Board gets glance at financial picture

FLEMING ISLAND – After several rocky years, the Clay County School District fund balance is headed for recovery. The fund balance is expected to end the current fiscal year at 4 percent, up from three-and-a-half percent at the end of the 2015-16 year.

“We’re moving in the right direction

as it relates to our spending,” said Susan Legutko, assistant superintendent for business affairs, who led a budget presentation last week. “And of course, our dollars are being focused in

the classrooms for the teachers and students of Clay County.”

The Clay County School Board discussed the tentative budget for the 2016-17 and 2017-18 years and possible changes to the superintendent’s office at a workshop May 31. Board members and the superintendent met at the Teacher Training Center at Fleming Island High School. Legutko said they held the meeting, which

did not involve any vote, to go over projections of where they expect to be at the end of the fiscal year.

“Everything is tentative at this point,” she said. “Typically, the final budget is presented in September of the following year. This year is a unique year because of the governor not signing the budget, and the legislature delaying giving it to the

Town council invites residents to share vision

ORANGE PARK – Annual visioning sessions offer local government staff and residents the chance to create a clear blueprint about future progress, however history suggests that low public turnout results in decision-making with little or no citizen involvement.

Town council will hold a public visioning session June 12 at Orange Park Town Hall to set the town’s

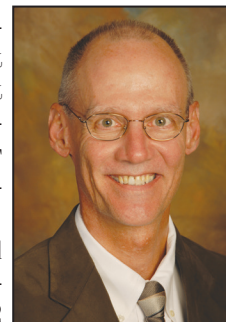
priorities for the next year. It’s a big deal, but so far there has been little to no excitement from residents.

Since the town began holding visioning sessions three years ago, the priorities have mainly involved essential projects, such as infrastructure repairs.

This year however, the town’s renegotiation of all three town pension plans, among other financial projects, has put the town in a better financial position to fund discretionary projects that have fallen to the wayside while the town raced from one problem to the next.

“I think when [residents] have something tangible in front of them that impacts them directly their antennae goes up and

Clay County Memories

The Magnolia Springs Hotel impressed even the most critical guests

Among the tourists who descended on Green Cove Springs during the annual winter migrations of the late 1800s was a unique category - older women traveling in small groups or packs as their behavior sometimes suggested. They adopted demanding and difficult attitudes. They criticized everything and everyone in an effort to appear blessed with superior knowledge and discriminating taste.

They were masters of the pursed lip sneer and prone to trail a gloved finger over any surface - prospecting for dust. Like battleships on full power they plowed ever forward held rigidly erect by heavily engineered corsets and dragged twelve yards of fabric over rear-mounted metal frame bustles like a wake.

Late in the season, in March of 1885, a trio of these ladies boarded the train in Philadelphia for a three-week stay in Green Cove Springs. They fully expected to be disappointed in the Florida experience and were determined to reinforce their conviction that the southern yokels would fail to achieve their high sophisticated standards.

The train was too slow, the service poor and pine trees in Georgia were boring. Jacksonville didn't impress them because the St. James Hotel was full and management placed them in a boarding house with dirty beds. They did admire the sour orange trees, dripping with fruit planted on every street.

On the boat trip south on the St. Johns River, they were heard to marvel at the gi-

ant live oak trees draping into the water but found the moss dreary.

They saw Mrs. Stowe's house and were suitably impressed but after all she was "their kind of people."

Their final destination was the grand Magnolia Springs Hotel just north of Green Cove Springs and at last the ladies could find no fault - except the price of \$4.50 per day or \$28 a week.

Nestled in the posh surroundings with the latest innovations of elevator, intercoms to summon liveried servants and both gas and electric lighting. The ladies

became less disapproving. When they took tea in the lavishly decorated lounge amidst oriental rugs, European landscape paintings, and crystal chandeliers, both their postures and attitudes made a subtle shift.

They ceased peering down their narrow noses in a pose full of disdain.

They couldn't miss the enthusiasm of fellow guests - diplomats, congressmen and an Italian opera star seemingly charmed by the Florida scenery, customs and people.

They bought woven palmetto hats, shipped oranges to everyone they knew, and doffed stockings and laced ankle boots

to dangle their feet in the sulfur spring. One supposed grand dame even stood in line in a shop in Green Cove to purchase a live baby alligator for her grandchildren. They loosened those corsets to collect moss and orange blossoms and wore broaches of lassoed chameleons on their ample bosoms.

In fact, they had a wonderful time and at the end of the holiday boarded the train in Jacksonville headed north. The chameleons and the baby alligator escaped somewhere around Waycross but, as the story goes, those corsets stayed permanently loose. Shocking.

they get interested, but when you're just talking about the general direction of the town for the next five years or so, the people, don't engage as much," said Town Clerk Sarah Campbell.

"Because we're coming off of a recent election, there was a lot of recent engagement in that process, so it's really the appropriate time to kind of gather all of that feedback and say 'hey, where are we headed?'" she said.

The town sets visioning meetings months in advance of the budget creation process, which ends in October.

"There's nothing like a great idea in

December that you can't fund for another year," Campbell said.

Last year, the town decided in their visioning meeting to focus on updating its land development regulations, which had seen little movement since they were last revised 10 years ago. The council also directed staff to consider boosting its number of code enforcement officers and a way to stabilize the town's finances. All of these benchmarks were completed within the year.

"Virtually every local government I've worked with in my entire career has had a strategic planning meeting," said Town Manager Jim Hanson. "Just about everything major that was accomplished in that community started as a goal identified by the elected body [during that time]."

"I've often told elected bodies that the two biggest decisions they make during the year is one, to adopt a budget and two, adopt a set of goals and visions," he said. But "frankly not many people come to our meetings, and it's important for the council members to bring the sum total of their experiences with them."

Without bodies at the meeting, Hanson said council members would fall back on conversations they have had with town

residents in the prior months and their own observations to decide what direction the town should move forward in the next year.

"I don't think that Orange Park is out of the ordinary in situations like this," Campbell said. "People aren't engaging in a dialogue about the future of their community."

Campbell said if the meeting could get a higher turnout than it has had in prior years, then a more robust vision for the future could define a more robust town the next year and fix problems residents have in their community.

"I think people certainly have opinions about those, but when we don't hear from them in this process, it's hard to elevate those issues," she said.

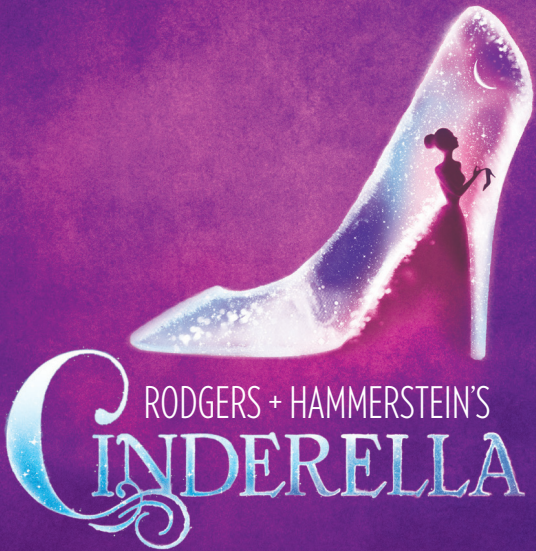

Sunshine law should remind leaders that people of Florida are citizens, not serfs

The irony of the state Constitutional Revision Commission trying to avoid sunshine laws is almost too rich to describe.

If allowed to happen, that would be a dark day indeed.

But that's exactly what CRC Chair Carlos Beruff is proposing, even as the commission continues a series of town hall meetings designed to take public input into the process.

Beruff, who ran a bare-knuckles campaign for the Republican nomination in the 2016 U.S. Senate race but ultimately crashed when Marco Rubio decided to get back in the game, proposes to allow two or more members to discuss the commission's official business in private.

Not only that, Beruff — appointed by Gov. Rick Scott to chair the committee — is pushing for authority to be the sole decision-maker about what measures the 37-member board puts on the ballot in 2018.

That would gut a requirement that a supermajority of 22 members approves all ballot initiatives.

The commission has been frosty to his proposals.

"What is called for is a presider — not a decider," Commission member and former Senate President Don Gaetz told the Miami Herald.

So, let's review: Florida has been noted for its landmark Sunshine Law that requires all government and related meetings to be open and with adequate advance public notice. The head of the Constitutional Revision Commission wants to ignore a bedrock principle of Florida law.

Good start, eh?

It's worth noting that Beruff was a controversial choice to lead the commission.

