Youth in grades 4 through 10 delivered great speeches, and the judges had a difficult time deciding the placings.

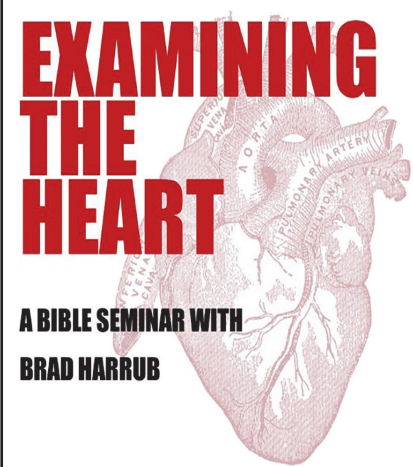
