*“Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.” – Matthew 6:19-21*

A “treasure” is that in which goods or precious things are valued and set aside for the purpose of collecting or stashing away as one’s joy. King Jesus is teaching His disciples that it is

worthless to set aside any kind of earthly treasure for security and joy. He goes on to point out that the treasures that are considered valuable upon earth (such as money, jewels, antiques, collectables, and such) fade away. Now King Jesus is not against earning money, having a savings account, and other wise conservative investments, because the Bible teaches that we are to work quietly and eat our own bread (2 Thessalonians 3:10-12). Therefore, King Jesus is warning His disciples about how futile it is to trust the temporary treasures of earth for one’s happiness and se-

curity in life. The apostle Paul also warns us that “the love of money is the root of all evil” and in loving money comes great sorrow (1 Timothy 6:10). If we greedily stash away anything of value with our heart trusting them, then in all actuality we are making them our god. Instead of trusting in the passing earthly treasures, the Lord Jesus is instructing the believer to lay up “treasures in heaven” which last forever.

How do we lay up these spiritual treasures? As believers, we do so by first knowing who is the treasure of our heart. Paul wrote

Your treasure?

that just as God commanded the light to shine in the beginning of creation, He also shined in the believer’s heart the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ, and that “we have this treasure” of knowing Jesus Christ in our earthly vessels of flesh (2 Corinthians 4:6,7). Therefore God is a God great in love and generosity. We read that God “spared not His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things” (Romans 8:32). Understand, the treasure of the heart does not have to do with the amount of money.

It has to do with who do you love supremely? When we boil it down, God’s children have a heart to lay up their treasures in the Kingdom of Heaven by first of all embracing Jesus Christ their Redeemer King as their one and only treasure. This pleases God the Father in Heaven and in turn He gives us the reward of increasing joy, peace, and love now - and in heaven to come.

I pray that you are fully insured by the blood payment of the Lord Jesus Christ upon the cross and you have the King as your treasure!

# Blaze interrupts interstate travel for hours

Marshall County crews braved the cold to battle a blaze which interrupted interstate travel for hours. The cause of the fire is still under investigation.

## Drugs in, out of jail

•Methamphetamine was found on two Marshall County Jail inmates Thursday, Jan. 27, a Marshall County Sheriff's Office report said.

Catherine Lurlene McCoy, 27, of Third Avenue North, and Katherine Lenore Harmon, 22, of South Horton Parkway, Chapel Hill, were each charged with introducing drugs into a penal institution. Bonds were set at \$7,500.

•An alleged attempt was made to sneak a drug into Marshall County Jail by a man being brought in following his arrest last Wednesday, an MCSO report said.

Joseph Rochester, 39, of Caney Creek Lane, Chapel Hill, was being arrested following a domestic disturbance at his home investigated by the MCSO and Chapel Hill police. Approximately 5.6 grams of cocaine were found inside a backpack in Rochester's possession, Deputy Josh McKinney's report said.

Rochester allegedly denied having drugs on him once arriving at the jail. Deputies said 92 Xanax bars were hidden in one of Rochester's jacket sleeves.

Charges of possession of a schedule 2 drug with intent to sell, possession of a schedule 3 drug, possession of drug paraphernalia, and domestic assault were filed. Bond was set at \$27,000.

•Video evidence resulted in a man being charged with possession of a schedule 2 drug and reckless endangerment after allegedly dropping a bag of methamphetamine in the parking lot of the Marshall County Probation and Parole office on Nashville Highway.

The video allegedly shows Patrick Eugene Mitchell, 49, of Belfast Farmington Road, shortly before entering the office. Mitchell is on probation for a previous conviction of possession of a schedule 2 drug, police said.

A client found the bag and turned it in to office staff.

•Methamphetamine was allegedly found on a man being arrested on a failure to appear warrant last Friday, the LPD said.

Alan Ward, 42, of Fifth Avenue North, was being searched at a Buena Vista Avenue home when officers noticed he allegedly tried to hide a

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE 17, CHAPTER 1, SECTION 17-111 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING TO BRUSH PICKUP POLICY.

