Cornersville talks events

The then-upcoming Main Street Christmas and the town events committee which organized the event was the focus of last Thursday's meeting of the Cornersville Mayor and Board of Aldermen.

"We're really excited about what's happening this weekend," said committee chair Trina Rios, of the event. "Cornersville can't do anything small."

Aldermen Doris Arthur and Sherry McClintock had some concerns about how the event had grown and the future direction of the town events committee.

Both asked questions about the events committee role and expressed concerns over inadequate information flow between the board and committee.

Both seemed surprised by the growth of the event since the board was last briefed and dissatisfied by a perceived lack of communication about the event with the board.

"It kind of leaves us hanging," said McClintock.

Also discussed was whether the committee wanted to remain as part of the town government or wished to spin off as a separate non-profit group.

Aldermen approved the job listing for a permanent town administrator presented by Chuck Downham from the Municipal Technical Advisory Service.

MTAS is assisting the town in the process of hiring a replacement for previous administrator Scotty Brock, who retired last month.

Downham said that they expected to begin reviewing applications on January 10.

"We appreciate you doing it for us," said Alderman Mary Johnson.

Aldermen also accepted a roughly \$3,000 check for reimbursement of the cost of repairs to Tarpley Avenue, which was damaged by a contractor installing fiber optic cable.

Copycat threats last week

The Marshall County Sheriff's Office and Chapel Hill Police Department responded last Tuesday, December 2, to two Chapel Hill schools following threats.

In two separate incidents, a student at both Delk Henson Intermediate School and Forrest School made threats on social media regarding a gun at school.

In both incidents, the students were quickly located and taken into custody, charged, and later released to their parents.

Searches did not produce any weapons and, in a release, the Sheriff's Office said that, after interviewing the two students, there was no reason to believe that either incident was more than a threat.

The threats are not surprising following the Tuesday incident, last week, in which a 15-yearold student in Oxford, Mich. killed four students and wounded several others before being taken into custody.

Hundreds of similar copycat threats were made, across the United States at the end of last week. as happens in the wake of school shooting incidents.

On Friday, concerns were raised about similar threats circulated on social media concerning "MCHS."

As a precaution, Marshall County High School held a fire drill to empty the building of students, before authorities determined that the social media threat concerned Macon County High School in Lafayette, Tenn., not Marshall County High School in Lewisburg.

Lewisburg sets end of year agenda

The Lewisburg City Council set their agenda for Tuesday's meeting and added several long-term items for further study at their work session on Tuesday evening.

A specialist from the office of the State Comptroller presented a draft proposal for the redistricting of the city's five council wards.

The adjustments are based on results from the 2020 Census which enumerated the city's population at 12,288 residents.

Guidelines require each ward to contain roughly equal numbers of residents. Both the 1st Ward and 5th Ward deviated from the averages, by 11% over and 10% under the targets, respectively.

The proposal moves census blocks along Nashville Highway from Ward 1 into Ward 3 and moves the area containing the Ridgetop Apartments from Ward 4 to Ward 5 to balance the ward populations.

The council will consider approving four grant applications for the Lewisburg Fire Department and one for the Parks and Recreation Department, none of which require city matching funds.

The council will also consider a resolution accepting grant funds allowing for the construction of a traffic light at West Ellington Bypass and Mooresville Highway.

A proposal for \$100 Christmas bonuses for full-time and permanent part-time city employees will also appear on the agenda.

The council discussed, but will not vote on next week, a proposal to add language allowing the collection of impact fees for new construction in the city to the city charter.

Similar to the county adequate facilities tax, the fees on new construction would be used to offset necessary infrastructure improvements for new development, keeping those costs from existing residents.

Amending the city charter would only make such fees possible, not actually put them in place.

The council will also wait to

"All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness" - 2 Timothv 3:16

Accuracy is very important in our lives. Accuracy regulates the context of our everyday life. Without accuracy we could not measure distance, weight, money, and time.

