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Trans bathroom kerfuffle creates political theatre

FLEMING ISLAND – While not on the official agenda, the privacy of transgender students in the Clay County School District was a lengthy topic of discussion at the school board's May 19 meeting.

Fifteen residents spoke in support of the May 13 letter issued by the U.S. Departments of Justice and Education that offered only guidance on how public schools can ensure the safety and protection of transgender students in providing access to bathrooms and locker rooms. Meanwhile, six attendees spoke supporting Clay County School Superintendent Charlie Van Zant Jr.'s May 16 robocall and YouTube video in which he pledged to not follow the federal guidelines. Yet in the same message, Van Zant gave confusing assurance that students who need "special accommodations" will be handled properly at each district school.

Members of the Fleming Island High Gay-Straight Alliance described Van Zant's call to parents as hurtful and discriminatory.

"Not only was this hateful, it was placing your personal religious and political views into this secular school. There is no place for this type of bigotry in my school or in other school in this county. This type of indoctrination is unacceptable and should not be put into our schools. Sir, this is a public school, a melting pot of students

Pier could come in wake of bridge project

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The existing Shands Bridge that is slated for replacement in the First Coast Expressway design should offer fishermen and other outdoor enthusiasts another better, safer format to enjoy their activities now that plans are in the works to keep part of the bridge as a fishing pier.

Land underneath the old bridge would be paved to provide for parking and other possibilities.

"It's an opportunity for another park setting," said County Commissioner Wayne Bolla after hearing the plans.

County Manager Stephanie Kopelousos brought up the idea at the regular meeting May 24 of the Clay County Commission. Kopelousos, who formerly was the secretary of the Florida Department of Transportation and has extensive experience with the department, said the subject came up during recent conversations with the DOT about what to do with the existing bridge once the new bridge is built. Plans are to tear down the existing bridge, she said, but the possibility of keeping part of it to use as a fishing pier was discussed.

That would probably be good news to anglers and other enthusiasts who use a part of the original Shands Bridge as a fishing pier. That pier was left behind when the existing bridge was built in the same manner that is now being discussed for the

Orange Park rocked by double murder

The story came together slowly. In the beginning there were lots of gaps and inaccuracies but as days wound out and the trial commenced in Green Cove Springs, the truth turned out to be more savage and tangled than they had imagined.

Late Sunday night, March 25, 1945, a 23-year-old soldier deserted from Camp Blanding and slipped into Orange Park armed with his Army issue M1 rifle looking for a car to steal to get home to New Jersey. He laid in wait up in the woods at the bluff on the river in the area known today as Holly Point East where couples were known to come from miles around to park.

There, he came upon a Mr. Nathan A. Ledbetter, former popular dirt track race car driver and current Jacksonville businessman, and his friend, Clara M. Jones, parked in a sedan.

Pvt. John Urspruch sprang from the bushes rifle at the ready and demanded the car and money. Ledbetter attempted to pull a revolver but was way out gunned. Urspruch released a volley of shots hit-

ting Ledbetter in the head and Jones in the chest.

Sadly, and a little late, Urspruch lost his nerve. Scrambling from the scene, he headed north and ended up on Market Street in Jacksonville at military police headquarters.

He admitted being AWOL but claimed to have stumbled on the car with the dead people inside.

His tale started to crumble and completely fell apart hours later back in the woods in Orange Park with military police, Duval County Sheriff's Office detectives, Clay County Sheriff John Hall with Clay County Judge and coroner Joe Jennings and several commissioners from the Town of Orange Park.

Admittedly this was a tough crowd to try to hustle and the scene was now brightly lit by battery-powered lights fully exposing his carnage. At any rate he cracked and confessed.

The MPs took him into custody until April 3 when he was indicted by a Clay

County Grand Jury for murder in the first degree of both Ledbetter and Jones. Local attorney S.B. Wilson was appointed to serve as his attorney and Urspruch became a tenant at Sheriff Hall's jail in Green Cove Springs.

At some point, the bloody car was towed to Green Cove Springs and parked on the lawn in front of the courthouse because it was there when the trial for the murder of Ledbetter started on April 23.

Two days later, the jury rendered a

guilty verdict with a recommendation of mercy and two days after that Judge A.D. McNeil sentenced Urspruch to spend the rest of his natural life in jail.

On May 1, Sheriff Hall transferred him to the custody of the Florida State Prison at Raiford.

It was in total 37 days from the commission of the crime to the commencement of the sentence. In 1945, justice was swift and it was not a good idea to go around murdering people in Clay County.

Provisional Level II trauma center back in Clay

ORANGE PARK – Two years, 25,000 pages, and 20 six-inch binders of documentation later, Orange Park Medical Center has its level II trauma center back.

The news undoubtedly comes as a pleasant surprise to Clay County residents who no longer have to drive to UF Health hospital in Jacksonville to receive appropriate care from skilled trauma surgeons and nurses.

This, however, comes to no surprise to the staff at OPMC who labored over the reports and documentation that they would eventually submit to the Florida Department of Health to review.

As of May 1, the provisional level II trauma center staffs two accredited trauma surgeons and two trauma nurses who have "no other responsibilities except for the trauma patients," said Trauma Director Kari Deaton, whose list of honorifics could form words on a refrigerator.

"The main reason we were doing this was for the citizens of our county and now we feel they can receive appropriate care in a more timely manner," Deaton said. "It's critical in a trauma situation, everyone's heard the golden hour for trauma, and that's why we're here."

Deaton's office has been busier lately with the initiation of the Level II trauma center now in full swing. When Deaton came on board last year, she had to start



from scratch. OPMC lost its previous provisional Level II trauma center two years ago when a site review revealed deficiencies in their services that disqualified the medical center based on regulations set by Florida Department of Health.

The climb back to provisional status has taken two years. In October of 2015, the hospital sent a 'letter of intent to apply' to DOH and started the process which just now has proven successful, however, the provisional status is just that, provisional. Full verification of the medical center's Level II trauma center won't come until approximately July 1, 2017.

Before that, however, there are milestones the hospital must hit. Before the

end of June, DOH will perform 'an in-depth review' of the medical center's application, and inform the OPMC of any 'omissions, deficiencies, or problems' in their application which, if not met, could result in the 'loss of provisional Level II trauma center status.'

After clearing that stage, the medical center will then submit to a site survey sometime between October 2016 and May 2017. If the medical center is successful in completing the site survey and meets DOH's requirements, then the provisional trauma center will then change into a permanent Level II trauma center.

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Nearly an hour had passed since the two of them took off from Vero Beach, armed with only their uniforms, their uncontrollable grins and the knowledge that what they were doing was illegal.

All details disappeared as they carved their way down the East coast of Florida. To their left, the shadows of the comma shaped Bermuda islands, to their right, Florida. A home waiting for them, hot

bricks to warm the sheets, a square meal in the barracks – but right then, that didn't matter to Norma Elliott. She was young and rebelling with her husband in the goose seat of a SB2C Dive Bomber.

Impersonating an officer, now that was the real crime. Norma donned a friend's uniform and ID card and went through gear check, fooling all of the commanding officers that she was a Navy Wave.

Joseph Elliott, or Jose as his squadron called him, had built a bit of a reputation

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Lawmakers must back criminal justice reform

As Florida residents continue to engage in this presidential election, Republicans, Democrats and independents are split on many pressing issues. But there's one issue many voters are united on – criminal justice reform.

Nearly every American has a family member, loved one or neighbor who has – or who will – come into contact with the criminal justice system. This creates a huge financial burden on taxpayers across the country who shoulder an enormous \$80 billion price tag to maintain a prison system in which recidivism rates remain stubbornly high. And the costs keep getting worse – nationwide, taxpayer spending on prisons has increased nearly 600 percent in the past 30 years.

Our bipartisan coalition, the U.S. Justice Action Network, came together to rally the growing support across the country for justice reform. We polled likely voters in Florida and five other key 2016 battleground states and it's clear there is a strong consensus on this issue.

An overwhelming majority of likely voters in the Sunshine State, regardless of political affiliation, agree that the current criminal justice system imprisons too many for too long, that mandatory-minimum sentences should be replaced and judges should have greater discretion in determining sentences.

At a time when our federal prison system houses more than 2.3 million Americans, it's no surprise that 69 percent of voters in Florida agree that our prisons house too many individuals. Even less surprising is that 74 percent of our voters agree that we are spending too much tax money keeping those who have committed nonviolent offenses behind bars and nearly 80 percent of voters say the main goal of our justice system should be rehabilitating those in our prisons and jails to become productive, law-abiding citizens.

Floridians also support specific policy recommendations that make our criminal justice system fairer. When it comes to sentencing reform, an overwhelming majority – 80 percent – favor giving judges the discretion to hand down sentences in a range versus a one-size-fits-all approach such as mandatory minimums.

