Unions sign new contracts

Teachers and support staffers to receive increases

FLEMING ISLAND — After declaring an impasse in contract negotiations, enduring mediation and an impasse hearing, the Clay County School District and its teachers have ratified a new contract.

The document signed by both parties at the April 21 school board meeting gives teachers a \$500 raise retroactive to last

July 1, plus they get to continue being paid \$450 for attending additional trainings called Professional Learning Communities. The negotiations broke down last fall after the district offered a proposal that would eliminate PLC pay and instead give only a \$500 raise. The new contract, however, gives both.

"This proposal was a zero gain for teachers, not a salary increase. The rea-

son teachers voted to ratify this contract, is that the county made a mistake at the [March 10 impasse] hearing. Your intention was to take away the PLC money already promised and replace it with the same money on our salary, but by the impasse hearing date, teachers had worked nearly all of the extra hours and been paid for them," said Victoria Kidwell, a teacher at Argyle Elementary and a board member of the Clay County Education Association

Doctors Inlet’s Florida Soap Plant

For years, folks living in Clay County could tell which way the wind blew by whether their nose hairs were curling from the wafting aroma of Florida Soap and Tallow’s rendering plant in Doctors Inlet or from Jacksonville’s paper mill to the north.

Tampa Soap and Tallow was already making a killing cooking up meat scraps salvaged from military mess halls at McDill Air Force Base in their back yard and were anxious to make a deal to do the same at Camp Blanding. In early 1939, they sealed the deal for the advice and support of local power broker, landowner and businessman, Bryan Jennings and got to work.

First on their list was hiring a young go-getter with military contacts at Blanding to arrange acquiring meat scraps and manage production. Several officers at the camp recommended a young Army Sergeant, Walter Odum, trained as an M.P. and working in the commissary while he awaited a medical discharge.

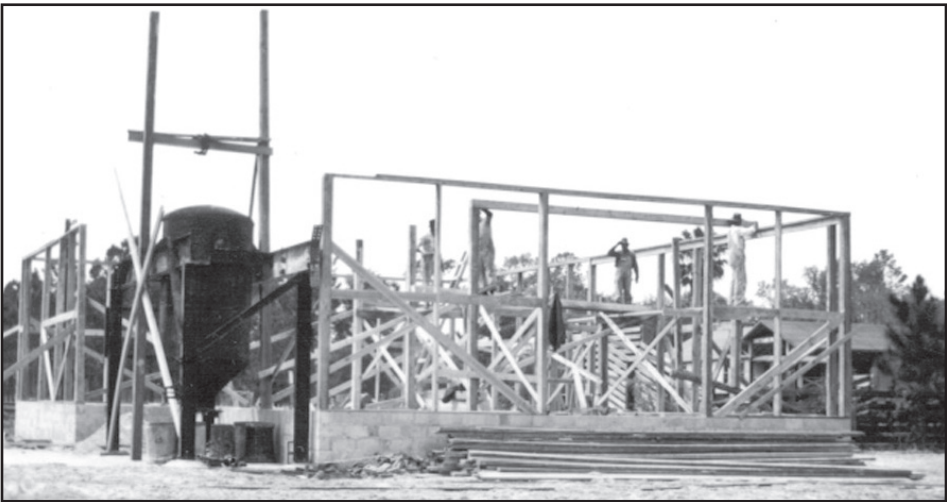
The state of the art rendering plant was constructed in Doctors Inlet off County Road 220 and just east of the railroad

tracks. Rendered grease was hauled out by train in tanker cars.

It was nasty, hard work. Meat scraps were picked up from Camp Blanding, area restaurants and meat processors in 50-gallon open drums and transported to the plant in open body trucks. The worst dread of any local was to get caught behind one of these trucks on a hot summer afternoon in the days before air-conditioned cars. Unidentifiable foul-smelling objects periodically catapulted from the trucks and lumpy liquids sloshed along behind leaving a smelly trail to steam on the pavement.

Once at the plant, the contents of the drums were run through the chipper to reduce large bones to manageable dimensions then dumped in the 15-foot tall cooker. Every few feet, a thick metal disk was tamped into place and then another layer of meat and bone alternated until the goulash reached the top and the heavy lid was clamped into place. Workers then fired up the steam-powered pressure cooker.

After a time, the cooker was turned off, the steam valve released and the grease valve at the base opened. When

the stream of grease slowed, the steam piston was hooked up to compress every drop of grease out to the collection drums. The cooker was opened and the metal discs slung into a pile for use in the next batch and the compressed, cooked wafers of squeezed dry meat and bone were rolled off and stacked to sell for animal feed.

The equipment was washed down and the greasy water funneled to the separator tanks where the grease was reclaimed.

Odum couldn’t stand to see anything go to waste and the immense quantities of feathers his trucks left at the chicken pro-

cessors gnawed at him until they came up with a solution. They built a rotating heated dehydrator and carefully regulated the temperature so as not to set the feathers on fire. Once dry, the feathers were ground into a fine pure protein powder, packed in bags and sold to Ralston Purina. Locals swore that blue-streaked clay with Feather Meal mixed in made an unbeatable shrimp bait.

Folks griped about the smells from the grease plant but to the men who worked there and the people they traded with – it smelled like money.

Bayard Conservation Area Solitude on the busiest of days

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – At the southern entrance of the Bayard Conservation Area, oak trees standing tall in the sky boast full leaves of light and dark greens. The forest’s verdant canopy screens bushes and creatures below from the midday sun, sparing just enough light on the forest floor for visitors to make their way through its trails.

Located in Green Cove Springs, the area is a vast 9,702-acre landmass that offers hiking, biking, horseback riding, camping,

fishing and hunting. It rests in the heart of Clay County along the western bank of the St. Johns River and right outside of Green Cove’s city limits.

As hikers walk along one of Bayard’s two trails, pine needles crunch and tree branches snap on the forest floor. The meandering pathway, formed solely for human trek, shifts from narrow to wide with every turn. Brown leaves float atop swampy marshes that emerge throughout the hike, while gaunt and creaky boardwalks aid

Health leaders plan healthier future for Clay County

ORANGE PARK – Months of meetings, planning and collecting data all came down to one event last week for Clay County's health care community.

The Health Planning Council of Northeast Florida met April 19 with health advocates and leaders from Clay County to unveil the Community Health Improvement Plan, which hopes to be the vehicle to improve the overall health of the community.

What CHIP intends to do between 2016 and December 31, 2018 is to remove these roadblocks to health and create a healthier, stronger community both physically and mentally.

To do this, those involved in developing the CHIP – health authorities, faith based organizations, and transit officials – held nine work groups to target specific methods to reduce the severity of the three priority health issues identified in a report put forth by the Health Planning Council.

The report, funded by the Florida Department of Health in Clay County, identifies the health issues in the community based on surveys, and offers health officials a baseline in which to develop strategies, but by no means is it closed off from the community.

"If there's a volunteer who's really interested, they're more than welcome to come to the meetings and get involved," said Emily Suter, director of health planning for the HPCNEF. "The more the merrier. The way you achieve these goals is through community ownership and involvement."

The Clay CHIP group decided to target three priority health issues they wish to

Courts failed organizations that won redistricting fight

If only the Florida Constitution included a provision like this:

(1) Members of the Legislature who vote for measures subsequently held unconstitutional shall be liable jointly and severally for all attorney fees and costs as established by the court.

(2) Failure to pay such liabilities within 60 days of final judgment shall constitute disqualification for re-election or election to another office.

That is, to be sure, as far-fetched a dream as hitting the Powerball, if not more so. But it's just as sweet.

It's prompted by a pair of recent court decisions that expose, as courts too often do, the distinction between law and justice.

Law is supposed to serve justice. When the law becomes an end in itself, it can thwart justice.

That's what has happened in the epilogue to the stunning victory over gerrymandering by a coalition of plaintiffs led by the League of Women Voters and Common Cause.

After four years of litigation, cynically resisted at every step and in every way by the Republican-controlled Legislature, the plaintiffs proved that Florida's congressional districts had been drawn in gross violation of the 2010 "Fair Districts" initiatives. The Senate then threw in the towel, confessing its own districts were invalid too.

Nearly two-thirds of the voters had voted for the initiatives that their purported representatives consciously violated.

Attorney General Pam Bondi was defending the Legislature rather than the people, so the nonprofits stepped up. Thanks to them, Florida finally will have fairer elections.

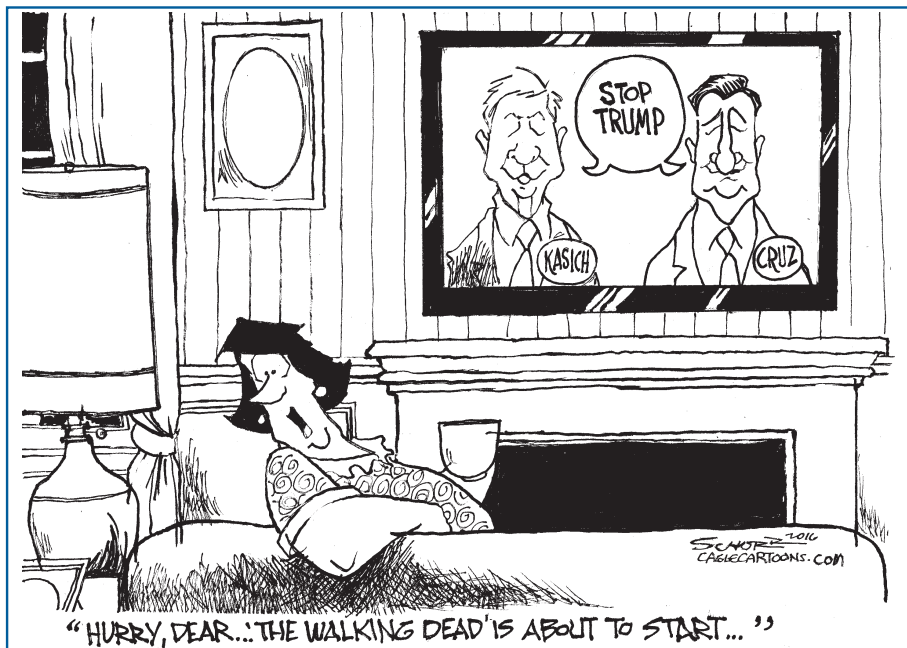
At the last reckoning by the Miami Herald and Tampa Bay Times, taxpayers had spent \$11 million to defend the Legislature through four trials, three special sessions and eight rulings by the Florida Supreme Court. The other side's legal bills are not public, but amount to several million dollars at least.

But when the plaintiffs went back to court to be awarded those fees, the courts said no.

Terry Lewis, the Tallahassee circuit judge who had heard most of the trial litigation, turned them down because of the general Florida policy, known as the "American rule," that each party bears its own costs. Losers pay only when there's a specific law or contract saying so.

"If there is to be an exception to that rule of law, which I have to follow, it needs

The President is Dead

"NATION MOURNS SLAIN PRESIDENT" read the morning headline on November 23, 1963 – not 18 hours after John F. Kennedy was senselessly gunned down in Dallas. Other headlines across the nation rang out similar expressions of grief mixed with disbelief for an event that, in many ways, defined and shaped the rest of the 1960s in America.