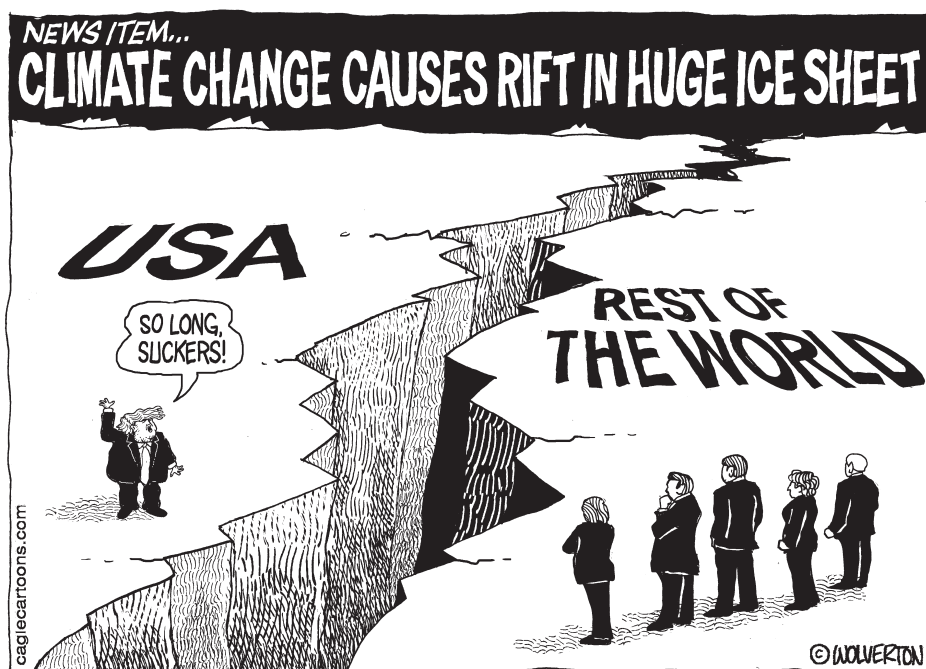
A little over a year ago, he drew wide criticism last year for remarks at the St. Johns County Republican Executive Committee, where he said of President Barack Obama: "Unfortunately, for seven and a half years this animal we call president — because he's an animal, OK? ... has surgically and with thought and very smart, intelligent manner, destroyed this country and dismantled the military under not one, not two, but three secretaries of defenses."

That doesn't exactly have the ring of someone interested in building consensus.

Beruff's current ploy is just continuing an assault on openness that has been taking place for years. There are more than 1,000 exemptions to the law as legislators find increasingly inventive ways to avoid public scrutiny.

Three members of the South Florida

6 marathons + 6 days = \$55,000

JACKSONVILLE — Jogging along U.S. Highway 90 from Tallahassee to Jacksonville leaves a great deal of time to meditate, especially when you’re doing it for a cause.

Whenever a logging truck would pass by 49-year-old Mike Freed while he ran alongside oncoming traffic, the vehicle’s headwind would hit him like a wave. It happened so often that, eventually, he began to run along the other side of the road.

There, whenever massive log haulers rushed passed him, tail winds would push him forward.

He connected the innocent happening to the cause he was running for — fundraising and awareness underfunded, pro-bono civil legal aid provided by Jacksonville Area Legal Aid, which serves residents of Clay, Duval and Nassau counties. He began the trek on May 28 and wrapped up in the rain on June 2 in Jacksonville.

“I would get a nice push to help me along, and that’s kind of what legal help does, it pulls you along so someone could get a head start dealing with a foreclosure or dealing with an abusive person or the

other headwinds they deal with in their life,” Freed said. “We all get tailwinds.”

“There was a lot of time to think when you’re running along [Highway] 90, and a variety of metaphors occurred to me,” he said. “That was one that was very powerful to me.”

Between May 28 and June 2, Freed — a business litigation attorney — jogged 160 miles from the Supreme Court building in Tallahassee to Jacksonville, stopping at every court along the way in part of a self-devised, six-legged marathon.

By the time he crossed the finish line in front of the Jacksonville Courthouse on June 2, Freed had already met his goal of raising \$50,000 in donations.

By June 6, the donations totaled more than \$55,000.

“Mike Freed is a beast,” said JALA President James Kowalski Jr. “He chanced into this idea and actually told me on a street corner a couple months back when we were walking downtown and I thought

Memory of student lives on in creative scholarship fund

OAKLEAF – A Clay County school is keeping the memory of one its own alive in an unprecedented way.

On May 31, Oakleaf Village Elementary School awarded four \$1,000 scholarships to graduating high school seniors. The Wyatt Morrison Scholarship – in this, its inaugural year – is the only scholarship program offered directly from a Clay County Public School.

Faculty and staff at the school started the scholarship this year to honor the memory of 4-year-old Wyatt Morrison who died from Acute Myeloid Leukemia on May 18, 2015, just one month shy of his 5th birthday. After four rounds of chemotherapy, Wyatt received a bone marrow trans-

plant on April 8, 2015. He is remembered as a beloved pre-kindergarten student, who left behind a loving family and a supportive school community.

“He was just one of those kids that always had a smile on his face, and his eye would literally twinkle when he smiled,” said Rose Woolwine, a physical education teacher at Oakleaf Village.

Woolwine was the driving force behind the scholarship program. She organized the fundraisers which made this scholarship possible. The funds were collected solely from teacher and faculty contributions and fundraising.

“It’s always good to help other people, and this a caring group of people, they got behind it 100 percent,” said Woolwine. “I hate that it took two years for me to think

of this. This is about the time where mom starts to think that people might be starting to forget him, and I want her to know that he will never be forgotten.”

The scholarships were awarded to Jesstina Farrell who attended Clay Virtual Academy and Kelsi McKenzie, Zachary Polen, and Samantha Smith who all graduated from Oakleaf High School. One of the scholarship criteria is for students to have attended Oakleaf Village for at least a year. These inaugural recipients were selected from among 10 applicants.

“I think it’s just really cool to earn money from school and from a great foundation,” said Polen. “I didn’t know Wyatt personally, but from knowing his older brother

No show turns into ‘put on a show’

JACKSONVILLE — After months of trying to speak directly with Sen. Marco Rubio, members of Indivisible Northeast Florida decided to host a town hall meeting and invite Rubio. And when Rubio never responded to their request, they hosted the town hall anyway.

“We wish he were here tonight, but we’ve got his suit instead,” said Indivisible leader Amy Marasco as she took the stage at the May 31 Empty Suit Town Hall in downtown Jacksonville.

Members of the Indivisible group staged a town hall complete with a black suit, white shirt and a red tie, hanging from fishing line, and controlled by a puppeteer — all representing Sen. Rubio.

During Marasco’s introduction, AC/DC music began to play, Marasco apologized for the apparent technical difficulties and turned around to see what the problem was. When she turned around she was met with Indivisible Nassau member and comedian Uriah Jones who had dressed in a blonde wig and extra-long red tie. Jones, as President Donald Trump, gave a speech to the audience in the style of Alec Baldwin’s Trump from Saturday Night Live, to which those present laughingly booed and harassed the presidential imposter.

Following Jones’ speech, five members

of Indivisible Clay County got in line behind the microphone and asked him questions. Jones called each questioner Steve, an ode to Trump aid Steve Bannon, and talked around their questions dismissively. Then Jones left the stage, again to the AC/DC soundtrack, throwing up his arms in a Nixon-esque display of two peace signs. Marasco took the podium back and continued her introduction.

“We’re going to keep trying,” Marasco said. “We’re not going to give up hope to have a town hall where [Rubio’s] actually present.”

Earlier this year, Rubio made comments about the lack of “real” town halls. He said that he would do a real town hall, but would not participate in something

where liberal activists fill the audience, citing an Indivisible document that he said instructed members to chant and boo during Rubio’s comments. These comments were played for the group at the beginning of the night’s question and answer session, followed by questions, Rubio’s answers, and then clarification from experts on each of the topics discussed.

During the questioning, members of the audience were given pre-written questions which were posed to the empty suit, and then actual audio of Rubio’s expected response was played back for the group from audio clips of interviews and press conferences where Rubio has spoken recently.

“[The suit] is a little like Rubio himself, substance lacking,” said the night’s mod-

erator and local writer Connie Timpson before moving on to the forum.

Topics included President Donald Trump’s alleged leak of classified information to Russian diplomats, healthcare, immigration and the environment. Rubio, or, the empty suit representing him, gave responses on each topic that received booing and criticism from those present, as well as chants of “lock him up,” and “do your job.”

Though some members of the nine local Indivisible groups seemed more aggressive towards Rubio’s suit than others, members of Indivisible Clay County seemed more reserved in their participation.

“We come from a place of, ‘Let’s do this in a respectful manner,’” said Fleming Island resident Sandy Goldman of Indivisible Clay.

Goldman said about 15 members of the Clay group attended the town hall, mostly with concerns about current healthcare legislation. Though Rubio wouldn’t meet with Indivisible, Goldman said the Clay group had scheduled a series of three meetings with Rep. Ted Yoho(R-3) at his Orange Park office the following day.

“We’ve had a very civil and respectful relationship with Ted Yoho and his staff,” Goldman said. “He’s listening to constituents, even those of us with opposing views.”

it was amazing idea.”

Freed began training for the fundraiser a little over a year ago. He had no prior marathon experience before his nearly weeklong journey across Florida, yet still escaped with no injuries.

Florida is one of three states in the country that does not allocate money at a state level for civil legal aid. And each year, Florida’s 32 civil legal aid organizations have seen other revenue sources diminish significantly. Available funding from The Florida Bar Foundation fell 77.2 percent in 2015 from \$33.9 million in 2010 to \$7.7 million. Most funding for civil legal aid organizations in Florida comes through federal and local grants, the Legal Services Corporation of America, and donations from churches, non-profits and private citizens.

At the same time, federal funding for civil legal aid is set to be zeroed under President Donald Trump’s budget.

As funding runs dry, the poverty rate in Florida has only increased.