A new level of accuracy occurred in 1955 when Columbia University scientists developed an atomic clock accurate within one second for 300 years. That is astounding. However, more recently, the National Institute of Standards and Technology switched to an atomic clock based on the vibration of atoms. It will take 300,000 years for that clock to gain

or lose a single second. Scientists are now working on a more accurate model with a mercury ion, and it is estimated that it could take 10 billion years for it to gain or lose a second. Regardless of how accurate we can become with our clocks the facts are that they will never be precise forever. Accuracy refers to closeness of a measured value or a known standard. However, one can be accurate but not have precision. Precision has to do with being exact.

Precision is an excellent word to describe the original writings of the Bible, God's word. Precision clearly magnifies the original manuscripts of the Bible as being infallible and without error. The apostle Paul explains that all scripture is, "given by inspiration of God." That phrase in the **Precision!**

original language specifically means, "God breathed." Wow! Do we realize the strength of that statement? When we read the word of God, we are reading the very words out of the mouth of God, which came from the mind of God. How remarkable it is for God to reveal to His creatures a tiny part of His holy thoughts and desires.

The apostle Peter agrees with Paul when he wrote that this prophetic word given to us, "came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Spirit" (2 Peter 1:21). In other words, the Holy Spirit of God moved these holy men to write down the works and words of God. Peter makes it very clear that the scriptures is the prophetic message from God, and it is not a product of man's

will, it is not the writings of ancient wise men, it is not a collection of the "Best of Religion," and it is certainly not the product of human ingenuity. Obviously, the Holy Spirit of God authored the scriptures, and that the Holy Spirit used the agency of Godfearing men to write it down. Even though some of our modern Bible versions may have some questions about translation, the original manuscripts are more than accurate. God breathed upon these holy men the power of divine inspiration, and since God is perfect and precise in all that He does, that means that the Holy Scriptures are not just accurate, but the word of God has precision.





U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region 4 Announces the Sixth Five-Year Review for the Lewisburg Dump Superfund Site, Lewisburg, Marshall County, Tennessee

Purpose/Objective: The EPA is conducting a Five-Year Review of the remedy for the Lewisburg Dump Superfund site (the Site) in Lewisburg, Tennessee. The purpose of the Five-Year Review is to make sure the selected cleanup actions effectively protect human health and the environment.

Site Background: The 20-acre area is located on a tract of farmland a half-mile north of Lewisburg and 40 miles southeast of Nashville. The city of Lewisburg owned and operated the dump, using 4 acres in the western portion of the quarry as a landfill, from the late 1950s to 1979. The city allowed surrounding communities to use the landfill for residential and industrial waste dumping. Industrial wastes reportedly placed in the dump included paint, paint strippers and solvents, industrial plastic waste, spent pickle liquor with residual metals, empty containers of adhesives, cements, lacquers and paints. Disposal operations contaminated groundwater and soil. After the site inspection and evaluating conditions at the landfill, the EPA added the Site to the Superfund program's National Priorities List (NPL) in 1983. An investigation by the Site's potentially responsible parties (PRPs) in 1990 found organic and inorganic compounds in the landfill soil, shallow aquifers beneath the Site, and an abandoned quarry pond. Studies raised concerns about the potential for exposure of contaminants, unrestricted access to the Site, disturbance of waste and more groundwater contamination.

Cleanup Actions: The EPA selected the Site's long-term cleanup plan in the Site's 1990 Record of Decision. The Site's lead PRP began site cleanup activities in 1992 and completed them in September 1993. Cleanup included removal and off-site disposal of exposed debris, reconstruction of the existing landfill cover, and long-term monitoring. The PRP removed over 382 cubic yards of debris and soil, 172 tires, 50 empty drums, and two drums of lead paint and sludge from the Site. The PRP disposed of the material at approved facilities. The EPA took the Site off the NPL in 1996. In 2013, the city of Lewisburg implemented a restrictive covenant that limits groundwater use and future land use and prohibits disturbance of the landfill cover system. Monitoring of the landfill cap and groundwater is ongoing.

