

## Rodeway Inn faces foreclosure

ORANGE PARK – In the wake of the Town of Orange Park's Nuisance Abatement Board seeking to close the Rodeway Inn and Con-

ference Center, the bank on the other end of owner Jitendra Patel's mortgage wants to foreclose and is suing him for more than \$2.6 million.

According to the complaint filed with

the Clay County Clerk of Court on Dec. 18, just four days after the Dec. 14 abatement board meeting, CenterState Bank of Florida is suing Patel as the guarantor of the loan for the outstanding balance and more

over Patel "causing waste, impairment and deterioration" to the property.

Patel's attorney plans to ask the court

## Couple charged with murder, arson

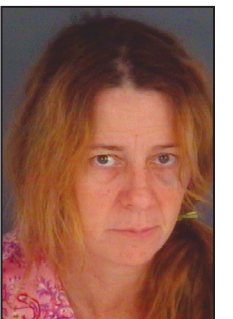

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Authorities are crediting detailed investigative work for the swift arrest of a Middleburg couple for a murder and arson that took place last week.

Craig Aldrich, undersheriff of the Clay County Sheriff's Office, said Dec. 17 that Joseph Lloyd White, 37, and his wife, Bobbi Lee White, 47, of Middleburg, are charged with premeditated murder in the death of Corey Bryan Lane, 35, of Jacksonville. Police found Lane's charred remains Dec. 15 at 8:11 a.m. abandoned in a 1998 GMC Savanna van that had been burned so badly only part of the vehicle

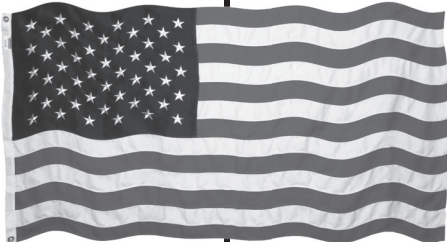

# Former Fair general manager moves to greener pastures

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – After 47 years of marriage, three decades climbing the corporate ladder and 10 years as the general manager of the Clay County Agricultural Fair, Pete Sutton is ready to embrace retirement.

Sutton, 69, retired Dec. 17 and plans to spend his retirement with his wife, Becky Sutton and two rescue dogs, on the couple's two-and-a-half acre Keystone Heights property they purchased last year.

"I owe this to her," Pete Sutton said. "Who knows what tomorrow's going to bring? My goal is to have good health, wake up, have a cup of coffee with her, share a laugh with her and share a life with her because we don't know how much longer we've got that. That's who I am and that's what I want to do."

Sutton began working for the Clay County Fair Association 10 years ago after he retired from Winn-Dixie Stores as the vice president in the general merchandise division. Even though Sutton said his 30-year long career with Winn-Dixie was challenging and rewarding, it was working at the Clay County Fair that brought him a great deal of joy because it was different each day. He worked with many people and never looked at the clock. He announced his retirement to the Clay County Agricultural Fair Board of Directors this past summer because he felt it was time for someone to take over his position to elevate the fair and to incorporate new elements such as social media.

"After the annual meeting in June, I made the announcement to the Board," Sutton said. "We cried and we hugged and it was like a family. It was the right thing to do. Could I have done this until I died? Sure, I absolutely love it but it was the right thing to do for the fair because I've given my all. It's time for someone to take it to the next level. It's time for me to just be with my wife."

During Sutton's tenure, major changes took place including the expansion of the Early Florida Village, additional livestock exhibits, incorporating the latest carnival rides and increased attendance to name a few.

"Last year was our best year ever with 113,591 guests," Sutton said. "The out-of-county attendance went up two percent. Fifty-one percent now are from out of the

county. That tells you you're a regional fair but we don't ever want to act like one."

Along with directors and board members, part of Sutton's job required traveling

to fairs and carnivals around the country to come up with ideas on how to improve the experience while maintaining the charm of a county agricultural fair that continues to

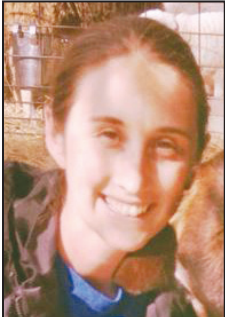
draw generations of families.

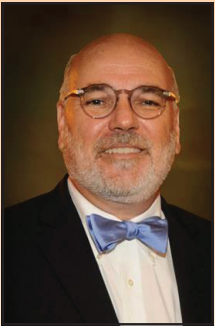

## Toward a more scientifically literate public

As a society we do a terrible job of educating our children to become scientifically literate. Sure, we have Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics, or STEM, programs throughout the country, and with some justification we can brag about the successes of students who are in or who have graduated from such learning experiences.

However, in general, these are highly selective programs leaving the vast majority of students with minimal exposure to science or engineering. Many of their exposures range from "I have to take it and I can forget it as soon as the course is over" to thinking that the subjects are painfully dull and have no relevance to their lives. Consequently, in either case, most students graduating from high school and entering college or the work force are what I call scientifically illiterate.

In college, students who are not in the sciences or engineering must take some science classes as part of the general education program requirements. Though dedicated instructors doing their best often teach these classes, the students are only motivated by the "I must take this class to graduate" requirement. The subject not only turns them off, but they very likely forget the material moments after the final is taken.

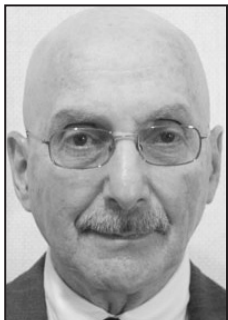
So, the majority of people in this country who will use the amazing new technologies that are being developed and who will be asked to make decisions on scientific and engineering issues (solar energy, nuclear power, fracking, energy efficiency, genetically modified plants and foods, to identify a few) are scientifically illiterate.

Sometime back I was in a group discussing the problem of keeping young children interested in science. One member of the group was a very experienced elementary school educator.

I will never forget her outline of the subject matter that would hold the attention of elementary school children. She said: "Children between ages 5 and 8 will love working on dinosaurs, from 8 to 11 you can keep them interested by space (rockets, satellites, Hubble, distant planets, the Big Bang and so on) but after 11 they will discover sex and you can't distract them from that."

The point of this story is that to create a scientifically literate public it is necessary to identify how to get their attention and how to make the material stick with them beyond the final exam.

In the mid-1990s, together with a colleague from the philosophy department, I put together a course for The Burnett

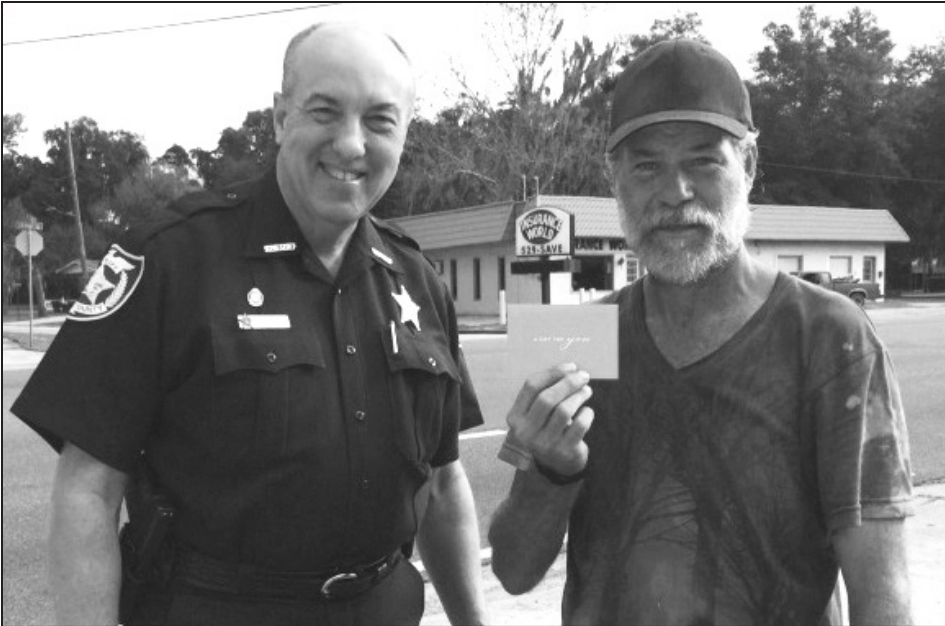
Secret Santa hits Clay County streets

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Clay County law enforcement officers joined their colleagues in Duval and St. Johns counties last week to take time out to be ‘Secret Santa’ for a day to give out 100 gift cards in the community. Each recipient tapped by a law enforcement officer was given a \$100 pre-approved gift card for their use.

The gift card giveaway was made possible by two anonymous donors to the Jacksonville-based Community Foundation For Northeast Florida who ‘just wanted to give the men and women who keep our communities safe the opportunity to spread some joy in this holiday season.’ The donors approached The Community Foundation through their professional advisor, and a Donor Advised fund was established to carry out their wishes.

The Community Foundation worked with the donors, TD Bank, and the three Sheriff’s Offices to transform the \$50,000 gift into the 500 gift cards for distribution. The TD Charitable Foundation supplied the TD Visa gift cards to The Community Foundation with no fee.

The Jacksonville Sheriff’s Office distributed 300 of the cards, and Clay and St. Johns County’s Sheriff’s offices each distributed 100 gift cards. Honors College at the University of Central Florida called the Culture of Science. It dealt with the who, when, where, why and how science was done – and most importantly what effect science had on society and what effect society had on science.

