## **Board tackles issues from Van Zant era**

FLEMING ISLAND – Old issues from the previous school superintendent's administration continue to linger with the Clay County School District.

At the school board's June 29 meeting, the board wrestled with whether or not to

pay legal bills for former school superintendent Charlie Van Zant Jr. and whether to re-hire the lobbyist that was contracted with under Van Zant's tenure as well.

Board member Ashley Gilhousen asked that the agenda include an item to discuss whether to re-hire lobbying group Southern Strategy Group, which the district had paid \$5,000 a month to represent it in Tallahassee. Gilhousen then made a motion, which was seconded by board member Betsy Condon, in order to begin debate on the issue.

Gilhousen cited a one-time \$1 million appropriation in fiscal year 2016 that she credits Southern Strategy Group with procuring for the district as the main reason the contract should be renewed.

"I think it's important that we have a steady presence in Tallahassee during the

## Churches work together to feed the hungry

MIDDLEBURG – A collaboration of five churches are doing their part to make sure those in need do not go hungry each weekend.

Any hungry person can visit the Weigel Senior Center on Saturday for a free hot meal, thanks to the churches that take turns managing operations for the Kitchen of Clay County, an all-volunteer organization that coordinates the meals.

The meals are offered every Saturday across the county at senior centers in Middleburg, Orange Park, Green Cove Springs and Keystone Heights. All centers combined serve more than 10,000 lunches per year, according to Jeff Provou, the president of the board of the Kitchen of Clay County.

The Kitchen of Clay County, formerly the Soup Kitchen of Clay County, is run entirely by volunteers. Many churches and

## Not all Clay County 4th of July memories are sweet

century, the Fourth of July was a big deal in Clay County. Times were simple then and, for most of the children, the biggest deal of the day was sucking a sugar soaked lemon that had been marinating in sugar at the bottom of one of the huge lemonade barrels.

The date falls in the middle of the hot Florida summer and represented a welcome respite from heat and blood-sucking

By today's standards, the celebrations were not spectacular at all. But for the people of the time, it was an event to look forward to through the monotonous first half of the summer and remembered through the dog days of July and August.

Events of varying size were planned in all parts of the county to recognize the founding of the nation. In small inland settlements, the day was mostly sharing news, food and conversation.

Green Cove Springs, as the county seat and the most populated area, gathered the largest crowds and organized the biggest show. As the date approached, merchants and townspeople unpacked the holiday paraphernalia of assorted ribbons and bunting and American flags and gradually the town took on the theme of red, white

Churches and social clubs planned their displays, mostly game booths for children, with prizes for all and special foods

In the decades beginning the twentieth for judging and sale. Wood stoves in kitchens all over town stayed fired up for days in preparations despite the heat.

> In Orange Park, first on the day's agenda was preparing for the children's parade. Clusters of mostly little girls gathered on quilts to make red, white and blue paper chains. All kids were well trained in the manufacture and assembly of paper chains because they made miles of it at school in preparation for Christmas.

> Boys' activities focused on teasing and tormenting the girls until it came time to catch the Mierfeldts' goat and attach his cart. The goat never cooperated and had a true aversion to being swathed in paper chains because he crunched every step he

> Families shared a picnic lunch under the trees then the older children scattered and the men migrated toward the bandstand and parking area to lean against something, confer about politics and make deals. The women settled toddlers and babes on quilts to nap and commenced to revel in the real purpose of the day - simple conversation.

> The desserts entered in the baking competitions were auctioned off and shared

> But as peaceful and innocent as this scene may seem, there was as always a tension in the air. In this time at the turn of the century law enforcement was a fragile thing. Men were accustomed to looking out

That all changed in Orange Park in 1911 when, after a similar celebration, one man was gut shot and died. One man went on trial for murder. Citizens were divided over where justice lay and, for almost a year, the county was locked in the turmoil of a barrel – memories are bitter and sweet.

An April count by the Clay County School District's homeless case management program Project R.E.A.C.H. - Requisite Education and Academics for Clay's



## Medical marijuana zoning set for special meeting

ORANGE PARK - County and municipal governments have remained in a similar zoning holding pattern since the passage of Amendment 2 in early November due to uncertainties surrounding the implementation of medical marijuana.

With the passage of an implementation bill this past Florida Legislative session it is now up to local governments to decide whether they want to allow dispensaries to set up shop in their communities.

Orange Park's Planning and Zoning Board will take up the issue in a special meeting July 13. The meeting is open to the public to share their com-

"I think a lot of communities have been waiting for the state legislation to pass on this issue, so that they can have a better understanding of the parameters of medical marijuana dispensing facilities," said Stephen Smith, director of economic and community development for the Town of Orange Park. "I suspect that these sorts of discussions and processes are happening throughout the state right now."

The planning and zoning board will make a recommendation to the Town Council for discussion and an ultimate decision as to whether or not the town will allow dispensaries in the town limits.

Amendment 2 passed in Clay County with more than 70 percent approval. The bill that eventually landed on the governor's desk provided a concrete list of qualifying conditions, market restrictions and use restrictions that included a ban on smokable

Under Florida law, local governments have two

options in their zoning – allow dispensaries, or ban them. From there, governments must zone dispensaries as they would zone any other pharmacy with the only exception being dispensaries cannot be within 500 feet of a school.

If the Town of Orange Park were to allow a dispensary within the town limits, then the town would both have facilities that can recommend the medicine and facilities that can dispense the medicine.

Many patients who would benefit from medical marijuana find themselves either transportationchallenged or with conditions that make it difficult to leave their homes.


Many municipal governments, including the Town of Orange Park, imposed temporary moratoriums on medical marijuana dispensaries in October. Cities and towns all across the state could soon lift those moratoriums as zoning boards parse through what zoning districts that could feasibly house dispensa-

"Every city and county in the state is going through the process of how to apply the terms of the law to their unique circumstances, and that's where we are right now," said Sam Garrison, town attorney.

The decision to force municipalities to zone dispensaries as they would pharmacies within the language of the medical marijuana implementation bill has not set well with some in local government.

"I don't want it in our community," said Green Cove Springs Council Member Pamela Lewis at the June 20 council meeting.

The Green Cove Springs City Council will bring up the issue at its July 25 council meeting.