Five-Year Review Schedule: The National Contingency Plan requires review of remedial actions that result in any hazardous substances, pollutants or contaminants remaining at the Site above levels that allow for unlimited use and unrestricted exposure every five years to ensure the protection of human health and the environment. The sixth of the Five-Year Reviews for the Site will be completed by September 2022. When the Five-Year Review is completed, it will be available online at www.epa.gov/superfund/search-superfund-five-year-reviews.

The EPA Invites Community Participation in the Five-Year Review Process: The EPA is conducting this Five-Year Review to evaluate the effectiveness of the Site's remedy and to ensure that the remedy remains protective of human health and the environment. Playing college baseball has always been a dream for Marshall County senior Bryson Hammons.

That dream became a reality last week as he signed his letter of intent to continue his baseball career after high school at Motlow Community College.

"It's always been my life-long dream. I've played my whole life. It's been my main goal to get there," Hammons said.

Hammons has hung his hat on being the main backstop for the Tigers through three years, but also swings a good bat and has been a valuable arm in the Marshall County rotation.

Coach Mike "Monk" Reese couldn't be more complimentary of Hammons' efforts and has high hopes for the future of his career.

"Bryson has been a three-year starting catcher for us and basically worked into the starting position before the season was up and he's been my catcher ever since. He's done an outstanding job for us as the catcher. He's also a pretty tremendous pitcher. He has good velocity and a good breaking ball. He has that mentality to be a pitcher, probably because he's been a catcher—and being a quarterback in football. It kind of all ties in together,"Reese said.

Hammons suffered a setback this fall during

football with a knee injury, but all signs indicate he's on track for a full recovery and ready to make the most of his senior season with the Tigers.

"Right now, the doctors are saying he's right on task. We open up in February, in terms of practice. Our first ball game is in March and the district tournament is in May," Reese said.

"In the short term, I'm hoping he can get ready as soon as he can, as long as he's 100 percent. When the doctor releases him and he goes through workouts and I see he was that guy before the injury."

When it came to deciding on a school, Hammons said the ability to play at the next level, coupled with the campus being close to home made it an easy decision.

"I had a very good idea that Motlow was where I wanted to go. When they offered me, I went and took a visit. I liked everything about it. It's close enough to home, too," he said.

Hammons figures to be an early impact for the Bucks, whether it's behind the plate or finding a spot among the pitching staff—and Reese says Hammons can deliver at the next level of competition.

"Competition wise, he has the velocity. If they choose to use him as a pitcher only. In college, you've got to pitch 1-9. You have to work every hitter. That's something he'll have to experience in the fall with his coaching staff. But they may look at him and think, he's a good athlete. He swings a good bat and is a great catcher. I think that will be something they'll look at in the fall to see what he's able to do for them," Reese said.

"They told me they

could see me getting some early innings pitching," Hammons said.

While he's been part of lots of big moments while playing for the Tigers, Hammons says the bonds and friendships he's built while playing baseball have been among his favorite memories as an athlete.

"Pretty much all my best friends are on the baseball team. I've played with them and I've made the tightest bonds with them," he said.

While he still has a senior season to participate in, Reese says Hammons has been invaluable to the program, both from a player perspective and a leadership perspective.

"In terms of the mental part of it, he's done an outstanding job for us. Athletically, he's one of the best athletes in the school, and one of the best athletes on the team. He swings a good bat for us and has a lot of athletic skills. He understands the game. It's been a pleasure to coach him. He's an outstanding young man," Reese said.

Hammons plans to pursue a business degree.

"This will be a real challenge for us in every way, shape and form," Alabama coach Nick Saban said.

Alabama has won six national titles under Saban, three of those coming in the short CFP era. This is the fifth time the Crimson Tide is the No. 1 seed, and are the first No. 1 team in the Cotton Bowl since Texas in 1978.

