayden LaVangie, who is now playing for Jacksonville University. The younger LaVangie led Fleming Island with 52 goals and added 22 assists in 2015.

Though the Golden Eagles also lost their entire starting defense from last year, this year's squad is loaded with seniors and has a chance to better their 12-5 mark from a year ago. Hawley has installed a new offensive philosophy.

"We would like to become more of a pass-oriented team, rather than relying on isolation," explained Hawley. "I would like to see more passing before dodging."

Hawley hopes to get offensive produc-

tion from multiple players. Hawley will be counted on, along with seniors Devan Marquis, Will Yarbrough and Nick Horrell. Senior Sam Barrington will move from middie to attack, where he will share playing time with Kirby Gracia and brothers Danny and Patrick Schreiber. Barrington led all scorers with five goals Tuesday night, while Patrick Schreiber and Gracia each notched three scores.

"Sam is a bigger, physical kid, and a very good dodger, while Patrick Schreiber is so savvy, and has such a high lacrosse I.Q.," said Hawley. "I am expecting a lot from them this year."

Fleming Island led 13-0 at halftime and used the second half to let their younger

players gain experience. Freshman Andrew Schreiber slipped a bounce shot past Bulldogs goalie Matthew Trecki late in the third quarter, becoming the third Schreiber family member to score in the game.

Despite the aforementioned loss of four senior defensemen, the Golden Eagles should be difficult to score against. Seniors Ryan Futch, Isaac Funyak, Andy Zima and Micah Trent all have plenty of varsity experience with the long stick. Depending on their progress, freshmen Addison deAbreu-Reese and Justin Szafranski may see a lot of playing time, which would allow Futch and Zima to play long-stick middie. The e Golden Eagles killed two penalties without allowing a shot on Tuesday, and allowed

only one shot on goal on the night.

An area of concern for Hawley is finding a capable face off man. Barrington has face off experience, but Fleming Island will largely rely on freshman Max Michaels and junior Elijah Ramirez, who is new to the game.

"Face off is such a critical part of the game," said Hawley. "If you do not win face offs, it is hard to possess the ball."

Michaels and Ramirez played well Tuesday, combining to win 12 of 16 ball drops, though stiffer challenges await.

Three-year starter Ryan Kelly returns to tend the net for the Golden Eagles. However, Jason Kunath, a fellow senior who would start at virtually any other school in the area and has already committed to continue his career at Monmouth College, will see significant action. Kelly saved the only shot on goal mustered by the Bulldogs Tuesday.

"I have two very good goalies," said Hawley. "Ryan is being pushed by Jason, who put in a lot of work in the offseason."

The Florida High School Athletic Association has realigned the lacrosse districts, and Fleming Island finds itself jumping from the frying pan into the fire. The Golden Eagles will no longer compete with long-time nemesis Jacksonville Bolles, but will now collide with new district member Ponte Vedra, North Florida's premier lacrosse program. Traditionally strong programs Bartram Trail, Creekside and Nease round out the Golden Eagles' district.

"I would say it is the toughest district north of Orlando," said Hawley said of the change. "It is good for us, as it will help us develop." The Golden Eagles travel to Ponte Vedra on February 17, and their first home game is February 22 at 7:00 p.m. against Jacksonville Lee.

After a quick strike from Interlachen, Keystone Heights responded with two runs in the fourth off a two-run single by O'Steen.



started almost disastrous with an 83 putting her seemingly out of reach of top finisher Megan Furtney of Illinois who topped the field with a 77 round.

Whataburger shooting ruled 'Stand Your Ground'

FLEMING ISLAND — Nearly two years after a fatal shooting at a fast food restaurant drive-thru, State Attorney Angela Corey's office has released a report citing the shooting was a justifiable use of deadly force.

At approximately 2 a.m. on January 1, 2014, Matthew Aston, 29, of Fleming Island, pulled into the drive-thru at a fast food restaurant, but an oddly-parked car was blocking the lane. Aston went around it to the area where orders are placed when Daniel Grady, 22, of Fleming Island,

the passenger in the other car, started cursing and flipping Aston off, according to the report, which was published in November 2015 but only made public in recent weeks.

Assistant State Attorneys Jonathan Sacks and Bernardo de la Rionda wrote the report, stating that as Aston pulled up to place his order in his GMC pickup, the Oldsmobile driven by William Cloutier pulled forward to the stop sign, bringing the two

vehicles closer together. Aston's passenger and fiancé, Nicole McPhun, told Aston one of the men in the other car had a gun, according to the report.

The assistant state attorneys wrote that video surveillance from the restaurant "corroborates that the driver of the black Oldsmobile opened the door and was facing the shooter's vehicle, Although the video does not capture what was in Cloutier's hands, based on the positions of both Cloutier and McPhun, McPhun would have had the ability to see a firearm."

