

Veterans Choice program still working out the kinks

MIDDLEBURG — Fred Holdsworth grew up in Philadelphia in the 1950s. He was into baseball and hanging out with his friends from the neighborhood. Every year, he and his family came to Florida to visit relatives in St. Augustine.

When he was in his 20s, Holdsworth was drafted by the Army. He spent nearly two years in Vietnam, and he brought home a souvenir that he still carries with him today — shrapnel in his right arm,

which limits his motion and causes intermittent pain, and in his right eye, out of which he can still see, but often has discomfort. He also walks with a permanent limp.

"I was one of the lucky ones," he said. His unit, while on routine patrol in a small village, was ambushed by the Viet Cong. Holdsworth dove on top of a South Vietnamese woman and her child to shield them from a grenade that blew up a nearby hut. Many other soldiers didn't survive

Green Cove Springs, dragway seek to limit noise

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — Friday night racing at Green Cove Dragway is suddenly a thing of the past, but the racetrack will remain up and running, at least for now.

After an undisclosed number of noise complaints from nearby residents, the track's owner, Peter Scalzo, vowed to the Green Cove Springs City Council Tuesday night that he will end Friday night racing – effective immediately – and that racing will stop by 10 p.m. on Saturdays.

"I want to do whatever it takes to be in compliance," Scalzo said at a packed special city council session. "Whenever there have been issues, I've always fixed them right away. I'm going to meet with the code

Coastal Spine and Pain agrees to \$7.4 million fine

JACKSONVILLE - Physicians Group Services, P.A., doing business as Coastal Spine and Pain, has agreed to pay \$7.4 million to the government to resolve allegations that the company violated the False Claims Act by performing medically unnecessary drug screening procedures.

The settlement relates to Coastal's use "Quantitative Drug Tests," tests that identify and count particles of illicit drugs in patients' urine. The use of quantitative drug tests – tests that are very specific and also very expensive – is appropriate only if there is reason to doubt the more general and cheaper qualitative drug test screens.

The government contends that Coastal appropriately performed qualitative drug tests for its patients. However, the U.S. contends that, regardless of the result of the less expense qualitative test, Coastal performed and billed for quantitative drug tests for all patients. The government contends this was medically unnecessary, as there was no reason to question or further confirm previous qualitative urine drug testing screens.

"The United States Attorney's Office is



committed to taking the steps necessary to protect Medicare, TRICARE, and other federal health care programs from fraud. When health care practitioners conduct medical tests, they must only bill for them when it is appropriate and medically necessary. We will vigorously pursue providers that perform tests indiscriminately, regardless of need," said A. Lee Bentley III, federal prosecutor on the case.

This case was developed through the proactive review of claims data. Coastal was a statistical outlier in terms of billing for quantitative drug test screens. In fact, in each and every instance that Coastal

billed for a qualitative drug test screen, it also billed for a quantitative drug test screen. This statistical outlier prompted questioning and investigation by the Department of Justice.

"New and expanded uses of data analytics to identify suspicious billing patterns, such as in this case, are providing law enforcement agencies with powerful investigative tools to combat fraud and abuse in federal health care programs," said Shimon Richmond, Health and Human Services, Office of the Inspector General, Special Agent in Charge. "Medicare should only be paying for medical tests to improve the health of beneficiaries, not the profit margins of unscrupulous physicians. Today's settlement should serve as notice to others that fraud will be vigorously pursued.'

This civil settlement illustrates the government's emphasis on combating health care fraud and marks another achievement for the Health Care Fraud Prevention and Enforcement Action Team, or HEAT initiative, which was announced in May 2009 by the Attorney General and the Secretary of HHS. The partnership between the two departments has worked to reduce and prevent Medicare and Medicaid financial fraud through enhanced cooperation.

One of the most powerful tools in this effort is the False Claims Act. Since January 2009, the Justice Department has recovered more than \$30 billion through False Claims Act cases, with more than \$18.3 billion of that amount recovered in cases involving fraud against federal health care programs.

"We appreciate the support from the Department of Justice in protecting the TRICARE benefit from fraud and helping to ensure the benefit continues to exist for our service members, families, and retirees," said Vice Admiral Raquel Bono, director of the Defense Health Agency.

The case was investigated with assistance from the Department of Health and Human Services Office of Inspector General and the Defense Criminal Investigative Service. It was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Jason Mehta.

The claims resolved by this settlement are allegations only, and there has been no determination of liability.

enforcement officer, and we're going to go over what I have to do."

In turn, the city council unanimously voted 5-0 to give Scalzo until May to bring Green Cove Dragway at Reynolds Industrial Park into compliance with the terms of its special events permit, which includes noise regulations and other city codes. When the permit expires in May, the council will consider imposing codes associated with regular businesses, assuming the track has complied with the special events permit by then.

"It can no longer be called a special event, because it's basically a year-round thing," City Manager Danielle Judd said. "We instituted the special event permit three years ago, to try to be accommodating to the participants as well as the rest of the community. ... And there have been compliance issues.'

In a nearly 90-minute session, nine people, including Scalzo, spoke in support of continuing drag races at the track.

"Me and my family, we come every weekend that we can," David Wade, a Putnam County resident, said. "It's a family event. There's a zero-tolerance policy for

drugs and alcohol."

Other speakers pointed out the revenue that weekend races bring into the city, but Council Member Van Royal pushed back.

"That's true, but people who live here pay property taxes and bring money to the city, and they expect a certain quality of life," said Royal, who was on vacation but

weighed in via conference call. "I'd like to have the track be part of the community. but it needs to be in compliance.

"I'd also suggest to Mr. Scalzo that you come up with a site plan, as a permanent business would. This is a real event, all

Council Member Steven Kelley recom-

mended that Green Cove Dragway limit its competition to six months per year, with an offseason. He suggested it would generate even greater interest and would fall under the special event parameters.

Several citizen speakers wondered aloud why no one in opposition to the track came to express their views at the special

"They may be intimidated, because all of you are here," Mayor Pam Lewis said. "Or maybe they don't want to spend their night here. Part of our job is to represent them, as we represent the community as a whole. That's why we're here."

Noise levels in Green Cove Springs aren't supposed to exceed 55 decibels. The dragway has passed that limit several

Vice Mayor Mitch Timberlake suggested reversing the direction of the track's races – south to north instead of north to south - which could cut down on noise as well as exhaust fumes in the direction of

In other action, during the regular session, the council voted 4-0 (Royal had left the meeting) to instruct staff to come up with a moratorium ordinance related to medical marijuana, in the event it's approved in the November general election referendum. The moratorium likely would be 6-12 months.

Symposium to discuss cancer's toll on the body

ORANGE PARK – The air hangs antiseptic with barbicide as Barbara Zwilling sits in an adjustable barber stool, clippers pressed to her scalp. The clippers buzz, her hair falls to the floor in thick clumps. To add levity to the ceremony, her hairdresser leaves a bit on top and spikes it

into a pink Mohawk. But as Zwilling looks into the mirror, she can hardly recognize herself.

