School board approves contract for new charter school

FLEMING ISLAND – In the final session for outgoing Superintendent Charlie Van Zant Jr. and Chairwoman Johnna McKinnon, the Clay County School Board pushed through a contract green-lighting a new charter school with a 3-2 vote last Thursday night.

Van Zant and McKinnon have been strong proponents of St. Johns Classical Academy. She, along with board members Ashley Gilhousen and Betsy Condon, voted to approve the charter school's five-year contract while Janice Kerekes and Carol

Studdard voted against it.

The board, in September's meeting, had approved by the same vote margin the application of St. Johns Classical Academy, with the caveat that the accompanying contract meet the board's standard criteria by February 2017.

The academy chose not to wait until February. Board attorney Dan Sikes helped draw up the new contract and contended that it meets all the board's requirements.

"What is the rush," Kerekes asked regarding the approval of the revised

BCC takes action on Hurricane Matthew clean-up

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — Clay County Commissioners are pulling out all the stops to help clean up the county from the effects of Hurricane Matthew.

Commissioners voted unanimously at their regular meeting Oct. 25 on a number of items that should help bring the county back to normal after the punishing winds, waves and rains of Matthew.

Among the items commissioners approved was the waiving of fees for those following a sort of "self-help" path by using the county dump to rid their homes of yard debris instead of waiting for the debris to be picked up by contractors. Residents can

take their debris to the Rosemary Hill landfill through Nov. 5 without having to pay the usual fees.

Those who have used the dump in the past few days and had to pay will be reimbursed if they can show their receipt.

This is the second time the fees have been waived. The procedure was also followed in the first two weeks after the storm, with those who used the dump prior to the fee waiving going into effect.

The fee waiver only applies to Rosemary Hill, said John Ward, director of emergency management for Clay County, as Sleepy Hollow is being used as a stag-

Firefighter, county settle lengthy lawsuit

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - A lengthy legal battle between a paramedic-firefighter and Clay County has been settled through mediation.

The Board of County Commissioners approved the settlement agreement and release in the case of Kevin Mobley versus Clay County at its Oct. 11 meeting by a vote of 4-0. Diane Hutchings, chairwoman of the BCC, was absent.

There was no discussion between the board members in attendance concerning the issue, which was presented by county attorney Courtney K. Grimm.

Mobley, the plaintiff in the action, expressed relief that the case was at long last finished.

"I'm just glad it's over," he said. "It shouldn't have taken 5 ½ years to settle."

Even though Grimm was not a part of most of the case as she just started as the county attorney a couple of months ago, she, too expressed satisfaction that it had come to a conclusion.

"I'm glad that we could get it through mediation." she said.

The total settlement is valued \$77.897.97. The breakdown includes Mobley being paid \$51,382, of which \$37,882 is back pay (and to which the county's retirement contribution and FICA payment will be made) and \$13,500 in mileage reimbursement.

be made in attorney's fees to Mobley's law-

Mobley had been seeking, among other things, a declaratory judgment that he is not an employee of Clay County when volunteering with the Keystone Heights Volunteer Fire Department. Mobley has said that the Clay County fire chief had a verbal policy that if any of the department's employee were off the clock and volunteering for KHVFD, they had to enter that volunteer time on their county card if they were employed by Clay County.

The case stemmed from an incident that occurred in 2011.

Mobley, who had worked in a paid position for Clay County Fire Rescue since August of 1996, had also volunteered for years on his days off for the Keystone Heights Volunteer Fire Department where he served as the volunteer fire chief.

According to Mobley's attorney, John Middleton, Mobley was responding to a call in 2011 for assistance in a serious car accident in Bradford County. A Clay County fire captain ordered Mobley off the call but he stayed because a Bradford County volunteer fire official at the site asked him to remain.

Mobley was consequently disciplined for not following orders, Middleton said.

"He was demoted from lieutenant to fireman - a permanent demotion which means you can't get anywhere - and took a 22 percent pay cut," he said.

In the case. Mobley claimed several of In addition, a payment of \$15,000 will his rights guaranteed by either the Florida

or the U.S. Constitutions were violated by various actions of the county, including paying him overtime as a volunteer for the KHVFD. He also sought to enjoin Clay County from disciplining him while volunteering for KHVFD.

Many of the points involving KHVFD are moot, said Middleton, as that group essentially no longer exists. On April 15, 2013 Clay County Board of County Commissioners, at the direction of County Manager Stephanie Kopelousus and Fire Chief Lorin Mock, cancelled the contract between the Keystone Heights Volunteer Fire Department and Clay County, according to the KHVFD website. According to Mobley, the KHVFD is in the process of being absorbed by the Bradford County volunteers.

Middleton said he views the county's actions as a "power play" to control volun-

"To me, it was a power play by the Clay County fire department," he said.

Both Mobley and Middleton said they thought the process to settle the case had taken an unusually long amount of time.

"The county fought it every step of the way," Middleton said.

As part of the settlement, Mobley was required to resign, which he did Oct. 11. He said he plans to pursue the self-employed teaching career he has been following for the past 15 years, teaching classes to those seeking certification in CPR, first aid and fire officer's certification. Over the years, he said he has taught hundreds from both Northeast and Central Florida.

He also plans to continue his volunteer

"I have every intention of volunteering for Bradford County," he said.

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - When it comes to one local library, all is quiet.

The Green Cove Springs City Council unanimously rejected a \$380,000 bid to renovate the Augusta Savage Arts and Community Center Library in a busy meeting on Oct. 18.

The council previously had requested a bid for tearing down the library and rebuilding it, with the expectation that it would be more cost-effective than renovation, but the estimate from Bidhe & Hall Architects of Orange Park came back higher, at \$402,000.

Now, the architectural firm will go back to the drawing board.

"I don't understand why it would cost more to just get rid of the thing and start fresh," Council Member Van Royal said.

However, it turns out that a miscommunication occurred. The firm's estimate of demolition and rebuilding was based on a structure identical to the renovation plans. Now, Bidhe & Hall will have more leeway in coming up with a different structure.

There is no timetable for the new bid, but Council Member Steven Kelley emphasized cost-effectiveness.

"If we don't save a dime with the new bid but we come up with a more functional space, I think the community will be happier," he said.

Bidhe & Hall is the largest architectural firm in Clay County. It has designed homes. businesses, schools and military buildings in multiple states.

The Augusta Savage Arts & Community Center was built as Dunbar High School in 1942, and is located on a five-acre parcel of land near the center of Green Cove

Springs, Augusta Savage donated the property for the first and only black high school in Green Cove Springs, according to the

In other action, the council unanimously passed an ordinance authorizing the city to borrow up to \$34.1 million from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection State Revolving Fund for upgrading of the Green Cove Spring's wastewater collection, wastewater treatment and reclaimed water facilities.

Residents had turned out in opposition to the measure in the previous meeting, but no one spoke at last week's public hearing.

Also last week, the council unanimously approved on first reading a one-year moratorium on medical marijuana dispensaries in the event Amendment 2 passes on Election Day, Nov. 8. The measure will be considered for a final vote in the next council

"Orange Park and other places have instituted similar moratoriums," said L.J. Arnold, city attorney.

In its session last week, the Orange Park Town Council unanimously voted for a year-long moratorium to study how to zone potential marijuana dispensaries.

