ELC begins defense of Class 3A State championship

Can they do it again?

Coming off its run to the 2022 Class 3A State Championship, the Estherville Lincoln Central Girls Basketball Team will try to defend its crown for the 2022-23 season.

With the loss of career 1,000-point scorers Kaitlyn Tendal and Jaydan Nitchals, the task won't be easy.

However, the Midgets return six of the eight players who played key minutes a year ago including the captain of the Class 3A All-Tournament Team, Haylee Stokes.

As a freshman, she led ELC in points, steals and assists last season with 453, 111, and 84, respectively. That works out to averages of 16.8 points, 4.1 steals and 3.1 assists per game.

Now a sophomore, the 5-6 guard will again be a leader on the team.

Other returning starters are Haylee's sister senior Jordyn Stokes and junior Jasey Anderson.

Jordyn, a three-year starter, is another solid guard. She recently signed to continue her basketball career at Iowa Lakes Community College following the conclusion of her high school career. She averaged 7.4 points, 22 rebounds, 2.1 steals and 2.0 assists per game last season.

Anderson, a two-year starter, was often given the task of guarding the opposing team's top offensive player. Her speed and quickness helped her harry opponents last season. She averaged 3.1 points, 2.5 rebounds, 1.3 steals and 1.1 assists per game.

Stepping up into starting roles will be senior Brei Christoffer and sophomore Rylee Yager.

Both played key minutes all season long and can continue offensively and defensively.

Yager averaged 4.7 points per game while Christoffer averaged 1.5 points.

Sophomore Hillary Ruschy also played in nearly every game last season and played key minutes last year. She also averaged 1.5 points.

Looking to the bench, junior Tatum Dunlavy also logged significant minutes as a freshman and will see her minutes increase this year

"We feel really good about these six returners," said ELC coach Don Martindale. "I think we will be a much faster up-tempo team defensively. We're hoping we'll be able to turn teams over and create easy runouts. Not much is going to change in the way that we play.

"I'm blessed to have kids that can play this style and, more importantly, bought into this style," he said.

"Hillary, Tatum, and sophomore Cara Schiltz will give us valuable minutes off the bench and will be in our rotation."

Martindale said the goals never change from year to year.

Sophomore Evi Nath also joins the roster after being injured last season. Three freshmen round out the varsity roster— Morgan Clabaugh, Zoey DeRuyter, and Lexi Juergens."

With the Lakes Conference down to five schools with the departure of Western Christian, ELC will look to defend its league title after posting a 10-0 record last season.

Midgets expect another winning season in 2022-23

MANAGING EDITOR After finishing with its best record in about

25 years, the Estherville Lincoln Central Boys Basketball Team will see if it can repeat that success for the 2022-23 season.

Junior Owen Larson will again be the squad's leader after averaged 22.1 points, 5.6 rebounds, 5.1 assists, and 2.5 steals per game last season. He shot 51.1 percent (190-of-372) percent from the floor including 43.1 percent (81-of-188) from 3-point range and 81.2 percent (69-of-85) from the free throw line.

ELC will look to replace the six seniors who graduated—Ryan Schiltz, Blake Ingvall, Adrian Vaughn, Jack Jensen, Tristan Howard and Grant Love.

This year's senior Logan Nissen returns with the most varsity experience after starting six games and playing in 23 of the 24 games. He averaged 2.9 points and 3.0 rebounds last season. Other returning letter winners include seniors Blake Evans, Alexander Sheridan, and Carson Grange and juniors Jordan Jensen, Cael Miller, Aaron Armstrong and Luke Heinrichs.

"Last year's team was more skilled offensively in terms of some guys being able to shoot a little better," said ELC Coach

Estherville

Nick Gruhlke. "I really like how hard this group works. Last year that was one of our strengths too. Our guys work their tails off."

Joining Larson and Nissen in the starting lineup are Jordan Jensen and Blake Evans. Several players are vying for the fifth spot±—Heinrichs, Armstrong, Miller, Sincere McMurran and Blake Andrews.

"Defensively, they're similar. Cael probably has a little advantage as he's a little bigger than the others. We might not know until January who those No. 5 and No. 6 players are," said Gruhlke.

Of Larson, Gruhlke said the junior is a lot stronger than he was a year ago.

"I anticipate him finishing well around the rim," said Gruhlke. "He's put a lot of time in the gym, obviously. He's shot very well from the 3-point line in practice. He's going to have to do a great job this year—which he does—in finding the open teammates. He's always a pass-first guy."

A year ago, ELC finished third in the Lakes Conference with a 5-5 record—the key included a rare win over Western Christian, which has left the league.

The Lakes Conference now has just five teams—ELC, Spirit Lake, Spencer, Storm Lake, and Cherokee.



