Students lend a hand for Habitat for Humanity

MIDDLEBURG – As snowstorms and cold temperatures make their way through the Northeastern U.S., 13 college students are enjoying better weather here working on a home with Clay County Habitat for Humanity as part of the Collegiate Challenge alternative spring break initiative.

Through Collegiate Challenge, students from across the country are able to register their group with the program and pick the week when they will be on spring break. After the week is selected, students pick the affiliate they hope to be placed with from the Habitat for Humanity International website. This year Clay Habitat got two groups of students – 10 from Case Western Reserve University and three from Duke, which began as a five-person group but two weren't able to make the trip.

'Empower U' graduates ready for success

ORANGE PARK – Twelve women are a bit more money savvy today after completing a new financial literacy course offered by the Miller Street Renewal Program.

They were honored March 9 for completing the six-week 'Empower U' financial literacy course offered through a partnership with Fifth Third Bank and the Miller Street Neighborhood Renewal Program.

Since 2001, the Renewal Program has assisted low-income citizens through a combination of education, spiritual and financial help.

Among the graduates are current students, victims of credit fraud and mothers. Women comprised the inaugural class in honor of women's history month.

The men who made a living in the Γ turpentine industry in Clay County earned every penny. It was a nasty, back-breaking job. They wiped pine sap on their trousers as they moved from tree to tree and by the end of the day the pants could stand on their own in a corner.

From 1890 until the mid 1920's, when Florida accounted for 52 percent of the total American output of naval stores, there was hardly a man, woman or child living in Clay County who wasn't in some way touched by the turpentine business.

As an industry, its reputation through history has been one of corruption, abuse and the lowest type of human cruelty. The story is different in Clay County because here, the majority of the camps were small, run by local families, and subject to close scrutiny of neighbors.

The same can't be said for the large turpentine camps west of the Suwannee River

and south into the isolated Big Bend area of the state.

For the most part, in Clay County turpentine workers were treated pretty much like other poor blacks and whites in the rest of the county. Both paternalism and a condescending disregard for human dignity was the order of the day but it was not unusual for the owner of the land and his sons to work side by side with their employees and eat the same food they did from the commissary.

Collection of the rich pinesap went from mid-March to mid-November. Usually six days a week the crew was in the woods before the sun came up. The chipping crew used a hacker and in some cases sulfuric acid to renew the wound on the trees and keep the sap moving. This was in fact considered a highly skilled job. Done carelessly or too aggressively and the tree could die. Too little attention and produc-



tion would slow or cease.

tents into a dip bucket then reattaching the clay pot to the tree.

The buckets held about 50 pounds of sap

When full, the bucket was dumped into 55-gallon barrels pulled through the woods on a wagon. When those barrels were filled, the wagon returned to the still or to a loading area for transport to a still. Each tree's sap was collected about every week to week and a half depending on the age of the tree.

At dark, the day's work was done and crews collapsed into the backs of wagons or later into the backs of trucks to head home.

Several of the men who would become movers and shakers in Clay County began their careers doing this work. If they could do this day after day they didn't flinch at much else.

The students arrived over the weekend, and weren't met with the warm sunny temperatures they had expected. Healy said that last year he was constantly sweating in the 80-degree temperatures and scorching sunshine – this year he decided to pack for the conditions.

"This year I only brought shorts and long sleeve t-shirts," Healy said as he stood by a fire at the edge of the property. He wasn't too disappointed though, as he had heard from people back in Cleveland that they were looking at an expected 24 inches of snow this week.

The students will work through Friday on the Middleburg home, which is currently about six weeks into the build, and six weeks from completion, according to Edwards.

Through the weeklong work experience, students are providing much more than volunteer service. They meet the family who will move into the home, and they learn skills through their work that they can take with them wherever they go.

"I've learned a lot already and it's only been one-and-a-half days," said Helen Yu, a student from Duke. "It's very empowering as a girl to know I'm able to do this type of work."

This rings true with Case Western Project Manager Jon Healy, who is in Clay County for his second year in a row, after he spent last year's spring break in Green Cove Springs tearing down a house that was sitting on a lot where Habitat planned to build.

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Report: Delinguency down in Florida, despite a host of challenges

Despite a host of problems facing the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice, it has managed to lower youth arrests for nonviolent offenses through the increased use of civil citations, according to a 2017 report on the government agency by the Florida Juvenile Justice Association.

According to the FJJA report, acquired

FloridaPolitics. by com before its public release, 121,968 children were served by the DJJ in fiscal 2015-2016, vear with the majority of children being served in their own communities. The annual review of the department is part of an ongoing over-

haul of the system begun five years ago to reform what many experts called the worst system in the nation.