Miami-Dade County recently adopted a measure restricting dispensaries from opening near residential areas or within 1,000 feet of a school. Hillsboro County, Sarasota County and Orlando all have similar restrictions

A statewide, 60-percent supermajority is necessary on Election Day for Amendment 2 to pass, effectively amending the Florida Constituion. In 2014, 65 percent of voters in Clay Country pulled the lever in

Ryan Tyson deep-dives into the vote-by-mail numbers

The race to Election Day has entered its final sprint.

More than 1.2 million vote-by-mail ballots have already been returned to elec-

tions officials across Florida. Early voting kicked off Monday in dozens of Florida counties.

It's too early to what those know ballots hold, but that doesn't mean the ballots can't offer some insight into the 2016 election. In a briefing memo over the weekend,

Ryan Tyson, the vice president of political operations at Associated Industries of Florida, outlined some of the trends campaign watchers are seeing so far this election cycle.

Vote early

Millions of Floridians are expected to cast their ballot ahead of Election Day. Tyson said his team anticipates about 29 percent of total votes – about 2.4 million – will be cast by mail this election. Tyson said he anticipates about 27 percent or more of the overall electorate will vote early.

While Republicans have typically had an edge over Democrats in vote by mail returns, Tyson said Democrats have increased their share of ballots returned by 185,000, while Republicans have only grown by 165,000.

Elections records show Republicans have returned 503,632 ballots, compared to 483,019 ballots returned by Democrats. Independent voters returned 219,698 bal-


Boost in turnout

With just 16 days until Election Day, voters returned 451,322 more ballots than at the same point in 2012. But Tyson warned a boost in vote by mail returns doesn't necessarily mean higher turnout.

"Contrary to popular belief, we don't anticipate that it's an indicator of higher than usual turnout," wrote Tyson. "Rather, we would suggest the growth in the popularity of VBM is due to both party's continuing effort to move their early or election day voters forward."

According to Tyson's memo, 27 percent of both party's returns were cast in person - either early or on Election Day - in 2012. The analysis showed 57 percent of Republicans voted by mail in 2012, while 54 percent of Democrats voted by mail in 2012.

'To us ... it seems the clearest indicator of true strategic growth in the utilization of VBM is amongst low propensity voters and voters who had vote history in 2012," he wrote. "In both categories, the Democrats are ever so slightly out pacing

favor of legalization, but the initiative narrowly failed statewide.

This year's version of the amendment clarifies language to ensure only licensed physicians can recommend cannabis use and specifies parental consent for a child to receive medical marijuana.

A CBS News poll in April found that 87 percent of Americans support the use of small amounts of medical marijuana pre-

scribed by a doctor.

Cannabis has shown efficacy in patients suffering from a variety of medical conditions — in some cases alleviating symptoms, and in others offsetting side-effects of treatment — such as Parkinson's disease, post-traumatic stress disorder, cancer and epilepsy.

the Republicans."

Vote by mail profile

Here's what we know about the vote by mail electorate – They're older, white and from Southwest Florida.

According to Tyson's memo, 82 percent of the vote by mail electorate is over the age of 50, "with 56 percent being over 65." Millennials, or voters between the ages of 18 and 34, account for just 7 percent of vote by mail voters.

New registrants, defined by Tyson as people who have registered to vote since 2012, account for 12 percent of the returned ballots. About 81 percent of the current returns are considered "likely" voters

Three-quarters (76%) of the current electorate is white, while Hispanic voters make up 11 percent of the electorate. Eight percent of those people casting ballots are African American.

As for where the ballots are coming from, Tyson wrote that "as is usual in this phase of the election, Tampa and Ft. Myers are disproportionately represented."

One-third (33%) of the ballots have been returned from the Tampa media market, while 12 percent have come from the Fort Myers media market. Those markets will ultimately be about 24 percent and 6 percent, respectively, of the final geographic make-up of the electorate.

Independent voter profile

About 217,000 independent voters returned their ballots as of Saturday. For the

most part, those voters reflect the overall profile of the vote by mail electorate.

According to Tyson's memo, 74 percent of independent voters – described as no major party voters in his report – are white, and 76 percent are over the age of 50. Tyson reported 50 percent of independent voters returning ballots are over the age of 65.

About 61,000 independent voters have no voter history from 2012. Tyson said about 48 percent of those voters are whites over the age of 50, while 16 percent are Hispanic.

"This memo is merely intended to dive into the electorate as it exists today, 16 days from the General," wrote Tyson. "With one full week of early voting in, we anticipate this memo will look a lot different next week as the electorate tends to get younger and less white during the second phase of voting."

Officials urge patience in cleanup

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — Hurricane Matthew's whirlwind weekend visit earlier this month not only wreaked havoc on the region, it left Clay County hanging with a \$7 million tab.

Now, Uncle Sam is opening his wallet to help

Clay County got official word Monday that it is eligible for aid from the Federal Emergency Management Agency for cleanup and repairs in the aftermath of the storm, which battered the area on Oct. 7-8.

The threshold to qualify for FEMA assistance was \$690,000. The county is facing \$6.9 million in expenditures, and that

number could increase.

"It's our best estimate right now," said John Ward, Clay County's director of emergency management.

FEMA will reimburse up to 75 percent of the cost, with the county and state splitting the remainder. The aid applies to general cleanup, debris removal, emergency protective facilities, and repairs to infrastructure, utilities, equipment and parks.

Clay County hasn't been declared for Individual Assistance, which is a federal assistance program that works directly with individuals and families to compensate for uninsured losses through the provision of limited assistance for home repairs, temporary lodging or other needs, the county

Sign code revamp is now business-friendly

ORANGE PARK – After months of discussion and negotiations, Orange Park Town Council unanimously approved rewritten land development regulations, including a proposal that will eventually eliminate pole signs while still giving the town a facelift.

Council voted on the new regulations on Oct. 18

As originally drafted, the sign ordinance called for small businesses to switch legacy pole and pylon signs for monument signs within 10 years. City officials believed the ordinance would effectively remove sign pollution and keep the town from adopting the cluttered look of Blanding Boulevard.

John Young, co-owner of A Newton & Young Insurance saw this as gross over-reach of the town's power and banded together with the owners of Custom Graphics & Sign Designs, located just outside town limits, to fight back with flyers and discourse among much of the town's business community.

Young, Jamie Thole of Custom Graphics and attorney John Fagan attended town meetings to voice their concerns.



With a few exceptions, new businesses in the Town of Orange Park will be required to install monument signs similar to this sign on Fleming Island.

"I bought the building that had the sign and it was part of the land and the whole package and that they would willy-nilly tell me that I would have to take down a perfectly good sign seemed a bit aggressive,"





Governor commends Clay Electric employees

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS - Gov. Rick Scott stopped by Clay Electric Cooperative's central office on Oct. 20 to congratulate its 420 employees on how swiftly the co-op restored power following Hurricane Matthew.

The cooperative had more than 73,000 members out of power the morning of Saturday, October 8, and in three days all accounts were back in service. "You should be proud of how fast you got it done," said Scott in front of a group of employees gathered to hear his remarks. "I want to thank you for what you do because I know it's a dangerous job."