"It took me three days before I could let my husband see me bald," said Zwilling, an Orange Park resident. "I didn't want him to see me bald, it was big. That

meant the cancer was real."

Doctor's diagnosed Zwilling with breast cancer in August 2013. Come October,

she was already in chemotherapy. Eight rounds of chemotherapy later, doctor's put a double mastectomy surgery on the table. Zwilling and her husband of 35 years discussed her options and decided to take the operation without breast reconstruction.

"He did not push me, my decision to not have reconstruction was mine," Zwilling said

She left the hospital that day wearing a camisole with breast cups to cover what she had lost that day. Things had changed. Her decision to have the double mastectomy was only the beginning of a much larger conversation with her husband and herself about how to handle a different identity.

Often, however, couples never have the conversation, according to Noelle Pomeroy of Jacksonville, who holds a doctorate in clinical sexology.

Seemingly a taboo wrapped inside a taboo, discourse about sexual problems after cancer is often negligible between partners. Concerns over self-image after

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Florida wildlife officials should consider ban on venomous snakes as pets



News that yet another venomous snake escaped from a Florida home – this time a cobra in the South Florida city of Homestead – should concern all Floridians. Although many states ban private ownership of venomous snakes, Florida does not.

Coincidentally, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission is scheduled to consider tightening the rules regarding possession of venomous snakes at its Sept. 9 meeting in St. Augustine.

Venomous snakes are not suitable as pets and individuals who harbor venomous reptiles such as cobras, vipers, or mam-

Dispatches from Japan

"I'm moving to Japan." I said those words constantly.

Every time someone asked me where I would be when I graduated college, that was always my answer. There was no

other option for me, but even with such resolve for so many years, even as I sit in a small town called Yosano tucked away in the mountains of Kyoto, I have to stop myself. "I moved to Japan."

A part of me believed the day would never come when I

could say that. Knowing that for the rest of my life I can proudly say "I lived in Japan" is an almost surreal feeling. Multiple times a day I will look around me and remind myself that I am in a foreign country. A goal, almost a decade in the making, was finally achieved.

The town I'm in now is small and surrounded on all sides by mountains. Being from Florida, where the majority of the land is flat as a board, this is fascinating. In the month since I've arrived, I've become well acquainted with the town, but every time I ride my bike, I am finding new things. There are small shops hidden behind normal-looking doors. There are centuries of history around every corner, if you are willing to look.

The next 11 months of my life will be a whirlwind of new experiences, many cultural faux-pas, opportunities to learn and opportunities to teach. I jumped on a plane to come to a country in which I had spent a total of nine days prior to my arrival. I don't speak the language and the closest family member I have is a 14-hour plane ride away. At this point, I don't think anything else can scare me.

Exploring the town of Yosano has been quite the adventure. Everywhere I have lived, the main mode of transportation has been in a car. Japan, however, drives on the left side of the road, making driving a scary experience for me. To remedy this, I decided to hold off on renting a car, and now my main mode of transportation is a bike; which may sound like a good idea until I realize that the town I'm in is rural and the closest anything is at least a kilometer from my house.

The town, however, is beautiful. For the first time in my life, I rode my bike to do my weekly grocery shopping. For the first time, I rode a bike through rice fields surrounded on all sides by mountains and I guess that's how I can describe the past month. It has been a month of firsts. I paid rent for the first time in my life. I'm in charge of my own house for the first time in my life. I am relying on a bike to get me anywhere I need to go. I've met people from South Africa, The United Kingdom, Barbados and Australia. People from all over the world came together with a similar goal — to teach English.

For the first time in my life, I am the foreigner. I'm from the odd place that is not Japan and that's all they know about me. I walk in the grocery store and I have to stop to think that I'm the only American in that store. I'm even the only American in my part of town. I walk through halls and everyone looks at me because I'm not Japanese, but I've never felt unwelcomed.

Children will go out of their way to talk to me in hopes of practicing their English. I stood in line at a festival and was approached by a young girl who just wanted the chance to practice the phrase "Hello, how are you?" and "Where are you from?" These phrases may seem simple, but I left that conversation with a smile on my face

down the avenues playing music I've never heard. This was the part of town I liked.

Five artists stuffed themselves into a three-bed, one-bathroom house.

Kevin, a drummer whose biceps were boulders, crashed on the couch with a



Power Rangers pillow. Juan, who would scrub the toilet of a burning house, played piano in his room. Down the narrow hallway across from him, Chuck plucked his bass in his room and – when he could sleep – slept poorly and kept a tally on everyone he figured didn't like him.

I slept in the upstairs loft with Joe. Me, on a yellowed mattress without sheets. He, on a narrow slice of futon we found in the trash next to a wedding photo a week earlier.

They were all in a rock band which changed names three times and opened a show for a hip-hop group in a bar once.

While painting, Joe asked me once why I write. I told him I write to fill the trash-

Everyone except for Kevin worked. All minimum wage jobs ranging from veggie arranger in a health foods store to tutor, but after rent and electricity and student loan payments – we were broke and couldn't eat properly, so I lost 40 pounds in six months.

Increasingly throughout the six months, I noticed Chuck and Joe whisper in their room across that narrow hallway from

Juan and Kevin, who whispered in their room.

I sat on the spiral staircase between both rooms leading to the loft one night and listened.

"Man, Chuck never practices, never cleans, never does anything," Juan said from the other side of his door.

And Kevin agreed and called Chuck lazy, unmotivated.

"Juan is just crazy. All he does all day is practice – I work more hours than him, I can't just practice all day like he can,"

Joe agreed and said Juan couldn't understand the position Chuck was in with his demanding job.

Caught in the middle, all I could do was report what they said to each other and hope everyone would work together to fix everything.

Come winter, Chuck and Juan stopped speaking to each other.

By summer, we had found new, exciting ways to show our disdain. We found new words to describe each other. We kept our fists balled. We blamed each other for our sunburns and sore backs. We created a soundless vacuum between us in that little hallway and quietly hoped we would all go away until the lease was up.

In my time acting as the messenger pigeon for Juan and Chuck's complaints, never once did they blame the courier for their problems.

In my time as a reporter, however, I've witnessed some in Clay County do just that.

Sometimes it manifests on bandit signs that look like a toddler conceptualized it on the back of a Denny's tablemat then designed it on Microsoft Paint.

Other times, the vendetta materializes in "forgotten" media invites to press conferences and dismal support for school

- The Sept. 3 primary resulted in 20,848 voters casting ballots in the Sept. 3 primary for a 30.2 percent voter turnout. At the time, Clay County had 69,014 registered voters
- Ten fire units from four Clay County Fire Department stations and two units from the Orange Park Fire Department responded to a fire at the fully-engulfed Meninac Lodge at Camp Echockotee on Doc-

- Virgil Fox, representing J.P. Hall and Son Inc., asked the Green Cove Springs City Council to consider extending water lines down U.S. Highway 17 to Reynolds Industrial Park and Hall Park to accommodate a 300,000-400,000 square foot food distribution facility that would create 200 jobs.
- Green Cove Springs City Council voted 5-0 to hire Kim D. Leinbach of Coralville, Iowa to become the next city manager.

