erry Crady proposed to his wife. Jennifer, with an engagement ring he made.

It was after an Angels game in California that he got down on one knee to present the ring, which incorporated diamonds from Jennifer's grandmother and Jerry's grandmother.

He laughs remembering the first time he met her. It was at a friend's wedding. She was picking on him for not matching his shoes to his suit. "I thought it looked good together," he laughed.

Now owner of Jeweler's Studio in downtown Lexington near St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church, Jerry creates custom pieces for locals day after day.

Donning the magnifying visor and leather apron like that of a blacksmith, Jerry says creating custom pieces is his favorite part of the job. He sits among his tools, listening to EDM, fully taking advantage of the introverted side of his iob.

Regardless of what Jeweler's Studio patrons visit the local establishment for, they're greeted with familiar faces, each with years of experience.

Jerry himself has almost 25 years' experience, while Pam Taylor has almost 20 years' experience.

She and Jerry have worked together for a long time, and like small business employees are used to, Pam's job description is essentially whatever needs to be done outside of making the jewelry.

Alongside creating custom pieces, the business also performs services including repairs and gold buying, and that's often where Pam comes in.

soon-coming proposal, find the piece that works best for them.

Sometimes, that entails diamond alternatives, such as lab-made or moissanite.

"Moissanite is a naturally occurring crystal made from silicon carbide that is used as an inexpensive alternative to diamonds," according to a 2023 article on VRAI.com. "Natural moissanite is incredibly rare. Most moissanite on the market today is man-made."

Moissanite rings and lab-made diamonds are growing in popularity. Some prefer them for their price, while others prefer them for their more-ethical sourcing, considering the dangers of mining and its negative impacts on the environment and the miners themselves.

"We've seen a lot more lab-diamond sales, especially in the past like five years," Jerry said. "They're more affordable than a natural."


A one-carat natural is about \$6,700, according to Pam, while a one-carat lab is \$1,000. Finally, a one-carat moissanite is \$450.

Lab diamonds and natural diamonds are the same on a hardness scale, Jerry said, whereas a moissanite stone would be slightly less hard, but a relatively negligible difference.

In short, whether someone is wearing a natural, lab-made or moissanite, they would have a hard time damaging it and a hard time telling one type of gem from the other.

Jerry and Pam can help Lexington locals find which option works best for them, and make it shine regardless of which type.

But again, it's only one of the services Jeweler's Studio, located at 600 W.

I hear wedding bells! Are you searching for the perfect spot to tie the knot in Lexington County? Check out these venues for your big day:

Corley Mill House & Gardens







Located at 221 Corley Mill Rd. in Lexington, Corley Mill House & Gardens has hosted events since 1997, offering both indoor and outdoor spaces. The 1908 Edwardian-era Corley Mill House was expanded in 2001 with a banquet hall and garden.

Rental rates:

- Discounts are available for off-peak months (January and February) and weekday weddings.





Midlands officiant just wants to know you we each other

amantha Leitner, a wedding officiant serving couples of any background throughout the Midlands, has married over 500 couples since 1989, and of those couples, she only knows of three who have broken up.

"And I could almost put my finger on it right there at the beginning," she said.

Born in Thailand to a Buddhist mother and a Jewish father, Samantha says she's "run the gamut" on religion, now identifying as spiritual while holding strong value in the Bible.

She's an outgoing woman with a frequent smile, the aura of a trusted counselor, is quick to listen and thoughtful in her questioning and has been married to her husband for over two decades.

The value of communication to maintain a happy marriage certainly isn't a new discovery, but Samantha said it's often a lack of communication that

results in unhappy marriages.

No couple has perfect communication, of course, but Samantha says it absolutely needs to be a priority in marriage, especially when brought up in different backgrounds.

"I usually sit down and talk with [couples] about what they are looking for, what is their vision," she told the Chronicle. "I have married a lot of interfaith couples, mostly Christian-Catholic, some Christian-Muslim and some where one is religious and the other isn't."

Samantha helps her couples personalize their ceremony, bringing honor to both their backgrounds.

"One of the couples that I married was a military couple and she was Muslim he was Southern Baptist and I thought, 'Oh jeez, could you possibly be at more opposite ends of the spectrum there,' and then talking with them, I realized there were so many similarities between them," she said.

Samantha said it's easy to stay optimistic about the couples she marries and about marriage in general, having seen so many successful ones.

She herself is on her third marriage and remembers a time when she was adamantly opposed to being a bride ever again.

"I thought, 'I'm a two-time loser. You can forget this. I'm never doing this again,'" Samantha recalled.

Then she met her third. Having been with him for over two decades, Samantha remembers prioritizing communication with him from the start, making him and his family well aware of her prior marriages and her first priority, her daughter.


It is with decades of discernment and multitudes of marriages witnessed






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