The Tide won the SEC championship game 41-24 over previously unbeaten Georgia, which is the No. 3 seed and will play Big Ten champion Michigan in the Orange Bowl, the semifinal to be played after the Cotton Bowl on Dec. 31. The championship game is Jan. 10 in Indianapolis.

This will be Alabama's third CFP semifinal game at AT&T Stadium, the home of the NFL's Dallas Cowboys. The Tide won the first two during national championship seasons. They beat Michigan State 38-0 in the Cotton Bowl six years ago, and last Jan. 1 beat Notre Dame 31-14 in a Rose Bowl game that was relocated from California because of the pandemic.

It is Alabama's ninth Cotton Bowl overall.

Cincinnati is in its first Cotton Bowl, and second New Year's Six game in 2021. The Bearcats lost

> Hutchinson would be the first defensive player to win the Heisman since Michigan's Charles Woodson in 1997. Woodson was also Michigan's last Heisman winner. The last Michigan player to be a Heisman finalists also played defense, though not exclusively. Defensive back Jabrill Peppers played some offense and returned kicks when he finished fifth in the voting in 2016. Hutchinson is one of the nation's best pass rushers with 14 sacks. The senior led No. 2 Michigan to its first playoff appearance as Big Ten champions and helped end an eightgame losing streak to rival Ohio State. Pickett returned to Pitt for a fifth season in 2021, taking advantage of the NCAA's eligibility give-back for playing through the pandemic in 2020, and had a recordbreaking year. Pickett passed for 4,319 yards with 42 touchdowns to eclipse school marks and led the 13th-ranked Panthers to their first Atlantic Coast Conference title.

defensive end Aidan Hutchinson, Pittsburgh quarterback Kenny Pickett and Ohio State quarterback C.J. Stroud were announced Monday as finalists for the Heisman Trophy.

The Heisman will be presented Saturday in New York, returning to its usual routine and date — second Saturday in December — after it was forced to delay and go virtual last year due to the pandemic.

There are some changes this year. The site of the presentation is moving from a theater in Midtown Manhattan, near Times Square, to a smaller venue on the West Side near Lincoln Center.

The process by which Heisman finalists are determined has also been modified. The Heisman Trust announced that starting with this season, there will be four finalists no more, no fewer — invited to the award presentation ceremony.

In the past the Heisman has invited at least three and as many as six players to the presentation. The number was determined by distribution of vote, with the cut-off decided by the gap between votegetters.

After a 2021 season in which a Heisman frontrunner took a while to emerge and the race seemed wide-open into November, Young closed strong to become the favorite.

The sophomore led a 97-yard, game-tying touchdown drive against rival Auburn two weeks ago, helping the Crimson Tide rally

The last Pitt player to be a Heisman finalist was receiver Larry Fitzgerald in 2003.

Stroud completed 71% of his passes for 3,862 yards, 38 touchdowns and five interceptions as the seventh-ranked Buckeyes finished 10-2 in his first season as a starter.

He is the third straight Ohio State starting quarterback to be a Heisman finalist, joining Justin Fields (2019) and Dwayne Haskins (2018).

In short supply

This year's free agent class was headlined by a star quintet of shortstops, but three of them signed big-money deals last week — Seager, Marcus Semien (Rangers) and Javier Báez (Tigers).

Carlos Correa and Trevor Story remain, with Andrelton Simmons also available for suitors who might miss out.

Correa, the 2015 AL

Simmons won the last of his four Gold Gloves in 2018 and batted just .223 with three homers for Minnesota last year.

Universal demand?

It's expected — but not certain — that the National League will adopt the designated hitter as part of the new collective bargaining agreement. Several players stand to benefit by waiting to sign until that change is official.

Castellanos Nick should get the biggest payday of the group. The 29-year-old hit .309 with 34 homers and 100 RBIs for Cincinnati in 2021, but his outfield defense is just OK. Kyle Schwarber, who hit 32 homers for Washington and Boston last year, has a similar profile.