The governor presented employees with a Hurricane Matthew Disaster Response Medal. All 420 Clay Electric employees will receive a medal. Clay Electric Board of Trustee President Dewitt Hersey also congratulated employees for a job well done, recognizing that getting the power back on required employees to be away from home for many hours. Ricky Davis, Clay Electric's chief executive officer and general manager, said the co-op has the best employees anywhere. Davis said he had daily conversations with the governor during the restoration process, in which Scott asked if the cooperative needed any assistance. Clay Electric mustered a workforce of 650 outside construction and right-of-way contract employees from across the Southeastern states, along with 150 Clay employees. Crews began restoration efforts Saturday, October 8 at 6 a.m., and by Monday, October 10 at 10 p.m., all accessible accounts were back on. Power was restored on two remote islands in the St. Johns River two days later.

Young said. "So we all said look, we need some relief here.'

Much to Young's surprise, it worked and officials subsequently rewrote the ordinance with fairer language. Now, the ordinance applies exclusively to new construction. Previously, the language included a 10-year grandfather clause allowing business owners the time to purchase new signs, which can get pricey.

For instance, Young paid \$5,000 to refurbish his 16-foot sign when he moved his business from Wells Road to Kingsley Avenue in early June. He said he didn't want his investment to go to waste.

In Fagan's case, the proposed ordinance would have made his digital sign noncompliant. For Thole, the decision to fight back came not from a business standpoint, because signs cost on average anywhere from \$2000 to \$30,000. The ordinance would affect roughly 175 businesses by Thole's estimate.

"The elimination of that zone and the incorporation of provisions in other parts of this made it more business-friendly in Orange Park and better thought out from a comprehensive standpoint," said Jim Hanson. Orange Park town manager. "We want to have a commercial friendly environment here so we can get good businesses moving

side, because we're generating the tax revenue that they need and they saw our side," Young said. "I didn't think myself I could have an affect with two or three others, I thought it was going to take a huge rally to join with me. It really didn't require that - it just took some common sense and discussion with. I'm pleased I really am."

There are some stipulations, however. If, for instance, a fast food restaurant moves into Young's business, then a monument sign no more than eight feet in height will have to be installed at the time of movein. Additionally, if vandalism, a natural disaster or natural degradation ruin Young's sign, then he can still replace the sign.

The rewritten ordinance passed along with completely revamped Land Development Regulations. It has been more than 10 years since the town last rewrote these regulations, which provide a guide for zoning, site planning landscaping and building regulations among others. The entire rewrite constitutes a third of the town's code.

The rewrite provides new laws for landscaping which, among other benefits, help ensure business owners either replant the protected trees they remove or pay into a fund to help mitigate tree destruction. The fund will pay for tree replanting for beautification associated with medians and road-

The rewrite also helps apply new zoning laws to establishments that, when the town last updated the code, were rare. For instance, the regulations now provide zoning allowing for food trucks to come and go freely in Orange Park. Previously, food trucks only appeared at town-sponsored events. However, they cannot locate within 100 feet of any other eating establishment.

Town officials say the new regulations will modernize the town as well as slowly reduce urban blight as current businesses give way to new businesses and vacant parcels receive new occupants.

Other projects seek to beautify the town and reduce blight, such as the Kingslev East project to refurbish the curbed medians and parking spots alongside the three-block section of Kingsley Avenue East from U.S. Highway 17 to River Road. Landscaping and decorative lighting will also make the stretch an even more popular destination for locals and tourists alike.

The Kingsley East project is the first major discretionary undertaking on the town's part for many years due to the estimated 10 years of road reconstruction and resurfacing which has taxed the budget.

Project construction will begin in early as 2017 and finish later in the year at the cost of \$802,000.

The town is also in the midst of a state funded project to landscape the now-bald medians along U.S. Highway 17 and Kingsley Avenue.

The \$3.9 million project extends from Bellair Boulevard to Park Avenue and from the Interstate 295 interchange area southward to Milwaukee Avenue. Work includes irrigation, electrical power for the irrigation system and lighting for new, native trees and ground cover.

"In an abundance of caution, she stepped down from that position." Gilhousen said. "I spoke with the Florida Commission on Ethics ... and because the board of directors are not paid - they are strictly volunteers – even with my mother being president of the board, I can vote on the contract without it being a conflict of gave for denying the application was an interest.

In a public hearing during the meeting, three citizens spoke against approving the contract for St. Johns Classical Academy. Prior to September's vote on the application itself, the Clay County Education Association took a stand opposing the approval of the charter school, as did the board's own staff.

Among the 12 reasons the board's staff

unclear and incoherent educational program as well as budgetary concerns.

Charter schools in Florida use public money that would otherwise go to county schoola. St. Johns Classical Academy promotes a "classical education." It has a Judeo-Christian subtext. For example, it may offer Creationism as a scientific alternative to evolution. However, St. Johns Classical Academy mentions no such language on its website or in its mission statement, because it is illegal for publicly funded schools in Florida – or anywhere in the United States - to teach religious-based doctrine, be it Christianity, Judaism, Islam or any faith.

Hillsdale College – a private institution and the parent organization of St. Johns Classical Academy – plainly asserts the Judeo-Christian tradition as part of its widespread educational mission.

Not all charter schools promote a classical education. Opponents of classical-education charters argue that such schools are subverting the law and, essentially, using public tax money to fund what would otherwise be a religious education reserved for private schools.

In an intense back-and-forth, Studdard asked McKinnon to give a definition of "classical education." Several audience members yelled out that they wanted McKinnon to define it as well. McKinnon refused.

'Google it," she told Studdard.

Advocates of charter schools point out that they are less encumbered by what many teachers call excessive standardized testing and having to "teach to the test." While many classical-education schools have a religious bent, other schools promote a "secular classical education," referring to a curriculum in Western-based liberal arts and sciences, rather than a practical, career-oriented curriculum.

St. Johns Classical Academy plans to open - at a yet to be determined location - for the 2017-2018 school year forgrades K-8. It then plans to add one grade level per year, eventually becoming a K-12 school.

Van Zant was voted out of office in the Aug. 30 Republican primary. He was defeated by Addison Davis, chief of schools for Duval County, who has the endorsement of the Clay County Education Association. Davis faces longtime teacher Rebekah Shively, who has no party affiliation, in the Nov. 8 general election, as well as a write-in candidate.

McKinnon was defeated by Argyle Elementary School teacher Mary Bolla.

Two candidates vie for votes in House District 19

PUTNAM COUNTY - On Nov. 8, Clay County voters will choose between two Putnam County men – a veteran union worker and a power plant operator – for House of Representatives District 19, a race that appears fairly low-key up to this

The dip in election fervor is largely due to Crescent City Democrat Hubert "Joe" Snodgrass' cancer diagnosis dating back to early August. It was around this time his opponent, Republican Bobby Payne of Palatka, defeated two candidates in the Aug. 30 primary election.

It was a fierce primary and a decisive victory for Payne, one he largely attributes to his support in Union County, which, along with Bradford and Putnam counties and southern Clay County, make up Dis-

His opponents, Katherine Van Zant and former chairwoman of the Republican Party of Florida Leslie Dougher, fought for control after Republican incumbent Charles Van Zant was term limited out. Many saw Katherine Van Zant as a stand-in for her husband, which perhaps explains Payne's 10-point victory over his closest rival.

USF surveys finds Floridians' trust of government drops

TAMPA – An overwhelming majority of Floridians do not trust leaders at any level of government and 88 percent oppose lengthening term limits for state legislators, according to a new survey published at the University of South Florida.

Florida residents do not give governments high marks for the job they do serving the public, says findings of the 2016 USF-Nielsen Sunshine State Survey. A majority of residents surveyed – 56 percent – identify integrity and honesty as the most important leadership quality. Racial and ethnic differences (24 percent) are the most-cited obstacle to solving major problems compared to 2014 when it was partisan differences (28 percent).

