Lewisburg names finalists

The final candidates to become the next Lewisburg City Manager have a decidedly local flavor.

The Lewisburg City Council met in a special called meeting prior to last Tuesday's monthly session to select interview candidates from the 17

applicants for the position. Lewisburg Councilman Bam Haislip, County Commissioner Sheldon Davis, and Kevin Owens, currently employed by the city of Birmingham, Ala., received sufficient votes to move to the next

Haislip and Davis were the only candidates to be nominated by all four councilmen taking part, Haislip did not attend the meeting as he was under consideration.

The council plans to interview the three finalists on Thursday, November 18, beginning at 3:30 p.m.

Current City Manager Buck Beard is retiring in January, and the council hopes to have a replacement named in time to transition into the office with Beard's assistance.

The following council meeting dealt with a sizable but routine agenda.

Councilmen approved the annexation of an approximate nine acre parcel at 1207 Yell Road planned for development.

The council also voted to dissolve the current Parks and Recreation advisory board, while reserving the possibility of re-establishing the body in the future with clearer guidelines and by-laws.

The board in its current form has not managed the quorum necessary to conduct business in over

Lewisburg Fire Department Chief Larry Williams introduced the department's newly appointed assistant chief, Drew Hawkins, to the council.

Williams also informed the council that his department has been approved to hold a fire candidate course beginning in March.

A similar series of classes, at no cost to participants, held several years ago resulted in 14 of the 15 graduates of the class being offered paid on call positions with the city, increasing opportunities for full time employment as a career fire fighter.

Williams noted that as many as a third of his current roster would be eligible to retire within

Veterans Day Parade

Marshall County celebrated the nation's veterans on Thursday with a fine turnout for the county's first ever parade, despite dreary weather.

The Marshall County High School Marching Band and the Forrest School Marching Band book ended a procession of county vets from many different eras, welcomed by crowds along the route.

Rain, which had threatened all morning, held off until the parade finished its route at the square, although as a precaution, the traditional observance moved from the courthouse lawn into the Dixie Theatre.

The traditional ceremony, courtesy of the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars, featured retired Lieutenant General John Riggs as the keynote speaker.

Riggs spoke upon the service and sacrifices made by all 17 million living American veterans, with special mention to the four Marshall County World War II veterans in attendance.

"You have never failed America and you never will," said Riggs. "When you were needed you were there and when you were there you were needed."

The addition of a parade to the annual observance has been years in the making and represents a positive addition to a solemn day.

How will you mark the 400th anniversary of Thanksgiving?

Last year the media went into a frenzy over the 400th anniversary of the Mayflower's arrival in North America, but the festivities were just



beginning. This Thanksgiving marks four centuries since the 1621 harvest festival held by the half of the Plymouth Colony

that survived that cruel first ("Forget corn mazes and hayrides! I'm bobbing for an-

tibiotics!") What a milestone! Even though our gaiety may be muted by acknowledgment of the injustices done to indigenous peoples since that fateful shared meal, this still

calls for a large-scale com-





Rockets edge Panthers, move on to state quarterfinals

The Forrest Rockets hosted a familiar foe in Friday night's secondround Class 2A playoff game as the Lewis County Panthers travelled to the Murrey E. Holton Memorial Field in Chapel Hill.

The two squads were region foes for four years until the most recent realignment.

The Panthers had held a 3-1 advantage over that time span, including a 7-0 win last season that secured the region title for Lewis County in the final regular season game at Forrest.

It was the same margin of victory again, but this time it was the Rockets who prevailed 13-6 in an oldfashioned slugfest as the two teams combined for 78 rushing attempts in a contest that was affected more and more by the weather as the night moved on.

"It came down to the last play and our kids competed all night long," Forrest coach Eli Stephenson said. "The guys got after it in the first half putting up some points on offense and our defense played well all night long. When you give up just six points, that's a heck of a job and I'm just really proud of the guys."

The Rockets played shutdown defense, turnover-free football, and rushed for 249 yards in the game as Tayton Swift led the way with 74 yards on 13 carries.

Chris Davis rushed the ball 10 times for 65 vards, Brenton Burchell had nine carries for 41 yards, Hunter Bennett added 16 yards on seven runs, McCalister Wilson rushed the ball twice for six yards, and Carson Yates had one carry for

one yard. Inexplicably, none of Forrest's points came in the ground game as two huge Gavin Grissom field goals and a 27-yard touchdown pitch and catch from Hunter Bennett to Brenton Burchell accounted for all 13 points for the home team.

"We played our style of football," Stephenson said. "We preached all week that this was going to be a physical game for four quarters and our kids answered the call.'