Juvenile arrests have dropped another seven percent during the same period, resulting in an overall six-year decline of 37 percent, the report said, citing the most recent delinquency report released by the DJJ itself.

Much of that decline was achieved through educating law enforcement agencies of the benefits in issuing civil citations in instances of first-time encounters with police for nonviolent offenses. This isn't a get out of jail freebie, said Catherine Craig-Myers, executive director of the FJJA.

"Florida's communities are seeing a more troubled child needing intensive services and multiple interventions, as well as 'crossover youth,'" Craig-Myers told FloridaPolitics.com March 13, referring to minors who have had contact with both child welfare programs and the juvenile justice system. "Florida still leads the nation in prosecuting children charged with nonviolent offenses as adults.'

She said children in the Sunshine State's DJJ residential treatment program have the most complex set of clinical behavioral needs. Keeping these particularly vulnerable youth from becoming criminalized is a paramount issue.

And without a significant investment to increase the number of qualified, highly trained staff on hand to shepherd these youth their problems, continued success could be problematic. The FJJA director said there's a need to work more closely with Florida's school districts in order to better ensure troubled children are identified early on.

Since 2009, two years before the state's DJJ reform plan went into action, there's been more than \$100 million cut from the agency's annual budget, negatively impacting the at-risk youth the agency is trying to

Musco's department made the news in 2006 when two white officers "Tasered" an obese, mentally ill, black woman in her wheelchair until she died.

An autopsy categorized 56-year-old Emily Delafield's death as a homicide and listed Taser shocks as a contributory cause of death. The main cause was an enlarged heart due to high blood pressure. The two officers used their Tasers for a total of more than two minutes. supposedly because Delafield had a hammer and a

Resident opposes Fleming Island street lights


Thanks for all you do for Clay, keeping us informed about what goes on in our community.

We were very concerned to read "Roadway lights coming to the island" in the Clay Today on March 2nd. The FDOT is planning to put up 158 light poles along Highway 17. Over \$1.5 million of taxpayer funds will be spent to fill a need that doesn't even exist; in fact, many of us believe that it will be to the detriment of the community.

We received state funding for the wetlands at Moccasin Slough. This was to keep the park/ preserve as a healthy habitat for the animals that live in the wetlands and provide a valuable undisturbed area for fauna and flora right here on Fleming Island. Bright lights would be disruptive to this habitat. (As well as to our night sky.)

These lights won't be just the initial tax outlay. There will be upkeep and electrical costs for years. That would be fine IF it was for a good reason, but it isn't.

These expenditures are under the guise of "safety," despite the fact that almost all of the accidents have been during the day. And the area with the most accidents and fatalities is at the County Road 220 intersection and further south, not where the lights are going in. In fact, having more free standing poles just 12 fet off the road

serve, the report stated.

Clearly, though, the agency is doing more with fewer resources.

According to the report, among the Florida counties showing the most improvement are Miami-Dade with a 12 percent decrease, Broward with an 8 percent decrease, Orange with a 7 percent decrease and Hillsborough with a 2 percent decrease.

But without sufficient annual support from the state's leadership, those numbers could begin to slip. Keeping children out off the so-called "school to pipeline path would be a challenge," Craig-Myers said.

When asked whether the current improvements could be sustained, she was blunt.

"Our report assumes that without continued reinvestment to expand prevention, to maintain quality staff and their retention, and to institute training focused on rehabilitation and treatment, rather than punishment and incarceration, the answer would be no," she said. "In my opinion the ongoing discourse about how we are doing – in terms of serving foster, or dependent, children –should serve as a 'cautionary tale' to inform our efforts to successfully serve pre-delinquent and delinquent children."

She said fully expanding the system would take time and should be viewed as a long-term goal. Reform needs to go beyond one governor and one administration, with a focus on "saving youth" now and "cost avoidance" to taxpayers later.

Statewide use of civil citations by law enforcement has been good, overall, but can improve. "When you arrest youth for these minor infractions – and we're talking about misdemeanor stuff here, we're not talking about grand theft auto and things like that – you're actually creating more re-offenders, which runs counter to the mission of law enforcement reducing crime."

A second annual report by the Tampabased Caruthers Institute, called "Stepping Up: Florida's Top Juvenile Civil Citation Efforts 2016," reveals research about counties that are simply arresting children rather than issuing civil citations. By its account, the institute has determined police actually create recidivism, or re-offenders, who generate more crime.

"There are some people who are committed to tough on crime than smart on crime," Dewey Caruthers told FloridaPolitics.com on Monday when asked about county sheriffs around the state who arrest rather than issue citations. "When you arrest youth for these minor infractions – and we're talking about misdemeanor stuff here, we're not talking about grand theft auto and things like that – you're actually creating more re-offenders, which runs counter to the mission of law enforcement reducing crime."

