## Bradley's strict bill for medical marijuana has competition


TALLAHASSEE – The latest stab on how legislators hope to regulate the forthcoming medical marijuana market comes from a 62-page Florida Senate bill aimed at a freer, more inclusive market for entrepre-

Senate Bill 614 filed by St. Petersburg Republican Sen. Jeff Brandes on Feb 1. would repeal the existing Florida statue governing low-THC medical marijuana and replace it with regulations he says look much closer to the easy access and open

market values voters approved by passing Amendment 2 last November.

Entrepreneurs and advocacy groups have lauded the bill as a step closer to the ballot initiative Floridians supported by 71 percent.

"[This bill] is exactly what the framers of Amendment 2 were looking for.'





Health could issue one license per 25,000 residents in a county.

Under this bill, Clay County could have eight licensed medical marijuana companies operating within the district.

The bill also creates separate license

types for businesses who want to either grow, process, transport or dispense medical marijuana. An MMTC is free to possess any type of license or a combination of multiple types of licenses.

The bill gives county and municipal governments the power to bar dispensaries in their districts, but also allows for an MMTC to deliver direct to patients, guaranteeing the medicine for patients who live in dispensary deserts.

"The overwhelming support of Amendment 2 was a strong mandate that

#### Pickleball anyone?

## County to install new courts for growing sport

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - The future of parks, recreation, leisure activities and ecotourism dominated the Feb. 14 meeting of the Clay County Board of County Commissioners, with fans of pickleball scoring some winning points.

Commissioners listened to a variety of presentations from information on bike paths, trails, blueways and roads to Airbnb bed taxes and support for golf marketing and pickleball fans.

While many of the discussions were basically for informational purposes, some became action items. Those included sup-

port for pickleball courts and the continuation of funding for the promotion of the golfing industry in Clay County.

Pickleball fans were among the biggest winners of the night as they saw the BCC approve, by a unanimous 5-0 vote, the conversion of a set of tennis courts at Ronnie Van Zant Park in Lake Asbury. The conversion of two tennis courts will result in six pickleball courts, said James Householder, facilities director for the county.


Pickleball is especially popular with senior citizens because it is lower impact than tennis, a sport it resembles, said



## Free black family, the Foresters, a lasting example of triumph in face of adversity

In 1853, family patriarch, Cyrus Forester had managed to purchase his and his son Louis' freedom from a supportive plantation owner. They began homesteading in the settlement of Magnolia Mills just north of Green Cove Springs.

Only three or four years later, the two had significant holdings of livestock and most of the land, including an additional purchase by Louis, was in crop production. They had also purchased freedom for the rest of the family and Louis' new wife.

Threatening stirrings of war were in the air and Cyrus was nearing 85 years old and felt the need to pass the torch to lead the family. He foresaw the threat of the family shattering in tense times without a clear leader and called the adult children together. He gave the land to Louis with the understanding that he would care for his parents and, when his father died, distribute portions to his brothers and sisters

as he saw fit.

As their neighbors around them, mostly white, the Foresters stayed close to home

and stayed alert to goings and doings around them. Union ships were cruising up and down the St. Johns River; Confederate

troops were in and out of the area. Both armies seemed to see Magnolia as a buffet of forage they could use at will.

Word of a Rebel troop raid to steal the large stored grain crop, abduct the men for forced labor and the family women to work in hospitals reached Louis. He waved down the Union gunboat Uncus to shell the raiders and transport the family to safety.

Sadly, safety was achieved at a high price. Shelling completed, the ships' crew came ashore like a hoard of locusts and allowed the family to take only token possessions. By the next day, when they arrived in Fernandina, two men's great coats and the family's \$311 in gold coins tied in their mother's apron had disappeared.

The three boys served in the Union military, one, Isadore, gave his life. The family

## County conducting survey about parks

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Looking for a good spot to play your favorite sport? How about a place to go where you can learn how to play chess, or where your children could go to learn safety rules for riding a bike?

Now's your chance, Clay County, to let your community leaders know what you would really like to see in a long-range plan for parks and recreation in the area—and maybe even take a chance to think out of the box a bit.

The Clay County Parks and Recreation department is currently conducting a survey to help determine just what residents here would like to see in their quest for good parks and recreational activities, said Michelle Sharp, the county's new Parks and Recreation department manager. Long a subject of the Board of County Commissioners, a parks and recreation master plan became one of the top choices of commissioners for action when they were asked by Chairman Wayne Bolla to rank their priorities when he took over as head of the BCC late last year.

With all that in mind, the survey is in-

tended to provide feedback from the community as the Parks and Recreation department works on a master parks plan, Sharp said. The survey can be taken online, and can be found at http://www.claycountygov.com/departments/parks-and-recreation/park-survey.

"There's nothing like hearing what the actual taxpayers actually want," said James Householder, facilities manager for Clay County (parks and recreation facilities fall under his responsibilities). Householder said the goal will be to provide a 10-year master plan for parks, looking at current use levels, population growth, maintenance needs, what people would like to see in the future, costs and how to pay for what is desired.

For Householder, one of the most important aspects of a parks survey and proposed master plan is to look at the big picture, taking into consideration the needs of all groups in the area.

"We have to look at our county as a whole," he said. "We should be being all inclusive," he added, saying that "thinking out of the box," and beyond the traditional amenities such as recreation facilities that serve athletic associations and ball sports might be a way to serve a larger popula-



tion.

That could include younger groups and more mature senior groups. Things from a community center where people could simply meet or take chess lessons or let their children learn bicycle safety rules to courts for pickleball — a new tennis/badminton-type of sport that's become very popular — could be ideas that come out of the survey, he said.

"It's our job to weigh it out," Householder said. "We have to be careful that we

serve all of our citizens."

Bolla said he hoped to schedule a workshop on a parks and recreation master plan in early March, using the survey results as a basis for the plan.

"I hope people will give the survey the full attention it deserves because it's going to help decide how we're going to spend our money for parks over the next 10 years," he said. "We just want to make sure we get the biggest bang for our buck."

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#### Here's a look at some of the appropriations asks by Northeast Florida lawmakers

As legislators begin filing appropriations bills in Tallahassee, we are starting

to get an idea what success (or failure) will look like for Northeast Florida this Session.

Two of the more compelling requests recently came from Jacksonville Rep. Clay Yarborough, who filed a pair of bills totaling \$10 million for the University of North Florida.

House Bill 2269 would earmark \$3 million for renovations of Schultz Hall on campus, which currently houses the Army ROTC and the history department.

The renovation would help students by increasing capacity to serve those pursuing "targeted business degrees."

House Bill 2271 would devote \$7 million to renovations of the science and engineering building on campus to better serve chemistry and physics students. A Harvard study in 2015 confirmed the need for this renovation, which was heard at November's meeting of the Duval County Legislative Delegation.

In addition to these asks, Yarborough also had two public safety appropriations.

HB 2331 would commit \$635,941 to a pedestrian and bicycle safety improvement project at the request of the city of Jacksonville.

Ballard Partners is handling the lobbying for this one, which would improve the safety situation of seven of the most dangerous crossings in Jacksonville – all of which are on state roads.

HB 2333 allocates \$631,072 to cross-walk countdown improvement, and the Fiorentino Group is carrying this measure, which would replace "Walk/Don't Walk" signs with "countdown heads" — 1,924 of them, all at dangerous intersections on state roads.