## Florida wildlife crossings work; safety for animals, people

It's always heartbreaking when I hear that yet another Florida black bear or Florida panther has gotten killed on a Florida

road. So far this year. vehicle collisions killed an average of two endangered Florida panthers a month. And for bears, the toll is worse: About 20 black bears die every month on roadways as they travel the state looking for

food and mates. And we all see many other dead creatures — deer, squirrels, opossums, bobcats, birds, reptiles and more — along our roadsides. This hurts people too: An estimated 200 people are killed and 29,000 injured yearly in the U.S. when their cars collide with animals.

The good news is that we can prevent this, and we have proven technology to do it. Building safe crossings for wildlife can reduce the carnage to nearly zero. Wildlife crossings take a number of different forms – expanded culverts, special ledges built along rivers or canal banks under highway bridges, or full-blown landscaped overpasses, like the striking forested Cross Florida Greenway Land Bridge over Interstate 75 near Ocala.

In Tallahassee, a study showed that 90 percent of the turtles that tried to cross Highway 27 from Lake Jackson to a nearby waterway didn't make it. Since the Lake Jackson Ecopassage was built under the roadway in 2010, the death toll has dropped to zero because turtles, alligators, and other creatures are now funneled by fencing to a culvert that allows them to pass between water bodies without dodging traffic.

More good news: A project that the Florida Wildlife Federation sparked years ago is finally a reality. It's along a nine-mile stretch of Alligator Alley (which runs from Naples to Fort Lauderdale) that was a renowned hot spot for dangerous collisions, especially Florida panther deaths. The Florida Wildlife Federation commissioned a detailed study of the problem in 2015,

## There is more to being patriotic than wrapping yourself in the flag



Kellyanne Conway, as she has a way of doing, said something recently on "Good Morning America" that was over-the-top baloney to, well, everyone — including supporters of President Donald Trump.

If they don't realize that, they should.

Asked about the escalating war between the president and the media, Conway defended her boss by saying, and I quote,

"It doesn't help the American people to have a president covered in this light. I'm sorry. It's neither productive nor patriotic. The toxicity is over the top."

of the opposition. Conservatives have been doing it for years, labeling liberals as subversive cretins out to destroy America.

For the most part, liberals let that happen, and so gradually the American flag became a weapon to be unfurled by conservatives – as Conway just did – whenever things get rough and logic won't win the day.

Over the years, the attacks have gotten more personal – like the outrageous video the NRA just released with conservative radio host Dana Loesch that sounded an awful lot like a declaration of war against the faceless "them."

"They use their media to assassinate real news," Loesch begins. "They use their schools to teach children that their president is another Hitler. They use their movie stars and singers and comedy shows and award shows to repeat their narrative over

and over again."

It gets worse.

"The only way we stop this, the only way we save our country, and our freedom, is to fight this violence of lies with a clenched fist of truth," she said. "I'm the National Rifle Association of America and I'm freedom's safest place."

Notice the wording: save "our" country. Not "their" country.

"Our" country.

Last time I checked, we're all in this together. I was born in Dayton, Ohio nearly 66 years ago and that makes me as American as apple pie. Just so my NRA friends understand, I'm not declaring war on anyone who thinks differently, acts differently, looks different, or worships differently.

If someone wants to wave the Second Amendment, fine. But then don't tell me the First Amendment is "unpatriotic."

You want to wrap yourself in the flag? Go ahead.

But the holiday we just celebrated – the Fourth of July – got its start because a group of Patriots decided to be decidedly unpatriotic and questioned authority.

While we're on the subject, just because someone uses the name "patriot" doesn't make them righteous. The Southern Poverty Law Center has identified 623 "Patriot organizations" in 2016 that it says really are "extreme anti-government groups" in the United States, including 28 in Florida.

A lot of them have names like America, Freedom, Liberty and, of course, Patriots.

So, Kellyanne Conway, it absolutely is "patriotic" for the media to aggressively challenge the most powerful man in the world. That check and balance – or, as you might call it, that freedom – is what really makes America great.

#### Thank You for Your Service... Now You're Fired

At the most recent Clay County School Board meeting, the citizens of the county got to watch as the board went back and forth over the issue of returning a military service member to employment after he returned from a recent deployment to Af-

Repeatedly, we were told that the district was doing all it was legally required to do according to their understanding of the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act, also known as USERRA. The position that the Superintendent was acting in the interest of uniformity and consistency with respect to human resources was also cited.

All board members were sure to remind everyone that they respect and honor the service of our military members.

In the end, the board voted 4-1 to terminate the service members employment; leaving him with their hopes, as well as those of the superintendent, that he find employment at a school within the district. And I am sure that legally the board is right in their action; but what about morally or ethically?

The question that should plague this board is why did this situation occur in the first place?

Addison Davis has assured the citizens of Clay County that he strives to be proactive; this board has assured the citizens that they also seek to support the superintendent in his efforts to be proactive.

Did none of them know there were reservists under our employment? Did none of them know members of our teaching force were deployed on active duty defending our nation? Regardless of the answer, we have to question their regard for our

teachers who take on the added responsibility of Reserve or Guard service in a branch of the military.

In April, the board, through proclamation, recognized children of service members. The proclamation extolled the profound situation these children find themselves in. In Clay it would seem those same children also have to worry if their parents will have a job should they return home unharmed from combat deployments.

The school board lawyer said again and again that the board had no oversight as to whom the superintendent hired, but the board does have oversight as to how hiring and employment is conducted with respect to our district policies.

A policy that places all returning service members into an at-large position respective of their title, should they not be able to return to their original position, and further affords them "shall interview" preference in positions that they are certified for, as well as including out-of-field hires should no certified position be available, would provide returning service members

the employment protections at the heart and spirit of USERRA as well as ensuring we are meeting our obligation to those answering our nation's call.

Clay County School District is the largest employer in the county, what example, what precedent are we setting? What message are we sending to veterans across the county? What message are we sending to service members who want to continue serving our community as teachers? How can we say that we respect the service of veterans when we ignore our moral and ethical commitment to them? How can we claim to recognize the stresses of children whose parents are deployed when we are adding to those stresses?

We cannot thank them for their service while we are showing them the door.

## Property values increase in Clay County

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - Clay is based on the market value minus dif-County Property Appraiser Roger A. Suggs submitted the Certification of Taxable Value to the Clay County taxing authorities and the Florida Department of Revenue on June 29.

