Commissioner David Salyers said. "We want to make it as convenient as possible for Tennesseans to demonstrate their commitment to protecting the environment."

Since the program's inception in 1993, more than 360,000 Tennessee households have properly disposed of more than 23 million pounds of material. There have been over 1,400 one-day collection events.

Household hazardous waste materials are considered flammable, toxic, reactive and/ or corrosive and should not be placed with regular garbage. Typical

Happy 50th Anniversary, M*A*S*H, Maude and Kung Fu

I didn't watch all of them from the very beginning, but several significant TV shows debuted in the fall of 1972. "The Bob Newhart Show" starred Bob Newhart (who

turned 93 on September 5) as psychologist Bob Hartley. Bob's trademark

stammer didn't seem all that noticeable to me. I was just starting junior high school and being at a loss for words was par for the course around the ninth-grade girls. I imagined lying facedown on Bob's couch to hide the zits. If Bob had added a P.E. climbing rope in his office, I'll bet all his patients would have plunged out the window.

"M*A*S*H," of course, followed the doctors and support staff of the 4077th Mobile Army Surgical Hospital during the Korean War. The comedy-drama could genuinely surprise us (as with Corporal Radar O'Reilly announcing the death of Col. Henry Blake). If "M*A*S*H" had been created in the 2020s, we would instead steel ourselves for the PREDICTABLE, with a dazed Radar muttering, "My teddy bear just announced that he's a lesbian." The "M*A*S*H" pro-

The "M*A*S*H" producers scrupulously turned off the laugh track during surgery scenes. Our hypothetical "M*A*S*H" of 2022? They would doubtless instead have guest-star Joe Biden pop in to remind the audience, "Not a joke."

'M*A*S*H" ranked #46 in the Nielsen ratings for its inaugural season and was near-ly canceled. When it bowed out 11 years later, the finale became the most watched U.S. television broadcast in history at that time, with 106 million viewers. TV programmers still haven't learned patience. Most shows come on and off faster than one of Klinger's gowns.

"Maude" gave us both Bea Arthur (as "that uncompromisin', enterprisin', anything but tranquilizin' right on

Maude") and Rue Mc-Clanahan (as her confidante Vivian Harmon) more than a decade before their "Golden Girls" misadventures. During the fourth season, I ran home from my afterschool job every Monday night to catch "Maude" (and its lead-in, "All in the Family," featuring Maude's cousin, Edith Bunker).

"Maude" was a ratings powerhouse for most of its network run; but I read in Norman Lear's autobiography that local station program directors balked at the syndicated reruns, using a crude term for a domineering woman. 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Tigers outlast Creek Wood for region win

CHARLOTTE — The good thing about ugly wins, they count as much as the pretty ones. On a night with several untimely penalties and a pair of crushing turnovers, the Marshall County Tigers (3-0, 1-0) were able to overcome all the adversity and lands its first Region 5-AAAA win of the season, fending off Creek Wood, 17-14.

"We faced a bunch of adversity tonight and that's how it goes sometimes. On the road, playing a tough opponent in Creek Wood—they're a playoff caliber team. We faced adversity from the very start but I'm happy we overcame it," Marshall County coach Thomas Osteen said.

Creek Wood's game plan was simple: run the ball, move the chains and play keep away from the Tigers.

The plan worked noticeably well in the first half with Marshall County getting just three offensive possessions in the first two quarters.

Creek Wood (1-2, 0-1) took the game's opening possession and was able to push the ball near its own 40-yard line, but Red Hawk quarterback Eathon Donaldson was sacked for an eight-yard loss on fourth down, which forced a punt.

On the punt attempt, the Tigers were able to tip the ball and recovered possession on the Red Hawk 39-yard line. Working with a short field, the Tigers capped the three-minute drive on a five-yard touchdown pass from junior quarterback Silas Teat to Marcus O'Neal.

Creek Wood forced a three and out on the second Tiger possession of the night and put together another five-plus minute drive, aided by a handful of Tiger penalties.

Quarterback Blaine Woodard snuck in for the two-point conversion to make it a 22-0 lead for the Bulldogs.

