Preston retiring from Emmet County Public Health

Emmet County Public Health Administrator Kathy Preston is officially retiring May 16 after nearly three decades of public health service in Emmet County.

Preston's replacement, Kari Batman, began her duties as administrator April 11.

An Armstrong native, Preston's parents are Peggy and the late Walt Burgeson. She still has other family in the area, including sisters Cindy Speltz and Peggy Taylor of Armstrong and brother Alan Burgeson of Spirit Lake.

An Armstrong High School graduate, Preston received both her LPN and RN degrees from Iowa Lakes Community College and began her first job at Valley View Care Center in Armstrong then later worked as a clinical nurse for Dr. Turner in Armstrong. She served as school nurse at Armstrong-Ringsted Schools for 15 years before taking her current position in 2008.

Preston has seen a lot of changes in public health over the years. When she started, home health was a key role. However, as other health-care providers began to fill that role, Emmet County Public Health moved to providing community health, including prenatal/postnatal care, health maintenance and a homemaker program for the elderly, lead program, immunization clinics, developmental and dental testing, blood testing, free STD testing and as a key leader in the Emmet County Wellness Coalition.

Public Health also offers school-based clinics, vaccinations, flu clinics, school-based and community education and a first-aid component in babysitting clinics. They also have a Stop the

WILD BLUE YONDER CONTINUES TO GROW

Iowa Lakes Aviation one of largest programs in the college

Tim Busch, aviation program director at Iowa Lakes Community College, was not expecting his path to bring him to the college.

"My path is kind of weird. I didn't come from academia. I was a defense contractor. So, I kind of developed the flying skills on the side," Busch said.

Busch started his own flight school, and with his connections in Dept. of Defense contracts, connected with the Air Force proposal that brought 18 Junior ROTC students to Estherville.

The program is an effort by the U.S. Air Force to train more pilots. The Air Force launched the program to address the shortage of pilots throughout

industries.

The 2021 cadets were visible in the community through the summer, assisting with the Estherville Flight Breakfast and exploring the area. The program is coming back in 2022, Busch said.

Of the 23 colleges that had cadets, only three of the colleges had every cadet end the program with their private pilot's license.

"We had a team that was hugely successful," Busch said.

In October, the Air Force invited Busch to speak to its leaders and to some of the other colleges about how Iowa Lakes mentored all of their cadets from start to finish.

The Emmet County District Court courtroom was a good venue for the Tuesday, May 10 Emmet County Board of Supervisors meeting where the

CO2 pipelines - the human impact

Are the carbon pipeline companies taking public funds, or investing in the future of rural communities like Emmet County?

Landowners are leading the opposition to the 685 miles of carbon sequestration pipelines planned to run through Iowa from two companies that will impact Emmet County. The Estherville News attended a meeting of environmentalists, scientists and citizen group representatives who oppose the pipeline, and reached out to the CO2 pipeline companies.

As the Estherville News has reported in its coverage of the landowner information meetings held throughout late 2021 and earlier this year, local landowners oppose the pipeline because the companies are seeking to use eminent domain to secure any land for which they are unable to gain the land-

owners' voluntary easement.

Among the most recent objections from local landowners received by the Iowa Utilities Board, Jim Richard of Wallingford said, "I hope the IUB sees this pipeline for what it is: a big money grab that will make a few rich people richer at the expense of the American taxpayers."

Jay Lausen of Estherville said, "I urge the Iowa Utilities Board to not grant a liquid pipeline permit/license to Summit Carbon Solutions, LLC. I'm a landowner in the path of the proposed pipeline in Emmet Co., Iowa, and I oppose the construction of this particular pipeline due to damage to tile lines, and irreversible damage

Estherville pool project staying cool

The Estherville Aquatic Center reaching conclusion

From the time the Estherville Parks & Rec board broke ground on the city's aquatic center project on March 29, 2021, board members have made a multitude of decisions on materials, design, supplies, staff, and more. At Monday's meeting, there were considerations of signage, and a wait for the play structure and a

few last minute details to go in. Tuesday, May 17 is the final pool progress meeting, and May 23 is the tentative date for an inspection by the state of Iowa.

Before the outer fence is complete, city maintenance director Roger Hash said he wanted his crew to be able to bring in the picnic tables, rather than having to carry them over a distance.

"We're getting down to the wire," city administrator Penny Clayton said.

Of the 25 lifeguards, 14 were certified as of Monday, and the

other 11 will be scheduled.

The pool manager will be Ms. Desiree Welty, who's been an English teacher at Estherville Lincoln Central Middle School, and will leave in August to take a new job in Ames. Welty worked in local pools through high school and college.

The board looked at various signage options among a sign mounted on a pole versus a brick mounting similar to the current signage in the parks.

Clayton also said various appliances like the slushy ma-

Editor David Swartz.