Of course, there's more to Northeast Florida than Clay Yarborough.


Rep. Cord Byrd, who represents part of Duval and all of Nassau, seeks \$375,000 in HB 2165 – the same amount as in last year's budget – for the Girl Matters: Continuity of Care Model.

The Girl Matters program, an initiative of the Deloris Barr Weaver Policy Center, is intended to prevent young women dropping out of school and turning to lives of crime, offering a therapeutic framework to mitigate the risk posed by mental health issues.

For every 30 girls kept out of the maw of the criminal justice system, the state saves \$831,000.

#### 5 years ago, 2012

- U.S. District Court Judge Roy Dalton Jr. ruled that two county commission ordinances were constitutional. The ordinances were designed to restrict alcohol sales at night clubs on Wells Road in the wake of shootings on that corridor.
- Orange Park Town Council voted to outsource its garbage and recycling pickup to Advance Disposal Co. of Jacksonville after years of operating that service using town employees.
- On a 3-2 vote, the Board of County Commissioners approved a land use change that would allow developer Ken De-Busk to build homes on the old golf course at the Ravines in Middleburg.

#### 10 years ago, 2007

Floridians demand fundamental change to the way we regulate medical marijuana," Brandes said in a prepared statement.

Fleming Island Republican Sen. Rob Bradley's previous implementation bill aimed to place more barriers on new businesses seeking to enter the market by requiring each company be able to take the medicine from seed to storefront.

Critics say vertical-integration in the medical marijuana industry — where a business must perform the cultivation, processing, shipping and sale of marijuana — creates a monopoly where only the most capitalized companies can take part.

"The laws on the books today promote a state-sanctioned cartel system that limits competition, inhibits access, and results in higher prices for patients," Brandes said. "This legislation outright repeals Florida's defective law."

Brandes' bill would break up the vertical-integration that seven companies currently licensed by the state have adopted into their business model.

"I'm not against the companies that are advocating for vertical integration," Sessa said. "[But] if you put limitations on who is going to be able to open these businesses, then you're limiting that market. You're not going to regulate somebody opening coffee shops because everybody is going to have the same coffee."

"If you start limiting access, that's when you run into monopolies."

The 62-page bill eliminates a statewide cap on the number of MMTC licenses, sets up a system for medical marijuana ID cards, restrictions on how much medical marijuana a patient can have and prohibits advertising the products.

Brandes' bill will find stiff competition from Bradley's bill. Sessa sees Bradley's bill as a marriage of an oppressive regulatory structure erected by FDOH and Brandes' less regulated bill.

Still, he said, "I don't think that's a compromise. I think Bradley's bill is much more geared towards the vertical integration and very limited market and is not really in the spirit of Amendment 2. I truly hope they lean more towards Brandes' bill."

Bradley said his bill's heavy regulation is necessary for a drug that is still a schedule 1 narcotic under federal law.

"Therefore, it's necessary that there is going to have to be strict regulation of the project," Bradley said. "Vertical-integration allows the state government, which is charged with regulating under the constitution ... to regulate from seed to sale."

"What other market or industry has that model ever worked?" he said. "Where you limit an industry to a select few that can start a supply and leave it up to the rest of the market. Tracking is required across the board, some states even require specific software from growing to processing to the consumer purchases, depending on what chain of custody it has gone through and it's not a ridiculously difficult process to implement."

Sessa said more competition allows for better quality control of the products and lower prices.

"I think competition is important between those that qualify for licenses in order to make sure there's better product and that they're lower prices," Bradley said. "But you have to balance that with the idea with anyone who gets into this business ... they have to be properly financed and able to handle the security and other various restrictions...to make sure the product they deliver is of good quality and is safe."

"If somebody just shows up with a bong and a dream and gets a license, they will not be able to properly and safely put a product to market," Bradley said.

Cummings(R-18) has a trio of appropriations asks.

HB 2159 seeks a \$500,000 allocation for early intervention for children with potential hearing loss; that ask is up \$100,000 from the previous year. The goal is to target infants and toddlers.

HB 2263 seeks \$300,000 for Clay Behavioral Health — Crisis Prevention Teams, a number unchanged from the previous year. This money "fits with the statewide effort to keep individuals with severe mental illnesses in the community as the Olmstead Act requires," according to the appropriations request.

HB 2265 seeks \$400,000 for home-delivered meals from the Northeast Florida Area Agency on Aging. That number is the same as 2016.

There is an urgent need for this money and them some in the seven-county area served by this organization: "a waiting list of frail elders waiting for home delivered meals" abounds.

Thus far, Lake City Rep. Elizabeth Porter has the most appropriations requests for her rural North Florida district to Jacksonville's west.

Porter seeks \$650,000 for a sewer plant at the I-75/CR 136 interchange (HB 2013) and \$500,000 for sewer system replacement in Macclenny (HB 2069).

HB 2129 is a request for almost \$2 million for improving agriculture and natural resources in the Suwannee River and Springs.

Porter also seeks money for community centers in her district: \$700,000 for the White Springs Community Center (HB 2243) and \$673,920 for the community center/fire and rescue building in Jennings (HB 2221).

The bulk of Porter's asks are educational: \$3 million of non-recurring funds

for the University of Florida's Institute for Comparative Veterinary Diagnostics (HB 2131) is one. That money will, if approved, see a \$6.5 million match from other sources.

Porter also requested \$2.13 million for the RiverOak Technical College Expansion Project in Live Oak, which will create a vocational education health facility (HB 2147), with the aim of pre-crime diversion.

Porter also asked for \$490,000 for the Florida State University College of Medicine to evaluate behavioral health systems in the Sunshine State (HB 2219).

HB 2253 involves an allocation for the small and rural district digital literacy program. \$1.1 million went into it in the last budget. Porter wants \$2 million this go around.

Porter also wants \$265,000 for postsecondary training in Baker County, via HB 2273. This would be a new allocation, with \$200,000 of the sum going to startup capital expenditures for the hoped-for informational technology and advanced manufacturing programs.

Also, Porter also wants \$800,000 for the construction of a state-approved emergency vehicle operations truck at Florida Gateway College in Olustee (HB 2217).

Finally, Porter wants \$690,000 for a cover of the arena at the Hamilton County Fairgrounds (HB 2185).

stayed in Fernandina.


The homecoming to Magnolia was a mix of relief and sadness. Grieving the loss of both parents, the family arrived to fields gone fallow and buildings much in need of repair. Louis was not surprised at the absence of any stock. While stationed in Hilton Head, he saw more than one ship unload herds of cattle sporting his own distinctive notched ear brand accompanied by steers with marks of his neighbors.

Like others, Louis filed a claim with the government for reimbursement. His tally for lost livestock — 100 cattle, 103 hogs and 125 chickens — amounted to a little over \$2,000. He didn't hold his breath but

instead with his family went back to work and nearly 10 years later, he received a check for \$480 minus attorney's fees.

Note: All the Civil War reimbursement claims filed in Clay County are available in The Clay County Archives. The Forester case depositions are extensive and paint a vivid picture of real people and real lives.