In addition, a 2011 Florida TaxWatch poll found that 84 percent of Floridians

This election year is no different. So far, we've seen readers send in letters ranging from urging support for certain candidates to discontent with the school district administration and hours of state testing.

In fact, one letter from an Oakleaf Junior High teacher recently led to some real palpable results. In his letter, teacher Allen Walker stated his disdain for having to uproot his computer classes so students could then come in and take the Florida Standards Assessment test. He said the result has been more days spent testing than teaching.

I'd venture to say that Mr. Walker's letter caught the hearts and minds of folks in the Clay County School District administration. It turns out, between the time his letter was published on May 12 and the time I'd assigned a reporter to go interview Mr. Walker regarding the successes his students had realized this year in passing the Microsoft Office Certification program, something happened.

On May 19, Carl Hendrick, assistant superintendent for information and technology, presented the school board with a presentation on how the district was preparing to equip more students with devices next year they can use to take the demanding FSA. Hendrick specifically said the new devices – he's chosen the Google Chromebook – will eliminate the need to shuffle students in and out of computer labs while disrupting students from their desired lessons.

Teacher takes school district lobbyist to task

Per the letter from Southern Strategy Group dated April 8, "Southern Strategy Group of Jacksonville, LLC is committed to providing the highest level of service in furtherance of your goals. This agreement will describe the terms under which that representation will occur." What follows is a series of vague assurances, including enhancing our wall-to-wall academies. So basically, they promise to do their job and you promise to pay them, seemingly regardless of the outcome. I sure wish you could trust your teachers this much.

They are charging \$5,000 a month for their services, but the letter goes on to say "costs directly attributable to the performance of this work will be billed in addition to the monthly retainer." I sure wish you could treat your teachers this well.

Despite their apparent success this year, how do we know they will continue

to perform? I recommend that they be required to join a Professional Lobbying Community. We'll call it a PLC for short.

We'll require them to meet once a week, regardless of their individual needs. How else can we guarantee that they will get better at their jobs? We certainly can't rely on their own intrinsic motivation to perform.

We'll need detailed reports of what they discuss and how they plan to implement it. How else can we guarantee that they will actually apply what they learn? We certainly can't rely on face-to-face conversations and occasional observations.

We'll also need to develop a vast array of tests to make sure that the legislators in Tallahassee are demonstrating adequate yearly progress. And don't forget the pre-tests and the practice tests.

You should at least demand as much accountability from this group that you do from your students and teachers.

What exactly are they lobbying for? Are they taking suggestions from teachers? Can we form a committee to make recommendations? Surely you will allow your teachers to have a voice.

Are they lobbying for smaller class sizes? I don't think so. Less mandatory testing? Probably not. More general funding for education instead of funding for specific programs designed to make us look good in the papers?

Van Zant killing school district

In Clay County it seems that few people know too much and far too many people know too little about the reality of the state of our school system. To the average citizen, the intricacies of the day to day operations of our school district are invisible. But for the teachers working daily in the classrooms with the students of our county, we see our hard work consistently undermined, derailed and disrespected.

Superintendent of Schools Charles Van Zant has often been in the public eye throughout his tenure for stoking the flames of controversy for political gain. As it is an election year, he's been abusing his position to place robo calls to parents in the district with rhetoric that isn't about educational policy, but about hot button issues that rile people up.

First, he exploited a county tragedy to invoke religious ideology. In his bid to get

re-elected, he's trying to appeal to a base of voters who came out to the polls last election for a promise of instilling prayer at the schools. Van Zant campaigned on allowing prayer in schools in 2012 and has yet to win that battle because, as the District's former attorney advised, the Supreme Court has deemed it unconstitutional.

In the past two weeks, Van Zant, seizing opportunity again, jumped on the transgender bathroom bandwagon and phoned homes. He claimed that he would stand up to President Obama's mandate and fight for liberty in Clay. Again, he focused on an issue that has little to do with educational policy or, as a Superintendent of a small rural county, one he has any ability to take on.

But his tough guy rhetoric is working to appeal to a base of voters he hopes to rile up and get to the polls once again. In my 17 years in classrooms up and down the East coast of this amazing country, I've had transgender students in my classroom since year one. No one ever made a big deal of it and they were accepted, not shunned, with open arms; as are all students who come to us in public schools. There's never been any controversy or issue with these students using bathrooms, because common sense and compassion have led the way. Only now is this being made an issue by those who have something selfish to gain.

The only outreach by Van Zant associated with educational issues has been to, again selfishly, take credit for the increase in Clay graduation rates due to his implementation of wall-to-wall academies. First, the academies are only in year two of implementation, so the students graduating last year and this year, have had little to do with academies.

Secondly, the real reason graduation rates have increased is because of Compass Odyssey credit recovery programs. In Duval, Superintendent Vitti has already publicly pledged to rid that district of the program. In Clay, we pump students into these labs and allow them to make up as many grades and courses as they can in order to ensure they graduate.

Some students are savvy enough to make up a course in as little as a matter of hours. So if anyone wants to really see how Clay bolsters its graduation numbers they need look no further than these mass production labs that have little to do with educating students and everything to do with padding the numbers.

The Compass Odyssey website advertises the program for the low cost of about \$240 per year, per student. So, in that regard, Superintendent Van Zant is finally practicing what he preaches in showing extreme fiscal conservatism: an increasing graduation rate for bargain bin prices, education not included.

Racing against the opposition

Some Green Cove Springs residents dislike the noise

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – What could arguably be described as one of Green Cove Springs' biggest hidden treasures is a strip of racing lanes located deep within Reynolds Industrial Park on State Road 16

Since its opening in September of 2013, the Green Cove Springs dragway has provided a place for racing enthusiasts to quench their thirst for speed. The track was recently in the spotlight after the tragic shooting deaths of Buddy Short and Valorie Short, both of whom frequented the dragway.

Buddy Short helped build and operate the attraction that has been growing in popularity. Now the dragway is in the spotlight once again, but under vastly different circumstances.

"The counties, municipalities, towns and states do a good job of providing places for kids to play the ball sports, but there's a lot of young people we call gearheads, they love motor sports," dragway owner Peter Scalzo said. "We provide a venue, with no investment from a municipality, we give them a place to race."

The dragway itself looks like the set of a "Fast and the Furious" film, but what goes on at the Green Cove Dragway is not

staged fiction at all. In fact, it's causing some real concerns for some Green Cove Springs residents.

Since it opened, the dragway has been going before the Green Cove Springs City Council to get its permits re-approved. On

May 17 they did it once again, but this time they were met with opposition.

"I never thought I'd be saying something against the dragway," said Joe Sobotta, a Green Cove Springs resident. "Volume is an issue with whatever cars are making that kind of volume, I can hear it outside and I can hear it on my porch."

Sobotta was the only Green Cove Springs resident to come before the packed council chambers and speak out against the noise levels that come from the track. He also claims to have felt attacked by the racing supporters that heavily outnumbered him.

"Either I didn't give my presentation to where it could be understood or we have a group that feels if you don't agree with them, then you're throwing a stone in the

spokes," Sobotta said. "I can assure you there is no consorted group of people who got together in Green Cove Springs who said let's go down there and complain, and shut down the racetrack, but I've been sort of accused of that."

Sobotta lives less than 1,000 feet from the St. Johns River and the sounds he claims to hear are something that Scalzo admits to.

"The way our track is laid out, the sound goes right into town," Scalzo said. "It travels over the water, once it hits the water, it really intensifies the sounds."

When past testing of the dragway noise revealed that it was slightly over the city's decibel limit, Scalzo was asked to take

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steps to reduce the noise. This included instituting a curfew on the races and setting up a sound barrier wall. Despite this, the city continued to get noise complaints.

"The raceway is enjoyable for race fans and car enthusiasts, however, the city has begun to get numerous complaints about the noise it creates. It has become a quality of life issue for residents whose peaceful evenings on their porches and patios are being interrupted, some report they hear the noise inside their homes," said Mayor Pamela Lewis in an official statement. "We are reviewing complaints that we receive and are continuing to monitor the situation."

The city of Green Cove Springs defines the dragway's weekend operation as a "special event," which is the same distinction as the city's annual River Fest, despite the dragway operating numerous times a year. For that reason, the dragway must get re-approved by the city council every year, something they have had little trouble with in three years.

Despite the reported calls, only Sobotta vocalized his frustration in person, while the dragway had several citizens speak in favor of it.

"Racing is a lot more than a fast car, and the Green Cove racetrack is more than a place where fast cars race," Amber Underwood, 19, said before the City Council. "For many people like me, it's a home away from home. Like other sports, racing has many positive impacts."

Underwood was just one of many that came to the meeting to show their support of the dragway.

Following a period of tense discussion, the city council unanimously voted to approve the special events permit for the dragway, ensuring that it will stay in Green Cove Springs, at least for another year.