"Our senior leadership up front does a heck of a job—Braden Bowyer, Layne Strasser, Brayden Jones, Colton Cashion—they get them going and it's fun to watch them play."

Grissom nailed a 45-yard field goal with nine minutes remaining in the first quarter and the Burchell-Bennett hookup came about six minutes later for an early 10-0 lead for For-

"When Grissom nailed that kick, I thought it was one of the turning points of the game," Ste-

phenson said. Meanwhile, the Forrest defense held the Panthers in check with a pair of three-and-outs in the first quarter and the first time Lewis

County had the ball in the second quarter, they fumbled it away and Bennett came up with the loose ball.

The senior quarterback proceeded to march the Rockets downfield, burning eight minutes off the clock on an 11-play drive that turned in to three more points on Grissom's second field goal of the game with 1:23 remain-

ing in the first half. Forrest took the 13-0 lead to the locker room and the Panthers took the second half kickoff and then disaster struck when they coughed up ball on first down and the Rockets recovered

the cold rock. The Rockets could not turn the miscue in to points as Grissom's third field goal try was no good with 7:38 remaining in the third quarter.

Lewis County got some offense going on its next series as they marched 78 yards to the Forrest 6-yard line where they were stopped on a fourth down play.

The sticks were brought in for a measurement and the Panthers came up inches short of the first down and the Rockets took over with 1:52 remaining in the third quarter.

The Rockets went three-and-out, punting on the first play of the fourth quarter.

The Panthers had to score to stay in the ballgame and they responded with a quick, nine-play drive that ended on a Dyer Barnes 15-yard TD catch from freshman quarterback Bryson McDonald.

The extra point try was no good and the Rockets led 13-6 with 8:11 remaining in the contest.

Forrest stayed with the ground game, running the ball nine straight times and burning four minutes and 37 seconds off the clock before a 51-yard Grissom field goal try fell short of the crossbar with 3:34 left in the game.

The cold rain was falling harder and the Panthers managed to get one first down before they went backward.

A few incompletions later, Forrest had the ball in victory formation and they had the

win to advance to the state quarterfinal round Friday night at Chapel

Hill. The Rockets (9-3) host Decatur County Riverside (11-1), who trounced Summertown 35-7 at Decaturville.

Forrest has never won a state quarterfinal game and the last time they played in one, it was Riverside that knocked out an unbeaten Rockets' squad in a 20-15 win at Chapel Hill in 2019.

The Forrest defense has been superb the entire season, giving up just 6.9 points per game in its nine wins and they will have to turn in their best effort of the season this week as the Panthers come in averaging 35.8 points per game through 12 games.

"We gotta work on ourselves," Stephenson said. "We have to be more worried about what we are doing other than what the other team is doing. So we are going to continue to follow that philosophy and we will be ready to play Friday night."

The two squads have also met three other times in the playoffs with the Panthers winning in 2011 and 2014 while the Rockets' lone win over Riverside came in a 23-20 first-round win at Chapel Hill in 2013.



Bulldogs held in check at McKenzie as season ends

McKenzie — All season long, Cornersville (9-3) has relied on a potent run offense that has allowed the Bulldogs to forge their way to a second-round Class 1A playoff berth.

Unfortunately for Cornersville, that offense was held in check against unbeaten McKenzie (12-0) and the Bulldogs saw their season come to a close following a 28-0 loss at McKenzie on Friday night.

In total, the Bulldogs were limited to just 34 yards of total offense, with just 18 coming on the ground.

McKenzie scored the game's first touchdown in the first quarter when quarterback Jackson Cassidy hit Marquez Taylor on a 15-yard touchdown pass.

The Bulldogs were forced to punt away the following drive, but a Rebel fumble set Cornersville up with prime field position on the Rebels' 28-yard line.

While able to press well inside the McKenzie red zone, Cornersville was held in check and unable to score.

The hosts added a second score just before the half when Taylor caught 13-yard touchdown pass from Cassidy to bump the McKenzie advantage to 14-0 at the break.

With both offenses unable to effectively sustain drives on each other in the third frame, it was an interception that facilitated the Rebels' third score of the night.

Cassidy intercepted a Cornersville pass and three plays later, Taylor found the end zone for his third score of the night to give the Rebels a 21-0 lead after the successful kick after.

McKenzie added one final score in the fourth quarter, this time coming on a 15-yard run by Taylor for the final margin of victory.

Caden White completed 2-of-3 passes for 16 yards for Cornersville,

with Wesley Pigg hauling in one pass for nine yards.

Cornersville's stellar run game was held in check to the tune of just 18 yards on 23 carries.