“It’s the biggest challenge facing First Coast residents — access to the third branch of government,” Kowalski said. “We simply do not meet the need. It’s a fact more than a challenge. So for much of the First Coast area, there simply are zero family law options, zero general immigration options for low income individuals ... and Mike’s work helps us in bridging some of those gaps.”

JALA accepts cases from individuals who are 125 percent of and below the poverty line, but Kowalski added that for individuals who are just slightly above that mark fall into an area where no legal help is available. Last year, JALA completed more than 5,500 cases with a little fewer than 30 full-time attorneys and unpaid help from community lawyers such as Freed.

Two of those attorneys operate in Clay County out of the Clay County Courthouse.

“There are a lot more people that have a need that I can’t possibly serve and I was kind of overwhelmed with how difficult it could be to put someone’s life back in order,” Freed said. “We have an increasing separation of haves and have nots in our society, and one small way we can bridge that gap is by making sure that when people have legal problems they have access to someone who can help them.”

Freed said that that realization alone was one of the main reasons he began assisting JALA and ultimately decided to hold the fundraiser. He hopes that, in this highly contentious political climate, that instead of complaining and lazing around on the couch, that people would go and become active in the organizations they care about and hold fundraisers to support the causes they believe are just.

Kowalski said even if the Gov. Rick Scott and the Legislature continue to refuse to fund these services, he’s confident those who care will continue to step up and run the extra mile.

governor.”

The budget was presented to Gov. Rick Scott on May 31 and by Friday, June 2, a budget deal had been reached with Scott calling for a June 6-9 Special Session. The Orlando Sentinel reported that “another \$215 million will be added to the \$24 billion PreK-12 schools budget, increasing per student funding by \$125, instead of just \$25 as in the overall budget.”

Clay County’s unaudited final revenue for the school district’s 2016-17 year, including local, state and federal funds, showed an increase of more than \$2 million compared to the previous year. The proposed 2017-18 budget shows an even higher amount. However, Legutko said if the governor approves House Bill 7069, the district may lose some funds to charter schools.

The 278-page HB 7069 would develop a “Schools of Hope” program to motivate charter schools to compete with underperforming public schools. It would also require public schools to share millions of dollars of local revenue earmarked for capital projects with charter schools and change the distribution of Title I dollars.

Clay County’s estimated total expenses for the 2016-17 year are \$262,164,470 – up more than \$3 million from the final expenses of the 2015-16 year. Expenses are projected to rise another \$8 million for the 2017-18 year.

Like past years, most of the budget is expected to go toward salaries and benefits – they made up nearly 84 percent of the estimated expenses for the 2016-17 year. In 2017-18, that number is expected to drop to 81 percent.

Tensions among board members grew when Legutko explained a projected increase in energy spending for the 2017-18 year. The increase comes in part due to a 5 cent per gallon gas tax increase that will take effect January 2018, which Chairman Janice Kerekes said is unfair to schools. Kerekes said their buses should be exempt from the tax, which was approved by the Clay Board of County Commissioners.

According to Assistant Superintendent for Operations Michael Kemp, depending on fluctuating diesel prices, the school district can spend more than \$1 million on fuel during the school year.

“The county commission is paving roads and drainage off the backs of our

students,” Kerekes said. “Their five-cent sales tax is costing us a couple of hundred thousand dollars.”

Board member Ashley Gilhousen, whose mother is BCC Vice Chairman Diane Hutchings, disagreed with Kerekes and said everyone benefits from the road maintenance paid for by the tax.

Legutko said food service is a self-sufficient program and the district now has 12 schools qualifying for the Community Eligibility Provision program for students from low-income families. The program, which is funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, provides free breakfast and lunch to all students at qualifying schools, regardless of income.

The board also heard presentations on proposed changes to the superintendent’s office, including restructuring and redefining positions. Superintendent Addison Davis said most changes would be effective July 1 pending board approval.

Davis said there are several positions being eliminated for the 2017-18 year and some of the changes are due to budget concerns. That includes one of the two current communication positions, he said.

“I would love to have two positions in communications, but I am not prepared at this time to come to the board financially without knowing the budget to ask for that to truly happen,” Davis said. “It’s just not fiscally sound for me to make that recommendation.”

The changes will initially cost \$89,000 more, Davis said, but he expects to save money over the next several years. He said

one reason for the increase is the staff’s extensive experience in education, which requires a different pay schedule. He plans to eliminate the supervisor of elementary education position effective January 1, saving \$113,000 in salary and benefits.

One proposed new position is the Coordinator of Choice, who Davis said would work on branding and help keep the schools competitive against new charter school options. The full job description will be presented at the June 29 meeting, he said.

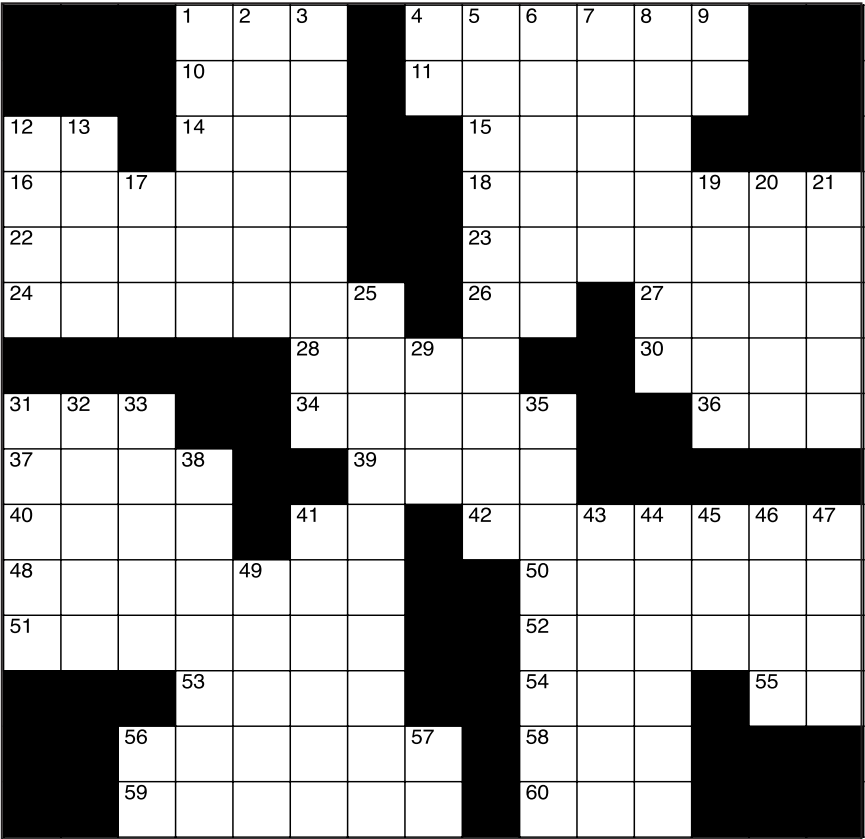
The Operations Division of the Superintendent’s Office, which includes bus drivers and maintenance workers, is understaffed and underfunded, according to assistant superintendent Michael Kemp. He said the department is struggling to stay competitive against industry.

“I still can’t get past the fact that we have just one exterminator for all of our schools,” Kerekes said. “I think it’s something we need to address down the road.”

Adjustments to salary schedules to support personnel are necessary, Kemp said, because many workers can easily make more money somewhere else.

Other proposed changes were the addition of new coach positions in elementary and secondary schools to assist and support teachers. Terri Stahlman, assistant superintendent for academic services, said she wants to create a vision for embedding science, technology, engineering and mathematics programs into the classwork and incorporate arts as well. Once the vision is developed, she said, she will hire someone to implement it in the schools.

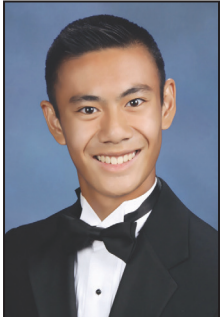

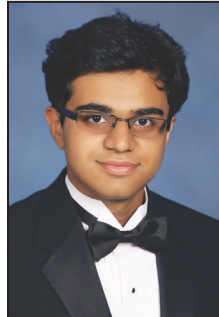

Blessings in a Backpack marks 5th year of helping students



GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A nonprofit that ensures students don't go hungry on the weekend has completed its fifth year of helping kids at Charles E. Bennett Elementary. Blessings in a Backpack, which is sponsored by the Magnolia Point Women's Club, gets a group of volunteers together each week to stuff backpacks that students take home. That way, kids don't have to worry about going hungry and

Railroad crossing repair to cause detours

DOCTORS INLET – Starting June 8, CSX Corp. crews will rebuild the grade crossing at County Road 220 and Sleepy Hollow Drive to provide a safe, smooth driving surface for roadway traffic.

CSX spokeswoman Laura Phelps said the company has worked closely with local authorities to minimize the impact on the community.

“For example, we scheduled the work after the school year ended and before summer school begins to avoid impacts to bus routes. Barring poor weather or any other unforeseen events, crews will finish replacing the crossties,

tracks and asphalt throughout the crossing by June 18th and the road will reopen to traffic,” Phelps said.

She said safety is the company’s top priority and the work is “critical to preventing accidents and service disruptions to local freight customers.”

