Felon charged with attempting to defraud judges, elected officials

GREEN COVE SPRINGS — A 17-page document lays out the charges against convicted felon Richard Price Tucker, 44, and details a complex scheme in which he tried to defraud six public Clay County officials, including two judges, the clerk of court and State Attorney Angela Corey.

Authorities extradited Tucker to Green Cove Springs last week from a federal prison in South Carolina to face six felony charges of attempting to file false Internal Revenue Service documents or

records against the real or personal property of others. According to court documents, Tucker attempted to fraudulently use the names of Fourth Circuit Court Judges John H. Skinner and William Wilkes, Fourth Circuit State Attorney Angela Corey and Clay County Clerk of Court Tara Green and have them become financially responsible for all of his debts. The case

also involves Teresa Nechvatal, who at the time, served as a legal secretary for Assistant State Attorney James Boyle, who is also listed as a victim in the case.

The investigation began in early April 2015 and was initiated by Corey's office in conjunction with the Jacksonville's Sheriff's Office. However, when it was

School district budget planning looks bleak, more cuts coming

FLEMING ISLAND — In presenting the first few expenditures that lay the foundation of its 2016-17 budget, the Clay County School District has again exacted the paring knife.

At a special budget session and called meeting March 29, the board voted 4-1 to approve a new allocation package that cuts three health educator positions from the district next year while adding a partial administrator position at one elementary school. Veteran board member Carol Studdard voted no on the package and board member Janice Kerekes was out of town for the meeting.

Superintendent Charlie Van Zant Jr. said the move was not easy but was just the first step if the district sincerely wants to significantly improve its finances, continue to provide quality student programs and give employees raises.

"I want to increase salaries, but I also have a responsibility to

Operation New Hope helps former inmates 'break the cycle'

JACKSONVILLE – Linsey Aube knows the ways the scarlet letter of hard time can distort reality into a cycle of mistakes which can mold a little girl into a docking number. However she has an opportunity that her father never had, to break the cycle chiseled by her past with the help of Operation New Hope's Ready4work program.

"I am an alcoholic and an addict," Aube said. "During my arrest I was blacked out I don't even remember getting arrested. I've been sober now since my arrest, and I'm very happy with life today. I have no reasons to go mess things up."

Bolstered by a \$1,475,000 appropriation from the 2016 Florida Legislature, Operation New Hope plans to setup a satellite office this year in Clay County to complement the services it currently offers to residents here and in Duval, St. Johns and Nassau counties.

This year Operation New Hope, which would make it easier for downtrodden men and women hidden by the heavy hand of the criminal justice system to try and make a new start for themselves by successfully completing the Ready4work program, which will help them find careers and re-enter society.

The organization helps men and women like Aube who did not commit a violent or sexual crime, and just want to regain control of their lives. Some, like Aube, for the first time in their lives. The program isn't easy, however, and for some the commitment is just too much.

"We pretty much guarantee these people a job if they're willing to do everything

we tell them to do," said Kevin Gay, Operation New Hope chief executive officer. "They've got to be a randomly drug tested, they've got to be on time to class every day. If they're one minute late to class then they're not going to move through. If you don't participate, if you're not engaged, if you've got a bad attitude, if you're not dressed properly. We're really clear in the beginning on what the expectations are. Most of our folks step up to that."

Gay's results don't lie and neither does the juxtaposed cost of his program versus the yearly cost of incarceration, which equates to a \$13,000 difference in price to the taxpayers. The program also boasts

a lowered prison re-entry rate for any clients who successfully completes the 29 courses.

"We practice what we call tough love here," said Bill Carroll, who ran the ready4work program for three years. "They have to prove to us, because we're advocating for them for an employer, they need to prove to us that they can be responsible, that they can arrive on time, and that they can work with a teammate. At the end of their time here, we offer them a picture of what they can do for an employer."

The courses that the client must complete are designed to address self-esteem, confidence, job training and certification in areas such as logistics. The goal of the program is not only to help the client get a job, but to teach them the life skills necessary to keep the job.

"Our focus is on breaking the cycle," Carroll said. "If we can help these men and women become productive members of society, then hopefully their children will not be following in their footsteps of being locked up and going away. We stress those factors the whole time they're with us.

Carroll said students are taught how to overcome their past as a bridge to their future success. "We teach them not to hide it, and how to talk about it, but not to dwell on it. More importantly to talk about what they've done since then, and we're very successful in doing this," he said.

Aube has taken the first step out of the cycle started by her ancestors. Her routine is one of diligence, and self-reliance, which has taken her on a journey from the blazing pavement in front of some courtroom and wrapped her in a blanket of previously unthinkable care.

"It's a vicious cycle," Aube said. "I never ever wanted to turn out like my dad, but that's exactly who I became. I don't feel like I'll ever go back to living like that. I am breaking the cycle. I know I only have six months sober right now, but that's the best I've ever had. I'm so happy right now, and I think that it's just because I've hated myself for my entire life.

"I finally loved myself. The goal is not just to be sober, but to care about myself so much so I can say 'why would I go back to that.'"

discovered that Corey herself was one of Tucker's targets, she asked Gov. Rick Scott to move the case to another circuit "to avoid a conflict of interest or any appearance of impropriety."

Scott signed a June 22, 2015 executive order that details how officials in the Seventh Judicial Circuit of Florida agreed to take on the case. Investigator Michael K. Taylor began working on the case after receiving "several IRS Forms" from the U.S. Secret Service.

Tucker, who is serving a 70-month federal sentence for manufacturing 50 grams or more of methamphetamine, filled out IRS Forms 1096 and Form 1099-OID under the names of Skinner, Nechtaval and

Corey in the amount of \$1 million each.

"Richard Price Tucker nominates and appoints the Honorable Judge John H. Skinner, the Honorable State Attorney Angela Corey and Teresa Aechtaval(sp) as 'fiduciary creditors and debtors' and directs them to file the appropriate IRS Form 1099's," states court documents.

According to the investigator, Tucker was attempting to force his victims to "pay and settle the charges, claims and bills associated with his Social Security number."

"According to the Internal Revenue Service, IRS Form 1099 OIDs are filed when an individual purchases a note for less than face value," states the filings.

At the same time Tucker was serving his federal drug sentence, he was awaiting transfer to a Florida prison where he was to serve a 13-month sentence for lewd and lascivious battery on a victim between the

ages of 12 and 16, which would be followed by a five-year sentence of sex offender probation. Officials suspended his state charges while he served his federal sentence.

Judge Skinner presided over Tucker's case in which he pleaded guilty on March 21, 2011. Judge Wilkes originally heard Tucker's case, but retired and became a senior judge before Tucker was sentenced. Boyle prosecuted the state case, while Nechtaval served as Boyle's legal secretary at the time.

In the meantime, while sitting in federal prison, Tucker acted as his own attorney and attempted to appeal his federal drug conviction despite having entered a voluntary plea agreement. On February 25, 2015, U.S. District Court Judge Marcia Morales denied Tucker's appeal.

A month later, Tucker mailed the first packet of IRS forms to Clay County. Court

documents show Tucker made contact with the victims via U.S. Mail that he shipped from federal prison on two different dates. The first packet was mailed on or about March 27, 2015 to Skinner and directed "the Clerk of Court to record the instruments and file them with the Internal Revenue Service," states the court records. The second packet, which was mailed on or about July 15, 2015, was mailed directly to Clay County Clerk of Court Tara Green and directed her to "record the instruments and file them with the Internal Revenue Service." In the second set of fraudulent documents, Tucker placed "a monetary value on his life of \$50,000,000.00," states the court documents.