This year's approval will be coupled with continued decibel testing, something that Lewis lobbied for at the meeting. Scalzo is also open to several ideas to further reduce noise, such as sound proofing the announcers booth and changing the direction of the track.

Another obstacle that the dragway could encounter is the potential for waterfront development directly across from them. The Reynolds Industrial Park is prime real estate. Scalzo and the city council recognize that a dragway and residential areas don't tend mix well.

"If a big developer wants to come in with a mega project next year, we don't want him to go away, because if he wants to build here, that is going to be an issue,"

Scalzo said. "At that point the city council is not going to renew my permit, and that's okay."

Until that looming day comes, the dragway is set in stone until May 2017, where races will continue until then.

"Everybody's going to have an opinion, we all can't agree on the same things,"

Track manager Thomas Wilson said. "The one thing I can promise them is that the noise from an ambulance at three in morning, responding to a street race accident, is way more hideous than these cars make in five seconds. We provide a safe environment to race."

support major changes that would send fewer nonviolent offenders to prison and instead seek more cost-effective alternatives, while 73 percent agree that fewer nonviolent offenders should be sent to prison in the first place. And 86 percent of Floridians agree a candidate who is "tough on crime" can also support cost-effective programs such as community supervision and treatment that saves taxpayer dollars while reducing future crime.

These are levels of support any politician in office or running for office would envy. The good news is Washington is listening and already discussing how to fix our federal prison system using many of the same ideas from the states, including the Sentencing Reform and Corrections Act. The bill, which has bipartisan support and is currently under consideration in the U.S. Senate, would reform federal sentencing guidelines to give judges more options when trying individuals who have committed nonviolent crimes and give the formerly incarcerated better access to rehabilitation programs, so those who leave prison don't go back.

This bill now has the backing of influential law-enforcement groups including the International Association of Chiefs of Police and the Major County Sheriffs' Association, who know that such reforms will help them do their job better and keep communities safe.

In Florida specifically, the 2016 Government Efficiency Task Force recommended smart justice reforms, such as the expansion of traditional work-release programs to reduce costs and improve offender outcomes, as well as the expansion of community-based alternative programs that focus on treatment and rehabilitation of mentally ill offenders while diverting them from jail.

If the Florida Legislature and our nation's Congress adopt these criminal justice reforms, it could save taxpayers a significant amount of money, as well as reintroduce countless individuals into society who have a great likelihood of a successful re-entry.

Regardless of which side of the political aisle you sit on, the numbers in support of criminal justice reform can't be ignored. Voters in Florida and across the country realize that we have to act smart and we have to act now. In this divisive political climate, when Republicans and Democrats agree on both the problem and its solution, our leaders must take action now. It's time for Congress and the Florida Legislature to move forward with these common-sense reforms that are both smart policies and smart politics.

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From a 'dark room' back to the classroom

FLEMING ISLAND – Six months of leaving school early, taking days off and spending hours at home might seem like every fifth grader's fantasy. However, that wasn't necessarily the case for a Paterson Elementary School student.

"It seemed like it went by fast, because I was just sitting in a dark room, hoping that I got better," Aiden Tarter said.

Aiden was a normal fifth grader with friends. He rode the bus home every day and enjoyed going to school. In September 2015 it all started to change. He began suffering from recurring occipital migraine headaches which made it increasingly difficult for Aiden to function.

Out of four children, he was the only one to suffer from these headaches.

Aiden would often complain about his headaches and medicines such as Motrin and Tylenol were proven ineffective for him. Frequent trips to Wolfson Children's Hospital and Baptist Medical Center

weren't working either.

Aiden simply wasn't getting any better. Eventually the headaches persisted to the point where he couldn't make it through the school day, which began to have ad-

verse effects on his education. It was time for the Tarters to take a new route.

"Once he started missing so much school, we went to his physician to fill out hospital homebound forms," said Heather Tarter, his mother.

The school convened a team of teachers, counselors and staff to work out a plan for Aiden's homebound education. It was then that the Tarters were introduced to the woman that would get his family through this rough patch, Laurie Tucker.

Tucker, a teacher with 35 years in Clay County Schools, was brought in to keep Aiden on track.

"He was a very nice young man, typical and he has a really good sense of humor," Tucker said.

as a daredevil back then and that night he showed her why.

The bomber's nose tipped down until the two of them were gliding inches above the water. Illuminated by the plane's two 80 million-candlelight power blister lights – she saw the ocean pass below her at 158 miles per hour.

"Real low," said Norma Elliott, speaking on her husband's behalf. "He went down real low with that plane, scared me to

death. I wouldn't talk to him. He tried to talk to me on the radio, but I wouldn't. I was scared."

Norma and Joseph Elliot – now residents of Green Cove Springs – aren't the same as they were then. Joseph was 23 when he snuck his wife out of Vero Beach. Now, at age 95, Joseph Elliot has trouble getting around without a walker. His speech is quiet and reserved, undoubtedly one of the lasting side effects of a stroke.

His memories are still with him, however. He can still point out where his squad's barracks once stood, and did so last Saturday at the Armed Forces Day Celebration. That day, the Military Museum of Northeast Florida re-dedicated the airfield with a new granite plaque in the name of Ensign Benjamin Lee, a World War I pilot and recipient of the Navy Cross who was one of the first victims of World War I.

It was a shared headache that day for everyone, because the old plaque, made of copper, was stolen and probably melted down for cash, said Chris Rodatz, president of the museum's board.

To honor Lee's memory, the museum unveiled it with Joseph Elliot's help that day.

"Hopefully," Rodatz said, "it'll stay where it belongs this time."

Joseph Elliot spent a great deal of his time at Benjamin Lee Airfield in the early 1940s, back when it was a massive Navy installation whose main purpose was to train pilots to land on aircraft carriers. The airfield was much different back then, it was home to more than 600 reserve ships called the moth-ball fleet.

The United States was at war. It was a time of tremendous change – 1945, the year Joseph Elliot married his wife, the U.S. dropped atomic bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Germany surrendered, Franklin D. Roosevelt died. Times were changing and the veiled innocence of the years prior was just a memory passing below an SB2C Dive Bomber at 158 miles per hour.

"It's kind of sad to me, to see everything change," Norma Elliot said.

Joseph Elliot eventually made the rank of Lieutenant Commander and retired from the U.S. Navy after 28 years of service and thousands of airtime hours. The last four remaining members of his squadron, VF742, are spread across the U.S. Most members, in the passing of 71 years, have died of old age.

Luckily, Norma Elliot said, he was never called to any of the fighting, but she also adds how close it came when times were uncertain. Whether it was the Bay of Pigs or overseas warfare, the possibility of war was always there.

"We were just so thankful. Every night he went out, we were just thankful he came back. It was a dangerous thing he did all those years," Norma said. "He was a daredevil. Yep, he was a daredevil."

Tucker would go in the Tarter home and treat Aiden just like any other student, while still being sensitive to his complex condition. Tucker referred to Aiden's condition as an "invisible illness" that couldn't be handled by conventional means.

The headaches made Aiden extremely sensitive to light and noise. To accommodate him, the Tartars designated a room in their home as a "dark room" where he would retreat. Despite his constant need for serenity, Tucker managed to work through any obstacles that Aiden's condition presented.

"Even as patient as she was, she still managed to get so much work done with me," Aiden Tarter said. "She did it without giving me answers, it was like a super power."

There were times over the six months Tucker spent with Aiden, that he would have to take a break or walk away from the work. Fortunately for him, Tucker had a support system that was dedicated to Aiden's success as a student.

"You work really hard with schools, obviously they're your biggest resource," Tucker said. "I would meet with Aiden's teachers and find out where they were in class, and look at his grades too."

Tucker's persistence, coupled with Aiden Tarter's hard work, allowed him to stay caught up with his studies until the proper treatment for his condition could be found.

"Our pediatric neurologist told us that he had to get on the right preventative medicine – they take six weeks or up to three months to work," Heather Tarter said. "Finally the pediatrician got involved, they changed his medicine again and low and behold, three weeks later, total difference."

Aiden has now been back at Paterson, full time, for eight weeks.

"It was a little hard coming back, he had a little bit of anxiety because he hadn't been at school and it was stressful," Heather Tarter said. "When we got passed that, he was perfect. Aiden's new found relief, meant that he would part ways with the teacher who helped him through his ailment."

"She was almost like part of our family, and we're sad we don't get to see her as much," Heather Tarter said.

Tucker, who is retiring this year, works with several Clay County Schools, helping students with disabilities.

"It goes by in a blink," Tucker said. "I still remember sitting in my first classroom at Grove Park Elementary 35 years ago."

During her tenure, Tucker has made many friends and admirers. The Tartars can offer only a glimpse of the kind of teacher that Tucker was for them.

"She cared a lot about Aiden," Heather Tarter said. "It wasn't all business, she spent time talking to him."