#### Crash victim reunited with EMTs, doctors

ORANGE PARK – New father and South Florida resident Dylan Roughton, at left, was reunited Monday with the first responders who saved his life Jan. 21 when he was in a wrong-way DUI crash on U.S. 301 in Clay County near Maxville. Clay County Fire and Rescue and Jacksonville Fire Rescue Department crews extricated Roughton from his vehicle he was driving en route to Asheville, N.C. when he was struck by the driver.

Roughton received treatment for a brain injury and multiple broken bones at Orange Park Medical Center. He is in daily rehabilitation to learn how to manage life from a wheel chair until he is completely healed. His mother, Angela Hunter, tears up as Roughton speaks with the fire crews who rescued him. Although he will likely use the wheelchair for six months to a year, Roughton said he could go home after his stitches are removed. Fire responders pitched in for a small gift of roughly \$255 they later presented to him before leaving the Feb. 13 reunion.

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## Camp Cadet struggling to stay open, enroll kids

MIDDLEBURG – Volunteers with a boot-camp style discipline camp intended to jumpstart military and law enforcement careers are struggling to raise funds to run the camp at full capacity this summer.

Known as Northeast Florida Camp Cadet, the program has given youth between the ages of 12 and 15 a peek into the life of what it takes to serve the country since 2011

"We really, really try and promote it, but we can't go into the schools too much because of the SAT and all the testing," said Kimberly Robinson, a Green Cove Springs Police officer who is the Camp Cadet program director. "Last year we had to drop it down to 35 [cadets] due to funding, this year we're hoping that we can accept 50 – we have a couple of fundraisers coming up."

It costs \$400 for each student to attend camp. The camp intends to provide 50 youth a year the chance to attend since its inaugural class. Overall, the program costs \$25,000 a year, which includes food, lodging, medical care, awards insurance and uniforms. So far, Robinson said, the group has raised \$17,000 this year.

Restaurants donate food to the cadets and counselors are unpaid volunteers, but the program is still costly. Counselors must raise the money themselves.

Last year, camp counselors encouraged businesses to sponsor a night in the Green Cove Springs' Old Clay County Jail. Counselors intend to do the same again this year. Robinson also seeks donations from businesses and residents, but said businesses eventually stop donating altogether.

Therein lies the problem, she said. Because Camp Cadet offers its services at no cost to parents, the only revenue sources can come from public and private partnerships.

Still, it is worth it, Robinson said. She

said Camp Cadet creates futures.

Camp Cadet is open to students from all types of backgrounds. One of its goals is to build self confidence in students.

"Some of the kids are teetering on that line — some of the kids might be victims of bullying, and some might just be introverts. Well, the purpose is to bring it out," Robinson said.

The camp focuses on placing children into a structured and rigorous schedule that begins at 5 a.m. Most cadets, Robinson said, aren't used to the rigor and spend the first night crying, but said by Wednesday, the cadets begin to work as a team and realize the counselors have their best interests in mind.

All counselors undergo extensive background checks and come from state, county and federal law enforcement agencies.

"I've come from a family of law enforcement, so I guess you could kind of say I've been prepared for it my whole life. The camp really helped me figure out how law enforcement really worked and how big a family it really was. No matter what agency it was they were always a tight knit

group," said Hunter Bass of Jacksonville, a cadet from the program's inaugural class who is now a Jacksonville Sheriff's Office deputy

Bass intends to become a counselor at the camp himself soon. He said he wants to show children what counselors showed him when he was a cadet.

Students must apply for Camp Cadet no later than April 1. Each applicant must submit a 500-word essay as part of the application. Although registration is held at Middleburg High, the class is held over the summer at North Folk Leadership Center, the center owned and operated by Gateway Girl Scouts Council.

Students will spend June 11 through 17 in a highly-regimented space where physical training and discipline are the linchpins of success.

"You have to look at the aspect of what you're showing kids, how to get that work ethic and how to have that drive to want to do something for the community... You're kind of showing them what our law enforcement and military based life is about," Bass said

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### **Pickleball**

Blevins appeared at the meeting with a number of other pickleball players and requested that commissioners convert the Van Zant tennis courts to pickleball courts.

Blevins said the players were suggesting the Van Zant Park courts because the location is centrally located in the county and there would still be courts left for tennis players after two courts were converted. It would probably be the least expensive for the county to convert since there is already a concrete pad in place as well as fencing, he said.

A few courts in the area have already been restriped to allow for pickleball play, but Blevins said that just didn't work well for the players.

"Keep in mind as you consider our request that taking a tennis court and painting lines on the court and calling it a pickleball court is like building a little league baseball field and not having a third base," he said.

Householder said money had already been budgeted this year for resurfacing courts at various parks, with a little over \$14,000 going to Ronnie Van Zant Park. About another \$10,000 of that already budgeted money will be used to take care of such things as new nets and poles for the pickleball court conversion, he estimated.

The idea of providing a new activity for seniors is something that falls in line with what the county is hoping to build on, Householder said. Discussions between Householder and the newly arrived director of Parks and Recreation department manager Michelle Sharp have centered on reaching out to a variety of citizens, he

"It was our intent to broaden our view on the services that we're providing to different levels of the community, not just school age ball players, but also try to look for things that we can offer the senior citizens and on the other side, too, we'll eventually start looking for stuff for toddlers. We want to cover everybody," Householder said. "So I think this is a good plan."

The courts should be ready by late spring or this summer, Householder said after the meeting.

The commission also approved by a unanimous 5-0 vote the continuation of its marketing partnership with Florida's First Coast of Golf by investing \$25,500 again this year with the group.

Kimberly Morgan, the county's new director of tourism and film development, said the partnership has been in effect since 1992, and results in a much more expansive exposure for Clay County's golfing industry than it could provide on its own. A destination marketing consortium for seven counties in Northeast Florida, it performs digital marketing through blogs, e-newsletters to its 84,000 subscribers and also publishes print ads in publications related to golfing and other activities.

'We couldn't do this on our own," she

The county has six golf courses, Morgan said. Statistics show that in December of 2016 alone, 1,598 golf rounds were played here, she added.

Even so, Commissioner Gayward F. Hendry said he would support the funding for this year, but next year would want to see more documentation of the support the county was receiving from the partnership.

Commissioners also approved a bid of \$457,000 to build a large group shelter or pavilion at the Moody Avenue Park ADA Baseball Field. The project has been long in the making, said Vice Chairwoman Diane Hutchings, in whose district the park lies.

'We've been waiting four years on this,' she said. "This is certainly an underserved segment of our community and it's going to be very exciting to be out here and let the kids in their wheelchairs be able to play ball. This is one of those things you just feel good about all over."

The commission also heard a report from Chris Rodatz, who is heading up the Clay County Bike, Blueways and Trail Committee. Formerly known as the ecotourism committee, the group is concentrating on a variety of activities that can contribute

to the quality of life as well as serve as an economic development engine, Rodatz

One committee suggestion calls for appointing or hiring a bicycle-pedestrian coordinator to help the county reverse its reputation as being unfriendly to bikers as well as runners and walkers.

"Clay County and Duval County have a terrible reputation as far as bicyclist-driver relationships. Duval is getting better on it kicking and screaming; they've been forced to do it and Clay County needs to be right behind them," he said.

Rodatz also suggested cleaning and clearing grass and trash from existing trails and utilizing signage that would remind people to "share the road.