40 Years Ago, 1976

- In negotiations with the Clay County School District, teachers lowered a request for a 17 percent raise to a 12 percent raise, while district officials said 3.9 percent was as high as the budget could handle.

bas pose special dangers to emergency responders and the community. Snakes can attack in the blink of an eye. While some caging may be more secure and structurally sound than others, there is no such thing as an escape-

proof cage or a zero percent chance of human error.

Too many Florida communities have had to deal with escaped snakes. Families, children and pets are endangered when snakes escape into neighborhoods and public safety

workers risk injury or even death while searching for dangerous reptiles at large. In addition, taxpayers routinely foot the bill for costs related to escapes, attacks and confiscations, since police, animal control and other emergency personnel must respond to these incidents.

When a 10-foot King Cobra escaped from a home near Orlando, snake handlers and wildlife officers searched the home and wooded 10-acre property and set traps. Four officers were stationed at the perimeter of the property to watch for the snake and other officers searched a nearby elementary school. The school canceled all outdoor activities and parents were asked to accompany students who walked or biked to school. The cobra was on the loose for five weeks before being discovered by a woman who heard hissing from under the washing machine in her garage.

All too often, taxpayer-funded zoos absorb the costs of supplying antivenin when a private owner gets bitten. Antivenin,

especially for exotic snake species, is expensive, can be difficult to locate, and may have to be flown in from another state. Depleting antivenin supplies to save the life of a pet owner puts zoo professionals at risk. The fact that many reptile collectors keep more than one species of venomous reptile has created confusion for paramedics and hospital emergency room staff about what antivenin a person — who is often unconscious — needs once bitten.

All reptiles require specialized expertise and care and many suffer from starvation, dehydration, parasites, respiratory infections, mouth rot and other symptoms of neglect when kept in private hands. The majority of reptile owners have their pets for less than one year. Some animals die due to poor care, while others may be abandoned or, as has been graphically demonstrated in Florida, intentionally released outdoors.

Because they are often inexpensive and easy to acquire, venomous snakes are growing in popularity in the pet trade and this problem will escalate without commonsense regulations.

Florida must implement rules to prohibit the possession of venomous reptiles as personal pets.

Floridians should contact the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission at Commissioners@MyFWC.com or (850) 488-4676 and urge the commissioners to limit the possession of dangerous venomous reptiles to facilities accredited by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums, or the Global Federation of Animal Sanctuaries. These facilities have the knowledge, experience and resources to provide safe, humane care to reptiles. This is the best way to ensure public safety and animal welfare.

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W.E. Cherry Elementary flourishes despite challenges

ORANGE PARK — Despite a swollen poverty rate and stalled school system, W.E. Cherry Elementary School has continued to defy its numbers and expectations to a point that the Florida Education Foundation contacted them to find out how.

In late August, the executive director of the Florida Education Foundation visited with the school's administrators to glean how to reproduce the school's successes. His response encapsulated what administrators and faculty knew all along — "Culture eats strategy for breakfast every day."

"The traditional kind of conventional wisdom — which I think is wrong — is a school that serves so many economically disadvantaged kids can't be expected to succeed," said Tracy A. Pierce, executive director of the Florida Education Foundation. "I think what Cherry really represents is a truth that we can be very successful with economically disadvantaged kids. We can't use poverty as an explanation or excuse and I think Cherry really proves that."

W.E. Cherry is somewhat of an enigma in the school district. Despite the Florida Department of Education downgrading the district to a "B" rating, the school re-

claimed the "A" rating it held for nine of the last 11 years. The school's poverty rate among students jumped to 94 percent in the last 11 years, a 55 percent increase.

These numbers earned the school 10th best in the state for schools with a poverty rate higher than 90 percent, but it's a ranking that came as no surprise to the staff and faculty who see the school's results every day.

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

that day.

"I got a purple heart, but who wants one?" Holdsworth said. "I thought the doctors and nurses were going to patch me up and send me back out into the field, but they said, 'No, you're going home.' So I'm thankful for that."

Decades later, Holdsworth, 72, still comes down to Northeast Florida from Philly, along with his wife Rachel, for roughly four months each year. It's where he often happens to receive health checkups and treatment from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, which has facilities in and around Jacksonville.

"It's a pain in the you know what," Holdsworth said. "There are long waits, you have to wait on results. It's almost always a frustrating experience in one way or another."

Holdsworth is like many vets for whom receiving health care from the VA has been a struggle. In some cases, patients have died of cancer and other illnesses while waiting for treatment. In other instances, patients have had to drive several hours to reach the nearest VA facility.

A few years ago, after a series of media investigations, the American public was appalled when these issues, as well as poor conditions at several VA hospitals around the country, came to light.

The Response

Amid the outrage emerged the Veterans Access, Choice and Accountability Act of 2014 or "Veterans Choice" for short.

In a rare bipartisan effort, Congress hurriedly set aside \$10 billion for veterans to receive health care at participating hospitals outside the VA system, with pending renewal of the temporary program slated for 2017. An additional \$5 billion was allocated to the VA for hiring physicians and staff and improving infrastructure.

The main requirements to enroll in Veterans Choice are either a VA appointment wait-time of at least 30 days, or living 40 miles or more from the nearest VA facility. Eligible veterans receive a Choice Card, which they use when seeking care from non-VA providers.

In May of this year, St. Vincent's Medical Center Clay County, along with the entire Ascension network in eligible states, became a participant in the Veterans Choice program.

"We're here for our veterans," said James Machado, president of St. Vincent's Medical Center Clay County, who served 10 years active-duty in the Air Force. "The VA will always have its place, and this program is an extension of the VA to help veterans gain access to the care they need."

Machado said St. Vincent's Clay has chosen to prioritize veterans' health, right down to a handful of parking spots close to the main entrance that are reserved for vets

Though the program is in its infancy at St. Vincent's, Veterans Choice has found

some success throughout the country, cutting down on wait times in many places and simplifying access. Also, electronic medical records have made coordinated care easy between the VA and affiliated private providers.

"Since we've started the program here, I haven't heard of any negative issues," Machado said. "We do everything we can to see patients as quickly as possible. It's vitally important."

The Problems

Veterans Choice came about quickly. It was up and running in many places within 90 days of the legislation's passing.

The initial success at St. Vincent's Clay notwithstanding, the program has had significant setbacks in various parts of the

country. It has been plagued by some of the very issues it was created to solve — namely, the waiting game, with familiarly long waits for appointments, approvals for tests and procedures, and for a Choice Card from the VA

Also, in some cases, physicians have had to wait as long as a year to be paid for their services through Veterans Choice, causing some providers to drop out of the program.

"Things are moving at government speed, which means very slow," said Tom Rentz, Service Officer of VFW Post 8255 in Middleburg, who retired from the Army as a Sergeant Major in 2011. "That needs to change. It's still like any bureaucracy."