The course proved extraordinarily successful and was given for six semesters instead of the three in the original proposal to the college. I have since given a somewhat modified version of this course for graduate students in the UCF College of Optics & Photonics and other engineering or science departments. Notice that the course does not deal with the what of science. That already is taught very well in the existing classes in the various specialties.

Such a course places science and technology in the context of our world and deals with the impact of science. Some examples of this are the discussions I have with the students of such things as the Internet or nuclear weapons or the early organized church’s problem with Galileo.

I also discuss pathological science, which is what happens when scientists become emotionally involved with a marginal or dubious phenomenon that if true would violate well-established scientific principles. If they were right, lots of money and prestigious prizes would come their way. It’s called pathological science because the scientists are pathologically involved with it and cannot see their errors.

- The Florida Highway Patrol charged Lavearn Leon Coles of Orange Park several traffic violations in a crash that claimed the life of Farrah Judith Terpack-Hart, 29, of Fleming Island, who was five months pregnant at the time.

It is important that scientifically literate citizens be able to recognize that flaw. In the early 1990s, scientists in Utah thought they observed nuclear fusion in a quite standard electrolysis experiment. They dubbed it “cold fusion,” and if it had been true it would have solved the world’s energy problems. Of course, it was not.

I make it a point to discuss scientific ethics about being honest, doing meaningful experiments, reporting all the results and performing careful analyses. The class and I view the play “Copenhagen” to understand and discuss the pressures nuclear scientists experienced during World War II. We also get into modern-day cosmology and that leads to discussion of the need for a God in the universe.

In my opinion, such courses should be offered as part of the general-education program for undergraduates to satisfy their science requirements. Such courses dealing with the effect of science and engineering just might result in more scientifically literate graduates. Most people don’t have to know what makes an airplane fly but they should know how greatly airplanes have and will change our society. The same can be said for the Internet or electric power. Most people don’t have to know the details, but they certainly should know the effects. Their lifestyles and maybe their lives will depend on such knowledge.

# St. Vincent's Clay tops off new addition

MIDDLEBURG — St. Vincent's Medical Center Clay County is one step closer to doubling its size with the recent topping off ceremony for its new J. Wayne and Delores Barr Weaver Women and Infants Pavilion.

Blain Claypool, president of Acute Care for St. Vincent's HealthCare, hosted the Dec. 18 ceremony for the three-floor patient tower that will be built so it can be expanded to five floors in the future. The exterior is now up and the rest will move rapidly.

"It's tremendous work to clear the ground and lay the foundation. You have to pour the concrete and let it cure while they're building the rest off-site. Then, they bring it all in and put it together like an erector set with all the beams and walls, Claypool said.

"Once they start putting it all together, the project goes pretty fast. We're now five months away from the emergency room expansion, which will open in May, and eight months from opening the tower in August."

With funding from private donations and the parent entity, Ascension Health, the \$33.1 million expansion is expected to bring 120 to 130 new jobs to Clay County. Claypool said the minimum "socially-just" wage of all Ascension hospitals is \$11 per hour, but many of the new local positions will pay much more.

"These are high-paying jobs — they average \$50,000 a year and we're seeing new businesses pop up around us as the

First Coast Expressway goes in immediately adjacent to our campus. There will be 10,000 new homes built along the beltway in the next 10 years and those families will have healthcare right in their back yard," Claypool said.

As a county resident who is raising his children here and educating them in the county school district, Claypool stresses that the not-for-profit ministry of St. Vincent's is a stakeholder in the county's eco-

nomie development. He said the hospital is also looking for 15 to 20 private practice physicians for another building the hospital is planning for its Clay campus just off Branan Field Road.

"We're moving forward with our second medical office building — we're out seeking tenants and once we sign leases to the point of being two-thirds full, that will trigger the beginning of construction," Claypool said.

With that expansion next on the horizon, the new tower now dawning will expand the emergency department and give the hospital something it has never had before — birthing services.

The expansion will include a birthing center named after major donors, J. Wayne and Delores Barr Weaver, which will be located inside the tower. It will feature eight suites for labor, delivery, recovery and post-partum treatment, two Cesarean section suites and four post-partum suites. There will also be childbirth education, sibling classes and safe sitter training to teach pre-teens and teenagers how to safely care for infants and other children.

The rest of the expansion will include 30 inpatient beds, 13 treatment rooms in the emergency department and capacity for 30 additional beds in the future.

The topping off or topping out ceremony is one rich in history and culture dating back to an ancient Scandinavian religious rite in which a tree was placed atop a new building to appease the tree-dwelling spirits that had been displaced during construction. Long considered an important component of timber frame building, the custom migrated initially to England and Northern Europe and on to the Americas. A tree or leafy branch is usually placed on the topmost beam in celebration of this point in construction.

When it was completed in the fall of 2013, St. Vincent's Medical Center Clay County was the county's largest commercial construction project with a price tag of \$110 million.

# Tynes Elementary students go Greek

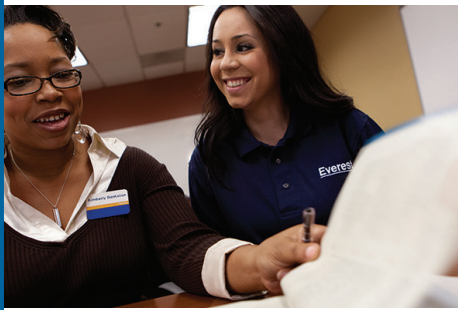

## A six year old boy's unforgettable Christmas

In the rural outskirts around Middleburg, on a Christmas after World War II, six year-old David Starling men complete a successful deer hunt in 1946 in the wIn the rural outskirts around Middleburg, on a Christmas after World War II, six year-old David Starling's life changed. That holiday marked a huge milestone in his journey to becoming a man. David got a gun.

Guns were a natural part of everyday life in those days. Even in the towns of Green Cove Springs and Orange Park most families kept a shotgun leaned against the wall near the backdoor or discretely tucked behind the sideboard in the dining room. Roaming rabid dogs or possums and raccoons raiding in-town hen houses were dispatched quickly. Nothing discouraged a neighbor's hog from foraging in a winter cabbage patch quicker than a shotgun volley over the ears.

Men hunted for pleasure and for necessity whether they lived in town or in the country. Times were hard and putting fresh

meat on the table was still man's work. In the country, men spent most of their working time outdoors and in the woods from daylight to dark. Rattlesnakes, moccasins and wild hogs had a way of routinely turning up when least expected. The Starlings were woodsmen, as comfortable in a pine thicket or cypress swamp as leaned back in a straight chair on the front porch.

Guns were considered an important tool in their working – lives. They were about as apt to head to the woods without their boots as without a rifle. Starling kids learned early to respect and take care with all the tools. They understood that any tool in the hands of a fool or a showoff could kill or maim. That especially included guns.

For the Starling men, Christmas Day – rain or shine – it was off to the woods to hunt deer.

Around midday they met up with the women who spent the morning preparing Christmas dinner then packed it up and



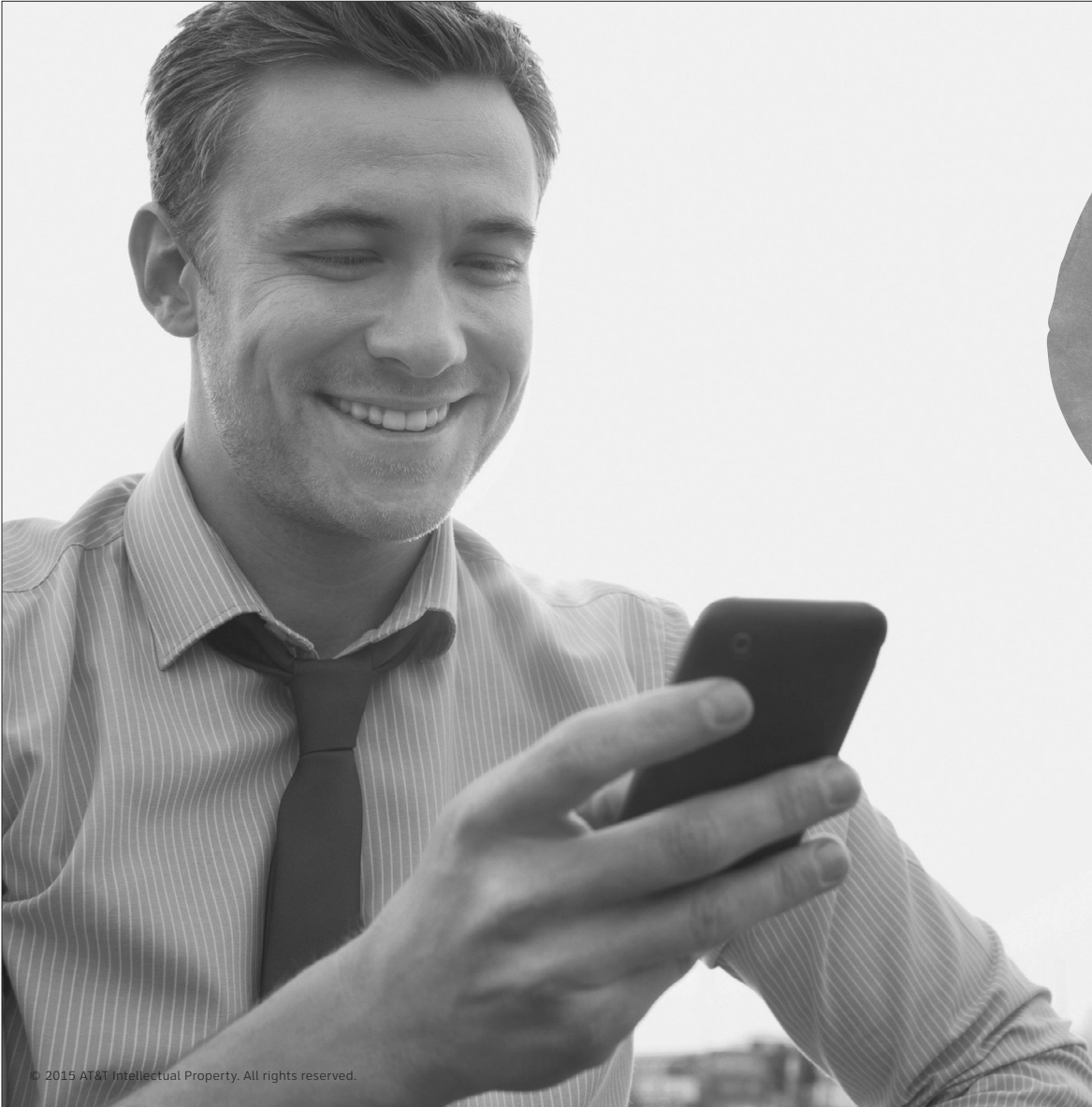

hauled it into the woods. Since he was four, David had been going to the woods. In the beginning, he traveled tucked in the back of his dad's overalls because he was too little to keep up.