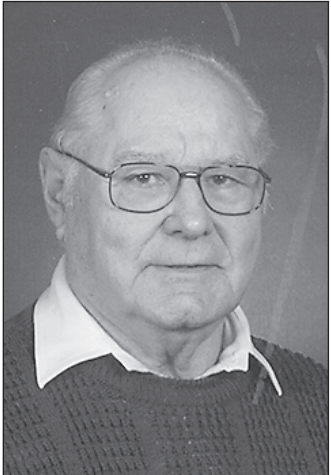
Rev. McCormick took a second turn at the podium praying for business.

upon colonoscopy. You are right that false positives are more prevalent in older individuals.

There are two reasons that I think the Cologuard is still a reasonable choice, although it isn't as good as colonoscopy. The first is that I continue to recommend a screening test for healthy 77-year-old men, and although colonoscopy is my first choice, a normal Cologuard test prevents a need for colonoscopy, and a false positive would lead to the same colonoscopy you would have gotten anyway (although there probably is more anxiety after a false positive test). The second is that a person with an abnormal Cologuard and a normal colonoscopy may be at risk for an abnormality that wasn't found on colonoscopy. A study looking at people in this category found a 25% risk of abnormality on follow-up colonoscopy, if the Cologuard was abnormal again one to two years later.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I am 35 years old. I have experienced fluttering in my chest for most of my adult life. It's been a once in a while kind of thing, but for the past month, I keep getting it every day. I have had a lot of EKGs, but my doctor seems to think everything is normal. Please help me, because it's messing up my work and other aspects of my life. -- S.Q.

ANSWER: Most of the time, fluttering in the chest is not something you need to worry about. Most people will have occasional episodes of this, and a few people have a greater number but are found to be normal after extensive evaluation.

A cardiologist might recommend a 24- to 48-hour heart monitor. If you have symptoms every day, this would be likely to catch your heart rhythm during an event. Devices that record for longer amounts of time are also available, and there are consumer devices that allow you to record an EKG yourself.

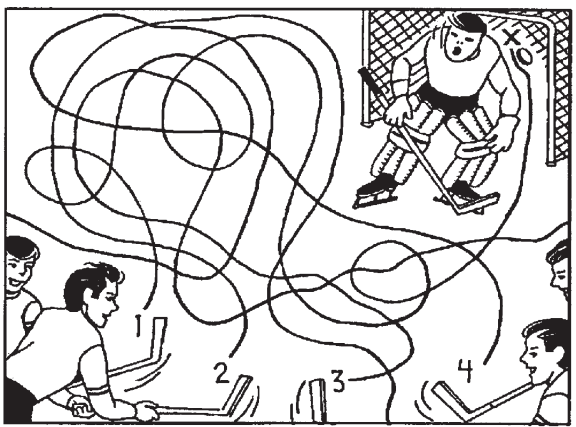

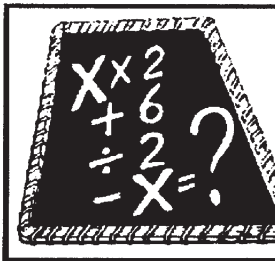

Writer to publish book on Wolden namesake

WALLINGFORD – Wolden Campground, part of the Emmet County Conservation Board network of parks and recreational areas, will likely find a bigger spot on the map when the park's namesake is featured in an upcoming book by an Ames author.

Amie Adams, who now lives in Ames and is originally from Clear Lake, is working on a book titled, "The Observer: The Life and Writings of Bernt Olaf Wolden." She holds a

master of fine arts degree in nonfiction creative writing. Adams told the Emmet County Conservation Board about her research at the board's Thursday, May 5 meeting.

Adams first became aware of Wolden and his writing when she worked as a camp counselor at Ingham Lake Lutheran Bible Camp. Further research led her to Wolden's columns that appeared in the Estherville Daily News from 1930-1968. Adams said Wolden was a contemporary of Aldo Leopold, a

pillar of the American environmental movement.

"I think he was writing at a really significant time in Iowa history," said Adams, who is compiling 100 of Wolden's columns as part of an environmental writing project. She also plans a 30- to 40-page introduction, with the intent of using the book as a fundraiser for the Emmet County Conservation Board, and possibly selling copies at the Emmet County Nature Center. She has applied for a \$1,000 grant from the

Iowa State Historical Society.

The board gave Adams its vote of support for her efforts. In other business Thursday, The Emmet County Nature Center Foundation heard about summer programs and other activities. Conservation Board Director Eric Anderson called recent archery programs at North Union High School "a huge success".

Anderson said Garrett Gray had been hired as a full-time naturalist intern/parks employee with his time split between

the two departments. Anderson said Gray would like to work through the winter and also return again next summer.

In the Conservation Board meeting that followed, Anderson also reported on camping receipts which total \$41,193.39 for the year. He also reported on the new building project.

Naturalist Ashley Reed highlighted various activities, including North Union archery, field trips, summer camps and weekly programs.
