Implementation

What's next for medical marijuana?

FLEMING ISLAND — A bill filed last Thursday in the Florida Senate offers voters the closest picture on what full medical marijuana legalization will look like for the state and Clay County.

The 36-page bill introduced by Sen. Rob Bradley (R-Fleming Island) broadens the 2014 'Charlotte's Web' bill that legalized low-THC cannabis for terminal patients to

provide new guidelines for the implementation of medical cannabis.

And although critics say the amendment lands much warmer to the accessibility voters soundly advocated for at the polls on

November 8, 2016, they say the bill's kinks remain glaring and concerning.

If approved, Senate Bill 406 would cement guidelines regarding caregiver registries, codify standards for medical marijuana treatment centers, require physicians to annually reassess patients and give the power of zoning dispensaries back to counties and municipalities.

Patients and municipal governments have been frozen in time waiting for a new

regulatory structure to take place since Floridians — and residents of Clay County — overwhelmingly supported Amendment 2 to legalize medical marijuana for patients with debilitating illnesses such as Parkinson's disease, epilepsy, cancer and chronic pain.

Despite widespread support from the electorate, the bill is expected to face healthy scrutiny in the senate as language

‘Gotta’ wear shades?’

County officials say bright 2017 ahead

ORANGE PARK – County and municipal leaders in Clay County recently laid out their visions for the coming year at a Clay County Chamber of Commerce event.

The annual State of the County luncheon is the county’s equivalent of the pencil marks parents use to mark their child’s growth. In January every year, elected officials reveal their plans for the new year and measure the county’s progress from years prior.

County Commission Chair Wayne Bolla laid out the county’s current problems and revealed future plans to better the quality of life here. When summing up the current climate, however, he invoked lyrics from the opening track of the 1986 Timbuk 3 debut album.

“We’re doing alright, getting good grades,” Bolla chanted, at the Jan. 19 event. “The future’s so bright, we have got to wear shades.”

Some of the same problems plague the 644-square mile county, however – congestion. Blanding Boulevard had the dubious honor of being the most congested road in the five-county area in 2016.

“We’ve done everything almost everything that’s humanly possible to fix that,” Bolla said. “We’ve widened the road, we’ve timed the lights...at the last board meeting

I asked what else we could do and they said ‘well we could double deck it.’”

The Board of County Commissioners has named roads as their number one priority this year. At the same time, the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization has identified \$250 million worth of road projects the county need to address in the next 10 years.

The county has more than 250 miles of dirt roads still left to pave and an additional 120 miles of resurfacing projects that are on a list. The county slates between \$1 and \$1.5 million a year for road work, but according to Bolla, the county would have to sink \$5 million a year just to keep the resurfacing list from growing.

Commissioners are currently looking at different options for a new resurfacing program. There is hope for a congestion respite in the First Coast Expressway project. The first phase multi-lane toll road is currently being built, with the first phase – Blanding Boulevard in Clay County to I-10/US 90 in Duval County – slated for early 2018 completion. The second phase will take the tollroad east from Blanding Boulevard in Middleburg through Lake Asbury and on to Green Cove Springs, eventually reaching I-95 in St. Johns County.

The introduction of a major highway through the mostly underdeveloped southern end of the county is expected to supercharge development and swallow greens-

pace around the toll road’s interchanges to make room for, what development officials hope, will be high paying jobs and provide entertainment for motorists to stop in the county.

Bolla said the commission is currently examining a project that would effectively tie College Drive where it crosses Blanding

Boulevard into the expressway and take traffic off the northern end of Blanding.

Bolla will “see if we could do something with the cost,” an estimated \$100 million.

In other top priorities, the commission wants to bring more parks to Clay County.

Residents can answer an online sur-

Commissioners spend time debating agenda(s)

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Clay County’s Jan. 24 commissioners’ meeting resulted in a dust up over who has what authority and what procedures need to be followed when setting meeting agenda items.

No real action or vote was taken on the topic but the consensus was that any commissioner could put an item on the agenda as long as it was done in a timely fashion and that all commissioners will now receive a review draft of the agenda before it is posted.

The kerfuffle began when commission Vice Chairwoman Diane Hutchings said she wanted to bring up a bit of “housekeeping.” The housekeeping turned out to be that a proclamation she had requested be put on the agenda was denied by Commission Chairman Wayne Bolla.

“If we’re going to put something on the

agenda, the staff, which includes our manager, our attorney and our auditor, as well as any commissioner, have always been allowed to put something on the agenda, and just because this last week that didn’t happen for me I wanted to bring it to everyone’s attention to make sure that we decide collectively how we want that to work,” Hutchings said.

While no mention was made at the meeting as to what the proclamation was about, Hutchings said later that it was to recognize National School Choice Week. She also said hundreds of other municipalities had made such a proclamation and that the Clay County commissioners last year had supported it unanimously. She said she had lined up representatives of various types of schools to attend the meeting to receive the proclamation. Up until a vote last fall by the school board, Hutchings had been the board president for St. Johns Classical Charter Academy, a

charter school approved as one of the last items under the tenure of former school superintendent Charlie Van Zant Jr. However, by the time the item came up for a vote, Hutchings had resigned the post.

“It was time sensitive,” she said.

For his part, Bolla said he had only heard of the item the night before the Jan. 24 meeting when he got a call from County Manager Stephanie Kopelousos requesting it be added to the agenda. Bolla said he didn’t have time to review it or research it so he said “no.”

“It was a proclamation that kind of committed the board to agreeing to some stuff and I said, well, I can’t research this, I don’t have the time to deal with it, I’m not really in favor of this. Normally, I’ll let the board vote on anything...but I got this at the last minute and so I said no,” Bolla said.

He later added that he believed the commissioners should discuss a proclama-

tion prior to it being delivered.

Kopelousos took the blame for the late notice of the proclamation, saying the staff “dropped the ball” on getting the item on the agenda. Hutchings had requested its placement on Jan. 6 via e-mail.

But Hutchings said her reason for bringing up the subject was not just on an isolated item.

“This particular issue is not what I’m concerned about. My concern is that you would deny any commissioner of putting something on the agenda,” she said to Bolla. “I think that the discussion needs to be that do we, as commissioners, want to grant you that power.”

Commissioner Mike Cella said that although he was new to the board, he had viewed commission meetings for some time and didn’t remember seeing the board vote to put a proclamation on the agenda.

Hitting the streets

Sheriff conducts first neighborhood walk

TANGLEWOOD – The stretch of Jefferson Avenue starting at Blanding is home to decades-old residents and transient rental units colloquially referred to as ‘Tanglewood’ was inundated with cops Tuesday evening.

Residents sat outside stunned that, for the first time, it wasn’t due to neighborhood crime.

Clay County Sheriff Darryl Daniels made good on his campaign promises of ramped up community policing efforts Jan. 24 as he held the first of many planned neighborhood walks. Daniels follows in the legacy of former sheriffs Rick Beasler and Scott Lancaster, who performed neighborhood walks before him.

Daniels pressed palms with residents, joked and carried on small talk while residents made their way home from work. The mood remained jovial, but residents still knew the necessity of Daniels’ visit.

“I’ve been here 25 years – never had a break in never had anything, I don’t want to say it’s hood but there has definitely been hood people showing up,” said Joann Nimmons, who has lived off Jefferson Avenue for 25 years. “They come by, put trash in your yard, they don’t care.”

She corroborated the thoughts of other residents who say much of the problem comes from the rental units scattered around the neighborhood. Many of the people who move into the units bring other things with them, sometimes, including drugs.

With all the changes in the neighborhood, Nimmons said a sheriff’s department walk, which she has never seen in her 25 years on the block, is a welcome sight.

“It makes me feel good,” Nimmons said. “But if something was done I would feel better, but I was impressed that he thought enough to do it, but let’s see what’s going to happen.”

Daniels said the follow up is his next step, and that this is just the first of many walks throughout problem neighborhoods

in the county.

“The walk is an opportunity to engage, but this walk is a teaser – there’s always a follow up component,” Daniels said. “This is chapter one or the first page, then there’s the enforcement side or follow up side to the things that have been brought to our attention... then express them in terms of the people ‘here’s what we found, here’s what we did, here’s what we will continue to do.’”

He said his decision to make Tanglewood his inaugural walk is due to the neighborhood reaching the level of statistical crime to justify the walk, and that Jefferson Avenue is just the first of other neighborhoods that have similar statistics.

He said Clay County has fewer violent crimes than Jacksonville, due in part to a lower population, but added that the prime crimes in the county are property crimes and thefts.

“Sheriff Daniels is my third sheriff...this is the only opportunity that I’ve been with the previous I’ve never done this before so this was actually pretty interesting for me to do this,” said Deputy Jacob Hawkins, who was recently transferred into CCISO’s community affairs section. “It’s kind of fun for me actually to get out and do this old type of police work, is what I call it, you can actually get out here and sit and talk with the people in the community and hear them say ‘this is what my concerns in the neighborhood are.’”