"I was the one being focused on, you wouldn't be the main focus in a regular classroom, and we got a lot of work done," Aiden Tarter said. "She was kind, generous, fun and a really fun person to socialize with."

Former Lee Field Naval Air Station Munitions Response Site Prioritization Protocol



The US Army Corps of Engineers is investigating a Formerly Used Defense Site known as Lee Field Naval Air Station. The military utilized the 1,560-acre site along the St. Johns River between the 1940s and the 1960s; it is now the Reynolds Industrial Park. During World War II, the Navy and Marines used it to train pilots, and following the war, the Navy used it to "mothball" ships. A small portion of the site was used as a small arms range for the harmonization of aircraft machine guns and as a skeet range.

The Corps evaluated and scored the Small Arms Range using a tool called the Munitions Response Site Prioritization Protocol. It ranks the risk to people and the environment and helps the Department of Defense prioritize studies or remediation, if necessary. Scores range from 1 (highest) to 8. Other ratings can be No Longer Required or No Known or Suspected Hazard. The score for the Small Arms Range is No Longer Required.

on campus and that none of his students would be allowed to share their stories of success. "The county said I could talk to her off campus but none of my students can talk to her," states Walker's email from May 19 at 9:12 a.m.

That night, at the school board, further proof of failed leadership and an attempt to detract others' focus from that lack of leadership was presented to the school board. The teacher's union rep explained that a grievance was going to be filed after a principal retaliated against a teacher for having written a letter to the editor.

I even called Oakleaf Junior High Principal Anthony Williams to try and get an answer. He called me back on May 20 and I asked how did this happen? In short, the answer was something to the effect of 'I needed to get permission from my boss, first.' So, come on Clay County, let's hear from you.

The question I ask now is where was the discourse? But I ask further still what are we becoming? Maybe these are questions to think about when you head to that voting booth in August and see which candidates names are there banking on a return to glory on the backs of a broken system.

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J.P. Hall Children's Charities awards more than \$10,000 in scholarship money

ORANGE PARK – Students entering college are master jugglers.

In their right hand, fear, anxiety and other agents of the endless unknowns of life after high school. In their left hand, curiosity, tenacity and other virtues that open paths to the eventual graduation hat toss. Jeffery Gainer's hands are occupied now though, as he hugs the woman whose signature appears at the bottom of a scholarship he received May 19.

It's a familiar last name to the 252 Clay County students who have benefitted from the J.P. Hall Children's Charities fund. Last Thursday, however, the fund added 11 new names to the list of kids who, otherwise, might never have gone to college.

The charity has presented more than \$422,000 in scholarships to underserved children since J.P. Hall Jr. founded it in the late 1970s. Four decades later, Virginia Hall now carries her father's torch, the legacy left behind to provide a path to education for those willing to work for it. Kids such as Gainer.

"We have some amazing, amazing young people," Hall told the guests at the awards celebration at the Thrasher-Horne Conference Center. "I'm blessed to have been a part of this and I want to continue to help and be a part of this. So I say thank you."

Gainer intends to use the \$2,000 he re-

ceived from the charity to pursue a nursing degree at the University of North Florida.

Of course, college isn't cheap. UNF also requires that a student's freshman year be spent on campus, and that's not cheap either.

UNF's average cost for its first year starts around \$16,000. To that figure, \$2,000 is only a drop in a much larger ocean. Gainer isn't deterred, however and intends to continue his education and become a nurse practitioner.

"I would have tried to my best to go to college and pay for it with loans, but I feel like without the scholarship it would have been really difficult," Gainer said.

There's some fear for the transition. His graduation is right around the corner and his first semester starts soon after. Gainer isn't as worried about the workload, however. He cites his already full plate for that.

Gainer, 18, has a daily schedule that would make even the most wizened senator's head spin. His days are swallowed by his constant commitment to school, his job at Sears, Beta Club, track and cross country meets and the healthcare academy at Orange Park High.

"I'm definitely a workaholic," Gainer said. "I have a lot on my plate I would say. I wouldn't say I possibly over filled by plate, it could sometimes be overwhelming, but I push myself so I know how to work around it."

Gainer's claim to be a workaholic

should come to no surprise to his friends. Until senior year, they were thoroughly convinced that he was anti-social because of his reluctance to even spend time with them and instead focus on clubs, commitments and his career path.

Gainer subscribes to the maxim of 'all work and no play,' however, so in the crumbs of time he has left in the day, he relaxes and watches reality television.

Last Thursday's scholarship ceremony speeches presented from the other charity board members emphasized inspiration and determination, vital virtues to be kept in any aspiring college student's back pocket.

"Go for the dream," said Clay County Commissioner Ronnie Robinson. "If you want to be an astronaut, be an astronaut. If you wanna' climb a mountain, climb a mountain. Do what God calls you to do, while not looking back or slowing down."

Gainer's biggest inspiration comes from his parents. His experiences have shaped him into the person he is today. When his father got in a wreck during his freshmen year, he was in and out of the hospital. It was there, Gainer said, that he realized he first wanted to be a nurse.

"I like to see how nice the nurses and the doctors are," Gainer said. "It inspired me to try and help someone else out, so whenever they're in hard times they can feel good."

That was four years ago. His father escaped with only a slash-shaped scar on his head and some broken ribs that, while they still cause him trouble, are preferable to what could have happened that day.

Gainer will be the first family member to successfully complete college. His father and mother started college, but were never able to finish due to financial troubles.

"That sort of inspired me to apply for my scholarships, because it really put it into perspective – if I don't get it together, it won't happen," Gainer said.

With all of the combined horsepower of Gainer's family pushing him along, he said he calculates his chances of getting his nursing degree to about "100 percent," and has all the certainty of the world in his hands, it seems.

"I know when I push myself I can do anything," Gainer said. "I know this is the job I want to do. There's nothing else I would even want to do."

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Election rigging allegations spur lawsuit

JACKSONVILLE — A collective headache spread across the tri-county area last Friday when yet another elected official was accused of rigging an election — only this time — someone spoke up.

On May 20, civil rights attorneys filed a suit against State Attorney Angela Corey's Campaign Manager Alexander Pantinakis and write-in candidate Kenny Leigh of Fleming Island for closing off the Aug. 30 primary to voters who are not registered Republicans.

Attorneys Bill Sheppard and Samuel Jacobson, both of Jacksonville, claim that Corey's campaign orchestrated Leigh's candidacy, citing in their suit that "Leigh qualified as a write-in candidate, with

aid and assistance from Pantanakis as a sham perpetrated to deprive 438,894 non-Republican voters of the ability to vote in the 2016 election for State Attorney for the Fourth Judicial Circuit."

The circuit covers Clay County, which as of press time, has 31,395 registered Democrats, 76,402 registered Republicans and 32,930 voters classified as "others."

"Unless the lawsuit succeeds, they're going to be deprived of their privilege of voting," Jacobson said. "The right to vote is the hallmark of democracy. We had a revolution to get the right for people to be able to run their own government."

Universal primaries spawn from a 1998 constitutional amendment, and occur when either party runs unopposed. As

written, the UPA allows voters from every party to vote for the candidate of their choice. A write-in candidate, however, closes the primary, which is why write-ins — and the laws allowing them — have received criticism from opponents who claim that the amendment allows incumbents to rig elections in their favor.

Jacobson intends to put the suit on an accelerated calendar through the court system, to come to a timely end before the Aug. 30 primary.

Corey originally only ran against one of her former assistants, Republican candidate Wes White who had served as her lead prosecutor in the Nassau County fourth circuit office. On May 5, however, a third candidate entered the race who had the potential to threaten Corey's re-election, civil attorney and former prosecutor Melissa Nelson.

The same day Nelson filed, so too did Leigh.

"I don't think there's any question that Kenny Leigh is a sham candidate and a pawn for Angela Corey," White said. "In my opinion he should be ashamed of himself."

Write-in candidates do not pay election fees, nor are required to qualify or even be likely to win, according to a Feb. 3 Supreme Court of Florida ruling.

Leigh, a men-only attorney whose law offices polka dot Florida, has donated to

Corey's campaigns in the past and claims he supports Corey, the suit said.

Calls to Leigh and Pantinakis' office were not returned by press time. Attorney Bill Sheppard did not return phone calls or email requests for an interview.

As the events in the race for State Attorney unravel further, a clear message of disenfranchisement is received from non-Republicans who, had the primary not been closed, would have had the chance to vote.

That same message was echoed in Clay County when, fueled by the same motivation, Republican Superintendent Charlie Van Zant Jr. allegedly encouraged Fred Gottshalk to run as a sham write-in candidate to protect himself from other party votes should his opponents qualify to run against him in the primary.

The message extends even further, according to Jacksonville University Sociology Professor Nathan Rousseau.

"In the short run, I don't think it's going to do much of anything unless the lawsuit wins out," he said. "The broader issue here, really, is that in certain respects this is a microcosm of national politics. That's the problem with disenfranchisement, it fuels itself until the population gets sufficiently fed up. Then comes social unrest."