The survey is overseen by professor Susan MacManus at the University of South Florida College of Arts and Sciences and identifies Floridians' stance on emerg-

ing and hot-topic issues. All survey data releases are posted on the USF-Nielsen Sunshine State Survey website, including Quick Facts summaries, infographics in .jpg format, and data analysis with cross

"Floridians have become more critical of government at all levels regarding their leaders' trustworthiness and job performance (public service). A majority values a leader's integrity and honesty above all else," MacManus said. "But Floridians also recognize that solving the state's big problems can be more difficult because of the extremely diverse population which yields differences of opinion about what should be done and how. The most cited obstacle in 2016 is the state's racial/ethnic divide. In 2014, it was the partisan divide between Democrats and Republicans."

Biggest Divide

• Racial/ethnic differences are the biggest divide in the state – Racial/ethnic differences are seen by 24 percent of Floridians as making coalition-building more difficult – an increase of 14 percent since 2014 (the last time the question was asked.) Other responses include elected official/average citizen differences (16 percent), partisan differences (13 percent), income inequalities (12 percent) and generational differences (11 percent). In comparison, the partisan divide was the most cited in 2014 (28 percent), followed by elected official/average citizen differ-

ences (17 percent) and income (rich vs. poor) differences (16 percent). Racial/ethnic differences ranked fourth (12 percent). Infographic: Biggest Divide in State

Leadership and Government Performance

• Most Important Leadership Quality – A majority (56 percent) of Floridians identify integrity and honesty as the most important leadership qualities, followed by consensus-building/bipartisanship (9 percent), consistency (7 percent), good communication skills (7 percent), intelligence (7 percent), compassion (6 percent), and vision (5 percent). Older Floridians look for integrity and honesty at a higher rate than younger Floridians.

• Citizen Trust in Leadership – Leaders at all levels of government received negative trust ratings ("fair" or "poor") from a majority of Floridians. The federal government leaders are trusted least with 80 percent of Florida citizens giving them negative marks. State government leaders fall in the middle—74 percent with "fair" or "poor" evaluations. Females trust government leaders at all levels more than males. Overall, females, older Floridians, and mid-income households assign more positive government performance ratings than their respective counterparts.

• State of Florida: Better or Worse Than Five Years Ago – Almost half (48 percent) of long-term residents think that Florida's livability is the "same" today as five years ago, but slightly more rate it as "worse" (26 percent) than "better" (23 percent). The "worse" ratings are the lowest in 10

FERNANDINA BEACH – The Historical Society of Orange Park will host an outing to Fernandina Beach on Nov. 5.


The group's first stop will be the Ame-

Feeding the wee ones

The Grill Guy's take on Shepherd's Pie

Earlier this month, my wife Lindsey gave birth to and blessed our family with our second daughter.

When you welcome a child into this world, you are greeted with a huge range of emotions and challenges. The first one is finding out who is going to make the coffee in the morning. The second one is finding out when the coffee will be done and if it can be made any earlier.

In all seriousness, one of the greatest hurdles I have had to overcome is what to feed these little rascals. You want your children to grow up feeling good and you want to provide choices so that they have the chance to be healthy.

Knowing that my kids have nutritious options helps me sleep at night. I won't get on a soapbox about this any more than I already have, but sound nutrition is the best health insurance you can give to your children.

With all of that in mind, I developed this recipe based off a household favorite of ours. Shepherd's Pie is something that is always a big hit.

The objective was to make something that is healthy and delicious without sacrificing flavor. The secret is to find a quality ground turkey and a sweet potato that hasn't been stripped of all its nutrients. If you have written off sweet potatoes I ask



you to give them one more chance. This rendition of Shepard's Pie is lighter and doesn't make you want to take a nap afterwards

Shepherd's Pie

- 2 large sweet potatoes chopped
- 1 head cauliflower chopped
- Salt and Pepper
- 1 cup Asiago/Gouda cheese grated and divided
- 3 Tblsp room temperature butter
- Oil (any neutral oil with a high smoke point)
- 1 lb ground turkey
- 1 cup celery diced
- 2 large onions chopped

- 1 Tblsp tomato paste
- 3 Tblsp shelled pumpkin seeds (pepitas)
- Pinch cinnamon
- 1 clove of garlic minced into a paste
- Zest & juice of 1 orange
- 1/2 cup chopped parsley
- 1. Bring a pot of salted water to a boil and add the potatoes & cauliflower until fork tender (about 20 min) and drain.
- 2. Add salt, pepper, cheese & butter to the potato and cauliflower mixture. Mash until smooth and set aside.
- 3. Set up a grill for indirect cooking or preheat an oven to 350-400 degrees
- 4. Using an oven safe, heavy bottomed pan (cast iron is great), warm the oil in the pan and brown the meat in the oil. When



- 5. Add the celery & onions to the same pan with the meat drippings and sauté for 1 minute
- 6. Add the tomato paste & pepitas to the same pan and cook for 1 minute.
- 7. Add the cinnamon, garlic, orange zest, juice, parsley and meat and stir to combine. If the mixture is too dry you can add a splash of water. Season the mixture with salt and pepper to taste.
- 8. Top the mixture with the potato & cauliflower mash and smooth it out using a spoon or silicone spatula.
- 9. Return the pan to the grill (or oven) and bake for 15-20 minutes until the top is golden brown.



Clay County added to list for SBA assistance

ATLANTA - The U.S. Small Business Administration has added more counties to the disaster declaration in Florida affected by Hurricane Matthew.

The disaster declaration now covers the counties of Brevard, Duval, Flagler, Indian River, Putnam, Saint Johns and Volusia in Florida, which are eligible for both Physical and Economic Injury Disaster Loans from the SBA. Small businesses and most private nonprofit organizations in the following adjacent counties are eligible to apply only for SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans: Alachua, Baker, Bradford, Clay, Lake, Marion, Nassau, Okeechobee, Orange, Osceola, Saint Lucie and Seminole in Florida.

Businesses and private nonprofit organizations may borrow up to \$2 million to repair or replace disaster damaged or destroyed real estate, machinery and equipment, inventory and other business assets.

For small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture and most private nonprofit organizations, the SBA offers Economic Injury Disaster Loans to help meet working capital needs caused by the disaster. Economic Injury Disaster Loan assistance is available regardless of whether the business suffered any physical property dam-

Disaster loans up to \$200,000 are available to homeowners to repair or replace disaster damaged or destroyed real estate. Homeowners and renters are eligible up to \$40,000 to repair or replace disaster damaged or destroyed personal property.

Interest rates are as low as 4 percent for businesses and 2.625 percent for nonprofit organizations, and 1.563 percent for homeowners and renters with terms up to 30 years. Loan amounts and terms are set by the SBA and are based on each applicant's financial condition.

Applicants may be eligible for a loan amount increase up to 20 percent of their physical damages, as verified by the SBA for mitigation purposes.

Eligible mitigation improvements may now include a safe room or storm shelter to help protect property and occupants from future damage caused by a similar disaster.

Applicants may apply online using the Electronic Loan Application via the SBA's secure website at https://disasterloan.sba. gov/ela.

To be considered for all forms of disaster assistance, applicants should register online at www.DisasterAssistance.gov or by mobile device at m.fema.gov. If online or mobile access is unavailable, applicants should call the FEMA toll-free helpline at 800-621-3362. Those who use 711-Relay or Video Relay Services should call 800-621-3362.