When asked what his follow up to the community concerns might be in the future, Daniels laughed and said “stay tuned.”

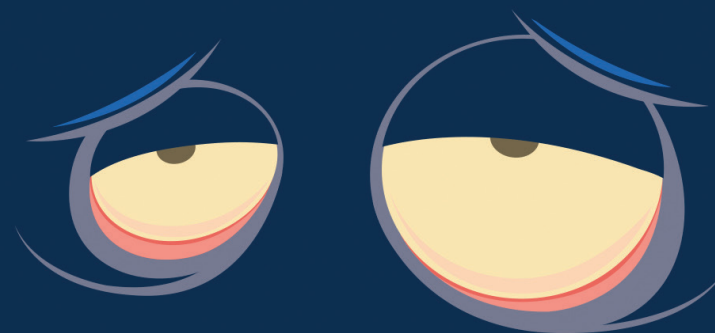

Proposed legislation could break the cycle of debt for many caught in Florida's legal system

It's a vicious circle: Poor people who can't afford their court-related costs and penalties incur escalating costs for not paying, further in-debting them to the state.

"It's a circle that some people get stuck in and they can't get out," Christopher Torres, a Tallahassee defense attorney and former Florida assistant attorney general, told Watchdog.org.

Compounding the problem is the state's practice of suspending drivers' licenses as both a punishment for delinquent payments and an incentive to get people to pay up. For those who can't afford their financial obligations, the suspensions only add more obstacles to meeting debts and ultimately moving on.

A new reform bill aims to break the cycle.

State Sen. Jeff Brandes (R-St. Petersburg) is proposing legislation to modify legal-debt payment terms and prohibit drivers' license suspensions statewide for individuals demonstrating an inability to pay court obligations and other legal penalties.

The St. Petersburg Republican is teaming up with state Sen. Darryl Rouson, a Tampa Bay-area Democrat, to push the reform measure. An identical bill, also sponsored by Brandes, died in an appropriations committee last year despite unanimous support from fellow legislators at two separate committee stops.

Brandes sits on the Senate Criminal Justice Committee and helped pass a landmark civil asset forfeiture bill in 2016. A second attempt at reforming legal system costs and burdens indicates renewed confidence that the reforms could pass this year.

County clerks of court are required to accept monthly debt payments equal to one-twelfth of 2 percent of a person's annual net income. It's a flexible standard meant to accommodate various income backgrounds.

But payments are often arranged inflexibly and at higher rates.

"In Florida, this presumption is often ignored and payment levels are set at fixed amounts," states a Brennan Center for Justice report on criminal justice debt.

Brandes' bill would cap annual payments made to local clerks of court at no more than 2 percent of annual net income, unless an applicant agrees to pay more.

In Florida, clerks of court also turn over unpaid accounts after 90 days to private attorneys or debt collection services.

Six Degrees of Separation

I never knew something could die twice, but two weeks ago, my childhood wrote its second obituary.

Smells of popcorn, sounds of roaring crowds and images of animal acts, jugglers and clowns rolled through me conjuring up joyful times.

Like many institutions, the inevitable happened Jan. 14 when the Feld Organization announced it would close its Ringling Brothers Circus and cease performing. Citing shrinking ticket sales and a dwindling audience, as well as stepped up scrutiny from animal rights activists, the circus is soon to be no more.

The circus was one of the few places one could be thrilled by such things as high-wire artists, made to laugh by such acts as clowns and amazed by daring animal acts. And the clowns. Like many people, I've never had a problem with clowns, which seem to come in all shapes and iterations – goofy, scary, outlandish and sad.

I remember wondrous times as a child going to the circus. When I was six, a circus came to my hometown of Milan, Georgia accidentally. We later learned, after it had already set up on the town's only baseball field, that it was supposed to go to Millen, Georgia, a much larger town closer to Augusta. My sister Carol took me and my brother Frank to see the show "under the big top."

My next encounter with a clown would be 1975 when Clem Clown came to the Mack's store in the nearby town of McRae to meet fans of his afternoon show on WALB-TV 10 in Albany, Georgia. But my favorite clown was one known the world over.

I grew up watching the inimitable circus clown Emmett Kelly on television. Having created Weary Willie on his drawing board in the late 1930s, Kelly portrayed, the sad hobo clown from the late 1930s on up until the 1980s. And it would be the late-80s when the unbelievable happened – I met his daughter. Suddenly, I was playing the game of "Six Degrees of Separation."

"Is it true that your father is the most famous clown in the world," I asked.

"Yes," said Stasia Kelly.

We were attending a convention sponsored by the now-defunct organization once known as the Georgia Association of Newscasters. It was thrilling to meet Stasia as I had only previously known her as a voice on Fox 97, a now bygone FM radio station in Atlanta.

While she did not go into detail about her father, I recall taking up most of the conversation telling her how he made me laugh as a child watching him perform on TV variety shows, which are, well, now also a thing of the past.

I remember pondering aloud with Stasia whether she thought the day will come when no one will know who her father was. She firmly answered that that day was inevitable.

His career began in the 1940s when Weary Willie became a hit and Kelly signed on with Ringling Brothers where he would go on to make thousands of adults and children laugh for decades.

Just in that brief moment at the GAN Convention, I could tell Stasia loved her father, and, consequently, she could tell that her father's work had brought me joy as an unwitting child.

In an article she wrote for Guideposts magazine in October 2006, Stasia said people cared about Willie and his struggles.

"They saw that no matter how hard he

State law allows them to tack on 40 percent surcharges to underlying debts.

The proposed legislation wouldn't abolish the surcharges, but it would limit the amount of time private collectors could pursue legal system debts to no more than 5 years. It would also deny any additional charges beyond what clerks of court contractually negotiate through an open bidding process.

Suspension problems

With respect to drivers' licenses, prohibiting suspensions for low-income people would help tackle the inherent inefficiency of obstructing good-faith efforts to drive to work and earn an income.

"Most people in Florida are dependent on driving," Torres said. "If you can't drive then it's harder to work or find employment. ... Getting caught driving illegally means new problems added to old problems, maybe even an arrest, and the cycle starts over again."

According to the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, 1.5 million notices of suspension were issued in 2014, mostly originating from "failure to

comply" or "failure to pay" offenses.

The Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability, a legislative research office, reports that a large percentage of license suspensions relating to delinquent court costs take more than two years to reinstate.

Reinstatement requires full payment of all financial obligations, enrolling in a payment plan (if not already enrolled), or a court order granting relief.

The amount of time and money involved for many suspension reinstatements leaves the door open for illegal driving. The American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators estimates that as many as three-fourths of drivers with suspended or revoked licenses continue to drive.

Torres said the penalties for driving with a suspended license hinge on intent. If a law enforcement officer determines that an individual was driving "without knowledge" that their license was suspended, then the penalty is a civil offense punishable by a traffic ticket.

If an officer determines that a driver was "knowingly" driving with a suspended license, then the offense is criminal and warrants arrest.

Under current law, hardship exemptions for business or employment purposes

do not apply for failing to pay court obligations and legal penalties, even though they're available for many driving-related suspensions, such as driving under the influence.

Prohibiting license suspensions for indigents, disabled persons, bankrupt individuals and government assistance recipients could enhance efforts to pay off legal obligations and reduce the cycle of escalating burdens and taxpayer resources required to sustain the merry-go-round process.

The question may be whether the state and local governments are willing to lose the revenue streams.

Revenue vs. debtors

According to a legislative staff analysis, if Brandes' 2016 bill would've passed it would've caused significant government revenue losses.

"The bill would likely have a negative impact on local tax collectors and clerks of court who retain a portion of revenues from certain drivers' license sanctions when issuing reinstatements, in addition to other fees retained by them associated with drivers' license suspensions and revocations."

The Florida Court Clerks and Comptrollers, a statewide association, estimated clerks of court would suffer annual losses ranging from \$24.7 million to \$82.4 million, depending on the success of the reforms.

If 15 percent of collections were lost because of the new payment plan modifications, licensing reforms, or the bill's promotion of community service as a way to pay off debts at minimum wage, then clerks of court could lose an estimated \$24.7 million in revenue.

If participation jumped to 50 percent, then \$82.4 million in estimated losses could result.

Add on another \$7.5 million in annual recurring funds for new full-time employees and IT support for payment plan main-

tenance, and legislators might balk at the reforms again.

But the issue isn't going away. Criminal justice reformers are confronting financially burdensome, and sometimes insurmountable, legal system practices across the country.

Marc Levin, director of the Center for Effective Justice at the conservative Texas Public Policy Foundation, says the cycle of escalating court obligations and legal penalties is too expensive in both human and taxpayer costs.