When the polls open this November, almost 53 years will have passed since this leader of the Free World was assassinated. Nine US Presidents have come and gone since that fateful day and, with a few exceptions, the Office of the President of the United States has suffered a steady decline – both in its quality of leadership, and the respect of the Office from the American people.

There was a time in our nation when this position was revered by most citizens. We looked to our Leader, not only for good, solid judgment as he served the country, but in much the same way subjects historically honored their kings and queens – with trust and adoration.

A recent documentary about the Kennedy Assassination reminded me of the heartfelt grief and plausible mourning that accompanied President Kennedy's death. Millions of Americans cried and wailed and sincerely lamented this great man who was violently taken from us. I've often wondered what our national reaction would be if, God forbid, something like that happened today.

William Gladstone said that the way a nation honors its dead reflects its ideals. This rings true in any level of society – including how we're affected when someone in our own family or community dies.

I firmly believe something happened in our national mindset when Kennedy was

shot. The subsequent results of the Warren Commission sparked a mistrust in our government which, to this day, grows like a malignant cancer. And just like cancer, this mistrust will not cure itself – it must be excised if the patient expects to survive.

Society reflects the mindset of the individuals who comprise it in the same way art reflects life and vice versa. You needn't venture too far from your own back yard to see this. There exists not only rampant mistrust of government, but a sour shallowing of interpersonal relationships in general – whether governmental, vocational, religious or familial.

My wife and I staff a booth at the Clay County Fair every year. Besides being a great place to eat a corn dog, have some fun, and do some good old-fashioned people-watching, the Fair is also an interesting study in human interactions and attitudes. This year more than others, I was intrigued to notice something I'd missed before: t-shirts!

What do shirts have to do with President Kennedy's assassination? Glad you asked.

I think what we say on our t-shirts, our vehicles' bumpers and back windows and our intrepid social media posts, says a lot about our attitudes and outlooks on life. Yes, some are funny and most must be taken with a grain of salt, but still, every expression contains a remnant of personal conviction.

A few shirts and stickers: "Sarcasm is my Second Language"; "In Memory of When I Used to Care"; "Keep Honking, I'm Reloading" – and lots of others I won't validate by mentioning (hmm, now there's a notable notion – not saying something for public view even though you have the "freedom" to do so...)

Would you really shoot me for simply honking my horn? Have we sarcastically stopped caring for each other?

If so, I hope and pray we all wake up before it's too late. The woods are lovely, dark and deep – but [we] have promises to keep, and miles to go before [we] sleep.

This Week in History

5 Years Ago, 2011

- After a three-week review of the firing of Ridgeview High wrestling coach Chris McNealy, Clay County School Superintendent Ben Wortham said the decision would not be rescinded.

- The Clay Board of County Commissioners introduced two controversial ordinances creating "an overlay district" on Wells Road aimed at lowering crime at nightclubs on that corridor.

- Clay High School's marching band received a \$10,000 grant from Bealls Departments Stores to replace their 15-year-old uniforms, however, another \$15,000 was needed to outfit the entire band.

10 Years Ago, 2006

- Emily Marie Delafield, armed with a hammer and two knives, died after Green Cove Springs Police officer used a taser to control her actions. The Florida Department of Law Enforcement was brought in to investigate the case.

- The Board of County Commissioners reviewed two conceptual plans to build a new east-west connector road from Blanding Boulevard to Branan Field Road. One proposal called for widening Cleveland Avenue from Blanding to Branan Field and another called for connecting via Parkridge.

to be made by the legislature or by the Appellate Court," Lewis said.

The plaintiffs took a powerful argument to the First District Court of Appeal. In California, Iowa and some other states, courts have invoked what's called the "private attorney general doctrine" on behalf of citizens who speak truth to power on the public's behalf, as the Florida plaintiffs did.

But at the First DCA, a panel of three judges appointed by Republican Governors Jeb Bush and Rick Scott turned them down. Judge Joseph Lewis' opinion relied on contrary precedents from other states. It was a political opinion by a politicized court.

And it added insult to injury. It scoffed at the plaintiffs' plea that the court should grant their fees because the Legislature never would.

"Not only is the argument about the future actions of the Legislature based on speculation," the court said, "but it ignores the fact that if the Legislature refuses to act upon an issue that is supported by the public will, Florida's citizens hold the power to vote their representatives out of office."

That was smug, fatuous and unrealistic. It was propaganda, not jurisprudence. Thanks to gerrymandering and the financial power of incumbency, Florida's Legislature never has to fear the voters. The odds of being swept out of their offices are almost as long as those in a lottery. The new maps are a significant improvement, but not a cure.

Judge Brad Thomas, writing separately, poured on the heifer dust. If attorney fees were to be awarded in redistricting litigation, he said, the sponsors should have provided for that in the "Fair Districts" initiatives.

Had they done so, the initiatives might have been tossed off the ballot because of Florida's single-subject rule.

Any chance of appealing the decision vanished a few days later when the Florida Supreme Court, ruling separately on legal fees for the appeals it had heard, denied them on a 4-3 vote with no written majority opinion.

Justice Barbara Pariente, writing in dissent for herself and Justices Peggy Quince and James Perry, warned that the court was encouraging "recalcitrant legislatures...to use the taxpayer resources at their disposal to run up their adversaries' costs, thereby shielding constitutional violations..."

In these cases, the defendants did just

that. They had relied on consultants to rig the maps for Republican candidates. When the plaintiffs subpoenaed documents, the consultants claimed they were "trade secrets." That had to be appealed, costing much time and expense.

When the Supreme Court finally opened the documents, in a split decision, there were "hundreds of thousands of pages" to sift through, and "the real stuff had been destroyed," according to the League's Ellen Frieden.

Even so, the "trade secrets" turned out to be dirty secrets, such as passing off a highly political map as the suggestion of a private citizen who had nothing to do with it.

More than a dozen lawyers were needed on the plaintiffs' side alone. As none of the nonprofits or private citizens have deep pockets, it's hard to see how those bills can be fully paid.

But Liza McClenaghan, Common Cause's state chairperson, sees a bright side.

"Now we have the legal precedents and recognition for the efforts. Supporters are no longer strangers. The lawyers are being paid through funds raised," she said in an email to me.

They won an enormous precedent that set benchmarks for future redistricting. But what happens if the Legislature tries again to game the Constitution? Pariente's warning is apt. The lawbreakers will hold the financial high hand, at taxpayer expense, and the nonprofits will be scrounging for money again. It could be left to the minority political party, with somewhat deeper pockets, to challenge the maps.

Such a partisan cast would be unfortunate, and harmful. The genius of the victory this time was that the public's banner was in nonpartisan hands.

Changes to alligator hunt application process

TALLAHASSEE – The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission will soon accept applications to participate in its annual recreational alligator hunting season, which always runs Aug. 15-Nov. 1.

The application period for the Phase I random drawing begins May 6 at 10 a.m. and runs through May 16. More than 5,000 alligator harvest permits will be available.

Hunters can submit their application with choices of up to 20 hunt areas and periods. A permit allows the harvest of two alligators on a designated harvest unit or in a county. Applicants must be at least 18 years old by Aug. 15 and have a valid credit or debit card.

Applications may be submitted at any county tax collector's office, license agent – most retail outlets that sell

Pilot honored for volunteer flights, more

ORANGE PARK — An Orange Park pilot was recently honored by a nonprofit for donating his time, personal aircraft and fuel to help others.

Kerry Bentley was named both Rookie Pilot of the Year and Pilot of the Year for the North Florida region by Angel Flight Southeast. He picked up his award at a gala held April 8 in River Ranch, Fla.

Bentley is one of 650 pilots in the Southeast Region and only one of a handful of award winners in the state of Florida. He first learned about Angel Flight a year ago when one of his friends needed the service for his wife.

"I checked it out for him and I thought, 'this is something I could do,'" he said.

Angel Flight is a nonprofit volunteer pilot organization that provides air transportation throughout the Southeast by private aircraft to distant medical facilities when commercial air service is not available or feasible for a patient.

He applied to be an Angel Flight pilot in January 2015 and flew his first mission in March last year. Since then, he has flown some 29 missions for Angel Flight.

"I first became interested in flying in my twenties, but I got away from it until about 12 years ago," he said.

The "Pilot of the Year" honor is based on 14 criteria that include flying and sometimes driving sick passengers, answering last minute transportation requests that may come in the middle of the night and flying round trip flights and waiting during the patient's appointment.

"Kerry exemplifies the dedication of

our Angel Flight Pilots who are so generous in their efforts to ensure a passenger receives the necessary medical care they need," said Steve Purello, volunteer pilot and chief executive officer of Angel Flight Southeast, based in Leesburg, Fla.

Bentley was a government contractor for more than 30 years, where he worked

on various building and electrical projects.

Now that he has more time from work, he is able to pick up flights every eight to 10 days.

"I really didn't know that I would win the award. It was a great surprise and certainly it's an honor. The combination of loving to fly and coupling that with helping people, I think it's a great thing. I was very honored," he said.

"I've been a volunteer for 22 years, and internally we talk about 'what are we going to do when XYZ person stops flying,' and then people like Kerry come along and fill those spots," Purello said.

Kerry and his family have been in Clay County for about 10 years now.

He flies a Cirrus out of Herlong Regional Airport in Jacksonville.

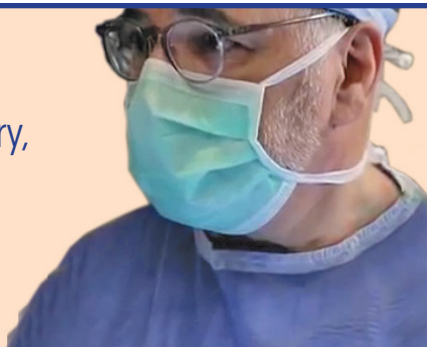
Aside from flying, Kerry has a few other hobbies.

"I skydive. I definitely like to be in the air. It's a thrill for me and it has been since the first time I flew," he said.

Bentley said the organization is always looking for more pilots "to keep the engine running."

"I just want people to be aware of the service we provide, to get more volunteers but also because it could be of benefit to a lot of people," he said.

Somer's Garden celebrates first anniversary

ORANGE PARK – It's humid, and the sun threatens to catch the hay bales ablaze while volunteers sweat into open pits soon to be filled with seedlings. Far flung as the volunteers are, the memory of Somer Thompson pins them all there like darts to make the garden, and her memory, flour-ish.

Volunteers celebrated the one-year anniversary of Somer's Sunshine Garden last Saturday by planting new organic vegetables and fruits along the small plot of land where just over a year ago the former home of Jarred Harrell, Somer Thompson's murderer, once stood.

Last February, with help from the Orange Park Fire Department, Clay County Fire Department and the Naval Air Station Jacksonville Fire Department, the Thompson family burned the house at 1152 Gano Ave. and from the ashes erected Northeast

Florida's first public food forest garden.