More than 1.5 million veterans live in Florida, including 140,000 in Northeast Florida, according to the U.S. Census Bureau, so demand for veterans' care in this region is likely to swell.

"Different patients are going to have different perspectives on Veterans Choice," said Rentz, who spends much of his time helping to facilitate health care and benefits for veterans. "That's just the nature of it, depending on what condition you may have and how urgent your medical needs are, just like with the VA.

"The thing is, if you know how to navigate online, there are actually a lot of resources there," Rentz said. "But we're losing a lot of Vietnam people every day, because many of them aren't computer literate. It's really sad. ... No matter how young or old you are, the process can be overwhelming with a lot of red tape."

Rentz emphasized that any veteran who fears that he or she may have an emergent health issue will be accepted at any emergency room. He also recommended using patient advocates to help navigate the Veterans Choice network.

"And you can always call your VA number and dial "0" for a help directory," he said. "It seems basic, but it's one place to start."

The Pushback

Machado's service in the Air Force, during which he spent time at numerous military hospitals and observed a wide range of health conditions, gave him a unique perspective.

"The thing is, for a lot of military folks, they're used to the traditional VA structure, so they're hesitant to go outside of that structure with Veterans Choice," he said

Also, fear exists among many vets that privatized care will eventually replace the VA, which, despite its shortcomings, many veterans rely on and trust.

Early last year, American Legion National Commander Michael Helm told Congress, "We applauded emergency legislation to allow veteran patients to use non-VA providers if they were waiting a month or longer to see a doctor or if they lived far from VA facilities. But we oppose privatization or vouchering out of VA care as a long-term solution."

The setbacks that have dogged Veterans Choice have only stoked skepticism about the program. To prevent the perceived "slippery slope" of phasing out VA care in favor of privatization, many veterans groups have been proactively opposing the expansion of Veterans Choice to cover all vets regardless of VA wait times or distance

Last November, a poll by the Portland, Ore.-based Vet Voice Foundation, which was jointly conducted by a Republican-backed firm and a Democratic-backed firm, found that two-thirds of veterans oppose privatization of care. Among their reasoning — vouchers may not cover all costs,

private insurance companies may prioritize profit over care, and it's the VA's responsibility to provide quality health care for veterans instead of pawning them off to private insurers.

Adding to the confusion, when Veterans Choice was instituted, no data-based methods of measuring its success were included with the legislation. Any evidence of its pros and cons, at least to this point, is anecdotal.

The Verdict

The overall effectiveness of Veterans Choice is yet to be determined. It varies widely in different locations. So far, so good at St. Vincent's Clay, but it only began here four months ago.

As for Holdsworth, he is cautiously optimistic

"I hope it turns out to be a helpful thing, but we'll see," he said.

Renewal of Veterans Choice seems likely, even if expansion doesn't. But Congress is already feeling pressure over the program's stumbles.

"It's meant to supplement the VA, not replace it," Machado said. "It's a new program, so it's going to have some wrinkles that need to be ironed out, but it's a good first step.

"If you need help, call us or call the VA to get things rolling," he said. "Don't wait. Make the call."

Hurricane Hermine leaves Clay Electric customers powerless

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – Although most of Clay County missed severe damage from last weekend's scare from Hurricane Hermine, about 43,000 customers of Clay Electric Cooperative lost power.

As of 5 p.m. on Sept. 2, 16,000 accounts were still without power, down from 43,000 accounts at 7:30 a.m. The coop brought in 130 workers from four states to help restore 27,000 accounts alone on Sept. 2.

Clay Electric moved 121 additional outside linemen and all available Clay Electric construction personnel to assist crews in the Gainesville and Lake City districts the morning of Sept. 3. All crews were asked to remain in the Gainesville and Lake City districts until all services are restored.

Power company officials said the outages were caused by Hermine's gusty winds, which peaked at around 55 to 60 mph across portions of the co-op's service area.

Most of the power outages were due to trees and limb debris on power lines.

The cooperative's Gainesville and Lake City districts were the most impacted by the storm since those areas were closest to the path of Hurricane Hermine.

As of 5 p.m. Sept. 2, here are the latest outage numbers by district:

Gainesville district – 8,500; Lake City district – 6,262; Keystone Heights district - 726: Orange Park district - 348: Palatka district – 22; Salt Springs district – 86.

The cooperative had crews working until 3 a.m. on Sept. 2 to respond to outages related to Hurricane Hermine. These crews were recalled when storm conditions made it unsafe to continue work. Work resumed at safe light the next day.

Outside crews began working with Clay Electric personnel and more outside crews arrived in an effort to speed up the restoration process. Eight construction crews from a Mississippi electric co-op arrived in Gainesville on Sept. 2 and helped with restoration efforts.

Officials asked members to remain patient as crews worked as quickly and safely as they could to restore power to as many people as possible as soon as possible.

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

Oakleaf Band trying to change the world

OAKLEAF — In January, Benjamin Hall found himself at a restaurant in Ouagadougou, the capital city of Burkina Faso, in West Africa, just south of Mali and northeast of Ivory Coast.


The 29-year-old architect was among six Americans who, along with six African counterparts, had teamed up with the buildOn organization to design and construct schools in impoverished areas of the world. The group of 12 men and women were celebrating a successful project in a nearby village, which would become a new prototype for future schools.

Only 10 of them made it out of the restaurant alive that day.

As the group dined and chatted and laughed, a hail of gunfire broke out in the street.

"We knew right away what was happening," Hall said. "The restaurant was being targeted by terrorists."

Members of Al-Qaida in the Islamic Maghreb murdered anyone in their path, unleashed grenades, set fire to buildings

and stormed the restaurant.

"We ran. We hid in the bathroom for an hour and 15 minutes as the attackers came in and out," Hall said.

The group's African driver was gunned down before he could escape. Ahmed Kere, a 32-year-old African humanitarian worker with the group, a devout Muslim who liked R. Kelly and soccer and was engaged to be married, tried to broker peace.

He was executed at point-blank range.
"He was trying to de-escalate conflict," Hall said. "That's the kind of person

Eventually, the terrorists moved on. Smoke filled the restaurant as it burned. Hall and nine colleagues made a run for it and survived, but 26 people died in the attack.

"It reaffirmed for me the need to help these places, to help provide education and a future," said Hall, a native of Springfield, Mo., who founded the organization For Burkina to raise money. "When kids in some of these places don't have an education or any hope for a way out, they can become susceptible to terrorism, to terrorist recruitment."

Ben Hall's older brother Jonathan, 32, was inspired by this harrowing experience. Jonathan Hall also happens to be

the band director at Oakleaf High School in Clay County.

"I wanted to do something," Jonathan Hall said. "High school bands are always doing fundraising projects, but we wanted to differentiate ourselves. I wanted to find a way to have the kids be part of something bigger than themselves."

Jonathan got the idea of branding and selling coffee.

"This isn't a door-to-door thing," he said. "It's a good product that we want to get into stores and into the community."

