St. Vincent's celebrates ER expansion

MIDDLEBURG — In the past, pop-up privacy screens surrounding patients waiting in the hallways at St. Vincent's emergency department was an uncommon, but real sight due to the shortage of emergency rooms. However, because of the medical center's forward inertia towards improved services, awaiting patients might stay where they belong — the past.

St. Vincent's Medical Center Clay County held a ribbon cutting ceremony Tuesday to celebrate the grand opening of the first wave of expansions scheduled for the hospital – their emergency room. The new wing sits south of the main hospital, and will raise the hospital's capacity from 110 patients to 150 patients a day.

"Patients have been very receptive," said Jeff Sapolsky, director of emergency services. "As crowded as we've been we've been trying to see them anyway we can. We offer them beds at our Jacksonville campuses, and they incessantly deny it, they love us here, they want to stay here in their county. So that's been really pretty humbling, that they would rather wait in the hall here than go to a room in Jacksonville."

The 5,500 square foot expansion brings the total size of the emergency department to 19,000 square feet. The expansion also adds 11 treatment rooms to the hospital, giving the medical center 29 emergency treatment rooms total.

The expansion also provides a space

Residents turn out on short notice

GREEN COVE SPRINGS—Armed with more than 200 petition signatures she'd collected in a 24-hour period, Lisa Hauber approached the podium at the Clay County Planning and Zoning Commission Tuesday night to ask officials to protect her neighborhood

Hauber and eight other residents from developments along Doctors Lake Drive urged officials to reject a proposal to rezone two connected parcels of land clearing the way for a developer to build a campground and recreational vehicle park at 3860 Doctors Lake Drive.

"You know this is a nice family-oriented community — we all look after each other and it's not uncommon for somebody to stop by my house that just lives on Doctors Lake Drive and say, 'You know I haven't seen your husband in a little while, you know, where's he at,' that's the kind of community we have. We don't want to change that," Hauber said.

Hauber and other residents raised concerns about such issues as increased traffic, transients, drainage, lighting, safety and increased noise levels if the proposal were approved. Ben Waldrop of Fruit Cove in St. Johns County wants to buy the property from the Duke family and invest \$400,000 to build the campground, which

Triple homicide ends in shooter's death

County gripped as story unfolded

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Four Clay County residents are dead after a violent attack that began Tuesday morning around 9:40 a.m. when Murray Leon Lancaster, 40, of Green Cove Springs abducted his estranged girlfriend at gunpoint from a hair salon and forced her to go with him.

From the Keeping it Classy Hair and Nail Salon at 805 Orange Ave., Lancaster drove Valorie Shea Short, 30, in his white truck to the entrance of Magnolia Point West off County Road 315 where they met her father, Welland Robert "Buddy" Short, 55, on Medinah Avenue. Police arrived moments later to find the bodies of both Val-

erie Short and her father, while Lancaster abandoned the white truck that now had blood splattered on the hood. From there, he drove to the Rosemary Hill Landfill where he shot his ex-wife, Erica Green Lancaster

From there, about 300 law enforcement officers worked together to find Lancaster, including Clay County Sheriff's Department, the Green Cove Springs Police Department, Florida Department of Law Enforcement, the Federal Bureau of Investigation and other law enforcement agencies. Clay County School officials placed all Green Cove Springs area schools on lock down, including Clay High, Charles E. Bennett Elementary, Bannerman Learning Center and Green Cove Springs Jr. High.

CCSO investigators believe Lancaster's

shooting spree, in which he later killed himself, is believed to be a reaction to an arrest surrounding an alleged domestic violence charge. CCSO arrested Lancaster on March 15 at 433 Melrose Ave. after getting into a drunken fight with Buddy Short and another man who tried to break up the fight

According to the police report, Lancaster shouted curse words and threatened officers with a balled fist while police

attempted to de-escalate the situation that ended in his arrest for two misdemeanor charges — one for dating simple battery and one for resisting an officer.

Police said the argument began when Valorie Short took Lancaster's keys away from him to prevent him from driving after a day of binge drinking. She told police that "when she wouldn't give the keys back, he grabbed her wrist and shoved her aggressively against the basketball hoop pole."

After the March fracas, a judge issued a no contact order as a condition of pretrial release on the battery charge. The order prohibited Lancaster from coming within 500 feet of Valorie Short, as well as prohibited any form of personal, electronic or second party contact with her. He was also ordered to not go within 500 feet of 431 Melrose Ave. except to collect his belongings with police supervision, according to the condition of pre-trial release document.

Tuesday's search ended after CCSO SWAT members and officers from CCSO and GCSPD located the suspect's truck on the Lancaster family property in the 1700 block of Idlewild Avenue/State Road 16 and conducted a search of all buildings on the grounds. Police found Lancaster inside a camper parked inside a barn with a self-inflicted gunshot wound. A handgun was recovered next to his body. He is the son of former Orange Park High teacher and former Board of County Commissioners member Larry Lancaster, as well as the nephew of former Clay County Sheriff Scott Lancaster.

"He was seen there going into a small mobile home on the property," Beseler said. "We had SWAT teams in place to collapse the perimeter at that location to try and determine if the suspect was still at the scene."

In the aftermath of the shooting, CCSO and GCSPD are working with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to try and capture a timeline of events that led to the shootings, according to CCSO Public Information Officer Mary Justino.

For example, police know that Lancaster went to Charles E. Bennett Elementary School on May 2 but they are not certain whether that happened before he abducted Valorie Short or after the first two shootings.

"We do think he went by the school. It's just a matter of confirming did he do that prior to committing the incident or sometime after," Justino said.

Justino said Lancaster was scheduled to appear in court on Tuesday for the March battery charge and was possibly unsure of the outcome.

"As far as the timing of things, there isn't really anything else that has occurred since that March arrest other than that court appearance was scheduled for yesterday," she said.

Police, however, do not have any information explaining Lancaster's motive in shooting his ex-wife, Erica Green Lancaster.

Spring Park pool renovation officially kicks off

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - Officials with the City of Green Cove Springs officially broke ground April 28 for the \$2.4 million Spring Park Pool renovation project, which includes adding a two-story pavilion and a splash park. Funding is coming from the city's One-Cent Infrastructure Sales Tax dollars, the Clay County Board of County Commissioners and the State of Florida. City staff will perform site and drainage work. Core Construction Inc. of Jacksonville is the contractor and Matthews Design Group is the designer.

The project, which is projected to be completed this winter, includes reconstructing the pool that is fed by historic Green Cove Springs. The work also includes constructing a two-story pavilion immediately north of the pool. The project will keep a historic look, with the pavilion featuring stone and stucco walls and a metal roof.

The pavilion will be located on land originally occupied by the old city hall. That building ceased to be used as city hall when the new city hall, also built with sales tax dollars, opened in 2004. The former city hall provided restrooms for the pool until it was demolished in 2015. The spring water is reputed to have healing powers. During the late 19th Century, many hotels operated around the springs, attracting wealthy visitors who arrived by steamboats that traveled the St. Johns River. As railroads facilitated tourist travel farther south, the hotels declined. However, Spring Park and the pool have remained a popular spot to visitors.

"We are delighted to keep enhancing the springs, this amazing natural feature that people have embraced throughout the history of the City and the State," Mayor Van Royal said. "This project also will foster economic growth in the City."

House bullies attack Florida **Supreme Court**

Steve Crisafulli, speaker of the Florida House, heaped disdain on the Florida Supreme Court's 5-2 decision to suspend

the state's 24-hour waiting period for an abortion.