The report, which reads like a summary of a 60-page report from the Clay County Sheriff's Office, states that "Grady left the front passenger side of the black Oldsmo-

bile and ran toward his vehicle. At the same time, Aston exited his truck and stood by his door. Aston stated he heard Grady say 'you want to die?' as he ran toward his truck, As Grady ran around to confront Aston, Aston fired one shot into Grady's chest, which ultimately killed Grady at the scene."

More details of the encounter are included in the sheriff's office report, which states Aston was ordering food when he saw Grady continue to approach him, so he removed his pistol from his backpack and chambered a round in the .40 caliber Glock.

"He exited his truck and pointed the pistol at Mr. Grady as he advanced. Mr. Aston said that he told Mr. Grady to 'stop' when he was still several yards from his truck. Mr. Grady continued to come toward Mr. Aston. When he reached the back of the truck, Mr. Aston fired a single shot, striking Mr. Grady in the chest. Mr. Grady fell to the ground next to the truck tire," the report reads.

The report said Cloutier hesitated, then got in his car and drove off, looping around the restaurant. The report states Aston "thought perhaps he was going to shoot Ms. McPhun and he told her to get in the truck." He told employees to call police while McPhun was already on her phone with 911.

The other vehicle came back around and "Aston feared that the driver would come back and shoot at them or bring others back, so he took off," the report states. He told employees they were going home and McPhun stayed on the phone with dispatch while on the way, so police would not think they were fleeing the scene.

According to the sheriff's report, Aston told deputies that Grady continued to advance at him despite Aston pointing a pistol at Grady. Aston told deputies he had children to think about and had McPhun with him to protect. He told deputies "he was in fear for his and Ms. McPhun's lives," according to the sheriff's report.

When Aston fired, he was standing in the truck's doorway and Grady was near the tail light. Aston told deputies "two more steps and he could have got me" and that he

was worried what may happen if Grady could wrestle the gun away from Aston, had Aston not fired before Grady got close enough to grapple for the firearm.

Aston also told deputies he had taken a concealed weapons class and was familiar with the associated law.

"He said that it was clear that Mr. Grady was coming directly at him and threatening him and his fiancée. He gave Mr. Grady an opportunity to stop and he did not. He continued to advance to within feet of him. He was in fear for his safety. The other individuals had instigated the encounter and continued the encounter by following him and getting out of their vehicle yelling rather than exiting the parking lot when he was ordering his food," the report reads.

Clay Today requested to speak with both Sacks and de la Rionda, however, interview requests were denied by Corey's Director of Communications, Jackelyn Barnard, stating via email that neither of them are available.

Former Fourth Circuit State Attorney Harry Shorestein said he wasn't directly familiar with this case but said Florida's Stand Your Ground law is an extension of the Castle Doctrine, which permits using deadly force inside a person's home without retreat.

"Very simply stated, if we have an argument outside your home and you have the ability to flee, the law said you must do so, but you never had to do so inside your home. Essentially, Stand Your Ground gives the shooter the same rights outside his home that always existed inside the home," he said.

He said the use of force has to be reasonable and this is where prosecutors used their judgment based on the facts of the case when deciding to not file charges.

"Had this gone to a jury, they would have looked at whether this was reasonable, which gets really muddy when you look at police shootings because they can use deadly force even against someone who's fleeing the use of deadly force. Shorestein said.

House squatters arrested

ORANGE PARK – Four people were arrested for burglary after police used a bat-

tering ram to enter a residence they were living in without the owner's permission.

On Feb. 10, officials from the Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Jacksonville residents Amanda Sue Prevatt, 36, Hunter Ryan Webb, 16,

Shanna Ann Carithers, 23 and Shawn Dale Pons, 30, of Keystone Heights, who were squatting in a residence in the 900 block of Doshire Drive.

According to the police report, the homeowner's

neighbor alerted the owner and her daughter that someone might be living in the home. The owner moved away from Clay

County to live with her daughter for health reasons. Police confirmed with the homeowner that her neighbor was the only person who had a key to the residence or permission to enter

"The victim stated all of her person-

al property is still inside of her residence and nobody should be inside of her house," and that her neighbor "should be the only one with access to her residence," the report stated

Officers obtained

consent from the homeowner to enter the residence. After observing one person inside the residence, police repeatedly asked the subjects to come to the front door but they refused. Police tried to open windows and doors, "but the locks on the door were new and they key would not work," and ended up using one blow from a battering ram to open the front door.

The front door opened and contact was made with Webb, who "began to walk out of the residence, but refused to comply with verbal commands and had to be restrained and placed on the ground," according to the report. After Webb began to resist and attempted to get up off the ground, he was placed into custody. He was transported to a juvenile detention center in Jacksonville.

Shortly after Webb exited the home, Carithers also exited and was taken into custody.

While clearing the residence, Pons allegedly exited a side room and was given verbal commands to lay on the ground. He was then placed into custody.

Police entered the garage and began to clear the area when Prevatt "was hiding

behind a piece of plywood in the corner," the report stated. Numerous times, she was told to get on the ground but she refused. Trying to place her on the ground, one official grabbed Prevatt "and they fell to the ground" and was taken into custody.

