
# Columbia State to host youth robotics camp at Lewisburg campus

Columbia State Community College will host a youth robotics camp for rising 6th – 8th grade students at the Lewisburg Campus.

The primary goal of the camp is to promote excitement for science, technology, engineering and math. Students will learn concepts of programming, engineering practices, and teamwork. LEGO Mindstorms EV3 Education Kits and program development environment will be used for hands-on building and programming activities.

Participants will build several robots during the camp, modifying and programming one for a BattleBot competition. The first four days will be allocated to learning basic LEGO robot build techniques and programming commands for movement, turning, sensing, decision-making along with combining the commands into sequences for solving problems. For the fifth day, participants will run a robot of their own design and build in the competition. Parents are encouraged to attend the competition on the final day.

The cost to attend is \$150. The camp will take place at 980 Ellington Parkway in Lewisburg. The schedule is Monday

## Marshall County Board of Public Utilities Water Quality Report 2021

### Is my drinking water safe?

Yes, our water meets all of EPA's health standards. We have conducted numerous tests for over 80 contaminants that may be in drinking water. As you'll see in the chart on the back, we only detected 9 of these contaminants. We found all of these contaminants at safe levels.

### What is the source of my water?

Your water, which is surface water, comes from Duck River, 9 miles North of Lewisburg. Our goal is to protect our water from contaminants and we are working with the State to determine the vulnerability of our water supply to contamination. The Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) has prepared a Source Water Assessment Program (SWAP) Report for the water supply serving this water system. The SWAP Report assesses the susceptibility of public water supplies to potential contamination. Water sources have been rated as reasonably susceptible (high), moderately susceptible (moderate) or slightly susceptible (low) based on geologic factors and human activities in the vicinity of the water source. The Lewisburg Water System sources rated as moderately susceptible to potential contamination. An explanation of Tennessee's Source Water Assessment Program, the Source Water Assessment summaries, susceptibility scorings and the overall TDEC report to EPA can be viewed online at <https://www.tn.gov/environment/program-areas/wr-water-resources/water-quality/source-water-assessment.html> or you may contact the Water System or TDEC at 1-888-891-TDEC to obtain copies of specific assessments.

### Why are there contaminants in my water?

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. Community water systems are required to disclose the detection of contaminants; however, bottled water companies are not required to comply with this regulation. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.

Contaminants that may be present in source water:

- Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife.
- Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally occurring or result from urban stormwater runoff, industrial, or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming.
- Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban stormwater runoff, and residential uses.
- Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban stormwater runoff, and septic systems.
- Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally-occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA and the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation prescribe regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. FDA regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which must provide the same protection for public health.

### How can I get involved?

Our Water Board meets on the third Tuesday of each month, at 9:00 a.m. 624 West Commerce St. Lewisburg. Please feel free to participate in these meetings.

### Cross Connection

Be aware and never connect your safe drinking water with a source that could be contaminated. This includes wells that have not been tested and garden hoses hooked to lawn chemicals. A back-siphonage of water or a faulty valve could allow dangerous chemicals to enter your safe drinking water supply. If you have a well or use chemicals that come in contact with the public's safe drinking water, you must install a backflow prevention device and have it tested annually to insure that it is in proper working condition. A backflow prevention device will separate and not allow your safe drinking water to come into contact with anything unsafe.

### Other Information

Due to all water containing dissolved contaminants, occasionally your water may exhibit slight discoloration. We strive to maintain the standards to prevent this. We at Lewisburg Water and Wastewater work around the clock to provide top quality water to every tap. We ask that all our customers help us protect our water sources, which are the heart of our community, our way of life and our children's future.

### Is our water system meeting other rules that govern our operations?

The State and EPA require us to test and report on our water on a regular basis to ensure its safety. We have met all of these requirements. We want you to know that we pay attention to all the rules.