He learned to be still, to listen and understand the sounds of the woods. He noticed the subtle changes in the direction of the wind and what it meant. He became a natural at interpreting faint signs in the trail. David began to think like a deer and absorb the measure of being a man.

He soaked up his father and uncles' simple respect for the land and feelings of responsibility for it. He saw their way of moving in the woods and the world without bluster or deceit but with awareness and appreciation.

Then, when he was six, David Starling got a gun and he walked on his own two feet in the woods on Christmas morning. But – the gift was more than a gun – it was a sign he was one of them and on his way to being a man.

the ancient Grecian Olympic Games and culture to life for a day. Two of Long's classmates, pretending to be horses, pulled her chariot across the playground in a race against the four other sixth grade classes.

Long, who is in teacher Nick Roman's homeroom class, said Roman's class chariot was modernized and included paper cut-outs of a GPS navigation system, a steering wheel and an iPhone. A license plate on the back read "Jedi I Am."

"I almost fell off but it was exhilarating," Long said. "I had a chill down my spine. I was steering with the steering wheel and tapping the GPS buttons."

Sixth grade teacher Paula Khaoprachan said the annual event was primarily to teach students about the spirit of competition, something the Greeks and Romans treasured.

"The main thing we try to teach them is participation because that was their thing," Khaoprachan said. "Being in the games was considered an honor. It wasn't about winning but it was about participating."

Gabriel Shearer, a student from teachers Tina Diaz's homeroom class, said that although the day included kid-friendly competitions, he learned a lot about the ancient sporting events and culture.

"[The Romans] did relay races, discus,

chariot racing, wrestling, but of course we're not doing that here," Shearer said. "They fought for olive headbands but not trophies."

Shearer's classmate Donnie Bowerman enjoyed the competition and said he felt a similar feeling to those who participated in the original Olympic Games.

"[The Romans] were very competitive and they liked to win," Bowerman said, who rode in the Diaz Destroyers chariot. "Just like we did."

Approximately 100 students in five homeroom classes spent Dec. 17 immersed in Grecian culture at the school north of Middleburg. In a creative version of Olympic Games, students threw pool noodles to represent the javelin toss. They took turns competing in the long jump, balanced olives on spoons and competed in relay races. Samantha Godfrey, 12, said her favorite game of the day involved filling a bucket with water using only sponges. "You have to collect a whole bunch of wa-

ter with the sponge and you have to run it to the other side and squeeze it into the bucket in a certain amount of time," Godfrey said. "There were 10 [students] on one side and 10 on the other and whoever had the most water won."

For snacks, students feasted on trays of hummus, olives, red and green grapes and grape juice.

Teachers and students dressed in togas, chunky gold jewelry and elaborate headdresses for the day.

"I wanted to do it up because I know they liked their gold," Khaoprachan said who wore a toga over her clothes and a gold necklace. "The kids always enjoy this annual event and they always participate by dressing up. The togas can be a challenge but they always can find their sheets and come in and amaze us with the outfits."

# School officials warn parents of social media dangers

FLEMING ISLAND — In the wake of a recent bomb threat targeting Orange Park High, Clay County School Superintendent Charlie Van Zant Jr. said he wants to encourage students to make good choices on

social media.

"The main message today is that we want to be proactive. We don't want this to continue. I'm urging students and families to make really good choices and to support their students in making good choices," Van Zant said in the Dec. 9 press confer-

ence at Fleming Island High.

Additional bomb threats closed at least five Duval County schools in "just over 24 hours," according to a Dec. 10 report in the Florida Times-Union. When asked if he was concerned with copycat threats during the media availability, Van Zant said, "you know, there's a litany of things I could worry about every day."

The bomb threat targeting Orange Park High via email from an unknown source cost the Clay County Sheriff's Office approximately \$4,100 in investigative costs on Dec. 8.

The school was shut down for the day and a team of officers canvassed the campus searching it in full before giving the all clear near the end of the day.

"That figure involves 20 CCSO members for eight hours at \$25.85 an hour, [the] average hourly rate used to calculate recovery estimates," said CCSO spokeswoman Mary Justino in an email. "Every incident is different and may result in different costs."

A second incident on Dec. 10 involving text messages sent by a female Fleming Island High student resulted in at least six parents going to the school and pulling students out of class.

"This statement and the rumor [redaction] caused concerns among students as it spread around the school, causing parents to withdraw their children from the school," states the CCSO police report.

On Dec. 18, a student has been charged with a misdemeanor count of disruption of a school function in the aftermath of last week's investigation.

Instead of being booked in a juvenile detention center in Jacksonville, the teen was turned over to her parents.

Van Zant said that cost did not include the impact on "2,000 kids at [an] average sized high school that had no learning yesterday."

Although the source of the bomb

threat remains unknown as law officials comb through emails and continue the investigation, the superintendent urged for parents to hold children accountable for their children's online behavior. "It's not spying on your kids to know what they're doing on social media," Van Zant said. "You need to be guiding your student along if you allow them to have this social media. If you don't allow them to have this social media, they probably have it anyway."

A troubled student going through a tough time or feeling frustrated to the point of making threats might reach out to fellow students or friends.

"Help calm them down," Van Zant said.

Once a threat is posted, tweeted, or sent as a text messages, the person has committed a misdemeanor under Florida law.

"They can break school board policy by threatening their peers in their school from home in their bedroom," Van Zant said. "There's no separation. They don't have to be on the 45-acre campus of one of our schools to break a school board policy or break a Florida law. So that's important to help police up your friends, to police up your own children and talk to them about this."

Once a threat is posted on one of the various social media domains, "it's not optional at that point to investigate it," Van Zant said. "It's not optional at that point for that student to be brought before the Clay County School Board for a level four offense which has specific consequences. It's not optional for law enforcement to pursue it as a misdemeanor or a felony depending on the nature of the threat and where it falls on the legal spectrum."

All of those things are going to happen just as... you squeeze the toothpaste tube and toothpaste comes out the end. Once you hit send, if it's a threat, things are going to happen."

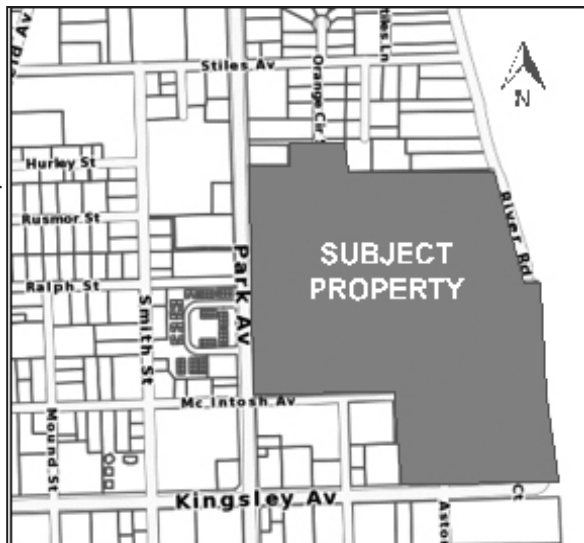

swore in four-year-old Jacob Snowden as an honorary junior sergeant during a day of honor hosted by Beseler, his deputies and other law enforcement agencies at Thrasher-Horne Conference Center Dec. 19. Snowden suffers from spinal muscular atrophy, a condition that will likely keep him in a wheelchair the rest of his life.

“I had no idea it was going to be this big and this extravagant,” Beseler said. “I think it’s just a testimony to the people of Clay County, Duval, St. Johns, and Bradford and all of our surrounding counties. When they see a young man that has a wish, they want to make his dream come true. And we have made Jacob’s dream come true today. I’ve never seen such a smile on a young man’s face.”

“Jacob’s Day” was created to help make Snowden’s dream of becoming a police of-

ficer as close to reality as possible. Jacob was given his own police car wheelchair, badge and police dog.

The building was surrounded with an army of law enforcement from the surrounding counties. Numerous crime-fighting machinery were brought out for the ceremony, including helicopters, motorcycles, armored personnel carriers, K-9 units and hundreds of squad cars.

As the sherriff remarked in his speech, it was the safest place to be in Northeast Florida.

“It was absolutely amazing,” said Amanda Snowden, Jacob’s mother. “There’s no words for it, there’s really not. I couldn’t thank them enough for this.”