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Time for new sod?

Q. I have just put down new St. Augustine Grass sod. When should I fertilize it and with what?

R. In a replicated experiment by the University of Florida, it was shown that newly laid sod is best not fertilized for at least four weeks after planting. This is because by fertilizing it sooner, there are not sufficient roots on the newly-cut sod to take up the fertilizer you would be giving it. The fertilizer would be lost to the grass and instead likely to simply pollute our ground water supply. Grass, when properly fertilized, will lock up these nutrients and keep this from happening, but newly laid sod, with its diminished root system, cannot do this.

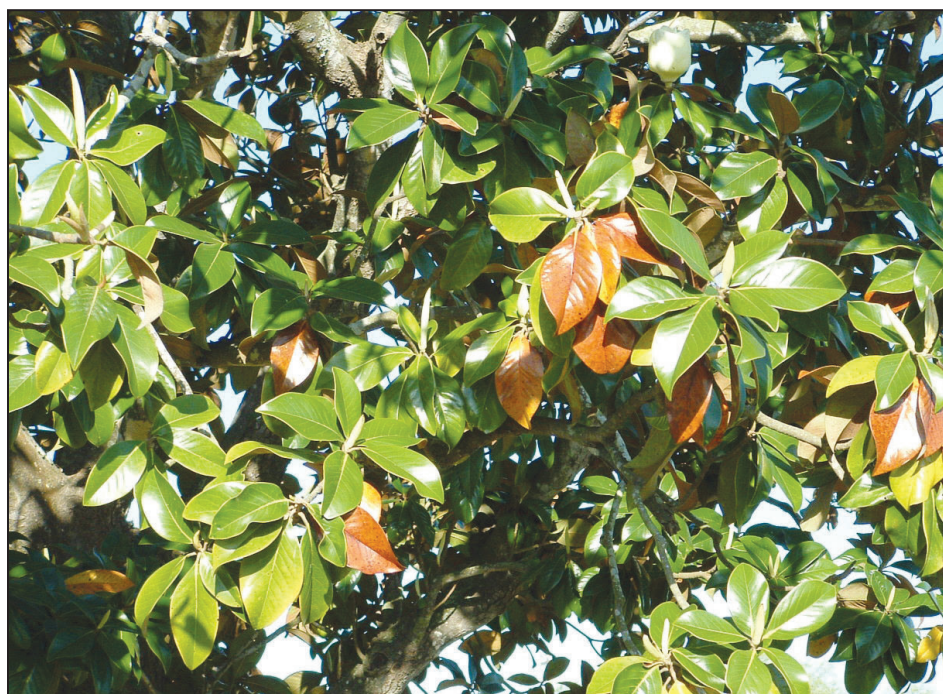
Because the sod is well-fertilized at the sod farm, newly installed sod easily has enough stored nutrition to survive while it regrows roots. Applying more fertilizer shortly after installation is not helpful and surely wasteful.

Bottom line – the first fertilizer application to newly-laid sod should be 4-6 weeks after its installation and since we will be in the heat of summer at that time, use a fer-

tilizer where the nitrogen is 50 percent or more slow release and less likely to burn. Don't apply weed killers on the newly-installed sod, as they might significantly weaken it and lead to increased disease attack. Using weed killers in the summer months is tricky in itself, since most warn against applying them when temperatures are above 85°F and even trickier on new sod.

Q. I have a Magnolia tree that is suddenly dying. It is dropping a lot of leaves and its other leaves are wilting. What should I do?

R. If the older leaves – those farther back toward the center of the tree – are the ones yellowing and dropping, do nothing. This is the season for Magnolias to do that as they prepare to flower. With the dry weather, they are also wilting more than normal but don't worry about that either. They are very drought-tolerant plants and often do this as summer comes on. Only if the ends of Magnolia branches are dropping their leaves, or dying back, should you be concerned. This dropping of leaves and wilting is characteristic of Magnolias this time of year and it often happens again toward the end of summer.

Rousseau, in some respects, equates this ad hoc voter suppression to the kinds of political ploys that led to protests in the 1960s and 70s.

"With Angela Corey, you have a similar situation," Rousseau said. "Where you have someone who is supposed to represent the law and there is at least a perception that what is going on may not be lawful, and if it is legal just disregards the way this country is supposed to be by exploiting people."

Shepard and Jacobson's lawsuit represents Carol Elizabeth Scott, Paul Bremer, Jennie Bennett and Elizabeth W. Williams, who between them are residents of Clay,

Duval and Nassau counties, the counties which together comprise the Fourth Judicial Circuit of Florida.

Rousseau characterizes this election as somewhat of a Catch-22 because although his contact with Corey has been pleasant, the opaque election process gives him the "impression that what is going on is possibly illegal, but definitely immoral."

"What's really sad about all this is that I know Angela Corey," he said. "She's a caring individual and I think that she really wants to do her job to the best of her ability. I have a lot of positives that can be said about her, but you can't take a blind eye to a process that raises these kinds of political and ethical concerns. Not a smart move on her part, it's just not a smart move."

current bridge.

The existing pier is not in very good shape, Kopelousos said, but it is a popular attraction for fishermen and others.

"The maintenance on it continues to go up. It's wood, creosote. It's got issues," she said.

The DOT would take care of getting rid of the original fishing pier and make the new pier useable for fishing, as well as paving for parking underneath.

"My goal would be for us to tell DOT we'd like to move forward with taking over that portion of the pier. They would put it in appropriate shape," Kopelousos said.

The county would be responsible for maintenance, but it is responsible for the maintenance of the existing pier, so there would be no difference there, she said. The new paving would add to existing parking and help keep cars from parking on the side of the road, she said.

Kopelousos said that during discussions she asked that the increased height planned for the middle of the new bridge be taken advantage of for the fishing pier.

"I asked them to look at getting us as far out before the span goes up so that you're in some of that deeper water," she said.

The commissioners were in agreement that the plan sounded good to them. Kopelousos said the next step would be for the DOT to bring back to the county a

maintenance-type of agreement that ensures the county will maintain the area.

"And rightfully so," said Commissioner Wendell Davis.

The commission also continued its move forward on purchasing approximately 158 acres of land located adjacent to Camp Blanding and the Belmore State Forest by unanimously approving a "facilitation agreement" with the St. Johns River Water Management District for due diligence services related to the purchase.

The property would be used long range for a multi-purpose public safety facility, with the first project on the land expected to be a gun range and accompanying building, Kopelousos said.

The property is currently privately-owned and the county is working with Camp Blanding to purchase it. The SJRWMD typically acts as the closing agent for Camp Blanding and handles most of the closing documents as well as the environmental assessment. Usually, the property is then managed by the SJRWMD, said Kopelousos.

This case is slightly different, she said. "Since we have compatibility with the property with the surrounding properties of Camp Blanding and the conservation area we will be the owners of the property. SJRWMD has agreed to continue like they normally do and be the closing agent. They are in the process of finishing up the

Boaters and beachgoers asked to help ID coastal birds Memorial Day Weekend

TALLAHASSEE – This Memorial Day Weekend, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and Audubon are reminding Floridians to share our beaches and islands with rare and declining species of water birds that are currently nesting statewide.

“Memorial Day is always a fun time to be around or on the water, but we’re not the only ones who think so,” said Julie Wraithmell, Audubon Florida’s deputy executive director. “The end of May is a critical time for some of Florida’s most iconic coastal birds and their fluffy chicks. Roseate spoonbills, black skimmers, snowy plovers, American oystercatchers, least terns and more are using Florida’s beaches and islands right now to raise their young.”

Unfortunately, when boaters or beachgoers approach nesting birds too closely, parents are flushed from their nests, leaving chicks and eggs vulnerable to predators, overheating in the summer sun, crushing under foot (in the case of beach nesters), or falling and drowning in water beneath the nest (in the case of tree nesters). A single, ill-timed disturbance can destroy an entire colony.

“While the disturbance is seldom intentional, the result for the birds can be deadly,” said Brian Yablonski, Chairman of the FWC. “Together we can ensure this holiday weekend is safe and enjoyable for people and birds alike.”

Each year along Florida’s coast, the FWC and local officials, along with Audubon volunteers, staff and partners, post many of the state’s beach and island nesting sites to make sure people know where the birds are nesting and to help prevent disturbance. Additionally, volunteer “bird stewards” from local Audubon chapters



and other partners will help chaperone nesting bird colonies on many Florida beaches this weekend. These stewards help educate beachgoers about the breathtaking spectacle of these colonies while reminding pedestrians not to enter protected areas. Volunteers also help monitor

colonies to collect important citizen science data about the birds’ nesting efforts through the Florida Shorebird Alliance (www.flshorebirdalliance.org).

In 1980, Florida had 10 million residents. Today, we have 20 million, with another 100 million tourists

visiting annually. At the same time, populations of many coastal birds have plummeted.

