Cannon spoke on the importance of the flag to him personally as a veteran and the vital support and assistance provided to county veterans by his office.

## Chapel Hill secures long-term water deal

Chapel Hill took an important step toward improving future water supply at the Board of Mayor and Aldermen meeting on Monday.

The town officially entered into an agreement with the county water utility to partner on sections of expanded supply lines to the town.

Director of the Marshall County Board of Public Utilities Tommy Whaley and board attorney Cecilia Spivy attended the meeting to finalize details of the agreement between BPU and the town regarding cost sharing on parts of the project to expand water lines along Highway 31A.

BPU will cover 100% of the first part of the plan, approaching the Duck River. Chapel Hill will join in with 40% of the second part of the extension, as the size of the pipes and resulting excavating increases costs beyond BPU's own service needs. The town and BPU will split the cost of boring under the river in order to lay pipe.

Chapel Hill will cov-

er 100% of the cost of the third phase which connects the line from the county master meter north of the river to the town's system.

Aldermen had previously voted to authorized up to \$1.8 million for the project. The board wanted clarity in the agreement that their cost would be capped at that amount unless the board approved additional funds.

Despite the conclusion of the agreement, completion of the project is still relatively far in the future.

Whaley said the contractor estimated a year before they would be able to get the pipe for the project and then a further 18 months of construction.

"I think this is a blessing for this town," said Alderman Jonathan Gilbert. An alternative source, if available, would cost the town much more to complete without a partner.

Mayor Mike Faulkenberry introduced new Town Recorder Phillip Dye, who recently filled the position which has been vacant for

**Be safe during extreme heat:**

- Wear loose, lightweight, light-colored clothing.

- Drink plenty of fluids to stay hydrated.

- Avoid high-energy activities outdoors during midday heat.

- Check on family members, seniors, and neighbors.

Never leave people or pets in a closed car on a warm day.

Know the signs of heat-related illnesses and ways to respond. If you are sick and need medical attention, contact your healthcare provider for advice and shelter in place if you can. If you are experiencing a medical emergency call 9-1-1.

### Heat Stroke

- Extremely high body temperature.
- Red, hot and dry

skin with no sweat.

- Rapid, strong pulse
- Dizziness, confusion or unconsciousness

If you suspect heat stroke, call 9-1-1 or get the person to a hospital immediately. Cool down with whatever methods are available until medical help arrives. Do not give the person anything to drink.

### Heat Cramps

- Muscle pains of spasms in the stomach, arms, or legs.

### Heat Exhaustion

- Heavy sweating, paleness, muscle cramps, tiredness,

weakness, fast or weak pulse, dizziness, headache, fainting, nausea, vomiting.

If you have signs of heat cramps or heat exhaustion, go to a cooler location and cool down by removing excess clothing and taking sips of sports drinks or water. Call your healthcare provider if symptoms get worse or last more than an hour.