Snowden’s family all wore matching

shirts supporting Jacob’s condition for the ceremony. Since they found out about his dream they made its fruition their number one priority.

“He woke up one morning and told me he wanted to be a cop,” Snowden said. “He just said he wanted to be 21 and have a badge and a car and a dog, so literally they covered every part of his dream today.”

While dealing with spinal muscular atrophy has been a trial for Jacob and his family, his mother maintains that moments like Saturday make it all worth it.

“It’s not necessarily difficult, just different,” Snowden said. “Everybody has their picture of how things are going to be and it doesn’t always turn out that way. But I wouldn’t change him even if I could. It

would completely change our lifestyle and change him and his personality and I don’t want that. He’s perfect the way he is.”

Although he’s only four, his mother believes that Jacob will maintain a firm commitment to his dream of being a police officer throughout the rest of his life.

“Usually kids go through stages, but this has been his constant for years now,” Snowden said. “I don’t see it going anywhere, especially now. It’s made his day, and as a parent that’s all you can ask for.”

That little service of making someone’s day would carry Jacob a long way, Snowden said.

“Just look at him though,” said Eddie Broco, a member of Jacob’s family and “Jacob’s Team.” “He’s smiling the whole way, and sometimes that’s hard to get him to smile. He’s going through a lot of surgeries, and he can’t even walk so he’s got to be in a chair for the rest of his life. It’s been worth it to put a smile on his face even for one day.”

identification number was legible.

“Through the great work of our investigators, they were able to put these pieces back together and determine that the individual that was in the burned vehicle had, in fact, been murdered,” Aldrich stated in a prepared video news release posted on YouTube.

Police found the van near the Jennings State Forest in the area of Nolan Road and Ellis Ford Road. Initially, CCSO stated the investigation was going to be a slow process as they had to rely on other agencies, such as the Medical Examiner’s Office in Jacksonville, which identified the body.

“Through great investigative work with our robbery homicide unit, they were able to determine that Joseph White and Bobbi White, husband and wife, individuals who live here in Clay County, had in fact, murdered Mr. Lane the day before and had planned that murder to rob him of a substantial amount of cash that he was known to carry,” Aldrich said in the video.

According to the arrest report from the CCSO, several family members of Lane

said the man had driven from his home on Rickenbacher Street in Jacksonville on Dec. 14 around 9 a.m. heading to Middleburg “to pick up Joseph White and Bobbi White to give them a ride to a doctor’s appointment.”

As the investigation continued, officers obtained a search warrant from County Judge Timothy Collins at 1:30 a.m. on Dec. 17 and headed to the White’s home in the 4800 block of Timothy Street in Middleburg. Officers later interviewed Joseph White at the CCSO Orange Park sub-station. Joseph and Bobbi White were officially booked on the charges at 11:20 a.m. on Dec. 17.

The couple are booked on identical charges along with premeditated murder. They are charged with armed robbery, burglary, arson and possession of heroin. Bobbi White faces an additional charge of cocaine possession.

No information was given about what kind of accelerant was used to burn the van nor did police attempt to offer a motive in the killing other than the attempt to steal cash from the victim. It is also unclear about the relationship between the Whites and Lane other than they were acquaintances.

Both Joseph White and Bobbi White remain in the Clay County Jail without bond.

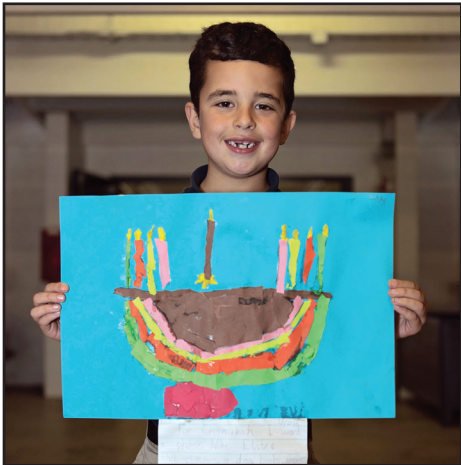

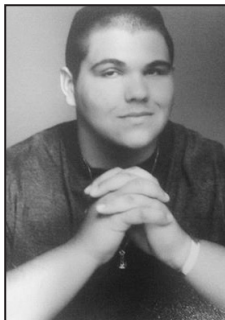

## Deadline for property tax exemptions is March 1

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Clay County property owners have until March 1 to apply for property tax exemptions, according to Property Appraiser Roger A. Suggs.

First-time applicants must bring their deed, two documents to establish proof of residency, such as a driver's license or identification card, voter registration card or utility bill and provide the Social Security numbers of all applicants.

Mobile home owners should also bring the title or registration to the mobile home. Applications may be filed at the Appraiser's main office in Green Cove Springs, located on the second floor of the county administration Building or the Orange Park branch office at 1518 Park Ave. or at one of their remote locations.

Once the initial application has been filed and granted, the exemption will be automatically renewed each January and a renewal notice will be mailed to you. If you still live in the home and qualify for the exemption, no action is required – keep the renewal notice as your receipt and continue to enjoy the benefits of lower taxes. It is your responsibility to notify the property appraiser if your eligibility for exemptions has changed.

# Baptist not allowed to expand to full hospital

FLEMING ISLAND — State officials have denied Baptist Health's recent supplication to build a \$80 million, 100-bed hospital on its Fleming Island campus.

The Florida Agency for Healthcare Administration denied Baptist's August application citing that Clay County has more hospital beds than it needs at the present time.

The agency identifies Northeast Florida as its District 4 and Clay County is in Sub-district 2, which had 873 licensed acute care beds with an occupancy rate of 62.10 percent for the January through December 2014 reporting period, according to the report it issued with the denial.

The subdistrict includes the 85-bed acute care West Jacksonville Medical Center, which is pending licensure, according to the report. The pending care center is tied to Memorial Hospital on South University Boulevard and is owned by HCA Healthcare, which also owns Orange Park Medical Center.

If the agency had only considered the number of acute beds in the county, the 873 would have been 225 beds, the number identified by the Health Planning Council of Northeast Florida in its Clay County assessment earlier this year. It also took into consideration the 42 acute care beds currently being added at St. Vincent's Medical Center Clay County.

Orange Park Medical Center officials sent a letter opposing the Baptist application, emphasizing that "the vast majority of Clay County residents live closer to OPMC and St. Vincent's Clay and will not have enhanced access through the proposed project."

The Orange Park-based hospital also claimed the requested expansion at Baptist Medical Clay Campus carried a "limited scope of offerings that means Clay County residents will be redirected to



other Baptist Health facilities in Duval County for specialized care — defeating the main purpose of the proposal to keep Clay County residents in Clay County for inpatient hospital care."

According to the agency report, St. Vincent's Clay also sent a letter of opposition, pointing out that Clay County does not have a rapidly-growing population or "expanding market that will minimize the impact on existing families." St. Vincent's also noted there is no access problem to healthcare facilities with existing hospitals.

The report states Baptist Health's demonstration of need "was not established by the applicant in order to merit approval of the proposed project. The agency did not find the applicant demonstrated the extent that the proposed project would foster competition and promote quality and cost-effectiveness to all residents of Clay County."

The AHCA also noted that "the applicant's proposed provision of health care services to Medicaid patients and the medically indigent populations did not demonstrate an increase of financial access to the residents of Clay County."

The Florida Hospital Uniform Reporting System indicates that during the fiscal year for 2013, Baptist Medical Center, Jacksonville, provided 26.5 percent of its

total patient days to Medicaid, Medicaid HMO and charity care. For the reporting period, these were the second-highest percentages of Medicaid and Medicaid HMO and charity care patient days combined in the agency's Northeast Florida district.

The Agency for Health Care Administration only allows these applications to be filed twice each year, so to meet the last filing date for this year, Baptist Health submitted an application Aug. 3 to expand from no beds to up to 100. This is the third time Baptist Health has been denied; its plans to build a full-sized hospital in Clay County having first been denied in 2005 when it applied to build a 92-bed hospital and again in 2013 when the current emer-

gency center was built.

Darin C. Roark, administrator of the Baptist Clay Medical Campus and Baptist Health emergency services expressed his disappointment on the ACHA ruling via email.

"The process of achieving Certificate of Need approval can take a number of years, and we remain committed to stay the course. We will continue to work with AHCA and explore our options. In the meantime, we will continue to enhance the pediatric and adult ambulatory care provided on our Baptist Clay campus in response to the needs of the Clay community," Roark said.

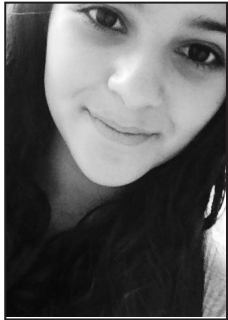


# Work Ready Program gets kids certifications, internships

MIDDLEBURG — A new internship program created by the Clay County School District's Academies of Clay is providing students with professional experience and allowing them to earn college credit for their work. The new program also allows participating companies to secure future employees in a competitive market.

One intern, 17-year-old Tatiana Rolon-Rivera, built a resume, competed and went through interviews, as well as

a drug screening. She succeeded and was selected by the Clay County Utility Authority for an internship through the district's Work Ready Program — making \$11.25 per hour as one of the company's first interns in the CCUA's first year in the internship program.

"This is my second internship," Rolon-Rivera said. "It goes all the way to summer and if I do well, it works out and there's an opening, I may have the opportunity to work at the Clay County Utility Authority."