Additional details on the locations of Disaster Recovery Centers and the loan application process can be obtained by calling the SBA Customer Service Center at 800-659-2955 (800-877-8339 for the deaf and hard-of-hearing) or by sending an email to disastercustomerservice@sba.

The filing deadline to return applications for physical property damage is Dec. 16, 2016. The deadline to return economic injury applications is July 17, 2017.





Spooky spiders and other arachnids

UF/IFAS Environmental Horticulture

Some of the most misunderstood and feared creatures found in the landscape and home are spiders and other arachnids. Around Halloween, many people adorn their homes with fake cobwebs and spiders of various sizes to inspire fright and I know few people who will willingly interact with an eight-legged intruder in their home.

However, many spiders that are seen in Florida are extremely beneficial, eating many pests that actually do harm to our lawns and gardens. This week, we are going to look at some of the most infamous spiders found in our area.

Golden Orb Weaver and Yellow Argiope Spiders

Gone by this time of year, the Golden Orb Weaver spider, Nephila clavipes, which is also known as the banana spider is one of the most noticed and feared in the garden. The female of this species is the most striking, being much larger than the males. Females bodies are often near two inches in length, not counting the legs



while the males are usually less than onequarter inch long. They build large webs during the summer and have the red yellow black coloration across their backs, which betrays their mild venous nature.

Another orb weaver found in our area is the Yellow Argiope, Agriope aurantia, which can be distinguished from the Golden Orb Weaver by a less elongated abdomen and a zig-zag pattern found near the center of the web. Both of these spiders capture prey and then eat it almost imme-

Oftentimes people will accidentally walk into these webs which can be near impossible to see in direct sunlight and panic once they see the size of its owner. The webs can be a nuisance around backvards and pools but can be easily controlled with a rake or broom. If not in the way, leave the webs and let the spiders feed on damaging and biting insects.

Black and Brown Widows

Probably the most infamous name in spiders is that of the Black Widow, Latodectius mactans. The Black Widow, along with the Brown Widow, have a strong venom that creates symptoms similar to tetanus with cramping, muscle pain and hypertension. Bites are very rarely fatal but, to prevent bites, it is important to look before reaching under stones, woodpiles or any dark covered area where spiders may

The Black Widow is usually one-and-ahalf inches long, with females being larger than males. They are identified by their black color, the presence of a red hourglass marking on the underside of their abdomen and smooth white egg sacs.

Brown widows are a similar size but are less distinctive, being gray, brown or black with an orange to yellow hourglass marking on the underside of the abdomen. The egg sac is spiked. Their bites are similar to that of black widows so, if bitten, it is important to try to capture the spider that bit you for identification.

Co-existing Happily

There are many more spider species found throughout our area and co-existence is recommended. Even the Black Widow is known to actually prey on fire ants so the pest control benefit should not be ignored. Most people do want to keep the creatures out of their home and the University of Florida recommends sealing or covering any possible opening for them to enter the home.

If found in the home, webs should be physically removed but most chemical sprays available to homeowners are not very effective. Dust formulations containing diazinon are helpful in crawl spaces, utility areas and attics to provide long term

The county has extended its Local State of Emergency through Nov. 2, which will help to address post-disaster public health and safety concerns.

Hurricane Matthew impacted 85 homes in the county, destroyed one and did major damage to 29 other. In several spots throughout the county, trees are still down and debris is sitting curbside awaiting hauling. Many residents have been accumulating vegetation piles in their yards.

Clarke House Park on Kingsley Avenue is temporarily closed because a tree fell on the park's castle.

The City Pier in Green Cove Springs, which also suffered damage, is closed until further notice.

'This will end up being about a fourweek process," Ward said of the cleanup. 'We're looking at another couple of weeks. It's going slowly because of the extent of

Clay County spans 640 square miles, so cleanup is time-consuming.

"Everybody be patient, we're getting it all done," said Chuck Pavlos, director of public works for the Town of Orange Park.

Crowder Gulf, a disaster recovery company that covers much of the southeastern United States and Texas, is picking up the debris. Landfall Inc., is monitoring the process for FEMA. A handful of other contractors are helping with cleanup.

"Debris contractors can be hard to

come by," said Jim Hanson, Orange Park's not put in bags. town manager. "Up and down the East Coast they're scrambling to get all their available people. In many cases, they're working six or seven days a week to try to get everything done.

"Cranes are even harder to come by. They're reserved for the most urgent situations, like a tree on top of a house."

Tree debris in Clay County must be stacked - not put in trash bags - and placed curbside, separate from normal household trash pickup. Additionally, the County is picking up construction debris, which also must be stacked separately and

No electronics or hazardous waste will be hauled away. Such items should be taken to Rosemary Hill Solid Waste Management Facility.

Wood-chippers will be brought into Orange Park during the coming weeks, with the hopes that much of the debris can be turned into mulch and shipped to a yetundecided location. The town doesn't want to send the chippings to a landfill, because it would cost \$40 per ton.

Cleanup in Green Cove Springs began at the river and is moving westward.

On a cold, winter evening, two Christian men sat before a cozy fireplace, warming themselves. They were discussing their Christian life and experiences.

The younger man expressed the reasons he did not believe that attending church services was important to his Christian experience. The older, more experienced man listened carefully to the younger man's excuses. By this time, the flames of the fire had diminished and only the glowing coals were left in the fireplace.

Carefully, the older man reached out with the fireplace poker and pulled one coal away from the rest of the glowing coals. The one coal, separated from the others, was alone on the hearth. The fire in the single coal quickly died and, instead of a bright red glow, the coal became cold and grev.

Nothing needed to be said. The younger man got the message.

When we separate ourselves from the fellowship of Christian believers, we give up one of the great benefits of the Christian life. The fellowship of other believers is one of the invisible strengths that God has given His people. In corporate worship, we draw strength from the Lord by the encouragement of one to another.

One of the most powerful statements the Apostle John made is recorded in his first epistle. He says that if we walk in the light of Jesus' presence and teaching, "we have fellowship with each other and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin." (1 John 1:7)

The fellowship of Christian believers is a gift of the Father to His children. We deprive ourselves of God's best when we do not meet faithfully with others who share our Love for the Lord.

It is for this reason, we are taught in the Scriptures to continue assembling ourselves together and exhorting one another with encouragement. (Heb. 10:25) It is signally important that you meet with fellow Christians to worship together and encourage each other.

School takes care of 'its family' in wake of Hurricane Matthew

Staff Writer

ORANGE PARK - A normal day for W.E. Cherry Elementary School Principal Angie Whiddon involves the usual daily administration – with a few caveats.

When a student or teacher is in trouble, she writes the name and the need on the back of whatever paper is available and takes funds from the school's Student in Need Fund, which is stocked with donations from local nonprofits and residents.

There are times, however, when the demand becomes too great and the school arranges special accommodations for traumatized communities. They're currently doing this for ailing communities in the aftermath of Hurricane Matthew, which blew through earlier this month.

The school's guidance counselor lives in St. Augustine, which likely saw the worst brunt of damage from the category three hurricane in all of the tri-county area, made of St. Johns, Duval and Clay coun-

"This is a little more than I was expecting myself, people's whole lives are on their front lawn," said W.E. Cherry Bookkeeper Michelle Solomon as she drove through

hired to help with debris removal.