"Spirit Lake returns nearly everyone from



their core group of eight or nine guys," said Gruhlke. "They also have a player that moved in that's about 6-6. Spencer's always tough—losing Karter Petzenhauser hurt them, but they have a pretty group. Between us three, I think we should vie for that top spot in the conference. Cherokee lost quite a few guys and Storm Lake lost its top 10 or 11 guys (to graduation). I don't know what to expect from them."



An influx of newcomers will bolster the Estherville Lincoln Central Wrestling Program in Coach Nick Hogan's second season at the helm of the Midgets.

The coach talked about the difference from last year's squad.

"We are having a shift to a more youthful roster as opposed to being reliant on older wrestlers last season," said Hogan. "We also are looking at having closer to a full lineup this season."

Six seniors return for their final season in Isaac Reineke, Will Martin, Ashton Bradley, Morgan Dalen, Cade Crees, and Jess Christensen

Will Martin along with Parker Duitsman and Austin Hansen are the returning district qualifiers from a year ago.

Wes Martin also returns for the squad. Of the returning wrestlers, Hansen ad the best record with a 36-2 record. Others with winning records last season are as follows: Crees was 16-6, Wes Martin was 30-12,

Bradley was 11-7, and Duitsman was 24-17. Hogan talked about the leadership for this year's team.

"Our returning district qualifiers as well as our seniors have been the ones who have adopted that leadership role on the team," he said.

However, there are many newcomers looking to challenge for a spot in the lineup.

"We have some young wrestlers who are coming off a solid season where they wrestled at the AAU State Tournament," said Hogan. "Those include Bennett and Warren Duitsman, James Richard, Clayton Burton, and Layton Yager. We also have Brody Olson who could wrestle some significant varsity time at our lower weights.

Six ELC bowlers to compete in shared program with Emmetsburg

Six Estherville Lincoln Central student-athletes will help form the first boys' bowling team in the shared program with Emmetsburg.

- As the host school for the program, Emmetsburg will host the season's two home meets. ELC's team members are Easton Wedebrand, Cesar Padilla, Joaquin Mata Diaz, Preston Crees, Carter Ingvall, and Evan Wedebrand.

Iowa has three classes for bowling – 1A, 2A, and 3A. Emmetsburg/ELC will be in Class 2A. There are 32 teams in that class.

State-qualifying meets are a one-day tournament.

Teams will bowl 15 baker games and the top total pins would advance to the State Meet. Class 3A and 2A state qualifying meets would have four sites with eight teams at each site, with the top two teams at each site qualifying for the State Team Tournament.

Individuals at the state qualifying meet will bowl three games. The top eight scores from each Class 3A/2A site qualify for the state individual tournament for a total of 32

ARMSTRONG - Although North Union Girls Basketball lost six seniors to graduation from a year ago, Coach Merle Tigges still expects a lot from his squad in 2022-23.

The Warriors finished 16-6 overall and placed second in the Top of Iowa West Standings with a 13-3 record. Only Class 1A Champion Bishop Garrigan fared better in the league, as they went 16-0.

North Union returns two key starters from last year's squad in senior Olivia Von Bank and junior Naomi Jones.

Jones led a balanced team with 9.4 points per gem while also recording 3.8 rebounds, 3.5 steals and 1.8 assists per contest. Von Bank was third on the team in scoring with 7.8 points per game to go along with 4.7 rebounds, 3.1 steals and 1.5 assists.

Other key returners that saw significant

playing time are junior Libby Stevens and senior Emily Meyer.

Two other players, senior Shelby Fraker and junior Olivia Merrill, are ready to step up for their turn.

"We're six deep while working to develop our bench," said Tigges. "These six are juniors and seniors that have played a lot of minutes, whether on varsity or junior varsity the last couple of years and are ready for the next step.

"Naomi, Libby and Shelby, will be at the guards, are all quick and aggressive," he continued.

Von Bank and Meyer are both solid players and Merrill is a 5-11 player that can post up and play well around the basket, he said.

Rounding out the varsity roster are Macy Colegrove, Jo Oleson, Ava Steinberger and Hannah Nelson.

Experience should bring more success to Warriors

ARMSTRONG — With many key players returning, the North Union Boys Basketball Team expects to improve on last year's record of 8-13.

"Last year was the first year of varsity experience for a lot of our guys," said North Union Coach Alex Fisher, who begins his ninth season as the team's head coach. "We are older now and will primarily play upperclassmen. This will help with the speed and physicality of the game. We should have more ability to score and defend this year."

Steve Ryan is the assistant coach.

Key returning players are seniors Teagon Fothergill and Logan Odegaard along with juniors Dan Fothergill, Preston Guerdet, Kyan Jones, and Aiden Lofstrom.

Fisher said the six players accounted for 84 percent of the offense a year ago.

"They've also had a good offseason," he said. "We should have a balanced attack. We shouldn't have to rely on just one or two individuals to handle the majority of scoring. We will have good ball handlers who can create offense for us. Our shooting should also be improved compared to last season."