Rolon-Rivera is an information technology student at Middleburg High School's Visual, Information Technology and Leadership Academy, where she is instructed by teacher Charlie Thompson. He referred the teen for the internship because she interned over the summer as an IT special-



ist for the school district and continues to excel academically.

to hold off until disputes with the town and its abatement board are decided in court.

"A good analogy would be if you have a car loan, the loan requires you to maintain insurance. If you let the insurance lapse, you default on the loan," said attorney Dan Copeland, who has been representing Patel in the abatement board proceedings.

"Mr. Patel is current on all of his payments, but he has to keep the property clear of any liens, encumbrances or judgments that could have a negative effect on the title to the property. We will address the lien and ask the court to abate or suspend the foreclosure action pending the outcome of litigation with the Town of Orange Park."

The nuisance abatement board voted unanimously on Dec. 14 to order the Rode-

way Inn to close, but neither the board nor the town have the authority to enforce the order. Town attorney Sam Garrison must petition the court to review the order and a judge will decide whether to enforce it or not. In the meantime, CenterState Bank wants the remaining \$2.64 million in principal.

The complaint also indicates the bank wants \$789 in interest, \$2,416 in late charges, \$8,300 in appraisal fees and interest, which accrues at the rate of \$396 per day. This totals \$2.65 million on a mortgage that was originally taken out on Aug. 16, 2006 for \$4 million.

The document indicates the bank fears its investment has been harmed by the condition of the motel and the controversy surrounding it. That controversy began when the nuisance abatement board met in February to address a high number of criminal complaints fielded by the Orange Park Police Department in the preceding

months.

In February, the board ordered Patel to pay a \$3,000 fine to the town and implement a photo I.D. program. The board also ordered him to put up surveillance cameras with a fence and lighting that police required, having previously chased people into the nearby woods from the hotel. The board followed up in March and found Patel to be in compliance with those orders.

However, the criminal activity continued and the board reconvened in September and heard testimony from OPPD Police Chief Gary Goble that the department had received 350 calls to the Rodeway since March 1.

The board ordered Patel to hire off-duty police officers and a private security company, which it did and Goble testified to the successful drop in crime at the Rodeway when the board met in October.

However, the fire chief had inspected the motel and found numerous fire and safety violations. The board gave Patel 30 days to put a plan together to bring the Rodeway up to fire and safety code standards. He was not expected to complete a plan in 30 days, but to merely present one and he hadn't done so when the board met again in November.

The board gave Patel another month to submit a plan by Dec. 11 or be ordered to close when the board met on Dec. 14. Because a plan endorsed by Barker was not received by the end of the business day on Dec. 11, the board followed through with its promise when it met on the 14th to follow up.

Copeland said Patel intends to countersue the Town of Orange Park when the appropriate time comes. The bank's foreclosure suit mentions inspections earlier this year that found mold and insect infestations. However, Copeland contends there are no health concerns at the motel.

"As of Dec. 8, they were inspected and any violations, such as simple as a dumpster lid being open, was corrected at the time of the inspection. In short, there were none. There were no health code violations as of Dec. 8," Copeland said.

Copeland said foreclosures are handled through case management conferences where the parties appear every 30 to 60 days to update the court on the matter as it moves toward resolution. He said there are no pleadings offered and he is confident for what he deems a "positive outcome."

There are as many as 100 people permanently living in the extended-stay motel.

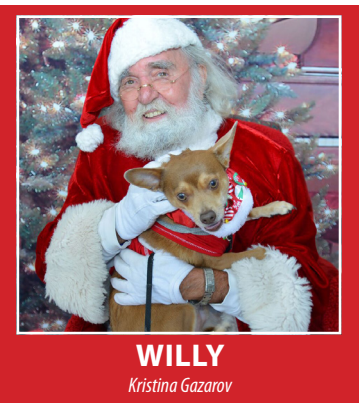
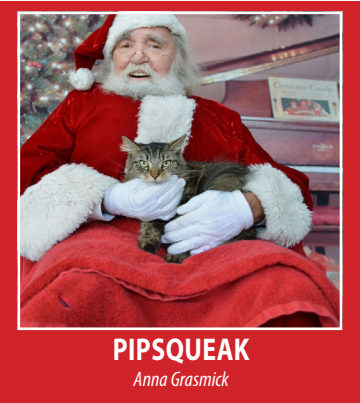
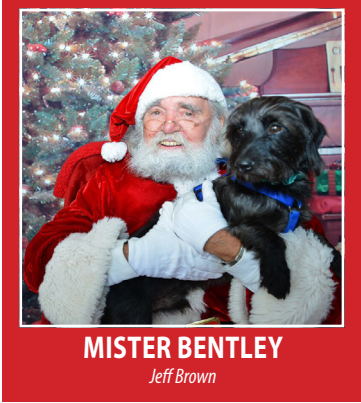

# Holly-jolly landscape color

If there's ever a time when landscapes look a little drab in Florida, that time is probably winter. We're easily spoiled in the Sunshine State, with year-round green being more the rule than the exception.

When leaves fall and trees look bare, many folks find their landscapes lose a lot of appeal. So, what can you do when your "Winter Wonderland" has you wondering where all the interest went? The evergreen foliage and bright red berries of holly can be just the thing to cure winter doldrums. This winter turn your eye – and your spade – to adding some spectacular color to the landscape with a staple of "holly-day" cheer.

Hollies are actually quite a large family of trees and shrubs. Hollies are ap-

preciated throughout the U.S. for their cheerful berries and year-round greenery that attract birds. Traditionally, holly symbolizes the regrowth and renewal of spring to come after the cold and dark of winter. In Florida, we have many native and non-native selections to choose from, with a big range in sizes. There's great holly selections for almost any landscape conditions – from sun to shade, from dry to wet, and most points in between. Find a spot first, and measure how much room your new addition will have to grow. Be sure to check overhead as well in case there are any height restrictions. Then, note the soil, sun and drainage in the area to match. With so many choices, you're bound to find one that works for your space.

Most hollies are very low-maintenance with few pest problems. If placed where they have room to grow full-sized, hollies will not require pruning – and that will help lighten your landscape load over the coming years. Many have a naturally tidy form that provides great structure in the landscape without the constant haircuts some plants need to look tidy. Choices you

can match to your space and conditions include:

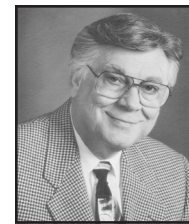
## Dahoon Holly (*Ilex cassine*)

While less showy than other varieties, Dahoon is a flexible plant in the landscape. Dahoon can be allowed to grow naturally into a small-trunked tree that's less regular in form than other hollies. This cultivar also responds well to shaping as a tall screen. Purchase one male and one female to ensure berries. This holly likes full sun to part shade and tolerates short periods of standing water, making it perfect for areas with alternating flooding and drought. Typically grows 20-30 feet tall with an 8-12 foot spread, though older specimens can reach 40 feet tall.

## Burford Holly (*Ilex cornuta* 'Burfordii')

One of the darkest greens in the landscape, Burford holly has a tidy form that rarely needs pruning. Burfords are especially sought because they are self-fertile, and will produce berries without the need

said fewer people want to make a career in her company's industry, so as organizations compete for employees, it helps to have already put them to work.

"These are really good kids who are already working on what they want to do in their careers. Our industry faces a limited labor pool, so instead of waiting for future employees to come to us, with current employees planning to retire and the First Coast Expressway bringing a need for us to expand services, this internship program gives us the opportunity to shape our future employees and have them certified from the beginning," she said.

There are four academies at Middleburg High School: the Design Build Academy for architecture, construction and arts such as pottery and photography; the Mecca Academy for healthcare, early

childhood education and culinary arts; the Steam Academy for horticulture, automotive and science technology; and the Vital Academy for computer systems and information technology, digital design and Web development, journalism and business management.

All four are overseen by Academies Coach Stacey Rutherford, who said the internships are organized with local businesses. This is the first year CCUA has gotten involved and started out by offering three internships with expansion to come later.

"We partner with our partners from our advisory board. These are businesses that are interested in hiring students from our academies and the Clay County Utility Authority asked for information technology, engineering and drafting and environmental. We set it up based on teacher recommendations, then I asked

the students if they wanted to apply," Rutherford said.

The water provider put 10 students through interviews, narrowing the field down to three. Rolon-Rivera was chosen for her prior internship and for having stood out when report cards are released.

"Tatiana is very impressive – we chose her for her academic excellence. She has already performed as an IT intern and she's working on certifications our people are required to have to work in their professional capacities," Laffy said.

In addition to the certification process that gives students a head start in their careers, Thompson said they can earn as many as 21 college credits just from the certification prep courses he teaches. They can also take college prep courses and dual enrollment classes in conjunction with St. Johns River State College.

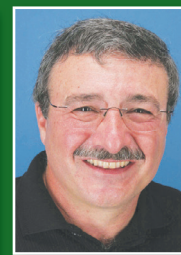

carnival and you have to be relevant in today's world," Sutton said. "I just don't want the fair to become the drive-in theater. As a kid, we all remember that participation ribbon, so we work hard to make it a family affair. That's our vision."

To put on a fair with more than 113,000 attendees requires help from networks of volunteers, a feat Sutton was able to build and retain through his positive attitude and good nature.

"We camp out for two weeks while the fair is going on and we get tired," said Tony Tharp, who worked with Sutton for 10 years as the entertainment director and a chairman of the board.

"This fair runs on volunteer help and we have about 1,000 or so. When you see him he's supporting our volunteers. He's a people person. I've never seen him mad or not in a good mood. We are really going to miss him," Tharp said.