"Everything here is donated, and anyone can come here and pick anything they want," said Abigail Thompson, Somer Thompson's sister. "We've got herbs, fruits, vegetables, all kinds. Cabbage, papaya, it's just really awesome. It's all in Somer's name. It's just an opportunity for people who are less fortunate than others to come out and get what they need."

Also unveiled April 23 was the garden's new signage, where originally nothing but the plants and some solar panel lighting donated by Home Depot stood. Now, the garden will have a new solar lighting system aside from the old lamps that used to hug the ground.

The same volunteers that showed up that morning to start working on the garden are the same people that helped the Thompson family cope with the death of their daughter seven years ago, Abigail

hunting and fishing supplies – and online at GoOutdoorsFlorida.com. Applicants must provide their credit card information when they apply. This is a change to the process from previous years. There is also a cancellation feature, which allows applicants to update their hunt choices or credit card information.

Within three days of an application period closing, applicants should see an authorization on their credit card verifying there is a sufficient balance to cover the cost of the permit, however, this does not mean they were awarded a permit. Once the credit card authorization process is complete, the lottery drawing will be held. All successful applicants will be charged, while those who were unsuccessful will have the authorizations lifted from their credit cards.

Cost for the alligator trapping license/harvest permit and two hide validation CITES tags is \$271.50 for Florida residents, \$21.50 for those with a Florida Resident Persons with Disabilities Hunting and Fishing License, and \$1,021.50 for nonresidents. The cost for applicants who already have an alligator trapping license is \$61.50.

Any permits remaining after the first phase will be offered during the Phase II random drawing. Applications for Phase II can be submitted May 20-30. Those who

were awarded a permit in Phase I may not apply during Phase II.

Remaining permits will be available in Phase III to anyone who did not draw a permit in either of the first two phases, and they may be applied for June 3-13.

If any permits remain after Phase III, there will be a fourth-phase issuing period beginning 10 a.m. on June 17 until all permits are sold. Anyone may apply during Phase IV, even if they were awarded a permit in one of the earlier phases, but there is a maximum of 10 permits allowed per person. Additional permits are \$61.50, regardless of residency or disability.

Successful applicants can expect to receive their alligator trapping license harvest permit and two CITES alligator tags in the mail within six weeks of payment.

To educate participants on the how-to's and rules and regulations of the hunt, the FWC offers free training and orientation sessions, which will be held at various locations throughout the state in mid-July and early August. Participants are not required to attend, but first-time alligator hunters are strongly encouraged to go.

Alligator trapping "agent" licenses can also be purchased for \$51.50, regardless of residency. This license allows one to participate in a hunt, while assisting and being in the presence of someone who has an alligator trapping license/harvest permit. Youth (ages 15 and younger) are exempt from having to have an alligator trapping agent license. And those possessing a

Florida Resident Persons with Disabilities Hunting and Fishing License are exempt from the cost of an agent license, but must still have it to assist in hunting alligators.

Alligator trapping licenses are non-transferable. All sales are final, and no refunds will be given. No other license is required to hunt alligators.

Early registration for kindergarten opens May 2

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Early kindergarten registration for the 2016-2017 school year will run from May 2-6 in Clay County.

To enter kindergarten, a child must be five years old on or before September 1, 2016. To complete registration, parents are required to submit the child's official birth certificate, proof of a school physical examination that was conducted within one year prior to the first day of enrollment, a Florida Certificate of Immunization available from a physician or a religious exemption form available at the Clay County Health Department and proof of residency.

An enrollment checklist including a complete list of requirements and forms can be found online in the parents' section of the Clay County School District website, OneClay.net. Parents with additional questions should contact the records secretary at their child's zoned school.

improve – mental health, healthcare access and healthy behavior and prevention.

Part of the plan is to assign an entity to a role to keep the plan running smoothly and responsibly.

Among the many roles that the health department will shoulder are plans to increase the percentage of adults who at a healthy weight from 32.7 percent to 33.7 percent.

They intend to implement a 5K program in Clay County using the YMCA and other local entities as resources.

In partnership with the tobacco education group, Quit Doc Foundation, they also intend to collaborate with employers to provide smoking cessation services and improve nonsmoking policies.

The plan also includes the possibility of conducting smoking cessation classes for youth in Clay County.

Doing so, Suter said, will increase the percentage of current smokers that have tried to quit in the past year from 59.7 percent to 61.1 percent.

Clay Behavioral Health Center will divide its attention between its crisis prevention programs and the strategies formulated in the CHIP meetings to increase awareness on mental health problems facing Clay County.

Four suicide prevention seminars and 10 Mental Health Council education sessions later, Clay Behavioral Health hopes to increase community participation in behavioral health initiatives by April 15, 2017.

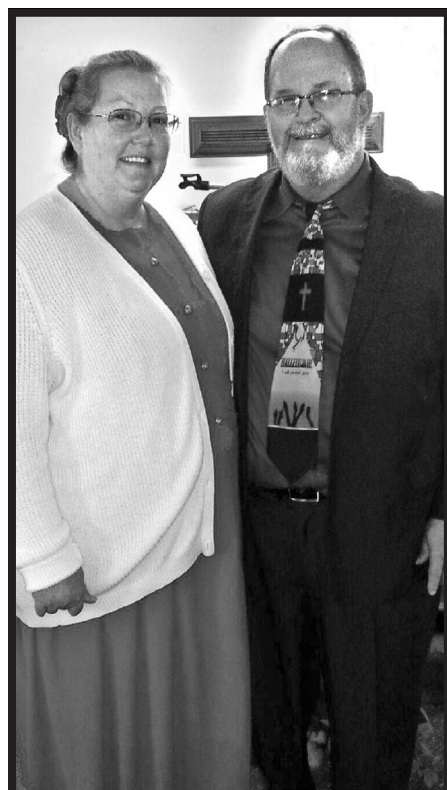
According to Irene Toto, chief executive director of Clay Behavioral Health, 25 percent of the Clay County population "shows signs of a diagnosable mental illness."

By no means is the CHIP plan set in stone just yet, and if the organizations that comprise the CHIP team can help it, neither are the statistics currently attached to Clay County.

"Because this document is a living breathing document we'll reassess it quarterly and annually," Suter said. "So if we see in Clay that these are not happening. What we'll do is check in and modify that plan based on what's going on and what's changing. This is a versatile, flexible document. It has a quality improvement process built in."

Battling the current health assessment of Clay County might seem like a game of red rover, but when organizations like the ones involved in CHIP link arms in tandem the future seems brighter for Clay County.

"I think we'll be closer to meeting those targets, but I think in the big picture," Suter said. "Where I'm looking there will start to be incremental progress on health outcomes. So I believe that we'll start seeing better outcomes in the Clay County community as a whole."

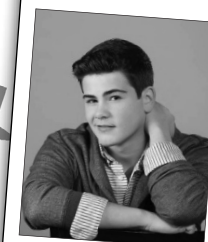

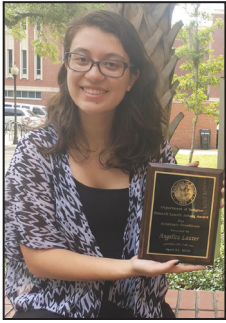

teacher union.

Teachers became angered two days prior to last week’s school board meeting when Superintendent Charlie Van Zant Jr. sent an email to teacher’s districtwide urging them to support the contract.

“We agree that our teachers are the backbone of our district, and they deserve a pay increase. As superintendent, my top priority has always been to reach an agreement with the union that fairly compensates our teachers for their hard work, while setting a course of sound fiscal management to achieve the financial conditions required of our district by state law. That goal is well within our reach if we move forward working together, avoiding scenarios like the recent impasse, in the future,” Van Zant wrote in the email.

Van Zant did not address any aspect of the teacher contract or contract negotiations during the meeting. Instead, Chairman Johnna McKinnon led the part of the meeting in which the district staff and teacher’s union officials make the contracts official by signing them.

Kidwell said teachers are tired of listening to district officials who do not appear to be listening to them.

“Unfortunately, there is a pervasive climate of disrespect, disregard and dishonesty toward employees at Clay schools. The teachers of Clay County hear your words, but we do not see the corresponding actions,” Kidwell said.

Last fall, the CCEA had asked for a \$1,000 raise per teacher and the district offered \$500, while eliminating PLC pay for the extra time they would spend attending training sessions.

In accepting its contract, the president of the Clay Education Support Personnel Association, described their negotiations as a difficult 18 months.

“It’s been hard on our people – the morale,” said Teresa Dixon.” I’ve never seen it as low as it is right now. I really am hope-

ful that we can get this behind us and move forward to a new era.”

Bus drivers, custodians and other support staff covered under the CESP agreement received an additional five cents to their hourly pay rate.

“Our people feel unappreciated and one nickel is not much, but a nickel added to their pay scale, a nickel reoccurring added to their pay scale, it meant enough that they were able to take the good with the bad.”

Dixon pledged to work on “solving the bad” in the coming months. This round of bargaining covered the 2014-15 fiscal year contract, which was rolled into the 2015-16 contract. Now, she said, it’s time to already begin negotiations for 2016-17. However, she said status quo – holding the line with no pay hike – does not equate to

negotiating.

“When I think about negotiations and bargaining, status quo isn’t bargaining. We need to get creative, we need to work together, we need to put our heads together and come up with some things,” Dixon said.

She said there have been some creative ideas offered to date, such as days off or one-time bonuses, however, those things are not sustainable.

“A couple of days off – that’s a great, great thing, that’s very creative. I think Mr. Broskie came up with that idea, but it doesn’t put food on the table and that’s what our people need. They need money, funds to put food on the table and I hope that as we start the 16-17 contract negotiations, that you’ll think of that and don’t come with the first proposal being status quo,” Dixon said.

The starting pay for a first-year teacher in Clay County is \$38,000, according to a pay scale adopted during the 2013-14 fiscal year. The pay scale tops out at \$62,000 after 28 years of service.

“As teachers, we expect to be allowed to be fully focused on our students. We need to know that the leaders of our district place their students’ welfare above their political agenda. We want to trust that our leaders are willing to sacrifice the same way teachers do every day to provide the best learning experiences possible for our students. We continue to wait to see actions that will match the lofty rhetoric of our leaders. We no longer trust your words. That time is over – we’re not listening anymore. Now, we’re watching and we encourage all of Clay County to watch too,” Kidwell said.

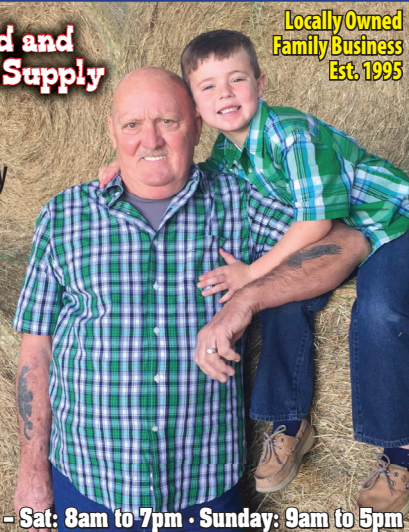

Moosehaven rezoning shot down second time

ORANGE PARK – The public's voice was heard last Tuesday as the seats in Town Hall filled one by one.