The 2017 preliminary taxable value is estimated at approximately \$9.9 billion - an increase of more than \$636

The preliminary taxable value is slightly higher than the estimate reported on June 1.

The statutory assessment date for the 2017 assessment roll is January 1,

Therefore, the overall increase in value is a reflection of the upward direction the real estate market experienced in 2016.

Although market values have increased, the assessed values of properties with a homestead exemption will be limited or capped at a 2.10 percent increase (excluding any additions or improvements) and non-homestead residential and commercial properties will be limited or capped at a 10 percent increase due to constitutional amendments passed by voters in 1992 and 2008, respectively. Taxable value ferentials or caps and exemptions.

The taxing authorities have until Aug. 4 to notify the property appraiser of their 2017 proposed maximum millage rates, and the date, time and place of their respective public budget hear-

This information will be used by the property appraiser to prepare the Notice of Proposed Property Tax forms also referred to as Truth in Millage or TRIM notices – which will be mailed to all property owners in mid-August.

Increases in the taxable value for the various taxing authorities in Clay County include:

Board of County Commissioners: 6.85 percent;

Green Cove Springs: 7.86 percent; Keystone Heights: 4.26 percent: Orange Park: 4.07 percent;

Penney Farms: 5.07 percent; School Board: 6.52 percent and

St. Johns River Water Management District: 6.82 percent

Certified information will be updated on the property appraiser's website www.ccpao.com following assessment roll approval by the Department of Revenue in mid-July.

sent a letter to the state petitioning action, and today there is finally a system of fencing and underpasses to help wildlife cross safely. In Southwest Florida, we've been involved in 50 different wildlife crossings so far, and we are excited to be involved with even more projects statewide.

Think about how nerve-wracking it is for us to try to dodge traffic when we have to run across a highway - just imagine how confusing it is for a wild animal to be moving through the woods and suddenly confronted by a road with speeding cars everywhere.

The highway crossings we're install-

ing have another important benefit besides cutting collisions – they provide key connections so that animals can roam in search of mates, which helps prevent inbreeding and protects a healthy gene pool for whole populations.

Since wildlife watching contributes \$5.8 billion yearly to Florida's economy, it makes sense for us to do what we can to keep our wildlife populations healthy and protected. If we humans are going to take over their landscape, the least we can do is use whatever tools we can to make it safer for them so we can all coexist.

## County gives final approval to branding

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - The Clay County Board of County Commissioners unanimously approved the final aspects of a branding project at its June 27 meeting. The new brand includes a new county seal and a new county logo.

Led by the Burdette Ketchum agency, the county now has a new seal that portrays the natural assets of the county,

primarily the waterways, and remains true to the citizens' passion for faith by keeping the phrase "In God We Trust" on the seal.

The seal also has the words "Clay County Florida" to help differentiate the county from other Clay counties in the U.S. and clearly defines that Clay County is in Florida. The seal will be used for official county business and cor-

For the first time ever, the county has a logo and tag line to use in all county promotional, marketing and communication documents. Kimberly Morgan, director of Tourism & Film Development for Clay County, said the tagline. "Small Towns. Big Passions." Is currently undergoing a copyright search, which is why the phrase

> is not on the shown here. She said it's best not to use the tagline until the copyright search is completed.

In a press release, she said the logo is designed to represent the passion pillars that exemplify Clay County: family, faith, country and military heritage, natural amenities and waterways,

drive for the future/innovation and distinctive small towns and all they represent. The foundation is the collection of small towns and vast waterways that make up the county that are reflective in the design of the logo.

"We're very excited to be moving forward with this new look," said Stephanie Kopelousos, county manager. "As our community continues to thrive and attract new businesses and residents, we now have a more refined and professional image that reflects who we are."

Burdette Ketchum was awarded the grant-funded branding and place making project and that also included research that defines the personality, values and insights into the county's identity within a tight timeline of 90-days. In addition to the new logo and seal, the project includes a sample wayfinding sign design and a placemaking map for proposed future signage within the county.

individuals donate funds to keep it running, said Craig Van Gundy, a member of the Kitchen of Clay County board and coordinator for Middleburg.

As the coordinator, Van Gundy works with each church to keep things running smoothly. Once a month, duties fall to Van Gundy's church, Middleburg United Methodist Church. He is also coordinator of MUMC's Food Bridge program, which provides food to people in need.

At the Weigel Senior Center on June 24, each table was set with a floral centerpiece, placemat, silverware and napkins. Van Gundy said volunteers rearrange the senior center's long folding tables to try to resemble a restaurant dining room. A basket of bread sat at each table as an appetizer while customers waited for their food.

Volunteers from Crossroad Lu-

theran Church acted as servers, greeted each customer and took their meal order. The volunteers brought out drinks, soups, sandwiches and desserts and bussed empty tables.

Guests arrived well before 11 a.m., and by the time lunch was served, nearly every table was full. Servers were constantly moving, carrying trays of food and making sure all customers were happy. One volunteer said the bustle was typical.

Options vary based on who is cooking that week, Provou said. The Kitchen secures the senior centers for the churches to use and provides some supplies, Van Gundy said, but most of the food is brought by the church serving that day.

On Crossroad's turn, the menu featured several varieties of soup – vegetable, chicken and rice, potato corn chowder and minestrone – and sandwiches, ham and swiss or turkey and cheddar. For dessert, customers had a choice of chocolate or white cake.

Deserae Cruz and her husband, Matthew Smith, are the team leads from Crossroad, which means they make sure the church has enough supplies and volunteers for the day. They also clean up at the end of the meal.

"He makes the sandwiches and makes sure the kitchen is running smoothly," Deserae said. "I'm out on the floor, interacting and taking orders." Deserae said she started volunteering shortly after she started attending Crossroad.

"Me and my daughter and my husband came and helped, and we've been doing it ever since," she said. "It's like a bright spot in my month. It makes me feel like I've actually done some good."

She said she wished the kitchen helped more homeless people. A few come in every month, she said, but many others either don't have transportation to get to the senior center or don't know the meal is offered. Many of their customers are seniors and people on fixed incomes, Cruz said.

There are certain customers Cruz looks forward to each month, she said. As a server, she gets to talk to the customers and get to know them.

"When you know you've helped someone," she said, "it just makes you feel good"

Provou said the Kitchen is run in coordination with the Clay County Council on Aging, which allows the group to use the senior centers. Much of the food is provided by Waste Not Want Not, a volunteer organization that collects food from restaurants and retail stores that would otherwise be thrown away.