# Rosemary is native to the Holy Lands

Rosemary (*Rosmarinus officianalis*) is a winter-blooming shrub that grows well throughout Florida. That alone makes it a great choice for your garden.

But like a talented actor, rosemary plays multiple roles. It brightens your drought-tolerant landscape, adds flavor to your cooking and aroma to your potpourri. Rosemary has been immortalized in song and classic literature, plus it plays a part in a charming legend of Christmas.

Its waxy needle-like leaves grow from the newer sections of the stems, while the older sections of the stem are covered with a rough gray bark. Rosemary is one of many culinary herbs in the mint family. Others include mints, thyme, marjoram, oregano, sages, monarda, and many others. Plants in our herb gardens produce aromatic chemicals to help to fight off leaf-eating predators, but these properties also add flavor to our cooking and aroma to potpourri mixtures.

Most people find the distinctive scent of this plant to be sharp, but pleasant and now we also know that smelling it improves your memory. Both the flowers and leaves of rosemary are traditional ingredients in the “Herbes de Provence” mixture. Rosemary is often used as the center of a “bouquet garni” in which several herbs are tied together or placed in a cheesecloth bag and are cooked in a soup or sauce, to impart their flavors, then removed before serving. A rosemary sprig is often used as a garnish on roasted meats. You can even use a sprig of rosemary as a brush to paint on the sauce when grilling foods and you could also try burning some rosemary in the grilling fire, which creates beautifully scented smoke.

In addition to planting it in herb gardens, rosemary is often used in general drought-tolerant, full-sun landscapes in Florida. It prefers a slightly alkaline soil, so use shells, chunks of cement or limestone in the soil where you plant it. Normally it’s a multi-stemmed shrub reaching up to five feet tall and four feet wide in ideal conditions, but there are also upright, single-stemmed varieties and recumbent types that serve as a groundcover. It can be trimmed into a short hedge or allowed to grow freely. Because it blooms in the winter, rosemary provides a good source of nectar for those occasional warm days in winter when solitary bees and other insects come out to forage. If you look at

rosemary when it’s not in bloom, you may wonder how it ended up in the mint family, but once you see those bilateral flowers with a double upper lip and an extended lower lip, it looks like any of the other mint flowers. Flowers are usually blue, but some cultivars have pink or white flowers. Whatever their color, winter flowers make a good addition to your landscape.

You can easily propagate rosemary from a soft-wood cutting by stripping off the lower leaves and then planting in sandy medium. Or if you have a multi-stemmed shrub, you can probably find a branch that has lain on the ground long enough to have developed roots, which can then be cut from the shrub and replanted. Seeds germinate slowly and the offspring may not resemble the parent plant. For instance, a seed from a recumbent rosemary plant could grow into an upright shrub.

## Rosemary, Christmas, and other traditions

Rosemary is steeped, as it were, in Christmas tradition, and would have been a common plant in the Middle East two thousand years ago. The rosemary legends revolve around Mary’s draping of a garment over the rosemary plant. One version tells that during the Holy Family’s flight to Egypt, Mary draped her blue cloak over the shrub and its white flowers turned blue. Another version says that after Mary hung the Christ Child’s garments on the bush, it was given its pleasant aroma as a reward for its service for the Child.

In the Middle Ages it was traditional to spread rosemary on the floor of the home at Christmas to release its fragrance as it was tread upon. It also had a reputation as being offensive to evil spirits and as a disinfectant to ward off illnesses.

Rosemary also symbolizes remembrance. When used at funerals, it’s thrown into the grave and given to the grieving relatives as a sign the deceased would not be forgotten. It also came to represent friendship and fidelity and was traditional to weave it into brides’ bouquets and grooms’ boutonnières to remind participants of their vows.

William Shakespeare made several references to rosemary in his works *King Lear*, *Romeo & Juliet*, *Hamlet*, *The Winter’s Tale*, and *Pericles*.

## Rosemary Christmas trees

Using a trimmed rosemary shrub as a Christmas tree is a great choice as seasonal decoration because it continues to be useful after the holidays. If you get a rosemary Christmas tree topiary, it will probably need some attention before you bring it inside or put it out on the front step for decoration.



Before this plant was placed in the store for sale, an upright, single-stemmed variety rosemary was planted into that pot three, six or even nine months previously and grown in a greenhouse or sheltered environment where it was well-fed and well-watered to induce fast growth.

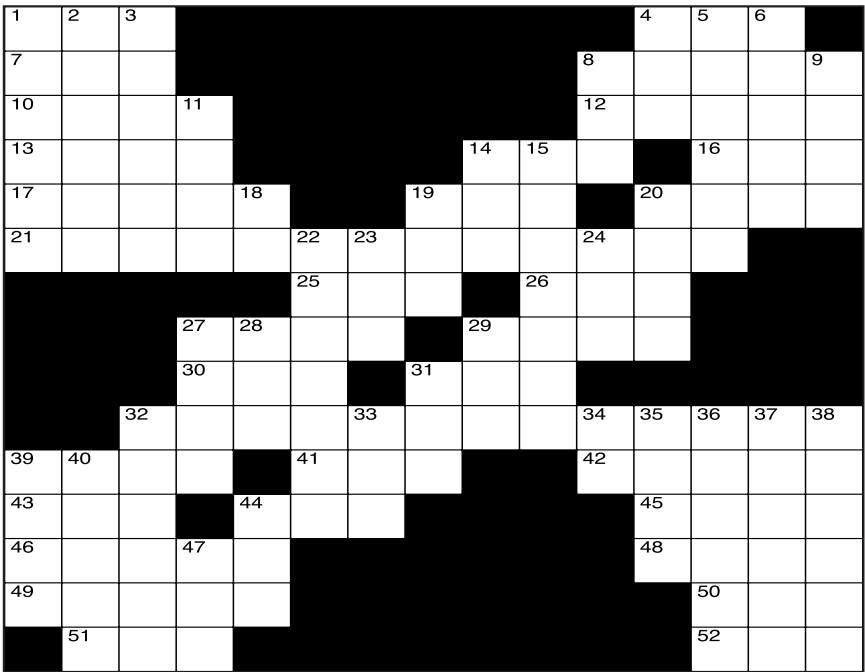
As the plant produced branches, it was sheared back – probably two or three times – to form a cone. By the time you receive it, the plant may be pot-bound and it may have had spotty care (either over-watering or under-watering and probably low light) since leaving its greenhouse environment.

When the holiday season is over you can plant your topiared rosemary in your

yard, but it will probably not retain its conical shape for long. If you plant a new one each year, you can create a wonderful rosemary hedge around your herb garden or create a grouping anywhere you’d like easy-care, drought-tolerant shrubs. Then enjoy your scented garden and your winter butterflies and bees. Merry Christmas!

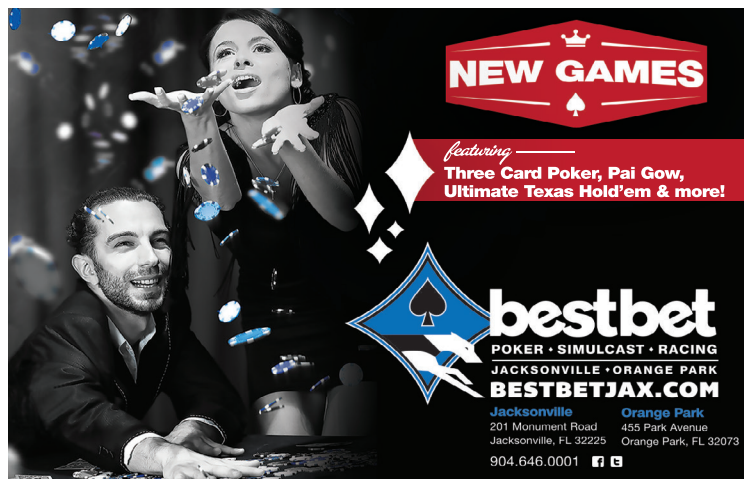

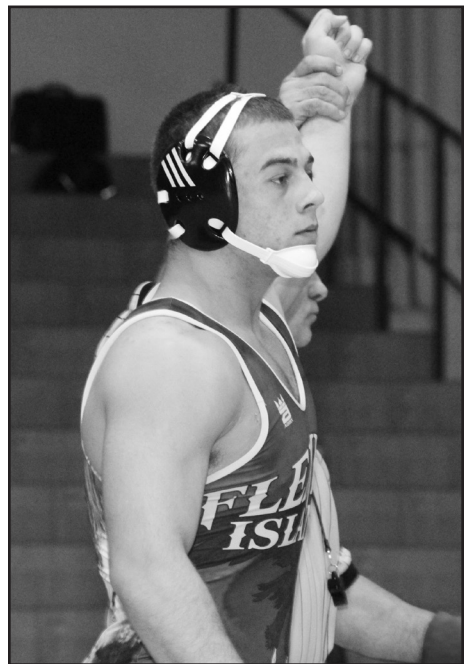

is early. We'll see some of those guys in our district, region and state meets."

Fleming Island finished with 259.5 points to hold off a late charge from Riverdale of Ft. Myers (fifth in Class 2A, 2015) who erased a 21 point lead by the Golden Eagles with a strong consolation round to tie the score twice during the finals' round, but fell short by just a point after Fleming Island's Jason Davis pinned at 195 pounds in just 46 seconds to secure the win. Region 1-3A rival Winter Springs (second in Class 3A in 2015) finished third at 204.5 with 1-3A's Flagler Palm Coast (fifth in 3A) fourth at 203.0. Miami of Columbus finished fifth at 143. Fleming Island finished 12th in Class 3A last year.