Nelson Cruz struggled after a midseason trade to Tampa Bay last year, but the 41-yearold still hit 32 homers and should get an everyday job. World Series MVP Jorge Soler also remains available.

Patriots throw fewest passes in a game since 1974

Mac Jones and the New England Patriots played a style of game more reminiscent of a triple-option service academy than the modern NFL.

Jones threw just three passes on a windy Monday night in Buffalo for the fewest pass attempts in an NFL game in nearly a half-century as the Patriots beat the Bills 14-10.

With 40 mph wind gusts placing an emphasis on running the ball, the Patriots relied on the ground game with 46 runs compared to just the three passes. The last time a team threw that little in a game came Sept. 29, 1974, on another windy day in Buffalo.

Joe Ferguson threw only two passes — both incomplete — that day for the Bills in a 16-12 win over the New York Jets. O.J. Simpson ran the ball 31 times for 117 yards and Joe Namath went 2 for 18 with three interceptions for the Jets.

There was only one other

game in the last 70 years when a team threw three or fewer passes, with Kansas City having three in a 24-10 win over the Oakland Raiders in 1968.

This was the eighth time in the Super Bowl era that a team threw five or fewer passes in a game, according to Sportradar, with those teams going 7-0-1. The last team to do it was also the Patriots, in the infamous 3-0 Snowplow Game win over Miami in 1982.

Top of the mountain

If the season ended now, the top seeds for the playoffs would be Arizona (10-2) in the NFC and New England (9-4) in the AFC.

Both the Cardinals and Patriots missed the playoffs last season, with Arizona finishing 8-8 and New England at 7-9. The last time both top seeds were coming off nonplayoff seasons was in 1992. when San Francisco (14-2) took the spot in the NFC and Pittsburgh (11-5) in the AFC. Neither the 49ers nor Steel-

ers made the Super Bowl that season with San Francisco losing to Dallas in the NFC title game and Pittsburgh to Buffalo in the divisional round.

Road warriors

The Cardinals have gotten into this position by being the NFL's best road team.

Arizona's 33-22 win at Chicago last week improved the Cardinals to 7-0 on the road with all the victories coming by at least 10 points. The last team to win its first seven road games by double digits was the 1968 Cowboys, who went 7-0 on the road that season. The road success ended in the playoffs when Dallas lost its first game 31-20 at Cleveland when the sites were predetermined by division.

The only other team to win seven straight road games by double digits in the same season was the 1984 Super Bowl champion 49ers, who went undefeated on the road but won the opener at Detroit by just three points.

Turnaround team

The Miami Dolphins have

been on a quite a roller coaster this season.

After winning the season opener at New England, the Dolphins lost their next seven games. Since then, Miami is 5-0 to become the third team in NFL history to have a five-game winning streak and seven-game losing streak in the same season, according to Sportradar.

The others are the 2017 49ers, who lost their first nine games and won their final five, and the 1994 Giants, who started 3-0, lost seven straight and then won six in a row.

With a win next week against the Jets following a bye, the Dolphins will join the 1974 Jets as the only teams to go from 1-7 to 7-7 in a season.

Tom terrific

Tom Brady is doing things at age 44 that he has never done before.

Brady had his sixth game this season with at least four TD passes, surpassing the five he had in 2007 for the most in a season in his career.

This is the sixth time in

NFL history a QB has thrown for at least four TD passes six times in a season with the other five all winning the MVP: Aaron Rodgers (seven in 2020), Patrick Mahomes (seven in 2018), Peyton Manning (nine in 2013), Manning (six in 2004) and Dan Marino (six in 1984).

Two of Brady's TDs last week went to Rob Gronkowski, giving the pair 90 in the regular season in their careers. That surpassed Philip Rivers and Antonio Gates (89 TDs) for second-most in NFL history. Only Manning and Marvin Harrison (112) have more.

Touchdown Taylor

Indianapolis' Jonathan Taylor scored on a TD run for the 10th straight game last week against Houston.