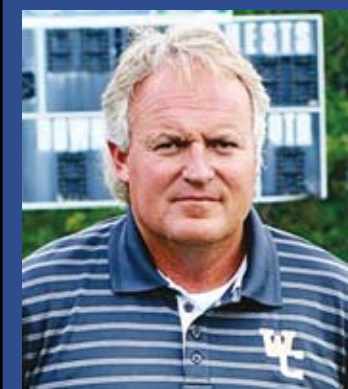

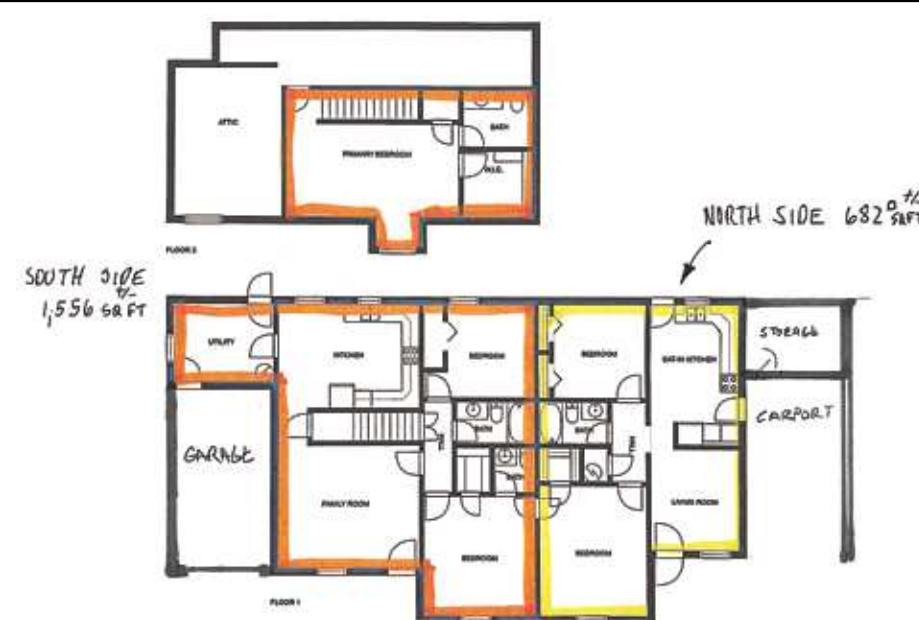

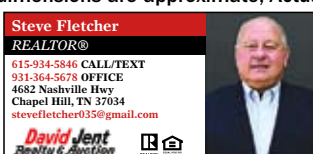

## Dedication ceremony for state historical marker at Jones School

The members of the Altruist Club of Lewisburg and Marshall County and the Jones High School Graduation Class of 1967, the last graduation class of Jones High, will host the unveiling and dedication of the Tennessee State Historical Marker at Jones School. The celebration will be Friday, June 17, 700 Jones Circle (current location of the Marshall County Board of Education), Lewisburg, at noon. The

public is invited to attend.

In September 1949, the Marshall County Board of Education approved the purchase of three tracts of land for the construction of a new school for African-American students. The land, consisting of twelve to thirteen acres, was located in North Lewisburg. After its completion Jones Training School, 700 Jones Circle, was dedicated in October 1951. The school name was changed to Jones High School in 1962. The school was named for Professor Ja-

cob “Jake” Jones, a long-time educator in Marshall County. Prior to settling in Lewisburg, Professor Jones taught in many of the schools for African-American students which existed in several small communities around Marshall County. In the early 1900’s, all of the schools for African-American students provided only an elementary education.

Professor Jones taught in the Lewisburg Elementary Rosenwald School. He is credited with establishing a high school in his home af-

ter several parents requested a high school education be provided for their children. With materials provided by the county, the parents volunteered to build a school on the site. The Lewisburg Elementary and Lewisburg High School was a brick building located where the current Citizens Bank and Savings (CB & S) sits.

Professor Jacob Jones spent his life dedicated to the education of African-American students in the Marshall County community. He died January 6, 1942 in the Lewisburg School building, prior to the construction of Jones Training School. His monument reads, “His Deeds Yet Live.” Therefore, it was fitting that his name was placed on the building that would continue his legacy. For seventeen years Jones Training and High School educated African-American students during the era of segregation. Additionally, it is not only fitting, but extremely important that we continue to recognize Professor Jones for his important contribution and legacy by placing a permanent State Marker on the site of the building that once reflected his name.

*“The LORD is high above all nations, and His glory above the heavens. Who is like unto the LORD our God, who dwells on high, Who humbles Himself to behold the things that are in heaven, and in the earth!” - Psalm 113:4-6*

Words come short of trying to describe the greatness of God. For example, our limited language actually reduces God to be in a place that is called heaven. We have the mind-set that heaven is so big that God dwells in heaven. Actually, the opposite is true. That is what the psalmist was expressing in our opening verses. The LORD God is above the heavens and humbles Himself to behold the things that are in heaven. What that is ex-

pressing is that God does not dwell in heaven, but heaven dwells in God. God is so incomparably BIG that all the heavens, and even the eternal abode of heaven itself - dwells in God! When we read the scriptures, we see that God Almighty is the all-powerful Creator and the everywhere present God (Revelation 4:8,11), which means that if there were not a God, there would be no heaven. # Henry insists foot is healthy

NASHVILLE — Tennessee running back Derrick Henry has let his hair down this offseason, prompting lots of questions about the new ‘do.

Not nearly as many as the current state of his right foot.

“The foot is good,” Henry said Tuesday.

A broken right foot cost Henry nine games last season. He returned for the Titans’ playoff loss to Cincinnati and ran 20 times for 62 yards and one touchdown. The man who ran for 2,027 yards in 2020 and was leading the NFL in rushing when he broke a bone in his right foot last October patiently tried his best to make clear that’s not an issue.

“Yeah, I feel good,” Henry said. “For real.”

Henry hadn’t talked to reporters since the divisional loss in January. He was among several veterans at the Titans’ mandatory minicamp Tuesday. Outside linebackers Harold Landry and Bud Dupree, right guard Nate Davis, inside linebacker Zach Cunningham all were on the field.