## Musician on a mission to 'Just Add Rhythm'

FLEMING ISLAND — Although using percussion to improve well-being may sound strange to some, Just Add Rhythm founder Alisha Ross said it's more common than most people realize. Ross said there is a large network of drum circle facilitators like her who want to share music with people for wellness and team-building.

Ross, the chief drumming architect, founded the mobile business in 2012 to bring that experience to others. With no office location, Ross drives a hatchback full of drums and other instruments to schools, summer camps, offices — wherever people need a stress-relieving activity.

According to Ross, studies have shown rhythm has a measurable impact on the immune system, mood improvement, stress relief and quality of life.

"There's research to show that music does some of these things too, but rhythm just has this special thing that seems to be universal," she said. "I just think there's something about drumming that's so accessible to most people, that almost anyone can experience those benefits."

Drum circle facilitation is distinctly different from music therapy. However, Ross said there is overlap.

"We want people to feel an individual sense of wellness," she said, adding that she wants people to feel happy and fulfilled by the experience. "The team-building aspect is the second part, and that is, do I feel connected with other people? Did my group achieve its objectives?"

Ross said she hopes that groups learn new communication techniques and ways to verbally and non-verbally show support for each other, inside the drum circle and

out. She begins each session with simple exercises designed to get the group excited

"Depending on who we're drumming with, the people may be there by their own volition, or they may have been told they have to be there, and maybe they don't want to be there," she said. "So, to get the energy up, we do some drum rolls and rumbles and just get people sort of interacting with each other in a way that gets rid of some of the nerves."

Ross said usually, that means starting

small, and using egg shakers, boom whackers — multicolored PVC tubes of varying lengths — and other instruments. She wants people to realize they don't have to

know anything about music to enjoy the experience



Homeless – revealed 944 students considered homeless in the district, up nearly 100 from last year's count.

Project R.E.A.C.H aims to remove the barriers that would keep a student from enrolling, attending and succeeding in school through events and initiatives aimed at eating away a child's mitigating circumstances.

"You would never want a child to feel different from anybody else," said Suzanne Church, a Project R.E.A.C.H co-coordinator. "That is the goal of our program – to remove any barriers that would make them feel different."

Project R.E.A.C.H receives funding through the McKinney-Vento Education of Homeless Children and Youth Assistance Act. The federal program awards dollars to states to support programs that ensure educational stability for homeless children and youth.

The organization conducts the count school by school. The district's homeless advocate, Melissa Whitaker, contacts each student's guardian individually to ensure their family qualifies for program initiatives funded through the grant.

Some children do not have guardians, however. These 'unaccompanied youth' are children that neither have a permanent address nor a proper guardian and either live in cars, sleep on friend's couches or perhaps have no shelter at all.

Of the 944 identified through this year's count, 124 of these students qualify under this category and 35 are elementary school-age children.

Many of these children, if they can get to a qualified school, can receive free school lunches over the summer, but the district's resources are limited when it comes to housing. In these cases, it turns to other agencies to fill the gap of services.

"With that kind of number and the small amount of apartments we have, that's kind of a drop in the bucket," said Patrick R. Hayle, executive director of Mercy Support Services. "We refer them to other agencies and typically those agencies are not in Clay County."

Mercy Support Services currently owns eight apartment buildings within the county to run its self-sufficiency program, which helps people return to self-sustainability and out of homelessness through social services and case management.

However, if their apartment complexes are full and someone calls looking for housing, Hayle said he must refer them outside of the county.

Clay County has roughly 2,500 affordable housing units within, or just north of

county lines, according to a report by the Clay County Economic Development Corp. All of the 11 affordable housing apartment complexes within the county are at or near maximum occupancy.

Without a homeless shelter in the county, there isn't anywhere for these people to go, said Hayle. So many will move into extended stay hotels without a lump sum to fund a deposit on a rental. Hayle said since this trend began, there have been more county motels that have begun to offer extended stay rates.

"They're living day to day or week to week," Hayle said. "The definition of homelessness in this case is that they don't have a home of their own, but some of them are actually able to put themselves up in extended stay hotels. The others are just going place to place. Some may live with friends or stay in cars until they outlast their welcome...and what we have seen is that a few others which were heretofore not considered extended stay have now joined that group."

R.E.A.C.H helps students plan for the future despite whatever current predica-

ment the student is experiencing. They offer services to help students qualify for tuition waivers to obtain higher education and transportation assistance.

Church said that as Clay County's population grows, so too will the number of homeless and unaccompanied youth in the school district and the funding the program receives.

session, she said, is the drum jam. Ross uses a method she learned from another drum circle facilitator and introduces a "rhythm seed" – a tiny repeatable rhythm. She said people are then free to repeat that rhythm, build on it or make up something else to complement it.

"Everything adds together to make that in-the-moment music that is unique and beautiful," she said, "and nothing else is gonna sound like it."

Just Add Rhythm works with both children and adults, Ross said, and the main difference in the sessions is the way she explains the program.

"Innately, children are more enthusiastic about drumming and about making noise," she said. "When I go into kids' programs, especially with younger kids...

the first thing they do when they see the

drums, they have to bang on the drum." Ross said adults are often hesitant and less eager to start playing. The challenge is to draw everyone in without forcing them, she said. Some people don't want to play

the drums, they just want to observe. "That's OK," she said. "However they show up is fine, and that's what makes each program so great. You've got this wide variety of people and attitudes coming in to every program that it's going to be different every time."

She said Just Add Rhythm provides services for corporate clients, community organizations and educational institutions.

"We work with a lot of camps and after-school programs," Ross said. "We work with senior centers, hospitals – basically anyone who wants to achieve their wellness objectives through interactive rhythm.

The business originated in South Florida and when Ross decided to move to Northeast Florida with her husband last vear, she moved the business with her. A facilitator in South Florida has kept the company running there. Ross said the move was a personal choice, but she knew her business could grow in the community.

"It seemed to have a really eclectic arts community, the kind of community that is sort of small and close-knit, but once you get in there, you realize how much is happening everywhere, all the time," Ross said. "I really wanted to be a part of that."