BE IT ORDANED BY THE CITY OF LEWISBURG THAT:

- Title 17, Chapter 1, Section 17-111 of the Municipal Code be amended as follows:
- 17-111. Brush pickup policy/rules.
- (1) The City of Lewisburg will collect and dispose of yard waste for individuals. Yard waste being defined as brush, trees, bushes, etc. Brush cannot be mixed with other material, such as household trash, furniture, or construction materials.
- (2) The City of Lewisburg will not collect demolition debris (rocks, dirt, tree stumps, wall board or plaster, roofing material, bricks, building scraps, glass/mirrors, refrigerant items (refrigerators, air conditioners, or anything charged with Freon or other gases), etc. The City of Lewisburg will not collect debris from remodel/evictions or move in/out. The City of Lewisburg will not collect contractors yard waste. The contractors will be responsible for the disposal of their own yard waste.
- (4) All leaves, twigs, small branches, pinecones, grass clippings, etc. shall be bagged.
- (12) Delete in its entirety and replace with:  
Brush/Bulky item collection will be weekly. **Special Pickups** above the once weekly pickup may be available upon request. Requestors will be responsible for the payment of the current land fill disposal rate as well as a \$35.00 per hour labor fee. This item shall not apply during times of emergencies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Ordinance take effect 15 days from and after its passage on second (2nd) and final reading, the municipal welfare requiring it.

Wells, editor and journalist; Archibald Grimke, journalist and lawyer; activist Henry Moskowitz; Mary White Ovington, journalist and suffragist; Oswald Garrison Villard, journalist; William English Walling; labor reformer; Florence Kelly, political reformer; and Charles Edward Russell, opinion columnist, journalist, editor, and activist. The NAACP holds a place of distinction in the history for the civil rights movement. NAACP is the largest and oldest active civil rights group in the nation and is an example to be followed for its emphasis on voter registration, legal defense, and activism.



On October 20, 2022, all of Marshall County's 420 5th grade students attended the Duck River Education Day at Henry Horton State Park.

Each student went to nine stations to learn important information about how to protect the Duck River along with a history lesson of the park. Once all the stations were completed, each student was asked to write an essay on what they learned that day. After serious review and consideration, Bryson Farmer from Mrs. Lisa Stacey's fifth grade homeroom class at Westhills Elementary School was selected as the winner.

On Friday, January 20, the Friends of Henry Horton, along with Henry Horton State Park Ranger Jesse Jewell, presented Bryson with a plaque that will hang in the lobby at Westhills Elementary School for the

2022/2023 school year. The Friends of Henry Horton also surprised Mrs. Stacey's class with a pizza party to share in

the celebration. Bryson's winning essay is reproduced below, reminding us about the importance of the Duck River and our role in conserving this important natural resource.

The Duck River is a very important source of water for all of Tennessee. Here are some basic tips for keeping the Duck River's pH low. First let me tell you what pH is. pH is "Potential hydrogen"; pH is how high or low acid is in everyday items such as lemons, batteries, laundry detergent etc. pH has two layers, base and acidity, acidity is when the acid in items are below a seven in the chart.

Items that would be on the chart are, battery acid, lemon or vinegar, grape juice, tomato juice, black coffee and "pure" water and I think you get it. Items that would be seven or above are, blood, yes blood, baking soda, milk of magnesia, soapy water, and bleach. Things that are above seven are safer but can still harm you for example baking soda is something

that you cook with most likely every time you cook but if you use too much it can make you sick. Something like acid from lemons you can still eat but it can mess your teeth up. One last thing I must tell you is to make sure not to just throw batteries into your yard or anything bad for the Duck River.