Lofstrom was the team's leading scorer a year ago and averaged 11.2 points and 5.0 rebounds per game. Odegaard was next

at 8.9 points and 3.8 rebounds per game. Danyal Fothergill averaged 6.4 points per game, Teagon Fothergill averaged 6.1 points per game and Jones averaged 5.2 points, 5.2 assists, 4.5 rebounds and 2.5 steals per game. Guerdet averaged 4.2 points per game.

Of course, there's always room for improvement.

"Although improved, we still need to be more physical and defend and score in the paint better," said Fisher. "Against bigger, more physical teams, we struggled in stopping teams scoring at close range and also struggled on the glass. We settled for too many outside shot attempts against those teams as well."

Fisher said the seniors will be this year's leaders.

"Teagon Fothergill and Logan Odegaard are our only seniors out and have been great leaders for us," said Fisher. "They have been coachable and led by example. Both have put in a lot of work the past couple of years to be good basketball players. We will look to lean on them during times of adversity and hope they continue to be great teammates and young men."

One sophomore will also add to the Warriors' depth.

"Grady Madden, better known as 'Jimmy,' will put in some big minutes for us this year," said Fisher. "He had a great freshman

season on our lower-level teams and a great summer of basketball. He brings a lot of energy, talk, and ability on the floor when he is in. He also makes the guys around him better which is a quality every coach loves."

A year ago, North Union finished tied for seventh in the Top of Iowa West Conference with a 6-10 record in the league. Lake Mills swept the conference with a 16-0 record.

"I think the Top of Iowa West is sort of wide open this year," said Fisher. "Lake Mills graduated a lot but also brings back a lot of talent. West Hancock will be in the mix with their bigs and ability to win the paint. Forest City and GHV (Garner-Hayfield-Ventura) are perennial contenders Feb. 7 @Lake Mills and will be good again. I feel like we can be in the mix as well with the talent we bring

back. I think there will be a lot of good conference games this year that could have title implications." Fisher talked about the goals for the team

this season.

"Our goal is to consistently improve and take it one game at a time," Fisher said. "We play a tough schedule again this year but our mindset is we can beat anyone we line up against if we play hard and play together. We want to be playing our best basketball come February and make a run come tournament time."

Experienced Titans return four starters to lead team 2022-23 SCHEDULE

GRAETTINGER - Coming off its first winning season in four years, the Graettinger-Terril/Ruthven-Ayrshire Boys Basketball Team will look for even more success.

The Titans finished 17-7 a year ago and lost one senior to graduation in Dalton Young.

GT/RA's four returning senior starters-Drew Schnell, Max Hough, Eric Heinrichs, and Kory Hough-all averaged double digits in points a year ago.

Schnell averaged 15.1 points, 3.1 rebounds, 2.1 steals and 2.0 assists last season while shooting 44 percent from the field, 40 percent from 3-point range and 70 percent from the free throw line.

Max Hough averaged 12.3 points, 6.8 assists, 5.9 rebounds and 3.8 steals per contest while shooting 33.8 percent from the field and nearly 70 percent from the free throw line.

Heinrichs averaged 12.1 points, 4.5

rebounds, 2.2 assists and 1.4 steals while shooting 45 percent from the field and 35 percent from the 3-point line.

Kory Hough averaged 10.9 points, 6.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game while shooting 47.8 percent from the field and 60.5 percent from the free throw line.

Fellow seniors Patrick Fiddler and Andrew Kral return to bolster the lineup as do junior Colin Hoffman and sophomore Kasey Hough, who saw varsity minutes on the court.

GT/RA head coach Randy Hough is in his 21st season, having started at Ruthven-Ayrshire and continuing the head coaching role since sharing the program with Graettinger-Terril. He is assisted by Matt Masters.

"We should be a very experienced team," Coach Hough said. "I would like to see better rebounding and free throw shooting."

The coach said the entire senior class will serve as this year's leaders and junior Isaac Murphy and Sullivan Hall are both promising newcomers. Seventeen players in

North Union finished with a 14-9 dual record and placed 17th in the Top of Iowa Conference Duals and 11th at the Top of Iowa Conference Tournament.

Fourteen wrestlers reported to practice and Coach Johnson is assisted by Brady Anderson.

Three seniors return for their final season-Dalton Tobin, Kacey Hamsmith and Kaleb Lufkin.

Coach Johnson talked about the differences between this year's team and last year's.

"We've already had three wrestlers quit from last year's team, but we got two new freshmen," said Johnson. "This team is much more experienced than last year and nas more confidence."

"I want everyone to take a leadership role whether they are freshmen or seniors," he said. "I have seen all the guys lead by example in and out of the wrestling room, but I have challenged all of our guys to be more vocal in a positive way. The captains will change on a weekly basis depending on who is leading the team in all areas on and off the mat."

Kade Madden and Draven Keeler are the newcomers to this year's team.

"Neither one has a lot of previous experience, but I love what I've seen from them so far," Johnson said. "Both are very coachable and work their tails off every day."