## Push underway to restore Keystone Beach Pavilion

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS — As a 15-yearold, Don Morgan used to go to the Keystone Beach Pavilion and listen to concerts. Today, as a member of the Keystone Heights Heritage Commission, Morgan, who is 85, is leading an effort to restore the pavilion to the way it looked and functioned in 1921.

"It was used for entertaining, they had little orchestras that would play and ... the sound was all over the area," said Morgan, who is an architect and Heritage Commission board member. "[The project] will restore the original building is what we're hoping to do and we hope function like it used to do."

After opposing previous efforts to restore the pavilion due to costs, Morgan said restoring the pavilion is a way to recapture one of the city's historic assets.

"We feel any restoration of original architecture is a benefit to the history of the town, of course, and our goal of the Heritage Commission," Morgan said.

At the Feb. 6 meeting of the city council's Community Redevelopment Agency, Morgan said initial details of the restoration project include installing a warming kitchen and disability-compliant rest-

rooms. In his career, Morgan designed the current Keystone Heights City Hall, Clay High and Keystone Heights High, the first phase of the current Clay County Jail and much more. However, he will not be the architect designing this project.

"With a little imagination and creative thinking, whoever ends up designing this thing, I think we can utilize the existing posts and beams and stairs to provide at least 20-30 seats out in front without disturbing the playground," Morgan said. "It's

not going to be a tear down and start over type thing."

When asked by Mayor Tony Brown about the pavilion's old changing rooms, Morgan said, they were not included in the new proposal.

"We decided the old changing areas are kind of obsolete – they were only 3 by 4 and, so that wouldn't be practical today. I would imagine if we are going to get into changing [rooms], that's a whole new area of code requirements and it would have to

be a little bigger, plus it would mean more bucks," Morgan said.

Morgan said he and fellow Heritage Commission members view the restored pavilion as a gathering place for community and civic groups.

"I think if we get the civic organizations behind us, they could probably use it every day of the week and then they can bring in special programs and very possibly, wed us to the past, I guess is what we're supposed to do," Morgan said.

In an attempt to get CRA members excited about the restoration proposal, Morgan presented two white boards with photos showing the pavilion in its current state and how it looked in 1921. He also had a drawing of what a redesigned bandshell would look like.

"The bandshell was circular – half a bowl – that projected sound when they first had the construction and they built the inn and they had people come down here and stay while they were looking into the area and buying land... And they would have speakers come in and stand up there and the bandshell actually projects – it's a giant megaphone – and it projected the sounds without electrical embellishments."



## Demolition company moves headquarters here

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – In his career spanning two decades, Jim Smith has learned how to safely handle everything from hazardous waste to duck nests.

Now, Smith and his wife Kristi have moved their \$1.5 million company, Jimco Site Services, to Green Cove Springs after being headquartered in St. Johns County since 1998. The company is located at 909 Leonard C. Taylor Parkway, which is the new name for State Road 16 East.

"We owned a piece of property where we also have our house and we were running [Jimco] off that property and we just needed to get out...time to expand," Kristi said.

The Smiths opened their 5,000 square foot headquarters on Jan. 1 and are looking to grow from their current crew of nine employees. In making the move across the Shands Bridge to Clay County, the Smiths also started a completely new company, Taylor Parkway Storage, which is adjacent to the demolition company. In total, the two businesses sit on just under four acres alongside State Road 16 near the old Lee Field Naval Air Station property.

"As things grow, we have the potential to hire for the storage yard, at least one more, maybe two. Drivers, I have CDL drivers coming in every day. If we can get this ball rolling, we can hire two, three, four more drivers easy," Jim said. "We just purchased a grinder so we hope to have at least one grinding crew, possibly two."

The Smiths chose Green Cove Springs based on multiple factors — the 20-minute

"We did this work at the swimming pool," Kristi said and Jim interjects saying, "Oh yeah. We did the Spring Park renovation two years ago when they tore down the old city hall," he said.

"And we were kind of looking at it then ... we looked at this property then," Kristi said.

They had owned a piece of commercial property in Jacksonville that would have made a good location for a company head-quarters. However, when that land was taken through eminent domain for a road construction project on Lane Avenue, the Smiths went shopping again for a piece of land. That's when they chose Green Cove Springs.

"It's just pretty. It's pretty and it's nice. I'm from a really small town in Mississippi ...raised that way in the just tiny little town and I love it. And we love St. Augustine, but it's just so grown up. We've already some good contacts and friends over in Green Cove Springs, so it was just a good fit," Kristi said.

For example, in 2013, Jimco did the demolition work on the old car dealership that now holds the Clay County Supervisor of Elections.

The Smiths are not only banking on their location to give them exposure and new customers, they are also hoping the feedback about the economy is true. From what they have been experiencing, they believe the timing was right to expand. For example, when she wrote the loan application for their Small Business Administration loan for the property and building construction, she had to do a market analysis for a revenue projection. She said, so far this year, current actual revenue is exceeding her projections by about \$300,000.

"From June of 15 to June of 16 and from June of 16 to June of 17, I'm \$300,000 ahead," she said.

About 80 percent of Jimco's business comes from commercial site work, while 20 percent comes from residential site preparation. One of the company's largest projects dates back to 2005 when it won a contract to help shut down operations for a former Clay County employer. Jimco tore down the old Iluka Resources Ltd. plant south of Green Cove Springs when

## New co-work space hatches

ORANGE PARK - Three realtors believe ideas hatch faster with company and they've just opened Clay County's first fullfledged co-work space to prove it.

Dubbed 'The Nest' its all-female cadre of co-owners decided to transform a commercially-zoned residential-appearing property at 630 Kingsley Ave. to establish what they hope will be the coziest co-work space Clay County hasn't heard of – yet.

The space opened late last month, complete with a private office space - which a landscaping company already rented. The Nest offers convenient daily office rental rates and longer term rates.

Housed within the 2,000 square foot compound is a conference room, two social rooms, both dedicated and shared desks as well as an outside compound they intend to

use for events.

"It's a home away from home," said Dulce Lake, the CEO who is capitalizing on the bird theme by giving herself the job title of Chief Executive Avian. "Because when you work from home, I think you tend not to work because it isn't an office environment. You tend to get distracted when you come here, you're able to work because there's no disturbance and you have access to Wi-Fi, access to a copier."

The space contains two dedicated desk areas that offer 24-hour access. There is also a supply and mailroom so business owners can make The Nest their business location and mail drop.

Prices for office space range from \$15 dollars per visit to \$325 a month.

Currently, The Nest offers Clay entrepreneurs the best chance to run a startup within the county they live in if they don't necessarily have the money to lease an entire office but want to avoid the bustle and hustle of the corner coffee shop.

"Our goal is really to help entrepreneurs, because for small businesses it's hard for them to start up," Lake said. "Their most expensive overhead is office space."

While co-work spaces in Jacksonville and around the country, they are scant in Clay County, Last year, Fleming Islandbased tech company Pragmatic Works was the first peep to break into the industry locally. Pragmatic CEO Brian Knight intends to expand the co-work space to full operational status. Calls were not returned to comment on the status of his co-work space pilot run.