"I can't sav I'm surprised," Crisafulli said in a statement. "In my opinion, this has been one of the most activist and overreaching state Supreme Courts in recent memory. I believe our govern-

ment works best when all sides respect the balance of power. It appears that several of our Justices seem to believe it is their job to invalidate any action of the Legislature, regardless of the law and constitution."

Of course that's pure bunk. It's part of the effort by a GOP that's increasingly out of touch on social issues to attack the authority of any court that Republicans haven't stacked. Their strategy is to undermine courts until they can rig them to overturn any progressive legislation that might be passed in the future.

At that point, if it ever arrives, they'll suddenly rediscover respect for the courts. It's not that they don't want judicial activism. It's that they want reactionary judicial activism.

The Legislature is sore because Florida courts stopped the lawmakers from ignoring the state constitution after voters amended the foundational document to curb gerrymandering.

That wasn't activism. It was the court doing its job. It was the court protecting the will of Florida's voters.

Crisafulli's claim the Justices want "to invalidate any action of the Legislature," is a ludicrous overstatement. And, in fact, the ruling he's railing against didn't nullify anything. It suspended the abortion waiting period while the high court decides whether to rule on its constitutionality.

Abortion is a complex and emotional issue. Respect for court rulings – whether you agree with them or not - is one reason this nation hasn't completely torn itself apart because of this issue and others. When Crisafulli attacks the court, he is the one who is not showing proper respect for the balance of power.

There's no reason to think Republicans in the Legislature might start reading the warning signs and moderate their positions on social issues. Speaker-Designate Richard Corcoran issued a statement that was, if anything, more defensive and ludicrous than the one Crisafulli released.

'Apparently, abortion activists, and their liberal allies on the Supreme Court," he said, "are no longer content just for abortion to be legal; their goal seems to

be to ensure that the maximum number of abortions are performed each year in Florida. How else would you explain opposition to a law that simply protects women from being pressured or bullied into making a life-altering decision?"

Really? Five justices on the state Supreme Court want to maximize the number of abortions in the state?

There is no one who wants to do that. However, there are quite a few people who want to stop lawmakers from interfering in medical decisions that should be left to a woman and her doctor.

Corcoran's contention that the waitingperiod law "simply protects women from being pressured or bullied into making a life-altering decision" is absurd.

The law isn't "simply" some kind of anti-bullying measure. The law itself is a bullying measure imposed by bullies like Crisafulli and Corcoran to harass women who have concluded that they want or need to have an abortion.

Their bullying law might be constitutional. Many other states have imposed waiting periods — though Florida's Constitution contains special privacy provisions that might change the outcome here.

But it is the Supreme Court and not the Legislature that will make that decision. America's tradition calls for respecting the decision even if you disagree with it. Of course, you also are free to disagree in strong terms. But when House speakers and speakers-to-be disagree in disrespectful terms, they are straying into territory that is dangerous to democracy.

Dentists team up to offer free annual clinic

FLEMING ISLAND – The suction tube squeaks as if someone is rubbing two balloons together inside Amina Kargbo's

"Ok, here comes the cracking. That's normal." said dentist Renata Folstein. D.D.S. with Island Walk Dental Care.

Folstein reaches towards a metal table and takes hold of a chisel that would look perfectly at home in a toolbox, then turns back to Kargbo's mouth. Two minutes of chiseling later, two extracted teeth take their place on the metal side table between a scalpel and drill.

Kargbo arrived at Island Walk Dental Care at 7 a.m. last Saturday, and wasn't seen until 11:30 that morning due to the large number of people seeking free tooth extractions for the dentist office's sixth annual Free Dentistry Day.

Waiting didn't bother her, she was just grateful that she could get the treatment done for free - as were the many others that filled the honey comb offices that morning to get much needed extractions on problem teeth.

'It's really a blessing that they're able to do this for free," Kargbo said. "It's still definitely worth it. Even with dental insurance, some procedures are still pricey."

Kargbo has had other extractions before, root canals too, so she expected a bit of pain during the operation and would have been without a local numbing agent that Folstein applied prior to the opera-

"We try to limit it just to extractions, because we feel it has the biggest impact," Folstein said. "Most of the people have really broken down, and have abscessed teeth. So I think taking that out is the most. With cleanings it's hard, because where do we stop? You can't ever clean them enough within the time period that you have."

By noon, Folstein had extracted nearly an entire set of teeth from multiple pa-

Island Walk Dental Care, normally just two physicians, had 12 physicians from various sister offices assisting with the patients that morning. With the addition of the team members from those sister offices, the count of volunteers came up to about 50 – all of them completely unpaid and volunteering their Saturday for the

multiple sister offices in the area, so it's like a big reunion. I have about 12 doctors. All of them are our colleagues, they come

over and they bring their team members, so it's just a big party.'

The event meant a chance for the physicians present to practice their surgical precision. Most are a lot of patients out here dentist offices outsource extractions to oral surgeons, but Folstein performs all of her extractions in the office along with her partner Renee Schulte, D.M.D.

'We also use this event to improve the surgical skills, because I mentor as well, I mentor younger doctors, so a lot of times we use an event like this to train," Folstein said. "It's a day where people get just bet-

Events like these help cover the under-

"We love it," Folstein said. "We have served residents of Clay County, who may be in pain and are not able to pay for an extraction, which can cost anywhere from \$150-\$300 depending on the state of the

Kargbo lives near Baymeadows in Jacksonville, but wants to become a patient because of the event. Aside from the pain, the only complaint she had after the surgery was that she wished she had eaten before she got the tooth pulled, because she'll now be confined

to "soup and mashed potatoes."

Folstein removes her purple gloves while Kargbo sits up. They both point and stare at the bloody bits of tooth on the metal operating tray. Still wearing sunglasses from the operation, Kargbo rubs her cheek.

"I feel like I just got punched in the face," Karbo said laughing. "In a good way."

Skateboard park rolls into changes

Improvements now set in stone

ORANGE PARK – After deliberating for less than five minutes, the Orange Park Town Council unanimously approved a contract Tuesday that would bring necessary improvements to the Orange Park Skate Park.

To the tune of \$395,000, Tampa-based Flores Construction Co. will spear-head the renovations to the park, which will include a completely redesigned concrete structure complete with quarter-pipes, banks and rails to emulate an authentic street scene.

Flores Construction Company subcontracted Team Pain, an Orlando-based company that specializes in custom skate parks in Florida to Colorado.

Although an end date for construction isn't concrete yet, the town's contract allows for nearly nine months of construction time – but David Flores, president of Flores Construction Co. is confident that the skate park will only take about six months to complete.

"They really go above and beyond all expectations, so the city is going to be very pleased," Flores said.

The bulk of the build out cost came from Clay County, however \$35,000 of the financial burden came from the Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program, a competitive state grant program for the improvement of public land or outdoor recreation.

Lynyrd Skynyrd lives on

JACKSONVILLE – With the recent closing of Freebird Live in Jacksonville Beach, fans of the 1970s Southern rock group Lynyrd Skynyrd are wondering how the band's musical journey can be remembered.

Although the original band has been gone for 40 years, the band's story can be told through a tour of the member's history in Jacksonville, starting with the formation of the band to the horrific plane crash that killed two of the notable members in the group. To this day they still remain popular among true fans.