The final points of the game came from the Cornersville defense as they backed Huntland up to their own end zone, and forced a safety on a blocked punt to bring the game to its final score of 24-0 with nine minutes and 17 seconds left in the fourth quarter.

The Bulldogs' defense continued to hold strong and force turnovers that eventually led to their offense lining up in victory formation to end the game.

Waddell was proud of his team for persevering in the conditions and pushing for the win.

"With things like that, I like to say 'so what? now what?," Waddell said. "If something happens, you just gotta move onto the next play. We did a great job of that tonight. A lot of teams would have let the delays and the rain get to them, but they did a great job of staying focused. They never showed their fatigue, so it was great."

The Bulldogs will hit the road next week for a matchup with the Clay County Bulldogs at 7 p.m. in Celina.



Swift had a 28-yard carry, getting the Rockets into better position for the Hill two-yard scamper into the end zone.


Grissom added the extra point, but Loretto still held the lead 38-28.





Georgia moves up to No. 2, passing Ohio State

Georgia moved up to No. 2 in the first Associated Press college football poll of the regular season, passing Ohio State, after the defending national champions dominated their opener.

Alabama remained No. 1 in the AP Top 25 presented by Regions Bank released Tuesday, receiving 44 of 63 firstplace votes from the media panel and 1,552 points.

The Bulldogs narrowed the gap on the Crimson Tide after beating Oregon 49-3 on Saturday. Georgia received 17 first-place votes.

Ohio State slipped to No. 3 and received two first-place votes. Michigan moved up four spots to No. 4.

Clemson dropped a spot to No. 5.

Florida debuted at No. 12 after its thrilling victory at home against Utah on Saturday night. The Utes slipped six spots to No. 13 after the loss.

The rest of the top 10 was Texas A&M at No. 6, followed by Oklahoma, Notre Dame, Baylor and Southern California.

USC is in the top 10 for the first time since the final regular-season poll of 2017, when the Trojans were eighth.

The eighth-ranked Fighting Irish dropped three spots out of the top five after losing 21-10 at Ohio State.

Poll points

Georgia has been ranked No. 1 or 2 in 15 of the last 17 polls, with the other two weeks at No. 3.

Since 2017, Georgia has been ranked No. 2 in the country 13 times and No. 1 nine times, all last season.

From 1981 — the season after Georgia won the national title — to 2016, the Bulldogs were ranked in the top two a total of 10 times.

In

— Florida's jump from unranked to No. 12 is the biggest for an unranked team since the first regular-season poll of 2016, when Texas landed at No. 11 and Wisconsin at No. 10 after Week 1 victories.

— No. 24 Tennessee is ranked for the first time under second-year coach Josh Heupel.

Out

— Oregon's humbling loss to Georgia sent the Ducks all the way out of the rankings. It's the first time Oregon has been unranked in a poll for which it was eligible since the last regular-season AP Top 25 of 2020.

— Cincinnati dropped out after losing at Arkansas by a touchdown, its first regularseason loss since late in the 2019 season.

For the Bearcats, who made the College Football Playoff last year, it snapped a run of 45 consecutive poll appearances, which was the fifthlongest active streak in the country.

Florida and Tennessee moving into the rankings gives the SEC eight ranked teams, the most for a conference since the SEC had eight three times in 2020.

The record for ranked teams from one conference is 10 by the SEC early in the 2018 season. From 2011-18, the SEC had eight teams ranked in a AP Top 25 a total of 14 times.

SEC teams get more chances for September statements

The Southeastern Conference was perhaps one blocked kick away from perfection last weekend, with a few impressive nonconference victories and some no-brainers. For teams like No. 1 Alabama and No. 24 Tennessee, bigger tests start on Saturday when they're among five SEC teams engaging in Power 5 nonconference matchups. A league that prides itself on being the best in college football gets a chance for more September statements. No. 2 Georgia looked every bit the defending national champion in a 49-3 win over then-No. 11 Oregon. No. 16 Arkansas toppled Cincinnati, a playoff team last season. Florida upended then-No. 7 Utah, the defending Pac-12 Conference champion, matching the highest ranked team the Gators have defeated in an opener. The first time was over No. 7 Houston in 1969. "Pretty good football there, huh?" first-year coach Billy Napier said. The football was solid league-wide, though it's hard

to read much into wins over teams like Mercer (Auburn) and Utah State (Alabama).