Jonathan partnered with Bold Bean Coffee Roasters, a Jacksonville-based company, which was eager to get involved.

"We don't just get into stuff as a moneymaking opportunity, we want to be part of a bigger cause," said Zack Burnett, a Bold Bean managing partner, speaking via cellphone on his way back from a trip to Colombia. "That fits into the vision for our company.'

Bold Bean works directly with roasters and growers in Colombia, Brazil, Guatemala, Costa Rica, El Salvador and Ethiopia to source its beans.

"The quality of their coffee was very important to me," Jonathan said. "We wanted to sell something that people would truly enjoy."

Bold Bean is providing the beans and the packaging for the Oakleaf band's new brand: Box 5 Coffee.

"Box 5" is the highest score that a marching band or concert band can attain in a competition.

The band needs to raise \$9,000 to get the project off the ground, which it's hoping to do by sometime next year. Once it does, a portion of the profits from every bag sold will go to funding the band with a portion also going to help others.

"I think it's a really great idea," said

Oakleaf senior Calah Cockerill, 17, drum major for the marching band. "Mr. Hall is a great person for coming up with it."

Box 5 will come in three blends, with each blend benefiting different places. The Signature Sweet blend (\$14.75 for a 12-ounce pouch) promises hints of choco-

late, dried fruit and warming spices. Every bag sold will provide a student in Burkina Faso with school supplies for a month.

"So many of the people in there are starved for education. They want to go to school and be educated," Jonathan said. "But there aren't facilities or supplies, or they have to walk for miles."

The Breakfast Blend (\$14.50 per 12-ounce pouch), which features "notes of brown sugar, berries and toasted nuts, will benefit the Shropshire Music Foundation. Every bag sold will supply a child in Syria, Kosovo, Uganda or Northern Ireland with a musical instrument, instruction and other music material.

"Music is such a good outlet when life is difficult," said Cockerill, who has played the flute since she was in sixth grade. "This is a way of spreading music around the world."

The Apasionada Bold blend (\$13.75 per 12-ounce pouch) boasts flavors of cherry, caramel and cocoa. Each bag sold helps fund music initiatives in Clay County and throughout the Jacksonville area.

"Our band has 180 members and it's growing, and the Oakleaf community is taking off," Jonathan said. "I think this fundraiser is a great way for people to get involved."

Written in 1900 by Jacksonville native sons, James Weldon Johnson and John Rosamond Johnson, the lyrics serve as both inspiration and a "through line" for these contemporary visual artists, affording the exhibit visitor an examination into Jacksonville's past and present race relations.

age, received a commission to create a sculpture to commemorate African American contributions to song for the World's Fair in New York. Standing approximately 16 feet tall, Savage's sculpture, The Harp, received international acclaim.

Although the sculpture was one of the most popular at the World's Fair and was

celebrated as one of Savage's major works, she did not have enough money to cast it in to bronze, and the plaster sculpture was destroyed at the conclusion of the fair. Despite the fact that The Harp no longer exists in its final form, its legacy continues through numerous photographs and smaller souvenir reproductions. The Cummer exhibit includes a beautiful homage to Savage with a photo display and narrative.

And while we all know only too well, about "the dog days of Florida summer" and how we all should slow down and keep hydrating, I say do yourself a favor and savor this current exhibit! Hydrate your cultural-self!

"LIFT: Contemporary Expressions of the African American Experience" will be on display through February 12, 2017. And don't forget Cummer Museum attendance is free every Tuesday from 4 to 9 p.m. and on the first Saturday of each month from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

From Grove Park Elementary to Madison Square Garden

Clay County native honing acting talents in New York

ORANGE PARK – Kelly P. Williams and her future husband packed her life into a cargo van 15 years ago and hauled it 960 miles from Orange Park to Brooklyn, New York shortly after college. Her black cat "Lucky" sat in the van the whole way to the one room apartment they eventually stuffed into.

As it turns out, she would need a lot of luck over the next few years to survive off her art along with luck and a cocktail dress.

After a promising start in the Jackson-ville dance scene and her Florida State University diploma in hand, Williams decided to move from Clay County to New York to spark a career in live dance. Through sheer force of will, tenacity and even some coincidental luck, Williams was able to expand her aspirations to more than just dance.

Williams grew her references, sharpened her talents and groomed a list of agents who helped her acquire roles on such television series such as "Gotham," "Gossip Girl" and "Blindspot."

Her start was a little turbulent, but like many dancers, "it's a tough, tough business" to try and make a life as a concert dancer, sometimes called the "orphan of the entertainment industry," Williams said.

"I was managing, I was poor, but I was managing," Williams said. "It really stinks because you go to an audition one morning and there's a little guy out there selling doughnuts and coffee and you're thinking 'do I want a cup of coffee, or do I want to take a dance class."

She held down three jobs to pay for her apartment ranging from dance instructor to Victoria's Secret associate. She said dancers work harder than other entertainers because of the hours spent drilling choreography into habit and constant assault of classes.

So she broadened her horizons.

Williams searched audition lists for musical theatre roles to help supplement the rather paltry rates dance companies paid her. She had some experience built up from

school plays at Grove Park Elementary, Orange Park Junior High and Jacksonville's Douglas Anderson School of the Arts.

She auditioned for and later performed in live musical performances heavy in dance such as the romantic comedy "Hello, Dolly!" and the western musical classic "Seven Brides for Seven Brothers." Suddenly, she found herself earning higher rates for her performances.

"Okay maybe I can have the coffee and still go take class," Williams said.

As she took more roles, she had to take more vocal lessonss. Increasingly, Williams suddenly found herself developing a set of entertainment tools she could carry over to other genres.

The Actors Equity Association, founded in 1913, is the performing arts union for live theatre performers and guarantees its members higher rates for their work among other things. The problem is getting in.

What takes some performers a lifetime took Williams 10 years of work through the Alhambra Dinner Theater in Jacksonville. While in New York, Williams booked shows at the Alhambra so they could accumulate points towards equity membership.

Shortly after earning her union stripes, a big break came in the form of a phone call from an old dance partner turned casting producer.

"She called me, I'm in Jacksonville, and she said 'Kelly what are you doing for New Years?' Would you be interested in doing this live event at Madison Square Garden, and I was like 'what, really?'" Williams said.

Her friend offered her a chance to dance in the American Jam Band Phish's annual New Year's Eve show.

Her fresh membership in the union started great. However, for two years after her Madison Square Garden performance, she hadn't booked anything. Her union membership guaranteed her competitive pay, but it meant she could only take work from union shows.

Her friends were in the same predicament and, like her, held down other jobs to pay the bills.

Her next break came from a theatre teacher, a cocktail dress and a call for background actors in the "Gossip Girl" television series.

"She said to me one day, 'hey Kelly do you have a cocktail gown?" Williams said.

Apparently, the show needed actors to walk around in the back of the frame in cocktail dresses. Williams had a cocktail dress, but no knowledge of the business of television production or acting. She auditioned anyway, got the part and arrived to the set looking and feeling, naturally, a bit lost. The realization that she could show up to a set without drilling choreography into her head, without warming her voice or memorizing lines and make a paycheck astounded her.