Taylor is the fifth player ever to run for a TD in 10 straight games in the season and the first to do it since LaDainian Tomlinson did it in 12 straight games in 2004. The others are Priest Holmes (11 games in 2002), Emmitt Smith (11 in 1995) and John Riggins (12 in 1983).

Napier plans to hire 'unprecedented' staff at Florida

GAINESVILLE, Fla. ---New Florida coach Billy Napier plans to hire an "unprecedented" support

Napier had close to 40 analysts at Louisiana-Lafayette and could end up with even more in Gainesville. In addition to a \$7.5 million annual budget for 10 assistants, Napier got a \$5 million pool to build a support staff that includes analysts.

His vision for Florida and athletic director Scott Stricklin's willingness to make it a reality — stood out during Napier's formal introduction Sunday.

Napier and his family arrived to a sea of orangeand-blue clad fans at the airport, and more waited for him to step out of a 42-year-old coach, who has

been one of college football's rising stars in recent years.

"I'm drinking water through a firehose right now," Napier said.

"These jobs will chew you up and spit you out if you let them, right?" he added later. "I think we've got to keep perspective. We got to have balance. That's one of the reasons that I believe in the infrastructure that we're going to create. ... It'll be the most difficult early, but once we get this machine up and running, I think we'll be able to have some pace to life where we can enjoy."

Napier took the job without having toured Florida's campus, its football facilities or the Swamp. His last trip to Gainesville came in 2011 as an analyst at Alabama, which rolled the Gators 38-10. Napier

his coaching career.

"In that one year, I think I learned more than I learned in the previous 10," he said.

Napier got an up-close look at how legendary coach Nick Saban built and ran Alabama's program, and he plans to model much of Florida's ways after the Alabama powerhouse.

"We're going to hire an army of people here," he said. "We're going to create an infrastructure not only in the personnel department but also from an on-campus recruiting, creative media, name, image and likeness. We've got a great vision for the organization that we're going to create here."

Napier's scheme might have a few wrinkles.

"Well, we're going to try to be different," he said. "We're going to try to put our personality, our spin van outside Florida Field. It remembers it well because on it, our brand in recruitwas all a bit surreal for the it was part of one of the ing. We're the University most influential seasons of of Florida. ... It's going to

Stricklin made it clear he's open to the changes that are coming, no matter the cost.

"He gives such a compelling reason to why these things are going to help make the Gators better," Stricklin said. "It's not just, 'Hey, we need this because.' It was, 'We need this because' and then he goes through a detailed plan of what the pieces are, how they fit together and why that's going to matter.

"When someone can explain why they need resources, it makes it really easy to want to invest in that."

Napier signed a term sheet Sunday that outlines key points in his seven-year, \$51.8 million contract. He will make \$7.1 million in his first season and get a \$100,000 raise annually before each of the remaining six years. His deal also includes

annual performance bonuses that could total up to \$1.5 million more. Napier gets a \$100,000 signing bonus to help with moving expenses, two luxury cars, 16 tickets to every home and away game, 18 seats in a suite for home games and use of the University Athletic Association aircraft for personal use that's valued up to \$70,000 a year.

The Gators will pay Napier's \$3 million buyout to Louisiana-Lafayette. His contract is 85% guaranteed, meaning he would get that percentage of what remains if Florida fires him without cause. Napier, meanwhile, has a sliding buyout to leave Florida — the figure starts at \$7 million before Dec. 31, 2022 and drops each thereafter.

"The market is what the market is, unfortunately," Stricklin said. "If Billy's as successful as I think he's going to be, we're never very thoughtful. He knows going to have to have a what's he doing there."

NCAA revises new constitution

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) – The NCAA released revisions Tuesday to its proposed pared-down constitution, including some clarifications about the role of the Board of Governors.

Passing a revised constitution at the NCAA convention in January is the first step in a two-phase process that will allow each division of the association to govern itself. The broader goal is to shift power away from the NCAA to conferences and schools.