Mason Calahan was the top earner on the ground, carrying the ball five times for 16 yards, while Ben Franklin added 10 yards on eight touches.

Defensively, Rhett Woodard and Bradden Hickman led the Bulldogs with five tackles apiece.

McKenzie proved effective on the ground and through the air, totaling 306 total yards of offense, with 205 coming on the ground.

Cassidy was effective in the pass game for the Rebels, completing 7-of-8 attempts for 101 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

He, along with Taylor, were the top earners on the ground.

Cassidy totaled 97 yards on 14 touches and found the end zone once,

while Taylor added 97 yards and a score of his own.

The loss ends the season for Cornersville in what's been a stellar season for the Bulldogs.

Cornersville wraps up the season after finishing second in Region 5-A.

The Bulldogs' only two regular season losses came to Clay County, who finished the 2021 campaign with a 10-2 overall record, and defending Class A state champion Fayetteville, who will face McKenzie on Friday night in a battle of unbeatens in the state quarterfinals.

Packers up to No. 1, Titans climb to 2nd

NEW YORK — The Pack are back.

Aaron Rodgers' return helped lift the Green Bay Packers four places to the top spot of the

latest AP Pro32 poll.

Rodgers missed the Packers' Week 9 loss in Kansas City after testing positive for COVID-19. However, the reigning MVP returned for Sunday's 17-0 victory over the Seattle Seahawks.

The Packers received six of the 12 first-place votes for 378 points in balloting Tuesday by media members who regularly cover the NFL.

"Defense coming on and (running back) A.J. Dillon packs a power punch, won without Rodgers throwing a TD," Fox Sports' John Czarnecki said.

The surging Tennessee Titans, who have won six in a row, got the remaining six firstplace votes for 375 points to remain in sec-

Another first-place NFC team, the Dallas Cowboys, climbed four places all the way to No. 3 after a blowout win over the Atlanta Falcons. The Cowboys head to Kansas City to face Patrick Mahomes and the Chiefs on Sunday in one of the top matchups of Week 11. The Chiefs rocketed up five spots to round out the top 10 after routing the Las Vegas Raiders 41-14.

"The Packers, now that they have Rodgers back, are my pick this week," said Charean Williams of Pro Football Talk.

"The Titans, perhaps, have the most impressive resume thus far. The Cowboys were impressive Sunday, but it's hard to overlook last week's game against the Broncos. That was a rout against a team that was routed by the Eagles this week.

"It appears the Chiefs are back, but I need to see it again this week against the Cowboys to be sure."

The Arizona Cardinals, last week's top team, dropped three spots to No. 4 after a

34-10 loss to the Caro-

lina Panthers.

The Buffalo Bills rebounded after losing to the Jacksonville Jaguars by dominating the New York Jets 45-17 and gained two spots to No. 5.

The Tampa Bay Buccaneers slid three places to No. 6 after dropping their second consecutive game, this one to Washington. The Bucs will finish off Week 11 when they host the New York Giants on Monday night.

The Los Angeles Rams also dropped their second in row and fell three spots to No. 7 after losing to the San Francisco 49ers 31-10 on Monday night.

"Matthew Stafford threw a league-leading three interceptions for touchdowns last season when he quarterbacked the Detroit Lions," said Rick Gosselin of Talk of Fame Network.

"He now has thrown interceptions for touchdowns in back-to-back games this month for the Rams. Joe Burrow (Bengals), Derek Carr (Raiders), Mac Jones (Patriots) and Matt Ryan (Falcons) have also thrown two interceptions for scores this season."

Don't look now, but the New England Patriots are back in the top 10. The Patriots, who climbed four spots to No. 8, have won four in a row and trail the Bills by only half a game in the AFC East. The Patriots, coming off a 45-7 rout of Cleveland, will open Week 11 when they head to Atlanta to take on the Falcons on Thursday.

"The Patriots look like contenders once more, as rookie Mac Jones gets more comfortable each week and (coach) Bill Belichick gets his team playing the kind of intelligent football that helped create a dynasty," Newsday's Bob Glauber said.

"Jones is no Tom Brady, but he looks good enough to get this team back into the tournament.

And the Baltimore Ravens fell three places to No. 9 after last week's loss at Miami.

"Doctor Woman" became a legend on the Cumberland Plateau

Tennessee History for Kids

If people who lived in Tennessee 100 years ago could speak to us today, they'd tell us we are spoiled. We have stores where we can buy just about every type of food, medicine or clothing we need. We have electricity and access to a clean, safe water supply. We all have some degree of access to a doctor.