LSU fell 24-23 to Florida State on a blocked extra point with no time on the clock in coach Brian Kelly's debut. That was the SEC's only loss on the weekend. No. 12 Florida and Tennessee rode nonconference wins into the Top 25, giving the SEC eight ranked teams. Arkansas moved up three spots in the rankings to start the follow-up to the program's best season in a decade. "I think that was just an energy booster fire for ourselves to know that we can play like we always can," Arkansas safety Simeon Blair said. "We can play and play at a high level against good teams of that magnitude." This week, Alabama visits fellow traditional power Texas after a 55-0 win over Utah State that amounted to a tuneup. The Volunteers, who beat Ball State 59-10, are at No. 17 Pittsburgh Vandy (2-0) hosts No. 23 Wake Forest seeking its first 3-0 start since 2017. Missouri visits Kansas State and Mississippi State is at Arizona.

– Alabama is making its first trip to Austin since 1922 and facing former Tide offensive coordinator Steve Sarkisian. The Longhorns are rebuilding but they have a 7-1-1 record against Alabama, which won the last meeting to claim the 2009 national championship. "I think there's an understanding that us going to Austin this weekend, it's gonna be hostile, there's gonna be a lot of noise, there's gonna be a lot of people," Tide linebacker Henry To'oTo'o said. "So we're excited and super juiced about it." Tennessee and Pitt are playing in the Johnny Majors Classic pitting two teams he coached. Pitt won 41-34 last year in Neyland Stadium. The Volunteers get a chance to give further evidence they're an up-and-coming program under coach Josh Heupel, who's more concerned about preparations than any of that. "Last week has nothing to do with this coming week," Heupel said. "A year ago has nothing to do with what's going to happen this week. To perform the right way, you have to prepare the right way."

 Mississippi State has its first meeting with Arizona in a game scheduled to kick off about 10 p.m. Central time. Bulldogs coach Mike Leach went 4-2 against the Wildcats while at Washington State, and his team attempted 84 passes in the 2017 meeting. "I think we're all excited to be up late and go play Arizona," Leach said. — Missouri faces an old Big 12 Conference opponent. The Tigers and Wildcats meet for the first time since 2011 but the 98th overall. Missouri leads 60-32-5. – Vandy has won the past three meetings with Wake Forest and actually leads the series 10-6. Commodores coach Clark Lea has already matched the win total from his debut season was Dave Clawson's linebackers coach in 2016 at Wake Forest. Lea said Clawson "has built a great program there and it's going to be a fun team to compete against." AP Sports Writer Teresa Walker contributed to this report.

Titans tap next man up experience replacing LB Harold Landry

NASHVILLE — The Tennessee Titans are days away from kicking off their new season and already have placed two players on injured reserve.

Losing Pro Bowl linebacker Harold Landry III hurts the most. One advantage the Titans have as they prepare to host the New York Giants on Sunday is this isn't the first time they've leaned heavily on that next man up mentality. They earned the No. 1 seed in the AFC last season using an NFL- record 91 different players, most in a non-strike season, with 26 on injured reserve. "Just because Harold went out does not mean that we're going to be looking at ourselves like, 'Hey, we're not going to be able to be the type of team or type of defense that we were capable of," safety Kevin Byard said Monday. "We're going to expect, and we've always expected, for backups to play like starters." The Titans had five starters go on and off injured reserve last season, not counting first-round draft pick Caleb Farley. The cornerback tore an ACL in his lone start.

Yet Tennessee still finished sixth in the NFL in scoring defense, second in run defense and was the only team in the league with three different players to have at least eight sacks apiece. Landry, who started every game the past three seasons, earned his first Pro Bowl nod with a careerhigh 12 sacks last season.

That earned him a five-year contract this offseason after Landry ▷ See **Titans**, Page 4B

Jones having his usual butterflies as Giants look to opener vs. Titans

EAST RUTHER-FORD, N.J. — At age 25 and entering his fourth NFL season, Daniel Jones isn't feeling any different in the stretch run to the season opener against the Tennessee Titans.

