er's daughter Eponine, played by Sunni Thomas, find themselves both loving the idealistic young revolutionary Marius, played by Al Dunaway.

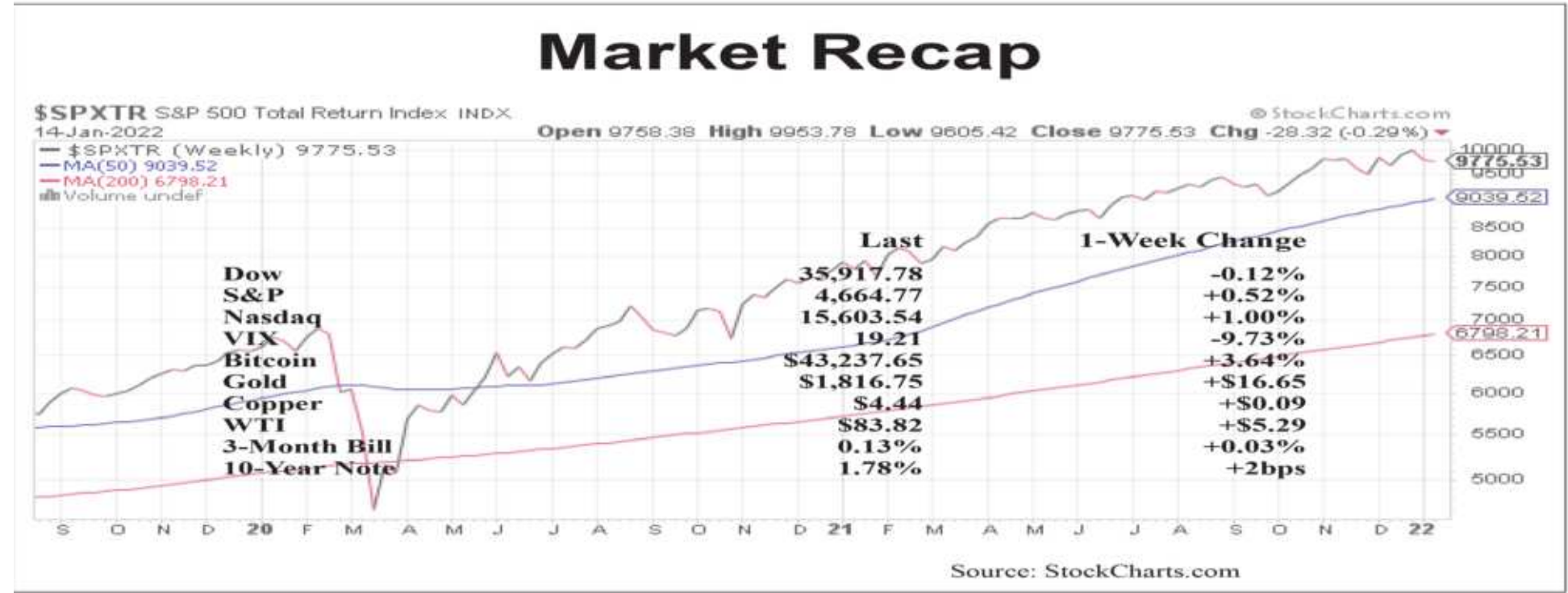

Are you putting off your annual physical exam?

I'm not seeking sympathy, but I'm writing this on the eve of my annual physical exam.

Don't infer that I'm bragging about a commendable lifelong habit. By "annual," I mean "I've (almost) done it two years in a row." And by "physical," I mean, if I had my druthers, I'd suggest, "Hey, doc, when I turn my head and cough, how about standing over there in the corner and reading my aura?"

Before my renewed dedication in the last couple of years, I could always make an excuse for kicking the can down the road. Until one day my neuroskeletal system gently implored me, "Stop kicking that %\$#@ can!! It hurts, bro!"

I came by my erstwhile procrastination honestly. Several generations of my family have showcased individuals leery of routine medical care. This foot-dragging stretches at least as far back as the days when a thespian-turned-pitchman might intone, "I'm not a doctor, but I play one on the telegraph."