Commissioners also voted to give county officials until 10 a.m. Thursday, Oct. 27, to get an answer from the Federal Emergency Management Agency on reimbursement issues. If no answer is received by then, the commission authorized county staff to move forward with picking up all yard debris anywhere in the county on both public and private roads.

The vote also included authorizing the county manager to write a letter to the county's congressional and legislative delegation to seek help with both the yard debris pick up and clean-up of the St. Johns River. The waters close to Clay County are littered with debris from the break-up of a number of docks — as well as the Shands Pier (not bridge), said County Manager Stephanie Kopelousos.

The county has been reaching out to a number of sources to help in its clean-up program, she said. But it has been frustrated in its clean-up efforts, especially as they pertain to private roads, by shifting FEMA rules governing reimbursement requirements. One thing that has been made clear, however, said Kopelousos, is that no reimbursement will be given without preapproval from FEMA for the work to be done on private roads.

The county has been approved by FEMA for other items, which should make the county reimbursable to a 75 percent to 25 percent match, she said.

"So we've now submitted today the second request to remove private property (debris). It's been a little frustrating for us because we feel like we took the guidance that was in place...and now we're still jumping through hoops," Kopelousos said.

Estimates for the private road pickup run from \$150,000 to \$500,000, she added

While commissioners didn't like the idea of no reimbursement for the work, they said it was more important to help the county's residents, particularly because of the health and safety issues.

"It's frustrating," said Commissioner

Buck Burney, referring to FEMA. "They are boogers and it is one of those things that if you don't jump through the hoops like they want you to jump through the hoops and get all the paperwork you will not get your money back."

"Now saying all of that, I think we've got to move forward. Our people deserve to be taken care of and if that puts us in the hole for whatever we've got to get going with this," he added.

Some 18 trucks are now being used by private contractors in the county, Ward said. They come from as far away as Minnesota, Missouri and Virginia.

More trucks are expected this week. And, with the commissioners' actions at the meeting, Advanced Disposal, the county's regular company for debris pick up, may get into the act, but only when it comes to the smaller piles of debris as it does not have the equipment to deal with the extremely large debris items, officials said.

Kopelousos said if Advanced Disposal is used for debris pick up, it will not be reimbursable.

Ward said work is now being done east of U.S. Highway 17 along Pine Avenue on Fleming Island and in the southern portion of the county, with efforts moving into the central and western parts of the county.

Destruction was the worst in areas along the river, he said.

While Ward said he hoped "we're not 60 days into it doing this," there is no timeline for a conclusion to the project.

"I'm not going to sit here and say we're going to have it done within a week or two because it's unreasonable," he said. "There is heavy debris all over the county and this is an ongoing process."

Ward and all county staff members received a great deal of praise and thanks from the county commissioners for the work they have done throughout the hurricane and its aftermath.

"You guys have done a great job," said County Commissioner Wayne Bolla, who pushed for having a continuation of waiving the dumping fees.

"I know it sounds like a band aid," he said, but added, "That could mean a lot to a lot of folks."

Snodgrass, who has worked in labor unions in every state, might have an even bigger foe to face in the fast-approaching general election — a highly conservative population that has long favored GOP candidates. Republicans in every county in district 19 outweigh Democrats by a substantial margin.

That's not to say a Democrat can't win, however. In 2008, Charles Van Zant beat Democrat Linda Myers of Palatka by three points. Each year since, he was returned to Tallahassee unopposed for four, two-year terms.

What the election then comes down to are the issues. The most apparent issue in District 19 is high poverty, an issue on which both candidates intersect but have different visions for possible solutions.

"[I want to] Raise minimum wage, not all at once, it's a process, the more money a person makes the more money a person spends," Snodgrass said. "If you have no disposable income you're living from hand to mouth. People don't want hand outs, they want a hand up. I'm talking about a solu-

tion."

Payne said he could improve wages in the district by improving public and private partnerships, apprenticeship programs and on the job training for skilled labor, which would increase opportunities for "students who aren't college bound."

Payne comes from the point of view of a job creator. As the general manager of the Seminole Electric power generation plant in Palatka, he touts he has created many higher wage job opportunities in the largely rural district.

Snodgrass comes from the position of a man who has worked with his hands his entire life. "We have improved our unemployment opportunities but we need to make sure every kid coming out of high school has a career path or has some opportunity," Payne said.

On taxes, Payne said it's important to keep taxes low and instead focus on improving the tax base by growing job opportunities in the district.

Snodgrass suggested adjusting gasoline taxes to inflation levels at the year 2000, which he could use to fix roads in the state.

He also said moving money from unnecessary programs would free more money as well as putting an end to tax exemptions for businesses that fail to employ residents at a living wage.

Snodgrass and Payne echo each other on the need for environmental protection, but for slightly different reasons. Payne sees the environment through a fiscally conservative lens as a resource useful for economic benefit. Snodgrass points to the proliferation of phosphate mines as an example of where governments and corporations hollow out entire ecosystems and where that philosophy fails.

"The environment is a gift, it's not something to be exploited, it should be used with responsibility," Snodgrass said.

As both candidates proceed into the general election in less than two weeks, voters will have to decide the candidate they believe will represent them in the House. Ask either of the candidates, however, and they'll both say it's been a grueling year.

Minors arrested in July grand theft case

ORANGE PARK – Clay County Sheriff's Office deputies have arrested three juveniles in connection with a July burglary in which roughly \$30,000 of personal effects were allegedly stolen.

Police arrested Dwight Xavier Miller, 18, of Orange Park, Ledarius Jamal Wingfield, 19, on Oct. 21 after Miller confessed to a July robbery of a house on the 1900 block of Holly Oak Drive that resulted in approximately \$30,000 of lost property, the report said.

A third minor – Zion Elijah Fishburne, 17 – was also listed in the report, but deputies gave no indication that the defendant was ever arrested.

Deputies charged the defendants with burglary of an unoccupied dwelling and grand theft of belongings valued between \$20,000 and \$99,999.

According to the report, the defendants were companions of the victim's son and were originally suspects, according to the report.

Deputies received a call from Miller on Oct. 18 regarding the incident. Upon making contact, Miller agreed to meet officers at the Orange Park Operations Center where he was interviewed in a secure room. There, he told investigators some of the victim's belongings were stored in Wingfield's car, according to the report.

In the car, deputies found two leather bags, a wedding ring valued at \$14,000 and other items belonging to the victim.

Deputies arrested Miller and transported him to a juvenile facility in Jacksonville.

CCFR responds to Keystone Heights wildfire

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – Clay County Fire Rescue responded to a wild land fire on Oct. 24 at approximately 11 a.m. The response came after an emergency 911 call that was placed to the Fire Rescue Communications Center alerting them to the fire at 5534 Smith St. in the Keystone Heights area.

Multiple units with more than 20 firefighters responded with the Florida Forest Service to control the fire. The initial report to the Clay County Fire Department from residences indicated high flames that were spreading fast. The fire involved a lake bed that was the site of the previous Caribbean Circle fire in March 2012. The Caribbean Circle fire grew to 150 acres and one home was destroyed.

No firefighters were injured or structures damaged and the fire was under control at 12:47 p.m. Monday.

The cause of the fire is under investigation by the Florida Forest Service and is estimated to be between five and seven acres.