His excitement level was up and the butterflies were floating in his stomach Tuesday as the Giants began work on the game plan for Sunday's opener in Nashville. It also will be Brian Daboll's debut as a head coach.

"It's all a good thing and it helps you know that you're getting ready to go," Jomes said after practicing in light rain. "Once we get out there and the ball gets snapped, that normally calms down a little bit and you get into the flow of the game. I'm excited to get going."

This is a major year for

Jones, the No. 6 overall pick in the 2019 draft. His first three seasons have been marked by inconsistency, losing and injuries. He missed the last six games of last season as New York went 4-13 and fired Joe Judge after two years as coach.

Daboll, the former Bills offensive coordinator, will be Jones' third head coach in his four years. He started with Pat Shurmur. Mike Kafka is his fourth offensive coordinator. They'll be running the offense Daboll brought from Buffalo.

Even co-owner John Mara admitted after last season the Giants, who have had five straight losing seasons, have seemingly done everything they can to mess up their quarterback.

The pressure on Jones increased earlier this year when new general manager Joe Schoen and the organization opted not to pick up the fifth-year option on his rookie contract. It's made this season: either produce or pack up.

Jones knows the stakes, but he has repeatedly said he is focused on this week and getting better.

"It's been fun this week," Jones said. "You kind of switch into game-plan mode, you're preparing for certain looks, scheming up our offense to put us in the best position to make plays and succeed. It's about us. It's about us executing our plays and doing what we need to do as a unit and an offense."

Daboll likes Jones' work ethic, his knowledge of the game and his leadership abilities.

"You want to have the quarterback feel as comfortable as he can, and you also want to tell him some of the reasons why you're doing things you want to try to do against the opponent you're going against," Daboll said. "But he's had really good dialogue with us; I think he's in a good spot."

Jones should benefit from an improved offensive line which added center Jon Feliciano and right guard Mark Glowinski in free agency. Right tackle Evan Neal was drafted No. 7 overall and left tackle Andrew Thomas has developed into an elite player.

Almost two years after an ACL injury, running back Saquon Barkley is looking very much like the back who was the 2018 NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

The concern is the receivers. Kenny Golladay is coming back from a bad season (no TDs). Kadarius Toney needs to show he can stay on the field, but he missed all the preseason games with nagging injuries.

It's unknown how much veteran Sterling Shepard can contribute after missing most of camp rehabbing an Achilles injury. Rookie tight end Daniel Bellinger is unproven. It's unknown how much at left guard for the injured Shane Lemieux. Ben Bredeson was listed as the starter on the depth chart backed up by rookie Josh Ezeudu. ... There were a cou-

Jones likes the offense, which employs a lot of movement. He also likes that Daboll is constantly finding new ways to run a play.

"I think it allows the quarterback to do a lot in the pocket, outside the pocket, in the run game," Jones said. "It allows us to get into advantageous looks depending on what the defense does, easily getting in and out of plays. I think from all those perspectives, it's very quarterback friendly for any quarterback."

ranked 10th in the NFL with his 12 sacks. He has a team-high 31 sacks over the past four seasons. Landry's total is the second most for this franchise over his first four seasons since 1982 when individual sacks became an official NFL statistic.

Giants first-year coach Brian Daboll sent his sympathies to Landry, someone he called a fantastic and dynamic player.

"We don't exactly know what's going to happen, whether (Denico) Autry is going to move over there, whatever it may be," Daboll said. "You know, the first game, you have to rely on your rules and things that you did



for training camp. And that's where our focus will be."

Landry would have faced Giants rookie right tackle Evan Neal, the seventh overall pick out of Alabama, before tearing an ACL in practice Aug. 31. The Titans now could start second-year linebacker Rashad Weaver in Landry's spot. Weaver broke a leg in his third game in ending his rookie season.

"That doesn't change anything," said Neal, who said he's been watching film on all the Titans. "They're going to have a guy that's in his place that I am going to have to block. So, I mean, that doesn't change anything for me at all."

One advantage for the Titans is Bud Dupree, their big free agent signee of 2021, finally feels like himself after spending last season recovering from the ACL he tore in December 2020 playing with Pittsburgh. Dupree started six of 11 games, letting his pride push him harder than he was ready. He finished with three sacks.