Duck River Macroinvertebrates are animals that are important to the Duck River because they clean the water! Macroinvertebrates are animals that can be helpful to clean because they are born there and always reproduce, this can keep the life cycle of these animals healthy. Some Macroinvertebrates are Stonefly, Water penny. The Macroinvertebrates in the Duck River are water filters, when they grow up they break down materials and after they are done they will then eat all of the materials, therefore it cleans the water slowly but surely. Isn't it amazing how these little creatures live and world Can you believe all the hard work they are putting into the Duck River to keep it clean and

we're just throwing all kinds of trash and pollutants into the water all for us to keep doing it and them trying to keep it clean? You may not notice when you throw trash out the window of your car or into your backyard but when the wind gets strong it can either blow all of the trash near a stream that leads to the Duck River or if you live near the Duck River it can blow directly into it. Next time you go to the Duck River please do the animals a favor and not throw trash into it because let me remind you that the Duck River is our water source.

One last important thing I must tell you is about the Mussels of the Duck River. The Mussels are the most important species of the Duck River because, here's a little name I like to call them, Filter feeders and river cleaners.

These animals are an essential part of keeping the Duck River clean and healthy. Mussels can help you tell if the water is clean or not. That's only one reason they are important.

ant. Remember when I told about pH and how it can affect some animals well this is one of those animals. See when pH gets really bad the mussels will of course get up all the water in their mouth and it will make them sick and they can possibly die so that is why you should always keep the Duck River clean. When the river is not clean the females cannot reproduce so when this happens the life cycle dies.

As you can see the Duck River is an important water source for Tennessee. There are many elements that help keep our water source relevant. Not only is it important to us, it is important to the animals and macroinvertebrates that inhabit the water. We have to try to keep our water source clean by watching our trash consumption and making sure we throw it away properly. If the trash gets into the river it can kill the life cycle of the organisms that keep our water clean. Let us all do our part and keep the Duck River clean!

## Cornersville rattles off 3rd straight win, downs City

CORNERSVILLE — During their previous meeting against Fayetteville City (9-11, 2-4), the Cornersville Lady ‘Dawgs (11-11, 3-3) pushed the Lady Tigers to an epic, five-overtime battle, in which the Lady Tigers won on a last-second three-pointer, beating Cornersville by a single point.

On Friday night, no overtime was needed.

Gentry knocked down a pair of key baskets to spark the rally towards the end of the third period and it was Franklin’s efforts off the glass and off the block in the fourth quarter that sparked a 14-4 romp through the final quarter.

“Ady—we started

# Super Bowl features matchup of All-Pro QBs

It's only fitting that the top two quarterbacks in the regular season based on All-Pro voting are the last two quarterbacks standing in the NFL this season.

First-team All-Pro quarterback Patrick Mahomes will take his Kansas City Chiefs into the Super Bowl against second-team All-Pro Jalen Hurts and the Philadelphia Eagles.

This marks the seventh time since the merger that the first-team All-Pro quarterback will face the second-teamer for the championship, with it last happening in the 2016 season when second-teamer Tom Brady's Patriots beat first-teamer Matt Ryan's Falcons 34-28 in overtime.

That's been the pattern in all six of the matchups, with the second teamer coming out victorious each time: Drew Brees over Peyton Manning in the 2009 season, Mark Rypien over Jim Kelly (1991), Joe Montana over Dan Marino (1984), Montana over Ken Anderson (1981) and Roger Staubach over Bob Griese (1971).

Both Mahomes and Hurts are among the five finalists for the MVP award that will be announced next week. The winner of the AP NFL MVP hasn't won the Super Bowl since Kurt Warner did it for the Rams in the 1999 season. The last eight MVPs to play in the game all ended up losing.

Mahomes will be starting in his third Super Bowl at the young age of 27 years, 148 days — 39 days younger than Brady in the 2004 season when he became the youngest QB to start in three Super Bowls.

Hurts is set to start his first Super Bowl at age 24, joining Mahomes and six others to do that before turning 25.

This will be the third

Super Bowl with both starting QBs younger than 28, with Brett Favre (27) beating Drew Bledsoe (24) in the game following the 1996 season and Jim McMahon (26) besting Tony Eason (26) following the 1985 season.

## Blowouts

The Eagles got to the Super Bowl behind a pair of lopsided wins, which bodes well for their chances to win it all based on past history.

Philadelphia followed up a 38-7 win over the Giants in the divisional round with a 31-7 win over the 49ers in the NFC title game.