### DO I NEED TO TAKE SPECIAL PRECAUTIONS?

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about not only their drinking water, but food preparation, personal hygiene, and precautions in handling infants and pets from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by *Cryptosporidium* and other microbiological contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. Lewisburg Water and Wastewater is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Information on lead in drinking water, testing methods, and steps you can take to minimize exposure is available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline or at <http://epa.gov/safewater/lead>

## Water Quality Data

### What does this chart mean?

**MCLG:** Maximum Contaminant Level Goal, or the level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

**MCL:** Maximum Contaminant Levels are set at very stringent levels. To understand the possible health effects described for many regulated constituents, a person would have to drink 2 liters of water every day at the MCL level for a lifetime to have a one-in-a-million chance of having the described health effect.

**MRDL:** Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level or MRDL: The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of disinfectant is necessary for the control of microbial contaminants

**MRDLG:** Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal. The level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.

Discretionary language regarding the use of averages to report levels of some contaminants.

AL - Action Level, or the concentration of a contaminant which, when exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

Parts per million (ppm) or milligrams per liter (mg/l) - explained as a relation to time and money as one part per million corresponds to one minute in two years or a single penny in \$10,000.

Parts per billion (ppb) or Micrograms per liter - explained as a relation to time and money as one part per billion corresponds to one minute in 2,000 years, or a single penny in \$10,000,000.

Nephelometric Turbidity Unit (NTU) - nephelometric turbidity unit is a measure of the clarity of water. Turbidity in excess of 5 NTU is just noticeable to the average person.

RTCR - Revised Total Coliform Rule. This rule went into effect on April 1, 2016 and replaces the MCL for total coliform with a Treatment Technique Trigger for a system assessment.

"Ella has done an excellent job closing for us all year," Lightfoot said. "She has been hungry for it, she has asked for the ball a few times and she came through.

"I had a runner on and I was fixin to hit it, she pitched it right inside and then whatever, there it was. It was a motivator, after that we knew we were back in this and all we had to do is score one or two more."

Chilton held the Lady Tigers in check and in the bottom of the fifth inning, Briley Burnham lined a leadoff single.

After a pop-up out, Maggie Daugherty came

up and slashed a rope in to the left field corner and Burnham scored all the way from first base to put the Lady Rockets in front to stay.

Forrest added a pair of big insurance runs in the bottom of the sixth inning on an error and an RBI single by Burnham.

Chilton took the three-run lead to the top of the seventh inning and the freshman closed the game out quickly on a strikeout, a groundout back to the circle, and the game-ending fly out to Daugherty in right field.

"Props to her (Chilton), she came in there with a gun show and shut them down," Warner said. "Our defense was really good tonight too, we turned two double plays for her and I think it was just an

all-around really great game."

Forrest (27-10) takes on Adamsville (22-13) in a winner's bracket game today at 11:30 a.m. while Meigs County (23-6) falls to the loser's bracket and will face Loretto (16-16). Adamsville beat Loretto 9-8.

"We knew coming in to this we were young and had to lay it all on the line," Warner said. "Coming off a win we are already in a great mood, so if we made it this far then why not go all the way."

Community (25-11) picked its first-ever state tournament win in a 2-0 victory over Summertown (36-10) and Alcoa (26-12) beat Decatur County-Riverside (25-13) 4-3.

"We will just do our best to stay relaxed and keep to our game plan," Lightfoot said. "At this point you just have to come and play ball and hope a few things go your way."

Durbin went 5 1/3 innings and gave up one hit, one walk and one hit batter.

Aside from that, the Panthers had no answer for the hard-throwing righty.

Durbin also got a solid effort behind him with several big plays made in the infield and a couple of diving plays made in the outfield.

"We had a fantastic game plan going in. We knew how we were going to play the outfield for the most part and our infield

guys stepped up huge and did exactly what they needed to do," Burkett said.

"I am very, very proud of our guys' efforts tonight. We battled through some adversity and managed to get things in a situation where we were able to win the ballgame," Burkett said.

Kain Moses worked the final 2/3 innings pitched and although Riverside drew a one out walk and doubled to center to put two runners in scoring position, the senior reliever punched out the final two batters of the inning to end the scoring threat.

strike out to give us an opportunity to be able to hit in the bottom of sixth. You want to put your guys in the best opportunity to win the ball game and they did just that," Burkett said.

At this stage of the game, pitching management is paramount for any coach and as evidenced by the previous game that saw Pigeon Forge defeat White House Heritage, can pay dividends with allowing pitchers enough rest to be available later in the tournament.