Caruthers said there are two segments of youth who get into trouble: the ones who have done something for the first time and get caught, who represent the overwhelming majority of overall teen or preteen offenders; and then there are the kids who have real issues – their home life may be bad, disorganized, they could be bullied at home or have substance abuse problems, Caruthers said.

Florida legislators passed a measure on March 8 in the Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Criminal Civil Justice eliminating police discretion in response calls involving first-time offending juveniles. SB 196, sponsored by Sen. Anitere Flores was passed unanimously, but was opposed by

both the Florida Sheriff's Association and the Florida Police Chief's Association. The bill is another part of reforms happening at various levels to stop the criminalization of minors before adulthood.

Statewide during 2015, juvenile civil citations were issued 50 percent of the time by law enforcement for those youth who were eligible. The Caruthers study noted stark differences in how civil citations were applied by law enforcers in rural versus urban settings, and in a range of socio-economic residential areas.

The FJJA report recommends increasing the use of civil citations by 75 percent statewide, estimating it would "improve life outcomes for nearly 7,000 arrested children as well as save \$62 million that could be applied more appropriately. It may be necessary to provide appropriate funding to ensure increased utilization and to address geographic disparity."

Thirteen counties across the state don't issue citations at all, including Polk, Bradford, Dixie, Calhoun and Holmes. Among the best counties utilizing the civil citation programs are Miami-Dade, Pinellas, Monroe, Leon and Broward.

Separately, keeping personnel on staff with DJJ has been a major problem. The average employee stays on for less than six months, according to the report.

"Five years into reform both DJJ and its partnering community providers are struggling to retain the professionals needed to ensure quality service delivery," the report said.

 career advancement. This low retention rate is a burden for partnering organizations of the DJJ and the agency itself, which has trouble in service continuity to the at-risk youth they are trying to help.

Former Florida DJJ Sec. Wansley Walters chimed in on the situation facing the state.

"The work to complete the reform is not yet finished and will require a second phase to reinvest resources, strengthen service delivery and ensure service gaps identified by the department are filled," she said in a statement. "These efforts will, in turn, slow down the pipeline that exists that feeds our children to the adult prison system."

Craig-Myers was just as direct in her assessment of the report.

"This report, looking at the success of the DJJ's reform effort five years later, will inform stakeholders, partners and decision makers on what may be necessary to ensure sustainability of reform," she said.

"Five years into reform, the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice is experiencing success. But there is more work left to be done. Our recommendations are made in the spirit of collaboration and optimism that reform of Florida's juvenile justice system will continue."



have had this opportunity, some that have wanted to go back to school but may have not have the means to do so," said Sonya Wells, with the Miller Street Renewal Program. "These are stepping stones, this is what these are, stepping stones. Now they can learn how to manage their money."

The program covers identity theft. credit building, homeownership, loans among other integral topics.

Program coordinators raise money throughout the year through church donations at St. Simon Church on Miller Street where the program leader preaches. Funds are also raised through various events honoring Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. The funds provide education and vocational training for their neighbors as well as provide various scholarships.

Recently, Pastor William Randall paid for two women's Certified Nursing Assistant courses. One graduate has a job. and Randall is confident the others will soon as well. Randall said the overall goal of every program is to gain meaningful employment.

"Yes, the jobs are available, but they're not educated to the level that they can get those jobs and elevate themselves to the level of middle class." Randall said.

The Empower U program, while free, remains an important ladder to economic success. During the program, students visit businesses where they are educated in tandem with the course material.

Randall said the need for programs such as Empower U will increase yearly.

"There's an increased need in every

area of low income people in the community of Clay County," he said. "Each year it continues to rise and there's always a need to lift them up."

He pointed to single mothers and citizens who are fresh out of jail or prison as common examples of those who don't always have the resources to rise above their situations.

So, Randall combats poverty at multiple angles. He also runs a program to pay for the down payment on cars for those who

don't have transportation, or other transportation to work. He said getting a job is just the first step, and it's important for the program to continue to support community members even after they ace the interview.

The largest business employment sectors in Clay County are retail, food service and healthcare. There is an inordinate number of low-income jobs that require little job experience on one end and a growing number of jobs that require high-skills on the other end of the spectrum.

There is a lack of a middle ground between the two, however. This leaves many on the low end of the economic spectrum stranded

endorsed by the Planning Commission or not) have ever been denied those zoning changes.

Developers are tearing down what little natural resources we have left that may attract tourists to our county and replacing them with communities that continue to put a heavy burden on our roads and schools.