"THE BEST BAND in the world. They were so good they created a complete new genre. Even Pink Floyd and Zeppelin didn't do that ... LONG LIVE SOUTHERN ROCK,"

said Al Haines on a comment that Concert Vault posted, mentioning the band.

Small wonder. Most lists ranking the top Southern rock bands of all time put Skynyrd at or near the top. The band also figures prominently in lists of the best rock bands.

Lynyrd Skynyrd was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame on March 13, 2006. So while Lynyrd Skynyrd may no longer be playing, it's not forgotten. One way to remember the band's roots and its journey may be to travel back in time in Jacksonville.

The first stop on the Jacksonville tour for fans would be Robert E. Lee High School in Riverside. It was here that the band decided to form in the summer of 1964 when a group of teenage friends and schoolmates came up with the idea of mak-



ing music together.

The original members of the group were 16-year-old Ronnie Van Zant, 13-year-old Bob Burns, 12-year-old Allen Collins, 12-year-old Gary Rossington and 15-year-old Larry Junstrom. All of the members were from Jacksonville except Junstrom who was from Pittsburgh, Penn. Just to clarify, Steve Gaines was not one of the original members in 1964.

The band's name, Lynyrd Skynyrd, wasn't the original moniker. The members tested a few different names before finally sticking with one.

The name Lynyrd Skynyrd was actually a mocking tribute to their physical education teacher, Leonard Skinner, who was strongly against the fact that the boys had long hair. He even went as far as suspending some because of their hair length.

The band also paid tribute to Skinner and his influence that brought the band together. On Lynyrd Skynyrd's third album "Nuttin' Fancy" the band used a photo of Skinner's realty sign for the inside of the album.

The second stop on the tour is Whitey's Fish Camp on Fleming Island.

Every hardcore fan knows that this was Ronnie's favorite spot to eat. One of the owners, Billy Ham, was very young during the time, but still remembers that catfish was a favorite among everyone at the time.

"It was the local hangout and back then there wasn't a lot places," Ham said. "His brothers Johnny and Donnie visit often with their families to grab a bite."

The next stop on the tour is Veterans Memorial Arena, formerly Jacksonville Memorial Coliseum, where Skinner introduced the band at a concert in 1974. When contacted, arena officials said while there were no signs to recall the band's original appearance, but that Skynyrd had returned to the arena to play consistently throughout the years.

After cementing its popularity in Jacksonville, the band began to make its name nationally during the years of the early 1970s. Over the years, Skynyrd would become the prime force in popularizing this Southern-tinged music.

It was in 1973 that the band released its first album, self-titled with the phonetic spelling of its name underneath because their band name caused a lot of confusion in terms of pronunciation.

Again, from the Internet:

"Every Lynyrd Skynyrd song Pandora picks for me has the pronunciation of Lynyrd Skynyrd underneath each song ... Pandora must not have a high expectation of their listeners ...," Brooke Bender posted on Facebook.

It was that album, featuring the iconic song "Free Bird," that helped the members develop their tear-jerking power-ballad sound. The song reached No. 19 on the Billboard Hot 100 chart. Fans would wave lighters around at concerts to the sound of their music

"Been to a lot of their concerts. And Free Bird is the last song they sing. Even though the concerts are awesome, it makes the whole night even better when they sing that song. Forever a fan," Tori Hudson said in a comment on a post on Facebook.

The following album "Second Helping" was released in 1974. It contained argu-

for EMS crews to decompress before they head back into circulation, as well as a new patient tracking board that offers a visual layout for new patients upon arrival.


"Our community has embraced us to the point that we recognized that we needed more space to be able to care for them appropriately," said Tina Caraway, manager of emergency services at St. Vincent's Clay.

The new wing's entrance is situated less than 100 feet away from St. Vincent's helicopter pad, and will assist in the quick admittance of patients in critical condition.

The project took just under a year to be completed, but renovations are still planned at St. Vincent's. The emergency department was just one leap forward towards the overall planned expansions, which collectively total \$33.1 million.

With the completion of the J. Wayne and Delores Barr Weaver Women and Infants Pavilion tentatively planned for late summer, patients can expect to see a new family birth center and more inpatient rooms to compliment the expansion of the emergency department.

"For the residents of Clay County who have been to our ER in the past and maybe experienced a longer wait than they wanted, this increased capacity allows us to treat them faster," said James Machado, president of St. Vincent's Clay.

At the cost of \$7.5 million dollars, the expansion not only offers quicker wait times for ER patients, but also gives the hospital room to hire 20 new full time employees. By the end of the expansions, the medical center will have hired 100 new employees to fill various different roles around the hospital.


"It expands our capacity," Machado

said. "This is what this is about, we've been seeing over 100 patients per day at this ER for a long time, and it sometimes stretches our ability to care for our community. It improves our ability to continue to serve this community, and to grow in the future as Clay County continues to grow."

When it opens later this year, the J. Wayne and Delores Barr Weaver Women

and Infants Pavilion – located inside the tower – will feature eight suites for labor, delivery, recovery and post-partum treatment, as well as two Cesarean section suites and four post-partum suites. There will also be childbirth education, sibling classes and safe sitter training to teach preteens and teenagers how to safely care for infants and other children.

A Registered Dietitian Nutritionist makes Healthy Choices at ALDI

Living in Springfield, Missouri in the late 90's, I was introduced to tornado sirens, wet snow, a city of 200,000 friendly people and a little supermarket called ALDI. As it was then, the store is still efficiently-designed, medium size, with super low prices and healthy choices, and has recently moved into Clay County along Blanding Boulevard, just north of Branan Field Road.

In my quest to share fit and healthy

choices with our residents, I met local Registered Dietitian Nutritionist Braddock Jenna who blogged on how to shop at ALDI. Jenna has been an RDN for than 10 more vears. Her FitLife journey began in high school when a coach took the

time to teach her how to eat healthy for optimal performance. Since then, she has been on a journey to make healthy easier. She is a mom of two boys, wife to a high school football coach, blogger and nutrition counselor. She's coined the hashtag #MHE or #makehealthyeasy. Note the slight difference to "healthy is easy."

Healthy Shopping and Savings

I keep a grocery list of healthy foods on my iPhone. This way, I'm not creating or re-creating new lists and getting distracted by unhealthy temptations. No matter where I shop, I have the right amount and right foods with me at all times. In other words, I have no excuses for making a bad choice.

Once you have your healthy list of staples, expect the following when shopping at ALDI, as shared by Jenna:

- 1. **Bring a Quarter**. Carts are interconnected, and to release one, you must rent it for a quarter. After the cart is checked back in, you get your quarter back. Jenna, who was invited by ALDI to visit their U.S. headquarters' education program said, "this saves you money because they don't need extra staff to man the parking lot and make sure grocery carts return to their store."
- 2. **Bring Your Own Bags.** "This is yet another small way that ALDI saves you money you use your own bags." Plus, it keeps things green and energy friendly.
- 3. **Pack Your Own Groceries.** After the cashier checks out your items, you will pack your own groceries. "We have all been unhappy with how someone else bagged our groceries in the past, so consider this a perk more than anything. And most importantly, remember this saves you money."
- 4. **Pricing and Paying**. Through efficient distribution and low operation costs, ALDI prices are kept quite reasonable. This includes the other streamlined processes mentioned in this article. Product prices are marked with signage hanging above the items. And to pay, you will need to bring cash or debit card.
- 5. **Shopping and Stocking.** "Now, let me just warn you that the first items you will cross in the store are the chips and snacks. This may give you the wrong impression of the store but it's for a reason. All the cold, frozen and fresh items

are in the far back of the store because it's closer to the stockroom and therefore takes less time to restock." Because there are no shelves, she points out that items are stacked in custom boxes so employees do not spending time stocking and fronting.