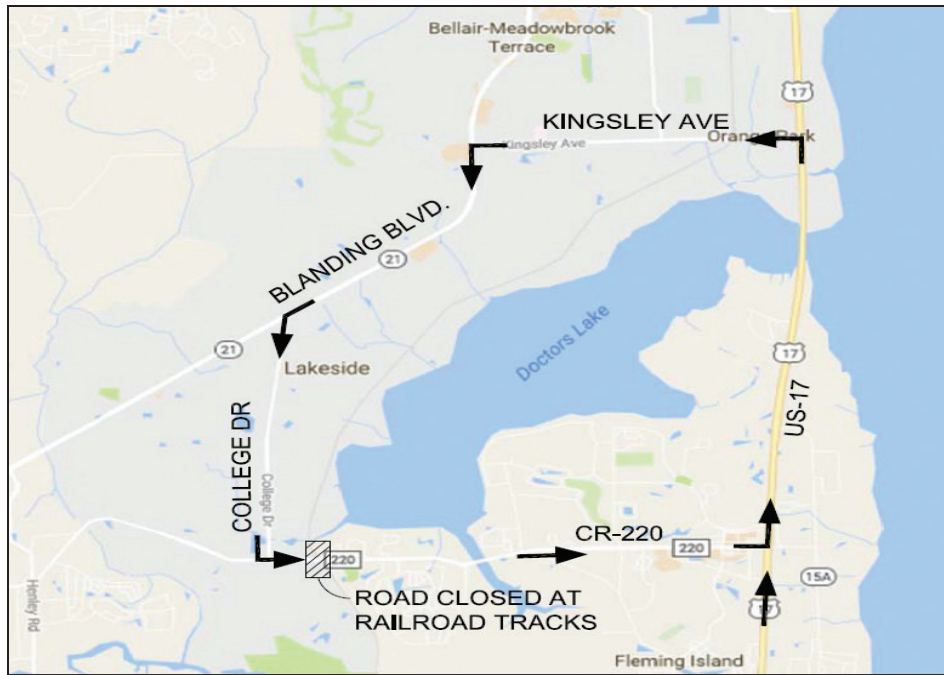
We understand this may be inconvenient to local drivers and we appreciate their patience while this important work is completed.

Traffic in both directions will be re-routed. When traveling east on County Road 220, Clay County Public Works suggested eastbound drivers use College Drive to Blanding

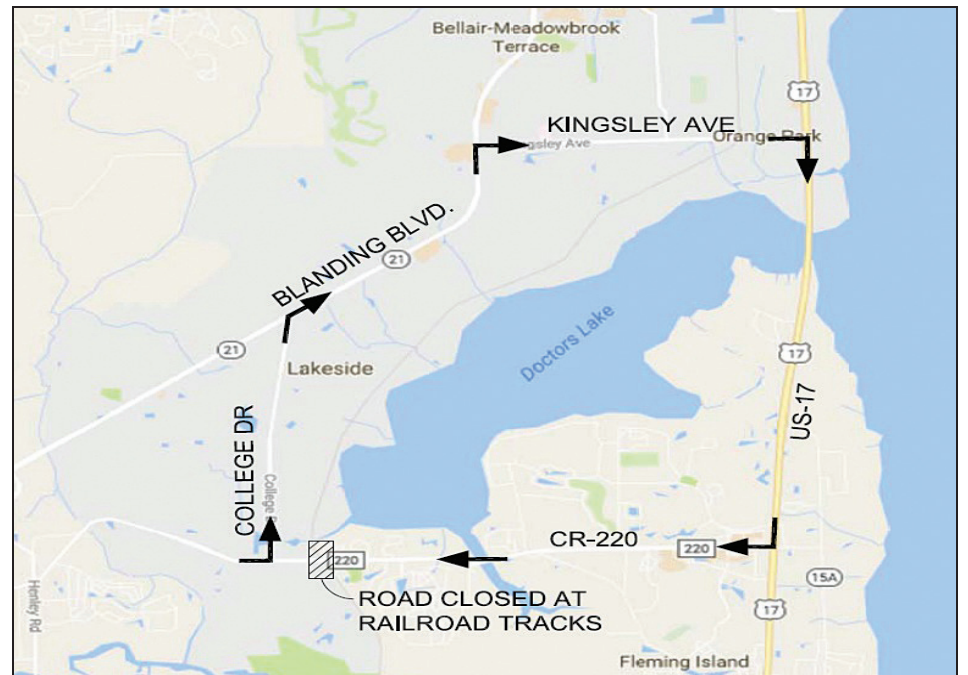
Boulevard turning on Kingsley Avenue to take U.S. Highway 17 south to get to any destination east of the railroad crossing on County Road 220.

County Road 218 lane resurfacing to get underway

MIDDLEBRUG – The Florida Department of Transportation announced that motorists should be on the lookout for a road resurfacing project soon to get under this summer.

FDOT hired Florida-based Anderson Columbia Company Inc. for the \$8 million project, which will start on the east side of the CSX Railroad tracks near U.S. 301 and extend to the intersection with State Road 16 in Penney Farms.

Motorists should take extra caution when driving in the area that stretches 21 miles all the way from Clay Hill to Penney Farms. The work involves milling and resurfacing travel lanes, shoulder milling and resurfacing, guardrail removal and replacement, pipe culvert installation, improved signage and roadway stripping, plus shoulder widening. Barring any weather delays or other unforeseen circumstances, the project should take approximately 10 months to complete.

Traffic will be maintained in accordance with FDOT design standards throughout the project. When lane closures are needed, drivers will be alerted in advance via portable, changing message signs. No lane closures will occur from 6:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and from 4:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. Within one thousand feet of Mallard Road and

State Road 21 intersections, no lane closures are allowed from 6:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. within six hundred feet of a school, no lane closures will be allowed from one hour before to 30 minutes after the school day begins, and one hour before and thirty minutes after students are released from project area schools.

These closure rules are put in place to ensure safe travel for all and will involve such area school zones as Clay Hill Elementary, Wilkinson Elementary, Wilkinson Junior High and Shadowlawn Elementary. The existing posted speed limits shall remain for each phase of the work along County Road 218.



Dog flu clinic next week

ORANGE PARK – Clay Humane, a non-profit animal clinic located near Orange Park, is offering a canine influenza vaccination clinic on June 9 and 10 to encourage families with dogs to protect their pets against a new strain of canine influenza spreading in Florida.

“H3N2 canine influenza has arrived in Florida. It is a strain of flu our dogs have never encountered before. Almost all dogs exposed to this virus will be infected,” said Christian Broadhurst, senior staff veterinarian at Clay Humane. “Just like the human version of the flu, the virus is very dangerous for the very young, the very old and the ill. It is vital pet owners protect all dogs from this strain of the flu.”

The clinic runs from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Friday and from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Sat-

urday. The immunization comes as a two-part series, so dogs will need to return for a second round of vaccines two weeks after the clinic. Dog owners can make an appointment for the second vaccination when their dog receives the first vaccine.

A \$50 fee covers both rounds of vaccinations against two strains of canine influenza virus, including H3N2. Clay Humane requires all dogs participating in the vaccine clinic have written proof of a current rabies vaccination or Clay Humane will administer a rabies vaccination for an additional charge. Dogs must be at least 7 weeks of age to receive the flu vaccine.

H3N2 is highly contagious and sheds from infected dogs for up to 24 days. Dogs who are around other canines are susceptible to the disease, especially in places like dog parks, boarding facilities, doggie daycares and places dogs congregate.

H3N2 is spread via contact with an infected dog through sniffing, licking, nuzzling or breathing air where an infected dog has been coughing, barking or sneezing. The virus is also spread through contact with contaminated objects.

To prevent the spread of canine influenza, vaccinate your dog and wash your hands with soap and water or disinfect them with an alcohol-based hand sanitizer after contact with any dogs. If your dog is coughing or showing other signs of respiratory disease, avoid participating in activities with other dogs.

Contact your veterinarian immediately if your dog has symptoms of the flu such as coughing, discharge from the nose or eyes,

Pastor aims to establish first homeless shelter in the city

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – John Sanders has a vision for helping homeless people and he plans to open the Vineyard, a shelter that will provide housing, job training and life skills – everything needed to be self-sufficient.

Sanders, pastor and founder of True Vine Fellowship church, said the city has a serious homelessness problem. They're living in the woods, under bridges and behind stores, he said.

"Just because you don't see homeless people doesn't mean they're not there," Sanders said.

According to Changing Homelessness Chief Executive Officer Dawn Gilman, a January survey of the homeless population found 84 homeless people in Clay County. However, the organization's annual survey is only a snapshot of one point in time, she said, and it is difficult to get an accurate count.

Sanders said he has a group of houses in mind for the project. The next step is raising the funds to purchase them. The goal, he said, is to own the property by January 1.

So far, Sanders said he has held car washes to raise money for the project,

and the church is hosting a benefit concert June 24. The Concert in the Cove will be held at the Shiloh Baptist Church at 1055 County Rd. 226 and will feature gospel music, hip hop and rap. Among the local performers will be Ashton Taylor, one of four finalists of WJXT Channel 4's Oh Say Can You Sing contest. Hungry Howie's is sponsoring the event.

Currently, Green Cove Springs does not have a homeless shelter. There are organizations that may help for a day or two, Sanders said, but many people need long-term assistance.

"This is what I believe, that we should help everybody, anybody that we can, no matter who they are," Sanders said. "If they're in need, that's what the church is supposed to do."