My mother delights in preemptively telling nurses that she suffers from the dreaded "white coat syndrome" – a phenomenon in which normally stable blood pressure or some other vital statistic spikes solely because the patient is nervous about being in the examination room.

I experience a touch of this myself from time to time. And by "a touch," I mean, the sight of cotton balls and tongue depressors has been known to make me start developing a conjoined twin.

Self-image is another issue. Most Americans could stay on a bucking bronco longer than they can stand to linger on that judgmental doctor's office scale. Sadistic nurses don't help,

when they estimate the weight of your clothing as no more than Tinker Bell would wear in a burlesque show.

Devotional Page

“Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil. Cling to what is good. Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another;” – Romans 12:9,10

There is no typo in our title. The question is not “Who do you love?” but rather, “How do you love?” The way in which we love speaks volumes as to who we are and how we live life. One can look up the definition of love and find love described in many ways. Love as a deep affection. Love as an emotion. Love as a passionate desire. However, no matter how you define love, any love that comes from a selfish heart with self-seeking motives is not love. You

see when we show another person deep affection and passion in a way for the purpose of fulfilling our own needs, then love is not in the picture. The hard thing is that we can demonstrate what passes for love and yet the whole time we don’t know that we are actually investing our emotions in another for the purpose of getting back. Many times there is a hidden motive for the affections we show and we are not aware of if because “self” blinds us. If you think this is outside the realm of reality, then let’s ask this question, “Can I give my affections to someone without getting anything in return or being acknowledge in some way?” Psychologist would think this to be unrealistic. However, the second part

of the equation that is missing, in the definition of love, is, “Love is a deep affection of one’s emotions toward another – not because of need, but because of want.” You do understand that I just described the love of God towards His people. God loves us not because He needs us but because He wanted us. That is unfathomable! Just think of it? God is love (1 John 4:8), and for one to show true love (self-less affection), one must know God’s love.

Lastly, love is demonstrated by what one does and not so much as what one says. How weary it becomes for someone to tell you over and over that they love you, but do everything opposite of love. Love is demonstrated by what we do. Once

again God is our example. Love was demonstrated on the cross when God gave His only begotten Son to pay for our sins. “But God commendeth His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us” (Romans 5:8). You do understand that while Jesus Christ hung on the cross that it was not the nails that held Him up but it was God’s love? The cross demonstrates the definition of selfless love – Not that God needed us but that God wanted us.

So how do you love? Our opening scripture encourages us to love as God loves. So join me in prayer that God will help us to show a sacrificial love to others.

Millennial Money: Now is the time to build your credit

Sooner than you may realize, your credit score will start to matter.

A solid credit score can be the difference between qualifying for an apartment or a low-interest car loan or missing out. So to have credit ready when you need it, the time to start building a good and lengthy credit history is now.

There’s more than one way to build credit, and it could be as simple as reporting your ongoing bill payments to the major credit bureaus. But keep in mind: Building credit takes diligence, particularly since missing payments can hurt your score for years to come.

WHAT IS CREDIT AND WHY DOES IT MATTER?

Your credit score is a number that typically ranges between 300 and 850 and is calculated based on how reliably you’ve paid past debts, such as credit card bills. Lenders use your credit score to predict how likely you will repay debt.

Your credit score helps determine the loans you can receive, the interest you’ll be charged, the credit cards you can qualify for and the properties you can rent. An employer can even check your credit history. Having a good credit score can save you money later on, mainly through lower interest rates when you secure a loan.

If you’re starting with no credit history, you aren’t alone. In the U.S., nearly 40% of people between the ages of 20 and 24 have little to no credit history to generate a score, according to the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau. Unfortunately, the same is true for roughly 20% of the population.

Building your credit might seem overwhelming if you haven’t thought about it before, but there are many strategies to employ, even if you’re just beginning. Start by establishing good habits with managing debt, such as not taking on more debt than you can afford, says Brittany Mollica, a certified financial planner

based in Chapel Hill, North Carolina. Missing payments will damage your score and can become a burden when you need to borrow money in the future.