Defensive lineman Jeffery Simmons, who recently took part in Von Miller’s pass rushing camp, and rookie wide receiver Treyton Burks were “unavailable” Tuesday, according to coach Mike Vrabel.

Tennessee finished with the AFC’s No. 1 seed and was fifth in the NFL, averaging 141.4 yards rushing without Henry for half the season.

The 6-foot-3, 247-pound Henry is the man who makes Tennessee’s offense work at its best. With Henry sidelined, the Titans finished 15th in the NFL, averaging 24.6 points a game — a big drop from 2020

when they ranked fourth with 30.7 points a game.

This was the third straight year that Henry spent the voluntary portion of the NFL’s offseason program working out on his own after enjoying his approach in 2020 during the pandemic. He works out two or three times a day, taking off some Sundays to take his daughter out or when traveling.

“I just felt like if it ain’t broke, don’t fix it,” Henry said. “And I’ll continue to do those things. I’ll communicate with the coaches and they knew what was going on and I talk to them every now and then, so that was good.”

Henry said he has been working with a physical therapist on a lot of footwork, making sure he finds his toes and balances on his foot. He’s been running hills, which has been documented with videos on social media, and doing all the things to make sure he’s ready when the Titans report for training camp July 26.

Missing nine weeks with the first real injury of his football career made Henry appreciate the game even more along with missing being around his teammates.

“With a bone, you have to let it heal on its own,” Henry said. “It takes time and things like that. You just want to make sure you’re taking care of your body, doing everything possible so that when the time comes again, you’re prepared and ready.”

He’s also eager to prove anyone doubting he can play at his usual level wrong.

“The doubters, whatever they want to be, I’m definitely motivated,” Henry said. “I’m ready to go. So we’re going to see.”

## Watson again denies misconduct claims

BEREA, Ohio — The new lawsuits — and potential for more — against Deshaun Watson may have further damaged his image and swayed opinion about him.

However, they’ve only deepened his resolve.

The Cleveland Browns quarterback reiterated Tuesday that he never committed sexual misconduct alleged by two dozen women in Texas, adding he plans to keep fighting to clear his name.

“I never assaulted anyone,” Watson said following practice as the Browns held their mandatory minicamp. “I never harassed anyone or I never disrespected anyone. I never forced anyone to do anything.”

Watson, who is facing civil lawsuits from 24 massage therapists accusing him of sexual assault and harassment during private sessions when he played for the Houston Texans, stood by previous comments proclaiming his innocence.

While acknowledging his actions have impacted others, Watson maintained he’s not done anything wrong.

“I just want to clear my name,” he said.

Watson’s comments were his first public ones since March 25, when he was introduced by the Browns after they persuaded him to waive his no-trade clause and signed him to a fully guaranteed, five-year, \$230 million contract despite his legal troubles.

Since then, his entanglements have grown, with two more women filing lawsuits in the wake of other accusers detailing disturbing encounters with Watson on a report by HBO’s “Real Sports with Bryant Gumbel.”

There was also a New York Times report that Watson booked appointments with at least 66 different women over 17 months while he played for the Texans. And on Monday, attorney Tony Buzbee, who represents all the women suing Watson, said he plans to file two more lawsuits against the quarterback.

## Cornersville names Waddell as head football coach

When Cornersville football coach Gerard Randolph stepped down from coaching responsibilities, the administration began a search for his successor it didn’t take terribly long.

Cornersville has named Shelby Waddell as the new head football coach for the Bulldogs.

“It was very exciting and I’m very humbled that Mr. (Brent) Adcox and Mr. (Eric) Crabtree have entrusted me to lead the program here. This is a great program with great people. To be able to come into a situation like this that Coach Randolph has left and to be asked to take that over, it’s an honor to be here,” Waddell said.

Waddell has made the rounds throughout the coaching circuit in Alabama and Mississippi and has been part of successful programs, as well as building programs from the ground up.

“I graduated college in 2016 from Athens State University. The year after I started graduated is when I really started coaching in a volunteer role at my alma mater at Cherokee (Ala.). In 2015, I ended up going to Mars Hill Bible School as a co-offensive coordinator helping kind of get their program started because that’s when they first launched football and I was there for a year,” he said.

Originally from Cherokee, Ala., which is a small community much like Cornersville, Waddell eventually came back to Cherokee as the offensive coordinator.