"Our numbers in the finals, plus some strong top eight finishes for the rest of the lineup kept us in the hunt despite the losses in the finals," said Cobbert. "We were still missing two guys (at 145 and 152), but the guys who lost early wrestled strong to stay in the points matches in consolation."

Top performer for the night for Fleming Island was freshman Deandre Demus, who had a state-meet caliber opponents list that would have shaken fear in most underclass wrestlers. Demus outpointed another freshman in his 113 finals match, Lake Mary's Jeremiah Costen, 13-9 after dispatching of Riverdale senior James Monos, a 2A state runnerup last year at 113, in the semifinals. In his prelims, Demus defeated Miami Columbus state qualifier Edgar Martinez, a senior. In his final, Demus scored six third period points to cushion his win.

"Deandre just goes out and wrestles tough all the time," said Cobbert. "He doesn't get rattled when people tell him his guy is a state runnerup or a region finalist. He just wrestles hard."

With his lineup of finalists; sophomore Albie Snedacker at 106, Demus, senior Tracy Davis at 126, senior Xaiver Sampsel at 132, senior John Martorana at 170, sophomore Ryan Smenda at 182 and Davis, a junior, Cobbert was wary of the firepower of the wrestlers in all the finals and that the points would be tough to earn.

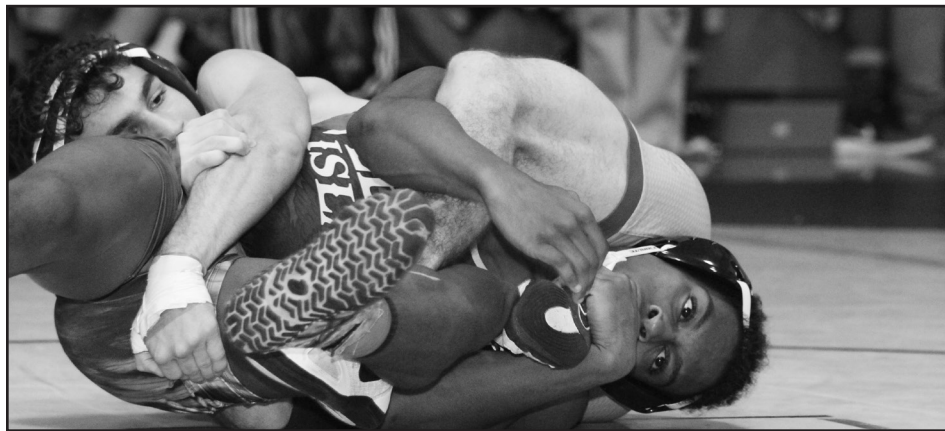
"This meet puts us up against a good lineup in preparation for a run at the end of the year," said Cobbert. "What we did today is good, but we have a lot of work to do. We need to be able to take these kind of first place matches."

Snedacker lost to Cian Fischer of Weyauwega-Fremont of Wisconsin at 106 7-3 with Davis, a state qualifier at 126, taking Flagler Palm Coast sophomore Michael DeAugustino, fourth at 126 in 3A last year, to four overtime rounds before losing 2-1.

"Tracy and DeAugustino will meet again at regions and could make it to semifinals at the state meet," said Cobbert.

In another possible region 1-3A finals' preview, Sampsel, a three-time state qualifier (sixth in 2015 at 120), lost by injury default at 132 against Winter Springs' sophomore Cole Mitchell. Sampsel had built up a 5-2 lead into the second period, but twice halted the match for a neck-related injury. Mitchell wound up tying the score at 5-5 then went ahead 7-5 before Sampsel relinquished the match with 28 seconds remaining.

In the next four finals, with no Fleming Island athletes, Winter Springs won at 138, Riverdale won at 145, Flagler Palm Coast won at 152 and Winter Springs won at 160 to set up Fleming Island's second round of finalists with Martorana losing 6-3 to Riverdale's Jared Galan off a final two-point move with just three seconds left in their 170 final match and Smenda also giving up a two-point takedown with six seconds left in his match to lose 8-6 to Riverdale's Gage Schield to set up a must-

win situation for Davis at 195. Smenda fell behind 3-0 in the first period, but wrestled back to tie the score at 4-4 and 6-6 before the final scoring opportunity went to Shield.

Davis was last week's outstanding wrestler at the Westside Kiwanis Invite and had rifled through his Bill Scott prelims with three pins in a row. In his final, Davis put Kichener on his back with a strong single leg takedown, then executed an Easton roll move to flatten Kichener for the pin and the team title final points.

"I learned after my state meet that every match I wrestle I have to treat as a state championship," said Davis, third at 182 last year in Class 2A with Oakleaf High School. "I made a critical mistake at the state meet last year and it cost me a title. I'm wrestling to get the job done this year."

For Cobbert, Davis' addition to the lineup adds an element of motivation to his young squad.

"Two things with Jason; one, he wrestles against me in practice because he is so strong and fast so he's learning stuff that other wrestlers don't necessarily get everyday," said Cobbert, a four-time state

champion while at Clay High School and still a formidable mat presence. "Second, the young guys feed off of his intensity not only on the mat, but in preparation for his matches. He wants to improve last year's third place."

Fleming Island got third at 138 from sophomore Paul Detwiler, seventh at 120 from sophomore Jacob Sandoval and fourth at 220 from sophomore Jose Concepcion who faced two-time state champion Dylan Meeks of Dr. Phillips in his semifinal and lost an 11-5 decision. Meeks defeated Riverdale's Cyrus Girtman to win the 220 title and stave off enough Riverdale points to keep the title in Fleming Island's hands. Concepcion did pin Flagler's Justin Haaf in prelims. Fleming Island junior Brandyne Mackey took fifth at 285 with a pin of Miami Columbus junior Robert Perez.

Fleming Island continues its rugged schedule with a duals tournament at Flagler Palm Coast on Tues., Dec. 22 and the Osceola Knockout Tournament at Kissimmee-Osceola High School in two weeks where Class 3A state champion South Dade is scheduled to compete.

soccer home for a long time.

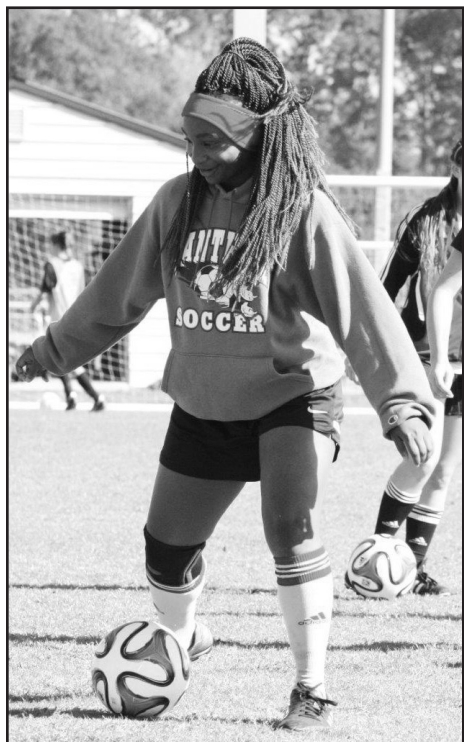
"I started playing here a long time ago and this is where my passion for the game started," said Brian, a midfielder for the recently crowned U.S. women's World Cup championship team that defeated Japan 5-2 in Canada in July. "To be able to keep improve enough to accomplish the things I have has been quite amazing, but I still want to do more."

Brian, on hand at the Clay County Soccer Complex to introduce her soon-to-be annual summer soccer skills camp, was part of a Hall of Fame weekend for the Eagle Harbor-based soccer plaza with eight athletes selected to be in the initial induction field this summer.

"We decided to do our first Hall of Fame in conjunction with Morgan's visit so that the kids could see how small beginnings can lead to bigger and better things," said Clay County Soccer coach Luis Torres, who works with complex director Al Cruz to keep the soccer balls flying in Eagle Harbor. "The interest in this camp alone makes it one of the biggest single weekend camps in Florida."

On Monday, Brian visited with a Clay High freshman, Alexis Lato, a soccer player recently diagnosed with a cancerous brain tumor. "I watched the World Cup soccer tournament on TV and even rewatched the China game yesterday and I just was thrilled that Morgan Brian would be here," said Lato, who visited with her mom, Elise and sister Emma, a Lake Asbury Junior High student.

Lato took over the media interview with Brian and asked questions about playing at such a high level, her future plans and what it was like to play with legends like Abby Wambach, recently retired from the American team and also recipient of the

"Being one of the youngest players on the team last year was interesting because all of the players are very seasoned and have experienced most everything that goes on at major international tournaments," said Brian. "I just tried to keep up with that part of it and kept trying to improve my soccer skills for when I got my shot to get on the playing field. Abby Wambach was all about her leadership skills and she was very vocal about us winning that championship game."

Brian had been a two-time MAC (Missouri Athletic Club) Hermann trophy winner, the equivalent to the NCAA football's Heisman Trophy for best player in the country, while at the University of Virginia where she and Kaili Torres, Luis' daughter and also a Virginia player, both played for the Cavaliers. In 2013, Brian led the Atlantic Coast Conference in scoring with 46 points off 16 goals and 14 assists while leading the Cavaliers to four NCAA tournament appearances in her four years and a College Cup appearance.

"I have been on championship teams from youth soccer, high school soccer, college soccer and now World Cup soccer and I don't think a World Cup team has ever won an Olympic gold medal," said Brian, who has recently signed to play professionally with the Houston Dash of the Women's Professional Soccer League. "That would be a nice goal."