The realization propelled her forward. She joined the Screen Actors Guild labor union and began to pick up background and acting roles in major television shows and had four agents to represent her.


"I was so tickled because I had kind of stepped away from so much dance and musical theatre and it kind of hurts a bit because my heart will still be in musical theatre and dance," Williams said. "If my friend had never asked me for someone to walk around in a cocktail dress for Gossip Girl, If I would have just blown that off — who knows where I'd be right now. Probably still struggling as a dancer or working in a clothing store."

Luckily, her newest role marries both her passions. She plays a speakeasy dancer in the Amazon Prime period drama "Z: The Beginning of Everything."

Williams is still out dabbling in every medium. She modeled one of the 10 finalist wedding dresses in the 12th annual Charmin Toilet Paper Wedding Dress Contest in New York. She models and operates her own photography and videography company.

While she's been a bit caught up with screen acting lately, Williams' passion for live performance will likely erupt again – as soon as she gets her next break.

"It's just very depressing because you don't get much back for so many years of work besides being in front of an audience," Williams said. "I love to hear the audience cry, I love to hear the audience sigh, I love to hear the audience clap."

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Middleburg native serves aboard U.S. Navy Ballistic Missile Submarine

BANGOR, Wash. – A 2012 Middleburg High School graduate and Clay County native is serving in the U.S. Navy as part of a crew working aboard one of the world's most advanced ballistic missile submarines, the USS Maine.

Petty Officer 3rd Class Landon Aldridge is a culinary specialist serving aboard the Bangor-based boat, one of 14 Ohio-class ballistic missile submarines.

A Navy culinary specialist is responsible for providing meals for the crew and standing galley watch.

"I like helping out the morale of the crew because it makes me feel like my job has significant purpose," Aldridge said.

Measuring 560 feet long, 42 feet wide and weighing more than 16,500 tons, a nuclear-powered propulsion system helps push the ship through the water at more than 20 knots.

The Navy's ballistic missile submarines, often referred to as "boomers," serve as a strategic deterrent by providing an undetectable platform for submarine launched ballistic missiles.

They are designed specifically for stealth, extended patrols and the precise delivery of missiles if directed by the President

The Ohio-class design allows the submarines to operate for 15 or more years between major overhauls. On average, the submarines spend 77 days at sea followed by 35 days in-port for maintenance.

According to Navy officials, current ballistic missile submarines, commissioned between 1987 and 1997, are reaching their end of life.

Leveraging more than 50 years of ballistic missile submarine design and operational experience, the Ohio replacement submarine will be a cost-effective recapitalization of sea-based strategic deterrence. The Ohio replacement also leverages Virginia class submarine capabilities.

Lead Ohio Replacement construction must begin in 2021 in order for the first new submarine to commence its first strategic patrol in 2031, Navy officials explained. Ohio replacement ballistic missile submarines will provide the nation's survivable nuclear deterrent through the 2080s

The plan includes 12 Ohio replacement submarines, each with 16 TRIDENT II (D5) missiles and a 42-year service life. The 12 Ohio replacement submarines provide the same at-sea presence as 14 original Ohio submarines saving \$20B (CY10) over the life of the class.

"Every day I am extremely proud to lead and serve alongside the exceptionally talented men and women of the submarine force," said Capt. Mark Schmall, commodore of Submarine Squadron 17, of Bangor, Washington. "Our team is filled with dedicated, hardworking, and highly qualified professionals who hold uncommon levels of responsibility and accountability in sup-

port of our nation's strategic deterrence mission. Their work ethic, commitment, and enthusiasm are second to none!"

Aldridge is part of the boat's Blue crew, one of the two rotating crews, which allow the ship to be deployed on missions more often without taxing one crew too much. A typical crew on this submarine is approximately 150 officers and enlisted sailors.

"I like the community aboard this ship," Aldridge said. "We are such a small crew that you get to know everyone on a more personal level."

A key element of the Navy's mission is tied to the fact that America is a maritime nation, according to Navy officials, and that the nation's prosperity is tied to the ability to operate freely on the world's oceans. More than 70 percent of the earth's surface is covered by water; 80 percent of the world's population lives close to a coast; and 90 percent of all global trade by volume travels by sea.

According to Navy officials, because of the demanding environment aboard submarines, personnel are accepted only after rigorous testing and observation. Submariners are some of the most highly trained and skilled people in the Navy. The training is highly technical, and each crew has to be able to operate, maintain and repair every system or piece of equipment on board. Regardless of their specialty, everyone also has to learn how everything on the ship works and how to respond in emergencies to become "qualified in submarines" and earn the right to wear the coveted gold or silver dolphins on their uniform.

Challenging submarine living conditions build strong fellowship among the elite crew, Navy officials explained. The crews are highly motivated, and quickly adapt to changing conditions. It is a busy life of specialized work, watches and drills.

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

Weathering the storm

Dealing with plant damage

As the tropics begin to develop more and more systems heading into the peak of hurricane season, these waves of mois-

ture and wind can cause damage to homes, infrastructure and even your landscape. Here are some tips on how to deal with the aftermath of storm damage in your landscape.

1. **Flooding** - One of the major

damaging factors of a storm system is the amount of flooding it generates. Whether it is from a nearby waterway overflowing its banks or localized flash flooding, these conditions can cause plant health issues. One key point is to potentially avoid eating produce that has been in a flood condition as the water can carry bacteria, chemicals and other potential health hazards from other areas and deposit them on your plants.

Some plants can do better having their

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roots submerged but prolonged flooding can cause the roots to not be able to access oxygen-causing dieback and making them more susceptible to diseases and rot. If your landscape stays water logged for a long period of time, observe how the plant responds as the soil dries out to see if any damage was done.

On a side note, to avoid making the flooding issue worse, make sure your irrigation systems are not running if your soil is very wet.

2. **Wind Damage**- With tropical storm and hurricane force winds, damage to trees, shrubs, and plants is unavoidable. By following a proper pruning schedule and managing the health of your plants, effects can be limited and plants that are suited to the Northeast Florida landscape will continue to thrive.

If you do have wind damage such as broken branches, it is important to prune following the storm as any part of the stem or branch remaining on the tree that is split or snapped can be a prime entry point for insects and disease. Prune these branches back to the collar, which is the point where the branch meets a healthy part of the plant or tree and make a clean cut. The tree will work to heal itself.



One item to note is do not prune palm fronds in preparation for hurricanes. The practice of cutting all but a few young fronds on the tree harms the plant by taking away the stored food inside of the leaves. University of Florida research has shown that a healthy palm frond will not normally become a projectile during a hurricane. In fact, pruned palms have higher damage levels.

3. **Lightning**- In the event of a lightning strike, the damage to plants or trees can be severe. A plant damaged by lightning will most likely lose its health and vigor and potentially die. If struck, a tree should be irrigated to stop from drying out

as the lightning damages the trees ability to move water to its leaves. Even if the tree survives, long term issues will often develop and the tree should be monitored to make sure it does not become a hazard.