In the midst of the storm, there is a “peace from God, which surpasses all understanding, that will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.” (Phil. 4:7) Give it to the Lord so that He can replace your disappointment and the bitter fruit it bears with His restful peace.

You cannot allow your disappointment to be greater than your God. He will accept all the cares that you cast upon Him because He deeply cares for you. (1 Peter 5:7) Even if great disappointment has brought a darkness over you, Jesus is the Light that casts out that darkness.

PATUXENT RIVER, Md. – A 2006 Ridgeview High School graduate and Orange Park native is serving “Where the future of naval aviation begins” at Naval Air Station Patuxent River, located in Patuxent River, Md.

Petty Officer 1st Class Dennis Vanleeuwen is an air traffic controller at NAS Patuxent River, responsible for the safe separation and guidance of airplanes in the sky.

Located at the mouth of the Patuxent River, the 14,500-acre complex is host to Naval Air Warfare Center Aircraft Division headquarters and Headquarters, Naval Air Systems Command. These two entities provide the full spectrum of acquisition management, research and development capabilities, air and ground test and evaluation, aircraft logistics and maintenance management.

“What I like most about my job is when you’re busy it gives you an adrenaline rush,” said Vanleeuwen. “But, it is also rewarding and I enjoy teaching others.”

NAS Patuxent River is home to the U.S. Naval Test Pilot School and the Atlantic Test Range and 50 other tenant commands. The facilities at Patuxent River are utilized by foreign governments, academic institutions and private industry for similar

projects and deliver effective and efficient installation management enabling tenants to achieve integrated warfare systems and life cycle sustainment.

Vanleeuwen said he and other sailors are proud to be serving at a command that readily defends America at all times.

“I like that this command is not in the country or the big city,” said Vanleeuwen. “This is one of the pinnacle duty stations in regards of complexity.”

With more than 800 employees assigned to the host naval air station staff, the civilian and military “Pax Pros” work hard to ensure the continued security, safety and first-class services are provided to all 20,000-plus employees working aboard the installation, according to Navy officials.

“The work our sailors and civilians do every day is extremely important to both the current health and future of Naval Aviation, and it directly impacts the Fleet,” said Capt. environmental assessment, so they wanted an agreement between the county and SJRWMD,” Kopelousos said. “That’s what we have before you today.”

The commission unanimously approved the item. It can still, however, walk away from the plan to purchase the land if things don’t proceed satisfactorily. A multi-purpose facility for the Clay County Sheriff’s Office has long been the dream of Sheriff Rick Beseler. And while Beseler won’t be the sheriff when the dream probably becomes a reality as he is not running for office again, it is moving forward.

Part of the reason for that is other agencies have become involved and are helping in the effort. The Federal Bureau of Investigation is one of those, and the gun range, which it would also use, is a top priority, Kopelousos said.

“My recommendation to you once we purchase this property, the first goal is to work with the FBI to get the gun range in place. The FBI has been working with the sheriff and they are committed to putting in that gun range. My hope is once we close on the property that gets started right away,” she said.

The county is expected to pay about \$200,000 as its share of the more than \$800,000 purchase price for the 158 acres. Among other things that the Sheriff’s Office is looking at for the future is a minimum security facility, a juvenile detention facility, a driving range and a training and storage facility, Beseler has said in the past.

and go through our charts, that’s whenever they look and say OK yes you are performing as mandated,” Deaton said.

The hospital employees approximately 1,500 staff members, and around 800 physicians, making it one of the largest employers in Clay County. The hospital is also in a growth spurt with \$15 million in capital investments underway, which include the finalization of their labor delivery suites.

“They’re all beautiful big private rooms with tech advances for comfort and convenience for people who stay overnight to have access to technology,” said David Goldberg, public relations officer for OPMC. “A real kind of hotel-like feel.”

As the hospital continues to improve its services, the hope is that the trauma center completes its residency at OPMC and stays for good, Deaton said.

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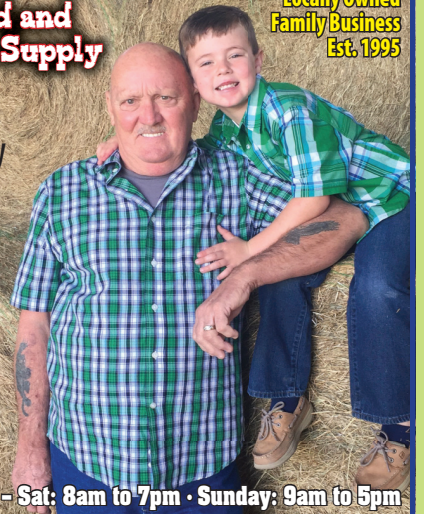

Middleburg crash ends in fatality

MIDDLEBURG – The Florida Highway Patrol reports that one person was injured and one person was killed in a May 24 car accident.

The crash occurred at Nolan Road and Brangus Road in Middleburg.

The crash involved the Toyota Tundra and a 2007 Honda Civic. It occurred at 6:35 p.m.

FHP said the driver of the Tundra began to pass the Honda Civic in a no passing zone as they approached Brangus Road. The Tundra hit the right driver's door of the Civic and sent the car into a ditch.

Clay County Fire Rescue pronounced the driver dead on the scene. While the driver of the Tundra was taken to St. Vincent's Health Care with minor injuries.

The crash remains under investigation.

Clay firefighter resigns after posting sexually-explicit photo

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A Clay County Fire Rescue firefighter and paramedic recently resigned after officials launched an investigation into allegations he posted a self-portrait that exposed his genitals on social media.

Action News Jacksonville reported May 24 that someone sent the TV station the photo that was allegedly taken by Lt. Anthony Myrick who was based at Fire Station No. 20 in Green Cove Springs.

Clay County Fire Chief Lorin Mock told Action News that Myrick had been on administrative leave while the county's department of public safety investigated the allegations.

"Mock confirmed the picture was taken in the bathroom inside Station 20 in Green Cove Springs," the TV station reported.

Myrick worked for the Fire Department for 11 years.

Action News Jax uncovered a history of

misconduct in Myrick's disciplinary record. Myrick was given a written reprimand in 2010 after "inappropriate and unprofessional behavior" while he gave H1N1 vaccines at various local schools.

Calls made to Clay County's human resources director were not returned prior to deadline at Clay Today.

Man facing attempted murder charge, more

ORANGE PARK – A Clay County Man is facing charges of attempted first degree murder, aggravated battery with a deadly weapon and armed burglary after an investigation by the Clay County Sheriff's Office.

Police said the charges stem from a fight and shooting that occurred on April 11. According to the arrest warrant, Larry Todd Prevat, 47, walked into the victim's residence on College Drive in Orange Park carrying a baseball bat and a can of gasoline. He violently assaulted the victim and attempted to set the residence on fire. Prevat assaulted both Brian Darnell and Prevat's estranged wife who had been dating Darnell since January when she filed for divorce in January.

Police said Prevat bit his estranged wife on the arms during the melee that eventually ended up with Darnell going into a closet and retrieving a shotgun that he used to subdue Prevat.

"When deputies arrive, both Larry Prevat and Brian Darnell are lying in the yard, approximately 12 feet away from one another in complete exhaustion and both severely injured," states the warrant.

He was arrested on May 23. The arrest

took place in Duval County under "Cops Without Boarders." Prevat was transferred to the Clay County Jail that same evening.

These crimes were just one in a series of crimes Prevat is accused of. Handwritten letters recounting various times Prevat made the victim fearful for his safety date back to 1999.

This is the first instance of violence against the victim by Prevat.

At press time, Prevat remained in jail where his bond is set at \$230,016.

Woman dies in dump truck crash

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A Clay County woman is dead following a fatal car accident on Russell Road, May 23.

Debra Williams, 59, was traveling southbound in a 2003 GMC Sierra, with a four-year-old passenger.

After crossing over into the northbound lane, the Florida Highway Patrol found that the Sierra collided with a dump truck.

Williams, who was not wearing a seatbelt, was ejected from the vehicle. Her passenger had minor injuries, while Williams was pronounced dead on the scene.

The driver of the dump truck had minor injuries as well. Authorities do not believe alcohol played a role in the accident.

According to the report charges are pending.

Man charged with stealing scooter, fleeing

ORANGE PARK – A Clay County man is facing charges of battery on an officer, resisting an officer with violence, and grand theft auto.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office arrested Ronnie Eugene Smith, 33, who is accused of stealing a vehicle on the 300th block of Blanding Boulevard. According to the CCSO report, the victim stated that she was close to Kingsley Avenue and Blanding when her brakes started to malfunction. The victim stopped and got off of a scooter to determine what was wrong. At that point, Smith took control of the scooter and drove away before the victim could catch him.

When an officer saw a scooter and suspect matching the victim's description, he attempted to make a traffic stop.