The ordinance to rezone Moosehaven to a Planned Unit Development was met with malcontent and controversy among many of those in the audience who whispered and interrupted Moosehaven representatives as they pled their case to the council.

Although both citizens and representatives from Moosehaven were given a chance to speak, the council eventually sided with the denial of the PUD ordinance four to one, with council member Scott Land being the only member to vote in favor of Moosehaven.

The denial came after a motion to defer the ordinance until the next council meeting on May 3 was also denied.

Moosehaven's proposed ordinance would have allowed for expected development past the commercial, residential and office zoning, or CRO, that is already in place.

What weighs heavily on the administrators of Moosehaven is that once the CRO zoning is lifted, then many of Moosehaven's facilities such as their dementia ward, their Alzheimer's facility and their bowling alley would become legally noncompliant.

If the CRO in place gets lifted, then Moosehaven would be unprepared for facility maintenance should a storm destroy any of their installations, however that didn't seem to move citizens in the crowd April 19.

"My question is when," Frank Ricketts said. "When is the litany of negligence going to stop? From my perspective, it does not matter if it is a matter of neglect, ignorance, malfeasance, misfeasance, or nonfeasance. We, the citizens of the Town

of Orange Park, deserve better. If I had to vote on this PUD as it was scheduled before you tonight, I would vote no thanks."

Some residents believed that Moosehaven's tax-exempt status meant that residents were shouldering the tax burden of Moosehaven.

Others felt that little care was taken in the planning to care for the wildlife and environment on River Road adjacent to Moosehaven's nearly 60-acre property. Some opponents said that not only would construction and traffic density harm this wildlife, but harm the residents along the river as well.

Concerns like these forced Moosehaven to add stipulations into the proposed PUD ordinance, such as relinquishing their plan of erecting more signage around Kingsley Avenue, and limiting the types of businesses that can be placed along the commercial property in front of the Moosehaven property.

"If this development proceeds, the fi-

nancial burden placed on the people and the infrastructure of Orange Park will be permanent until the property is sold," said Evie Howard, a resident of River Road. "We cannot continue to have roads that need repair, policemen that are overworked, and firemen who are exhausted. Corporate Moosehaven needs to be honest about its intentions and responsible to the community from which it will benefit."

Moosehaven, if taxed, would generate an approximate \$437,942 in revenue, \$143,576 of which would go directly to the Town of Orange Park.

Taxes generated within the town are spent on Moosehaven for fire, ambulance, and police services, which are not available within the grounds of Moosehaven.

"There were some statements made that they were getting a special deal but that's incorrect, they are charged for every gallon of water, and every gallon of sewage," said Jim Hanson, town manager.

Moosehaven is charged for its water

and sewage in the same manner as a large commercial property, Hanson said, and continued on to mention that their water and sewage is a conversation all of its own.

With Moosehaven's request for a zoning change denied, regardless of the public conversation, their CRO is up for review on May 3.

The future of the Town of Orange Park's biggest employer's facilities now up in the air, administrators can only hope that the council will vote to allow the current zoning to stay where it is.

"When and if that CRO is lifted, which I understand is on its way out, all of those uses that we currently have there will become legally nonconforming uses under your current zoning code," said Emily G. Pierce, Moosehaven's attorney. "We are going to be put in a really bad position if the PUD is not approved and the CRO goes away. We then have the bulk of our property as legally noncompliant."

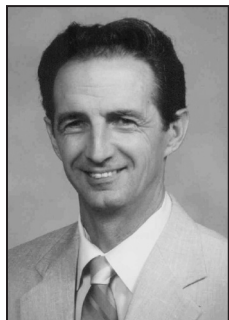

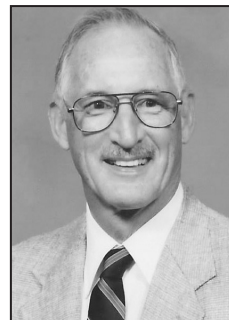

Before trimming your palms, do a little homework

It's that time of year again when people think about having their palms "hurricane-pruned" because they have heard this will make them less likely to have fronds ripped away and sent hurling through the air like missiles in the event of a storm. Fact is, this type pruning is unnecessary in North Florida based upon years of observation following several hurricanes and our knowledge of palm physiology.

Here's the real story – Unlike woody plants, such as shade trees and shrubs, palms do not store a lot of their energy reserves in their roots. They store it in their trunk and in their



fronds. When they need to grow a new frond, they rob food reserves and nutrients from the lowest green frond and transport it to the new one forming. With time that lower frond turns brown and is then no longer vital to the health of the tree. It can be removed or left in place – the palm does not care but most people feel it looks better if it is cut off.

However note: Removing any green frond – even partially green fronds – before it has given up its stored nutrient and browned, forces that palm to rob from the next green frond up. This is not a good thing!

Observations following hurricane events over the last 15 years by the University of Florida have shown that green fronds are not ripped from the tree by high winds. If the storm is that strong, whole tops are ripped from the tree and the palms that are most likely to have their

whole top crowns ripped away are those that have been "hurricane-pruned" to the degree that lots of green fronds were removed. In other words, the removing of green fronds did not make the crown more "wind-tolerant" (which is the thought process behind doing it) but in fact more wind-intolerant. So why would a person do this?

Palms that regularly had green fronds removed for any reason, suffered more from nutrient deficiencies – especially potassium – and were also found more prone to insect and disease attack.

So what is the bottom line here? Anyone who still tells you a North Florida palm should be pruned once a year to make it more hurricane resistant and that pruning should be made so all fronds (green or brown are removed) until only those that are in the 10 to 2 position on a clock – are "old school" and have not kept up with new recommendations. Don't let

them touch your palm because they are not doing good things to your palm.

Current University of Florida recommendations for proper palm pruning is to only remove brown fronds, palm fruit and palm flowers because these make no difference to the palm and can be removed for aesthetic purposes without degrading the health of the palm. Absolutely no green frond should be removed without a very good reason, i.e. rubbing on the roof or power line, because this causes harm to the palm. The justification that it saves you from having to have the palm pruned so frequently has also been shown not true – removal of green fronds simply causes other green fronds to brown more quickly. To learn more about proper pruning go on-line and type into the search box "UF IFAS Palm Pruning." Let's stop paying people to abuse our palms by pruning green fronds from them.

Free dental clinic wins top Celebrate Clay award

ORANGE PARK – The all-volunteer staff of the Clay County Dental Care clinic will soon have the funding necessary to offer more free dental services to underserved Clay County residents.

Clay County Dental Care captured the top honor in this year’s “Celebrate Clay” awards presented by the Paul E. & Klare N. Reinhold Foundation. The clinic was awarded the \$10,000 Paul E. Reinhold Community Service Award at its April 26 celebration at the Thrasher-Horne Conference Center.

The dental clinic was honored for its role helping people who cannot afford dental insurance and dental care. In 2015, the clinic 496 Clay County residents, of whom 261 were new patients.

“Two-hundred-thirty-five residents of Clay County returned to the clinic which indicates that Clay County Dental Care provides essential care to the Clay County population,” states the nonprofit clinic’s award application. “In 2015, based on pricing commonly used by dentists in the local area, the value of the dental procedures was \$244,000.”

The clinic operates with 17 full-time volunteers and enlists aid from Fortis College students who are training to become dental assistants. “In addition to providing dental care, our volunteer dentists are aiding these students in their clinical and practical coursework,” states the application.

Overall, the Foundation awarded \$75,000 and 48 community service awards to nonprofit organizations that provide services to Clay County residents.

The Foundation created the “Celebrate Clay” awards program to honor the legacy of Paul and Klare Reinhold and to recognize, reward and encourage community service within Clay County. The Foundation has awarded more than \$540,000 to Celebrate Clay award recipients in the past eight years.

A panel of five judges including three independent volunteers from the community and two Reinhold family representatives voted on the best projects of 2015 to determine the winners of the \$75,000 in cash awards. This year’s judges were. Felecia Hampshire, council member, City of Green Cove Springs; Tom Morris, executive director, Clay County Utility Authority;

Teresa Scott, president and chief executive officer, Penney Retirement Community; and Ron Pilgrim and Rolf H. Towe, representatives of the Reinhold family.

Applications were open to all nonprofit groups active in the First Coast Area that provided services to Clay County residents in 2015. The 48 winners included Clay County and regionally-based nonprofits, churches and school programs.

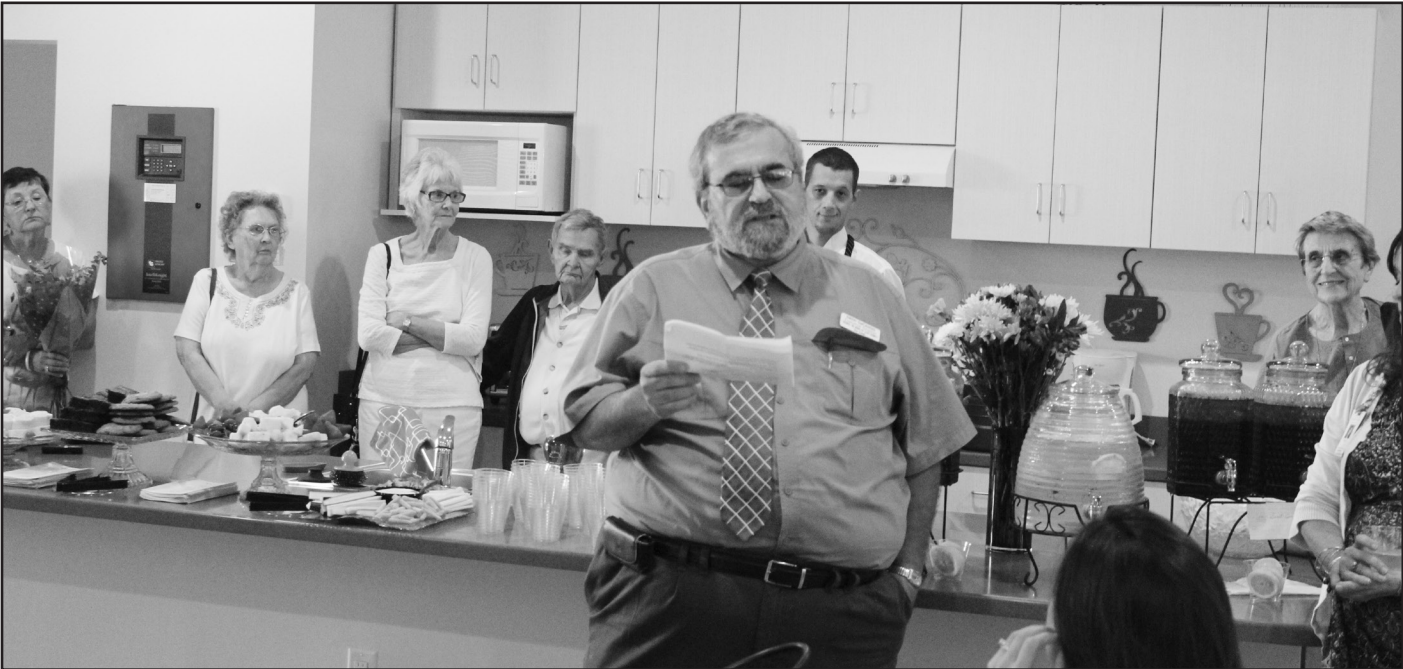

"This is designed to maintain socialization and sort of help with trivia and reminiscing to encourage long term memories, so the idea is to provide their caregivers with respite, or rest, and also the actual clients to engage with one another," Hyde said. "The trivia pulls out long term memories, which most of our clients are very good with, they don't do well with short term memory. They can tell you the first car they drove, how old they were when they got their license, but they might not know what state they're living in right now."