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


Man allegedly forces driver at knifepoint to drive him to murder his girlfriend

Cole allegedly popped up from the back seat of the man's vehicle and held a knife to his throat, the report said. Surprised, the victim brought his hand up and sliced his hand on the knife. Cole allegedly told the victim he would not hurt him if he did everything Cole asked him to do.

Cole allegedly commanded the victim to give him his wallet, and then threw it back at him when there was no money in the wallet, the report said.

The victim drove Cole to County Road 215 and dropped him off just south of the intersection of Juniper Avenue, where he walked north from there.

The victim called the police and report-

ed the incident along with a description of Cole. Shortly afterwards, deputies were dispatched to a suspicious male breaking into a residence of a house on the 4000 block of Joan Avenue. The suspicious male matched the suspect's description in the kidnapping.

Deputies responded and found Cole on the porch with his girlfriend. The victim identified Cole as the man who kidnapped him, the report said.

Cole's girlfriend told police Cole was drunk earlier in the day, so she left him on Blanding Boulevard and went home. Cole called her multiple times from the Kangeroo station to pick him up.

Deputies found a knife matching the victim's description under the tire of a car in the driveway.

At press time, Cole remained in the Clay County Jail without a bond.

The investigation revealed that Troy Tuten touched and forced the female victim to perform inappropriate sexual acts with him on multiple occasions starting at the age of 10. Tuten also exposed himself to the male child victim on more than one occasion.

Prior to the 2015 investigation, Troy Tuten had eight prior felony convictions.

schools in the Clay County School District, meaning they receive federal financial aid to care for their high rate of impoverished students. They feed all students' free breakfast and lunch. For many students, school provides their only opportunity to eat properly.

Many students who come to class deal with their parents problems at an early age. Some wonder where their next meal will come from and if they'll soon be evicted from their home. This worry sometimes leads to behavioral problems in the classroom, but the school favors mentorship over punishment to deal with those problems.

"Some of these kids you cannot talk to — you have to talk with," said Jarrod Eason, assistant principal. "Some of these kids see things that they shouldn't see, experience things they shouldn't experience and go through things that no kid at such a young age should ever go through, so when they come here they shouldn't have to worry or fear about being chastised or punished about miniscule things."

Each class of students is different, so the administrators stay out of teachers' way and let them teach in ways that best

suit the students as long as they abide by federal and state guidelines.

"A lot of them don't have the prior background knowledge that a lot of the kids with different social backgrounds have," said Holly Strickland, who teaches kindergarten at W.E. Cherry. "When I read the three little pigs, that's a brand new story to them. Most kids have grown up with nursery rhymes, fairy tales, so that's where we start building, with letters and rhymes."

Strickland said many of the parents are doing the best they can, but often times work two jobs and worry about rent payments and other issues.

To help take some of the financial burden off the minds of parents and students, however, the school has its own fund to help the families who are in need. The Student in Need Fund receives donations from local nonprofits, businesses, school fundraisers and residents who donate to the fund.

The parents' needs can be anything. In the past, the school has used the fund to cover parent electric bills, donate refrigerators and help families who lived out of their cars get back on their feet and into stable housing.

"We take care of the whole kids...we try to take care of the whole family, because that's very important," said Principal Angie Whiddon. "I've been in the dumpster in the back of a bar at 10-o-clock at night digging boxes out to help pack up a family that was being evicted."

The school has its own clothes closet for students and helps foster inclusion from parents with community events such as grill-outs. However, sometimes the food isn't going to W.E. Cherry students, but other people in need.

On May 3, when Murray Leon Lancaster shot and killed Erica Green Lancaster, Valorie Short and her father, Welland "Buddy" Short, the school brought food donated from families, teachers and parents to first responders, many of whom knew the victims.

W.E. Cherry's success on paper might have first turned Pierce onto the school, but the school's culture of inclusion and academic excellence is what keeps him motivated.

"Everyone at Cherry will do whatever it takes to help students apply to their highest potential, and I think it's very clear that teaching staff as well as administrative staff are consistently going above and beyond their job descriptions to make sure their students succeed to the highest level," Pierce said.

cancer caused from a web of problems can dissolve marriages, alienate patients from loved ones and even themselves.

A second 'birds and the bees' talk may be in order for a percentage of the 1.68 million new cancer patients the U.S. Census Bureau estimates will develop by the end of the year,

"It becomes important to discuss be-

cause once you're in recovery, you try to get your life to go back to normal, but the sex part of it may not be able to go back to normal as a result of all the treatment," said Noelle Pomeroy, a clinical sexologist and

licensed mental health counselor. "That body image and intimacy is a huge part of people's sex life."

Pomeroy will bring her message about intimacy and body image after cancer to Orange Park on October 1 as the keynote speaker of the Pink Ribbon Symposium at the Thrasher-Horne Conference Center.

For the last nine years, the nonprofit symposium has dedicated itself to breast cancer education.

A 2014 study by The Australian Cancer and Sexuality Study Team found sexual activity, sexual satisfaction and sex drive decreased in many cases for both genders

after cancer.

The study found body image concerns, psychological factors and physical difficulties, such as vaginal dryness and erectile dysfunction caused feelings of frustration, anger and inadequacy among the majority of participants.

Many in the 657 patient study felt a loss of self-confidence and "inadequacy" and changes in their sense of "masculinity of femininity."

Over the next few months after she shaved her hair, Zwilling learned how to draw her eyebrows on with a pencil and not to open the oven or the drier while wearing her wig so it wouldn't melt. Zwilling learned how to be normal again. For her, normalcy was paramount.

"You don't want people to look at you as being different," Zwilling said. "I tried to live life almost as normal as I could – put one foot in front of the other."

Growing up in Pennsylvania, Zwilling saw her sister, both grandmothers, an aunt, an uncle and three of her cousins develop breast cancer.

Zwilling now wears prosthetic breasts. Her auburn hair has grown back shaggy and short. Normalcy has now found a place in her life and in her reflection, however many cancer patients still struggle to negotiate a body image forever changed from cancer.

Zwilling diverted questions about her sex life after breast cancer.

Pomeroy said cancer patients, who lose a part of their sexual identity, grieve similarly to those who have lost limbs.

For instance, James Minton of Green Cove Springs resident, is his family's bedrock. His chutzpah for aggressive business tactics is only trumped by his capacity for compassion with his family.

Minton was the man everyone came to with their problems. When Minton received a prostate cancer diagnosis in 2014, however, he had to confront the masculine self-image he thought was had etched in stone. Suddenly, he was the one who had the problem. It was tough, he said.

"I didn't want to be a burden," Minton said. "It's very important to not have a weakness if you can. If you have a weakness, you're going to give in to your sickness. Weakness is when you know you have a weakness and you don't do a damn thing about it."

Patients often feel powerless, because cancer is not a choice. This can emasculate some men and affect how they show affection to their spouses and in turn how they receive it, Pomeroy said.