Dupree said he didn't feel like himself until this summer. The Titans signed linebacker Derrek Tuszka to the roster.

"It's unfortunate. It's disappointing," Titans coach Mike Vrabel said. "Feel terrible, obviously, for Harold and the work that he's put in and his value to our football team. NASCAR's wild regular season rolls over into playoffs

DARLINGTON, S.C. — Buckle up your five-point harness. Looks like NASCAR's playoffs will be just as wild and unpredictable as its regular season.

That came into sharp focus at Darlington Raceway where Erik Jones became the first-ever non-playoff racer to take the postseason opener in the Southern 500 on Sunday night — one week after the cutoff for playoff qualifying.

Jones' crew chief, Dave Elenz, was gratified his team finally broke through at one of the most difficult tracks in NASCAR. "But I think the first thing Erik said to me is, 'Don't you wish we won Daytona" in the regular-season finale, Elenz said.

At the end, Jones outlasted all three of his old Joe Gibbs Racing teammates — Martin Truex Jr., Kyle Busch and Denny Hamlin. Truex lost a late lead with power steering problems, Busch's engine blew up with Jones in second. Hamlin reached Jones' back bumper on the last lap but couldn't pass him.

"It was crazy. I've never had anything like that happen," Jones said. Truex, like Jones, didn't qualify for the playoff. Busch and Hamlin are vying for the title.

Earlier in the night, playoff favorites Chase Elliott and Kyle Larson of powerhouse Hendrick Motorsports struggled.

Elliott bounced off the wall as he spun by himself in the first 100 laps, damaging his suspension, which his team could not repair. Top-seeded coming in, Elliott was out of the race and fell to ninth in playoff points.

Larson, the defending NA-SCAR Cup Series champion who is seeded fourth this year, had early engine problems and fell four laps off the pace. Larson steadily rebounded to get back on the lead lap and end 12th — not what was expected out of the 2021's most dominant driver.

"So, pretty bummed about it, but also happy at the same time because I thought we were going to have another DNF," said Larson, who fell to seventh in the point standings with two more races at Kansas and Bristol before four of the 16 playoff teams are eliminated.

Busch, faced with questions about his racing future much of the summer, looked he'd have a moment of celebration as he led the race with less than 40 laps remaining. Then his failing engine sent him to the garage.

The race's least surprising result? Continued driver anger over what they see as an unreliable, unsafe Next Gen car. The loudest voice Sunday came from Kevin Harvick, the 2014 series champ whose car caught fire and had flames coming through the dashboard.

Harvick parked the car on the grass and scrambled away to safety. He did not return. Moments later, J.J. Yeley's machine caught fire under the hood and he, too, had to get out quick.

Drivers have said the hits this year feel harder, something NASCAR's analytics back up. Kurt Busch gave up his playoff spot due to his continuing recovery from a concussion suffered in a crash at Pocono.

"I'm sure it's just crappy parts on the race car like we've seen so many times," Harvick said. "They haven't fixed anything. It's kind of like the safety stuff. We just let it keep going and keep going."

Harvick fell from ninth in the playoffs coming in to 16th and is on the brink of elimination if things don't improve the next two weeks.

Darlington brought a quick and surprising shuffle to the playoffs, which are unique among sports because those who aren't racing for a title still get to race for victories. Imagine if the NL's top-seeded Los Angeles Dodgers lost to the Florida Marlins, who didn't make the playoffs. That's what happened at Darlington as Jones won his third NASCAR race and second Southern 500.

Jones, who drives for Petty GMS, was the 17th racer to win in 27 races this season, closing in on the most ever in NASCAR, which was 19 different winners in 2001.

Jones also gave the history-filled No. 43 car, made famous by NASCAR Hall of Famer Richard Petty, its 200th win.

Joey Logano, fourth at Darlington, moved into the points lead with William Byron second, Hamlin third and Christopher Bell fourth. Joining Harvick on the bubble as the first four out were first-time playoff participants in Austin Cindric and Chase Briscoe, and Austin Dillon, who pulled off a win-and-in at Daytona a week earlier just to make playoff field.