"While there is a legitimate role for fines and fees, their use has skyrocketed over the last few decades, with the penalties appearing to be more tied to generating revenue for government rather than legitimate public safety purposes," he said.

The American Civil Liberties Union asserts that "state and local courts have increasingly attempted to supplement their funding by charging fees to people convicted of crimes, including fees for public defenders, prosecutors, court administration, jail operation, and probation supervision."

The debate between revenue and reform will be heard at the state Capitol when the annual legislative session convenes March 7.

Last year, the Florida Court Clerks and Comptrollers association reported \$894 million in total collections for court costs, monetary penalties, fees, service charges and other costs. The collection rate was 73 percent.

took it on the chin, Willie never gave up. He became the world's most famous clown, probably the most recognizable clown ever. Maybe the reason Willie was so easy for people to love was that Dad brought a bit of himself to the character. Not that Dad was a sad sack, but he understood struggle," she wrote in Guideposts.

Stasia was inspired to write the Guideposts story after her father died. In the article, she describes how she felt boarding a plane in Atlanta to head to her childhood home in Sarasota, Florida the day her father died. She sat there clutching a newspaper article that included a photo of her father talking on the phone smiling after hearing news of her birth.

"Now, staring out the plane window, I tried to be grateful for that happiness Dad had found, and for the life he had led making others happy. How much more blessed

could a daughter be than to have Emmett Kelly as her father?" she writes.

And just as organizations fold and radio stations change names and formats, the inevitable happens. And like Stasia, we can strive to be grateful for the happiness those things brought us along the way.

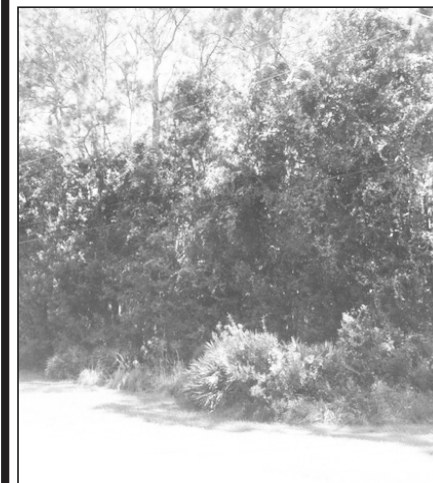

"That is why I have come here today," he continued, "because of the opportunities that are now available to all of us."

After a brief summary of African-American history in America, Watson asked that the crowd celebrate the progress that this nation has made, and give thanks to those who made it possible, such as King.

Martin Luther King Day became an official national holiday 31 years ago, and is celebrated each year on the third Monday in January. The date is not King's birthday, which was Jan. 15.

Killed in April of 1968, at the Lorraine Motel in Memphis, Tenn., King's legacy is

able to live on in not only the things he accomplished throughout his life, but also in a national commemoration each year.

Just as King used his national spotlight to tell the nation of America's injustice on African-Americans, Watson used this celebration as a platform to speak to the young people, asking them to realize how far those before them have come and how far they too, can go.

"So, for the young people who think there's no hope, who feel there are no opportunities available to you," Watson said,

"I say to you: Shirley Chisholm, Thurgood Marshall, Medgar Evers, Dr. King.

"If they made it, through all the difficulties and all of the roadblocks in their way," explained Watson, "we have no excuse."

Watson asked that the audience repeat those words.

"We have no excuse," the crowd chanted.

He said that while some have worse circumstances than others, there is still no excuse. He even asked that rather than complaining that the deck is stacked against you, that attendees can stack their own deck.

At this point, the crowd was all in, cheering and praising the words that Watson spoke.

And much like King's famous 'I Have a Dream' speech, Watson cast his own dream for today's youth.

"I dream of a day, that all of our young people will choose education instead of incarceration," he began. "I dream of a day that all of our young people will take a positive dream instead of drinking and smoking," he said.

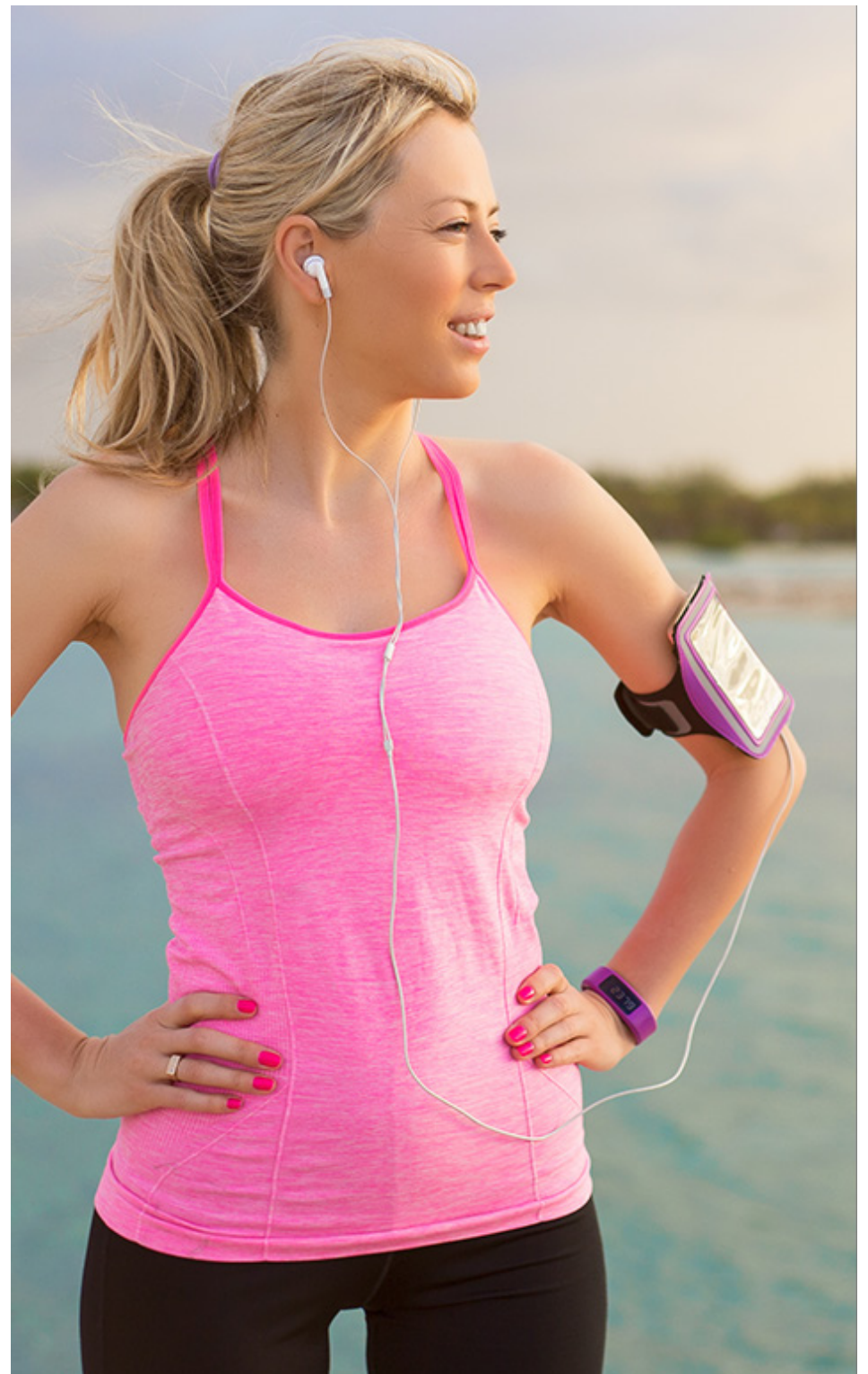
Each of these lines from Watson's speech were met with an eruption of applause from the audience that resembled a worship service.

He said it is important that the children of America no longer choose obstruction, recklessness and a care-free attitude towards education and knowledge. Instead, Watson asks that children educate themselves on what they are not happy with, so that they might responsibly and effectively find a solution.

"I have a dream that we as a nation finally realize that we hold our fate in our hands," Watson said.

Before closing, he left listeners with one last thought.

"I dream of an America, simply Americans, not Black Americans, not White Americans, not Democrats or Republicans," he said, "but simply Americans, not divided by class or race, or status, but people taking advantage of the American dream, working together for freedom, unity, success, greatness and strength."

Entrepreneurs transform park into shark tank

ORANGE PARK – The products of Clay County's growing entrepreneur culture stood on stage Saturday to pitch their products in the inaugural innovation festival dubbed Pitch in the Park.

Innovators touted products ranging from drywall repair to mobile apps to the crowd, organizers and judges in an event which is being compared to a hybrid of the competitive pitching television show "Shark Tank" and Jacksonville's yearly innovation festival "One Spark."

"These innovators have the dream to transition from the garage to the global stage with the invention they've created," said keynote speaker Wally Conway, host of the Home & Garden Show on a Jacksonville radio station.