What makes these problems so difficult to accept is the fact that we have an ordinance requiring impact fees. A moratorium was immediately placed on the collection of these fees and has been renewed year

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after year consistently by each successive board. There is nothing admirable in unbridled growth. Look at Oakleaf as one example. So many unnecessary homes are being crammed into that area that in the very near future the children in these homes will need to be bused elsewhere.

Now Mr. Garrison is pushing for higher taxes necessary to accommodate growth that I don't believe the vast majority of us want or need. On one hand, we are constrained from collecting impact fees (which, of course, are too low to really cover what needs to be done) and on the other we are told we absolutely must raise gas taxes, transportation impact fees (whatever they are) increases in the ad valorem taxes, and who knows what else?

What I believe we need is a moratorium on housing developments. It's not



hard to do. To date more population has not brought us desired business commerce with higher paying jobs. All we seem to get are convenience stores attached to gas stations. I have spoken with various commissioners and asked why they rubber stamp every housing development and still have not received a coherent argument for them

Recently the commissioners showed they had no hesitation in imposing a moratorium on medical marijuana dispensaries. Some of the pretend criteria they reference to back their move was "we need sufficient time to research, study, and analyze the potential impact and compatibility of such facilities upon adjacent land uses and surrounding areas."

My question is why aren't they ever doing that for these huge housing developments? Look at the horrendous traffic problems we are already enduring. And take a quick peek down the road. Our aquifer is extremely low. Do we really want to strain it? More people will lead to rationing water and much higher prices. How's that for Quality of Life?





Clay Electric trustees approve record \$8 million Capital Credits refund

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – Clay Electric Cooperative's board of trustees declared a record \$8 million Capital Credits refund for members who received service from 1988 through 2015.

Capital Credits reflect the cooperative's not-for-profit and member-owned status and represent each member's prorata share of any margins left over at the end of the year after all expenses are paid. Capital Credits are a unique benefit of being served by an electric cooperative. Investor-owned electric utilities send their margins (profits) to stockholders, and municipally-owned utilities return their profits to city coffers for use in road-paving or similar projects.

Before Clay Electric's nine-member board of trustees decided whether a refund could be made, it carefully considered a variety of data and economic conditions. Following this review, the board decided it was prudent to refund \$8 million to entitled members and former members. This year's refund will be the 43rd consecutive time that the cooperative has refunded Capital Credits.

Current members of the co-op who are entitled to a refund will receive a credit on their March bills. The number of Capital Credits bill credits scheduled for this year is approximately 132,600. The average amount of a bill credit this year is \$28.40.

For those entitled to a refund but who no longer receive service from Clay, a refund check will be mailed around the middle of the month. The co-op is scheduled to mail approximately 62,000 refund checks to this group. The minimum amount to be refunded by check is \$10. The average check amount this year is \$45.34.

Former members of the cooperative who receive a refund check should cash their check within 90 days. If the check

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Food fight OA helps fight compulsive eating

JACKSONVILLE – Overweight since childhood, Claire had always known she had a problem with food.

Claire – whose name has been changed to protect her anonymity – tried Weight Watchers and several diets. She had two lap band surgeries, and experienced periods of rapid weight loss and weight gain. Nothing worked.

It wasn't until she found a local chapter of Overeaters Anonymous until she learned she had a problem and that she wasn't alone. "My name is Claire and I'm a compulsive overeater."

"Hey Claire," said the other 16 members sitting in an intimate room tucked away at the western campus of Mandarin Presbyterian Church. The meeting functions as a sanctuary for compulsive overeaters, who converge at the church every Saturday morning.

The structure of OA mirrors Alcoholics Anonymous – attendees read from the "Big Book," AA's seminal text. Members get a few minutes to share their experience coping with the disease.

Claire told of a particular instance where she would cry and eat a whole bag

of chips on her couch. To cover her tracks, she would buy another bag and eat it down to where the first bag was to keep from bringing attention to herself.

"I couldn't do this anymore, I was like 'This sucks, this is nuts," Claire said. "I didn't know I had a life problem and I was eating to overcome that."

She started going to OA meetings and kept coming back thanks to the support of the group.

"I'm saving my life and so are all of you," Claire said.

On March 17, Overeaters Anonymous will host the Soar 8 Region Assembly and

HELP WANTED Solar farms offering high-wage jobs

MELROSE - Florida Power and Light has begun hiring workers to build two new solar farms in Hawthorne and Florahome, near Melrose.

Collectively, the solar farms have a 151-megawatt electricity capacity while the sun is shining – enough to power about 30,000 homes. The Hawthorne farm is on 1,315 acres, while the project in Florahome will use 587 acres. The average array takes up about 450 acres.