6. **Expect Brands and Off-Brands.** "Ninety percent of the products in ALDI are store brand. But this doesn't mean they are cheap. ALDI works with many of the big food producers that produce name brands to package their own line."

Jenna's Healthy Choices

In a follow-up blog, Jenna made a list of staples that she buys from ALDI. As a lifelong and real life nutritionist, she is naturally conscientious of her choices. Here are her quick picks:

General healthy items she notes are the variety of produce (fruits and vegetables), nuts and dried fruit, olive oil and vinegars, spices, canned goods, frozen fish, fresh meats (ground beef and chicken), deli meats and cheese, whole wheat breads, dairy and eggs, gluten-free products and even some organic options. Specific items include: Clancy's Tortilla Chips, 80 percent dark chocolate bars, Simply Nature Fruit & Nut Bar and Energy Bars, Simply Nature Kids Squeezable Fruit Blends, and Burman's Whole Grain Mustard.

"I tend to buy bananas, tomatoes,

whole pineapple, carrots, broccoli, peppers, apples, berries, citrus, zucchini and asparagus. My favorite and most exciting produce to buy is avocados. This is one of the foods I wasn't able to buy regularly because they are pricey for not a lot of food."

Healthy Eating Anywhere

My talk with Jenna concluded with the focus on what really matters — planning and prioritizing healthy options. She made it a point to say that the initial take of ALDI maybe less impressionable, but that might be true of any place you buy food. "Give ALDI a chance," she said. If you're truly committed to eating healthy, you will find it anywhere, but here at ALDI, you're going to get reasonably low costs.

More tips on pruning palms properly

As a follow up to our last column on the University of Florida recommendations for properly pruning palms, I wanted to discuss what to do with all the old basal portions of those cut fronds that some decide to take off to finish the annual pruning effort. While there is little research to support whether this is a good or bad thing, there is lots of anecdotal information on why it is not a good idea to systematically remove those palm "boots."

The word "boot" refers to the part of the palm frond that wraps around the palm trunk. When someone cuts off the frond itself, this is what is left still attached to the



trunk and held firmly in place. To remove it is not always an easy task and done improperly (using a chain saw) leads to injuries to the trunk that never heal.

I've seen nothing in print to suggest removal is necessary or desirable except for aesthetic purposes. It, of course, makes it easier to move a palm with them off and it is necessary to remove them if you are to brace that palm properly once transplanted. In other situations, the question to ask is "might they serve some useful purpose to the palm by leaving them on?"

The first possible purpose is to protect that trunk from

injury. Since the trunk of a palm does not cover over with cambium tissue when it is injured, as hardwood trees do (i.e. no real bark ever forms), leaving the boots in place would serve to protect that trunk from in-

This is what probably happens in nature where they stay on for some time after the frond itself breaks off.

During a severe drought a few years back, I observed that palms which had their boots stripped off, seemed to suffer from stem cracking. It was my thought at the time, that these boots might keep the trunk protected from excessive drying and heating during extended drought.

Finally, these boots catch organic matter, much like bromeliads in trees which allows them to make a protected habitat for things to exist there. They serve as a home for small animals (snails, tree frogs, lizards, etc.) and are an important feature

in any wildlife-friendly landscape. Some homeowners actually put soil in the sharp angled cup they form and then grow plants like ferns in them. I found this interesting and attractive.

Bottom line – why remove them? Stop the aesthetic thing! For every person that says they like the looks of a clean palm trunk there is a person who sees the value of leaving them on and feel the palm looks better that way. I think it is a "no brainer" - leave them be until they fall off them-

'Paradise' comes to the Thrasher-Horne

ORANGE PARK — This Saturday country music fans will enjoy 'Just Another Day in Paradise,' when award-winning country music songwriter Phil Vassar performs live at the Thrasher-Horne Center of the Arts.

Part of a world tour, his show encourages audience participation with the ability for anyone in the audience to tweet song requests during his show.

Cut from the same cloth as Billy Joel, Vassar's work as a songwriter landed him an award from the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers in 1999 for Country Songwriter of the Year. Like Joel, Vassar is traditionally a piano player, which is difficult to manage in a guitar town like Nashville, he said.

A year after receiving his first award, Vassar released his debut album 'Phil Vassar' that created five hit singles and was certified gold in the United States.

Ask any active grandmother in the South, and they'll say apple pies aren't just made of apples — and to that end, Vassar isn't only a singer songwriter. People are normally a bit more complex than that. When Vassar's name isn't being screamed over a loudspeaker to an electric crowd, he's home in Nashville with his two daughters Haley, 17, and Presley, 12.

"It's crazy trying to juggle your family life and your home life, but it's all I've ever done," Vassar said. "It's all they've ever known. They sing and dance and write songs too now, so it's like 'oh my gosh.' All these years of private school then you're going to be an artist? Like what are you thinking? But we'll see. They're very smart

and beautiful, I'm very lucky."

Vassar is divorced. He gets along well with his wife, however, and thanks God for that

"We just had prom this past weekend and let me tell you it's something else," Vassar said. "It's trying times for teenagers. They're looking at colleges and universities, it's become a busy busy time, but it's part of it. Guitar lessons, piano lessons, it's just so crazy."

Vassar's girls are used to their dad disappearing on tours, so it's not much of a shock to see him vanish for months. While it may not affect them much, Vassar still remembers how he changed when his first daughter was born.

"It changed my life," Vassar said. "Here I was in the middle of writing songs and when you have a kid like that, it really grinds you. You go from being all about yourself to all about this other human being. You hear people talk about it and I was just this dumb guy. It was really an epiphany, the realization of that I'm responsible

for this little life it's just amazing."

Feminine history within Vassar's family tree is as long reaching as it is ironic. Growing up without a dad, Vassar sat surrounded with just his mother, sisters and his sisters' daughters. Forty years later, Vassar is still face down in the 'estrogen pool of life' dealing with the same problems every father has to deal with – vetting boyfriends, dance recitals and watching his daughters outgrow dresses.

When asked if a shotgun helped with the boyfriend vetting process, Vassar just laughed.

Crammed into the tour van are Jeff Smith, the guitar player, Steve Cook, the bass player, and Jake Caldwell, the drummer. Adding Vassar on piano and vocals that makes a four-piece country powerhouse capable of raising an audience's fingertips to the skylights.

"I love these guys," Vassar said. "It's fun to play with these guys every night. It's like caged animals, we get released for a few hours, then we go back to the bus you know."

With the amount of ground that's changed under Vassar's feet, and with the amount of ground his feet have covered over the years, he still remembers his roots as a bartender in Nashville playing gigs whenever the time allowed.

"I'm really lucky," Vassar said. "We just keep making music and touring the world. We just got back from London, and we're going back in June to Munich and Milan and Manchester. It's a good time man, we're really very lucky."

Russell Dickerson appears with Vassar as a special guest in this one-night show that begins at 8 p.m. on May 7. Tickets range from \$13 to \$33.

A Nashville native, Dickerson said his favorite part of being a musician is simply playing shows and being on the road. He gained notoriety in 2012 when his first single "Green Light" remained on Sirius XM's "Hot 30 Live" for seven straight weeks as an indie artist. His second single, "Yours," jumped to No. 15 after only two weeks on the Highway Hot 45 chart where it debuted at No. 30.