Ross said her interest in African drumming stemmed from her experience at Berklee College of Music. At the time, her focus was singing and piano. She wanted to study rhythm to improve her abilities, and she fell in love with drumming. She traveled to West Africa to study drumming and earned a master's degree in ethnomusicology, the study of music of different cultures.

The drum circles she facilitates with Just Add Rhythm are not culturally specific, Ross said, and the focus is on the "community-building and self-empowerment aspects of rhythm." That way, people who don't have access to learning about West African cultures and complex rhythms can enjoy it. In the field of drum circle facilitation, she said, the music is presented "in a way that is easily hands-on, instantly ac-

Many of the organizations Ross works with are nonprofits, she said. Often, nonprofits get funding earmarked for cultural arts programs, and bring in artists like Ross. She said she has also worked with nonprofits as a consultant for grant pro-

Ross said she runs everything by herself for now, but as the business continues to grow, she would love to hire and train additional drum circle facilitators to help expand in the Jacksonville area and reach more people.

She said rather than feeling a spirit of competition with other facilitators, most share her idea that, "We need more of us in the world to provide this wonderful service to people who maybe don't know that they need it."

## A Greenhouse in Your Garden?

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - With the heat, humidity, and rains of summer, it is a good idea to take a break and devote some time to planning your garden for the fall and winter. In this vein of thought, one option many consider as they get more invested in gardening is the possibility of a greenhouse. However, this is an option that needs a lot of planning and is not right for everyone.

#### Why Greenhouses?

In Florida, a greenhouse takes on a different purpose than much of the country, where the growing season is much shorter

and many favorite plants require protection from extended periods of cold. The three main reasons for having one in our region are to protect tropicals. start plants in the winter, and to have more control over the growing process.

In the peak of the summer, many greenhouse designs become hard to manage due to heat and a greenhouse does take quite a bit of management to make it successful

at any time of year. Think about how you might use the greenhouse before you spend the money and time constructing one.

#### **Many Choices**

Greenhouses and other protected growing structures such as cold frames or hoop houses can come in many sizes, designs, and materials, it basically comes down to what resources you have and your budget. Before making any decisions, ensure that you are allowed to construct one on your property. Greenhouses can be prohibited by some homeowners' associations or pre-existing zoning regulations. Following

that, find a design that fits your wants and needs. Look for a structure that provides for good ventilation, adequate size, and will match your investment of time and money. Make sure that any design is built to withstand the weather and think about how much work will need to go into the maintenance of the structure. Within the greenhouse there are also many choices such as flooring, bench style and materials, heating, cooling, ventilation, and irrigation to consider. In the end, you can have a temporary row cover, costing only a few dollars to an automated masterpiece that can be more expensive than most homes.

#### Now where?

A greenhouse should always be placed with the end walls facing North-South to ensure even light and heating. Avoid placement that shades the greenhouse unless it occurs on the west side, which can block some of the summer sun. You should also consider your water and potentially an electricity source.

There are many aspects in choosing a greenhouse or protected growth structure and it is best to plan and research before committing to it. If interested in more information, utilize online guides available from the extension services of land grant universities or consider attending the Greenhouses in the Garden class being held at the UF/IFAS Extension Office in Green Cove Springs on July 19th. #### A career in the books

## Long time Clay County library leader to retire

MIDDLEBURG - It all started when a younger Opal Leino went to a job interview with the hopes of obtaining a job at a local convenience store. Her interviewer tipped her to an open position at the then Clay County Headquarters Library in Green Cove Springs, the same library she used to visit as a child. Today, nearly 38 years later, that convenience store doesn't exist, and Leino is retiring from a long career in working in Clay County's libraries.

In October 1979. Leino began working at the Green Cove Springs branch library as a clerk. She wore many hats at that time, and she was being groomed by seasoned librarians. She even drove the

"I got to meet people from all over the community." Leino said. "I was always a shy and timid person, but it brought out a lot in me, it was a whole new experience

As it turns out, the grooming and learning experiences were for a purpose. About 20 minutes away from Green Cove Springs, a small group of women in the Middleburg area were fighting to get a branch library built in their community. Leino, who'd been driving the bookmobile as far as Clay Hill was well aware of the need for a library in that area, and she was ready to help them in any way she could.

That small group of "feisty women." as Leino puts it, are the Friends of the Middleburg-Clay Hill library. In the early 1980's, once funding was secured for a new library in Middleburg, Leino was promoted to branch manager of that upcoming branch.

"We didn't have enough funding and staff to do it full time," Leino said. "In the meantime, before the library was to be built, they wanted a storefront library."

For about a year, Leino would commute from Green Cove Springs, hauling books in her car, to a small Civil War-era two-story house on Main Street in Middleburg.

It was in that makeshift library, Leino made memories that would last a lifetime.

"If we didn't have room on the porch, we'd have programs out in the yard," Leino

In that little house, Leino said it was average for them to host 60-70 kids at one time for programs.

In the winter, adults and children would trot up the stairs to have indoor programs, with heat coming from a double-faced fireplace. Despite the unique circumstances, Leino, volunteers and library friends persisted until 1985, when their dream of a new branch library became reality.

Once the Middleburg-Clay Hill branch library officially opened, Leino, the bookmobile driver turned branch manager, was already an established literary leader in Clay County.

"It's grown amazingly," Leino said. "It's



a challenge to keep up with." Some of the changes include the automation of the card catalogue system in 1995, to keep up with the ever-changing technical landscape, Leino pursued bachelor's and master's degrees in her spare time.

"Sometimes I miss those old card catalogues," Leino said with a smile.

Over the years. Leino has seen how technology has changed not only her profession, but the community she serves.

"We still have people, especially in Clay Hill, who don't even have and can't get access to the internet, so it's not about people wanting to switch to e-books, but it's that they can't, and wellibraries have to be that bridge," said Leino. "It might be different in a community with a lot of jobs and a lot of money, but in this community people are just trying to make a living." Regardless, Leino has been committed to instituting computer-based programs and promoting Science, Technology, Engineering and Math education in the library.

Leino says she could write a book about the people she's encountered during a career. In her time, she has seen the kids she used to read to back in the 1980's, come in with their own children to library programs. She also recalled a gentleman a who lost his job during the 2008 economic downturn, thanks to a library partnership with WorkSource, he found a job. He returned to thank Leino and her staff for helping him get on his feet.

Her staff offered similar sentiments.