The Eagles became the fifth team to win their divisional round and conference championship games by at least 20 points. The other four teams all followed it up with a Super Bowl victory, with San Francisco doing it in 1988 and '89, Chicago in 1985 and Pittsburgh in 1978.

The Eagles also became the 11th team to allow seven or fewer points in back-to-back playoff games in the season, with the 2000 Ravens the most recent to do it before Philadelphia. Seven of the previous 10 won the Super Bowl that season.

The only team to do it three straight games in a single postseason was the Chiefs on the way to their first Super Bowl title in the 1969 season.

## Old-man Johnson

The well-traveled Josh Johnson finally got his first playoff opportunity in some unfortunate circumstances.

The 36-year-old Johnson has spent time with 14 NFL organizations since being drafted by Tampa Bay in 2008 and played in three different spring leagues.

Johnson got forced into action for San Francisco after Brock Purdy injured his elbow on the opening drive of the NFC title game.

Johnson went 7 for

13 for 74 yards and lost a fumble before being knocked out on the first drive of the third quarter with a concussion. He became the third-oldest player at the time of his first postseason pass, with only 40-year-olds Josh McCown and Sonny Jurgensen waiting longer.

The concussion for Johnson led to Purdy going back into the game despite not being able to throw the ball more than 5 or 10 yards.

San Francisco threw the ball only 18 times in the 31-7 loss, marking only the fifth time in NFL history a team lost a playoff game by at least 20 points while throwing fewer than 20 passes.

## Streaks snapped

The Bengals and 49ers each came into the conference title games on impressive streaks, with San Francisco having won 12 in a row and Cincinnati 10 straight.

Both got snapped on Sunday.

Before this year, 10

teams had taken winning streaks of at least 10 games into the conference title game, with

eight coming out victorious.

The only teams to lose before the Bengals and

49ers were the 2004 Steelers (15 straight) and the 1976 Steelers (10 straight).

# Kelces prepare for Super Bowl showdown

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — Donna Kelce is going to have to pull out that now-familiar custom jersey — the one with Kansas City Chiefs tight end Travis Kelce's front stitched to Philadelphia Eagles center Jason Kelce's back — one more time this season.

At least this time, she'll get to see her boys in person.

For the first time in Super Bowl history, a pair of siblings will play each other on the NFL's grandest stage. Kelce helped the Chiefs return to their third championship game in four seasons on Sunday night when they beat the Bengals for the AFC title, while Jason has the Eagles back for the second time in six years after their NFC title win over the 49ers.

"Cool scenario to be in, you know?" Travis Kelce said. "My mom can't lose."

Or maybe can't win.

Indeed, there have been plenty of famous NFL siblings over the years, and many had some memorable matchups: Peyton vs. Eli Manning, Tiki vs. Ronde Barber. But they never reached the same Super Bowl, or had to put their dear old mom in such a predicament, where one will be hoisting the Lombardi Trophy at the other one's expense.

"It's going to be an amazing feeling playing against him," added Travis, whose team has gotten the better of big brother's Eagles the last three matchups. "I respect everyone over there in the Eagles organization. You won't see me talk too much trash because of how much I love my brother.

But it's going to be an emotional game, for sure."

Jason Kelce was even ever-so-briefly a Chiefs fan Sunday night, pulling on a Kansas City sweatshirt for about the three hours between the end of the Eagles' 31-7 rout of San Francisco and the finish of his little brother's 23-20 win over Cincinnati.

"That's it for the rest of the year," Jason said with a smile. "I am done being a Chiefs fan."

He'll leave that to mom and dad.

While her husband, Ed, has mostly kept private over the years, Donna has been a fixture as she crisscrosses the country to watch her boys. During wild-card weekend

last year, she started in Tampa Bay watching the Eagles against the Buccaneers, then hopped a plane to Kansas City in time to watch the Chiefs play the Steelers at night.

She already has seen both of her sons win Super Bowls, too: The Eagles beat the Patriots in 2018 in Minneapolis, and the Chiefs rallied to beat the 49ers in Miami two years later.