OAKLEAF – Created by students, for students, the Oakleaf High School art walk kicked off its inaugural festival April 22 to show all the work students put into their craft this year.

occupants, a health and nutrition center.

Converting a smoothie bar into a comic book shop is as hard as it sounds, but the couple committed themselves to doing all of the work without outside contractors. Two months later, their doors are open and Dustin Brunell rests easy with the thought that the foundation has already been laid.

His vision – a shop that feels more like a museum – a store that sends out vibes of a different world to his customers is obvious in the galley style walls of the shop. One wall holds the autographed works of space western comic "Cremisi."

"Cremisi follows a spaceship captain called Shay as he goes through the universe tackling issues that would make a character turn to broken, fits of rage, alcoholism, depression," Fox said. "Even though our characters consist of an alien crew, the point of Cremisi is to address what we consider human, as individuals. What we see is humanity doesn't just apply to humans, we see human traits in dogs, their facial expressions, the wagging the tail. We assume it's expressing joy like we do, and I want to use an alien cast to present that, and show that there are things we do see as humans that we see as human."

Cremisi is drawn in a style Fox calls

artists, some local, some not. To the right is a faux brick wall with superhero logos and lighted display cases that hold models and action figures with little white price tags stamped into them.

A Gremlin sits clad in sunglasses in the center of the shop, a life sized Chucky doll from Brussels stalks at the top of the display case near the back, a rocket raccoon model in the corner, white boxes stuffed with comic books which Dustin Brunell believes, even though they're not hanging on the wall, are all hugely important.

Celebrating The Rogue Gallery's first month, Dustin Brunell can look back on the accomplishments already made. Namely, his involvement with Isaac Fox of Astral Ticket, the Jacksonville-based writer of the "BWC," where only the colors are black, white, and crimson with the crimson allowing blood to pop off the page.

"Part of the goal of Cremisi is to show what part of the pressure of severe anxiety or perhaps unpleasant memories of maybe [someone suffering] from PTSD or severe alcoholism go through," Fox paused for a moment before continuing. "While at the same time presenting an awesome story full of action, violence and a little bit of sexiness. Fun for the whole family."

Fox writes the comic and works with an artist from Spain and Poland to create the visuals of the story. Aside from Fox himself, the entire team of Astral Ticket is female.

Dustin Brunell has not only agreed to

stock the comic book, but assisted Fox in garnering the attention of other comic book shops as well.

Brunell and Fox share a quiet respect of each other cropped from extensive financing. Cremisi was funded 200 percent past its original funding goal of Kickstarter, a website created for small business owners to crowdfund products and ideas. Brunell, on the other hand, took \$30,000 off his house and received \$15,000 in financing from 121 Financial Credit Union to cover the cost of the \$16,000 buildout of shop.

"I was joking with Isaac the other day, I said 'if I could I would make you take your shoes off when you walked in," Brunell said. "I just love the culture. There's so much in here of so many places, and I want the vibe. I want people when they walk in here to feel that this is something. This is different."

To that end, Brunell is also working to expand community in Clay County, not only comic book culture, but manga culture, anime culture, and even cosplay culture.

He hosts a Gundam clinic that teaches those interested how to get their Gundam's looking up to shelf snuff. Cosplay clinics aren't an uncommon site at the shop either. The clinic teaches people how to sew and create the costumes that they've always wanted to create. Sewing, Dustin Brunell said, is one of those arcane arts that no one really knows how to do any-

more, and he's happy to host it.

Also on his plate is hosting a LARP group, which will brandish their swords and spears at his business sometime soon, as soon as he can get the group's 17-year-old host to understand the responsibilities of playing at a shop instead of a park.

The gallery will host its 2016 Free Comic Book Day on Saturday, May 7. The event plans to have cosplayers and normal citizens alike take advantage of the comic books they will be giving away.

The gallery gives all civil servants, including hospital workers, police officers and firefighters a 10 percent discount at the store. Brunell has a lot on his plate. Between his house on Fleming Island, his daughter, his life, his shop and his passions, he probably doesn't have much free time left. That doesn't mean, however, that he'll forget the reasons why he opened the shop in the first place.

"I feel like we're desensitized to art," Brunell said. "Those artists put their blood sweat and tears into their work and we need to give them credit. I believe Orange Park needs a hub for these things. We as a community need to come together and forget all the craziness and remember that we are a community, because I grew up here. We need to make it known that Orange Park is on the map. We need to make sure that this isn't just a stop between Jacksonville."

mentatively the band's most famous song, "Sweet Home Alabama." This song was a response to the Neil Young's songs "Southern Man" and "Alabama" which implied that people in the South were racist and stuck in the past. The band countered with this song, an anthem about Southern pride and all the good things in Alabama.

Now, head on to 220 Riverside Avenue near downtown. Although the Riverside Studios are no longer located here, this was where the building purchased by the band in 1976 as a practice hall and a studio once stood.

It was in this building that Skynyrd polished its hard-rocking Southern style. The song "Georgia Peaches" off the band's album "Street Survivors" was recorded here.

The band .38 Special, co-founded by Ronnie's brother Donnie Van Zant, used the building next door.

Brickyard Road is the next stop on the tour. It is located in Middleburg and is most notable because it was the road on which Ronnie Van Zant lived on at the time of the plane crash. His younger brother also wrote a song about it, based on his memories of that road.

"Street Survivors," released in 1977, became the band's fifth album and second platinum disc. It was completed by the band three days before the tragic plane crash in Mississippi that killed

The crash created controversy over the original cover sleeve of the album, which depicted a photograph of the band that presented Gaines, the guitarist who was showcased in this album and who had died in the fiery crash, engulfed in flames.

The second to last stop on the tour is Jacksonville Memorial Gardens Cemetery in Orange Park, where Ronnie Van Zant and the two Gaines family members who died in the crash were originally buried.

Jay Jacobs, sales counselor of the Gardens, said a few fans still visit the old graves to this day, decorating them with flowers and other accolades.

For decades people have visited the cemetery from all over the country to pay tribute

Jacobs said he remembers in particular, "mailman, either from New Jersey or New York, (who) would come visit their graves every year."

However, on June 29, 2000, both Ronnie Van Zant's and Steve Gaines' graves were vandalized. Van Zant's remains were relocated to Riverside Memorial Park Cemetery in Jacksonville.

And that's the last stop on this historical tour of Lynyrd Skynyrd.

The relocated grave where Ronnie is buried is surrounded by the graves of other Van Zant members. But the grave of the



band's founder stands out.

This is the new burial site of the lead member of Lynyrd Skynyrd that was discovered by accident in 2012. As seen there are fresh flowers and, strange enough, coins all over the tombstone.


Fans still visit the gravesite, so it is often covered with fresh colorful flowers. The two-part tombstone has a base depicting four birds, one on each corner.

On top is a plaque that reads "Ronald Wayne Van Zant 1948-1977." There's another bird on a granite flower pot near the grave.

On that day, a confederate flag, stuck right into the ground in front of the grave, waved in the slight breeze.

Here, surrounded by his free birds and a symbol of his love for all things Southern, Ronnie Van Zant lies. It's the final symbol of the Southern rock music legend that was Lynyrd Skynyrd.





Cohn was born in Metz, France in 1920. She was a devoutly religious Jewish woman living just across the German border in France when Hitler rose to power. As the Nazi occupation escalated, Cohn's sister was sent to Auschwitz while her family fled to the south of France.