The revised constitution was released a month ago and a special constitutional convention was held a week later as part of the pro $cess \ of \ getting \ feedback$ from members.

Among the revisions made in the 18 1/2-page draft was a clarification to note the Board of

Governors, comprised mostly of university presidents, will approve contracts regarding media rights and revenue-producing agreements in consultation" with governing bodies for each division.

Also, the proposed constitution will explicitly state the board will consult with divisional governing bodies when evaluating the NCAA president's performance. The board's consultation with divisional bodies is to promote transparency.

Earlier this year, the board extended the contract of NCAA President Mark Emmert in a move that caught much of the membership off guard because the board is not required to notify membership of its actions.

Common Fig: Ficus carica

UT Gardens' December 2021 Plant of the Month

Tennessee gardeners often consider the common fig, Ficus carica, as not well suited to the majority of the state's growing conditions. While many common figs are indeed best grown in Zones 8 to 10, several cultivars now possess cold hardiness and can be successfully grown in Zones 7, 6 and even 5 when properly sited and managed. The term 'hardy' refers not only to the limbs' increased ability to sustain winter conditions, but more importantly to the roots' ability to survive cold temperatures.

Ficus carica cultivars 'Brown Turkey,' 'Improved Celeste,' and 'Hardy Chicago' are all touted for improved cold tolerance. In growing seasons following mild winters many cultivars, including those listed here, have the ability to produce two crops. The first crop, grown on previous year's wood, is referred to as the breba. This crop is usually smaller and less flavorful than the main crop, which matures later in the summer on current year's growth. In some cases, the breba may be the only crop that has adequate time to develop. In colder zones and exposed sites, it is common for the above ground plant parts to be injured and even killed to the ground by harsh winters, but two qualities in particular give these cold hardy cultivars a leg up. The cold hardiness of the roots ensures that the plant will survive, and their classification as a shortseason producer (90 to 100 days to maturation) means that a crop can be produced on new wood the following season. These qualities provide an obvious advantage in colder climates with shorter growing seasons.


While proper cultivar selection is non-negotiable, proper siting also plays an important role. Placement near a south or southwest facing wall or structure can provide protection from harsh winter wind, give access to high light, and even provide radiant heat. These conditions come together to create an ideal micro-climate. Obviously, while not everyone will have this 'ideal fig paradise' in his or her landscape, we can still make figs work for you! If no structural protection is feasible, young plants can be caged and surrounded with straw, hav or leaves for added protection from fluctuating cold temperatures. A final option is to grow fig plants in very large containers and move the plants to a more protected area, like a garage, during the winter months. 'Brown Turkey' is one of the most common cultivars on the market and it's reliable. 'Improved Celeste' is from the breeding program at Louisiana State University and is often referred to as Sugar Fig because of its sweet flavor. It also has been noted for

heat tolerance. 'Hardy Chicago' is likely the most cold tolerant with above-ground portions hardy down to 10 F and roots to 20 degrees below zero.

Contrary to popular belief, the fruits of common fig do not require internal pollination by a specialized wasp. The fruits of Ficus carica are parthenocarpic (fruit develops without fertilization) and therefore do not require multiple cultivars to set fruit. As fruits mature, look for three signs of ripeness: color change from green to brown or purple, softened fruit and hanging fruit. Figs are used in a variety of dishes, from sweet desserts to savory meat and cheese combos. For the staff of the UT Gardens, Jackson, a favorite pairing is fresh fig with goat or cream cheese on crackers or toast and drizzled with honey!

Ficus carica collections at UT Gardens, Jackson, include 'Giant Green Italian,' 'Pete's Honey,' 'LSU Purple,' 'Violet de Bordeaux,' 'Hardy Chicago,' and 'Celeste.' At the UT Gardens, Knoxville, you can see 'Brown Turkey,' 'Celeste,' 'Panache,' and an unnamed heirloom from George Washington's father-in-law's plantation in Virginia. I hope that this brief plant profile provides enlightenment some and inspires you to try Ficus carica in your own landscape!