She hasn't seen much of them lately, though. The way the playoff schedule worked out for the divisional round and the conference championship games, it was impossible for Donna to make it to see both of her boys in person.

In any case, they've come a long way from their solidly

middle-class upbringing in Cleveland Heights, Ohio. Jason blazed the trail as the star offensive lineman who earned a scholarship to Cincinnati, and Travis soon followed suit. Both caught the eyes of NFL scout during their college careers, and of one coach in particular: Andy Reid.

It was Big Red who, while coaching the Eagles, used a sixth-round pick on Jason during the 2011 draft. And two years later, after Reid had gotten a fresh start in Kansas City, the Chiefs used a third-rounder to bring Travis into the fold.

"Big brother probably protected Travis from doing some crazy things. He probably talked him from dropping off

a ladder into raked-up leaves once or twice," Reid said Monday. "Listen, they're both at heart very competitive and compassionate, is the biggest thing. They care and they care about people and they care about their game."

They also happen to be very good at it.

Jason has been to six Pro Bowls and was just voted an All-Pro for the fifth time, and he's emerged as one of the best offensive linemen in Eagles history. Travis has been to eight Pro Bowls, just made a fourth All-Pro team and is second in NFL history to Jerry Rice in playoff catches, yards and touchdowns.

Football's not the only thing they're good at, either.

The brothers have new a podcast called "New Heights with Jason & Travis Kelce," which takes listeners on a riotous, real-time ride through the NFL season. The weekly shows are recorded on Tuesdays and last between 60 and 90 minutes, the two NFL stars playing off each other as if they were hanging out in mom's basement.

Special guests have included Eagles quarterback Jalen Hurts and Chiefs counterpart Patrick Mahomes.

"They have a good mesh there, and a good relationship," Reid said. "I think Travis has grown up a lot. Jason probably came in a bit more mature — Travis was a little immature. But he's really grown into a good person."





"I have invested time in both of those two," Reid added, "so I feel like a part of the family."

# Andy Reid turned a 6-inch binder into a Hall of Fame resume

Andy Reid was an unknown assistant in Green Bay when Eagles owner Jeffrey Lurie took a chance on hiring Brett Favre's position coach to revive a struggling franchise in Philadelphia.

A newspaper headline greeted Reid's arrival with a headline that said: "Andy Who?"

Everybody knows his name now.

Reid won more games (130) than any coach in franchise history during his 14 seasons with the Eagles. He led Philadelphia to nine playoff appearances, six division titles and five NFC championship games. But Reid couldn't deliver a Super Bowl victory, losing to the New England Patriots after the 2004 season. For that reason, he was underappreciated by many fans and reporters in Philly.

Reid eventually lost his job after only his third losing season in 2012, and immediately landed in Kansas City. He finally hoisted that elusive Vince Lombardi Trophy with Patrick Mahomes and the Chiefs three years ago. By that time, the Eagles had won their first Super Bowl under then-coach Doug Pederson, one of Reid's prized pupils.

Now, Reid and the Eagles are going head-to-head aiming for that second title. The Chiefs (16-3) vs. the Eagles (16-3) is one of the most-anticipated Super Bowl matchups in recent years.

Just don't expect the stoic Reid to get emotional about it.

"When you really cut to the chase on it, they're a really good football team and so, I think that's where the energy goes because really when it's kickoff, you're playing that team," Reid said Monday.

"It's the players that you're going against and the coaches and so the uniform (and) all, that's not where your mind's at. Your mind's at making sure you have a solid game plan and that you come out and you can perform to the best of our ability.

"That's, I think, where the major focus goes, and you try to — it doesn't matter who you're playing — you try to blank out all the hype that goes with the game. It's a pretty big game for everybody. ... It's a big, big deal. It's the Super Bowl. But you try to blank that out and make sure that you're getting the game plan — what really mat-

ters — together."

Nearly a quarter century since he walked into an interview with the Eagles armed with a 6-inch binder containing notes on how to build a winning team, Reid has amassed Hall of Fame credentials. He's led the Chiefs to nine playoff appearances, including seven consecutive division titles in 10 winning seasons. He's been to five straight AFC title games, winning three.