Martha, though, chose to fight back and joined the intelligence service of the First French Army. Utilizing her perfect German accent and Aryan appearance, Cohn posed as a German nurse desperately trying to obtain word of a fictional fiancé. She traveled the countryside and approached troops sympathetic to her 'plight' thereby obtaining critical information for the Allied commanders.

When at age 80, Cohn was awarded France's highest military honor, the Medaille Miliataire, not even her children knew to what extent this modest woman faced death daily to defeat the Nazi Empire. At its heart, this remarkable story is the tale of an ordinary woman who, under extraordinary circumstances, became the hero her country needed her to be.

In 2002, Cohn penned her memoir "Behind Enemy Line: The True Story of a French Jewish Spy in Nazi Germany." She lives with her husband in Palos Verdes, Calif. and travels internationally sharing her remarkable story.

Maya specialist to discuss rituals in late classical period

"When my daughter was younger, she skated at a place in Mandarin called the Skateboard House, and when it closed she really wanted to continue, so we talked to different people and found out there was a park in Orange Park that was closed," said Anjie Palmer of the Orange Park Patrons, a nonprofit that operates the skate park. "We found it and sure enough it was a skate park, and so we worked with some other people and got it repaired to the point we could open it. Then we kinda stayed."

That was back in 2011. Since then Palmer and her volunteers have continued to supervise the skate park and transform it from just a skate park to a community hub by working with Eagle Scouts and 4-H Clubs to plant native flowers to attract hummingbirds and butterflies and even created a nature trail on the property.

The town hopes that the new concrete structure will curb the maintenance that the skate park has required in the past due

to the wooden structures aging. This renovation will also make the park an overall safer place for children to skate.

"The reason we're excited about the concrete is because they'll be a lot less repairs needed," Palmer said. "Right now the town has had to put a lot of time into repairs. Mainly it's just the maintenance issues, because it's wood in Florida."

For the 600 skaters that use the skate park a year, a concrete foundation could mean less scraped knees and Neosporin. The revisions also include a new LED lighting system to improve the safety of the park even more.

Flores is currently working with Team Pain on a separate skate park in Jackson-ville Beach. That site is scheduled to start in June.

The conceptual drawing provided for the project is subject to change, and allows local skaters' input to hammer out the finer details on the construction, however because of the specifications of the contract, skating pools will more than likely not be considered for the project.

Skaters in Orange Park should be as excited as Palmer is, because they can continue practicing new tricks and flashy flairs in a brand new concrete jungle.

"It's a fun place, the kids enjoy skating, but we try to make it more than that," Palmer said. "We make it community center, because it's a community effort. As


far as the atmosphere at the park we try to make it positive, and just be there for them. Some of them don't have anywhere

In other business, the Town Council voted to delay the meeting to repeal the commercial redevelopment overlay in place alongside U.S. Highway 17 and Kingsley Avenue to May 17. This gives the town attorney, Sam Garrison, enough time to amend the ordinance to include a grandfather clause for designs submitted before the amendment.

Also at the meeting Tuesday, the Council appointed Alvin Barker Jr. as the Orange Park Fire Chief, which will raise his

"Left untreated, invasive cogongrass can spread quickly, causing long-term problems," said State Forester Jim Karels. "In addition to reducing the productivity and value of forests and rangelands, it can greatly increase the risk and severity of wildfire."

The Cogongrass Treatment Cost-Share Program, which is supported through a grant from the USDA Forest Service, is offered for non-industrial private lands in all Florida counties. It provides reimbursement of 50 percent of the cost to treat cogongrass infestations with herbicide for two consecutive years.

business and appearance standards.

"We are looking at investing up to \$400,000 to upgrade the property, including adding Wi-Fi throughout the park and planning a privacy hedge blocking the residential view into the park. We will add an amenity center and pool to the back side of the office and turn the house into a bath house and laundry facility for the campers. These buildings are acres away from these property lines and would be where most of the campers would be concentrated at," Waldrop said.

The property at 3860 Doctors Lake Drive includes two parcels, one 12-acre lot that is currently a residential mobile home park with six occupied homes, while the second adjacent lot is four acres and includes a home, the mobile home park office and a barn. At full use, the current mobile home park has 57 sites for mobile home hook-ups complete with power and water and sewer service.

"We intend to use those same sites after the proper upgrades so there'll be very little change in that aspect. The property also has three buildings, which we'll continue to use — the office, there's a house on the property and there's also a barn on the property. All three buildings need repair and we intend to upgrade those three buildings," Waldrop said.

Like many projects that involve zoning changes and neighborhoods, rumors begin to circulate. One such rumor was that Waldrop planned to serve alcohol at the campground, as well as operate a convenience store-type retail outlet. However, Zoning Chief Chad Williams clarified at the May 2 meeting that saying "there is no alcohol permit that has been applied for."

Waldrop said he plans to become a member of the Good Sam Network of campgrounds and RV parks. According to the Good Sam website, the organizations reviews member parks and grades them on cleanliness, amenities and appearance much like an accreditation process.


"I want to be clear, especially to the residents here, that we have no plans to have any full-time RV'ers. We don't want the situation – it's not where people are going to move in and live there properly. This is as an RV park and will be s temporary status. We will also have appearance standards before we will allow anyone to stay in the park," Waldrop said.

County Planning and Zoning staff recommended the proposal be denied on grounds "that a commercial venture of this type is not compatible with the surrounding area," states a staff report. "This area has developed as a mix of varying residential densities. Locating a campground in this area of Clay County is not compatible with the surrounding permanent, long-term residential neighborhoods that have been established here."

Residents such as 20-year Admiral's Walk resident George Pate, pleaded with commissioners to deny the application. Pate said in the time he has lived here, it's

become obvious that Doctors Lake Drive is over utilized.

"As many of you are keenly aware, Doctors Lake Drive has now become Blanding East, if you will, so for us, it's incredibly difficult for us to get in and out of our neighborhood now. I can only imagine, especially now with the knowledge that the campsite is going to be temporary in nature for the campers only exacerbates the traffic," Pate said.

Planning Commission member Gayward Hendry urged residents in attendance to envision what will become of the property if it is not rezoned to allow the campground to be established. Hendry said the land will become something that will impact traffic.

"I'm not saying that your arguments were not well thought through, but you need to think what this is going to be if it's not going to be an RV park. Now, there are other concerns obviously, but the traffic, I think, overall, you'd be much more satisfied with an RV park than you would what is going to be absolutely without a doubt sometime in the future."

When the public hearing closed, Planning Commission member Scott Westervelt made the motion to accept the county staff's recommendation and deny the rezoning application, while member Marsha Dumler seconded his motion. The application was voted down 6-1, with newly-appointed member Richard Fain the lone no vote. Now the proposal heads to the Board of County Commissioners to debate at its May 24 meeting as the Planning and Zoning Commission is only an advisory board. The BCC could approve or deny the application despite the May 3 denial.



Camp Blanding: History buffs and hand grenades

CAMP BLANDING — "Welcome to Camp Blanding," a sign greeted at me as I approached what appeared to be an abandoned battlefield on the side of a paved country road. A well-kept patch of grass decorated with restored tanks, planes and military-style humvees could be seen from the road — badges of honor worn by the historic National Guard training camp on the edge of Clay and Bradford Counties near Starke.

A building directly next to the display of wartime vehicles houses an organized display of photographs, weapons, newspaper articles, uniforms, medals and other memorabilia, the bulk of which were collected and preserved from WWII.