Life Care Centers of America agrees to pay \$145 million

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Life Care Centers of America Inc., which owns two centers in Orange Park, and its owner, Forrest L. Preston, have agreed to pay \$145 million to resolve a government lawsuit alleging that Life Care violated the False Claims Act by knowingly causing skilled nursing facilities to submit false claims to Medicare and TRICARE for rehabilitation therapy services that were not reasonable, necessary or skilled, the Department of Justice announced Oct. 24.

Life Care, based in Cleveland, Tennessee, owns and operates more than 220 skilled nursing facilities across the country.

"This resolution is the largest settlement with a skilled nursing facility chain in the department's history," said Principal Deputy Assistant Attorney General Benjamin C. Mizer, head of the Justice Department's Civil Division. "It is critically important that we protect the integrity of government health care programs by ensuring that services are provided based on clinical rather than financial considerations."

This settlement resolves allegations that between Jan. 1, 2006 and Feb. 28, 2013, Life Care submitted false claims for rehabilitation therapy by engaging in a systematic effort to increase its Medi-

care and TRICARE billings. Medicare reimburses skilled nursing facilities at a daily rate that reflects the skilled therapy and nursing needs of their qualifying patients. The greater the skilled therapy and nursing needs of the patient, the higher the level of Medicare reimbursement. The highest level of Medicare reimbursement for skilled nursing facilities is for "Ultra High" patients who require a minimum of 720 minutes of skilled therapy from two therapy disciplines (e.g., physical, occupational, speech), one of which has to be provided five days a week.

The United States alleged in its complaint that Life Care instituted corporate-wide policies and practices designed to place as many beneficiaries in the Ultra High reimbursement level irrespective of the clinical needs of the patients, resulting in the provision of unreasonable and unnecessary therapy to many beneficiaries. Life Care also sought to keep patients longer than was necessary in order to continue billing for rehabilitation therapy, even after the treating therapists felt that therapy should be discontinued.

Life Care carefully tracked the minutes of therapy provided to each patient and number of days in therapy to ensure that as many patients as possible were at the highest level of reimbursement for the longest possible period. The settlement also

resolves allegations brought in a separate lawsuit by the United States that Forrest L. Preston, as the sole shareholder of Life Care, was unjustly enriched by Life Care's fraudulent scheme.

"Billing federal healthcare programs for medically unnecessary rehabilitation services not only undermines the viability of those programs, it exploits our most vulnerable citizens," said U.S. Attorney Nancy Stallard Harr for the Eastern District of Tennessee. "We are committed to working with our federal partners to protect both.

As part of this settlement, Life Care has also entered into a five-year chain-wide Corporate Integrity Agreement with the Department of Health and Human Services Office of Inspector General that requires an independent review organization to annually assess the medical necessity and appropriateness of therapy services billed to Medicare.

"Therapy provided in skilled nursing fa-

cilities must be medically reasonable and necessary, and we will continue to vigorously investigate companies that subject their residents to needless and unreasonable therapy," said Daniel R. Levinson, HHS inspector general. "The corporate integrity agreement with Life Care is designed to ensure that it only provides therapy based on the individual needs of each resident."

The settlement, which was based on the company's ability to pay, resolves allegations originally brought in lawsuits filed under the qui tam, or whistleblower, provisions of the False Claims Act by Tammie Taylor and Glenda Martin, former Life Care employees. The act permits private parties to sue on behalf of the government for false claims for government funds and to receive a share of any recovery. The government may intervene and file its own complaint in such a lawsuit, as it has done in this case. The whistleblower reward in this case will be \$29 million.

Expert suggest moderation with Halloween candy

GAINESVILLE - A little candy goes a long way, especially during and after Halloween, according to a University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences nutrition expert.

As with any sugary food, consuming too much Halloween candy is not good for you. said Karla Shelnutt, a UF/IFAS associate professor in family, youth and community sciences and a statewide nutrition Extension specialist.

"It's OK to eat some candy in moderation," Shelnutt said. "I don't think kids should be eating more than one to two pieces of candy a day."

When the kids return home from trickor-treating and they spread their sweets on a table, let them have a piece of candy, even two, she said. But then, parents should space out the rest of the candy over days or even a week or two. Candy also should not replace healthier snacks, such as fruit, Shelnutt said. It's also impor-



tant that parents explain to their children why they shouldn't eat a bunch of candy at once, she said.

More than one-third of American adults are obese, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Obese children ages 6 to 11 increased from 7 percent in 1980 to 18 percent in 2012. The rate for those ages 12 to 19 increased from 5 percent to 21 percent in the same time

In these days of increased eating, obesity and diabetes, it's important to know that children ages six to eight need only

1,200 to 1,600 calories a day, depending on their level of physical activity, Shelnutt said. If they're less active, they only need about 1,200 calories a day. Just one or two candy bars can provide about 10 percent of their daily caloric intake, she said.

Of course, there are safety concerns. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration urges parents to tell their children not to accept – and certainly not eat – any treats that are not commercially wrapped. Thus, Shelnutt urges parents to examine the candy to make sure there's nothing suspicious in it.

According to the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, \$1.9 billion worth of candy is sold each Halloween. Therefore, the academy has its own suggestions to limit sugar and fat intake at Halloween. They suggest, consider not buying candy, don't open the candy too early, donate extra candy and serve each child, instead of leaving candy out for them to eat.

a St. Augustine neighborhood after the storm. "Everything that was in their house is outside by their trash. There's nothing in these houses, everything's outside.'

The elementary school decided to help not only their teacher, but also many affected in the disaster. They posted to the social media network Facebook asking for donations of totes, cleaning supplies, bottled water and restaurant gift cards to add to residents' cleanup efforts following the

The public responded tremendously.

School workers packed two minivans full of supplies and shipped them over to the Nation's Oldest City on Oct. 10, and less than a week later towed a trailer of donated goods held together with bungie

cords to distribute in neighborhoods.

There have been roughly 4,700 flood claims in the state after Hurricane Matthew, and about 2,700 of them have come from St. Augustine. Storm surge poured over the sea barrier and flooded homes and businesses. Officials in St. Augustine estimated damages at several million dollars, and it's unclear how long recovery might

The school has some experience with the exercise, however. On May 3, when Murray Leon Lancaster shot and killed Erica Green Lancaster. Valorie Short and her father, Welland "Buddy" Short, the school brought food donated from families, teachers and parents to first responders, many of whom knew the victims.

"We need to help her, but if we're going to help her then let's try to help as many people in her area as we can," said Assistant Principal Jarrod Eason. "Even though St. Augustine isn't part of Clay County, it is still near and dear to our hearts and it's part of the First Coast community. It's the right thing to do because we're decent people and they're another piece of the W.E. Cherry family.

Eason recalled his time on the island of Guam in the western Pacific Ocean where his father lived while serving in the U.S. Navy. Eason was 11 when a string of typhoons hit his home, ripping the roof off and flooding his cinderblock structure with four inches of water, ruining many of his personal belongings.

He said his experience gives him a special outlook on the situation facing residents of St. Augustine.

Public service is a duty seemingly engrained in the school's psyche, perhaps because the school has made a concerted effort to help their students who struggle the most in their home life due to money

W.E. Cherry is one of seven Title 1 schools in the Clay County School District, meaning it receives federal financial aid to care for the 94 percent of students who live below the poverty line. It is also an "A"

"This is what W.E. Cherry does, we care about people and we're always trying to help," Solomon said. "I sent out a Facebook message to our peeps at W.E. Cherry telling them about the things that people need and we had it. We had two cars full plus two vans, in no time at all."