After poring over the ideas from 18 innovators, the judges named Zachary Schwartz – creator of a mobile app called IntoGo – winner of the top prize.

Schwartz's app turns the idea of 'what can I do this weekend' on its head with a swipe left and right for yes and no design that allows algorithms to find, regardless if you swipe left or right, what its users like to do in their spare time.

"Date night ideas, dinner, live music, events – IntoGo is your solution," Schwartz said in his winning pitch. "In less than 10 weeks we launch this app IntoGo, previous One Spark winners, local investors in a local software team. This app right here is now the fastest growing app in the history of Northeast Florida."

Schwartz won a \$1,000 first prize and the opportunity to press palms with potential business partners.

Staged at Orange Park Town Hall on Jan. 21, Pitch in the Park's creators want it to become an annual affair. The festival's creators, who are themselves entrepreneurs and business owners, created the event to market the budding innovators of Clay County as much as the innovators market themselves. The event marks the

culmination of years of planning between Bob Hawkinson, co-owner of TLC Total Lawn Care, Brian Knight, head of the software company Pragmatic Works and Bill Garrison, president of the Clay County Development Corp. and others.

"We were very pleased with it, we were very pleased with the turnout and who participated," Garrison said. "The biggest thing of it all is the demonstration that Clay

County has a strong system of business support and that's really what we want to demonstrate and I think we were successful with that."

The group has already begun to move forward planning for next year's event. They got public feedback after the event and discovered that both pitchers and attendees alike had some recommendations for the event. Garrison hopes to discuss those recommendations and use them to improve the festival for next year.

"We had no idea with what to expect," Garrison said. "The majority of the feedback was good. We now we need to improve on our sound and that's going to mean a sound system. Bring the pitch component inside and makes it more controllable and everybody can hear better so they can improve the pitch component."

Garrison also believes that the event simply had "too much going on." While pitchers had the stage, musicians strummed away in the background, which he said may have taken the focus away from some of the pitchers. Because the event is 40 percent judged through audience participation and the remainder through a select group of judges, he said this might have weakened the event.

However, he said planning for 2018 begins immediately, so he hopes the event will be an even larger success then.

Coming in second and winning \$500 was Fleming Island entrepreneur Elaine Smith, founder of Glamour Theatre Company, while Wally Trudeau, inventor of a unique drywall repair tool, took third place and a \$250 prize.

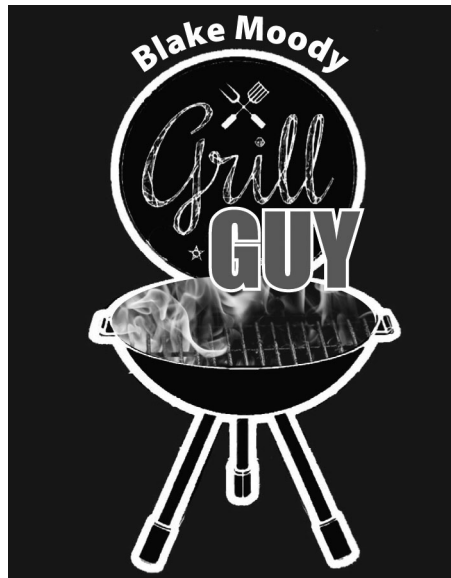

er scored well in pork or brisket, so I didn’t think we had a chance to do well.

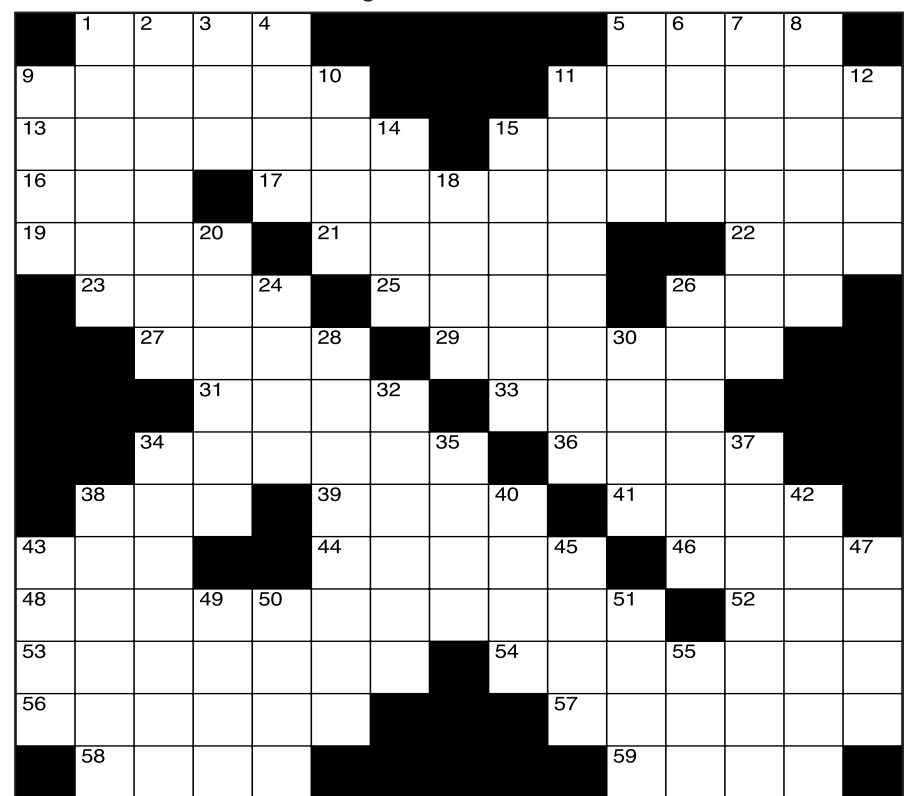

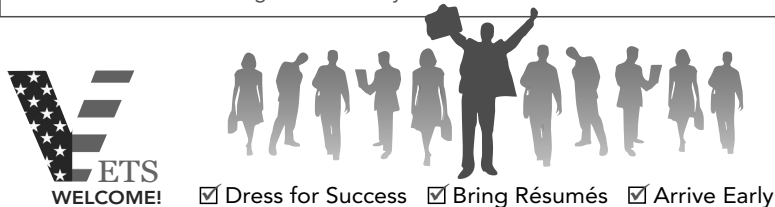

tendance, were awarded a free trip to the NFL's Pro Bowl and related activities in Orlando on Jan. 26.

It includes two buses, a hotel stay, and numerous activities for the ESPN Pro Bowl week in Orlando.

"I had no idea," Carroll said. "I'm glad I didn't know. It made the event even better that it was a surprise!"

Carroll became Florida's ambassador for Fuel Up Play 60 after an extensive application and interview process. Fuel Up Play 60 is a bit different than Play 60. Fuel Up teaches sixth-graders how to eat healthy, so they can have the "fuel" to exercise, which is what "Play 60" is all about.

The NFL flew Carroll to Purdue University last year for a five-day forum to learn about how to educate kids on eating healthy. It was his involvement, as well as his active classmates, that led to the Pro Bowl trip.

"This has been one of the most fun experiences of my life," he said. "I think this program is going to spread like wildfire."

The Fuel Up Play 60 program here works in conjunction with the Florida Dairy Council.

"As a PE coach, my goal isn't just to see the kids once a week and have them exercise," said Shannon Pellegrini, the school's physical education teacher. "My goal is to inspire them to exercise as they grow up and become adults."

"I always tell them that I didn't like physical activity in school, but now as an adult I do runs and I actually pay for it at the gym. "I think the Play 60 program inspires kids to be active."

Carroll is ambassador for this school year.

"Because of his ambassadorship, along with Coach Pellegrini, that contributed to this Play 60 trip happening with Orlando," said Sarah Lawson, Lake Asbury Elementary principal. "He has been a go-to person."

Chase said he is happy for his classmates.

"They made this trip happen with their involvement," he said. "They have been amazing. It's going to be a great trip. NFL players will be there. It will be lots of fun. I can't wait."

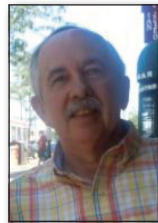

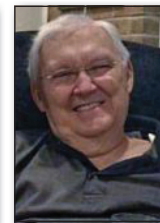

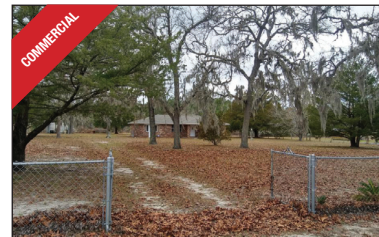

School Superintendent Addison Davis commended the efforts of the teachers and school employees on the stage from the 41 schools in Clay County. Davis said teachers are the heart of the school system.

"Teachers are the No. 1 influence on student achievement," Davis said. "Many of us have been impacted by a teacher in some way, shape, or form that's made us better personally and made us better professionally."

The rigorous selection process involved six essays written by the nominee, then the 41 teachers were observed in their classroom.

