Chief requests expanded use of reserve officers

EPD faces potential major staff shortage as of summer

At Monday evening's city council meeting, Chief Brent Shatto presented a proposed ordinance amending Chapter 80 of city code. The ordinance would allow the Estherville Police Department to expand its use of volunteer police reserves for regular police work as the department looks to ongoing and future vacancies. Shatto said the idea of supplementing the department with expanded roles for its reserve officers came about after discussions with Arnolds Park Police Department and with Officer Heinrichs, who previously worked for Pocahontas Police Department.

Shatto said Estherville's department has one officer, Tyler Van Roekel, who has been on unpaid administrative leave for the duration of a court case. One vacancy occurred when Sgt. Corey Danner moved out of state. Sgt. Matt Reineke will begin his responsibilities as Emmet County Conservationist on July 1. Another officer has applied for a job with another

Corridor representative meets with supervisors

Business and industry is growing in the four-county Iowa Lakes Corridor region, the Emmet County Board of Supervisors learned at its Tuesday, April 16 meeting.

Joanne Follon, Business Retention & Workforce Partnership Coordinator with the Iowa Lakes Corridor, told the board the region's work ethic, community support and quality of life are big plusses in the opportunity for area growth. However, lack of workforce, housing and

Follon said the Corridor plans to visit 10 of 17 Emmet County target businesses by the end of April regarding their business retention and expansion plans. In the four-county region, Follon said 46 percent of businesses have plans to expand, 18 of them within the next three to five years, representing \$524 million in capital growth, the largest of which will be Platinum Crush, a







In other business, the city council set a public hearing on May 6 at 5 p.m. regarding the sale of three city lots to two purchasers. The city had set the properties at 705 South 12th Street, 1120 7th Ave. South, and 701 South 11th Street for sale and redevelopment. Andrew Ward had a successful bid for 701 South 11th Street, while Drain Pro had a successful bid on 705 South 12th Street and 1120 7th Ave. South. Drain Pro plans to build a 50x80 building with 2-3 overhead doors for an office and van storage with a cement driveway straddling the two adjacent lots. Drain Pro bid \$1,500 on each lot, or a total of \$3,000. Andrew Ward will construct a 40x70 building with two insulated overhead doors for a hobby shop and storage. Ward's successful bid was also \$1,500.

Council member Roy Gage said he was personally disappointed in the amounts of the bids. Gage, an experienced landowner, said if he had owned those parcels, he would likely offer them for more like \$5,000, and that the city was losing out on the expense

"something" to go forward. Understanding this distinction can help us better parse the statements our politicians make. Here is a reallife example to illustrate this difference:


Back in December, Gov. Kim Reynolds ended Iowa's participation in a summer food program for low-income families with school-age children. The governor made the decision even though the bulk of the expense would be paid by the federal government.

About 240,000 Iowa children from needy families are affected by her decision. Their parents would have received \$40 per month during the summer for each child who qualifies for free or reducedpriced school lunches. The program's purpose was to help these needy families feed their children during the summer when classes are not in session and the kids are not eating at

In Iowa, the federal government offered \$29 million for food assistance this summer. State government would have been responsible for covering \$2 million in administrative

But in deciding to withdraw Iowa from the program, the governor explained her rationale: "Federal Covid-era

cash benefit programs are not sustainable and don't provide long-term solutions for the issues impacting children and families." She also said the program "does nothing to promote nutrition at a time when childhood obesity has become an epidemic."



Last week, the governor unveiled details of a new state grant program to feed needy Iowa kids during the summer months. A total of \$900,000 in competitive grants is being offered to communities to expand the reach of two existing summer meal programs providing meals each week day through schools, churches, libraries and community organizations.

It is obvious the \$900,000 in state grants will not feed as many children as the \$29 million in federal summertime assistance would. The money for the grants is coming from the federal government, too.

State Representative Chuck Isenhart, a Dubuque Democrat, said the state meal programs Reynolds is expanding spent about \$5.8 million last year and fed about 20,000 kids. The Reynolds grants will provide meals for an additional 1,800 kids, he estimated. State Senator Sarah Trone

Garriott, a West Des Moines Democrat, said in a statement last week, "The competitive grant program amounts to crumbs for Iowa kids. Gov.

Reynolds could have accepted \$29 million in federal food assistance that would've reached 240,000 children in every corner of the state. The \$900,000 state program she announced ... is tiny by comparison and forces Iowa communities to compete for a sliver of that much-smaller pie. It's not enough to meet the real needs facing our state."

The meal sites have inherent problems the summer food benefit cards do not. Families must bring their children to and leaving the program. Nebraska first said it would drop out, too, but Gov. Jim Pillen, a Republican, ultimately gave in to public pressure and said Nebraska will remain in the federal program.

Back to Gov. Reynolds' concerns about the federal summer food benefits being unsustainable:

from the meal sites every day in the summer, which is difficult for most working parents. And Isenhart reminded lawmakers 12 counties did not have a meal site last summer, and 21 other counties had only one summer meal site

The summer food program which operates much like SNAP, the program formerly known as food stamps — was established during the Covid pandemic, when many families' incomes fell because parents had their work hours reduced or they were laid off or lost their jobs. Now, although the pandemic is not the economic impediment it once was, the earnings of many families are not keeping up with inflation.

That is why the federal government is making the summer food program permanent, although it gave the states the option of dropping out. Iowa joined 12 other states in

than it will cost Reynolds to deploy Iowa State Patrol troopers and Iowa National Guard soldiers to the Texas border with Mexico this spring.