Tucker is currently in the Clay County Jail where he is being held on \$150,018 bond and has a court date set for May 4 on the new charges.

ORANGE PARK – Covered in paint, cedar shavings and ribbons, Gonzo the rabbit amazed attendees at this year’s Fifth Annual Rabbit Fashion Show where he and his owner, Bianca Smith, took home first prize.

The Clay County 4-H Club, an international youth development and youth mentoring program, started the fashion show at the Clay County Agricultural Fair five years ago. The fashion show helps instill confidence in the children who participate in the event, but it also gives Clay County residents the rare opportunity to see rabbits dressed in outfits that match their owners.

“I’m an artist, and he’s also an artist,” Smith said. “What we kind of did was his picture was one of me, and his picture is one of him. We actually planned for it a few

weeks before, but we actually painted all this stuff last night. It took us two hours, and we also made his hat this morning. We cut two little holes to make his ears come out.”

State workers bothered by bats, bad air

In Greek mythology, Ajax is known as the guy who raped the prophetess Cassandra.

In Tallahassee, Ajax is known as the absentee landlord of Northwood Centre, a state office building so sick with mold and bat poop that Gov. Rick Scott took the extraordinary step of cutting off rent payments and relocating 1,500 state employees.

Among the displaced is Department of Business & Professional Regulation Secretary Ken Lawson, whose executive desk was located directly under 10 pounds of bat guano.

The face and voice of Ajax is one Stuart Silberberg, described by the Tallahassee Democrat as a principal for Ajax Investment Partners, a New York City firm that has, since 2007, co-owned Northwood in partnership with Los Angeles-based JRK Birchmont.

As the parties gird their loins for litigation, Silberberg granted a lengthy interview to the Democrat. Unable to dazzle the paper's reporters with his brilliance, Silberberg instead baffled them with bullfeathers and talking points that would work brilliantly in *The Onion*, a satirical website.

But this is not a laughing matter for the affected employees. And air quality is not a new issue at Northwood. According to the Democrat, "Problems from mold, sewage and animal feces surfaced in the mid-1990s [resulting in] a lawsuit filed in 2002 by 60 workers who sued Northwood and won a substantial, undisclosed settlement."

Now, there's a new lawsuit. Silberberg can't explain "the reports of employees fainting and throwing up," but he "honestly wishes he could," he told the Democrat. Then, he proceeded to blame the victims, conjuring up images of profit-motive crazed plaintiffs feigning sickness, like the complaining witnesses in the Salem witch trials.

"I don't know where that stuff comes from," said Silberberg. "The Fire Department was there. They found nothing. All the specialists that we have working at the property came, reported, they found nothing. Our environmental firm was there. They found nothing."

"Our property management team walked the property. They found nothing. We are as stumped as anyone. The property checks out clean as it almost always does," he said.

From 2007 to last month when Scott pulled the plug, Northwood's current owners pocketed over \$56 million in rent. Silberberg, we are told, has "an even longer

At the same time there is a double standard – a mother is a reservoir of compliments.

My mother made a locket that contained her mother's ashes, and she wore it for a few months following my grandmother's death. It was eventually packed away into a drawer next to her bed, as most mementos are, like my late little sister's dress and stuffed bunny that said 'I love you' when she squeezed it. So she kept squeezing it to store that in her hump for when the constant assault of dragging days dehydrated her.

I sometimes see my grandmother in her, as she stares out of open windows, as she crushes a cigarette into a packed ashtray. 5 Years Ago, 2011

Mitch Timberlake and Pam Lewis were elected to serve on the Green Cove Springs City Council. Timberlake defeated Jeanne Eisenstein in the Seat 1 race, while Lewis defeated William Gause in the Seat 2 race.

After running unopposed, Marge Hutton and Steve Howard were sworn in to serve on the Orange Park Town Council.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Nyota Z. McGriff of Jacksonville for one count each of initiating theft of property and the sale of drugs in connection with an organized fencing organization.

10 Years Ago, 2006

Gov. Jeb Bush appointed his friend Rep. John Thrasher (R-Orange Park) to fill a vacancy on the Clay County Board of Commissioners after the indictment of Commissioner Christie Fitzgerald in connection with a drawn-out illegal dumping scandal.

Florida Supreme Court Justice Kenneth B. Bell joined Judge William Wilkes to cut the ribbon officially re-opening the newly-restored historic Clay County Courthouse, built in 1890.

Underdog no more

Nonprofit helps dog owners pay for cancer treatment

FLEMING ISLAND – Cody is just like everyone else. He likes home cooked meals, going for long walks on the beach and even the occasional dog treat.

Diagnosed with lymphoma a month ago, the Golden Retriever has been fighting ever since. Now, with aid from the Magic Bullet Fund, a Briarcliff Manor, N.Y.-based nonprofit that raises funds to help dogs fight cancer, Cody might be able to enjoy those simple guilty pleasures for years to come.

“He loves going on walks,” said Robin Anton, Cody’s owner. “We’re going to do everything we can to give him a fighting chance. Imagine a person is going through chemo, would you want to eat? No. Would you want to go out and play? No. But the last three weeks he’s been responding very well.”

Clay County Animal Care and Control captured Cody two years ago inside an area Winn-Dixie while he perused the aisles happily. Anton found Cody at the shelter, and decided to give him a new forever home.

“I took him to the vet alone that morning,” Anton said. “And I had this feeling because I did some research online and lymphoma came up, and I was like please, please, please. I was crushed, my whole family was devastated. We went from our regular vet to our oncologist that day. It was so much information to process all at once. The cancer, what do we do? If we didn’t seek treatment then they were giving us four to six weeks. Tops.”

With the average cost of treating lymphoma ranging from \$900 and \$3,000 dollars, Anton was at a loss at what to do financially. Her oncologist recommended the

Magic Bullet Fund as a way to help cover some of the costs of Cody’s treatment.

“Honestly it’s just this ray of sunshine every time I speak with any of the volunteers of the organization,” Anton said. “The communication has just been amazing. Nothing shy of amazing. He had his fourth treatment on Friday [April 1], and she was calling me that night asking ‘how is it going’ how did it go.’ To say I’m in awe of them on a daily basis is an understatement.”

Laurie Kaplan started the Magic Bullet Fund 12 years ago after her Siberian Husky, Bullet, was diagnosed with lymphoma at age nine. Her oncologist urged her to

write a book, and when she did, she put all the profits into starting the fund, which has helped 485 dogs fight back against cancer.

“We help dogs all over the country,” Kaplan said. “I’m in New York, but our volunteers are all over the country. Once we raise the funding, we have 30 days for each dog to raise funding. Cody came into the fund which was on March 16, so we have until April 16 to pull the rest of the funding for Cody, then the money is raised and we keep in touch with the clinic and they send us an invoice.”

history with the property, dating back to the early 1990s.”

More specifically, and in his own words, Silberberg has “been affiliated with this property since 1993, when it was owned by two owners, maybe three, before this. Through institutions that I’ve worked for, I have financed and refinanced this property four times. I think what’s important here is the property had traded institutionally several times and been financed institutionally several times, and each and every time, there would be an environmental inspection and an environmental report. And each and every time, the property passed those reports.”

That actually makes sense if you’re in the business of collecting fees and commissions for churning office buildings you don’t have to work in.