Judges combined the scores from the written portion and the observation to whittle the field down to five finalists. A panel comprised of education professionals and community leaders then interviewed the finalists to determine the winner for both awards.

Robert Garcia is a groundskeeper and track coach at Orange Park High School. He started as a volunteer because his kids attended school there, but Garcia's been at the school for 14 years.

Garcia said he was humbled by the award.

"It's really an awesome honor. It's [Orange Park High School] really a family atmosphere," Garcia said. "I'm really lucky not only to coach at Orange Park, but also be a part of the staff and I enjoy everybody."

Bily, who teaches fourth grade at Lakeside Elementary, said she was excited and it's wonderful to have the appreciation from other people.

"It's nice to be recognized because my family does share me so much, it's a real honor," Bily said with her family around her on stage.

Bily said the best part of teaching is the children she teaches and the fact that she is not stuck in a cubicle all day like some jobs afford.

via an app. Sally and I chose this app for many reasons due to ease of use, its large database of foods and the barcode scan feature.

Combined 80 pounds lighter with no exercise

It's amazing how portion control and journaling *everything* makes you realize what you are doing to yourself. We started with a three-day crash-type diet to jumpstart the weight loss. We figured we could endure for three days and it worked as we lost 10-12 pounds between us. Since intense exercise is not our thing, the real hard work had just begun – daily journaling, choosing the right foods, portioning and staying within our calorie limit.

As we started making these changes, immediately the heartburn and acid reflux diminished.

I think this was due to the amount of food we were eating and not necessarily the weight loss. We began to have more energy and, of course, clothes began to fit again. Also, sleep has been better.



Since July 15 to date, Jim has lost 50 pounds and Sally has lost 30 pounds.

In my conversation with the Crosbys, their journey has had ups-and-downs. Recent holidays were tough as well as weekly dinners out with friends.

It wasn't until about a few weeks ago did they purposefully start exercising. "Exercise is not my favorite thing to do, so motivation is a huge problem. That is my new challenge," Sally said.

The Crosby Challenge

At present, the Crosbys are taking further steps to a fitter life. Mr. Crosby's personal challenge is to complete the Couch-to-5K program. "The weight loss provided some motivation to get moving. I still don't like running, but it's bearable and I see progress," he said. As for Sally, she has begun longer dog walks (up to a mile) intermittently.

Whether you use this app, or another app, or follow your own food journal, do what works for you. As Jim states, "my goal was to quickly track what I was eating, not make tracking a part-time job." We know nothing comes easy. There are no surprises when it comes to making changes. And if an app helps you do that, then nothing is stopping you.

is refined and wrinkles smoothed in committee when the legislature convenes in March.

The Florida House has yet to propose a companion bill.

"We have a simple goal," Bradley said. "And that is to faithfully implement Amendment 2 as it was overwhelmingly approved by the voters over in Clay County. So this is clearly something that people demand. They demand safe access to medical cannabis when they or their family members are suffering from debilitating conditions, so what this bill does is it gets us to a place where people can access medical marijuana."

Once 250,000 patients are registered with the Office of Compassionate Use, the bill allows five new medical marijuana treatment centers to open. The overall goal is to have 20 dispensaries in operation by full implementation, roughly after 500,000 patients are registered.

The bill also removes roadblocks to patient registry, including a prior stipulation that patients have a three-month relationship with the recommending doctor prior to recommendation.

The bill, titled "Compassionate use of low-THC cannabis and marijuana" replaces the definition of medical cannabis as used in the former bill and refers back to the traditional meaning of marijuana as used in the Florida Constitution.

The change does not mean, however, that use of the schedule 1 drug outside of a medical use will carry any less of a penalty under law. Users who qualify under the proposed bill cannot use the medicine in public, planes, schools, jails, or in their place of work – unless stipulated otherwise by their employer. The bill also allows physicians to recommend proper marijuana "delivery devices" and creates penalties for recommendation of the medicine to unqualified patients. Doctors must pay a \$999 fee and complete a four-hour course to qualify to recommend the medicine. Currently, one percent of Florida physicians have registered to recommend the drug.

Physicians must also clearly label the recommended dosage, and dispensaries must clearly list their product's strength on packaging, which must be childproof. As an additional safety measure, all transactions will be recorded to prevent doctor shopping.

Dispensaries will be prohibited from selling recreational delivery devices such as bongs and rolling papers.

Qualified caregivers must be at least 21 years old and, just like patients and physicians, register with the Office of Compassionate Use, the offshoot of the Florida Department of Health that oversees and enforces the regulatory structure of medical marijuana put forth by legislation.

Hillsborough County Sen. Dana Young (R-18) co-sponsored the bill. Young oversees the health policy and regulated industries committee.

Despite its marked improvements in the access approved by congress in 2014, leaders with the Florida Cannabis Coalition, a Tampa-based group of more than 800 entre-

preneurs say the bill doesn't go far enough to remove an apparent "oligarchy" in business opportunities that will arise from Amendment 2.

"If we put in a system that's only advantageous for only a couple of entrepreneurs in the state, then it just so happens to end up that it's not advantageous for the patients we have in the state," said Carlos Hermida, executive vice president with the membership based group. "A lot of people think maybe a free market would allow for greedy people to enter the business but that's not the case. It allows for patients in the state to actually get the medicine they deserve."

He said competition would improve overall quality of the product, but Hermida describes the \$5 million performance bond companies must post in order to begin the process of registering their business with the Office of Compassionate Use as too large of a barrier of entry for many of his members.

Hermida said it's a shared consensus among Coalition members that a horizontal implementation structure would bring more benefit to the small business community than the current vertical implementation structure proposed would be.

Currently, business owners who hope to break into the estimated \$1.4 billion medical marijuana industry must be able to run a sophisticated and security-conscious grow operation as well as run their own processing operation to turn products into useable forms other than its raw form as well as their own retail shops. The "start to finish" business model is written into the proposed law.

And although a provision that required grow houses to have been plant nurseries prior to registration has been removed in the revised text, Hermida said, the current regulations create an almost impenetrable regulatory model that favors only the wealthiest business owners who can create, run and operate all of those different businesses simultaneously.

"We believe in free markets, and we really believe in a freer market with the cannabis industry because it forces ourselves to live up to a higher standard," Hermida said. He added any updates to the 2014 bill's regulations are a welcome, describing the bill as "a worst case scenario." After three years, only seven businesses have been approved for operation in the state.

Bradley said the business model ensures marijuana, which is still illegal on a federal level, is produced in only the most sterile and highest quality environments.

"To make it available for medical use, there are safety and security reasons to protect the public and the businesses themselves, so it is necessary to have regulation," Bradley said. "And so I think it's appropriate to have a system whereby an individual business that has the ability to grow and sell the product is not following the rules that you can pull up that business by the root and have it stop doing business or if it's a minor violation to fine the business and it be meaningful."

Although estimates vary, a state report found – at full implementation with 450,000 active patients registered – the state stands to generate roughly \$67 million a year in medical marijuana sales.

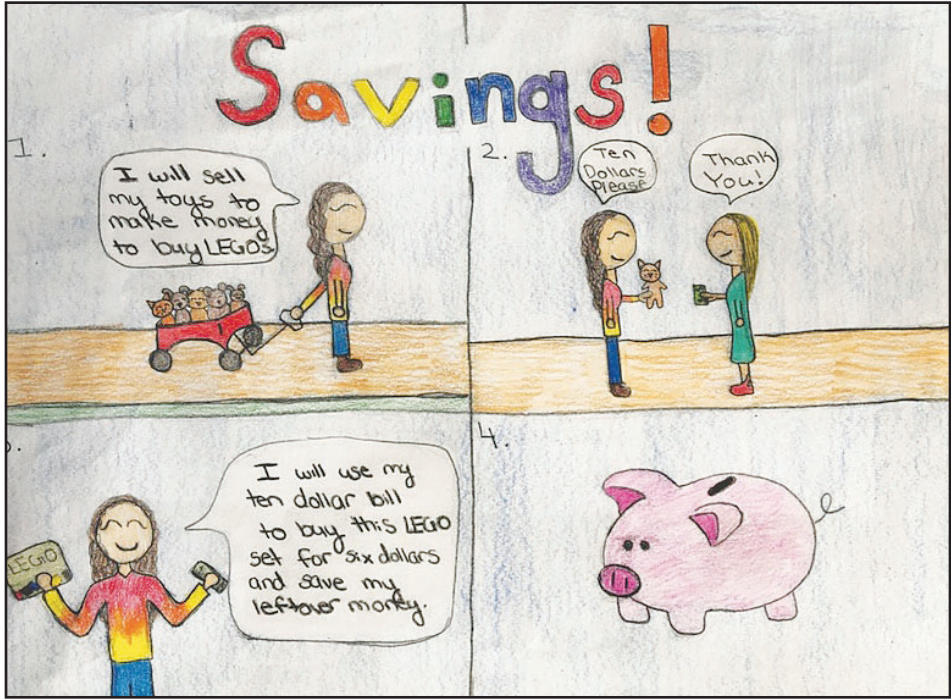

The fair is just around the corner

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Growing up, one of my favorite times of the year was when the Delaware State Fair rolled around. Being in 4-H and later FFA, I spent almost the entire summer getting my vegetables, woodworking projects and sheep ready for exhibiting.