"It's brutal. I think this is what truly separates good teams from great teams. You saw it in the previous game with Pigeon Forge. They basically staffed the entire game and had certain guys on this rest and certain guys on that rest. You're really rolling the dice when you do something like that. We did something a little bit dif-

ferent rolling Durbin for 70 pitches and then Kain for 15. It's interesting to see how coaches play different ways. We're lucky and fortunate to have been here before and kind of know what our game plan was going in," Burkett said.

Forrest collected six hits off Riverside starter Jake Swindle.

In the bottom of the third, Andrew Timmons ground into a fielder's choice and then scored from second when Durbin helped his own cause on a single to center field.

That lone run proved to be the difference in Tuesday night's tournament opener.

In the bottom of the sixth, senior catcher Camden Vaughn doubled off Swindle to lead off the inning before the game was put on hold.

# Rockets cap incredible rally in sectional

CHAPEL HILL — It's the stuff kids live for — back against the wall, win or go home, deliver the big hit or see the season end.

Most kids dream of it. Preston Gentry and the Forrest Rockets got to live it.

In the most improbable of rallies, Forrest erased a 9-1 deficit in the bottom of the seventh inning against York Institute in the Class 2A state sectional on Friday afternoon, forced extra innings, and then punched their ticket to the upcoming Class 2A state tournament with a walk-off RBI single by Gentry in the bottom of the eighth.

Gentry's hit finished the Rockets' 10-9 win over the Dragons.

"I just told them that there are good teams in this world. There are great teams in this world. There are tough teams in this world. There are gritty teams in this world. And then there's the 2022 Forrest Rockets. They are never out of any ballgame, whatever," Rocket coach Andy Burkett said.

Friday's sectional was a rollercoaster of emotions for both teams, to say the least.

York took an early lead off a solo homer that appeared to be a routine fly ball to left, but was carried over the fence during the gusty first inning.

The solo homer by Missouri commit Nicolas Smith off Forrest starter Riley Durbin was just one of three base runners the Dragons managed in the first five innings.

York put another runner on base on a Rocket error in the infield and a second that came on another Forrest error on a fly ball to left that got caught in the wind.

Aside from that, Durbin was dialed in and the Dragons were simply unable to figure out a way to put runners on base.

Durbin sat down eight in a row at one point and struck out the side twice, allowing Forrest to stay well-within striking distance.

After three innings, York opted to go to the bullpen, despite Smith's effectiveness on the mound.

Smith pitched the first three innings for the Dragons and didn't give up a hit.

The only Rocket base runners that were able to reach came via Dragon error.

Still, Forrest continued to press the offen-

sive mindset and try to create opportunities on the base paths.

That aggressive mentality finally paid dividends in the bottom of the fifth.

After Andrew Timmons was hit by a pitch with one out, and a pair of back-to-back walks by York relief pitcher Caden Stover, the Rockets saw the bases loaded with just one out.

Kason Fuller laid down a perfect bunt, allowing the Rockets to score the tying run, with just one out.

But after the Rockets drove home the tying run in the bottom of the fifth, the Dragons went on to take a three-run lead after back-to-back two-RBI base hits by Blaine York and Seth Helbig.

Things continued to spiral in the Dragons' favor with a huge seventh inning.

After reliever Ashton Grubbs struck out the first batter of the inning, York answered with three-straight hits to load the bases.

It wasn't until Tanner Talellent drove home two on a RBI single to right and Blaine York laced a two RBI double to right that the game appeared to teeter out of hand.

The Dragons tacked on one more run in the five-run seventh on a RBI single by Helbig.

By the end of the inning, York Institute had built a 9-1 lead, all but clinching a trip to the state tournament.

But as this season has proven, Forrest can't be counted out of any game.

Senior catcher Cam Vaughn led off what may be the biggest seventh-inning in school history with a double to center.

Two batters later, Ka-

son Fuller ignited the biggest inning of the season for the Rockets with a RBI single to right.

Brennan Mealer followed up and drove home two more on a double to right, cutting the Dragons' lead to 9-3.

Still, Forrest had no outs and Braden Bowyer stepped to the plate and launched a two-run shot to dead-center, making it a 9-5 score.