Smith did not stop, and tried to flee on foot. He became aggressive and failed to cooperate with the police, according to the CCSO report. Officers also reported that Smith had a strong smell alcohol, because Smith was so combative they were unable to conduct a field sobriety test. They trans-

ported him to Orange Park Medical Center to receive a blood test in lieu of the field test.

He was medically cleared from the hospital, placed in restraints and transported to the Clay County Jail for booking.

Fraud, theft charges for Oakleaf man

OAKLEAF – A Clay County man is facing multiple grand theft and organized fraud charges following a lengthy investigation by the Clay County Sheriff's Office.

CCSO arrested Ryan Timothy South, 34, a longtime employee of Orange Park attorney John F. Tolson Jr., on May 16. South is believed to have stolen from three separate trust accounts associated with the law firm.

According to the arrest warrant, a review of South's financial records, obtained via subpoena, reveal that he deposited 42 checks totaling \$314,853.12 into three of his personal banking accounts from August 2010 to January 2015.

One of the victims was deceased and involved a trust account that Tolson managed for the victim's estate. According to the report, South asked a representative of the deceased's estate to sign blank checks that were to be used to pay for expenses related to the administration of the estate. From December 2010 to April 2014, 32 checks were either signed or forged by South, according to police. The total amount that he stole from the estate was \$245,535.

According to the warrant, South signed checks with a stamp of the accounts signatory's signature without his permission. He obtained \$57,000 dollars from that account, the investigation found.

As the office manager at the law firm, South had access to real estate files and he prepared checks to be signed by the account's signatory from September to November 2014. It was revealed that the accounts he referred to were closed. The total amount he is accused of stealing from the real estate trust account was \$11,418.12.

South was arrested on one count of Organized Fraud and three separate counts of Grand Theft. At press time, he remained held in the Clay County Jail where his bond is set at \$250,012.

Orange Park man shot by JSO dies

JACKSONVILLE – Officials report that an Orange Park man shot May 14 in Downtown Jacksonville by two Jacksonville Sheriff's Officers has died.

22 at UF Health hospital after being shot around 4 a.m. on May 14 near Union and State Streets.

JSO Chief Chris Butler said the incident began around 2:30 a.m. when Marsh was dropped at a downtown shelter by a family member who said they did not know how to handle him because Marsh was using drugs.

At 3:31 a.m., Marsh placed a 911 call alleging he was mugged, however, during the call, he changed his story repeatedly about the fabricated incident "and was very vague as far as the mugging itself," Butler said.

Marsh told dispatchers he was at the McDonald's near Market and State Streets in Downtown Jacksonville and then became "verbally abusive with the dispatcher," yelling and making racist comments and using obscenities.

While on the phone with dispatchers, dispatchers received a call from the McDonald's manager while officers were en route. The manager said Marsh was banging on the windows holding at least two

bladed knives demanding he be allowed inside. However, when officers arrived, he had fled the restaurant and went across the street where he was then heard yelling at JSO, "Here I am, come get me."

Police found Marsh in a parking lot between the Vet Center at 300 State Street and a dental office located at 300 Union Street, an L-shaped parking lot between the two businesses.

Marsh said he was going to cut off the officers' heads and slash them and throw the knives at them, according to Butler.

After setting up a perimeter around Marsh, Butler said he raised a knife and charged at officer White. That led officer Cochran to shoot once and White shot three times striking Marsh in the arm and head. An investigation was launched into the shooting and the officers were placed on administrative leave.

and diversity should be celebrated. This school is not meant to be a breeding ground for this type of blatant hatred," said Caro Barkowitz, president of the GSA.

Barkowitz said students should not have to out themselves to administrators simply to be able to use the bathroom.

Several students complained they had been blocked and their comments deleted from Facebook after attempting to respond to Van Zant's phone call and video. So, they took to the school board meeting to voice their concerns.

Christian Like, vice president of the GSA said Van Zant's message not only attacked trans children, it attacked their families for simply loving and supporting their children.

"Numerous trans students clearly heard the underlying message of not feeling welcomed inside Clay County Schools. When the called discussed traditional family values as if they were superior to untraditional family values, Charlie Van Zant attacked both those families that contain and support trans students, as well as any other families that do not fall under the traditional family umbrella. This is both hurtful and harmful to these students and their families as they feel discriminated against for being themselves," Like said.

Despite the transgender issue being used as what was described as a political wedge issue, teachers, as well as School Board Member Carol Studdard said that transgender students' privacy has been handled properly and professionally for at least two decades in Clay County. Many agreed that Van Zant's message is a non-issue because, despite the rhetoric, teachers are going to protect the students first.

"There's no need to make this a political football now," said Renna Lee Paiva, president of the Clay County Education Association. "There is absolutely no need. Mr. Obama is not sending the bathroom police to Clay County, he has other things on his plate. We have to comply. We have unisex

bathrooms all over the place and we take care of our own. These are our children, every one of them and you have an obligation of this school board to protect every one of them. We don't do it by percentages."

The controversy became enflamed on May 16 when Van Zant stoked a fire saying that the school district was not going to follow the new federal guidance, but also went on to contradict himself in the video by saying that students' needs would be taken care of. His remarks led to a packed board room at the Teacher Training Center at Fleming Island High.

"Where an individual requires special accommodations, discretion and sound judgment will be used by our school-based personnel and those school officials will guide our efforts to meet those students' needs," Van Zant said.

His video and overall response to the federal guidance has even drawn the attention of the San Francisco-based National Center for Lesbian Rights, which has reviewed Van Zant's public statements and also wrote a legal opinion that was presented to Van Zant and board members by Dan Merkan, director of policy at the Jacksonville-based nonprofit JASMYN, the Jacksonville Area Sexual Youth Minority Network. He said the new federal guide-

lines were not developed in a vacuum.

"This is not something that we really can dispute anymore and so, if you don't follow the guidelines, you're opening yourselves up to lawsuits and you're also creating an unsafe environment for those young people who are transgender who have to have access just like any other student to a full education and to the resources and accommodations available to them within schools, which include restrooms and locker rooms," Merkan said.

For years, JASMYN has provided community-based education to educators and LGBT youth through its "Safe Place" program, which ensures students will not be bullied or singled out for being different. One of those teachers is Orange Park High Science Teacher Bobbi McDermott.

"Are there statistics available to support such a stand? Is there a history of problems arising specifically from non-heterosexual students entering the restroom or locker rooms of their choice? It

seems that this is a non-issue presently in Clay County. While Clay County Schools do stand in compliance with Title IX, we want to be sure I can tell my students they are in a safe place where they will not be bullied, but they may wish for a return to former times when bullying was much more common, but I'd have to send them out to the superintendent's office for that," McDermott said.

Board members nor Van Zant responded to speakers' comments, as is common practice when attendees speak on issues that are not on the posted school board agenda, therefore, no action was taken.

In other business:

The board voted 3-2 to continue the contract with lobbyist firm Southern Strategies Group. Board members Janice Kerekes and Carol Studdard voted no with Kerekes saying that hiring a lobbyist is, under state statutes, one of the few roles that are solely the school board's not the superintendent's.

Meanwhile, those who support paying the \$20,000 a month pointed out that the firm was able to secure \$1 million in new funding for the district this year. Van Zant has yet to provide a specific list of how those funds will be spent.

The board also voted 3-2 to approve spending \$547,000 in the next five years to equip each district school bus with GPS systems. Voted down two previous years, board member Betsy Condon said she had found that Alachua County was able to increase its state FTE funding per student because a similar system there allowed the district to count students more accurately. The system cannot go into place until its implementation goes through bargaining with the Clay Educational Support Personnel Association, the union representing bus drivers and other staff.

FLEMING ISLAND – With his Fleming Island High baseball team taking on the likes of state playoff caliber talent, including 4A-Providence, 4A-Trinity Christian, 7A-Creekside and 3A-St. Joseph's Academy, Golden Eagle senior Tanner Thomas yielded one of the biggest bats in Northeast Florida while shutting down enemy strikes from his shortstop hole to be named the Clay Today All County Baseball Player of the Year. Thomas garnered Clay Today All County First Team honors last year as a third baseman.

behind 8-0 with an unusual inability to get a clean center snap to one of three quarterbacks used for the game.

Clay's defense stymied a second quarter Bears' drive that ended with a fourth and two pass from the Clay 11 being defended away from defensive back Marquez Delafield. Bartram Trail did convert a fourth down play to the Clay 18, but a false start flag moved the Bears back five yards before Clay defensive back Marcus Dixon forced a hurried pass on a blitz off the corner. Clay's other defensive back, Jordan Copeland, got flagged for pass interference to keep the drive alive. An inside blitz from defensive back Christian Swilley nailed Bartram Trail for a three yard loss before the fourth down incomplete gave Clay the ball with 8:30 left in the half. Swilley's name was called numerous times with secondary level tackles.