"She's wonderful, she's so helpful, if you need to know something Opal knows it," said Teresa Denapoli, senior library clerk. "She's funny, she'll have you're rolling on the floor if you're having a bad day.

On July 25, Leino will lend out her final books as a branch manager at the library she's called home since 1985.

"I feel like I've done all that I've set out to accomplish, there's so much more that others can do" Leino said. "I think the Lord has other plans for me, like Jerimiah 29:11, there's somebody higher than me that has plans for me."

#### Man arrested for MDMA, marijuana on Fourth of July

ORANGE PARK - An Orange Park man was arrested Tuesday evening after speeding through a residential neighborhood while allegedly in possession of drugs and drug paraphernalia.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Darren DeAngelo Wolfe, 22, after finding him in possession of multiple MDMA pills and a large amount of marijuana July 4 just after nightfall.

According to the report, Wolfe was

spotted going about 10 miles an hour over the speed limit along a residential section of Palmetto Place Court. The officer noted that children were in the street setting off fireworks and cars were parked on both sides of the street as families celebrated the Fourth of July holiday.

After stopping Wolfe, the arresting officer noticed the smell of fresh marijuana coming from the vehicle, and upon further investigation, discovered 21 grams worth of MDMA pills in addition to 28 grams of marijuana.

Wolfe faces two felony charges, one for trafficking MDMA and one for marijuana possession over 20 grams, in addition to a misdemeanor paraphernalia charge. Wolfe remained held in the Clay County Jail where he awaits a bond hearing at the time of publication.

#### **Child neglect charges for Green Cove man**

The warrant calls for Meisinger's arrest for child neglect after an officer from the Green Cove Police Department and a child protective investigator deemed his residence unfit for a child. During the investigation, the investigators smelled human feces before even entering the residence. Upon entry, they found trash bags full of food and other garbage, and food on several surfaces throughout the home.

The debris throughout the house had attracted cockroaches, with the report stating that the officer saw hundreds of the bugs crawling along the ceiling. The bathroom in the home was flooded and not working, and the air conditioner was broken, police said.

Meisinger faces a felony charge for child neglect and has been released from Clay County Jail since his transport from Virginia Beach.


#### Man arrested for pushing senior



The Clay County Sheriff's Office ar-

rested Joseph John Joyce, 37, and Lillian Barbara Yvonne Adams, 33, on June 20 on multiple charges following a random license plate check.



After Joyce noticed he was being pulled over, he sped up, travelling at a high speed along Wells Road, driving recklessly and

swerving into oncoming traffic. The officer stopped chasing Joyce to avoid causing an accident that could injure innocent by-

After stopping the chase, a deputy responded to a 911 call that the vehicle had been spotted along Ursa Street. The deputy eventually caught up with the vehicle at a BP station along Blanding Boulevard.

After speaking with the defendants, and calling for a police dog, the vehicle was found to be "emitting the presence of narcotics" by the dog and was searched. Officers found a loaded revolver, loaded rifle, baggies containing heroin, a marijuana concentrate, pipes, syringes, spoons and a scale. They were also found to be in possession of a driver's license that did not belong to either of them.

The pair face felony charges for possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and possession of heroin with the intent to sell, and misdemeanor charges for unlawful possession of four or fewer identities, drug equipment possession or use, and the possession of less than 20 grams of mari-

Additionally, Joyce faces a felony for fleeing a law enforcement officer at a high speed, and two misdemeanors for driving

an unregistered vehicle and driving on a suspended or revoked license. Both were booked into the Clay County Jail. Joyce is being held on a \$211,000 bond with a court date set for July 26. Adams is being held on a \$110,000 bond and has a court date on the same day.

#### Clay teen dies in Alachua crash

GAINESVILLE – Authorities in Alachua County report that a Middleburg teen died June 29 in a two-vehicle accident in the Island Grove area in U.S. Highway 301.

Alachua County Fire Rescue said the wreck took place around 9:30 a.m. Police said Daniel Timothy Dodd, 18, of Middleburg, was driving a Dodge sedan northbound on the inside line when the crash occurred. Police said he crossed the median, spun in a clockwise rotation, and then was struck by a Chevy Silverado.

The Florida Highway Patrol said the van left debris 200 feet in both directions.

When rescue personnel arrived, they found one person in serious condition and Dodd dead at the scene.

The crash is still under investigation by FHP and the Alachua County Sheriff's Office.

## Clay County Schools one point away from "A" district letter grade

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — The Clay County School District was one point away from being named an "A" District in recent scores released last week by the Florida Department of Education for the 2016-2017 school year.

The state calculates school grades annually based on up to 11 components, including student achievement and learning gains on statewide, standardized assessments and high school graduation rate. Clay County improved in percent of possible points earned, moving from 57 percent ("B" letter grade) to 61 percent ("B" letter grade), one point shy of the "A" school rating (62 percent).

Clay County District Schools now has 12 "A" schools, an increase of five schools from the 2015-2016 academic year. Three schools improved from a "C" letter grade to "A" or "B" ratings. Lake Asbury Junior High demonstrated remarkable improvements jumping from a "C" to an "A" school, a 101-point increase. Ridgeview Elementary made significant gains by increasing 134 points, moving from a "B" school to an "A." Overall, Clay County now ranks 12th in state in percent of possible points earned, moving up eight spots from last year.

"The release of school grades demonstrates Clay County District Schools is moving in the right direction to become a Top 10 and "A" school district. These improvements are based on the hard work and commitment exhibited from our teachers, support staff, school leaders, students, and parents. Clay County Schools will con-



legislative session. In the past, it's paid off to the tune of \$1 million, which has over and above paid for itself, so I think it's an important thing that we pursue in the best interest of our district." Gilhousen said.

Board member Mary Bolla characterized the lobbying contract as an "extravagance right now" as she was the first to speak on Gilhousen's motion. She said when she went to Clay Day during the legislative session, she was somewhat conflicted as to why the district's lobbying firm didn't reach out to prep the school board on the issues that would impact the district in this year's session.

"The update, for instance, on House Bill 7069, I got most of that from the lobbyist for St. Johns County because of our consortium with them." Bolla said.

Condon spoke next and defended rehiring Southern Strategy Group.

"I would like to see us renew it, but I would like to see us come up with some very specific goals — working with our superintendent — for some things that we ask for." Gondon said.

Condon said the Clay Board of County Commissioners' legislative wish list was very specific and "they got almost everything on their list."

