Lions roar once more

Storms forecast for last Friday held off, not wanting to spoil the celebration and dedication of a state historical marker at the former Jones School.

The building, which currently houses the Marshall County Board of Education offices, was dedicated in 1951 as Jones Training School, serving as the county's high school for African American students as well as an elementary school.

Named after Professor Jacob "Jake" Jones, a long-time African American educator in the county who, prior to his death in 1942, privately taught high school classes in his home to African American students by request.

In 1967 with school desegregation, the final class graduated from the then Jones High School, after which the building was used as an integrated elementary school

until closing in 1981. Alumni from Jones

joined with the broader community to celebrate their memories of the school which once served as the center of the county's African American community.

In his remarks, Mitchell Johnson of the Altruist Club of Lewisburg and Marshall County said that the project had been driven by the desire to see "the contributions and legacy of Jones" preserved.

Johnson thanked the many people who had

assisted in the process of applying to the Tennessee Historical Commission for approval of the marker, a process only complicated by delays over the last two years due to the pandemic.

The Altruist Club of

Lewisburg slows part of Mooresville Hwy

Proof of the growth coming to Lewisburg was evident based on the agenda for last Tuesday's meeting of the City Council.

The agenda ran for two and a half pages, most of which, in the public hearing prior to the meeting, old business, and new business, concerned zoning, rezoning, or annexation requests.

Based on the number of requests, residential construction appears poised to continue unabated for the foreseeable fu-

Among the development requests, the council approved several other measures as well.

Notably, the council approved a resolution extending the 30 mile per hour speed limit further out Mooresville Highway.

After a request from Councilman Jack Cathey the 30 mph zone will begin at White Drive and extend to the entrance of Ridgetop Apartments at the crest of the hill.

The change is intended to anticipate the installation of stop lights at the intersection of Mooresville Highway and West Ellington Parkway.

Mayor Jim Bingham noted that the Tennessee Department of Transportation had not yet released the city to begin construction on the light and that he anticipated another year before the approval was granted.

Lewisburg Public Works will begin relocating the speed limit signs to meet the new standard within the next week or two.

The council approved on first

reading the city's proposed budget and tax rate for the fiscal year beginning July 1.

After this year's property reappraisal, the city property tax will fall to \$1.28 per \$100 of assessed value, down from the previous rate of \$1.84 per \$100.

Councilmen also approved a resolution setting the third weekend of September as a permitfree yard sale weekend with the hope that such an event will spur additional community economic development.

The council voted to defer the final reading of a resolution establishing an additional two percent hotel/motel tax, proceeds of which would be earmarked for the tourism fund.



Hunter Bennett has been playing basketball ever since he was big enough to pick up a ball.







It was another step — and a big name with his four major championships — that added to the roster of the LIV Golf series and invariably will lead to no space for some of the lesserknown players who competed in the inaugural event outside London two weeks ago.

Koepka withdrew late Tuesday night from the Travelers Championship, the PGA Tour said. He was not at a player meeting Tuesday morning at the TPC River Highlands. The next LIV Golf event starts June 30 outside Portland,

Koepka was the second player, behind Rory McIlroy, to speak out against a rival league in March 2020 when he told The AP, "I have a hard time believing golf should be about just 48

"Money isn't going to change my life," Koepka said at the time.

The proposed rival league was different from LIV Golf, presented as the "Premier Golf League" though still relying on Saudi Arabia's sovereign wealth fund. Greg Norman and LIV Golf took the idea of 48-man fields, no cuts with a team component. LIV Golf has not announced Koepka's signing

amid speculation that a few others were soon to join. One was Abraham Ancer of Mexico, the 20th-ranked player in the world who won a World Golf Championship last year in a playoff, along with the Australian Open in 2018.

Ancer said his decision was not taken lightly and that joining LIV would allow him to give back to the game by helping it grow in Mexico.

"I never could have imagined being in this position today," he said on Twitter.

The news was surprising to most players, similar to Dustin Johnson on the initial LIV list, because Koepka had been so outspoken

Jordan Spieth said he was at a corporate outing last week with several top players, Koepka included, all of them supportive of the PGA Tour in this turf war.

"He was one of them," Spieth said. "I'm staying with J.T. (Justin Thomas) and we woke up today and were like, 'Wait — what?' I wouldn't have been surprised if he was like DJ from the get-go. I'm just surprised because of where we

The development came as the PGA Tour held a player meeting at the Travelers Championship, during which Commissioner Jay Monahan spoke of the tour's position and plans to reshape the season and its tournaments. according to two players in the meeting, the

PGA Tour plans to return to a calendar season that would start in January, and only the top 70 players would be eligible for the FedEx Cup playoffs. They spoke on condition of anonymity because the meeting was for players.

Currently, the top 125 make the postseason, with the top 70 advancing to the second playoff event and the top 30 to the Tour Championship. The new plan is for the top 70 at the start, then top 50 and top 30.