His vision for the Vineyard includes job training and resume help. He hopes to help people prepare for interviews and form relationships with local businesses for job placement.

Sanders said he created a resource team to build connections and move the project forward. They are not members of the church, he said, but they see the vision and want to be a part of it.

Most people he has spoken with are excited about the project, Sanders said, and

he has not heard any negative response – yet.

He said another pastor tried to open a shelter in the city years ago and the project fell apart over zoning issues. He hopes buying several houses in one area, instead of building something new, will alleviate that hurdle.

Sanders said this work is important because he wants to help people's spirits.

"I think before you can reach their soul, you have to meet their needs," he said. "It's hard for me to talk to you about Jesus if you're hungry. You're not gonna' hear me. I have to feed you first."

However, he said, the Vineyard is not about bringing more people to his church, and no one is obligated to join.

Sanders said his first initiative to aid

those in need was a clothes closet he set up since starting True Vine Fellowship in 2014. The True-ly Di-Vine Treasures Clothes Closet is located at Celebration Church, which allows him to use the front space of the building at 806 Oak St. He said volunteers work hard to keep the space maintained and presentable. He knows people may be feeling bad for coming there, he said, and he wants to make them feel comfortable.

"God said that we should love everybody," Sanders said, "Love is action. You gotta' do something. I can say I love you all day long. If I don't ever do anything for you, it's just words."

"If we say we're Christian, that means we should show some love. We should be out helping people in need."

Summer lunch program begins next week

ORANGE PARK — Graduates have headed home for the summer, but at least 49 percent of Clay County Public School kids could have trouble finding proper nutrition until school starts again.


For those students, summer lunch programs make up an essential component to their health.

The Clay County School District’s annual free summer lunch program will operate in nine schools and one mobile location June 12 through Aug. 4 to help feed students who, otherwise, might go hungry.

“There’s still a need for them to have meals over the summer, and just because the school year ends, doesn’t mean that hunger ends,” said Susan Glover, director of the district’s Food and Nutrition Services. District wide, 49 percent of students qualify for free or reduced lunch, a two percent increase from the year prior. Students qualify based on their parents’ income.

The district raised the prices for its meals at the June 1 school board meeting. The price increases ranged between 25 and 15 cents, and will continue to rise year after year until it reaches the federal average rate of \$3.16.

“What we’ve always tried to do is to really increase at a slow pace so we can always keep in mind our community,” Glover said. “We see at the grocery store

food prices have increased and with us not having done an increase in so long we definitely wanted to.”

The district last increased lunch prices in the 2012-2013 school year.

Two years ago, the district began a pilot program to compare district data with government assistance data from the state and create schools who only serve free meals to students. The Community Eligibility Provision was included in the 2010 Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act, which al-

lows the nation’s highest poverty schools and districts to serve breakfast and lunch at no cost to all enrolled students without the burden of collecting household applications. Instead, schools that adopt CEP are reimbursed based on the number of families participating in government assistance programs such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families.

Next year, the number of schools that qualify under this provision will double

from six to 12, or just under a third of the district’s schools.

Because the state has begun sharing information with school districts, families that receive government assistance automatically qualify for free or reduced lunch. Last year, the federal government began to factor in students who received reduced lunch into the CEP qualification as well. The increase could also be due to more families seeking government assistance or higher access to information, said Glover.

Even with more students accessing the benefits of school lunch programs, the threat of cuts loom. Despite well-documented benefits, funding for school lunch programs has historically been a partisan issue, mainly due to many of the programs’ highly regulated structure and costs.

Near the beginning of President Donald Trump’s administration, threats of dramatic cuts circulated, but the current budget proposed by the president has left funding for these programs intact. The budget still drains funds allocated for SNAP and TANF, which, under current law, would impact the number of children eligible for free or reduced lunch. Threats of cutting school programs are nothing new, however. They’re a reality Glover deals with often.

“I can’t put any worry on it, I have to just keep forging ahead...and continue to run a cost effective program and deal with the changes as they actually come,” Glover said.

Water concerns, pollutants take stage at town hall

KINGSLEY LAKE – With District 4 County Commissioner Gavin Rollins back after a one-year National Guard deployment to Africa, about 30 residents attended a town hall meeting Monday to hear from their representative and address any issues they may be facing.

Though Rollins was prepared to talk on a number of subjects, those attending the meeting had one of two things on their minds – the Black Creek pipeline project, and the hazardous disaster created by the use of EZ Base at different sites in Clay County.

Rollins began with the Black Creek project, recently appropriated \$13.3 million by state lawmakers. Dubbed the Black Creek Water Resource Development Project, it calls for a proposed pipeline to be built along State Roads 16 and 21 to a spreader field near Lake Magnolia on Camp Blanding property.

He explained the basics of the project, how water will be pumped from Black Creek, eventually making its way into Alligator Creek and from there into the Keystone Lakes which have seen a drastic drop in water level in the last few years. Prone to flooding, Black Creek runs with excess water about 70 percent of the time, according to Rollins.

It wasn't long before the Kingsley Lake community started speaking up.

"One of the things we really want to do is preserve the quality of our water," said Rex Brown, Kingsley Lake Board of Directors environmental committee chairman. "Some people have been concerned about the cost and effectiveness of what we're doing."

One resident, Dub Murphree, stood up during the town hall and expressed his opinions on the Black Creek pipeline project. He started by stating that he considers Rollins to be in a conflict of interest, as Rollins lives on Keystone Lake, and is an outspoken supporter of the pipeline.

He continued with criticism of Sen. Rob Bradley(R-Fleming Island), who ushered the funding bill through the senate. Next, Murphree speculated that if the water from Black Creek was not enough to fill the Keystone Lakes that lawmakers would take water from Kingsley Lake next.

"The premise that the lakes in Keystone need to be saved from their current and natural condition is not scientifically valid," Kingsley Lake resident Michael Romanelli recited to Rollins, asking the commissioner to write the statement down. "This can be verified by the St. Johns River Water Management District database," he said. According to Romanelli, the water in the Keystone Lakes has always fluctuated by as much as 30 feet, and the lakes are just low right now.

"We are being told that this will help

Keystone lakes and will not hurt Kingsley," Rollins said.

The commissioner didn't sway from his position, stating that though he does not personally have a degree in science, the people doing studies on Black Creek do, and that they have research to prove that the project will help the lakes around Keystone Heights.

"We'll just have to agree to disagree," Rollins finally said.

In a longer discussion, several residents from Middleburg expressed concerns about the use of EZ Base, a form of coal ash, that had been used on roads in Camp Blanding, as well as several other locations near Middleburg. Rollins said that the Department of Environmental Protection is working with the St. Johns River Water Management District to find and test sites where the ground cover has been used.

However, at this time, the only thing they can do is order removal of the substance from areas where DEP deems the installation to have been completed improperly, meaning that it wasn't properly packed down to prohibit the ash from lifting off the ground and washing away.

Use of EZ Base was halted in Clay County by the Board of County Commissioners in 2013 after they received several complaints and saw the substance banned in the state of Georgia.

Should DEP find sites where the installation has been unsuccessful, the Jacksonville Electric Authority is responsible for the proper hazardous materials cleanup procedure.

Not all residents met Rollins with contention. Brown, who moderated the event, described it as a positive meeting with Rollins and said he believed his questions had been answered.

"I think his explanation of the water project provided some more information for folks here," Brown said. "I hope we can work with him to continue to test sites of concern for EZ Base."

Rollins hopes to attend similar town hall meetings throughout his district to hear from constituents and update them on things affecting their part of District 4. He also encourages anyone living in his district to contact him or the BCC if they are in need of DEP testing on their property for contaminants caused by the application of EZ Base.

The Truth About Thatch

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Thatch is a term used quite a bit to describe issues with turfgrass, mainly because of the problems that accompany it. Thatch creates an excellent place for pest insects to hide and holds moisture in the upper parts of the plant, which can lead to disease. However, thatch is often misunderstood, mainly where it comes from and how to manage it.

What is thatch?

Thatch is a layer of dead and living turf-

grass between the lawn and the actual soil that can develop into a thick, spongy mat with a mixture of stem, root, and leave material. Thatch is commonly found in St. Augustine grass, Zoysia grass, and Centipede grass that is overwatered, overfertilized, or improperly mowed. It is rarely an issue in Bahia grass due to its more open growth and management.

Why is thatch a problem?

Excessive thatch creates several issues in the lawn. The buildup of plant matter makes a great habitat for insect pests and fungal growth. In addition to this, the

layer can impede the penetration of water and fertilizer to the roots and makes the lawn more susceptible to cold and freeze damage. A lawn with heavy thatch will go dormant sooner in the winter and will take longer to start growing in the spring. Mowing is also complicated by this layer, making it easier for scalping to occur as the mower sinks into the lawn, cutting too much of the healthy upper turf layer.

How can I control thatch?

One of the best ways to control thatch is to follow the proper management strategies for your lawn. For more detailed information, check out solutionsforyourlife.ufl.edu to access fact sheets and guides for the care of your turfgrass species. By managing water and fertilizer properly, the layer will not establish as quickly and conditions that lead to the decomposition of thatch will be favorable. Also, try to never cut more than 1/3 of the total leaf blade when mowing. These longer clippings can take much longer to decompose in the lawn.