“Certainly the income stream from the state offices was a primary reason from an economic standpoint,” said Silberberg, who understandably would like to turn the “income stream” back on.

Less understandable is the stream of patronizing ipse dixit pronouncements delivered by Silberberg to The Democrat.

Silberberg oozes condescension in a series of not-too-veiled suggestions that Scott is too dumb to understand the basics of building management.

“I can only speculate that they don’t fully appreciate the process by which capital improvements are made to large-scale institutional buildings,” Silberberg told The Democrat. “It takes a long time to conduct tests, make engineering studies ... and put contractors in place to make changes. And I think they were frustrated – my guess – with the pace of those changes.”

Bat problems, according to Silberberg,

“are very common around Tallahassee.” And “there are always ongoing issues [that] relate to things that employees at the property are doing. And they could be things like running their own refrigeration units at their desks or plants and humidity.”

Notwithstanding our bats and our reckless use of refrigeration units, Silberberg is willing to take Florida state government, and its rent money, back.

“We would certainly welcome a conversation with them,” said Silberberg. “They have been difficult. I would love to have a conversation with the right person. It’s our understanding that it’s moved beyond the agencies themselves and perhaps to a legislative issue.

“That’s a matter of law and budgeting. But we would welcome the conversation because we know we have a clean property. We also think we have the right property to keep the state happy for years to come.”

There’s too much money at stake for Silberberg to think anything else.

And in the long-running bats#@! crazy case of Northwood Centre, there’s no predicting where the next load of guano will drop.

\$3 to \$40 based on the age division and the number of children who participated in the April 3 event.

"The judging criteria is they have to look cute," said Stephanie Conner, 4-H agent for Clay County. "They're looking for most creative, best team theme, and best overall. They can purchase their costumes

or hand make them, so the kids that hand make them get a lot of brownie points. It's a little bit easier for the older people to handle it, but there was a lot of energy put into making her costume."

Smith participates in the 4-H Club called 'Happy Hoppers' which helps youth all there is to know about rabbits, traveling to rabbit shows and participating in events such as the rabbit fashion show.

"The kids are made to talk in front of crowds and get the experience for being in front of a crowd," Conner said. "It builds confidence, it's hard for teenage kids to get up and talk in front of crowds, so for the little ones to come up, even if it's just 'my rabbit's name is coco' so we build confidence in a fun hands-on setting."

The 4-H Club focuses a great deal on public speaking and confidence building, but the program also offers anything from hunting classes all the way to photography lessons. The instructors work to find a place for any child's interest, Conner said.

Rollin' on the St. Johns River

Boat tour brings awareness about the waterway's health

FLEMING ISLAND – Fertilizer, failing septic tanks and crumbling infrastructure might not seem like they've got anything in common, but look under the surface and it's all right there in the river crashing against the shore.

The St. Johns Riverkeeper and other river advocates laced up and shoved off for a 13 day tour along the St. Johns from the headwaters at Fort Drum to the river's mouth at the fishing village of Mayport. The tour, dubbed "Save the St. Johns," was meant to raise a flag of awareness about the problems facing the St. Johns River, and act as the catalyst of change needed to change the polluted fate awaiting it.

"This has been a 13 day tour to not only celebrate the treasures and beauty of this water shed, but most importantly to get out and meet the locals that enjoy and value the St. Johns River, and to talk about issues," said Lisa Rinaman, St. Johns Riverkeeper, at an April 1 stop on Fleming Island. "Unfortunately there are threats to the St. Johns River and we need to understand those and bring awareness to those so we can be part of the solution, and then activate people throughout the watershed

to be part of protecting the river."

Among the threats to the St. Johns River is nutrient pollution, which can come from failing septic tanks, failing infrastructure, or even discarded dog waste which can run down storm drains and enter the river.

"Nutrient pollution leads to algae blooms that shut down business like right here in Doctors Lake in the past," Rinaman said. "These algae blooms not only are harmful to our fisheries and wildlife, because they pull out oxygen from our waterways, but they also can be toxic to hu-

mans. Nutrient pollution is a huge problem throughout the 310 miles of the St. Johns River."

Rinaman and her entourage made their Clay County stop after boating through Black Creek, Swimming Pen Creek and Doctors Lake before heading back north to Mayport in Duval County.

Algae blooms aren't the only threat to the well-being of the St. Johns. Last February, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection publicly supported a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers plan to dredge – and therefore deepen – 13 miles of the river to allow the largest new class of cargo ships to enter the Port of Jacksonville. It's a realization that Rinaman did not take lightly, because last Friday the St. Johns Riverkeeper filed a suit to stop the DEP.

"The dredging on the north end of the river will also do damage to our wetlands and grasses and undermine the health of the St. Johns, and so it's time we look at this river and make sure we're protecting it and trying to keep the pollution out, because that's the cheapest solution," Rinaman said.

The Save the St. Johns tour focused on

Daughter works to educate others about colon cancer



FLEMING ISLAND – Charles Goodale was a man of many hands in his lifetime. Some remember him fondly as a brilliant Navy commander aboard the USS Conserver, others knew him just as a man always willing to crack a joke.

Goodale died from stage four colon cancer and now leaves his legacy in the morning glories that climb telephone poles and intertwine with power lines around his house, suffocating every available surface, perpetually touching, perpetually blooming.

Alison King knew Goodale as more than that. She knew him as a father and a mentor, who in his last year, dissolved before her in the face of colon cancer which metastasized through his body quickly and ferociously. Goodale isn't alone. Cases like his touch 150,000 people a year, because colon cancer is the second-leading cause of cancer-related deaths in the United States.

"It was about 7-8 months after he passed I went to a reunion for the USS Conserver," said King, referring to the diving and salvage ship her father commanded. "One of his divers came up and said 'thank you for taking care of our skipper.' Another man came up to me in tears and said that when he came aboard the Conserver that he had quit school, and my dad grabbed

him and shoved him in his office and said 'you're going to get your diploma under my watch' and he said he was more of a father to him than his own father, so I was able to learn what kind of man he was."

Goodale never completed a colorectal cancer screening. His last days, which were fortunately spent in his home under the care of hospice workers, would have been much different if he had taken one day out of his life to complete it, King said.

"That poor man suffered," King said. "I can remember he would eat breakfast and he would say 'I gotta go' and he would get up and get halfway to the bathroom and say 'I'm not gonna' make it.' It's comical now, you know? But bless his heart, he was warning us."

When the symptoms got severe, Goodale finally went in for a colonoscopy, but it couldn't be completed because the mass in his colon was so large. When discovered early, colon cancer has a survival rate of 93 percent, but as the cancer progresses to later stages that number drops to eight percent.

"It's unfortunate," said Michael Herman, M.D. of the Borland-Groover Clinic, Goodale's physician. "Because it could've

been prevented with a 30-minute procedure. Prevention is key. It's easier than you think, and any patient that's had a colonoscopy will tell you 'yeah, it's easier than you think.' It's not surgery where we cut on the skin or anything else. You come in, you go to sleep, you wake up and you go home. It takes a day and a drive."

As the disease worsened and treatments became less and less effective, it began to become clear that the best thing they could do for Goodale was to just make him comfortable, Herman said.

"He started losing control of his bladder," said Betty Barlow, a professional home healthcare aid who helped nurse Goodale in his last days. "That bothered him, he didn't like that. He was a military man who was used to being in control and that was something he didn't have any control of."

Colon cancer doesn't always show symptoms, and some might not know they have the disease. Studies show that 50 percent of Americans have never had a screening. That leaves half of the American population to balance on the same tight-rope Goodale walked on.

