It covers about 50,000 acres of land and 650 miles of shoreline with its 763 billion gallons of water. But even those big numbers can't fully communicate the outsize impact Lake Murray has on Lexington County and the Midlands. It is a hub for outdoor recreation and tourism, is home to businesses and restaurants that generate a great deal of revenue, and is generally a tremendous part of the county's identity.

Which is why the Lexington County Chronicle will launch LakeSide this spring, a quarterly magazine exploring the various activities and developments happening around the lake and the people that are making them happen.