While those times as a youth exhibitor have passed for me personally, there is still an opportunity for everyone in Clay County to get ready to exhibit plants in the horticultural department for the Clay County Agricultural Fair. This year's fair will be held March 30 through April 8 at the county fairgrounds.

To enter plants in the fair, you must either live or work in Clay County. Also, adult exhibitors 19 years old and up must have grown the plant themselves for at least 6 months and youth entrants 18 years old and younger must have grown the plant a

minimum of 3 months.

Entries can be brought in and accepted on the day of check-in or online entries can be placed at www.claycountyfair.org by March 24. Check-in day for plants is March 26 between 2 p.m. and 7 p.m. and March 27, between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m., the day when exhibitor will be given an exhibit number and tags for their plants.

Each exhibitor is limited to 25 total entries and you can enter more than one plant in a section but no more than one of any particular variety or color. For example, you may enter several entries into the foliage plant class but cannot have two of the same variety in that class.

Plants must be pest and disease free and will be inspected at registration and disqualified if found to be infested. Entries must be clean, groomed and in an appropriate container – broken containers will not be accepted. Also note that, even though there is no size limit, any plant container over 18-inches must be set in place by the owner.

When bringing in plants, it is important to know the name of the plant and in which class it should be entered.

Judging will take place March 20 from 9 a.m. until noon and ribbons should be placed before the opening of fair. Plants are judged on the basis of their form, health,

attractiveness of display, size, growth difficulty and condition. Entries should also not be recently re-potted.

During the fair, your entries will be cared for by Master Gardener volunteers but you can request to do your own watering. I would also like to note that work is being done to reduce the level of light and temperature in the building to make the fair a much less stressful experience for the entries.

Exhibit pick up is on April 9 from 2 p.m. until 5 p.m. and April 10 from 10 a.m. until noon. You will need to bring the receipt portion of your entry tag. Prize money will also be distributed to you.

Now for the exciting part. If chosen as one of the top 3 plants in a section, you will receive a ribbon and a premium award. First place blue ribbons receive \$3, second place red ribbons receive \$2, third place yellow ribbons receive \$1, and fourth place also receives a yellow honorable mention ribbon. In addition to these premiums, a special merit plant, best in show and superintendent's award will be given and each exhibit receives a premium and rosette.

If you take full advantage of this opportunity, you could walk away with over \$100 in prize money along with the pride that comes with exhibiting your hard work



to the citizens of Clay County.

For more information about entering the fair, please visit www.claycountyfair.org. I hope to see many new entries and exhibitors in the Horticulture department this year and please make sure to stop by and visit our Master Gardener and Agricultural displays in the exhibit building and the Early Florida Heritage Garden.

Two-truck crash ends in fatality

LAWTEY – The Florida Highway Patrol reports that a two-vehicle crash in Western Clay County near Lawtey has claimed the life of a Hernando, Florida man.

FHP said the 44-year-old man, whose identity has been withheld until notification of next of kin has been completed, was pronounced dead at the scene at 1:34 p.m. on Jan. 24. The crash took place near the intersection of Richard Mosley Road and U.S. Highway 301 northbound.

The unidentified man was driving a box truck while traveling northbound behind a tractor-trailer truck driven by Marc R. Jones, 63, of Keystone Heights.

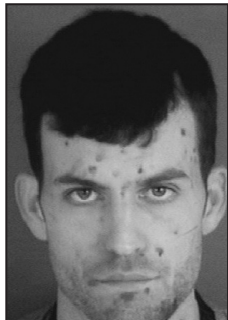

CCSO uses taser to capture suspect

MIDDLEBURG – A Clay County Sheriff's Office deputy had to use his taser earlier this week to capture a man who was believed to be in possession of heroin at a convenience store in the Oakleaf area, just north of Middleburg.

Police arrested Robert Tidwell Hill, 25, on Jan. 23 at 2:23 p.m. after an officer "observed the defendant drop a small plastic baggie containing an unknown white substance inside."

The incident took place at the Kangaroo store at 3895 Old Jennings Rd. which the officer said he entered to conduct a routine property check.

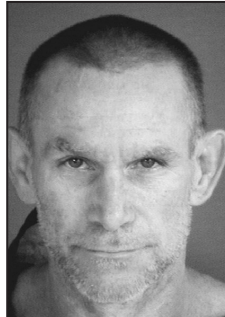
When the officer saw the plastic baggie, he asked Hill to stop, but Hill pulled away from the officer and "pushed off on my chest" before running out of the store towards a vehicle. After refusing verbal commands to stop and get on the ground, the officer used his taser to capture Hill who turned to try and avoid the taser. However, when he turned, one of the taser probes struck Hill about three inches above his left elbow and a second probe struck him about one inch above the left side of his mouth.

Hill faces charges of heroin possession, violence on a police officer and possession of drug paraphernalia. At press time, Hill remained held in the Clay County Jail with his bond set at \$32,510.

Police find feces, syringes in home with child

LAKE ASBURY – What began as a call to police to check out a disturbance on a resident's property ended Jan. 23 with the caller's arrest for different felony charges.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Joel Thomas J. Lanfair, 44, at 5 a.m. on Jan. 23 after an investigation. He faces one count each of child neglect without great harm, possession of ammunition by a convicted felon and possession of drug equipment.

According to the police report, the investigation began when the responding officer walked Lanfair's property to check out a disturbance he had heard.

After finding no one intruding the property, the officer got permission to enter Lanfair's home to look at the attic, which is where Lanfair had said he heard the noise coming from.

"I professionally asked the defendant if he was taking any medication or diagnosed with any psychological issues," states the police report.

The officer also questioned Lanfair about "several ulcers on his arms and legs." He also asked Lanfair if he had a history of methamphetamine use after sensing a chemical smell in the home.

A search of the home did not uncover any drugs, but a number of used and unused syringes left within reach of two children in the home, feces on the floor and "several areas with old rotting food, some even having a significant mold build to the food" in a bedroom.

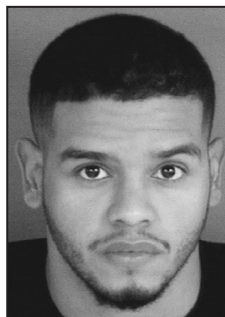
The Department of Children and Families was called in to investigate the home and the safety of the children.

Drug charges come after traffic stop

The vehicle was eventually found near the AMC theatre entrance. Once Tomlinson arrived, he confirmed that this was the Garcia Matos' vehicle.

A search of the car yielded a jar containing 30 grams of marijuana, as well as a digital scale and a grinder, both considered to be drug paraphernalia. Police also found a passport and a Social Security card, which was used to positively identify the suspect as Carlos Yeimi Garcia Matos.

During a search for Garcia Matos, the police were notified of a 911 call from Garcia Matos himself. The call was placed near the location that Garcia Matos failed to stop at a stop sign. Police responded to the location and found Garcia Matos there.

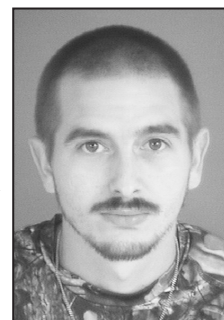
Garcia Matos was arrested and transported to the Clay County Jail where he currently remains held with a bond of \$90,013.

ORANGE PARK – An Orange Park man faces a charge of armed robbery with a firearm after an investigation by the Clay County Sheriff's Office.

Officers took out a warrant for Ge'Von Marcell Smith, 23, on Jan. 20, six days after the alleged holdup that occurred at 311 Blanding Blvd.

According to the arrest warrant, on Jan. 14, at 6:21 p.m., Smith approached a man who was sitting in his vehicle at an ATM machine at 311 Blanding Blvd near Orange Park. The victim asked Smith, "can I help you?" Smith then allegedly pulled a gun from his waistband and pointed it at the man's head and demanded money.

In an effort to defend himself, the victim attempted to disarm the subject. Police said the man was able to get out of his vehicle and restrain Smith by kicking him in the face and putting him in a chokehold. This chokehold eventually knocked Smith out. At this point, the victim returned to his vehicle to call 911 but while doing so, Smith regained consciousness and fled the scene to a nearby apartment complex.