Lato asked Brian of any pregame rituals she does and was privy to two inside bits of inside information.

"Before every game, I shower just before the game," said Brian. "I also shower after the game, of course, but, also, just before the whistle to start the game, I jump three times in the air and touch my chest

# Roney sisters lighting up scoreboards

Three-point aces push Broncos to 11-5

MIDDLEBURG — For the last year, opponents of the Middleburg High girls basketball team knew all about the three-point prowess of junior point guard Hannah Roney. Roney led area scorers last year with her 25.1 points per game with her 52 three-pointers second in north Florida.

“Other teams would mark her and double and triple team her, but she still scored her 20-30 points per game just because she was that good,” said Broncos' first year coach Michael Hayward, now at 11-5, 4-1 in district play. “With the two of them on target, it's poetry in motion.”

The “two” that Hayward spoke of was the sister pair of Hannah Roney and freshman sister Mallory Roney, now a second Bronco sharpshooter. Hannah Roney, with a 20.8 points per game average, has pulled slightly ahead of Mallory in the three point shooting category with 47 on the year on 145 attempts as Mallory, at 19.8 points per game, has settled in at 36 on 108 attempts from the outside stripe.

“We tend to try and feed each other on the court and that keeps everything kind of even,” said Hannah Roney, the Broncos single season scoring record holder and season three-pointer leader with 54

successful shots as a freshman breaking Nyesha Little's old record of 40. “We have both got more assists than before with our passes also feeding other girls to score.”

In the assists category, Hannah Roney has 91 passes leading to scores with Mallory adding 51 after 16 games.

For Hayward, the double dynamic presents just one drawback and, against 7A-Bartram Trail early in the season, with Hannah Roney fouling out early in the third, Mallory Roney was left to direct the Bronco attack. Middleburg led 34-28 at the half. Bartram Trail outscored the Broncos 19-8 in the third quarter.

Against 7A-Oakleaf on Monday, a 61-46 non-district loss, Hannah Roney hit just one three pointer while Mallory Roney hit two.

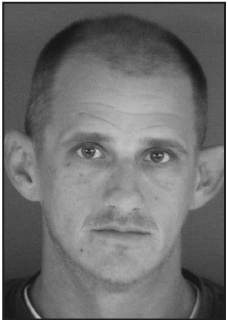

## Bank fraud charges for Middleburg man

### Body identified, located in retention pond

According to a post on the Clay County Sheriff's Office Facebook page, the man's body was spotted by a resident of the area and reported to the CCSO through neighborhood security staff.

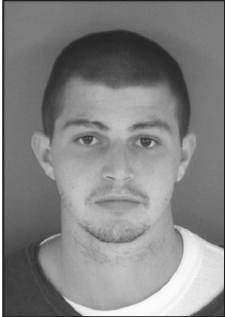

Although the report did not mention how Camplesi knew the victim or obtained the pills, the report stated that a witness “picked up [Camplesi] from a job site and observed [him] ingest at least one pill from the stolen prescription bottle on the way...home.” Camplesi was arrested Dec. 17 and, at press time, is being held on \$5,003 bond.

## Pot plants seized at man's home

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A Clay Coun-

ty man was arrested after a search of his home between Middleburg and Lake Asbury revealed 34 marijuana plants were found.

Kyle Edward Murphey, 24, was arrested and charged with cultivation of cannabis, possession of a controlled substance and possession of less than 20 grams of cannabis, according to the Clay County Sheriff's Office police report.

Although the report did not state how police were alerted that Murphey was growing cannabis, on Dec. 18, contact was made with Murphey who voluntarily exited the residence, the report stated.

According to the report, a search by officials found 34 marijuana plants in various stages of growth, 20 pills identified as narcotics using the website drugs.com, and approximately eight grams of processed marijuana.

He has since been released on an undisclosed bond from the Clay County Jail.

## Boys caught throwing rocks at cars

MIDDLEBURG – Three boys under the age of 12 were identified as the people responsible for two incidents of throwing rocks at vehicles heading Northeast on Henley Road last week.

On Dec. 15 around 6:45 p.m., two separate victims filed complaints after their vehicles were damaged costing between \$200 and \$400.

In a sworn statement, one victim said she was driving on Henley Road with her mother when “something hit the passenger side door frame of the vehicle,” according to a Clay County Sheriff's Office police report. Officials saw two small indentations on the top right side of the passenger side door.

The second victim was also driving Northeast on Henley Road when he heard “a very loud bang” but did not see pedestrians near the area and no other vehicles ahead. However, the bottom right corner of the victim's windshield was cracked, according to the report. Both incidents occurred near Coppergate Elementary School.

The investigation revealed that three children were throwing rocks at the cars. There were no firearms of any kind involved. At press time, the investigation remains ongoing and the children's names have not been released. Officials are working with the children's parents and with the victims to finalize the case and determine what, if any, charges will be filed.

for a male and female plant. Give full sun – part shade and moderate water; tolerates drought and flooding conditions. Burford holly can be kept pruned as a hedge, but best as a small tree 15-25 feet tall and wide, where the drooping lower branches add greatly to the form.

**American Holly (*Ilex opaca*)** is one of the most popular landscape plants in America history. Its touch character and beautiful pyramidal form make it an outstanding landscape selection. Give American Holly a little extra spacing – plants have thorns on the leaves that are unpleasant to work around, so give some breathing space around walls, walkways, and maintenance areas. Likes full sun – part shade and very well drained soils. American holly is one of the larger holly choices, with a 35-50 feet mature height and 15-25 foot spread.

**Yaupon Holly (*Ilex vomitoria*)** has become popular lately for the tea made from its roasted young leaves. It is the only plant found in Florida with a natural caffeine content. Yaupon holly can be kept clipped as a hedge, or trained to espaliers and even topiaries and bonsai. The natural form makes a lovely effect like a small grove, which can be enhanced by pruning off lower limbs. Males do not produce berries; buy plants with berries present if you want all female plants. Withstands drought when established as well as occasional flooding. Full sun – heavy shade. Plants grow 15-25 feet tall with a 15-20 foot spread.

**Weeping Yaupon Holly (*Ilex vomitoria* ‘Pendula’)** This Yaupon holly relative has a fantastic weeping form that makes an eye-catching landscape accent. Often sold as a multi-trunk specimen. 15-30 feet tall with a narrow, drooping 6-10 foot spread. Same cultural requirements as Yaupon.

**‘Nellie Stevens’ Holly (*Ilex x* ‘Nellie Stevens’)** Rapid growth to 20-30 feet in height with a 10-12 feet spread and a nice pyramidal form. Best when unpruned to allow branches to reach the ground for

a living ‘Christmas Tree’ effect. ‘Nellie Stevens’ requires a male from another holly species to cross-pollinate for berry production – add a Chinese Holly for a selection with similar bloom times. Give an area with full sun to part shade. Very drought tolerant when established. ‘Nellie Stevens’ can also tolerate periods of flooding.

**‘East Palatka’ Holly (*Ilex x attenuata* ‘East Palatka’)** – a local hybrid discovered in Palatka in the late 1920s, this is a great tree for uniform appearance, such to line a driveway or walkway. East Palatka holly also works well in small areas 100 square feet or more surrounded by paving. Trees grow moderately fast to 30-45 feet in height with a 10-15 foot

spread and a nice pyramidal form. Prolific berries in fall and winter. Likes full sun – part shade and almost any soil as long the site is well-drained. Drought tolerant once established.

By the time you read this, the shopping and wrapping will be finished, presents will be opened, and the holiday meal eaten. It’s the perfect time to sit back and set a few landscape goals to brighten the New Year. ## Keep pets and livestock from becoming prey to wildlife

TALLAHASSEE – If you are like most Americans, your pet is a beloved member of the family. Having your pet injured or killed by a wild animal can be a tragic and traumatic event.

Reports of negative interactions with Florida wildlife are on the rise, prompting the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission to remind Florida residents and visitors to protect their pets and livestock from wildlife depredations.

Florida is unique among states in the eastern U.S. in that most of the native predators still roam here. This includes panthers, bears, alligators and bobcats. Many negative interactions with Florida wildlife can be prevented by taking the appropriate precautions.

appropriate precautions.

Safety measures should be taken to protect pets such as dogs and cats, by keeping them indoors at night, on a leash or in an outdoor predator-proof pen.

Cats are a particularly easy target since there are a variety of predators that prey on them, including panthers and coyotes as well as bobcats and even dogs. Keeping your cat inside not only protects it from becoming prey but also prevents it from preying on songbirds and other wildlife.

FWC also recommends properly sheltering livestock such as goats, sheep, calves, pigs, donkeys and poultry from wildlife depredations. Livestock can be protected by keeping them in a secure

fenced enclosure with a roof, especially at night.

Coyotes are live in all 67 Florida counties and are adaptable to rural, suburban and urban areas. Both coyotes and bears are attracted to a variety of food sources such as unsecured trash, bird and wildlife feeders and pet food left outside. However, because bears are opportunistic feeders, depredations of pets or livestock are more often caused by more active predators such as panthers or coyotes.

Panthers don’t eat trash and pet food, but will eat animals that are attracted to these items. Panthers are typically found in southwest Florida, but they are starting to be reported with more frequency in

other parts of the state.

When feeding outdoor domestic animals, be sure to only put out enough food for the animal to eat immediately, and then remove any uneaten food as soon as possible. Keep all food sources stored in a secure location when not in use to reduce the likelihood of conflicts between your animals and bears and other wildlife.