The two farms, announced in early March, are part of four new solar farm expansions the electric utility has planned for 2017.

The utility estimates

completion dates for the two solar farms by Dec. 31, and will hire about 250 workers at roughly \$16 an hour. The top end of the pay scale goes as high as \$21.47 per hour for more experienced workers.

"I don't think you'll ever see jobs like this pay that type of money ever again," said Randy Page, business representative with the North Florida Carpenter's Union, who is handling the hiring process. "We're trying to recruit as many local people as we can just to help the community out. Why not keep the money in the community?"

The utility currently operates 11 other solar farm installations, and, as it stands, they show no signs of slowing their solar program. FPL has announced





eight new solar plant construction projects across Florida. The utility hopes to complete all projects by early 2018.

Improvements to technology mean even solar farms built within the decade remain inferior - and more expensive - than current technology.

> "As the cost continues to decline we can now build these cost effectively, it's just gotten more cost effective for us to build these," said Stephen Heiman, an FPL spokesman. "We're now building plants three times this size for the same cost."

Prices for utility-scale solar panel installation projects fell 60 percent since 2007, according to a 2016 study by the Department of Energy's Electricity Markets and Policy Group. Falling renewable energy prices along with increased regulatory pressure is beginning to crack the coal industry.

FPL has approximately 850 customers in Clay County. And while these two solar farms represent an initial investment of about \$140 million each, Heiman said the utility is likely to earn that money back through low maintenance costs and reliable en-

ergy generation. "Our universal solar energy centers

are built cost-effectively, meaning there is no net cost to customers after savings from fuel and other generation-related expenses. In fact, these eight new plants are projected to save our customers millions of dollars of the life of the projects."

Heiman said the changes were part of a push to phase out coal power plants. The average life of a solar panel is about 30 vears

Much of the movement towards cleaner burning energy comes from U.S. Environmental Protection Agency regulations on the industry that President Barack Obama rolled out during his administration. The Clean Power Plan, specifically, mandates energy companies to reduce their carbon emissions by 32 percent by 2030.

Heiman said the addition of solar alone has allowed FPL to meet that goal.

Electricity generation represents 30 percent of greenhouse gas emissions in the United States, and 67 percent of that electricity comes from burning fossil fuels - mostly coal and natural gas. Although for the last eight years, 'Big Coal' has seen an enemy in the executive branch, newly elected President Donald Trump has planned massive rollbacks on energy regulations. Massive changes in the market overall, however, have made it uncertain

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Clay Electric selects Landis+Gyr for AMI deployment

ATLANTA – Clay Electric Cooperative is investing \$26 million to launch what's called advanced metering infrastructure.

Co-op officials said a financial analysis indicates the cost of this project will be offset over time through lowered operational costs, improved efficiencies and gains in productivity.

Clay Electric has chosen Atlanta-based Landis+Gyr to install the project using its Gridstream AMI solution, which provides an RF mesh IP network platform capable of connecting meters and intelligent devices across the utility's service territory.

"Our advanced metering project is focused on enhancing member services and improving operational efficiency," said Toby Moss, director of information and communication technology at Clay Electric Cooperative. "Included in that is the ability

to offer prepay and other billing options to customers, as well as improve outage response and system maintenance."

According to Wayne Mattox, manager of communications at Clay Electric, the co-op's board of trustees looked at all the facts and costs surrounding AMI and decided early last year that it was time for the co-op to make the move to the new technology.

Mattox said the co-op made the decision for a number of key reasons. AMI provides new payment options to its members, optimizes maintenance and replacement operations by being able to predict where and when new infrastructure assets would be needed, will help staff identify outages quicker and restore power quicker. Mattox said AMI also puts members in control by providing daily energy usage data which can help our members troubleshoot high bill problems as well as manage their daily usage of power and improve electric service reliability and power quality – fewer outages, blinks and surges.

Landis+Gyr's RF mesh network provides IPv6 capable endpoints and intelligent routers that offer flexible communication options for connecting with a variety of energy management equipment, such as load management devices, streetlight controllers, distribution automation devices and home area network equipment.

whether it will make a significant impact. Clay Electric Cooperative customers

who would like to use solar energy are, at least currently, comparatively out of luck. Clay Electric sources its electricity from Tampa-based Seminole Electric Cooperative.

In December, the wholesale energy distributor held a ribbon cutting ceremony for its own solar array, which, by itself, would only generate 2.2 megawatts on solar power

However, Seminole also has biomass and landfill gas generation in its energy portfolio, meaning Clay Customers who The AMI deployment is a lengthy process involving significant planning for the software, hardware, network design and implementation of the entire system.