"It's a real testament to the job that general manager Brett Veach and Coach Reid have done over the last several years," Chiefs chairman Clark Hunt said after the team clinched the division last month.

"We obviously have a bunch of young players and we've got some new players, and Andy and his staff have done a tremendous job of incorporating them into the team. That's just part of the National Football League. They've really done a fantastic job, and I couldn't be more proud of them."

Reid is a no-nonsense, old-school coach who is respected and loved by his players. He rarely throws anyone under the bus. Part of the criticism he received from reporters in Philly was for his unwillingness to call anyone out and to always shoulder all the blame after losses and poor performances. "I gotta do a better job" became a punch line.

He came across as robotic in news conferences, always opening with injuries before turning it over to reporters for questions by saying: "Time's yours."

At 64, Reid has become more of a lovable grandpa in Kansas City. He's known for wearing floral shirts and cracking jokes about his weight. Ask Reid how he plans to celebrate a victory and he'll say with a cheeseburger.

"I'm gonna go get the biggest cheeseburger you've ever seen!" Reid said after the Chiefs beat the 49ers in the Super Bowl on Feb. 2, 2020.

After a victory over the Seahawks on Dec. 24, Mahomes and All-Pro tight end Travis Kelce presented Reid with a cheeseburger inside a wrapped Nike shoe box as a Christmas gift.

Players in the locker room cheered and holered. Reid smiled and shouted: "May you all get a gift as great as this."

Another Lombardi trophy would be the best present of all.

# Tom Brady retires... 'for good'

TAMPA, Fla. (AP) — Tom Brady, who won a record seven Super Bowls for New England and Tampa, has announced his retirement.

Brady — the most successful quarterback in NFL history, and one of the greatest athletes in team sports — posted the announcement on social media Wednesday morning, a brief video lasting just under one minute.

"Good morning guys. I'll get to the point right away," Brady says as the message begins. "I'm retiring. For good."

He briefly retired after the 2021 season, but wound up coming back for one more year with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. He retires at age 45, the owner of numerous passing records in an unprecedented 23-year career.

A year ago when he retired, it was in the form of a long Instagram post. But about six weeks later, he decided to come back for one more run. The Buccaneers — with whom he won a Super Bowl two seasons ago — made the playoffs again this season, losing in their playoff

opener. And at the time, it begged the question about whether Brady would play again.

Only a couple weeks later, he has given the answer.

"I know the process was a pretty big deal last time, so when I woke up this morning, I figured I'd just press record and let you guys know first," Brady says in the video. "I won't be long-winded. You only get one super emotional retirement essay and I used mine up last year.

"I really thank you guys so much, to every single one of you for supporting me. My family, my friends, teammates, my competitors. I could go on forever. There's too many. Thank you guys for allowing me to live my absolute dream. I wouldn't change a thing. Love you all."

Brady is the NFL's career leader in yards passing (89,214) and touchdowns (649). He's the only player to win more than five Super Bowls and has been MVP of the game five times.

Famously underrated coming into the NFL — he was picked 199th in the 2000 draft by the

Patriots, behind six other quarterbacks, three kickers and a punter — Brady certainly wasn't expected to become synonymous with greatness. He played in one game as a rookie, completing one of three passes for six yards.

The next year, it all changed.

Brady took over as the Patriots' starter, the team beat the St. Louis Rams in the Super Bowl that capped the 2001 season, and he and New England coach Bill Belichick were well on their way to becoming the most successful coach-QB duo in football history.

More Super Bowl wins came after the 2003 and 2004 seasons. The Patriots returned to football's mountaintop for a fourth time in Brady's era a decade later to cap the 2014 season, the start of three more titles in a span of five years.

In 2020, he joined the Buccaneers and won his seventh Super Bowl. He spent his last three years with Tampa Bay, getting them to the playoffs in each of those seasons.