Some grasses can still build up thatch over time so de-thatching can be done. This is accomplished using a verticutter where thatch is actively removed. If the thatch layer is 2-3" thick, this should be done in April to June in our area. This process actively cuts down into the soil, through grass, thatch, and soil and then loose ma-



terial can be raked off the surface. This is stressful on the lawn, especially those with Centipede grass. Aeration can also help to promote a better environment for thatch breakdown and topdressing with sterilizer can provide excellent control over time if done in small amounts to allow for decomposing microbes to contact the plant material. Overall, remember that thatch is only an issue if excessive so for many lower maintenance lawn areas, these control methods are not necessary on a regular basis.

What about grass clippings?

Research shows that if proper mowing timing and height are maintained, grass clippings do not contribute to thatch and should be left on the lawn to decompose and add nutrition to the soil. Never leave grass clippings on pavement though as they can run off into local waterways, causing excessive nutrients.

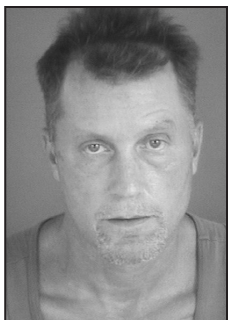
Restaurant undercover operation leads to meth

FLEMING ISLAND – Authorities report that an undercover operation at a Fleming Island restaurant ended this week in an arrest for charges of methamphetamine trafficking.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Bryan Eugene Gibson, 52, of Jacksonville on June 6 at 11:45 p.m. in the parking lot of the Sleep Inn and Suites on East West Parkway after first observing Gibson in the Dick's Wings restaurant nearby.

Officers used a drug-sniffing police dog to search Gibson's vehicle after the traffic stop. When the dog alerted the officers to the smell of drugs, they searched the vehicle. The search resulted in 27.6 grams of methamphetamine, two scales, a ledger, \$934 in cash and three syringes. The Florida statute for trafficking is 14 grams or more of a drug.

Gibson faces one count each of trafficking methamphetamine, conspiring to traffic methamphetamine. At press time, he remained in the Clay County Jail with bond set at \$251,005.

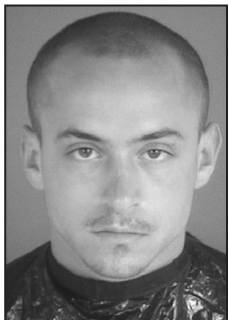
Subway armed robber collared

ORANGE PARK – Police have arrested a Jacksonville man for allegedly robbing an Orange Park area subway restaurant at gunpoint.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office charged Daniel Christian Taylor, 26, on June 6 at 2:08 a.m. after conducting an investigation.

According to the police report, Taylor went to the store at 195 Blanding Blvd. on June 5 at 8:53 p.m. and "insinuated he had a handgun in his waistband with the intent to permanently or temporarily deprive the victim of the money inside the cash register using a firearm," states the CCSO report.

Police said the store clerk admitted he saw what appeared to be the handgrip of a handgun sticking out of Taylor's waistband, which led him to run to the back of the

store where he called CCSO. When Taylor saw the store clerk run to the back, Taylor fled the building. Taylor was captured hours later by police. A search uncovered he was in possession of 1.26 grams of marijuana and 2.06 grams of cocaine.

He was booked into the Clay County Jail on one count each of possession of not more than 20 g. cannabis, possession of a controlled substance, attempted armed robbery with a firearm. His bond is set at \$155,258.

Clay pedestrian killed in St. Augustine

ST. AUGUSTINE – A 52-year-old Green Cove Springs man was killed June 4 in St. Augustine while trying to cross U.S. 1.

The man was hit by a 2004 Chevy Tahoe around 4 a.m. on June 4, according to a release from the Florida Highway Patrol. The release stated Christopher Matkowski, 56, struck the pedestrian while driving southbound on U.S. 1 near Arapaho Avenue. The victim's name has not been released at press time due to notification of next of kin.

FHP said Matkowski could not avoid the pedestrian and stopped the vehicle immediately. Matkowski was not injured and the incident was not alcohol related, the release stated. No charges have been brought, although further investigation is pending, the release states.

Sex charge for OP man

ORANGE PARK – An Orange Park man faces a felony sexual battery charge after police say he forced a woman to have sex with him.

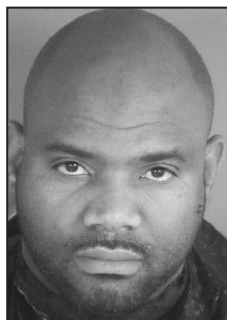
Officers arrested Jean Romain Toussaint, 40, on June 3 at 9:33 p.m. at the Clay County Sheriff's Office at 212 Blanding Blvd, according to a police report.

Police said Toussaint showed up at the woman's house around in Clay County 3 a.m. on June 3 shortly after a text message conversation in which she told him not to come and that she would not have sex with him.

When he arrived, she let him inside, the police report states, and reluctantly agreed to rub his back. Police said the woman told officers he then followed her into the bedroom and she told him again she did not want to have sex.

Toussaint is accused of forcefully digitally penetrating the victim and forcing her to engage in intercourse, the report states.

Toussaint agreed to meet police at the Orange Park Substation, where he was arrested and transported to the Clay County Jail where his bond is set at \$250,003. At press time, he remained in jail.

Couple charged with scamming senior

MIDDLEBURG – Police transferred a Jacksonville man and woman to the Clay County Jail from the Duval County Jail June 1 to faces theft charges, according to a Clay County Sheriff's Office report.

The transfer of Pamela Denise Hancock, 37, and Alandis Calvin Adams, 32, the report states, was based on a warrant for felony charges of grand theft in the amount of \$300-\$4,999 and fraudulent credit card use.

A Clay County judge issued the warrants after Teresa Irwin, Hancock's aunt, noticed unauthorized ATM withdrawals totaling more than \$1,000 that occurred between February 10 and March 15, the warrants state. According to the police report, Hancock is also charged with theft of a credit card. The warrant notes Hancock's criminal history and states she is on active probation for trafficking in stolen property, a felony.

At press time, Hancock remained in jail with bond set at \$40,008 and Adams' bond is set at \$40,006.

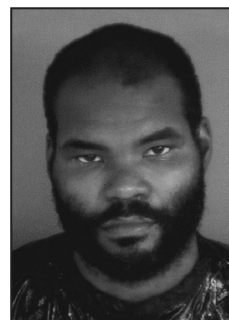

Following months of construction delays on the \$2.2 million project, the City Council has finally reached a point where they can safely open the newly-redesigned pool, with hopes of returning to a time when folks came from far and wide to see and swim in the spring-fed swimming area.

“We’re all thrilled that the pool is finished,” said City Manager Danielle Judd at the June 6 council meeting. “It’s been a long haul, but we think it’s going to be a real jewel for the community.”

Judd and Assistant City Manager Mike Null have worked since the first completion deadline was missed in December to get all of the construction finished, fences down and swimmers in the water. Finally, their dream has been realized.

The pool’s official opening date is June 8, at 11 a.m., which will be the daily opening time. The pool will be open six days a week, Tuesday through Sunday, from 11-7 p.m., with the facility closed on Mondays for cleaning. In addition to the pool, the city has also added a splash pad feature outside the gates that will be accessible to all park visitors who can turn on the water feature with the push of a button between 11 a.m. and 8 p.m., seven days a week.

Rates for entry are set at \$4 for adults, \$2 for children, and \$3 for active military and senior citizens 65 and older. The city is reviewing options for summer passes and will set the rates for passes at the June 20 council meeting, with the expectation of offering family passes and potentially indi-

vidual passes as well. In addition to setting pass rates, the council will also discuss rates for renting the pool’s upstairs pavilion at the June 20 meeting.

Though the pool is opening this morning, the city will be holding a ceremonial dedication ceremony on Saturday, June 17,

from 9 a.m. until 11 a.m. when the pool opens for the day. During the ceremony, city staff will participate in a ribbon cutting and share refreshments with the public prior to the pool’s opening that day.

“The pool has been completely rebuilt, it’s the centerpiece for Green Cove,” said Mayor Mitch Timberlake, who hopes the pool will bring back some of the city’s historic draw. “People aren’t going to get on paddleboats from Jacksonville to Green Cove, because now they have cars. A spring-fed pool is a unique experience, very few exist anymore, we hope this leads people to rediscover Green Cove Springs.”

Though the pool is substantially complete and able to commence full operation, the city is still going over a punch list with the contractor and engineers, but items still left incomplete are all small and should be finished soon, ending a months-long saga of anxiously marking off items on their list.

Since the end of February, delays on the project led the city to butt heads with the Spring Park contractor Core Construction Company of Jacksonville. Council voted to charge Core liquidated damages of \$500 a day for each day the company does not finish by April 14 and \$1,000 a day for each day the project ran past April 28. Those dollar amounts would be deducted from the city’s final payment to Core.

Marrone says Jags 'Not practicing'

JACKSONVILLE — Jacksonville Jaguar coach Doug Marrone took an interesting take on the recent round of organized team activities.

"We haven't practiced," Marrone said early Friday afternoon following OTA 6 at EverBank. "I know you guys look out there and you think that's practice ... I don't. I don't call it practice. I really don't."

Ironically, the Jags practices have been very vigorous, action-packed and sometimes contentious despite the players not wearing pads and not engaging in full contact. For that, Marrone remained optimistic yet realistic about what he was seeing on the field.