"The vendor selection has been a meticulous process with a cross section of professionals from Clay Electric weighing in to ensure our service and support to our members is kept as a top priority. Additionally, we have performed thorough research on the technology. We also have consulted with several other utilities who already are running an AMI network, throughout the country, to gain a benefit from their experiences," Mattox said.

Clay Electric plans to begin deploying the network infrastructure and 173,000 new meters this summer, with a goal of completing the project in 2019.

"This project showcases the strength of our communications network for both rural and urban applications," said Tim Weidenbach, senior vice president of sales and customer operations for Landis+Gyr. "We look forward to working with Clay Electric to strengthen their customer service programs and overall grid reliability."

Mattox said the cooperative does not expect any additional costs to its members to install the new system nor are there any rate increases anticipated in association with this project.

want green energy and all of its benefits aren't at a complete loss. Seminole distributes energy to nine separate nonprofit utility companies.

With solar panel prices on the decline, there's also an opportunity for customers outside of FPL's service area to set up their own panels on their home and either live off-the-grid or sell the energy back to the cooperative.

On rainy days and nights, however, FPL must rely on its other staple energy sources – natural gas and nuclear.

"We're the largest generator of solar energy in Florida and I believe solar energy will play an increasing role in the future," Heiman said.

Now Maryanne goes to OA to discover a way of looking at herself without feeling bad about herself.


"I'm trying to separate the humanity from the character defects and find a way to deal with life and to deal with me."

For some OA members, the problem isn't food. Some members in OA confront family troubles, where they ate to comfort recent stress or past trauma.


Amy never mentioned food. She brought up the things causing her distress: a recent job change and her boyfriend's ex-wife resurfacing

"Under all my resentments is fear bitter and finding the faults in others, peoplepleasing and [being] addicted to people," Amy said.

Rosemary grew up around unhappy people and constantly tried to please them. She said she never knew what her purpose or mission in life was.

"I became a vessel for other people, Rosemary said. "It was tremendously uncomfortable, so I ate."

With kids and a marriage, she reached a place of desperation where she didn't want to overeat anymore.



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"You understand and accept in spite of all of these awful stories [I have] that I'm OK if I just be who I am."

Maria said she had to quit playing God, referring to step 3 of the program: "God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference. Thy will, not mine, be done."

For Maria, she needed to change everything. Her overeating stemmed from a desire to be perfect.

"There was this thought of how I should be - this perfection - this expectation in my head. There was a constant conflict and underlying agitation. The food soothed me."

Maria had to identify her trigger foods, and say "My name is not on them."

"You have to let it go. I couldn't get it because I couldn't let it go. I can feel the sadness and the grief," Marie looks up at the rest OA who are listening attentively to her story. "But I have you, so I don't have to be alone.'



Davis names "Champions of Change"

FLEMING ISLAND - Since he was sworn into office last November, Clay County School Superintendent Addison has been examining the school district to determine what is working, what needs improving and what are the best practices that can be shared to elevate the district back into Top 10 status in Florida.

One tool he used to collect feedback on those aspects is a nationally-recognized survey that district administrators, teachers and principals recently completed. At the March 2 Clay County School Board meeting, Davis presented highlights of the Insight Survey.

According to results of the survey, 10 schools in the district scored in the top 25 percent of schools across the nation. For achieving such a high ranking, Davis recognized those school's principals as "Champtons of Change" for the 2016-17 school year.

He said the first aspect of being a great principal surrounds the role of instruction-

Detour planned on First Coast Expressway extension

JACKSONVILLE – A detour taking place later this week will impact motorists traveling on Jacksonville's westside. The detour begins on the evening of March 17 and concludes

on the morning of March 18 as part of the First Coast Expressway Extension project, the northernmost segment of the toll road that, when complete, stretch three counties.

The detour involves westbound drivers on Interstate 10 who wish exit onto State Road 23 South, the First Coast Expressway. Instead of exiting I-10 West onto the normal exit ramp for SR 23 South, drivers will be directed to exit onto Chaffee Road. From Chaffee Road. drivers can then take Normandy Boulevard to SR 23 South. This detour will take place from 9 p.m. Friday to 5 a.m. Saturday.

Construction began in July 2015 on this \$45 million extension of the First Coast Expressway aimed at reducing congestion in the existing



interchanges of I-10 at Chaffee Road and at U.S. 301. Completion of the extension is scheduled for early 2018, weather permitting. FDOT hired J.B. Coxwell Contracting Inc., of Jacksonville to do the work. The project is part of the overall First Coast Expressway – a toll road being built to connect I-10 with Interstate 95 in St. Johns County. The FCE from U.S. 90/I-10 to New World Avenue will not be subject to toll collections. Up-to-date lane closure information is available at www.firstcoastexpressway.com. The Florida Department of Transportation urges motorists to always follow the speed limit and stay within the limits of orange cones and barrels while traveling through construction zones.