“Getting in good habits of always paying your bills is really important,” Mollica says. “You don’t want to have to be climbing out of a hole of all sorts of credit card debt that you’ve piled up, especially starting out early on.”

CREDIT CARDS — AND ALTERNATIVE CARDS

Credit cards can be a great tool to establish credit, but they can also damage your score if you take on more debt than you can handle.

If a parent or another trusted person in your life has a high credit limit and a long history of making timely payments, you could become an authorized user on their account and benefit from their good credit. This is one of the easiest ways to lengthen your credit history, says Blaine Thiederman, a certified financial

planner in Arvada, Colorado.

Becoming an authorized user will also impact your credit utilization rate, or the amount of money you owe to lenders divided by the total credit available to you, which can help your credit score.

If you have your own income, you can apply for a credit card when you’re 18 years old; otherwise, you have to wait until you are 21. A secured credit card is typically the best credit card to start with. A cash deposit backs these cards, and since the credit card company can take that deposit if you miss payments, people with short or poor credit histories can qualify.

The deposit you have to make for a secured credit card could be a burden, and if that’s the case, an alternative card might be better for you. These

cards use income and bank account information to determine your creditworthiness rather than your credit score.

MONTHLY BILLS

If you live independently, payments for rent, utilities and phone bills can all be reported to credit bureaus. So paying those bills can build your credit if they’re on time and you have them reported.

Unlike credit card payments, these payments aren’t reported automatically and can require a third-party service, such as Experian Boost or UltraFICO, to make the credit bureaus aware of your payments.

Remember, these services sometimes require a fee and reporting your bill payments may not always impact your credit score; instead, they may just appear on your credit report.

LOANS

Making regular payments on loans can also help you build your credit. And even if you don’t have any credit history, some loans are available.

Credit-builder loans rely on income rather than credit for approval. If you’re approved, the loan sits in a bank account and becomes available once you pay it off. Your monthly payments are reported to the major credit bureaus.

Student loans are another loan you can use to build your credit when you’re just starting. Federal student loans don’t require credit to qualify, while most private student loans do. Paying off your loans will help you grow your credit history, and you can get started while you’re still in school by making interest-only payments.

Ralph Emery, famed country music broadcaster, dies at 88

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Ralph Emery, who became known as the dean of country music broadcasters over more than a half-century in both radio and television, died Saturday, his family said. He was 88.

Emery passed away peacefully of natural causes, surrounded by family, at Tristar Centennial Medical Center in Nashville, his son, Michael, told The Associated Press. He had been hospitalized for a week.

Beginning his career at small radio stations and then moving into television as well, Emery was probably best known for his work on the Nashville Network cable channel. From 1983 to 1993, he was host of the channel’s live talk-variety show “Nashville Now,” earning the title “the Johnny Carson of cable television” for his interviewing style. From 2007 to 2015, Emery hosted a weekly program on RFD-TV, a satellite and cable TV channel.

He was inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame in 2007.

“Ralph Emery’s impact in expanding country music’s audience is incalculable,” said Kyle Young, CEO of the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum, in a statement Saturday. “On radio and on television, he allowed fans to get to know the people behind the songs. Ralph was more a grand conversationalist than a calculated interviewer, and it was his conversations that revealed the humor and humanity of Tom T. Hall, Barbara Mandrell, Tex Ritter, Marty Robbins and many more. Above all, he believed in music and in the people who make it.”

Born on March 10, 1933 in McEwen, Tennessee, Emery attended broadcasting school in Nashville and got his first radio job at WT-PR in Paris, Tennessee. He later worked at radio stations in Louisiana and the Nashville area before signing on in 1957 at Nashville’s WSM, the station that carries the Grand Ole Opry, until 1972.

His autobiography, “Memories,” came out in 1991, followed by “More Memories” in 1993 and

“The View From Nashville: On the Record with Country Music’s Greatest Stars” in 1998.

Emery hosted “Pop Goes the Country,” a syndicated TV show, from 1974 through 1980. From 1981 to 1983, he was host of “Nashville Alive,” on cable station WTBS.