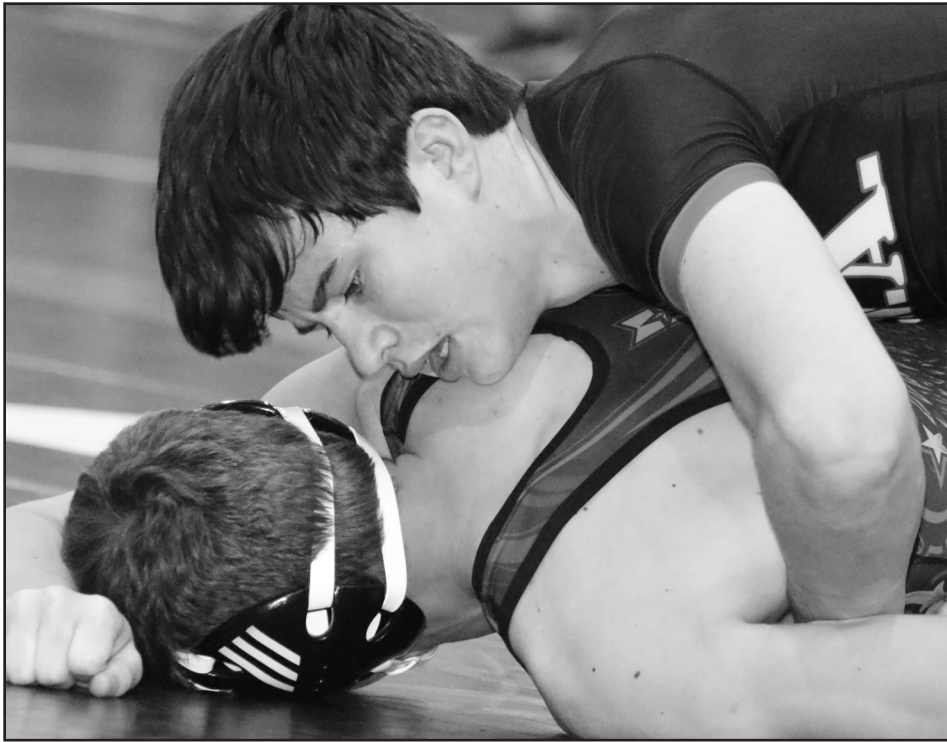

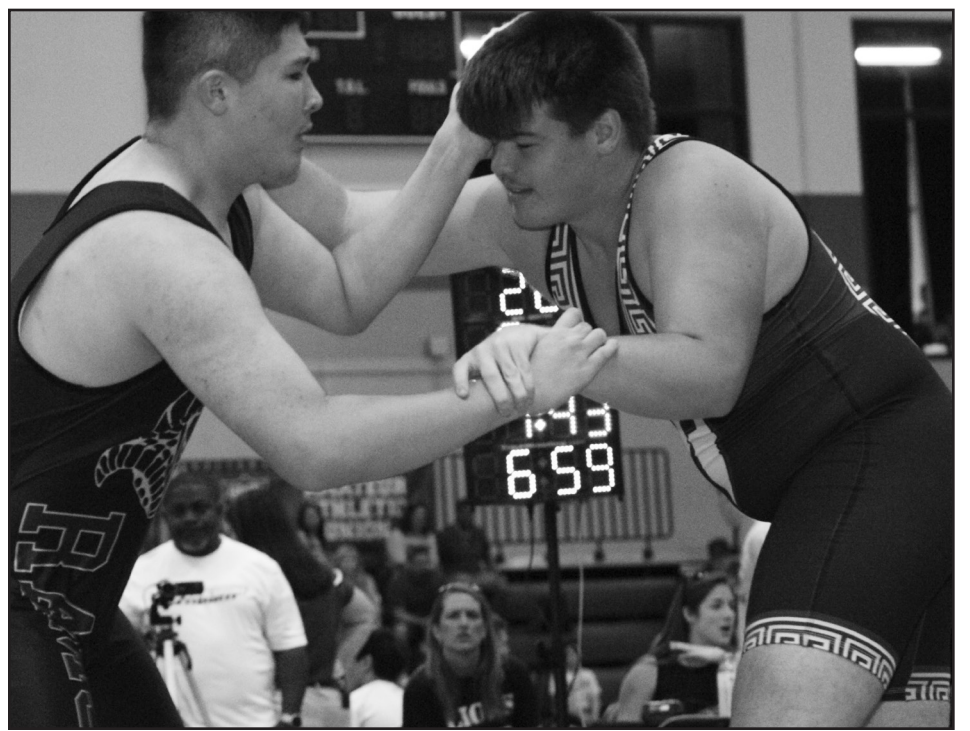

Cobbert has made his North Florida Wrestling Academy, located off College Avenue in Orange Park, open to all comers for training and mat time and looks to add numbers to the fold as the summer progresses.

Considered the national duals championship event of the year, the AAU Scholastic Duals is a five-day slugfest of competition pitting teams from as far as Oregon and New Jersey with midwest powers from Ohio, Indiana and Illinois as well as southeastern powers like Camden County, the aforementioned Georgia state champions and also Brandon, a nationally-ranked program for at least a decade in Florida.

"I think we have a better team going this year by about 40 points," said Cobbert. "We lost some tough ones last year at Disney and fell to seventh when we were in the mix for the top spot.

This team pushed the envelope to get 100 points at the state meet behind South Dade. Now, we are going after a Disney title."

In preparation for the AAU Scholastic Duals, area teams have been traveling to get in last-minute tournament level competition and also high-intensity training partners in the area. Camden County visited the Fleming Island High gym on Saturday for a session while both Fleming Island and Camden County both traveled to south Florida's Southeastern University in Lakeland for a duals matchup against each other plus three other teams.

Fleming Island, with state champion Jason Davis and a host of state medal teammates including third placer Paul Detwiler and upper weight stalwarts Ryan Smenda, Jose Concepcion, plus Middleburg High heavyweight Bailey Barnard,

dominated the field with an unbeaten slate including a four-point win over Camden County. The Camden County win was energized by a last-second pin by 182 wrestler Anthony Breeden who upset Camden state qualifier RJ Woodard prior to Davis, Smenda and Concepcion dominating their final matches.

Davis, Smenda and Detwiler were all unbeaten and pinned throughout the meet to push their names up as top contenders at Disney. Cobbert noted that his add-on wrestlers, teams are allowed three, will be Brandon Dickman, who returns out of Creekside High School from last year's War Eagles team after placing third in Class 2A at 170, Jaquan English, a newcomer and state qualifier at 126 out of 1A-Raines High School and Nate Ferkovich of Lake Brantley, who was state runnerup at 170 in Class 3A to Southwest Miami's Angel Delcueto.

In 2016, the War Eagles of Fleming Island, now the North Florida Wrestling Academy, finished seventh overall in the Community I division (Big Schools) after a

fourth place finish in their Pool competition against teams from Brownsburg (IN) Purple, Perry Meridian (IN) Blue and Pierre (SD) Governors.

Liberty (OH) Patriots was team champions with Brownsburg second and Perry Meridian third. PA Rampage took fourth with Flagler fifth and Social Circle (Ga) sixth.

In the championship bracket, Fleming Island lost a close 31-28 match to PA Rampage in the quarterfinals and got stung by state-rival Flagler Palm Coast 30-28 in the consolation semifinals before defeating Naperville Phoenix in the match for seventh place.

For the War Eagles, Jason Davis finished unbeaten at 14-0 with Albie Snedaker, Paul Detwiler and Smenda all going 12-2.

Oakleaf High's Knights wrestling club, coached by Wes Champs, got a rugged match against Fleming Island three weeks ago at Buchholz, but answered with their own tournament a week later with Ridgeview, Suwannee, West Nassau, Yulee and

some Camden County wrestlers competing.

Champs said he is bringing a full team minus a 195 pound wrestler with Ethan Gustillo and Isaiah Graham running unbeaten records for their tournament.

In 2016, in their first Disney Duals, Oakleaf took 10th in their pool competition. Unfortunately, Oakleaf's Pool lineup included eventual national champion Liberty (OH) Patriots. Oakleaf battled through one of the roughest pool matchups of the tournament and finished with a 41-33 close loss in their final pool match that led to a 36-33 consolation bracket win over eventual consolation round third placer Austintown Fitch B out of Ohio.

Competing with the Oakleaf squad will be, from Orange Park High, Nartorian Lee, second in 2A at 170, and Tyler Dehart. Oakleaf will have their regular lineup including Ryan Rosano, Ethan Gustillo, Isaiah Graham, Trent Carroll and Donovan Gray. From Middleburg, Cody Eastwood will join the team. Champs will also have three eighth graders from Oakleaf Junior High and two freshman wrestlers.

In the Community Division II (small school) competition, Clay, with a lineup filled with state medalists and placers from the Clay High team and also Suwannee High, placed second in pool play behind the Rootstown (OH) Raiders after a 35-25 loss before finishing second in championship bracket play behind Tomahawk (OH) Wrestling, the eventual national champions.

In the championship bracket, Clay defeated Rootstown 35-22, but lost a tough 41-22 match to Tomahawk in round four.

Clay, according to coach Jim Reape, will be heading to New Orleans for the Jazz Town Wrestling Duals on June 17-18. The team list for the Jazz Town event includes Clay, Bayou Elite (TX), Camden County (GA), Rayne (LA), Oklahoma Rampage, Granite City (IL), Riverdale (FL), Niceville (FL) and Springstead (FL).