Caring for seniors with cognitive challenges takes its toll on caregivers, whether they hail from family or private care agencies. Often caregivers shoulder much of the burden that comes along with the disease by helping with the hygiene of their family member and covering the cost of treatment and medication.

"We do find that the more they interact and socialize and engage, the families will tell you that they will engage more when they get home," Hyde said. "It also helps with behavioral issues. That behavior can be driven by boredom"

Boredom among senior clients can be driven by an assortment of causes, but Hyde chocks it up to the shock of being moved somewhere new, having their possessions sold or taken away and enduring the shock of suddenly requiring care when a person was previously self-sufficient.

Judy's Place is somewhat of a diversion program, Hyde said. At face value, it offers senior a fun place to go while caregivers are working or resting, but the program also engages the minds of the mentally impaired and keeps their minds occupied to keep them out of a nursing home for as long as possible, which costs more than the daycare.

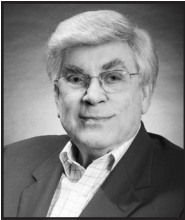
Price differs for every treatment, but Judy's Place offers to change at least some of that price. The facility costs \$12 an hour, which covers food, bus transportation with help from Clay Transit and any medications administered during their stay.

Often times the cost of the day care is subsidized by financial grants provided through the Council of Aging. Less than 25 percent of clients will be required to cover the entire cost of the day care, but that is only a fraction of the cost some families will have to deal with on a daily basis as they go about their daily lives.

With more than 3,000 patients diagnosed with dementia or Alzheimer's in Clay County, facilities such as Judy's Place and day care centers like it are increasingly important. Through a collaboration between the Council on Aging and Moosehaven, the \$407,000 facility was built using only a donation from a member of Moosehaven that sat on a shelf for

years while administrators scratched their heads at what to do with it.

"It's for the families, to try to relieve them so they can lead relatively normal lives, and keep their folks who have Alzheimer's or dementia comfortable, that's one part of it," said Andrew DeCandis, executive director for the Council on Aging. "The other part of is for the person who has Alzheimer's and dementia to give them a place to go where they feel comfortable, and at least act to the best of their abilities. We try to take them as far as we can possibly take them. With Alzheimer's and dementia you decline over years, and what we try to do is maintain them for as long as we can."

Proper Praying

Jesus gave us a perfect model for prayer. His disciples asked Him to teach them to pray. He responded by saying, "Pray like this: ..." He followed that by giving us what we call "The Lord's Prayer" but what should be more accurately called "The Model Prayer." In the teaching He is giving us a pattern for prayer.

The longest prayer by Jesus that is recorded is in John 17. He prayed several hours in Gethsemane. The model prayer Jesus put forth as a guide for His disciples in prayer only contains 50 to 65 words depending on the version of scripture that you read.

I am not making a case for spending little time in prayer. Jesus' life was the opposite of that. But when praying in public, brevity is usually a virtue. In the solitude of your time alone with God, you should pray until you know you have touched the heart of God. Regardless of the amount of time you spend in prayer, the important ingredient is not multitudes of words but faith in the God who loves us and wants to invest good things into our lives.

Jesus said the heathen believe their prayers to their gods will be heard because of their many words. (Matt. 6:7) We know it is faith the moves the hand of God.

How long are we to pray for anything? I believe we pray until the answer comes. There is so much to be said about prayer, we certainly cannot cover all the subjects here. So I will give you this conclusion. Always pray. Pray in faith. Pray constantly, or as Paul wrote, "Pray without ceasing."

hikers in crossing the serene bogs.

The conservation area is mute besides an occasional rustling bush or screeching bird. Even on its busiest of days, Bayard offers solitude to each of its visitors.

Although he grew up in Jacksonville, avid Bayard visitor Matthew Conrad said he appreciated that the area wasn't swarmed with hikers.

"It's a perfect day for a hike," Conrad said. "I was worried when I saw a full parking lot that it would be crowded, but there's so many miles of trail that we only ran into other hikers maybe once an hour."

The conservation area offers more than

15 miles of trails that wander through the John P. Hall Nature Preserve. The bark on the towering oak, scattered throughout the area are painted with either blue symbols, marking the hiking trails or colored diamonds, marking the equestrian routes.

Warbles of woodland birds and the occasional knocking of a woodpecker's beak against the trees are omnipresent in the canopy above. Deep into the trails stands a towering observation deck. It is a perfect site to catch an overhead view of Bayard and is a prime lookout for animal observation.

Karen Davis of the St. Johns River Water Management District said the Bayard Conservation Area is an exceptional location for animal watching.

"From the observation deck, visitors

tend to see a lot of deer," Davis said. "Deer thrive in this area, which is why it is such a popular spot for hunting."

The Bayard Wildlife Management Area is the name for the southern areas in Bayard that permit hunting. Hunters value the WMA as a choice spot for fishing, frogging and hunting turkey and deer.

Hikers and equestrians however, must pay attention to the signs posted on the exterior of the management area that list when and where hunting is permitted.

Conversely, hunters must also follow the regulations and avoid the areas that are closed to the sport. The months of September through November allow deer hunting, and March and April are for turkey hunting.

Being so close to the river, the Bayard Conservation Area is sometimes referred to as a wetland.

Young, silvered tadpoles stroke through the brackish blend of Clay County land and river water. Deep into the trails, the vegetation thins out and a shoreline appears.

Heather Venter, the St. Johns Water Management District's land manager, said the forest's proximity to the river is one of the main reasons that this particular area in Green Cove Springs was chosen by the state to preserve.

In the Bayard Conservation Area, visitors can appreciate abounding habitats: the flourishing, green forest alive with creatures, roots and stumps protruding up and out of the sodden floor of the marshes, the campgrounds, offering an authentic camping experience deep in the wilderness and the St. Johns River – famous for its brackish beauty and surplus of fish and animals.

"When it's season, pods of manatee can be seen in the St. Johns," Venter said. "The Bayard Conservation Area provides visitors with the opportunity to see countless species, whether they be land or water-bearing. That is why we strive to preserve this particular area in Green Cove's natural habitat."

Thompson said.

“This is a community where tragedy took place, where something could’ve just been ignored, and people would have understood it,” said Jolinda Kohl, co-founder of Bringing Food Forests to Northeast Florida. “Who wants to go near a property where a seven year old child was violently killed on? Just ignore it and forget about it. For Diena [Thompson] to have turned that around and made it into a place of healing and growth, we believe that’s important.”

Diena Thompson took it upon herself to change the narrative on similar deaths. She started the Somer Thompson and Somer Sunshine Foundation to help strug-

gling families make the most of a situation by acquiring grants and funds to help victim’s families financially.

After the tragedy, Diena Thompson was given ownership of the home where Harrell lived. She knew she didn’t want anyone to live there, but was at a loss of what to do with the property until she met Kohl, who turned her onto the path of food forest gardens.

The great thing, Kohl said, about food forest gardens is that they’re self-sustainable. Currently volunteers will go into the garden once a month for two hours to perform general maintenance on the property, but they hope to lessen that number over the years until the garden is completely autonomous.

An idea grew from the garden: start a petition to bring Michelle Obama to Somer’s Garden and tell Somer’s story to the nation. Launched in 2010, Michelle Obama’s “Let’s Move” initiative was created as a tool for childhood obesity prevention, and follows First Lady Michelle Obama as she travels around the country visiting gardens.

With the garden open to the public, anyone can come and get what they need. The food is ‘there for the taking.’

“It was hard,” Abigail Thompson said. “Honestly people were just supportive from the time she went missing until the time we found her. People from all over the country were looking for her. We had people in Alabama looking for her, and that’s what really got us through it, if these people weren’t here, the garden wouldn’t nearly be what it is now.”

Teen charged with fondling minor girl

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – A Keystone Heights 19-year-old faces one count of lewd and lascivious molestation for allegedly touching a minor while she was fully clothed.

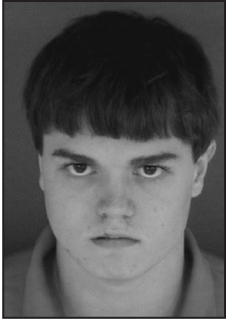
The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Daniel Thomas Bronson Jr. on April 25 after obtaining an arrest warrant.

According to the police report, Bronson was an invited guest at the victim's home when the allegation took place on April 21. Police said, he followed the girl and his brother into the girl's bedroom "despite not being allowed in her bedroom," states the report.

Police said the victim told Bronson to stop and pushed his hand away from her buttocks, however, he immediately placed his hand back on her in an unwelcomed manner.

Bronson is officially charged with lewd and lascivious molestation on a victim younger than age 12 by a person older than age 18.

He was booked into the Clay County Jail where his bond was set at \$50,003.

Teen charged with stealing car

DOCTORS INLET – A late night joy ride recently ended in an arrest for a Doctors Inlet teen.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Cameron Lee Carson, 16, on April 25 at 6:25 a.m. and charged him with one count of grand theft auto.

According to the police report, the victim noticed her car was missing around 1:30 a.m. when she went to look for her car keys.

Police said the victim reported the theft about an hour and a half after Carson returned with the car. Police did not provide clear information on how the victim and Carson know each other, but the police

report lists their addresses on the same street.

When police contacted the victim, she said she still wanted to press charges and told police she did not give Carson permission to use her vehicle.

Carson was booked on the charge at the CCSO Middleburg sub-station and then transported to a youth detention center in Jacksonville.

Middleburg man facing child pornography charges

MIDDLEBURG – The Clay County Sheriff's Office has charged a Middleburg man with five counts of possession of child pornography and one count of lewd and lascivious behavior by a person over age 18 involving a victim under age 16.

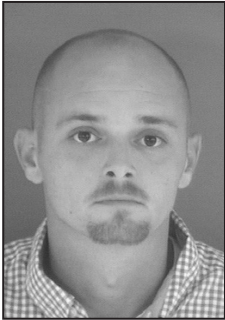
Police arrested Jeffrey Lawrence Jimmerson, 33, on April 21 after obtaining arrest warrants in the case.

CCSO detectives from the Special Victims Unit launched their investigation on April 13 after learning about the allegations that are believed to have occurred on or around April 6, according to the police report.