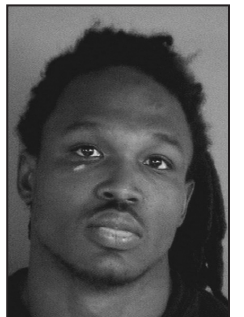
CCSO officers arrived at the scene and tracked Smith to the apartment homes located at 222 Blairmore Blvd. where police dogs eventually lost track of him.

First Coast Expressway South project area detour planned

OAKLEAF – The First Coast Expressway will close in both directions Saturday, January 28 from 9 p.m. through Sunday, January 29 at 6 a.m. as crews install a new overhead steel toll gantry structure. A detour is required for the contractor to safely lift and set these overhead electronic toll plaza pieces using large cranes.

Motorists traveling on the Expressway – also known as State Road 23 – during these hours will be detoured to Oakleaf Plantation Parkway on the west side of the expressway, allowing for continuous north-south travel in the area.

When completed in late 2017, the First Coast Expressway South project will become part of a 15-mile-long SunPass administered toll road that connects I-10/U.S.

90 in Duval County to Blanding Boulevard in Clay County. This First Coast Expressway South project involves the section of the Expressway from north of Argyle Forest Boulevard to Blanding Boulevard just north of Middleburg. Work on this six-mile-long project began in May 2014 at an estimated cost of \$85 million. FDOT hired Dragados USA to complete this project.

Once opened, Expressway commuters will pass through electronic overhead toll plazas – also known as gantries – without stopping. Electronic systems will either detect the vehicle's SunPass transponder device or scan the vehicle's license plate for a toll-by-plate invoice drivers will get in the mail without stopping on site.

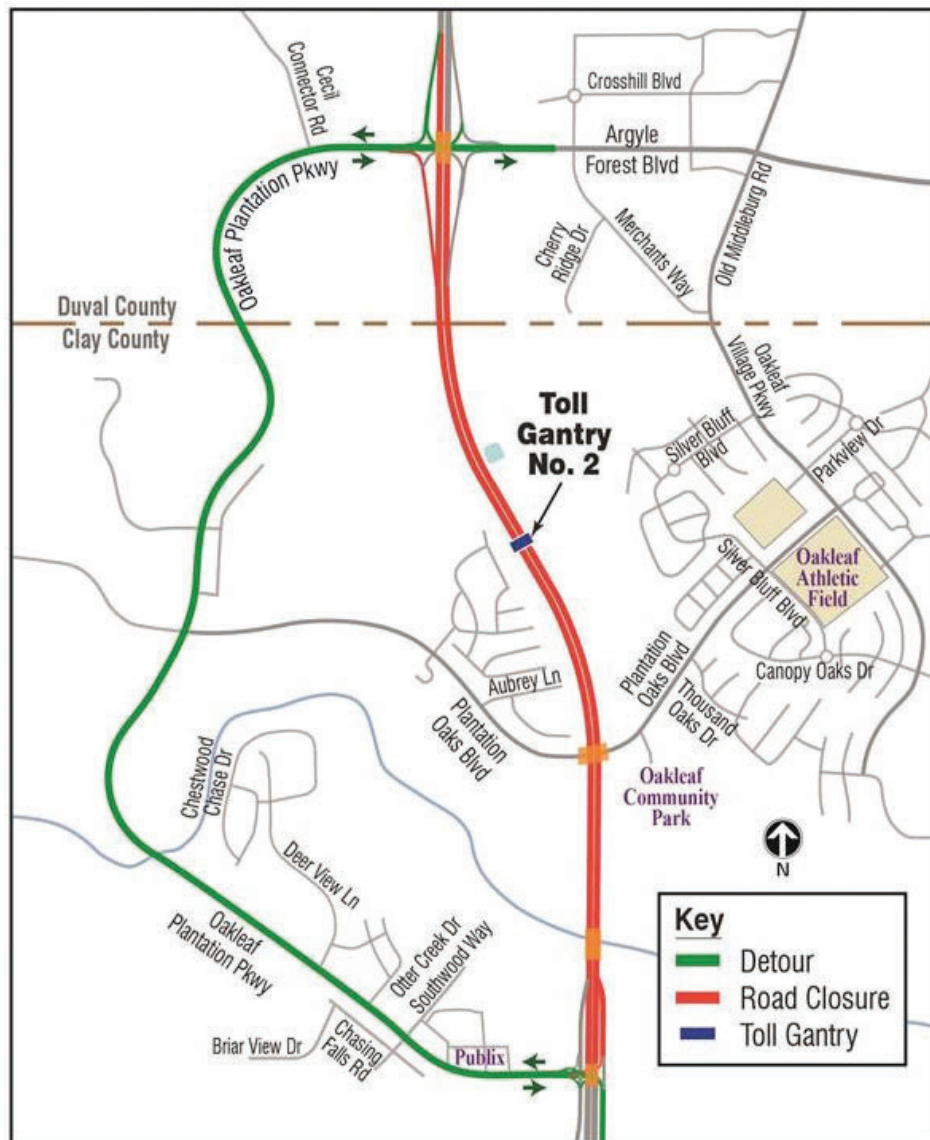

"If there's a process, then I guess we should know what that process is," he said.

According to Kopelousos, the agenda is usually put together on the Wednesday before the next Tuesday meeting (the commission typically meets on the second and fourth Tuesday of the month) and the chairman reviews it. It is then usually posted on Thursday so the public has a chance to see if there is an item of interest.

"The way we've operated is that if you (a commissioner) want to put something on there, we put it on the agenda," Kopelousos said.

Bolla, who previously served on the Clay County School Board, said during his years on that board, there was a two-week deadline to have something placed on the agenda.

But the county commissioners said they didn't see a need to change things that much, and that the system was basically working.

While no vote was taken, the commissioners agreed that, in the future, any items they wanted to see go on the agenda would be presented in a timely manner, and, following a suggestion from Hutchings, each commissioner would receive a draft of the agenda before its posting. That way, they could each ensure that if they had requested an item to be included on the agenda, it was indeed there.

After the meeting, Bolla said he was satisfied with the end result.

"We need to build a little more discipline into the process," he said. "We're sorting it out."

Roney twins lead Broncos to win over Eagles

District championship tournaments start January 30

MIDDLEBURG – Much as Middleburg High senior guard Hannah Roney loves her former coach Joey Williams, winning Thursday's game against Fleming Island, where, incidentally, Williams is head coach, was one item on her "bucket list" of things to do before she graduates as, arguably, Middleburg's best hoopster.

"I still love coach Joey a lot for what he had done for me in junior high," said Roney, who played under Williams while at Lakeside Junior High School. "We lost to them so much last time (61-40 at Clay Christmas Tournament) because we didn't really believe in ourselves at that time. Having him coaching on the other is fun, but we still had to beat him."

Beating Fleming Island on Thursday was not just what they did, but dominated in most of the game's strategies to the tune of a 64-30 blowout with both teams entering the game as top 10 in state rankings; 10th in Class 7A for Middleburg at 19-3, and ninth in Class 8A for Fleming Island at 19-2, according to the Florida Association of Basketball Coaches girls state rankings.

For the game, Roney and sophomore sister Mallory Roney, both were on fire

"We wanted to redeem ourselves after that first game," said Mallory Roney, a sophomore. "We were up by six at one point in that Christmas game, then we just gave up."

Although Fleming Island opened with

none other than a three pointer from Malory Sinsel, also a top gunner in the northeast Florida arenas, but from there, it was Middleburg's scrappiness and hustle that outdid the Golden Eagles.

"They came to play," said Williams, who was without forward Molly Ragle, who was on the bench nursing a minor knee injury. "I think they were taken aback by the Christmas game. I told my girls that none of them had a good game. No excuses, they outplayed us."

Ironically, Hannah Roney air-balled her first three-point attempt, but later sunk three three pointers.

Both teams volleyed the ball around with a strong case of "big game" nerves hitting both sides as the first quarter score was a low 11-8 for Middleburg, which was not indicative of the frenetic action and pace on the floor.

"Basically, that Christmas game, we played bad, and today, my girls were ready," said Middleburg coach Mike Hayward. "I told the girls in the locker that we need to do this for Hannah. She didn't want to go 0-4 in her high school career against Fleming Island."

After the initial stanza of action but no buckets, the Broncos put their foot on the gas pedal and turned up the volume to the tune of 9-0 run behind three steals from Mallory Roney that converted to scores and strong rebounding from Sienna Hardison and freshman Britany Range.