On the talk-variety show “Nashville Now,” Emery sat at a desk, interviewing country music stars and others, much like Carson chatted with celebrities on NBC’s “Tonight” show.

Emery also briefly had his own recording career in the early 1960s. “I’m not a singer and that was one of the major problems,” he confessed in a 1990 interview.

“Ralph had a deep love for his family, his friends and his fans,” a family statement said, adding that Emery leaves behind his wife, Joy Emery, three sons, five grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren. Funeral arrangements were pending.

Emery’s death was first reported by The Tennessean.

"I'm excited and nervous. I'm excited because I worked my way up. I used to run at 30 minutes and now I'm graduating at 22 minutes in three miles and

I got a scholarship," she said.

Joining Molina at UT-Southern will be fellow Marshall County senior Krew Capps, who also signed his letter of intent to make it official.

Firehawk head coach Justin Watson joined Molina at her signing and expressed his excitement for her to get to campus later this fall and officially join the roster.

"Krew and Lydia are both excellent signees for our team and newcomers for our team. I fully expect both of them to be integral parts of our success," he said.

Molina got her start running in middle school on a whim and knew she found her niche once settling into the Tigerette program.

"I've been running for four years. In middle school, I just had this feeling when they held

tryouts. I just wanted to go and try it," she said.

From her earliest days in middle school to finishing her high school career in the state meet, she's been the consistent leader of the Tigerette program, both on the course and in the halls as well.

"They meant a lot. Both of them were our No. 1 runner. They're a great loss for our team, but I know our underclassmen are ready to step up and fill their shoes. They're great leaders. They were always at practice and always did everything they were supposed to do. They went above and beyond outside of practice and were just role models for our kids within our building, too," Marshall County coach Heather Denton said.

While Molina finished her season with a 23:00

final time at a difficult and technical course at Sanders Ferry Park, her best memory came when she hit her time goal of 22 minutes.

"In the Best of Marshall Meet this year, my goal was 22 minutes and I got it that day," she said.

While there were other schools in the mix when it came time to select a college, in the end it was the campus of UT-Southern that she fell in love with, as well as being close to home.

"I had a school that was interested me in Alabama, but when I walked onto the campus (at UT-Southern) there was something about it that just drew me in and I was like, I've got to go here," she said.

With running being a goal-driven sport, Molina's focus now shifts to fitting into the college roster and setting

her sights higher on the next time goal.

"I just have to keep working. My goal was 22 minutes and I got that. My next goal is 21 and hopefully close to 19 by the end of college," she said.

"It builds up the program and gives us some momentum within our school to hopefully help us recruit the halls.

That's our goal for next year is to get some more kids involved in our program," Denton said.

For now, Molina plans to keep running and prepare for her upcoming freshman season.

While she's still months away from officially starting her freshman season, she has a career path picked out and plans on becoming a nurse.

UT-Southern competes in the NAIA and is a member of the Mid-South Conference.

After a solid 5-2 start to the season, the Forrest Rockets have lost six out of their last eight games, including a 56-44 loss to Community in the District 7-AA opener Friday night at Chapel Hill.

The Cornersville Bulldogs hosted their first wrestling match in over 40 years Tuesday night, welcoming intra-county rivals Forrest and Marshall County High School to Frog Bottom.

It was a big reunion for Cornersville assistant coach Jeff Gross, who was a three-time state champion wrestler at Forrest.

"This feels good, we have been travelling to all away matches so far this season," Gross said. "We are looking to get mats for our school and get the momentum and intensity here to make a culture of wrestling and become a better team."

Gross, along with head coach Sam Hubbell only had four healthy wrestlers for the duals due to some out with either injury or sickness.

"We have a couple guys out sick, but the guys that are here are committed and ready to go to work," Gross said. "We had a lot of guys come out, but it was a little tough on them, so we have a good start to the program. I don't care how many guys I have, whoever we have, we will work hard and get better."

The Rockets beat the Bulldogs 48-6 in the first match of the night with Cornersville's only win coming by Joshua Bennett via a forfeit in the 106-pound weight class.