"Sooner or later you have to accept what you're being faced with," King said.



“You try to make the best of it. He was adamant about not getting screened, and so you take on a different perspective when it hits close to home, when you have a loved one that dies from it. That’s what is driving me to try and get the word out to people.”

March was colon cancer awareness month. King, and people like her, spend

their time advocating about the importance of screening for the easily preventable cancer. In the meantime, she will continue placing wreaths on her father’s grave and watching the morning glories she planted in her father’s yard curl together like her and her father’s fingers used to.

“I hold onto his laughs, his jokes,” King said. “I try not to recall how miserable he was the last year. I try to remember him how he was before he was diagnosed. That’s how he would want to be remembered. The funny, cutup, guy sitting out by the pool with his glass of wine.”

The money raised from the Magic Bullet Fund goes directly to the clinic and never to the owners themselves, Kaplan said. The fund receives a grant from the Petco Foundation every year to help keep the general fund stable for the dogs and pet owners who need it.

“He just finished his first round, and they go through four rounds of treatment,” said Dr. Zachary Neumann, Cody’s veterinary oncologist with Southeast Veterinary Oncology and Internal Medicine. “The last two rounds are more like two months each. We just finished the first month, and the next time I see him is when we gauge his response to the first round of chemo drugs, but we’re not at a point where we can say what his response will be. Most dogs go until a full remission after the first round.”

Cody is on what’s known as a CHOP protocol, Neumann said. CHOP stands for the four alternating medicines – Cyclophosphamide, hydroxy doxorubicin, Oncovin, Prednisone – that Cody will be receiving over his last four months of treatment. Some treatments will be oral and some intravenously.

Cody’s first week was tough, but Kaplan, Neumann, and his entire family are confident that Cody will pull through



to continue chewing on people’s forearms, moving his leg back and forth, and rummaging for squirrels in his backyard for years to come.

“Every day is something new,” Anton said. “A lot of people say it’s just a dog. People actually say that. But when you go to the oncologist you’re amongst people that would go the distance for their animals. Even when he wasn’t feeling well, we’d still take him on his walk, and he’s also got a little squeaky toy that help get him through. Look at him now and you wouldn’t think, you wouldn’t know that he’s sick.”

Clay County Tax Collector offering new service

Florida Commissioner of Agriculture Adam H. Putnam partnered with Tax Collector Jimmy Weeks to pass legislation that extends this opportunity to residents of Clay County. Florida concealed weapon licenses are processed by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. Due to rising demand, tax collector offices have been given authority to take applications, fingerprint the applicants and send the information securely to the department for final determination. There are currently more than 1.4 million concealed weapon licenses in Florida, and the department processed more than 134,000 applications for new licenses last fiscal year.

Time for lawn sprinkler maintenance

A reader asked, "I have a new home that has a sprinkler system for my lawn. Can you tell me how to best use it?"

Here's some tips:

Look at your irrigation timer and make sure that the clock is set properly. With power outages and changes from Eastern Standard Time to Daylight Savings Time, it is important to set the time clock to the correct time.

Check what days your system is set to come on. Depending on your address, you can water every Wednesday and Saturday (if you have an odd number address) or Thursday and Sunday (if you have an even address). If you have different zones, it is those zones that lawn sprinkler systems should be set to come on twice a week (or once a week if you have damp soil). Those zones that irrigate woody shrub beds should only come on every 10-14 days – woody shrubs do not need (nor want) the amount of water you supply grass. They will be healthier with less water.

Determine what time of day to have the

whole system come on. You cannot water during the hours of 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on any day. For disease reduction, it is best to water during the early morning hours. Consider having the system come on sometime between 2 and 3 a.m. – but so that all zones are through by 8 a.m.

Next, decide how long to leave any one zone on. To do this run a zone for 15 minutes and measure how much water is deposited into a series of straight-sided containers scattered around within the irrigation zone. Measure how much water is in each container, total this for all containers and divide by the number of containers. This gives you an average delivery rate for 15 minutes for that one zone. With this in hand, figure out how many 15 minute blocks of time you would have to leave that zone on to deliver half an inch of water. This is considered the amount that would conserve the most amount of water and still give the lawn what it needs, although the Water Management District does allow up to three-quarters of an inch per cycle but unless it is really hot you can get by with a half-inch per zone each time you water.

Finally, make sure all sprinkler heads



pop up properly (aren't being restricted by grass runners) and that they are pointed

in the proper direction (they can become twisted with time so they are not watering what they are designed to reach). If heads are not working properly – turn them to adjust the pattern.

Now you are ready to start the irrigation season with a system that is as close to efficient as you can make it. You should regularly repeat these checks throughout the summer to ensure your irrigation system is efficiently conserving water as you keep your lawn in good shape.

This is the Florida-friendly way to irrigate.

"Old timers when they had a cough would serve yourself up some whiskey honey and lemon," said Steven Hal-



Comes to the Thrasher-Horne Center

ORANGE PARK – Lights, places, cello, bass, guitar, drums, piano – forget it.

The play 'Once' erupts on stage May 1 at the Thrasher-Horne Center for the Arts to enthrall a fresh new wave of dedicated followers in the captivating story

of Guy, a street musician, who meets Girl, a Czech immigrant florist, on the streets of Dublin. The unlikely meeting of these two sparks a connection that may change their disenfranchised lives.

actors do.

"It's definitely one of my favorite shows," said Luke Wygodny who understudies five separate roles in the play. "I saw it on Broadway a couple years ago, and I auditioned back when it was on Broadway. I connected with the show because of the music aspect, as well as the acting and the movement, all the actors are the band, and that really spoke to me because I played instruments and acted all my life so I could combine them into one."

The original Oscar-winning film starred Glen Hansard and Markéta Irglová as the two main characters. These two actors are also musicians who recorded the soundtrack for the film. However, they do not star in the play because they are touring with their band The Swell Season. That doesn't stop them from loving the play, Wygodny said.

"The most beautiful part about the characters is that they're all stopped," Wygodny said. In this piece, there's a moment for each individual character where they find a moment for awakening and they find a start they find where they're going, and they find a split second that sparks the truth within them. That's the most beautiful part of this piece, and about these characters."

Among the characters for which he understudies – Andre, Bank Manager, Eamon, Emcee, and Švec – Wygodny said

the Bank Manager is one that sticks out as one of the most relatable characters. The Bank Manager plays the cello and has a secret love for music but has to strap himself into a suit every day and go to work.

"The show is about awakening and music, and about making music together," Wygodny said. "There's a lot of silence in the show, and there's so much more spoken in

the silence than within the text. The music is a conversation within itself. There's so much more spoken in music sometimes than there is in spoken word, and vice versa."

Wygodny is part of a New York-based folk band called Water & Rye, which explains his excitement for 'Once,' which allows each actor to show their emotions not

only through their acting, but through their music as well.

"The characters can shine and find truth in this insane, crazy world that we live in," Wygodny said. "I think that relates now, because we're trying to find awakening, not for ourselves individually, but for the world around us. All of these people after the show come up to the actors, and everybody's eyes are glazed over because this show brings out something in the audience that's indescribable, and every person in their chairs is awakened."

Once comes to the Thrasher-Horne on Sunday May 1 for two shows before the group moves on to North Carolina for their next performance. In the meantime, Wygodny will continue juggling the motivations and emotions for all five characters every morning and continue acting with the same excitement he had when he first saw the show on Broadway.