"Trying to get a co-work space in Clay County is something we've been encouraging and supporting for a couple years I would say," said Bill Garrison, president of the Clay County Economic Development Corp. "So I think [the Nest] is a great opportunity for those starting businesses that need a lower overhead and just a professional atmosphere to work."

As a consultant with IDEXX, a multinational corporation engaged in the development, manufacture and distribution of products and services for the animal veterinary markets, Dufort will highlight some challenging small animal medicine cases along with new innovative diagnostic tests

Veterinarians will earn five hours of CE credit by taking part in the seminar, and brunch will be served to attendees.

Entrepreneurs have increasingly turned to co-work spaces for the pull they have over likeminded business owners who are looking to network as much as they are to have a desk and free coffee. The Nest, like other co-work spaces, also places entrepreneurs in a stylish area with enough room to stretch. The Nest's owners have recycled furniture as decorations along with modern accents to give the space an industrial feel.

Lake said she is anxious have to see where the business goes, however, because while co-work spaces in Jacksonville operate well, there's never been a successful co-work space in Clay County.

Sixty percent of the county commutes to neighboring Duval to work. Garrison hopes to plug as many holes in the county as he can to keep workers - and their businesses – from leaving the county daily. He said a co-work space is a step in the right direction towards that goal.

"That's kind of a fact of life." he said. "The problem has always been that business owners are going to go up there to Duval County, because that's Jacksonville, and the message we're trying to get across ... is there is entrepreneurial support here, they don't have to leave. That's kind of the message we want them to know – we have everything you need right here."

Meeting deadlines and being on a work site when we say they're going to be there is what sets them apart from their competition, Jim said.

'We added the clearing and the grind-

ing for the subdivisions and the moving of dirt, so we got a little bit flexible and it seemed to work out." Jim said. "I don't claim to always be the cheapest, but I do answer the phone and I'm willing to give you the bad news along with the good news or the good news with the bad news.'

And then there was the demolition project with the ducks. When the Brumos Mercedes and Lexus dealerships on Atlantic Boulevard set out to remodel, Jimco was called in on the project by the general contractor. As it turned out, there was a mama duck that had built a nest near the dealership's service department.

"There was a little duck in the middle of our demo job. Well, I mean, you can't just run over the ducks, so Jim brings a cardboard box, puts the nest and the ducks in it and brings it to the house and my girls hatched the duck eggs and raised the little ducklings," Kristi said.

## Celebrating black history in a diversity desert

FLEMING ISLAND — When Nico and Lisa Warren moved from the Tampa to Fleming Island, they were surprised to learn the almost daily, cultural events they had become accustomed to in Tampa was nearly nonexistent in Clay County.

Instead of waiting around for cultural enrichment to come to the community, the two artists decided they would bring it themselves

Nico, a musician, and Lisa, a dancer, began the cultural literacy and semi-professional performing arts nonprofit Kreative Kids and Beyond to expose students to diversity.

"Cultural awareness and cultural literacy — we find that's one of the most important aspects, because if we know each other and know of our backgrounds, then we'll be more appreciative and we'll be able to approach people differently and not have those stigmas about each other," Lisa said.

The married couple has been practicing their craft for roughly 18 years. The two place a huge importance on the polyrhythmic, almost trance like music and dance of West Africa. Based out of the Orange Park Performing Arts Academy, the two teach not only the practice, but the history and importance of every dance and song, which become more important during Black History Month.

"When we were in the Tampa area, it was basically the busiest month for cultural dance companies where we basically had a performance three or four times a week," Nico said. "Since we moved up here

we're slowly gaining contacts and slowly having performances."

The group held a riveting performance Friday during a fashion show celebrating Black History Month and benefiting the atrisk youth program Clay PACE Center for Girls.

The group, made of an ethnically diverse cadre of children and young adults, played and danced to Kuku, a West African dance celebrating the harvest and successful fishing.


They didn't headline the show, the models, clad in golden yellows, mangrove greens and pottery reds, were the features. This is a departure from their performances in Tampa, where audiences gravitated to see them.

"This is something very new to Clay County, and we're new," Lisa said.

However, another hurdle comes from the County's demographics. In 2010, Tampa had over a quarter of its population identify as African American. This is nearly 10 points over the Florida 2015 average. Meanwhile, Clay County has only one out of every 10 person who identifies as African American in the 2010 Florida Census.

It doesn't take a large minority community to celebrate Black History Month, however. Self-described hobby historian Eugene Francis of Orange Park said celebrating black history shouldn't end in February.

"It's not so much about Black History Month," Francis said. "It's about knowing your history. That's who you are, that's your pride, no different than anyone else. We should not be subjugated to saying we just celebrated one month, February, we celebrate 24/7, 365."

#### **More closures on First Coast Expressway**

JACKSONVILLE - State Road 23 - the First Coast Expressway - between Normandy Boulevard and 103rd Street in Jacksonville will be closed from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. nightly in both directions Feb. 13 through Feb. 17 as crews continue State Road 23 bridge work at Normandy Boulevard and at 103rd Street. A detour is required for the contractor to safely complete this work overnight. State Road 23 will reopen daily to traffic from 5 a.m. to 8 p.m. during this

Motorists traveling on State Road 23/ FCE during these hours will be detoured to either New World Avenue or to Chaffee Road, allowing for continuous north-south travel in the area.

When completed in late 2017, this FCE North project will become part of a

15-mile-long SunPass administered toll road that connects I-10/U.S. 90 in Duval County to Blanding Boulevard – State Road 21 – in Duval County. Construction began in September 2013 on this first phase of the First Coast Expressway which spans six miles from north of Argyle Forest Boulevard to just south of I-10. FDOT hired Dragados USA to complete this project at an estimated cost of \$77 million.

Once opened, FCE commuters will pass through all-electronic overhead toll plazas - also known as gantries - without stopping. Electronic systems will either detect the vehicle's SunPass transponder device or scan the vehicle's license plate for a toll-by-plate invoice in the mail, without any stopping and or cash required on site. The FCE from US90/I-10 to New World Avenue will not be tolled.

available at www.firstcoastexpressway. com. The Florida Department of Transportation urges motorists to always follow the speed limit and stay within the limits of orange cones and barrels while traveling through construction zones.



#### Officials assess Feb. 7 storm damage

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Clay County Emergency Management has completed its survey with the National Weather Service on the damage from the Feb. 7 storm.

While the National Weather Service said no tornadoes touched down in Clay County, there were wind gusts that exceeded 70 miles per hour or higher in some areas of the county. Officials report that three homes were destroyed in the wind storm, four others had major damage and more than three other homes had "some sort of impacts to them."

Electric authorities worked to restore power to the areas that had significant infrastructure damage. Between all the electric authorities, Clay County Emergency Management monitored more than 4,500 residents and businesses that without power in Clay County.

Meanwhile, officials with the Town of Orange Park said the town had more damage in this storm than it did during Hurricane Matthew. The Bird Wood subdivision on Doctors Lake Drive had multiple cases of downed trees and damages to homes. Town work crews took to the roads last Wednesday morning with saws and other equipment to assist residents and make roadways safe for travel.

Emergency Management encouraged residents to continue to use caution walking around downed trees and to stay away from any possible downed power lines from the storm. ## Orange Park High to host clothing program for those in need

ORANGE PARK - Orange Park High is using the latest fashions to remove yet another obstacle to student engagement and attendance.