Forrest's Braiden Vanderploeg picked up six points for the Rockets on a first period pin over Caden Bush in the 138-pound weight class before Seth McCoy added six more points with a forfeit at 145.

Asa Nance followed

with a pin over Cornersville's Jonathon Zuniga at 152 and Forrest Ozburn was awarded a forfeit in the 160-pound weight class.

Rocket 170-pounder Chris Davis pinned Xavier Viazcan and Alex Harvey (182), Peter Wilson (195), and Nathan Hall (285) also picked up forfeit wins for Forrest.

There were double forfeits at 113, 120, 132, and 220 pounds which resulted in zero points for either team.

The Rockets followed with a 54-18 win over Marshall County with Braiden Vanderploeg pinning Ryan Bentley (138), Ozburn pinned Aaron Powell (160), Harvey won by fall over Brock Anderson (182), Wilson pinned Levi Franks (195), and Nathan Hall pinned Eli Alexander (285).

McCoy, Nance, Davis, and Tegan Vanderploeg won by forfeit for the Rockets, while Charles Hargrove (220), Julius Foster (106), and Marc Burns (120) all picked up forfeit wins for the Tigers.

In the final match of the night, the Bulldogs took on the Tigers and in the only two weight classes that were wrestled, Cornersville came out on top.

In the 106-pound weight class, Bennett outdueled Julius Foster for a second round pin and Caden Bush pinned Marshall County's Ryan Bentley in the first round.

The Tigers won the match 36-24 with forfeits in 120, 160, 182, 195, 220, and 285 weight classes while Bulldogs got forfeit wins at 152 and 170.

The match is the only home event for the Bull-

dogs this season as they prepare for the future which is in good hands with Gross, who intends to pass as much of his knowledge and experience as he can to the young wrestlers in Cornersville.

"The community has been awesome. A lot of people came out of nowhere and just helped us out and got things done. Even tonight this match would not be possible without getting these mats from MCHS," Gross said. "We will continue to come to work every day and be 110 percent committed and be all aboard."

"It's not just a sport. It teaches you a lot of life lessons. It teaches you to be tough and all around I think it is the greatest sport in the world, so we will continue to work, get better, have fun, and just let it fly."

Gross won his first state title in 2017 in the 113 pound weight class, 2018 at 126, and 2019 in the 138-pound weight class for the Rockets.

In his four years at Chapel Hill, Gross had an unbelievable 135-7 record with an undefeated season in 2018 (26-0) and one loss seasons in 2019 (39-1) and 2017 (31-1).

Gross finished in fourth place at the state tournament as a freshman (39-5) in the 106-pound weight class.

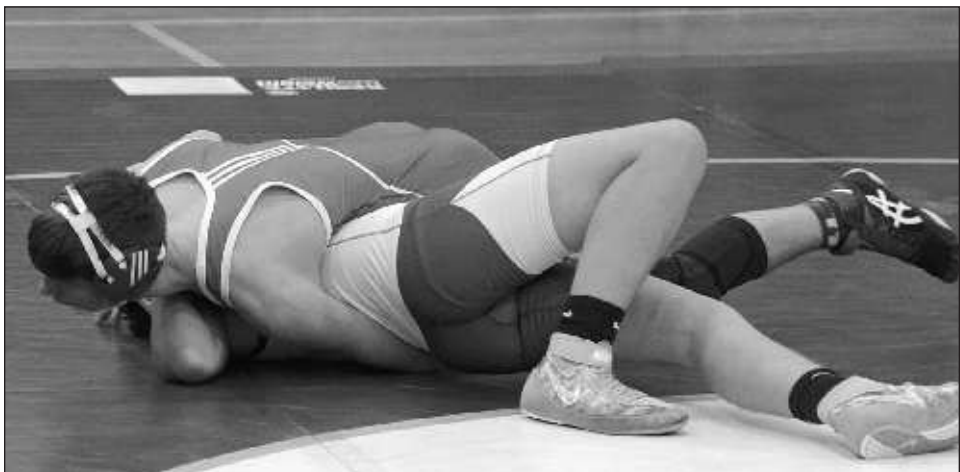