"That was Swilley's first varsity game and he did a good job with Raequan Williams on the other side," said Hoekstra.

Bartram Trail would end the half down 8-7 after successful passes for gains of 10, four, and two catches of 20 yards each pushed the Bears into scoring position. Bartram Trail scored on a 23 yard scoring pass with 13 seconds left in the half to tighten the score to 8-7.

Bartram Trail punted from midfield on the first drive of the second half to start a Clay offensive drive that featured 12 grueling plays topped with Jenkins hitting wideout Ty Whitaker just inside the goal line giving Clay a 14-7 lead. Kicker Liz Fogarty nailed the PAT for a 15-7 lead with 4:20 left in the third period. Earlier in the drive, Wilson scored off a long run off tackle, but the play was negated by a downfield flag.

"Our wideouts have always been coached to block downfield and our guy got caught, but Colin was already past the play," said Hoekstra.

Gatewood, at quarterback for Bartram Trail, repeated two runs of 30 yards on the last play of the third quarter and the first play of the fourth quarter for a score to put the Bears down just 22-14 as both teams chose to start testing the depth of their respective teams.

Bartram Trail got the better of the fourth quarter to take a 29-22 lead with 13 seconds left in the game.

Fleming Island High’s defense was led by Deon Pate and Brandon Mackey to force five fumbles; one here in the first half in spring game action against Menendez.



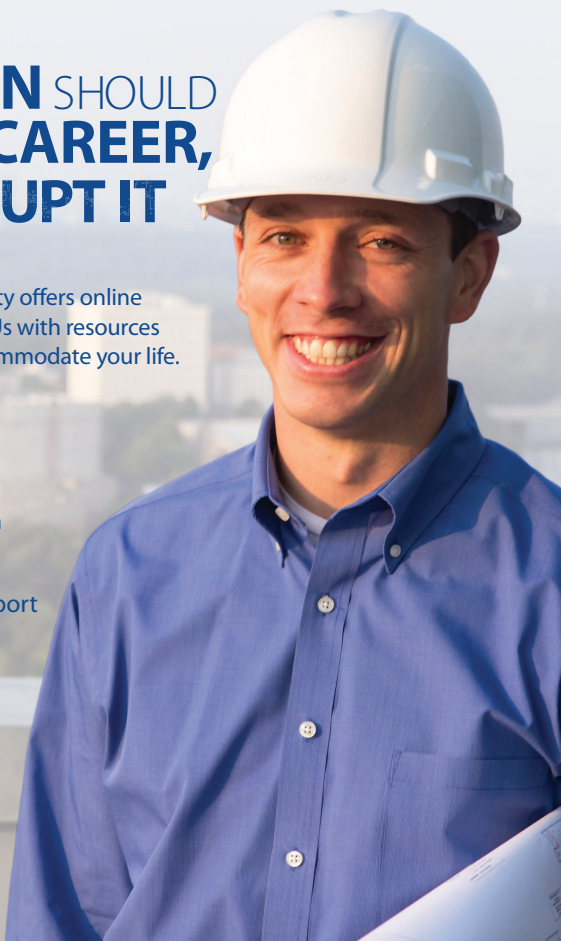

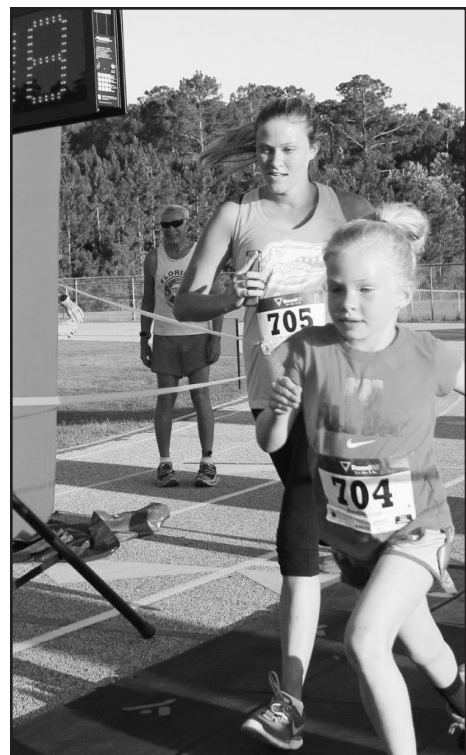

posts on the Clay Today All County First Team; catcher Will Sarsen, a U.S. Army commit, relief pitcher Billy Schopp and third baseman Chris Hawkins, also heading to Tallahassee Community College, the 2016 All County First Team featured players from Clay, Oakleaf, Middleburg and Ridgeview in a county-wide gathering of the area's top talent.

Sarsen, a returner to the Clay Today All County team after being selected second team last year behind Oakleaf High's Jacob Schmidt, now at South Georgia State College, was one of Klosterman's most feared batters with runners on base with his 22 RBIs and .321 batting average.

"Defensively, no catcher in the county nearly as good as him," said Klosterman.

to Terry Parker in the region semifinals.

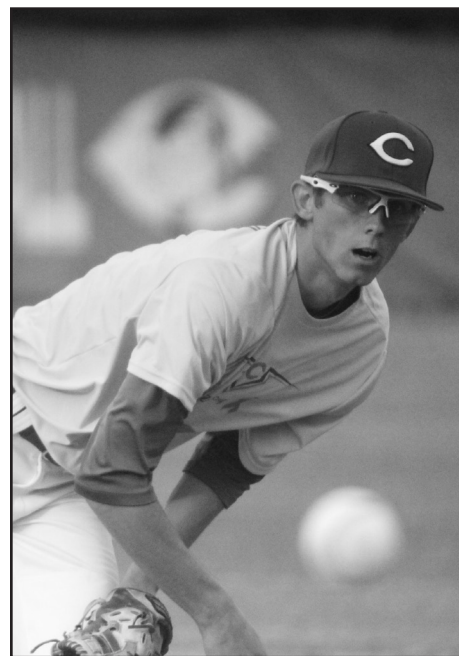
Top point man for Sgromolo was Clay Today All County First Teamer Tyler "T-Rex" Robison, who has been selected as the first

The Ridgeview defense would set up the lone score of the game when defensive back Mike Green would intercept a pass and return it to the Middleburg 45 yard line with just under nine minutes left in the fourth quarter. Panther running back Caleb Plyler would gain 20 yards on the first play combined with a 10 yard run by Jake Denny

on the next play. Add a face mask penalty against Ridgeview to give the Broncos first and goal at the seven yard line. Andre Bowick would kick a 21 yard field goal for the lone score of the game and a 3-0 spring game win for first year head coach Cameron Porch.

Both coaches hope their teams continue to improve heading into the all important summer weight training season and August training camp.

"I like what I see on film but we need to preform on the big stage in the fall" said Smeltzer.

He also knows the psychological game can be just as important as the physical.

"Its mental with alot of our guys. We are fast and talented but the players have to believe because they are certainly capable of showing it," he added.

Porch was also pleased with his first spring but knows, especially as a first year coach, that his players have to be willing to buy into the entire program. "Our main focus is to continue to improve, especially in the weight room. We have a long journey ahead of us but its going to a be a fun ride."

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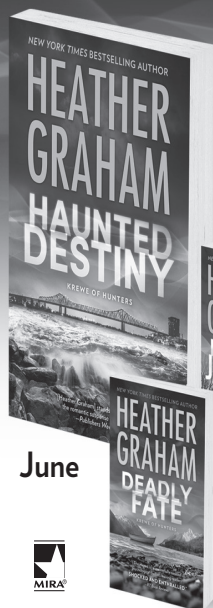

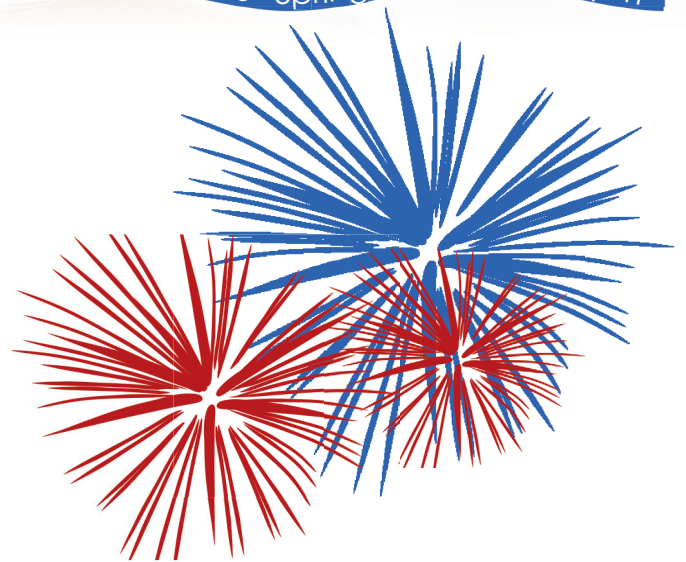