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Clay officials tackle Tallahassee

TALLAHASSEE –Government officials from each major community joined members of the Clay County Chamber and County Commission to advocate for local needs to state lawmakers and inform those from outside Clay County what the area has to offer.

Only two days into the 2017 legislative session, Clay County residents from various organizations and businesses met with legislators who filed into a conference room before the start of the day's voting at 1 that afternoon.

While meeting face-to-face with lawmakers Sen. Aaron Bean(R-Amelia Island) and Senate President Joe Negron(R-Palm City), Clay Day attendees expressed their interests regarding one issue likely to come up during this year's session: continuation of the First Coast Expressway.

"We don't have an interstate in Clay County," said Clay County Commissioner Diane Hutchings, "and we are on board with the toll concept."

Another subject on the minds of Clay County's leaders was the continuation of Enterprise Florida and Visit Florida, both of which were recently killed and cut, respectively, by legislators.

Both Senators were quick to respond

and explain their position on the issues, affirming that they would do their best to advocate in favor of Clay County residents and keep in mind the opinions of local chamber board members and city government officials.

After their orientation, the group moved outside to the Capitol's courtyard area between the new and old capitol buildings.

In the courtyard, a variety of booths displayed information about all the major communities in Clay County, in addition to booths from Clay Electric Co-Op, Vac-Con Inc. (who brought one of their vacuum trucks into the courtyard), the Military Museum of North Florida and a musical performance by the Orange Park High School Jazz Band.

There were also sausages and barbecue provided, feeding about 1,200 people in total who were lucky enough to wander through the Clay Day setup.

Clay County District 1 Commissioner Mike Cella stood at the steps of the old capitol building looking around at all the booths and people in the courtyard before speakers Rep. Travis Cummings(R-Orange Park) and Florida CFO Jeff Atwater took the podium.

"This has been a great day," Cella said, "There are a lot of people here to support

their communities."

While other counties have held events like this in the past, this was a first for Clay County. Before they had sent representatives from the chamber of commerce to advocate for their interests, but this year was a much bigger event. "In the past it's been a chamber-only event specifically to meet with legislators," said Bill Garrison, president of the Clay County Economic Development Corp. "This year we had all five constitutional officers there, and over 100 people from Clay County. Garrison said there is already a debriefing planned later this month to discuss what they could do to make next year's event bigger and better, but he considers this year's event to have been a major success.

"In general, it was a home run," Garrison said. "Miami-Dade and Palm Beach counties host events like this, but this was a first for us. I overheard somebody say that Clay County really knocked it out of the park."

al leadership, while another is being an operational expert. The survey also looked at How do we recruit and retain our teachers? How do we make sure they feel safe? How do we make sure they feel incentivized? How do we get them engaged into every facet of our school system?

"The Insight Survey allows us to look at strong cultures and that's really what we want to do. We want to figure out what's working and what's not and what we can do differently," Davis said.

Davis said the top schools in the district are not necessarily the ones perceived as

"We have schools that thrive regardless of challenges they face every day, regardless of the socio-economic makeup, regardless of the disabilities they serve, regardless of the makeup of their community. This is all about leadership and connectivity and being involved in our teachers and the thinking process to support that every single day," Davis said.

Davis and his cabinet are in the process of taking the survey results along with input he has received from the seven recently "Listen and Learn" events, as well as "Dialogues with Davis" – discussions and district administrator – and merging that information to develop a new strategic plan to improve the Clay County School District. One thing is certain, there is a lot of excellent teaching and learning already going on that simply needs to be shared among the district's schools.

"We've got to figure out what these top quartile schools are doing so well and take their best practices and strategies and implement them into our bottom quartile and we've got to stop working in isolation. We have to branch out and go to each other's schools and have conversations. We have model classroom teachers across this entire district. We should be highlighting them around [the district]."

The 2017 Champions of Change are Wilkinson Elementary Principal Heather Teto, Keystone Heights Elementary Principal Melanie Sanders, Shadowlawn Elementary Principal Nancy Crowder, Clay High Principal Cary Dicks, McRae Elementary Marcus Dooley, Coppergate Elementary Principal Amy Dyal, Bannerman Learning Center Principal Mike Elia, Green Cove Springs Junior High Principal Jen Halter, W.E. Cherry Elementary Principal Angie Whiddon and Robert M. Paterson Elementary Principal John O'Brian. In the survey, each of these 10 schools scored higher than the national average of 7.8 on the Insight Survey. Bannerman and Shadowlawn both scored a 9.6, McRae scored a 9.4, W.E. Cherry scored 9.3, Green Cove Springs Junior High scored 9.1, Paterson scored 9, Coppergate and Clay High both scored 8.7, and Wilkinson Elementary and Keystone Heights Elementary both scored 8.6.