The school rolled out a new clothing closet Feb. 10 to fill a gap in services available to students and sew holes in student attendance rates that social workers attribute, in part, to a lack of clean and decent

"We do a lot of work with kids who have poor school attendance and sometimes,

frankly, that's because they don't have proper clothes to wear," said Karla Nachtsheim, Orange Park Junior High social worker. "It could be clothes, it could lack of nutrition or it could be lack of school supplies. So we want to take away all of those barriers."

The new clothing closet is a partnership with the Jacksonville-based nonprofit Dignity U Wear that was founded 16 years ago by Holocaust survivor and philanthropist Hendri Landwirth.

"He knew what it meant to go without clothing or food, so that's where that Dignity came in," said Cheryl Estevez, director of agency relations with Dignity U Wear. "He felt like if you give someone a pair of underwear or some clothing that they would lift their head up and not be

have simple defects, such as a missing stich on a logo.

"I have students who come in for clothes on a regular basis," said Susanne Hall. Orange Park High social worker. "The first two students who came in - separately - came in and were like 'wow,' and immediately went and got clothes."

The closet is open to all students in the Clay County School District who have a need. However, the need is apparent at Orange Park High where 54 percent of the student body receives free or reduced lunch. Students qualify for free or reduced lunch based on their parent's income.

The new clothing closet creates a path for instant fulfillment and allows social workers to end the previous practice in which social workers submitted requests for clothing after identifying a needy child.



The old system took a week – sometimes two – to process the student's request and send out the clothes. With Dignity U Wear, students will have immediate access to the clothes they need.

Social workers themselves will run the closet along with student volunteers.

"It's really a partnership to be proactive, to really help students and help them in a way that helps them not only be successful in our classrooms, but successful in our hallways and successful outside of our community," said Addison Davis, Clay County School Superintendent, who was at the Feb. 10 ribbon-cutting.

Orange Park High opened 'OP Outfitters' nearly a decade ago to provide students with basic essentials such as toiletries and basic food items. The school expanded the program in October to provide a 'one-stop-shop' for foods of all kinds, not just microwavable items.

"OP Outfitters was created...for at risk children that need help, so, obviously, now with Dignity U Wear coming in, we're not only to help Orange Park students, but now the entire county," said Clayton Anderson, OPHS principal. "[It's] a phenomenal opportunity."

The Dignity U Wear partnership expands necessary basic services to students to allow them to focus on their school work. Next week, Anderson said the new 'Suds and Studies' program will kick off. In the same room as the food and clothing closet sit washer and dryer units. Students will be able to wash their clothing at no charge while at the same time receiving tutoring for their classes.

"Education is the most important thing," Anderson said. "But we also know that our children are dealing with real life problems, so if we can take that away from them for about eight hours and they know they have food, they know they have clothing and school supplies, et cetera, then that's a worry they don't have to face...so they can focus on their education."



The Dignity U Wear partnership allows students to focus on their studies and not have to worry about basic needs, such as clothing. The clothing program is open to all Clay County students.





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## Pollen is in the air

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — With yellow dustings on cars and a lot of extra congestion and sniffling, it is a sign that pollen is being released in our area. With a normal season of pollen release from January to June, this time of year may not be the favorite of those who suffer from allergies but there are some things you can do within your landscape to hopefully lessen the effects.

#### The Science of Pollen


Simply put, pollen is the male reproductive material of plants. Whether it comes from flowers or cones, it is often carried by the wind or by insects from one plant to another or at least from one reproductive structure to another. Once it reaches another female portion of a flower, it can merge with an ovule and develop into a seed, bringing forth another generation of plants.

With it being so light and needing to be carried long distances, plants that have wind dispersed pollen produce high amounts which can cause reactions in those who are sensitive to it. Pollen that is distributed by insects, known as pollinators, do not usually cause as many issues with allergy sufferers.

Weather can also have a great effect on the movement of pollen as rain can heavily dampen its movement along with cold temperatures and frost slowing tree productions. However, warm windy weather can increase its production and travel.

#### **Pollen Allergies**

Overall, allergies are a natural reaction of your body in response to contacting a  $\,$ 



foreign substance, known as an allergen. For many, pollen can be their allergen but you can also have reactions to mold spores, dust, plant saps and material, and many others. Overall, tens of millions of people suffer from allergies from pollen every year and, as a whole, people spend billions of dollars a year for doctor visits and medications to control their allergies.

#### **Limiting the Issue**

However, even with pollen being present, there a few things you can do to limit the issue. First of all, when planning a landscape, you can try to make smart plant choices with allergens in mind. For example, there actually is a scale to measure the pollen production of trees known as the Ogren Plant-Allergy Scale or OPALS. By taking into account the likelihood of a tree to cause symptoms based on exposure to the plant and its pollen, it is rated on a 1-10 scale with 1 being the lowest and 10 being the highest risk of causing a reaction.

Trees such as pines, magnolias and persimmons have relatively low scores (4, 5, and 5 respectively) while Oaks, Winged

Elms and Sweet Gums are much more likely to cause issues with scores of 8, 8, and 7 on the OPALS scale. Additionally, some plants are dioecious, meaning they actually have male and female plants, and have varied ratings depending on which you plant with the male plant normally having a much higher rating.

Outside of choosing plants that produce less airborne pollen, there are also some best practices to limit your exposure when gardening. Here a quick list of some tips from the University of Florida:

- Dry clothes inside during pollen season
- Limit outdoor activities during the pollen season and on days with high wind and low humidity.
  - Stay inside from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.,

which are peak pollen times.

- Shower after spending time outside.
- Use air filters and maintain your air conditioner filter.
- Wear a dust mask while mowing the lawn, gardening, or raking leaves.

With some extra knowledge and practices, you can work to keep yourself feeling better during the spring, and eventually fall, pollen season.

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## Council looks to aid those with housing needs

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – Residents of Keystone Heights who need housing repairs or renovations may soon be able to get help from city hall.

City Council voted on Feb. 6 to apply for a \$650,000 Community Development Block Grant from the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity that would fund home repairs for low-income families in the city limits.

"For this particular grant, we would be looking again at a minimum of nine low-to-moderate income houses," said Scott Modesitt of Brandon, Fla.-based Summit Professional Services, a consulting firm specializing in helping governments apply for grants.

"The primary requirements for applicants – the resident must live within the incorporated area of the city, has to be owner-occupied, they can have a mortgage and it cannot be a rental property," Modesitt said. "And the individual must be below 80 percent of the median area income."

Modesitt said, as drafted, the grant application could possibly fund more than nine home repair projects. He also said that, of the nine total homes, three homes will be low income – where the owner's income does not exceed 50 percent of the median for Clay County and another two homes will be for those falling in the very low income category, which is for residents whose income does not exceed 30 percent of the median income for Clay County.

In addition to assistance with housing repairs, temporary relocation assistance will be provided to residents who will be unable to remain in the home during construction, as needed, the grant documents state

"Currently the grant application is budgeting \$540,500 for housing rehabilitation/replacement, \$12,000 for temporary relocation, and \$97,500 for administra-

tion costs. Only households that are low to moderate income are eligible to participate in the project; this ensures that the project meets a national objective," states the application.