"If you're an artist, an actor, or a musician, they all have in common the most beautiful reason for being on earth," Wygodny said. "That art is what keeps us all here, and creative, and alive, and together. Because for a doctor, they heal, and the biggest thing for me, which is the reason I write songs and the reason I act, is because I want to send out a message to everyone I meet and touch and find truth in this world we live in, and remind everyone why we're here."

the band came to Brewer's and jammed for three hours straight while customers downed the microbrew.

However, the beer that's been attracting all the buzz amongst bluegrass and Brewer's fans alike was birthed at a table crowded with friends and beers.

"My wife and I had attended some of their shows and we knew they were a big deal," Halford said. "We're bluegrass fans, and we ran into them at Bold City Brewery, and basically got to chit chatting over some beers. We're all about music and art, and being that the music and art scene is really cool in Jacksonville, we felt like those are all things that bring people together. So I

said cool, let's sit down and do it."

So Halford and the band sat down and started fleshing out the taste of the beer together, which ended up being an arduous process due to the complexity of the flavor they were trying to replicate.

The band wanted a flavor that would appeal to their fans, and wanted something lighter in color, not a heavier beer. The customers at Brewer's are more of the assertive crowd, Halford said, and not the Bud Light crowd. Eventually however, out of much deliberation and crumpled sheets of paper, the eight percent alcohol by volume Grandpa's Cough Medicine Ale was born.

"It's a malty beer," said Brett Bass, guitarist and vocalist for Grandpa's Cough Medicine. "It's pretty neat. There's not another beer were you can say 'it kind of

tastes like this.' It's actually an idea I've taken to other breweries in town. They wanted to make a cheap beer and weren't on board, so we scratched it. So when Steve approached us about it we were really thrilled."

The collaboration offers customers at Brewer's a new option on top of the artisan choices already offered there, but it also allows Grandpa's Cough Medicine to travel with their beer and tap it at their shows around town, such as their show at Jack Rabbit's last Saturday.

When the band isn't performing, Bass enjoys competitive shooting. Jon Murphy, who plays bass in the trio, has a master's degree in applied linguistics, and works as a substitute teacher. Mikey Coker, the five-string banjo player, is the least talkative of the band, so he's kind of a mystery, Bass said.

Meanwhile, as the band prepares to tour over the summer, Bass thinks back to why he loves performing in the first place, and how this business venture got started – from the love of performing.

"I like the transfer of energy," Bass said. "It's not something that's present at every show, and sometimes the energy transfer is minimal. The audience barely claps, then I'll go into autopilot mode. There should be clapping, and screaming, and good energy. I like how in the moment I am. For me, it's the time where I feel the most alive, when I'm in the moment. I think most people who have performed understand."







Running

On January 1, 1929, unbeaten Georgia Tech was playing University of California in the Rose Bowl. It was a beautiful 80-degree afternoon in Southern California.

Two powerhouse college teams with only one loss between them met on the field of battle. In those years, the Rose Bowl was the nation's only bowl game. The football attention of the nation was on the game.

In that game, a moment's mistake became an enduring football legend.

In the second quarter the game was scoreless. A Georgia Tech player, "Stumpy" Thomason, fumbled. One of California's best players, Roy Riegels, recovered the fumble. Riegels ran toward the Georgia Tech goal line but then, somehow becoming confused, he turned and ran toward his own team's goal line. Suddenly, he was in the clear, but racing toward his own end zone.

A team mate ran him down and tackled him at the one yard line.

Paul often uses the analogy of the sports activities of his day to bring truth about our Christian life. He speaks of the race we have been called to run. Of course, Paul is urging us to always run in the right direction. "Let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us." (Hebrews 12:1)

This "race that is set before us" is the plan of God for us to successfully arrive at the place the Lord has planned for us. Running "that race" is daily progress toward the goal line – or finish line – of life. It will also take us to the destination we all desire.

Just as surely as ball players have gone in the wrong direction, many people are allowing that mistake to be their way of life. In any race (or ball game) going the wrong direction will lead you to the wrong destination.

Douglas Corrigan, who was famed for flying nonstop from Floyd Bennett Field in Brooklyn to Ireland in July 1938, when he supposedly thought he was flying to California.

bringing together groups of people which, normally, would not meet face to face. It was all in an effort to identify some of the problems facing the St. Johns, and to go to these parts of the river to not only see the beauty, but see the threats that face the waterway.

"When you move over to Green Cove, and you see the spring and the view of the St. Johns River you can see how valuable this waterway is, and how important it is that everyone works together to protect it," said Shannon Blankinship, outreach director for the St. Johns Riverkeeper. "In Clay County having strong partnerships is going

to be key for everyone there to work together to raise more funds, and raise more awareness."

She said everyone can protect the St. Johns. Homeowners can put a buffer zone of 6-10 feet around the water where they don't fertilize, ensure that grass clippings aren't blown down the storm drain and always pick up after your dog, Rinaman said.

"It is our responsibility to protect the entire St. Johns River, so we have to take a holistic approach to protecting not only the main river, but our tributaries and springs, because the river is only as healthy as her tributaries, and springs that feed it fresh water. The only way to do that is to have strong relationships with the local stakeholders as well having a look at the entire water system."

The other way NFLT can help is through the purchase of a conservation easement. Florida Commissioner of Agriculture Adam H. Putnam recently announced the state would invest \$35 million to purchase conservation easements on agricultural lands in Florida. NFLT crafts, holds and manages a number of conservation easements. In both cases, the land is protected from development but can still be used for farming, ranching, hunting, or other specific purposes. NFLT can assist farmers and ranchers through the donation process or the application process for this program.

Celebrate Florida's Gopher Tortoise Day

TALLAHASSEE – The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission is urging Floridians to celebrate Gopher Tortoise Day for the first time in the state.

Gopher tortoises live in every county of Florida and are known for their extraordinary digging skills. These gray or brown tortoises use shovel-like forearms to carve out burrows averaging several yards deep

and five yards long. Their burrows give shelter to hundreds of other native species.

Gopher Tortoise Day is a newly-launched effort to highlight the importance of conserving this state-threatened species, whose presence goes back 60 million years.

The FWC is encouraging the public to be aware of the gopher tortoise as a Florida keystone species and learn how their actions can strengthen recovery efforts. "Many Floridians and visitors to the state are knowledgeable about gopher tortoises and willing to take actions to help them. We're excited about Gopher Tortoise Day as a way to get more people involved," said Deborah Burr, who leads the FWC's gopher tortoise management program. "Indeed the success we have had so far in conserving Florida's gopher tortoise population and its habitats is closely tied to the enthusiastic support and participation of the public."

So you think you can't dance?

Whether good or bad, surprises will always elicit nervous energy. The unknown is nerve-racking even if you know the outcome is good. Such was a recent email from Karen Brouhard at the Fleming Island Jazzercise location. She kindly invited me to try out one of her fitness classes to experience the "Jazzercise high." Whoa, did she know that I'm just a runner at bare minimum? So before even replying, I had to stalk their Facebook page, read a couple posts and watch some videos to calm myself down. Because you know, I had to give it a try.

You're Good

Karen, owner and certified instructor, for over four years was once a student of Jazzercise. Then an instructor approached her and said "You're good, you should consider teaching." So she did, and then went on to be her the owner of the Fleming Island location off U.S. Highway 17.

The Fleming Island studio has 13 instructors, a growing membership of 150, average class sizes of 10-18, and a mixed age group of 28-80 year olds mostly females.