The fall would be used for players beyond 70th to secure cards for the following year, although research showed most inside the top 100

The tour was still looking at three fall events for limited fields, along with eight tournaments during the regular season that would offer spiked purses in the range of \$20 million. Some of those under consideration already have the biggest purses.

LIV Golf was expected to announce as many as four new players this week. There was endless speculation during the U.S. Open involving more than a dozen names, some of whom have expressed no interest in going.

That led two-time major champion Collin Morikawa to post on Twitter, "To state for the record, once again, you all are absolutely wrong. I've said it since February at Riviera that I'm here to stay on the PGA Tour and nothing has changed."

Watson settles 20 civil suits, faces NFL suspension nymity because the investigation tailed their encounters with Wat-

HOUSTON — Cleveland Browns quarterback Deshaun Watson's decision to settle 20 of 24 civil lawsuits for sexual misconduct may not dissuade the NFL from giving him a lengthy suspension, a person familiar with the league's investigation told the Associated Press on Tuesday. Watson has been accused by

massage therapists of harassing, assaulting or touching them during appointments when he played for the Houston Texans. Houston attorney Tony Buzbee,

who represents all 24 women, said Tuesday in a statement that once the paperwork is finished on the 20 settlements, "those particular cases will be dismissed." He added that the terms of the settlements are "confidential" and that his legal team "won't comment further on the settlements or those cases." Watson still faces discipline

its own investigation into the 26-year-old's behavior and is expected to make a decision before the Browns open training camp on July 27. Following Buzbee's announcement, NFL spokesman Brian Mc-Carthy said the agreements have

"no impact on the collectively bargained disciplinary process." Another league official told the AP "settling doesn't give someone a pass" and indicated a lengthy suspension remains in order. The

hasn't concluded.

NFL investigators interviewed Watson in Houston over several days last month. They've spoken with 11 of Watson's accusers, according to a person familiar with the investigation, who said Buzbee declined to make more women available for interviews. The league will present their

findings to disciplinary officer Sue L. Robinson, a former federal judge who will decide Watson's punishment. This is the first case for Robinson, who was jointly appointed by the league and NFL Players Association. The Browns, who signed the

three-time Pro Bowler to a fully guaranteed, five-year, \$230 million contract in March, had no immediate comment on the settlements. Watson has denied any wrong-

doing and vowed to clear his name. Rusty Hardin, Watson's lead attorney, did not immediately return an email or a text seeking comment.

In March, two separate Texas grand juries declined to indict him on criminal complaints stemming from the allegations. After that, the Browns and several other teams pursued Watson, with Cleveland convincing him to waive his no-trade clause and join a team with a solid roster.

The first 22 lawsuits against Watson were filed in March and April 2021. The last two lawsuits were filed after HBO's "Real Sports with Bryant Gumbel" aired an interview last month with two of the women who de-

The settlements also come after The New York Times reported earlier this month that Watson had booked massage appointments with at least 66 different women over 17 months while he played for the Texans. The report said that a Texans representative had provided Watson with a nondisclosure agreement that he gave to some of the women to sign.

Last week. Watson reiterated his innocence and sidestepped any questions about whether he would settle with any of the

"I never assaulted anyone," Watson said June 14 in his first public comments since being introduced by the Browns in March. "I never harassed anyone or I never disrespected anyone. I never forced anyone to do anything."

Buzbee said he plans on taking the four unsettled lawsuits to trial, including the first one that was filed by Ashley Solis, who has previously made her name public. In an interview with HBO's "Real Sports with Bryant Gumbel," Solis said she felt threatened by Watson after their massage session when he told her that she had a career to protect and "I know you don't want anyone messing with it just like I don't want anyone messing with mine."

Buzbee said that without Solis, "the conduct experienced by these women would likely have continued unfettered."

Duren, Williams, Kessler top list of NBA draft's big men

Memphis' Jalen Duren, Duke's Mark Williams and Auburn's Walker Kessler are the headliners among big men in Thursday's NBA Each is a mobile big

man with the ability to finish above the rim, with Duren and Williams as potential lottery picks, along with Kessler as a first-round Here is a look at the

top bigs in the draft:

Duren

The 6-11, 250-pound freshman is just 18 years old but has impressive athleticism and strength.

STRENGTHS: Duren has the solidly built frame to bang for position and the athleticism to finish lobs above the rim, making him ESPN's No. 10 overall draft prospect. He averaged 12.0 points and 8.1 rebounds, proving effective in attacking the rim and running the floor.