Forrest continued to wreak havoc on the Dragon bullpen when the Rockets got two more RBI singles in the inning off the bats of Vaughn and Durbin, but it was a score by Vaughn on a York error that knotted the game at nine apiece and completed the rally.

"We were trying to steal, we were trying to drag bunt. We were trying to make something happen. We had a couple of unfortunate plays where we had some bunts go right back to the pitcher. That kind of put us behind the eight-ball. Once we were able to grind it out enough and get an opportunity to pass the bat to the next guy—can't say enough about their effort out there," Burkett said.

After Vaughn let out an emphatic yell after scoring the tying run in the bottom of the seventh, the momentum completely shifted in the Rockets' favor and Moses, who took over on the mound in the top of the seventh, recorded a perfect, 1-2-3 eighth inning.

Brennan Mealer then stepped to the plate and appeared to have hit a walk-off home run, but it was ruled a ground rule double.

York went on to load the bases, bringing Gen-

try to the plate, with just one out.

It was his one-hopper that found the outfield, allowing pinch runner Levi Van Patten to score from third and punch the Rockets' ticket to the Class 2A state tournament next week in Murfreesboro.

Despite elite-level pitching from both rosters, both teams connected on 10 hits.

"We knew their top two guys were good. They're mid to high 80s pitchers. They kept us off balance. We knew if we could get to their bullpen, we could have a chance to swing the bat," Burkett said.

Fuller, Mealer and Bowyer all drove home a pair of runs, while Vaughn went 2-for-4 with a double.

Mealer also had a solid afternoon at the

plate, going 2-for-5 with two doubles.

As impressive as the Rockets were against the Dragons' pitching staff late in the game, it was Durbin's efforts that kept them alive for the majority of the game.

He went six innings of stellar baseball on the mound for the Rockets, allowing four runs on five hits, while striking out eight.

"He (Durbin) absolutely grinded it out. He was pitching so well. We had a great game plan for those guys at the plate. We wanted to stay away from Smith. He's a dangerous player. He's a Missouri commit for a reason and you saw that in the first inning when he got the home run. We were able to settle in and figure out how to pick this lineup apart

here and there. He gave us every opportunity to win the ballgame today," Burkett said.

Moses took the win, pitching 1 1/3 innings in relief.

Having completed one of the greatest come-from-behind victories in the mid-state, Burkett couldn't hide a smile while celebrating with his team after Friday's win.

"I'm so happy. I'm so incredibly happy. Short of the day I got married and short of the birth of my two kids, this is probably one of the greatest feelings I've ever had," he said.