Prevatt had allegedly been living in the residence for about three weeks without permission and changed the locks and was using utilities paid for by the home owner.

Each received one charge of burglary to a structure, a felony, and resisting an officers without violence, a misdemeanor.

Middleburg man in two-vehicle crash

STARKE – A Middleburg man is in serious condition after his motorcycle struck another vehicle.

Just after 8 a.m. on Feb. 12, Gilbert B. Garrett, 45, of Middleburg was traveling through the intersection of State Road 16 and County Road 225 when Brandi Thorton, 22, of Lawtey, Fla. turned left to head

east onto state road 16.




Lewd battery arrest



"At one point, [Ramirez] became so upset he logged onto [the] victim's account and posted a nude photo of [the] victim on her Facebook timeline," the report stated. The victim was in ninth or 10th grade at the time of the incident.

Ramirez remained in the Clay County Jail with bond set at \$75,006.

Middleburg woman charged with child abuse

MIDDLEBURG - One day before her 34th birthday, a woman was arrested for child abuse.

She has since been released from the Clay County Jail on an undisclosed bond.

Teen arrested on pot charge

FLEMING ISLAND - A student at Fleming Island High was recently arrested for allegedly selling marijuana from his home.

On Feb. 11, the Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Jeffery Dean Bailey II, 18,

for two counts of sale and delivery of marijuana, once in October and once in November.

On two separate occasions, Bailey conducted a narcotics transaction with an undisclosed person at his home at the 4000 block of

At press time, he remained in the Clay County Jail where his bond is set at \$102,523.

Teen charged with striking officer

ORANGE PARK - A student from Bannerman Learning Center was arrested after he allegedly stole a PlayStation game console.

On Jan. Eugene Christian Jackman, 16, was arrested for burglary or an unoccupied dwelling while unarmed, resisting an officer and battery on a law enforcement officer.

Officials from the Clay County Sheriff's Christopher Jackman Office were alerted



when the victim's recently purchased PlayStation 4 game console, remote control and four games were missing from his room. Reviewing security footage of his home using his smartphone, the victim confirmed that Jackman was seen entering the victim's home on the security footage.

When officials approached Jackman. "he turned around and started to run across the street," according to the report. After a brief chase, Jackman was tackled to the ground. According to the report, Jackman resisted by kicking the officer in the face multiple times and attempted to run again, forcing the officer to use "distractionary strikes while yelling stop resisting," the report stated. Jackman was cleared for detention at Orange Park Medical Center and transported a juvenile detention center in Jacksonville.

Oakleaf motorcyclist dies

OAKLEAF – The Florida Highway Patrol investigated a solo motorcycle crash Monday night at 10:18 p.m. on Oakleaf Plantation Parkway that resulted in a fatality.

FHP said Jeffery Rashad, 36, who has an Orange Park address, was heading north on the parkway when he lost control of his 2014 BMW Model RR motorcycle and collided with a concrete utility pole in the center median.

According to the FHP news release, Rashad was pronounced dead at the scene by Clay County Fire Rescue and no other vehicles were involved in the accident.

Two Clay men in Bradford **County crash**

HAMPTON. Fla. – Two Middleburg men received minor injuries in a two-vehicle crash in Bradford County last weekend.

The Florida Highway Patrol reported that Leroy Jennings, 69, of Middleburg, was driving a 2016 Honda Accord on U.S. Highway 301 near S.W. 90th Street in Hampton on Feb. 13 when the crash occurred at 11 a.m.

Jennings was traveling north in the right travel lane while Billy Gifford, 62, of Middleburg was heading north in the left lane driving a 2005 Mack semi-tractor trailer. FHP said the left rear side of the Honda collided with the right front side of the Mack truck after one of the vehicles traveled across the center lane and initiated contact.

After the collision, the Honda rotated counter clockwise landing in front of the tractor-trailer, which resulted in a head-on collision.

After they collided, the Honda overturned on its side before coming to rest facing east in the median. The crash caused the semi to overturn on its right side causing lime rock to be scattered on the highway.

Both drivers received minor injuries and did not require medical treatment.

Bannerman student charged with pushing teacher's aide

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - An Orange Park teen is charged with a felony count of battery on a school officer after an incident at Bannerman Learning Center.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office reports that Travis Lamar Jackson, 14, of Orange Park was talking during class on Feb. 12. When the teacher asked an aide to remove the student from the classroom, the situation escalated.

According to the police report, Jackson was being disruptive to a point they had to call in the CCSO school resource officer to the classroom. When the officer arrived, he found the victim restraining Jackson with his hands behind his back. Staff and others got Jackson to calm down before taking to the principal's office.

According to the report, when the teracher's aide got to the room to remove Jackson, the child was angry, was cursing and stormed out of the room toward the front office. He demanded to see the principal, who was in a meeting and Jackson was told to sit down and wait. He attempted to leave the office and the aide stood in front of Jackson, who pushed the aide with open hands.

Jackson remained upset and was later arrested for battery on a school official and taken to a juvenile detention center in Jacksonville.

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

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


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