Duren also showed flashes of relentless rebounding ability by pulling down 20 rebounds against UCF in the American Athletic Conference Tournament and 19 against Western Kentucky in November. And he averaged 2.1 blocks. "I've gotten better, my

body has gotten better," Duren said. "And honestly I'm looking just to continue to develop throughout my rookie year, coming in being one of the younger draftees." **CONCERNS:**

didn't shoot well in either of the team's NCAA Tournament games, including a 3-for-11 showing against potential No. 1 overall draft prospect Chet Holmgren of Gonzaga while being limited by foul trouble. His offensive game is still developing beyond the rim-running lobs and it's unclear what type of range he'll have. He also shot just 62.5% from the foul line.

Williams

The 7-2, 242-pound sophomore is an elite rim protector with mobility and an improving offensive game.

STRENGTHS: Williams offers incredible length, from a 9-9 standing reach to a wingspan of better than 7-6. That helped him rank 12th in Division I at 2.82 blocks per game while altering plenty more shots, so much so that now-retired Hall of Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski compared him to a hockey goalie during the NCAA

Tournament.

Krzyzewski had also noted that Williams ranked as the No. 14 overall draft prospect by ESPN — had improved his lateral movement, giving him a better chance to handle switches and ballscreens.

On the offensive end, he averaged 11.2 points with the ability to go up and get lobs for easy finishes.

"I'd say I'd bring to wherever I'd go just being that live threat: immediate rim protection, running the floor, playing hard, that sort of stuff," Williams said. "I think I bring that right away.'

CONCERNS: 20-year-old's offensive game is still in development. He showed more back-to-the-basket improvements last year, but there's still room to grow. He could also improve as a rebounder after averaging 7.4 boards with double-figure outputs in only 12 of 39 games despite his size.

Kessler

The 7-1, 256-pound sophomore is another elite shot blocker and top defender with mobility.

STRENGTHS: ES-PN's No. 26 overall draft prospect was named national defensive player

of the year by Naismith and the National Association of Basketball Coaches after ranking second in Division I by blocking 4.56 shots per game, including nine games with at least seven blocks.

Kessler offers length (9-5 standing reach, better than 7-4 wingspan) and has shown mobility to pursue the ball and switch on perimeter.

Offensively, averaged 11.4 points while shooting 60.8% from the field to go with 8.1 rebounds while playing alongside potential No. 1 overall pick Jabari Smith.

CONCERNS: Kessler's shooting touch didn't show up in two college seasons, the first coming at North Carolina. Kessler shot just 57.7% at the foul line in two seasons while also hitting just 10 of 50 (20%) on 3-pointers last season with the Tigers.

"If Walker came back to Auburn next year, he's have looked a lot more like Jabari Smith from the standpoint of (being) that aggressive taking those shots," Auburn coach Bruce Pearl said Tuesday. "I hope that as he gets in and transitions to the NBA that that's what will happen for him at that next level as well."

Title IX ensured balanced cutbacks during pandemic

Title IX is always on Candice Storey Lee's mind and the Vanderbilt athletics director believes that's how it should be for any administrator running college pro-

"I would hope that's part of our DNA and that it is seen in how we make decisions on a day-to-day basis," Lee said. By most accounts, it is.

It certainly was during the

height of the COVID-19 pandemic. At times, Title IX was at the forefront of decisions by ADs. When schools examined which programs might be cut to save money as the spread of the virus shut down the sports world in 2020, the law prohibiting sex-based discrimination was a major

It was an example of how Title IX ensures equity between men and women in education and prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in any education program or activity receiving federal funds, such as student financial aid. "The law is meant to shape

decision-making and behavior, and it has done that," Virginia athletics director Carla Williams said. "I think it will continue to do that."

Compliance can be measured in multiple ways, in-

cluding whether the overall program's gender breakdown is proportionate to that of the general student body. The goal is ensuring men and women have equitable participation opportunities as well as access to scholarships. But the shutdown created

financial pressures, particularly for Division I programs with lost revenue from the canceled NCAA men's basketball tournament and uncertainty about whether football — which largely funds Olympic and lower-profile sports programs — would go forward at all.

Schools that chose cuts had to consider Title IX compliance numbers for remaining

programs. And ultimately, cuts hit more men's programs (47) than women's (22) in Division I, according to data from The Associated Press and wrestling site Mat Talk

"I imagine it would have made it much harder for anyone to actually consider the cutting of women's sports," South Florida athletics director Michael Kelly said. "Unless, if they already had a preponderance or excess of women's sports and women's student-athletes and women's student experience, then maybe they did. But I'm not aware of too many that are in that situation."

East Carolina athletics di-

rector Jon Gilbert faced that difficult decision.

The Pirates, an American Athletic Conference member, announced cuts to four programs -men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis — in May 2020 while citing a \$4.9 million budget deficit. The school later announced plans in January 2021 to restart the women's programs while paying more than \$189,000 in a settlement to avoid a gender-equity lawsuit.

"Certainly Title IX is extremely important for all that it represents, and it certainly is a factor when you go down that path," Gilbert said.