That building, the Camp Blanding Museum, is a nonprofit organization that was opened by the Florida National Guard in 1991. The museum's goal is to share information about Camp Blanding and its paramount role in training soldiers — hundreds of thousands of them — for combat since

1939.

Camp Blanding itself is situated on 72,000 acres of lush green, along the shore of Kingsley Lake. To active and retired military personnel, the camp offers recreational opportunities such as camping, fishing and swimming. The museum, which is open every day from noon to 4, is free to enjoy. The wealth of knowledge found in the museum is priceless.

Photographic displays cluster just about every inch of the walls, with supplemental descriptions of each artifact's purpose. There are always informed and friendly volunteers on duty to open up a dialogue with, such as front-desk greeter and veteran Roger MacEwen.

"I retired from the Air Force," MacEwen said. "The military was really good to me. This is just one way I can give back. It's particularly interesting because many, many of the people we see here trained here [during WWII]. They're in their nineties now; they're truly the world's greatest generation."

One exhibit that piqued my curiosity was labeled "HALL OF HONOR." This

display denoted Blanding-trained soldiers who were awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor, the highest and most respected military award.

Forty-seven infantrymen were recognized and awarded after showing exceptional courage and problem-solving skills in times of combat, all of them having slept in Blanding's barracks at one point or another.

On the opposite side of the room, a faux Nazi soldier was placed between a display of various WWII weapons and an exhibit labeled "WOMEN AT WAR," which used the iconic Rosie the Riveter flyer as a centerpiece.

Today, much of Bradford County is economically tied to agriculture. But at one point, in the years leading up to and during WWII, the entire county was thriving in military-industrial-complex-fueled prosperity following the opening of Camp Blanding. At its peak, it had one of the highest populations and largest hospitals in Florida.

The camp was developed by Starrett Bros. and Eken, a contracting company that gained notoriety in the '30s for building the Empire State Building, the tallest building in the world at that time.

Creating well over 20,000 civilian jobs, the project cost was approximated at \$36

million [totalling over \$600 million in 2016] and was completed in 90 days. This type of economic growth in preparation for the war was pivotal in pulling America from the throes of the Great Depression, explained 20-year museum curator Greg Parsons.

"[The construction workers] were working three shifts a day, seven days a week," Parsons said. "Starrat Bros. and Eken were offering two or three times the current wage rate to get people here to work."

Camp Blanding, which covered around 30,000 acres at the time, was originally used as a National Guard training camp, but was federalized in 1940 and primarily used by the U.S. Army to train infantry-

It was a designated anti-Nazi prisoner of war camp for German soldiers, the majority of which were captured in North Africa. The number of German POWs kept at Camp Blanding during WWII was approximated at 1,200.

"History is so important for young people to know," two-year volunteer Ferne O'Quinn said. O'Quinn, a Jacksonville native, originally came to Camp Blanding to research and trace her genealogy; her father and uncle were WWII vets who trained there.

Canady was transported to Orange Park Medical Center where he was pronounced dead.







GREEN COVE SPRINGS – During a April 19 ceremony, Clay County Sheriff Rick Beseler honored a quick-thinking sergeant for stopping two murder suspects last year. In May 2015, multiple agencies from outside Clay County were engaged in a high-speed vehicle pursuit of murder

suspects headed towards Clay County. Sgt. Eric Twisdale was the first supervisor on scene, took charge, directed units to block routes and staged spots for the stop sticks. Twisdale assumed the second vehicle position and took command of radio traffic. The pursuit entered Green Cove Springs while the suspects drove recklessly with no regard for the lives of other motorists. The suspects were driving over medians and traveling in both the north and south bound lanes. Twisdale requested permission to ram the suspects' vehicle to force them from the road before civilians were injured or killed. When he did, the suspects' vehicle spun and came to a stop on the Governor's Creek Bridge. Without thought of his own safety, he approached the suspects' vehicle, followed by several other officers, and took the suspects safely into custody. In this stressful life or death situation, his calm demeanor and courage under pressure stopped two dangerous men before they could harm anyone else; a true demonstration of exceptional valor.







ORANGE PARK — Ridgeview High field event specialists Cra'Sean Carey and Mozart Louis-Charles both know that they will not be considered favorites for Friday's Class 2A track and field championships in Bradenton and that's okay for both.

"When the other guys start to warm up and they see me get into the ring and take my tosses, they look at me as no threat," said Louis-Charles who finished fourth in the region 1-2A shot put to advance. "I'm not the big, tall guy that can just throw the shot 50 feet, but I concentrate on technique and power."

For Louis-Charles, the probable smallest tree in a forest of six-feet-four or five inch, 270-310 pound shotputters, the size difference is a mental advantage rather than something to worry about.

"I'm faster across the circle and if I hit

Louis-Charles also competes in football and weighlifting at Ridgeview and thought the transition from season to season has pros and cons.

"I'm stronger and agile from football and weightlifting, but I lose technique by not throwing the shot all year," said Louis-Charles, who has entertained football scholarship talk, but would like to continue with track in college. "I'm getting small college interest for football, but I'm waiting for track. A good showing Friday will help that."

For Carey, the return to the state meet in Class 2A (12th in Class 3A last year in shot put with 33'-11" put) is a chance to

JACKSONVILLE – Terry Parker High baserunner Terry Mims crossed the plate on a throwing error to cap a two-out, five-run rally in the bottom of the seventh inning, lifting Terry Parker to a wild 10-9 Region 1-6A semifinal victory over visiting Ridgeview Tuesday night, ending the Panthers' most successful season ever in heartbreaking fashion.

Barfield later scored on a wild pitch.

Tosado and Oliveira scored again in the second inning, after Carlos Gonzalez reached on an error and scored on a wild throw by Braves right fielder Kyle Kauffman. Oliveira was Ridgeview's hitting star, going two for four with three runs scored.

"Oliveira is one of North Florida's best catchers," said Sgromolo. "He hits, and he blocks every low ball."

But the Panthers could not hold the lead forged by the offense and protected by starter Tyler Robison, who pitched effectively in limiting the Braves to three runs over five innings. Occasionally

TALLAHASSEE — Oakleaf High pitcher Chris Mauloni had a horrific first two innings as opening pitcher in the Knights' 5-2 district 2-8A championship loss to Atlantic Coast High School a week ago, but got a bit of redemption with a three run batting performance that included a fifth inning two-run home run as the Knights defeated Tallahassee Lincoln 9-1 in their region 1-8A quarterfinal match Tuesday in Tallahassee. Lincoln (17-7) won the district 1-8A championship 11-9 over Tallahassee Chiles (19-9). Atlantic Coast (15-7) beat Chiles 7-2 to advance.

Oakleaf (15-7), scheduled to return to play at Atlantic Coast High on Tues., May 3 in the region 1-8A semifinal, got three first inning runs against Lincoln with Justin Wager singling and moving to second on a Mauloni walk before Brady Shuey singled to load the bases with one out. Ty Andrews singled for one run with Shuey moving to second base with Ian Marlar singling to score Shuey before a strikeout ended the bombardment.

With senior Will Pillsbury on the mound for Oakleaf, Lincoln had no answer with two groundouts and a strikeout.

Lincoln scored their first run in the bottom of the second with Pillsbury walking two batters and a single loading the bases before a third walk scored the single run.