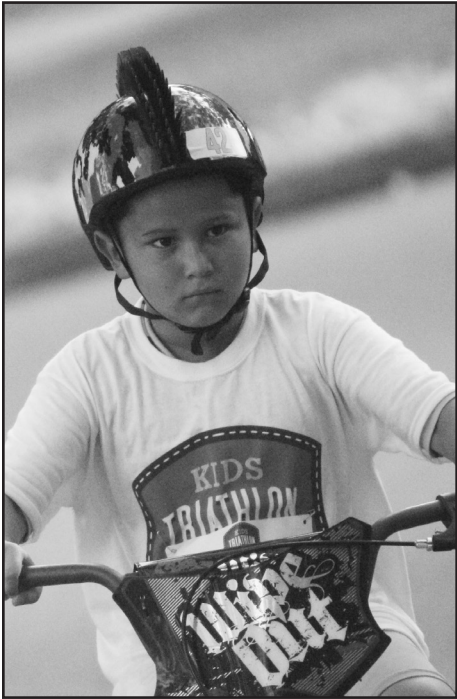

Heath, who was an outstanding football and baseball athlete at Clay with a duo-sport scholarship offer coming from Missouri Valley College, has been on a mission to find his way since those energetic days as a Blue Devil.

"I could do just about any sport back then," said Heath, who had turned down a full ride football scholarship to Texas Christian University to be able to play both sports in college. "The only sport I wasn't really good at, but tried, was wrestling. I wasn't disciplined enough for that."

After a shoulder injury ended his sports aspirations, Heath endured a tumultuous decade or more of flailing emotionally, physically and psychologically. Heath, via a choice meeting in a bar with an Air Force recruiter and a future first wife, found a reason to change his life.

"Since five, I've always had sports. After I got hurt in college, I was lost," said Heath. "I just didn't know what to do. That's when I discovered softball and flag football and some semi-pro baseball, but everyone who was a has-been was also there."

The mission to find his niche came to an emotional halt just a month ago when Heath was inducted into the Jacksonville

Guns N Hoses Boxing Hall of Fame at the Jacksonville Arena. Heath also proposed to wife-to-be Wendy in the same ring he was presented his Hall of Fame trophy and ring. Gun and Hoses is an annual boxing challenge between Jacksonville area firefighters and policemen.

"This ring; both rings if you think about it, have brought me around to accepting that my bad previous life choices all finally got me my due," said Heath. "I was all over the place trying to find what I was supposed to be. My life would have been very different if I had found boxing early in my life."

Heath's athletic endeavors over the past 20 years have ranged from college football, college baseball, amateur flag football, league softball and even swimming, tennis and basketball. The consistent theme in all of his actions was internal.

"I wanted to prove to someone that I was a really good athlete," said Heath. "I was most of the time number two; Clay football behind Bolles. Clay baseball until we finally beat Bolles in my senior year. Bad karma just kept me from winning something big."

In the fateful bar that Heath had holed up in 1996 after returning from college injured, broken and emotionally unknowing of his future, Heath was approached by an Air Force recruiter who asked of his life

intentions.

"I was at a friend's wedding reception and he started talking about the Air Force and I told him I didn't think they would take me," said Heath. "Later on, I found out my grandma, Lois Sheehan, had set up the meeting, but that, and, two days later, I met a pretty woman that just smiled at me while cashing a check at a bank. I went home and pretty much asked myself what was I going to do with the rest of my life. It all changed from there."

Heath went to the recruiting station, signed on, married the woman and became an Air Force firefighter.

"The recruiter had asked what I wanted and I told him I was athletic, a team player and a go-getter," said Heath. "He said you are a firefighter."

Heath finished his Air Force commit in 2001 and signed on first with a Savannah National Guard unit, then 13 years at Mayport before ending up at First Coast Navy Fire Rescue at NASJAX the past few years. Heath had two certificates for saving two lives as firefighter.

Heath's first Guns and Hoses fight came in 2007, at age 32.

"You may laugh, but I cried my eyes out after I won that first fight," said Heath. "The emotion of being back in a sport and then overwhelmingly winning with a knock-out just blew my mind. The adrenaline was so intense."

Heath's boxing came to a screeching halt in anticipation of a second fight when a broken hand left him rehabbing for nearly two years. Heath finished with two more fights; in 2009 and in 2016 and both wins, before retiring from the sport with seven knockdowns, one knockout and one TKO.

"When I don't fight, I train other athletes and our fire department Guns and Hoses record is 11-6 now," said Heath. "Coaching is definitely one of the next steps I'd like to try. And I want to be a parent."

Heath becomes visibly emotional when talking of his Ella and fiancée Wendi Knight.

"She makes me cry," said Heath. "Ella grounded me and she is the first girl in five generations in my family and I want her to be the best at whatever she wants to be. I'm at a better place because of her and Wendi. The good karma; Wendi and Ella, finally caught up to me."

Missouri, with Toelken entering the game in the fourth inning, won 12-7. Missouri eventually lost two games to be eliminated from the tournament.

A grand slam by Missouri slugger Glendinning in the fourth gave Missouri an 8-6 lead against Texas A&M into the fourth inning.

After Houck worked a 1-2-3 inning in the fourth, Missouri hitter Chris Cornelius hit a solo homer, his second of the year, to give Mizzou a 9-6 lead. The Tigers added another run on an error with two outs to take a 10-6 lead.

Texas A&M got a run back in the bottom of the fifth on an RBI groundout to second base, but that was all despite loading the bases with one out. Junior RHP Andy Toelken of Green Cove Springs relieved Houck after 4.1 and inherited a runners-on-the-corner jam that yielded one run.

Mizzou tacked on another run on a Harris RBI single following a Brett Bond (St. Louis, Mo.) double in the top of the sixth inning.

After Toelken retired the first two batters in the bottom of the sixth inning, a rain and lightning delayed the game for one

hour and 47 minutes. Toelken retired the first batter following the break to send the game through the sixth.

Toelken finished the Texas A & M game with zero hits, two walks and five strikeouts with four groundouts and four flyouts against 18 batters faced.

Missouri's season ended with a 10-3 loss to LSU and a 10-2 loss to South Carolina. Toelken did not play in either game.

For 2016-17, Toelken finishes with a 2.82 earned runs average for second on the Missouri roster with a 5-3 won/lost record and one complete game. In 70.1 innings pitched, Toelken gave up 59 hits, 31 runs (22 earned) with 24 walks and 52 strikeouts.

Six different Blazers recorded hits on Saturday, while Slaughter, White, and Andzel each posted multiple hits in the game.

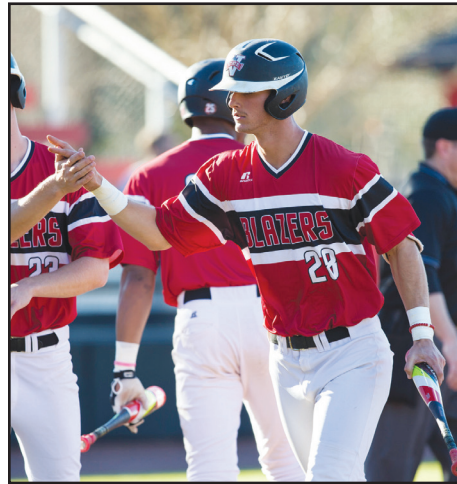

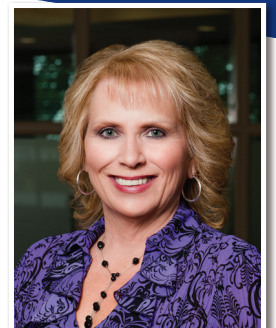

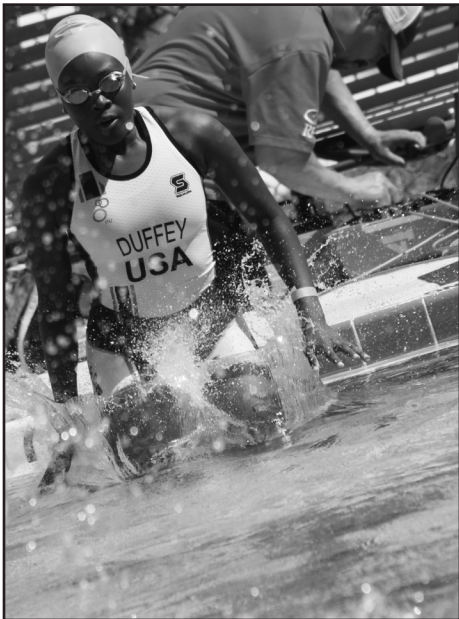

bles and Chad Henne were joined by Brandon Allen out of Arkansas and all three were capable of moving the ball downfield in scrimmage situations.

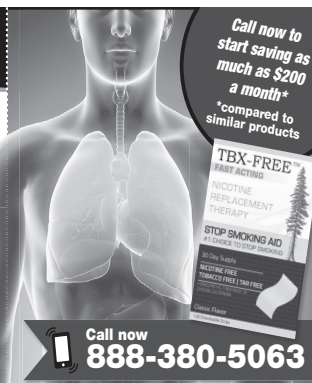

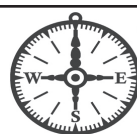