"When cancer comes into your life, it doesn't come in and cherry pick parts of your life," Pomeroy said. "If he feels that he now needs financial help or feels that he's a burden, all of that feeling of inadequacy or demasculinization leads into the bedroom and affects how he feels about his body."

Minton redirected questions regarding the extent prostate cancer affected intimacy with his wife.

Minton gave himself power the only way he could – he armed himself with knowledge about his preferred treatment. He wanted to learn everything possible about proton therapy before he told his family.

All the while, Minton spoke at lengths about all of his feelings with his wife, whom he refers to as his best friend.

"The good, the bad and the ugly," Minton said.

Minton overcame his budding body image problems through those talks with his wife

Cancer elicits similar feelings of helplessness in women, Pomeroy said. However, the feeling multiplies because of how much society focuses on appearance, an ideal very few women ever live up to, Pomeroy said.

Zwilling felt constant encouragement from her husband throughout the process. "He didn't baby me," she said.

For Zwilling, the largest bandage came from her faith in God. Friends and family showered her with affection, so she said she never suffered a loss of intimacy or a morning without encouragement.

Still, it took time for her to grow accustomed to the horizontal scars on her chest where her breasts once were – the scars she believed were a dream slowly became reality. Zwilling stood in front of her mirror and saw herself beautiful. And she was.

"It's taken me awhile to get used to the body image without the prosthetics," she said. "I look in the mirror. Those are scars — beautiful scars. They're scars that show me God's goodness."

Blue Devils defense shuts down Flagler

GREEN COVE SPRINGS - Two interceptions by defensive back Marquez Delafield and a blocked field goal attempt highlighted Clay High School's 15-0 win over 8A-Flagler Palm Coast on Sept. 3 in a stormdelayed game played at Clay High School. Clay improves to 1-1 while Flagler falls to 0-2.

"It was very good to see Marquez make plays when the ball is in the air," said Clay High head football coach Joshua Hoekstra. "We've been stressing takeaways in practice and we were able to get three vesterday."

With the onset of Hurricane Hermine jumbling the Friday night schedule of area high school football, Clay High took a shot at a rare Saturday morning game that brought a festive atmosphere to Blue Devil stadium on a dreary, hot and humid morning.

"Not being allowed to practice on Thursday or Friday was our biggest concern and it showed at times," said Hoekstra, who now hosts 6A-Gainesville High on Friday. "We've had success the past few years by using the first three games of our season playing bigger schools and it helps us to find our identity. Each year each team is different.'

Clay, with a second 100 yard performance running effort from senior running back Colin Wilson, again was workmanlike on the offensive side of the ball with Wilson's longest run just 40 yards. Hoekstra seemed undeterred about the Blue Devils seemingly slow start and the after-effects of a year of no Bilal Ally in the backfield.

"First two games of 2015, 1-1 record (Beat 7A-Fleming Island 28-0, lost to Flagler 7-0) and averaged 235 yards per game, 28 points," said Hoekstra. "First two game of 2016, 1-1 record (24-14 loss to Fleming Island, 15-0 win over Flagler) and averaging 292.5 yards per game, 29

points. We're identifying who we are on offense and I feel good about where we are at.

On Clay's first offensive series, tailback Willie Troutman fumbled the ball away in a scrum at the Flagler 17 yard line. From there, the rest of the game was in the hands of Wilson, quarterback Jaylan Jenkins and backs Marcus Jones and Tymious Goodman.

After the first series fumble, Flagler was able to move the ball with a 17-play drive that put the Bulldogs at the Clay 41 yard line. Strong defensive efforts from defensive tackle Abbott Taylor and linebacker Rico Schnitzler kept Flagler from penetrating deep from scrimmage, but the Bulldogs were able to keep the chains moving. Two bad center snaps; one to Flagler's quarterback and the second over the punter's head, halted the drive with defensive tackle Tobiah Griffin and

Broncos buck losing streak with win at Ridgeview

ORANGE PARK – Middleburg High's 6-foot-5 defensive end Andrew Austin's long arms led Middleburg to its first win since 2014, a 14-12 nail-biter at Ridgeview Monday night, Sept. 5.

The win snapped a 15-game losing streak that covered parts of three seasons for the Broncos, and the players reveled in it with a jubilant group of fans who had made the short trip from Middleburg after the final horn.

"It was an ugly win," said Broncos head coach Karl Smeltzer. "At halftime we spoke of eliminating penalties and creating turnovers, and we did that."

Austin combined with safety Travis Hupp to cause a crucial turnover early in the fourth quarter. Middleburg's Matt Oliver had just missed a 29-yard field goal attempt, leaving the Broncos with a 7-6 lead and appearing to shift the momentum to Ridgeview. The Panthers took possession at their 20. Eyeing a short dropback by Huff, Austin threw his hands toward the sky and tipped Huff's pass into the air. A diving Hupp intercepted the fluttering ball at the Ridgeview 26. On the next play, Broncos running back Robert Lowder appeared to be hemmed in by four Panther defenders on the sideline, but broke an arm tackle and dashed to the goal line to

put Middleburg ahead 13-6 with 9:18 remaining.

"They made that one big play that stole our hearts," said Ridgeview coach Cameron Porch, referring to Lowder's run.

Austin made the game's other critical play in the first half. The six foot, five inch defensive end broke through the line to block Ridgeview kicker Nick McCarter's extra point attempt after the Panthers' first score, preserving a 7-6 Broncos lead. The block forced Ridgeview to go for a two-point conversion when the Panthers drew within 14-12 on a yard scoring pass from Tyler Huff to Brandon Peffer with 6:37 remaining. Broncos cornerback Terron Allen had tight coverage on Kiaran Turner on the two-point attempt, and Huff's pass went over both of their heads.

"He is a force," Middleburg coach Karl Smeltzer said of Austin. "He was our MVP last week, too, with five tackles for loss."

Austin added a sack and a tackle for loss on Friday for good measure.

The Broncos won the game because they got the better of the battles at the line of scrimmage. Middleburg established a running game with Lowder, a junior who gained 76 yards on 17 carries.

"They had him, but when he cut it back, I knew he was gone," said Smeltzer of Lowder's touchdown run. "He has great

Spartans fall in season opener

"That one hurt," said Sellinger. "They just caught us off guard and got a guy behind us."

On their first series of downs, St. Johns would try to offset a huge defensive front for the Bobcats with running back Eli Morton take slashes off tackle, but the Spartans could only muster seven yards before punting.

The Spartan defense stiffened behind linebacker Brom Peterson and outside linebacker Troy Myers who kept the Bobcats in and out in four downs.

St. Johns running back Logan Higby would fumble away the ball on the Spartans next series and Munroe would answer with a 12-play drive that mixed up passes and runs to score again and go up 12-0.

"We stress control things you can control and fumbles are part of that," said Sellinger.

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



In the fourth quarter, Delafield stole the show with a key pass break up on the ensuing Bulldog drive that was nearly an interception at the Bulldog 27.



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