"I think I've been on

the record dozens of times saying there's no quarterback I'd rather have than Tom Brady, and I still feel that way," Belichick said in 2021 — shortly before Tampa Bay, with Brady, came to New England and beat the Patriots in a game dubbed "The Return." "I was very lucky to have Tom as the quarterback, to coach him, and he was as good as any coach could ever ask for."

Brady has won three NFL MVP awards, been a first-team All-Pro three times and selected to the Pro Bowl 15 times.

Brady and supermodel Gisele Bündchen finalized their divorce this past fall, during the Bucs' season. It ended a 13-year marriage between two superstars who respectively reached the pinnacles of football and fashion.

It was announced last year that when Brady retires from playing, he would join Fox Sports as a television analyst in a 10-year, \$375 million deal.

# Broncos get Payton as coach in deal with Saints

ENGLEWOOD, Colo. — The Denver Broncos have agreed to a deal with the New Orleans Saints that will make Sean Payton their head coach, a person with knowledge of the accord said Tuesday.

The person, who spoke to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity because the teams hadn't announced the agreement, said the Broncos would send their first-round pick, No. 29 overall, in this year's draft to the Saints along with a future second-rounder. Denver also will receive a third-round pick in the trade.

Payton remained under contract with New Orleans after stepping down from the Saints last year and working in broadcasting this season.

Payton, 59, went 152-89 in 15 seasons with the Saints and 9-8 in the playoffs. He led New Orleans to a 31-17 win over the Indianapolis Colts in the Super Bowl following the 2009 season. He stepped away last year when quarterback Drew Brees re-

tired.

The Broncos, who went 5-12 in 2022 and extended their playoff drought to seven years, fired rookie coach Nathaniel Hackett on Dec. 26 after he went 4-11. Interim coach Jerry Rosburg went 1-1.

Payton's top task will be to get quarterback Russell Wilson back to his winning ways after the 11-year pro had his worst statistical season following his blockbuster trade from Seattle for four premium draft picks and three players.

The Seahawks reached the playoffs under QB Geno Smith in their first year without Wilson, and now they own the Broncos' No. 5 overall selection in the draft in April.

The Broncos got back into the first round by trading pass rusher Bradley Chubb at mid-season to the Miami Dolphins, who sent the Broncos a first-rounder originally owned by the San Francisco 49ers.

That selection, the 29th overall pick, now belongs to the Saints.

Payton was the headliner during this year's cycle of head coach openings. Just five teams were searching

for coaches: the Broncos, Texans, Panthers, Colts and Cardinals.

The Broncos conducted an extensive search, beginning with a virtual visit with Jim Harbaugh, who decided to stay at the University of Michigan. Also considered were Dan Quinn, DeMeco Ryans, Raheem Morris, Ejiro Evero, Jim Caldwell and David Shaw. The Texans hired Ryans on Tuesday.

NFL rules didn't allow the Broncos to speak with Payton until Jan. 17, more than three weeks after they'd fired Hackett.

Team owner and CEO Greg Penner led the search with assistance from limited partner Condoleezza Rice and general manager George Paton.

Paton led last year's search and landed on Hackett, one of several decisions that backfired on him in 2022 as Hackett became just the fifth head coach in NFL history not to survive his first season.

Others were the \$70 million contract he gave to free agent Randy Gregory, who played in six games and recorded a pair of sacks,

and the \$245 million contract extension he gave to Wilson before the opener.

Wilson threw a career-low 16 touchdown passes and was sacked a league-leading and career-high 55 times in 15 games for Denver. He has vowed to do everything he can to bounce back in 2023.

Wilson played well for two weeks under Rosburg, giving the team hope that his poor performances last season were an aberration and that maybe his skill set was just a bad fit in Hackett's offense.

Penner, his wife, Carrie Walton-Penner, and her father, Rob Walton, purchased the Broncos last summer for \$4.65 billion, a global record for a professional sports franchise. But the team turned out to be more of a fixer-upper than they expected.

"When we purchased this great franchise in August, this is not the season we were expecting," Penner said after firing Hackett. "I want to personally apologize to our fans and all of Broncos country. We know that we need to be better and we will."