The Feb. 6 meeting marked the second public hearing that is required before applying for this type of grant. The first public hearing was held in October, a month after the city appointed and met with a Citizens Advisory Task Force, which is comprised of residents who meet the income requirements for the grant — both requirements for applying for the grant.

Once the grant is approved, Modesitt said, there is a stringent applicant review process to determine eligibility.

"We check their taxes. They have to be current on all utilities, can't have any nonstructural code violations with the city. They have to be current on their mortgage and we verify, through third-party verification, all of their income information,"

Modesitt said

Modesitt said residents who claim a disability must present a certified letter from their doctor as part of the vetting process.

"We take all those individuals applications and rank them using the city's housing assistance plan and then we would being that list back before the council for approval," Modesitt said. "We take all those individuals applications and rank them using the city's housing assistance plan and then we would being that list back before the council for approval."

He also said the resident cannot have any non-structural code violations with the city at their time of applying for a housing grant. Modesitt said if home is older than 50 years, it has be submitted for state historic review and homes built prior to 1978 must be tested for lead-based paint.

"I will say the last time we did this, we had several senior citizens that were able to take advantage of this," said Mayor Tony Brown.

Council voted 5-0 to approve the grant application after the public hearing. The grant application is due to Tallahassee on Feb. 16 and, according to Modesitt, state officials will have a determination in 4-to-6 weeks.

In other business, city council passed an ordinance to impose a moratorium on medical marijuana for one year. The ordinance, like many passed in Clay County and around the state, intends to delay implementation and licensure until governments can work out planning a zoning rules on where medical marijuana dispensaries can be located.

#### Lineman in critical condition after accident

ORANGE PARK – A lineman who was injured in an industrial accident Monday afternoon in Orange Park was listed in critical condition at UF Shands Hospital in Gainesville.

At 5:43 p.m. on Feb. 13, Orange Park Police Department and Orange Park Fire Department Personnel responded to the accident in the 1400 block of Park Avenue near Stiles Avenue.

They gave immediate medical attention to John Bowman, 18, who was working for Fiber Comm Connect who had suffered an electrical injury while laying fiberglass line under the roadway, according to a media release from OPPD.

According to police, witnesses said they heard three explosions and saw a flash of blue light. Bowman and his crew members were laying a fiberglass line when the line somehow "got away from them" and traveled about 75 feet in the air where it struck a power line.

Bowman and a co-worker tried to run when two or three transformers exploded. According to the report, Bowman yelled, "I think it got me," at which point, he collapsed. Bowman was revived at the scene and then transported to Orange Park Medical Center for treatment. He was later transferred to Shands Hospital in Gainesville.

During the incident, traffic was briefly shut down on Park Avenue/U.S. Highway 17 to allow rescue workers to treatment the man and clear the road of a downed wire. Officers with the Clay County Sheriff's Office and Florida Highway Patrol assisted with traffic control.

#### **Green Cove Springs Police** assist feds in steroids case

JACKSONVILLE – Federal authorities have unsealed an indictment five people in a steroids abuse case that led authorities to Georgia and New York state.

United States Attorney A. Lee Bentley III said Donald McCloud Long, 50, Sarah Ann Long, 33, Armando F. Aman, 37, all of Jacksonville, and Shelby Travis Phillips,

26, of Savannah, with conspiracy to manufacture, distribute and possess with the intent to distribute, anabolic steroids. Taylor Salvione, 25, of Gloversville, N.Y., was also charged separately for the same offense. If convicted, each faces a 10-year term of imprisonment and a \$500,000 fine.

According to the indictment, from in or about December 2013, through on or about September 27, 2016, the defendants conspired to manufacture, distribute, and possess with intent to distribute anabolic steroids, a Schedule III controlled substance. Salvione is charged with participating in the conspiracy from March 2015 through April 2016.

An indictment is a formal charge that a defendant has committed one or more violations of federal criminal law, and every defendant is presumed innocent unless, and until, proven guilty.

These cases were part of Operation Total Package, led by the Drug Enforcement Administration. It was a collaboration among the DEA, the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's Homeland Security Investigations, the U.S. Postal Inspection Service, the U.S. Customs and Border Patrol, the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, the Jacksonville Beach Police Department, the Green Cove Springs Police Department, the Internal Revenue Service – Criminal Investigation, and the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency. It is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Kelly S. Karase.

cohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives and the United States Attorney's Office for the Middle District of Florida to ensure appropriate referral and federal prosecution of violent criminals and drug dealers who use and possess firearms.

This strategic initiative includes having a Special Agent from ATF on-site who will review all firearm cases the office handles for potential federal firearm charges when appropriate.

Cases in which a defendant qualifies for federal prosecution and lengthier sentences will be referred to federal prosecutors for appropriate prosecution.

Having an on-site special agent permits greater intelligence sharing on cases with federal partners and provides a speedier referral of cases suited for federal prosecution to federal authorities. One goal of the initiative is to ensure that armed career criminals (who have violent felony records or have engaged in serious drug trafficking offenses) face federal minimum mandatory sentences of 15 years instead of the three years normally faced under Florida law when they possess a firearm.

"We will be working closely with our state and federal law enforcement partners to ensure crimes involving the illegal possession and use of firearms will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law," said Nelson in the Feb. 9 press release. "This is another step in showing the community that these types of crimes will not be tolerated."

The ATF Tampa Field Division's jurisdiction includes the Fourth Circuit counties of Clay, Duval and Nassau.

Part of ATF's mission is dedicated to combating firearm violence through efforts targeting violent repeat offenders, career criminals, gun traffickers, and gangs. ATF does so through working with partner agencies at the local, state and federal levels.

"A key component of ATF's mission is reducing violent crime," said Daryl Mc-Crary, Special Agent in Charge of the ATF Tampa Field Division. "The Fourth Circuit State Attorney's Office commitment to reducing firearms violence effectively enables ATF and our partners to execute its investigative strategies and priorities."

The United States Attorney's Office for the Middle District of Florida also has increased its prosecutorial resources and efforts to address firearms and violent crimes.

The office routinely coordinates with the Jacksonville Gun Crime Unit, consisting of members of the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, ATF and state and federal prosecutors who regularly meet to discuss investigation and prosecution of gun crimes.

The office has operated the Project Safe Neighborhoods program, a nationwide

commitment to reducing gun and gang crime.

"This new partnership will leverage state and federal resources and enhance our ability to fight violent crime in the Jacksonville area," said United States Attorney A. Lee Bentley, III.

This latest local collaboration builds on past efforts and follows in the footsteps of similar working arrangements in Orlando and Tampa.

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## Raiders rock the 'Dome for K-Man's first title

ORANGE PARK – Revenge is a strong word. In sports, revenge can be the ultimate motivator especially for high school athletes.

One year ago Baker County ended Orange Park's season with an upset in the district semi-finals to end the Raiders' season

"I don't believe in a revenge game and we never talked about it...But I know our guys thought about it alot" said Orange Park Raiders head coach Derek Kurnitsky after his Orange Park High Raiders basketball team scored a 60-52 district 4-6A championship win over top-seeded Baker County High School on Friday in Orange Park's Raiderdome gymnasium. Baker County was the district 4-5A runnerup the past two years to Bishop Kenny, last year's 5A runner-up.