The victim's mother helped detectives locate Jimmerson's cell phone that he kept in a tool box but kept the phone's battery in a separate drawer. When detectives put the cell phone back together, they found several images of the woman's children asleep in bed. Police said one image on the phone appeared to show Jimmerson masturbating in close proximity to two children.

As the investigation continued, police found additional images of child pornography including adults having sex with minor children.

When detectives attempted to contact Jimmerson, he fled the area and did not show up for his job at a local electrical

services company. Officers were told that Jimmerson told his employer that he had to move.

Jimmerson was booked into the Clay County Jail on the charges and at press time, he remained in jail with his bond set at \$135,018.

Fight ends in arrest

MIDDLEBURG – What began as a night of three adults drinking heavily ended in a fight and one arrest last weekend.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Joshua Wayne Gaither, 32, of Middleburg, on charges of assault and battery during burglary, two counts of simple battery and one count of possession of a harmful new legend drug.

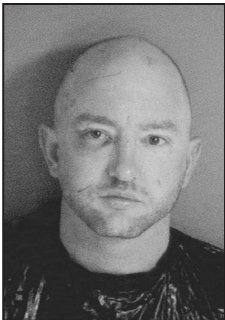
According to the police report, the fight began as a verbal spat around 11:30 p.m. on April 23 between Gaither and his girlfriend while the two were socializing at the home of a friend in the 4900 block of Joan Avenue in Middleburg.

When Gaither became unruly, the homeowner went next door and enlisted the help of a neighbor to help remove Gaither from the home. At 5 a.m. on April 24, the homeowner "was laying naked in bed and was awakened when he was struck in the face," states the police report.

The two men came to blows and struggled fighting all the way down a hallway with the two of them covered in blood, police said.

Police said Gaither struck his girlfriend in the face until she fell unconscious on the floor. About three hours after the fight, police found Gaither walking down Juniper Avenue after he fled the scene when police were called. A search unveiled Gaither in possession of four of the muscle relaxers, Methocarbamol, for which he did not have a prescription.

Gaither was booked into the Clay County Jail where, he remained at press time. His bond is set at \$118,511.

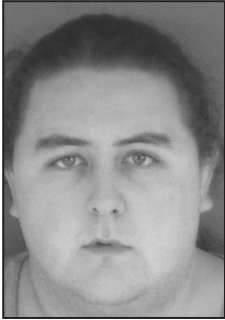

Morton told police that he and his son then took his pet cat "Aurora" to a veterinary clinic where doctors treated the cat for blunt force trauma to the eye. Doctors said the cat's right eye socket was "heavily bruised and swollen" and had to remove the cat's eye due to the severity of the damage.

During a police interview on April 23, Conley admitted he was angry that the cat had defecated on his bedding and admitted that he picked up the cat "and threw her through his bedroom door in a fit of anger," states the report.

Conley was charged with torturing an animal with intent to inflict intense pain. He has since been released from the Clay County Jail on \$5,003 bond.

Orange Park man sentenced in federal court for concealing relationship with a foreign national

JACKSONVILLE – United States District Judge Timothy J. Corrigan has sentenced a former immigration officer from Orange Park to six months in federal prison and two years of supervised release for concealing a material fact during an interview with a government agent.

Paul Reynolds Friel Jr., 48, of Orange Park, failed to disclose the fact that he was living with Marisol Rodriguez Chavarria, a foreign national, and that he had contact with her during the preceding seven years while being interviewed in December 2011. He was sentenced on April 21.

The interview was required as part of a background investigation for an expected job promotion within the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services where Friel was employed as an immigration officer.

According to court documents, Rodriguez entered the U.S. from Nicaragua on December 10, 2010 on an immigrant visa issued by the U.S. State Department. She was a citizen of Nicaragua and entered the U.S. as the spouse of Luis Aguilar. In or around March 2011, Rodriguez moved into an apartment with Friel and divorced Aguilar. Thereafter, Friel and Rodriguez lived together in a romantic relationship, were married in March 2012 and later had a child together.


According to court records, Friel had known Rodriguez from previous trips to Nicaragua and paid for her airfare to fly to the U.S. from Nicaragua. Rodriguez previously pleaded guilty to possession of an immigrant visa issued by means of a false statement. Aguilar previously pleaded guilty to conspiracy to commit visa fraud.

Lake Asbury man charged with animal torture


LAKE ASBURY – A recent incident involving a severely injured cat has ended in an animal torture charge for a Lake Asbury man.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Tyler Michael Conley, 21, on April 23 at 3:38 p.m.

According to the police report, the case began April 14 when Brian Morton told police he came home to find pillows and blankets in his garage that appeared to be covered in blood and cat feces. Conley had been living with the Morton family for about a month when the incident occurred.

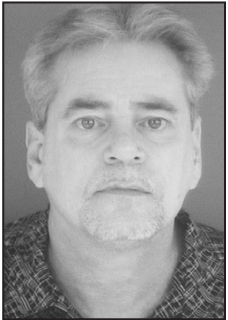

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Office of Inspector General and the Jacksonville office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, investigated the case, which was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Dale R. Campion.

Tri-county Lowe’s bandit collared after lengthy investigation

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A Jacksonville man suspected of stealing items from at least three different Lowe’s home improvement stores in three counties was arrested on April 20 and brought to Clay County.

The Clay County Sheriff’s Office extradited Donald Eugene Ashcraft, 54, of Jacksonville, to the Clay County Jail in Green Cove Springs from the Alachua County Jail. He is charged with one count of grand theft valued between \$300 and \$4,999 and one count of organized scheme

to defraud. According to the warrant issued September 29, 2015, Ashcraft went into the Lowe’s store at 1700 Blanding Blvd. on February 2, 2015 “carrying a day planner and no other items. A short time later, [Ashcraft] pushed a vanity to the customer service area and used a receipt to obtain a \$329.00 cash refund for the vanity,” states the warrant.

A second similar incident took place on February 17, 2015 except this time it involved him dragging 10 boxes of laminate flooring to customer service where he obtained a fraudulent \$214 cash refund.

As CCSO officers dug further into the case, they found Ashcraft has been wanted by the Gainesville Police Department for two years for carrying out similar fraudulent refund cases and that there was an outstanding warrant on file for his arrest there. He was later arrested in mid-February 2015 after a Florida Highway Patrol trooper contacted Ashcraft in Jacksonville.

Before his Gainesville charges, police said, Ashcraft went to a home improvement store in Putnam County without any items, but minutes later, made his way to

At press time, Ashcraft remained in the Clay County Jail where his bond has been set at \$10,006. However, he will remain held here for Alachua County authorities who have charged him with schemes to defraud as well.

Police arrested Tabitha Lynn Hogg, 29, on April 20 using a warrant issued by a local judge. She is charged with one count of child neglect.

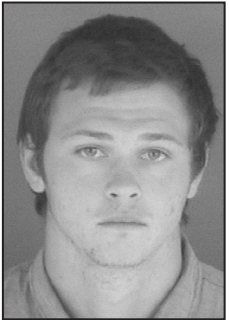
The case was launched on Feb. 21 when a witness told CCSO officers they saw Hogg’s toddler walking through a parking lot near a park that is located between two large retention ponds.

Another ALF coming to Fleming Island

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – An upscale assisted living facility proposed for Fleming Island looks to be the latest project to become a part of the growing health care industry in Clay County.

The Clay Board of County Commissioners cleared the way for the proposed project at its regular meeting Tuesday by unanimously approving amendments to the Fleming Island Plantation Development of Regional Impact and a Development Order that would allow for PS-5, or Private Service, zoning to be added to the uses for the piece of property on which the facility would be located. The PS-5 uses include bed space.

Previously, office space was the main ingredient in the zoning for the parcel of property, but it wasn't being utilized, county officials said.

The assisted living facility is being proposed by PruittHealth, a Southeastern business which operates about 93 other similar facilities throughout Georgia, North and South Carolina and Florida.

The ALF would be built on some 12.51 acres of land that would be bounded by Old Hard Road and Town Center Boulevard and sit across from Thunderbolt Elementary School.

The project will be a 97-bed skilled nursing facility, said Chuck Brown, chief development officer for PruittHealth. Some 59 of the beds would be private, while 38 would be semi-private. The building will be about 72,000 square feet and generate

around 120 full-time equivalent positions, he said. About \$14 million in annual revenue is projected, he added.

"We build a higher-end facility than a lot of what you see in skilled nursing," Brown said. "We're privately held and we're number 14 in the nation in skilled nursing facilities as far as size."

Two-thirds of the company's facilities have won at least the bronze quality award from the American Health Care Association and 17 facilities are currently recognized by U.S. News and World Report as the best nursing homes in the country, Brown said.

Among the things that set PruittHealth facilities apart are some of their amenities.

"Our buildings are typically larger (with) a lot more common space," Brown said. "We do restaurants instead of dining rooms. We do spas, chapels. We'll have a sports bar, movie theaters for the patients."

The facilities also have a lot of higher end equipment to help in rehabilitation, Brown said.

The average length of stay for about 60

percent of the residents is about 23 days. That would involve those who are basically at the facility for rehabilitation from something such as a hip or knee replacement. The remainder of the residents fall into the long-term category that either can't go back home or choose not to go back home, Brown said.

Pete Davis, chairman of the Fleming Island Advisory Committee, said his group had met with PruittHealth in March.

"We were very much impressed with their organization and their structure and the committee unanimously voted recommending approval," he said.

Mike Cella, a resident of Fleming Island Plantation and chairman of the Fleming Island Plantation Community Development District board, agreed with Davis.

"We welcome the development and we're very anxious to get our commercial properties established and developed, and this, of course, fits in with what we think we would need in that particular area," he said.

Cella said that although there had been

a "smattering of residents" who were apprehensive about putting what might be a high-traffic facility across from an elementary school, they believed that would be offset by the number of jobs created.

Cella did have one word of warning about assisted living facilities in general.

"The one thing I would caution the board about today is we do have two other groups that are looking at putting some kind of assistant living facility in Fleming Island Plantation. Both have come before the CDD board," he said, adding he would caution about "overdeveloping in one particular area."

"So although PruittHealth is first in the door, those other projects that come forward I think will have to be looked at a little more intense in terms of making sure that they don't overlap with what these folks are doing and that we don't overbuild with too many assisted living facilities in a very small area," Cella said.

In addition to the two groups Cella mentioned, an assisted living facility is almost completed in the activities area of Branan Field and another is under construction on East-West Parkway on Fleming Island.

For this particular project, however, the county commissioners expressed their support.

"It looks like a good fit to support our industrial development efforts along the lines of health care and I think it's a real positive move," said Commissioner Wayne Bolla.

Brown said they are required to have "concrete on the ground" by Sept. 17 this year and expect to open in the fall 2017.

Déjà vu of the 2012 superintendent election fresh in some residents' minds, controversy over the ethicality and authenticity of Gottshalk's running swirled from person to person, as rumors often do, said Renna Le Paiva, president of the Clay County Education Association.

"Gotshalk is a Charlie Van Zant [Jr.] supporter," Paiva said. "Why does he go in as a write-in vote? I think the law is unbelievable. I don't think anyone in a small town should be excluded from voting. I was an independent, and now I'm a registered Republican, because it dawned on me that I couldn't vote."