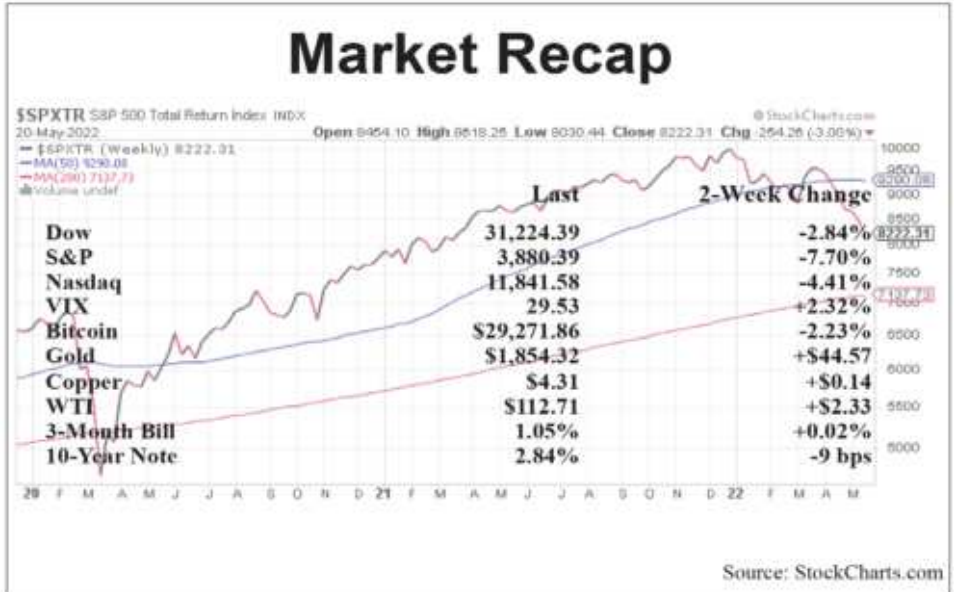



# Lady Rockets edge Westmoreland in sectional

Sometimes you need some luck to go along with an outstanding effort and the Forrest Lady Rockets had both and much more Friday night at the Field of Dreams in Chapel Hill as they came away with a close 5-2 win over Westmoreland in the Class 2A sectional round.

It was a remarkable 14th win in a row in the pressure packed state sectional elimination round as Forrest heads to its 19th state tournament appearance and the four-time state champions will be going for the state title three-peat.

“It feels great with this team,” Forrest coach Shelby Lightfoot said. “We are taking it one game at a time, yes we always have that big picture goal, but we are looking for that first game and take it and go from there. These girls have a little bit of grit and they are going to get everything they worked for.”

Sophomore Leslie Bartoli’s seventh inning go ahead single paved the way for a big three-run rally that gave Forrest junior Julie Williams some much-needed breathing room as the junior finished off a gutsy complete game win in the circle.

Williams gave up two runs on six hits while striking out two and walking three Westmoreland batters.

“Julie was nervous as a cat in the first inning,” Forrest coach Shelby Lightfoot said. “Once she settled in, she did a great job and gave us time for our bats to come alive.”

The red-hot Bartoli went a perfect 3-for-3 at the plate for the Lady Rockets, who had eight hits in the contest.

Maggie Daughrity went 2-for-3 and once again turned in a momentum changing play when she led off the bottom of the third inning with Forrest trailing 2-1.

Daughrity scorched a line drive in to the left field corner and circled the bases for her second inside the park homerun of the postseason.

Christa Warren, Abby Ferguson, and Carli Warner all had one hit apiece with Warner driving home a run in the seventh inning.

Briley Burnham also knocked in a run on a fielder’s choice RBI that made it a 5-2 contest.

Forrest escaped a massive amount of trouble in a wild top of the first inning as the Lady Eagles loaded the bases with no outs and only came away with one run as three Westmoreland baserunners were thrown out at the plate.

A fielder’s choice on a throw from Warner at first base to catcher Parker Wales accounted for the first out.

An ensuing wild pitch sent the first Westmoreland runner safe to the plate for a 1-0 lead and on the same play a second runner tried to score and was nailed at home as Wales scrambled for a loose ball and threw to Williams covering the plate for the second out.

Inexplicably, moments later the Westmoreland runner on third base tried to steal home and was easily nailed on a throw from Warren at third to Wales at the plate.

Forrest tied the game in the home half of the first inning as Warren belted a one-out out single, went to second on a passed ball before scoring on a throwing error.

Williams escaped a two-on, no-out jam in the top of the second in-

ning on a pair of infield popups and an inning ending strikeout.

The Lady Rockets went down in order in the bottom of the inning before Westmoreland took the lead again in the top of the third inning on a fielder’s choice RBI by Mallory Cassetty.

Daughrity’s inside the park homerun tied the game at 2-2 in the home half of the frame as both pitchers settled in for two innings of scoreless ball.

Williams seemed to get stronger as the game went on and had little trouble retiring the Lady Eagles in the top of the sixth inning.

Ferguson came up with a big one-out single in the bottom of the sixth inning and stole second base.

Bartoli stepped in and thought she had struck out, headed towards the Forrest bench, but it was only strike two and when she stepped back in the batter’s box, she delivered the go-ahead base hit to left field, making it 3-2.

“Bartoli has been hot right now, that was a big hit, she has her con-

fidence and when she comes up she swings it well,” Lightfoot said. “And then feeding in to that momentum, Carli had all the confidence too and had that girl’s number.”

Williams came back

to the circle for the seventh inning and after a pair of pop-up outs, Kyla Urell singled to keep the game alive for Westmoreland.

Williams reached for some reserve gas and got the game ending out on a pop-up to Burnham at second base.