Mauloni singled to open the third inning and later scored off singles from Shuey and Andrews. Walks loaded the bases and scored one more run with Andrews scoring run six off a walk to Isiaih Byars with bases

In the fifth, Mauloni homered to put the game at 8-1 then, in the sixth, doubled with Pillsbury on base to score Pillsbury for the final 9-1 score. Mauloni struck out the final three Lincoln batters.

Raiders win flag football title

ORANGE PARK - The Orange Park High flag football team fell behind 13-0 on two first quarter scores to Westside High, but battled back behind three touchdowns from senior Gianni Ruemmelev to win 26-13 in their district 4-1A championship played Wed., April 27 at Orange Park High School.

The win puts the Lady Raider in a Friday region semifinal playoff game at Terry Parker High School at 7 p.m. Terry Parker is 13-0 and the district 3-1A champion with a 27-7 win over Paxon and 21-7 win over Raines in their championship tournament. Orange Park is 10-3.

"It says a lot about a team that comes back from 13 points down to win like we did," said Orange Park coach Matt Boyack. "Once we figured out their offense, we got great defense and shut them down."

Westside, who had beaten the Raiders in regular season play, opened up the contest with a 50 yard scoring scamper that was followed by an interception that turned into a 20 yard scoring sweep play.

Orange Park settled in and quarterback Harlee Sharp kept finding Ruemmeley open over the middle for lengthy gains.

In the second quarter, Ruemmeley outjumped a Westside defender for a short pass over the middle that turned into a 35 vard scoring play.

With 3:41 left in the half, Ruemmeley bobbled then caught her second touchdown pass and with eight minutes left in the third period. Ruemmeley took a swing pass for a 20 yard score to end the night's

On defense, safety Katie Berlin had one interception in the third period to thwart the Westside offense in the Raider end of the field. Angela Dimichele, Shakarri Mack and Maxine Knox all combined for the Raiders shutdown defensive effort.

Early errors bedevil Clay in regional

JACKSONVILLE – A three-hitter by Holden Alexander and a two-hit night from Ken Burke were not enough to overcome four errors and Terry Parker left-hander Tyler Naumann Wednesday night, as Clay's playoff run ended with a 3-2 loss to the host Braves in their Region 1-6A quarterfinal at Terry Parker High School Wed., April 27.

"Fielding has kind of been our Achilles heel all year long," said Clay second-year coach Josh Persinger. "When we make the routine plays, we're tough to beat.'

The errors, all in the first two innings, led to two unearned Braves runs and a 3-0 deficit that the Blue Devils spent the rest of the game trying to close. The second inning was particularly trying. Alexander struck out Parker designated hitter Joev Ragland, but the third strike got under the glove of Clay catcher Spencer Speer, allowing Ragland to reach first base. Next, the Braves' Kyle Kauffmann grounded to third, but Blue Devils second baseman Austin Burke could not handle the throw

from fellow sophomore Tyler Spence and the ball went into right field, where Ken Burke, Austin's cousin, scooped it up and tried to throw out Ragland at third base. No one was covering the base, and Burke's throw sailed into the Clay dugout, bringing Ragland home and sending Kauffmann to third. With the infield drawn in, Austin Burke could not handle a hot shot by Parker's Cameron Courtright, allowing Kauffman to score.

The Braves manufactured their other run in the first when leadoff man Terry Mims reached on an error by Clay shortstop Cole Escher, stole second and third, and crossed the plate on a sacrifice fly by Braves' third baseman Tyler Rourke.

The three runs without a hit were all the Braves could muster against Alexander. After needing 39 pitches to get through the first and second innings, the slender right hander threw only 16 pitches in breezing through the third and fourth innings. Alexander struck out four and walked only one in pitching a complete game.

"As a senior, he wanted it," said Persinger of Alexander. "He gave me the best game of his life.

Alexander also had a hand in both Clay runs as the Blue Devils fought back with single runs in the fourth and fifth innings to pull within one. In the fourth, Alexander reached base on a bad hop single past third, was sacrificed to second base by Speer, and scored on designated hitter Josh Lemen's liner to left center. The next inning, walks issued to Ken Burke and Gage Chancey and a Braves' error on a sharp grounder to shortstop by Escher loaded the bases in front of Alexander, who drove in Burke with a sacrifice fly to left.

Naumann walked Speer to reload the bases. Unfortunately for Clay, Naumann, who entered the game as one of North Florida's two 11-game winners and has yet to lose this year, induced Lemen to hit a high fly to center field, leaving all three runners stranded.

The Blue Devils left eight runners on base in the game, failing to take advantage

of four walks issued by Naumann. Clay outhit the Braves four to three, but could not move their baserunners around the bases.

"Especially coming down late, we just did not get the timely hits," said Persinger.

Chancev led off the seventh with a walk and stole second base with one out. But Tyler Rourke relieved Naumann and struck out Alexander and Speer looking to end the game. Ken Burke, a junior, had two of Clay's four hits and also made a perfect throw from right field to nail Parkers' Johnny Moon at home plate to end the sixth inning.

The Blue Devils end their season at 15-12, having made the playoffs in five straight years. Of the players in Clay's starting lineup Tuesday, only Alexander and Chancey are seniors.

"I was proud of them," said Persinger of his team. "We are young, and we will use this to build on.'

Parker, now 24-3, will take on Ridgeview on Tuesday, May 2, in the regional



Macpherson shifted from the "Oklahoma" drill to a 20 minutes offensive team set and a 20 minute defensive team set designed to put a lot of formations and plays on film for assessment

"Used to be that teams would run a play, then stand around discussing it for 20 minutes." said Macpherson. "If we really want to move an up-tempo game, we just keep throwing stuff at them, let them go with it as fast as we can, then make the corrections in the film room. Up-tempo is all about moving in and out of schemes quickly as we push the signlals from the sidelines. This is the first day so it'll take time." Behind center, returning senior quarterback Demarae Byrd seemed to take command of the Raiders offense and offer some pocket pass completions that gave to smiles from Macpherson.

changing his arm angle, the junior righthander struck out several Braves with sidearm deliveries.

"He is a bulldog," said Sgromolo when asked about Robison. "I did not want to take him out, but his pitch count was high."

Robison helped his own cause by driving in two runs and picking Arman Bernal off of first base in the fifth inning with two men on and two outs.

In the seventh, Hunter Morris, who had taken the mound in the sixth in relief of Robison, got two quick outs after walking Tyler Rourke to lead off the inning. But consecutive hits by the seventh, eighth and ninth batters in the Braves' order, the last a tworun double to deep right field by Cameron Cartwright, narrowed the Braves' deficit to 9-7 and brought the tying run to the plate in lead-off man Terry Mims.

Sgromolo brought in Brycen Jones to face Mims. One strike away from a berth in the regional final, Jones, who had had a spectacular night in right field with two assists and two running catches, walked Mims on a full count. The sophomore then uncorked a wild pitch to move Cartwright to third and Mims to second. With a 2-0 count, Sgromolo chose to intentionally walk Parker's Dylan Letellier, who entered the game batting .456, to load the bases. Unfortunately for the Panthers, the strategy backfired when Jones walked Julio Perez on four pitches, forcing Cartwright home with the tying run.

Sgromolo brought in senior reliever Cameron Cooper to try to preserve the tie, but on the lefty's second pitch, Oliveira aggressively tried to catch Mims straying off of third base. Panthers third baseman Austin Kittle had no chance at stabbing the

"This year has been special," said Sgromolo. "I am so proud of our players, and really also the parents, the administration and the community, the way they have supported us.