"I think there can be good gained from the right group with the right strategy, but I understand your concerns as well," Condon said.

Gilhousen made one last push for the lobbying firm before the full board voted on her motion.

"I think that part of what was missing from this last session was a dialogue between the elected members of our board and our superintendent and the lobbyist firm. So, I think maybe a regular workshop where we're checking in and developing those goals together will be a healthy relationship," Gilhousen said.

When it came time for a vote, Gilhousen's motion failed 2-3 with her and Condon voting yes and board members Janice Kerekes, Carol Studdard and Mary Bolla voting no. The board voted 3-2 on May 19, 2016 — when Van Zant was still superintendent — to hire the firm with Kerekes and Studdard voting no at that time.

In other business:

The school board voted 3-2 to pay some \$4,600 in outstanding legal bills the district received since January 2017 on behalf of Van Zant in his defense of a Florida Commission on Ethics complaint filed last August by former Keystone Heights Principal Susan Sailor. Sailor claimed Van Zant had plagiarized an academic paper she wrote for the district and used it as a class assignment for his online master's degree.

On June 14, the issue was dismissed by Florida Commission on Ethics as it found no reasonable cause for the complaint.

However, the district this year has already paid \$2,756 in legal bills that were not brought to the board for approval.

School Board Attorney David D'Agata said he brought the issue to the board's attention because it "has the power of the purse" and that this specific ethics charge did not arise from Van Zant's official duties as superintendent. However, D'Agata said a separate Ethics Commission complaint alleging Van Zant was complicit in allowing high school principals to place students in ESE in order to beef up the district's graduation rate was under the purview of Van Zant's tenure and, as such, those bills were paid.

"This is not Mr. Van Zant's personal

checkbook," said Chairman Janice Kerekes

After about a 30-minute discussion, the board voted 3-2 to pay Van Zant's legal bills on a motion by Mary Bolla that was seconded by Ashley Gilhousen. Kerekes and Studdard – having frequently disagreed with many of Van Zant's policy actions while superintendent – voted against the motion.

"The sun'll come out tomorrow," Studdard said. "Life goes on."

The school board voted 4-1 with Gilhousen voting no to approve the personnel consent agenda item governing appointments, reappointments, transfers, redesignations, retirements, resignations and concluded employments. Board member Betsy Condon pulled the item for discussion, but when the vote came to approve the item, she voted yes and said, "Please know, I want to support the other teachers" on the list. A previous motion to kill the agenda item failed on a 2-3 vote.

Before the vote, Gavin Rollins, a former school district administrator, spoke to the board in dismay regarding his employment status after returning March 1 from an approximately 12-month deployment with the Florida Army National Guard. He stopped short of accusing the district of unfair treatment to veterans.

In January, Rollins said he emailed Davis "respectfully requesting" adequate reemployment upon his return and said he would have been willing to return as an administrator, "but I wanted to be good employee so I stated that I would be willing to take a social studies teaching position in a full-time capacity as adequate employment if an administrator position was unavailable," Rollins said.

After his return, in early April, Rollins was placed at Keystone Heights High

School as an instructor with the school's Army JROTC program.

"I didn't want the ROTC position and I protested but they responded by saying take this temporary position and I would be guaranteed placement as a social studies teacher in the fall. I was told that the ROTC position was my only option for reemployment, so I agreed on the basis of that promise," Rollins said.

Superintendent Addison Davis said it's his job to make sure the district is being consistent in its human resources practices.

"So, no different than anyone else, once you resign an administrator position, which this is the first time on the record, that I've ever heard about protesting the resignation. I actually didn't even know the resignation was in place until I asked in the last two weeks about school year's over, I need this employee to come back to the district, because I may have some tasks to fulfill their employment until June 30," Davis said.

Under the federal Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act, employers are required to provide adequate employment to service members when they return from deployments if possible.

Rollins' contract ended June 8, the same day all Clay County annual contract teachers' contracts ended. Davis said Rollins, who has a temporary certification in social studies, can come back to the district as a social studies teacher in the fall if a principal chooses to offer him a position in the district.

The next school board meeting is Aug. 3 at 6 p.m. at the Teacher Training Center at Fleming Island High.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. – Clay High swimmer Caeleb Dressel upped the ante on his expertise in the pool with a scintillating best-ever split in the 50 butterfly, yes, butterfly, as the former Blue Devil blasted the field at the Phillips 66 U.S.A. National Championships/World Team qualifier June 27-28 at the Indiana University Natatorium in Indianapolis. ## Quarterman top draw at ACC Kickoff conference

Ex-Knights LB among league best

MIAMI — Former Oakleaf High School linebacker Shaquille Quarterman, now a standout middle linebacker at the University of Miami, has been selected by the Hurricanes staff to attend the annual ACC Kickoff event in Charlotte July 13-14.

The event is a media day type conference with Atlantic Coast Conference football teams able to send a coach and two players for media interviews and photographs.

Quarterman, a standout last year as a freshman, will be joined by junior running back Mark Walton.

A preseason All-conference team is also formulated with division race predictions from league media members.

Quarterman, who was third among ACC freshmen in tackles (84) and had more tackles for loss (10.0) than any ACC freshman since 2009, is the first UM linebacker at the event since Raphael Kirby (2015). Quarterman was also one on nine Hurricane players chosen by Athlon Sports magazine as preseason All-ACC first teamer. Quarterman was a third team All-ACC selection last year.

After the Hurricanes' spring scrimmage in April, Quarterman commented that the well-publicized Miami linebacker crew of Quarterman, Michael Pinkney and Zach McCloud; all returning sophomores, seemed to all be in sync in the live format event.



points and Bolles teammate Ryan Murphy's 65

Dressel, who finished second by .01 to U.S. Olympic gold medalist Nathan Adrian in the 100 freestyle, his most widely acclaimed event, stormed away with the 50 butterfly title over U.S. Olympic silver medal freestyle sprinter Cullen Jones (50 free, 4 x 100 free relay 2012) with a record 23.05 in the final to smash Jones' one day old record of 23.26 set in the morning preliminary rounds. Tim Phllips of North Carolina took third in the 50 butterfly at 23.37.

In the final day of competition, Saturday, Dressel returned to historically his favorite event, the 50 free, and held off Adrian to win the event in 21.53 for his third national title for the week. Adrian finished in 21.87 with Jones third in 21.89.