As recently as the 1920s, large numbers of Tennesseans had access to none of these things. They lived on small homestead farms and got by on what little they could produce. They had no electricity and depended on their fireplaces for heat, often insulating their walls with mud and newspapers. Their homes were located on horse trails. They did not have access to medical care.

A wonderful autobiography called Doctor Woman of the Cumberlands by May Wharton describes the living conditions in rural Cumberland County from about 1918 until World War II. Dr. Wharton had lived and practiced medicine in many sections of the northern U.S. prior to 1917, when her husband accepted the job of principal of Pleasant Hill Academy, an institution in Cumberland County.

When she came to Pleasant Hill, Wharton planned to teach science and math full-time and practice medicine parttime, but that's not the way things worked out. As soon as word spread in Pleasant Hill and the small communities near it, such as Browntown, De Rossett, Whittenburg, and Neverfail, people began turning up on Wharton's doorstep, asking the "Doctor Woman," to come to their homes.

When she first got to Pleasant Hill, Wharton had no other way to get to these remote cabins than to hike across high mountains and over ravines. Eventually she acquired a horse, but the going was still quite rough. Take, for instance, the time that she had to cross the flooded Caney Fork River at night to reach a woman in labor at the other side.

"There remained the swinging bridge, and if I was to be any use to the young girl who was waiting for me to deliver her first baby, I should have to cross it quickly. No doubt that long footbridge swinging lightly

over the gorge some seventy-five feet above the rushing torrent of the river was a picturesque sight. But I knew well how wind and weather had worn and loosened many of the boards on the walkway, and how the wire rope handrail, now much worn, offered treacherous sharp points to the grasping


"I grasped the handrail and staggered giddily along the seeming miles of the madly swaying thing."

Wharton sometimes arrived to find patients with advanced cases of influenza, pneumonia, cancer, tuberculosis, or in the middle of a difficult baby delivery. Using what instruments and medicines she could carry, she did her best.

In 1920, only two years after she came to Pleasant Hill, Wharton's husband died, and she made plans to leave Tennessee. The heads of 50 families –just about every household within several miles of Pleasant Hill – signed a letter asking her to stay. "Doctor Woman," the letter said, "we feel that we cannot do without you." Because of this appeal, Wharton remained on the mountain, continued her house calls, and started a hospital in a vacant commercial building. It proved to be too small, which is why she raised money to start a 30-bed hospital known as the Upper Cumberland Mountain Sanitarium. This remained the primary medical facility in the area until the Cumberland Medical Center opened in 1950.

To this day, Wharton's name is associated with several institutions in the area - including the Uplands Retirement Village and a group home for the elderly called Wharton Homes. I visited there not long ago and was happy to see that they are proud of their association with "Doctor Woman" of the Cumberlands.

Chinese Wild Ginger: Asarum splendens

UT Gardens' November 2021 Plant of the Month

Chinese wild ginger is a shining example of a tough and versatile ginger.

If you are tired of groundcovers so ordinary that you don't even see them anymore, then you will appreciate the exquisite glossy marbling on each leaf of Chinese ginger. Asarum splendens is a spreading evergreen member of the pipevine family, Aristolochiaceae, and develops into a groundcover that spreads swiftly enough to achieve satisfying coverage but not so fast as to be rampantly difficult to control. With a height of just 6-8 inches, Chinese ginger provides a low but richly textured flooring under azaleas, aucuba or bigleaf hydrangeas.

Its substantial cordate leaves offer bolder foliage than the typical evergreen groundcovers, well appreciated in the shade garden once the summer foliage of hostas have been erased by

Winter containers benefit from its mounding dark foliage to anchor sparkling golden or variegated sedges and saucy pansies. The deep green leaves are almost black yet offer shimmering glints of silver when struck by light. Don't worry about putting Chinese gin-

ger into all day sun during the cooler months. During summer, either move the container to a shady setting or add a tall plant to the combination that can offer shelter from the sun during the hottest parts of the day.

In the landscape, remember that its very dark foliage can make it almost disappear in deep shade, so bring it forward where it can enjoy a few hours of late or early sunlight, or use in bright shade – or at least provide some contrast with lighter foliaged plants for

This plant does well in dry shade as long as soils are not terribly droughty and is happy in the company of autumn fern, heuchera and hellebore. It is deer resistant, and durably perennial in Zones 5 to 9. In the very coldest Tennessee winters or regions, it may lose some foliage to a severe drop in temperatures but will rebound in spring.

Let's face it, most evergreen perennials generally fall into two categories - the overused and predictable groundcovers or the sadly underutilized – when there are many that can play a variety of roles for year-round interest.