In Florida, a universal primary – one in which voters from every known party are allowed to vote – occurs when either party runs unopposed. Should either two candidates, Rebekah Shively, who is running as no party affiliation, or Marion Keith Nichols, who is running as a Democrat, fail to

file the 1,361 petitions required to qualify for the ballot, or pay the \$7,000 fee to run, then the election will be closed to only Republican voters because of Gottshalk's write-in.

Shively, a teacher of Bannerman Learning Center in Green Cove Springs, is only 100 petitions away from that goal, and said confidently that she will qualify via petition, foregoing the costly fee.

As a write-in, Gottshalk, a self-professed sham candidate, has no fee to pay nor petition signatures to collect, according to Florida laws governing write-in candidates.

"To take his candidacy seriously is an error on the part of any voter," Shively said. In expectation of 2012 nostalgia, Paiva advised teacher's union members to switch parties from Democrat, NPA and

Republican because of Gottshalk's write-in. So far, approximately 1,407 members have switched parties, even though most of the union's members are registered Republicans, she said.

Responding to the write-in buzz on social media since Gottshalk's April 22 filing, Van Zant issued a press release Tuesday denying allegations of any involvement with Gottshalk.

"This is nothing but another false, political attack drummed up by public labor union bosses," Van Zant wrote. "Liberal unions do not want a conservative Superintendent. They want a liberal Superintendent, and they are backing one. The Union thinks he is a candidate they will be able to control."

Paiva said the union, expecting the primary will be closed to only voters registered as Republicans as they were in the 2012 election, will support Van Zant's fellow Republican opponent, Addison Davis, for superintendent.

"We need to have a voice in Clay and the only way to have a voice in a strong

Republican county is for people to have the opportunity to vote," Paiva said. "I'm asking them to switch parties so they have the ability to have a voice in the election of their local county."

Paiva believes that the disenfranchised teachers she supports also need a voice, and believes that they can't have that voice in a closed primary, as was the case in 2012 when Gottshalk's write-in candidacy closed the primary, and will be the case should Shively or Nichols fail to qualify.


Meanwhile, Shively believes Gottshalk's move was orchestrated and intentional.

"Mr. Van Zant does not have any idea whether I will qualify or not," she said. "He has no previous information to garner any postulation from about me, So I believe Mr. Gottshalk is his insurance to close the election."

Qualifying for the superintendent's race runs from noon on June 20 to noon on June 24, while petitions are due at the Clay County Supervisor of Elections office at noon on May 23. Calls to Gottshalk were not returned by deadline.

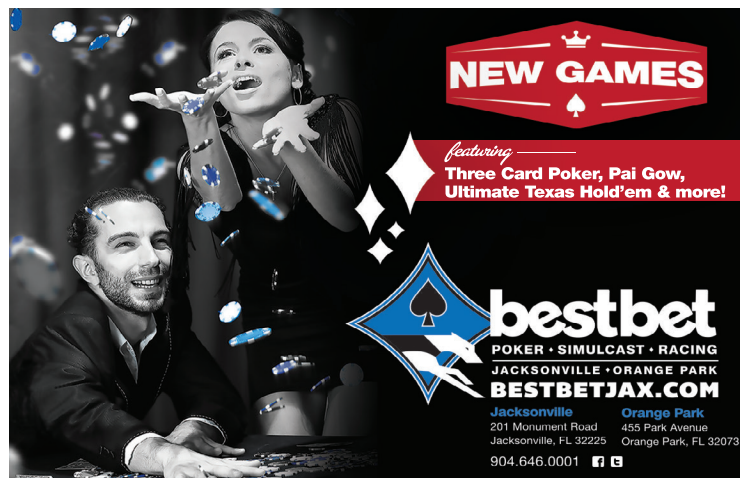

Deja Vu for Knights

Oakleaf loses district title to Atlantic Coast 5-2

JACKSONVILLE — After every Oakleaf High baseball game, head coach Chris Lannom and his team always talk about turning the page.

After Thursday night's 5-2 district 2-8A championship loss to Atlantic Coast, Lannom instructed his team to not turn the page.

"We need to remember how this loss felt," said. Lannom, who, ironically, lost the district 2-6A championship game last year to Columbia and later beat the Tigers in the region semifinals en route to a region championship loss to Bartram Trail. "As a team we need to learn how to grow from this loss."

Atlantic Coast scored four runs in the opening inning and used three pitchers to defeat the Knights 5-2 to capture the title in front of a home crowd at Atlantic Coast High School. Oakleaf travels to Tallahassee Lincoln (17-7, 2-7A runnerup in 2015), the 1-8A champion with an 11-9 win over Tallahassee Chiles, for their region 1-8A opener on Wed., April 27 with Atlantic Coast hosting 1-8A runnerup Tallahassee Chiles (19-8, lost to 7A champion Oviedo in region 1-7A finals in 2015).

The Rays (14-7) jumped out to a 4-0 lead in the top of the first inning on hit batsman, two walks, two errors and a Baltimore chop two-run single by right fielder Noah Searcy off of righty-starter Chris Mauloni. Note: A Baltimore chop refers to a hit straight down in front of the batter that bounces high enough that a catcher has to wait to make a play and is also right

Kittle blast fuels Panthers' title grab

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — A three strikeout finish to the fifth inning and a two-run double in the top of the eighth proved to be decisive moments for the Ridgeview High baseball team as the Panthers won

their first-ever district baseball title with an 8-3 win over Clay High Thursday night at Clay High School.

"It was all my team to win this game, I just did my job," said relief pitcher Hunter Morris, who entered the bottom of the fifth inning with Clay baserunners at first

and second base, but deflated a Blue Devil surge with three strikeouts in a row to end the inning with the score tied at 3-3.

Ridgeview, with second-year coach John Sgromolo, got the first district title in 4-6A after losing to Clay last year in

Lady Knights go two touchdowns on Lincoln

OAKLEAF – A two run homer by Baylee Goddard and sterling no-hit pitching from Kelsey Sweatt and Madisyn Davis pushed the Oakleaf High softball team to a relatively smooth 14-0 region quarterfinal win over Tallahassee Lincoln (16-12) on Wed., April 20. Oakleaf beat Atlantic Coast 4-1 on Tues., April 26 at 4 p.m. Atlantic Coast (17-9) defeated Tallahassee Chiles 7-5 in their region opener. Atlantic Coast lost 3-0 to Oakleaf in the district 2-8A championship game on April 16 and 1-0 on Feb. 25.

Against Lincoln, Sweatt started on the mound for the Knights and recorded seven strikeouts in four innings work while Davis entered for one inning and got two strikeouts to fuel the Knights domination.

Oakleaf (26-2) ramrodded eight runs batted in between Tracey Ferguson (3), Alex Acevedo (3) and Goddard (2) as the Lincoln pitching staff had no answer for the Knights batting lineup. Oakleaf scored

two runs in the first, three in the fourth and eight in the fifth inning.

Blue Devils befuddled first, then dominant

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A seemingly befuddled Clay High softball team gave up four runs in the first inning to an inept Ed White team with an effective looping pitching attack, but the Lady Blue Devils retooled their attack and stormed to a 14-4 five inning in their region 1-6A quarterfinal playoff game Wed., April 20 in Green Cove Springs.

"When you are seeing top ranked pitching and playing all season and then get a team like Ed White that, with just eight to-

tal wins, it's easy to think you don't have to show up with your best game to win," said Clay High coach Matt Lewis, who will play Ponte Vedra, who won a tight 4-3 region quarterfinal over Paxon, on April 26 in the region semifinal. "We let the newspaper clippings about them get the better of us in those first two innings, but the girls responded once we 'chatted' a little in the dugout."

With ace pitcher Ashley Stokes on the mound, Clay gave up four first inning runs off three walks, a wild pitch and a hit batter, plus a long centerfield hit over a short

field positioned centerfielder before Lewis was able to collect his thoughts in the dugout.

"With that looping pitch, everyone wants to just smash it because it looks so slow," said Lewis. "We have to concentrate the couple of days before Ponte Vedra got get our mind straight after a game like this."

In their ensuing at bat, Clay got a wicked long centerfield single from Raelye Rouw and a choppy double from Maegan Stone to score with Stokes blasting a dou-

ble to center field to score the game 4-2.

With Charlotte DeNapoli replacing Stokes on the mound between stanzas, Clay's defense knocked down the first three White batters.

In the bottom of the second, Clay drilled White for six runs off doubles from Brittany Costa, DeNapoli and Stokes, a single from Rouw, three walks and a hit batter to go up 8-4. In the third, Stokes would smash a homer to centerfield with DeNapoli finishing off the scoring with an RBI single at 14-4.

OAKLEAF – After hitting the first Atlantic Coast batter, Oakleaf High pitcher Kelsey Sweatt stayed strong for the next seven innings and got sterling defense behind her, including a scintillating outfield snag and throw double play from leftfielder Destiny Pacetti to oust the Stingrays 4-1 in the region 1-8A semifinal on Tuesday at Oakleaf High School.

"When I started sprinting to the ball, I heard Alex (second baseman Alex Acevedo) yelling two, two," said Pacetti. "I just reacted by catching, setting up and throwing to second base in one motion. You have to trust that your teammates got your back."

The third inning double play by Pacetti

accented a near-perfect defensive effort by the Knights who travel to Dover to face Strawberry Crest High in the region championship on Fri., April 29. Strawberry Crest (18-11) defeated defending Class 6A champion Ocala Forest 1-0 in extra innings. Ocala Forest beat Oakleaf in the 2015 state semifinal before winning the state title.

"Of course, we wanted to just get to the final, but we were kind of hoping to get a second shot at Forest," said Oakleaf High coach Christina Thompson. "We'll just get our minds set to take on Strawberry Crest on Friday and go from there. The great part about this team is that we don't get excited about who we play because we are confident in our lineup top to bottom to be able

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A bases-loaded strikeout and a misplayed outfield fly proved costly as the Clay High softball team lost 2-0 in eight innings to Ponte Vedra High in the region 1-6A semifinal Tuesday night at Clay High School. Clay finishes their season at 21-5.

With the score still tied 0-0 as Clay stepped up for their final at bats, Raelye Rouw started a barrage of hits with a slap-hit single to left field followed by a deep centerfield double from Kalyn Morgan that looked to put another thrilling ending to a Blue Devil v. Shark contest. A strikeout to Maegan Stone put two outs on the scoreboard with an intentional walk to Ashley Stokes amping up the excitement level in Green Cove Springs. Unfortunately, Clay batter Charlotte DeNapoli was victimized

watching a questionable third strike go by her without a swing.