And the \$29 million price tag for the summer food benefits program is significantly less than the \$128 million Iowa state government is paying this year for tuition vouchers for students attending private K-12 schools. Two years from now, when the voucher program is fully implemented. the vouchers will cost the state treasury an estimated \$345 million per year. So, unsustainable really



Armstrong Council tackles city infrastructure

ARMSTRONG — The Armstrong City Council at its Tuesday, April 9 meeting addressed city infrastructure and how to pay for it.

City Superintendent Troy Leininger in his maintenance report said he had been working on storm sewer intakes. He also said Visu-Sewer of Mason City could jet and camera 10-12 blocks of sanitary sewer lines for

Councilmember Arden Kinnander moved that the city pay Visu-Sewer for the work from the city sewer operating fund which has \$320,000, and the council approved.

Leininger also said the city had sent a letter the previous Friday informing residents of the DNA-mandate lead and copper survey and he had completed 40 inspections as of Tuesday's council meeting. The purpose of the survey is

or copper water pipes entering their homes. Leininger said 500 homes remain to be inspected.

Leininger said residents were acceptable to the inspections which have been scheduled at 15-minute intervals. While residents have questioned who will pay for lead and copper pipe replacement, Leininger said that has yet to be determined. He noted funding and loan forgiveness will be available.

The council approved \$1,800 for dust control application by Wessels Oil Company. Leininger said Wessels will do the same streets as last year. The council approved several reso-

lutions for change orders and pay requests to King Construction for work on the city lagoon project. They included painting the building at the site and additional sludge removal.

The council also adopted a resolution authorizing early redemption of special assessments from the curb and gutter project.

They approved another resolution authorizing a loan agreement with Bank Midwest for a 5.75 percent loan and authorizing \$1.3 million in capital loan notes and amending the tax levy for repayment for the North Golf Course Drive project. Councilmember Arden Kinnander said the interest rate is good for five years and is 1 percent over what the city could have had with bonding. He said the interest rate will be refinanced at five- and 10-year intervals.

The council approved a supplemental agreement with Veenstra and Kimm Engineering. Kinnander said there would be no additional charges, but that the agreement was to comply with a Community Development

The council approved a resolution transferring \$81,000 in American Rescue Plan Act funds for water tower and quonset repairs. They also approved a resolution approving a \$111,420 contract with Central Coatings for repainting and inspection of the city's two water towers. They also passed resolutions for water revenue capital notes and bond counsel engagement.

In other business the council:

• Heard the sheriff's report from Emmet County Sheriff Mike Martens who noted an average of 25 hours of weekly uniformed patrol for the month of March. The city's contract with the county calls for a minimum of 20 hours. Martens reported an accident, a domestic assault and a drug arrest resulting from a traffic stop. • Approved a liquor liability quote





Vocal Cord Becomes Paralyzed After a Cold DEAR DR. ROACH:

My daughter, 45, has had a paralyzed left vocal cord for about a year now. We have been to an ear, nose and throat (ENT) doctor who ran at least a half dozen tests, including several scans. These didn't show a reason for the problem, and everything else appeared to be normal. She had a cold before this happened, and we were treating her for a lingering sore throat.

The doctor has told us that there is nothing to be done to unfreeze the vocal cord. I would love your opinion on this matter, as she has a lot of pain associated with it, and she coughs trying to get out what feels stuck in there. -- K.P.

ANSWER: Paralysis of the vocal cord is often the result of damage to the nerve that leads to the vocal cord; there's one on each side. The left side is particularly vulnerable and may be damaged during surgery (especially thyroid surgery), but a big fear is that a mass (especially a cancerous one) can damage the nerve and cause paralysis of the vocal cord. This is why her doctor did a CT scan.

There are other less-common causes, such as nerve damage from other occurrences (stroke and multiple sclerosis); inflammatory diseases (lupus and others); and infections (such as Lyme disease). It sounds like the ENT doctor looked for other possibilities such as these. (But if not, then it should be done.)

When a cause can't be found, we call it "idiopathic unilateral vocal cord paralysis." This often seems to happen after a viral infection, and it sounds like

ment, but ENT surgeons have several types of surgical interventions to improve hoarseness, cough and discomfort. It's time to go back to her ENT doctor or get referred to an expert in the surgical treatment of this condition.

DEAR DR. ROACH: If exercise helps new arteries to grow, would it also help new veins to grow and alleviate varicose veins? --M.D.stuck in there. -- K.P.

ANSWER: It's a good thought, but unfortunately, exercise does not make the body grow new arteries, which are the large blood vessels that bring oxygen-rich blood to our organs and muscles. Exercise increases the size of the arteries and can help keep them from getting stiffer with age. Exercise in combination with a good diet can also help keep them from getting blocked.

In addition, exercise can help with varicose veins, but once again, it isn't because the body grows new veins. Varicose veins are dilated veins that occur due to damage in the tiny valves inside the veins. Without those valves, the venous blood can pool under the effects of gravity, causing the veins to swell.

Exercise helps because of the pump effect of the intermittent muscle contraction, which forces blood back into the large veins and ultimately back into the heart. Exercise, compression stockings and elevation are among the most important lifestyle changes for varicose veins.





Emmet County will have a contractor start spraying noxious weeds along the county road right-of-way sometime around May 13, 2024.

Residents who do not want their roadside sprayed must complete the No Spray Permit. Signs must conform to the "DO NOT SPRAY" signs available at the Emmet County Engineer's Office (at a cost of \$3) and erect them on their property where spraying should be omitted.

The contractor does not spray directly in front of any rural residence that is being maintained, so signs are not needed at these locations; however, the contractor does spray the ROW directly across from rural residences unless notified otherwise. If you are concerned about spray drift carrying across the road to your residence, you need to post signs on the ROW opposite your residence.

To obtain the signs, the resident must fill out an application which states that they will control the noxious weeds at the sign locations. Applications should be completed annually.