If Jazzercise conjures up past images of '80s workouts, then you're thinking like me. The products have changed and now include 12 different classes – Dance Mixx, Interval, Fusion, Core, Strike, Strength45,



Strength60, Express, Personal Touch, Junior Jazzercise, Lo and Lite. Each class a different purpose, body target and end result.

What Was Awesome

1) **Dance Mixx:** I was hoping to stay in the back of the studio during class, but no, co-instructor, Ashley Cochran, moved me directly in front. So I received some cheers and "go get 'em's," but I was even more nervous and then couldn't stop laughing inside, as she gently guided me through the moves. Dance Mixx, is a one hour high-intensity mix of cardio and strength training workout to pre-choreographed, beat-dropping music. There's a warm-up, aerobic/cardio phase, strength/stretch portion, then a cool down. The goal is lean muscle targeting the three major muscle groups – upper body, abs, and legs.

Caveat: Variety, as I've written before, is one of the keys to staying with a workout and breaking through boredom. If Dance Mixx doesn't work, there are at least 11 more classes to try. Also, the month of May

is unlimited free fitness class of your choice.

2) **No mirrors and great people.** Being fearful and shy is normal for all first-timers, but after 30-minutes for me, that seemed to fade away. I was finally getting my "groove." The studio clearly has an atmosphere of no judgment, no intimidation, no mirrors setting. Even kid care is provided while you work out. Instructors and fellow participants make you feel like you belong. Just walk in and be yourself.

3) **The successes.** I asked Karen for a success story and she immediately mentioned Shannon Klein. In 2012, Shannon visited the studio after receiving a Jazzercise postcard and felt like she needed to lose weight and crank up her motivation. After 12 weeks of the Forever Fit Challenge classes, she lost 24 pounds. Since then, she has become a certified instructor, no more cholesterol medication and is 50 pounds lighter. (Her story will be featured soon).

So you think you can't dance? You don't need to. Just come to class and move. That's what I had to do, but the moving or dancing, either way accomplished the



goal of having fun, getting a good workout, releasing some endorphins, meeting people and burning calories. And as mentioned above, the month of May is unlimited free fitness; any class of your choice! Police Briefs

Sailor charged with child pornography

DOCTORS INLET – Acting on a tip, the Clay County Sheriff's Office has charged a U.S. Navy sailor with three counts of transmitting pornography to a minor via a computer.

Police arrested Steven Alexander Jewell, 23, of Doctors Inlet, on April 5 after obtaining search warrants to seize the images stored on his computer hard drive.


According to the police report, the investigation began on Jan. 29 when officers asked to view Jewell's computer.

The search "revealed numerous images of child pornography," states the redacted police report.

"Some of the images contain prepubescent female children...shown and the focus of the images are on the sexual organs of the children," states the report.

Some of the images, police said, involved adults inflicting violence on children while touching them inappropriately, as well as performing sex with the children.

Jewell was booked into the Clay County Jail on Tuesday, but has since been released on an undisclosed bond.

Knife standoff ends in arrest

ORANGE PARK – What began as a confrontation about a stray dog killing a cat ended this week in an arrest for an Orange Park man.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Randolph Ernest Brinkley Jr., 41, on April 4 at 8:30 p.m. in the 300 block of Linden Lane following an investigation.

According to the police report, Brinkley pulled a knife on one of his neighbor's after she came to his home to discuss her dogs getting loose and allegedly killing one of Brinkley's cats that lived outside his home.

"Once at the residence, the dogs attacked then killed one of Randolph's families outside cats which upset Randolph," states the CCSO report.

Police said the neighbor's son drove around the Bellair-area neighborhood trying to find his family's missing dogs when "an unknown bystander" told the man that one of his dogs had killed one of Brinkley's cats.

When he and his mother went to Brinkley's home, police said, Brinkley began cursing at the woman and her son.

The woman told police "she was in fear

for her safety when Randolph brandished a knife from his pocket first so she pulled a knife from her shirt to protect herself," states the report.

After being placed in the patrol car, police said, Brinkley began yelling and banged his head in the backseat on the way to the Clay County Jail. At press time, Brinkley remained in jail with no bond.

Update: Clay deputy in hit-and-run

MIDDLEBURG – Witnesses have provided the Clay County Sheriff's Office with more accurate information regarding a March 24 hit-and-run involving a deputy officer.

Sgt. Matthew James Magish, 40, of Green Cove Springs, received minor injuries in the crash involving his Dodge Charger patrol car. Magish continues to recuperate at home and has not yet returned to duty.

However, witnesses were able to give authorities an updated description of the vehicle that hit the officer near the intersection of County Road 218 and Blanding Boulevard.

Police are now searching for a dark blue – may or may not be two-tone – Ford F-250 extended cab truck with four doors, brush guard, a raised leveling kit and oversized tires. Police believe the truck would likely have damage to the front end of the passenger side.

The suspect is described as a white male, possibly in his late 20's or early 30's, with an athletic build who was seen wearing baseball cap, a dark shirt and blue jeans.

Witnesses said the suspect driver exited his truck in the middle of the intersection immediately after the crash and checked his vehicle for damage. He then got back into his truck and drove off southbound on Blanding, according to Mary Justino, public information officer for the CCSO.

Any new information about the suspect or his vehicle are welcomed at (904) 264-6512, Justino said. "We are specifically asking for motorists who were traveling that night on SR 21 (Blanding) between Keystone Heights and Middleburg to think back about vehicles they saw in that same stretch of roadway that may fit this revised/updated description."

Man charged with stealing \$273,000 worth of diesel

MAXVILLE – A Brooker, Fla., man has been arrested and charged with stealing 16,500 gallons of diesel fuel valued at \$273,000 during a six-month period.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Darrell Justin Crews, 30, on March 30 after an investigation that began with a tip from a Florida Highway Patrol officer. However, Crews' supervisor told police that he had noticed "an increase in the amount of the fuel he was purchasing for the job site" in February this year.

According to the police report, Crews – a fuel truck driver at Chemours at 780 Highway 301 in Clay County – allegedly began stealing the fuel in September 2015.

"The fuel truck can hold up to 900 gallons of diesel fuel and the defendant was responsible for driving the fuel truck around the job site to fuel up other vehicles," states the CCSO report.

A review of Crews' fuel truck's GPS records showed his truck about 70 times since September from the Chemours job site to 8570 U.S. Highway 301 in Jacksonville.

"The truck would sit at the location for various lengths of time prior to the defendant's shift starting and then leave," states the report.

Police said Crews' regular work hours run from 4 a.m. until 1 p.m. "and would have no reason to operate the fuel truck outside of those times or at that location."

During the investigation, CCSO detectives found that Crews had been selling the stolen fuel for \$1.25 a gallon "for at least the last 3 to 4 months," states the report. Police said the man who bought the stolen fuel paid in cash and did not keep receipts of the purchases.

Crews faces one count of scheme to defraud involving more than \$50,000. He was booked into the Clay County Jail on March 30, where at press time, he remained held. His bond is set at \$250,003.

Fatal crash leaves one dead, and one at large

JACKSONVILLE – The Florida Highway Patrol continues to search for one of the drivers a fatal crash that occurred just north of Orange Park last Friday. The crash on U.S. Highway 17 and Interstate 295 which left one man dead.