In the 50 fly preliminary rounds, Jones blistered the field with his 23.26 with Dressel second fastest at 23.33. Jones' split bested the 2013 record of 23.29 set also in the Indianapolis pool by Eugene Godsoe. The world record is 22.43 and the American record is 22.91 by Bryan Lundquist set in 2009.

Dressel returned for the 100 butterfly final on Thursday where his he came in with the second fastest prelim split of 51.38 with Jack Conger of North Carolina top seed at 51.37. Conger was a gold medalist on the RIO 4 x 200 free relay team. In the final, Dressel had the second fastest time at the 50 meter turn (23.87) then blasted the field in the second 50 (27.00) to win in 50.87. Olympian Michael Phelps holds the world, USA and championship records for the event with a 50.22 the championship and USA record and a 49.82 the world record; all set in 2009. Tim Phillips of North Carolina was second in 51.30 with splits of 23.70 and 27.60. Conger matched Dressel's 23.87 to the turn but faded to 27.46 to finish third in 51.33.

In the 100 free, where Dressel finished second in the Olympic Trials and sixth at the RIO 2016 Olympics, the entire finals field trailed Dressel and 50 meter leader Michael Chadwick at the turn; both were

under 23 seconds, before Adrian, sixth at the turn, stormed to the finish with a 24.69 final 50 split to catch Dressel, who finished with a 25.11 split. Chadwick dropped to fifth overall with a 25.67 final 50 time. Overall, Adrian swam a 47.96 with Dressel at 47.97 for second and Townley Haas of Virginia third at 48.20.

"I didn't know where the other swimmers were and I think if I looked around to see them, I would have lost," said Adrian after the 100 free final. "I think coming back strong in the second 50 is now built into my nervous system. For so long, I had to answer the question of what happened to American sprinting. We are in a good place now."

Ryan Murphy, the Olympic gold medalist in the 100 and 200 backstroke and a Bolles teammate of Dressel, finished eighth in the 100 free in 49.21.

On Thurs., June 29, Dressel finished sixth in the 200 freestyle at 1:47.51 with Haas the winner at 1:45.03. Haas led from start to finish with first touches at all turns.

On Saturday's final event of the week, Dressel will be the fourth seed in the ultra-fast 50 free with Anthony Ervin, the Olympic gold medalist, Adrian and Jones all ahead of Dressel with splits from 1-4 at 21.40, 21.47, 21.75 and 21.76.


Also competing from the Bolles School and Orange Park, Auburn University senior Ashley Neidigh finished 14th in the 800 freestyle in 8:40.07 with Olympic gold medalist and world record holder Katie Ledecky of Stanford winning decisively in 8:11.50 with Leah Smith of Virginia second in a distant 8:20.46.

In the womens 1500 free final, where Ledecky again holds all the world and national records, Neidigh qualified with a 15:54.88 and eventually finished in 16:32.76 for 12th place.

On Thursday, Neidigh took 13th overall, seventh in the Consolation Final in the 400 individual medley with a 4:48.53 with Leah Smith of Virginia the national champion at 4:33.86.

In her best finish, the 400 free, Neidigh took eighth in 4:15.29 with Ledecky winning in 3:58.44.

Also competing were Grady Heath in the 200 free and Sherridon Dressel, both also Clay High graduates and University of Florida freshmen.





Also, Abate joined younger brother John Abate, an incoming junior point guard for Kurnitsky for next year.

"The basketball speed is much faster at the college level," said Abate, who averaged about 18-19 minutes of playing time as a freshman on a team with just two senior players. "The IQ of the basketball players is the biggest jump even at the Division III level. Faster guys, bigger guys and they hit harder."

Abate, to be a sophomore shooting guard at Elmira College in New York, returned to his hometown roots for the annual Raiders' summer league schedule and has offered his college experience to the younger Raider hopefuls; one his younger brother John Abate, while preparing himself for his second year at the college level. Elmira graduated just two seniors.

"Coach Kurnitsky asked me to help out on his summer basketball team and I'm loving it," said Abate. "He prepared me well for the college game with his fast-paced style and I can come in and demonstrate the techniques that gave me some success at Elmira."

Abate, who put up a 5.3 points per game average for the Soaring Eagles with a season-best of 16 points with five games in double digit scoring, commented that his Elmira team did not fare as well as expected as per wins and losses, but that the youth on the squad is looking to improve immensely this year.

Abate averaged about 19 minutes per game for Elmira with three rebounds and two assists from his rookie slot. Abate scored his best four games in his first four games on the college level with games of

11, 13, 16 and 12 points in four of five games in November 2016. In those games, Abate had game minutes of 15, 36, 36 and 37 games as his presence pushed Elmira to two losses and two wins (70-68 over SUNY Maritime with Abate hitting nine free throws, 76-67 over Vassar with Abate snagging team-high 14 rebounds) for the early part of the season before a 10 game losing streak ensued that featured just one win (66-63 Ithaca, team high three steals) in the final 11 games giving the Soaring Eagles a dismal three win season.

"We didn't do as well as we wanted, but we were very young," said Abate.

Where Abate excelled was on the defensive side of the ball with 58 total rebounds and 12 steals. Abate also had 35 assists for the season.

For the battle off the backboard, Abate as been concentrating on adding some heft to his slight frame with a strong weightlifting and conditioning program for the summer.

"The goal is to put on 15-20 pounds of muscle mass to improve durability under the boards," said Abate.





#### **Description of Assessments**

The District imposes O&M Assessments on benefitted property within the District for the purpose of funding the District's general administrative, operations, and maintenance budget. The proposed O&M Assessments as stated include collection costs and/or early payment discounts, which Clay County ("County") may impose on assessments that are collected on the County tax bill. Moreover, pursuant to Section 197.3632(4), Florida Statutes, the lien amount shall serve as the "maximum rate" authorized by law for O&M Assessments, such that no assessment hearing shall be held or noticed provided in future years unless the assessments are proposed to be increased or another criterion within Section 197.3632(4), Florida Statutes, is met. Note that the O&M Assessments do

not include any debt service assessments previously levied by the District and due to be collected for Fiscal Year 2017/2018. For Fiscal Year 2017/2018, the District intends to have the County tax collector collect the assessments imposed on certain developed property, and will directly collect the assessments imposed on the remaining benefitted property by sending out a bill prior to, or during, November 2017.