Solo crash kills Middleburg woman

Following the arrest, Noakes was transported from the Duval County Jail to the Clay County Jail where he was being held on a \$15,000 bond. Noakes has since been released.





Several electronic devices were seized and approximately 619 still images and 11 videos depicting a minor victim engaging in sexually explicit conduct, in many instances with Walters, were recovered.

This case was investigated by the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's Homeland Security Investigations and the Clay County Sheriff's Office. Prior to this arrest, Walters was already a registered Florida Sex Offender.

Leddy taking college show on the road

Fleming Island grad at North Dakota State University



DELAND – Fleming Island High graduate K.K. Leddy has been on the road since February 10 with her North Dakota State University softball team avoiding the harsh North Dakota winters in places such as California, Arizona, South Carolina, Louisiana and this past weekend, nearby Deland.

"I love my team," said Leddy, after the Bisons lost a thriller 7-6 game to Columbia University on Sat., March 11 with a handful of home runs on both sides. "It's definitely been a good fit."

As one of a small handful of returners on the Bison softball team that played in last year's NCAA Division I regional playoffs in Seattle and finished with a 39-15 won/loss record including a 17-0 slate in Summit League conference play, Leddy, a

"No one on the field was a starter last year," said Leddy. "It's definitely challenging just trying to be the leader on the team.

North Dakota coach Darren Mueller has just one senior on his roster, redshirt catcher Alyssa Reina, with a lineup of underclassmen to take the reigns of one of the best seasons in his 23 year history. Reina is currently ailing with a thumb injury which leaves Leddy as the lone returner.

"She (Alyssa) is injured now with a thumb injury," said Leddy. "She was a starter last year. All we can do is do our job on the field."

For Mueller, the challenge is keeping his ace pitcher on the mound.

"One thing is that K.K. has not been able to pitch in our fall schedule," said Mueller. "We had to hold her out until January because of arm issues. Fall is when we work on her pitches and some adjustments. Her upside is still coming if we can keep her healthy."

Mueller cited that Leddy's game attitude on the mound has made her the leader of the Bisons thus far.

"She's got that power pitcher mentality," said Mueller. "We had to take one of her pitches away to avoid further injury. College softball is a little bit of both power and finesse."

Mueller noted that area coach Jennifer Ritter in Clay County, a friend, gave him the heads up on a pitcher and they made the effort to offer Leddy the scholarship.

"Jenny did North Dakota games for ESPN in the regionals and just stayed in touch," said Mueller. "She told us about K.K."

In Deland, at the Stetson University

Westin Invitational, Leddy and her Bisons won four games; two over Manhattan College, one over Stetson and one over Colgate with a homer-fest 7-6 loss to Columbia University on Saturday. Leddy gave up one homer in the second inning off a fastball with a three balls, two strike count before being replaced in the third inning with the score 4-2.

"We've been on the road for five weeks," said Mueller. "It's up to the young players to quickly learn to play together. We graduated five seniors from last year."

Mueller said Leddy, who was the Summit League tournament most valuable player last year, used her intensity to gain confidence from his seniors. Leddy was also an Summit League All-Tournament selection last year as well as earning a Summit League pitcher of the week award. Leddy was a second team All-Summit League selection too.

"They fed off her intensty," said Mueller. "She came in and shut the door on the opposing team in relief. She has a big personality when she is out there."

From Deland, Leddy, who pitched and won the Bisons first game in Deland (vs. Manhattan) with seven strikeouts in the 3-2 win on March 10, will travel to Gainesville to take on the twice-national champion Gators of the University of Florida, second ranked in NCAA Division I, then go south to Clearwater for a major tournament against the likes of third-ranked Auburn, 22nd-ranked South Florida, 40thranked Ohio State, 11th-ranked Missouri and 116th-ranked Rutgers.

From Clearwater, the schedule goes to Atlanta for a three-game series against Georgia Tech then a three-game stint at Fort Wayne, IN before heading home to Fargo where temperatures hovered around 16 degrees on Sunday.

"The weather is a big difference between here and North Dakota obviously, but the biggest difference is the level of intensity at the college level," said Leddy, who noted that the Bisons home games start in April. "I don't care how big a travel ball team you played for in high school, there is no comparison with the intensity level."

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