On April 1 at 9:11 p.m. Steven B. Fordham, 31, of Jacksonville was driving a 1999 Ford Explorer when he turned left onto U.S. Highway 17 southbound from the Interstate 295 southbound exit ramp. Fordham merged into the left travel lane which caused a black Mercedes-Benz C 250 to collide into the rear of Fordham's Ford Explorer, causing the Ford to roll multiple time before finally coming to a stop. The passenger of the Ford, Joseph T. Jannelli, 40, of Jacksonville, was not wearing a seat belt and was ejected at the scene. He was pronounced dead later after being transported to UF Health hospital in Jacksonville.

FHP said the driver of the Mercedes fled the scene on foot. Meanwhile, Fordham received minor injuries.

High school student faces drug charge

FLEMING ISLAND – A student at Fleming Island High School was charged with attempting to deliver marijuana last week when he was found with cannabis on school grounds.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Bryce Alexander Dalton, 16, on March 28 after getting a call from the school's vice principal.

Dalton faces one felony charge of attempting to deliver 20 grams or less of cannabis, the CCSO report said. Dalton came to school on the March 28, and after a search was conducted, officials found the student with several clear plastic baggies containing 3.1 grams of cannabis. Police believe he intended to distribute the drug to other students.

Dalton was suspended from school for 10 days with the recommendation for expulsion from the school, and was transported to a juvenile detention facility in Jacksonville.

Drug thefts found to be inside job

ORANGE PARK – An employee of the Wells Road Veterinary Hospital was arrested last week after an investigation found that she had allegedly been stealing drugs from the hospital.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Tiffany Michele Saunders, 32, of Jacksonville on March 31 for stealing and consuming hydromorphone on five different occasions, the report said.

Police said between March 22 and March 26, Saunders allegedly acquired and consumed the drug Hydromorphone HCl, which when used correctly, is a powerful pain reliever considered to be six to nine times stronger than morphine. However, when used illegally the drug will take effect within 15 minutes and creates a sense of euphoria which lasts longer than six hours. The drug often times will cause the user to develop a physical and psychological addiction.

The bottles of the drugs were never found, however after an investigation Saunders was arrested on five counts of grand theft of a controlled substance, and transported to the Clay County Jail, where she later bonded out.

Prosecutors file papers in child burn case

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Prosecutors are moving forward with a case involving Green Cove Springs man who was arrested

Feb. 14 for child neglect with great bodily harm after receiving second-degree burns covering 40 percent of his body.

Last week, Assistant State Attorney Khary O. Gaynor filed official court documents charging Christopher Ryan Modlin, 31, with the crime effectively moving the case closer to prosecution.

The case goes back to Feb. 13 when Green Cove Springs Police and Clay County Fire Rescue responded to Modlin's home in the 2900 block of Grande Oaks Way.

The investigation found Modlin was intoxicated to a point that he was "unable to hold a conversation" and had neglected to care for his four-year-old son who had fallen into the fire.

In filing the court documents, Gaynor stated the child received a permanent dis-

ability as a result of the fire. The night of the fire, the boy was flown to UF Health hospital in Gainesville where he was admitted into the burn unit.

Police said they believe the 4-year-old boy fell into the fire after his older sister startled him when she went outside to tell Modlin and his son that dinner was ready.

According to the report, Modlin was able to place his son "on the ground and rolled him to put the fire out." Witnesses told police they heard a scream from the Modlin home and saw the boy "engulfed in flames."

"Due to Christopher's level of intoxication he was incapable of providing proper supervision to his minor child which was a contributing factor to the child's injuries," states the report.

In the meantime, Modlin remains in the Clay County Jail where his bond is set at \$75,003. His next court date is scheduled for April 12.

Middleburg man arrested for operation of marijuana grow house


MIDDLEBURG – A Middleburg faces felony charges after an investigation found he had been operating an elaborate mari-

juana grow operation from his home.

A special agent with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement took Villavicen Leonardo Rodriguez, 31, into custody on March 28 after he was allegedly found to be growing 29 large marijuana plants that weighed in excess of 25 pounds.

According to the police report, a Clay Electric Cooperative technician identified a house which was stealing electricity from the power grid, and had been identified as a possible marijuana grow house, because it is common for marijuana growers to divert power.

The special agent had been to Rodriguez's residence the week before and noticed the strong odor of green marijuana at the front door, and began to observe the house for signs of activity. Rodriguez left the residence as a passenger in another man's vehicle, and was dropped off at a convenience store at the corner of Everett Avenue and Blanding Boulevard. Rodriguez identified himself to a marked patrol car

and was detained.

At press time Rodriguez remains in the Clay County Jail where his bond is set at \$100,003. He is charged with selling, purchasing, manufacturing, delivering, and trafficking 100 pounds of cannabis.

Juvenile arrested for sexual battery on a child

ORANGE PARK – A juvenile was arrested last week for events that took place three years ago, and charged with sexual battery on a victim under 12 years of age.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Zaiden Morford, 15, on March 30 for multiple incidents of sexual battery and rape that, police said, took place in January 2013.

Morford was between 13 and 14, and the victim was between four and five years old at the time the incidents took place.

During the investigation, police found the teen had sex with the victim against its will. Morford allegedly perpetrated many similar incidents as indicated by the victim, but the victim did not disclose to what extent the incidents took place.

After booking, Morford was transported to a juvenile facility in Duval County.

balance our budget along the way and get our financial health recharged before doing so. We've come a long way in the right direction but we still have a long way to go," Van Zant said.

Instead of having health educators provide abstinence education at district schools where they are invited in, the program will be administered using current classroom teachers and will meet state statutes that require the program.

"This was tough because each leader came with their programs and positions that are personal to them and professionally important to them," said Diane Kornegay, deputy school superintendent.

Kornegay said the process that was unveiled on March 29 began the previous week with a working group of undisclosed "district leaders" who were asked to examine programs from the lenses of cutting, becoming more efficient and ending any possible duplications. She said administrators – about 15 in the task group – had to answer tough questions.

She said staff was asked "How do these programs and positions directly impact and support improving student academic performance? Are there any duplication of services? Are there programs or services that can be delivered through a more innovative, effective and less costly means? And, are there any programs that are no longer needed given the changes in our instructional delivery model?"

The questions originated from Jim Hamilton, president of the Pensacola, Fla.-based HBEC Group, a lobbying firm that counsels members of the Florida Association of School District Principals, of which Clay County is a member. He spoke to the March 29 meeting at no cost, Kornegay said. Based on his years as a school principal and years of lobbying the Legislature,

Hamilton painted a dark picture of state education funding. He signaled that cuts should be on the mind of the Clay County School Board and district officials.

"If you want to do stuff for kids, if you want to do things for your employees, you need to find the money with the money you have and spend it differently. And that is the only answer there because you don't have any authority. You know that, right? You have no taxing authority that's not either granted by the Legislature or by the people in a referendum. You cannot raise money independently. Period," Hamilton said.

Studdard wanted transparency and asked district staff who from the district sat in on the discussions involving the allocation cuts. Kornegay said it was 15 people from district staff but no school principals were involved in the work group meeting.

"That's fine and good, it's just I just tend to move a little slower," Studdard said. "We need to stop and think what we're doing. I understand this is the first start with this group... that met with you, but something this serious, we need to make some big

budget cuts in order to get ourselves back whole financially. We didn't get in this hole overnight and we're not going to get out of it overnight."

Kornegay also stressed that the new allocation package shifts some duties from district staff back to the schools, something she described as repurposing. Van Zant echoed her sentiments.

"I do believe that our employees deserve more, but I've also said and believe that we cannot spend money that we do not have. The only option that we really have is to closely scrutinize every dollar and aggressively repurpose resources to meet those goals of improving student achievement and improving employee compensation."