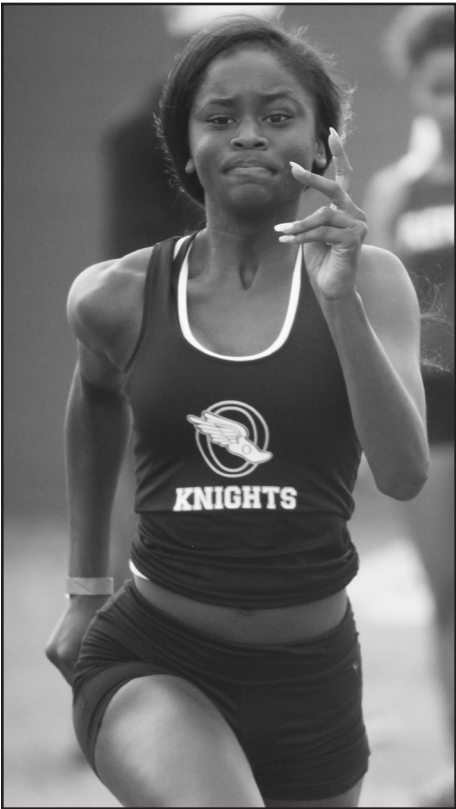

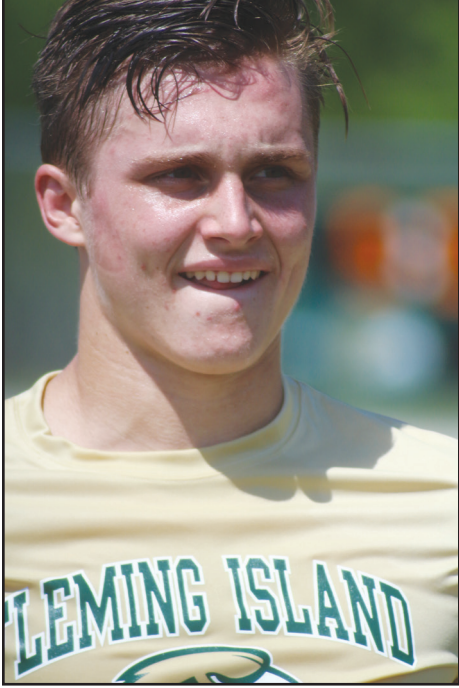

the district 4-5A final. Sgromolo, who lost two key district matches with Clay in regular season play, commented that he has preached one thing all season to ignite his team.

"Right below my lineup sheet is something I have been preaching all season, in fact, the past two years, and that is process," said Sgromolo, who played and coached side by side with Clay head coach Josh Persinger as a Clay Blue Devil. Duckworth slated for starting backfield position for University of Idaho

MOSCOW, Idaho — Former Oakleaf High running back Aaron Duckworth is slated as a top prospect to be in the starting backfield of the University of Idaho football team for the 2016, according to Idaho Media Relations press reports.

In the Vandals annual spring game, the Silver and Black game, Duckworth rushed for an impressive 167 yards and two scores on just 13 carries with a 30 yard run in an 80 point barrage from the number one offense against the number two defense. Duckworth scored on runs of 24 yards and one yard. Saunders rushed for 72 yards on 14 carries with two scores with Brantley getting 16 yards with three receptions with a six yard scoring run. Duckworth also caught two passes for eight yards.

"The score wasn't as important as people executing where you want them to execute," said Vandals head coach Paul Petrino. "That happened."

Duckworth, in a post-scrimmage interview, talked about being the top rusher for the scrimmage.

"I just want to go out there and show how hard I've been working in the off season," said Duckworth. "The competition from the other guys is still there."

Bigger, stronger Westry adds to Wildcat secondary

LEXINGTON, Ky. — Oakleaf High graduate Chris Westry had two pass breakups in the annual Blue/White spring scrimmage for the University of Kentucky's Blue team, the eventual 31-20 winner over the White team, and has gotten high praise from his coaches for his stability on one side of the pass defense for the Wildcats. Kentucky finished 5-7 overall in 2015, 2-6 in the Southeastern Conference.

Westry, a third team Athlon Sports All-Freshman team nominee in 2015, joined teammate tight end C.J. Conrad as two Wildcat freshman chosen for the annual honor. Westry and Conrad were also

named 2015 Southeastern Conference All-Freshman team members.

Westry started all 12 games for the Wildcats and finished second among SEC freshman with 10 passes defended. Westry also had 36 tackles and a game-winning interception against South Carolina. Westry finished 2015 with two interceptions. His first pick was of Mississippi State quarterback Dak Prescott, Prescott's first interception of the year. Kentucky head football coach Mark Stoops has been impressed with Westry since day one in Lexington, but sees him as a force on the Wildcat defense in 2016. In the post-game press conference after the annual Blue/White game, Stoops answered two questions about Westry.

Q. How much confidence do you have in Chris Westry?

COACH STOOPS: Yeah, Chris, from what I could see, again, I have a lot of confidence in. When I see the ball going down the field on his side, like immediately I'm like, that's not going to be complete. Because I feel like it's just not going to happen. I know a couple times as I was standing behind the quarterbacks and watching them challenge him down the field, I thought that was a very low percentage that we were going to complete that. And that was true.

Q. What does Chris Westry need to do this offseason?

COACH STOOPS: He needs to contin-

ue to work, and I mentioned that through spring because he's such a big guy, he's so long, it's uncommon for a guy to be 6-4 and play corner. He's got to constantly work his fundamentals. When he gets out there in game like situation, he just can't -- through the course of spring, I, we have to really stay on him and push him because he fundamentally has to play good to play at that elite level and to get him to play like he's capable of. So he's got a long way to go, but I like his work ethic and he takes the coaching and he takes hard coaching and we just got to stay on him and he's got to have a great summer. Because he's just so darn big, I don't want him to grow into a linebacker.

Westry also answered questions for local media.

On if he senses that Coach Stoops is fired up about the secondary ...

"Absolutely for the most part, he gives us more leeway than past times. He expects a lot from us this year. We only lost two guys and the majority of the guys that have returned have played before. So he expects a lot from us right now."

On Coach Stoops saying he expects the pass to be incomplete when it goes to his side of the field ...

"Well, that says a lot about the confidence that he has in me and I appreciate Coach Stoops saying that, but I am just trying to go out there and compete. You either win or you lose and I like to win. Today, I don't think any were completed my way."

On if he feels this secondary could be a lock-down secondary this season ...

"Absolutely, each and every guy in our secondary we have faith in. Really, in my opinion, we really don't have one, two or three deep, we are all really just ones. We all go out there and grind and like I said you either win or lose and most the time we want to win."

Westry felt that his off-season weightlifting training will help him to fend off big-

ger wideouts, but that his speed would still be his main weapon.

"I had to hit the weights hard because I said to myself a couple weeks ago that I didn't want to be called skinny anymore," said Westry. "I have to be stronger, but also be able to run with the fast guys."

Rutgers coach Chris Ash commented on Sneed's initial foray into college football.

"Consistent effort; consistent toughness; coachability; and a great attitude every single day," Rutgers coach Chris Ash said, explaining why Sneed was knighted. "It was the head coach's decision, and everyone looked at me and was kind of

scratching their head like, "What are you doing?" Every time I watch that kid in the weight room, in the offseason drills, and in practice, it's been 100 miles per hour. And he's shown that he is extremely tough and coachable. And it's that way every single day."

Running backs coach Zak Kuhr echoed Ash's sentiment.

"One of the hardest working players on the team," Kuhr said. "He's earning everything he's getting. You can tell he's coming straight out of high school because he's a little unpolished and a little raw. But he's working his butt off, and he's earning respect from the team."

Earning the respect of his teammates was the primary goal for Sneed, who isn't about to rest on his laurels.

"Really I come in every day and I just try to do what the vets are doing," he said. "So I was just basically trying to watch the leaders, trying to emulate them and I didn't know Coach Ash was looking at me (to be Knighted) but it's an honor to get your hard work recognized."

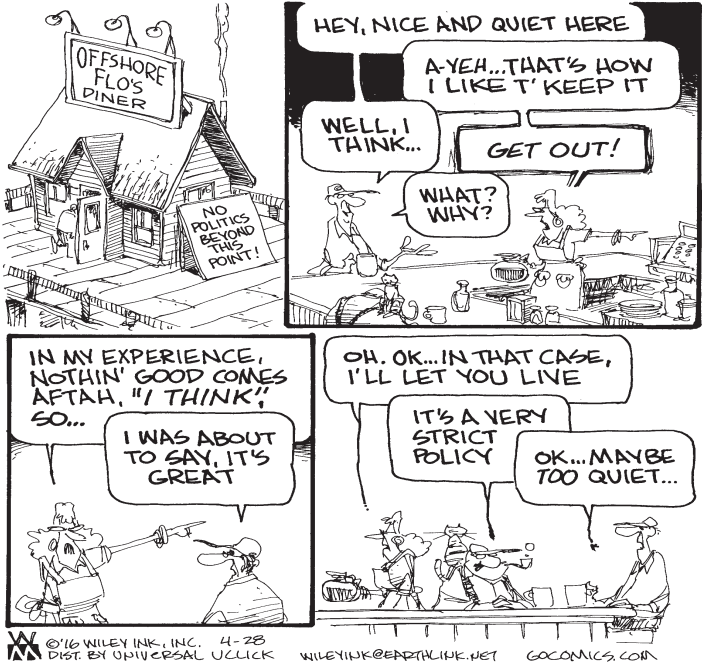

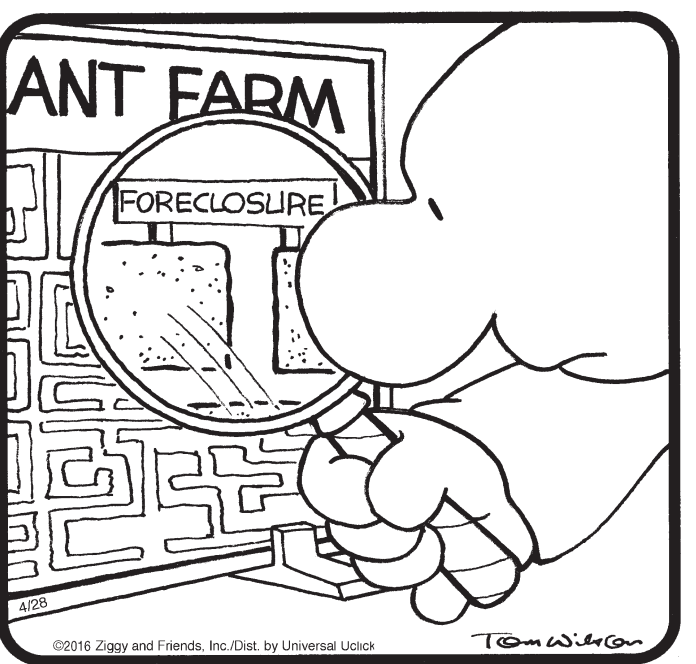

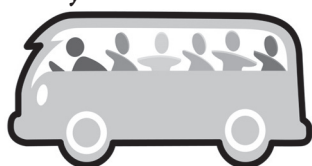

If you are a person claiming a right to funds remaining after the sale, you must file a claim with the clerk no later than 60 days after the sale. If you fail to file a claim you will not be entitled to any remaining funds. After 60 days, only the owner of record as of the date of the lis pendens may claim the surplus.