Orange Park (14-13) returns to the Raiderdome Thurs., Feb. 16 at 7 p.m. to host Terry Parker High (18-3) the district 3-6A runnerup to Ribault. Parker is ranked 11th in 6A by Maxpreps. District 3-6A featured four teams with winning records; Ribault (18-7), Parker (18-3), Bishop Kenny (20-7) and Yulee (15-7).

The game started tight with both teams amped up with a district title on the line. Orange Park's sharp shooter Blake Partin scored two free throws at the 5:18 mark of the opening quarter for the game's first baskets. The Wildcats would finally score their first basket with 4:15 left in the first quarter to tie the game at two. Luckily for both teams and the packed "Raider Dome" fans in attendence those baskets finally took the tightness out of both teams.

Raider guard Jalen Oliver would penetrate and dish to an open Partin for a three pointer that would ignite a 7-2 run to give Orange Park a 12-5 lead with just under one minute left in the quarter. Baker County would answer with two baskets in the final 50 seconds to close the gap to 12-9.

The Raiders would have perhaps their best (And most important) eight minute stretch of the season during the second quarter. Orange Park would score five quick points in the first minute of the quar-

ter that included a three pointer by John Abate to extend the lead to six points. Jordan Bundy would extend the lead to eight points on a lay-up then a Ty McBride steal and open lay-up would push the lead to 25-15 midway through the quarter. Partin would hit another three pointer later to give the Raiders an 11 point lead and he would lead all Orange Park scorers with 15 points. McBride would then work the clock down to the final seconds and hit a difficult fade away 17 foot jumper at the buzzer to give Orange Park a commanding 32-19 halftime lead outscoring the Wildcats 20-10 in the quarter. Orange Park was also commanding the interior against the bigger Baker County front line. Although undersized, the Raiders would use a double

teaming tactic to Wildcat post players that touched the ball which forced much more outside shooting than the Wildcats are used to taking.

"Our shooters were better than their shooters tonight. They had great athletes but we countered with great basketball players" said Kurnitsky.

The second half saw Baker County going to a man to man defense which is not normal for the predominately zone defensive team. The Raiders stayed true to their offense and continued their ball movement and fast pace. The teams would trade baskets for the majority of the quarter until Blake Partin got the crowd on their feet with a four point play on a corner three pointer to regain the 13 point advantage with three minutes left in the quarter. A visually frustrated Wildcat team had body language that said the 13 deficit would not be overcome on this night.

"We needed to have more energy than Baker County. We made sure we were going to go right after them and be the aggressor" said Partin who finished with 15 points despite battling foul trouble much of the game.

The fourth quarter was much like the third with the Wildcats simply not being able to cut the lead to under double digits. The night could be summed in one play made by the Raiders in the fourth quarter. Diallo Bryant had the ball stolen from him that resulted in two points for Baker County with three minutes left. Bryant would get the in bounds pass and immediately go coast to coast for a lay-up to make up for his mistake sending the message that whatever Baker County can do, the Raiders had an answer for and could do it better.

"The last few games we have been locked in and focused," said Oliver. "We are playing together as a team and we are going to be tough for any team that we play in the Regional tournament."

defeated Gainesville High 54-23 in their region quarterfinal. Middleburg beat Nease for the district 3-7A title, but lost twice in regular season play to the Lady Panthers.

In that first quarter, Range came out firing from deep in the corner in front of the Broncos' Stampede fan section to thrill the packed gymnasium in what looked to be a romp for the Lady Broncos.

"If she can get a hot hand, we're going to feed her the ball," said Hayward. "If we have three shooters on target, that's a tough cover. She's a great addition to Hannah and Mallory."

With sophomore guard Mallory Roney snagging rebounds, steals and a huge blocked shot with 30 seconds left in the stanza, Middleburg finished with a 17-12 opening salvo in their first playoff game in nearly 20 years. Katie Bryan sunk two free throws after the buzzer after she crashed in for a layup and drew a two-shot foul.

"Katie had a nice layup plus one," said Hayward. "My sixth and seventh girls are bought in and know they are just as critical to the team."

Roney ended as the top scorer for Middleburg with 27 points (3-3 pointers) on the night with Vanguard sophomore guard Essence Bell matching Roney's 27 points to lead the Knights.

In the second quarter, Middleburg kept the foot on the gas with Roney hitting two of her three-three pointers on her first two shots of the quarter while sister Hannah Roney handled steals and layups for her 11 points on the night. Hannah Roney was using alley-oop passes to sister Mallory throughout the night to take advantage of her height to gain layups for the Lady Broncos.

"When we get the mismatch, we go power," said Hayward. "If they want to match Mallory up with a shorter girl, we always want to get the ball to her. If they collapse on her, she dishes out."

Fleming Island tried a set play to set up Suhrer taking the ball deep, but the resultant corner kick failed.


At 6:40, Murphy sliced behind the Melbourne defense, Cruz lofted a lead pass over top and Fleming Island appeared to score the go-ahead goal.



Fleming Island (26-2) returns to the Fleming Island High gym on Tues., Feb. 14 for the region semifinal against district 4-8A rival Creekside, who handed the Golden Eagles their very first loss of the season on December 6. Fleming Island's second loss was a trouncing by district 3-7A champion Middleburg High, 64-30, on January 19. Middleburg won their region opener as well, a 60-58 win over Ocala Vanguard. The Knights (20-7) defeated Jacksonville Robert E. Lee High 50-41 on Thursday to earn their spot in the semifinals. The Fleming Island/ Creekside winner will face the winner of Niceville (19-8)/Tallahassee Lincoln (15-8) region semifinal game in the upcoming region championship game on Fri., Feb.

Robinson led the Golden Eagles with 21 points and dished out seven assists, but may have made her biggest impact on the boards. At the free throw line with her team clinging to a 60-57 lead with 34 seconds remaining, the sophomore rebounded her own miss in a crowded lane and was able to pass the ball to Hope Rozier on the left wing. The extra possession led to two foul shots by Rozier, pushing the Golden Eagles' advantage to five.

"I knew as soon as I released it that I missed, so I did not want to give up that rebound," said Robinson.

The Buccaneers had a final chance to tie after a lay-up by the Buccaneers' Mya Bass cut the deficit to three, but Bass' long three-point attempt from the left side was short, and Robinson snared the rebound with two seconds on the clock to deny First Coast another opportunity.

"She is the best rebounding guard in the district," Fleming Island coach Joey Williams said of Robinson, who finished with 10 boards.

Fleming Island suffered a blow when starting forward Claire Ragle went down at the end of the first quarter with a knee injury. Williams turned to Durden, who played most of this season on the junior varsity, and Durden responded with a 10-point, 15-rebound effort.

"I was so excited for her," said Williams

Bass and Michelle Williams hit two three-pointers each as the Buccaneers pulled to within 49-41 at the end of the third quarter, and tied the game at 57 on a three-pointer by Moriah Steele with 1:12 remaining. Steele, First Coast's leading scorer, equaled Robinson's 21 points.

The game was a stark contrast to the last time Fleming Island and First Coast met, when the Golden Eagles made 16 three-point shots on their a 91-49 rout. On Thursday, First Coast made seven shots from beyond the arc, while the Golden Eagles made just three.







"We are looking to build from last year and compete in our district and make it to


playoffs," said Bucklew.