The district's money woes have come under fire since 2012, the last year the district maintained a three percent fund balance, which is required by Florida statutes and is closely watched by the Florida Department of Education. The last year the district was at three percent was 2012 and the balance has dipped yearly until this year.

Hamilton challenged board members to find new money to fund the things they believe are important to the district and the students.

"If you want to pay your people more, you're going to have to find the money. If you want a better set of academies for Clay County students, you're going to have to find money. You're doing some things that you've been doing for the past 20 years that you should keep doing for the next 20 years. You've been doing some things for a year that you shouldn't do for another moment unless you are exquisitely different from every other organization in the world, that is the fact of life," Hamilton said.

In the coming weeks, Van Zant said, he will be working to meet with school principals and other "stakeholders" who want to meet both goals – giving pay raises and providing quality education. He said, however, cuts will have to be made.

"With 85 percent of our budget going towards people, the fact is we can't continue to have more people and pay them less or have fewer people and pay them more, however, we cannot do both," Van Zant said.

School board member Betsy Condon said employee pay raises are important to her and, if not accomplished, could create tension between her and Van Zant. Said she heard Hamilton's message and, at the meeting, publicly challenged principals and their support staffs to go back to the schools and examine ways to cut more.

"I don't want to cut the programs that you have put your time and effort and probably your own money into and I value those programs. Employee raises are important to me. I told the superintendent that we could be at odds if he didn't find a way to get that done and that's more valuable to me than keeping doing things the way that we were doing them because we're doing them that way."



Raiders land two region champs; Middleburg, Fleming Island get one title each

STARKE - Orange Park High senior Jordan Morrissette will lead one of the largest boys weightlifting contingencies to the FHSAA Weightlifting state championships next week after he dominated his weight class at the Region 3-1A championships held Fri., April 1 at Bradford County High School in Starke.

Area lifters head to Kissimmee on April 15-16 for a shot at a state title. Morrissette's region title puts him in line to repeat a state title for Orange Park at 199

pounds as graduated Andrew Radecca won in 2015 at 199 pounds for Class 2A. Keystone Heights, the co-state champions in 2014 with Baker County, will send six lifters with a legitimate shot to garnering a second state title. Baker County is now in Class 2A.

"I'm excited to be bringing six guys to the state meet with a good shot at one or two state titles," said Orange Park coach Craig Nosse. "Jordan Morrissette is ranked number one in his class with a couple others in the top 10. It only takes a good day from our guys and a bad day from someone else."

Fleming Island's Kaden Page was top Region 2-2A lifter at 219-pounds making him the fourth seed for the state meet with 710 pounds the top seed. Middleburg High

sophomore Tyler Braswell won a Region 2-2A title at 119 pounds and will go to the state meet as the sixth seed. Region 2-2A was hosted by Flagler Palm Coast High on Wed., March 30.

At Saturday's region 3-1A championship, Morrissette opened with the top lift in the bench press at 385 pounds before hoisting 265 pounds in the clean and jerk for the title. Diante Hartsfield of Madison County High finished second to Morrissette but only benched 335 while putting 270 up on his clean and jerk. Morrissette's 650 pound total puts him as the top seed at 199 in Class 1A by just 20 pounds.

"We'll work on adding five or 10 pounds in the next two weeks, but it's a fluid game

Clay rolls in Kissimmee

Rain stops Blue Devils shot at finals

KISSIMMEE - With a looming district tournament just a week away, Clay High softball coach Matt Lewis got to see how his Blue Devils' would fare on foreign turf against top-rated teams.

"Kissimmee is always a good place to test the team against quality opponents, for sure," said Lewis, who has the Blue Devils on top of district 4-6A at 7-1. "We were clicking, but saw some little things we can focus on."

Clay answered with two wins; a 4-2 win over 6A-Eau Gallie, the 2011 4A champions and a 2012 Final Four finisher, and an overwhelming 11-6 win over 2A-Canterbury, the 2013, 2014 state champions and a Final Four finisher in 2015. Teams were rained out of Saturday's championship

round of play with Clay scheduled to face 6A-Barron Collier, a four-time state champion team in the 1990s and region finalist in 2015, in a semifinal match.

"I talked with the Barron Collier coach and I think we both agreed that not playing was okay with both of us as we may possibly match up in the Final Four if we keep going in the playoffs," said Lewis, a 2001 state champion and a region semi-final 2-1 loss to eventual 5A champion Baker County last year. "We have three games this week to end the season then move into districts."

In the Eau Gallie opener, Clay hammered three first inning runs to set a tone with a walk to Raelye Rouw and singles from Katlyn Morgan and Maegan Stone scoring one. Walks to Ashley Stokes and

Fleming Island girls lacrosse finishes with Bolles win

FLEMING ISLAND – Gina Porazzo scored five goals while freshman goalie Patricia Volz made nine saves and to lead visiting Fleming Island to a 17-6 romp over Jacksonville Bolles in a non-district game Tuesday night.

“Gina had her best night ever,” Fleming Island coach Clint Lyons said of Porazzo, a junior who moved to Fleming Island last Spring and is in her first season for the Golden Eagles.

Porazzo displayed a variety of moves, twice rushing the crease from behind the goal and beating Bulldogs goalie Leann Watson with bounce shots. Twice more she outran defenders down the right alley to convert uncontested shots. She also added a left-handed drive while running in from the left wing.

With Porazzo leading the offense, Volz spearheaded the defense. Although Fleming Island has a quality goalie in senior Julia Winters, Volz has played so well that Lyons has decided to have the pair split time for the remainder of the season. Against Bolles, Volz allowed only three goals, resulting in a stellar .750 save percentage.

“She [Volz] made some great saves early that if those shots had gone in, it might have been a different game,” said Lyons.

The Golden Eagles led 11-3 at halftime and scored the first six goals of the second half to put the game away. Senior Lori Beaird had four goals, while sophomores Kierra Marquis and Lizzie LaVangie each had a pair.

Bolles, which got three goals from Emily Fallon, falls to 4-7 on the season.

Fleming Island was placed in District 6 before the season began, and the Golden Eagles have struggled in North Florida’s toughest district. District members Ponte Vedra, Creekside and Bartram Trail are all ranked in Florida’s top 15, and the Golden Eagles lost to each of them. Those losses, coupled with an overtime defeat against Nease, mean that Fleming Island will miss the playoffs despite a 5-4 record.

“Our goal is to win all of the remaining games,” said Lyons. “That would give us an 8-4 record, and our third winning season in a row.”

The future of girls lacrosse at Clay County’s only high school program hangs precariously. Seven seniors will graduate from this year’s team, leaving three juniors, 10 sophomores and four freshman. There is no U-15 or U-13 girls team in any local program, though there is a U-13 and a U-9 girls team playing at Fleming Island Athletic Association. Thus, there is the prospect of a few years where the Golden Eagles cannot field a team.

“We’ll play as long as we can,” said Lyons. “The trick is getting young girls to come out and try it, because in this age

where kids are so specialized, the soccer and volleyball players do those things year-round.”





In doubles, Burns and Suhrer combined forces to win


6-1, 6-0. In the No.2 doubles, Bryant Kane and Evan Maier lost 6-1, 6-2.






Fleming Island, which has lost four games by two or fewer goals, falls to 5-7 on





Charlotte Denapoli scored the second with bases loaded and an Allison Byrd flyball scored the third.