Williamson said she learned "it doesn't matter what you look like, the biggest thing is it doesn't matter what you look like on the outside, it matters what you look like on the inside, and Danielle is the most beautiful person on the inside." She hopes others in the school also learned something from Catlett's election.

Catlett, on the other hand, said she feels more confident and will undoubtedly take this experience into adulthood.

"I feel like a princess," Catlett said.






Friday v. Palatka final shot for playoffs


push for a team top three finish for coach Al Nesi.





Fleming Island loss ends playoff chase

GAINESVILLE — That is how Fleming Island head coach Damenyum Springs summed up what Gainesville Buchholz senior receivers Luke Whittemore and Bryan Jaszczak did to his Golden Eagles in Fleming Island's 28-14 loss to the Bobcats in Gainesville Oct. 21. Buchholz, 5-2 overall and 3-0 in District 3-7A, clinched the top spot in the district with the win, while the loss eliminated the Golden Eagles, 4-3 and 1-3, from playoff contention.

Whittemore, a Duke commitment, had six receptions for 109 yards and two touchdowns, while Jaszczak snared four balls for 82 yards and another score. The 6'1" Whittemore set the tone on Buchholz's opening possession, hauling in a 36 yard pass over Fleming Island's Jaylan Robinson in the end zone. On the Bobcats' second possession, Kaszczak gained inside leverage on a skinny post, caught a line drive from quarterback Camden Orth at the ten yard line and darted into the end zone to complete a 21 yard score. Whittemore gave the Bobcats a commanding 21-0 lead at the end of the first half on a second post pattern, this time beating sophomore cornerback Aaron Ramirez from 35 yards out.

According to Springs, the cornerbacks covering Whittemore were supposed to be receiving help to the interior of the field from a safety. The assistance never came.

"We could not stop their receivers," lamented Springs afterwards. "They were a

lot faster than we were."

Orth, a sophomore, completed 17 of 24

throws for 224 yards.

The Fleming Island defense played well against the run, limiting the Bobcats to a paltry 48 yards on 22 carries. Robinson had two tackles for loss, while Marquavian Wright had two sacks. But the inability to contain the Bobcats' aerial attack and to establish their own running game sealed the Golden Eagles fate.

Fleming Island crossed the 50 yard line once in the first half, but was forced to punt when Bobcats' defensive end Chris Rumph, who was unblockable all night, and Adam Kinney combined to sack Golden Eagles quarterback K.B. Ashe. Rumph finished with a sack and three and a half tackles for loss.

Led by outside linebacker/receiver Jackson Bull, the Golden Eagles came out determined to make the game competitive after the intermission. The junior knifed in and chopped down Bobcats' running back Khauriee Sullivan for a loss on fourth and one from the Golden Eagles 35 yard line to halt Buchholz's opening drive. He then gathered in an underthrown ball from Ashe for 36 yards, ran for nine yards as a wild-cat quarterback, and rammed the ball over the goal line on fourth down from the two yard line to get the visitors on the board with 5:59 left in the third quarter. Bull finished with 132 all-purpose yards.

"phoenix" into the thunderous ball carrier he was as a sophomore before a knee injury.

Wilson pounded the Wildcat front line in three straight carries from the Clay 20 to the Baker County 41 looking to be as destructive as ever. Clay quarterback Jaylan Jenkins took his speed off the right corner to the Baker County 39 before going back to Wilson for five carries to the Wildcat four yard line.

Smelling a momentum altering next play in the hostile Baker County crowd, Clay stalled to holding flag, a sack by Wildcat linebacker Shaquan Griffin and an errant end zone pass on fourth down left Clay zeroed.

"The opening drive was great until our touchdown was called back on a holding call from the two yard line," said Hoekstra. "We didn't execute again in the red zone, called a pass to be thrown to Ajay (wideout Belanger) in the endzone and the ball was thrown to the flat."

Wilson and company rolled again down the field with a handful of handoffs to Wilson and Brown, who blasted Menendez for 261 yards and five scores last week, that ended with Wilson fighting off two tacklers at the end of a 25 yard scoring run.

Baker County again got movement quickly on the ground with a gaping hole greeting tailback Chris Smith who sauntered 43 yards to the Clay 25. Two plays later, quarterback Joe Green took a draw the rest of the way for a 14-7 Wildcat lead with 10:22 to the half.

Clay got stuck in their end of the field for the rest of the half, but the Blue Devil defense kept the Wildcats near midfield as the half ended. One key play was a missed pass attempt to Belanger who had gotten behind the Wildcat defense, but could not grab a near-perfect toss from Jenkins.

"We felt good about moving the ball on them and our coaches and players did a good job of staying calm," said Hoekstra. "We knew it would be a four quarter ball game."

Clay stuffed four plays from Baker County as the third period opened then used the surge to go 45 yards in five plays with Brown scoring from 13 yards out to tie the game at 14-14.

Starting at their own 30, Baker County again found the edge of the Blue Devil defense and Harmon rumbled 59 yards to the Clay 33 before linebacker Evan Martin made a touchdown saving tackle. An apparent fumble recovery from middle linebacker Rico Schnitzler was not approved and Harmon hit paydirt from 23 yards out to put the Wildcats back up 21-14 with 4:13 left in the third.

Hoekstra tried again to bait the Wildcat defense in tight before going over top again to Belanger who got just his fingertips on a long ball from Jenkins a second time.

The missed pass led to a five play scoring drive for Baker County that pushed the scored to 28-14 with 11:33 left in the game. Clay would get to the Baker County 10 yard line on the ensuing drive, but Wilson was stopped on a fourth and two at the Wildcat 10 yard line. Baker County stayed with their ground game to grind the clock and got a fourth down interception with 1:45 left in the game to end the game.

ORANGE PARK – The Orange Park Raiders and Palatka Panthers went score for score for three quarters but the Panthers eventually took control late for a 34-20 district 5-5A victory in one of the more exciting second halfs this season. The loss essentially ends any playoff hopes for Raider first-year coach Tom Macpherson.



"Bull gives us a lot of speed and toughness," said Springs. "As long as he grows, he will be a star."

Buchholz completely neutralized Fleming Island's running game. The Bobcats notched 10 tackles for loss, four by Rumph, and four sacks. The Golden Eagles gained only 83 yards on 41 carries, and even that yardage total was inflated by several lengthy scrambles by Ashe on aborted pass plays. Buchholz seemed especially intent on shutting down Anfernee McCaskill, and they did so. The speedster had minus one rushing yard on six carries, and his only reception went for a loss of eight yards.

Neither Ashe nor freshman Dean Hyams could consistently deliver big plays through the air to sustain drives, though Ashe had some success late in the game. The pair combined to complete 9 of 20 passes for 112 yards. Ashe led Fleming Island rushers with 68 yards on 17 carries, and scored the game's final touchdown on a trick play from 22 yards out with 0:12 remaining. Ashe took the snap and lateraled to running back Kesean Young running right, who then reversed his field and ran left, pitching the ball back to Ashe, who was shadowing him as if Young had an option to run or pitch. Ashe sped to the outside, turned the corner and dived over two tacklers into the end zone.

"The execution on that play showed that as long as there is time on the clock, we keep fighting," said Springs.

With two games remaining in the season but with no hope of reaching the playoffs, the Golden Eagles must find motivation as they host Jacksonville Ed White in its final home game of the season Friday at 7:30.

"We have got to play for pride, and send the seniors off in a good fashion," said Springs