“In 2016 when I did my student teaching, I came back to Cherokee as the offensive coordinator and helped them get back to the playoffs since 2002 and the first time they hosted since like 1999,” he said.

“I was there for year, graduated and got a teaching job at Biggersville High School, which is close to Corinth, Miss. I got to be there for two years and was part of a huge rebuild where we made the playoffs for the first time since the 1990s. That first year we ended up 8-4 with the first winning record in a long time. I think we went 12-2 the next year and made it to the second round of the playoffs, was runner up in the region and was the best year they had in school history at that time. After I left there, they kept it rolling and about two years later they played for a state title,” Waddell said.

After stints at Cherokee and Biggersville, Waddell found his way to another rebuild in 6A Hazel Green (Ala.), which is where he’s been the last three years.

“I ended up going to Hazel Green the past three years and

took the offensive coordinator job there. Hazel Green is 6A. Ended up coming in to another massive rebuild and was able to get that program back to where we were competitive in most of our games this year. I won’t say it was an easy road, but we changed the culture there. They have a good foundation to work with now,” he said.

Having been part of teams that have continued success, as well as having to help teams rebuild into competitive programs, Waddell has a vision of stepping into his role with the Bulldogs and carrying the torch left by Randolph.

“I’ve known coach Randolph for a long time. We’ve been friends for a while. We would get together in the offseason and talk ball. I know the job he’s done here and it’s been absolutely incredible and the job the staff has done here has been exceptional,” he said.

Having that string of recent success, Waddell says, helps a new coach get his foot in the door and continue the program’s competitive nature.

“I do think it puts you ahead because you already have the standard of expecting to be good and competitive every year. But those are big expectations to live up to. Kind of my goal is to see how much we can build on that and get to the next level,” he said.

While some coaches are bent on overhauling coaching staffs, rosters and schemes, Waddell wants to implement some of his own ideas to an already successful formula to hopefully carry the program to new heights.

“It’s more analyze the roster and build around that. I’ve been in more of a spread background. When we were at Biggersville, we would be in the spread some, but we would get in the I and we would play a physical brand of football,” he said.

“What I want to do from an offensive end is get in here with these coaches, see what they’ve been doing and trying to fit some of the stuff I may want to bring in to what they’ve been doing to where it’s not a total overall and fitting it to our kids. I’ve been a part of offenses where it’s go-go-go and I’ve been part of offenses that want to slow it down and eat up clock because that’s what best fit us. It’s all working with what you have, in my opinion.”

Waddell and the Bulldogs began summer work earlier this month and have been working on getting acclimated with one another.

“Really kind of focusing on us. It’s not going to be an overhaul on everything because there’s been working really well, but there

are going to be some changes in some areas and just getting the kids used to that,” he said.

As with any new coach, Waddell thinks the biggest challenge is just getting to know the program and community.

“I think just getting to know the kids, getting to know the staff, earning their trust and earning their respect. To me, that’s not something that’s given. That’s something you have to earn,” he said.

One of the bigger points Waddell wants to address is the retention of players and staff with the new coaching change.

“I’ve seen it from the other side when there’s change. When I played high school ball, there was a period where we had three different head coaches,” he said.

From the day he was offered the position, Waddell began reaching out to the members of the staff.

“That night, I was already reaching out to people on staff. I’m not bringing in a big staff. I made it a point to let everybody on staff, and the players too, that ‘Hey, you guys have been doing a great job and I want to keep everybody on board,’” he said.

While success can look like different things to different coaches, Waddell has a clear vision of what success can look like in Year 1 of his coaching tenure.

“To me, every night on that field, we’re competitive and we’re in every game and we’re making the other team uncomfortable because they’re having to work. Obviously we want to win every game we step out on that field and play. But success is also how we play the game, the manner we play it and building great people off it. That’s a big deal to me,” he said.

Waddell comes to Cornersville with his wife, Olivia, of five years.

Being a religious man, Waddell feels the path and direction that led him to Cornersville was part of a bigger scheme he was both honored and thankful to be part of.

“I was just honored to be honest they would entrust me to be the head coach of this program. It’s always been a goal of mine and I didn’t know if it would ever happen or when it would happen. I’m a big believer in God and I feel like he has a plan for all of us. I’ve always prayed to send us where you want us. I’m just excited this is the path he has for us,” he said.

Cornersville posted a 9-3 overall record in 2021, which included a push to the second round of the Class 1A state playoffs.

The Bulldogs open the 2022 schedule on Aug. 18 at Richland.