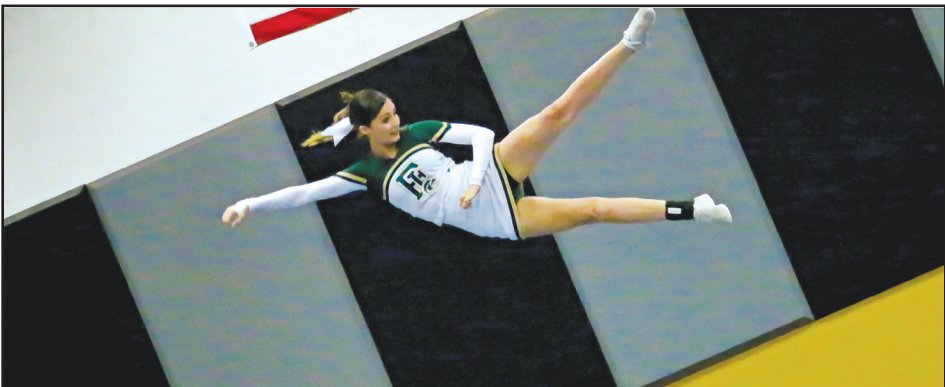

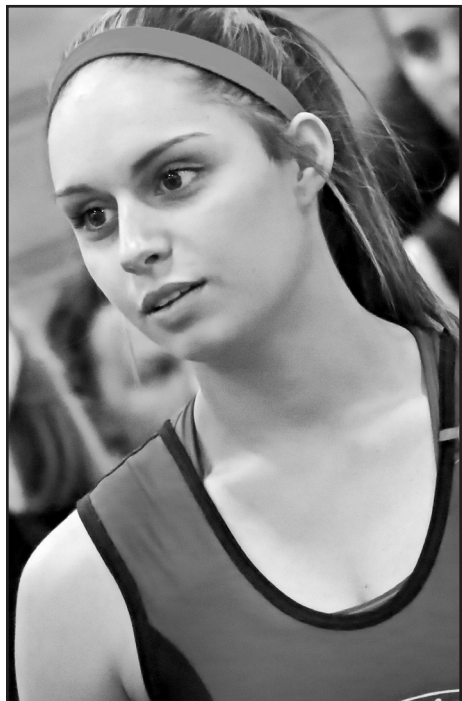

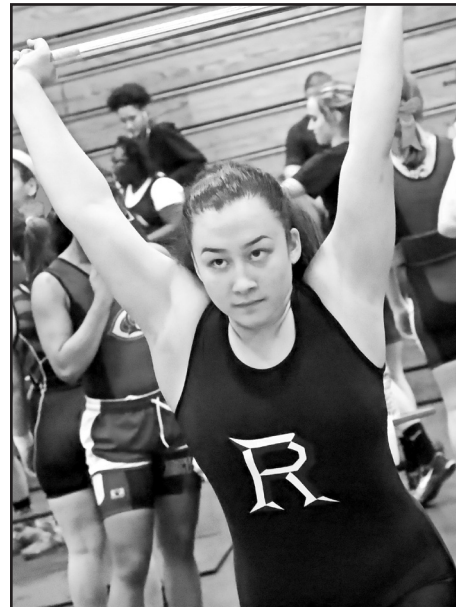

Two big wins for Clay

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Clay High's boys basketball team put itself in prime pouncing position in district 4-6A with a 43-41 district win over Ponte Vedra High on Tuesday.

The game itself did not give the Blue Devils any position change in the district lineup with a three win, four loss district slate, but the win, coupled with a huge win Friday night over county rival Fleming Island, a 69-66 barnburner at Fleming Island High no less, can be the turning point of a lackluster season that now looks to have a strong district to region finishing run.

"We took a bad loss a couple games ago to Palatka (a 66-25 blowout January 5)," said Clay coach Jared Moses, now 8-7, 3-4 in district play. "I went home and re-evaluated myself. I realized I was being way too hard on these guys. They're phenomenal kids and I had to go back and build them up and they responded."

Clay forward Ajay Belanger and guard Cameron McHenry both scored 11 points to lead the Blue Devil scoring. Against Fleming Island, Clay would get nine fourth quarter free throws off Golden Eagles sloppy play that proved to be the difference in the game. Clay only committed one foul in the fourth. Clay sunk six of those attempts which turned out to be the difference maker.

"We've gone back to shooting. I told my kids, I coach at the Y- these are third grade shots we're missing," said Moses. "I told them my third graders can make 30 points and we've been at 30 points a game for a long time. To put up 69, we've found a little bit of rhythm."

Clay point leaders against Fleming Island were Belanger with 15 total points including two 3-pointers, Jon Barnes with 12 points including three 3-pointers and Colin Wilson with 10 points. Clay is done for district play until the district tournament, but has key games with Fleming Island (Jan. 30) and Oakleaf (Feb. 1), both 8A schools to test their mettle.

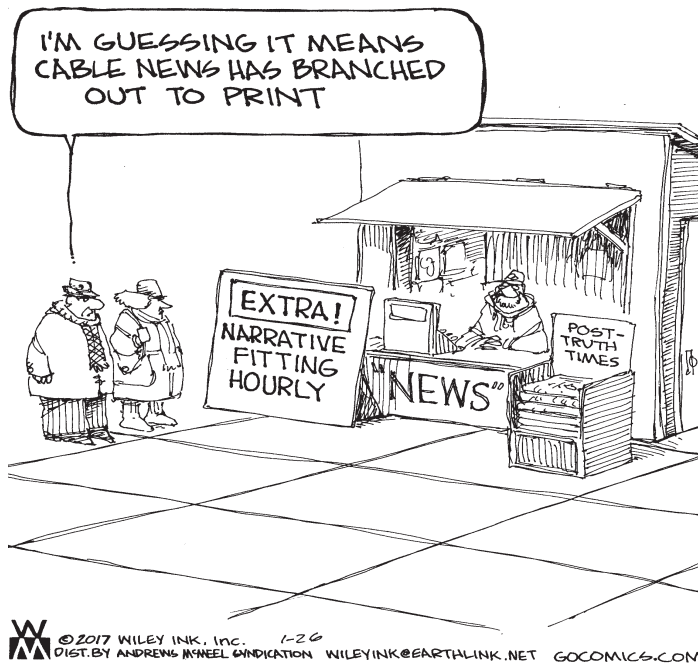

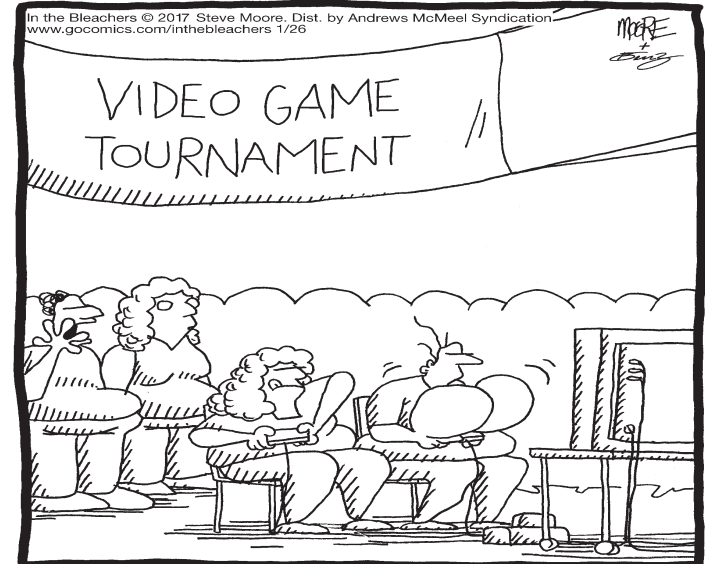

Rosano leads Knights' unbeaten grapplers

OAKLEAF — Oakleaf High wrestling coach Wes Champ has had to figure out the head coaching regimen pretty quickly as a first year coach for the Knights and with a handful of strong upperclass wrestlers, hopes to peak at the right time for the upcoming district and region tournaments set for February.

"Our new kids are coming along, but our core guys are pretty strong," said Champ, who got a six win, three loss effort at the Flagler Duals Invite on January 14. "Rosano is doing awesome at 13-0 with Ethan Gustillo building a strong shot at a district top four finish."

In last year's district 1-3A matchups, Rosano lost in the 106 final to Fleming Island's Albie Snedaker, who this year has suffered a season-ending injury, then finished as runnerup in region 1-3A to Freedom High's Marcus Jean-Baptiste.

At the 3A state championship meet, Rosano lost to Jean Baptiste in the consolation

quarterfinal 4-3.

"Ryan has improved a lot about his game this year with an eye on a strong state meet finish," said Champ. "He's going to be a solid contender."

Champ liked Gustillo as a region prospect with Vince Karl at 126, a region qualifier at 120 last year, Isaiah Graham at 160, Donovan Gray at 152, and Trenton Carroll at 145 all good candidates to get out of districts.

Karl lost to Fleming Island's Jacob Sandoval at districts in the semifinals, but battled back to get fourth and advance to regions where he won one match, but faced off and lost to Sandoval a second time in the consolation early rounds.

Gustillo got roughed up in the 126 districts, lost his first match, then lost to Trace Insalaco of Flagler Palm Coast, who is now at Fleming Island High School.

At 138, Carroll finished 0-2 at districts. "He's our most improved this year," said Champ. "He could make a stab at a region spot."
